Planners move to rezone Six/Haggerty area

The Six Mile/Haggerty Road intersection will not become an oasis for burger, taco, and pizza vendors if the Northville Township Planning Commission has its way.

Still smarting from McDonald's Restaurants' recent foray into the township, planners last week moved to rezone fast food vulnerable property along Six Mile and Haggerty.

The commission set a March 26 public hearing date as

a prerequisite for changing undeveloped property along the intersection from freeway service to large office zoning.

Planners are expected to approve the proposed zoning change after the public hearing March 26.

Rezoning approximately nine acres along Six Mile and Haggerty has been a topic of commission conversation since late October, when McDonald's presented a restaurant site plan for a parcel adjacent to Standard Federal Bank west of Haggerty on Six Mile.

Residents and planners alike spoke against the prop-

osed McDonald's and the commission explored ways to prevent similar uses.

Except for a chunk of freeway-zoned land at the intersection, large office zoning stretches the length of Haggerty between Six Mile and Seven Mile roads. Large office zoning also dominates the east side of Haggerty.

"(The plan is) to make zoning on the Northville Township side consistent with Livonia zoning on the other side of the street," Commissioner Richard Allen said.

"It also takes into account the evolution of development in the area," commission Chairperson Charles De

Land said.

The proposed zoning change will not affect the McDonald's site.

Freeway zoning originally was intended as a buffer to residential housing along the Haggerty corridor in the township. But residents have made it clear that large office buildings are preferable to fast-food restaurants and resultant traffic.

The March 26 hearing on the proposed zoning change is set for 7:15 p.m. at township hall.

Township hears from first two trash haulers

Proximity and capability could be the pivotal issues between a pair of would-be Northville Township solid waste and recyclable materials haulers.

Two trash-hauling giants — Browning-Ferris Industries (BFI) and City Management Corp. — met with the township board Feb. 6 to plead their cases for a pending township-wide waste-hauling contract.

Two additional firms will offer the board presentations Feb. 13.

BFI's landfill and soon-to-be-constructed materials recovery facility (MRF) along Napier Road between Five and Six Mile roads in Salem Township appear to offer the firm advantages over City Management Corp.

Detroit-based City Management does not have a local transfer station or MRF and would have to build such a facility in the Northville Township area, a spokesperson said. Township solid waste and recyclable materials would then be trucked to the firm's Sumpter Township landfill.

"We'd like to find a facility in Northville Township or nearby," said City Management spokesperson Edward Hoover. "The ultimate fallback is the (material) would be taken to Detroit."

But a transfer station in the township is unacceptable, Supervisor Georgina Goss said.

"Northville Township is not interested in, or willing to provide acreage for, a transfer station," she said. "That's it, period."

Both firms told the board they would be willing to bid on a contract to become a preferred-status hauler. The township's proposed solid waste ordinance, to be considered by the board Feb. 14 and implemented by June 30, 1991, stipulates that a preferred-status hauler will be selected.

Under the proposed ordinance, residents may contract with haulers other than the township firm, but the other companies must adhere to guidelines set for the township's selection.

Both BFI and City Management outlined collection plans for township solid waste, recyclable and combustible materials.

The firms demonstrated their collection processes with slide presentations and showed the board plastic recycling bins that individual homeowners would use.

Typically, residents would place newspapers, tin cans, glass and plastics in the recyclable materials container. Solid waste would be set out

at the same time as recyclables, and haulers would separate recyclables into different truck bins at each household.

At multi-family dwellings such as apartment complexes or condominiums, residents would either place individual materials containers at a specific site on a specific day, or would put recyclables into a large separation container, said City Management spokesperson Tom Horton.

BFI spokesperson Bob Line — who also serves on the township's Water and Sewer Commission — said his firm is an international company that services 16 million curbside recycling customers across the nation.

The ability to be everything to everyone is ample reason for the township to select BFI, Line said.

"We can be extremely flexible and tailor a program to fit your needs and desires," Line told the board.

Horton said City Management is Michigan's largest solid waste-handling firm. The company contracts with Lincoln Park for solid waste and recycling collection, and "appears to be low-bidder" for Bloomfield Township's solid waste plan, he said.

Both firms declared their ability to handle household hazardous waste, and both told the board that minimum \$1 million insurance liability levels were necessary.

Another board consideration may involve the time frame needed to implement collection strategies.

"We would be comfortable (in putting a plan together) with 90 days," Line said. "We've done it in a lot less."

"We'd love to have 120 days," Horton said. "We could do it in 90 days, but if you start too soon, you limit the educational process for the residents."

Both presentations were well-accepted by the board, Goss said. She placed emphasis on proximity.

"One of the things we'll look at is where their recycling area will be," she said. "We will look at landfill sites, travel time and where we want our composting material taken."

Wednesday's board meeting will include presentations by Laidlaw Waste Systems Corp. of Southfield and Waste Management Corp. of Livonia. The meeting is scheduled to begin at 7:30 p.m.

County post spurs planner to resign

A potential job related conflict of interest has cost Northville Township the services of its planning commission vice chairperson.

Karen Woodside, a member of the commission since 1988, submitted her resignation — effective immediately — to Supervisor Georgina Goss Jan. 31.

Woodside cited personal reasons for her departure, but said her decision stemmed from her position as a Wayne County assistant prosecutor and the pending sale of a 930-acre plot of county land to developer Robert DeMattia.

"I perceived there could be a conflict problem (with county land matters)," Woodside said. "We received a legal opinion from (township attorney) Ernest Essad in November stating there could be a potential ethics problem because I receive a paycheck from Wayne County."

Woodside said Essad advised her not to take part in discussions involving county land zoning

strategy. Woodside had chaired a planning commission sub-committee studying a township planned unit development ordinance, the zoning plan which will be used to develop DeMattia's property.

The county sold its property north of Five Mile and on both sides of Sheldon Road to DeMattia and his partners last year for \$31.75 million.

The developers are faced with a May, 1991 deadline to acquire zoning from the township. If zoning is not complete by that date, the developer can back out of the deal, forfeiting only a non-refundable \$300,000 sum paid to the county last September.

Woodside would have had to remove herself from all planning commission discussions on county land zoning. Instead, she decided to step down.

Woodside said the rapidly changing face of the township offered a unique challenge during her commission term.

She said the PUD, the PRUD (planned residential unit development), revised township master

plan and the woodlands ordinance were water-mark issues the commission acted upon during her tenure.

"We've had a tremendous amount of development here," she said. "All the things we did hope fully were beneficial to the township."

Woodside's resignation is a loss to the township, Goss said Thursday.

"She put in long, hard hours and was always prepared," Goss said. "She brought in a perspective from a single family resident subdivision and her knowledge as an attorney was invaluable to us."

"We will miss her."

Goss said a search for a replacement will begin immediately. She asked township residents to call or send her a letter stating why they would like to serve on the commission.

"The main concern is dedication; we need someone willing to spend the time necessary to do the job," she said. "We'll take the time to find the best possible candidate."

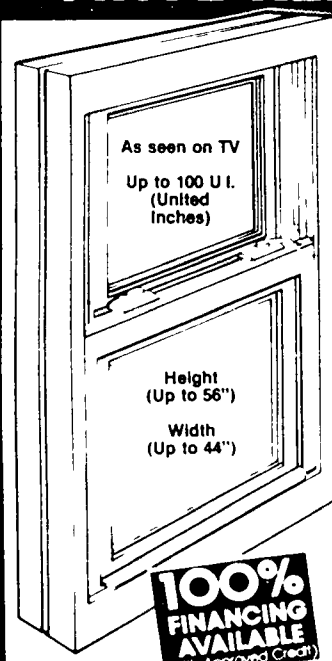

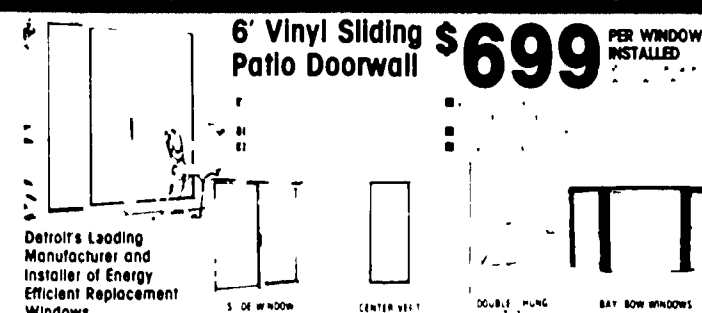

Student group considers war

Northville High School's Students Aware of the World are well aware of the war with Iraq, but they have not formed a consensus regarding the merits of the war.

The group's members all have different opinions, and the group has not taken a position on the war, said SAW President Lori Brummett.

