

STATE LAND ON SEVEN MILE To be donated and sold

Northville Township would pay the state \$1 for 16 acres of rolling, tree-lined property along Seven Mile Road as part of a complex deal struck late Thursday.

State and township officials also tentatively agreed to raise population caps at Scott Correctional Facility. ensure permanent closure of another prison, and move nearly 100 acres of state land onto township tax rolls.

The state's desperate need for prison space clinched the Northville Township deal, which will allow Scott Correctional's inmate population to increase from approximately 550 to 860 in a double-bunking strategy.

The plan apparently satisfies a federal consent order to provide improved facilities for prison inmates. The state presently pays a \$10,000 daily fine as part of the consent order, and could save \$4 million by year's

Thursday's announcement capped a week of intense negotiations and pleased local officials. "I think it's a win-win situation for the State of Michigan and Northville Township," Supervisor Georgina Goss said.

The plan is contingent upon state House and Senate approval and Gov.

John Engler's blessing.
The state Office of Management and Budget also must approve the plan and the state attorney general's office must okay modifications to a consent agreement between the state and Northville Township, township attorney Ernest Essad said.

Approval may not be as imposing as it sounds. The deal was cut with assurances that it was workable, Es-

The deal will be done very quickly ... that's the indication from the state people," he said.

City council interviews six for post

The city council had interviewed six of eight final candidates for Northville's new city manager by Thursday night, and in the process got a firsthand glimpse at several different management styles.

The six finalists currently or most recently served as managers or administrators in Lake Orion, Belleville, South Lyon, Huntington Woods, Springfield and Grand Ledge. The candidates were drawn from a

field of 95 applicants from across the country, with resumes being sent from as far as Alaska, California and Massachusetts.
The council will complete its inter-

views Tuesday, and whittle the field down further within the next week.

The new manager will replace 17-year veteran Steve Walters, who agreed in February to become Plymouth's new city manager. Walters cited his desire for new challenges on a larger scale in his decision to leave Northville for Plymouth. He plans to leave Northville May 24, and Assessor Mark Christiansen has been appointed acting city manager until a replacement is selected.

The new manager is being offered a alary between \$50,000 and \$60,000 annually. The council is seeking a person with a master's degree in public administration, at least five years' experience in general management, "and proven leadership in financial management, labor relations, planning and community development."

Walters earned an annual salary of \$61,380 and a \$3,000 car allowance as Northville's manager, and will earn \$66,000 and a \$4,800 car

allowance in Plymouth. Here are excerpts from the interviews conducted so far:

JOHN D. BERCHTOLD, 37 Village Manager, Lake Orion, MI 1990 population of 3,057

Berchtold cited as managerial strengths his "extensive experience as a city manager of five communities," and his skills "as a generalist in administration with a forte in problem solving and interpersonal

Other strengths include practice in joint services programs with Orion Township, experience in historic preservation and renovation, and experience in negotiating union contracts.

Berchtold, who served as village administrator of Wolverine Lake for four years before Lake Orion, told the city council, "I'm not unfamiliar with the (Northville) area at all . . . so I would bring to Northville some of my strong Oakland County experience as well as contacts.

Berchtold said he would be active in community affairs as well.

"In my particular situation, the manager is the chief spokesman for the community, by tradition and agreement, he said.

As far as budget crises are con-cerned, Berchtold cited his experiences as city superintendent of Harbor Beach between 1980-1983. When I went to Harbor Beach, I

found there were a number of committed obligations that exceeded budgeted revenues, and . . . we were not receiving state-shared revenues from the State of Michigan. So we corrected that situation by a number of things - layoffs, we went to an emergency freeze in purchasing where purchasing was so centralized that everything literally went through me, and we also looked at cost containment in union agreements. We had 25 full-time employees;

we laid off five . . . We turned that around so that by the time I left in 1983 we had a strong fund balance. though some of those employees may still not have been replaced."

Berchtold compared Northville to Lake Orion, a 100-year-old village on M-24 north of Pontiac. "We're working on downtown revitalization, similar to what you've already accomplished here in Northville," he said. We have a Downtown Development Authority, TIFA (Tax Increment Financing Authority) district which realizes about \$400,000 a year, and the community, in my mind, is heading toward that of a white-collar, soft suburban community where the people live in the community and commute to Detroit and elsewhere."

Meeting slated on McDonald's

One last look before the burgers start to fry.

That's the scenario facing the township planning commission at 7:30 this evening when McDonald's Restaurants presents its Six Mile/ Haggerty final site-plan request.

Planners are expected to approve grudgingly - the fast food giant's restaurant plan that since October sparked a generous helping of resi-

Township planning consultant WBDC has recommended final site plan approval and planning commissioners likely have delayed the inevitable as long as possible.

The proposed restaurant is slated to be built just west of the Standard Federal Bank building on the south side of Six Mile Road.

A traffic impact study — in the past a major sticking point — is no longer an issue. Parking, lighting and access issues have been addressed,

questions.

And commission-adopted zoning changes were too little, too late. WBDC has placed stipulations on

its approval recommendation, including a dictum that the developer make county-required improvements to Haggerty Road prior to occupancy.

McDonald's will also be required to

build a sidewalk along Six Mile, submit replacement costs for three protected trees that will be destroyed,

as have vehicle-circulation and modify its landscape plan.

Trial date set for Shores dispute

Beleagured Shores of Northville developer Vincent Dilorenzo and a firm he heads face criminal charges in 35th District Court July 16.

Attorneys for DiLorenzo and D & T Construction of Mt. Clemens on Friday requested a jury trial after a last-minute settlement between the developer and prosecutors dissolved.

The state Department of Natural Resources alleges DiLorenzo and D & T failed to apply for and obtain necessary permits when developers began reclamation work on the proposed 400-acre Shores of Northville subdivision.

DNR officials allege the developers violated the state Inland Lakes and Stream Act in the spring of 1990. The alleged violation is punishable by fines up to \$10,000 daily.

Prosecutors and DiLorenzo attorneys met Friday for more than two hours in an attempt to ham-

mer out a settlement and avoid a trial A settlement could not be reached, and the parties appeared before Judge James Garber in a scheduled pre-trial exam that had been adjourned in March and April.

Garber told DiLorenzo attorney Michael Sugameli that the defendant's decision to go with a jury trial ended the chance for a settlement. "If I schedule a jury trial, there will be no plea," he said. That's the end of it . . . there will be no

disposition of (this) case. "I want to make that crystal clear," Garber said. Garber then rejected Sugameli's request to de-

lay the trial 90 days. 'I'm losing my patience on this matter," Garber

said. "Let's get it taken care of."
Assistant Wayne County Prosecutor Reilly Wilson said efforts to reach a settlement with Di-Lorenzo and his agents were fruitless.

We've not been able to agree on a disposition to the court," he said. "There will be no concessions from the prosecutor's office from now on.

"(He) can plead guilty as charged," Wilson said. Neither Wilson nor Sugameli would comment on terms of the proposed settlement.

"As far as a plea bargain, a lot of things were discussed," Sugameli said. "Unfortunately, it could not be resolved." Sugameli said he will present a motion to dis-

miss individual criminal charges against Sugameli said DiLorenzo continues to pursue a

restoration plan for Sump Drain, the tiny, diverted creek on Shores property that eroded and caused considerable on-site and neighboring property damage.

But DNR official David Pingel said DiLorenzo has not presented a restoration plan since the DNR rejected a March 18 overture.

Pingel said he had no idea when Sump Drain and surrounding erosion damage would be repaired.

"I can't answer that," he said. "The DNR is not obligated to (help the developer with a repair



Poppy campaign this week

The annual Poppy Campaign to benefit veterans and their families runs this Thursday through Saturday.

The American Legion Auxiliary Unit 147 of Northville sponsors the campaign, in which voluntary donations are exchanged for paper poppies. Campaign organizers ask that donors wear their poppies as a remembrance for veterans.

As part of the local observance, the American Legion Auxiliary sponsored a coloring contest in which local students colored a drawing of a

poppy. The results may be seen in the windows of the post, 100 W. Dunlap.

The symbol of the paper poppy derives from real popples which grew wild on the battlefields of Flanders. The flower became a symbol of sacrifice to the American soliders in World War I. The poem "In Flander's Fields" by John McCrae commemorates the symbol.

