## Finance reform plan perplexes school officials

Officials in Michigan school districts are scrambling to see how a new shared-growth school financing plan being touted in Lansing will affect them.

Northville officials are no different.

Superintendent George Bell said he has seen no accurate facts or figures to convince him whether he should or should not support the plan. The information he has received so far has been sketchy and inaccurate, he said.

"It doesn't spell out anything," Bell said. "There aren't any numbers."

"If it's good for Northville schools I'm going to support it."

But Bell said he fears the plan could be pushed through the legislature without proper evaluation before the representatives break for the holidays.

"They're going to try to railroad it through before the holidays," Bell said.

The plan, if adopted, would in two years phase out the recapture method used this year to give in-formula districts an infusion of money costing property wealthy out-of-formula districts a total of \$72 million.

The Northville Public School District lost \$1.3 million this year to recapture and, because of a looming \$1 billion deficit in the state budget, could expect to lose at least that amount next year.

To get rid of the recapture provision, however, out-of-formula districts would have to agree to give up one-half of the growth in their community's future commercial/

industrial taxbase under the proposed plan.

Metropolitan Detroit school officials will listen to specific details of the plan, pushed by Republican Senator Dan DeGrow, at a hearing in Royal Oak today.

Citing inaccurate and incomplete reports covering the scope of the plan, Bell said he is going to the hearing in hopes of finally receiving some correct information so he personally can evaluate the idea.

"They're having a hearing on a proposal that has not been written," Bell said.

Bell may attend the hearing, but he is not planning to testify. Director of Business and Finance John Street may attend if Bell is unable.

"If I'm prompted to, I will speak," Bell said.

A bill containing the plan is expected to be discussed by the Senate Appropriations subcommittee on Tuesday.

Under the plan, all Michigan school districts, both in-formula and out-of-formula, would pool half the growth in their commercial/industrial taxbase into one pot.

New properties on the tax rolls and increases in assessments would be considered new growth.

The pooled money would then be distributed to in-formula districts only.

In return, the state would agree to phase out its present system of recapture over a two-year period. Under recapture, money has been taken from out-of-formula districts like Northville and given to in-formula districts.

Under the plan, recapture would be cut in 1991-92. In 1992-93, it would be eliminated.

## Schools push for rehearing of suit

A lawsuit against the state seeking to return \$72 million to 56 property-rich school districts, including Novi and Northville, was dismissed Nov. 9 in a surprise move by the Michigan Court of Appeals.

The lawsuit sought to return "recaptured" state aid to pay for social security benefits and categorical aid like transportation and special education to out-of-formula school districts.

Attorney for the school districts, Dennis Pollard, said he feels the dis-

missal was based on a court error. "All I know is that just reading it they've confused two portions of the (Michigan) Constitution," Pollard said. "It was just an oversight as far as I can see."

Pollard received word of the dismissal on Nov. 12 and wrote a petition for rehearing the next day. The petition was submitted to the court Nov. 21.

Northville administrators are planning to stick with the lawsuit, at least through the rehearing process, said Superintendent George Bell.

## Crawford's to move into former bakery

Crawford's Bakery Connection is moving north, though not as far north as the bakery it will replace.

Crawford's, now located at 144 Mary Alexander Court, will move sometime in January to the former site of Holloway's Old Fashion Bakery at 123 E. Main St.

Crawford's manager, Sue Poster, expressed excitement about the move.

"Things are happening real fast for us in the bakery department," she said. "Opportunities arise and you just have to take advantage of them."

Poster was uncertain about the fate of the present Crawford's Bakery — whether it would remain open in some capacity or be closed.

Poster said she discussed the impending move Nov. 19 with Joe Spagnuolo, owner of the Main Street building that housed Holloway's

Bakery and Tiffany Art Glass upstairs. "We still have to meet to go over plans for the exterior and interior," she said.

Any renovation of the exterior will have to be approved by the Historic District Commission first, as the new site falls within the city's historic district.

Poster cited two other reasons for delaying the move to Main Street. "At this point we're just too busy with the holiday season, and they're still working over there," she said.

Poster said there is still "a lot of cleanup to do" at the new site, following the fire which broke out in Tiffany Art Glass early on the morning of Sept. 29. The fire gutted the second-floor shop and forced the closure of Holloway's Bakery due to heavy smoke and water damage.

Damage to the building was esti-

Trying to squeeze several arguments about the merits of U.S. space exploration into eight minutes, the debaters must top even JFK's speed speaking record.

To provide the opportunity for every member to debate, the Novi High School debate club belongs to four leagues.

Tuesday, Novi High School hosted a debate.

This year, the topic under debate is whether the United States should expand its space exploration program beyond the earth's mesosphere.

For lay people, the mesosphere is the space between 15 and 50 miles

"I like basketball where the ball goes off and the game is over," Peter Best said.

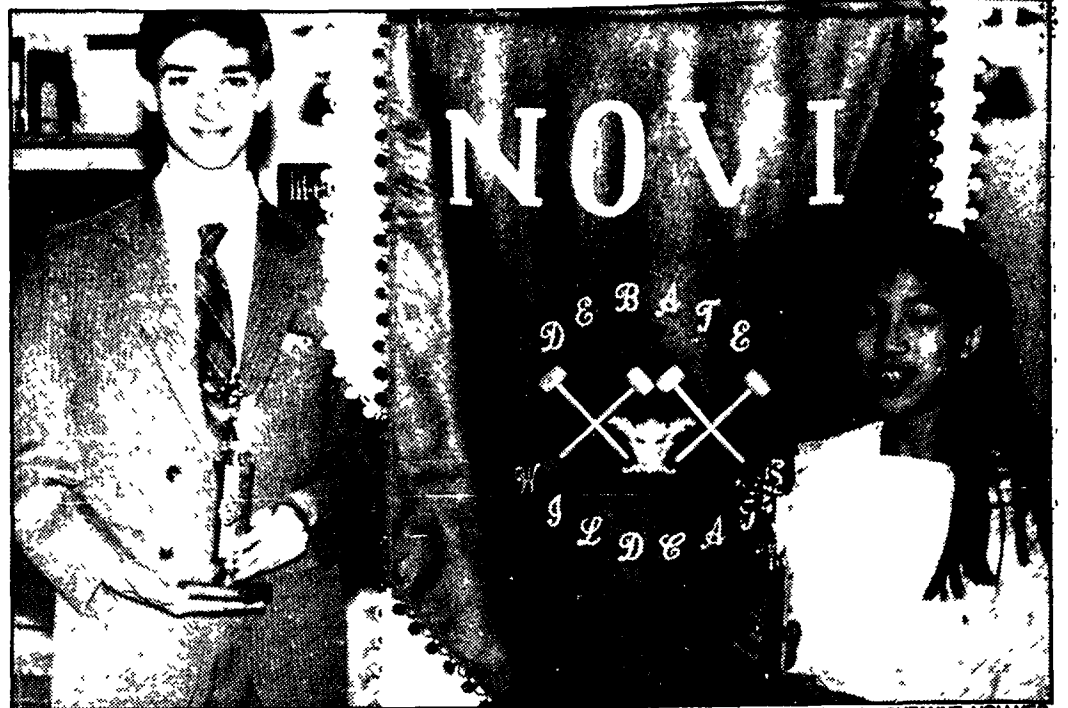

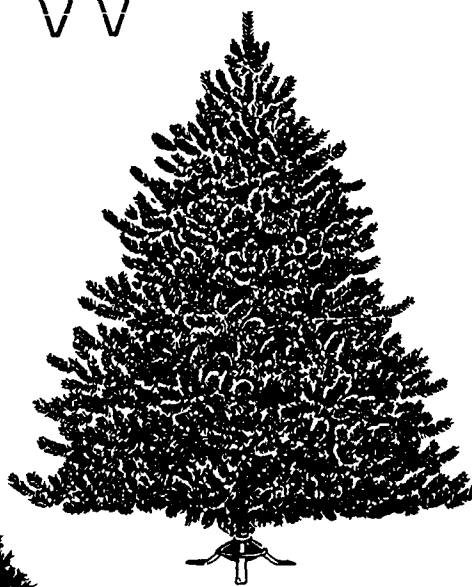

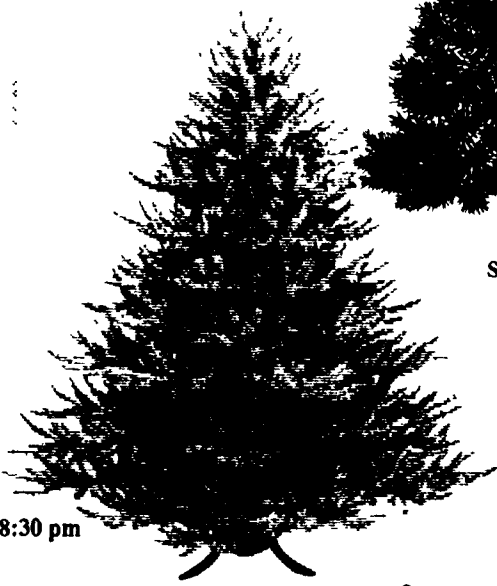

# Oakland seeks high-tech traffic solution

Oakland County officials want to reduce traffic problems by making signal lights smart enough to divert motorists away from congestion.

County commissioners have tentatively agreed to provide \$2 million so Oakland can qualify for \$70 million in federal money for a high-tech traffic pilot program.

The project is designed to computerize and coordinate more than 100 traffic signals in the City of Troy within two years and subsequently within a 68-square-mile area in five years.

The expanded area, which includes 27 communities, is bounded by Orchard Lake Road on the west, Dequindre on the east, South Boulevard on the north and Eight Mile Road on the south.

Troy was selected as the test area because it contains a significant portion of I-75 as well as other state and county highways, said John L. Grubba, managing director of the Road Commission for Oakland County.

Grubba outlined the high-tech program Thursday during a meeting of the Finance Committee of the Oakland County Board of Commissioners.

Grubba also asked for the \$2 million as "seed money." The committee authorized the \$2 million, but the full board must vote on it, probably next month.

"We have identified a very exciting, workable traffic flow control system that already has a high degree of demonstrated success in Europe" and other places, said Grubba.

Grubba said the proposed system involves putting traffic sensors and automated television cameras at various intersections to monitor the flow of traffic.

By detecting which highways are clogged and diverting motorists to alternative routes, the so-called Advanced Traffic Management System (ATMS) reduces time spent idling in traffic by about 40 percent and speeds traffic flow by 20 percent, Grubba said.

Cars equipped with the so-called Advanced Driver Information Systems (ADIS) will derive additional benefit from the system, Grubba said, because their on-board computers can pick up signals more quickly and advise the driver accordingly.

Equipping cars with ADIS is up to individual motorists, Grubba said. Automakers expect to make the technology available in the mid-1990s.

This is the ideal time to install ATMS, Grubba said, because the technology is evolving and federal officials are willing to invest tax dollars on testing projects.

"We're probably going to have to install this system anyway," Grubba said, because ATMS is believed to be the most efficient way of managing traffic congestion.

"But if (Oakland County) moves now, federal dollars are available," said Grubba, who has been conducting private discussions with state and federal officials for more than a year.

## Anti-gridlock plan raises questions

Commissioners were happy to receive a proposal that Oakland County invest \$2 million to qualify for \$70 million in federal funds to manage traffic congestion. But questions outnumbered answers Thursday when the proposal was outlined for the first time.

Here's a sampling of comments from commissioners along with the answer provided by John L. Grubba, managing director of the Road Commission for Oakland County:

■ Commissioner John E. Olsen, R-Huntington Woods, asked, "If the county did not provide \$2 mil-

lion to qualify for federal dollars, would the road commission supply the money from its budget?"

The road commission would try to find the money, Grubba said. But given the loss of revenue because of reduced gasoline sales, "We'd probably miss this opportunity," he said.

■ Commissioner Marilyn E. Gosling, R-Bloomfield Hills, asked if the grant would have any impact on road maintenance. "I can see having this wonderful system while the roads crumble," she said.

Grubba said the \$70 million in federal money would be used to train people and install the sensors, beacons and computers needed to monitor traffic and divert traffic.

Maintaining roads is not related, Grubba said.

■ "Troy is a wonderful place to live and work in," said Commissioner John G. Pappageorge, R-Troy, "as long as you don't have to make a left turn during rush hour."

Officials realize traffic congestion hampers economic growth as well as diminishing the quality of

life, said Grubba.

Ken Strobel, spokesman for a group he identified as the Coalition on Road Enhancement, said the computerized traffic system appears to be the best way of maximizing highway efficiency without adding traffic lanes.

"Not providing the \$2 million would send the wrong message to Lansing," said Strobel, a developer. "We want the legislature (with its influence on state highway funds) to know Oakland County will do its part for good roads."

