

Walters, Plymouth cut a deal

Over a table at Ernesto's restaurant in Plymouth last week, Northville City Manager Steven Walters hammered out the details of a contract that would change his title to Plymouth city manager.

Walters spent three hours at the restaurant last Wednesday evening negotiating a new contract with Ply-

mouth commissioners Ronald Loisel and James Jabara. Loisel and Jabara were appointed by Plymouth Mayor Ralph (Jack) Kenyon to a committee to woo the city manager south.

The committee's efforts were successful, Loisel said Thursday afternoon.

"We have an agreement, though it still has to be adopted by the commission," Loisel said. "I believe we have

an agreement that will be supported by the commission."

Plymouth City Mayor Ralph (Jack) Kenyon predicted little if any commission opposition to the proposed contract. "I can't imagine who would be against it; I would expect a unanimous vote," he said.

The full Plymouth commission will vote whether to accept Walters' terms at its 7:30 p.m. meeting tonight.

Walters confirmed the proposed

contract Friday. "If they (Plymouth commissioners) approve it, the agreement is made," he said.

Walters said his decision to leave his present post reflected no dissatisfaction with his 17-year tenure as Northville's manager.

"It is feeling that this may just be right for me at this time, and the opportunity is here," he said.

Walters would take over as Plymouth city manager June 1 under

the agreement, Loisel said. "He felt he needed that time to get them (Northville) through their budget process and wrap things up."

Neither Walters nor Loisel would discuss details of the new contract before reviewing it with the entire commission tonight, but Loisel did say it is close to the manager's current compensation.

"It's more than he's making in Northville," he said. "The contract is

very similar, with health benefits, retirement benefits. The car allowance may be a little better."

Northville officials gave Walters a 9-percent raise last year, bringing his annual salary to \$60,580. The raise included the general 6-percent increase approved for all administrative personnel and a 3-percent merit increase. He earns an additional an-

Judge delays criminal trial over project

A criminal trial involving the managing partner of a controversial Northville Township development has been postponed until April 12.

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources' case against Vincent DiLorenzo and D & T Construction on Friday was adjourned because the developer and DNR are scheduled to resume discussions on the Shores of Northville project this week, said Reilly Wilson, Assistant Wayne County Prosecuting Attorney.

Wilson, representing the office of Wayne County Prosecutor John D. O'Hair, is prosecuting DiLorenzo and D & T for alleged violation of Michigan Inland Lakes and Streams Act 346.

The DNR charges that the defendants failed to obtain permits and eventually rerouted a stream illegally on the former Thomson Sand and Gravel site during reclamation work in 1990.

"There are criminal charges pending," Wilson said. "We allege failure to apply for and get permits in five charges."

Wilson said violation of the state Inland Lakes and Streams Act is a misdemeanor punishable by fines up to \$10,000 per day.

The DNR charges date back to Feb.

7, 1990, Wilson said.

Discussions between the developer and DNR will not change the focus of the April 12 pretrial, Wilson said.

"They didn't get permits; that can't be changed," Wilson said.

The state may seek additional legal action against DiLorenzo and D & T that could benefit neighboring residents whose property has been damaged by the rerouted stream, Wilson said.

"State statutes provide for the possibility of a petition to circuit court looking for injunctive relief," Wilson said. "The court could tell (the developer to rectify damages)," he said.

"(The damaged property) is serious stuff," he said. "There's ongoing injury to the land."

Wilson said the prosecution has not decided if it will seek injunctive relief.

"I don't know what's appropriate," he said. "By April 12 we should know where we are."

DiLorenzo and D & T Construction served as the reclamation agent for the Shores of Northville development. The Seven Lakes of Northville Limited Partnership, the owners of the property, were not named in the DNR violations charge.

The April 12 pretrial will be held in 35th District Court in Plymouth.

City assessments may even out

Northville City homeowners tired of double-digit property assessment increases may be pleased by next year's figures, said assessor Mark Christiansen.

"The (real estate) market is sliding down," he said. "Because the market is declining (the assessment) sales study is going to reflect lower values, and I wouldn't be at all surprised to see (assessment) decreases in some of the neighborhoods, if not many of them."

Homeowners this year saw their assessments rise an average of 13 percent in the Wayne County portion of the city and 6 percent in Oakland County. Numbers varied widely between neighborhoods and even more widely between individual properties.

Near-record numbers of city homeowners have signed up for Board of Review hearings this year, in part due to the wide range of assessment increases. Christiansen, who was hired due to city complaints over county assessing, attributed much of the range to previous county assessing errors.

"This is simply an unavoidable situation when you're trying to go into an area and establish new equity from a situation where things were poorly

done in the past," he said.

This year's wide range between assessments should be a thing of the past in many cases, Christiansen said. "In the future, within these neighborhoods, the increases should be pretty much across the board, since we've corrected for a lot of these problems . . . Because of what we've done this year with the huge increases in assessments in some areas of Wayne County, I really don't expect to see the kind of disparity between the two counties next year that has historically been the case."

Of course, the assessor admitted, next year's predictions do little for residents protesting this year's increases. "We're having a difficult time talking with some people who come in who have just purchased a home recently, for instance, since June of 1990," he said. "They come in and they've got a sales price, and in many cases those sales prices are showing a decline in the market."

The problem is that assessment figures are based on sales that are already an average of two years old, Christiansen explained. "The sales data that we had to use by law for the basis of our sales study is over a two-year period that started April 1, 1988 and ended in March 31 of 1990," he said. "That was the peak of the real estate market. The highest sales that we've experienced were occur-

ring in that two-year period."

"None of the sales which have occurred recently, which are showing that they are going down, are taken into account in the study. They will be next year and they will be the following year. But that doesn't appease the people who are coming in with a deed right now, when in fact I've got an assessment that may in fact now exceed 50 percent of the market value of his particular property because it's based on the value that may have been in effect a couple of years ago."

Christiansen said he has a trick up his assessor's sleeve that might limit next year's assessment increases even further. "The state lets you use either a 24-month sales study or a 12-month sales study," he explained. Because last year's sales figures were higher than the previous year's, limiting the sales data to that year would not have limited assessment increases this year. But Christiansen said that this year's sales may well show a decrease over last year.

The advantage to taxpayers is that if sales figures begin to decline, the assessor can ignore the earlier year of sales figures and just use the latest — and therefore lowest — figures possible.

"If the 12-month sales study is to the advantage of the taxpayer, it'll be used," Christiansen said.

Township may sue

An "emergency situation" affecting the former Thomson Sand and Gravel site and adjacent properties has prompted Northville Township to seek legal action to remedy problems caused by a redirected stream.

The township will petition Wayne County Circuit Court to allow the township to access a half-million-dollar escrow account to repair Sump Drain on the Thomson site, Supervisor Georgina Goss said Friday.

Goss said the township is seeking declarative relief because it will "allow us to access escrow funds immediately to correct the Sump Drain."

"We are definitely moving ahead with it," Goss said. "The township attorney will petition the court to let us begin working with the Department of Natural Resources to repair the Sump Drain."

Goss said the circuit court will be petitioned within the "next 10 days."

The court is expected to act on the petition soon afterward, she said.