Northville Mayor Christopher Johnson has officially proclaimed May 16-18 as Poppy Days. Following is the text of the declaration:

"Whereas, America is the land of

Whereas, A national at peace must be reminded of the price of war and the debt owed to those who have died in war; and

"Whereas, Red poppy has been designated as a symbol of sacrifice of lives in all wars; and





Berchtold described his management style as one based on feedback and trust. "I'm a strong believer in training," he said. "I believe in looking at all the options, so I'm bound to ask department heads, What do you perceive as solutions to problems? instead of me generating solutions. Although I'm not afraid to come up with answers, I think that's how people grow and I think that's a good coaching technique."

ROBERT D. HERRON JR., 30 City Manager, Believille, MI 1990 population of 3,270

Herron cited as his personal strengths "extensive exposure to the personal and technical aspects of municipal government, along with my familiarity with the demands of being the city manager of a fullservice community."

His application also listed experience in labor relations and computer applications and supervision of community and economic development activities.

"I'm sure, as you well know, a city manager wears a variety of hats," Herron told the council during his

As one of his assignments, Herron said he has taken on the role of over-seer of capital improvements in Belleville due to his position as coordinator and director of the city's Downtown Development Authority.

"In the time that I've been in Belleville, we've spent two to three million (dollars) in capital improvements," he said. The improvements are much needed, he added.

"I think Belleville's downtown is similar to Northville's downtown 10 years ago . . . We've kind of tried to fashion ourselves after Northville and Plymouth," he said. "The Central Business District was severely declining in the 1980s. Since then it's turned around . . . but it's obviously not at the level of Northville."

Describing his management style as "aggressively laid-back," Herron said. "I try to keep the city council as informed as possible . . . but at the same time I'm not afraid to make a recommendation, and I'd hope they trust my recommendation. So far,

The manager is dealing with sim lar issues in Belleville as Northville officials are here, he said.

This year has been a difficult year," he said. "We're wrestling with solid-waste issues -- curbside recycling is in this budget, as is a com-

posting program."

When he became Belleville's manager, Herron said, police grievances were a common occurrence. A new contract he helped negotiate has eliminated many of the underlying problems. The first thing I had to do when I

got to Owosso was go to all the labor unions — there were five of them and get them to agree to concessions.

His greatest success. Allie said. was "bringing the town back economically." The process involved an ex-tensive five-year capital improvement program. We put almost a \$7-million program in front of the voters — new roads, new sidewalks and streetlighting — just a major facelift for the city, and it passed by a two-to-one margin.

Allie said the relationship between the council and manager is crucial to

the city.
"I have always put my highest priority on the relationship between the city manager and city council," he said. "I think the levels of communication are going to either make or break this system of government." Allie described himself as involved

in the communities where he works. The manager also cited extensive experience in communicating with the media. "My relationship with the press has always been very open," he said. "I never attempt to hide any-

thing from the press. Allie described a city's budget as "probably the most important tool and document the city has in terms of carrying out a plan." To help define and guide a city's budget plan, "one of the things I do is define a five-year forecast with every budget," he said.

Allie considers such forecasts crucial to the long-term financial stability of a city: "I think the cities that are in the most financial difficulty right now are the ones that were not looking ahead, that were just doing what it took to get by," he said.

MILFORD A. MELLON, 48 Former City Manager, Springfield, MI 1990 population of 5,582

Mellon's application lists his 14 years of experience as chief administrative officer in city government, and his preparation and administration of budgets, problem solving, policy development, public and labor relations, and planning as qualificamanager. Mellon cited economic develop-

"I got into the manager business kind of by the back door," he told the city council. Mellon served as city clerk and city assessor from 1973-1976 in Grant, MI, before serving as city superintendent of Bridgman, MI and city administrator of Franklin, Wisc.

Agreement with state great news for town

Expect to see a lot of smiles around Northville Township Hall this week. Big. ear-to-ear, Cheshire-Cat type smiles. There's good reason for them.

Using the state's prison overcrowding problems as leverage, Northville Township managed to cut a deal which will, all in all, do good things for the community. Very good things.

The key to the deal: Township officials agreed to allow double-bunking of prisoners at Scott Regional Correctional Facility on Five Mile Road. The corrections department uses double-bunking as common practice at prisons around the state, but Northville Township's corrections facilities - Scott and the justclosed Phoenix complex - have been exempt (most of the time) from this practice under a court order limiting populations at the buildings.

The township has now agreed, however, to let the state double-bunk when . Scott switches to a women's facility. The population limit will be the same as the combined limits of Scott and Phoenix; in other words, the net number of prisoners allowed to be held in Northville Township will remain at the level at which it has been for the last few years.

In return for that concession, plus a token \$1, the township will get:

- A promise that the state will tear down the Phoenix complex and sell off the land, 30-35 acres, for private development --- thereby losing an unsightly prison complex and eventually getting valuable land onto the township tax rolls. In addition, the state pledges not to build any new prison tacilities within the township.
- The sale of another 50-some acres of state-owned land immediately on the valuable corner of Haggerty and Seven Mile, providing an even better boon to the tax base of the township and the school district.
- An outright donation of 16 acres of land on Seven Mile just east of the state police post. It's a nice piece of land which may be used for much-needed soccer fields or other recreational purchases. Whatever it's used for, it must remain under township ownership.

Sound like a good deal? It is.

In contrast to the controversial Haller property donation, this deal has no future strings attached. It's all worked out.

There are some approval hoops through which the township and the state need to jump — for example, the whole shot requires the approval of the state Legislature and the governor. The obstacles might seem large, but key players in putting together this deal don't seem worried. There have been enough assurances passed around that everyone feels comfortable in the plan's ultimate approval.

So who's to thank for all this? Well. lots of people, including everyone who pushed for the court judgments establishing prison-population caps; Susan Heintz, the Northville Township resident who now heads up Gov. John Engler's regional office; Township Supervisor Georgina Goss; and assorted other officials at local and state levels.

What they all managed to work out is an agreement which means nothing but good news for the Northville community. The only down side to the deal, for anyone, involves the Department of Natural Resources, which has apparently lost the site of its long-planned new district headquarters. But with current economic conditions and even uncertainty over what the DNR's structure will be in the future, those plans were so far off as to be irrelevant.

Under the new deal, both Northville and the state get things they desperately want. Winners all the way around, and no real losers; it's the kind of deal which makes politicians drool. And the kind, when it's accomplished, that makes them smile. Big smiles.



lowing provisions:

 Northville Township will allow the state to bypass population caps at Scott Correctional. Under terms of the new plan, the state would house approximately 860 female inmates at Scott. The present male inmate population stands at just under 550.

- Phoenix Correctional Facility would be closed permanently, razed in the near future and declared surplus. The property would then be placed on the open market. Approximately 30-35 acres would revert to township tax rolls.
- No new prison facilities could be built in Northville Township.

 The state would sell the township 16 acres between the Michigan State Police Post and Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital for about five cents an acre. The property includes 600 feet of Seven Mile Road frontage and extends south approximately 1,100 feet in a rectangular shape. The property is to be used for public

 Approximately 50-60 acres of state property between the state hospital and Haggerty Road on Seven Mile is to be declared surplus and placed on the open market.

In effect, the township will receive the 16 acres for public use, will benefit from additional taxable land, loses a prison from its back yard, and restricts further prison construction.

But the township will not witness overall hikes in its prison population due to the Phoenix closing, Essad

"Actually, it's a net reduction in prisoners," Essad said. "We're basically giving up double-bunking (restrictions)," Goss said.





Calif. vintner develops new tool for success

California winemakers have what it takes to make great wine. They are the best-educated winemakers in the world. They have the best technology, and they have the money to purchase the high-tech equipment required.

At present, increased quality of California wine is a result of improved vineyard techniques (viticulture) rather than winemaking skills (viniculture). As many California producers contend,

Wine is made in the vineyard."

One of the leaders in this viticultural revolution is Robert Pepi Winery in Napa Valley. Pepi is a specialist in sauvignon blanc production. He attributes the success of his wine to what he has learned in the vineyard.

"Herbaceous, grassy sauvignon blanc is a result of uncontrolled vegetative vigor," Pepi explains. Excessive vine growth prevents direct sun expo sure on the fruit and reduces air flow through the vine that helps balance the fruit."

