Arson blamed for damaging blaze

Arson caused a Jan. 30 blaze that did over \$200,000 damage to a state administration building in Northville Township, a state fire marshal investigator said Friday.

Township firefighters last Wednesday evening battled and extinguished a fire at Wayne Community Living Services, 15480 Sheldon Road at Five Mile. The fire started in a forms room and caused extensive smoke and heat damage, township Assistant Fire Chief Rick Rosselle said.

The fire broke out after work hours and no employees were hurt in the blaze, but three township firefighters suffered minor injuries, a fire department spokesperson said.

The fire was an arsonist's work, officials said. "We've determined the fire was intentionally set," said Det. Sgt. Michael Malloy of the Michigan State Police Fire Marshal Division. "It was definitely set; we're looking for a motive."

The fire marshal's office has not isolated the exact

cause of the fire, Malloy said. He said no accelerants — liquids used to start fires — were present at the scene, but wiring flaws or other electrical mishaps were ruled out.

"It's hard to speculate on what they used (but) a lighter or matches could have been involved," he said.

No suspects had been identified by press time Friday, Malloy said. The investigation will continue.

"We will be following up on it," he said. "We'll be interviewing people and compiling information."

Wayne Community Living Services is a branch of the state Department of Mental Health and deals primarily with Wayne County group home coordination and regulation. The damaged portion of the building housed counselors and psychologists, said Director James Dehem.

The cause of the fire was a surprise to Dehem.

"I'm visibly upset by this act," he said. "I believed investigators were looking for structural problems as the cause."

Dehem said early estimates indicated damages in excess of \$200,000. Clean-up costs will top \$20,000, he

said.

Dehem said his office is involved in the arsonist search.

"I can tell you we're checking into former employees and contractors who (formerly dealt) with us," he said. "And we're looking at the possibility of strangers, people just walking in."

"It was a very ludicrous idea; I don't understand it," he said.

The fire started in a room used to store paper forms, Dehem said. Few or no client records were lost, he said.

State employee Elaine Canner, a psychologist, reported the fire just before 7 p.m.

Canner said she was walking through the building with mail for another department when she smelled smoke.

"I turned off the copier because I thought that was what I smelled," she said. "I wasn't even sure it was smoke."

But smoke was rolling out of the building by the time firefighters arrived minutes later.

Township firefighter/paramedic Guy Balok said "very intense heat" turned into "super-heated steam" when firefighters sprayed the blaze.

Steam caused first- and second-degree burns to firefighter Ronald Rosselle.

"I was the nozzle man and was on my knees when I hit the fire," Rosselle said. "The fire was in a closed room and there was no place for the heat to go."

"The heat from the flames jumped out and hit my face," he said. "In 13 years, it's the first time I've ever been hurt."

Rosselle was treated and released from St. Mary Hospital in Livonia for burns to his face and right thigh.

Also injured were Rick Rosselle (struck in the left side of the face by a falling metal shell) and firefighter Bill Zimendak (injured left elbow).

For retiring fire Chief Robert Toms, the fire marked his last significant action with the township.

"What a way to go out," he said.

Mother helps others

Nancy Lewis knows the tragic reality of military involvement.

The Northville woman has felt the pain of having a son join the armed forces only to return home in a flag-draped casket.

Her son, Richard Lewis, was one of 47 sailors killed by a gun turret explosion aboard the USS Iowa April 19, 1989.

That fact has made Lewis sensitive to the feelings and fears of families with relatives fighting in the Persian Gulf.

To help other military families through their potential grief, and to help them cut through the bureaucracy that surrounds even as tragic an event as a death, she has compiled some of her experiences and the experiences of the other families who lost sons aboard the Iowa that day.

The resulting 11-page letter details the techniques that the Iowa families have used to work through their grief and to get on with their lives.

First copies of the letter, dated January 1991, were addressed to "Desert Shield families." As Operation Desert Shield has changed to Operation Desert Storm, the need for Nancy Lewis's grim advice has become that much more acute.

"It is natural to bury our parents, not our children. The child we brought into this world so that the future would know we were here is now gone," Lewis wrote.

"I am hoping that the following information will never be of any use to anyone," she wrote. But with 12 U.S. soldiers reported killed in action through Friday, nine declared missing in action and eight prisoners of war, not to mention allied troop losses and the dozens of military personnel killed in accidents before the war even began, that hope is tragically forlorn.

Lewis also spoke before a recent meeting of Northville's West Side Chapter of the Michigan Military Family Support Group shortly after the war began Jan. 16, giving worried family members practical advice about the military and the way it operates. She cautioned them not to

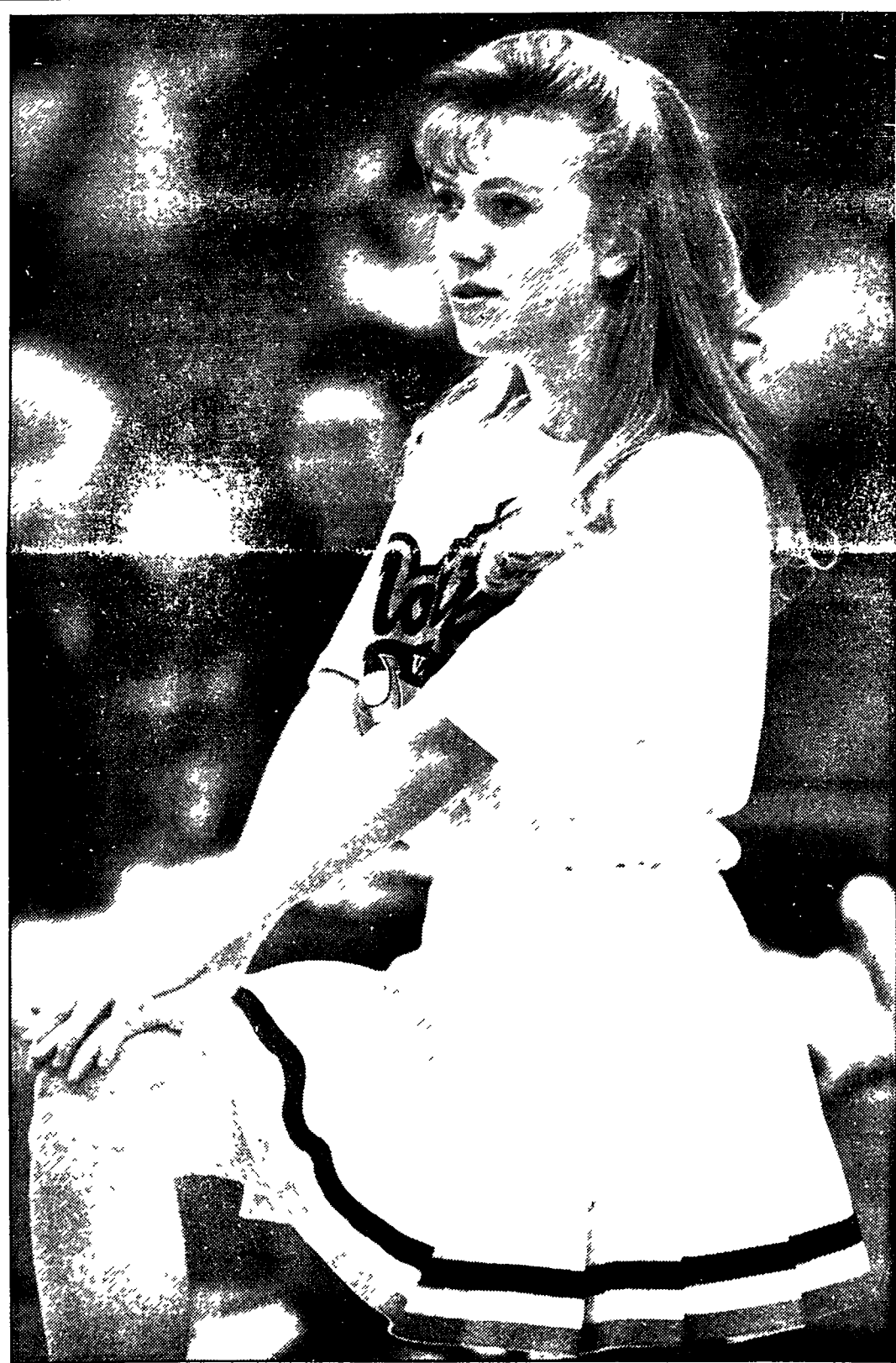

Speaker talks on challenges of the future

If we play our cards right, the future can be brighter than the deficit, unemployment rate, and overall slumping economy might indicate, futurist David Pearce Snyder told Northville residents Tuesday.