"My understanding is they will hear it because we're doing an emergency action," Goss said. "I certainly hope they will, because we have a serious problem."

The escrow fund consists of approximately \$523,000 collected by the township from the former owners of the gravel pit. The monies were meant to ensure proper reclamation of the site after gravel mining was completed.

Environmental problems caused after the alleged redirection of Sump Drain spurred a series of legal maneuvers by the township to wrest control of the escrow account.

The township is prepared to repair Sump Drain if the court agrees to declarative relief, Goss said.

"The township engineer is aware of and is taking a look at the Sump Drain problems," she said. "We have to have DNR approval, but we feel the DNR will work with us."

Cost increases force subscription hike

The cost of an annual subscription to *The Northville Record* will rise from \$18 to \$22 effective April 1.

The \$4 annual increase is the first since 1987.

Philip Jerome, executive editor of the *Record* and *HomeTown* Newspapers, said the price increase is tied directly to operating costs, including an 11-percent hike in the cost of newsprint and a 19-percent increase in postal rates.

The newsstand price will remain 50 cents.

Jerome emphasized that the current rate of \$18 per year will remain

Manipulatives a new approach

A mental light bulb came on for visitors and school board members who may have had a more shadowy understanding of some mathematics concepts than they had thought.

At a meeting last month, the Northville Board of Education got a lesson in math similar to the math lessons given to Northville students for the past five years.

When the concept of square roots was demonstrated using small yellow blocks, "ah-ha's" echoed throughout the board room as the numbers under a radical sign were seen in a new light.

Northville kindergarten through eighth-grade students learn math using manipulatives, or objects they can touch and move. And the way they have been taught could give them an edge on a new Michigan Educational Assessment Program math test, said Northville science and math resource teacher Betty Parker.

The MEAP math test will change beginning next fall. The test has been 80 percent computation in the past. The test will be 20 percent computation when changed. On the new MEAP, 80 percent of the test will be made up of story problems and estimations, and of work done on calculators, or problems Parker said will require "strategic thinking skills."

Northville students should be better prepared than most students for the new MEAP, she said.

"The MEAP test is spearheading a lot of changes," Parker said.

She said many districts are now beginning to teach with math manipulatives in order to provide the greater understanding of mathematics concepts the new MEAP will require.

Many districts are just discovering the value of using miniature cubes and boxes, calculators and random number generators (dice) to teach math, Parker said, calling Northville

schools "very progressive."

"I know that from my experience traveling around the state and around the country that Northville is on the cutting edge," she said. "Most districts are just beginning to use manipulatives."

The concept of mathematics manipulatives first came to the district in a spring 1986 position statement endorsing manipulatives as tools to promote abstract thinking.

"I don't think any of us realized the kind of implementation we would see," said Assistant Superintendent for Instructional Services Dolly McMaster.

With the passage of a 1989 bond issue, the district was able to purchase over \$60,000 worth of math manipulatives.

That is over a half-million objects being used by Northville students, McMaster said.

The objects range from the small, yellow blocks used to teach board members a new way of looking at square roots to calculators that can be used on an overhead projector for demonstrations.

Criticisms of math manipulatives have been from people who learned math just fine the old way, and do not see the need for change, Parker said. But the old ways have been scientifically proven to be less effective than teaching with math manipulatives.

"Today, we do things based on scientific research that shows the best way children learn," Parker said. "We are not a tradition-based profession any longer. We are a research-based profession."

For those with criticisms of teaching calculator use, the response would be that the new MEAP math test will include a section requiring calculators, Parker said.

And Northville students are taught to understand the functions their calculator is completing and to check the logic of their results, she said.

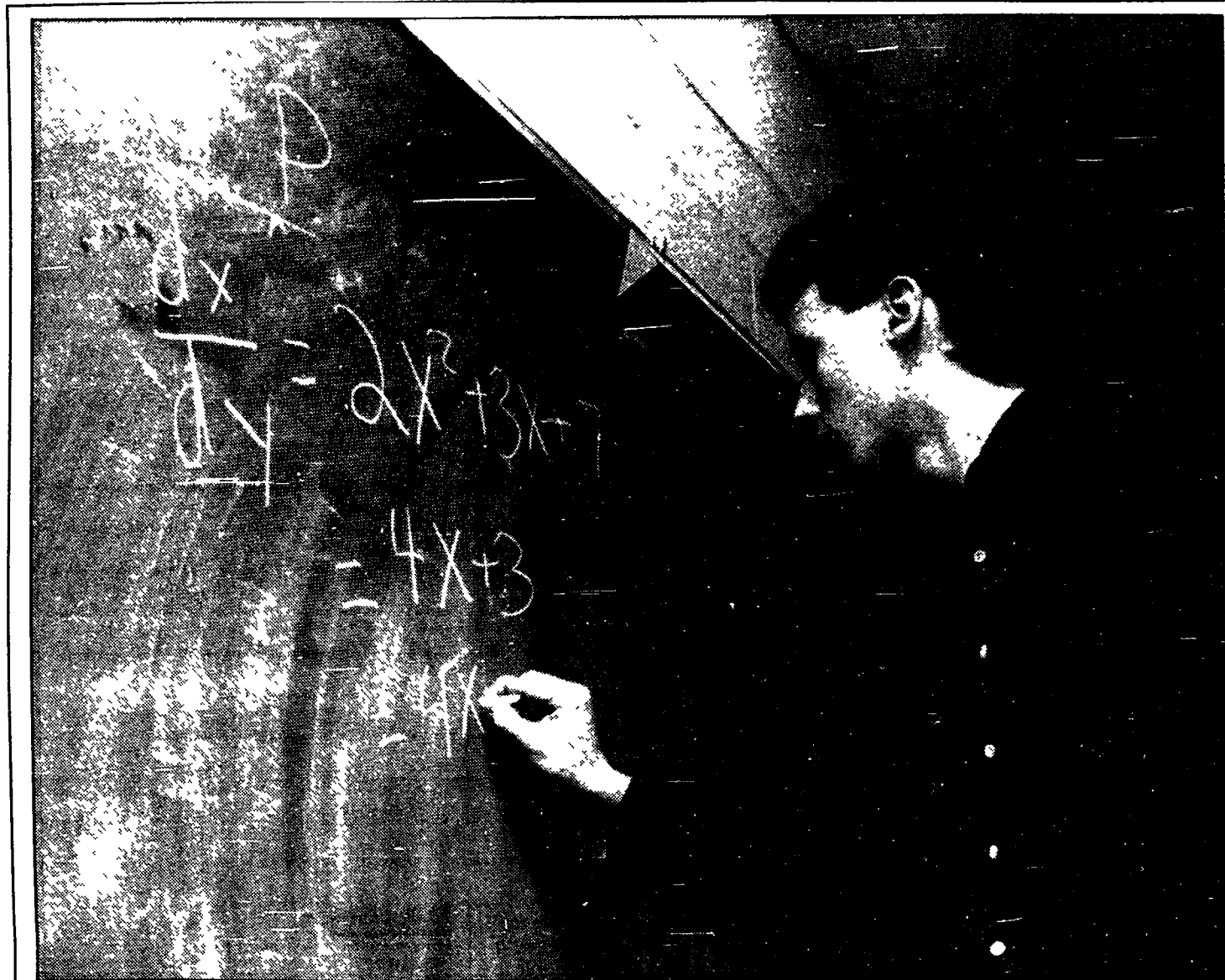

Report recommends library cuts; document's conclusions rejected

A controversial library study whose implementation could have cut state aid to the Northville Public Library was rejected after it received no support from state librarians.