Sauvignon Blanc grapes that are shaded from the sun do not ripen completely, giving a vegetable rather than fruit character to the wine. To improve sun exposure and air flow, Pepi has

developed a new vine-trellising system that he calls the "Two-Heart Canopy." The canopy is a term for the upper vine and leaves that shade the fruit from the sun. Pepi has divided the canopy by separating the trunk of the vine into two major branches that

are trained upward in a wishbone design, as if each vine is split in two. This method opens the canopy and exposes the fruit to direct sunlight. The wide trellis is the single most important factor to us viticulturally," Pepi says. "It's not only

giving us better quality fruit, but it is enabling us to directly style the wine in the vineyard. "Allowing more filtered sunlight to have direct contact with the fruit affects the development of the floral, perfumed, citrusy aroma and flavor elements of sauvignon blane with the elimination of one-dimensional herbaceousness so common in

the variety. The wide trellis system can be described as a stake with a four-foot cross arm at the top. Consider the head of the vine as a "Y" that is split in two, then every vine has two heads and four

"We're trying to achieve as much complexity in aroma and flavor as possible without any mark-edly assertive character dominating," Pepi explains. "Essentially, we're striving for a style that showcases the best qualities of a white Bordeaux and, therefore, blend with just under 20 percent semillon, an amount that adds complexity, viscosity and body without being obvious or dominating.
"We don't want a lot of oak in our sauvignon

blanc. In addition to flavors developed through our training and trellising system, we age sauvignon blanc in large, five-year-old oak casks. This helps us achieve oak subtlety as well as providing a place for the flavors to marry."

The wine's crisp, clean lines make it a perfect accompaniment for grilled tuna or swordfish garnished with a fresh pepper and tomato salsa.

1986 Robert Pepi "Vine Hill Ranch" Cabernet Sauvignon, Napa Valley (\$2,5). Cassis and blackberry aromas are accompanied by a note of cedar and eucalyptus. MISSING LINKS Sausages make comeback with big flavor

Modern sausage makers are trimming the fat and calories out of their products these days and even coming up with vegetarian and poultry versions.

Pork sausage is still available, of course, but today it's becoming a flavoring agent, rather than the main

In fact, flavor is the key aspect for today's sausage makers. Schoolcraft College's culinary arts department took great pride in the flavor of sausages made from scratch by its students.

"Flavor is very important," said Chef John Vanderwouw, who taught in the meat-cutting department at Schoolcraft, and is now chef of the Embassy Suites hotel in Livonia. "We were very successful in tastings."

In addition to traditional pork sausages and breakfast links and patties, Schoolcraft students produced Italian and Polish varieties. More challenging varieties included veal, poultry and even fish sausages.

Vanderwouw said the way to best perk up the flavor of sausage was the use of fresh herbs.

We don't use the dehydrated products," he said. They're the main flavoring agents. They can be very impressive if handled in the proper manner, but overuse can spoil the product too. It should just be a taste." Cutting fat from sausage has also

become an important goal. People are very conscious of fat structures and cholesterol," said Vanderwouw. "We have cut down on

fat content. Some products need some, but we try to be careful. Instead of 20 percent fat we'll cut it to

"If you (are) careful with the production you don't need the fat, but you can't overdo it or you end up with

a dry product."

Chef Richard Benson added that Schoolcraft's students, as future restaurant chefs, could use techniques commercial producers could not. Over in England they make a

sausage with spices and oatmeal, but they also put ice in with the meat when they grind it," Benson seid. The ice makes some moisture in it, but because of the regulations, you can't sell it in stores here. You can do it if you make it and sell it in your own restaurant."

Other helpful hints for home sausage making come from self-taught sausage expert Bruce Aidells, an author who has devoted a couple of decades to learning about and refining the sausage-making process, and how to make it and cook with it.

To what does he attribute the rising popularity of the hearty links? sausage is a lot leaner than it used to be, and that fits the current lifestyle. Taste is really important to-

day, too." Aidells said. He added that the food style 'nouvelle cuisine" is just about dead. He concurs with the Schoolcraft experts who said great taste is what

matters, rather than pretty looks. Originally, Aidells planned to make just one kind of sausage, the spicy andouille that goes so well with

Sausage expert Bruce Aidells is lso sausage-cooking expert Bruce Aidells. Whether you make your own or buy them commercially, here are some of his tips.

Aidells pan-fries raw sausage in a dry, heavy skillet over medium heat. His method: put sausages into a cold pan, cover and cook them in their own juices, turning them until they are browned on all sides. This should take 10 to 15 minutes, depending on the thick-

ness of the sausages.
When pan-frying smoked sausages, add about 1/4 -inch of water to the skillet to help soften the casings. Cover and cook until liquid evaporates. Continue to cook until the sausages are evenly browned, about 10 minutes. GRILLING

Grill them raw or precook them by poaching in hot water for 15 to 20 minutes for sausages in medium casings. To grill sausages directly over a charcoal fire, he says it's a good idea to pre-poach them to reduce the amount of fat that will drip onto the fire and flare up.

Aidells prefers to cook poached sausages in a covered kettle-style barbecue, turning them frequently until they are evenly browned, which takes seven to 12 minutes. depending on the diameter of the sausages and how hot the coals are. The internal temperature of the sausages should reach 155 to 160 degrees when measured by inserting an instant-read thermometer 2 to 3 inches into the end of a

Don't use extremely hot coals, which can cause excessive flaming and will burn the outside of the sausages before the inside is

The secret to grilling sausages, according to Aidells, is to turn them frequently as they cook to ensure even browning.

POACHING

The trick to poaching sausages is to cook them very gradually so that the moisture stays in the sausage and they don't become too dry. This is why Aidells doesn't re-commend pricking the sausages

To peach 3 pounds of link sausage, bring 2 to 3 gallons of lightly salted water to a temperature of 180 to 200 degrees. An accurate intsant-read thermometer is useful here. The water should not be polling

Put the sausages in the hot water and poach them over very low heat. The water should stay between 160 and 180 degrees. Depending on the thickness of the sausages, they will take 15 to 40 minutes to cook to an internal temperature of 155 to 160 degrees.

Remove the sausages and serve at once or cool in a colander under cold running water and refrigerate or freeze. Reheat later by pan frying, grilling or poaching.

Our salad days are fast returning

With the warm weather soon to be here, many of us will eat lighter, cooler meals. Salads can be the answer to a heat wave or bikini alert.

Nearly all foods may be incorporated into a salad. The most common, of course, are lettuces and raw vegetables. With the addition of meats, cheeses, fish and fruits, salads become main courses, appetizers or desserts. Salad ingredients must be fresh, crisp and appealing. And, we hope, healthful.

The variety of greens and associated components are almost endless. Alfalfa sprouts, tiny sprouts with a grassy flavor, Belgian endive, slightly bitter small spear-like heads: red or green cabbage; escarole, also known as broad leaf endive; Chinese nara cabbage, mild, delicate and crisp; red or green leaf lettuce, tender and rich; radiochio, bright red wild chicory with a slightly bitter taste; romaine, the caesar salad stand-by; watercress, bibb, spinach, and the very common iceberg are a few of the selections available in local supermarkets and farmers' markets.

Carefully inspect each type of lettuce before purchasing. Crisp, tender, unblemished are key qualities. If lettuce is not be prepared at once layer in paper towels, moistened if the leaves seem unusually dry. Refrigerate in a drawer or plastic bag.

Remove all limp or unusable leaves before use. Cut the stem or core off lettuce before washing and separate leaves into a bowl of cold water. Swish to loosen any dirt and allow to sit several minutes so the grit will settle to the bottom. For unusually dirty leaves wash as many times as needed. Remove to a salad spinner and dry.

An alternative is to roll wet leaves between stored after washing, layer between paper leach out vitamins and minerals so it is important not to let the leaves sit in water for any longer than necessary. Cut or tear into bite-sized pieces just before mixing.

