Campbell sworn in to open local court

Patricia Campbell had her day in court Thursday, as she was sworn in as the first judge of Northville's new Probate Court.

Campbell was sworn in by Wayne County Probate Court Chief Judge Freddie G. Burton Jr. in the courtroom that she soon will preside over at Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital. The new court will actually be part of the Wayne County Probate Court, headquartered in Detroit.

Burton took the opportunity to thank the people instrumental in making the courtroom a reality, including Sallie Dimwiddle, director of the county probate court's mental division, and Steve Thomas of the state Department of Mental Health.

"We have an opportunity to show you how cooperative government works," Burton said. "In fact, I've never seen so many governmental units get together and unanimously agree that this is something that needs to be done."

The new probate court, which has

been in the planing stages for more than five years, will handle mental competency hearings and alleviate the need to transport psychiatric patients into downtown Detroit for the hearings.

Outgoing DMH Director Thomas Watkins said the new court symbolizes greater sensitivity toward the needs of psychiatric patients. "This is more than just a courtroom," he said. "It's an opportunity for people to be treated with dignity and respect."

Cold, drink cause trouble

An evening frolic at a local toboggan run turned into dangerous sledding last week for a 22-year-old Livonia man apparently influenced by too much holiday cheer.

Northville Township emergency workers found the man "semi-conscious" at the top of a hill at Cass Benton Parkway approximately 9:30 p.m. Dec. 26. The man was suffering from a combination of alcohol ingestion and the effects of extreme cold weather, paramedics said.

Friends of the man told paramedics the victim passed out at the bottom of a hill approximately 100 yards east of Sheldon Road and south of Seven Mile. The man was moved to the

top of the hill where he lay for almost an hour, according to reports.

Rescue workers loaded and strapped the man to a toboggan for a trip back down the hill. Rescuers then wrapped him in an environmental kit — a foil-lined rescue blanket that traps body heat — and transported him to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia.

The man was held for observation and released the following day, emergency workers said.

Brutal cold weather and alcohol are a dangerous mix, according to township paramedic Guy Balok.

"It was five degrees when we went out there and he had consumed a lot of alcohol," Balok said. "He was near a crisis situation."

Balok said the man was not suffer-

ing from hypothermia — a significant loss of body heat — but he was "past the shivering state."

"The potential was there for hypothermia and frostbite," he said.

Alcohol use in extremely cold weather can trick the body and open the door to serious problems, Balok said.

"Because of the alcohol consumption, he was not aware he was cold," he said. "He was already in an altered state of consciousness and that's where the body starts to shut off blood to the extremities."

The message to winter wonderland lovers is clear, Balok said.

"Dressing for the weather to go out tobogganing is one thing, but mixing in alcohol can be very dangerous," he said.



Process helps kids write right

Northville students are publishing their writing and improving the appearance of their work thanks to a new IBM computer system in Northville schools this year.

And although student interest in writing may be declining, some Northville students may be writing better, according to a survey and California Achievement Test results taken at Winchester Elementary School at the end of the 1989-90 school year.

The \$3-million telecommunications system was financed by an October 1989 bond issue.

The new computers combined with the "process writing" method of teaching writing skills have Northville students publishing work in formats as detailed as illustrated newsletters. Process writing teaches students to take specific steps or follow an established process when writing a story or essay, hence the name process writing.

"There's a whole process you have to go through, that's why it's called process writing," Winchester teacher Sue Keen said.

Winchester Elementary School students get an extra dose of process writing because school officials chose improved writing as a goal for the school under the district's Strategic Planning Initiative for district-wide improvements in education.

The goal was set in 1988. A survey

of students' achievements and attitudes in writing was taken during the 1989-90 school year along with the California Achievement Test.

The survey shows a decline in students' interest in writing, Winchester Principal Kathy Morhous said.

"We're not real happy with the test results," Morhous said. But she said she believes the test may have raised more questions than it answered, as the school's first attempt to measure an effective goal like increasing student interest in writing.

"We're real enthusiastic because we think kids are doing more writing than they have ever done before," Morhous said.

If students are writing more, then they may have become better critics of their own writing, which could account for their decreased interest in writing as shown by the survey, Morhous said.

California Achievement Test results for 1989-90 showed improvement in language expression by an average of nearly 3 percent. The test showed an average increase of 9.15 percent in language mechanics.

The "process" of writing Northville

students use to complete their work begins with brainstorming ideas. Students do a rough draft or "sloppy copy." They hold "conferences" with their friends and teachers to get ideas for improving their story. The final step requires the students to type their stories into a computer.

The computers make further revisions easy because stories are saved on a disk, Morhous said. Editing requires only a few key strokes, rather than rewriting the entire story by hand.

"They're more willing to do drastic editing," Morhous said.

Students are taught to put their hands on the computer's keyboard, and do their best from there, she said.

"Some do quite well," Morhous said. "Especially if they have computers at home."

Writing on the computer is a big advantage for Winchester fourth-grader Justin Dilly, who said he likes writing class more now that some of it is done on the computers.

"I like writing on the computer," Dilly said. "I'm not very good at writing by hand."

Student Kathryn Giebel, whose longest story was four handwritten pages, does not mind writing by hand. Giebel was unable to work on the computer recently because the disk was getting full, and she was working on another long story.

"My mom says I should be a writer because I write long stories," she said.

The students put their work in a binder. The folders are available for perusal by other students in the class.

"(The binders) are the hottest thing in the reading center," Keen said. Fourth-graders Ron Pollicchio, Matt Ryder and Brian Thompson worked together on a folder about the holidays.