The study, by King Research of Tennessee, was the subject of a recent report by a statewide committee of public library directors and trustees. The committee recommended that the King Research study be rejected, and the recommendation was approved late last year by the state legislative council that oversees public libraries in Michigan.

"It's good to see that the (King Research) report was dismissed," said Northville Library Director Pat Orr. "It raised some questions that are going to have to be answered, but I think what will happen is that public libraries in Michigan will work together to come up with some answers."

Local librarians like Orr were most concerned over a King Research recommendation that state funding be cut to libraries serving communities of more than 25,000. Northville's population — including both city and township residents — was measured at 23,539 by the 1990 U.S. Census.

Beverly Papai, a member of the committee that recommended rejection of the King study, said the legislative council stood behind her committee's recommendations. "They endorsed the Library of Michigan recommendation that the King study not be used for long-range planning, and they acknowledged that consideration be given to the other recommendations (made by the committee)," she said.

The committee urged the state to address the lack of stable, adequate library funding, and preserve local autonomy over the control of library cooperatives. The committee also recommended

that the library community develop standards defining quality public library service.

Papai said the King study was not entirely negative. "The (study) identified issues and concerns that were universally perceived as important by librarians and trustees statewide," she said.

It was the King study's implementation plans that worried library directors, Papai said.

The primary recommendation was that the public library cooperatives be replaced by another type. . . but public librarians viewed cooperatives as crucial," she said.

"The King study developed proposals without consideration given to funding," she added.

"I think it is a victory to some extent, but I think we still have all the long-range problems that the public library community cited in calling for a long-range study in the first place," Papai said.

nual \$800 in longevity pay and \$3,000 in car allowance.

The current Plymouth city manager, Gordon Jaeger, earns an annual \$59,500 base pay and \$4,800 in car allowance.

The Plymouth City Commission agreed last week to give Walters first shot at the position being vacated by Jaeger May 1. The commission had decided to search for a new full-time administrator despite Jaeger's offer to stay on part-time.

Walters had been asked to be one of two final candidates for the position last year, but Plymouth officials gave the job to Jaeger in April.

Walters was asked to consider the position in 1981 but he declined. He served as Plymouth's assistant city manager between 1967-1970.

Walters, 46, has served as Northville City Manager since 1973, after a three-year stint as manager in St. Ignace.

Loiselle predicted that Walters would bring "a fresh approach" to Plymouth government and oversee several upcoming Plymouth City projects.

"We have a very large streetscape program," he said. "The two largest things we've got going are the DDA (Downtown Development Authority) project and we're looking to do some shared service things with Plymouth Township that our current city manager, Gordon Jaeger, has started. We'll hopefully be able to continue along that, investigating the possibility of more shared services and keeping our budget problems under control."

"We're (also) looking at job descrip-

tions and internal structure. That's a program that was started under Gordon and needs to be completed."

Northville's departing manager will enter a turbulent Plymouth City Hall. Plymouth residents are still protesting the city's agreement to back Plymouth Township's attempt to operate Mettetal Airport, and the City Commission is still reeling from Mayor Dennis Bile's sudden resignation two weeks ago, not to mention Jaeger's recent decision to step down after a year on the job. Plymouth's chief of police also announced his resignation two weeks ago, to take a similar post in Lisle, Ill.

But Walters has said he welcomed the opportunity to set up Plymouth's proposed Downtown Development Authority and explore the merger of public services.

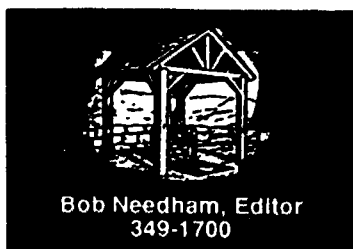

Waiting on sidewalks not the best approach

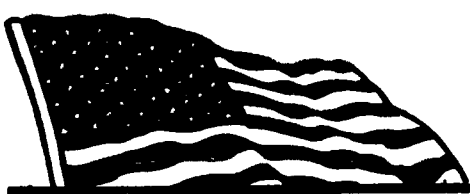
It's easy to understand why the Northville City Council would want to put off discussing the controversial sidewalk program in the city. That doesn't make it right, however.

Council members briefly took up the sidewalk issue last week as part of a review of city projects. City Manager Steven Walters suggested the council put off any in-depth discussion of sidewalks until next winter, saying it was probably already too late to do anything with sidewalks this construction season. The council readily agreed.

That may be partly because of the tremendous headaches city officials suffered the last time they tried to address the question. The problem is basically this: The city is supposed to have sidewalks along all its streets, on both sides. It doesn't, and there is some unfairness to that fact.

Most places in the city do indeed feature sidewalks. Residents in essence paid for these walks, in a variety of ways, direct and indirect. Residents who don't have sidewalks, on the other hand, didn't pay. If everyone is supposed to have them, this situation is clearly unfair.

But — the city's proposed solution was also unfair. The idea was to charge residents the full cost of new sidewalks in areas without them. It was a shock to many unsuspecting homeowners, who were in a way being punished for work left undone by other people, years ago, when costs would have been less. And a host of other questions cropped up too; most importantly, who exactly should share in the cost of putting in the new walks?



GOVERNMENT

If you don't remember the controversy, you can at least see how it happened. Sidewalks became a very — pardon us — bumpy issue, and in the end nothing got settled.

Nothing remains settled. And putting everything off another nine or 10 months will not help.

It's easy to picture the sidewalk question dragging on into eternity. If this doesn't get taken up again until November or December, it will still probably take months to work out. By that time, in all probability, a new city manager — unfamiliar with all these issues — will be the one trying to devise a policy. Finding a workable solution would take quite a while under the best of circumstances, and these won't be the best of circumstances.

It could easily take so long that nothing gets done next summer either. So it could get put off again . . . and so on . . . and all the while, the cost of actually doing the work keeps going up.

The city council should decide the real importance of the sidewalk question. If it's worth going through all the trouble to resolve, then it's worth resolving now. Putting it off does not solve anything.

Walking to work, pro and con



There wasn't much fanfare when I moved into Northville last week. More likely people were probably muttering, "What took you so long?"

As a youth growing up in New York City, I knew of only three ways to get around. The bus, the subway and walking. Even if I don't have anywhere to go, I still like to walk. Once around the neighborhood is enough to refresh my spirit when I need it.

But from my new home in the Woodland Glen apartments, I don't set foot on a sidewalk until I'm halfway to Main Street. Pavement on Griswold doesn't even start until Pennell Avenue, west of the railroad bridge. And that's only on the southwest side of Griswold. The sidewalk on the other side of the street starts at Main Street, and goes about 100 feet before stopping in the middle of nowhere. It doesn't even reach Mill Race.

From what I've been told, I'd be barking up the wrong tree if I wanted the City of Northville to extend the sidewalks on Griswold to the city limits. Asking a city politician to address sidewalks is like asking the Pentagon about battle plans. The city will give you a lot of waffling, but no walkways.

