





## Police seek suspects in scam

Police have a composite drawing of one member of a two-person team that convinced a 77-year-old woman to give them several thousand dollars.

Police expect to have a composite drawing of the male suspect in the scheme sometime next week.

The female suspect, pictured in a composite drawing, is about 5 feet, 2 inches tall, in her late 30s, and has a heavy build, weighing about 180 pounds. She has shoulder-length blond hair and was wearing pink pants, a white blouse and sweater.

The male suspect is about 5 feet, 2 inches tall, in his mid-40s, and has a medium build, weighing about 190 pounds. He has brown eyes; short, brown hair; and a mustache. He was wearing a dark suit with a white shirt.

Northville Township investigators are working with the Plymouth Township police department in the case. A 77-year-old Plymouth woman was contacted March 13 by a man and a woman claiming to be Plymouth Township police officers.

They came to her home and told her someone had been taking money out of her account. The male subject presented a badge.

The Plymouth woman said she knew the team was a fake, but fear for her physical safety forced her to go along with the scheme.

The man told her someone was withdrawing money from her bank account at Michigan National Bank on

Five Mile Road in Northville.

The couple remained at the woman's house for two hours, and made one telephone call before joining the woman in her car on a trip to the bank, where she signed over a check for "a considerable sum of money," police said.

The female subject accompanied the Plymouth woman into the bank and instructed the woman to call her Judy and pretend to be her aunt while in the bank.

The check was cashed, a teller counted the money, and the woman handed the money to the female police imposter.

The female subject instructed the Plymouth woman to give her the money so it could be funneled back into her account and monitored to see who was trying to remove it.

Police are uncertain if the fake police actually had one of her checks, or if the check she signed while at the bank had been in her possession the whole time.

A bank cashier, the Plymouth woman and the female subject each counted the money.

The female subject told the woman she would be picked up in front of the bank by the male subject. The Plymouth woman has not seen the suspects or her money since then.

## Business expo draws turnout of about 600

Hundreds of people packed Cooke Middle School last Wednesday night for "a taste of Northville," and found out it tasted pretty darn good.

The only bitterness — waits of an hour or more to get to the edible goodies — will be sweetened up for next year's event, said Laurie Marra, executive director of the Northville Community Chamber of Commerce.

"We couldn't be happier. A fantastic success. We had a crowd that we never anticipated," Marra said of the first-ever "Taste of Northville" Business Expo.

Ten local eateries and more than 30 other businesses gathered in the Cooke gym to show their stuff to members of the public. The food proved to be the biggest attraction, with people lining up before the doors officially opened.

Marra estimated that 600 people or more attended the event, designed by the chamber of commerce's Activities Committee to show the public what local businesses have to offer.

The wait was well worthwhile because the food was so delicious. The restaurants went out of their way," she said.

"We've gotten an awful lot of calls (congratulating the chamber)," she continued. "The businesses certainly were able to showcase all the things they do. That was our main thrust."

In addition to the food, other special attractions at the expo including a series of drawings and raffles, as well as giveaway items at many businesses' booths.

"Everybody was interacting. It wasn't people standing around for food and leaving," Marra said.

The chamber fully intends to sponsor another expo next year about this time, Marra said, and the problems of crowds and waiting are already addressed. She hopes to use Northville High School for the 1992 event, which will provide more room for parking as well as more space for exhibitors.

"That was the one and only drawback," she said.

Next year the chamber hopes to attract even more restaurants to participate, Marra added.

She expressed thanks from the chamber to the school district, for its donation of space, and to the restaurants and other exhibitors for pulling the event together.

## Family seeks news of Kuwait

The Gulf War may be officially over, but a former Northville couple is still struggling to learn the fate of family members living in war-torn Kuwait.

Renee and her husband Mohammed lived and worked in Kuwait for three years prior to a harrowing escape from the occupied country last August. The family stayed with Renee's parents in their Northville condominium for a short time last year after their escape, and had lived and worked in Northville before moving to the Middle East.

The couple, who asked that their last name not be used, now lives in Farmington Hills with their four children.

Renee, Mohammed and their four young children escaped from Kuwait Aug. 28 by obtaining papers identifying the family as Palestinians and hitching a ride across Iraq into Jordan. Iraqi soldiers had already sealed off Kuwait's only other border, with Saudi Arabia.

The family left behind a house and a car, and took only what they could fit in a taxi. The taxi driver charged them \$2,000 to take them to the Iraqi border. Renee wore a veil during the trip to hide her appearance as they drove through checkpoints manned by armed Iraqi soldiers.

They then hitched a ride to Jordan with a truck driver hauling sheep.

The family lived with Renee's parents in Northville when they returned to the United States while Mohammed hunted for work and a more permanent home. An engineer by trade, Mohammed has worked as

an engineering technician in Livonia and a sales engineer in Kuwait.

Given Kuwait's current treatment of Palestinians, the former engineer said he was uncertain whether he'd even be allowed back into the country that has been his family's home.

"I don't know what's going to happen, whether they'll let me in or not," he said. "Because my origin is Palestinian, I don't think they'll let me in. They want to kick out the Palestinians who are already over there. . . . Right now they are under curfew. They have checkpoints around the heavily populated Palestinian areas."

"I heard it on BBC news that they had detained 300 people, and all the Kuwaitis are calling for Palestinians to get out of Kuwait."

Mohammed's concern extends to the rest of his family now living in his house outside Kuwait City. His 78-year-old father has lived in Kuwait since 1957.

"If they're going to kick them out, there is no place for them to go," Mohammed said. "My family, they don't have a place to go, because they are from the Gaza Strip. The Jordanians won't let them in, the Egyptians won't let them in, nobody would take them."

Mohammed is anxiously awaiting the restoration of phone service to Kuwait, so he can hear from the father, mother and five sisters he hasn't spoken to since the war broke out more than two months ago. He knows the country is still largely without electricity or running water, and fears for their health.

"My dad, he's got heart problems," Mohammed said. "Before he had a

## Newspaper subscription rates rise April 1

The cost of an annual subscription to The Northville Record will rise from \$18 to \$22 effective April 1.

