Second place times two

Teams do well at OM meets

Modern teen idols and ancient history came together in a Northville High School Odyssey of the Mind (OM) skit winning a second place in the state.

NHS team members performed a skit in which they were required to incorporate art and artifacts from ancient Pompeii, answering a long-term problem in posed in October.

Odyssey of the Mind is a competition matching the wits of students from around the state. Teams form early in the school year to find creative solutions to long-term problems.

Two of Northville's four teams qualifying for the state competition received a second place in their divisions April 27.

The winning high school team wrote and acted out a skit about Madonna, Michael Jackson, Vanna White and Betty Crocker playing a board game called Mystecopoly. As a result of singing and dancing required by the game, members of the group magically were transported through time to ancient Pompeii where they bought artifacts needed to return

Council considers hiking fines, fees to help balance city's tight budget

Drivers who park their cars illegally in the city can expect stiffer fines in the near future.

The increased fines are part of the city's efforts to increase its revenue and trim costs in the face of a decline in state-shared revenue and the state's withholding of racetrack revenue.

The city council has scheduled a public hearing for June 3 to consider increasing several fines and fees, and changing the collection date of registration and license fees to Jan. 1. Currently, several of the fees have different collection dates.

Under the new schedule, fees for building identification, burning leaves or rubbish, businesses and dogs would be increased, as would several parking fines.

The fines for parking too close to an intersection, in a "No Stopping or Standing" zone, on a

sidewalk or facing traffic would be increased to \$10 if paid within seven days and \$15 if paid after. Double parking would now cost between \$15-\$20, while parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant would set the violator back between \$20-\$25, depending on how soon the fine is paid.

The biggest increase would be to those who illegally park in a "Handicapped" zone. What now costs between \$20-\$25 would cost between \$50-\$75.

The charge for the city's annual parking permit

would be raised from \$5 to \$12.

The fees for services including copies of police reports, bicycle licenses, gun and concealed weapon permits, which were raised in March 1990, will remain the same.

The higher fees are expected to raise about \$26,000, with most of that coming from the increased cost of parking fines. The increases will bring the city's dog licenses, business registrations and parking fines more in line with other area municipalities, city officials say.

Police warning of crimes by roving groups

Northville Township police have joined a search for a roving band of alleged thieves and rip-off artists.

Police said a "disoriented" woman who said she wanted to use a restroom was found in the Portis home of a Northville Township resident last month. Portis is located in the Northville Colony Estates subdivision.

The Portis woman told police she entered her home at 3 p.m. April 30 and found an "overweight, white woman approximately 60 years old" wandering through her bedroom.

When the homeowner asked the woman what she was doing, the intruder reportedly replied, "I was only using the bathroom."

The resident then ushered the woman from her home before calling police.

Police suspect the woman is part of a "family-oriented group" of thieves that migrates from sunny winter climates to northern states in the summer.

Township police say the case may be related to an incident in which a Plymouth Township woman reportedly was bilked out of \$4,549 by a self-proclaimed psychic.

Plymouth Township police on Friday said the psychic incident was their only reported case that could be tied to the transient group.

But it may not be the last.

"This is the season (for that type of

incident)," said Plymouth Township police Sgt. Robert Antal.

Antal warned area residents to be wary of strangers bearing bargains. "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is," he said.

Police have said the group — which often travels in five- to 10-car bands — makes its primary living by roaming from state-to-state, town-to-town in search of financial opportunities.

Phony roofing, driveway-paving and home-siding schemes can be part of the group's menu of fast-buck forays, police said.

The transient outfit also excels in residential breaking and entering and Northville Township police believe the Portis home was a target.

Township police Lt. Gary Batzloff said the group likes to operate during daylight hours when residents are shopping or working.

The Portis resident may have interrupted a burglary, police said.

A witness told police he saw a woman on the front porch of the Portis home before she entered through the garage. The garage door was opened by force, police said.

When the suspect left the Portis home, she layed down in the back seat of a black vehicle, which may have been a newer model four-door Buick Century, the witness said.

The vehicle was driven away by another woman, the witness said.

Walkaway back in state care

A walkaway state hospital patient accused of mugging a Northville man and stealing his car is back under state care.

Township police said Terrance Jenkins, 27, of Detroit, returned to Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital some time May 12, four days after he walked away from the facility.

Police allege that the six-foot, 190-pound Jenkins walked west from state hospital property on Seven Mile to Northville Plaza, threw a 72-year-old local man to the ground, and stole his vehicle.

The Northville man suffered head lacerations and later was found to have a compound fracture to the elbow. He was released from Boitsford General Hospital last week.

The car, a 1983 Ford Fairmont, was found late last week in Highland Park.

Jenkins, defined by hospital security as "assaultive and combative," left the hospital during a security lapse, hospital Director Walter Brown said.

"Standards for newly admitted patients were not observed," he said. "We will take appropriate action."

Brown would not specify the hospital's disciplinary action against its staff. When asked if Jenkins would

now be monitored more closely, Brown replied, "Certainly."

Brown would not comment further on Jenkins' return to the state hospital and said he did not know when township police were alerted to the patient's arrival.

But township police said they did not know Jenkins was back until mid-week — well after his return and nearly a week after computer printouts indicated that a walkaway hospital patient was suspected of criminal activity.

"(We) did not know he was there until Wednesday," police Chief Chip Snider said. "It was common knowledge by Saturday (May 11) that the walkaway was a suspect."

Jenkins may never face prosecution for his alleged crimes.

Snider said the township will forward its investigative findings to the Wayne County Prosecutor's office, but Jenkins' status as a hospital patient will send up "red flags" during prosecutor reviews.

A competency review most likely will be held to determine if Jenkins could stand trial, Snider said.

