Legal storm brewing at Shores site

Those thunderclouds hanging over the proposed Shores of Northville development in Northville Township are not just gathering April showers.

The black clouds more likely symbolize a brewing legal storm that this week is expected to erupt into a downpour of charges and countercharges in Wayne County Circuit Court.

Township attorneys on Friday said the township will petition circuit court seeking injunctive relief to repair Sump Drain, a meandering creek that has contributed to massive erosion to property west of the Shores of Northville site.

The township will ask the court to allow it to use funds from a \$520,000 escrow account to repair erosion only on the 400-acre Shores of Northville site, said township attorney Ernest Essad.

"We'll ask the court to immediately allow us to apply for a DNR permit, to use their (escrow) money to repair the drain," Essad said. "(The suit) will probably be ready Monday for township officials to review."

The township's action comes on the heels of the second adjournment of a criminal trial prosecuted by the state against Shores of Northville partner Vincent DiLorenzo and a construction firm he heads.

Officials from the state DNR and Wayne County Prosecutor's Office on Friday agreed to postpone DiLorenzo's pretrial examination from April 12 to May 10, in part to allow the developer and DNR more time to establish a workable and mutually agreeable Sump Drain repair plan.

Last Friday's hearing had been set after a similar March 15 adjournment.

The state is prosecuting DiLorenzo and D & T Construction for allegedly violating the state's Inland Lakes and Streams Act. Allegations date back to March 1990, and potential fines could cost the developers hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Township and state officials also allege that the developers illegally re-

routed Sump Drain early last summer during reclamation of the proposed development site, formerly a gravel pit.

Sump Drain washed away culverts and its temporary stream bed last December. Resulting erosion created massive upstream damage to neighboring properties, filled lakes on the Shores site with sediment and hiked lake levels at Blue Heron Pointe subdivision to the east.

DiLorenzo and the state have not reached accord on a Sump Drain repair plan, but the developer Friday said an agreement is near.

"The DNR is favorable; there are no major problems with the plan," DiLorenzo said. "There's just two little minor things."

Reilly Wilson, assistant Wayne County Prosecutor, said attorneys representing state and developer will meet later this month to attempt to reach a repair plan settlement.

When told that DiLorenzo called repair points of contention "minor," Wilson said: "I'm delighted he calls them minor."

A potential down-the-road agreement does not mollify the township. It will petition the court to "keep the pressure on," Essad said.

But the township's action will spawn another round of legal chess maneuvers. John Ashton, attorney for the Thomson Trust — former owners of the Shores site and holder of the escrow fund — said he will attempt to block the township's injunctive relief quest.

"That will cause us to move forward in circuit court," Ashton said.

Ashton said he will ask the court to "turn the escrow funds over to his client."

Ashton would not say if he would include the developer in his court action.

"I'm not prepared to say that at this point," he said. "But obviously, the township's not the only player."

ROOFING IT

Principal makes good on high-flying promise

The Moraine Elementary principal spent Thursday eating pizza and fighting the cold and wind on the school's roof.

Mary Najarian was on the roof for six hours following a challenge to all her students to read during March.

March is recognized as reading month statewide, and Najarian decided to offer a special incentive to Moraine students to honor the month.

For every grade level that met its reading goal, Najarian would spend an hour on the school's roof.

The incentive turned out to be great enough that not only did every grade meet its goal, but also every student met his or her own personal goal.

"There was 100-percent participation. They all met and surpassed their goals," Najarian said.

In fact, three Moraine students read over 2,000 pages.

Fourth-grader Amanda Brackel, reading 2,197 pages, was the top reader in the school.

"She was just pleased as punch," said Amanda's mother, Teri. "She's a wonderful reader. She was one of those kids who was reading with the flashlight under her covers."

Amanda was required to read 280 pages during March to meet the fourth-grade goal.

From kindergartners who were required to have 75 pages read to them, to fifth-graders who had to read 350 pages, everyone met their goal.

Because the goal was reached by every Moraine student, each of them received a free personal-size pizzas from Pizza Cutter and a button that said "I

got mine."

But the biggest incentive was Najarian's day on the roof.

"I think that is what really turned the kids on," Najarian said. "It was such a wacky idea to see an authority figure on the roof."

Najarian spent Thursday on the roof. The day was a little chilly, she said, but Pizza Cutter also rewarded her with a free pizza.

The event thrust Moraine into the spotlight with television broadcasts and newspaper coverage of the day.

The publicity was unexpected, Najarian said. "I was just overwhelmed," she said.

But will Najarian risk braving the elements again next March?

We will have to wait and see, she said.

EMS switch sparks objections

A fiery letter from a rejected ambulance service to township residents has ignited a blaze of controversy around the local fire department.

The township board's February decision to drop Novi-based Community Emergency Medical Service (CEMS) as its medical transport provider prompted a pained response from CEMS President and CEO Greg Beauchemin.

Beauchemin, who earlier said he was "blindsided" by township Fire Chief Rick Rosselle's recommendation to sever township/CEMS ties, charged in a March letter that new provider Huron Valley Ambulance (HVA) is costlier and that CEMS was not afforded an opportunity to respond to township concerns.

And Beauchemin on Friday charged that residents have suffered from the emergency services switch.

"I felt the change would have a de-

vastating effect on a system that was proven . . ." he said. "We've been monitoring response times and (they are) no better."

"I'd say it has taken away from residents' (safety)."

Township officials strongly disagree.

Rosselle says CEMS was dropped because it did not respond to fire department complaints of poor emergency response times, CEMS rudeness to patients, and CEMS fail-

ture to return township fire department medical equipment.

The change to HVA has been positive, Rosselle said.

"I'm really happy with HVA," he said. "My responsibility is to see medical service in the township is up to snuff."

"I made a good and firm decision," he said.

Rosselle said he believes Beauchemin's letter was "a scare tactic" de-







Appealing results

Hundreds ask city for lower assessment figures

A total of 314 contentious property owners trooped into Northville City Hall to appeal their property assessments this year.

Of those, 218 actually saw their assessments reduced by the Board of Review.

The vast majority of petitioners were homeowners, said City Assessor Mark Christiansen. "We had, at most, five commercial appeals."