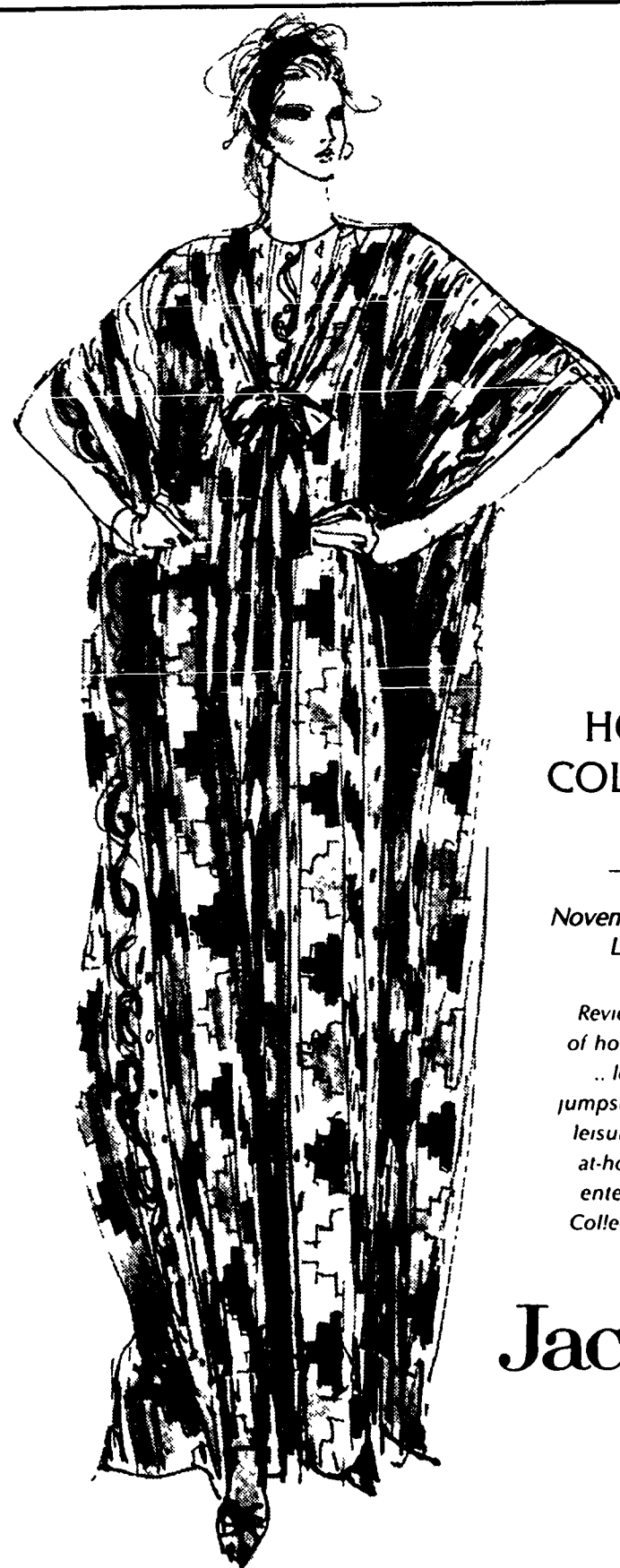

# **NOTICE** **CITY OF NORTHVILLE** **ORDINANCE NO. TITLE VII, CHAPTER 16** **WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM** **REVENUE BONDS**

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR ACQUIRING AND CONSTRUCTING IMPROVEMENTS TO THE WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF NORTHVILLE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF REVENUE BONDS TO PAY THE COST THEREOF; TO PRESCRIBE THE FORM OF THE BONDS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE COLLECTION OF REVENUES FROM THE SYSTEM SUFFICIENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE COSTS OF OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE SYSTEM AND TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS; TO PROVIDE AN ADEQUATE RESERVE FUND FOR THE BONDS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEGREGATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF THE REVENUES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE RIGHTS OF THE HOLDERS OF THE BONDS IN ENFORCEMENT THEREOF, AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE BONDS AND THE SYSTEM

**THE CITY OF NORTHVILLE ORDAINS:**

**Section 1. Definitions.** Whenever used in this Ordinance, except when otherwise indicated by the context, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

(a) "Act 94" means Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended.

(b) "Adjusted Net Revenues" means for any operating year the excess of revenues over expenses for the System determined in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, to which shall be added depreciation, amortization, interest expense on bonds, and payments to the City in lieu of taxes, to which may be made the following adjustments:

(i) Revenues may be augmented by the amount of any rate increases adopted prior to the issuance of additional Bonds or to be placed into effect before the time principal or interest on the additional Bonds becomes payable from Revenues as applied to quantities of service furnished during the operating year or portion thereof that the increase rates were not in effect.

(ii) Revenues may be augmented by amounts which may be derived from rates and charges to be paid by new customers of the System.

The adjustment of revenues and expenses by the factors set forth in (i) and (ii) above shall be reported upon by professional engineers or certified public accountants or other experts not in the regular employment of the City.

(c) "Bonds" means the Series 1990 Bonds, together with any additional Bonds of equal standing hereafter issued.

(d) "City" means the City of Northville, Counties of Wayne and Oakland, State of Michigan.

(e) "Project" means the additions, extensions and improvements to the System together with appurtenances and attachments thereto to be acquired and constructed in accordance with the Ordinance.

(f) "Revenues" and "Net Revenues" mean the revenues and net revenues of the System and shall be construed as defined in Section 3 of Act 94, including with respect to "Revenues", the earnings derived from the investment of moneys in the various funds and accounts established by this Ordinance.

(g) "Series 1990 Bonds" means the Water Supply System Revenue Bonds, Series 1990, of the City in the principal amount of \$400,000 authorized by this Ordinance.

(h) "Sufficient Government Obligations" means direct obligations of the United States of America or obligations the principal and interest on which is fully guaranteed by the United States of America, not redeemable at the option of the issuer, the principal and interest payments upon which, without reinvestment of the interest, come due at such times and in such amounts as to be fully sufficient to pay the interest as it comes due on the Bonds and the principal and redemption premium, if any, on the Bonds as it comes due whether on the stated maturity date or upon earlier redemption. Securities representing such obligations shall be placed in trust with a bank or trust company, and if any of the Bonds are to be called for redemption prior to maturity, irrevocable instructions to call the Bonds for redemption shall be given to the paying agent.

(i) "System" means the entire water supply system of the City, including such facilities thereof as are now existing, are acquired and constructed as the Project, and all enlargements, extensions, repairs and improvements thereto hereafter made.

**Section 2. Necessary Approval of Plans and Specifications.** It is hereby determined to be a necessary public purpose of the City to acquire and construct the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by McNeely, Lincoln, Northville, Michigan, and the City's engineering staff, which plans and specifications are hereby approved.

**Section 3. Costs; Useful Life.** The total cost of the Project is estimated to be Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) including the payment of incidental expenses as specified in Section 4 of this Ordinance, which estimate of cost is hereby approved and confirmed, and the period of usefulness of the Project is estimated to be not less than forty (40) years.

**Section 4. Payment of Cost; Bonds Authorized.** To pay the cost of acquiring and constructing the Project, including payment of legal, engineering, financial and other expenses incident thereto and incident to the issuance and sale of the Series 1990 Bonds including establishment of a bond reserve, the City shall borrow the sum of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) and issue the Series 1990 Bonds therefor pursuant to the provisions of Act 94.

**Section 5. Bond Details, Issuance in Series, Registration and Execution.** The Series 1990 Bonds hereby authorized shall be designated WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS, Series 1990, shall be payable out of Net Revenues, as set forth more fully in Section 7 hereof, shall consist of bonds of the denomination of \$5,000, or integral multiples of \$5,000 not exceeding in any one year the amount maturing in that year, dated as of December 1, 1990, numbered in order of registration, and shall mature on September 1 in the years and amounts as follows:

The Series 1990 Bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates to be determined on public sale thereof, but in any event not exceeding the maximum rate permitted by law, payable on March 1, and September 1 of each year, commencing September 1, 1991, by check or draft mailed by the transfer agent selected by the City to the person or entity which is, as of the 15th day of the month preceding the interest payment date, the registered owner at the registered address as shown on the registration books of the City maintained by the transfer agent. The date of determination of registered owner for purposes of payment of interest as provided in this paragraph may be changed by the City to conform to market practice in the future. The principal of the Series 1990 Bonds shall be payable at Manufacturers National Bank of Detroit, Detroit, Michigan as registrar and transfer agent for this issue. The Series 1990 Bonds shall be sold at not less than 100% of their par value.

The Series 1990 Bonds shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity. The Series 1990 Bonds shall be executed in the name of the City with the facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the City Clerk and shall have the City's seal printed on them. No Bond shall be valid until authenticated by an authorized signatory of the transfer agent. The Bonds shall be delivered to the transfer agent for authentication and be delivered by the transfer agent to the purchaser in accordance with instructions from the Director of Finance of the City upon payment of the purchase price for the Bonds in accordance with the bid therefor when accepted. Executed blank bonds for registration and issuance to transferees shall simultaneously, and from time to time thereafter as necessary, be delivered to the transfer agent for safekeeping.

**Section 6. Registration and Transfer.** Any Bond may be transferred upon the books required to be kept pursuant to this section by the person in whose name it is registered, in person or by the registered owner's duly authorized attorney, upon surrender of the Bond for cancellation, accompanied by delivery of a duly executed written instrument of transfer in a form approved by the transfer agent. Whenever any Bond or Bonds shall be surrendered for transfer, the City shall execute and the transfer agent shall authenticate and deliver a new Bond or Bonds, for like aggregate principal amount. The transfer agent shall require payment by the bondholder requesting the transfer of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the transfer.

The transfer agent shall keep or cause to be kept, at its principal office, sufficient books for the registration and transfer of the Bonds, which shall at all times be open to inspection by the City; and, upon presentation for such purpose, the transfer agent shall, under such reasonable regulation as it may prescribe, transfer or cause to be transferred, on said books, Bonds as hereinbefore provided.

If any Bond shall become mutilated, the City, at the expense of the holder of the Bond, shall execute, and the transfer agent shall authenticate and deliver, a new Bond of like tenor in exchange and substitution for the mutilated Bond, upon surrender to the transfer agent of the mutilated Bond. If any Bond issued under this Ordinance shall be lost, destroyed or stolen, evidence of the loss, destruction or theft may be submitted to the transfer agent and, if this evidence is satisfactory to both and indemnity satisfactory to the transfer agent shall be given, and if all requirements of any applicable law including Act 354, 1931, Public Acts of Michigan, 1972, as amended ("Act 354"), being sections 129.134 to 129.135, inclusive, of the Michigan Compiled Laws have been met, the City, at the expense of the owner, shall execute, and the transfer agent shall thereupon authenticate and deliver, a new Bond of like tenor and bearing the statement required by Act 354, or any applicable law hereafter enacted, in lieu of and in substitution for the Bond so lost, destroyed or stolen. If any such Bond shall have matured or shall be about to mature, instead of issuing a substitute Bond the transfer agent may pay the same without surrender thereof.

**Section 7. Payment of Bonds.** The Series 1990 Bonds and the interest thereon shall be payable solely from the Net Revenues, and to secure such payment, there is hereby created a statutory lien upon the whole of the Net Revenues which shall be a first lien to continue until payment in full of the principal of and interest on all bonds payable from the Net Revenues, or, until sufficient cash or Sufficient Government Obligations have been deposited in trust for payment in full of all Bonds of a series then outstanding, principal and interest on such Bonds to maturity, or, if called for redemption, to the date fixed for redemption together with the amount of the redemption premium, if any. Upon deposit of cash or Sufficient Government Obligations, as provided in the previous sentence, the statutory lien shall be terminated with respect to that series of Bonds, the holders of that series shall have no further rights under this Ordinance except for payment from the deposited funds, and the Bonds of that series shall no longer be considered to be outstanding under this Ordinance.

**Section 8. Bondholders' Rights: Receiver.** The holder or holders of the Bonds representing in the aggregate not less than twenty percent (20%) of the entire principal amount thereof then outstanding, may, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceedings, protect and enforce the statutory lien upon the Net Revenues of the System, and may, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceedings, enforce and compel performance of all duties of the officers of the City, including the fixing of sufficient rates, the collection of Revenues, the proper segregation of the Revenues of the System, and the proper application thereof. The statutory lien upon the Net Revenues, however, shall not be construed as to compel the sale of the System or any part thereof.

If there is a default in the payment of the principal or interest on the Bonds, any court having jurisdiction in any proper action may appoint a receiver to administer and operate the System on behalf of the City and under the direction of the court, and by and with the approval of the court to perform all of the duties of the officers of the City more particularly set forth herein and in Act 94.

The holder or holders of the Bonds shall have all other rights and remedies given by Act 94 and law, for the payment and enforcement of the Bonds and the security therefor.

**Section 9. Management; Fiscal Year.** The operation, repair and management of the System and the acquiring of the Project shall be under the supervision and control of the City Council. The City Council may employ on the efficient management and operation of the System. The City Council may make such rules and regulations as it deems advisable and necessary to assure the efficient management and operation of the System. The operating year and fiscal year of the System shall be the same as the City; that is beginning on July 1st of a year and ending on June 30 of the following year.

**Section 10. Rates and Charges.** The rates and charges for service furnished by and the use of the System and the methods of collection and enforcement of the collection of the rates shall be those in effect on the date of adoption of this Ordinance or placed in effect prior to the sale of the Series 1990 Bonds.

**Section 11. No Free Service or Use.** No free service or use of the System, or service or use of the System at less than cost, shall be furnished by the System to any person, firm or corporation, public or private, or to any public agency or instrumentality, including the City.

**Section 12. Fixing and Revising Rates; Rate Covenant.** The rates now in effect, or to be placed in effect prior to sale of the Series 1990 Bonds, are estimated to be sufficient to provide for the payment of the expenses of administration and operation and such expenses for maintenance of the System as are necessary to preserve the System in good repair and working order, to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same become due and payable, and the maintenance of the reserve therefor and to provide for all other obligations, expenditures and funds for the System required by law and this Ordinance. In addition, it is agreed that the rates shall be set from time to time so that there shall be produced each fiscal year, Net Revenues in an amount equal to 110% of the principal of and interest on the Bonds coming due in each fiscal year. The rates shall be fixed and revised from time to time as may be necessary to produce these amounts, and it is hereby covenanted and agreed to fix and maintain rates for services furnished by the System at all times sufficient to provide for the foregoing.