The combined effort resulted in poems and pictures about Hanukkah and Christmas, including a limerick about a reindeer.

"There once was a reindeer named Sam, who wouldn't eat anything but jam. He lost his spoon, and ran into the moon. And Santa never saw him again," the three boys wrote while waxing poetic one day.

Gavin Walsh likes to add drawings to his stories, which are usually about war and violence, he said. He does not like using the computers, Walsh said, but is glad to be learning the skill in case he ever needs it for a job.

The success or lack of success of the interaction between computers and process writing will be tested again during the next school year, Morhous said.

State may consider 200-day school year

Michigan students might be in school 200 days a year under a proposal by the state superintendent of public instruction.

"Drill and practice do make a difference. Drill and practice do make a difference," said Donald L. Bemis, who heads the state Department of Education.

For a generation, the state has required 180 days of class a year. In earlier years, Bemis said, some districts offered 190 days or more. But the 180-days law had the effect of making that the maximum.

Bemis, in a year-end interview, billed his 200-days proposal as a method of making Michigan competitive in an international economy.

Japanese students have 243 days in a school year; South Korean, 220; Israeli, 215; Scots, 200.

Michigan ranks with Mexico and Sweden in requiring only 180 days.

"It's the way we have to go," agreed Dorothy Beardmore, a Republican member of the state Board of Education from Rochester. "It may not be 200 class days; there may be some staff development time."

A spokesperson for the Michigan State Chamber of Commerce, a supporter of quality improvements in public schools, said that business group was not inclined to support the idea at this point.

A longer school year would cost more money, and Bemis has a way to finance it.

"We could do it five days at a time over four years," he said.

"We've been increasing K-12 school funding 7 percent a year. We would allow 4 percent for inflation. That leaves 3 percent. With 3 percent, we could fund five more days a year."

Under his plan, the state would provide monetary incentives to schools willing to extend the length of the school year.

Bemis' figures make two unspoken assumptions: Inflation would be held to 4 percent, and school employees would accept pay increases limited to the rate of inflation.

In recent years, the annual increase in the consumer price index has been 4 to 6-plus percent.

Bemis launched his idea in an Oct. 5 speech in Flint on the "state of education" and at first got little attention.

His 200-days proposal was added at the last minute and wasn't in the original speech text. A departmental news release buried the idea in the 13th paragraph. There has been virtually no public discussion of it since then. Neither Democratic Gov. James Blanchard nor John Engler, his successful Republican challenger, discussed it.

A former superintendent of Utica public schools, Bemis was appointed to the state post in January of 1988 with support from Blanchard.

In mid-1990 Republicans on the State Board of Education tried to give him an unsatisfactory performance evaluation. But with a 4-4 partisan split, the board was unable to dump him. Under a ruling by attorney general Frank Kelley, Bemis has 2 1/2 years left on his contract.

Bemis plans to stay around that long. Meanwhile, Republicans have picked up a 5-3 majority on the state board.

Another major idea in Bemis' speech was to raise the mandatory school attendance age from 16 to 18 and to prohibit those under 18 from holding full-time jobs until they have reached "essential skills standards."

The student wouldn't necessarily have to be in class until age 18. He or she might engage in "job shadowing, apprenticeships, mentor kinds of things that give hands-on experience," she said.

Other Bemis proposals, some of which have been incorporated into the State Board of Education's new goals:

- Reduce school dropouts by 16 percent and achieve a 90 percent high school graduation rate by the year 2000.
- Conduct a statewide literacy assessment as part of the 1990 national adult literacy survey.
- In 1991, begin testing all new teachers to ensure competency in basic skills.

County alters special ed funding

Wayne County school districts, including Northville, can expect to see some changes in the way special education facilities are funded.

The Wayne County Regional Education Service Agency (RESA) Board of Education, which links districts in Wayne County (including Northville) to the state, voted Dec. 12 to make three changes in funding for special education facilities.

The recommendations should lead to fairer funding for special education programs, Northville Special Education Director Leonard Rezmierski said.

Rezmierski contributed to Wayne County in its decision-making process, but because he has not seen the final board-adopted funding proposals he is unsure of his position on the decisions.

"I'm waiting for the final passed documents," he said. "We know it is

something in keeping with what we are concerned about.

"We want to be very prudent about those funds so that when we have a shortfall or some renovation needed the money will be there.

"We are just concerned that we are being wise with the funded money so if there is a leaky roof we can fix it. "Ask me a year from now if it's working. It's expensive. If it's not the roof, it's the heating system."

In the last 20 years, the number of programs serving special education students has increased due to state and federal mandates providing special education services for a wider range of handicapped people.

Because many districts were experiencing declining enrollment during this time, buildings were available to house the programs.

Some districts, like Northville, had to lease buildings to house special education programs. Northville administrators have been leasing Bryant School in Livonia to house a

portion of Northville's special education center programs. No criteria have been established to control leasing costs.

Of 36 center programs for students with less common handicaps operated in Wayne County, 12 are operated in separate facilities. The deterioration of buildings used for center programs, and funding problems has forced Wayne County RESA to re-evaluate its facilities usage policy.

Based on recommendations by a Facility Review Committee and testimony given at a public hearing the board decided to establish a \$5 million fund over the period of two years. The fund will be designated for the repair of facilities used to house special education center programs.

Establishment of the fund will result in a decrease in the amount of revenue available for local districts. Northville is estimated to lose \$43,300 over two years if the recommendation is approved.

The second change in special education funding will be the result of a new program regulating rental payments to local districts housing and operating special education center programs.

Northville will receive an estimated \$41,863 for providing special education facilities to 214 students, 97 percent of whom are not residents of Northville.