Cooked or raw vegetables are naturals for salads. Mushrooms, oucumbers, peppers, radishes, zucchini, tomatoes and onions need not be cooked. Wash and dry carefully. Tomatoes and cukes should be peeled. As paragus, broccoli, cauliflower, peas, beans and leeks can be cooked and used in salads. Cook to a crunch in lightly salted water. Shock immediately in ice water, dry and store under refrigeration until ready for use. It is desirable to marinate cooked veget-

clean towels but the spinning method is far superior. Wet leaves wilt when stored and dilute a salad dressing. If lettuce must be towels for a day or two at most. Water will

ables in the salad dressing to be used for several hours before serving. Drain, reserving dressing for use on the salad, before tossing together. The marination process adds flavor to the vegetables. Most meat and scafood that is used in salads should be cooked, cut into different sizes and shapes and marinated before combining with the greens and vegetables. This is an excellent way to use

Marinades and dressings are integral parts of a salad too. Marinating means to steep foods, such as meat, vegetables and fish, in an acid to preserve and flavor. Dressing is as its name implies - a coating used to enhance the flavor and appearance of a

Robust salads call for thick dressings, delicate salads for light dressings. The ingredients of dressings are acids, such as vinegars and citrus juices, and oils, such as olive, safflower, peanut, sesame and walnut. In general, acids add tang and oils add flavor.

Tofu or fruit and vegetable purees can be used to replace some or all of the oil to reduce fat. Taste and smell your oil before using to assure it it fresh and not rancid. Extra-virgin olive oil is the best to buy for dressings. The price tag is higher but the wonderful flavor

Do not use the expensive olive oil for cooking; it is just a waste. A pure or virgin oil is fine for sauteing and regular cooking.

Other special oils are often potent in small quantities. Taste them before using and mix with unflavored oils to dilute. Only buy the amount you will use over a three-month pertod and store in a cool, dark place.

The types of vinegars range from cider to wine to fruit. Flavored vinegars will add their particular essence to the salad. A good wine vinegar is universal in its use. I make my own from leftover red wine added to a crock with a red "mother" working away. Nothing can

Fresh citrus juices can be used as an alter native to vinegars. Fresh is best. Vinaigrettes are made with vinegar of juice or a combination of both and oil. Herbs, garlic and shallots can be added for a different taste sensation. Standard portions are three parts of oil to one part of acid. I recommend a bit more oil to cut the acidic bite. Toss delicate green salads just before serving. Be aware of the amounts of dressing you use. 1-2 tablespoons per serving prevents the "drowning" effect. Too much dressing wilts a salad and is a waste and it is put down the drain.

breakfast debate continues.

Many use the excuse that there just isn't enough time in the morning to fix breakfast or that they're trying to cut calories and will just skip the morning meal. But skipping break-fast often leads to tripping up throughout the day.

Gourmet business going great guns

In just a year, Elaine Houlihan's gourmet food line has grown. Based in a state-of-the-art commercial kitchen in Auburn Hills, Houlihan's **Culinary Traditions now includes 10** fruit preserves, three Italian herbed olive oils and an Italian bread dipping sauce, along with the gourmet applesauce which introduced her to the gourmet world.

Bloomfield Hills resident Houlihan admits she has never attended professional cooking or chef's classes, but she has been cooking most of her life. Inspired by her maternal grandmother, who was born north of Rome, Elaine - or Elena Houlihan as she is known to her family — was making pasta and rolling potato gnocchi by hand at the age of 4. Her fondest memories about growing up in upstate New York focus on the Italian culinary traditions — canning or preserving tomato sauce, making homemade pasta and putting up fresh fruit, preserves and especially applesauce made from a variety of apples near her home in Cortland.

Houlihan, who was professionally trained as a psychologist, said, "Ive always loved to cook and for years wanted to do something in the culinary field." With the support and encouragement of her husband, she left a position in business imaging, which she held for a number of years with Eastman Kodak, to research Houlihan's Culinary Traditions.

A year later, in October 1989, she moved into a commercial kitchen. After researching the market for a year, there was no question in her mind that a gourmet applesauce and gourmet toddler applesauce was going to be her initial product. After selecting a source for the finest Michigan Em-· i pire apples, Houlihan tested and retested the final formula.

Six months later she perfected a recipe for Elena's Bread-Dipping Sauce, an idea reminiscent of her grandmother's sauce that was served table accompanied by crunchy Ita-: lian bread to munch on until the meal was ready.

"It's a zesty tomato sauce, absolutely like my family recipe," Houli-. han said. Along with the dipping sauce, three herbed olive oils were added to the line. Unlike other flavored olive oils, these extra-virgin Italian olive oils are blended with

The oil blends are sauces designed to be tossed with freshly cooked pasta. I wanted to make a simple sauce that could flavor pasta quickly, in 10 minutes."

"The oil blends are sauces designed to be tossed with freshly cooked pasta. I wanted to make a simple sauce that could flavor pasta quickly, in 10 minutes," she said. "I didn't see any herbed oils in the market and realized how few people know how to season pasta with herbs

Three months after marketing the oils, Houlihan experimented with Michigan fruits and created 10 fruit preserves. Her marketing talents were put to good use designing labels and naming the preserves after American cities which provided the inspiration — Traverse City Tart Cherry, Atlanta Peach and New York Apple Raspberry, to name a few.

All the preserves are made in small, 40-quart batches. They are hand-stirred and hand bottled. Every batch is numbered and logged by each kitchen employee before

Just bring up the subject of preserves and Houlihan responds with pride, "There is an art to making pre-Writing the recipe is only part of the job, she added. You must check the ph levels, make sure each batch has the correct amount of pectin because different crops have a wing amount of eugar content.

Most of Houlihan's Culinary Traditions can be found locally at Get Sauced, in Trappers Alley, Detroit; all three Merchant of Vino shops (Birmingham, Southfield and Troy) the Market Basket, Franklin; the Quar-ton Market, Birmingham; Muffins and More, Birmingham, and Neiman Marcus, Chicago.

"I just got homesick for sausage," he said. "I decided to make my own."

Aidells, who said he originally learned to cook by watching Julia Child on television, had little more than a copy of one of Child's books when he decided to make homemade sausage. He used a meat grinder and tried a basic recipe. It took him and a friend only an hour to mix the ingredients but another eight hours to stuff the casings by

We were up all night trying to get the stuff together before it spoiled."

The transition from cancer research to making

After working at the National Institutes of Health in Washington, D.C., he decided he didn't like that kind of work and did like cooking.

"I was really into cooking. I thought I was a better cook than a scientist. I wasn't going to win the Nobel Prize or anything."

His new book, Hot Links and Country Flavors (Knopf, \$19.95), is for the home sausage-maker and the consumer who just likes to eat sausage. The book is the latest in the series Knopf Cooks

While southern courses are searing in 100 degree temperatures, in Northwest

Michigan courses are green and beautiful. The temperate weather and generous smattering of lakes, streams and ponds on or near the courses (along with modern greenskeeping equipment) keep them in top condition from April to October.

At A-Ga-Ming Golf Club, the number one hole gives golfers a panoramic view of beautiful Torch Lake, Located nine miles north of Elk Rapids in hilly Antrim County, A-Ga-Ming gets its name from the Chippewa Indiana and literally means "beside the water."

A-Ga-Ming's tight fairways require carefully placed shots and golfers need a great deal of concentration to keep from being distracted by the course' exceptional scenery. Hardwood and pine forests, cherry orchards, gently rolling hills and the beautiful blues of torch Lake make the course an excellent choice for a relaxing golf outing.

Nestled in the hills and pine forests 36 miles northwest of Cadillac, Crystal Mountain Resort offers a unique layout and choice of tees to assure that no two holes play alike. Architect Robert Meyer designed the 6,414-yard, par 72 course so that no two fairways were parallel and sprinkled the back nine with numerous water hazards.

The Bear, designed by Jack Nicklaus for Grand Traverse Resort, is a challenging championship course that ofers great diversity and a Scottish flavor in a northern Michigan setting. Nicklaus' signature hole number thirteen is completely surrounded by hardwoods and water, with five deep bunkers around the green. The 7,065-yard, par 72 course, allows golfers to play The Bear in the morning and spend the afternoon on the Resort Course. Equally

challenging, the 6,741-yard, par 72 Resort Course, with frequent ponds and traps that demand a golfer's close attention, has many elevated tees with an excellent view of Grand Traverse Bay.

Grand Traverse Resort is a Golf magazine silver medalist and the Bear has consistently been chosen as one of the top 100 resort courses by Golf Digest.

East of Traverse City, High Pointe Golf Club's championship course features wide, rolling fairways and is one of only two courses in the country using fescue grass on fairways and greens. Golf Digest has named High Pointe one of "America's 75 Best Public Courses." Golf Magazine lists High Pointe as one of their "Top 10 You can Play" courses.