Appeals during the nine days of Board of Review hearings were divided almost evenly between the city's two counties, with 169 from Wayne and 145 from Oakland, Christiansen said.

The fact that the numbers were al-

most equal between the counties, and that the total number of appeals was not much greater than last year's figure of 282, surprised the assessor.

"I would have guessed that, particularly with what happened in Wayne County, there would have been more (appeals)," he said.

Homeowners this year saw their assessments rise an average of 6 percent in Oakland County and 13 percent in Wayne County. The numbers varied widely among neighborhoods and even more widely among individual properties.

The variations were attributed to the wide discrepancies in past property valuation figures from Wayne County Equalization Department assessors, as revealed by a newly installed computer assessing system at

City Hall.

Christiansen enclosed a letter explaining the reasons behind the variations in his assessment notices to Wayne County property owners. "Sending out the letter on the Wayne County side may have helped some," he said.

Appeals — like the assessment increases that inspired them — were not confined to specific neighborhoods. "They just seemed to be coming from all directions," Christiansen said.

In Wayne County, a large share of the appeals came from homeowners on First Avenue, South Rogers Street, Thayer Boulevard and Wing Street. Homes in the neighborhood between Cady and Fairbrook were valued an average of 32 percent more

than last year.

"They (appeals) were scattered pretty evenly on the Oakland side," Christiansen said.

The total reduction in state-equalized value (SEV) from the 218 property owners who had their assessments reduced was \$1,109,630. SEV figures equal 50 percent of a property's actual market value.

The city's total SEV after the Board of Review hearings was \$180,123,870, an 8.5-percent increase over last year's total SEV of \$166,087,790.

The figures do not take into account the result of Michigan Tax Tribunal reductions, which can take years to be decided.

Letters from township may start arriving today

At least Northville Township can say it makes half the people happy half the time.

Nearly 50 percent of 313 township residents who appealed 1991 property assessments will find assessment reductions when they open today's mail.

Township employees on Friday mailed letters notifying residents of Board of Review decisions, and approximately 150 received reductions for hardships or one-year adjustments, said Nancy Molloy, township administrative assistant to the treasurer.

Another 30 residents had their assessments reduced by assessor decisions, Molloy said.

Total value of reductions from the Board of Review and township assessors was approximately \$1.2 million, she said.

"It was the board's decision that some were assessed too high," Molloy said.

Some Board of Review decisions were based on hardships, Molloy said. Hardship cases reviewed by determining a petitioner's income constraints, she said. Several of the hardship cases came from the Highland Lakes subdivision area, she said.

Not everyone will be happy with the review board's findings.

Property owners will receive a pink form that will be marked with either an assessment change, a

hardship determination or a denial, Molloy said. If the property owner's appeal has been denied, the form will read "fair and equitable."

If the property owner is not pleased with the board's determination, a second appeal process can be attempted.

"If they are not satisfied with the decision, even with a reduction, they can go on to the Michigan Tax Tribunal," Molloy said (see related story).

Hardship cases may not be appealed, she said. The 313 cases handled by the Board of Review were down from last year's 460 petitions, Molloy said.

Tax tribunal offers another chance

Property owners who have filed tax assessment appeals with the Board of Review and are dissatisfied with the board's findings still can appeal to the Michigan Tax Tribunal.

But be forewarned: Because of the backlog in cases, tribunal appeals can take years to come to a hearing.

"It's taking at least a year to handle the (Tax Tribunal) appeals," said Northville City Assessor Mark Christiansen, who just received nine notices of tribunal reductions from

last year's assessments.

In the city, 218 of the 314 appeals to the Board of Review were granted reductions.

Property owners interested in appealing their assessments further must make their appeal to the tribunal by requesting an appeal form from the state. After the state has received the request, a Michigan Tax Tribunal Small Claims Division petition is sent back to the appellant and to the city.

Both must complete the paperwork by June 30 and return it to the state.

The tax tribunal asks for several pieces of information from the prop-

erty owner on its petition form. The home or business owner is asked to include an estimate of the true market value of the property. A listing of the previous year's assessment is also requested.

A key question on the petition asks property owners whether they plan to support their case with written evidence. Providing evidence gives the appellant a better chance of winning the case.

Other important information to provide includes existing sale prices of similar homes in the community and any relevant material that would adversely affect the value of the property.

Each tribunal hearing, once it is scheduled, takes approximately a half-hour.

If the property owner's appeal is granted, the difference between the assessment the tribunal sets and the city's assessment is refunded. The refund includes interest.

One last warning to would-be appellants — the tribunal has the power to raise as well as lower an assessment.

signed to blacken the eyes of the fire department and township board.

"I'm a new chief and they wanted to deface me and deface the township board," he said. "I have no idea what they think they're going to gain."

At the least, CEMS gained the attention of township residents.

Township officials received approximately 50 letters from concerned residents, Supervisor Georgina Goss said. Goss defended the move as necessary.

"The change from (CEMS) to (HVA) was based on the need to deliver a superior emergency medical service to our community," she said. "We needed and now have an ambulance service who will be more responsive to . . . growth."

Some northeastern township residents fear HVA will not be able to respond to emergencies quickly enough. They question HVA's ability to reach them from the firm's nearest outpost at Five Mile and Sheldon.

North Valley resident George Patak last Thursday told the township

board that HVA location and expense worried some residents.

Rosselle told Patak that the township's First Responder ambulance service is set up to augment commercial ambulance services. First Responder is designed to stabilize emergency sites prior to commercial pick-up and transport, Rosselle said.

The township is fully equipped to transport patients on emergency cases not handled by commercial firms, Rosselle said.

"I'll be at your house within six minutes (with the First Responder) unless I break down on the road," he told Patak.

HVA Executive Director Dale Berry bristled at the CEMS letter.

"The last-ditch attempt by CEMS to scare the public, especially senior citizens who may need emergency services more than others, has been inaccurate and unfortunate," he said.

Berry attempted to quell resident fears about high emergency medical costs.

"Only 25 percent of people transported actually have any out-of-pocket costs at all (and it's) usually under \$100," he said.

"Quality is the most important thing we provide."

Beauchemin stands by his letter, a month after it was mailed.

"I'm confident in our product," he said. "I felt we could mail a letter to prove (the township made a mistake). It's not a scare tactic."