Yeah, this living in Northville business is going to take some getting used to. If you happen to drive past some guy slogging through the mud alongside Griswold around rush hour, give me a honk and a wave.

And if they ever hold a vote to improve sidewalks in the city or the township, vote with my feet instead of your own.

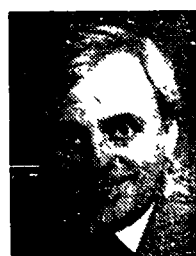

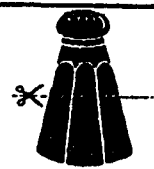

**Books provide
a guided tour**

One of the major differences between American and European wines is the label. Most American wine labels are dominated by a grape name, such as cabernet sauvignon or chardonnay. European wine labels emphasize the place where the wine was made, such as Bordeaux or Burgundy.

As you become more interested in wine and its origins, place names become important to identifying a wine's quality. With the long history of wine-making in Europe, a classification of wine quality evolved principally on a wine's geographic origin.

Without being predisposed to geography, an interest in wine tends to generate a curiosity about place. It is now possible to learn everything you've ever wanted to know about Italian wines in Burton Anderson's "The Wine Atlas of Italy: And Traveller's Guide to the Vineyards" (Simon & Schuster, \$40).

The book is well written by one of the best authorities on Italian wines.

"Oz Clarke's New Encyclopedia of French Wines" (Simon & Schuster, \$24.95) is an accurate, refreshingly humorous text covering all the wine regions of France. The book's features offer a comfortable introduction to French wines.

Clarke, a British wine authority and broadcaster, has traveled the length of France. He understands the wines and gives superb descriptions of aromas and flavors. Clarke is opinionated and doesn't mind letting you know.

He calls Muscadet "the perfect easy-going light, soft, fresh dry white." For good value he predicts, "We're going to see more and more Corbieres, Minervois, Fitou and Cotes du Roussillon." He contends that Beaujolais Gamay grape "can perform brilliantly but frequently doesn't."

Of the famous red Bordeaux wines of Chateau Lafite Rothschild, Clarke said, "I wish I could draw near in humble mood to worship at this shrine of perfection, but I can't, and the reason is simply that the wine is so wretchedly inconsistent." On the other hand he admits, "La Lagune has given me more pleasure than any other single wine."

Despairing about the quality of the white wines of Macon, Clarke suggests that although we should see a steady stream of enjoyable, fruity, fresh, creamy Macon-Villages Chardonnay, the wines of Australia and New Zealand have twice the flavor at half the price.

"The Simon & Schuster Beginner's Guide to Understanding Wine" (Michael Schuster, Fireside Books, \$12.95) is a guide for the novice and experienced alike. Schuster expertly focuses on tasting techniques, grape varieties and winemaking methods, accompanied by illustrative color photographs.

A proponent of language as a part of wine enjoyment, Schuster emphasizes correct vocabulary as he describes tasting techniques. He uses all the senses (sight, smell, taste and touch) to encourage a complete experience.

Grapes, and the wines they make, are discussed from aligote to vignier, for whites, and cabernet to zinfandel red wines. Sparkling and fortified wines are explained and a brief discussion of spirits also is included.

Books are the best way to expand your wine education. They will heighten your wine enjoyment.

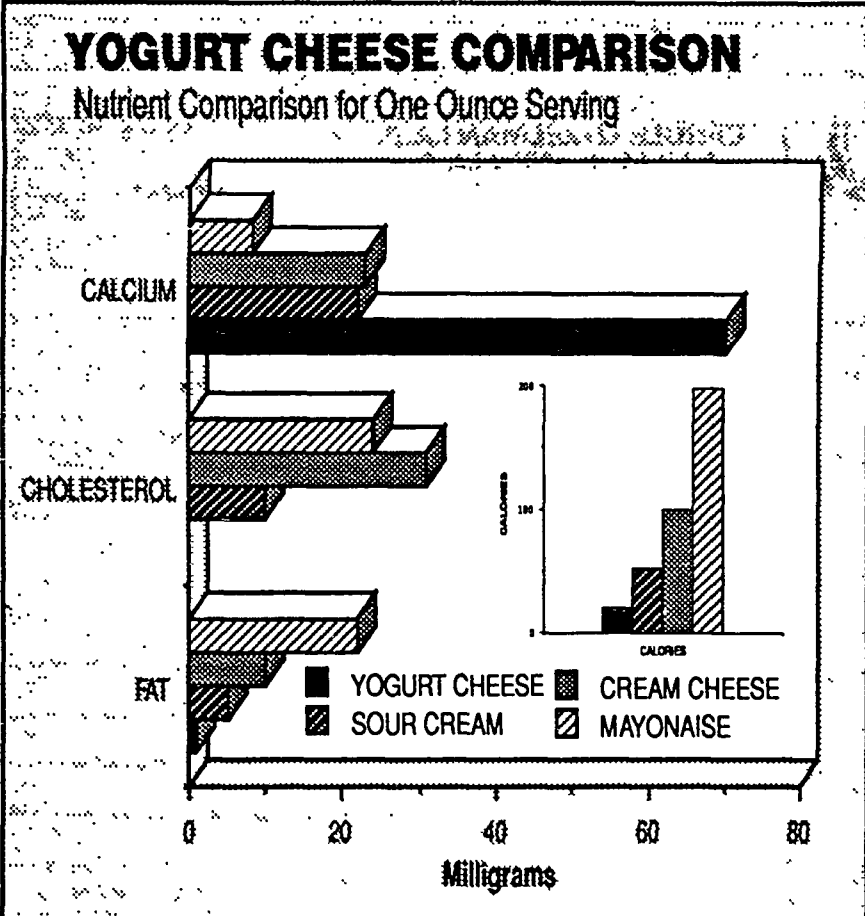

**Forgotten dairy product
creamy, without the guilt**

The Health Police are on the prowl, and they're coming to get you, all you lovers of sour cream, cream cheese and mayonnaise.

They know you've been sneaking around, dipping into cheesecake, chip dips, creamy salad dressings, cheese blintzes and potato salad, knowing full well that all that stuff is high in fat, cholesterol and sodium.

Perhaps you've been asked by your doctor to give up all those creamy goodies. Or perhaps you'd just like to for health's sake, but can't live without a dollop of sour cream on your baked potatoes.

Well, sneak no more because there's a new low-fat, low-calorie, low-cholesterol alternative to sour cream, cream cheese and mayonnaise. It's called yogurt cheese. Yogurt cheese is simply yogurt that has been drained of liquid.

Yogurt cheese is not just some substitute that looks and acts like cheese. From a dairy expert's point of view, it is a true cheese.

Remember the "curds and whey" nursery rhyme? When you got too old for nursery rhymes, you still wondered what whey was, right? Whey is, quite simply, the liquid that comes out of any dairy product when it's curdled to make cheese.

Yogurt cheese has a long tradition in Middle Eastern and Indian cookery. The Arabs call it *laban*. In India, it is sweetened, spiced with saffron and cardamom, and mixed with pistachios to make a festive dessert called *shrikhand*. Greek farmers mix it with chopped cucumbers for lunch.