Snyder was invited to Northville by a district Strategic Plan committee searching for an alternative to the current school day at Northville High School.

Tuesday, Snyder discussed the future, and the role schools can play in preparing the country for the 21st Century.

Northville schools are up to the challenge, Assistant Superintendent for Instructional Services Dolly McMaster said in concluding the evening. The district has a "formidable" task ahead, she said.

Part of the task will be getting more people involved, she said. "This audi-

torium should be packed this evening," McMaster said.

School officials are learning that "good is not good enough," McMaster said. And Northville schools will not be afraid of the changes that will be needed "to help move this nation into the future," she said.

But changes will be carefully thought out. And no changes will be made "unless the pluses far outweigh the minuses," McMaster said.

Snyder told about 100 Northville residents that the last decade of this century, the 1990s, will be eventful if nothing else.

"There isn't going to be any question that the '90s are going to be dramatic. I mean — bang — we started off with a war," Snyder said.

Rising foreign competition and decreasing productivity will lower the standard of living for most Americans if individuals and institutions are not able to better apply information to

Meeting on Shores development set

Township officials will meet with representatives of D & T Construction, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, and township engineering consultants Wednesday regarding the troubled Shores of Northville residential development.

The meeting is an attempt to seek solutions to erosion problems caused by relocation of a tiny stream on the former Thomson Sand and Gravel property south of Seven Mile Road and between Beck and Ridge roads.

Erosion caused by stream redirection has gutted a nearly 200 foot stretch of land owned by neighboring property owners.

"The meeting is to determine what corrective action D & T Construction is proposing for the Sump Drain," township Supervisor Georgina Goss said.

D & T Construction of Mt. Clemens began a reclamation project on the gravel pit site soon after purchasing the land in 1989.

Early last summer, the company's agents redirected Sump Drain, a feeder creek that stretches through the western portion of the township, under Ridge Road, and into the gravel pit area.

The move was an attempt to hasten the restoration process, but township engineering consultants and the township zoning board of appeals determined the firm had overstepped reclamation guidelines and ordered D & T to stop work.

The state DNR also notified the developer on June 6 that the Sump Drain redirection violated the state Inland Lakes and Streams Act and ordered the developer to halt "unauthorized activity and submit a plan of restoration of the site," according to a letter from the DNR to the developer.

The developer grudgingly stopped work at the site, but did not forward applications to the DNR.

Early this year, erosion on the development site spawned massive erosion on neighboring properties. The zoning board of appeals terminated the reclamation agreement in order to gain control of the site, but directed the developer to submit plans to the DNR to rectify the problem.

The developer had 30 days to appeal the township's action and show progress with the restoration.

Wednesday's meeting is not open to the public. Carol Maise, township planning and zoning administrator, and Mick Kruszewski, chief building official, will represent the township at the talks. Agents for the developer, plus DNR officials and engineers with township consultant firm Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May will also attend.

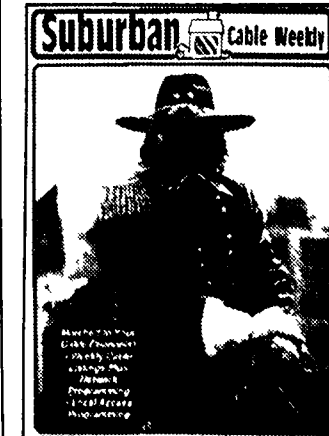

Speaker challenges schools to meet the future

their work.

"We are faced not just with a rising tide of foreign competition. We are faced with a tidal wave of foreign competition," Snyder said.

An increasing number of jobs will be available for the workers of the future, Snyder said, but the new jobs mainly will be in low-paying fields.

"It begins to raise the question: Where the hell is the silver lining in this future, especially for educators?"

Educators are asking why they should be teaching kids to lead fulfilling lives when they will be forced to work in unfulfilling jobs, Snyder said.

Technology was thought to be the answer in the 1980s, Snyder said, but technology has not been an economic cure-all.

"Paperwork went up even though we have computers," Snyder said

"Those of you who think computers are phonies, well, the data bears you out."

But the future is not all doom and gloom for Americans. With a little patience, technology may still be the light at the end of the tunnel if educators can train their students to use it.

"The tunnel is a lot longer than anyone thought when we went into it," Snyder said.

Studies of the last economic revolution, when the economy converted from steam power to electromechanical power, showed that "you do not retol an entire economy overnight. It takes 40-50 years," Snyder said.

And a changing economy should expect the general levels of economic well-being to dip before they rise, he said.

"Eventually, we learn to use all that equipment, and, by golly, our prosperity goes up again," Snyder

said.

He said by the mid-1990s the number of jobs will begin to increase in America and by the year 2010 "the rising tide will lift most of our boats."

But today's young people are not yet prepared to lead the country to prosperity, and that is where the education system comes in, Snyder said.

"A growing share of young adults in our economy are so unprepared they are simply untrainable," he said.

The easiest scapegoat is education, but we are not in a situation where "education has all of a sudden gone bad," Snyder said.

Education has, in fact, improved, Snyder said. But higher-order thinking skills are now needed in the workplace to increase workers' abilities to handle the information that goes with new technology.

Suburban school districts like

Northville are not exempt from trying to improve their programs just because their test scores and achievement rates may be above average.

"Success is its own worst enemy," Snyder said.

Globally, American schools are ranked 15th, so a good education here is not a good education when it comes to international competition, Snyder said.

"When you're No. 1 in America, you're No. 1 in the 15th best school (system) in the world," Snyder said.

Snyder suggested schools increase internship programs and vocational education, saying the "best way to learn is in the marketplace."

He also suggested that schools link programs for "at risk" students to the community through job-training programs like vocational education.

Students know the basics, but

applying the basics through critical thinking and problem solving needs to be addressed by educators, he said.

"The world of work has become far more complex than it used to be," Snyder said.

He said extending a school year that already is not working or attempting to find moral solutions to education problems (like telling students they just need to work harder) is not the answer.

Changing students' outlook on the future is the answer, he said.

"Most students are passive in their

outlook to the world. Most have no enthusiasm to learn and that is the greatest challenge to education," Snyder said.

And the role educators will play in changing students' view of the world should be done on the local level, he said.

"We need to give students a sense of control over their destiny," he said. "If we can't do that, all the education reform in the world isn't going to do anything."

"That is a task worthy of every parent, every educator, and every communicator."

panic if their son's or daughter's possessions are mailed home. Many personal belongings are being sent home as the war continues, she explained, to lighten the load carried by soldiers and their units in the field.

But Lewis still hesitates to speak before support group gatherings, fearing that her son's fate represents a possibility that other families would rather not consider.

"I think I'd be depressing, because my son's already come home in a body bag, and they're still holding out hope," she said.

Writing the letter was one of the hardest tasks Lewis has tackled lately, she said. During the process, the pain she thought she had begun to bury resurfaced.

"I think these things, and I can talk about these things," she said, "but when I actually had to sit down and write it down, I didn't realize how depressing the last two years have been."