The \$4 annual increase is the first since 1987. Philip Jerome, executive editor of the Record and HomeTown Newspapers, said the price increase is tied directly to operating costs, including an 11-percent hike in the cost of newsprint and a

19-percent increase in postal rates.

The newsstand price will remain 50 cents.

Jerome emphasized that the current rate of \$18 per year will remain in effect until April 1. Anyone wishing to take out a new subscription to the Record or renew a subscription can take advantage of the opportunity to beat the increase by placing their orders prior to April 1.

# From Kuwait to Northville — but not back again

heart attack but he survived it, but I don't know if he's alive or dead now. I have no idea.

"My brother's wife and my sister are due to have babies," he added. "It's going to be hard for them in this situation, because there is no water and there's nothing in the hospitals. The Iraqis stole everything from the hospitals. So that makes me even more worried."

The last word Mohammed had from his family came from his brother-in-law, who escaped to Jordan in a failed effort to get his wife and two daughters out of Kuwait shortly before the coalition forces began bombing Iraqi positions in Kuwait and Iraq Jan. 16.

"He left my sister in Kuwait and he came out into Jordan, to see if he could get her a Jordanian passport," Mohammed said. "He was going to go back to Kuwait and get her but the

war broke so he couldn't go. After 10 days he realized he decided he was going to go to Kuwait and try to get her out, but I guess the bombardment was so heavy he stayed in Kuwait."

Mohammed had planned to return to Kuwait to participate in the country's reconstruction. But that plan has been put on hold by the Kuwaiti government.

"The Kuwaitis aren't issuing any visas into the country right now, so (Mohammed) can't even go back to

work," Renee said.

"I'm not real anxious to go back," she added. "I wouldn't go back right now — not with the kids. They're still cleaning up and there are no schools open . . . Once they have the schools going and I'm pretty sure that it's going to be safe, then I might consider it."

Mohammed added, "I would like to go right now and just see how they are doing, but what am I going to do? I just have to wait and see."

The couple has asked U.S. Senator Carl Levin's office for help locating Mohammed's family, but had not heard from the senator by press time Friday.

Renee said she wasn't surprised by the quick defeat of Iraq's army by coalition forces last month, having seen Iraqi soldiers desert during the four weeks it took the family to escape from Kuwait.

"I probably could have predicted that they wouldn't fight, because

while we were there they had a lot of desertions right away," she said. "A lot of young kids, especially, were trading in their weapons for Kuwaiti dress to be able to walk around the streets and not be recognized as soldiers. They'd trade their weapons for Kuwaiti dishdasha (long robes) and any food or water that anybody would give them."

"Quite a few of them deserted, because even then he (Saddam Hussein) wasn't feeding anybody and wasn't providing any water."

**News Briefs**

**EASTER EGG HUNT:** The annual Easter Egg Hunt sponsored by Northville Jaycees will take place at 10 a.m. Saturday, March 30, at the Cass Benton Parkway.

The big event features candy and prizes for all kids up to age 12. Tom MacKinnon of MacKinnon's restaurant will sponsor a special visit from the Easter Bunny.

**FRESH SCHOOL STORYTIME:** Northville Public Library's Spring Preschool Storytime registration is now under way.

Children 3½ to 5 years old, and not yet in kindergarten, may enroll for either the 10:30 a.m. or 1 p.m. programs which will take place on Wednesdays, April 10 through May 15.

Parents must remain in the library during these half-hour sessions and are asked to arrive 5 to 10 minutes early to allow preschoolers to adjust to their surroundings and be ready to enter the Story Room with the group.

**"SENIOR" PROM TO BE HELD AT COOKE:** The reopening of Cooke as a middle school displaced a few groups that had been using the building, including Senior Citizens. That fact has not gone unnoticed by school officials and the school's student council who are sponsoring a "senior" prom for area senior citizens.

The free dinner and dance will be held this Wednesday, March 27. Any Northville-area senior citizen is welcome to attend the event. Cooke Principal Jeffrey Radwanski expects to be able to accommodate 100 people.

Spaghetti, cooked by teachers and served by students, will be the evening's fare. Entertainment will be provided by a band of the seniors' choice. Salad and dessert will be provided by the school's life skills class.

Doors open at 3:30 p.m. for the event, which runs from 4-6 p.m. Senior citizens and students will be able to mingle and learn about each other, Kohl said. And a video of Cooke students working and playing in their building will be shown during dinner.

**BOOK SALES ARE BACK:** After a lapse of a year and a half, used book sales are being resumed by the Friends of the Northville Library. The first will take place on Saturday, April 20, in the city council chambers in the municipal building.

Contributions of used books are now welcome at the library and will be moved for sorting as they come in.

Most used books are acceptable for resale with some exceptions. The Friends cannot accept encyclopedias more than 10 years old or textbooks up through the high school level.

Picture magazines of a relatively current vintage are now acceptable.

Book sales were suspended 18 months ago because the Friends no longer had a sorting and storage place for contributed books, but since that problem has been solved, the popular sales are now back on the Friends program.

Revenue from book sales is used to provide many goods and services for the library not possible within the constraints of the budget.

**ROTISSERIE BASEBALL:** The Northville Public Library is organizing a simplified version of the very popular Rotisserie-style baseball leagues which are active nationwide. "General managers" choose or "draft" major league players who they feel will perform well during the coming season.

The deadline for enrollment is April 1, after which the general managers need only sit back and await the results. Different leagues will be formed depending on the number and type of responses received. The action begins on opening day and will continue until the All-Star break on July 9. **Local photographer grows in art**

Ken Jacobsen of Northville feels at home taking photos of natural settings. Ever since being a Scout and camping with his family, he has loved spending time in the countryside.

"It's an excuse to be out there," said Jacobsen about nature photography.

Since getting his first 35-mm camera five years ago, Jacobsen has worked at improving his photographic skills. For the past two years, he has worked seriously to create photos that had a market value. His recent exhibit of nature photographs at J. Giordano Gallery in Northville gave him the confidence to realize that he is doing something right.