**Section 13. Funds and Accounts; Flow of Funds.** Commencing on December 1, 1990, all funds belonging to the System shall be transferred as herein indicated and all Revenues of the System shall be set aside as collected and credited to a fund to be designated WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM RECEIVING FUND (the "Receiving Fund"). In addition, on December 1, 1990 all Revenues in any accounts of the System shall be transferred to the Receiving Fund and credited to the funds and accounts as provided in this section. The Revenues credited to the Receiving Fund are pledged for the purpose of the following funds and shall be transferred or debited from the Receiving Fund periodically in the manner and at the times and in the order of priority hereinafter specified:

**A. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE FUND:**  
 Out of the Revenues credited to the Receiving Fund there shall be first set aside, or credited to, a fund designated OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE FUND (the "Operation and Maintenance Fund"), monthly a sum sufficient to provide for the payment of the next month's expenses of administration and operation of the System and such current expenses for the maintenance thereof as may be necessary to preserve the same in good repair and working order.

A budget, showing in detail the estimated costs of administration, operation and maintenance of the System for the next ensuing operating year, shall be prepared by the City Council at least 30 days prior to the commencement of each ensuing operating year. No payments shall be made to the City from moneys credited to the Operation and Maintenance Fund except for services directly rendered to the System by the City or its personnel.

**B. BOND AND INTEREST REDEMPTION FUND:**  
 There shall be established and maintained a separate depository fund designated BOND AND INTEREST REDEMPTION FUND (the "Redemption Fund"), the moneys on deposit therein from time to time to be used solely for the purpose of paying the principal of, redemption premiums (if any) and interest on the Bonds. The moneys in the Redemption fund (including the Bond Reserve Account) shall be kept on deposit with the bank or trust company where the principal of and interest on the Bonds, or any series thereof, are payable.

Out of the Revenues remaining in the Receiving Fund, after provision for the Operation and Maintenance Fund, there shall be set aside each month commencing December 1, 1990 in the Redemption Fund a sum proportionately sufficient to provide for the payment when due of the current principal of and interest on the Bonds, less any income on amounts on deposit in the Redemption Fund, (including investment income on amounts held as part of the Bond Reserve Account). Commencing December 1, 1990, the amount set aside each month for interest on the Bonds shall be one-ninth (1/9) of the total amount of interest on the Bonds coming due September 1, 1991, and thereafter shall be one-sixth (1/6) of the total amount of interest on the Bonds next coming due. The amount set aside each month for principal, commencing December 1, 1990, shall be one-ninth (1/9) of the amount of principal next coming due by maturity and the amount set aside each month for principal payment commencing September 1, 1991, shall be one-twelfth (1/12) of the amount of principal next coming due by maturity. If there is any deficiency in the amount previously set aside, that deficiency shall be added to the next succeeding monthly requirements. The amount to be set aside for the payment of principal and interest on any date shall not exceed the amount which, when added to the money on deposit in the Redemption Fund, including investment income thereon and on the Bond Reserve Account when it is fully funded, is necessary to pay principal and interest due on the Bonds on the next succeeding principal payment date.

There is established a separate account in the Redemption Fund to be known as the BOND RESERVE ACCOUNT (the "Bond Reserve Account"). There shall be deposited in the Bond Reserve Account from the proceeds of the Series 1990 Bonds an amount equal to the Reserve Funding Amount. Investment earnings on the Bond Reserve Account shall be retained in that account until the Bond Reserve Account equals the maximum annual debt service due in the current or any future fiscal year (the "Reserve Amount"). At any time thereafter that the amount in the Bond Reserve Account falls below the Reserve Amount there shall be deposited from the next available Revenues of the System, after provision for the deposits required by Section 13 A and B, an amount sufficient to make up the deficiency. The Reserve Funding Amount means the lesser of (1) the maximum annual debt service due in the current or any future year, (2) 125% of the average annual debt service or (3) 10% of the principal amount of the bonds. Interest on the Bond Reserve Account must be transferred into the Redemption Fund once the Reserve Amount has been reached.

Except as otherwise provided in this Section, the moneys credited to the Bond Reserve Account shall be used solely for the payment of the principal of, redemption premiums (if any) and interest on the Bonds as to which there would otherwise be a default. If at any time it shall be necessary to use moneys credited to the Bond Reserve Account for such payment, then the moneys so used shall be replaced from the Net Revenues first received thereafter which are not required for current principal and interest requirements until the amount on deposit equals the Reserve Amount. If additional Bonds are issued, each Ordinance authorizing the additional Bonds shall provide for additional deposits to the Bond Reserve Account to be made from the proceeds of the additional Bonds or City funds on hand and being available for such use in an amount that will result in the Bond Reserve Account legally equal to the maximum annual principal and interest requirements on the Bonds outstanding after issuance of the additional Bonds, or such lesser amount as may be necessary to maintain the tax-exempt status of the Bonds. If on any principal payment date the amount in the Bond Reserve Account exceeds the Reserve Amount, the excess shall be transferred to the Redemption Fund for payment of principal and interest on the Bonds due on that date or credited against the next required deposits to the Redemption Fund.

**C. REPLACEMENT FUND**  
 There shall be established and maintained a fund designated REPLACEMENT FUND (the "Replacement Fund"), the money credited thereto to be used solely for the purpose of making repairs and replacements to the System. Out of the Revenues and moneys of the System remaining in the Receiving Fund each month after provision has been made for the deposit of moneys in the Operation and Maintenance Fund and the Redemption Fund (including the Bond Reserve Account), there may be deposited in the Replacement Fund such additional funds as the City Council may deem advisable. If at any time it shall be necessary to use moneys in the Replacement Fund for the purpose for which the Replacement Fund was established, the moneys so used shall be replaced from any moneys in the Receiving Fund which are not required by this Ordinance to be used for the Operation and Maintenance Fund or the Redemption Fund (including the Bond Reserve Account).

**D. IMPROVEMENT FUND**  
 Out of the remaining Revenues in the Receiving Fund, after meeting the requirements of the Operation and Maintenance Fund, the Redemption Fund (including the Bond Reserve Account) and the Replacement Fund, there may be next set aside in or credited to a fund to be designated IMPROVEMENT FUND (the "Improvement Fund"), which Improvement Fund may have several subaccounts therein, such sums monthly as the City may deem advisable to be used for additions, improvements, enlargements or extensions to the System, including the planning thereof.

**E. SURPLUS MONEYS:**  
 Thereafter, any Revenues in the Receiving Fund after satisfying all the foregoing requirements of this Section may, at the discretion of the City, be used for any of the following purposes:

1. Transferred to the Improvement Fund.
  2. Payment of debt service on other bonds or obligations incurred by the City for improvements to the System.
  3. Transferred to the Redemption Fund and used for the purchase of Bonds on the open market at not more than the fair market value thereof or used to redeem Bonds prior to maturity pursuant to Section 5 of this Ordinance.
  4. Any other use permitted by law.
- Section 14. Priority of Funds.** In the event the moneys in the Receiving Fund are insufficient to provide for the current requirements of the Operation and Maintenance Fund or the Redemption Fund, any moneys or securities in other funds of the System, except the proceeds of sale of the Bonds, shall be credited or transferred, first to the Operation and Maintenance Fund, and second to the Redemption Fund.
- Section 15. Depollitory and Funds on Hand.** Moneys in the several funds and the accounts established pursuant to this Ordinance, except moneys in the Redemption Fund (including the Bond Reserve Account) and moneys derived from the proceeds of sale of the Bonds, may be kept in one or more bank accounts at a bank or banks designated by resolution of the City, and if kept in more than one bank account the moneys shall be allocated on the books and records of the City in the manner and at the times provided in this Section.

**Section 16. Investments.** (1) Moneys in the funds and accounts established herein and moneys derived from the proceeds of sale of the Bonds, may be invested by the City in the following:

- (a) United States government obligations.
- (b) Obligations the principal and interest on which is fully guaranteed by the United States.
- (c) Repurchase agreements that are secured by United States government obligations or obligations fully guaranteed by the United States and that are held by an independent third party.
- (d) Certificates of deposit or other accounts of, or bankers acceptances of banks that are members of the federal deposit insurance corporation.
- (e) Commercial paper that is rated in the highest category by a nationally recognized rating agency.
- (f) Obligations of a state of the United States or of a political subdivision of a state of the United States that are rated in 1 of 3 highest categories by a nationally recognized rating agency.
- (g) A collective investment fund that invests solely in 1 or more of the securities authorized for investment by this subsection.
- (2) Investment of money in the Bond and Interest Redemption Fund being accu-

mulated for payment of the next maturing principal or interest on the bonds is limited to 1 or more of the following:

- (a) United States government obligations, or obligations the principal and interest of which are fully guaranteed by the United States, that mature not later than the date for payment of the maturing principal or interest for which the money is being accumulated.
  - (b) Repurchase agreements that are to settle on or before the date set for payment and that are secured by United States government obligations or obligations fully guaranteed by the United States and that are held by an independent third party.
- Investment of moneys in the Bond Reserve Account shall be limited to obligations bearing maturity dates or subject to redemption, at the option of the holder thereof, not later than five years from the date of the investment.
- (3) In the event investments are made, any securities representing the same shall be kept on deposit with the bank or trust company having on deposit the fund or funds or account from which the purchase was made.
- (4) Profit realized or interest income earned on investment of funds in the Receiving Fund, Operation and Maintenance Fund, Replacement Fund and Improvement Fund shall be deposited in or credited to the Receiving Fund at the end of each fiscal year. Profit realized on interest income earned on investment of moneys in the Redemption Fund including income derived from the Bond Reserve Account shall be credited as received to the Redemption Fund.
- Section 17. Bond Proceeds.** From the proceeds of the sale of the Series 1990 Bonds there shall be immediately deposited in the Redemption Fund an amount equal to the accrued interest and premium, if any, received on the delivery of the Bonds. There shall be deposited in the Bond Reserve Account an amount equal to the Reserve Funding Amount. The balance of the proceeds of the sale of the Series 1990 Bonds shall be deposited in a bank or banks, designated by the City Council, qualified to act as depository of the proceeds of sale under the provisions of Section 15 of Act 94, in an account designated 1990 CONSTRUCTION FUND (the "Construction Fund"). Moneys in the Construction Fund shall be applied solely in payment of the cost of the Project, including any engineering, legal and other expenses incident thereto and to the financing thereof.
- Any unexpended balance of the proceeds of sale of the Bonds remaining after completion of the Project in the Construction Fund may, at the discretion of the City, be used for further improvements, enlargements and extension to the System, if, at the time of such expenditures, such use is approved by the Michigan Department of Treasury if such permission is then required by law. Any remaining balance after such expenditure shall be paid to the Redemption Fund and may be used for the purpose of purchasing Bonds on the open market at not more than the fair market value thereof, but not more than the price at which the Bonds may next be called for redemption, or used for the purpose of paying principal of the Bonds upon maturity of calling Bonds for redemption.

**Section 18. Bond Form.** The Series 1990 Bonds shall be in substantially the following form:

Interest on this bond is, as payable by check or draft mailed by the transfer agent to the person or entity who is, as of the 15th day of the month preceding the interest payment date, the registered owner of record, at the registered address as shown on the registration books of the City kept by the transfer agent. For prompt payment of principal and interest on this bond, the City has irrevocably pledged the revenues of the System, including all appurtenances, extensions and improvements thereto, after provision has been made for reasonable and necessary expenses of operation, maintenance and administration (the "Net Revenues"), and a statutory first lien thereon is hereby recognized and created.

This bond is one of a series of bonds of even date of original issue aggregating the principal sum of \$400,000, issued pursuant to Ordinance No. , duly adopted by the City Council of the City, and under and in full compliance with the Constitution and statutes of the State of Michigan, including specifically Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended, for the purpose of paying the cost of acquiring and constructing improvements to the system.

For a complete statement of the revenues from which and the conditions under which this bond is payable, a statement of the conditions under which additional bonds of equal standing may hereafter be issued and the general covenants and provisions pursuant to which this bond is issued, reference is made to the above-described Ordinance.

Bonds of this issue are not subject to redemption prior to maturity. This bond is a self-amortizing bond and is not a general obligation of the City and does not constitute an indebtedness of the City within any constitutional, charter or statutory limitation, but is payable, both as to principal and interest, solely from the Net Revenues of the System. The principal of and interest on this bond are secured by the statutory lien hereinbefore mentioned.

The City has covenanted and agreed, and does hereby covenant and agree, to fix and maintain at all times while any bonds payable from the Net Revenues of the System shall be outstanding, such rated for service furnished by the System as shall be sufficient to provide for payment of the interest on and the principal of the bonds of this issue and any additional bonds of equal standing as and when the same shall become due and payable, and to create and maintain a bond redemption fund (including a bond reserve account) therefor, to provide for the payment of expenses of administration and operation and such expenses for maintenance of the System as are necessary to preserve the same in good repair and working order, and to provide for such other expenditures and funds for the System as are required by the Ordinance.