But overall, Lewis said the healing process has begun for her and most other Iowa family members.

"By being active and working with one another we've worked through

our grief and are now reaching out trying to help others," she explained. "I keep telling all my families, 'When you reach out to help others, you're really helping yourself.'"

"My best times are when I can sit down with Rich's friends and hear Rich stories. I can laugh, I can cry... we can't do anything to bring them back, but if we can enjoy the memories, it's a big solace."

Another therapeutic step taken by Iowa families was the publication of a composite photo showing all 47 sailors.

"All these families, each and every

one of them, have come to me and said, 'You don't know how much that picture means to me, it tells me he was not just a number,'" Lewis said.

"That's what I'm afraid of happening now, that these kids will just be numbers."

Township meets with haulers

Potential bidders for a township-wide solid waste collection contract will offer presentations to the township board Wednesday.

Two collection firms will discuss solid waste plans with the board beginning at 7:30 Wednesday evening. Two other companies will meet with the board at 7:30 p.m. Feb. 13, township Supervisor Georgina Goss said.

Goss said the presentations are designed to give the board an idea of the services provided by collection agencies.

"Because we are looking to implement a curbside recycling program and a preferred-status hauler in the township, we want to gather as much information as we can," Goss said. "I want to do this before we seriously start studying curbside

and preferred-status haulers."

The township board will ponder a solid waste ordinance at its Feb. 14 meeting, Goss said. Residents should not expect the board's initial peek at the proposed ordinance to result in policy, she said.

The Wayne County Solid Waste Plan mandates community adherence to solid waste and recycling guidelines. The township is looking to stay in step with the plan by implementing its own ordinance and selecting a preferred hauler.

A preferred hauler would handle all township solid waste and recyclable materials collections, Goss said. Individual homeowners would not have to sign on with the township's hauler, but would have to abide by the township's solid waste and recycling guidelines by contracting with a hauler that would handle identical collection duties, Goss said.

Community-wide collection should help cut trash costs to individual homeowners, she said. Meetings with potential haulers will serve as a sorting out process.

"We want to know what we can expect," she said. "We're trying to get the lowest possible price."

Browning-Ferris Industries, locally based in Livonia, and operators of the Arbor Hills Landfill in Salem Township, will meet with the board Feb. 6. Detroit-based City Management will also present a program that evening.

Scheduled for Feb. 13 are Laidlaw Waste Systems Corp. of Southfield and Waste Management Corp. of Livonia.

All meetings are open to the public and will be held in the township meeting room at 41600 Six Mile Road.

Credit comes to class

A high school senior armed with a credit card ventures to a local mall ready to fight the crowds and win the best deals. The scenario might sound like a dream to most young people, but it could sound more like a nightmare to parents and credit institutions.

But some Northville High School business students recently received their first lesson in credit, including a lesson on how to obtain a credit card, as part of the district's partnership in education with Ford Motor Credit.

For one 18-year-old student who already had a credit card, the lesson on establishing good credit was old news.

But some students, still too young to have a credit history, learned they must be 18 and have a good credit record before they would be considered likely candidates for receiving a credit card.

They learned about the ups and downs of credit from one who knows as the first part of a Partnerships in Education program between the high school and Ford Motor Credit Co.

"Credit is using somebody else's money to do what you want to do," said Vivian Vazquez, marketing spe-

cialist for Ford Motor Credit.

The idea might sound great to a high school senior with nothing to his or her name except the desire to own a new car, but Vazquez used a little of her own life experience to remind Wayne Saunders' business classes that using credit has its downside.

Vazquez discussed her early days in the credit business when she repossessed cars from people who were behind on their payments.

"Sometimes people had to find a

ride or walk home from the mall," she said.

Vazquez's visit to Northville High School formally began a partnership between the school and Ford Motor Credit.

The program is new to the high school, but Ford Motor Credit previously tested the program at a New Jersey high school.

"You're kind of being test marketed here," Partnerships in Education Director Jan Purcell said.

Ford Motor Credit, which is a divi-

sion of Ford Motor Co. that approves special financing offers, plans to distribute the program nationally through Ford offices.

Saunders, a teacher at Northville High School, will continue the program through the beginning of February.

He will discuss areas of consumer credit — from loan sharks and how to avoid becoming involved with unscrupulous lenders, to credit unions and how to use the credit industry to one's advantage.

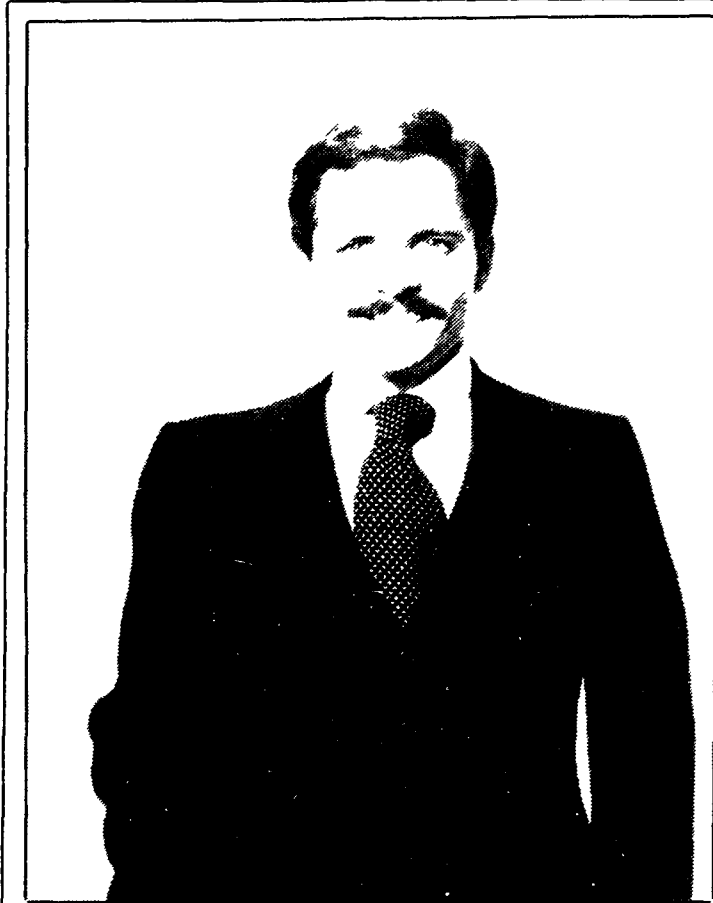

Troopers to be decorated

Four troopers from the Michigan State Police post in Northville have been selected to receive professional excellence awards.

Troopers Michael Oliver, Jim Willing, J. Michael Taylor and Chris Mitchell were selected for the award for their investigative work in the apprehension of a Walled Lake man suspected of armed robbery and criminal sexual conduct.

According to state police, a 20-year-old Westland woman was allegedly raped after accepting a ride from the Walled Lake man after her car had broken down. The man, identified as Frank M. Mole, took the woman to a Farmington Hills motel where he allegedly sexually assaulted and robbed her.

In apprehending Mole, troopers conducted an extensive search dur-

ing which they located him sitting in his vehicle with another female he had recently met at a bar. Mole was later arrested and charged with CSC and armed robbery. He is currently awaiting trial in Oakland County Circuit Court.

The troopers were recognized for conduct above and beyond those normally expected to tenaciously investigate, pursue and eventually arrest an alleged felon.

House puts pay raise to rest

The Michigan House of Representatives has turned down a controversial 16-percent-over-two-years pay increase.

But Speaker Lewis Dodak, D-Birch Run, kept Thursday's results unofficial by taking an unrecorded vote.

There was a two-thirds vote (to reject), the House journal clerk reported.

Other lawmakers said three Democrats voted no: Dominic Jacobetti of Negaunee, chair of the Appropriations Committee, and Joe Young Sr. and Jr., both of Detroit.