Graham Kerr, the "Galloping Gourmet," makes frequent use of it in his recently revived television show. It also appears frequently in recipes on Jeff Smith's "The Frugal Gourmet" show, and in his cookbook of the same name.

According to the University of California, Berkeley Wellness Letter, "yogurt cheese can be an excellent substitute for high-fat cheeses, sandwich spreads and dips. What makes yogurt cheese so special is that it picks up the flavor of anything it's mixed with."

Further kudos for yogurt cheese come from *Cardiac Alert*, a newsletter dedicated to the prevention of heart disease: "Because yogurt cheese is low in sodium and low in fat, it is a healthy addition to anyone's diet. It is especially useful, however, for people with high blood pressure and heart disease."

The accompanying chart gives

specific nutritional comparisons between cheese made from lowfat yogurt, and the creamy favorites, cream cheese, sour cream and mayonnaise. Yogurt cheese is clearly lower in sodium, calories and fat, and is higher in calcium.

For those who with lactose intolerance, yogurt cheese is also lower in lactose. And it is high in protein as well. If you want no fat at all, use non-fat yogurt to make your yogurt cheese.

The Surgeon General, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the American Heart Association and the American Cancer Society have all told us to get the fat out of our diets. Most importantly, we've been told to be aware of the "calories from fat" in the foods we eat.

Yogurt cheese gets 30 percent or less of its calories from fat. By comparison, Gouda and Edam get around 65 percent of their calories from fat; cheddar, colby or jack cheeses get a whopping 72 percent.

Making yogurt cheese is quite simple. In the old days, yogurt was spooned into a cheesecloth (now you know where that word comes from, too) sack and suspended over the kitchen sink to drain.

Rather than dangling a drippy sack over your sink, try this method: line a small colander (or large strainer) with a couple layers of cheesecloth, and place in a bowl. Spoon in the yogurt and let it drain.

Technology has also made available a number of yogurt funnels, which can be found in gourmet stores. We tried one called the Really Creamy Yogurt Cheese Funnel, and found it convenient to use, and effective at making delightful creamy cheese.

You can't use fruit yogurts to make yogurt cheese. You're generally limited to plain, coffee, vanilla or lemon. The yogurt you use must be free of gelatin. Check the label if you're not sure. Certain highly-processed yogurts (such as Yoplait) won't work either.

Made with plain yogurt, the cheese is mildly tart, somewhere between sour cream and cream cheese. Sweeter yogurts, like vanilla and lemon, yield sweeter cheeses.

Its texture is like that of whipped cream cheese. It tastes creamy, like it's loaded with fat, but you can eat it guilt-free.

The uses for yogurt cheese are endless. Triad Publishing has even devoted two whole cookbooks to its use — "Not Just Cheesecake," and "Snack to Your Heart's Content." Included here are some possibilities.

Irish cookery demonstrates more skill than luck

Luck. The Irish believe that luck has a tremendous influence on their lives.

The phrase "luck of the Irish" applied to me early this year when I was awarded a trip to Ireland to do what I love the most — cook and eat.

The jokes started to fly among friends and colleagues. Ireland is not known for its cuisine or culinary expertise. Anyone I ever spoke with that had traveled to the Emerald Isle told me how bland and unimaginative the food was. Well, I was going to find out firsthand.

January is not the time of the year to go to Ireland unless you are happy sitting by a fire to keep warm. Of course, I had no choice in the matter and was just thrilled to be visiting the home of my ancestors.

I could hardly wait to see the brilliant and varied shades of green looming out of the ocean as we flew over. I had expected to have tears well in my eyes at the sight. It was the only disappointment I was to have for 10 days. Snow covered the entire tiny country. There was literally no green. I learned quickly that keeping warm was a priority.

The plane landed early in the morning at Shannon Airport. Since there was short layover before going on to Dublin, we were allowed to get off the plane. My feet had touched the Irish soil. How exciting. It is hard to explain the feeling you have knowing that you are in the land from which your relatives emigrated.

We decided to celebrate with an Irish coffee at the spot that made them famous, the home

of the Irish coffee, the Shannon Airport Bar. The barkeep smiled, knowing we were tourists, and put on his show. A bit of sugar, a dash of Irish whiskey, hot coffee and the richest, loveliest heavy cream I had ever tasted. Skip everything else, give me a bowl of that hand-whipped cream with a spoon.

The Irish coffee at Diamond Jim Brady's (our American Irish pub) has been made the exact same way for years. But that cream. What a difference an Irish cow makes.

Our culinary journey began in a small town about two hours from Dublin in a town called Limerick. We had been on the go for nearly 48 hours without sleep, a shower or a decent meal. To top that off we were driving on the wrong side of the road and sitting on the opposite side of the car. Talk about scary.

The tourist board recommended a B and B nearby. I have never, even in this country, stayed at a B and B and didn't know what to expect. The room was clean and neat, the proprietor charming. But boy was it cold. The Irish are used to no or minimal heat. Obviously, we were not.

Thank heavens for the breakfasts. Fresh orange juice, hot, perfectly brewed tea, that wonderful cream, porridge (oatmeal), brown Irish bread with luscious jam and butter, two eggs, ham and bacon. The bacon is like nothing I've ever had. The closest comparison is the true Canadian peameal. Lean and juicy. Who needs lunch with a start like this?

Each morning began the same. I am not a lover of fried eggs so the next day asked for scrambled. Their texture was light and soft. Totally different than ours. Tiny, tiny curds. Very delicious. I found out later that the eggs are stirred over a hot water bath until curdled, not fried and stirred over direct heat, thus the contrast.

Unch was generally skipped with a pint of Guinness stout used as a substitute. Stout in this country does not compare. Chemicals added for travel make it bitter. Not being a beer drinker, I amazed myself by asking time and time again for a "pint of Guinness, please."

Dinner was not the affair we make of it in the U.S. Little fanfare; just good, earthy, simple food. The tastes were incredible. Irish salmon is revered in culinary circles. It isn't hard to figure out why. The flesh is firm and a beautiful pink. And the flavor cannot be topped.

Accompaniments are unpretentious — lots of potatoes prepared of all the usual ways but better, and loads of fresh vegetables, broccoli and carrots being the most popular. And that wonderful Irish brown bread and rich butter.

Plaice is another popular fish. A variety of flatfish, it reminded me of an upscale orange roughly/sole combination. Fried and sauteed, its fresh, non-fishy taste is one I'd love to encounter here. Prawns (shrimp) as big as a finger are also abundant. Dublin Bay prawns are renowned around the world for their succulent qualities.

The most popular meat is lamb and mutton. Sheep dot the hillside wherever you go. Young lamb is superior and the sausages and steaks made from mutton are out of this world. Veal and steaks are available and very good. I did not miss any "American" food while gone.

Our travels took us to Lahinch, Dublin, Caven, Virginia and all in between. Each meal was a delightful experience. The Irish people are thrilled to have an American visitor. We are their idols. Service was superb. When was the last time your french fries were served using French service? French service is the hardest and most time-consuming of all styles of service. It is rarely if ever used in the United States anymore. Truly classic but very unpretentious when done by the Irish.