The township has attempted to respond to residents' questions by scripting an informational letter explaining fire department and HVA services. The board also scheduled a public hearing on the ambulance switch issue for 7 p.m. May 9 at township hall.

NORTHVILLE CITY COUNCIL MINUTES SYNOPSIS
MARCH 18, 1991

Mayor Johnson called the regular meeting of the Northville City Council to order in the Council Room at 8:00 p.m.

1. ROLL CALL:
PRESENT: Mayor Christopher J. Johnson, Councilmen Paul F. Folino, G. Dewey Gardner, Jerome J. Mitman.
ABSENT: Mayor Pro-tem Carolann Ayers, excused out-of-town.

2. ALSO PRESENT: City Manager Steven Walters, City Clerk Cathy Konrad, Assessor Mark Christensen, Finance Director Bev Morrison, Fire Chief James Allen, Public Works Superintendent Ted Mapee, James Eagan, Ken Kurkel, Mark Nottley, Kathleen Oron, and Northville Record Reporter Steve Kallman.

3. APPROVAL OF COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES:
The minutes of the special meeting and the executive session of March 11, 1991, were approved as submitted.
The minutes of the regular meeting of March 11, 1991, were approved as corrected.

4. CITIZEN COMMENTS:
None.

5. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA & APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA:
Moved, supported, CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY, to approve the agenda as amended and the consent agenda A through F.

6. ALLOCATION OF 1991 WAYNE COUNTY BLOCK GRANT FUNDS:
Moved, supported, CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY, to allocate the estimated 1991 Wayne County CDBG funds of \$84,500 for the Senior Nutrition Program: \$1850; Information Center Home Share 1990 and 1991 - \$950; and Barrier Free City Hall - \$61,700.

7. RURAL HILL CEMETERY POLICY:
Moved, supported, CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY, to approve the Rural Hill Cemetery Policy with the following modifications: 1. increase the fee of the cemetery by Allen Monument Company at \$500.00 per month; 2. increase cemetery rates by \$50.00 to cover the additional operating cost; and 3. establishment of \$50.00 non-refundable deposit for grave, or opening and closing services.

8. NORTHVILLE TROLLEY:
Council was concerned with the potential liability and the trolley being used outside the City for a non-City event. It was Council's consensus that the City Manager draw up guidelines for insurance purposes and to review them with the City's insurance company and John Gabel.

9. REVIEW OF ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL FUNCTIONS:
Ken Kurkel noted that Plante & Moran has completed a review of the City's financial controls and organizational duties.
Mark Nottley reviewed the following: Overall Administration and Operations: Finding 1: Completed and ongoing computerized projects reflect an ongoing commitment to operational efficiency and effective data management - Recommendation 1: no specific recommendation; Finding 2: workload of the City Manager is excessive - Recommendation 2: City should create and staff a new deputy manager position; Finding 3: a more structured communication process may serve to strengthen interdepartmental relations - Recommendation 3: City administration should establish a monthly meeting process designed to provide a forum for interdepartmental communication.
Financial Operations: Finding 1: work assignments within the Finance Department appear appropriately structured and well defined - Recommendation 1: no specific recommendation; Finding 2: cashiers/clerks can absorb additional workload and responsibilities - Recommendation 2: additional duties should be assigned to the cashiers/clerks.
Jim Eagan reviewed the financial controls, which are the procedures to safeguard assets and insure that the accounting data is accurate and timely. Finding 1: Internal financial controls appear to be appropriately developed and assigned - Recommendation 1: no modifications; Finding 2: present management reports do not provide sufficient information for financial forecasting - Recommendation 2: City should develop improved financial reports which forecast anticipated cash flows; responsibility for report preparation should be assigned to the newly created deputy manager position; Finding 3: in addition to forecasting, the City may benefit from a more active approach to financial planning - Recommendation 3: the City should create a finance committee.

Returning soldier talks to Northville pen pals

Army private Sean Mach told a Moraine Elementary third-grade class he had to go 41 days without a shower while in Saudi Arabia.

The lack of water was just one of the difficulties of war he brought home to the third-grade class taught by his stepmother, Judy Mach.

Judy Mach's class had written Sean, a private in the 101st Airborne, six times while he was in the Persian Gulf. The class Wednesday had a visit from their adopted soldier during which he thanked them for the letters and shared a few war stories.

A lack of shower water was not the only hygiene problem that arose for Desert Storm soldiers, Sean said.

The male soldiers had to keep their hair extra short so a bug-infested fighting man would be easily spotted and quickly treated.

Sean's haircut was not the style he would have chosen, but bugs were not the only reason soldiers were given the "high and tight" cut.

"It's a common haircut they give

because if they mess it up, no one knows the difference," he said.

Judy Mach's class wanted to know what, besides haircuts and hygiene, caused the most discomfort for American soldiers stationed in Saudi Arabia during the war.

Was it the Army boots? And how was the food?

The Army boots were not too uncomfortable, Sean said. In fact, when he got back to the U.S. his tennis shoes seemed uncomfortable.

But the food Sean was able to eat on his return was a welcome change from the MREs, which is army talk for meals ready to eat.

And the Pepsi Cola sold in Saudi Arabia was not exactly what an American would expect.

The can looked the same except that half the label was printed in Arabic and half was printed in English. But looks were deceiving in this case.

"(The Pepsi Cola in Saudi Arabia) tastes terrible; it takes about a month to get used to," Sean said.

Kool-Aid mailed by the third grade class was a welcome relief, he said.

"Everything you all sent got used," he said. "Nothing got thrown out. The food was eaten real quickly."

The letters sent in the class's packages were also appreciated.

"Mail is the best thing that ever happened to the American soldier," he said.

He appreciated the letters and packages the class mailed, although it often was several weeks before he received them.

"I really appreciated the letters, and all the candy, and all the Kool-Aid."

But the "coolest" thing Sean saw in Saudi Arabia was neither the mail he received from his Moraine friends, nor the half-Arabic pop cans.

The absolute coolest sight in what Sean calls the "kingdom of sand and sun" were the rats.

The animals, called kangaroo rats, scurried around the desert on two legs. American soldiers passed the time by putting leashes on the beasts and taking them for walks.