With 110 votes flashing on the roll call board, there was no way to record

accurately which members were absent or abstained, the equivalent of voting no.

It took the House only about two minutes to adopt a Senate resolution rejecting pay increases proposed by the State Officers Compensation Commission (SOCC). The Senate paved the way a week earlier by passing the resolution 34-0 with three abstentions and one absent.

Jacobetti was denied a chance to make a 40-minute speech in favor of the pay raise.

Dodak and several Democratic leaders wanted to accept the pay hikes without taking a vote but were embarrassed into turning it down

when House minority leader Paul Hillemonds, R-Holland, turned it into a political issue.

If a two-thirds majority of both chambers hadn't rejected the increase, lawmakers would have seen their current \$45,540 salaries go to \$47,288 on Oct. 1 and to \$52,800 in 1992.

The governor's salary would have risen 12.9 percent to \$120,500. Supreme Court justices would have been raised 12.5 percent to \$120,000, and 600 appeals and trial court judges would have received automatically the same percentage increase.

Working to improve hometown coverage

If this is the editorial page, it must be Thursday, right?

Well, no. This is the new, and we hope improved, Monday edition of your hometown newspaper. Welcome.

When our Monday edition was first launched — a short nine months ago — it was one big trial balloon. Staffers were not sure what to do with it; readers were unsure how to react to it. Since then, our staff has worked to improve the Monday paper (as well as the Thursday edition, of course) to better serve our readers.

In all honesty, the Monday edition has not been an overnight success. Common complaints are that there's not much news in the second edition, there's too much about Novi in it, and that readers simply don't "need" it.

Beginning today, we've introduced a set of changes to make the Monday newspaper much more worth your time. Most importantly, the paper is divided into two sections. Although the overall number of pages will remain about the same (at least for the time being), the front section will be much more local, geared completely to covering Northville.

The differences are obvious on the front page, where we abandoned the special design and returned to our traditional, Thursday front page format. On page 2, you'll find our standard "Community Calendar" — providing a look at the events planned for the week ahead. Printing a calendar in both editions benefits everyone: People organizing events will get them listed twice as often, and people who might be interested in the events get an extra chance to learn about them.

"News Briefs" move to page 3, just like on Thursday, and "Police News" holds down its usual spot on page 4. That brings us here to page 5, which will be an editorial page like Thursday, including a return of Phil Jerome's column.

Up to this point, the Monday editions featured several "theme" pages on subjects like entertainment, homes, and

business. These pages were not working for a variety of reasons, and we've junked all but one: our food page. That page seems to be eliciting a positive reaction from readers, so we're going to concentrate on that and continue to improve it. And that, with its new name of "Creative Dining," will open the newspaper's second section, followed by classified ads.

What we're trying to do is make the Monday paper as much like the Thursday paper as we can. In short, we're playing to our strengths. We hope it works.

Recalling those three complaints identified above, the new Monday edition will contain more local news. It will also contain virtually no news about Novi, except when the news has some impact on the Northville community. As for the third complaint, maybe we don't "need" this edition — but we do have it, and we firmly believe it's a great opportunity to serve the town.

To some degree, the Monday edition has already proved itself to be a very useful vehicle for information. When the Tiffany Art Glass shop in downtown Northville burned on a Saturday morning, we were able to get you information about that fire three days before the Thursday edition. And when the Northville High School football team was in the playoffs, that news didn't always have to wait for Thursday. In a day and age when we can get news from around the world in a matter of seconds, some news consumers (i.e. readers) understandably grumble when it takes a bit longer to receive news from down the street.

We hope you like the changes we've made. Rest assured, there are probably more to come; we will always look for ways to continue improving both the Monday and Thursday papers. In addition to the changes you see today, several other ideas — like sports coverage and guest columns from people in the community — are still being discussed.

I looked around the building I was in. People went about their business; conversation was vibrant; someone laughed just a little too loudly at a joke. The place was full of life, full of people. Not unlike my target.

Wash those thoughts out of your mind, I told myself. Yeah. Like they taught us in basic. It was easy. You know your orders, and that's all you need to know. Feelings had no place in the military.

Defensive weapons were even easier to use. I had guns and Sparrow missiles at my disposal. A Libyan MiG would show up on a heads-up display on the canopy of my aircraft. Again, it was an all-too-simple task of putting him in the crosshairs and firing. The heat-seeking Sparrow did the rest.

Forget the fact that the pilot had a family and friends. He had the same training I did, and had no compunctions about blowing me out of the sky without concern for my family and my friends. I was, for all intents and purposes, a machine against another machine.

Libyan planes weren't all I had to worry about. There would be anti-aircraft fire thicker than flies at a barbecue.

Fortunately, the F-15 is a pretty high-strung animal. A touch of the joystick left or right and you can dodge ground fire. Besides, when you're hustling by at over 1,000 mph, the gunners have to be real lucky to put a bullet into you.

With a lurch and a roar from the engines, the runway rolled away beneath me, the stripes moving quicker and finally blurring into one before they dropped away.

At supersonic speed, the target came up quickly. In the distance I saw it, MiGs buzzing overhead like a welcoming committee. Taking an attack posture, I came in fast and low.

Dodging the anti-aircraft fire was like sidestepping raindrops. Don't ask me how I didn't get hit. I used the guns against them, but never even got near the target on the first pass.

By the time I was ready for another run, the MiGs had my number. My stomach dropped as I dove in again, but they fell right in on my tail.

The engines howled as I pulled up and out to evade their fire, looping, rolling. It did no good. I saw an Exocet missile coming, and was powerless to escape it. There was a screech, a flash of yellow and white, and then everything went red. Then came the words.

Came over. Insert coin.

Damn. I looked at my watch. Still another half hour until Mom's flight was due. Metro Airport can be a boring place when you have time to kill.

I fidgeted with the last quarter in my pocket, and debated dropping it into one of the TVs at the other end of the terminal.

I decided against it. I knew what I'd see: CNN's continuing coverage of the war. For two weeks now, I'd seen — or perhaps more appropriately, not seen — the "Nintendo war" through the glowing blue box. I'd grown to disparege the numbing effect it's had on my feelings about the war.

Besides, I'd already had enough video warfare for one day.

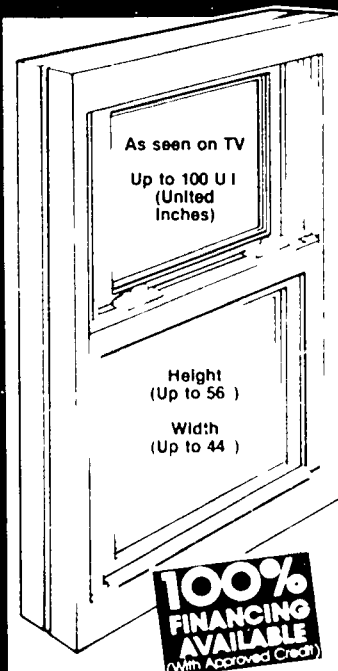

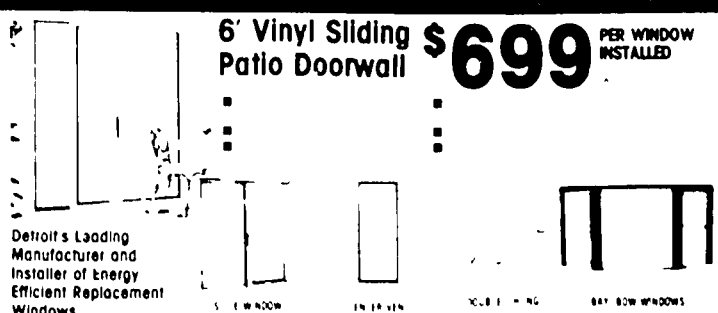

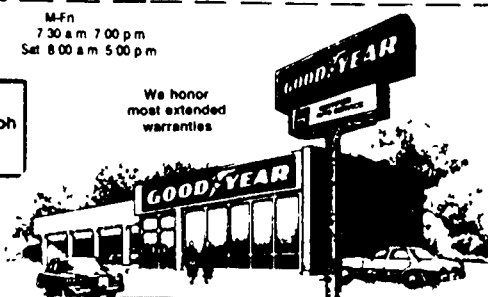

Californians make French connection

Schramsberg, though not the first California producer of methode champenoise sparkling wine, certainly deserves credit for blazing the trail toward ultra-premium American sparklers.