Sandwiches were a mainstay for locals for the evening meal. A chicken sandwich was just that — chicken, bread and chicken salad consisted of chicken, bread and a piece of lettuce. Nothing glorious except that the chicken was real; no pressed luncheon meat here. Then the rich stock left from boiling the chicken was used in the sauce.

Ireland is one of few countries that produces most of the food that it uses. Very little is imported. The variety of produce does not compare to what we are used to, but wonders are worked with what is available. The fish is extraordinary. Meat is very acceptable. Dairy products excellent. Brown bread the best.

And, oh, what I'd give for a pint of stout.

IRISH DARK SODA BREAD

3 cups all-purpose flour
2 cups whole-wheat flour
2 tsp. baking soda
1 tablespoon baking powder
2 tablespoons brown sugar
2 1/4 cups buttermilk

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Add all the dry ingredients in a large bowl and mix very well. Pour all the buttermilk into the bowl and stir until a soft dough is formed. Do not try to make it smooth. Pour the dough onto a floured board and knead for one minute. Divide the dough in two and form into round loaves. Put the loaves on an ungreased sheet and slash an "X" into the tops with a sharp knife. Allow to rest for 10 minutes and bake 40-45 minutes in the center of the preheated oven. Cool on racks or serve warm with butter, honey or jam.

If you have a sweet tooth, beware. Cakes, pies, cookies and candy can be high in sugar and fat. Instead of a jelly donut as a morning snack, sink your teeth into a warm Apple Cheddar Muffin. If chocolate is your weakness, enjoy Chocolate Cupcakes prepared from a low-calorie, low-fat recipe.

Do you snack while you are watching television? When you're bored? Suppose you always get hungry in the late evening before you go to bed. It is important to recognize when you snack so you can prepare healthy snacks ahead of time and have them on hand when temptation strikes.

Keep fresh fruit, low-fat frozen yogurt, air-popped popcorn or low-fat crackers readily available. Another good rule to follow is to keep unhealthy snacks out of your house completely. A little "nibbling know-how" can turn your snack breaks into health breaks as well.

SALSA

Yields ½ Cup

1 medium tomato, blanched, peeled, seeded and finely chopped
¼ cup tomato juice
2 tablespoons each finely chopped scallion (green onion) and green bell pepper
¼ small garlic clove, minced
1 teaspoon minced fresh cilantro (Chinese parsley)
¼ teaspoon ground cumin
¼ teaspoon chili powder
¼ teaspoon hot sauce
¼ teaspoon minced jalapeno pepper (optional)

In small bowl combine all ingredients, mixing well. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate until flavors are blended, at least 30 minutes.

Each 2-tablespoon serving provides: ½ Vegetable, 2 Optional Calories.

Turn tortillas over; brush each with half the remaining margarine and then sprinkle each with half the cinnamon-sugar mixture. Broil until cinnamon-sugar mixture caramelizes, about 1 minute.

(2 cupcakes each)
2 eggs (at room temperature)
¼ cup granulated sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line eight 2 ¼ -inch-diameter muffin pan cups with paper baking cups; set aside.

Using electric mixer at medium-high speed, in medium mixing bowl beat eggs until light and fluffy and double in volume, 3 to 4 minutes. Gradually add sugar, 1 tablespoon at a time, beating after each addition until blended. Stir in vanilla. Sprinkle cocoa over the batter and fold in. Divide batter evenly into baking cups (each cup will be about ¾ full). Partially fill empty cups with water (this will prevent pan from burning and/or warping). Bake in middle of center oven rack until a toothpick, inserted in center of cupcake, comes out clean, about 20 minutes. Remove cupcakes to wire rack and let cool.

Yogurt cheese mixes quick and easy

All of the following recipes use yogurt cheese, or yogurt drained of its whey. Draining should be done overnight, as it takes an average of 10-12 hours, and the whey should be discarded. Timing is a matter of preference: longer draining yields a thicker, dryer cheese.

Here are some other pointers:
● Yogurt cheese is best blended into recipes with a fork. Vigorous blending with a blender or food processor is not recommended.
● Like all milk products, yogurt cheese is sensitive to heat. Do not heat it alone, or allow it to boil. To cook without risk of separation or thinning, combine yogurt cheese with flour, cornstarch or eggs.

● To combine with hot foods, bring yogurt cheese to room temperature, and/or allow hot foods to cool slightly. When possible, add yogurt cheese to hot foods at the end of cooking time.
● Yogurt cheese softens slightly when stirred with other ingredients. Therefore, it is best to make a spread a few hours before you plan to use it and let it stand in the refrigerator to firm up.

DIPS & SPREADS

The following, from "The Strong Bones Diet" (Lois Goulder, 1986) can be used as spreads for sandwiches or crackers, or as a stuffing for celery, cherry tomatoes, dates, etc. Thin the

mixture with a little liquid to make a dip.

Combine yogurt cheese to taste with: Mashed artichokes and parmesan cheese; Chopped jalapeno or chili peppers; Chutney and curry; Curry, coconut and chopped almonds; Grated cheese; Grated cheddar and port wine; Chopped olives; Minced clams and chopped olives; Chopped shrimp and dill weed; Crumbled bacon and horseradish; Minced leftover ham, chicken or corned beef and pickle relish; Flaked salmon or sardines; Chopped shrimp or oysters; Peanut butter and banana slices; Raisins; Chopped apricots, dates, nuts; Chopped mandarin oranges and figs; Crushed pineapple; Lime or lemon juice and honey; Dried soup or salad dressing mix.

SALMON MOUSSE

1 can (1 pound) salmon
1 envelope unflavored gelatin
1 tablespoon lemon juice
¼ small onion
¼ cup boiling water
¼ teaspoon paprika
1 tablespoon dill weed (or 1 teas-

poon dried
1 ½ cups yogurt cheese

Drain salmon, and remove skin, but not the bones. Place gelatin, lemon juice and onion in food processor (metal blade) or blender and add boiling water with the machine running. Add salmon and pulse several times. Add paprika and dill and pulse again. Remove to bowl and blend in yogurt cheese. Pour into 1-quart mold and chill.

STRAWBERRY ICE CREAM

16 ounces vanilla yogurt cheese (made from 32 ounce container of vanilla yogurt)
2 pints strawberries, washed, hulled and crushed

In medium-sized bowl, stir yogurt cheese and strawberries until blended. Chill at least three hours. Process in ice-cream maker per manufacturer's instructions. (Or, pour mixture into 9-inch-by-9-inch metal pan. Cover and freeze, stirring occasionally until partially frozen, about three hours. Spoon mixture into

chilled large bowl. With mixer at medium speed, beat until smooth but still frozen. Return to pan, cover and freeze. Also makes great frozen bars. After final freezing or processing, pour into small paper cups or plastic molds.

FANTASY CHEESECAKE

Tastes rich, yet has just 88 calories a slice.

2 cups vanilla flavored yogurt cheese
2-4 tablespoons sugar (optional)
1 tablespoon cornstarch
2 eggs lightly beaten (or 1 egg and 2 whites)

Combine yogurt cheese, sugar and cornstarch. Add eggs and mix gently with a fork or wire whisk. Pour into 8-inch pie pan or 7-inch springform pan.