 Section 19. Covenants. The City covenants and agrees with the holders of the Bonds that so long as any of the Bonds remain outstanding and unpaid as the either principal or interest:

- (a) The City will maintain the System in good repair and working order and will operate the same efficiently and will faithfully and punctually perform all duties with reference to the System required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Michigan, the City's Charter and this Ordinance.
- (b) The City will keep proper books of record and account separate from all other records and accounts of the City, in which shall be made full and correct entries of all transactions relating to the System. The City shall have an annual audit of the books of record and account of the System for the preceding operating year made each year by and independent certified public accountant, and a copy of the audit shall be mailed to the manager of each syndicate or account originally purchasing any issue of the Bonds if requested at the time of delivery of the Bonds. The auditor shall comment on the manner in which the City is complying with the requirements of the Ordinance with respect to setting aside and investing moneys meeting the requirements for acquiring and maintaining insurance. The audit shall be completed and so made available not later than four (4) months after the close of each operating year.
- (c) The City will maintain and carry, for the benefit of the holders of the Bonds, insurance on all physical properties of the System and liability insurance of the funds and in the amounts normally carried by municipalities engaged in the operation of water supply systems, including self-insurance. All moneys received for losses under any such insurance policies shall be applied solely to the replacement and restoration of the property damaged or destroyed, and to the extent not so used, shall be used for the purpose of redeeming or purchasing Bonds.
- (d) The City will not sell, lease or dispose of the System, or any substantial part, until all of the Bonds have been paid in full, both as to principal and interest or provision made thereof as herein provided. # Schools want lawsuit reheard

"We're going to stay with it through this stage at least," Bell said. "There may be a point down the line when we decide it's not worth pouring money into the case any longer."

If the schools are given the rehearing and win, but the state appeals the decision, Northville might get out of the case for financial reasons, Bell said.

The dismissal came five days after the same court ruled in favor of Macomb County's Warren-Fitzgerald

school district in a similar case. In the 10-year-old Fitzgerald case, the court decided the state cannot reduce aid for state-mandated programs.

If the court decides to rehear the current case, Pollard said, it could be decided quickly, at least more quickly than the Fitzgerald case was decided.

The Fitzgerald case asked for damages caused by state aid reductions while the current case asks for an injunction preventing aid reduction. But some delay may be inevitable.

Pollard hoped to get the Macomb Circuit Judge who recommended the Court of Appeals rule in favor of the schools in the Fitzgerald case, George Denewith, to hear the current case. But Denewith, who had been handling the case for three years, died soon after the Fitzgerald decision was handed down.

Bringing a new judge up to speed on school finance issues could take a long time.

"The problem is that this case is extremely complicated," Pollard said. "The judge you find has to have the

ability to set aside his docket for a while and become involved in the case."

And the court has not been as speedy as Pollard had hoped up to this point with the current case.

"It took them two months to get to this point when I thought it would be a few weeks," Pollard said.

Pollard is optimistic that the court will rehear the case, and decide favorably for the school districts.

"The same judge and the same court issued a decision that agreed with our position that recapture was unconstitutional," he said.

# Methodist church has new minister

From ministry to banking and back again, The Rev. Thomas Beagan has found his way to the Northville First United Methodist Church.

Beagan was ordained a Methodist minister in 1983, and worked in Utica as an associate pastor for three years.

He then made a drastic career change to banking.

But how does a minister become a banker, and an investment broker no less?

Beagan made the change because as a new single parent he wanted a job that would give him more time with his son, Justin, who is now 7 years old.

Prudential Securities hired Beagan and trained him as a banker.

"Apparently they thought I had enough people

skills that they could train me," he said.

But his true love was the ministry, and Beagan recently accepted a position that allowed him to get back into his field without relocating his family.

"The banking was just something that I had shorter hours that I could do as a single parent," Beagan said.

"This provided the opportunity for me to go back into the church without my family having to move."

Beagan began Nov. 1 as the minister of education at Northville First United Methodist Church. He will now be directing the Sunday school, the youth club and adult education classes.

Beagan will stay in the position for at least four or five years until his son finishes fifth grade at Silver Springs Elementary School, and he plans to stay in the field of ministry indefinitely.

His new responsibilities as minister of educa-

tion will have him doing everything from choosing curriculum for Sunday school classes to filling in when teachers are absent.

He is also helping the junior and senior high members of the church plan a trip to Appalachia next summer.

Not all churches have education directors, but Northville First United Methodist has a growing population of members, many helping to contribute to the church's growing population of kids.

"It's certainly breaking the trends of mainlined churches today," Beagan said.

The membership has doubled in the last six years with over 300 young people in the Sunday school program on Sundays and over 100 in the Wednesday youth club.

"(The church) puts a lot of emphasis on Christian education," he said.

"We have an excellent program here, a big program."

# SEMCOG sees neglect of traffic troubles

Many local governments are neglecting traffic engineering—the science of moving vehicles more efficiently and safely than they're doing now.

So says the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments, which deplores the 190,000 crashes, 600 deaths, 56,000 injuries and costs of \$1.7 billion that occur each year in the seven-county region.

SEMCOG's newly adopted Regional Traffic Safety Policies says:

"Fourteen communities have a population greater than 50,000. For communities this size, the Federal Highway Administration recommends a full-time professional traffic engineer on staff."

"Yet . . . only six employ a full-time traffic engineer," said the report, offered by Donald Jensen, an Oakland County commissioner from Birmingham.

The policy, adopted unanimously, advocates:

- More college programs in, and local use of, traffic engineers.
- More truck inspections. Michigan's limit of 1,674,000 pounds is double the limit of any other state. Only three states allow semi-trailer lengths greater than Michigan's 53 feet.
- Better screening of drivers over age 55. They are twice as likely to be involved in fatal accidents as the 25-54 age group. More roadway design research is needed to understand elderly drivers' reaction times and vision.
- Efforts to reduce crashes at highway construction and maintenance work zones, where 4,165 accidents occurred in 1987.
- A tighter definition of drunk driving through lowering the allowable blood alcohol content, currently 0.10 percent.

• Greater consistency in court sentencing of drunk drivers. District judges were praised for their program in this area.

• More use of seat belts, including making failure to wear a belt a "primary" offense for which police may stop a driver.

• Licensing, more training and higher standards for emergency medical service (EMS) personnel.

• More comprehensive traffic records, particularly by local government, which maintain 70 percent of all roadways in southeast Michigan.

SEMCOG's report noted the federal government spends \$1 billion a year on AIDS research for 27,000 patients, but traffic research gets only 12 percent as much to address 160,000 traffic deaths and injuries.

**Section 20. Additional Bonds.** Except as hereinafter provided, the City shall not issue additional Bonds of equal or prior standing with the Series 1990 Bonds.

This right is reserved in accordance with the provisions of Act 94, to issue additional Bonds payable from the revenues of the system which shall be of equal standing and priority of lien on the Net Revenues of the System with the Bonds but only for the following purposes and under the following terms and conditions.

(a) To complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor. Such Bonds shall not be authorized unless the engineers in charge of construction shall execute a certificate evidencing the fact that additional funds are needed to complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor and stating the amount that will be required to complete the Projects. If such certificate shall be so executed and filed with the City, it shall be the duty of the city to provide for and issue additional revenue bonds in the amount stated in said certificate to be necessary to complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications plus an amount necessary to issue such bonds or to provide for part of all of such amount from other sources.

(b) For subsequent repairs, extensions, enlargements and improvements to the System or for the purpose of refunding part of any Bonds then outstanding and paying costs of issuing such additional Bonds including deposits which may be required to be made to the Bond Reserve Account. Bonds for such purposes shall not be issued pursuant to this sub paragraph (b) unless the Adjusted Net Revenues of the system for the last two (2) preceding twelve-month operating years or the adjusted Net Revenues for the last preceding twelve-month operating year, if the same shall be lower than the average, shall be equal to at least one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the maximum amount of principal and interest thereafter maturing in any operating year on the then outstanding Bonds and on the additional Bonds then being issued. If the additional Bonds are to be issued in whole or in part for refunding outstanding Bonds, the annual principal and interest requirements shall be determined by deducting from the principal and interest requirements for each operating year the annual principal and interest requirements of any Bonds to be refunded from the proceeds of the additional Bonds. For purposes of this sub paragraph (b) the City may elect to use as the last preceding operating year any operating year ending not more than sixteen months prior to the date of delivery of the additional Bonds and as the next to the last preceding operating year, any operating year ending not more than twenty-eight months prior to the date of delivery of the additional Bonds. Determination by the City as to existence of conditions permitting the issuance of additional Bonds shall be conclusive. No additional Bonds of equal standing as to the Net Revenues of the system shall be issued pursuant to the authorization contained in this sub paragraph if the City shall then be in default in making its required payments to the Operation and Maintenance Fund or the redemption fund.

(c) For refunding a part of the outstanding Bonds and paying costs of issuing such additional Bonds including deposits which may be required to be made to the Bond Reserve Account. No additional Bonds shall be issued pursuant to this subsection unless the maximum amount of principal and interest maturing in any operating year after giving effect to the refunding shall be less than the maximum amount of principal and interest maturing in any operating year prior to giving effect to the refunding.

**Section 21. Sale of Bonds: Designation of Transfer Agent.** The City shall receive bids for the Series 1990 Bonds in accordance with the notice of sale approved by the City Council, award sale of the Series 1990 Bonds to the successful bidder determined in accordance with Act 94 and this Ordinance, and take all further necessary steps to issue and deliver the Series 1990 Bonds.

**Section 22. Covenant Regarding Tax Exempt Status of the Bonds.** The City shall, to the extent permitted by law, take all actions within its control necessary to maintain the exclusion of the interest on the Bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, (the "Code") including, but not limited to, actions relating to any required rebate of arbitrage earnings and the expenditure and investment of Bond proceeds and moneys deemed to be bond proceeds, and to prevent the bonds from being or becoming "private activity bonds" as that term is used in Section 141 of the Code. The City hereby designates the Series 1990 Bonds as "qualified tax exempt obligations" for purposes of deduction of interest expense by financial institutions.

**Section 23. Repeal, Savings Clause.** All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, repealed.

**Section 24. Severability; Paragraph Heading; and Conflict.** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance. The paragraph headings in this Ordinance are furnished for convenience of reference only and shall not be considered to be part of the Ordinance.

**Section 25. Publication and Recordation.** This Ordinance shall be published in full in The Northville Record, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Northville qualified under State law to publish legal notices, promptly after its adoption, and shall be recorded in the Ordinance Book of the City and such recording authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk.

**Section 26. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall be effective upon its adoption. Adopted and signed this 19th day of November, 1990.

In no case shall there be more than one main building and the customary accessory buildings on one lot in the R-1A and R-1B zoning districts. # Novi slated for one of three '91 Homearamas

Could a Homearama in Novi be one of three such showcases next year in metro Detroit?

The Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan, primary sponsor of the annual cavalcade of new idea houses, is thinking about sponsoring a third show next year, instead of the usual two.

"For sure we'll have one, at most three," said Dennis Dickstein, chairperson of the show committee and president of Ralph Manuel Realtors of Birmingham. "It's not 100 percent confirmed or approved."

Clarkston and Novi tentatively have been selected for shows next spring and fall, respectively. That leaves the East Side out—at least for now.

"There's a couple of people who want to

have a Homearama on the East Side and some builders want to do it," said Nancy Rosen, a spokeswoman for the BASM. She declined to be more specific.

Builders in Novi and Clarkston next year will be challenged to construct new idea homes to sell at about \$200,000 including land costs, Dickstein said.

Houses in the recently concluded Brighton Homearama are priced in excess of \$500,000.

Dickstein said he doesn't believe that a third Homearama would dilute attendance at the other two shows.

"Novi and Clarkston are two different worlds, two different sets of people," he said. "People will drive three quarters of an hour to an hour to Brighton to see homes that sell for

\$500,000. They won't drive an hour for a \$200,000-plus house."

"You might have smaller attendance at each show, but they pull from different areas. If we're going to put on an East Side show, houses will be in the \$500,000 price," Dickstein said.

About 100,000 turned out to tour 10 houses in the Pine Creek Subdivision surrounding Brighton Lake, Dickstein projected.

"It was very successful," he said. "Reception of the public to the site and environment was even more overwhelming than I thought."

"All the builders are talking with customers. All we have to do is tie them down with results. That's what matters," he said.

The American, a 7,500-square-foot country or Cape Cod house built by James D. Compo of Farmington Hills, was selected the favorite of visitors during an informal survey the weekend of Oct. 12-13.

The house, with four to six bedrooms, three fireplaces, a lower-level recreation room with spa and sauna, and a multi-level deck, was the largest in the show. Its price, which includes the lot and landscaping—in excess of \$800,000.

Visitors cited the layout, view of the lake, decks and warmth in spite of size for making it their overwhelming favorite.

Runners-up were the Balmoral, a 5,200-square-foot model built by Robert R. Jones Associates of West Bloomfield, and The Glengarry, a 4,150-square-foot house

constructed by Damascus Development of Rochester.

"We got a lot of comments like, 'You really finish everything off, you really complete the details,'" Jones said. "We got all kinds of comments on the kitchen and family room, how cozy and warm they are."

The trim and floor plan of his house proved to be popular with visitors, said Timothy McDonald, president of Damascus.

"Homearama is an excellent program. It's a good opportunity to show your wares, show people what you're all about," he said.

Jones concurred.

"Sure I want to sell the house, but for me, it's a promotional vehicle," he said.