Programs in regular education facilities will receive \$1,500 per teaching station. Programs in separate facilities will receive \$2,500 per teaching station. Districts that transfer center programs from a segregated facility to regular education facilities will be paid the higher rate of \$2,500 for two years. Because the increased rental payments will increase program costs, the amount of revenue available to reimburse local districts for high incidence program costs would decrease costing Northville approximately \$6,469. The change would therefore give Northville an estimated

\$35,394 funding increase.

The third change will increase rent payments to districts that lease facilities to Wayne County RESA. Northville schools does not lease space to Wayne County, and the district's rental agreement with Livonia for Bryant School will not be impacted by this decision, said Kathryn Mathey, director of the special education center at Wayne County RESA.

Although Northville's buildings and programs are well-funded, Rezmierski said, he is concerned about students who are attending center programs in other districts.

"It's critical for us that we are supportive that (other districts) have access to run a quality building because they're our kids attending school in those buildings," Rezmierski said.

"We want to make sure they're going to a quality building. From that point of view we view this as a fair program."

'Football widows' give book a great reception

To be or not to be a football widow. That is the question you ladies out there have to ask yourself.

Her book has 191 pages, including a back glossary, that explains the complicated game in simple terms so every woman, and every man for that matter, can quickly learn and understand the game.

There's the complete rules of football and what each player does, diagrams of the field and alignments, offensive and defensive fundamentals, referees, penalties, signals and much more.

Everything you'll ever need to know about the game is clearly explained. You'll learn how points are scored, how and why penalties are handed out, the difference between offensive and defensive teams, plus the roles each player has on the field and the way referees control the game.

From the unique viewpoint of a woman, football suddenly seems so easy . . . and uncomplicated. Maybe that's why *Football News*

said Foehr "has done a remarkable job, understandable."

How and where in the world did she get this idea of writing a book to show and tell women about football?

"It's not my intention to coerce you into liking football because it's the 'in' thing to watch and talk about all fall," she said. "But I'll bet the more you learn and understand what's happening on the field, the more fun you'll have, and you'll see how the game can be addictive."

As for herself, Foehr "could sit and watch three NFL games — just ask my husband — and never be bored."

An insatiable football fan since her days at Ohio University, Foehr got hooked on the NFL when she and her husband Donald began attending Detroit Lions games, using his company's tickets. When the Lions moved to the Pontiac Silverdome, the Foehrs bought season tickets. Foehr has missed just one home game in 15 years.

"We would always take another couple with us because we had four tickets," she said. "It usually was so obvious that the other woman did not know much about the game. She was mostly people-watching or bored to death. I was having such a good time."

She later taught a football class for women at the Birmingham Community House. In addition to meeting with rousing popularity, it gave her a chance to stockpile her football knowledge.

Four years ago, she took a course on writing for publication and hit the word processor. It took her book about nine months to hit the 10,000 copies-sold mark.

"Let's face it, football is a game you're either going to love or hate," she said. "If you read the book and still feel that you don't like the game, then forget it. But at least you tried."

"Believe me, with effort, this is a sport that everyone in their right minds can learn."

So break out the munchies — and don't forget the dip — cuddle up to your significant other and watch the game(s). But, one thing. If at all possible, get control of the remote control.

Late-season releases are good to not so

The pre-Christmas rush to attract holiday dollars at the box office peaked last week with the Christmas Day debut of Francis Ford Coppola's much-heralded and over-promoted "Godfather III." Despite Mr. Coppola's hesitancy to finish films, "Godfather III" made it to the 1990 awards sweepstakes by a slender margin. Earlier, exhibitors opened this mini-season with "Almost an Angel," "Bonfire of the Vanities," "Green Card," "Kindergarten Cop" and "The Russia House" (B+, R, 120 minutes).

The latter mixes '50s Cold War angst with Hollywood romanticism in a stylish rendition of John Le Carre's novel starring Sean Connery as the boozy Barley Blair, a British publisher who makes a lot of sense, drunk or sober, when it comes to talking about the mess we've made of our 20th century world. Such talk by Blair at a Russian writers' conference sets off a chain of events that are sometimes difficult to follow. The film's structure has interesting convolutions as it continually bends back on itself to reveal new information while, at the same time, overlapping sequences.

The latter may very well be the way of the world of espionage. Nonetheless it is sometimes difficult to follow, particularly with the extensive performance in accented English — British and Russian-style.

The film's excellent photography by Ian Baker ("Roxanne" and "A Cry in the Dark") is a mixed blessing since there's a bit too much "local color" footage in Russia, Portugal, England and Canada. This isn't supposed to be a travelogue.

Despite such complaints, the film is as literate amplification of the nagging question lurking in every glasnost statement: Can democracy triumph over the better interests of the military and munitions manufacturers? The answer in "The Russia House" is no. That's probably realistic given the problems boiling just under the surface of our current celebration on ending 40 years of Cold War conflict.

Boozy Blair (Connery) is unwillingly plunged into just such a maelstrom by comments he makes which touch the soul of a mysterious Russian, Dante (Klaus Maria Brandauer), who uses his friend, Katya (Michelle Pfeiffer), as a conduit to the west.

Tom Stoppard wrote the very literate scenario from a Le Carre novel while Connery, Brandauer and Pfeiffer deliver their lines with superb professionalism. If the premise of "The Russia House" is correct and glasnost and Gorbachov are bad for the military and the munitions merchants, then the Red Army and the KGB will soon reassert Stalin-

ist tendencies in Russian society and "The Russia House" cynicism will prove prophetic.

