State finishes fence project at the hospital

Resident fears over psychiatric hospital walkways may be assuaged with the addition of heightened security measures at Northville Regional Hospital.

Fences and gates recently were installed around the perimeter of the hospital in an attempt to curtail patient walkways at the psychiatric facility on Seven Mile Road in Northville Township.

An agreement between state Dept. of Mental Health officials and state Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, led to a decision to virtually surround the hospital grounds with six-foot-high chain-link fences.

A gate designed to seal off the hospital's service road during evenings, weekends and holidays was also included in the agreement.

"No patients can leave unless they go over the fence," Geake said. "They fenced in everything but the roads that go in and out."

Geake said additional hospital security measures have been a top priority during his 18-year Senate tenure. Department of Mental Health opposition to fencing has led to "piecemealing" security improvements over the years, he said.

Improvements included a "living fence" — shrubbery intended to discourage walkways — but that approach was not enough, Geake said.

"They've (patients) continued to get out and be a nuisance to the community," he said.

Township police records indicated that 133 patients walked away from NRH in 1990. Eighty-one were recovered, but 55 did not return and some have startled residents of nearby subdivisions, Geake said.

Fencing was completed this month, said Von DuBose, NRPH Director of Environmental Services.

"It's basically an extension of fence on the east and west of the facility," he said.

DuBose said the eastern hospital grounds are fenced on an angle to the main entrance road on Seven Mile. The western borders also extend to the Seven Mile entrance, he said.

A gate to close off a service road which meanders from Seven Mile through the facility and out to Haggerty Road near the Hawthorn Center was finished Friday, DuBose said.

"The road will be closed from 5 p.m. until 6 a.m. Monday through Friday, and all day on Saturday, Sunday and holidays," he said. "The gate will divert all traffic to the Seven Mile entrance."

Cameras and on-ground security personnel monitor entrances on Seven Mile, DuBose said.

Township officials were pleased with the new security format.

"It beats the living fence," Supervisor Georgina Goss said. "We appreciate the effort of putting the fence up (and) hopefully it will curtail walkways."

But Goss remained wary that fences would be a cure-all for the walkway problem.

"Only time will tell," she said. "We will be monitoring police reports to determine the effectiveness."

Geake said he viewed the fencing as a personal and professional triumph over his opponents. His quest for additional security spanned the careers of more than a handful of state appointees.

"In that time, there have been six Directors of Mental Health," he said. "Those six are gone; I'm still here."



Local MEAP numbers outpace state figures

Students in Northville schools scored above the state average in every category of the Michigan Educational Assessment Program test, but district administrators don't plan to rest on their laurels.

MEAP test results are used by teachers and administrators to evaluate areas in the curriculum that

could be improved, said Assistant Superintendent for Instructional Services Dolly McMaster.

"We look at every test item on every objective of every test," McMaster said.

But if the results show Northville students have not mastered a specific skill, then the curriculum will not necessarily be changed to improve the district's test results.

If a determination has been made

that the MEAP tests a skill, for example in the fourth grade, that the district feels should not be taught until the fifth grade, then a change will not be made in the curriculum just to improve MEAP scores, McMaster said.

"You don't teach for tests," McMaster said. "You certainly look at it as one indicator of many of how our students are performing. Teaching

Budget leaves plans intact

Gov. John Engler's expected veto of portions of a spending bill approved by the state Legislature last week will not adversely affect most local state-funded programs.

Deletions from a proposed \$467-million spending package will focus on state social services programs such as General Assistance, said state Sen. Robert Geake (R-Northville).

No surprises are in store for Northville-area correctional facilities and the state psychiatric hospital, though Geake said the all-clear bell has yet to be sounded for a local state children's facility.

"It's too early to tell, but it's my understanding we will be able to fund programs like the Hawthorn Center," Geake said.

Senate Republicans last week approved a house version of a funding bill 36-1, but urged Engler to veto portions of the measure because it is

still over budget, Geake said.

The bill is designed to avoid layoffs to corrections employees, state police, and preserve most handicapped children's programs, he said.


The state still intends to close Phoenix Correctional Facility, 47900 Five Mile Road, and change Scott Correctional Facility, 47500 Five Mile Road, to an all-women's institution, Geake said.

Phoenix is slated for closure April 27. Most inmates will be shipped to a new prison in Adrian and most employees will be offered positions in a new Detroit correctional institution.

State cuts should not affect staffing at Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital, 41001 Seven Mile Road, because the facility is expected to house additional inmates relocated from a hospital to be closed in Ypsilanti, Geake said.

"I don't anticipate layoffs there," he said.

for the test in contradictory." Northville students at every tested grade level correctly answered over 95 percent of the questions on the MEAP basic skills reading test.

Northville fourth-graders mastered 98.1 percent of skills tested on the MEAP basic skills reading test, topping the state average for fourth-graders of 86.9 percent.

District seventh-graders scored 98.3 percent. The state average for seventh-graders is 87.7 percent.

Tenth graders correctly answered 95.1 percent of the MEAP reading test questions in Northville. The aver-

age state score is 87.3 percent correct answers.

Northville's reading test score results were similar to the results of Novi students taking the MEAP test.

Novi students scored 98.9 percent, 95.9 percent and 96.4 percent in the fourth, seventh and tenth grade respectively on the MEAP reading test.

"They're still shaking out the bugs somewhat in the reading assessment," McMaster said.

"We're still looking at how that scoring is being done, and how our students are doing on that."