He often goes to Kensington Metropark and Maybury State Park's Living Farm to take pictures of animals, which he finds challenging.

"I especially like to take pictures of animals, getting close without crossing (their) personal space," he said.

According to Jacobsen, nature photography requires a person to be patient enough to sit down for an hour to get a photo or possibly follow the animal around. He added that there is also the luck factor — a photographer must first be out there to get the photos desired and then maybe the shot will happen.

Yet he has found that if he wants a particular shot, it never happens. According to Jacobsen, a photographer must also be an "opportunistic" and take advantage of whatever picture is present.

He remembers going to Maybury to take photos of deer and being unsuccessful. Walking back, he ventured upon a shot of cattails in a pond which he feels is one of his best

photos.

Jacobsen would soon like to work in stock photography. This involves giving his material to an agent who markets them to various publications such as magazines and greeting cards. He hopes to be working with a stock agent within a year.

"I try to capture a piece of the world as I see it," he said. Jacobsen explains that he makes a conscious effort to think about what kind of photo he would like before actually taking any pictures. He feels he has reached a point in which he does not just see a shot and take the picture but can imagine how a picture will turn out before he takes it.

"I can visualize what I want in the picture. I am not just snapping a pic-

ture and seeing what it turns out like," Jacobsen said.

He finds a certain satisfaction in knowing he has created something on his own. Looking at his photos, he knows that he has captured that moment on his own. He added that "looking at what the picture is going to be" before taking the photo is what makes an individual a true photographer.

The professional photographers Jacobsen admires for color landscape are David Muench and Elliot Porter. For animal photography, he especially likes the wolf photography of Jim Brandenburg.

Jacobsen is currently attending Wayne State University working towards an MBA.



# Council raises questions over insurance cost

The Northville Trolley has become a welcome sight in downtown Northville, but some officials are worried that the city's insurance of the vehicle leaves the city exposed to hefty insurance claims in the event of an accident.

City council members raised the concern at two recent council meetings, and directed Manager Steven Walters to review their concerns with the city's insurers, the Michigan Municipal Risk Management Authority.

Northville currently pays the cost of insuring the vehicle — about \$600 a year — through its fleet insurance coverage. Local restaurateurs John and Toni Genitti and Al Valente sought the city's participation in the project when they bought the trolley in 1989, and city officials agreed to insure the vehicle as long as it was used for city-related events and driven by properly licensed Northville School bus drivers.

The city requires that the trolley be used for activities related to the City of Northville, but the requirements were never formally specified. Some council members have since expressed concern about the broad interpretation allowed by the definition, and the fact that the trolley is driven outside the city at times on its way to and from Northville. The trolley has been used for weddings and other private functions that take place, at least in part, within the city.

Said Council Member Carolann Ayers, "I don't think we should be insuring a vehicle that's being used for

private parties and what-have-you."

Council Member Dewey Gardner agreed, saying, "I think the real problem is it's being used for a private use like taking a bride to a church or a wedding party to a reception. That's something I think we want to avoid."

Mayor Chris Johnson sounded a more conciliatory note, though. "If they're talking about transporting people to events in Northville, or vice versa, I don't see a problem with that," he said.

"I wouldn't foresee, say, this should be the shuttle bus to Twelve Oaks Mall," he added.

City Manager Steven Walters said the insurance cost would not change whether the trolley was restricted to the city or not. "It's not a problem from an insurance standpoint, but it's a different kind of exposure, obviously, than operating downtown," he said.

The council discussed whether the city's insurance should cover the trolley when it operates outside Northville, and instructed Walters to review the situation with the Michigan Municipal Risk Pool.

"If it's going to be a private use, I think there should be something that keeps the city from being liable," said Council Member Paul Folino. "We're not telling them how to use it or when to use it, we're just saying, 'These are the conditions where the city insurance kicks in and where it doesn't,'" said Johnson.

The city had not contacted the Genitti about the trolley's insurance as of press time Friday. John Genitti said he would attend an upcoming council meeting to address the council's concerns.



### Deputy manager post may be a necessity

Being a city manager isn't necessarily supposed to be an easy job. But working 88 hours a week seems a little excessive.

In a recent interview, Northville City Manager Steven Walters estimated his work week at between 60 and 70 hours as a matter of course. It's not a problem, he said, as long as you like what you're doing.

Now we hear from city auditors Plante & Moran that Walters was being modest. In a recent special report to the city council, the firm tagged Walters' usual work week at between 65 and 88 hours.

And, the auditors' report added, there are things needing attention which he doesn't get to.

Can you say "deputy city manager"?

In fact, the idea of a deputy manager for Northville is the main topic of the report. In the 1990 city audit Plante & Moran raised the issue; that spurred the council to commission a full report on the concept.

The resulting document includes several recommendations, but establishing a deputy city manager position is the biggest. At first blush, the idea might not sound like a real winner for a city which seems to be in a constant budget crisis; the new position, would, after all, cost money. But the auditors believe that the extra administrative time, if used to research monetary issues and develop financial forecasts, could save money in the long run. In addition, when the city hires a new city manager to replace the departing Walters, it will most likely be for less money than Walters earned. Taken all together, these changes — in-

cluding the hiring of a deputy — might at worst be a financial wash for the city.

So that just leaves as a question the value of the position itself, and that does not really seem like much of a question.

No one should be expected to work weeks of lengthy weeks. Few people would, and even fewer could keep it up without driving themselves nuts or suffering a serious decline in the quality of their work.

Hiring a deputy will certainly help city operations continue more efficiently than under a new manager alone, with no deputy. While the deputy position might not be necessary to implement the auditors' other recommendations, it will certainly help.

If Walters and the council can find a way to create a deputy post from among the existing positions at city hall, that's great. But that most likely will not prove possible.

However it happens, it is probably in the city's best long-term interests to squeeze the deputy city manager position into the 1991-92 budget. Doing otherwise could do great harm to the city in the long run.