No such luck in "The Godfather, Part III" (C+, R, 161 minutes) which is a disappointing film mostly because the tradition has become a formula. There's the requisite family party, a street fair, English sub-titles, the obligatory trip to Sicily and a young upstart looking to assume the mantle of power from an aging Godfather.

On its own, the film doesn't have much to say and as part of the trilogy flounders dismally with uneven scripting and acting. It's impossible to find any enjoyment without re-reading Parts I and II prior to seeing Part III.

In and of itself that would not be a major flaw except that it serves to remind the audience just how much Robert Duvall is missed and that the Corleone saga was best left completed in 1974.

As in the past, this "Godfather" is beautifully photographed and richly detailed. Sofia Coppola as Mary Corleone, Michael's daughter, is not without talent. However, she is not ready for this role. Her valley-girl snarl and mannerisms along with a somewhat distant approach make her character unsympathetic.

Despite her parent's agony, her accidental death at the end of the film is somehow satisfying for the audience. Unfortunately, this is not what writer/director/producer/father, Francis Ford Coppola intended. On the other hand, Al Pacino, Andy Garcia and Talia Shire give magnificent performances.

Pacino's Michael Corleone, in falling health at 60, has developed a conscience and harbors bitter regrets about his violent life. Coppola, though, overstates his case with religious and operatic symbolism and occasionally boring pontification.

Garcia is Vincent Mancini, Sonny's illegitimate son, in a stunningly brash and boisterous performance. Shire returning as Michael's sister, Connie, is both a moralist and a feminist. Connie actually orders a hit and Michael's lieutenants carry it out.

The plot suggests a Mafia-related Vatican conspiracy was behind the death of Pope John Paul I and that the bad guys were the ones wearing the robes. It's an interesting twist but one that's lost unless the audience is already aware of these conspiracy theories. Certainly, "The Godfather, Part III" is worth seeing. Just don't judge it by the standards its predecessors set. (Reviewed by Susan Pincham)

Like "Godfather III," "Bonfire of the Vanities" (C+, R, 120 minutes) is a major production with everything in its favor. Yet the payoff is not all that satisfying.

Both films raise the question, "Do megabucks make good movies?" Certainly, in "Godfather" and "Bonfire" all that money pays off in slick-looking productions which capture and hold the eye with excellent performance, fine music, superior looking scenes — and so on down the line of film techniques.

But it still doesn't make a good movie. "Bonfire of the Vanities" probably will grab and hold audience attention but when it's all over, there's a certain to be some wonder as to whether or not the two hours of over-yupped exaggerations were worth it.

Based on Tom Wolfe's novel and directed by Brian DePalma, the episodic structure of "Bonfire" revolves around a drunken reporter, Peter Fallow (Bruce Willis).

With a good deal of voice-over narration and commentary, Fallow tells the story of one Sherman McCoy (Tom Hanks), a terrifically successful broker who lives in a \$6 million Park Avenue condo with his unbelievably pretentious wife Judy (Kim Cattrall). They have a little daughter, Campbell (Kristen Durst) who has more screen time than character.

Sherman McCoy also has a mistress, Maria Ruskin (Melanie Griffith), who is married to an older gentleman, Arthur Ruskin (Alan King). One night after Sherman meets Maria at the airport, he gets lost in the Bronx on the way back to Manhattan. As they struggle out of the Bronx, Maria runs down a young black man, Henry Lamb (Patrick Malone), while driving Sherman's car.

In the ensuing turmoil, the film supposedly dissects the politics of justice and the antics of media, religion, government and

the monied classes as each manipulates the system for its own benefit.

The results, however, turn out to be a jumbled caricature which continually shifts from one sub-plot to another. There's Fallow's search for love, truth and the "great story," told via voice-over.

That might have been an effective technique, if used consistently, but just as viewers settle in with that, the film reverts to standard narrative mode, telling of Sherman McCoy's downfall and a variety of sub-plots: Maria's husband and other lovers; Sherman's wife and other Park Avenue yuppies and Sherman's search for himself. The last involves reconciliation with his father (Donald Moffat).

There's also Rev. Bacon (John Hancock) and District Attorney Abe Weiss (uncredited) who use and abuse the media. The last come off poorly as a shabby crowd of jackals.

The exaggerated characterizations and distorted camera angles are strangely unrealistic, particularly for a film purporting to treat with contemporary society and issues. Maybe it's all summed up in Judge White's (Morgan Freeman's) concluding monologue which reeks with the cloying sincerity popular in '50s style high school pageants.

Despite its attractive veneer, it's a shame so much has been expended for such little gain.

On a much lighter note, "Kindergarten Cop" (B-, PG-13, 105 minutes) may have a sappy and contrived plot but the kids are cute and Arnold Schwarzenegger is macho even though the art for this film suggests that Mr. Muscles has changed his venue.

But he's still a cop and goes undercover with his partner, Phoebe O'Hara (Pamela Reed), to ferret out the wife of a murderer and drug dealer, Cullen Crisp (Richard Tyson). Crisp's wife, Joyce (Penelope Ann Miller), supposedly has escaped with \$3 million in drug money. Joyce has a six-year-old child.

The plot may get more complicated but it doesn't get much better. What is worthwhile is Schwarzenegger's interaction with a classroom of six-year-olds.

Ready or not, kindergarten teacher is his cover while searching for Joyce's child. Fighting off those little devils in the classroom is a clever contrast to the usual Schwarzenegger role of fighting thugs in the streets which is where "Kindergarten Cop" begins.

"How much trouble can 6-year-olds be?" Schwarzenegger asks. Have a few laughs as he learns the truth about what goes on behind closed kindergarten doors.