Northville students also scored above the state average on the MEAP

math test. A new MEAP math test will be given next year for the first time. Despite an expected dip in scores, McMaster said district staff is anxious for Northville students to take the test.

"We're anxious to see how we're going to do in light of what we've been doing since 1985," McMaster said.

The district has been using math manipulatives and other learning techniques to teach math since 1985 (see related story).

"We've been using less 'drill and kill,' as they call it, and emphasizing more strategic thinking skills," McMaster said.

Despite changes in district math

curriculum that would benefit students taking the new MEAP math test, McMaster expects scores to drop, at least temporarily.

"Anytime you change a test from what kids are typically used to, other than the fourth-graders who haven't seen the test before, there will always be a dip across the state, and we will experience a dip as well," she said.

This year, Northville students scored 96.2 percent, 92.3 percent and 92.5 percent on the MEAP math test in the fourth, seventh and tenth grades respectively.

The state average scores were lower with students correctly answering 88 percent in the fourth

grade, 73.8 percent in the seventh grade and 70.6 percent in the tenth grade.

Also scoring above the state average on the MEAP math test were Novi students. Novi's average scores were 96.8 percent in the fourth grade, 90.1 percent in the seventh grade and 84.8 percent in the tenth grade.

The MEAP science test is given in the fifth, eighth and eleventh grade. Northville fifth graders scored 92.5 percent, well above the state average of 67.3 percent.

Northville eighth-graders scored 80.1 percent. Statewide, students averaged 51.4 percent in the eighth grade.

Eleventh graders scored 62.3 percent in Northville. The state average is 39.1 percent for eleventh graders.

Northville students scored higher than Novi students on the MEAP science test.

Novi students correctly answered 74.5 percent in the fifth grade, 67.6 percent in the eighth grade, and 61 percent in the eleventh grade on the science test.

Northville's results are expected to be discussed at a March 11 Northville Board of Education meeting, McMaster said. The meeting will be held at the Old Village School, 405 W. Main St., at 7:30 p.m.



City cites Doheny lot as hazard

Local business owner Charles Ely was issued a court summons by the city Feb. 19 for storage of "dangerous" vehicles and equipment on his vacant Doheny Drive lot.

Ely denied responsibility for storage on the lot, saying the equipment was placed on the lot by Northville resident Paul Perry who leases the lot from Ely. Perry buys and sells the equipment, said Ely.

Ely referred questions about storage on the lot to Perry, who failed to return phone calls from the

Record by press time Friday.

Ely was cited for failure to remove 21 vehicles and pieces of equipment from the lot across from the city Department of Public Works. The equipment includes trailer cabs, open trailers and a construction site trailer. He was ordered to remove the pieces by the city building department Jan. 28, and given five days to begin removal. A particularly unsightly street sweeper was removed within that period, said Building Inspector Joe Attard, but the other equipment remained on the site Friday.

Ely was given until Feb. 18 to restore the lot to its original condition. "He has not complied, so we issued a ticket this morning," Attard said Feb. 19.

"It probably is (Ely's) fault for allowing storage in the first place, but they are not his trailers," Attard said. "Now we're just trying to get the rest of it gone."

The remaining equipment includes at least eleven tractor trailers, four tractors, a Stroh's beer truck, and an old oil truck.

The storage is a violation of city ordinances, said Attard. "It's unsightly, plus it's dangerous," he said. "We've had numerous complaints from the surrounding businesses."

A preliminary examination on the charge has been scheduled for March 11 at 35th District Court in Plymouth.

Girls State applications urged



Decision makes sense, but procedure doesn't

We've no argument with Northville Township's decision to cut its ties to the ambulance firm that handled the township's emergency medical caseload.

Township fire department personnel have grumbled for quite some time that Community Emergency Medical Service (CEMS) of Novi was not up to snuff when it came to township service and coverage. Therefore, the move to ax the company was no real surprise.

But it came as a bit of a disappointment that a reporter more or less broke the news to CEMS officials last Friday that they had been dispatched in favor of Huron Valley Ambulance.

Fire Chief Rick Rosselle told the township board at its Feb. 14 session that concerns over CEMS' response times, lack of equipment, lost ambulance units, and so on prompted a change to a new ambulance provider. Rosselle said CEMS officials were regularly advised of problems, especially since the fire department stepped up scrutiny of the firm during the last quarter of 1990 and early 1991.

His pleadings fell upon deaf ears, Rosselle said, and the department was forced to make a move to ensure residents of Northville Township the best available ambulance provider. The board agreed, and CEMS will be history on or about March 15.

But we wish CEMS had been notified about the impending switch at an earlier

date. True, the township had no contract and no legal obligation to discuss the change with the ousted firm, but perhaps a more professional approach to the dismissal was in order.

CEMS served the township for the bulk of the 1980s and on into the 1990's. Why not tell the firm — or send them a copy of the board's Feb. 14 agenda — that a change was afoot? CEMS officials could have requested time for response under the board's public comment criteria to plead their case.

If the fire department's claims were true — and we believe them to be — we're quite sure the board would not have been swayed by potential protests from CEMS. After-the-fact notification just seems to cast a pall over the decision.

By all accounts, the new ambulance provider sounds like a solid firm that will work with the fire department in a positive manner to treat sick or injured township residents. That really is the bottom line, but diplomacy should not be a victim of the need for change.

Latest plan for deck raises promising idea

A new aspect to the plans for an expanded Cady Street parking deck make the project more attractive than ever.

