

## Diverted creek wreaks havoc on land

Ann and James Malecki's wooded lot off Ridge Road in Northville Township used to feature stately cedars, beeches and ash, many of them adorned with homemade birdhouses.

A quiet creek perhaps a foot deep and three to four feet wide wound its way through their property, attracting muskrat, blue herons and ducks.

The Maleckis loved their home of 28 years and planned to spend their retirement years enjoying its natural beauty.

But now the birds and animals are gone. Healthy trees are toppling and the trickle of water from the creek has turned into a churning, destructive nightmare that has chewed away hundreds of feet of soil and trees along their water frontage.

The Maleckis, township officials, and engineers say an overzealous developer rerouted the creek on a neighboring property and is responsible for creating a gorge — which varies from 12-18 feet deep, is approximately 30 feet wide and 188 feet long — on the Malecki property.

The developer says the fault lies with Northville Township, the township's engineering firm, and the state Department of Natural Resources.

Something caught James Malecki's eye as he was shaving the morning of Dec. 29. Through a back window, Malecki saw a large tree fall near the creek in his back yard.

Alarmed, he walked to the creek and noticed a culvert between his land and the neighboring property had collapsed. The culvert had been designed to accept water from the Maleckis' property and disperse the creek on the former Thomson Sand and Gravel property.

"I said, 'Where's the culvert?' and

## A dime store may return

Downtown visitors may soon have a shopping opportunity they have been missing for two years. The owner of Black's True Value Hardware is seeking to turn his Main Street location into a dime store.

Store owner Robert Black is moving his 15-year-old hardware business to the Highland Lakes Shopping Center on Seven Mile Road, and seeking to convert his present 139 E. Main St. location to a dime store. Black said previously that the new township location was a superior site for his hardware business because of more convenient parking, but he originally was uncertain what he would do with the Main Street location he leases from building owner Betty Meredith.

The decision to open a dime store hinges on Black's ability to obtain bank financing for the new business, he said. "That may or may not go through," he added.

"We're definitely planning for a dime store," Black said. "We haven't bought any supplies yet because we're working on financing. . . . What the bank is unsure of is if a dime store can turn a profit in downtown Northville."

The potential dime store would mark the return of such a store to downtown Northville after a two-year

lapse. The D & C dime store operated near and at the site for 31 years before closing in September 1988, citing rising rental costs as the reason. Black's Hardware took over the location shortly thereafter.

The new store would not involve the owners of the former dime store, Black said. "They're not interested in having a store in Northville, it's too high a rent."

But Black said the new store would be similar in nature to the former store. "A dime store's similar to a small version of a K mart or the old Kresge stores. It's just got regular household merchandise," he said.

Black expects to open his new hardware store Feb. 15.



## Aerobics group leaps to rescue

Aerobic Connection in Farmington Hills will be jumping for Joey in January.

It's a fund-raiser to raise \$2,500 for a wheelchair lift for Joey Davis, a 2 1/4 year-old Northville boy with severe physical and mental retardation.

Several times every hour, Joey flinches his arms, rolls his eyes and loses consciousness. When that happens, his mother Carla, 30 and separated, knows immediately that he is having a seizure. Everytime he has a seizure, he loses time developmentally.

Joey needs total care because he can't move anything on his own.

He's blind and weighs 25 pounds. "Joey just sees shadows," said Carla, 30, a surgical registered nurse who works part-time at Garden City Osteopathic Hospital. "We don't know if he can interpret anything he sees."

Carla is currently embroiled in litigation with Providence Hospital in Southfield, trying to prove that Joey's

severe mental and physical difficulties are the result of a birth injury.

She's hoping the outcome of the lawsuit will assist her in purchasing a home that is barrier-free for her son.

"I want him to be taken care of properly," Carla said. "I don't want him to go to a nursing home. I haven't gotten to the point where I can leave him with strangers. If I quit my job, I would get lots of help. I have applied for SSI (Social Security), but was denied."

Carla's mother does the bulk of the baby-sitting.

A 1979 graduate of Redford Thur-

ston High school, Carla suspected long before her doctors' diagnosis that Joey had serious problems. They regarded her as a neurotic mother who happens to be a nurse, she said.

Mary Urbats of Livonia, a manager with Aerobic Connection, is the conduit for the fund-raiser which she hopes will make Carla's life a little bit easier. The two women met last April on a golf course.

With the help of Peter Nielsen, a former Mr. International Universe, his partner Russell Pauling, and her 20-member staff, Urbats is confident area residents will open their hearts

to a little boy in great need.

An Aerobic-A-Thon will be held Saturday, Jan. 12, from 9 a.m. to midnight at the health spa located at 23317 Orchard Lake Road in Farmington Hills. Sponsor pledge sheets are available by calling 478-8677. You need not participate in the aerobic session to contribute money.

Carla's day never ends. Every two hours she turns Joey to prevent bed sores. During this same time interval she feeds Joey strained baby food and gives him something to drink in order to maintain his body weight. "Joey had to be resuscitated at birth," Carla said. "I knew he was in distress."

Joey doesn't cry at birth, and he doesn't cry now. So Carla has to guess what's wrong when he becomes ill.

"I don't know when he's having pain or not," Carla said.

Urbats has the highest praise for her friend, Carla. "She has a way of influencing people to have a good outlook on life."

# MONDAY EDUCATION

## Impressionable: computer kids

Northville students have been trying their hand at a few new activities, from copying impressionist art to designing automobiles, thanks to the district's new bond-financed \$3 million telecommunications system.

Meads Mill students are already experienced computer users having competed in a computer knowledge competition since the fall of 1987. Recently, they have expanded their computer skills.

The 1989 voter-approved bond issue permitted the district to install computers in every school. At Meads Mill, that means students can see an impressionist art exhibit from the Toledo Museum of Art right in the building.

The exhibit was shown on a laser disk system in the Meads Mill library. The system is "like a video but a lot better," according to librarian Robert Stover.

Stover displayed the copies of the work of impressionist artists like Pierre Auguste Renoir and Vincent van Gogh around the building to promote the new equipment. Stover also took the opportunity to encourage students to try their hand at impressionism. He held a contest for the best copies of impressionist work. Six students won for their impressionist renderings.

Meads Mill students have participated in the Knowledge Master Open, a competition on computers between schools around the world for three years. The competition is held four times per school year. Students work in a group to answer questions from

computer disk sent to the school by competition organizers.

Preliminary results are phoned to the school's adviser, Stover at Meads Mill, soon thereafter. Meads Mill's final rank was 15th and Cooke third out of 51 competing Michigan schools.

Meads Mill ranked 444th out of 1,350 schools competing internationally from as far away as Korea and Uruguay. The official results were recently mailed to the advisers at both schools.

Meads Mill students have also had their computer art designs evaluated by engineers from Ford Motor Company in another competition available to students attending schools with computer systems.

The futuristic technology found in the Meads Mill library is not only for special competitions and events. Card catalogs and library cards are becoming a thing of the past at Meads Mill.

"These things are going to be definite dinosaurs in a few years," Stover said.

A computer wand checks out books, and immediately notifies the computerized card catalog that the book being checked out is no longer available. Students can search the card catalog from their classrooms and the library.

World Book and Grolier's Academic American encyclopedias are available on computer which can search the volumes of information with a few key strokes.