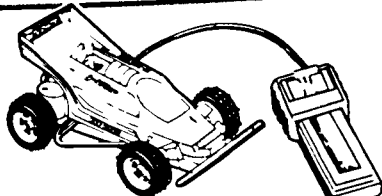

# Northville spec. ed. director honored for taking a stand

Northville schools has prohibited the use of a device that administers electric shocks to a special education student prone to self-injurious behavior in a controversial decision that led the district to court and eventually to a state hearing.

Recently, an international group came out in support of the district and specifically Northville's executive director of special education Leonard Rezmierski.

The district refused to allow a Westland teenager attending Northville's Bryant Center to use a headband that dispenses an 85-volt shock for two-tenths of a second when the head is struck.

The student, Terry Phelan, has a disability that causes him to hit his head as often as 100 times a minute.

Permitting the use of the headgear, called SIBIS (self-injurious behavior inhibiting device) was never considered in Northville, Rezmierski said, because it goes against the policy of the district and possibly the law under the Michigan Corporal Punishment Act.

Northville has until the end of this school year to show that an alternative method of treatment could be successful. Two New York specialists have been working with the district to develop an educational plan for Terry.

Rezmierski will accept an award for the district's intervention in Chicago on Dec. 7 from the Association for Persons with Severe Handicaps or TASH.

He will accept the award by speaking before over 2,000 people, and he has mixed feelings about the honor.

"I'm quite surprised at the whole thing," he said. "I don't mean to make it any bigger than we need to."

The district just stumbled into a controversy, and Rezmierski said, although grateful, he feels a little strange about accepting an award for their decision.

"It's something we've come across on the way to helping kids," he said.

The honor, he said, belongs mainly to Terry Phelan.

"If you want my opinion, the one person who should get the award is Terry," Rezmierski said. "Here's this kid, this human being who is trapped with this problem."

But others also deserve some recognition for their work with Terry, Rezmierski said.

The mother (Susan Phelan) is working her head off to get help for this kid," he said.

"The fact that people are working together, there's the award. I can't

say enough about how fortunate we are to have that staff."

But the bottom line remains the same, Rezmierski is receiving the award, and he is the person who will be speaking to people from around the world about SIBIS and non-aversive behavioral intervention in Northville.

"I'm really wrestling with what I should say on behalf of all of this," he said.

But if nothing else, Rezmierski and the district have gained a wealth of information on the subject during the past year, and that information will be useful for other students and other districts.

"We serve as a repository of information," he said. "That's fine. It's an ability we have."

### Lesson for the holidays: Don't knock tradition

If there is one thing I have learned, never tamper with tradition.

I once met a fellow food writer who always cut her turkey in half before roasting it. Finally, one holiday her husband said, "Why do you do this?" and she replied, "Because that's the way my mother did it." The husband then went to the grandmother and said, "Why do you do this?" and she said, "because my oven was too small."

Hardly a column goes by without some mention of Wyandotte where I grew up, or my momma, and, believe me, when it comes to tradition, you never argue with a woman wearing a babushka and wielding a rolling pin.

Take last Thanksgiving, for instance. Families have been known to revolt at the sight of a strange dish. Marriages have become unglued because one partner preferred oysters in the stuffing.

Last year, I tried to bring some homemade cranberry relish to dinner. Now you have to realize that this batch of cranberry relish was made with two pounds of fresh-picked cranberries culled from a recent trip to Maryland and hand carried on the airplane to avoid smashing. 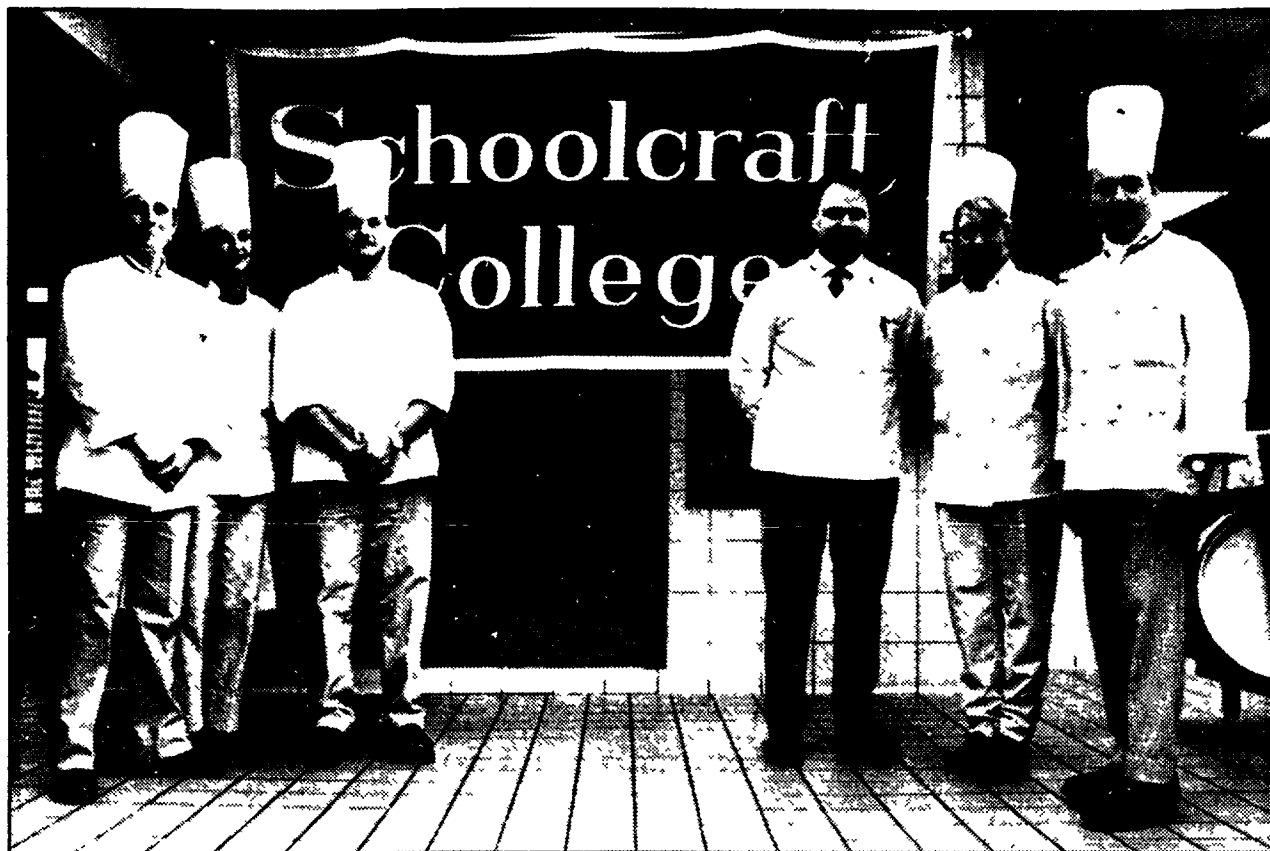
I should have known better. Momma shrieked and almost dropped the Cornish casserole of canned yams baked with marshmallows.

## Proving their medal Students chefs are surprise winners

Where burning the competition means not burning dinner, four students of Schoolcraft College's culinary arts school have something to be proud of.

Competing at the World Cup international cook-off in Luxembourg on Nov. 9-11, the four students raised some eyebrows by bringing home four individual gold medals, as well as a gold medal for their team efforts.

"I honestly didn't expect them to do that well," said Chef Mary Brady, executive chef at Schoolcraft who, along with Chef Jeff Gabriel, acted as team captain. "There were nearly 1,000 people competing in Luxembourg. To come home with four gold medals and a team gold, we were just ecstatic. We couldn't have asked for anything else."

The students — Shawn Loving of Detroit, Don Bargo of Ann Arbor, Pamela Ford of Plymouth and Kim Larson — spent months preparing menus which included hot hors d'oeuvre platters, cold food platters, and five-course meals.

"You start out with a menu," said Ford, "but by the time the competition comes around, it can be something totally different because you're constantly refining. Don had a dessert that started out as a simple tart, and ended up being this beautiful dessert."

Bargo added, "Right now, I'm starting to think of ideas for shows in April."

The competition itself lasts just three days, over which time the students pre-

pare their food, or as Larson called it, "three days and one all-nighter."

Judging is based on many things including appearance, presentation, use of ingredients, compatibility of the menu, flavors, textures, technique and cooking skill. But the area where the Schoolcraft students feel they scored most decisively was creativity.

"The European competitors all had very large pieces, very heavy food," said Larson. "What we concentrated on was food that could have actually been made in an everyday restaurant. It was simple but spectacular."

In competition, food is elevated to the level of artwork, and like artists, the students made use of color to make an impression.

"The colors really stood out when you looked at our dishes next to the others," said Bargo. "The Germans and Europeans had a lot of browns and tans, and then ours just jumped out at you."

Things got hectic as the end of the competition neared, and there was all the pressure of a one-run baseball game.

"There was a bunch of yelling, screaming, laughing and crying," said Brady. But

she said dedication and a strong team ethic helped the group pull together.

"They got some great support from everyone, from the school," Brady said. "They were a very strong team. Everyone helped everyone else, and that was a real kick to see."

"You need people that are extremely dedicated. And if it wasn't for the support of the spouses, it wouldn't have happened. Of course they also had to have the talent to begin with."

The competition was more than just a means for some chest-thumping by the students, however. Experiencing Europe was a learning experience as well.

"It was a different culture and different food," said Larson. "The grocery stores over there were incredible. Nothing like we have here. I could have spent days there. One store had 10 varieties of wild mushrooms."

The students were in general agreement that American grocery markets paled in comparison to their European counterparts, for both quality and variety.

"They have higher standards, and they're just more aware of their food," said Bargo.

Said Ford, "You could go into a candy store, and the counters were made of mahogany — not just in one of them, but all of them."

Understanding the European appreciation for food was something the students could bring back with them, and keep with them throughout their culinary careers.

"You come back, and your ideas are refreshed," Bargo said. "You want to take your time more with your own food. It just changes your attitude towards cooking."

### Calif. Meritage blends grapes from Bordeaux

Meritage (rhymes with heritage) is the name adopted for California proprietary wines styled in the Bordeaux image. These wines are always in the super-premium category but may not be labeled with a varietal name since they contain less than 75 percent of a single grape variety.

Meritage wines must be blended entirely from Bordeaux grape varieties. For red wines, this includes cabernet sauvignon, cabernet franc, merlot, malbec, and petit verdot. For white wines, the blend is limited to sauvignon blanc, semillon and muscadelle.

Until 1978, the best California cabernet sauvignons were made entirely from cabernet sauvignon grapes and most California wineries followed this model.

Winemakers generally agree that, of the Bordeaux varieties grown in California, cabernet sauvignon is most complex in aroma and flavor. It is the slowest to develop and provides the structure which holds the other elements together.

Merlot broadens the palate impression of cabernet sauvignon while contributing a fleshier, more expansive mouthfeel and a subtle perfume of strawberries and raspberries.

Cabernet franc has an aroma that emphasizes the cherry and bell pepper character of cabernet sauvignon. Malbec highlights the wine's fruit intensity with raspberry flavors reminiscent of zinfandel.

One of the leaders in the effort to produce proprietary Bordeaux-style wine is Lyeth Vineyards.

Lyeth blends grape varieties and vineyard characteristics to build a wine that has both concentration and richness. "For my palate, 100 percent varietal cabernet sauvignon is frequently too aggressive," according to winemaker Bill Arbios.

On average, Lyeth Red is 75 percent cabernet sauvignon, 20 percent merlot, and 5 percent cabernet franc and malbec.

Merlot from Alexander Valley contributes herbaceous, raspberry, plummy fruit aromas and flavors, along with richness and body. Cabernet franc is delicate and light with berry character that is often spicy and black peppery. Malbec provides depth of color, berry-like aromas and black raspberry and peppery flavors.

"We're looking for a complex, harmonious, balanced, rich, soft and approachable wine with no single component sticking out," Arbios says. "Cabernet sauvignon gives the wine structure. It has muted bell pepper qualities with plums, currants and varietal spiciness in the eucalyptus, mint end of the spectrum."

"The other three varieties flesh out the wine and give it complexities. Merlot shows green olives and cassis. Cabernet franc highlights strawberries and general fruitiness while malbec is chewy and spicy."

Arbios' goal with Lyeth White is to pattern it after the great white Bordeaux, La Vieille Haut Brion. Principally a blend of sauvignon blanc and semillon, the proportions vary from vintage to vintage depending on the ripeness of sauvignon blanc.

Semillon adds a rich fig-like character to the wine that is particularly important in years when the sauvignon blanc is lean and crisp.

### In pursuit of the perfect pie

Pies are defined as any filling, sweet or savory, contained in a crust. Quiche, tarts, flans, "pasties" and calzones all fall into the pie category.

Pie making can be traced back to the Golden Age of Greece and recipes have been passed on for centuries with each generation adapting the ingredients and methods to fill their specific needs. The word "pie" is actually traced back to the magpie, a black and white crow, which was a popular filling in past times.

Pie recipes were brought to the new world by British settlers and the early pioneers developed endless varieties of pies using the ingredients of their new land. Pies were easy to prepare, economical and thus a mainstay of daily life.

Pies are mistakenly believed to be very fattening and unnutritional. In truth, it's all in the filling and crust. There are many ways of cutting calories and still being able to serve a delicious pie.