Paul Hogan should stick to "Crocodile

Dundee" because his rough outback charm doesn't make it as an ethereal romantic. But that's essentially the role he's written and produced for himself in "Almost an Angel" (C-, PG, 95 minutes).p

The overly long and slow opening (15 minutes) establishes Terry Dean (Hogan) as a nice guy despite the fact that he robs banks. He's paroled and goes back to robbing banks. He's killed (sort of) while saving a kid from an oncoming auto. God, or one of his representatives who looks and sounds an awful lot like Charleton Heston, gives him a second chance as a probationary angel.

Well, you've probably heard that story before and this one has occasional moments of charm but not enough to save it from the dust bin of also-rans.

Dean gets religion and winds up in a small town where he befriends a bitter, dying cripple, Steve Garner (Elias Koteas), who, with his sister, Rose (Linda Kozlowski), run a recreation center for latch-key kids who need a place to play until they don't need their latch keys — or something like that.

It's pretty thin although Hogan and Koteas have their moments and "Almost an Angel" might have worked much better as a buddy film than it does as one about ghosts returning to help humanity.

Is the under-\$100,000 home a dying breed?

Building homes under \$100,000 — some say that in these days of rising land, labor and material costs, restrictive zoning and building codes and slow growth/no growth pressures that that's almost impossible. The key word is "almost."

Sam Blumenstein, president of Classic Construction in West Bloomfield, said there is a tremendous market for under-\$100,000 housing, but no one is filling it because of obstacles.

Affordable housing is critical for first-time home buyers, who are just entering the home buyer market and need a way to build equity, and for empty nesters, who need less space now.

The need for affordable housing is best exemplified by the sales record of under-\$100,000 homes.

"We keep hearing about the economy slowing down, but we're bucking the trend like crazy. Sales are up 50 percent," Blumenstein said.

Very few builders are building for the under-\$100,000 market, Blumenstein said, but not because they don't want to build affordable housing. "Unless you're a vertical company like we are, you just can't do it."

Classic Construction is able to save a great deal of money because the company not only assembles and buys the land, but rezones it, develops it and builds the homes as well.

"If you do all that, and you run a tight ship, you can still do it," he said.

Instead of someone making a profit at each step of the development process, he can sell homes at 15 to 20 percent savings because he cuts out several middlemen, Blumenstein said.

And just because it's affordable housing doesn't mean it's cheap housing, he said. A nine-hole golf course, nature and walking trails and common areas, and community centers and pools are available to the homeowners.

Classic Construction is developing the 900-unit Maples of Novi development which has several options available for under \$100,000. Attached one-bedroom, one-den condominiums start at \$79,900; and detached three-bedroom, 1½ baths

Existing homes still has cost advantage vs. new

A subtle reason for the lack of homes for under \$100,000 is builders have a hard time competing with the existing home market.

Bill Lawson, a partner with the Michigan Home Builders Inc. in Rochester Hills, said rising costs have made it impossible to compete. "We can't build a home for the same price as an older home and give you the same thing."

Increased regulations, land costs, material costs, labor costs — all have risen in the last decade.

The main selling point of the new home is exactly that — its newness, he said.

High property taxes is another reason it is difficult to build homes for under \$100,000, Lawson said.

Even though assessments have risen significantly in the high-growth areas, they have not risen as quickly as building costs, Lawson said.

Assessments on older homes of the same size and type as a newer home are generally lower for the older home because the assessment was established at the original lower sale price, he said.

Lawson said some people point toward re-urbanization as the answer to building affordable homes — the argument being that builders should construct homes in Detroit and other urban areas

condominiums start at \$99,900. Homes adjacent to a nine-hole golf course start at \$139,000.

The single greatest obstacle to building homes under \$100,000, Blumenstein said, is the price of land.

"You can't buy the land cheap enough and you can't develop it cheap enough to (build homes for \$100,000 or less)."

Once the price of the lot goes over

where land costs are relatively low.

Image problems, racism and lack of city services aside, builders are still reluctant to build in established urban areas — even though the extensive infrastructure makes property alluring, Lawson said.

Because property has either devalued or not appreciated, tax rates in urban areas are generally much higher than in less urbanized areas, he said. "So why would I want to build in Detroit?"

The tax burden on newer, high-cost housing would be huge, he said.

For example, two \$100,000 homes — one in Detroit and one in Rochester Hills — would cost the same to build, but taxes would probably be more than double on the Detroit home.

True, the Detroit home would probably be larger because fewer costs were eaten up by land acquisition, but the two similarly priced homes would have extremely disparate tax bills, he said.

"Until they solve that problem, builders are not going to want to build (in the urban areas)," he said, suggesting that a system similar to the tax abatements granted to industrial and commercial properties might be an avenue to explore.

\$22,000 to \$25,000, the price of building materials and labor makes \$100,000 an unattainable goal, he said. "That's what's really killing the under-\$100,000 market."

Blumenstein added that local government restrictions on minimum lot sizes, woodlands and wetlands are the greatest factors in driving up land costs.

To make affordable housing more common, Blumenstein said com-

munities will have to loosen their restrictions and recognize the need for lower cost housing.

Some communities, he said, are already taking a second look at their ordinances. The result? More flexible zoning ordinances that allow builders to develop projects with a higher density on part of the site in exchange for open space, woodlands or wetlands preservation on another part of the site, Blumenstein said.

Communities that insist on stricter zoning ordinances, he said, are learning the hard way that the costs of restrictive zoning ordinances are high.