For example, the World Book Encyclopedia mentions the words "Kennedy" and "Dallas" 19 times in 12 articles. If a student is writing a paper

about former president John Kennedy's assassination, then they can print all of the World Book references to Kennedy and Dallas. The computer also suggests other searches that might provide relevant information.

And the new microfiche system at Meads Mill is Stover's pride and joy.

"This is what they have at high schools and, of course, they've had it in the colleges. Now they've had it at this level," Stover said.

The district subscribes to Text on Microfiche which provides students access to 120 magazines from Ms. to Good Housekeeping. The magazines are

printed on microfiche, and provide easy access to current events, Stover said.

"Now that teachers know about this they're assigning real current-type projects," he said.

Younger students often will look up a story in a magazine on microfiche even if a copy of the same magazine is available in print at the library, Stover said.

"It's new and exciting. That's why they like it," he said.

The next step in computerizing district school buildings might include purchasing equipment to en-

large information on a computer screen and put it on a wall screen or monitor. This technology would enable more students to participate in the Knowledge Master Open. Currently, they are limited to including the number of students who can fit around a single computer.

The technology would have other uses, and Stover is not sure that the Knowledge Master competition would actually benefit from it.

"If you get 60 kids all trying to say an answer it might detract from the competition," he said.

# Creek destroys land

then I knew it was gone," he said.

With the culvert went the Maleckis' retaining wall, tons of soil, more than 20 mature trees and countless bushes and shrubs.

Also lost was some of the Maleckis' spirit.

"I was devastated," he said. "It was unbelievable; I didn't think something like this could happen," Ann Malecki said.

Earth movers and backhoes last winter clawed the 350-plus acres of the old gravel pit property wedged between Beck and Ridge roads and Six Mile and Seven Mile roads.

Workers graded the site under terms of a reclamation agreement between Northville Township and Alta Sorenson, whose family sold the gravel pit land the previous fall.

D & T Construction, a Mt. Clemens firm headed by Vincent DiLorenzo, handled the reclamation chores, which were limited to moving earth and grading slopes, under terms of the reclamation agreement.

The reclamation project was to be a precursor to development of a huge subdivision on the site, later dubbed "The Shores of Northville." DiLorenzo is a general partner in the development project.

According to the agreement, site preparation and reclamation were two separate items.

But local officials believe DiLorenzo's firm began site preparation almost as soon as equipment rumbled onto the property.

Township officials became alarmed when residents complained that the developer destroyed a swath of trees next to a subdivision off Ridge Road. Officials later determined the developer wiped out more than six acres of trees protected under the township's woodlands protection ordinance.

D & T workers also redirected the creek — formally called Sump Drain — in what Malecki says was an attempt to dry out a wetlands area to make it usable as residential lots.

DiLorenzo said the creek was redirected to ensure completion of the reclamation project. The creek was to be returned to its natural path at a later date, he said.

In March 1990, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) issued the developer a cease and desist order. The order was intended to force D & T to stop all "unauthorized activities immediately."

DiLorenzo said the cease order was handed out because of questions about erosion around lakes on the site. He said the creek was moved "months later" as the firm continued its reclamation plan.

But D & T altered the creek without DNR approval and has yet to make application for water redirection.

The developers never applied for any type of permits from the DNR, prior to or after re-routing the creek, according to DNR spokesperson Dave Pingle.

Wayne County government also got involved. Last spring, the county health department slapped the developer with a stop order, claiming erosion and runoff was detrimental to the site and county.

And last summer, the township ordered the developer to stop all site activities. The developer had overstepped reclamation terms, the township determined.

That action, DiLorenzo said, caused the damage to the Malecki property.

"My contention last summer was we had to move it back," he said. "We said the creek was not in the right place."

"We said, 'If you pull us off the project, it's premature.' I think the township grossly erred in this thing."

After a pair of summer rain storms, the area east of the Malecki property began to show effects of the creek redirection. A large area of sand and gravel gradually eroded and left a gaping maw in the westernmost portion of the proposed Shores of Northville site.

Officials feared the problem would intensify.

"We realized it was a potential problem last November," said Donald Weaver, of Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May, the engineering firm which consults with Northville Township. "We were concerned this [a large-scale washout] would happen."

"We wanted D & T to resolve the problem on their property before the erosion got to others."

Weaver said a November meeting between his office, township representatives, DiLorenzo, and the county health department offered no resolution.

"DiLorenzo said they were prohibited from correcting the problem because of the cease and desist order," he said. "They said they'd get sued by the DNR as well as the township if they went ahead."

The DNR was invited to the meeting but did not respond, Weaver said. He reiterated, however, that the developer has not taken a step to apply for DNR permits.

DiLorenzo said he told others at the meeting that he would be "happy to go back in." But he said township engineers told him not to.

"Everybody's up in arms," DiLorenzo said. "They wanted us to stop and now they want us to go back in."

"What do they want us to do?" Weaver did not mince words when asked if the reclamation project and creek redirection were to blame for the Maleckis' woes.

"Yes. We think that problem was caused by the reclamation at the Thomson Sand and Gravel property," he said.

According to Weaver, erosion on at the development site and on the Maleckis' property was caused when the creek was redirected. Silt deposits had held the creek in a meandering path, but when the water course was changed, the creek almost effortlessly scoured away the new sandy path, he said.

As the creek straightened on the Thomson property, residual effect — called headward erosion — became noticeable. The water gained speed and began to eat away at the sand base and the area surrounding the culvert adjacent to the Malecki property.

Sometime late Dec. 27 or early Dec. 28, the culvert gave way.

The township zoning board of appeals will meet tonight (Jan. 7) to discuss the erosion problem. The ZBA's top priority is to determine if a half-million dollars of reclamation funds held in escrow can be used by the township to finish the project on the Thomson site and restore the Maleckis' property, said ZBA Chairperson Karen Baja.

"It's a travesty," Baja said. "I want to know, legally, if due to improper reclamation, we can take funds to restore and repair Mr. Malecki's property and the west lake [on the Thomson land] that has all the gravel dumped into it."

"If something isn't done soon, before the spring rains, we could lose all the way to Ridge Road," she said.

Supervisor Georgina Goss called the ZBA meeting "the final step we can take to go ahead and have that property reclaimed."

Goss said the township has the power to choose who it wants to complete the reclamation. She also pointed the finger of blame at the developer.

"That problem is definitely the responsibility of D & T Construction," she said.

DiLorenzo said the township is responsible because it listened to the advice of its engineering consultant.

"The township relied on the Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May's expertise," he said. "I think they miscalculated. Here's a perfect case where they were wrong and the truth finally came out."

"Them telling us to leave was wrong," he said.

Meanwhile, the Malecki's backyard disappears almost before their eyes.

"Every once in a while you'll hear a 'plop' and you know another tree is gone," Ann Malecki said Thursday. The soft-spoken couple say they

are considering legal action against the developer, but hope the township can take care of the problem after the ZBA meeting.

Even if the township can restore their property, it can't replace the trees and memories that have grown

along with them the past three decades.

"You can't replace nature," James Malecki said. "Some of those trees are 50-60 years old."

"I don't guess we'll be around to see anything like them again."

# Study links TV with lower scores

A Schoolcraft College research study of 2,269 first-year students in fall 1990 showed a definite relationship between scores received on the ASSET placement test given at Schoolcraft's orientation and the amount of television students watch, the number of books they read, and the amount of homework they did in high school.