SAW's agenda focuses mainly on the environment, but the student group also works with animal- and human-rights organizations.

It is environmental issues that helped convince Brummett she is against the war.

"Saddam Hussein isn't fighting a real war," Brummett said. "He started an oil spill. He's just destroying the earth."

In fact, Brummett is one SAW member with several strong opinions about the war. She said she feels the U.S. should have pursued alternatives to war like continuing economic sanctions and working with Iraq through groups like Amnesty International.

"I think we should leave (Saudi Arabia)," Brummett said. "They're saying there is no alternative, and I think

there is. There are more things that could have been done.

"Aren't we imposing the same thing on Iraq they're imposing on Kuwait?"

Fear of Iraq obtaining nuclear weapons convinced junior SAW member Nickie Cross that she agreed with this war, although she said she is theoretically opposed to war.

"I don't believe in war; it's basically stupid," Cross said. "But if we were going to start it, it should have been now."

That is, unless Bush knew ahead of time Iraq intended to invade Kuwait.

"People are saying Bush knew Saddam was going into Kuwait," Cross said. "That's when he should have stopped it."

Sophomore SAW member Eddie Rohn said he saw war with Iraq as an inevitability.

"Peace has a price. It would have come to this eventually," Rohn said.

But he said he is not sure the U.S. should continue to invest money in defending Western beliefs around the world.

"We're kind of keeping track of everyone. We don't invest enough in ourselves," he said.

Freshman SAW member Bret

Jensen agrees that war was inevitable. He said reports that Saddam Hussein took incubators intended for Kuwaiti babies helped convince him the U.S. was doing the right thing in becoming involved in the conflict.

"From what I hear in the media, I support it, but we don't know everything," Jensen said.

A distrust of the media was shared by several SAW members.

The media has placed too much attention on the war, senior SAW member Jay Bullington said.

"I'm really desensitized. I feel like, don't bother me unless (the number of casualties) is in the triple digits," Bullington said.

Rohn agreed. He said he thinks bringing home the news too quickly lowers morale and hurts the war effort.

They both said that televised video footage of injured Americans hurts people with family members stationed in Saudi Arabia. People watching television might think their son or daughter was in a bomb's path every time they saw an explosion on television, Rohn and Bullington said.

State cops barred from using jail

Drunken drivers who used to receive a free night's stay at local lock-up facilities will no longer have that luxury.

Northville City has stopped housing drunken drivers arrested by Michigan State Police outside the city, due to a Wayne County decision to stop reimbursing the city for the cost.

Northville is one of five cities affected by the county's Jan. 25 decision to no longer pay for housing of "pre-arrestment prisoners," the majority of which are drunken drivers who are released only after their blood alcohol level has dropped below the state's legal limit of .10 percent. The five cities — Northville, Belleville, Lincoln Park, Melvindale, and Trenton — still are owed about \$150,000 for housing pre-arrestment prisoners over the last two years.

Northville is owed at least \$9,907 for housing 184 such prisoners. The city housed 245 such prisoners in 1988, 235 in 1989, and 192 in 1990.

Representatives of the five cities met Jan. 25 with David Katz of the Wayne County Executive's Office, and Wayne County Jail Administrator Peter Wilson. The county officials announced then that the cities would no longer be reimbursed for housing pre-arrestment prisoners, but that the county would consider reimbursing the cities for prisoners housed before that date.

The county's decision represents a serious safety concern, said Northville Police Chief Rod Cannon. "We're not at war with the state police; we're friendly with them and they understand our position," he said. "It's a major concern for them. If they don't have these lockup jail facilities available to them, there's going to be about 200 drunk drivers annually

who are released prematurely. They'll be arrested and then they'll be processed and released to the custody of their families.

"There's no guarantee once they're released that they're not going to drive again. It's happened before."

Cannon said that releasing intoxicated drivers prematurely can lead to more work for the police departments themselves.

"If you process him and turn him over to his wife, there's better than a 50 / 50 chance you'll be responding to a family fight or he'll go driving again," he said.

"Socially, it's just unacceptable. The safety and the welfare of the citizenry are going to be endangered by this."

City Manager Steven Walters said the county's current stance stems from the state's refusal to house pre-arrestment prisoners itself.

"The dilemma here is that the state doesn't see fit to pay for the housing of its prisoners, which in the final analysis may be the source of the problem," he said. "They are neither willing to pay for someone else to house these prisoners, nor are they prepared to provide a lock-up facility at their police posts, like every local police department does at its own expense. . . . The state takes the position that they have no budget to pay for the housing of state prisoners, and the county argues that it has no legal requirement to pay for housing those prisoners."

The dilemma is exacerbated by the fact that many Wayne County municipalities, including the City of Plymouth, have refused state police requests to house prisoners arrested within their communities in their lock-up facilities, Walters said. That fact has placed the burden of housing pre-arrestment prisoners on the five municipalities that have agreed to house them.

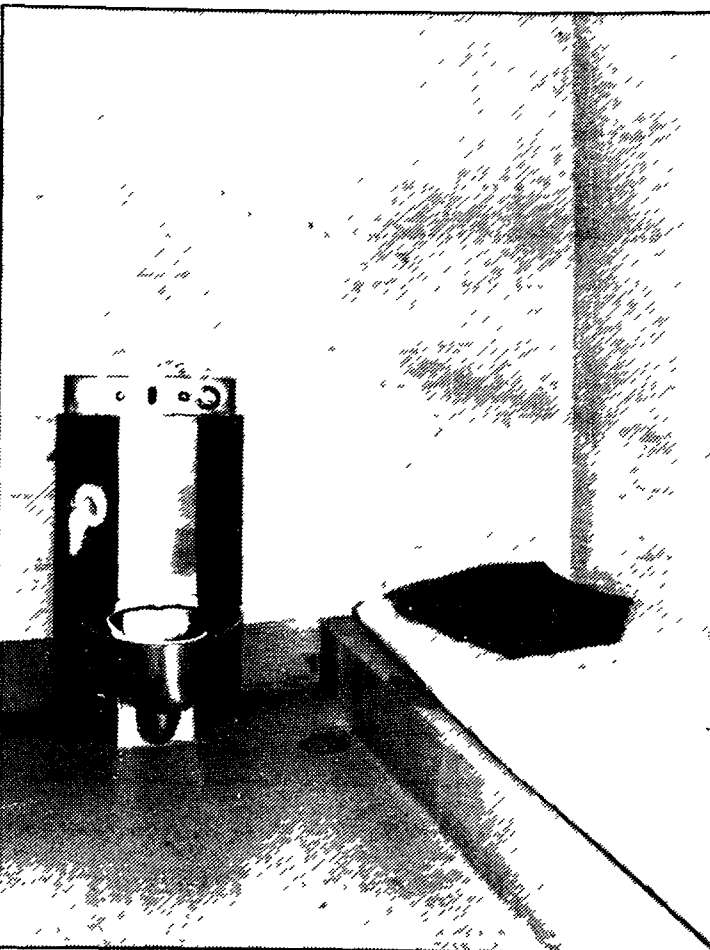

"If everybody would take the prisoners arrested by the state in their own community, there wouldn't be a problem," Walters said.

Northville City will continue to house those prisoners arrested by state police within city limits, Walters added. "We're not saying we're not going to house their prisoners anymore. We're saying we're not going to house other communities' prisoners anymore without getting reimbursed."

"We were doing it not at all because we were making money off of it, be-

cause it was a liability to the city," Walters added. "We were willing to (house them) for the good of the citizens when the state police were not able to house prisoners in other places."

The city council unanimously passed a resolution Dec. 17 urging the county to continue reimbursing local municipalities for the prisoners. The resolution noted that the county had reimbursed cities in 1988 but that the bills for housing 2,540 prisoners in 1989, 184 of those in Northville, had not been honored.

Traffic around Main St. school irks neighbors

Parking is not just a problem downtown, a local resident said.

West Main Street resident Mary Elwart-Keys told the city council last week that parents dropping their children off at a local preschool program cause traffic snarls and safety hazards in her neighborhood.

Parents parking in front of the Board of Education building at 501 W. Main St. to drop their children off at the Early Childhood Development Center often block her and other neighbors' driveways, back up vehicular traffic on West Main and Linden, and make it difficult for service vehicles to enter and school buses to leave the area, Elwart-Keys said.

"People park illegally wherever they can," she said.

What's worse, she said, the illegal parking poses safety hazards to children enrolled in the program: "Children... often dart out into the street. I think it's amazing that a child or adult hasn't been injured to date."

"We're jeopardizing the lives of children coming in and out of that school."

An Early Childhood Development Center spokesperson estimated preschool program enrollment at 167 children.

The existing unloading zones in front of the building on the south side of Main Street can accommodate about 10 cars at a time.