**Cognac can put you in the spirit**

The French district of Charentes, an hour's drive northwest of Bordeaux, on the Atlantic, is known for butter, cream, shellfish, casseroles and cognac.

"Cognac produced from grapes grown on chalky soil, double pot-distilled, and aged in oak, has the elegant, delicate aroma and smooth, silky taste of the finest distilled spirits," says Benedicte Hardy, international export manager for A. Hardy cognac.

Hardy, the great-great granddaughter of the founder Antoine Hardy, whose cognac house has borne his name since 1863, is on a mission to sell America on the pleasures of sipping cognac. Hardy received great attention in the United States last year because her family-operated firm offers the world's most expensive spirit — Cognac Perfection, retailing for \$3,500 per bottle.

For full enjoyment of a fine cognac, practice the following techniques when you taste.

**The glass:** The glass to be used is not a snifter but one that is tall and slim on a short stem. The bowl is 3 1/4 inches high by 1 1/4 inches in diameter with a total volume of 4 1/2 ounces. This tasting glass allows the cognac to present its perfumes in waves — the very volatile first, followed by less volatile components. A 1-ounce pour of cognac is ample for a thorough evaluation. In the case of cognac, tasting requires less drinking and more attention to aromas, flavors and sensations.

View the cognac against a bright, white background to observe its color and brilliance. It should have a golden hue without being too dark.

Cognac's aroma can be evaluated in two steps. First, hold the glass at waist level and swirl it vigorously. Then, very slowly, raise the glass toward your nose. Breathe in deeply to determine at what maximum distance you can perceive the first perfumes of the cognac. This will help you determine the vitality of the cognac, which is controlled by the more volatile elements of the spirit.

Repeat the process of swirling and inhaling while holding the glass a few inches from your nose. This "second nose" allows you to discover a new level of perfumes that are part of the less volatile components. This step helps assess the length of the cognac.

Raise the temperature of cognac by hand. Do not waste money on a warmer. Cognac is 40 percent alcohol and many desirable components are volatile. Heating the spirit only serves to evaporate volatile elements before you get to enjoy them.

Taste is best appreciated in two steps also. Take a little drop of cognac on your tongue and let it diffuse through your mouth. Swallow it very slowly, detecting whether there is any bitterness or acidity. Note too the smoothness, roundness and balance.

Next, take a bigger sip. Rotate the cognac in your mouth so that your tongue is coated and simultaneously circulate air through the liquid. Your entire mouth and nasal passages will overflow with the aroma.

**WINE SELECTIONS OF THE WEEK**

The holiday of Passover begins at sundown on March 29, which corresponds to the 15th day of the Hebrew month of Nisan. And while you may hear of, and even take part in slight variations of the holiday, the main elements of the celebration have not changed in thousands of years: the Paschal lamb, the matzo and the bitter herbs.

The Passover Seder is one of the most universally observed of all Jewish ceremonies. All over the world, families and friends join together and reinforce the ties that bind them to past generations.

Everyone eagerly sits down at the table and anxiously waits as once again the youngest child asks, "why is this night different from all other nights?"

We have heard the story retold year after year, but the words of the Haggadah are charged with new meaning this year because of the recent Middle East crisis.

The Seder celebration revolves around special, carefully chosen foods that are to be eaten and those that are forbidden. It is through this ritual meal that the story of the exodus is repeated. Each dish holds a special meaning, which will be explained before it is eaten.

All leavening, flours and grains are forbidden. Only the special flours used for baking matzo may be used and that flour is strictly supervised.

By Jewish law, the entire process of the

**TURKISH HAROSET**

1 medium-size orange  
1 pound pitted dates  
1/2 cup sugar  
1/2 cup teaspoon cinnamon  
2 tablespoons sweet Passover wine  
1/2 cup chopped walnuts or almonds  
Remove skin and seeds from orange. Puree in food processor and set aside in small bowl. Grind dates to fine paste.  
In small saucepan, mix sugar with pureed orange and dates. Cook over low heat until sugar is dissolved. This may take as long as 20 minutes. Stir in cinnamon and wine and cook an additional five minutes.  
Remove from heat, add nuts, if desired. Put into small serving dish and refrigerate overnight.

**A little bit of tofu can pack a protein punch**

Recently, while preparing for competition, I have had the opportunity to work in Chef Kelli Lewton's test kitchen at Miesel-Sysco. She is responsible for testing new products and comparing like products of differing brands for the benefit of Miesel's customers.

The gentleman who is the company's executive chef is Jan Willemsse. Before coming to work for Miesel, chef Jan was the original Henry Ford's chef. The stories he can tell about the early days of the Ford family are fascinating.

After speaking with chef Jan one day I began to wonder, "Just how old can this man be?" He doesn't appear to be a day over 70, is the first person in each day, and works in the kitchen as ably as some of the younger generation. When chef Jan told me he was 90 years old it was hard to believe.

The next logical question was "what is your secret?" Soybeans. Yes, soybeans. Jan can, and does, make everything and anything out of soybeans. He attributes his good health to a diet low in fat and rich in the protein of soy. He is not a strict veg-

etarian, but eats a minimal amount of animal protein. I decided to give it a try.

Tofu is the most familiar form of soybeans that I know. At least once, frequently twice a week, I prepare a meatless meal, often incorporating tofu. I feel so good the next day, full of energy and vigor. Not that I have anything against a nice steak or burger — but there are alternatives for protein. One that is becoming more and more popular is tofu.

Tofu is simply bean curd. Soybeans are ground, water is added and the mixture is cooked for a short time. Then the moisture is pressed out and much of the raw pulp removed. The liquid is milky in color and is mixed with a natural solidifier which hardens it. The tofu is then cut into cakes and packaged in water.

Tofu is over 2,000 years old and has its roots in China. The Chinese have known for centuries that the soybean is a significant source of protein. Because the country is so densely populated and the space for raising animals for meat is so limited, tofu was and still is a practical solution to the shortage of protein.