Test scores on the ASSET placement tests evaluate students' skills in writing, reading, and mathematics. The scores show that the more time students spent watching television every day, the lower their placement scores. Those who reported

watching five or more hours daily had scores 6 percent lower than students who watched on or less hours of television daily.

The study revealed that the more books students read per year, the higher their placement scores. For example, those who read five or more books during the year had mean scores in writing, reading, and numerical skills that were 8, 9, and 5 percent higher respectively than students who read no books during the year. Frequent readers outscored those who read one or two books a year by mean scores of 7, 8 and 4 per-

cent higher.

Students were asked: "On the average, how much homework was assigned to you per week when you were in the 11th and 12th grades?" Students who indicated that they were assigned 6-8 hours of homework per week had mean scores of 10, 6 and 9 percent higher respectively than those who were assigned less than one hour each week.

These results support the conclusions reached in other recent studies: The more time students spend reading and doing homework, the higher they score on basic test skills.

# Wayne County keeps prenatal care

Prenatal care for high risk mothers will continue at several Wayne County sites, despite closing of obstetric services at Outer Drive Hospital, Detroit.

Outer Drive, the prime source of medical care for county prenatal patients, closed its service Dec. 3.

Care for the roughly 1,000 county patients will continue at Annapolis, Garden City Osteopathic, Hutzel, Oakwood, St. Mary and Michigan Health Center. Annapolis is in Wayne, Garden City Osteopathic Hospital is in Garden City, Hutzel Hospital and Michigan Health Center are in Detroit, St. Mary is in Livonia

and Oakwood Hospital is in Dearborn.

"Many others expressed an interest but were unable to participate at this time," said Assistant Wayne County Executive Vernice Davis-Anthony. "We will continue to work toward a long-term plan that distributes clients to all OB hospitals and

expands access to care for these clients."

The county health department will continue to provide maternal support services, including transportation assistance. Additional information is available by calling the department at 467-3352.

## What to do when a buyer backs out

What recourse does a seller have when a buyer at closing does not want to go through with the sale? The seller, after notification that the mortgage was approved, started packing, took time off to move and lost income from his activities. What if the seller already had a commitment to buy another place? Is the credit rating of the defaulting buyer affected? Must the defaulting purchaser compensate the seller other than just deposit monies?

You have asked a number of questions, the answers to which depend in part on the terms and conditions of the purchase agreement. Generally, in the event of a default by a buyer, the seller is entitled to foreseeable damages that could be expected under the purchase agreement. Generally, the purchase agreement provides that the seller may maintain the earnest money deposit as liquidated damages, which basically means that the parties have agreed that in the event of a default, the amount of earnest money is deemed to be the measure of damages sustained by the seller.

But in a carefully worded purchase agreement, the seller also retains the right to pursue specific performance, that is, to make the buyer purchase the unit (which is not usually a viable remedy) or to seek actual damages incurred by the seller because of the buyer's breach. Those damages may include expenses incurred by the seller regarding the sale, potential loss of income from his activities, the difference in the marketability of the property, depending upon market conditions, and perhaps mortgage interest and the like, depending upon whether the seller committed to buy another home and must close.

It is questionable whether the credit rating of the buyer would be affected by this decision on his part unless he ends up being sued and a judgment is obtained against him. Obviously, to the extent that the parties in drafting a purchase agreement contemplate these or other situations arising, adequate provisions should be placed in the purchase agreement providing both the seller and the buyer with adequate and varied remedies in the event of a documented default by the other party.

I would like your comments on the following set of circumstances that has come to my attention as a

board member. The other board members don't seem to be too concerned. Our managing agent has been given the discretion to let certain contracts, the price for which is being set by the board. What apparently is happening is the managing agent is going out and obtaining a contract, which he signs on his own behalf with a contractor, collects the amount which we have authorized for the contract, and then apparently renegotiates the contract with the contractor and keeps the difference. Somehow I think this is wrong. Your comments?

It depends on what the management company has disclosed to the board. If the board believes that the contractor involved is going to be working for the price as initially represented to the association board, which resulted in the board providing authorization for the contract figure, and the management company then changes that figure through negotiations or duress on the contract, that is obviously an abuse of the management company's discretion and it may well be improper.

If in fact the management company is being offered a financial incentive to get cheap contracts, it is not necessarily helped by the fact that the management company is able to negotiate a cheaper contract without the association gaining the benefits of it.

It looks like the management company has found a way to pocket additional money, perhaps while lowballing the management fee to the association to get itself in the door. I think this is an extremely questionable practice and would suggest that you have your association's attorney write an opinion letter regarding the propriety of same assuming, of course, that the attorney does not have a proprietary or financial arrangement with the management company. In that case, you had better consider new legal counsel and a new management company.

## Zoning baffles homeowners

People don't have unrestricted rights to do whatever they want with their property. And there's no guarantee that a community will retain its flavor at one particular moment for all time.

Those are the big lessons Ron Figlan tries to impress upon students in his adult education class on zoning and land use at Oakland Community College.

"There are a lot of people who don't realize zoning is a binding and legal document," he said. "It controls the use of land. A lot of older people feel, 'It's my land, I pay taxes. Why can't I do what I want with it?'"

"There needs to be some control by the community so uses will be compatible," he said.

Figlan, a planning technician for the city of Troy for 20 years, has taught a six-week course at OCC for several years.

"I would go up to the counter every day (at work) and talk to real estate people," he said. "They wanted to know, 'What's zoning, how do you change it? I found myself standing up there a half-hour giving them lessons in zoning.'"

"I said, 'I wish I could talk to them all at once.' I called Lawrence Tech, OCC, Wayne State. They said they didn't have a class that offered that," Figlan said.

"OCC called back and said, 'Would you like to teach?' I said, 'Why not?'"

## OCC course seeks to set people straight

Figlan described the class as general rather than specific because procedures are different in every community. Initially set up for real estate professionals, students have included plan commissions, architects, landscapers, zoning inspectors and builders.

Figlan's course outline addresses kinds of land uses, zoning districts, variances, site plans, and municipal departments involved in the process.

"We look at a site through the eyes of the owner, the eyes of a real estate agent and the eyes of the city," he said.

Figlan spends a lot of time answering real-life questions posed by his students.

"There might be a problem with dogs or a teenage boy working on cars keeps me up all night — what do I do?" Figlan said. "They ask questions getting into concepts and philosophies, social aspects of planning. Concrete and steel vs. trees."

"I like to hear other peoples' views, their side of the story," he said. "I guess you could look at planning as very precise — a building must be set

back X amount of feet, there has to be X amount of trees.

"There's another aspect of planning, the psychological and sociological effect building has on planning in a community."

Figlan said he's surprised by how naive many people are about zoning matters.

"What I've heard often is, 'I bought this house and property behind me was nothing but trees and woods. Now you're proposing a sub behind there.'"

"What can you do to a developer who meets all the requirements for whatever zoning you're looking at? How can you deny him?" Figlan said.

Another situation that often surfaces — not enough attention is given to potential growth or change before moving in.

"A majority of people look at that house and property and take a casual look around the area and that's it. Especially if you're going to spend \$250,000 for a house, look at what's going on or what could go on."

Some property owners don't become aware of development and re-

zonings that may impact their lifestyles until it's too late to have effective input, Figlan said.

"You get in right at the beginning when it goes to the planning commission for public hearing," he said. "When you get in earlier, it's possible the planning commission may make a recommendation subject to Joe Blow's recommendation or question."