Elwart-Keys said she first complained about the parking shortage to School Superintendent George Bell last September, but has gotten little response since then.

Local police officials have been little help as well, she added. She said police required a sworn complaint

before they would cite a person for parking in front of a fire hydrant. "I really think we should expect a greater response from the police," she said.

Police recently signed a section of Main Street near her home as a no parking zone, Elwart-Keys added, but she predicted the move will do little to solve the problem because parents park illegally already. "I don't think another sign is the answer to the question," she said.

But Police Chief Rod Cannon said Friday afternoon that the new no parking zone has helped reduce the traffic "bottleneck" in the area by limiting drop-offs to the south side of the street. "Since yesterday I think it's been flowing well, but I know a few local residents are perplexed," he said. Cannon said he drove by the area several times Friday and saw little evidence of traffic problems.

"If the officers are there and they see people in violation, they're cited," he added.

Elwart-Keys told the council she will argue her case further at the Board of Education meeting tonight at 7:30 p.m. at the Old Village School, 405 W. Main St.

"The residents of the neighborhood are paying the price because the school board does not have enough parking," she said.

Elwart-Keys' husband, Charles Keys, asked why the city did not require adequate parking for the preschool program when it began.

"The school district was exempt from that process and they still are, which is why we need their cooperation," replied Mayor Chris Johnson.

Public school programs are exempt from local zoning ordinances.

MUSTANG UPDATE: The way the Northville swimmers are now performing, it's hard to believe that they actually have a blemish on their season record.

The Mustangs put together the season's best effort on Feb. 5 to crunch a proud Livonia Churchill squad 75-18 and extend their winning streak to seven. It was Senior Night — the final home meet of the season — and the result was 32 career-best swims, six school records, six pool records and three more state qualifying cuts.

"I thought it was the most outstanding swimming I've seen in a dual meet in my four years here at Northville," Mustang Coach Mark Heiden said. "We had eight seniors swimming in their last home meet and they wanted it to be memorable — they did."

Northville — ranked No. 10 in the most recent Class A state poll — grabbed firsts in all 12 events. The highlight of an evening filled with outstanding efforts came in diving, where Mustang seniors Steve Lang and Larry Oslecki combined to put on one of the greatest performances ever seen in the Northville pool. Before the event was over, two new school records and two new pool records had been established.

"It was the best high school diving exhibition I've ever seen," Heiden said. "You can only dream of having two divers like this on the same team."

WILDCAT UPDATE: Last week's 110-73 win over Livonia Churchill gives the Novi swim team a 3-4 record this season against members of the powerful Western Lakes Activities Association (WLAA). After dropping three of the first four against the WLAA, the Wildcats have now won two straight, and can even the slate on Feb. 12 against Livonia Franklin.

"All four of our losses were to the WLAA's top four teams," Novi Coach Kevin Lane said. "We've had a lot more luck against the rest."

The Cats won seven of 12 events against the visiting Chargers on Feb. 5, but the big highlight was the winning effort in the 200-yard freestyle relay. The Novi team of Mark Chirgwin, Mike Speerschneider, Derek Speerschneider and Jamie May won the race in 1:33.59, which qualified the team for a spot in the MHSAA State Meet. The Wildcat combo clocked in exactly at the qualifying cut-off, down to the hundredth of a second.

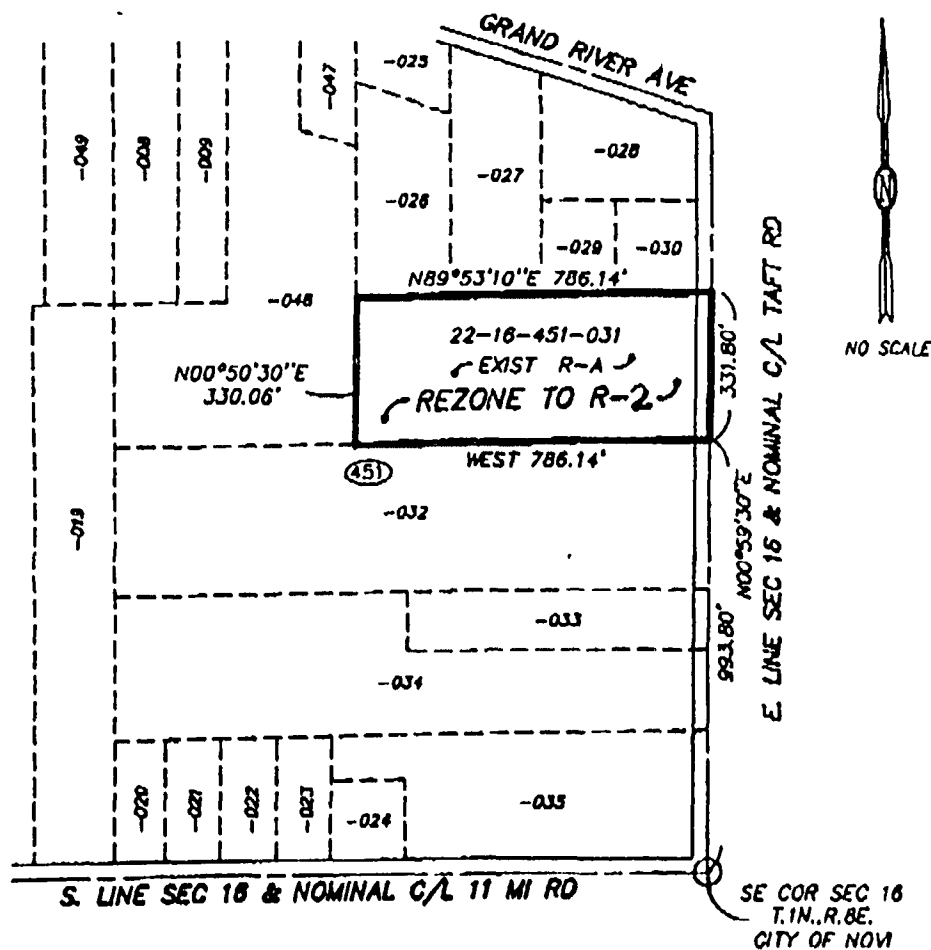

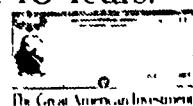

Proposed zoning move may please everyone

The thought of fastfood restaurants, video stores and gas stations popping up along the Haggerty Road/Six Mile intersection like so many spring rain-spawned mushrooms plainly distresses Northville Township residents and officials alike.

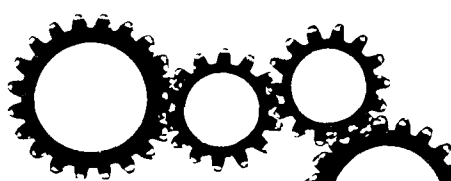
Somebody should do something about freeway service zoning, someone recently told the planning commission.

Guess what? Someone is doing just that.

The commission took a step to wrest tighter control of undeveloped property along Haggerty Road by setting a March 26 public hearing for a proposed zoning change. Planners clearly support a zoning switch from freeway service (gas stations, restaurants and the like) to large office complexes.

The proposed change will align a small parcel along the Six Mile and Haggerty intersection with the balance of large office-zoned land between Six and Seven Mile along Haggerty, planning commissioners said. The rezoning will also provide consistency with Livonia's territory east of Haggerty.

But the real reason for the potential change is the fear of burger joints and resultant traffic woes. Planners were shocked into rezoning fever by

the out-of-nowhere appearance of a McDonald's site plan for Six Mile near the intersection.

Residents screamed, poets dreamed and planners wrung their hands at the thought of horde of taco nuggets and self-serve stations clogging arteries — transportation and human — along an intersection already bloated with traffic and user-intensive businesses. So a change was proposed and most likely will be approved March 26.

To be honest, journalists kind of like having a multitude of fast-food restaurants nearby. We boycott some, turn our noses up at others, but always need them during our usual mad-dash-before-deadline lunches and after-night-meeting dinners.

But we've no particular problems with the planning commission's move. It's what residents and officials want, and this is a chance to have it their way.

Township offers good ordinance on trash

Under the terms of the Wayne County Solid Waste Plan, Northville Township needs to pass a new ordinance dealing with trash disposal and related issues.

All the communities in the county, including the township and the city, face the same sort of issues: figuring out ways to comply with waste-reduction and other guidelines in the county's waste plan. The township's effort, in the form of an ordinance set for formal introduction this week, is a particularly thorough one.

Among the facets of the township's plan: selecting, for the first time, a "preferred" company for trash collection; a prohibition on burning garbage; local licensing of trash haulers; and, most importantly, requiring residents to sepa-

rate trash by type.