"Those were about the coolest thing I've ever seen," Sean said.

Self-evaluation begins process for Bell's review

The evaluation process of Northville schools Superintendent George Bell is under way, but the process itself may need to be changed more than Bell's performance.

Superintendent evaluations are required by board policy, but the initiation of the Strategic Plan makes the evaluation more of a district-wide process than a school board process, Bell said in a self-evaluation.

Bell suggested the evaluation be revised following the completion of the Strategic Plan's First Annual Update.

Bell presented the self-evaluation to the board at its April 8 meeting. Northville school board members are

preparing to evaluate Bell on April 27.

Bell had a positive outlook for the future of Northville schools in his self-evaluation except in the area of finances.

"It's hard to say how anyone could responsibly manage the financial resources of a school district in the State of Michigan," Bell said.

"The uncertainties of finance have been one of the most frustrating parts of my attempts to maintain the momentum of progress which is so important to our continued success."

Bell said he is working with the Strategy One strategic planning committee that deals with financial issues to get the committee involved in the school board's determi-

nation of millage to be requested at a June 10 election.

The Michigan Model for Comprehensive Health Education also made an appearance in Bell's self-evaluation.

The Michigan Model is a lesson plan that fills a state requirement that the school district have a health curriculum. The model has stirred controversy in Northville and around the state by parents who feel the model does not reinforce family values. A district health committee will respond to specific criticisms posed by opponents of the model.

"I recognize that the opponents of the health model feel we are less responsive than they would like, but you are well aware of the complications in pulling the District

Health Advisory Committee together for a response to their concerns," Bell said.

The best indicator of community relations is the success of a September 28 millage election that passed 2-1 in September, Bell said. But he did not accept all the credit for the millage's success.

"I don't think it is possible to separate the superintendent's public image from that of the district," Bell said. "It seems to be evolving well."

Bell has evaluated each administrator twice this year. He will complete final evaluations in May, but said there are no administrators who have needed "corrective action."

CEMS controversy dragging on too long

Northville Township's switch in ambulance service, from Community EMS to Huron Valley Ambulance, created some controversy when it first took place. Now, several weeks later, the flap seems to have lost none of its steam—in fact, it appears to have gained some.

It's starting to get a little ridiculous.

To recap, township officials felt unhappy with the service CEMS provided to its residents. The city, which used and still uses CEMS, had no complaints—but CEMS has a station within city limits. The township felt response times and service could be better, and the fire chief wanted shopping for another ambulance company.

He came up with HVA, and he recommended to the township board that the township make the switch. The board readily concurred.

The controversy came about when CEMS objected to the change, arguing, among other things, that its service was adequate; that it deserved a chance to plead its case before the board; and that, in fact, it did not even know that the board was considering a change.

At the time we said in this space that the township should indeed have notified CEMS of the potential switch, and should have heard its defenses before making a decision. We did not argue with the change itself, however. HVA appears to be a better company for the township; the fire chief believes that to be the case, and there is no reason to doubt him.

That all still holds. But CEMS is taking its mistreatment to ridiculous extremes and is getting in the way of smooth township operations.



Government

The company's president sent a misleading letter to township residents seeking their support. He continues to make noise about how much better his firm would serve the township. He has not, however, offered any evidence of that assertion—which leads us to believe that if he had received the chance to plead his case, it wouldn't have made a shred of difference in the township's decision.

The whole matter has got so far out of hand that the township plans a public hearing on the change of ambulance firms—in May, about three months after the decision was made!

Of course, theoretically, the township could switch back—and this seems to be what CEMS is after. Bowing to this public-relations attack would be a mistake, however, and unless the hearing turns up some shocking new information, you can expect things to remain the same.

This all could have been avoided if the township officials had had a little more foresight and brought CEMS into the decision-making process. That didn't happen—but they've paid for it and then some. This controversy deserves a quick death.

Mondavi chairs nearby WineFest

Every serious wine consumer knows the name Robert Mondavi. His winery, founded 25 years ago in the Napa Valley, is famed worldwide.

For a quarter century, Robert Mondavi has been the unofficial spokesperson for the California wineries, praising their efforts and encouraging an exchange of technological advances between the New World and the tried-and-true methods of European vintners.

Recently, at age 77, Robert Mondavi has turned over control of the Robert Mondavi Winery to his sons Michael and Timothy. The transition will be smooth because Mondavi desires nothing more than the continuation of a family tradition of excellence in the wine business.

Michael, the sales and marketing director, and Tim, the winemaker, will share duties as joint CEOs. "My father has given us the responsibility of running the Robert Mondavi Winery together with a unified vision," Tim Mondavi said, in responding to our question about winery challenges in the 1990s.

"These are big shoes to fill, but I'm not going to fill my father's shoes, I'm going to fill my own."

The Mondavis believe their father will never retire. He will just move on to other ventures related to the Robert Mondavi Winery. Among them will be work on the cultural aspects of wine and arenas for integrating viticultural art, and wine and food dimensions.

"Making good wine is a skill," Tim said. "Premium winemaking is an art. Three factors lend an expression to the art of winemaking: the weather, site and soil, and the people involved. The challenge is using these three factors to their maximum."

Tim believes that California's advantage among the wine regions of the world is that grapes can be grown there more naturally. "Wine should be the true reflection of its natural environment," he maintains. "Wine is not manufactured; it is grown."

Tim described how winegrowing is a passion for him. He referred to winegrowing as the bellwether of winemaking. His greatest challenge since becoming the winemaker in 1974 has been pinot noir production. We personally believe it has been his greatest success.

"We learn something new each vintage," Tim said. "In 1974, I experimented with different fermentation temperatures for pinot noir. In 1976, we retained stems. In 1978, we put the wine to barrel earlier and used newer oak."

"In 1985, we turned the corner. Now, with the release of the 1988 Robert Mondavi Reserve Pinot Noir, people are realizing that our pinots are not flukes. We have attained a consistent, world-class quality."

Now celebrating its 10th year, the Ann Arbor Art Association's WineFest is a celebration of the liquid assets of wine. Festivities begin with a buffet dinner from 6-8 p.m. Saturday, April 20, at the Ypsilanti Radisson Resort. After dinner, Tim Mondavi will be the honorary chairperson of a live wine auction of more than 1,000 bottles in all shapes and sizes donated by some of the area's most astute collectors.