The Tom Doak-designed course plays similar to British courses, allowing golfers to bounce and roll their shots when approaching the open greens. The young, gifted architect chose a unique design for the 6,819-yard course with the front nine holes an open links style and the back nine an increasingly, popular series of par four holes that require long tee shots onto wide fairways.

On the east side of "America's Summer Golf Capital" near Gaylord is Wilderness Valley, where golfers can enjoy a quiet setting without noisy traffic sounds and may spot some of the wildlife that frequent the area. Deer, wild turkey, raccoons and other wildlife abound on the 6,485-yard, par 71 course with narrow fairways and large greens. Wilderness Valley's appeal to golfers will be enhanced this summer with the new 7,115-yard, par 73 Black Forest course, designed by Tom Doak, and scheduled to open in August.

Fast greens, thick fairways and lots of water are the offering at McGuire's Resort Center's Spruce, a 6,133, par 71 course just south of Cadillac. McGuire's golfers can also play the popular and fun Norway, a nine-hole, 2,792, par 36 course that offers lots of hilly terrain.

Rolling hills with vertical drops as long as

180 feet challenge even the most skilled golfer on the Legend at Shanty Creek-Schuss Mountain Resort, near Bellaire. Designed by Arnold Palmer, the Legend has been recognized by golf Digest as one of the country's top 50 resort courses, Shanty's Deskin, designed by William Diddel, is a 6,559-yard, par 72 course carved out of orchards and farmland with fairly open play and difficult, but true, greens. The Schuss Mountain Golf Club course is dotted with strategically-placed water hazards and features wide fairways and large, slick greens.

Boyne Mountain and Boyne Highlands are sister resorts that serve up a five-course selection showcasing three championship layouts. The Heather, a 7,218-yard, par 92 course with challenging narrow fairways and undulating greens, has been named in Golf digest's Top 100 every year since 1971. The course was designed by Robert Trent Jones, Sr.

and is located at Boyne Highlands in Harbor Springs.

The newest course at the Highlands is the Donald Ross Memorial Course. The 6,840-yard, par 72 course features exact duplications of 18 of the famed architect's great holes from the best Donald Ross courses in the U.S. and abroad. Golf Magazine lists the Ross as one of the world's Top 10 new courses to play.

Boyne Highlands tops off its golf offering with the Moors, a 7,179-yard, par 72 course that is both beautiful and challenging.

Boyne Mountain, located just off U.S. 131 near Boyne Falls, offers the equally beautiful Alpine, a 7,017-yard, par 72 course with generous fairways and scenic view of Deer Lake. The Monument is a hilly course and site of the unique island hole, number eighteen, dubbed by Sam Snead as "one of the most intimidating golf holes anywhere.





Oakland Hills, site of eight major golf championships, once again plays host to a premier tournament when the U.S. Senior Open returns to the famed South Course, July 25-28, as the suburban Detroit country club celebrates its 75th anniversary year.



Traveling with children? Pray they grow up fast

OXYMORON: It means two words that contradict one another, like "military intelligence." Some people think that "family vacation" is an oxymoron. How can you enjoy yourself when two wild animals are wrestling in the back seat of your car?

Remember the old Agatha Christie thriller Murder on the Orient Express? The one I have in mind would have a less exotic title: Murder in the Back Seat of the Car. If it was a newspaper headline it might read Parents Abandon Child in the Rockies.

If you have ever traveled with children, you are already nodding your head in understanding; I need say no more. If you haven't, I would like to congratulate you.

I have changed diapers at 30,000 feet. I have heard myself yelling: "IF YOU BOYS DON'T STOP FIGHTING, I'M GOING TO STOP THIS CAR." I have watched in despair as they read comic books while we were driving through the world's most spectacular mountain scenery.

And I've learned a few things. The problem is, by the time I figured out what to do with one age level, they got older and I had to start again.

Traveling with babies seems difficult at the time but in retrospect it may be the easiest time to travel with children. If you are flying with small children, fly at night. Eventually they'll go to sleep.

If you are driving with one baby, try to squeeze crib mattress into the back seat. We drove 1800 miles with a month old baby that way and it worked like a charm. But it only works with one child.

We drove regularly across country to see grandparents and soon learned the basic truth about children: they are wild animals, and you should expect them to wrestle. One solution: a box that fit on the back seat between the two boys; play things went into the box and they could play games on the lid.

That works if there are only two of them. I have a friend who has six children and often tells this tale: "We left on our vacation and were six miles from home when we realized that we had left the baby behind." That was long before they made the movie, *Home Alone*.

Camping and cottaging and creative thinking can get you through the early years but eventually you have to start planning your vacation with the kids in mind.

There are two ways to do this. One is to build kid-interests into your everyday planning. Go to the Children's Museum in Indianapolis. While you are in that area, allow time to go to Connor's Prairie, which is fun for both.

The second way is to plan vacations that accommodate both adults and children. The key to this approach is that you pick the right place and you don't plan to spend all your time together. Believe it or not, your kids have the same problem with vacations that you do. Too much togetherness.

Consider the exotic approach. Go to Club Med, which has recognized your problem and now offers Baby Meds and Club Meds for children. Go to Club Med in Eleuthera Bahamas, for example, and your kids will be so busy learning how to swim and windsurf that you may not see them at all.

Try a dude ranch. They can ride, hike, climb, play. You can do any of the above or you can just relax and read that book you've been carrying around for three years.

The essential ingredient of this approach is that you choose a place where you can enjoy yourself without the kids, and the kids can enjoy themselves without the parents, and you can get together regularly enough to keep track of one another.

Consider a three or four day cruise, for example. Or one of those great packages that gives you a few

days at Walt Disney World and a few days aboard a cruise. Unless your children are very small, or old enough to sneak into the disco in the middle of the night, there's not much trouble they can get into on a cruise.

Believe it or not, the day will come when they won't want to travel with you. When your daughter will say "but Mom, I want to work at McDonald's this summer!" You will hear yourself starting to reminisce about the good old days when the kids traveled with you on vacation.



Michigan ecosystem is lumber baron's legacy

Indian River, Michigan-

This is a story about an agency of Michigan government that makes money...lots of it and about an interesting "what if." But first let's talk myths.

As someone once correctly observed, "myths die hard." Take this one, for example: "Michigan pioneers found a land teeming with deer."

Fact is there were far fewer deer in the "olden days" than in 1991. But try telling that to oldtimers and you'll find yourself up to elbows in futile argument. And somebody will drag out a dog-earned photograph of Great Grandpa Henry with the half-dozen bucks he took in one hunting season. "Pictures don't lie."

So none of this is likely to dispel long-held beliefs. But let's look at the evidence anyway.

Most will agree that the trees covering this state at and before the turn of the century were bigger and older. Here in the Tip of the Mitt of Michigan, the predominant tree was the white pine. Huge--four feet or

more in diameter--these pines towered skyward, straight as an arrow. Lots of wildlife inhabited this forest of gigantic trees. Some of the animals included deer. But because deer couldn't reach the juicy needles of the, big, mature white pines and because little food could grow in the shade of the huge trees, the whitetail population was unspectacular.

Lumber barons indiscriminately cut down these giants, made themselves fortunes, and moved on. Behind them lay mile after mile of treeless landscape. From Pellston on US-31 east to Sea Shell City on the I-75 freeway, for example, hardly a tree survived. Just stumps and sandy soil as far as the eye could see.

Farmers moved into this region of inexpensive and now largely treeless land, optimistic that they could wring livelihoods from the soil. But crops don't grow well in sand. And livestock--cows and horses and sheep--found little of the grasses they need to survive. By the 1930s, in the midst of the Great Depression, struggling farmers were unable to pay their taxes and many of them simply let their lands go. The shells of their dreams are found here and there throughout the region.

Which brings us to another myth: that the state forests of Michigan have always been owned by the state. That isn't so. For more than a century, during and after the great logging era, the land was privately owned. It wasn't until the 1930s that the majority of the state forest land came under state ownership--largely through delinquent tax confiscation.

Although the raped landscape of Northern Michigan produced little successful farming, it did give rise to millions of saplings, mostly aspens, which require sunlight to regenerate. New white pine growth simply couldn't compete with the faster-growing aspens. In this environment, deer found food plentiful and their numbers multiplied.