Research has proven that soybeans produce 33 percent more protein from an acre of land than any other crop and 20 times as much protein that an acre of land used to graze cattle or raise their fodder.

Tofu contains all of the eight essential amino acids needed by the body to use protein making it an equal substitute for other protein sources. In addition tofu is low-calorie, low in sodium and cholesterol free. Eight ounces, which is a giant portion, contains only 150 calories. As a comparison, an equal amount of meat contains up to 800 calories depending on the cut.

The Chinese people have a lower incidence of heart disease and much of this can be attributed to the lack of meat and cholesterol in their diets.

It is not necessary to eat meat to get your allotment of protein. Tofu is safe for persons on a restricted sodium diet, or those just watching their salt intake. Also, tofu is rich in calcium, iron, phosphorus and vitamins B and E.

Like any other food it is important to follow a few simple rules. Tofu should always be immersed in water and stored in the refrigerator. Change the water at least every

other day to prevent spoilage.

Most stores offer a choice of firm or soft tofu, the difference being the water content. Soft tofu is good in soups and gravy dishes, while the firmer can be crumbled and added to dishes or fried. Generally they are interchangeable in any recipe. Dishes containing tofu are best served hot and rewarmed easily.

Because tofu requires a short cooking time it is excellent for use when you are in a hurry. Tofu can be frozen but the texture will become spongy. Simply squeeze out the excess water and proceed as usual.

Another alternative is to "dry" the tofu by wrapping in cheesecloth and weighing it down to remove the moisture before freezing.

Tofu is inexpensive, nutritious and provides a high quality protein with a low number of calories. An excellent cookbook and information source is "Nutritional Cooking With Tofu" by Christine Y.C. Liu. She is a nutritionist as well as a cookbook author, and has broken each recipe down into calories, carbohydrates, protein, fat, cholesterol and sodium. The book is available at the Kitchen Witch in Northville.

**TACO TOFU**

1 pound tofu, crumbled  
1/2 teaspoon onion powder  
1/2 teaspoon ground cumin  
1/2 teaspoon chili powder (more if you are a spice lover)  
3 ounces tomato paste  
salt and pepper to taste  
2-3 tablespoons oil  
10 taco shells  
shredded lettuce, cheese, chopped tomato, onion, green pepper, taco sauce, etc. for garnish  
Heat oil in frying pan and add first seven ingredients. Stir and cook 3-5 minutes. Divide the tofu mixture between the taco shells and bake in a 350-degree oven for 3-5 minutes. Garnish as desired.  
Calories: 650 for recipe  
Fat: 47 grams (can lower this amount by eliminating oil and using Pam)  
Cholesterol: 0  
Taco shells and garnish are not included in calculation.

## AVOCADO AND GRAPEFRUIT SALAD

1 whole avocado  
juice of 1 lemon  
1 whole grapefruit, peeled and cut into sections  
greens for the plate  
1 cup white vinegar  
1/2 cup dry red wine  
6 tablespoons honey  
Peel avocado and slice. Dip avocado into lemon juice so that it will not turn brown. Mix salad dressing ingredients. Place greens on the plate, arrange avocado and grapefruit. Pour small amount of dressing on top.

## STUFFED CORNISH GAME HENS

10 whole matzos or 7 cups matzo farfel  
1 onion, grated  
2 eggs  
3 tablespoons matzo meal  
2 celery ribs, chopped  
4 tablespoons chicken fat  
1 tablespoon parsley  
1 tablespoon paprika  
2 cups chicken soup, (approximate)  
salt and pepper to taste  
Optional: you can add mushroom, celery, giblets or whatever  
6 whole Cornish game hens, cut in half

1 cup hot water  
1/2 cup honey  
1 cup orange juice  
Break matzo into small pieces and soak matzo in cold water for 2 minutes and squeeze out all of the liquid. Saute onion and celery in chicken fat until soft.

In large bowl, mix together all of the remaining ingredients. Use as much liquid as needed to get the right consistency. For a lighter stuffing use additional liquid.

On a foil-lined cookie sheet, place 12 mounds of stuffing. Cover each mound with 1/2 of a cornish game hen. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 to 1 1/2 hours.

Mix together hot water, honey and orange juice. brush it over hens and use as a glaze/baste while the hens are cooking.

## ONION SOUFFLE

8 eggs, separated  
4 cups chopped onion  
1/2 cup oil  
salt and pepper to taste  
1/2 cup matzo meal  
Beat egg whites until stiff; set aside. Saute onions in oil until soft but not brown. If onions are not sauteed they will be bitter. Remove from heat and let cool slightly.  
Beat egg yolks, salt, pepper and matzo meal. (If you sift matzo meal it will make the texture of the souffle a little lighter.) Fold in egg whites. Put in 2-quart oiled casserole. Bake 30 to 40 minutes.

Just before serving, pour 4 tablespoons melted butter or margarine over the top.

Variation: Add 2 cups chopped spinach, well-drained, to the mixture before baking.

## SWEET POTATO AND APPLE CASSEROLE

4 large sweet potatoes, peeled, cut into cubes  
1 medium butternut squash, cut into cubes  
4 apples, peeled and coarsely grated  
3/4 cup sweet red Passover wine  
1/2 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons cinnamon  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
2 cups pitted prunes (optional)  
1 cup walnuts

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.  
Mix all ingredients together in large bowl, making sure to coat all vegetables. Passerole dish. Cover tightly and bake for approximately 1 hour until vegetables are tender.

Before serving, stir once again. May be topped with walnuts, if desired.

## SPONGE CAKE

6 eggs, separated  
juice of 1/2 lemon  
1 cup sugar  
1/2 cup potato flour  
1/2 cup matzo cake meal  
Preheat oven to 325 degrees.  
Beat egg yolks until thick and lemon colored. Stir in lemon juice.  
Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Gradually add sugar, 2 tables-

poons at a time, beating after each addition. Beat until a stiff meringue is formed. Fold egg yolks into this mixture.

Sift potato flour and cake meal together onto sheet of waxed paper. Sprinkle a small amount of meal mixture onto egg mixture; fold in. Continue this process until all meal is folded in.