This year, Schramsberg celebrated 25 years of Napa Valley sparkling wine innovation.

Nearly a decade before the first French-American connection in California wine country, Schramsberg initiated the use of classic French grape varieties for making sparkling wine.

It produces a line of fine wines that includes Blanc de Blancs made from chardonnay and pinot blanc, the perfect wine for fresh oysters.

Blanc de Noirs is made primarily from pinot noir with a small percent of chardonnay and pinot blanc for added structure and complexity.

Schramsberg Blanc de Noirs is the first white sparkling wine made from black skinned grapes produced in the United States.

Cuvee de Pinot is a brut (dry) rose that combines pinot noir, Napa gamay, pinot meunier and pinot blanc in a wine that can be enjoyed throughout the meal. Cremant demi-sec is a dessert wine made from aromatic Flora grapes.

Schramsberg Reserve, a California prestige cuvee, boasts maximum complexity due to barrel fermentation, strict selection of wines for the blend and long bottle aging on the yeast lees.

When Schramsberg was established, in 1965, U.S. production of sparkling wine totaled 50,000 cases annually. Today, American production of methode champenoise wine exceeds 2.5 million cases.

Considering these statistics, the founding of a sparkling wine house was a courageous and prophetic investment of owners of Jack and Jamie Davies.

Imitation may be the sincerest form of flattery, but Mumm Napa Valley is not trying to imitate its French counterpart in Champagne.

"Our wines reflect the style and quality of Napa Valley fruit. This is not a French product from California," said Greg Fowler, winemaker at Mumm Napa Valley.

Mumm Napa Valley increases complexity in its wines by harvesting fruit from 56 different vineyard sites in Napa, Yountville and Carneros. Each component has something special to contribute to the final blend.

Pinot noir from Napa adds a distinct cherry fruit, while the pinot noir from Carneros adds body and a touch of tropical fruit.

"Chardonnay contributes spice and zest to the wine plus a little green apple tartness expected in sparkling wine," Fowler said.

Since beginning production in 1986, Mumm Napa Valley has increased from 10,000 to 100,000 cases annually.

Mumm started with a single sparkling wine. Today, there are four styles in the Mumm line.

Mumm Napa Valley Blanc de Noirs showcases a bright blush of pink with generous flavors and weighty palate that showcases stylish fruit.

"I want the fruit pouring out from the top of the glass, strawberry fruit in particular," Fowler said.

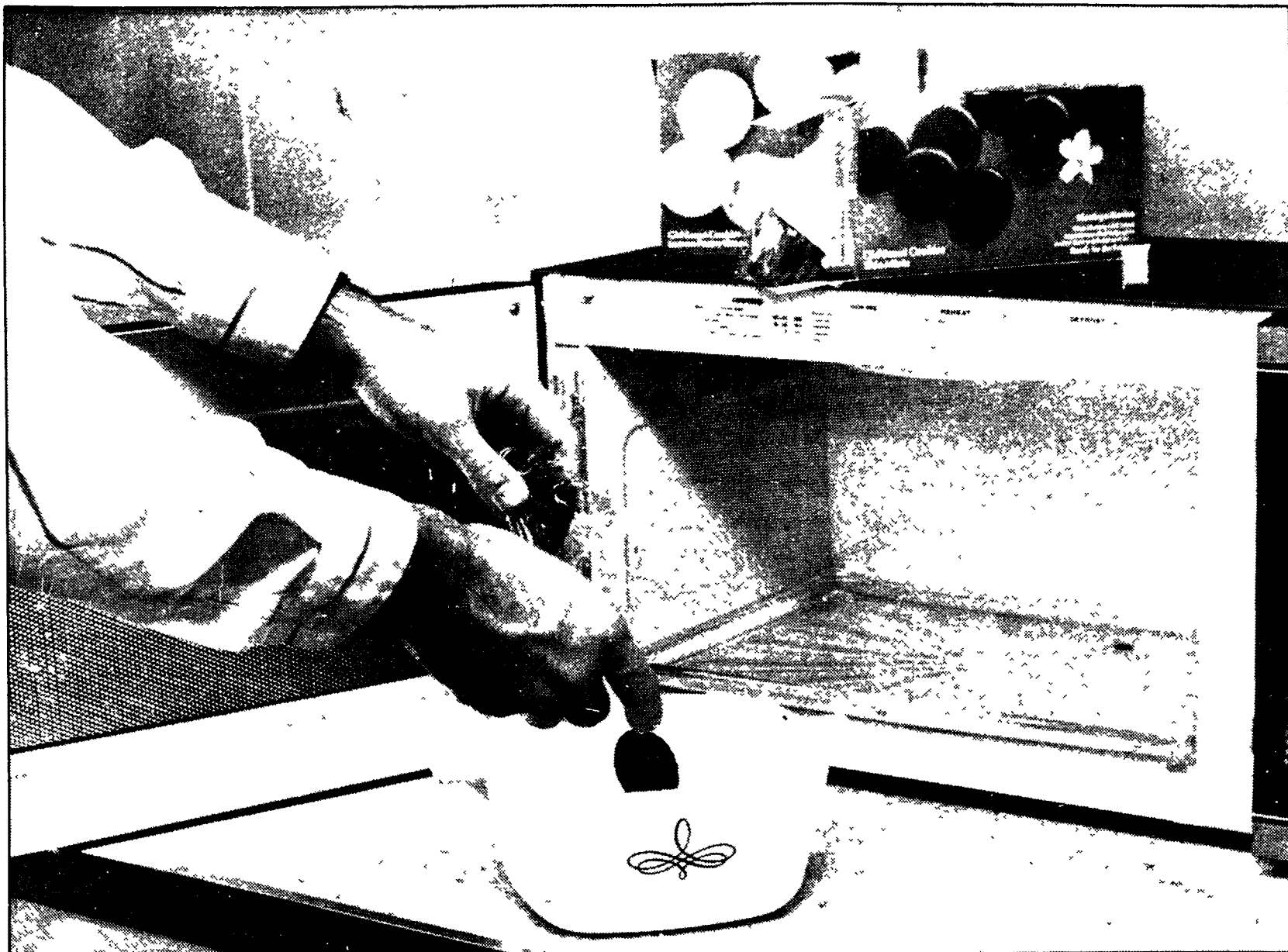
Mumm's Brut Prestige has a delicate bronze color with touches of melon, apples and toasty vanilla-caramel on the nose and the palate.

This blend contains 35 percent chardonnay, lending the added structure and rich, lingering finish.

WINE SELECTIONS OF THE WEEK

Perrier-Jouet Grand Brut (\$25) is a versatile champagne that enhances appetizers and lighter first courses. Its exceptionally fine balance makes it especially appealing.

Bollinger Brut Special Cuvee (\$32) showcases the toasty aromas of barrel fermentation and a high percentage of pinot noir in the cuvee. Fresh bread dough flavors are accented with hints of citrus. Crisp and clean, it is a perfect meal accompaniment.

Cookie capers Scout up a creative snack

Purists may be disappointed, but Girl Scout cookies aren't just to be eaten straight anymore. With a little creativity, you can turn a box of good cookies into an even better snack or dessert.

Not that there's anything wrong with the cookies themselves. They're good eating on their own or dunked in milk. And the sales are important to the Girl Scouts.