Use vegetable fats when possible and keep to a minimum. Reduce sugar proportions by taking advantage of the natural sweetness of fruits and

vegetables. Use sugars that contain some nutrients and minerals such as honey, maple sugar and molasses. Avoid using prepared foods with additives whenever possible.

Grains, cereals, dried beans, peas, and lentils are economical and can be used in fillings and crusts — not to mention their high protein and fiber content. Small amounts of nuts can be incorporated for flavor and texture. Use defatted meats and poultry and fresh fish to keep cholesterol amounts down.

Basic pastry preparation by hand starts with sifting the dry ingredients together into a large bowl. Cut in the cold fats with a pastry blender, two knives or a fork until the dough is in the size of small peas and is crumbly.

Drizzle ice water over the mixture one tablespoon at a time until sticky holds together but is not doughy. Shape into a smooth ball, wrap in plastic and refrigerate 30 minutes before proceeding.

If you are using a food processor, sift the flours into the food processor bowl and pulse on and off for three seconds to aerate. Cut chilled fats

into 1-inch cubes and add to work bowl. Pulse on and off until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. With machine running add ice water slowly until dough pulls away from sides of bowl. Shape into a smooth ball, cover with plastic and refrigerate for 30 minutes before rolling.

Some simple variations include mixing grated orange or lemon, wheat germ, bran, finely chopped fresh herbs or cheeses into the flour; use cream cheese instead of a fat; replace ice water with egg or egg yolk, buttermilk or liqueurs. To roll the pastry, place the dough onto a lightly floured surface, form into a ball and flatten.

Sprinkle pastry and rolling pin with flour and roll from the center outward using light even strokes. Lift the pastry and turn it over, repeating the process. Continue until the pastry is 1/8-inch thick and 2 inches larger than the container.

Roll the pastry onto your rolling pin and place in the center of the pan. Unroll it to cover the pan, pat into place and trim any overhangs of more than 1/4-inch. Flute edges with fin-

gers or fork. Chill before cooking to reduce shrinkage. To avoid soggy crusts brush with egg white and bake at 475 for a few minutes until egg white sets or brush with butter or olive oil before filling.

Use cold utensils, hands and bowls and touch the dough as little as possible. Buttering or oiling pie pans will help the crusts to brown. Do not omit salt from recipes as it acts as a browning agent, strengthens the gluten in the flour and adds flavor.

Some equipment that is necessary for making pastry includes measuring cups and spoons, a sifter, mixing bowls, wooden spoons, electric mixer, pastry brushes, pastry wheel, pie pans, heavy rolling pin and a hard, non-porous work area (marble slab) for rolling pastry. A food processor is a nice addition to any kitchen but not a necessity.

Fillings are limited only by the imagination of the cook. I have included several ideas to get you started. Pies freeze well, are easy to prepare and can be nutritional. They are a nice alternative for dinners and individual sizes are fun to pack for lunch.

#### WHOLE WHEAT PIE CRUST

##### SINGLE CRUST

1 cup whole wheat flour  
3/4 cup all-purpose flour  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1/2 tsp. baking powder  
1/2 cup solid vegetable shortening  
1/2 cup unsalted butter  
2-3 tbsp ice water

##### DOUBLE CRUST

1 1/2 cups  
3/4 cup  
3/4 tsp  
1/2 tsp  
3/4 cup  
3/4 cup  
3-5 tbsp

Sift dry ingredients into bowl. Cut in cold fats until dough resembles peas. Add ice water until dough holds together but is not sticky. Form into a ball and cover with plastic wrap. Refrigerate 30 minutes before rolling.

#### CRAB QUICHE WITH HERB CRUST

Prepare single crust recipe above and add two tbsp of chopped fresh basil and dill

##### Filling:

1 tbsp. unsalted butter or olive oil  
1/2 cup chopped scallions  
2 6 oz. cans crab meat, drained  
2 tbsp dried herbs  
1 tbsp tomato paste  
1/2 cup milk  
1/2 cup light cream  
3 eggs  
1 avocado, mashed  
salt and pepper to taste  
5 ounces grated swiss cheese  
1 small yellow squash or zucchini sliced thin  
1 tbsp toasted sesame seed

Saute scallions in butter or oil until tender. Add crab meat and season with salt and pepper. Mix remaining ingredients in a small bowl and add cooled crab meat mixture. Assemble. Preheat oven to 400. Roll out pastry dough to fit a 10-inch quiche pan or 8-by-8-by-2 baking pan. Sprinkle 1 cup of the grated swiss cheese in the crust. Pour filling over the cheese. Decorate with squash or zucchini, sprinkle with remaining cheese and sesame seeds. Bake at 400 for 10 minutes then reduce heat to 350 and bake until filling is set, about 20-25 minutes.

# Biweekly plan draws interest

The article published on Oct. 22 in this column by guest writer Jay L. Smith has had an enthusiastic response. Smith, who is a member of the board of the Institute of Certified Financial Planners, demonstrated how bi-weekly payments on your mortgage (rather than monthly ones) could save you extraordinary amounts of money.

It's a very simple principle that takes advantage of the number of two-week periods in the calendar year, allowing you to pay off your mortgage more quickly — up to 10 years early.

The process is handled by ABC Bank (not the real name of the bank). The result is a huge savings in total amount paid.

To date, almost 200 requests have been received, and these requests are continuing. Everyone who has asked has been mailed the information he requested. In addition, those who indicated that they needed additional help have been referred to a toll-free telephone number published by the institute.

Today I will answer several questions that have been raised by my readers.

**Why do I need the ABC Bank. Can't I pay bi-weekly mortgages myself?**

You certainly can, but there are several problems.

■ Most banks and mortgage companies won't allow you to modify the existing terms of your contract, so you may have to refinance it, generating additional costs.

■ Making bi-weekly payments on time is a painstaking chore. Besides, it loses most of its value if you are unable to invest the balance satisfactorily.

■ If you are unable to keep up with a self-generated program for financial reasons, your long-term interests may be jeopardized.

**Why did you ask for the mortgage data?**

My original intention was to analyze the data and advise you if the program will work for you. Unfortunately, the volume of responses made it impossible for me to keep up with the analysis.

# How To Decorate Your

## The Christmas Tree, Its Tradition Continues.

Create a magnificent Christmas tree. With a theme that expresses yourself and your family's traditions. One which will inspire your family and friends.

For example, you can create a tree with your old family treasures and heirlooms. Or a designer tree like those you've seen in national magazines. You can make an elegant tree. A tree for children. A heritage tree.

And you can start by following the principles outlined in this brochure. Principles of tree trimming which have stood the test of time. Because they follow basic concepts of design and form.

After you have mastered the basics, let your imagination do the rest.

The result . . . a Christmas tree you'll be proud to display in your home. One which will continue your Christmas tradition.



## Themes

Trimming your tree is an expression of your creativity.

Many of us decorate our trees with family treasures. Sometimes we decorate with things our children made, or gifts from friends and loved ones.

Others use a tree to tell a story, such as The Night Before Christmas, Santa's Workshop, Rudolph and his friends or Dickens' Christmas Carol.

Sometimes a tree is designed to harmonize with room decor, such as Early American, Country or Victorian.

An Early American look can be created with popcorn, cranberry garland and apples. Calico, polka dots and gingham fabrics in dramatic contrasting colors create a country look.



## Types of Christmas Trees

There are two basic types of artificial Christmas trees. They're characterized by the sweep and the shape of their branches.

Upswept trees, such as the scotch pine, have branch tips which point upward. Out-swept trees, such as the balsam, have branches which point out parallel to the floor, curving slightly upward at the end. These two types are available in various shapes and sizes.

Types of artificial tree construction include those with stick-in branches or fold-away construction, in which branches are hinged to the trunk and fold open for use. The Mountain King™ is a fast-assembly tree whose branches are preassembled into panels that hook onto the tree trunk.

If you prefer a live or cut tree, choose one with full, evenly shaped branches. Be sure to check for dryness by snapping a twig. It could be flammable.

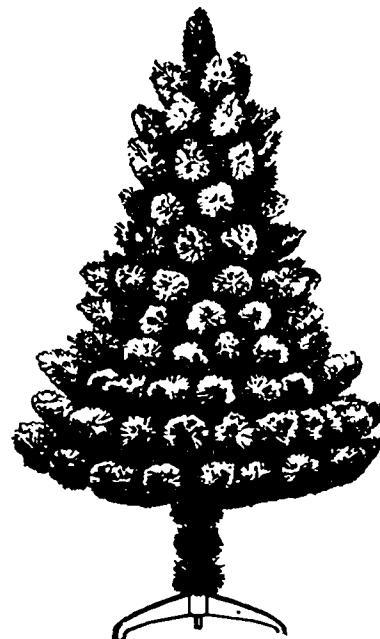
When you're ready to decorate, consult the following chart to help you in your planning.

After assembling your Christmas tree according to the instructions which come in the carton, you must shape it to make sure it looks its best.

Shaping is done by moving the branches up or down or sideways. The idea is to have even rows of branches, keeping to a minimum the space between the branches.

The branch tips should be spaced evenly from side to side. And don't worry, you won't hurt the branches by bending them. Start at the top of the tree and work your way down. Step back and occasionally look at the tree. Readjust the branches that are out of place.



An elegant look can be achieved with white satin balls, mirrored ornaments, gold and silver glass. Clear crystal ornaments also create a sophisticated effect. Create a theme to delight children with teddy bears, old fashioned toys, candy and cookies.

To give your tree a natural look, use fruits, nuts, pine cones and birds. Then there are heritage trees that reflect family origins.

A Scandinavian effect can be made with straw, wood ornaments and yarn. A Bavarian-style tree could be decorated with candles, hand-blown glass, old tin figures and St. Nicholas ornaments. Oriental themes are reflected in paper fans, parasols, lanterns and origami animals.

Religious themes can be made with cherubs, animals, nativity figures and ornaments with religious scenes.

Remember, virtually anything can be used to decorate a Christmas tree. Merry Christmas!



## Lighting

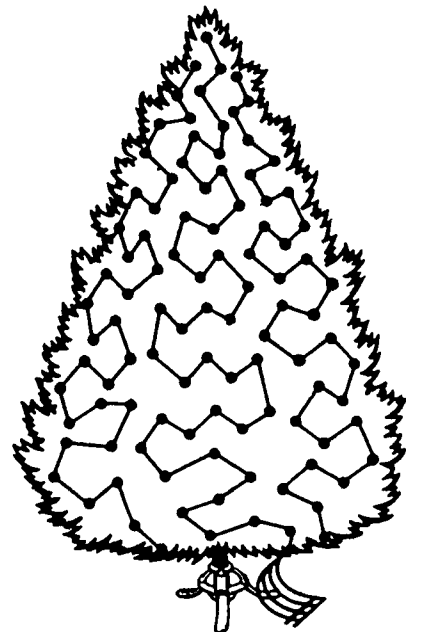
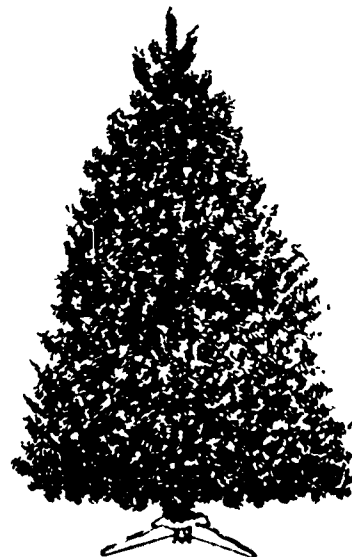
When selecting lights, choose the color (or colors) which coordinate best with your decorations. Miniature light sets are recommended for use on artificial trees.

Always light the tree before adding ornaments. Use the same style of lights to give uniformity. Work with the bulbs lit to judge their placement and effect.

Start with the first bulb at the top of the tree. Wind it around the top branch, then work your way downward.

Zig-zag from side to side, from branch to branch. At the same time, zig-zag in and out, lighting the inside as well as the outside to give more depth to your tree.

Hide the light cords by winding them around the branches and nestling them in the needles. Do not hang the bulbs in mid-air between the branches. The more lights you use, the better and brighter your tree will look.

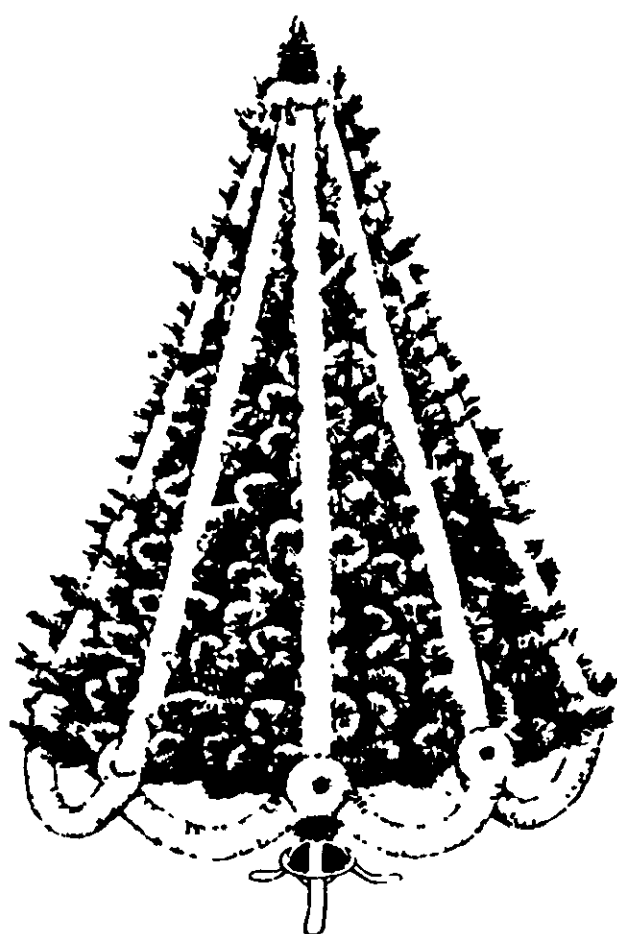

Swagging garland creates a framework to highlight and offset decorations. It also adds symmetry to the tree.