Full case lots as well as rare half bottles and large format presentations are up for bids to support the art association's multiple community endeavors. These range from art instruction offered to underprivileged youngsters to enriching the art expression of senior citizens.

Auction proceedings will be followed by a dessert buffet and dancing. If you have entertained the thought of attending a wine auction, at \$50 per person, here's one not to miss. WINE SELECTION OF THE WEEK

1988 Robert Mondavi Winery Pinot Noir Reserve (\$30) has a full, ripe black-cherry impression in the aroma and on the palate. The integrated oak components are reminiscent of a fine Burgundy. The smooth, silky, velvety finish completes a handsome presentation. You may think this bottling is pricey unless you have recently checked the tag on some 1988 Burgundies.

THE SAUCIER'S APPRENTICE

This is the second in a two-part series on different approaches to healthier sauces.

Jean-Georges Vongerichten is part alchemist, part magician, part public relations representative and part chef. And he is out to change the way the world thinks about sauce.

"I want to make a statement," said the dynamic 33-year-old chef of Lafayette restaurant. "The public thinks that French food is all butter and cream and that you have to sit for two hours at the table to eat it. I want to break that image."

Vongerichten's "laboratory" is a gleaming stainless-steel kitchen with a huge window allowing the public to watch. Lined up on the windowsill in tall, slender glasses is a rainbow of infused oils, his favorite "sauce."

"About five years ago, I threw all my stocks away and moved to pan juices and then to oils; now we do about 30 oils," says the supremely confident chef, offering tastes of a striking red potion flavored with paprika, a brilliant orange oil scented with curry and a crystal-clear mint oil the color of a block of ice. Each oil has a pure, intense flavor and aroma.

"Any ground spice can be made into a flavored oil; herbs, roots, shellfish, fruits and vegetable juices too," says Vongerichten, shaking a jar of lobster oil he has taken from the walk-in refrigerator.

The process starts with mild canola oil, which has the lowest saturated fat content of all vegetable oils. Using several techniques, Vongerichten extracts the essential flavors of saffron, wasabi, ginger, horseradish, curin, basil, cranberries, shrimp, tomatoes, truffles and other ingredients, then infuses these flavors into the oil.

Ground spices are the easiest to work with, he says. "You just mix the spice powder with water to wake up the flavors; then make a paste the consistency of ketchup; then add the oil and shake. The mixture will be cloudy, but after two days the paste goes to the bottom and you can ladle the oil into a jar."

The solids are then discarded, and the oil can be further strained through cheesecloth or paper coffee filters for greater clarity. Vongerichten says spice oils can be kept at room temperature for a month or more.

For fresh herb oil, such herbs as basil, chervil and mint are blanched in boiling water for 15 seconds, drained, dried and blended with a small amount of olive oil to a smooth paste. The mixture is placed in a glass jar, more olive oil is added and the enhanced oil is allowed to sit for one day before being filtered. Herb oils can be stored, tightly covered, in the refrigerator for up to a week.

Oil can make for a healthy sauce base

Vegetable juice oils are made by combining freshly extracted juices (using a juicer) with safflower or corn oil. They can be used immediately and may be refrigerated for up to two weeks.

But dreaming up these eldrits is only part of Vongerichten's magic. The next step is using them in place of the heavy cream creations of Escoffier and his followers.

"You can drizzle these oils over sauteed or steamed foods, or marinate meat or fish in them a day ahead and grill it," says Vongerichten. Because of the oil's intense flavor, only a few drops are needed. The result is a light, aromatic dish with few calories.

In his book "Simple Cuisine," the chef also suggests using infused oils to dress salads, saute foods and make "absolutely unheard-of mayonnaises." Some of Vongerichten's favorite dishes with huiles parfumes (perfumed oils) are grilled lamb with curry oil, chicken finished with tomato-chili oil and sauteed cod with fresh ginger oil.

Vongerichten says his flavored oils are just what the diner of the '90s ordered: increased flavor with less saturated fat and fewer calories. "And besides," adds the smiling chef, "it's a lot of fun."

TIPS FOR OILS

Vongerichten offers these suggestions for using infused oils to enliven everyday fare:

- Marinate a butterflied leg of lamb or lamb chops in curry oil, then grill or broil.
- Marinate tuna steaks in wasabi oil before grilling.
- Toss your favorite pasta with citrus-flavored oil.
- Drizzle slices of roast pork loin with cranberry-orange oil.
- Marinate chicken breasts in cardamom oil for 15 minutes; grill or saute.
- Flavor grain salads such as couscous

- and bulgar wheat tabouleh with ginger oil.
- Toss cooked shrimp in a vinaigrette made with curry oil.
- Let infused oils add flavor to grilled foods, pasta and salads with these basic recipes from Vongerichten.

HERB- OR SPICE-INFUSED OILS

- 3 tablespoons dried herb or spice of choice
- 1 to 2 tablespoons water
- 2 cups canola, grapeseed, safflower or corn oil

Yields two cups.
Mix dried herb or spice of choice and water in wide-mouth jar with lid. Stir into paste consistency. Add oil; cap jar and shake to distribute ingredients. Let stand at room temperature to allow flavors of herbs or spices to infuse oil, about 2 days.

After first day, herb or spice paste will settle to bottom of jar. Shake during this time to intensify spice flavor.

After two days, carefully ladle infused oil into 8-ounce jar; discard paste. Filter oil through paper coffee filter or double thickness of fine cheesecloth. Store, tightly covered, in refrigerator for up to six months.

If you have a juice extractor, you can use it to extract the juice from beets, carrots, cranberries, pineapples, or yellow or red bell peppers, which is necessary to make the following syrups. Otherwise, use a food processor as instructed here.

VEGETABLE OR FRUIT SYRUPS

- 1 to 2 pounds vegetable or fruit of choice
- 2 cups safflower, grapeseed or corn oil

Yields 1 1/4 cups.
For carrots, bell peppers or beets, grate and then process them in food processor until very fine. For tomatoes or pineapples, cut them into 2-inch pieces and process

until pureed. For cranberries, process until ground fine.