All these changes, if adopted, will dramatically improve the trash collection system in the township — both in terms of efficient operations and environmental concerns. The ordinance, frankly, is probably more far-reaching than it needs to be under the strictest terms of the county plan. The drafters of the proposal have taken a progressive approach, and the township will be well-served by the result.

Learning to separate trash by type will require a major lifestyle change for many residents. But it will be best for everyone in the long run, saving money on disposal costs and getting rid of the garbage in the most responsible way.

Bending over backward again



The move by Eastern Michigan University to drop the Huron as its mascot doesn't seem like a very sporting move to me.

I'm by no means insensitive to the plight of Native Americans, but I can't help but feel that even those of Indian heritage would be left scratching their heads over EMU's action. Here we go again, bending

over backward to placate a special-interest group.

Supposedly the use of an Indian mascot implies a warlike nature in Native Americans. For that reason the school was put under pressure in 1989 to drop the Huron, and it gave in to the request two weeks ago.

Even if a warlike nature was the only thing that the Indian mascot stood for, I would still have a hard time swallowing that as a reason to drop the team's name. I'm mostly Irish stock, but I don't take offense at the pugilistic moniker at Notre Dame, the Fighting Irish. As long as their 50-50 raffles aren't going to support the IRA, I'm happy with the name.

But that's not all a school mascot — Indian or otherwise — stands for.

A mascot can stand for rulership, like the South Lyon Lions; reliability, like the Perry Ramblers (named for the supposedly reliable automobile); tenacity, like the Litchfield Terriers; quickness, like the Freeland Falcons; leadership, like the Waterford Kettering Captains.

A mascot can also boost a community's identity, like the

Midland Chemicals or the Negaunee Miners.

Those are all noble qualities for a mascot to represent.

And in carrying a name onto the playing field, the athletes themselves do justice to the nickname as well. Think of all the positive aspects of athletics: pride, teamwork, fair play, achievement. Not bad attributes for a Huron (or a Chippewa, or any Redskin) to lay claim to.

I'm not so naive as to think that a team's mascot is always portrayed in a positive light. I think it was Ypsilanti High — the Braves — that used to have as its logo a rather undignified caricature of a potbellied Indian with a Jimmy Durante nose. I can understand someone taking offense, and the school did drop it.

EMU's Huron was nothing of the sort. He was a rather proud-looking Indian, well-festooned with feathers.

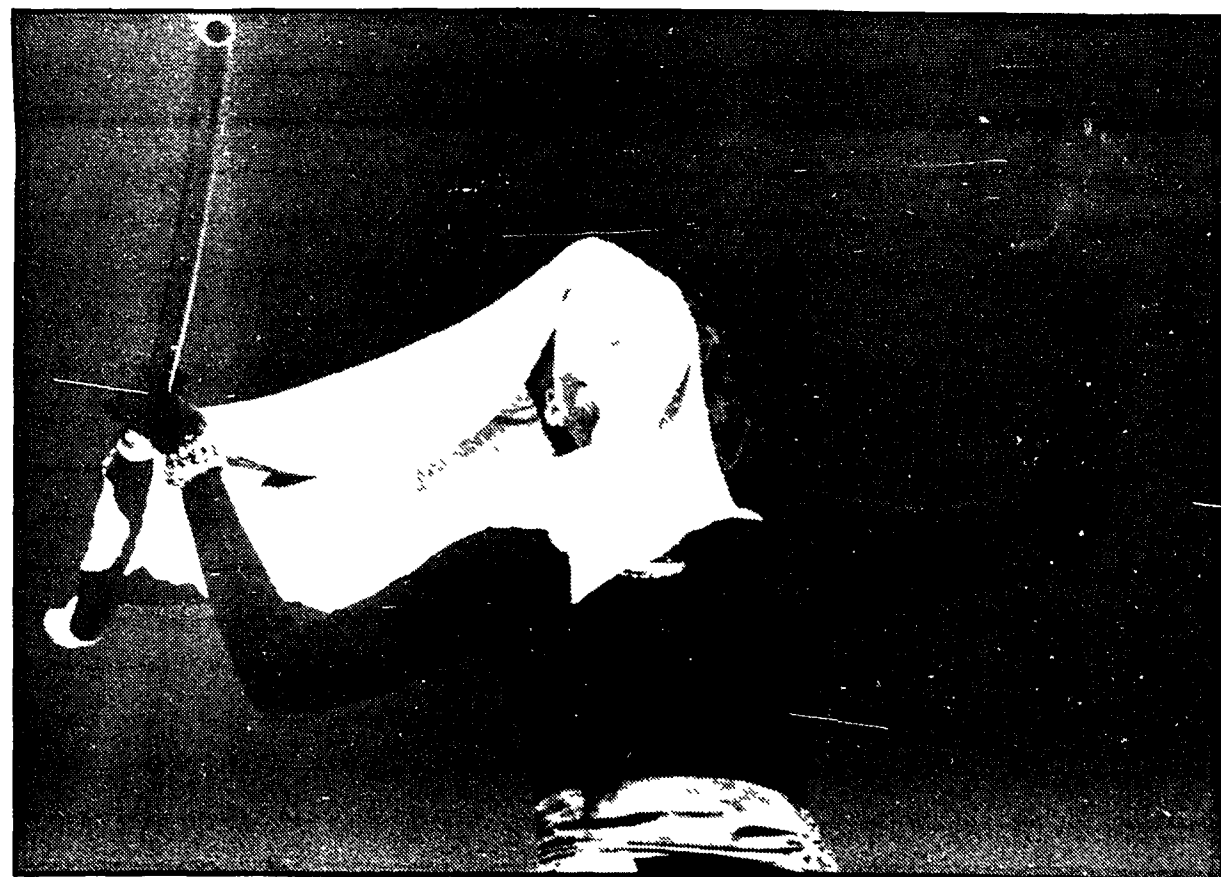
There's no denying that the Native Americans have had a pretty tough time of it. As a minority group, they've been dumped on, and they've got a right to be mad (dare I say fighting mad?).

Discrimination seems to be something we're all too good at here in America. The plight of Native Americans and blacks are only the largest manifestations. My family name was once O'Byrne, but my great-grandfather Patrick changed it to Byrne because of discrimination against Irish immigrants in the late 1800s.

I think in EMU's case, Indian activists have a legitimate gripe if they want to do away with the war whoops from the pep band. But to me, doing away with the Huron nickname and logo are like throwing the baby out with the bathwater.

Group offers a refreshing change



Two events occurred in one recent week that I thought I never would live to see.

First, the Soviet Union gave the United States some military secrets on how to deal with weaponry the Soviets had sold to Iraq.

Second, the Michigan Townships Association conducted a seminar on how to comply with the "sunshine laws" — the Open Meetings and Freedom of Information acts. Not on how to evade them. How to obey.

Most readers are familiar with the Soviets' long-standing obsession with official secrecy. MTA, which held its annual convention in Detroit, may be less familiar to you.

In population, townships are our smallest units of government. Outside the metropolitan area, many have only a couple of thousand people. They tell you they are grass-roots government. They frequently don't act like it.

In 1975, township supervisors were vociferous opponents of the Open Meetings Act. I was at some legislative hearings and read stacks of testimony.

Since then, township supervisors could be counted on to support every crippling amend-

ment — allowing meetings in private homes, closing the doors any time an angry citizen threatened a lawsuit, everything imaginable.

MTA used to invite legislative committees handling OMA bills to its conventions and bombard them with requests for secrecy. It was pretty blatant.

Detroit's profane mayor and its city council have bad reputations in this regard. But to see sheer red-faced anger, you really need to pry information out of a rural township supervisor.

MTA's revolutionary seminar on compliance with the sunshine laws was conducted by Evelyn David, MTA's public affairs and membership information officer. Previously, she had been supervisor for 11 years of Sebawa Township.

David is not a lawyer. That is significant. Both sunshine laws were deliberately written in layman's language so that ordinary local officials and citizens can understand them without a lawyer's interpretation.

Indeed, the sure ways to tell that a public official intends to give you the runaround are when he or she says (a) "Why do you need to know?" and (b) "I want to consult our attorney."

You don't have to have a reason for attending a meeting or requesting information. And when an official wants to consult an attorney, 99 percent of the time it's to ask the attorney to concoct a rationalization for denying you access,

not to clarify the law.

David's seminar was good. A lot of it was technical:

- When do you have to have the minutes of a meeting available? Eight days.

- Are you obliged to provide the public copies of unapproved minutes? Yes — but label them "unapproved minutes."

- When protesting an assessment, may a taxpayer who doesn't want to speak publicly demand a closed meeting of the board of review? No — sessions must be open.

- A quorum of our board is having a workshop with the union. Do we have to post it and keep minutes? Yes — even if you call it a workshop or a study session, it's still a meeting.