Start at the bottom of the tree and twist the garland around a branch tip. Swag gracefully from branch to branch. Usually the swag should be 12 to 18 inches wide, depending upon the width of the tree.

Continue around the tree. When you reach your starting point, secure and cut the garland.

On the next row, make sure that the peaks of your new swag are centered directly and uniformly over the valleys of the previous row. They shouldn't touch the top of the row beneath. The swags should be smaller as you go up the tree. Depending on the size of your tree, you will have five to seven rows of garland going around it.



Another idea for placing garland is a vertical technique in which garland is hung vertically from the top of the tree to the bottom. Only the bottom row is swagged horizontally.

Still another look is achieved by attaching two or three pieces of garland to the top of the tree. Spiral garland down around the tree.

Other effects can be made by twisting two strands of different colored garland together, creating a two-toned effect.

This two-toned effect can be used in a horizontal, vertical or spiral fashion.

Be sure the spaces between the garland are equal to create a consistent pattern.



## Trimming

Trimming is more effective when you follow an organized plan. One easy method is to start with the peaks created by the garland as a focal point.

Hang glass, bows, ribbons or other kinds of ornaments on the peaks. This will organize the tree and provide symmetry.

Reflective glass ornaments, hung inside the tree as well as on the branch tips, add dimension. Distribute each type of decoration evenly throughout the tree.

A tree-top ornament, usually a dominant feature, is then added. The base of the tree is enhanced by a tree skirt covering the tree stand.

A striking look can also be achieved by placing the tree stand in a wood barrel or a container that harmonizes with your theme.



## Christmas trees can cause fires

Unless treated with fire-retardant material, fresh-cut Christmas trees can dry out rapidly and pose a serious fire hazard.

The Michigan Association of Insurance Companies (MAIC) is urging special safety precautions for the coming holiday season.

MAIC president Terry Buckles urges homeowners to keep all decorations well away from fireplaces, wood stoves and heat registers. He also suggests sawing at least one inch off the trunk bottom to speed water absorption before setting up the tree.

In the 1979 holiday season, state police fire marshals officers reported 18 Christmas tree fires and 21 related incidents with a total property loss of nearly \$315,000, Buckles said.

Last year, he said those figures dropped to 14 such incidents and property losses of less than \$50,000. Buckles also suggested the following fire-pre-

ventative measures:

- Use only appropriately marked indoor and outdoor light sets bearing an approval label of a reliable testing laboratory. Inspect the lights prior to installation and replace any that are damaged.

- Use only flame-retardant or non-combustible decorations. Untreated cotton batting, tissue paper and some foamed plastics can invite fires.

- Put gift wrappings in a closed container as the gifts are opened instead of in fireplaces. A fireplace "bonfire" can cause a dangerous burst of flame and heat.

- Use extreme care in decorating with live candles. They can start a fire in seconds.

For holiday gifts, Buckles suggested fire alarms and extinguishers.

MAIC is a non-profit public affairs organization representing 46 property-casualty insurers.

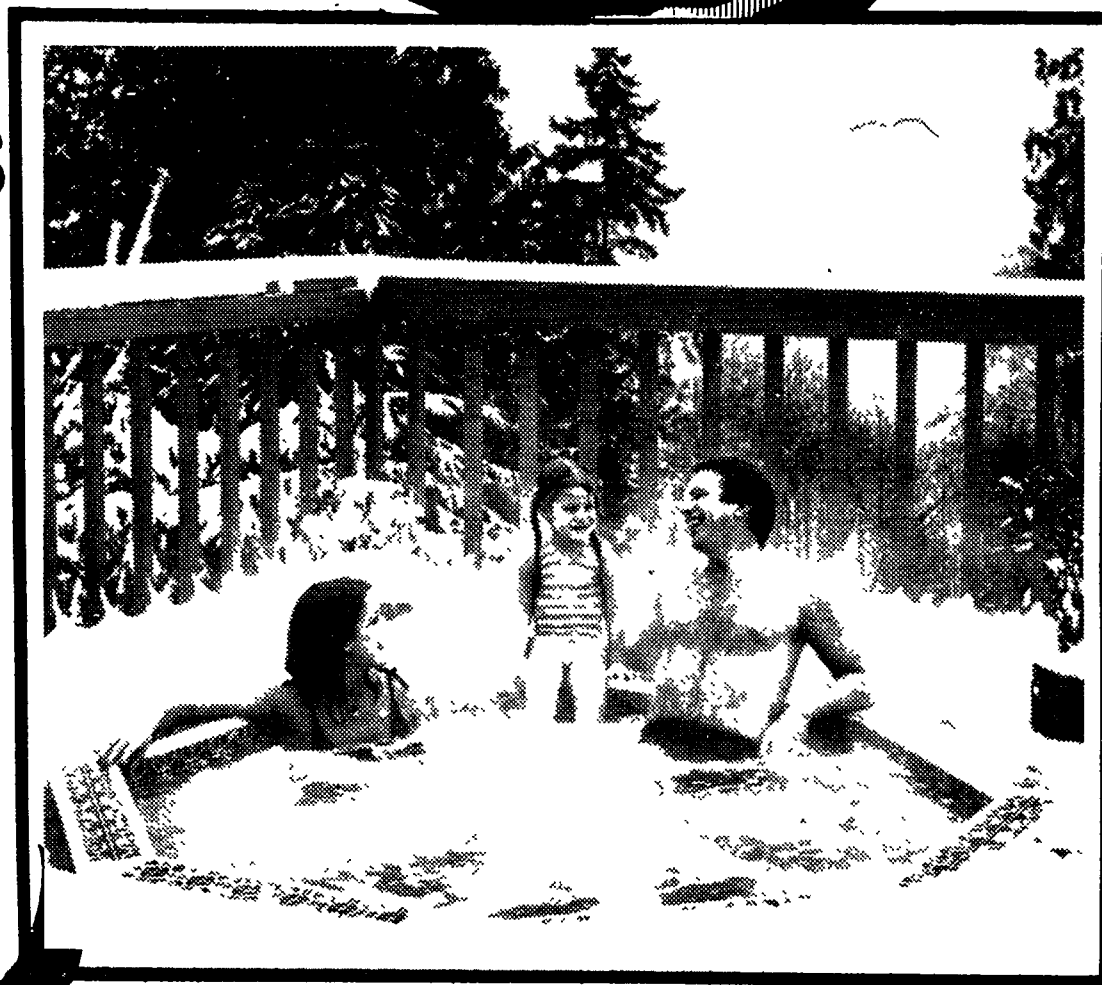

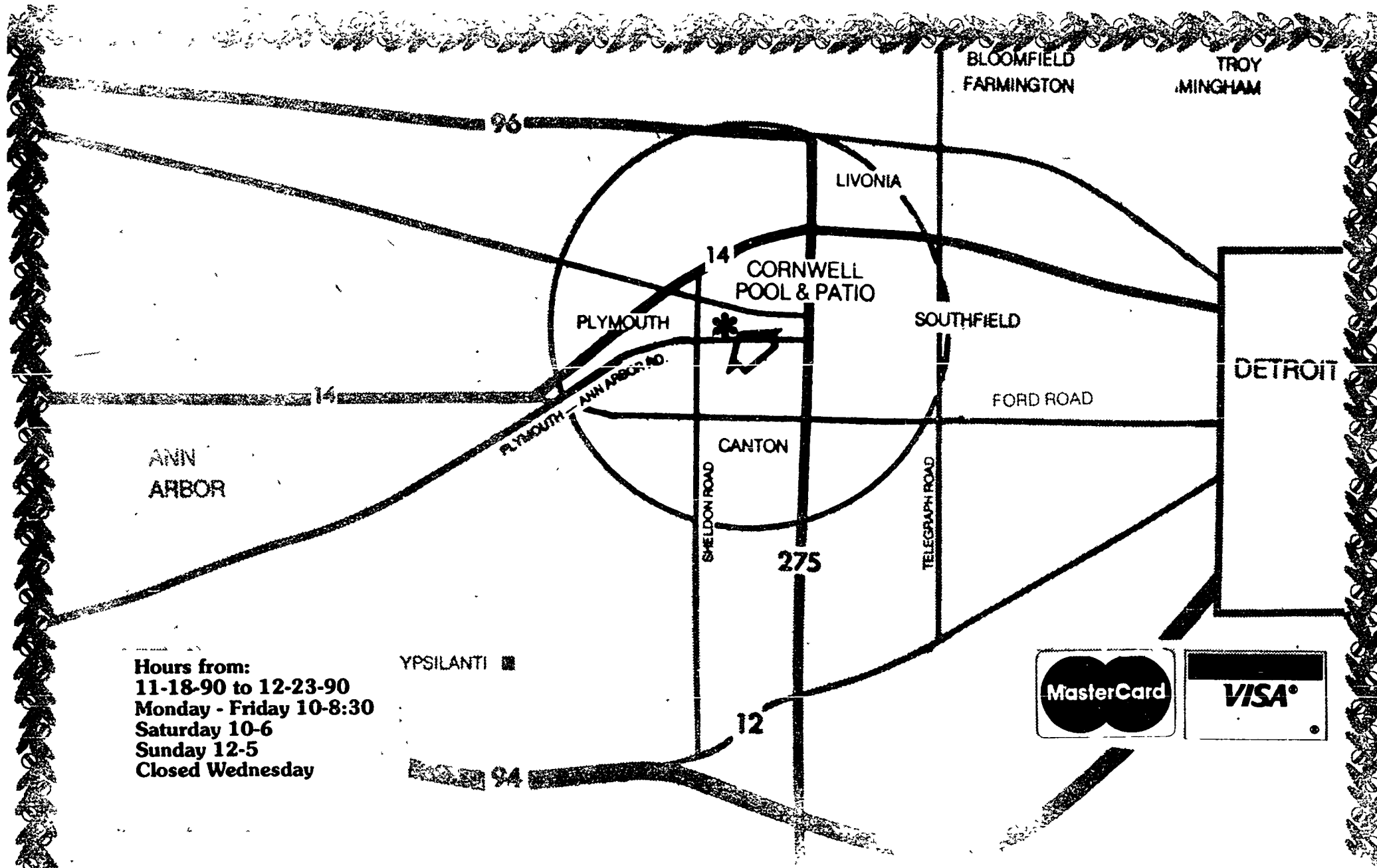

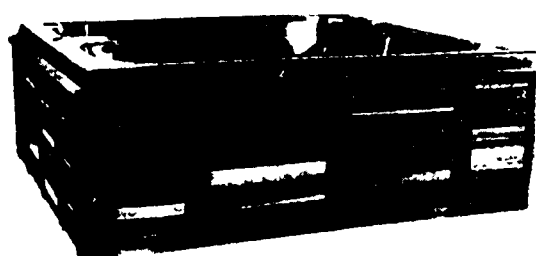

# Kate Jackson portrays emotionally numb woman

## Rick Schroder plays long-lost son who returns

Mare Blackburn, a Vietnam War widow, was shopping in a rural Minnesota grocery store and was distracted for only a few minutes. During those crucial moments her 3-year-old son was kidnapped.

Sixteen years later on Halloween night, a 19-year-old stranger knocks on Blackburn's door — claiming to be her son.

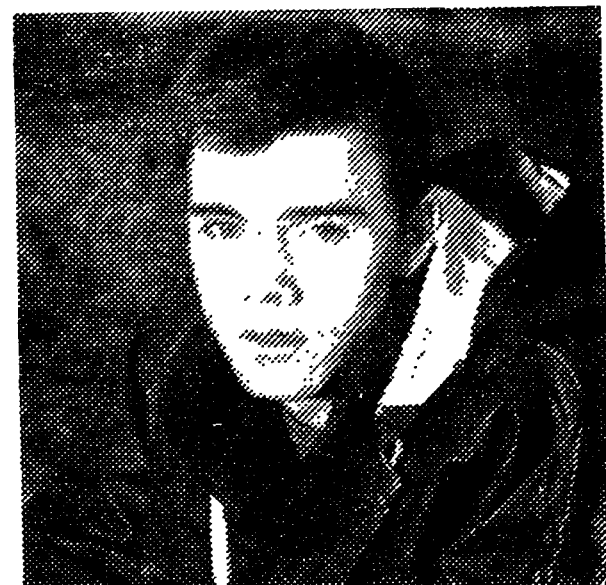
So begins the plot of the CBS thriller *A Stranger Within*, airing Tuesday, Nov. 27, on CBS. The movie stars Kate Jackson as Blackburn, Chis Sarandon as Dan Vance, Blackburn's boyfriend, and Rick (don't call him Ricky) Schroder as Blackburn's son.

"I think the movie is going to be pretty scary," commented Jackson in a recent interview. "It was written by John Pilmeier, who wrote *Agnes of God*. He (Pilmeier) is such a magnetic presence and he's a wonderful writer. He was on the set, and when you got

finished with a scene you would look, wherever he was in the room, to see if he approved. Tom Holland (*Fright Night*, *Psycho II*) directed and he is also very talented.