The Northville Community Chamber of Commerce needs more space. It's outgrowing its S. Main site, and its officials have considered putting an addition on the present building. At the same time, the evolving design of the parking deck has created a space which could be filled by the chamber.

Architect Gregory Presley, also a member of the city's Downtown Development Authority, came up with the idea. At least at first blush, it seems like an excellent one.

Under Presley's latest plan, the chamber offices would fill up a gap created by moving the new deck slightly south of its

current location (for reasons of landscaping and parking configuration). He created a preliminary design showing the chamber with 2,140 square feet of space — enough for a largish meeting room, an information desk, kitchenette, three offices, and two sets of restrooms — one of which would be public.

All this smack dab in the center of downtown, a nice place for the chamber to be. The public restrooms alone are reason enough to support this idea, but the benefits to the chamber are great too. It would probably improve the overall appearance of the deck as well.

The chamber and Singh Development have a lot of details to work out, of course, and we hope they do it. This idea sounds like an excellent one.

The amazing wonder sealant



One of my favorite books around is a little coffee-table type volume called "Quintessence."

The book has photos and short histories of various products — mostly of American manufacture — which hold the quintessential qualities in the performance of their function. That is, these objects are generally the first, or best known, or best functioning, or longest-lasting, or even the one-and-only of their breed.

The Volkswagen Beetle is honored as the quintessential economy car. The Checker Marathon, the quintessential taxicab. The Parker pen, the Polaroid Land Camera, Levi's jeans, and even Animal Crackers are all held in esteem for their lasting impact on their various industries.

One key product is missing from this hall of fame of consumerism, however. And I'd like to take this moment to nominate it for inclusion in the next edition. That product is GE Silicone Sealant.

This stuff is just incredible. I see it as the Scotch tape (also applauded in "Quintessence") of the 90s. Not only is it a sealant that form a waterproof seal tight enough to keep out a tidal wave. It's a handy adhesive, too.

The thing I like best about it is that it dries quickly. But if you botch the job and have to start over, it peels off (with some, but not much, effort) like weatherstripping and leaves no residue. Kind of like Post-It notes, only more versatile.

I've used it to caulk my bathtub, fix a torn raincoat, and seal a leaky window on an old house. When I worked in restaurants, it was a mainstay of kitchen contractors, who used it to seal gaps around stainless steel and wooden countertops.

The best fix yet, though, was the on/off/volume knob on a 25-year-old Zenith TV that I keep in my bedroom. The plastic knob broke and the guy at the repair store said I had a snowball's chance of finding the replacement part.

He did, however, offer to drill and cut and custom-build a replacement knob out of metal. For the pleasure and privilege of this job he would only charge me about seven times what the little old black-and-white was worth.

I said thanks, but no thanks, and headed to Meijer for a tube of GE Silicone. A little dab did me, and the old set is back on the job.

Suffice it to say that if you have two things you never thought of joining together, you could do it with GE Silicone.

I'm sure I could think of other uses for it, but right now I've got this dog-eared copy of "Quintessence" with a cracked binding that needs attention.

The city council agreed Tuesday to settle a long-running couple of lawsuits involving a local couple by buying the couple's vacant Wing Street lot.

The agreement ends a suit filed against the city by Richard and Marilyn Smith for what they claimed was the city's taking of the vacant lot north of their Wing Street home.

The Smiths sued the city June 7, 1989, after discovering a city-installed drain pipe on the lot. The couple previously had been denied a variance to split their two lots and sell off the vacant one.

According to Wayne County Circuit Court documents, a potential buyer offered the Smiths \$30,000 for the lot in August 1988, contingent on obtaining approval to build a single-family home there. The Smiths had been told that the lot was unbuildable in August 1986, when they bought the property from Jesse and Nancy Grimm.

The building department later declared the lot unbuildable under city ordinances, and the Board of Zoning Appeals turned down the Smiths' request for a variance in November 1988. Shortly thereafter, the couple discovered the city-owned drain pipe running down the middle of the lot and sued the city for unlawful taking of their property.

The couple also sued the previous owners of the property, the Grimms, for breach of contract.

That suit triggered several others. The Grimms sued both the city and the people who sold them the property, Douglas and Marjorie Bolton and Laura Hicks. The Grimms argued that because the Bolton family should be responsible for the suits against them.

The Boltons, in turn, sued the city, claiming no knowledge of the pipe and arguing that the city should be responsible for any damages assessed to them.

Under the agreement approved by the city council and signed by all parties last Wednesday, all plaintiffs will drop their suits and pay their own attorney fees and the city will buy the Smiths' vacant lot for \$40,000. The city paid \$10,000 for the lot Wednesday and will pay the remainder as a five-year land contract.

The city retains the right to build a single-family home on the property, a right the Smiths were denied because they could not split off the lot under city ordinances, said City Manager Steven Walters (see related story).

City attorneys rejected a mediation offer in October that would have cost the city \$45,000.

That was the Smiths' attorney's original concept, which would not have included us getting the lot. That was just to get the (drain pipe) easement," Walters said.

Walters said the city agreed to settle the case now to avoid a protracted legal battle.

"This is an out-of-court settlement

based on directions from the judge," he said. "We reached a point where we decided that agreeing to a settlement and avoiding the appeal costs and the price difference between what we thought was reasonable and the settlement amount."