David and MTA set a good example for other groups such as the associations of school boards, municipal leagues, counties, colleges and police chiefs. I have a notion we would be better governed, and have more confidence in government, if our officials studied how to comply with the sunshine laws rather than crabbily challenging citizens to "sue us."

Math programs offer flexibility

We have been very fortunate in having a son with a 4.0 average. He is especially good in math, having taken high school algebra in the eighth grade. He is now a junior taking calculus which I understand is the strongest math class offered in high schools. Why don't schools have extra challenges for talented students who finished all the high level math before their senior year?

They do. I checked with your school system. Your son, a junior, is not taking calculus this year. He is taking trigonometry/pre-calculus. After pre-calculus he is eligible to take analyti-

cal geometry/calculus in his senior year, a real challenge.

In addition, your district offers a high-powered (math based) advanced placement computer class for the more talented upper class math students.

Also available is probability statistics for those really into math. And the district can make arrangements with a local university for the very talented math students to take a college math courses which grant dual credit.

Dual credit means a student can receive high school credit toward graduation and also university credit providing the parents pay the

university tuition.

Congratulations on having a talented math student. And congratulations to your school district for offering a very rigorous math experience for its gifted math student.

Back when you were in high school calculus was probably the only senior math offering. Algebra, the freshman offering.

Today, the brighter math kids often take algebra in the eighth grade and geometry in the ninth grade. Indeed, pre-geometry experiences can now be found at the upper elementary level in quality programs.

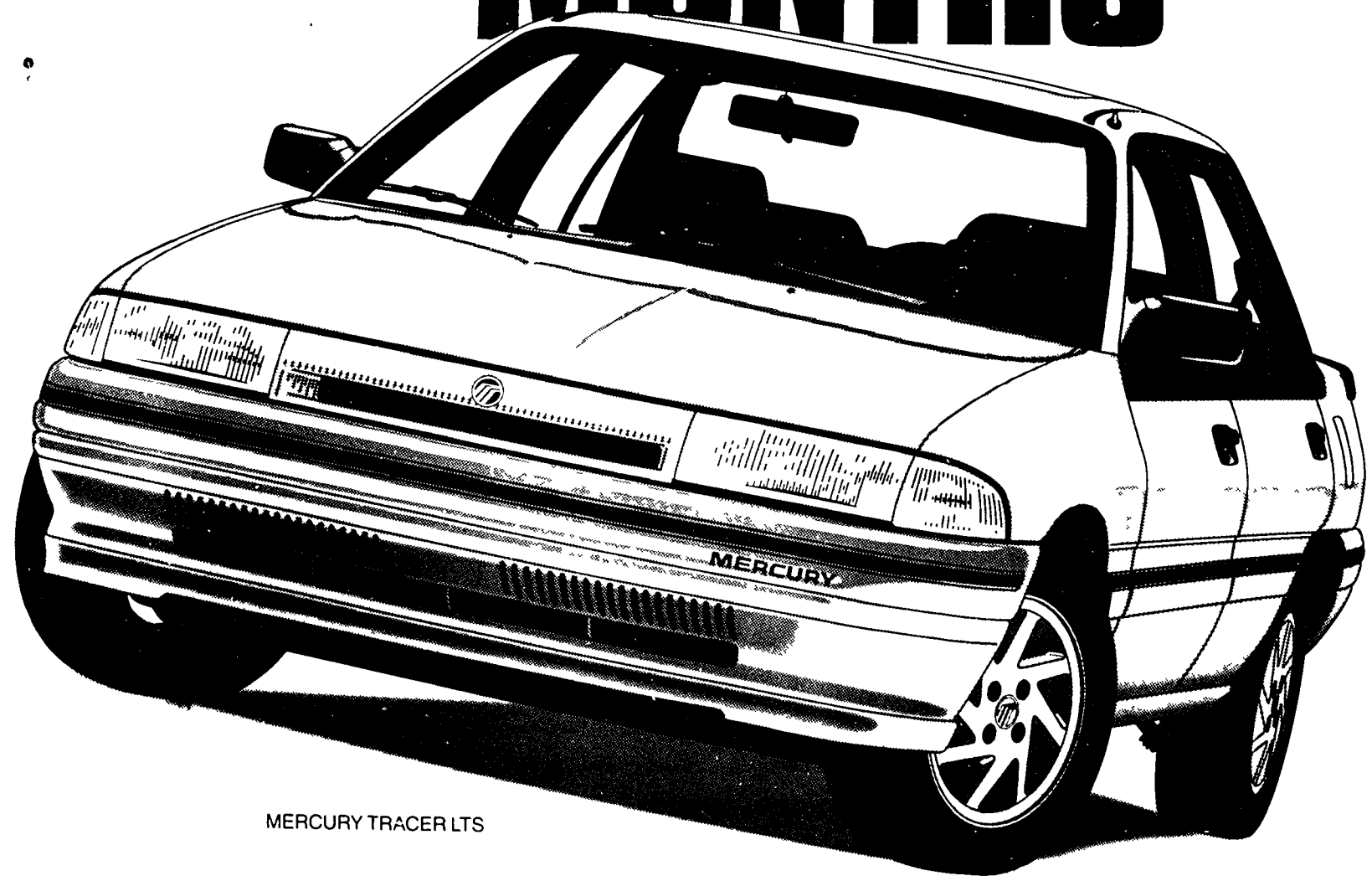

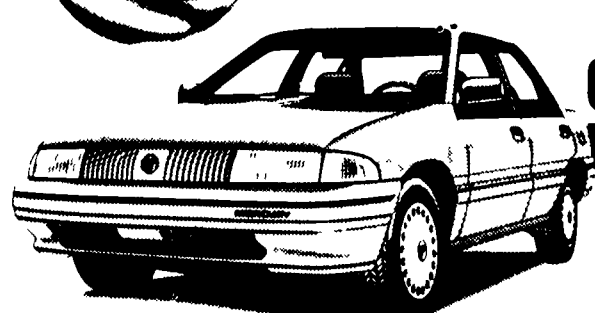

Picking Burgundy is a name game

Bordeaux, the wine region along France's Atlantic coast, is organized around the chateau concept. Here the vineyards that produce wine surround a large domicile. Once ruled by the English, Bordeaux vineyards are still controlled by wealthy land owners.

Burgundy's vineyards, on the other hand, were divided among the peasants after the French Revolution. The atmosphere in Burgundy is one of a farming community without much aristocracy.

Ownership of Burgundy vineyards is a complicated network of small growers, many of whom farm their tiny plots in the evening and weekends after working a full-time city job.

Clos de Vougeot (125 vineyard acres owned by 77 growers) is a classic example.

Ownership of thousands of small vineyard parcels is constantly changing as heirs take possession of family plots and land is bought and sold. It is difficult to keep track of who has what grapes available for making wine from one vintage to the next.

How can the wine consumer sort out the Burgundy puzzle? Since the wines of France are given place names, consumers could familiarize themselves with the names of the region's appellations.

But it may be more important for the neophyte to become familiar with the names of the best producers rather than remembering the great Burgundy vintages or the long list of appellations. The best producers make good wines even in lesser vintages.

Considering that Burgundy produces only one-tenth as much wine as Bordeaux, that Burgundy suffers from huge vintage variation and the weak American dollar, it is inevitable that prices of Burgundy wines will continue to escalate.

"Not all Burgundy wines are very expensive," said Pierre-Henry Gagey, assistant managing director of Maison Louis Jadot in Beaune. "There are many fine Burgundies, both red and white, that I would classify as affordable."

The current vintage in the market is 1988. It is a great vintage because the tannins are softer and the quality from the small grower is high. Throughout 1991, the 1988 vintage offers a fantastic opportunity to discover the affordability of many Burgundy wines.

To begin a discovery of white Burgundy, produced entirely from chardonnay, Gagey suggests searching out wines from four small villages in the Cote d'Or: Savigny-Les-Beaune; Pernand-Vergelesses; Auxey-Duresses, St-Aubin; and Rully in the Cote Chalonnaise.

For red Burgundies on a budget, Gagey recommends selections from the villages of Pernand-Vergelesses, Marsannay, Santenay and Cote de Beaune.

In addition to Louis Jadot, we recommend the following Burgundy producers for quality, value and availability: Joseph Drouhin, Louis Latour, Etienne Sauzet, Pierre Bouree, Georges Deleger, Georges Duboeuf, Jean Grivot, Robert Jaye-Gilles, Mongeard-Mugneret, Christian Serafin, Tolle-Beaut, De Villaine, Lucien Bollob, Lupe-Cholet, Chartron et Trebuchet, Alain Geoffroy, Remois-senet, Coche-Dukry, Philippe Rossignol, Robert Cheillon, Francois Raveneau, Francois Jobard, Olivier Leflaive, Dauvissat, Hospices de Beaune, Jaffelin and Henri Jayer.