In many recent lawsuits, the courts have sided with builders in saying that some of these restrictive ordinances constitute an unlawful taking of property.

Bill Lawson, a partner with the Michigan Home Builders Inc. in Rochester Hills, said land costs alone have made home construction under \$100,000 virtually impossible. Lawson primarily builds custom homes and small projects.

"It's really tough," he said. "You can go out into the sticks where the land is cheap, but you're going to have a hard time anywhere else."

Lawson builds homes in the \$100,000 to \$150,000 range in North Oakland County where land prices have skyrocketed in recent years.

IMPROVED LOTS, depending on where they're located, can cost as much as \$100,000 in desirable areas and even in less desirable areas will frequently cost more than \$50,000, he said.

"If you're building in Rochester it will cost you \$40,000 just for the lot — that means you would have to build (the house) for about \$50,000. You can't do it," Lawson said.

James McLennan, president of Willow Development in Birmingham said there aren't any secrets to building homes for under \$100,000. Builders arrive at a home's cost by adding labor and materials costs and then factoring in the profit.

"And frankly, you don't make much of a return for \$99,900," McLennan said. "It's a real price, but it's also a promotional price."

Recession prompts many to renovate

OK, maybe building a home under \$100,000 is becoming a thing of the past.

Rising land, labor and material costs, restrictive zoning and building codes and slow growth/no growth pressures have made new home construction a difficult albeit not insurmountable task.

So other than apartments and existing homes, where does that leave John "blue collar" Smith?

Mike Claffone, a sales manager for the Michigan Condominium Corp. said some builders will be turning to remodeling jobs of existing structures — especially in light of the slowing economy.

Remodeling can offer significant cost advantages to new construction depending on the property, he said, mainly because the building's structural frame — one of the greatest costs in building — already exists.

"The fact that we start with an existing structure reduces our costs significantly," he said.

Remodelers can also purchase existing buildings in high-price, high-growth areas at half the cost of building new, he said, because assessments — even though they've increased — have grown as fast as building from scratch.

By remodeling old apartment complexes, builders can often bring in condominium projects well below \$100,000 — even as low as \$59,000.

And some existing facilities, Claffone continued, offer great opportunities. The Michigan Condominium Corp. recently revamped 116 executive rental units in West Bloomfield and renamed it Moon Lake Condominiums.

The two- or three-bedroom, two-bath, detached units, which

sell for \$99,990, were a rare find even for a company that specializes in finding remodeling jobs. "It's by far one of the best products, new or (remodeled), on the market."

Claffone said one thing that adds greatly to the cost of housing is people expect more in a home and are unwilling to wait for the extra bedroom or amenities.

Since remodeling cuts down on materials and labor costs, builders — with the right property — can offer more at a reduced price.

"If we built (Moon Lake condominiums) today, there's no way we couldn't do it for \$99,990."

"(But) because we already had the existing structure, we were able to put more money into other things," he said.

Claffone said there are relatively few homes for under \$100,000 these days, but there are still a lot of homes for under \$125,000. "There's actually a lot of competition out there."

Claffone said the line between "affordable" and "luxury" housing has continued to blur over the years.

As costs continue to rise and building continues to be more difficult, first-time buyer and starter home prices will edge over the \$100,000 mark, he said.

Get the right caulk for your home job

Most homeowners know that caulking cracks in the exterior of their house helps reduce heat loss in winter and makes it easier to cool in summer.

Caulk also keeps out moisture and pests. But with so many kinds of caulk available, deciding which to buy can be daunting.

Here are the facts so you can fill those cracks.

Caulking compounds are sold in bulk cans, in cartridges for use with a gun, in squeeze tubes, and in rope-like strips good for temporary seals around storm windows and air conditioners. For a homeowner, it's usually most convenient to use cartridges in guns.

There are six basic types of caulk.

■ Oil-base caulk is inexpensive and will bond to most surfaces including wood, masonry and metal. But it dries out relatively fast and is recommended only for temporary fixes.

■ Latex-base, water-thinned caulk is fast-drying and will take paint very well. It's a good all-around caulk that is easy to use and relatively long lasting.

■ Butyl rubber caulk is long-lasting and best suited for making metal-to-masonry joints.

■ Polyvinyl acetate caulk is a durable material that adheres to all surfaces, including paint.

■ Silicone caulk is long lasting and takes well to all surfaces except paint.

Because paint won't adhere to pure silicone caulk, it's usually best to choose clear caulk or a color that goes with the color of your house. Or use a silicone acrylic caulk, which is paintable and fairly durable.

■ One-part polyurethane caulk is the longest lasting of all the compounds. Applied to a properly prepared surface, it will last for up to 40 years. But it won't take paint and it comes in a very limited number of colors.

Caulking is needed wherever two materials or parts of a house are joined:

■ Where windows and doors meet siding, including under sills and above drip caps.

■ At all corners formed by siding.

■ Between the underside of eaves and gable molding.

■ Between masonry steps, porches, patios, decks and the main body of the house.

■ Around pipes, exhaust-fan outlets and clothes-dryer vents.

■ Between siding and any part protruding from the main body of the house.

Sizable cracks in wood siding, concrete, roofing and masonry surfaces may require a permanent repair job instead of caulk. But you can fill many cracks wider than a half-inch with oakum (loosely twisted hemp or jute fiber impregnated with tar).

Before you begin, be sure to prepare the surfaces to be caulked. Scrape away any dirt, grease and old compound with a putty knife. Finish cleaning with a wire brush.

To ensure adhesion, most caulks require wiping the surface with a solvent such as mineral spirits. Check the label directions.