Judith Anderson, a West Bloomfield planning commissioner, recently took Figlan's class to see how other municipalities approach the planning process.

"It's a fun class for anyone interested in the community," she said. "It gives insight into what's done and why and how planning for the future is done as far as zoning, roads and things."

Dennis Randt, who accepted a job last summer as a zoning inspector for the city of Farmington Hills, took the course to get a perspective on suburban zoning issues.

"He didn't stick to zoning issues," Randt said. "He went into other issues — tax bases, assessments, etc. Land management, in general, was the most enjoyable part. He gave perspective on that."

Figlan expects to start the next session of his course in January at OCC Orchard Ridge, Farmington Hills. Contact the office of continuing education at 471-7541 for details.

## Get smart; get a smoke detector

News story after news story tells of fire fatalities that might have been prevented if smoke detectors had been in use.

Smoke detectors make a shrill warning sound when exposed to smoke. Since they are relatively inexpensive and easy to install, there is no reason any home should be without them.

Here's some basic information on buying and using these life saving devices:

"Ionization" detectors contain a tiny amount of shielded radioactive material. This material breaks air down into charged atoms through which a small current can flow. Smoke interrupts the flow of current which sets off the alarm. An ionization detector responds more quickly to the fumes of a fast-burning fire.

"Photoelectric" detectors use a small light beam which impinges on a light-sensitive photocell. The alarm sounds whenever smoke interrupts the light beam. The light bulb producing the beam lasts about three years; then it must be replaced. A photoelectric type of detector gives a faster response to smoke from a smoldering fire. It is also less prone to false alarms from innocuous kitchen fumes.

Either type of smoke detector may be powered by a battery (usually 9-volt) or house current. For effective use:

■ Test your smoke detector about once a month to make sure it's operating properly.

To test, simply press the test button on the front of the unit. The alarm (a continuous blare) will sound as long as the test button is depressed. This test automatically checks the electronic circuit, horn and battery.

If the horn does not sound, replace the battery. If it still does not sound, have the detector repaired or replaced.

■ When the smoke detector battery begins to weaken, it will sound a warning signal (usually intermittent beeps or chirps). Replace the battery immediately following the manufacturer's directions.

■ Clean your smoke detectors yearly to remove dust, grease and other soil. Where to locate:

- In halls leading to sleeping areas.
- At the heads of stairs leading to living areas.
- In your basement, but not too near the furnace.
- In the bedroom of any smoker in your family.
- On the same house level as your kitchen, but not too near your appliances since everyday cooking can easily set it off. Caution: Never turn off a smoke detector because you are cooking something that will cause it

to sound off. It's too easy to forget to turn it on again.

- Away from air currents (vents or radiators, for example), dead air corners and ends of halls.
- On the ceiling at least 20 inches from all corners or walls.
- On walls, at least 12 inches from the ceiling and the nearest corner.

Note: Don't paint the detector. Painting clogs the holes and reduces its effectiveness.





## 1990 was banner year in video

Looking back, or looking forward, there's nothing but good news for the video cassette business. Although figures aren't yet available, 1990 was a banner year with every indication of record sales and rentals for video cassette producers and distributors.

Recent theatrical motion pictures lead the list of favorites but exercise tapes and other self-improvement materials, cable TV pics and comedy programs as well as old broadcast television favorites continue to attract home entertainment dollars.

In the last category, CBS Fox Video decorated the holiday season with a long thought lost rendition of the principle cast members of "I Love Lucy" singing "Jingle Bells." The clip first aired on Christmas Eve 1951 and again the following year. Entitled "I Love Lucy's Jingle Belle," it is available on a home cassette, "I Love Lucy and The Honeymooners: A TV Christmas Present." This 52-minute tape also includes holiday episodes from "I Love Lucy" and "The Honeymooners."

A slightly different type of holiday tie-in is almost 6 1/2 hours of "Godfather I and II," boxed in a special collector's edition with a 12-page commemorative booklet and additional footage from both parts.

This may be the ticket (just under \$100) for "Godfather" devotees although it seems a bit much for a couple of gangster movies that are not considered as great as they say, at least not in this corner.

Despite the lukewarm critical response to "Look Who's Talking" when it debuted theatrically in late '89, the film cracked the \$100 million box office barrier and sold more than one million units on video cassette. Tri-Star rushed production of "Look Who's Talking Too" to take advantage of that success. Their haste was apparent in the latter film's weakness. That translates into "look for it on cassette early in the year."

Other new trends in home video programming slated for the new year include a lot more motion pictures available on laserdics and wider distribution of the newer format, 8mm video.

Both LIVE Home Video and Buena Vista Home

Video Worldwide closed out the year with announcements that they would release a number of titles in the 8mm format. Buena Vista is the Disney-Touchstone releasing company and they have an agreement with Sony to enter this new market.

Their package includes eight Touchstone titles already available on video cassette and three Walt Disney films, "The Little Mermaid" and a two-volume musical feature about Elvis Presley, "The Great Performances — Center Stage" and "The Man and the Music."

"Three Men and a Baby," "Good Morning Vietnam," "Beaches," "Cocktail," "Big Business," "Stakeout," "Splash" and "Adventures in Babysitting" are the eight Touchstone titles available since Dec. 10 in the 8mm format.

LIVE Home Video's six-title 8mm offerings, first available Nov. 1, were led by "Total Recall." The company and its children label, "Family Home Entertainment," have plans to release "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles: The Movie," an animated episode of the Mutant Ninja Turtles, "The Fabulous Baker Boys," "Air America," "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer" and "Babar: The Movie" on 8mm during the first quarter of '91.

LIVE, along with Buena Vista, is associated with Sony in this 8mm venture and they report more than 1,700 titles now available. That's not many compared to the 125,000 listed in the 1991

"Video Sourcebook," but a good start for a new format.

As competition grows and popularity of the Video Walkman TV/VCR grows, no doubt large numbers of 8mm video formatted films will become available. Certainly, they're already competitively priced with Buena Vista and LIVE titles announced in the \$20-30 range.

Another change to watch for, open pricing, was announced by Orion Home Video. Beginning in April 1991, all of their releases priced above \$30 will no longer carry a manufacturer's suggested retail price.

This suggests that competition is building in the home video marketplace and at least one company is willing to take its chance with market pressures and, of course, the wholesale price they set for their dealers.

Another new trend, sports videos combining music videos, a story line and original footage, will appear in early February with "Michael Jordan's Playground." It includes a music video, "Anything's Possible," wherein Jordan makes his musical debut. This could open up a whole new field for athletes, particularly if they're talented. Naturally, there's a promotional tie-in with Wheaties.

Finally, for those who indulge excessively during the holidays and need to lose weight but don't have the time, there's something new in exercise tapes. Wood Knapp Video announces the Jan. 4 release of "The Five-Minute Workout," an hour-long exercise tape with Sandy Duncan and choreographer Kevin Carlise.

This one's a \$3 rebate if you purchase the right crackers and is advertised and effective, exercises that can be done while shopping or waiting for a bus. Sounds intriguing but why does it take an hour tape to explain a five-minute workout?

## Vic Dunlop keeps making them laugh

Before the comedy explosion in this country, there were few television shows featuring stand-up comedy on a regular basis — the ultimate, of course, being "The Tonight Show."

That was the age before David Letterman, Arsenio Hall, HBO, Showtime and others were shows that performers in the clubs aspired to perform.