Gadgets and gizmos

What's cooking in new kitchen gear

OK, now that the holidays are over, it's time to reorganize the kitchen and make room for all your new gadgets and gizmos. But before making any rash decisions about which tools stay and which get packed away for the next garage sale, let's consult a few professionals who know all about your future in the kitchen.

Espresso machines, electric hand mixers and chef's knives were all big sellers during the 1990 holiday season, but at the top of the list was an electronic bread-making machine. Priced between \$230 and \$350, depending upon the size and brand, this small, counter-top kitchen appliance mixes, kneads, raises and then bakes one loaf of bread any time you add the ingredients and program it to do so.

Most of these machines bake one round or one rectangular loaf, depending on the make and model you choose. It won't work for braided coffee cakes, baguettes, or rolls, so don't discard your electric mixer with a dough hook attachment just yet.

Are you as baffled as we are as to why, during recessionary times, folks are plunking down \$200 to \$380 for a machine which only bakes specific styles of bread? Toula Patsalis, owner of Kitchen Glamour kitchenware stores, said, "Now that the average family has a dual income and both people working, they want kitchen conveniences and they want the best."

Patsalis added that high-quality chef's knives and paring knives, especially the high-carbon stainless steel, by Wusthof-Trident and Gerber have sold well.

At the Kitchen Witch in Northville, popular items have a decidedly Italian bent to them.

"Pizza stones were very popular this year," said owner Ronnie Cambra. "You just set them in the oven, and they crisp up the bottom of your pizza real well. They're good for baguettes too."

Naturally, said Cambra, if you buy a pizza stone, you also need a pizza peel, the huge paddle used to lift whole pizzas out of the oven.

Moving from the sublime to the ridiculous, another popular item at the Kitchen Witch was the Twirl O'Chetti. It's a fork with a hand crank on one end that allows you to twirl the tines for eating spaghetti.

"Most people buy it as a joke gift; it's a fun thing," said Cambra.

She also says that the popular TV cooking shows have dictated what sells her store. Sales of pasta makers picked up when Graham Kerr (a.k.a. the Galloping Gourmet) did a series on pasta.

"Zyliss garlic presses are popular too because of Jeff Smith, 'the Frugal Gourmet,'" Cambra said.

Also popular were the French sandwich makers, which operate on the same basic principle as waffle iron.

"People buy them for college students," said Cambra. "They can take them in the dorm and make a fairly good meal by putting veggies and things in the sandwich."

Richard Christensen has been an associate at Bridge Kitchenware in New York City for the past 19 years. He agrees that top-quality kitchen knives are hot items. He said home cooking is now "the thing to do. Our customers realize that high-quality items are long lasting and really make a difference when you use them. In New York, more and more people are cooking at home again, not just because of the high cost of restaurant dining but because you get less quality for your dollar (dining out)."

David Smith, manager of Williams-Sonoma in Troy, agrees electric hand mixers and electronic bread-making machines are "in" but he also saw requests for hand-cranked egg beaters and elongated fish poachers.

Well, what does 1991 hold for cooking enthusiasts? Use of copper zabalone (Italian egg custard) pots and manual pasta machines is on the rise, as Italian cookery is still very popular. Christensen predicts sales increases in 1991 of the electric hand mixer and top-quality knives, along with stainless steel mandolines, a hand-operated tool that slices, juliennes or waffle cuts vegetables and fruits. The mandoline came to fame during the nouvelle cuisine era of the late '70s and early '80s.

The "back-to-basics" philosophy in kitchenware has

been obvious in the cookbook market as well. Last year Julia Child's "The Way To Cook" and "The New Basics" by Julee Rosso and Sheila Lukins each sold more than one million copies. And just as the 1990 holiday rush began, Fred Bridge and Jean F. Tibbets added some balance to the list with "The Well Tooled Kitchen" (William Morrow and Co., \$24.95, 1990).

For more than 55 years, Fred Bridge has supplied cooks, from the professional chef to the weekend cuisinier. Shelves and counters of his New York store on E. 52nd Street are packed warehouse-fashion with every conceivable kitchen gadget, pot, knife, slicers and mold.

"The Well-Tooled Kitchen" is described as a guide to more than 500 kitchenware items. With more than 250 photographs, it really is an encyclopedia of utensils. Bridge and co-author Tibbets devote the first 30 pages of the book to the history and uses of knives. They thoroughly answer all questions about the best materials and design of knives for chopping, slicing, boning, fluting, filleting and decorating food.

Not sure how or why to use a butcher's (or a multicut) steel, or even what it is? Bridge and Tibbets explain that the steel, a tapered cylinder, is used to straighten a knife blade's cutting edge and give it a keener finish.

So before going out to buy a new truffle slicer, grapefruit knife or brioche mold to your pantry shelf, consult the source: "The Well-Tooled Kitchen."

Well-tooled recipes

As an added bonus, authors of "The Well-Tooled Kitchen" have included a selection of recipes from some of the country's best known chefs, such as Wolfgang Puck, Marcella Hazan and Paula Wolfert.

Here are two classic dishes from two of New York's best, Andre Soltner, chef-proprietor of Lutèce restaurant, and Sandro Floritti, executive chef of Sandro's.

TARTE A L'ORANGE (Andre Soltner, Lutèce, New York) (for your peelers and whisks)

Pastry:
1 cup flour
3 tablespoons granulated sugar
Pinch salt
6 tablespoons cold, unsalted butter, cubed
1 large egg yolk
1 to 2 tablespoons cold water

Egg wash:
1 large egg yolk combined with 2 tablespoons cold water.

Unlucky at love? Try your luck with chocolate

Picture, if you can, life without chocolate.

For some it may be easy but for chocoholics the idea is unbearable. To us a meal is incomplete without our fix of a truffle or candy bar, a grocery trip wasted without the obligatory bag of semi-sweet chips, and the cup of cocoa before bed to relax and soothe is unheard of. Indeed, we would gladly give up an entire day's calories for a rich, chocolate dessert.

What is the mystique behind this divine substance? History tells us that Cortes and his soldiers were the first to encounter chocolate at the court of Montezuma in 1519. They were present during a ritual ceremony where the mighty ruler kept drinking a sacred liquid from a golden goblet. Later the Spaniards were also served bowls of the beverage called "chocolatl" meaning warm liquid.

The Aztecs believed that one of their high prophets brought the seeds from paradise, sowed them in his garden, and that their consumption conveyed wisdom and knowledge. The cocoa bean became important religiously and monetarily as it was used as a medium of exchange for goods. For the next 100 years the Spaniards held a monopoly on cocoa which provided a very profitable business.

Gradually chocolate spread to Italy and France where it was condemned as "the beverage of Satan" by churchmen. However, it was served in the high courts as a sweetened, frothy beverage and accepted enthusiastically. By 1707 cocoa was being served in specialty shops in England.

It was not until 1876 that milk chocolate was

created in Switzerland. The same basic process is used today, the cocoa beans are milled producing a chocolate liquor from which all chocolate is made. The cocoa butter content is about 55 percent in baking chocolate.

Milk chocolate is made by adding whole milk solids, sugar, additional cocoa butter and vanilla to the liquor. Sweet and semi-sweet chocolate are made in the same way, but omit the milk.

Chocolate liquor is pumped onto presses and some of the butter extruded out. The cake-like substance that remains is ground up, and results in cocoa powder.

Dutch chocolate is treated with alkali which produces a darker chocolate, while the Swiss are noted for their chocolates of velvety smoothness.

In 1765, the first chocolate factory was established in the American colonies and from that point on we have become a country of chocolate lovers. On an annual basis chocolate is a \$5-billion industry. Last year, on average, each American ate 11 pounds of chocolate.

There are many varieties of chocolate and each has its specific place in cooking, baking or candy making. Unsweetened chocolate is also referred to as bitter or baking chocolate. It is the pure chocolate liquor from the beans which has poured into molds to cool and harden.

Cocoa is the powder left from the liquor after most of the butter has been removed. It can be used for unsweetened chocolate in most recipes by substituting 3 tablespoons cocoa and 1 tablespoon vegetable shortening for each ounce of

chocolate.

Sweet chocolates are made from the liquor with sugar and extra cocoa butter added. They are used for cooking and eating. Semi-sweet chocolate is liquor with the addition of some sugar. The Dutch process cocoa and chocolate are richer and darker and can be substituted for regular chocolate.

Store chocolate in a dark, cool place. A higher temperature will change the color due to the melting of the cocoa butter. It is wise to use chocolate in a timely manner rather than storing for any length of time.