When dealing with a lacquered aluminum surface, first remove the lacquer with xylol, then wire brush the surface and finally apply a metal primer with a rust-inhibiting agent.

For an average-size job, use a cartridge inserted in a caulking gun. Cut the end of the nozzle diagonally at a width equal to that of most cracks, and push a long nail down the spout to puncture the inner seal.

Squeeze the trigger slowly and draw the tip along the seam you want to fill. Work at a slow, even pace. If you want to be sure a joint is filled completely, push the tube along the joint instead of pulling it.

Weather affects how caulk goes on. Caulk on a mild, dry day when it's over 50 degrees. On a hot day, refrigerate caulk for an hour or two to keep it from running. To keep unfinished tubes of caulking fresh, plug the hole in the tip with a large nail.

Leasing home can avoid tax bite

Maybe you can help me clear up some tax questions I have regarding our home. My wife and I sold our home about 11 months ago and bought a more expensive home, in part, to avoid having to pay a tax on the profit of our home. We have now found that we may want to buy a larger house. We are concerned that if we sell our new house now we will have to pay a tax on the deferred profit because we have owned our new house less than 24 months.

When you sold your first home, you correctly deferred the profit tax by purchasing a replacement principal residence of equal or greater cost within 24 months before or after the sale as is permitted under the Internal Revenue Code, Section 1034. But the code provides that you can only use this once every 24 months with one exception. There is a tax deferral on a sale in less than 24 months if the sale is because of a job location change that qualified for moving expense tax deduction. That means that your new job must be more than 35 miles further away from your old home than was the old job.

Finally, to avoid having to pay the tax, you are advised to wait to sell your current home until you have owned it at least 24 months. If you cannot do so, you may lease your current home to a tenant, perhaps with an option to buy, until after your 24 months expires or you may buy or lease a larger home so you can move now.

I am advised that several tax court decisions indicate that a temporary rental of your old home, while it is available for sale, will not convert it into a rental property and you will not lose a tax deferral of Section 1034 of the tax code, the "roll-over resident rule." You are advised to contact your tax adviser concerning these transactions.

We are interviewing management companies. Four of the five bids we received were within \$1.50 per unit of the other. The fifth management company is \$3.75 cheaper per unit based on specifications for the management contract that our lawyer prepared. The board, to no one's surprise, is gravitating toward the cheapest one. I am wary because I believe you get what you pay for. How do I convince the other board members of this?

There is always the school of hard knocks that will serve to teach directors that your belief is correct. Unfortunately, too many hard knocks can ruin a condominium association. Moreover, because of the frequent turnover of directors of the association, what one board learns is not always transferred to the succeeding board. Simply put, some management companies, like some lawyers and CPAs in the field, intentionally bid in at prices well below the market to get the account.

Then either the management agent does not deliver the services promised (because it realistically

cannot afford to do so because of its low rate) or it raises the fee after it has gotten in the door of the condominium. The management company may even have many accounts (about which it boasts to the frugality) of many community association boards. But can it and will it be able to deliver the services? Probably not in the long run. He who charges less knows best what his services are worth.

We have an opportunity to buy a timeshare that gives us the chance to travel to Maui in Hawaii. We have heard it is a beautiful area, but I'm wondering about the liability of having a condo there. What do you think?

A timeshare in Maui, a beautiful but expensive island, as in any other place, should be reviewed carefully by you before purchase.

Check to see whether you will be able to trade the use of your timeshare for other locales in the world.

The state of Hawaii has a condominium statute regarding condos, and there are lawyers who specialize in condominiums throughout the islands.

There is a substantial condominium boom in Honolulu with the attendant condominium association problems, including multi-million dollar construction defect litigation.

Sow seeds now for spring begonias

The bright-hued flowers of tuberous begonias can be the stars of your annual garden this summer. If you want them blooming in May, Michigan State University horticulturists say you need to start tubers growing in February or sow seeds Jan. 1 for blooming plants in four to six months.

Several types of tuberous begonias are available. If you want spectacularly large flowers — up to 8 inches across — in brilliant shades of red, orange, salmon, apricot and yellow, as well as bicolor and white, plant Begonia (tuberhybrida). Multiflora bear many more flowers but smaller ones, about 1 inch across. Multiflora maxima begonias produce many blossoms about 2 to 2½ inches in diameter. Pendulous types produce small but abundant blossoms on drooping stems. They're especially well suited to hanging baskets.

Tubers dug from the garden last fall or purchased this winter should be firm and free from signs of mold. Discard any that are soft or lightweight for their size — they are probably rotten. Seeds are available from a wide variety of sources.

Plant begonias tubers in February in moist peat moss, sphagnum moss or vermiculite in open trays. Place tubers with the round end down and 3 to 4 inches apart. Do not cover the tubers until the top growth is 3 to 4 inches tall.

Place the trays where they will receive a little indirect sunlight and temperatures of 65 to 70 degrees. The tubers rot easily, so water sparingly until new growth appears. Shoots should start to appear in about a week.

Within four to five weeks, tubers should be ready to transplant into 5 to 6-inch pots. Cover the tubers with

a well drained potting mix high in organic matter. To promote root growth, mix 1 teaspoon of superphosphate fertilizer (0-20-0) in each gallon of soil.

Place the newly potted tubers in an east window where they will receive bright light but little direct sunlight. Fluorescent lights can be used to supplement natural light. Minimum night temperature at this stage should be 60 to 65 degrees.

If starting begonias from seed, follow the specific directions on the seed packet. Generally, seeds need constant moisture and high humidity for successful germination.