The settlement figure is half-way between the amounts sought by both parties. A city-commissioned appraisal valued the vacant property at \$25,000, while an appraisal commissioned by the Smiths placed its value at \$45,000, Walters said. The Smiths also sought an additional \$10,000 in legal fees, he said.

The settlement ends what could have been an expensive and damaging suit against the city's zoning ordinance. Preliminary rulings by Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Kathleen MacDonald favored the plaintiffs, and the city's ordinance on lot splits was called into question during the trial.

The zoning questions led the city to retain the Bloomfield law firm of Plunkett & Cooney as well as the city's original attorneys in the case, Cummings, McCloy, Davis & Acho of Livonia, for its defense.

The city's actions were described in opposing legal briefs as "active negligence" and "unlawful taking and trespass."

After a June 8 hearing, Judge MacDonald found the city liable for unlawful taking and trespass as a result of Northville's construction of a drain pipe on the Plaintiff's property."

The city claimed the pipe was in-

stalled in the early 1950s with the previous owner's permission, to relieve flooding on the property owner's lot, but the easement was never recorded.

City attorneys maintained in a May 11 brief that the pipe was installed "with the acquiescence of the prior owner to relieve flooding on the Plaintiff's property, and therefore, it was not a taking."

"Whatever happened, the nefarious plot painted by the Plaintiff's complaint . . . did not happen. The city did not unilaterally take Plaintiff's property and confiscate it."

In any case, city attorneys argued, the vacant lot was too small to split off under city ordinances adopted in 1963, and the Smiths were subject to the ordinance because they bought the lot in 1986.

The Smiths' attorney, Ernest Essad of Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczky in Plymouth, countered on May 25 that, "The Plaintiffs are not appealing the Zoning Board of Appeals' decision. They are asserting their vested rights . . . to build a one-family dwelling on their pre-existing, non-conforming lot of record."

But city attorneys argued that the Smiths "failed to establish a vested, non-conforming use."

Last year, the city offered to move the drain pipe to an unbuildable portion of the vacant lot but refused to grant the Smiths the right to split their lots. The Smiths rejected the offer.

Zoning ordinance misses test

A court case involving the City of Northville's zoning ordinance almost became a test of the ordinance itself, said City Manager Steven Walters.

City officials settled the case last week, buying a vacant lot from Northville homeowners Richard and Marilyn Smith. The Smiths had sued the city for illegally taking their property after discovering a city-owned drain pipe on it. The couple also charged that the city unfairly denied them the right to split their vacant lot from the one on which their home sits, to allow the construction of a single-family home.

City officials argued that the Smiths were unable to split the lot under Northville zoning ordinances, but agreed to settle the case rather than face a challenge to the ordinance. "It didn't seem like a wise case to test the zoning ordinance on,"

Walters said, because of the Smiths' charges of illegal taking and trespassing related to the city-owned drain pipe.

The city's purchase of the property sidesteps the potential legal challenge to the ordinance itself, Walters said.

"By us having the property, the Smiths' zoning issue became sort of a moot point," he said. "Legally, the zoning ordinance is still intact as is."

"To have a court case end up leaving the zoning ordinances alone is something."

The settlement also leaves the City of Northville the right to build a single-family home on a Wing Street property, the right that the Smiths were denied.

Walters admitted that the situation did appear strange. "It's kind of a quirky thing because the city's position was that the Smiths couldn't do this," he said.

But, Walters said, the Smiths were unable to


build on the lot because they could not split their two lots in the first place, under the city's existing zoning ordinance.

"Substandard lots are still buildable even if they are too small (in) frontage, if they're all you own," he said. "The ordinance said that the Smiths couldn't have split it off."

Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Kathleen MacDonald apparently did not see it that way, however.

"It was Judge MacDonald's view that the Smiths did (have) the right to build on the lot," Walters said. "That's why the purchase of an easement was going to be as expensive as the purchase of the lot."

"We were surprised at MacDonald's view based on other cases related to zoning, not involving the city."

To Glen Ellen vintners, it's all in the mix

Glen Ellen Winery is 10 years old. Yet, a visit to the "home" ranch in Sonoma Valley might lead you to believe that nothing changed during the decade.

The visitors, so warmly welcomed to the ranch, depart with the impression of a California boutique winery. But in the 1980s, Glen Ellen's astute marketing strategies developed it into a big winery with a "little" image.

Glen Ellen began its successful 10-year rise in the industry by producing a series of affordable wines. "We call our inexpensive wine Proprietor's Reserve because we want to provide value," explains Mike Benziger, managing general partner. "We want to sell a wine that everyone can afford to drink daily."

"The Glen Ellen style is determined in the vineyard with innovative farming techniques — watering, fertilizing, canopy control, time of harvest and vineyard selection. We farm for flavors," he says.

The Benzigers do their flavor farming by buying grapes from 240 growers in seven California viticultural areas. "We purchase fruit from 101 growers for our Proprietor's Reserve Chardonnay," remarks Glenn Proctor, director of viticultural operations.

"By working with so many growers in such diverse areas, we are able to build a wine from the ground up. Chardonnay from Paso Robles helps increase body and fullness. Santa Maria-area fruit improves aging potential, while grapes from Mendocino contribute intensity and approachability."

After harvest, each grower's wine is fermented and stored separately. Growers are invited to taste their wines in comparison to a neighbor's in a quality feedback program. The result is innovative vineyard techniques that improve flavors.

In the winery, each lot of wine is classified according to vineyard origin, style, flavor, and aging potential. Chardonnays from Santa Maria, a cool growing area with lean soils, exhibit apple and lemon-citrus characters that enhance ageability.