And then there was "Make Me Laugh" — a show that was truly ahead of its time.

Remember?

A game show where contestants could win fabulous cash and prizes if they could only keep from cracking a smile and laughing aloud. That premise brought out the best in a strong cast of comedians, whose job it was to keep the booty out of the contestants' hands.

Among the resident comics on the show, which ran in first-run syndication for three seasons — 1979-1981 — were standouts like Gallagher, Howie Mandel, Bruce Baum, Bill Kirchenbauer and Vic Dunlop.

Dunlop has kept busy in the years since "Make Me Laugh." He still spends about 30 weeks of the year on the national club circuit, which was only in its infancy at the time of the show's run.

"We (the stable of comics on "Make Me Laugh") actually helped create that circuit," Dunlop said in a recent interview from his home in Los Angeles.

The big, boisterous Dunlop has also made appearances in five feature films, including "Meatballs 2."

"The film stunk, but I was great in it," Dunlop said with a chuckle.

His current television credits include a "Showtime Comedy All-

Stars" special with Detroit's own Tim Allen, Arts & Entertainment's "An Evening at the Improv," and regular appearances on the now-defunct game show "Win, Lose or Draw."

A significant portion of Dunlop's time these days is devoted to his video production company, appropriately titled VDTV.

"I'm delighted," Dunlop said. Headquartered in Burbank, Dunlop and a staff of about eight writers and technical people work on various projects, including a new line of video comedy greeting cards.

"For a good gag greeting card today, you're likely to pay \$3-\$4," Dunlop explained. "For a few more bucks, you can get them a gift."

These "cards" are three- to five-minute videotapes and feature Dunlop in various vignettes. He's dressed as a nurse for the "Get Well" card and Cupid in the "Love" card.

At this time, there are about a dozen video cards, and Dunlop handles his own distribution, making deals with outlets in the town he plays in and selling them after performances.

Eventually, if the idea takes off, he would like to cut a distribution deal with Hallmark or another major greeting card company, while maintaining control over the creation and production of future video cards.

While Dunlop claims to have grown up as a person (he has been married for seven years and has inherited two children from the marriage), he still can be a crazy man on stage.

And he promises originality and zaniness for his holiday appearance in Detroit, which includes special New Year's Eve shows.

## Holiday films disappoint at the box office

Don't look for any new films until Jan. 11. Even Hollywood needs a breather after its double pump action with a multitude of Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday releases.

Many of those films are disappointing the studios and Warner's leads the list. "Bonfire of the Vanities," taking in \$40 million price tag, opened poorly, with just over \$3 million its first week. That's not promising. Neither was the critical response.

Another major motion picture from Warner Bros., "The Rookie," co-written by area resident Scott Spiegle, also fared poorly with the critics and the box office, garnering a mere \$14 million in three weeks.

None of the other recent releases are performing all that well either. "Godfather III" is the only new film with significant enthusiasm. It opened Christmas Day and the financial word isn't in yet.

It's indicative of the problems motion picture producers face in the new year when \$14 million at the box office is described as "mere" or "paltry." Each year during the '80s unprecedented box office boom, production costs and ticket prices rose constantly. But so did box office receipts and the Hollywood express careened on down the tracks. "Bigger and better" — always the Hollywood motto — was their major business philosophy in the '80s.

Now, with economic problems rising, the first deflation reported in more than 40 years and the threat of war, Hollywood may have to face the new year with a more austere approach. Mega-million dollar deals

and exorbitant production costs may be history. Already resistance to rising ticket prices is climbing as more and more people wait for motion pictures to appear in video cassette.

The economics of renting a \$3 tape for the whole family are clearly more attractive than \$6 tickets. Week in and week out, the video cassette rental charts are dominated by recent theatrical motion pictures. Need for more money may force Hollywood studios to raise their prices to video cassette distributors. That, in turn, will elevate tape rental charges although not enough to challenge \$6 at the box office.

Whatever the '90s bring, clearly the '80s were a golden decade for Hollywood. And 1989 set the all-time box office record with \$5 billion plus and 1990 should come even closer or even equal that figure. Although the initial response to recent new movies has been light, a terrific Christmas week has the potential to push 1990 into record-breaking territory.

Whatever the bottom line for '91, have a safe and happy holiday with all our best wishes for health and peace in the new year.

**W**ounded American industry, anxious to win back customers and confront competitors globally, has aimed at the elusive target called quality and claimed some successes in recent years. But many workers feel left out of the quest.

A credibility gap exists between company talk and company action, according to a Gallup survey this year of more than 1,000 American employees, which was funded by the American Society for Quality Control (ASQC).

While half of the workers surveyed said that their company proclaims quality as extremely important, only slightly more than a third believed their company followed through well. Almost as many workers are dissatisfied (25 percent) with quality improvement efforts at their companies as are satisfied (29 percent).

Perhaps most telling, two out of three employees said they have been asked to be involved in decisions, but only 14 percent believe they are completely empowered to make those decisions.

And ASQC president, John J. Knappenberger, with more than 20 years in the quality field, doesn't dispute the findings.

"I'm not surprised the quality message hasn't reached everyone," said Knappenberger, also vice president for quality for the automotive division of TRW, Southfield.

The overall survey results, Knappenberger said, reveal two key problems: the need by both manufacturing and service industries to embrace a new definition of quality and adopt management styles that don't waste human resources.

"Traditionally, quality has been defined by specifications and by the manufacturer. Actually, the manufacturer doesn't define quality; the customer does," Knappenberger said. He added that "quality was traditionally seen as a product, but

quality is everything we do."

Not only does the customer define quality in today's world, but its definition keeps evolving. Companies must anticipate and keep ahead of customer expectations to succeed.

"This concept of quality extends beyond manufacturing and has been transformed into all areas of business," Knappenberger said. "We all believe that we deal with customers well, but how many employees have actual contact with people? In manufacturing, it's a very small number. Even in service industries, it's still a small percentage of the whole."

Knappenberger gave the example of trying to check in at a hotel, only to find that the computer is down. We vent our frustrations at the hotel clerk, Knappenberger said, but "the actual decision to shut down the computer was made by an employee elsewhere, distant from actual customer contact."

Such employees as the computer controller must have an understanding of real customer needs, Knappenberger said. "Too many people inside organizations don't understand the linkage to external customers."

Knappenberger does claim some recent American success stories, citing companies like Xerox, Milliken

and Co., and the Cadillac Division of General Motors as having quality and customer satisfaction as business fundamentals. All have won the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Awards, established by Congress in 1987 and administered in part by ASQC.

But only 37 percent of the workers surveyed this year think that the United States is gaining on foreign competitors. In contrast, 51 percent of executives polled in 1989 by Gallup for ASQC said the United States was gaining on foreign competition.

Knappenberger believes the new concepts of quality demand new leadership styles and skills from management.

"Employees want to be involved. We talk a good game but we really don't empower employees," he said.

His message to managers: Give up some power. Let individuals use their creative juices. Be a coach or facilitator rather than an inspector or checker.

"We need to get all people involved and empowered. We can no longer mandate people to improve quality; we have to excite them. Those in leadership roles have to be willing to give up some control and have faith in the results."

While Knappenberger said that this should lead to better quality and more fulfilled employees, he conceded that "this is a whole different flavor for management than in the past. It is like the first lieutenant asking, 'How can I take that hill?'"

Such an approach, Knappenberger said should enhance a new perception of quality as "things gone right," rather than just what meets expectations or specifications.