Transfer processed vegetable or fruit pulp of choice to large sieve lined with double thickness of cheesecloth. Squeeze processed vegetable or fruit pulp to release about 1 cup of liquid; discard solids.

Transfer juice to medium non-reactive saucepan. Bring to boil and simmer until reduced to 1/4 cup, 25 to 30 minutes. Strain this syrup through fine sieve; discard solids. Pour syrup into jar with tight-fitting lid.

Add oil; cover jar tightly and shake vigorously. Store in refrigerator for up to two weeks. For oil with uniform color, shake well before using.

CITRUS-INFUSED OIL

- 2 tablespoons citrus zest (orange, lemon, grapefruit)
- 1 cup canola, grapeseed, safflower or corn oil

Yields one cup.

Combine zest of choice and oil in glass bottle with tight-fitting lid. Let stand at room temperature for two days to allow flavors from zest to infuse oil. Strain mixture through paper coffee filter. Discard zest and return oil to bottle. Store, tightly covered, in refrigerator for up to six months.

RED SNAPPER IN POTATO FLAKES WITH TOMATO OIL

- 3 eggs
- 4 7-ounce red snapper fillets
- 1 cup instant potato flakes
- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
- tomato oil (recipe follows)

Yields four servings.
Beat eggs in shallow bowl. Dip red snapper fillets in beaten egg, then dredge them lightly in potato flakes. Pat flakes onto fish so fillets are nicely coated.

In saute pan, heat olive oil over medium-high heat. Cook fillets one minute per side. Season with salt and pepper. Transfer fillets to warmed serving plates. Drizzle with tomato oil.

TOMATO OIL

- 4 large beefsteak or plum tomatoes
- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1 tablespoon chopped thyme or basil

Yields 1/2 cup.
Put tomatoes, unpeeled, through juicer extractor. You should have 3 cups of juice. In saucepan over medium-high heat, reduce tomato juice by 1/2 to about 1 cup. Strain through fine mesh strainer into clean saucepan. Reduce to syrup, no more than 1/4 cup. Stir in olive oil and thyme or basil. Store, tightly covered, in refrigerator for up to two weeks.

Cooking in the 'wave can draw raves

Ten years ago I never would have thought of buying a microwave for my home or business. I still rarely use a "micro" mostly due to lack of habit.

But, because convenience foods are so popular today and time is so short for cooking, the microwave is becoming a best friend to one-time cooks and future culinarians. I have nothing against the microwave; my complaint is much of fast food that goes into them.

The micro can be a valuable tool for nutritional, quick meals. According to a spokesman for a large manufacturer, 70 percent of the time microwaves are used to reheat precooked foods, 20 percent for defrosting, and only 10 percent for primary cooking functions.

It is important for nutrition's sake to use the microwave for these primary functions. Steamed vegetables are incredible, fish excellent and snacks easy. Although I do not advocate cooking meat or poultry in the microwave, mostly due to personal preference, there are many other options.

Oatmeal and Cream of Wheat are easy, fast and there is little clean-up. Reheating

soups saves pans and time. I portion leftover soup and chili into mugs and everyone helps themselves when hungry.

Eggs are simple and quick in the microwave. When bacon is "fried" in the micro much of the fat is melted away leaving a much leaner product. Melting butter becomes a piece of cake and defrosting liquids easy as setting a dial.

The principal behind microwave cooking is fairly simple, yet very different from conventional oven cooking. Convection ovens, or the ovens we are used to, use heated air for an extended length of time to cook food, the air itself transfers heat.

The air inside a microwave only becomes heated as the food that is being cooked becomes hot. The waves, generated by the oven's magnetron tube, travel through the food at a rate of 2.5 billion times per second. This sets the molecules present in the food in motion, causing heat-producing friction. This may sound very scientific, and it is, but simply put, the waves penetrate the food at an incredibly high speed and cause the water molecules of the food to move around fast and pro-

duce friction, which produces heat and cooking.

The actual microwaves rarely pass more than 1 1/4 inches into the food; the outer areas heat first and residual heat moves toward the center of the food heating it. The metal walls reflect the waves and do not become hot. Plates become hot from the food, not from the microwaves. If there is no moisture the microwave cannot produce the friction necessary to heat.

Because of the direct heat transfer foods heat quicker than other cookery methods. This offers some drawbacks. Flavor is a chemical process that requires time and temperature to fully develop, neither of which is prominent with microwave cooking.

In addition, standard microwave ovens do not brown foods. This is unappealing to most people. We eat with our eyes. If it looks good it will taste good. Foods with high contents of fat, water and sugar tend to burn easily because they heat so quickly. Cook halfway and stir to prevent

burning.

A microwave is much more efficient full than almost empty. For warming or cooking, food should be no colder than refrigerator temperature. Put frozen food through a defrost cycle first. When arranging a meal on a plate put the denser foods on the outer rim and the less dense, such as vegetables in the middle. Keep your oven clean for the most efficient use.

Glass, Saran Wrap, some plastics, and paper (for short cooking times) are acceptable cooking vessels. Foil and metal skewers can be used effectively but check your manufacturer's guidelines before doing so. Like any other method of cooking practice makes perfect.

The microwave is an indispensable piece of equipment in many households but it is important to remember that speed can't be a substitute for good ingredients and nutritious meals.

PARCHMENT SEAFOOD SPECTACULAR

- 2 6- to 8-ounce halibut steaks
- 1 tablespoon dry white wine
- dash soy sauce
- dash lemon juice
- 1/4 cup sliced mushrooms
- 1/4 cup small broccoli florets
- 1 tablespoon tarragon (fresh if available)
- dijon mustard
- salt and pepper to taste

Key 2 sheets parchment, large enough to wrap envelope-style around fish and vegetables, on the counter. Place a fish steak in the middle of each and spread lightly with dijon mustard. Add vegetables and sprinkle with wine, soy, lemon juice and tarragon. Add salt and pepper as desired. Wrap completely. Place on glass dish and microwave on high 7-9 minutes. Let rest several minutes. Serve in paper. Add rice or pasta that have already been cooked and be added to packet for a complete meal.

Low Fat and Loving It by Ruth Spear (Warner Books, \$19.95, hardcover) offers great-tasting solutions to the low-fat diet dilemma.