Bake in small, ungreased tube pan (9-by-3 1/2 inches) for 1 hour. Test by sticking clean toothpick deep into center of cake. If it comes out clean, cake is done. Invert pan until cool.

## SPICY FRUIT SALAD

1 1/2 cups dried apricots  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
3 cups applesauce  
1/2 cup golden raisins  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
sugar as needed

Put apricots and lemon juice into small saucepan and add enough water to cover fruit. Do not cover, simmer for 30 minutes.

Put apricots and water mixture in blender. In small saucepan, mix apricot mixture, applesauce, raisins, cinnamon and sugar if necessary. Heat through.

## MATZO BREI

3 matzos  
2 tablespoons water or milk  
2 large eggs  
salt and pepper to taste  
vegetable oil for frying  
Break matzos and put in cold water for 2 to 3 minutes. Drain and squeeze very dry. Mix together liquid, eggs, salt, pepper and matzo.

Put in frying pan that has been generously greased and spread over entire pan. When brown on 1 side, turn and brown on other.

The Matzo Brei can be served with cinnamon and sugar, jam, sour cream, applesauce or your choice.

## SALMON PATTIES

1 (1 1/2 ounce) can salmon, including liquid  
2 large eggs  
3/4 cup grated onion  
3 tablespoons parsley  
1 1/2 tablespoons lemon juice  
salt and pepper to taste  
Put salmon and its liquid into blender. For a chunkier texture, use

a fork instead of a blender. Add remaining ingredients.

Put mixture into medium-size bowl. Add enough matzo meal to hold mixture together. Adjust seasoning to taste. Let mixture rest for approximately 15 minutes to allow matzo meal to absorb liquid. The mixture will become heavier.

In large skillet, over medium heat, heat a small amount of vegetable oil or spray with Pam. Form salmon mixture into rather thick patties. Fry until golden brown on each side. Patties can also be baked at 350 degrees for approximately 45 minutes, if you don't want to fry them.

## MATZO, SPINACH AND MEAT PIE

4 matzos (do not use egg matzos, as they are too soft)  
1 pound fresh spinach  
1 medium onion, chopped  
1 clove garlic, minced  
6 tablespoons vegetable oil  
1 pound ground beef  
2 tablespoons pine nuts  
salt and pepper to taste  
1 cup mashed potatoes  
4 eggs, beaten  
Soak whole unbroken matzos in cold water until soft, about 2 minutes. Put matzos between 2 pieces of paper towels and press out as much liquid as possible.  
Steam spinach briefly until it wilts, squeeze dry.

In medium saucepan, saute onion and garlic in 2 tablespoons oil. When onion is soft, add meat and brown. Mix together meat and onion mixture, the spinach and the mashed potatoes.

Beat 2 eggs and add to meat mixture. Beat remaining 2 eggs in shallow pie pan in which you can coat the whole matzo.

Grease an 8x8-inch square pan. Cover bottom of pan with 2 of the matzos. Spread meat mixture on top. Cover with 2 remaining matzos. Brush top with small amount of vegetable oil. (If you eliminate the oil on top, matzo will not be crisp.) Bake 30 to 40 minutes or until lightly browned.

Variation: Eliminate ground beef and mashed potatoes; substitute tuna or salmon.

matzo preparation, from the mixing of the flour and water to the baking of the matzo, can take no longer than 18 minutes. Once the grain has been exposed to water, fermentation begins after 18 minutes. After the matzo has been baked, no further leavening is possible.

The Seder plate, which is always the same, contains:

**Karpas**—a green vegetable, such as parsley, which represents the new growth of spring.

**Maror**—bitter herbs, which represent the bitterness endured by the Jews during their slavery.

**Harose**—a sweet mixture of fruits, nuts and wine, this represents the mortar used by slaves to build the pharaoh's cities.

**Zeroa**—a roasted shank bone, a symbol of the paschal lamb that was used as a sacrifice in the temple. This sacrifice was made on the eve of the exodus from Egypt and the blood was used to mark the doorposts of the homes of the Jews.

**Betzah**—a roasted egg. A symbol of one of the offerings made on the three pilgrimage festivals. The egg also represents a symbol of the mourning for the destruction of the temple.

Also on the table are three matzos representing the whole of the Jewish community, saltwater into which the greens will be dipped and a cup of wine for the prophet Elijah.

Because the vast majority of American Jews can trace their roots to Central and

Eastern Europe (Ashkenazi), their foods and celebrations in America tend to be very similar. When asked, "What is Jewish food?", most often the answer will be chicken soup, gefilte fish, brisket and potato pancakes.

However, there is another group, the Sephardic, whose ancestry can be traced to Spain and the Middle East, who have a very different culinary background.

Living in warmer climates with long growing seasons, the Sephardic always had vast varieties of fresh fruits and vegetables available. The combination of fresh and dried fruits, rice and grains, created a very different cuisine.

Another major difference was that the Sephardic cooked with olive oil and did not use the chicken fat that was the basis of almost every Eastern European recipe.

Although the cuisines appear to very different, there are many similarities—such as the strudels of Hungary being the same as the baklava of the Middle East.

Many foods have been traditionally identified with the holidays, and for some cooks this is the time to re-create memories from the kitchen. Most recipes used throughout the year can easily be adapted to the restrictions of the holiday.

As with any holiday, it often is very hard to change the traditional meal that has come to be expected. Most Passover Seder start with chicken soup and matzo balls. The more daring hosts may choose to introduce one or two new recipes to the table, as long as the family favorites are maintained.

But then, no recipes are really new; they are handed down through generations. Some are written down or found in collection

cookbooks and then adapted and changed by each cook's background and personal taste.

Most attention focuses on the dishes to be served at the Passover Seder because that is the most important celebration during the holiday; however, there are seven other days of the holiday in which special foods need to be prepared. Again, although any type of broiled fish or chicken, with most steamed vegetables, is acceptable, there are some old favorites.