Warm region, Paso Robles chardonnay has rich, smooth flavors that add body to the wine. Monterey fruit comes from the cool Salinas Valley known for lean soils that limit vine vigor. In a blend, the Monterey fruit adds apple and pear aromas, plus a rich, spicy character.

Warm days and cool nights in Napa Valley yield chardonnay that increases complexity and structure as well as adding a tart, minty-apple nuance.

Sonoma County grapes contribute a flavor intensity reminiscent of Granny Smith apples.

Glen Ellen uses the principles of "farming for flavors" when producing red wines too. Cabernet sauvignon grown in Paso Robles contributes a cedar aroma, while Santa Maria cabernet gives a berry-cherry quality. Monterey cabernet is peppery while that from the Clarksburg area yields a hint of chocolate and coffee. The people at Glen Ellen use a large flavor palette for making consistently attractive wines for your enjoyment.

Glen Ellen Proprietor's Reserve wines are value-priced. The 1989 Proprietor's Reserve White (\$5.40) shows attractive floral-spice aromas with flavors reminiscent of gewurztraminer. The 1989 Glen Ellen PR Sauvignon Blanc (\$6) highlights aromas of honeydew melon with clean, fresh flavors and an off-dry finish. The 1989 Chardonnay (\$7) emphasizes crisp, apple aromas and flavors. The 1989 PR Gamay Beaujolais (\$4.20) is a fruit-juicy, light red wine with raspberry and strawberry flavors. The 1989 PR Merlot (\$7) shows honest grape flavors without hindrance of overpowering oak.



Scratch Cooking

Getting back to basics foils modern myths

Think back for a moment to your childhood. Maybe you have a fond memory of weekends spent in the kitchen helping a parent or grandparent cook from scratch.

Remember when the fare was cake or cookies or brownies or something really good, and you waited for a chance to lick the spoon? The smell of home-baked goodies would linger in the house, fresh and fragrant, all afternoon long.

What you may not have picked up on (no doubt your senses were already overwhelmed) was that the ingredients were all simple. Just the basics used in cooking from scratch.

Fast forward to the present, with two-career couples, single parents and single singles with not a moment to spare.

The best we often hope to achieve in the kitchen is throwing together a prepared mix. Scratch cooking is almost a dirty word.

Yes, we've heard the excuses before. Think about the time, the difficulty, and that lengthy cleanup, right?

Think again. Baking from scratch can be as easy, simple and fast as using a mix, if you choose the right recipes and plan ahead.

If you're a hard-working business person or student, you probably know the benefits of planning ahead, so this should come naturally. The same principles apply in the kitchen.

If you're a problem-solver on the job, perhaps you can look at a recipe and figure out a way to save a step, or do without an extra dish to wash.

For the most part, it's cheaper to cook from scratch. Think about it on a philosophical level. Every time you add some sort of processing to a mix — packaging, processed sugar, processed flour, ingredients you can't even spell or pronounce — that's an added cost that the manufacturer passes on to you.

There's another benefit to scratch cooking if you're the health-conscious sort. Not only do you know exactly what goes into your recipe, but you can limit or control things like fat, salt and processed sugar.

Take pancakes. The ingredients used in pancake mix are virtually the same as those used if you make the pancakes from scratch, so the nutritional content may be the same — but maybe not.

You don't know, for example, how much salt or sugar was used in the mix. If you make the pancakes from scratch you can control the amount, or even eliminate sugar and salt completely.

You also can use whatever kind of flour you want — whole wheat, rye, buckwheat, unbleached white — instead of the highly processed flour used in the mix.

As for time and dirty dishes, if you compare making pancakes from scratch with a regular (as opposed to instant) pancake mix, you may be surprised to find that, using flour instead of mix, you need add only three extra ingredients — sugar, salt and baking powder — to the egg, oil and milk you have to add to the mix anyway.

Retro recipes

Some of the recipes below give ranges for the amounts of some ingredients. If you want to cut down on the fat or sugar content, use the smaller amount.

MAYONNAISE

- 1 egg yolk
- 1 teaspoon hot (not sweet) mustard (e.g. Dijon)
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- pinch of white or cayenne pepper
- ¾ cup oil (see note)
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice or wine vinegar

In a bowl, whisk together egg, mustard, salt and pepper. While mixture thickens, slowly pour in oil. Continue to whisk vigorously. When oil has blended in, slowly add lemon juice or vinegar, season to taste.

Yields 1 cup, which will fit in the 8-ounce (small size) jar of the store-bought variety. Next time you buy some, save the jar, and fill it with your own.

NOTE: To help prevent fresh mayonnaise from breaking up in the refrigerator, add several teaspoons of hot water at the very end while whisking. It is best to blend olive oil with a vegetable or peanut oil at a ratio of roughly one to six. Too much olive oil gives an overpowering flavor, and may cause the mayonnaise to harden in the refrigerator.

- 1 cup homemade mayonnaise (see above)
- ¼ cup ketchup

Fish makes for fine lenten fare

With the start of the Lenten season I was reminded that all Fridays now until Easter are to be meatless. This means no animal flesh. No, not even chicken.

The logical alternatives are fish or vegetarian meals. Both can be very nutritious and simple to prepare. This column will be devoted to fish and seafood and their benefits. Next week's will elaborate types of fish and their proper handling.