Bake in a preheated 325-degree oven for 20-25 minutes (pie pan) or 55 minutes (springform pan). Cool slightly and refrigerate, uncovered, for 24 hours. Serves eight.

Note: for firmer cheesecake, drain yogurt cheese up to 24 hours.

Winery's chef shares recipe

These recipes are from Chef Gary Danko, chef/manager for The Restaurant at Chateau Souverain Winery in Sonoma County, Calif. He was the subject of a recent "Focus on Wine" column by Eleanor and Ray Heald. The column detailed Danko's participation in the Great Chefs program at the London Chop House in Detroit.

GRILLED MARINATED QUAIL WITH POLENTA CROUTONS AND CRANBERRY ONION COMPOTE

24 ounces veal or duck stock
6 quails, semi-boneless
Wing tips and necks from quails

Marinade:
1/4 cup cabernet or red wine
1/4 cup olive oil, extra virgin
1 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
1 1/2 teaspoons thyme
1 1/2 teaspoons ground coriander
6 small clusters of arugula or watercress

Marinade: combine wine, olive oil, salt, Dijon mustard, thyme and ground coriander. Brush on quails and place in glass bowl or stainless steel and marinate 1-3 days.

Quail essence: brown tips and necks in olive oil until golden brown. Discard excess fat. Ladle in 6 ounces veal stock and reduce to a glaze. Repeat twice more until 6 ounces brown sauce remains. Strain well and discard bones. Reserve. This may be done a day ahead.

Grilling Quails: let quails come to room temperature. Have grill heated. Grill quails for 2 minutes on each side. Remove legs from breast and continue grilling legs for 2 minutes longer, while you toss arugula with olive oil, vinegar, salt and pepper. Arrange on plate with slices of smoked pear and olives. Place breast on greens, arrange legs around and drizzle with 1 ounce of hot quail essence.

Cranberry Onion Compote
1 pound fresh cranberries
1/4 cup red wine
1 cup sugar
3 tablespoons lime juice
3 tablespoons orange juice
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 pint (1 pound) pearl onions, peeled
2 cups chicken stock
1 bay leaf
1 sprig thyme
4 tablespoons unsalted butter

In saucepan combine cranberries, wine, sugar, lime, orange juices and salt. Bring to a boil and simmer for 8 minutes. Set aside.

In saute pan melt butter, over medium-high heat, saute pearl onions until golden brown. Add stock and simmer until pearl onions are crisp tender. Add cranberry mixture and simmer until liquids have concentrated. Salt and pepper to taste. This may be made 3 days ahead and gently warmed before serving.

Oven Polenta
5 tablespoons olive oil
1/4 cup minced onion
1 cup large cracked polenta
4 cups water
2 teaspoons salt

Brush 12-inch cake pan with 1 tablespoon olive oil. Reserve.

In ovenproof saucepan heat 4 tablespoons olive oil, add onion and saute over medium heat until translucent. Stir in polenta and coat with olive oil, cooking long enough to heat through. Whisk in boiling water (measured after the oil) and return to a boil. Add salt. Place in a 350-degree oven for 25-30 minutes (or until most of the water is absorbed). Remove from oven and whisk until well blended. Pour into prepared cake pan, smooth top. Cool. Cut into wedges or desired shape (This may be made 1-2 days ahead).

To serve: brush polenta with olive oil and grill or pan fry until golden brown. (In effect sear the outside and warm the inside.)

1/2 cup sliced celery
1 teaspoon dried basil leaves
2 garlic cloves, minced
4 ounces spaghetti, broken into 3-inch pieces
1 cup sliced zucchini
1/2 cup frozen cut green beans (from 16-ounce package)

1 (15 1/2-ounce) can Green Giant or Joan of Arc dark red kidney beans, drained
1 (15-ounce) can Green Giant or Joan of Arc garbanzo beans, drained
In 6-quart Dutch oven, combine water, beef broth, tomatoes, onions, carrots, celery, basil and garlic. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 20 minutes. Stir in remaining ingredients. Simmer covered an additional 20 minutes or until vegetables and spaghetti are tender. Stir in chopped parsley to garnish and serve with prepared pesto sauce if desired. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Makes 8 (1 1/2 cup) servings.

'Wolves' threatens to run away with Oscar

Costner's western leads the pack

Tinsel Town's biggest night of the year will culminate Monday, March 25, with "The 63rd Annual Academy Awards." ABC will broadcast the Hollywood gala live from the Shrine Auditorium in Los Angeles.

Front and center with the most nominations is Kevin Costner and his western drama "Dances With Wolves." "Dances With Wolves" scored 12 nominations, the same number as 1981's "Reds," and one short of the 13 nominations received by 1966's "Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?"

Costner's film is the first western to be nominated since 1969, and would be only the second ever to win. ("Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid" (1969) was the last western nominated; "Cimarron" (1931) captured best picture.)

Runners-up in the most-nominated category are "Dick Tracy" and "The Godfather Part III" with seven; "GoodFellas" follows with six; "Cyrano de Bergerac" and "Ghost" each with five.

Vying for this year's 24 Oscars will be film professionals from 223 movies. The top nominees include:

Picture: "Awakenings," "Dances With Wolves," "Ghost," "The Godfather Part III," "GoodFellas"

Director: Kevin Costner, "Dances With Wolves"; Francis Ford Coppola, "The Godfather Part III"; Martin Scorsese, "GoodFellas"; Stephen Frears, "The Grifters"; Barbet Schroeder, "Reversal of Fortune"

Actor: Kevin Costner, "Dances With Wolves"; Robert De Niro, "Awakenings"; Gerard Depardieu, "Cyrano de Bergerac"; Richard Harris, "The Field"; Jeremy Irons, "Reversal of Fortune"

Actress: Kathy Bates, "Misery"; Angelica Huston, "The Grifters";

Julia Roberts, "Pretty Woman"; Meryl Streep, "Postcards From the Edge"; Joanne Woodward, "Mr. and Mrs. Bridge"

Supporting Actor: Bruce Davison, "Longtime Companion"; Andy Garcia, "The Godfather Part III"; Graham Greene, "Dances With Wolves"; Al Pacino, "Dick Tracy"; Joe Pesci, "GoodFellas"

Supporting Actress: Annette Bening, "The Grifters"; Lorraine Bracco, "GoodFellas"; Whoopi Goldberg, "Ghost"; Diane Ladd, "Wild at Heart"; Mary McDonnell, "Dances With Wolves"

An Oscar first would occur if Costner wins best director and best actor trophies. No actor/director has ever done so. A win by Graham Greene would be the first win by a Native American. A win by "The Godfather Part III" would be the first win by a "three-quel" and would mean a best picture sweep by the mafioso series.

Two honorary Oscars will be awarded during the ceremonies, one to actress Myrna Loy ("The Thin Man"), and one to the legendary Sophia Loren. Last year's host Billy Crystal, returns as emcee this year, and Bob Hope will make this 27th appearance on the show.