Spear is a veteran cookbook author who developed an interest in low-fat cooking during her own health crisis. She has consulted with nutritionists and doctors to develop a plan for healthy and satisfying eating, with the latest nutritional data, substitutions for high-fat foods and more than 200 recipes.

Here is one of her recipes.

HAM AND POTATO PIE

Serves 5 (about 1 1/4 cups each)

Pam
3/4 cup finely chopped onion
1/4 cup finely chopped green pepper
1/4 cup defatted chicken stock, or homemade
Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
1 1/4 cups finely chopped lean ham, all visible fat removed
2 cups creamed corn (one 17-ounce can)
2 cups seasoned Low-Fat Mashed Potatoes

Preheat the oven to 425 degrees.

Spray a large non-stick skillet with Pam and saute the onion over medium heat until softened, about 2 minutes. Add the green pepper, chicken stock, salt, pepper and Worcestershire sauce and simmer uncovered for 10 minutes.

In a bowl, combine the ham, corn and onion mixture; then spoon this into an ungreased baking dish. Cover with the mashed potatoes, roughen the surface with a fork, and bake uncovered for 30 minutes, or until the top is flecked with brown. If necessary, run the dish under the broiler to brown.

KITCHEN WINDOW: Chef Elwin Greenwald, proprietor of Elwin's Tu-Go in Royal Oak, will conduct a short series of cooking demonstrations the last Tuesday of April. Wake up your weekends with brunch

Trying to get the gang together but having trouble juggling schedules? Invite everyone for a weekend brunch, since mornings often aren't so planned. You won't have to wake up at dawn because you assemble this dish the evening before and chill it overnight. In the morning, while breakfast is baking, heat up some purchased rolls, cut up some fruit, and put on the coffee.

TURKEY-ASPARAGUS BRUNCH BAKE

1 pound fresh asparagus, or one 10-ounce package frozen cut asparagus, or one 10-ounce package frozen cut broccoli

1 pound ground raw turkey
1 cup chopped onion
1/2 cup chopped red or green sweet

pepper
8 eggs
2 cups milk
1 cup all-purpose flour
1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
1 teaspoon lemon pepper
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon dried tarragon, crushed
Non-stick spray coating
1 cup shredded Swiss cheese (4 ounces)

To cook fresh asparagus, wash and scrape off scales. Break off woody bases where spears snap easily. Reserve a few spears for garnish, if desired. Cut remaining asparagus into 1/4-inch pieces. Cook reserved spears and pieces, covered, in a small amount of boiling water for 7 to 9 mi-

nutes or until crisp-tender. (Or, follow package directions for cooking frozen asparagus or broccoli.) Drain; set aside.

In a large skillet cook turkey, onion and pepper until vegetables are just tender and turkey is no longer pink. Remove from heat; drain. Set aside.

In a large mixing bowl beat eggs. Add milk, flour, Parmesan cheese, lemon pepper, salt and tarragon; beat until smooth with a rotary beater. (Or, combine eggs, milk, flour, Parmesan cheese, lemon pepper, salt and tarragon in a blender container; cover and blend for 20 seconds.)

Spray bottom and sides of a 13-by-9-by-2-inch baking dish with non-stick spray coating. Arrange meat mixture in dish; top with cooked cut asparagus and cover and

chill. Cover and chill egg mixture separately.

To bake, stir egg mixture well and pour over turkey mixture. Bake, uncovered, in a 425-degree oven about 30 minutes or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean. Top with cheese; bake for 3-5 minutes longer or until melted. If desired, top with reserved steamed asparagus spears. Serve immediately. Makes 10 servings.

Thrift bakeries save customers bread

Irene Lithland's grocery cart is chock-full of pastries, coffee cake and muffins.

Each month Lithland drives from her West Bloomfield home to the Awrey Thrift Store in Livonia to stock up on goodies at reduced prices.

"It's worth the trip," said Lithland, eyeing a tray of blueberry muffins. "I freeze most of it, and it will last a month."

Variety and savings from 20 to 50 percent are the drawing cards.

There's an abundance of local thrift stores. Shoppers may choose from Awrey, Wonder Hostess, Entenmann's, Brownberry, Pepperidge Farm and Sara Lee.

Some thrift stores carry bakery goods which didn't sell in grocery stores. Some are fresh, others slightly out of date. Package contain freshness codes.

Other products may land in a thrift store because of overproduction or weight discrepancy. Most goods taste fine, with little or no loss of quality.

Some products have minor flaws — perhaps the icing is crooked — which don't affect taste.

"They're irregular — not picture-perfect," said a clerk in the Sara Lee outlet in Westland.

Awrey's thrift store, on Farmington Road south of the Jeffries Freeway, is adjacent to the plant where Awrey baked goods are produced.

The fragrance of baking sweet rolls lures customers to the spacious shop. Hard decisions must be made: Oatmeal bran or stone-ground whole wheat bread? Croissants or English muffins? Fudge brownies or strawberry streusel coffee cake?

At Awrey's thrift store, 98 percent

of the products are fresh.

"They're baked in the plant and brought directly to the thrift store," said company spokeswoman Betty Jean Awrey. "It's replenished all day long."

The Awrey discount is 20 to 30 percent, with daily specials. Many products are packaged in large, institutional trays or in individual portions. Customers may have a party cake decorated while they wait.

Diana Barlage of Plymouth, on her first trip to the thrift store, bought a large banana-flavored birthday cake, to be served at a party for daughter Emily, 4. Barlage expressed delight with the \$6 price for the cake, which serves 25 people.

A dozen fresh, old-fashioned doughnuts, tagged at \$2.49, were selling for \$1.89. A popular cinnamon coffee cake, \$3.49 retail, was priced at \$2.49.

Betty Jean Awrey said new products are taste-tested in the thrift store.

By the time her shopping was finished, Lithland had her quota of sweet rolls for her 91-year-old father, who lives with her. She also had a stockpile of individually wrapped danish pastries for her son, who pops them into the microwave for a fast heat-up.

"They cost a lot less than in the grocery store," Lithland said.

Try home-baked fuzzy navel cake

Betty Jean Awrey provided these Awrey's recipes for home baking.