Which brings us to a third myth: that the white pine, the "state tree," grows in the largest numbers in the state. Others say it is the maple. Neither assertion is correct, says Dave Wellman, Department of Natural Resources (DNR) forester of Indian River. "The aspen is by far the Number One tree in Michigan."

Wellman works for the agency that makes money for the state. Last year it is estimated that the Forest Management Division made about \$8 million from the sale of Michigan

Forest land of Michigan is divided into three regions: Region 1 in the Upper Peninsula, Region 2 in Northern Michigan (north of the Saginaw County line), and Region 3 the southern third of the state. Forests in Regions 1 and 2 come under the jurisdiction of the Forest Management Division; Region 3 forests are managed by the Wildlife Division of the DNR. Trees in Region 3 are not

removed for commercial purposes.

Region 2, which includes our Indian River area, contains 1.9 million acres of land. Thirty percent of this acreage is forested.

Region 1 and 2 forests are managed either commercially through the sale of timber or noncommercially for improved wildlife habitat or improved timber production. The DNR does not itself cut and mill timber. It sells this right to private industry through a bid process.

Wellman, like other state foresters, is responsible for determining which trees can and should be harvested. Their decisions are influenced by these objectives -- forest renewal, improved wildlife habitat, improved tree growth, reduction of insect and disease damage, salvage losses, and improved timber production.

Besides selling timber, the Forest Management Division also administers oil-gas-mineral leases. These are the money-making arms of the division. But there are spending arms as well: construction and maintenance of all trails on state land for hiking, cross-country skiing, and snowmobiling, and the management of all forest campgrounds.

With money coming in and going out, the division comes pretty close to breaking even. And when it comes to state government, that's not a bad showing.

Following the great lumbering era at the turn of the century, the aspens took command. Aspens flourished because of the clear-cut (cutting of everything) white pine.

'In order to regenerate, aspen must have lots of sunlight," explains Wellman. "They are intolerant of shade. Regeneration occurs from root sprouting after a tree is harvested. Hundreds of sprouts replace a single harvested tree. So in managing aspens we do indeed practice clear-cutting.

"We also eventually clear-cut red pine but we do it in three or four stages during the 80-90 years until their maturity. We'll begin thinning them about 30 years of age, let them put on a burst of growth over the next 10 years and then selectively mark then for cutting. Then we let them go for another 40 years before clear-cutting.

'On the other hand, if it's a good stand of hardwoods--white ash, bass wood, beech, maple--we very nearly always selectively harvest. We

wouldn't clear-cut them as we will aspens."

Today, the early 20th century aspens are mature; in fact, many are older than ideal for harvesting. All of which presents a special problem for today's foresters. Much of the aspens of the state, which sprouted following the great lumbering era, are well beyond maturity. The older they grow the more they are likely to become diseased and lose their value--commercially or noncommercially. Yet, to clear-cut all of these mature trees at once would devastate the state's forests. So although large numbers are harvested, Forest Management tries to do it in a way that does not destroy the beauty of the forest.

Clear-cutting and aspen regeneration, admits Wellman, is influenced by another not so surprising factor: Michigan's deer population.

Because deer like young aspen forests and because there is heavy pressure within the state for maintenance of a large deer herd, "our (foresters) decisions on what trees should be cut and grown, to be honest, are made in part to please the public and the deer. Industry, frankly, has little influence. We don't say: 'there's a better commercial demand for oak so let's grow oak.' Surprisingly, there seems to be a good market for whatever we happen to be selling. And there's a very good market for the aspens."

Aspens are used for paper products, plywood, particle board, dairy/apiary supplies, pallets, furniture and construction lumber.

Forestry Management Division also is involved in the planting of trees. But not nearly as much as it was back in the 1950s when hundreds of thousands of acres were planted. In those years more trees were planted than cut. That's not the case today, says Wellman, noting the preponderance of aspens at maturity.

"Generally speaking, we try to maintain the same species in an area after harvesting. So if we harvest red pine, we try to replant it with red pine. But that can't be done effectively until all the mature trees are gone because young trees don't grow well in the shade of their adult neighbors. So you're really talking about a 90-year cycle."

Following the fragrance of flowers

You don't have to be a gardener to enjoy flowers, and you don't have to bend and stoop, weed and hoe, spray and pinch back blossoms to enjoy some of the finest perennial beds, the latest bug-free roses and the glory of well-established shrubs. They're all there waiting for you -- in Michigan and Ontario gardens tended by devoted horticulturists, colleges and universities, and even a royal society.

Let's start far afield, in Hamilton, Ontario, and work our way back to southern Michigan. Perhaps it's a personal preference for stupendous roses and a hundred varieties of lilacs that impressed me at the Royal Botanical Gardens, (off Plains Rd. at the northern city limits). Plan to visit the first week of June to catch spring flowers at their finest, but just to be safe, telephone ahead to be sure the particular flowers you're interested in are in blossom: 416-527-1158.

Take sturdy walking shoes, a jacket, and a notepad and pencil, because you'll want to note some varieties to try yourself. The advantage of seeing such a wide variety of roses is that you can view them in all stages of their flowering life, from tight bud to the falling-petal stage. And frankly, some are so untidy in the last stages that you'll want to avoid them. Others are glorious throughout their life - much like some people you may know.

The Spring Garden, with displays of iris, lilies and peonies, is at its best in early June, or maybe late May, depending upon the weather.

The gardens spread over 1000 hectares of an old stone quarry and there's an interpretive center, a tea house, restrooms, and a gift center. Food is served in the summer. There's an admission charge and parking fee.

You may be thinking of avoiding Canada this year due to the new taxes. Don't deprive yourself of this garden as it's well worth the drive and the expense, particularly if you're a rose lover.

In Windsor, Ontario, you have a choice of colorful stops. Coventry Garden and Peace Fountain, two miles east of downtown Windsor, is on Riverside Drive East at Pillette Rd. (tel. 519-255-6270). A dramatic symbol of the peaceful tie between Canada and the United States, the Peace Fountain is the centerpiece of Coventry Gardens, which honors Windsor's sister city in Britain. The floating fountain, one of the largest in North America, presents a changing pattern of colored lights and water sprays.

Not as large as some collections, the riverside **Dieppe Gardens** across from the Art Gallery of Windsor is also worth a look. The roses are a wonderful counterpoint to the maritime traffic on the Detroit River.

Windsor's second large garden is

at Tecumseh Rd. and Ouellette Street, about five minutes from the tunnel. Queen Elizabeth II Gardens boasts six acres of roses with 450 different varieties. There's also some maze-like shrubbery and a featured Lancaster bomber, a memorial to those members of the Royal Canadian Air Force who died in WWII. An astrolobe and sundial of Copernicus, the father of modern astronomy round out the display.

The gardens are free, open daily, and more information is available by telephoning 519-255-6276.

Back in Michigan, you have a choice of gardens to interest you year around. If you like your garden stroll to include historic homes and cultural institutions, head for Cranbrook House and Gardens at 380 Lone Pine Rd. in Bloomfield Hills, north of Detroit. Telephone 313-645-3149 to check on home tours which are scheduled the fourth Sunday of the month from 2-4 p.m., April-October and selected Sundays in July and August.

The garden is open 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. Mon.-Sat.; 1-5 p.m. Sunday, June-August. Daily 1-5 p.m. May and Sept. Pre-arranged tours are given weekdays.

The gardens surrounding the English manor house designed by Albert Kahn cover 40 acres of formal plantings, woods, two lakes, and a pine grove. Lawns are meticulously kept and lead the eye to flowering shrubs in all seasons. This is an established planting, restful to both the eye and soul. After experiencing the house, the museum and the gardens, you'll feel refreshed and rested - even though your feet may be protesting!

It wouldn't be accurate to describe Fernwood as just a garden. It's so much more - an institution, if you will. Located at 13988 Range Line Rd. in Niles, (telephone 616-695-6491), it has become part of the lives of those who frequent it.

Oh, these are acres and acres of growing things, plus woods and walks, an interpretive center, lectures and events, art shows and classes, trips and endless diversions. For instance, on June 4-6, "A Rosemary Trilogy" will cover the history, culture, and uses of rosemary, that delightful herb used by so many. There will be a lecture (including rosemary tea), a demonstration (complete with a plant for each participant), and a tasting

(rounded off by a vegetarian buffet). Fernwood programs are designed to be both entertaining and informative. Perhaps that's why there are so many repeat audiences.