"It is the real way that we fund Girl Scouting," said Kathy Langham, mother of a scout and an area manager for cookie sales in Novi. "It's our major fundraiser. The troops themselves make 35 cents per box. That money is for whatever the troop chooses to spend that on, whether it be camping or any other activity."

The majority of the money from the cookie sales goes to the council, the regional administrative organization that oversees a number of troops. In Novi, it's the Michigan Metro Council that gets the profits, while Northville is served by the Huron Valley Council.

The councils use that money for administrative and personnel needs and to operate camps and other regional activities.

"The Girl Scouts sell calendars and nuts in the fall, and they make a better profit on those," said Langham. "But they don't sell as much as the cookies do. Nowhere near."

Unfortunately, Langham said you'll rarely find the scouts selling door-to-door anymore. For safety reasons, the scouts are discouraged from knocking on strange doors. Instead they are encouraged to call on friends and relatives, or participate in group sales in public places like

malls and supermarkets.

Some people are ready with orders when cookie sale time comes around. Langham relates the story of how a neighbor bought a dozen boxes on the spot from daughter Beth, without so much as a sales pitch.

"She said, 'I was wondering when you were going to come around. I'll take a case of mints,'" said Langham. "There are people like that who look forward to the cookies. Especially the Thin Mints, Samoas and Tagalongs. Those are the big sellers."

In reality, there are several bakeries around the country that make Girl Scout cookies. Each council chooses the bakery that it buys from, so the names of some types of cookies may vary.

For example, in Northville you can order Thin Mints; Caramel Delites; Peanut Butter Sandwiches; Shortbread; Lemon Pastry Creams; Peanut Butter Patties; and Golden Yangles, a new choice, sugar-free snack crackers made with cheddar cheese. The Huron Valley Council orders from ABC Bakeries of Ohio.

In Novi, where the Michigan Metro Council orders from Little Brownies Bakers in Louisville, KY, you can get all the same varieties. However, the Caramel Delites are known as Samoas, and the Peanut Butter Patties are called Tagalongs. Novi scouts also offer a new cholesterol-free cookie called Trail Mix Chip.

Regardless of what they're called, they're \$2.50 a box. And it's money well spent considering that it goes to developing the young women of the next generation.

Cookin' with cookies

Most people eat Girl Scout cookies right out of the box, but that's not the only option. These recipes incorporate Girl Scout cookies and other ingredients. The main challenge is not eating all the cookies or crackers while preparing these tasty treats.

9-by-5-by-3-inch microwave-proof loaf pan. Microwave on high (100 percent power) for five minutes. Rotate pan one-quarter turn in microwave four to six minutes more, or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Let stand for five minutes before removing from pan.

DAYTRIPPERS' SUSTENANCE

5 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
1 tablespoon light brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
2 cups Golden Yangles
2 cups (already popped) popcorn
2 cups thin pretzel sticks or mini rings
1 cup salted cocktail peanuts

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. In a 15-by-10-by-2-inch baking pan, combine butter or margarine, Worcestershire sauce, brown sugar and garlic powder. Stir in Golden Yangles, popcorn, pretzels and peanuts. Bake for 20 minutes, stirring occasionally.

MICROWAVE JOURNEYCAKE

1 1/2 cups finely crushed Shortbread cookies
1 1/2 cups flour
1/2 cup sugar
1 tablespoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup mashed bananas
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup butter or margarine, melted
2 eggs, slightly beaten

In large bowl, combine cookie crumbs, flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. In small bowl, combine bananas, milk, butter and eggs. With spoon, stir into crumb mixture just until blended. Spoon into greased

1 cup finely crushed Thin Mint cookies
1 cup real butter (no substitute)
2 cups sifted powdered sugar
4 ounces unsweetened chocolate, melted and cooled
4 eggs
1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Beat butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add chocolate and vanilla, beating until well combined. Add eggs, one at a time, beating three minutes after each addition. Divide the cookie crumbs in half. Sprinkle one-half the crumbs on the bottom of 16 cupcake papers in muffin tin. Spoon chocolate mixture over crumbs and top with remaining crumbs. Freeze until firm.

WELCOME HOME PUDDING

1 small package instant vanilla pudding
2 cups cold milk
1/2 cup miniature marshmallows
8 to 10 Peanut Butter Patties, cut into small pieces
whipped topping
whole Peanut Butter Patties (for garnish)

Prepare pudding with milk according to package directions. Fold in marshmallows and cookie pieces. Spoon mixture into pretty glass dishes and garnish with a dollop of whipped topping mix and a whole Peanut Butter Patti. Chill or serve immediately.

Sweet potatoes have true American roots

When Columbus discovered America in 1492, he also discovered a yellow-brown vegetable, the sweet potato. Guess what he did? He took some roots home with him.

By the 1600s the delicious, edible sweet potatoes were a leading crop of the Virginia colonies, and by the 1900s more than 200 varieties were grown in the South. Sweet potatoes are available year-round but are most plentiful from September to December for holiday eating. However, sweet potatoes are great for eating all year.

Sweet potatoes are versatile, easy to prepare and have great potential. They can be served as an appetizer, salad, main dish or dessert. They seem to have taken a bum wrap because of the name or the heavy amounts of sweetener that is added to them. Actually, a sweet potato has no more calories by weight than a white potato. As with other potatoes, it's what you add to them that makes the fat and calories add up.

The darker the orange color of the vegetable, the more beta carotene (which the body transforms into vitamin A). A serving of one sweet potato has two to five times the recommended amounts of beta carotene. A sweet potato serving has more potassium than an orange, plus some dietary fiber. It also contains about half the amount recommended for a daily allowance of vitamin C and about 120 to 140 calories. All this nutrition inside the skin of a sweet potato!

Sweet potatoes come in two versions: the light or pale-skinned type with yellow pulp that remains firm when cooked, or the bright orange, more moist, rough-skinned variety that becomes soft when cooked. The moist, flaked potato tastes sweeter than dry varieties due to the starch converting to sugar while cooking. Some people call the softer, more moist version a "yam." But a true yam is really a starchy white root grown primarily in the tropics of West Africa, the Caribbean and

Latin America.

Select well-shaped (tapered toward the ends), firm, plump, brightly colored skins that are free from decay. Do not choose one that has cuts, holes or blemishes. Best supplies of potatoes generally are in the winter months. Store in a cool, dry, dark, well-ventilated place. Do not store in refrigerator. If you have purchased more than you can use in a short period of time, cook, mash and freeze for use later.

Cook a sweet potato in the skin to help preserve the vitamins. Treat just like a white potato. The skins will slip off easily after cooking, but it is also edible. Since the skin is a little tough you may want to rub with a little margarine and wrap it in foil to bake. Place sweet potatoes on a baking sheet and bake at 375 degrees for about one hour or until tender. To boil, place chunks in saucepan (leaving skin on), add water, bring to a boil, cover, reduce heat and simmer until tender. Drain

well. Slip the skin and use in whatever dish you are making. Pierce sweet potatoes several times with a fork before microwaving to prevent exploding. Microwave on high six to seven minutes per pound.

Enjoy sweet potatoes combined with white potatoes to make your favorite potato salad recipe. As a main dish, bake or microwave in their skins. Scoop out the pulp and mash it, add pineapple or orange juice, or diced apples and raisins with spices, and return the pulp mixture to skin and reheat, and you have twice-baked sweet potatoes. Mashed sweet potatoes can be put into a casserole. Add fruits, juice, spices and top with chopped nuts for a great side dish (skip the marshmallows).

Mix shredded sweet potatoes with chopped apple, flour and onion and fry as pancake in a little melted margarine or oil.

Shred raw into salads for crunch, or pare and slice and serve raw with a dip. Raw sweet potatoes taste like a sweet raw carrot. They will darken quickly so soak in water before serving and refresh frequently if served on a raw vegetable tray.