Chocolate scorches easily when heated so it is wise to stay close while melting. Grating or chopping into small pieces facilitates melting. To melt chocolate over direct heat use a heavy pan and stir constantly. The addition of liquid flavoring or butter helps prevent scorching.

A preferred stove-top method is the use of a double boiler. Keep the water to a simmer so that steam or splashes do not touch the melting chocolate which would cause it to harden and stiffen.

The microwave is a true convenience when melting chocolate. Place bits into a glass bowl and micro on high power for 30 seconds, stir and repeat until all the chocolate is smooth. Finally, the oven is also an option. Preheat to 300 degrees, place the chocolate into an oven-proof dish and put into the oven. Turn the oven off. Stir and check the chocolate frequently.

Since chocolate is associated with passion and the holiday of lovers is approaching, I have included several easy and delicious recipes that will have your sweetheart eating out of your hand.

PAT'S KNOCK-YOUR-SOCKS-OFF, SUPER EASY, CHOCOLATE COOKIES

½ pound butter or margarine, melted
1 sleeve saltine crackers
4 ounces semi-sweet chocolate chips, melted
½ cup crushed nuts if desired

Place crackers in a jelly roll pan in a single layer. Pour melted butter over and bake in a 350 degree oven for 15 minutes. Spread melted chocolate over crackers and sprinkle nuts over the top. Let cool until hardened. Cut into squares. It's hard to eat just one!! Or two!! Or three!!

CHOCOLATE ALMOND BARK

1 cup sugar
3 ounces chocolate melted (unsweetened)
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 cup toasted, blanched almond slivers or slices

Place the sugar in a heavy skillet and stir over low heat until melted. Add the chocolate and vanilla and blend until smooth. Add the almonds and stir quickly to distribute. Pour onto a cookie sheet covered with waxed paper and spread until even. Let cool. Break into pieces and store in an airtight container.

NUT CLUSTERS

1 ounce unsweetened chocolate
¼ cup semi-sweet morsels
1 tablespoons butter or margarine
1 ½ cups salted mixed nuts (or your favorite nut)
1 tablespoons vanilla extract

Melt chocolates together. Stir in butter, nuts and vanilla. Drop by spoonfuls onto wax paper. Cool and store in an airtight container. Makes 2-3 dozen clusters.

Recipes call for popular gadgets

Combine the flour, sugar and salt in a large bowl and stir to mix. Make a well in the center, add the butter and work it in until it is the consistency of coarse cornmeal.

Combine the egg yolk and water, stir to mix, then add to the pastry and mix well.

Shape into a ball, then roll and fit it into a 9-inch-round tart form. Trim, prick the bottom of the pastry shell with a fork and freeze 30 minutes.

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Line the form with aluminum foil, weight with pie weights and bake 12 minutes. Remove the weights and foil, brush the pastry shell with the egg wash and continue to bake 8 more minutes. Remove from the oven and cool to room temperature before using. Makes one 9-inch tart.

Grand Marnier
Bavarian Cream,
Fruit Topping
and Glaze
4 large egg yolks

1/4 cup granulated sugar
1 1/2-ounce package unflavored gelatin
1 cup milk
1 1/2 tablespoons Grand Marnier
1/4 cup heavy cream
6 large navel oranges
2 tablespoons warmed and strained apricot preserves
1 tablespoon orange juice

Whisk the egg yolks, sugar and gelatin together in a bowl and set aside. Heat the milk in a medium saucepan, then slowly add to the egg yolk mixture, whisking constantly to mix. Pour back into the saucepan and cook over medium-low heat 5 minutes or until the custard is thick enough to coat the back of a spoon; stir constantly.

Pour the mixture into a bowl set over a large bowl of iced water, then stir in the liqueur; stir frequently until the custard is chilled and thicker.

Beat the cream until soft peaks form, then lightly fold into the custard; continue to chill until firmer, then pour into the cooled tart shell

and spread evenly.

Julienne the zest from two of the oranges and blanch in boiling water 2 minutes. Remove with a slotted spoon and set aside.

Use a sharp knife to peel all the oranges; cut between the membranes to release and remove the flesh, then arrange the freed orange sections over the filling in concentric circles.

In a small bowl combine the strained preserves with the orange juice, stir to mix, then use it to glaze the oranges; sprinkle the tart with the julienned orange zest.

FOCACCIA

(Sandro Fioritti, Sandro's, New York)
(for your bread-maker)

1 1/4 ounces active dry yeast
1 1/2 cups warm water (108 degrees)
2 1/2 teaspoons coarse salt
1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil
4 cups unbleached flour
2 tablespoons fresh whole rosemary leaves

Combine the yeast and 1/4 cup warm water in a large bowl, stir to mix and set aside 5 minutes to dissolve thoroughly.

Add the remaining water together with 1 teaspoon salt and 2 tablespoons oil and stir to mix; gradually work in the flour.

Turn the dough out onto a well-floured surface and vigorously knead 10 minutes or until the dough is smooth and elastic. Shape into a ball and place in a large bowl, cover with a towel and set aside in warm place, 1 1/2 hours or until doubled in volume.

Punch down the dough, knead briefly; then roll to fit a lightly oiled baking sheet. The dough should measure about 1/2 inch deep. Use your finger to poke holes in the surface of the dough at 1-inch intervals, then brush with the remaining oil.

Sprinkle the rosemary over all and season with the remaining salt; set aside 30 minutes to rest. Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Bake 15-20 minutes or until golden brown. Makes 8 servings.

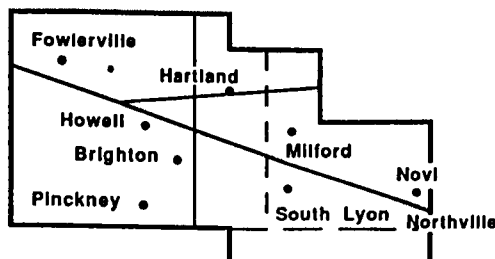

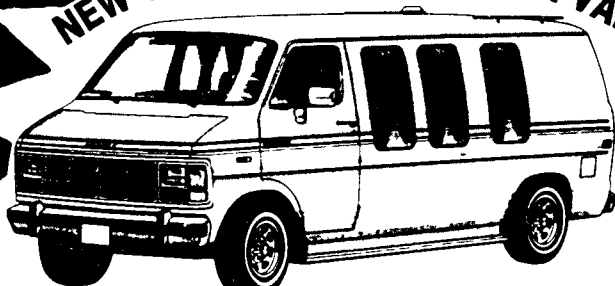

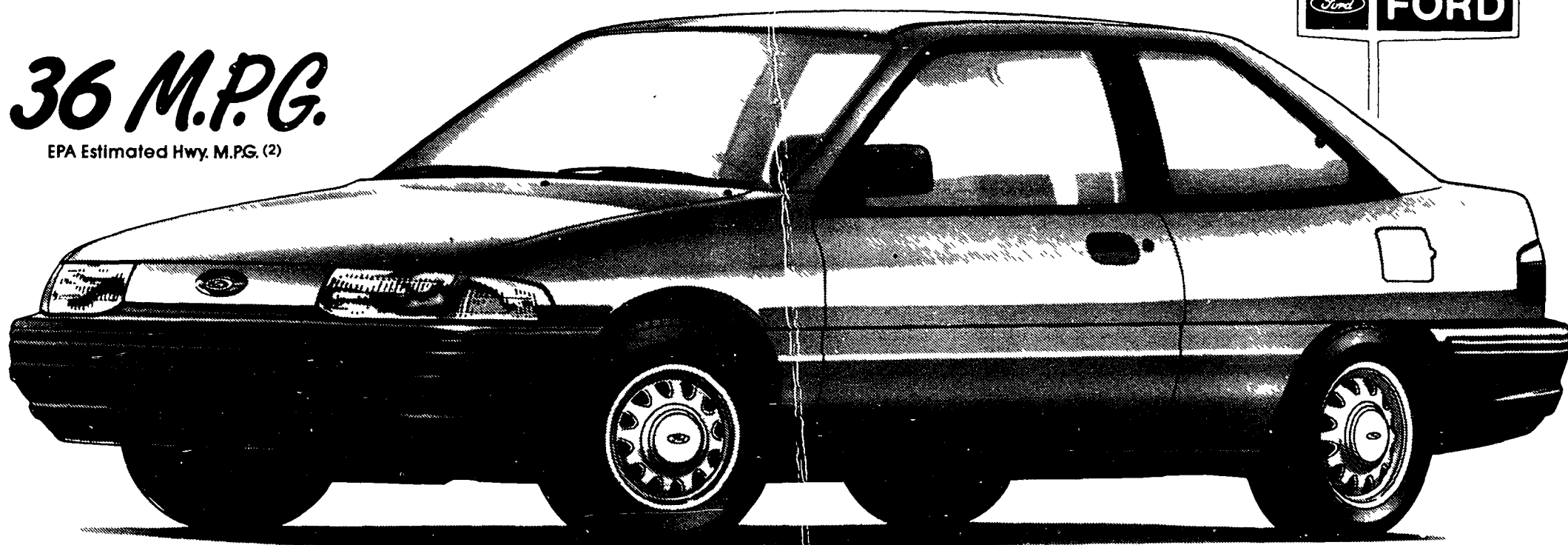

Carl Reiner hosts 'Sunday Best'

New NBC program looks at television past, present

Comedy legend Carl Reiner has been humoring television audiences through five decades ever since he was a regular on 1949's "The 54th Street Revue."