Michigan State University's Horticultural Gardens on campus in East Lansing (telephone 517-355-0348) is best visited during the warm months, when paths among the gardens can be fully appreciated. The nearby greenhouse, used for teaching horticulture classes, has displays of seasonal flowers and green plants. Admission is free to both. The greenhouse is open Mon.-Fri. from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. yeararound, while the gardens operate on the same hours May 1 to October 1.

At Tipton, on M-50, five miles west of the junction with M-52, you'll find Hidden Lake Gardens, (telephone 517-431-2060).

A slight admission charge admits you to six miles of winding roads, special scented trails, a conservatory with tropical and arid plants, a pine-shaded picnic area, free parking and a gift shop in the visitor center. Take a bit of something healthful to feed the swans and let your spirits revive.

Hours are from 8 a.m. to dusk, April through October.

Midland boasts about its Dow Gardens; enter off St. Andrews near the Midland Center for the Arts and Grace A. Dow Memorial Library.

Director Douglas Chapman says the waterfalls will be turned on for the first time this year - and that means 750 gallons of water making the rounds every minute. In addition to the sixty acres of plantings, bridges,

waterfalls and flowers, there's a greenhouse for exotic specialities. Telephone 517-631-2677 for more information.

University of Michigan's Matthaei Botanical Gardens at 1800 N. Dixboro Rd. in Ann Arbor is a wonderful place to take the family. After all, it's summer all year long in the conservatory, with lush tropical banana and lemon trees and giant types of cacti to inspect.

Outdoors, wander through flower beds of perennials and annuals, herbs and shrubs. Four outdoor trails give you a touch of the wild easily marked for strolling in comfort and two ponds of goldfish intrigue viewers.

There are bathroom facilities, a gift shop and nearby restaurants.

The small admission charge covers free parking and while the grounds are open from sunrise to sunset, the conservatory hours are from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily. Group tours can be arranged with three weeks advance notice.

These outdoor trails are a favorite of my own grandchildren, and they've learned to identify trees, leaves and flowers from the well-identified species. My own interest lies with the many herbs lovingly planted and cared for in beds near the conservatory. Continued From Page 21 How do Wellman and his cohorts decide to sell timber?

"During the winter months we make up 'prescriptions' for two years down the road. The work I'm doing right now, for example, is for 1993. The forest is broken down into compartments, and we work in these compartments on a 10-year rotation basis. That is, we try to take only a tenth of the mature trees within a compartment every 10 years," he explains.

"Within each of these compartments we look at every stand to assess the trees' age, their health and quantity (in board feet). What we have then is a good inventory of what is in the forest. And from this inventory our prescriptions are drawn. Then late in the spring or summer we get together with our people and the wildlife people, including recreation representatives, and our prescriptions are discussed and a final decision to cut or not cut is made. This board also includes representatives of the public.

Age, of course, is the major factor in determining if a stand of trees is ready for harvesting. But the board also looks at other factors. Does the area have a recreational value that suggests retention of the trees, regardless of age? Will cutting adversely affect wildlife habitat? Will wildlife benefit from cutting? Will forest beauty be hurt by cutting? What's the estimated value of the harvestable timber? These are examples of the kinds of questions the board will address.

Occasionally, also, Wellman points out, "we'll also look at the historical value of a stand. For example, we'll come across a small virgin stand of timber that somehow was missed during the lumbering era. If the trees are basically healthy we may decide not to cut them, even though they are well beyond their

prime. "Also, generally speaking, Forest Management stays clear of swamp lands. The wildlife (division) people make the decision here. These are

viewed principally as wildlife habitat. What's more, if you remove cedars it's virtually impossible to regrow them as might have been possible naturally prior to the deer explosion. Now the minute a cedar shoot springs up, it's

eaten by deer.' So don't try blowing that old deer myth past a forester like Wellman. He won't buy it.


Instead, you might consider this possibility: What if the timber baron had not raped the land of its virgin

trees? Maybe the "state forests" would still be privately owned. Maybe there would be no public trails or campgrounds or a need for Forest Management. Maybe the white pine, not the aspen, would yet be king.



Lake Macatawa: A long drink of water

On rough days, when boisterous southwesterly gales are churning Lake Michigan, few sights are more welcome than the bright red lighthouse beckoning wave-tossed mariners to the comfortable---and delightful---shelter of Lake Macatawa.

That red lighthouse seems to represent the image of Michigan. You've seen it in dozens of picture,

with colorful boats and sails in the background. It's at the entrance to the cement-bordered channel connecting Lake Macatawa to the big lake. To the north across the channel are the white sandy dunes and beaches of Holland State Park, one of the most popular in the state.

On a nice day, the north side of the channel is lined with gawkers, watching the heavy boat traffic move in and out. Many of them are fishing, for salmon in spring; perch, walleye and bass in summer.

At the far end of this long, narrow lake, five miles to the east, lies the City of Holland, where the famous annual festival of the tulips is being celebrated through Saturday, May 18. But the area is resplendent with colorful flowers and neat green landscapes long after the tulips have withered.

High on these old sand dunes, big, attractive turn-of-the-century cottages perch, evoking charming images of ladies with long skirts and parasols and men in straw hats.

The lake itself, with towering sand dunes at its western end, was once called "black" by the Indians. When the government cut the channel through, the waters cleared.

The west end of Lake Macatawa is familiar to us because for years Allan has kept his boat there, usually at a slip near Point West. The sign identifying this restaurant and motel complex is around the corner to your right as you come out of the channel from Lake Michigan.

Inside the restaurant's handsome lakeside structure is a dining room and the Point cocktail lounge. It is open from 7:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily (to 10 p.m. Fridays and Saturdays). It serves up 100 items like Belgian waffles and eggs Benedict from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. every Sunday at its Bruncheon Buffet. Boaters can order carryout meals, but only with several hours' advance notice.

We sometimes tie up at the sea wall, where the policy is first come first served, and go to the restaurant for lunch or dinner. Sometimes there are slips available for diners, although most of the transient slips are for overnight guests at one of Point West Inn's 66 motel units.

A motel spokesman reports that new slips are being added to the north of the restaurant, and hopefully will be ready by June 1.

Behind the restaurant, a U-shaped motel surrounds a swimming pool. Nearby, Point West also operates a five-story hillside building with sleeping rooms on its top three floors.

Darrell Warnock, food and beverage director, tells of summer plans for a Hawaiian-style bar and outdoor entertainment on the patio overlooking the lake. Guitarist Brian Morris performs Wednesday through Sunday evenings, starting June 19.

Indoors in the Pointe Lounge, bands featuring Chicago-style jazz and top-40's numbers will play for dancers starting at 9:30 Fridays and Saturdays. The Point West phone is 616-335-5894.





It's only a short hike from Point West south to Eldean Shipyard and the Sandpiper Restaurant. In recent years, owner Herb Eldean has expanded this full-service marina to contain 290 slips and moorings, and winter storage for 400 boats.

į

Allan particularly likes the beautiful marine hardware at the 10,000 square foot ship's store. Julie likes the beautiful tiled showers and head facilities available to renters of Eldean slips. There's even a children's playground and picnic area, as well as a laundromat.

Both of us like the gorgeous view and the food served at the Sandpiper, which Eldean and his wife Pat opened in 1985. Since then its superb food has earned awards and placement in directories of the best restaurants in Michigan. Restaurant critic Molly Abraham, of the Detroit Free Press, says Chef Ed Westerlund is creative and innovative, changing the menu every two months.

The Sandpiper is open seven days a week and offers carryout lunches and a special catering menu for boaters. While the restaurant is elegant, the dress code is casual. No ties or jackets required. At night, appetizers, cocktails and desserts are served on the deck overlooking the boats. (616) 335-5843.

To reserve a transient slip, customers of the restaurant should call Eldean's Marina. 616) 335-5866. For a slip assignment for overnight dockage, visitors should stop at the gas dock.

Next door to Eldean's complex is the Macatawa Bay Yacht Club, which welcomes members of reciprocating clubs to its clubhouse. (616) 335-5230.

Within the last few years Herb Eldean has further expanded his operation by the purchase of the former Bay Haven Marina, on the north side of Lake Macatawa at Big Bay. The new full-service operation is called Eldean Yacht Basin and contains 371 slips, some available to transients. (616) 786-9300.