"We all want something more. We can all get more together if we all work together, going for win-win situations rather than win-lose situations. The win-win mentality adds value to employees, companies and society," Knappenberger said. Something else that employees want more of is job skills training, mentioned by 21 percent of surveyed employees as the most important way companies can make it easier for them to do high quality work.

Knappenberger agrees, but again stresses the importance of mindset, adding that training is different from education. He said that while industry can train workers in specific job skills, they must have the educational skills to learn and think for themselves.

"In the past, we had a throwaway society. The work force is getting smaller and smaller at the same time as the jobs are getting more and more demanding. The year 2000 work force is in the field; the year 2010 work force is in school."

Addressing education problems in the United States, Knappenberger said that "everyone, it appears, wants to pay the buck. It will take concerned people to get involved toward a common goal."

Knappenberger sees the problem much like his analogy of the first lieutenant and the hill.

"Throughout school we are treated and graded as individuals but the workplace is a team effort. Yet we are rewarded traditionally as individuals. We need to start grading as teams."

## Michigan S & Ls stay healthy

Savings and loan conversion activity in Michigan probably will be limited to a few isolated cases — mainly because there are relatively few thrifts in the state, but also because state thrifts are by and large healthy.

According to Gary Mielock, deputy director of the Michigan Financial Institutions Bureau, there have been only three applications from federally chartered thrifts — including Franklin Savings Bank — to convert to state chartered banks.

"There will be more (thrifts applying for conversion), but not many," Mielock said. "The main reason is there aren't a lot of thrifts in Michigan."

There are only two state chartered thrifts in Michigan, neither of which have applied for conversion, and 40 federally chartered thrifts.

Procedurally, the conversion from federally chartered thrift to state chartered bank is different than federally chartered thrift to federally chartered bank, Mielock said.

Federally chartered thrifts must first convert to state thrifts before converting to a state chartered bank, while the conversion to federally chartered bank is ap-

parently a direct conversion, he said. Mielock said Franklin Savings does not need a state charter in addition to a federal charter, but may follow through with its application in case the federal charter — which has been conditionally granted — is denied.

The state charter/federal charter system was established to ensure a check and balance, Mielock said, the argument being that if one charter authority becomes too harsh, it will offer a choice to the financial institution. "If we become too lenient, it can be measured against the other and we expose ourselves to some of the things that happened (in the savings and loan industry)."

"Michigan has taken no position on savings and loans converting to banks," he said. "Or for that matter, we haven't taken a position on banks converting to thrifts — whatever the request, we'll process it as the rules allow."

Michigan Financial Institutions Bureau regulatory analyst Darwin Sanborn said there is little difference between a state chartered and a federally chartered bank, so conversion from a thrift is largely a matter of personal preference.

"Do you want to be called a nationally chartered or federally chartered bank?" he asked. "The differences are so minor that the general public wouldn't see them."

Sanborn said it's not clear if there will be a wholesale conversion of thrifts to banks in the next decade, mainly because there is less of a need for conversion from thrift to bank in Michigan. Michigan's financial institutions are healthier than those in other parts of the country, he said.

If a thrift does wish to convert, it will probably be for the options being a bank can offer, rather than the stigma of being a "savings and loan," he said.

Recently published reports in financial and general readership publications show Michigan and Ohio as having some of the most stable financial institutions in the country.

"The percentage of loans that are repossessed in Michigan is the second lowest in the nation," he said. "Our lenders have proven to be more conservative," he said. Because of Michigan's and the Midwest's more cyclical economy, financial institution managers approached investment opportunities more cautiously.

## Franklin is approved for conversion

Franklin Savings Bank's decision to convert from a savings and loan to a bank should benefit everyone involved, from the smallest depositor to the largest stockholder.

Franklin has branches in Southfield, Birmingham and Grosse Pointe.

"I can't think of any reason not to (convert from a savings and loan to a bank)," said Franklin Savings Bank vice president of corporate communications Rebecca Christian.

Since the passage of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery and Enforcement Act of 1978, the benefits of being a savings and loan no longer exist, Christian said. "Financial institutions might as well become banks to benefit from the advantages such a move offers."

Stockholders will benefit from an appreciation of stock value, she said. "Because banks will be able to make more diversified investments, and because of the public perception that banks are more stable, a bank stock will be more attractive than a thrift stock."

It therefore stands to reason that Franklin Savings Bank stock will increase in value if it converts to a bank. Even if that does not occur, the regulations affecting savings and loans will not cause a bank's stock to depreciate.

Depositors stand to benefit because — if they believe the perception that banks are more secure than thrifts — they can be confident their money is safe, Christian said.

Borrowers, Christian continued, will benefit because they will have a

wider pool of competing institutions offering loans — especially when one of those competitors in an aggressive financial institution like Franklin Savings that has its eyes set on steady growth in the coming years.

"We have the capital to compete with larger banks, but are small enough to offer small bank services," she said. Institutions with reserved growth strategies would be hard pressed to build assets of more than \$400 million in the seven years Franklin has been in existence, Christian said.

And finally, employees benefit by having the burden of extensive reporting and regulations removed. "As we saw it, if we were going to have (basically) the same requirements as banks, we ought to operate as a





# MONDAY FOOD

## Chef Larry Janes

### Quick recipes let you enjoy your own party

Live it now and then, we foodies need to be kneaded a little. Must be all that yeast, flour, good food and wine that so often "goes to our heads."

At one of my favorite restaurants last weekend, I ran into a faithful reader who commented on the fact that all I ever write about are "elaborate" foods and ideas that few working people have the time or energy to create.

Well, you asked for it. Just when you needed it the most, here are some basic holiday tips the Janes Gang uses to make life in the kitchen just a little more comfortable and less hectic.

First, never underestimate the qualities of a good meatloaf. Most folks look at this recession staple as a Tuesday night dinner. At my house, we use a basic meat loaf recipe and use it to stuff mushroom caps, wrap in puff pastry or phyllo dough (precooked) or make meatballs, which are mixed with equal parts of grape jelly and chili sauce for a tasty hot appetizer.

If there's ever any left, we crush it up and mix it with taco seasoning for a topping on nachos. Never has one food item served to be so versatile. It's freezable, microwavable, but most of all, inexpensively easy.

Everyone has their 15 minutes of fame and adulation, or so Andy Warhol says. But as for me, I'm just waiting for some fancy food magazine to ask me to name three ingredients in my cupboards.

Because so much of our entertaining is the non-planned kind, open up my cupboard and you'll find at least two cans of "exotic" vegetables along with an expanse of different oils.

The vegetables are kept for foodie emergencies like the time when, out of desperation, I opened a can of artichoke hearts, drained them and mixed with equal parts of mayonnaise and Parmesan cheese.

The mixture was then plopped into a small pie plate and baked at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. A hot, aromatic and thoroughly pleasing hot dip that was at home with french toast points or Ritz crackers.

Ditto for that can of garbanzo beans that can be blended or finely chopped and mixed with some finely chopped onion, a little oil, salt and pepper for a humus-type cold spread that when dipped with pitas from the freezer and heated in the oven can be a godsend for the busy homemaker.

Speaking of freezers, mine has never made it through the holidays without a constant supply of unsliced French-type bread. This is the stuff that can be taken from the freezer still frozen, sliced lengthwise and brushed with either olive oil, vegetable oil or nut oil and sprinkled with dried basil (fresh chopped is even better but not mandatory).