Americans' interest in health and nutrition has grown to tremendous heights in the '80s and now the '90s. A recent survey conducted by the food marketing institute reveals that individuals' main concern is the fat content in food, not the cholesterol and sodium.

Indeed, if we all limited our fat intake to the recommended 30 percent there would be minimal obesity and fat-related diseases, not to mention how good everyone would feel physically and mentally.

Fish and seafood make for heart-smart eating for several reasons. Seafood is nutrient-dense. That is, it offers large quantities of

protein, vitamins and minerals without high levels of calories or fats. Most varieties of fish and shellfish contain less than 5 percent fat and are generally low in saturated (bad) fat.

Seafood is naturally low in calories. On the average, a four-ounce portion contains only 100 calories. Remember, however, that what you put on the fish or serve with it must be low-fat also. Tartar sauce and rich buttery sauces are not permissible.

And, although the Friday fish fry is a looked-forward-to treat, the caloric and fat content skyrocketed with deep frying. Many seafood products fit into the low-sodium category, though shellfish and processed fish tend to have higher sodium levels. Anything in a can will generally have a higher salt content. The use of fresh, non-processed fish is recommended.

Also use lots of vegetables and fresh or dried herbs for flavoring instead of salt. Cooking with wine is a nice addition of flavor. Lemon juice and tarragon vinegar are sodium-free alternatives also.

Lobster and shrimp contain the highest amount of cholesterol of any shellfish. A 3 ½-ounce serving still only contributes a third to a half of the daily recommended allotment for cholesterol, with very little saturated fat.

Seafood and fish are excellent sources of complete proteins and contain all of the essential amino acids. B-complex vitamins, potassium, iron, phosphorus, copper, iodine, and in some cases calcium, are contained in seafood. Fish contains little or no connective tissue so it is easy to digest.

The number of ways to cook fish are endless. Virtually every cooking method known to man can be used effectively. The varieties of fish and seafood available are countless. Joe at Northville's Shopping Center Market keeps his display case chock full of an interesting collection of fish and is extremely knowledgeable. He is more than happy to assist his customers with their selections.

Be willing to try new items and experiment with the ways you cook fish.

FISH-K-BOBS

1 pound salmon, tuna or swordfish steaks cut into 1-inch cubes

- 1 red, yellow or green pepper cut into 1-inch cubes
- 1 red or white onion cut into 1-inch cubes
- 8 whole mushrooms
- 8 cherry tomatoes

Any additional vegetables that can be skewered: zucchini, broccoli, eggplant, yellow squash, etc.

- ½ cup low salt soy sauce
- ½ cup orange or lemon juice
- 1 cup dry white wine (increase soy and juice if wine is omitted)
- Fresh or dry herb of choice (dill, tarragon, oregano) to taste
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped fine
- 4 skewers, metal or wooden

Mix soy, juice, wine, garlic and fresh or dry herbs. Add fish and marinate for 2 hours or overnight. Drain and skewer fish alternately with the vegetables. Broil, bake or grill until fish is firm to the touch. Brush marinade over during

cooking. Serve over rice or with potato or pasta.

ORANGE ROUGHY ENPAPILLIOTE (Parchment) (for sole, halibut, etc.)

4-6 ounces roughy or mild fish, Parchment (can be found at Kitchen Glamour stores)

Fresh vegetables, sliced or chopped: carrots, green or red peppers, zucchini, onion, mushrooms, cooked, sliced redskin potatoes

Herbs (fresh if possible): oregano, basil, dill, tarragon

Spices: garlic, pepper, cayenne pepper

Cut approximately 12-inch piece of parchment for each fillet to be cooked. Place fish in center, top with vegetables, spices and herbs you decide to use. Wrap well, sealing all edges. Bake 350 degrees for approximately 30 minutes. Open pouch as you serve to let the aroma escape.

Approximately 250 calories.

Get back to basics with scratch cooking

You can make the batter with one bowl, one measuring cup and two measuring spoons. With the mix you use only one less item, a measuring spoon.

When you bake from scratch you create something that's entirely your own, and it sure tastes better than anything that comes out of a box. The progress we've made away from

scratch cooking seems to have sidestepped taste, failing to acknowledge that that was the prime benefit of eating in the first place.

Perhaps in the process of your return to scratch cooking (call it retro-cooking if you want to sound hip), you can link up with those magical days of years past, and with the people who created them with you.

Here are some tips to help you along the way:

● Read the recipe through before you start, and simplify the steps.

Many cake recipes require that dry and moist ingredients be added alternately. If you are using an electric mixer, that isn't necessary. Just dump all ingredients in together and let the mixer do the work.

● Do things in a logical order; many recipes are not arranged that way.

If you need melted chocolate, that may appear in a recipe as a third or

fourth step. If you rearrange the order, you can melt the chocolate while getting started with the rest of the recipe. Then the chocolate will be ready when you need it.

● Think of time and dish-saving methods. The recipe may say "in a separate bowl," but that's not cast in granite.

There's no reason why you should mix the flour, salt and leavening in a separate bowl you will have to wash

later. Just add the separate ingredients when it would have been time to add the mixture.

● Don't be afraid to vary the ingredients used: decrease the amount of sugar, salt and/or fat; use a different type of flour.

Once you have found simple recipes, adapted some of them so they are easier to use, and mastered the art of baking from scratch, you can start experimenting — such as using

honey instead of sugar, or low-fat plain yogurt instead of sour cream.