After the last spring frost, move the plants to a lightly shaded spot outside. A northern exposure or a site under shade trees is best for begonias. Avoid planting them where they will be exposed to direct afternoon sunlight. A little morning sun is good,

however. Also avoid planting in deep shade — plants will become tall and leggy.

Regular watering and fertilizing keep plants growing well and flowering profusely. MSU horticulturists recommend using a complete fertilizer such as 10-10-10 at the rate of 1 teaspoon per gallon of water every two weeks. Apply this solution liberally to the soil around each plant, being careful to keep it off the foliage.

Overwatering can lead to stem rot and mildew on foliage. Crowding may also contribute to mildew.

Serious insect problems are uncommon in tuberous begonias. Severe attacks by aphids, thrips, mealybugs or whiteflies may require weekly treatments with a labeled insecticide. Ask your local garden center or Cooperative Extension Service office for recommendations.

Letterman knew radio or TV was in store

Although his show is aired an hour past most of our bedtimes, David Letterman is one of the nation's most popular entertainers. NBC's *Late Night with David Letterman* is a combination of sarcasm, irony and one-liners, served up by a good-natured host with a smile that would make the tooth fairy proud.

A native of Indianapolis, Ind., Letterman had wanted to be in television or radio most of his life. He majored in radio/TV at Ball State University in Muncie, Ind., and after graduation he got a job at Indianapolis' WLWI-TV. At different times, he was the host of a Saturday morning children's show, a weatherman, a news anchor and a late-night movie host. In 1975, after a year of hosting a radio talk show in Indianapolis, he moved to Los Angeles to pursue a comedy career.

His first network television exposure came on the brief CBS variety series *Mary*, starring Mary Tyler Moore. Subsequently, he was invited to be a guest on NBC's *The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson*, and he made his first appearance on that show Nov. 24, 1978. He has made a total of 21 guest appearances on that show and has been guest host 50 times.

In 1980, NBC hired him to host a morning comedy/variety, *The David Letterman Show*. The program only ran for three months, but it became the prototype for his late-night program.

NBC has the big winner in the New



“Dillinger” re-made for television

Mark Harmon and Sherilyn Fenn star

On the evening of July 22, 1934, John Dillinger went to the movies. He was 31 years old. He had been Public Enemy No. 1 for exactly one month. With his girlfriend, Polly, and her landlady, Anna — radiant in her red dress — he went to see Clark Gable in a gangster movie at the Biograph Theatre in Chicago. So the story went and so the story goes.

On Sunday, Jan. 6, ABC continues the Dillinger film legacy with the premiere of “Dillinger,” starring Mark Harmon and screenom’s heir apparent Sherilyn Fenn. The first made-for-TV movie on the subject, the film is a David L. Wolper production, produced by his son Mark.

Such is the clout of Wolper Productions that ABC asked them what kind of movie they had always wanted to do. (Wolper’s long history of credits includes the beginning and ending ceremonies of the Olympics, “Roots” and “North and South.”) “Dillinger” was their answer.

Why would anyone want to re-make a movie that has been done twice before? The first “Dillinger” was made in 1945 and starred Lawrence Tierney. (Film buffs will spot Tierney making a cameo appearance in this film.) The second starred Warren Oates in 1973.

Mark Wolper explained that what his company sought to do was create a film that was as historically correct as possible. He believes his “Dillinger” is the most accurate of the three. For example, contrary to popular belief, Polly Hamilton, Dillinger’s girlfriend, was not “the woman in red” who fingered him for the FBI that fateful night. The handmaiden of history was a woman named Anna Sage, a disreputable immigrant who set up Dillinger in a deal to avoid deportation. (Hamilton is played by Patricia Arquette and Sage by Lucy Childs for the ABC movie.)

According to Wolper, this is the story: In the summer of 1933, John Dillinger was just another ex-convict released after having served a prison term for attempted robbery. A year later he was the most wanted man in America, with a series of flamboyant bank robberies and two jail breaks to his discredit.

It was Dillinger’s arrogant style that made him an FBI target. He delighted in informing the press when federal agents blew an easy chance to catch him. So brazen was he, that he took one of his preferred ladies, Billie Frechette (Fenn), for a nearly public picnic at his father’s family farm, inviting the neighbors

to be photographed with the outlaw. Dillinger, as Wolper would have it, was actually a likeable character with many friends and supporters.

ABC’s “Dillinger” was filmed in well-preserved areas of Milwaukee, Wis., resembling Chicago. Shooting a period film from 50 years ago was no easy task. The main problem, said Wolper, was eager Milwaukeeans in modern dress appearing on roofs and windows in the street scenes. Then there was the problem of telephone lines and freeways showing up in the shots.

Even so, Wolper says his film is extremely stylish, and that he and ABC are pleased. But you can be its judge.


Jerry Vale, Don Novello to make guest appearances on NBC series





A: You are going to be sorry you ever asked about Gregg Rainwater's earring because, Leta, you lose. When I asked Gregg about his earrings, he chuckled and wanted to know what you had guessed they were. He then told me they are made from the vertebra of a rattlesnake. *The Young Riders* won an Emmy Award for its costuming, although it was nominated in several categories. The show was also honored with the American Western Heritage Award.

Q: Can you tell me how old Billy Mummy and Angela Cartwright were when they filmed *Lost in Space* and how old are they now? —Janet, Paterson, N.J.

A: Billy Mummy was born in 1954; he was 11 years old when he signed for the series *Lost in Space*. Angela Cartwright was born in 1952; she was 13 years old when the series began. The series premiered on Sept. 15, 1965, with its last telecast on Sept. 18, 1968. Their ages now are 36 and 38, respectively.