Add some Parmesan and, if available, paper-thin slices of tomato for a homemade hot bruschetta that can be sliced into wafers, plated and passed as a hot appetizer that will warm anyone's heart.

Sitting next to the Campbell's Cream of Mushroom soup that, when heated and mixed with two cups shredded cheese, turns into a hearty cheese fondue is the ever-present can of refried beans. Old El Paso makes a regular refried bean with lard, and a vegetarian variety.

Either one can be spread onto a large heat-proof platter and then ringed with shredded cheese, chopped onion, chopped and drained canned tomatoes and a sprinkling of cumin and garlic powder for a nacho-type dip calling for more.

So if you think that entertaining has to be planned out with ample dollar and time outlays, think again. Entertaining should be a time of fun and only you can make it that way.

#### MINI MEAT LOAF WELLINGTONS

##### basic meat loaf

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup tomato sauce or ketchup
- 1/2 cup crushed cracker crumbs
- 1 small clove garlic, finely chopped
- salt and pepper to taste

Combine all ingredients and mix well. Shape into a loaf pan and bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes.

##### To make Wellingtons:

- 1 meat loaf, precooked
- 1 package frozen puff pastry dough
- 1 cup finely chopped mushrooms
- 1 cup grated cheese

Cut meat loaf into 2 by 2-inch squares. Cut puff pastry sheets into 4 by 4-inch squares. Place a cube of meat loaf in center of each puff pastry. Top with a tablespoon of chopped mushroom and a tablespoon of shredded cheese. Bring ends of puff pastry together and place seam-side down on a baking sheet. Brush with egg white or milk and bake at 375 degrees for 10-15 minutes or until golden. Makes about 24.

#### HOT ARTICHOKE DIP

- 1 can artichoke hearts, drained (not marinated variety)
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Chop artichoke hearts. Combine with remaining ingredients. Mix well. Place in baking dish and put in a 350-degree oven for 30 minutes or until hot and bubbly. Can be broiled for 10 minutes. Chef's secret: Try adding in crumbled cooked bacon. If no artichokes are available, try substituting one grated onion. This mixture can be spread on crackers or bread and then broiled individually, if desired.

## Fond of fondue?

### Try dipping into a different dessert

Want good food, good fun and good company for entertaining? Why not try a dessert fondue party?

It is fun, informal and can be done on the spur of the moment for those last-minute parties or when surprise guests drop by.

A fondue party is a great way to entertain. It's a perfect opportunity to get together and renew old friendships as well as make new ones.

Fondue is simple to prepare and can be done in advance, allowing you to get out of the kitchen and enjoy both your guests and their conversation. Your friends can also join in the preparation by dividing these tasks among the group.

The classic Swiss fondue, made from melted cheese, was the rage in the 1960s and early 1970s in many American households.

Fondue pots were also filled with melted chocolate in which pound cake and strawberries were dipped for dessert. As the novelty wore off, fondue sets took a back seat on kitchen shelves, only to come out once in a while for nostalgia's sake.

We are beginning to see the fondue set once again because of its convenience. More new and different recipes, ranging from appetizers to desserts, are being created.

Imagine new twists on the classic fondues. For instance, instead of plunging a juicy ripe strawberry to a pot of melted chocolate, a moist cube of chocolate cake can be dipped into a warmed fruited sauce. The classic chocolate fondue will remain the granddaddy of dessert fondue with more and more accompaniments for dipping — for example, peppermint sticks, festive for the holiday season.

Fresh fruits, such as apples, strawberries and bananas, are usually served along with pound cake for a dessert fondue. But to make it special, try such serving suggestions as whole dried fruit, or one of the "new" fruits: carabola stars, kiwi and mango. You can also use meringue, macaroons, brownies, mini cupcakes and sponge cake to dip

#### BUTTERSCOTCH FONDUE

- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 2 egg yolks
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon cornstarch
- 6 tablespoons butter, cut into pieces

In a fondue pot, whisk together the brown sugar, cream and the egg yolks. Continue whisking the mixture on the stove top over medium-high heat until the mixture is hot. Continue whisking for five minutes. Remove from heat. Add vanilla.

In a separate bowl, mix the cornstarch with two tablespoons of milk. Add the cornstarch mixture to the brown sugar mixture. Return to heat and whisk until thickened. Remove the mixture from the stove and stir in butter. Place butterscotch over low heat at the table.

#### WARM BERRY FONDUE

- 1 pint berries (strawberry, raspberry, blueberry, etc.) rinsed and poked over
- 1/2 cup fruit-flavored liquor
- 2 tablespoons sugar

Puree the ingredients in the food processor or blender and gently warm over low heat at the table. Note: Frozen berries may be substituted for fresh fruit.

#### AMARETTO FONDUE

- 1 1/2 cup half and half
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 2 egg yolks, beaten
- 1/2 cup Amaretto

In the fondue pot mix the half and half, sugar, cornstarch and egg yolks. Warm the mixture gently on the stove whisking constantly until it coats the wire whisk. Remove from the stove. Add the Amaretto. Stir and place fondue over low heat at the table.

Note: Almond extract may be added if you do not wish to use Amaretto.

#### WHITE CHOCOLATE-HAZELNUT FONDUE

- 1/2 cup hazelnuts, coarsely chopped
- 12 ounces white chocolate
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 cup hazelnut liquor, such as Frangico

Toast hazelnuts on a sheet pan in a 350 degree oven for 8-10 minutes or until golden brown (watch the nuts carefully, they may burn easily).

Break up chocolate and place in the fondue pot. Add the heavy cream and heat slowly, stirring constantly, until the chocolate melts. Stir in the toasted hazelnuts and liquor. Remove from stove and place on burner at the table over low heat.

in the warmed sauces.

Try strips of puffed pastry lightly sprinkled with sugar to serve as an alternative. I also suggest cutting up that fruit cake you received as a gift and those holiday cookies, sugar or gingerbread men will do, to make it a little more festive for the holiday season. Place them next to the fondue pot and watch them disappear, along with the other accompaniments.

Try some condiments such as chopped nuts and toasted coconut for rolling your dipped fruit or confections in. This adds a different texture and treat to your fondue.

While fondues are simple to make, here are a few general hints you might want to keep in mind when preparing your dessert fondue. Be sure that the temperature, or

flame, is set low so that the sauce is warm enough without burning the fondue.

Also, when making the fondue that calls for egg yolk, be sure that you continue to whisk the mixture while on the stove so that the yolks do not scramble while heating. (The egg white may be used to make meringue for dipping.)

Try limiting your party to a small number so it remains intimate and more informal. Fondue is conducive to small numbers (4-6 people per pot) allowing enough room for the forks in each pot.

What my friends and I do is use more than one fondue pot so that we are able to have more than one type of fondue at our gatherings. Offer your guests coffee, a nice dessert wine or cordials when the festivities begin.

### The spice is right if it's from the East

In an earlier column I wrote about the virtues of herbs. Herbs are the aromatic leaves and sometimes flowers of plants, usually of temperate origin. Herbs are not plentiful in the colder months, making spices more popular due to their availability.

A spice is defined as a natural product which are the dried seeds, buds, fruit or flower parts, bark or roots of plants, usually of tropical origin. To put it more simply, herbs are fresh and spices are dried. The countries from which they originate differ in temperature, herbs from neutral climates and spices from hot, humid areas of the globe.