An easy walk from the Basin is The Hatch (616-399-9120), a friendly bar, lounge and restaurant specializing in sea food. They serve dinners only, Mondays through Saturdays, 5:30 p.m. to 11 p.m., and brunch on Sunday from 10:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., with a 10:30 p.m. closing time. Carryouts are offered. The Yacht Basin makes a nominal charge for slips for the Hatch's customers arriving by boat.

Moving east, and still on Big Bay, is the Anchorage Marina and Yacht Club, another full-service marina. It, too, provides a restaurant and lounge, open seven days a week from May 1st. A swimming pool, game room, TV area, party store and playground are among the facilities open to boaters. (616-399-6745; restaurant, 616-399-1881)

Back on the south side of the lake, east of Eldean's complex, a dozen or so slips are available free to boaters who stay at the Lakeshore Motel-Resort. From the lake, you can spot the family-style vacation spot by its sign. Owners Joanne and Tom Schippa live in the main house, surrounded by 12 white units with black roofs. Each accommodates two to as many as eight occupants. For reservations, call (616-335-5355) and tell Joanne Schippa you are bringing a

For those who trail their boats to this area, public launching ramps are available at Holland State Park and at Kollen Park in Holland, at the east end of the lake. Another launching ramp with 101 parking sites is four miles west of the city on Lake Macatawa. Department of Natural Resources signs should guide you to it.

In Holland itself, cruising boaters can visit the Marina Bay (formerly Perrin's) marina, approximately one mile from downtown. The 160 slips include half a dozen or more open for transients. The marina's niceties include a swimming pool, showers and jacuzzi. (616-396-8600).

To get to Marina Bay, be sure to follow the buoyed channel up the lake, because Macatawa has many shoal areas. With our five-and-a-half-foot draft, we touched bottom many times in recent years when lake levels were low. For the 1991 season, the experts are predicting an improvement. We fervently hope they're right.





'Weather rock' sets tone for camp ground

Wolcottville, Indiana-

You'll know by the "weather rock" near the entrance that this isn't your typical campground.

Gordon's Camping owner Ray Gordon says hospitality is the key to his success. Now in his 30th year of campground ownership, he calls campers "some of the nicest people upon the face of the earth."

crowded the aisles of the buildings at the Ann Arbor/Saline Fairgrounds viewing the offerings of more than 350 dealers on Saturday and Sunday, April 13 and 14.

A week earlier, when the temperature flirted with 80 the 80 degree marks, antiquers stayed out in the sunshine rather than roam the booths of the Americana Show in Southfield.

Both shows offered some stand-out antiques. Dealer Thomas Gifford brought to the Americana show the longest deacon's bench I have ever seen. The back was formed of eight Windsor chair-style loops. It was priced at a reasonable \$850 -- a bargain for anyone with a long wall to accommodate such a conversation piece.

New to the Saline show was The Sparrow's Nest booth of Bobbie an Ron Wenzel of Allegan. It was filled with white-painted old furniture expertly decorated with appealing floral and ribbon designs in pastels, mostly pinks, blues and greens. The light look of the old furniture thus revamped drew much interest. Such furniture would dress up a bedroom or porch beautifully.

"They did very well," Easton reported.

Also very popular were toy dealers with old-time wind-up toys and mechanical banks. The demand for toys of the past has been gaining steadily. Easton confirmed.

An outdoor booth near the entrance to the show displayed an old-fashioned doll buggy tagged at \$150 and a high-sided wooden toy wagon for \$275.

Speciality dealers included Colonial House Antiques and Gifts from Berea, Ohio, with shelves lined with Royal Doulton figurines, mugs and plates. They will be on display again at the next Saline show July 6 and 7, and also at shows in Allegan May 26, June 30, July 28, Aug. 25 and Sept. 29.

Also drawing interest was a gun dealer from Williamsburg, Va., as well as many dealers in jewelry and silver.

"Silver has kind of regained its popularity here in the last year or two," Easton noted, pointing out that it always has been popular in Europe.

Some dealers displayed full sets of silver or silverplate while others offered fill-in pieces. I especially enjoy inspecting the serving pieces on display. Some are Victorian with intricate floral designs. Who says a gravy ladle or pie server has to match place settings?

As we wandered through the crowded barns at the show, our eye was caught time and time again by beautifully polished brass and copper pieces. Brass candlesticks in some abundance glowed. Even some with visible signs of wear looked good polished and generally were priced according to condition. I saw one tagged at \$24.

If all this has made you want to seek out your own bargains of the past, put on your jeans and walking shoes (an absolute necessity and plan to take in these upcoming markets:

'Reason for Living' not just Jill Ireland's story

Jill Clayburgh lands role in family drama

"Reason for Living: The Jill Ireland Story" is not about the actress, says Jill Clayburgh. The TV movie, airing Monday, May 20, on NBC and starring Clayburgh in the title role, is about families.

Actress Jill Ireland made 35 films in her long career. Almost one year ago to date, she died of breast cancer. But before her death, the actress penned two novels: "Life Wish," chronicling her battle with cancer, and "Life Lines", depicting her adopted son's heroin addiction, overdose and death.

"Reason for Living" is based on "Life Lines" and Ireland's determination to help her son beat the monkey off of his back.

"I think she felt strongly about what she learned from having dealt with her cancer," said Clayburgh of Ireland. "She felt she could help her son deal with his flirtation with death. She felt she knew something about death, and, therefore, she had a way to communicate with him."

The film is really about what you do and where you turn when you have tried everything you can think of to help a loved one. "It's not about her as a celebrity or as an actress," said Clayburgh. "It's a very passionate story about a woman and her feelings for her family, her children, her parents, her own life and her own mortality. People might turn it on because it's Jill Ireland, but I think the book's success is because of its originality. It's not a self-serving book about 'how great I am' and 'how wonderful I am." It's a pretty soulsearching look."

Originally, Ireland had planned to play herself in the telefilm. She is, in fact, executive producer of the production. When she realized it would be impossible to do so, she made a list of the actresses she would want to see in her role. Clayburgh, nominated twice for an

Oscar ("An Unmarried Woman, Starting Over") and once for an Emmy ("Hustling"), made the list and won the part.

Ireland's husband, Charles
Bronson, reportedly hasn't read
either of his wife's books and was
opposed to the making of "Reason
for Living." His role will be played
by Lance Henriksen ("Aliens"). "It's
something that she jokes about in
her book and, in fact, the movie,"
said Clayburgh, noting it was her
understanding that things had been
worked out with Bronson.

Clayburgh has never met Bronson or Ireland. The materials she used to prepare for her role were Ireland's books, tapes she had made with the show's producers and TV interviews. It is the second real-

person role she has played. In 1976 she played Carole Lombard in the biographical film "Gable and Lombard." Such a role demands certain responsibilities, but she looks at it as a challenge.

"I think that the film is about her very human struggle to find an answer, and then to have to try something else," concluded Clayburgh, herself the mother of three. "Parents feel so helpless when these things happen and so inadequate and sort of that feeling that 'Anybody could do it (parenting) better than I could.' I hope that you walk away seeing that nobody does it all that well, but everybody does it as well as they can, and that's sort of all you can ask of yourself."

Academy Award-nominee Jill Clayburgh plays the title role in "Reason for Living: The Jill Ireland Story," Monday on NBC. The biodrama, based on Ireland's bestseller "Life Lines," chronicles the actress' fight to end her son's heroin addiction amid her own battle with cancer.

Aussies co-exist with salt water crocodiles

People the world over are learning
how to peacefully co-exist with the
environment. But the people in Australia's Northern Territory have an
even tougher challenge — co-existing
with one of nature's deadliest
creatures.

The fifth installment of ABC's World of Discovery, airing Sunday, May 12, tells how the people in Darwin, a tropical coastal city of 73,000 people, live on a day-to-day basis with the threat of salt water crocodiles appearing in their parks, ponds and — literally — backyards.

"They're tremendous animals," said Dennis Kane, executive producer of "Crocodile's Revenge." "They move like lightning," he said of the creatures that can grow to 21 feet long and weigh one-and-a-half tons.

Making a resurgence after near extinction in the mid-1960s, salt water crocodiles are fierce predators capable of attacking from the water onto a beach at speeds of more than 40 miles an hour.

"I believe it's over the past five or six years 25 to 30 people have been taken by salt water crocodiles," Kane explained. In the show, viewers see how government patrol boats travel just outside the city's lights to keep the creatures out of the public's way.