Included are recipes for the Seder and family favorites to be used during the week.

The recipe for harose is a mixture of apples, wine, cinnamon and walnuts, and it is open to interpretation. The cook who submitted them claims never to have measured the ingredients but "each year it gets better. This is a very different recipe."

# Grow your own ratatouille veggies

How would you like to fill your kitchen garden with vegetables ready for the skillet?

Plant all the makings for Ratatouille, a Mediterranean medley of vegetables cooked in olive oil and served as a main course or a side dish, hot or cold. The versatile ingredients for this recipe, eggplant, squash, tomatoes, onions and garlic, can also be used for other meals, from stir-fries to salads.

There's no mystery to growing tasty vegetables. As with cooking, a few basics are what matter; the recipe for successful gardening calls for healthy transplants, good soil, plenty of sunshine and proper amounts of water. Instructions for turning your harvest into Ratatouille follow.

## PLANNING THE GARDEN

The vegetables should be planted in a spot which receives at least six to eight hours of sunlight a day. The site should also be well drained and close to the house for easy maintenance and harvesting.

Nothing is more important than ensuring that the garden is fully prepared to receive and nurture crops. Vegetables require soil which consists of at least one-third organic matter. All-natural Canadian Sphagnum Peat Moss is ideal because it holds up to 20 times its weight in water, releasing it slowly to thirsty roots. Canadian peat improves any soil type. It binds sand, dramatically reducing the leaching of fertilizers, and aerates clay, giving roots room to grow.

Provide your vegetables with the proper growth environment by digging out the garden bed to a depth of 8 to 12 inches. Break up the clods of dirt and remove rocks, weeds and other debris. Mix in a ratio of one part Canadian Peat Moss with two parts soil.

Although using water-retentive Canadian Peat will reduce the frequency plants need to be watered, it is still important that vegetable gardens receive at least one inch of water a week. When insufficient rainfall leaves the soil dry to the touch, give

the garden a deep, penetrating soaking. Reduce evaporation by watering at ground level in the early morning.

Applying an organic fertilizer is also recommended. The first application should be added before tilling, so that the proper nutrients will be well mixed in with the soil. Check planting instructions for each vegetable you buy to see if the particular variety has specific fertilizer needs.

## VEGETABLES FOR THE RATATOUILLE

So many varieties of each Ratatouille vegetable exist that the kinds you choose to plant will make the taste of your dish unique. The different colors and sizes of the vegetables add beauty to the garden as well. Be sure to choose the healthiest looking transplants you can find. Transplants can be started from seed indoors, or purchased from a nursery or garden center.

**Squash:** A "summer squash," zucchini is available in shades of

green, yellow, gray and black. Plant the zucchini after the threat of frost has passed. Pick the zucchini as they ripen so the vine can concentrate on producing a steady supply of new young fruit.

**Eggplant:** This vegetable ranges in color from popular dark purples, sweeter white-fleshed varieties, white and purple streaked kinds, and even green or red breeds. They can grow as small as an egg or large as a football.  
Plant eggplants a week to 10 days after the last frost. The fruit should be harvested with clippers and can be picked while young, tender and shiny-skinned.

**Tomato:** Tomatoes can be the common red, or orange, yellow and green. They also come in various sizes and shapes that range from round, slightly flattened, to pear-shaped.

Plant tomatoes after the last frost, when evening temperatures hit 55

degrees. Tomatoes should be planted deep into the ground so the first leaves are just above soil level. Don't worry if you bury a large portion of the stem, it will develop roots.

**Peppers:** Finger-shaped or blocky bells; green, red, yellow or orange; sweet or hot, there is a pepper to please every taste. Their shiny green leaves and white blossoms make them decorative additions to the garden as well.

Don't set out transplants before night temperatures are consistently above 55 degrees, or the growth of the plants will be stunted. Harvest peppers with pruning shears or a knife.

**Onion:** An indispensable ingredient in the Ratatouille and other recipes, onion bulbs grow beneath the soil as the weather warms, with lovely leaf tops announcing their location. They are ready to harvest when the tops begin to yellow and fall

# Give leftover eggs some egg-citement

Long before Christian times, eggs were decorated and exchanged as one of the yearly rites of spring.

Later the egg, long a symbol of rebirth, became important to the celebration of Easter, representing Christ's resurrection from the tomb.

Modern kids love to color hard-cooked eggs for Easter. It still think it's a great fun, messing around with those little plastic bottles of food coloring and dipping eggs into a rainbow of colors. The only problem is, after they're all decorated, who wants to eat them? One or two, and you're pretty much "egged out." Although, chocolate eggs are a different matter entirely . . .

What to do if you have extra Easter eggs? Chopped hard-cooked eggs make a tasty and attractive garnish for salads, soups and casseroles. And today's recipes should give you a few flavorful alternatives to egg salad sandwiches.

Eggs that crack while being hard-cooked are still perfectly fine to use (though not to color.) Refrigerate promptly and plan to use within a day or two or the eggs may dry out. Hard-cooked refrigerated eggs with shells intact will stay fresh for more than a month.

Sometimes hard-cooked eggs have a greenish tinge between the yolk and white. This is caused by a chemical reaction during cooking, between the sulfur in the white and the iron in the yolk. The color does not indicate spoilage. It may look unattractive, but eggs are perfectly safe to eat.

Always store raw eggs in the container they came in, with the large end on top (they'll stay fresher longer that way). Use only clean, unbroken, odor-free eggs.

If raw and hard-cooked eggs get mixed up in the refrigerator and you can't tell which is which, here's a good way to tell them apart: try spinning them. Cooked eggs will spin because the yolk and white are equally heavy. In raw eggs, the yolk is heavier than the white, so the unbalanced egg won't spin.

Eggs are a good source of proteins, vitamins A and D, riboflavin and some minerals. Two large eggs will provide a third of your daily protein requirements — at only about 160 calories.

(Recipes in this column are tested in 625-700 watt microwave ovens.)