Today we take spices for granted. They are a reach away from the dish we are preparing or readily available at the local grocery store. Yet, throughout recorded history spices have played a role in man's fate. The phrase "Spice of Life" conjures images of romance and adventure — not cooking.

The first experiences man had with spices likely occurred 50,000 years ago when wrapping meat in leaves to protect it from the fire and ashes. Much to their delight people discovered different leaves imparted varied flavors. Early food was often spoiled and unpalatable by the time it was eaten, so this discovery was pleasing at the least. Spices made it possible to eat food that would otherwise be unpalatable.

The doctors of ancient Rome and Greece discovered the medicinal value of spices. Wine mulled with spices and honey was thought to be effective in treating many illnesses. Spices also became important in religion and remain so today as evidenced by the use of incense.

Generally speaking, the most important spices come from the East, specifically from India, Ceylon and the Spice Islands. Spice trade can be traced back to the ancient Greece. Spices were brought from their sources to main ports in India and shipped by camel to Syria.

The bible has numerous references to this spice trade. The Queen of Sheba bore camels of spices as gifts when she visited King Solomon and Joseph was sold to spice traders when he betrayed his brothers.

As the Greek and Roman colonizers spread throughout Europe so did their knowledge of spices. Very quickly their value was recognized and spices were used in trade and war. For several centuries after the decline of the Roman Empire spice trade ceased.

The Arabs resumed the trading of spices and for several hundred years enjoyed a complete monopoly. Gradually, Europeans rediscovered the sources of spices. Famous travelers such as Marco Polo and Columbus disclosed practical routes to the spice centers and soon every major European port became a hub for spice trade.

For years the dockworkers of London had their pockets sewn shut to prevent the pilfering of the exotic cargo they unloaded. The first pure food law in history was an English ordinance passed in 1447 prohibiting the adulteration of spices. Yale University is the result of an endowment from Elihu Yale's fortune made from spice trade.

America's involvement with spice bartering began in the early 19th century as the clipper ships traveled to far away ports. So many journeys were made that the supply of pepper corns was greater than the demand for the first time in history. Prices fell, drastically affecting many businesses.

In 1835 American settlers in Texas developed chili powder by combining different dried peppers from Mexico. Immigrants from many lands brought their distinctively flavored dishes to America. Soldiers returning from World War II brought home a taste for Oriental, Mediterranean and Italian foods.

Today's modern methods for growing, drying, packaging and shipping have made a wide variety of spices available at reasonable prices.

When cooking, spices, like all seasonings should enhance, not overpower, the exceptions being chilies and curries. Start with a pinch and add more as needed. It is impossible to fix overspiced foods.

Spices make it possible for you to serve a variety of interesting foods. They need not be exotic or expensive. Well seasoned food is food that has been made to taste good without any predominating flavor. Let your imagination be your guide.



**ABC dives into swimming coverage**





# Cable Comments

I dedicate this column to Judy Kral, a Plymouth resident, who has been our Administrative Assistant

for the Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission for the past seven and one half years. Judy has just retired from her position but her contributions will remain as we continue to promote and develop new strategies to attract a greater television audience. We have always brainstormed because we have always appreciated each others ideas. The simplest idea can lead to another helpful idea. Over the years Judy would always surprise me as I conducted my administrative business, with new ways for us to reach more people. She would use her natural creative talents to come up with ideas and she would also develop a plan of action. She even began editing our SWOCC newsletter. Any one of our staff could be seen walking through our halls asking for variations on specific ideas.

When one does produce a television show it is easy to get caught up in the production itself. Please take note to have someone other than yourself plan to prepare the publicity. If you must, do it yourself, take the time to map out a plan of action. Here are several considerations:

- Determine who your target audience is. It may be as large as the metropolitan area or as specific as your neighborhood association, a classroom of children or a specific age or interest area.

- Next find out if this target group already has access to some existing publicity tools... for example a church bulletin, an organizations newsletter, flyers from school to parents, an-

other television show or a radio program.

- Appeal to your Community Television Organization for a grant to cover design and printing costs. Also consider asking an organization with similar objectives to donate to your non-profit volunteer project.

- Write our a Press Release. Keep it simple and interesting. Just the facts man! Let the writers fill in the more detailed information. Send the press release to the periodicals and tabloids covering the target audience area.

- Prepare a thank you flyer for your crew, guests and studio audience s well as passers by. Keep it simple, with a eye catching picture that will tell the title of your show, guests and topic. CHANNEL. DAY AND TIME!!!

- If you have an ongoing series your Community Access Center may be interested in consolidating several series and sending out a Direct Mailer. We have found that this form of advertisement is very effective.

- Take advantage of all the wonderful video footage which you have just shot. Listen to your audio track as well and create a 30 second promo for your show. This can be scheduled in between other shows. Use your audio track for a radio promo.

- David Zmich of Omnicom says that 'when the truck rolls... or the cameras are set up they get tons of calls'. "When is the show going to be aired" they ask. Producers should wear your shows personalized T-shirts and have those flyers ready.

Remember, how exciting it is to recognize someone you know while watching tv. Don't discount this... You and your guests are exciting, especially to those who know you.

- Prepare an even shorter an-

nouncement to go on the alpha numeric channels of the Cable lineup. Alert the intended audience. People do read these!!! Omnicom has such announcements on Channel 15 when there is not video programming scheduled. MetroVision has its Community Bulletin board on Channel 3.

Most importantly is the time element. Be serious about your show before anything goes out and follow through on this personal commitment. The press does not take lightly to missed deadlines nor to inaccurate information. The Cable Companies' Community Access Staff provides the weekly schedule to the Newspapers and TV Guide at least two weeks in advance. Frankly this time schedule helps one to be more organized and adds incentive to follow through beyond the 'shoot in the studio.'

Therefore, we all thank a person like Judy Kral who took her responsibilities so seriously. She also added a creative dimension which enhanced everyone's effectiveness and success. Look around you and share your ideas in television, and watch your audience grow!

# 'Dark Shadows' returns to TV as miniseries, series

## Jean Simmons plays Collins matriarch

### Dirk Benedict discovered acting on a college buddy's dare

**A:** Dirk Benedict was born in White Sulphur Springs, Mont., on March 1, 1944. There was nothing in his hometown to turn a young man's fancy toward Hollywood or Broadway. Instead, his time was filled with hunting, fishing, skiing and high school athletics. He discovered acting when, on a dare from a fellow Whitman College freshman, he tried out for the lead in the school's production of *Show Boat*. After graduating with a liberal arts degree, he enrolled at the John Fernald Academy of Dramatic Arts in Rochester, Mich., for a two-year training program. He later moved to New York where he appeared in several plays on Broadway and with a touring company. His first movie was *Georgia, Georgia*, filmed in Sweden. He starred in *SSSSSSSS* and in *W* with Twiggy. He made his television debut as a guest lead on *Hawaii Five-O*. Benedict was quickly acknowledged by the television industry as one of its most promising newcomers. His television series include *Battlestar Galactica*, *Chopper One* and *The A-Team*. He makes his home in the San Fernando Valley area of Los Angeles. A licensed pilot, he spends his leisure time flying.

He continues appearing in live theater and made-for-television movies. His new dramatic series, *Under Cover*, will be previewed this Monday on ABC. The series will premiere on Saturday, Jan. 12. He and his wife, actress Jennifer Evans, make their home in New York City.