He's at it again as host of NBC's new series "Sunday Best," which looks at funny broadcasting moments since the beginning of television through the present.

While he got his start on television as the photographer in a 1948 series called "Fashion Story," he gained fame for two other roles: his regular spot on the 1950's variety program "Your Show of Shows" and his writing and producing role on "The Dick Van Dyke Show." In fact, the tall, balding Reiner looks the same as he did when he played on the latter show as Alan Brady from 1961 to 1966.

The '60s brought another claim to fame for the comedian. His comedy routine, "The 2,000 Year Old Man" with Mel Brooks, had several incarnations on television and on records.

In the early 1970s he worked for a

while on "The New Dick Van Dyke Show," and in 1976 he played Mr. Angel in the short-lived series "Good Heavens." Later in that decade he took his talents to feature films, directing movies like "Oh God" and "The Jerk."

He got his chance to play drama in the 1981 TV movie "Skokie." But he has also continued creating comedy vehicles for others as a writer, producer and director.

As host of NBC's "Sunday Best," Reiner will be guiding viewers through events in television history.

"He's really the father figure who guides you through, and he really is strictly the host. He may do an occasional comedy bit, but we will have other comedy bits on the show," explained Garth R. Ancier, executive producer of "Sunday Best."

Those other comedy bits are provided by an eclectic group of television aficionados including syndicated columnist and TV satirist Linda Ellerbee, actor/comedian (and original Eddie Haskell) Harry Shearer, co-creator of David Letterman's

"Late Night" Merrill Markoe and comedian Jeff Cesario. Executives on "Sunday Best" include former CNN managing editor Cissy Baker and former "SPY Magazine" features editor Bruce Handy.

On the premiere episode of "Sunday Best," the contributors paid tribute to Reiner through a segment of clips of his classic shows, including his toupee run on "The Dick Van Dyke Show," "The 2,000 Year Old Man" and skits from "Your Show of Shows."

Each week "Sunday Best" will be divided into various segments, from a look at the previous week in television to highlights excerpted from a week at some other point in television's history. There's a theme segment, a viewer video mail segment, and lots and lots of miscellaneous clips.

"It continues to be molded and shaped. That's the nature of a show like this. It's never been done before, so the whole thing keeps molding as we go along," Ancier said. "We're just having fun with it."

TV comedy king Carl Reiner hosts NBC's new weekly series "Sunday Best." The series takes a look at humorous broadcasting moments from the beginning of television up to the most recent week's shows. "Sunday Best" is broadcast, appropriately, on Sundays.

Role more important than recognition

Almost every weekday you can see John Aprea portraying Lucas on *Another World*. His character has gone through a transformation over the past year, beginning as a bit of a hoodlum who could do no right and becoming a man simply trying to prove himself.

"When my character was younger I was supposedly a bit of a scoundrel who was driven out of town. Now I've come back to try to clean up my act," said Aprea in a recent interview.

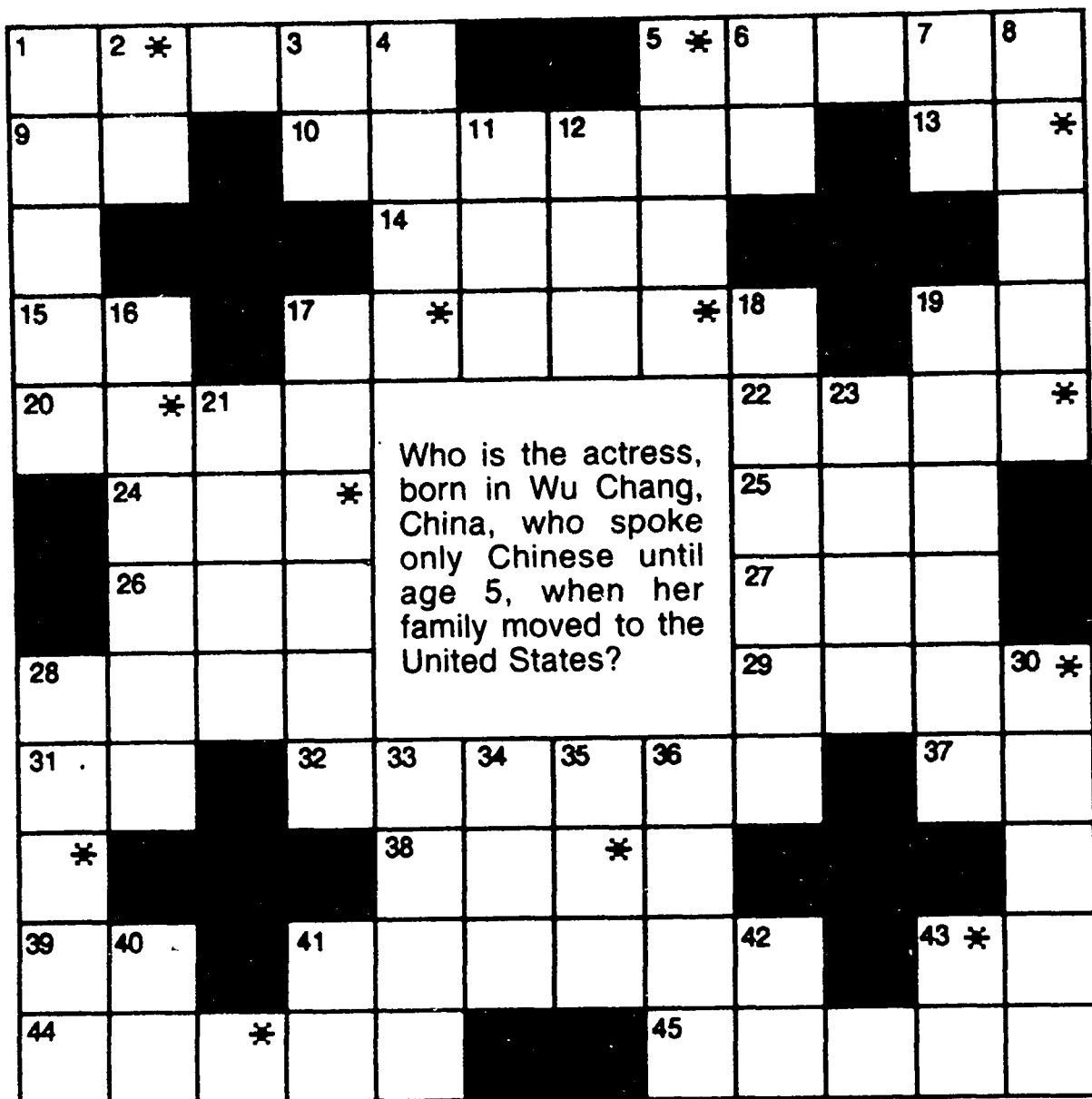
"I've actually played a lot of characters of ill repute," said Aprea. One such character, Manny Vasquez on *Knots Landing*, brought him more recognition than he could have ever imagined. "I didn't realize the power of that show. Manny wasn't a part where they call you up and give you a contract. He just started and then ended up going through an entire season. He was a recognizable character, but I didn't feel like a real part of the show. But it turned out that more people knew me during that period than all of the other stuff I've done put together."

After the role on *Knots* ended, Aprea moved his family, wife Ninon and 2-year-old daughter Nicole, to New York to work on *Another World*. The flashy show business arena of L.A. became a distant memory. "*Another World* has been around for 26 years, and there is a real feeling of family there," Aprea explained. "We shoot in Brooklyn, and the crew is a very neighborhood kind of people. It's not at all 'show businessy' there."

He believes the soaps are a great place to perfect the craft of acting. "I've seen some of the people on our show do scenes that were just magnificent, and they didn't have near the time to prepare for it that someone in the movies or theater would have had."

His advice to would-be actors is hard but true. "Don't go into acting, and if you do, know that the only thing that matters is the work itself. You have to know that there is going to be rejection and work is difficult to find. There are a lot of very dedicated people out there who can't make a living. It's a tough business and you've got to love it."