## MICRO-TIP OF THE WEEK

Never attempt to hard-cook eggs in the microwave, or to reheat eggs in their shell. Steam will build up inside the shell and eggs will explode — a real mess!

- 1 cup cooked ham, cubed
- 4 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon pickle relish
- 1/2 teaspoon prepared mustard
- dash freshly ground black pepper

Once the onion bulbs have been pulled up, let them dry in the sun three or four days, after which they can be stored in mesh bags in a cool, ventilated space.

**Garlic:** In the same family as onions, garlic should be planted in fall. Its bulbs multiply into clusters or cloves. Garlic is harvested in much the same way as onions, but the tops can be braided together rather than removed. Garlic is a perennial bulb that can grow two to three feet high. The herb has pretty white or lavender blooms.

After plants have been set in place, the difficult part begins: waiting until harvest time. Other recipes call for peppers, zucchini, eggplant, tomatoes, onions and garlic in various combinations, but Ratatouille requires them all. Enjoy the classic recipe for this fresh vegetable medley.

Yields 2 or 4 servings.  
Preparation time: 5 to 10 minutes.  
Cooking time: 1 to 2 minutes.  
Oven setting: 70 percent power (medium-high)

In a medium mixing bowl combine all ingredients except English muffins; mix well. Mound evenly onto toasted muffin halves and arrange on paper towel on floor of oven. Microwave 1 to 2 minutes or until heated through.

## ZUCCHINI LUNCHEON BAKE

- 4 cups (1 1/2 pounds) sliced zucchini (1/4 to 1/2 inch slices)
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1/2 cup diced onion
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 2 tablespoons milk
- 1/2 teaspoon seasoned salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 2 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
- 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

Yields 4 to 6 servings.  
Preparation time: 10 minutes.  
Cooking time: 7 to 10 minutes.  
Oven setting: 100 and 70 percent power (high and medium high)

Combine zucchini, butter and onion in 1 1/2 quart microwave-safe casserole. Cover and microwave at 100 percent power for 5 to 7 minutes, or until tender, stirring every 3 minutes.

In small bowl combine sour cream, milk, seasoned salt and pepper. Stir into zucchini mixture, then top with hard-cooked eggs and Parmesan cheese. Microwave, uncovered, at 70 percent power for 2 to 3 minutes, or until heated.

## SALAD NICOISE FOR TWO

- 1 (5-ounce) baking potato, pierced
- 6 fresh green beans
- 2 cups romaine lettuce, torn into small pieces
- 6 cucumber slices
- 1/2 tomato, cut into wedges
- 6 pitted black olives
- 1 (3/4 ounce) can tuna, drained
- 1 hard-cooked egg, finely chopped
- 4 anchovy fillets
- vinegar and olive oil

Yields 2 servings.  
Preparation time: 10 to 15 minutes.  
Cooking time: 5 to 7 minutes (plus 5 minutes standing time).  
Oven setting: 100 percent power (high).

Place potato on paper towel in oven and microwave for 3 minutes. Turn potato over and microwave 1 to 3 minutes longer, or until potato gives slightly when squeezed. Wrap in foil and let stand 5 minutes.


Wrap washed green beans in plastic wrap. Microwave 1 minute; set aside.

Place lettuce on 2 salad plates. Arrange green beans, cucumber, tomato and olives around edges of lettuce. Peel and dice potato. Place in center of vegetables. Arrange tuna around potato; sprinkle with chopped egg. Crisscross anchovies on top of potatoes. Serve immediately with vinegar and olive oil.

# Michael Nouri goes through 'Changes'

## Danielle Steel movie mirrors professionals

It's raining in L.A., and the war has come to an end. "It's a great day," says actor Michael Nouri. Nouri, who co-starred with Jennifer Beals in "Flashdance," has just finished the NBC film Danielle Steel's "Changes" and has found some time to talk about it. He shuts the door to keep his golden retriever from escaping into the wet outdoors. "It's like a whole new day," he says pensively.

"The thing that really grabbed me about the part in 'Changes' is that there's an art to the character," begins Nouri, whose smooth, tranquil voice almost entrances you. "And you see that he goes from being insular to being more involved and going through the painful process of having to admit he's been neglecting his own emotions and also the emotional needs of those closest to him."

In "Changes," airing Monday,

April 1, on NBC, Nouri plays a handsome, celebrated heart surgeon whose wife has died, ironically, of a heart ailment. Enter Nouri's "Changes" co-star Cheryl Ladd. Ladd plays a beautiful and famous New York TV correspondent who falls for Nouri. She's a single mother; he's a single father. Together they have everything going for them. However, when they marry, the crises that follow do not make for a happy "Yours, Mine and Ours" ending.

"I think, especially, professional people will relate to this," says Nouri. "Maybe we can all relate to it on the level of how we will turn to something else rather than face our feelings about something. Have a drink. Have a cigarette. Have a meal, whatever it takes to not deal with the real thing coming up. We're part of a culture that's learned to anesthetize its feelings, kind of numb it until the feeling goes away. But the feeling never goes away. It usually comes back harder and bigger..."

The glamour, wealth and power exhibited in Steel's miniseries are sure to be enticing elements of

"Changes." But in real life, it's evident they aren't what the real Michael Nouri is about. The actor says it's been necessary for him to divorce his success from fame and money — the penchants of Hollywood. "My professional life is unpredictable. It's a real roller coaster ride. Sometimes I'm high; sometimes I'm low, and there are the attendant emotions that go with both. I'm still having to remind myself that I am not what I do. I do what I do. But I am what I am."

Nouri, who meditates daily, takes this philosophy so seriously that in the early '70s he quit acting and traveled across Europe and the U.S., living out of a VW van. To earn money he'd open his guitar case, "Prime it with a few bucks," and strum on street corners.

The actor eventually settled down in 1975, going to work on the CBS daytime drama "Search for Tomorrow," for which he won an Emmy. His current projects include two feature films, "Total Exposure" and "Psychic," scheduled for release this year. But it is his work with the National Multiple Sclerosis Society about which Nouri seems most earnest. He was recently named the organization's official ambassador.