Cable Comments

It was Saturday and we had just moved into our new offices and studio. Boxes were piled high and we had no phones. I was camped out to oversee the painting contractors for the day. Peeking around the corner were two sets of eager eyes with glowing grins on their faces. Meet the co-producers of the new monthly series, "The Cosmic Connection" Jill Turley and Fran McClellan. Jill is a counselor at Harrison High School and Fran is in promotion for 96.3 Radio. They have been friends and business partners for years. With all the television options in our area they decided to become reacquainted with us.

Preproducing their show with Joan Lillie of MetroVision, they decided to capitalize on Fran's natural, insightful characteristics and center their show around Metaphysics. Fran has been unusually aware of her capabilities since six years old and at the age of thirty-eight she felt confident enough to pursue learning more of this phenomena. She is a member of the Astrological Association and had training in California.

Jill is a natural organizer who understands production and she also has people skills and professional training which will help to create a very well-tuned team as a production crew.

The objective of 'The Cosmic Connection' will be to develop an awareness and an understanding of the 'Aquarian Age'. Guests will include local celebrities such as Michael J. Fox and they are also gathering their resources to bring on movie stars who come to Detroit. The show will encourage residents to be part of a studio audience and there will be a segment for live call-in questions. Evelyn Button, a teacher-lecturer will be co-

host with Fran McClellan. Her expertise is in providing Astrological Predictions.

A very unusual feature is the introduction of the Tederington family. Mary and Todd Tederington have a three month old son Tory. The family is interested in the Astrological phenomena which surrounds their lives. An Astrological chart will be created for Tory. The show will feature Tory through home video clips and the shows followers may follow Tory's development.

The 'Cosmic Connection' program will have expenses. Preproduction for Community Television everywhere is a very creative process whereby resourceful people use new found treasures in their attics, cellars and garages; and search for funding to reimburse or funding to underwrite costs or services.

Grants for Community Television usually deal with the material expenses and usually do not allow for labor cost. Every show will have considerations for promotional items such as posters, flyers, newsletters or ads. Most print shops and even duplicating services have artists on staff to assist those of us whose artistic flare leans to a different medium.

Supplies and Materials can add up to include props, new sets, artificial plants, cue cards or costumes. Research materials may need to go beyond a library or a supplier and therefore have an expense.

Production Services such as having large 'special effect' props hauled; or expenses for talent such as appearance fees; lodging and food expenses if the talent is from out of state; graphics or artwork could be a subcontract and supply expense; special effects such as design cookies or artificial environment inducement such as a fog machine or a fan for a wind effect will have costs. Copyright approved music is usually sub-

scribed to by a studio. One may select to secure the rights and pay the fees 'per needle drop' for a special musical score.

Grants may also cover miscellaneous expenses for such items as long distance telephone calls; mileage for budgeted out of town projects (necessary for B-roll); child care with documented studio or edit schedule; mass photocopying necessary for on-location distribution; or registration fees or entrance fees.

Once an organization has established a television grant program there is always a procedure necessary to ask for the funding. This may seem belabored however, this process is necessary to assure two things. One is that your follow-through will also indicate your serious intent and commitment to your television project. The second, is that money for such grants is a privilege and only those who genuinely need the funds should apply for them. This process will assure the serious producer that their competition for money is playing on a level field.

Grant forms and contracts will ask for several levels of detailed information. The first form will have you detail your request for financial help. A

Discerning fans of television sports received a double shot of good news recently when ABC Sports introduced a series of educational vignettes and announced that it had reached an agreement with the Cuban Government to broadcast the 1991 Pan Am Games from Havana.

For decades ABC has billed itself as the leader in television sports. Although the network faces stiff competition for Nielsen numbers from CBS and NBC, the moves prove ABC has renewed the commitment to excellence it first made with the ground-breaking *Wide World of Sports* almost three decades ago.

The vignettes, which debuted on *Wide World of Sports* Feb. 16, will run throughout the year. They cover a wide range of sports and show the relationship between sports, science and technology.

include anticipated crew positions. A contract which recognizes the grantor and grantees expectations and responsibilities will be issued. An itemized budget and any necessary auxiliary invoices will be insisted upon.

Organizations may have a deadline for submission and a reviewing committee. Submission is not an implied assurance that you will receive the grant. In Community Television the criteria is frequently focused around the intent to encourage diversity in public, educational and governmental community access programming via a cable network.

Along with the formal grant requests resident producers should enthusiastically remember the great opportunity their program is to local and small businesses. If a business supplies your show with props, set materials, hairdressing, clothing, art supplies etc. without monetary compensation, then their name and general location may be listed in the credits of the show. If they are financially underwriting portions or the all of your program then a sponsorship message with their name recognized may also be listed in the closing credits or at a break.

All and all the experience of pursuing grants or underwriting of any kind for your show is an

exhilarating opportunity. Everyone who begins developing an idea for a television show is full of adrenalin and joyous anticipation. Talking about the process of the show to be produced feeds the momentum and the drive to follow-through which burns up a tremendous amount of energy and time. Including others will help emphasize ones purpose as well as reinforce the assurance that your show will be the best it can be.

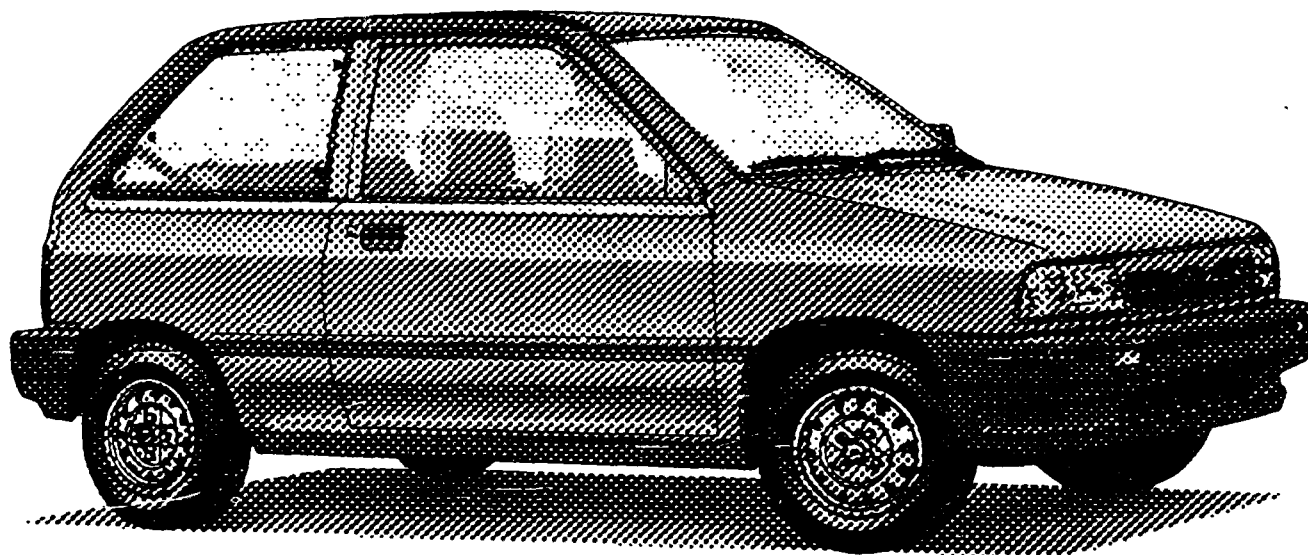