"We filmed on location in Minnesota about 40 miles from Minneapolis," Jackson continued. "My character is a woman who feels you just don't get second chances in life. She has pretty much shut down emotionally. She was married to a man who was killed in Vietnam, and then her son was kidnapped. I think at that point she decided it is better to just not feel anything rather than get hurt."

In the flashback scene in the beginning, the makeup artist had to make Jackson look like a 22-year-old. The beautiful actress joked about the fact that 15 years ago she would have been working on *Charlie's Angels* and it all seemed kind of weird. "There were some days when I was so tired there was no way they were going to make me look younger. I think they probably shot the whole thing through a bunch of gauze or maybe a Navajo blanket to

make it work."

The filming was a positive experience for the actress, although the conditions were a little frigid, and it was a very physical film. "It wasn't the easiest possible movie to do. It was a tough schedule and we worked through the night a few times. But I think the hard work is going to pay off. Rick has grown into a very solid actor. Chris is just wonderful. He never has a false moment," said Jackson.

She strolled into my office the first summer that we were developing the concept of Community Television in 1983. Sharon McDonald was just returning from a tennis match and decided to follow up on an article she had read in the Observer. "Just what is this opportunity involving television?" she asked. Having a teaching background with a blend of Journalism and Television, Sharon's curiosity had been aroused. You could feel the energy and enthusiasm in the room. As usual when the opportunity came to talk about my favorite subject, I had many ideas. One of the special privileges of my position is the ability to help people turn their ideas into real results through television. Sharon and I definitely had ideas!

Since she was teaching she agreed to join up with a team of folks and share in the production of a News Show which we entitled 'Community Upbeat'. There are many times throughout the three hour evening that our minds will tune into the same idea and the entire class will join in on a lively discussion.

What we are witnessing is a real success story. Community Television has received a great deal of acclaim. Community Television reaches out and explores new ideas which will en-

hance the industry. A person with Sharon McDonald's wisdom, intelligence, and personality is always in demand. One indeed does become a goal-oriented professional with excellent communication, organizational and leadership talents.

# 'Decoration Day' explores military racism in WWII

## Veterans James Garner and Bill Cobbs co-star

Why would anyone turn down the Congressional Medal of Honor? That is the subject of "Decoration Day," a Hallmark Hall of Fame movie airing Sunday, Dec. 2, on NBC. "Decoration Day" is based on the novella by John William Corrington.

Judge Albert Sidney Finch is a lonely widower existing in a gloomy retirement. His only contact with the world is through his irascible but loyal housekeeper Rowena.

James Garner ("The Rockford Files") stars with Bill Cobbs ("Rage of Angels"), Judith Ivey ("Down Home"), Ruby Dee ("Do the Right Thing") and Larry Fishburne ("Cotton Club") in this human-interest story set in 1975 Georgia.

Judge Finch (Garner) is jolted out of his languor when he is asked to champion the cause of a former boyhood friend, Gee Peniwell (Cobbs), a black World War II veteran. On a point of principle, Peniwell has refused to accept the Congressional Medal of Honor.

Why? In a recent interview, Judith Ivey, who plays the woman who helps the judge begin his life anew,

wouldn't give that away: "It's part of the mystery of the piece which is unwoven by James Garner," she said enigmatically. She did tell us this: "Ultimately it's dealing with the racism that he felt existed at the time while he was in battle."

It is interesting to note that both Garner and Cobbs are military veterans, and Cobbs' father fought in World War II. "I had very strange feelings as a boy," said Cobbs, "seeing my father in the service, and then seeing him as a second-class citizen." A native of Cleveland, Ohio, Cobbs recalls, as a boy, visiting his father at Orlando Air Base, in Florida and hopping up onto a counter seat at a local drugstore. "I found out that I had no right to sit in that chair, that we had to go to the back of the drugstore and wait until everyone else had been taken care of."

Garner also recalls racial discrimination within the Army when he was in Korea. "The Army was still basically segregated. I remember there was a black unit of 14 soldiers, and nobody knew what to do with them."

"Their unit was too small to really stand alone, and nobody else wanted them in their section," said Garner. "When I heard about it, I said, 'My God, give them to me. They can join my section.' And you know what, after that I had the best section of all."

The passing of friendships is also an issue in this film. "I think it's awfully important to try to maintain relationships with people you know and like," said Garner. "In the story, Albert Sidney has let about 30 years pass without talking to his closest childhood friend, a black guy named Gee. I guess everybody lets that happen, but it's a real shame."

If there is one thought that Garner says he would like audiences to take away from "Decoration Day," it is that people should never give up on life. "Here's Albert Sidney, his wife's gone and died on him, he's quit his job, he's bored out of his mind, he's feeling terribly sorry for himself. And then he's presented with a challenge and he starts living again. He even falls in love, for heaven's sakes," said Garner. "You know, it doesn't matter what curves life throws us, it's not over 'til its over. This story is all about hanging in there, and picking up the pieces, and moving on."

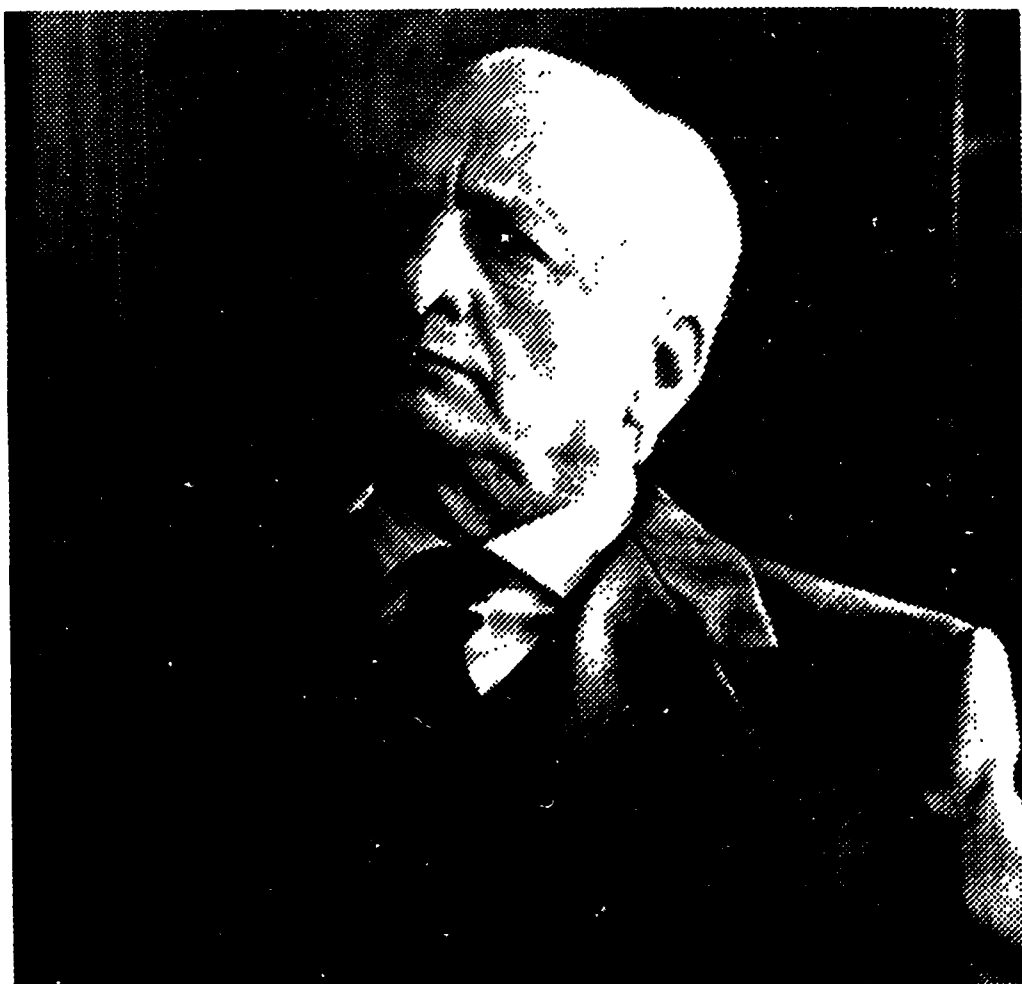

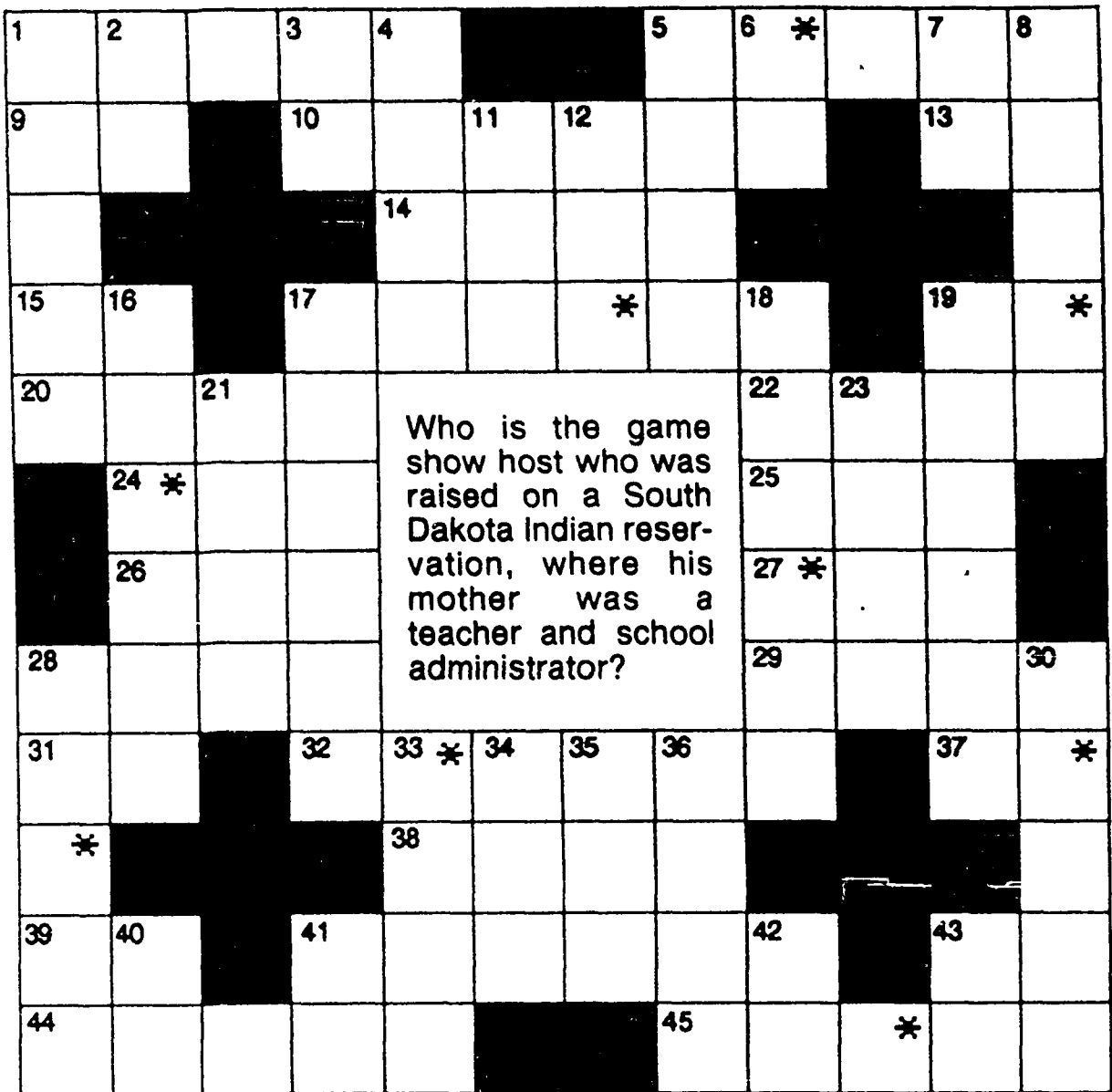
I also can't stand what they are doing with little Carrie. She is a good girl and they shouldn't make her bad.

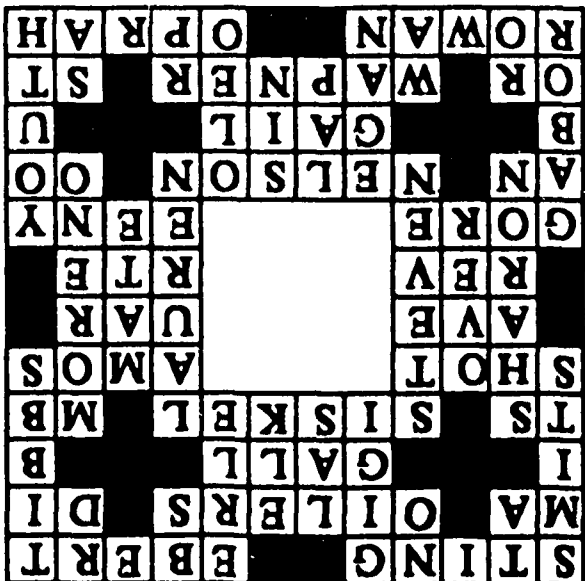

**A:** Charles Farrell died on May 6, 1990, at his home in Palm Springs, Calif. He was 82 years old.