As these experiments produce great results (most of the time), your confidence will grow.

In no time at all you will be moving on to more difficult recipes, tackling Julia Child or Craig Claiborne, or even creating your own concoctions. Can the Pillsbury Bake-Off be far behind?

Scratch recipes use the simple ingredients

1/2 cup sweet pickled relish, drained
1 teaspoon grated horseradish
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon grated onion
dash salt and pepper

Combine all, mixing well. Refrigerate 1-2 hours before serving.

Yields 2 cups.

VARIATIONS: Substitute dill pickle relish for sweet. Or add one hard-boiled egg, finely chopped.

BARBECUE SAUCE

1 tablespoon butter
1 medium onion, minced
1 small clove garlic, minced
1 12- to 14-ounce bottle ketchup
1/2 cup vinegar
2 tablespoons brown sugar
1 teaspoon cayenne pepper

1 teaspoon Worcestershire pepper
1/4 teaspoon allspice

In a saucepan, melt butter and add minced onion and garlic. Cook over medium heat until golden brown, 3-5 minutes. Add rest of ingredients. Cook over medium heat, stirring frequently, for a half hour, or until sauce is reduced by a third.

BLUEBERRY PANCAKES

1 1/2 cup flour (whole wheat, unbleached white, rye, buckwheat)
2 tablespoon oil
1 cup milk
1 tablespoon sugar, optional
3 tablespoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt, optional
1 egg
1 cup blueberries

Combine flour, sugar, baking powder and salt; add oil, milk and egg; mix until smooth, then stir in blueber-

ries. Bake on preheated griddle until tops bubble; turn and bake until done. Makes about 6 small pancakes.

BROWNIES

2 ounces baking chocolate
3/4 to 1 cup sugar
2 eggs
1/2 cup flour
1/2 cup chopped nuts, optional
1/2 cup butter or margarine
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt, optional

In a medium saucepan over low heat, melt chocolate and butter; remove from heat. Add sugar and vanilla to the chocolate mixture in the saucepan, mix well. Add eggs and stir until smooth; then add flour, baking powder and salt, again mixing until smooth. Stir in chopped nuts. Pour into an 8-inch-square baking pan and bake in a 350-degree oven for about 25 minutes, or until toothpick inserted in the center of the pan comes out clean; don't overbake.

BERRY COBLER

This dessert is really just sweetened fruit and biscuits, but it looks and tastes like a lot more.

2 1/2 cup berries (blackberries, blueberries, raspberries)

3 tablespoon butter or margarine, melted
1 cup flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 cup milk
2 teaspoon lemon juice
1/2 to 3/4 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt, optional

Topping:

1 tablespoon cornstarch
1/2 to 3/4 cup sugar
3/4 cup boiling water
1/2 teaspoon salt

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place fruit in a deep-dish 10-inch pie pan; sprinkle with lemon juice. In medium, oven-safe bowl, melt butter in preheating oven. Add flour, sugar, baking powder and salt, then stir in milk until smooth; spoon over berries. In the same bowl, mix together cornstarch, sugar and salt; sprinkle over batter. Pour boiling water over all. Bake at 350 for about 1 hour. Serves 6.

OATMEAL CAKE

This is a moist, spicy cake that is easy to make but special enough for company.

1 1/2 cups boiling water
1/2 cup raisins
1 cup quick-cooking oats

1/2 to 1/4 cup butter or margarine

Put oats, raisins and butter or margarine in medium bowl; add boiling water. Let stand for about 20 minutes. Then add:

3/4 to 1 cup white sugar
2 eggs
1 1/2 cups flour
1 teaspoon cinnamon
3/4 to 1 cup brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt, optional
1 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 teaspoon baking powder

Stir together until smooth; pour into a 13-inch-by-9-inch pan and bake at 350 degrees for about 35 minutes.

Topping:

While cake is baking, combine in a saucepan:

1/2 cup butter or margarine
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup chopped walnuts
1/2 cup brown sugar
1 cup coconut

Cook together over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until butter is melted. When cake is done, spread topping over cake while it is still hot and broil until frosting is brown (about 3 minutes).

GRASSHOPPER PIE

OK, this dessert is not a health food. But it's a festive, dinner party dessert that you can whip up in no time the day before the party.

Crust:


3 tablespoon butter
20 creme-filled chocolate cookies, crushed (about 1 3/4 cups crumbs)

Melt butter in 10-inch, deep-dish glass pie pan in the microwave. Add crumbs and combine. Firmly pat on bottom and up sides of pie pan.

Filling:

1 cup heavy cream
3 tablespoon green creme de menthe
1 can sweetened condensed milk
2 tablespoon white creme de cacao

In medium mixing bowl, whip cream until stiff. On low speed, fold in rest of ingredients. Pour into crust; cover. Freeze for at least 4-5 hours before serving.

Cable Comments

The Michigan Cable Television Association is the organization which enables the

Cable Operators to gather to discuss and project how to meet today's market needs and plan for future technologies. They have appointed Colleen McNamara as their Executive Director. Her objective is to execute a more thorough plan for Public Relations throughout the state. The MCTA hosted the Winter Meeting and is now planning for Cable Day which is April 23, 1991 in Lansing, Michigan. On this day the Cable Companies throughout the state pool their resources to bring a closer view of the happenings at the Capitol. The Senate may be seen live in the morning and the House of Representatives may be seen in the afternoon. The transponder will be provided by 'PASS'.