FUZZY NAVEL CAKE

Using an Orange Cake Mix, bake the cake according to directions for 8-inch round cake. After cake is baked and cooled, pour ¼ cup of orange juice over each 8-inch layer. Spread one layer with peach jam, placing the other layer on top. Finish the cake by icing with Peach Buttercream Icing.

PEACH BUTTERCREAM ICING

2 cups butter
2 cups sifted confectioners' sugar
¼ cup sweetened condensed milk
2 large egg whites
¼ cup peach jam
¼ cup sifted confectioners' sugar
¼ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon vanilla extract
¼ cup confectioners' sugar

Place butter in mixing bowl, add 2 cups confectioners' sugar, mix at low speed to obtain smooth paste. Whip at medium speed, adding the sweetened condensed milk slowly and gradually until light and fluffy. Using a very clean bowl and beater, whip the egg whites until stiff while adding the ¼ cup confectioners' sugar slowly. Mix this meringue slowly into the above butter mixture. Add vanilla and remaining ¼ cup confectioners' sugar. This last amount of sugar can be doubled if stiffer icing is desired. (Note: Best results are obtained when butter and sugar are at room temperature and egg whites and milk are cold out of the refrigerator.) After icing is made blend in ¼ cup of peach jam.

RAISIN BRAN MUFFIN BATTER

1 cup cake flour sifted
4 cups bran
¾ cup brown sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1 ¼ teaspoons baking soda
1 teaspoon cinnamon
2 teaspoons cornstarch
1 cup salad oil
3 eggs
1 cup water
¼ cup honey
1 tablespoon molasses
¼ tablespoon raisin juice (see note)
1 cup milk
1 cup raisins
¾ water

Note: Soak the raisins in water for 30 minutes before using.

Add the flour, bran, brown sugar, salt, baking soda, cinnamon and cornstarch in the mixing bowl. Dry-blend the ingredients thoroughly.

Add the salad oil and eggs and mix until smooth.

Add the water, honey, molasses, raisin juice and milk to the mix and incorporate these ingredients thoroughly.

Add the raisins and water. Mix well.

Bake in cupcake tins at 375 degrees for 20 minutes. Enough batter for 2 ½ dozen 2-ounce muffins.

AWREY KARAT CAKE

Makes 2 Large (9-inch-by-8-inch) Rectangular Cakes (16 Servings)

1 cup granulated sugar
2 eggs
¾ cup salad oil
1 ¼ cup all-purpose flour
1 ¼ teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 ¼ teaspoons salt
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 ¼ cup grated carrots
¼ cup crushed pineapple

Mixing Directions: Beat sugar, eggs and salad oil till light (on high speed for 4 minutes). Sift flour, baking powder, soda, cinnamon and salt. Add to above, mix on medium speed for 5 minutes.

Add grated carrots and pineapple, mix only till incorporated.

Empty batter into greased, rectangular pans. Bake for 30 minutes at 360 degrees or until cake springs back when depressed lightly with a finger. Let cakes cool in pan.

Cream Cheese Frosting

¼ cup cream cheese
¼ cup margarine
1 ¼ cup confectioners' sugar

Mix cream cheese and margarine together, cream till light. Add confectioners' sugar, cream till fluffy.

Frost cake in pan, sprinkle lightly with pecan pieces. Chill before serving for ease of cutting and best flavor.

MOLASSES COOKIE DOUGH

1 ¼ cups graham cracker crumbs
1 ¼ cups granulated sugar
2 tablespoons milk
1 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon baking powder
2 tablespoons baking soda
1 teaspoon allspice
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon cloves
1 egg white
1 cup shortening
¼ cup water
¼ cup molasses
6 cups flour

Add the sugar, milk, salt, baking powder, baking soda, allspice, cinnamon, cloves and egg whites, blend into the graham cracker crumbs.

Mix for 1 minute on low speed. Add the shortening and mix for 1 minute on low speed.

Add the liquid, mix on low speed. Add the flour and blend in.

Bake at 370 degrees for 14-16 minutes.

Yield: recipe makes 4 pounds dough and 6-8 dozen cookies.





Three of country music's top stars have been recruited to host "The 26th Annual Academy of Country Music Awards" Wednesday, April 24, on NBC. Clint Black, Kathy Mattea and George Strait will emcee the gala, which is the granddaddy of all country awards programs.

Scheduled to perform are Strait, Mattea, Garth Brooks, Reba McEntire, The Judds and The Kentucky HeadHunters. All are nominated for awards. Strait, Brooks and McEntire will vie for entertainer of the year honors; Mattea is a top-female vocalist nominee; The Judds will compete for vocal duet honors.

Also nominated for entertainer of the year is the inveterate Dolly Parton. Parton, incidentally, has teamed up with Ray Benson, head of the Grammy-winning band Asleep at the Wheel, for the new NBC movie filming in Austin, Texas.

Taking the Kentucky HeadHunters to task in the top vocal group category will be Alabama, vying for its sixth award, Restless Heart, The Desert Rose Band and Shenandoah.

Sadly, the biggest occurrence Wednesday may be the last performance of The Judds. The mother-daughter team shocked the music world last fall after a tearful Country Music Awards ceremony when they announced Naomi Judd is suffering from Chronic hepatitis.

"Our life is a soap opera," Wynona, the younger Judd, has said. To be sure, The Judds have trod a rocky road paved only in recent years by Grammy success.

Naomi Judd was born the daughter of a filling station owner and a housewife in the small town of Ashland, Ky. She rarely remembers her parents ever going out by themselves. Their children were their lives, said Naomi, and "we were the Waltons." Things changed when she was 17 and her 15-year-old brother,

Brian, was diagnosed with cancer. Much of the Judd's time was spent on the road seeking treatment for their son. Meanwhile Naomi was left home to attend school and care for her younger siblings.

The death of Brian ultimately tore the Judd family apart. To escape the tension at home, Naomi married a local boy named Mike Ciminella. The week of her high school graduation, she gave birth to Wynona.

Although she "loved motherhood," Naomi said she "hated marriage." After the birth of her second daughter, Ashley, she divorced her husband.

What followed was a long train of jobs (she worked two or three at a time to support her girls), three moves from coast to coast and back

Sherilyn Fenn of 'Twin Peaks' is rising to top screen-dream status