Soup can be made by pureeing baked or boiled sweet potatoes. Add defatted chicken stock, herbs and spices, and before serving stir in low-fat buttermilk or yogurt.

Try pureed sweet potatoes for pies, breads, biscuits, muffins, cookies, cakes, croquettes and custards. Sweet spices such as cinnamon, ginger, cloves, nutmeg and allspice complement sweet potatoes very nicely. Remember, a sweet potato by itself is not fattening. It's the caramelized or candied versions that add calories. Be like Columbus and take some nutrient-dense sweet potatoes home.

They eat mashed potatoes without guilt here. And pot roast and deep-dish pizza and hot dogs and deep-fried, beer-battered fish and bread pudding.

And — this may be the best part — if you order a dessert in a restaurant, no one expects you to share it with all your dining companions. No ending up with a silver and a secret longing. In this town, it's OK to eat a dessert all by yourself.

Beyond that, they have no fear of frying. And they don't try to get six to eight servings out of a three-pound chicken.

Stay here for a week and it becomes apparent: You're not in Southern California, Dorothy. The Midwest and its commercial center, Chicago, have not cut off their culinary roots to embrace all the new fads.

And although I can't personally vouch for their cholesterol counts, the people strolling Michigan Avenue don't look lumpy and out of shape, like some mid-America cousins who don't know the joys of wearing skintight bicycle shorts that cut off the circulation.

I don't mean they don't know gourmet when they see it. Sure, you can get wild mushroom lasagna. And, sure, they know the health food trends, and salad bars do dot the landscape in this town.

But it seems they still know how to enjoy what they're eating: they don't just eat for food value but fun value, too.

This is the place for ethnic eats, from Czech dumplings so tender you can cut them with a piece of thread (which they do) to Italian restaurants' original Chicken Vesuvio, a dish that is fried and then baked with plenty of garlic, olive oil and potatoes.

(Can you even imagine putting that description on a menu in California? Yet it's a popular Chicago classic.)

This winter, restaurants are luring in customers with updated "mom food" which has come out of the prairie. In fact, almost to a one, trendy restaurants will offer their version of real mashed potatoes and consumers eat them up, potato skins and all.

Probably the most famous mashed potato dish is Oprah's Mashed Potatoes, served at a popular restaurant, The Eccentric, of which television celebrity Oprah Winfrey is part owner. (In fact, one officer of a chapter of the gourmet-oriented American Institute of Wine and Food admitted to heading to The Eccentric first thing to try the famous potatoes on a trip to Chicago earlier this year.) Diners flock to the restaurant for the potatoes and a variety of other down-to-earth food, including some fabulous pot roast.

The recipe for Winfrey's famous side dish is included in this story, probably for the first time in print, according to executive chef Russell Bry.

Another mashed potato version that's a hit is at owner/chef John Terczak's namesake place, Terczak's. Here's how he makes them:

He takes Idaho baking potatoes and boils them with the skins on. Without removing the skin, he mashes the potatoes with butter and salt and pepper. Period. No milk allowed. His customers love them.

"Some people come in and order just appetizers and potatoes," Terczak said.

Forget exotic ingredients and edible flowers — mostly this is regular food; this is nuts-and-bolts food, mainly Midwestern with a few touches from the "outside."

Menus all over this lakeside town reflect hearty fare, like:

- Chicken and dumplings
- Country-style corn chowder
- Bread pudding
- Crab cakes
- Pot roast
- Roast pork stuffed with sausage
- Sautéed lake perch

But make no mistake. In Chicago, hearty doesn't necessarily mean a big, heavy, gravy-laden, belt-loosening food. Midwest food may have its roots on the farm, but it is not just beef and mashed potatoes.

Don't be surprised to see something like this on a restaurant entree list: fresh fish, pan roasted with bacon, leeks and Missouri black walnuts.

Whatever you try, remember it's OK to go ahead and eat like a Chicago native — enjoy.

CHICAGO HOT DOG

- 1 Vienna frankfurter, boiled
- 1 poppy seed hot dog bun

Ketchup
Sweet pickle relish (preferably like Chicagoans do it: dyed bright green with food coloring)
Chopped onions
Chopped tomatoes
Whole small, hot green peppers (the hotter the better)
Yields one serving.
Put hot dog in bun and layer each ingredient in the order given. Then try to get one end in your mouth.

OPRAH'S MASHED POTATOES (from The Eccentric restaurant)

- 1 ½ pounds Idaho baking potatoes
- 1 ½ pounds red potatoes
- Salt to taste
- ½ stick butter
- 6 to 7 ounces milk
- ½ cup horseradish, or to taste (see method below)
- Butter and snipped green onions (green part only) for garnish

Place potatoes in pan and cover with salted water. Boil under tender and drain. (Leave on all or part of peel.) Using hand masher, mash potatoes with salt to taste, ½ stick of butter and milk and ½ cup of horseradish by tsp. until desired taste is achieved.
Garnish with dollop of butter and snipped green onions.

CHICKEN VESUVIO

- 1 broiler chicken, about 3 pounds, cut up
- ½ cup all-purpose flour
- 1 ½ tsp. dried basil
- ½ tsp. dried leaf oregano
- ½ tsp. salt
- ½ tsp. each dried leaf thyme, freshly ground pepper
- Pinch each dried rosemary, rubbed sage
- ½ cup olive oil
- 3 baking potatoes, cut into lengthwise wedges
- 3 tbsp. minced fresh parsley
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- ½ cup dry white wine

Rinse chicken under cold water; pat dry. Mix flour, basil, oregano, salt, thyme, pepper, rosemary and sage in shallow dish. Dredge chicken in flour mixture. Shake off excess.

Heat oil in 12-inch cast-iron or other ovenproof skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Add chicken pieces in single layer. Fry, turning occasionally (use tongs so chicken will not be pierced) until light brown on all sides, about 15 minutes. Remove to paper towels.

When all chicken is browned, add potato wedges to skillet. Fry, turning occasionally, until light brown on all sides. Remove to paper towels.

Heat oven to 375 degrees. Pour off all but 2 tbsp. of fat from skillet. Put chicken and potatoes back into skillet. Sprinkle with parsley and garlic. Pour wine over all. Bake, uncovered, until potatoes are fork-tender and

thigh juices run clear, 20 to 25 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. Serve with a little of the pan juices. Serves 4.

This may possibly be the best bread pudding I've ever tasted. It's worth the effort. Before tasting it, I thought caramel sauce would be "gliding the lily." It's not.

JOHN TERCZAK'S BREAD & BUTTER PUDDING CAKE WITH CARAMEL SAUCE

- 10 slices white sandwich bread
- 6 tbsp. unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1 cup granulated sugar, plus 1 tsp.
- ¼ tsp. ground cinnamon
- 3 cups milk
- 1 vanilla bean, split
- 3 large eggs, plus 3 egg yolks
- 1 recipe caramel sauce (recipe follows)
- confectioners' sugar for garnish

Heat oven to 400 degrees. Butter one side of each slice of bread. Toast under broiler or in toaster oven. Lean toast against vertical surface to cool without becoming soggy.

When cool, trim crusts and discard. Cut each piece into two triangles. Make concentric circles of triangles with long side of each pointing up in 1-½ quart souffle or casserole. Leave center of dish empty. Sprinkle one tbsp. of sugar and cinnamon over toast. Set pan aside.

Scald milk and vanilla bean in saucepan. In mixing bowl, whisk or beat eggs and yolks with one cup sugar until sugar dissolves and mixture is smooth and lemon-colored.

Gradually pour hot milk into egg mixture, stirring constantly. When all milk has been added, use ladle or large spoon to remove froth from surface. Remove vanilla bean and scrape soft interior of vanilla bean back into custard.