Near the end of September they will host the Great Lakes Cable EXPO at COBO Hall in Detroit. The states involved will be Indiana, Illinois, Ohio, Michigan and Wisconsin.

The idea this year is to encourage a positive message. Throughout the State of Michigan the plan is to help expedite an understanding of how the cable operators may become even closer and more responsive to their Communities.

This year the MCTA named Hugh Jencks as Member of the year. Hugh is well known to most of us as the 'positive educator'. This philosophy toward learning has helped us all. Hugh feels that the organization has recognized him for his committee work, and sharing the message about cable through the state association in order to educate the legislature and consumers. One of the projects named the 'Drug Free Child' which included a study kit for

schools and broadcast on HBO. The rest of the committee included Bill Wishman, Jack Leachman, Berry Harrison and Clare Kable.

The future is bright for Mr. Jancks who began his career in education in the Battle Creek School System. He taught English and Theatre until 1967 when he switched to television instruction. Hugh remarked that early people in television came from the theatre and that, theatrical personality also tended to be interested in the technical also.

In 1979 he attended a conference in East Lansing which hosted presenters from Omnicom. They had a vision of modern cable television which intrigued him. It included the marriage of program commercial offerings as well as Community Access. The Battle Creek system was an older system and didn't seem to have change over a long period of time. Hugh Jencks was invited to join Omnicom in 1980. He remained there for eighteen months. He then transferred to Booth Cable Communications in April of 1983 after spending time in Independent Franchising. He became Program Director at Booth, then was promoted to General Manager.

Hugh reflects that it is interesting to note that people are the same no matter what the profession. There are the same challenges and rewards everywhere. "Management is management." I asked him what was his biggest challenge. "I know that every action will have an equal and opposite reaction. One must be very careful because it is hard to see all the ramifications, for every change there are five other unforeseen changes." He found that in business every time he would become enthusiastic and make a quick decision things became more complicated. He suggests that it is wise to

"involve a lot of people in the decisions." On the subject of the cable industry, Hugh comments that "the industry suffers most from its immediacy!" He suggests that we should look back at the last 15 years and look at the impact and change cable has made on the lifestyle of every American. Even with all the options and his career in cable he still watches only one hour of television a day. (An interesting side note, many of us in the field practice the same.)

As to the business experience he has found that if the general public does not embrace a programming or technological option then the offering is not economically viable. "Frankly, we are not using much of the technology yet as the public has not been ready for it." Speaking as a true Cable General Manager Hugh responds in spirited tone, "the marketplace and free enterprise does dictate the needs." He sees in the not too distant future the combining of the Telephone Industry and Cable with the intent to get the best out of each.

The next step in our future he believes is collecting data directly from people's homes.

Congratulations, Hugh Jencks! I, for one, have always appreciated your willingness to teach me one on one when I needed to have a quick understanding of complicated issues or technology!

The MCTA published a few interesting facts in their winter newsletter. Cable television homes in 1990 numbered 53,903,630 or 58.6% - There were 9,575 cable systems in operation - There are 93 programming services in operation - Ad revenue increased 26% over 1989.

Improved customer service is a major focus of improving industry image for 1991! We look forward to this particularly progressive outlook as consumers.

Mark Harmon plays lead in Depression-era drama

Past more and more like the present

"When they need their crops picked they call us migrants. And when we have them all picked they call us bums and tell us to get the hell off," wrote *Grapes of Wrath* author John Steinbeck.

The year is 1937. Ertie Robertson is an injured rodeo rider who moves his family to California's San Joaquin Valley to harvest crops. The pickers are

paid but a nickel a box and are so poor they have to live in tents. Ertie's son wants to join up with the union, but Ertie's only concern is to feed his family on a day-to-day basis. And he wants nothing to jeopardize that.


"I used to read a script and think, 'Gee, this is a great story and a great character, and I want to do this,'" said Harmon, the star of NBC's Dust Bowl drama *Long Road Home*, premiering Monday, Feb. 25. "You only have to do a few movies or a few projects that turn out very different from what you first

read to when they eventually come out. My judgement now, I think, has a lot more to do with who's involved," continued Harmon. "I've admired John Korty for a long time, and I was thrilled to get the opportunity to work with him."

Long Road Home, co-starring Lee Purcell (*To Heal a Nation*) and Morgan Weisser (*Extreme Close-Up*) is a gritty drama directed by Korty. Korty has done a lot of movies looking back at topics of social importance including six-time Emmy winner *The Autobiography of Miss Jane Pittman* and *Farewell to Manzanar*.

"I think that we are definitely going into a very difficult period for America economically," said Korty, making the parallel between the Great Depression days and joblessness and homelessness today. "I think this story may strike chords in many Americans, whether they experienced the 1930s or not. I hope it will serve to remind us of the basic strengths that make it possible to survive depressions, wars and other calamities — family loyalty, pulling together, and helping one another."







Richard Dean Anderson comes from artistic background

Q: What can you tell me about Richard Dean Anderson? How old is he? I really love his show MacGyver. Can you send me his address? —Kathie Bunnell, Park Rapids, Minn.

A: To Kathie and all MacGyver fans: I have recently received many letters asking about Richard Dean Anderson. So, all you loyal fans — this is for you. Richard Dean Anderson was born Jan. 23, 1950, in Minneapolis. His mother is an artist, and his father is a highly regarded jazz musician. He opted for an acting career only after his dream of a professional hockey career was shattered when he broke both his arms playing varsity hockey in high school.