Put pan with toast in larger pan. Heat water to boil in teakettle. Carefully pour custard into hole in center of toast circles. Transfer both pans to shelf set in middle of oven and pour hot water into larger pan until it comes halfway up the sides of toast pan. Bake until custard is risen and set but still soft, about 40 minutes. Remove cake pan from oven and water bath. Cool on rack.

To serve, cut room-temperature cake into six to eight portions. Dust serving plates with confectioners' sugar, then use cake knife and rubber scraper to transfer portions to plates without losing custard. Pour caramel sauce around cake and serve. Serves 6-8.

CARAMEL SAUCE

- 1 tbsp. unsalted butter
- ½ cup granulated sugar
- ½ cup whipping cream, at room temperature

Put butter in heavy-bottomed saucepan. Pour sugar atop butter; do not stir. Melt sugar over medium heat until mixture is brown and bubbling, about 10 minutes. Stir with whisk and continue cooking until caramel is

very brown and almost at point of scorching. Immediately begin whisking in small amounts of cream. Continue until caramel has syrup consistency.

Pour sauce through strainer into top of double boiler. Keep warm, or reheat over hot, not boiling, water before serving. Yields 1 cup sauce.

Designer pizzas are sold in this city as well, but Chicago is the city where deep-dish pizza was born.

DEEP DISH PIZZA

- Crust:
- 1 cup water
 - ¼ cup vegetable shortening
 - 1 ¼ tbsp. sugar
 - 2 ¼ tbsp. salt
 - 1 ¼ packages active dry yeast
 - ½ cup warm water (105-115 degrees)
 - ¾ cup yellow cornmeal
 - 3 to 3 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- Vegetable oil
- Filling:
- 1 (28-ounce) can Italian-style plum tomatoes
 - 2 tbsp. vegetable oil
 - 1 small onion, chopped
 - 1 small green pepper, chopped
 - 1 clove garlic, minced
 - ¾ tsp. dried leaf oregano
 - ¼ tsp. each fennel seeds, salt
 - ¼ tsp. freshly ground pepper
 - ½ pound fresh mushrooms, sliced
 - 1 pound mild Italian sausage
 - 1 (10-ounce) package mozzarella cheese, thinly sliced
 - ½ cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese

Heat oven to 425 degrees. For crust, heat one cup water, shortening, sugar and salt until shortening melts; cool to 105 to 115 degrees warm. Dissolve yeast in ¼ cup warm water; let stand until bubbly. Mix yeast and shortening mixtures in large bowl. Add cornmeal. Add two cups flour; beat well. Stir in enough additional flour to make a soft dough. Turn onto lightly floured surface; knead, working in more flour as needed until smooth and elastic.

Brush round 12-inch pizza pan (at least 2 inches deep) with oil. Press dough evenly over bottom and up sides of pan. Bake at 425 degrees for five minutes.

For filling, drain tomatoes in colander; chop tomatoes and return to colander; set aside to drain. Cook onion, green pepper, garlic and spices in two tbsp. oil in medium saucepan over medium-high heat until onion and green pepper are tender. Stir in well-drained tomatoes and mushrooms; cook lightly; remove from heat.

Remove sausage from casing, saute until browned. Drain grease; crumble into pizza crust. Arrange mozzarella slices over sausage. Top with tomato mixture; sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Bake until crust is golden brown, about 45 minutes. Let stand five minutes before serving.

ITALIAN BEEF SANDWICHES

- 1 tsp. each red pepper flakes, garlic powder, dried basil, dried oregano, freshly ground pepper
- ¼ tsp. salt
- 1 small sirloin tip roast, about 2 ½ pounds
- 1 cup cold water
- 8 good quality, soft Italian rolls, warmed

Pickled hot peppers or sliced sweet peppers as desired. Heat oven to 450 degrees. Combine seasonings in small dish. Rub half over all surfaces of meat, working some of it under fat layer. Put meat in shallow pan just large enough to hold it. Bake 15 minutes. Reduce oven to 350 degrees and bake 20 minutes longer.

Remove pan from oven and pour cold water into bottom of pan. Let stand several minutes until fat has solidified, then remove and discard fat. Add remaining seasoning mixture to pan juices. Return to oven and continue baking until cooked as desired, preferably rare. Rare will register 130 degrees on instant-read thermometer and will take 15 to 20 minutes for final step.

For easier slicing, place meat in freezer until almost solid. Refrigerate pan juices.

To serve, slice meat into paper-thin slices, using meat slicer or electric knife if available. Heat either by placing several slices at a time in microwave oven just until warm, 30 to 40 seconds, or by placing in a steamer over simmering water for 1 to 2 minutes. Heat pan juices and spoon over split rolls. Add meat and peppers as desired and serve immediately.

Cooking and other homemaking skills are part of the Girl Scout program, too. Just about every Girl Scout learns to make 'Smores — a toasted marshmallow and a chunk of Hershey's chocolate between two graham crackers.

The campers also learn how to make snacks that travel well in the outdoors. Gorp is a mixture of things like cereal, raisins, peanuts and sometimes M & Ms. A close relative of gorp is trail mix, which uses granola, oats, chocolate chips and such.

"A lot of their time revolves around camping," said Langham. "Even the first-graders go on overnights."

"They'll break up into patrols, each one with a different duty. When it's their turn to cook, they have to cook. The girls come up with their own re-

cipes, and mostly it's things like sloppy joes, hot dogs, spaghetti, grilled cheese, macaroni and cheese. They choose things they can adapt to do outdoors. Things they can do over a fire, or can put a grill across a fire."

Merit badges can be earned for cooking, but that's not all. Other badges are available for planning healthy menus.

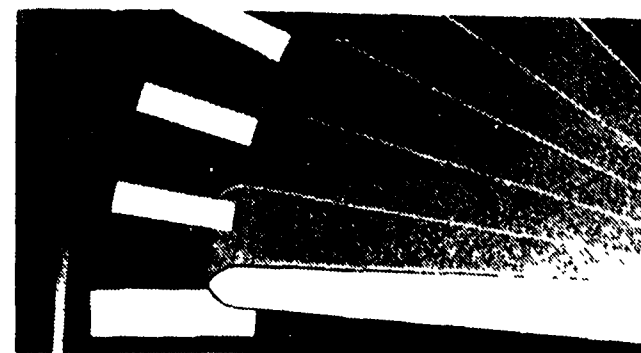

Theron and Ray have followed this path in Farmington Hills and Novi, while Mark, a Belleville resident, volunteers in the Plymouth area.

The learning includes fine-tuning technical skills as well as such qualities as being reliable, having good follow-through procedures, and practice at being a team player. At this point, many residents branch off on their own, as have Theron, Ray and Mark.

Theron Walker and Ray Kaczor got together as a result of a common interest in bands and local talent. Theron Walker is the Executive Producer of "THE GROOVE SESSION." His philosophy is to 'really' give people

exposure on TV. Local talent, Theron says, "may even be better than the professionals." Ray Kaczor has a lot of past experience in booking entertainment in the Metropolitan area. Hosts for the talent portion are Jennifer Skurnwicz and Lauren Rainwater. Al Stearns hosts the shows which feature the bands.

Each person learns that Community Television is expanding their network of resources as well as skills.

Although the television equipment varies from one location to another, the interest, drive and basic techniques are the same. Ones' concentration must be on the idea or person you are developing into the show. To illustrate this concept one could hold

Focus now on what you see in your view. What is in the background? Does it reinforce your subject? What is in the foreground? Does this create depth to your scene? Remember, visuals are the drama as well as the teaser to the television viewer.

These men know this and have caught the 'TV bug'. They have found the real 'fountain of youth'. It is the excitement of real life as it mingles with fantasy. Community television offers all of us the opportunity to explore and learn. So let's get motivated!

'Guns of Paradise' returns to CBS

Western series enters third year