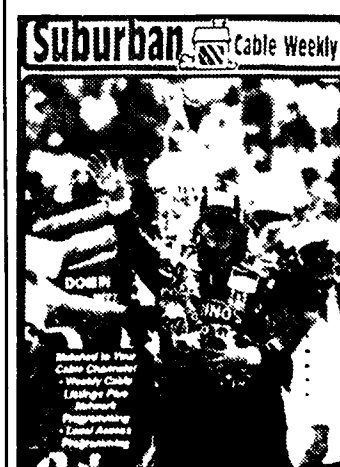
Jenkins walked away from the hospital two days after his admittance. He previously had walked away from a group home in Detroit, police said.

to modern time.

The team was coached by Cheryl Patterson, a Redford teacher and parent of team member Holly Chrysan.

"Students wrote the skit, which Patterson called 'hysterically' funny. The most difficult part about coaching the team was finding time when the students could meet for practice.

"Getting them together was a nightmare over the last four months," she said.

Team member Lee Hyland agreed.

"We practiced diligently as all get out, but our practice schedule looked like a bell curve," he said.

"We practiced once a month for six months and then 27 times the last month."

And the early practice sessions were not as productive as the later sessions, said team member Angela Helmer.

Dasgupta plans to attend Eastern Michigan University, and Hyland plans to attend Wayne State University. They both said returning to the high school to coach a team would be possible.

A Schoolchester Elementary team win also received a second place at the state competition.

Brynn Wade, Dan Fiske, Deric Swancutt, Steven Buchanan, Greg Last, Jordan Nault and Steven Purtell built a balsa-wood

structure weighing less than 15 grams.

The structure held 375 pounds before breaking.

Winchester competitors also created a life-size Monopoly board with team members as game pieces.

The players moved around the board placing weights on their balsa-wood structure as part of the game.

They won a first place in the style category and an overall second place in the state.

Northville sent two other teams to the state competition. One high school team was the hit of the event with its shirt design (see related story).

A middle school team made up of students from Cooke and Meads Mill also qualified for the state competition but did not place. Members Jamie Belanger, Lisa Cochrane, Cassie Mandas, James Medeiros, Rehn Peterson and Andy Vartanian competed against other fifth-, sixth- and seventh-graders from around the state.

Park develops slow but sure

Visualize a beautifully landscaped community park on Beck Road complete with five soccer fields, three baseball fields, fences, lights, and ample parking.

Then wake up and face reality. Township planners last week approved a final site plan for the Northville Community Park on Beck Road between Five and Six Mile, but an arduous construction and funding process has just begun.

Recreation Department Director John Anderson on Tuesday said he is seeking bids for first-phase park construction. Bids for grading, seeding, building storm sewers and parking lots are expected to be returned by mid-June, Anderson said.

Crews last winter bulldozed 39 acres of scrub brush designed to fill a community recreational-space void. Community officials at that time thought Northville youths would be kicking the old soccer ball around this summer.

That will not be the case. In fact, Anderson said a spring 1992 opening might be optimistic.

"Some of the plans have taken longer than we anticipated," he said. "The site plan and then the grading plan took longer."

Anderson said he hopes site grading can be underway by late June and finished a month later. Seeding will follow, with planting dates dependent upon the type of irrigation system chosen, he said.

After grass plantings, the park plan becomes a bit of a financial

mystery.

"We anticipate we'll have money for the grading, seeding and some irrigation," Anderson said. "We'll have to take a phased approach."

The community park war chest currently holds about \$70,000, Anderson said. Those funds were raised through park development fees paid by team and individual registration costs, and are not sufficient to foot the entire park bill.

Anderson said he could not approximate the entire park cost until phase one bids were returned.

A 1989 failed recreation millage doomed recreation department attempts to make the park "nice right off," Anderson said.

The park construction delay did spawn changes to the original plan.

Anderson said an initial plan to build three soccer fields and two baseball diamonds was modified — by narrowing full-size fields — to create an additional pair of soccer fields.

Officials now see the park developing three full-sized soccer fields and two smaller soccer fields. Three baseball diamonds, which will be designed for youth baseball and adult soccer, will also be figured into the park equation.

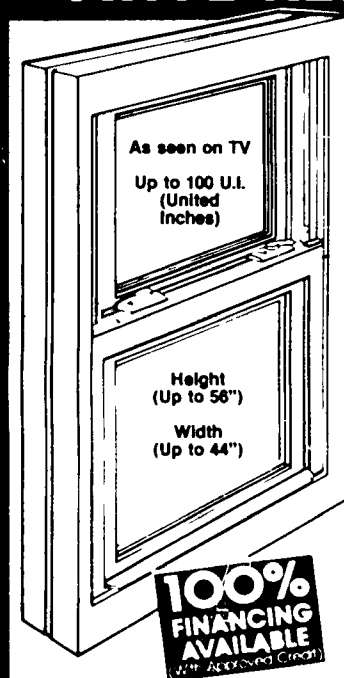
Lighting is out of the question for now, Anderson said, and landscaping is "farther down the road."

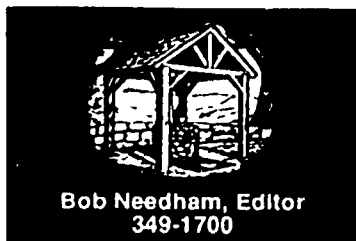

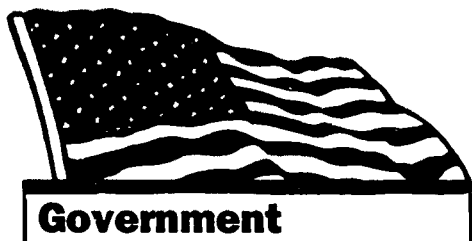

Our Opinion

Time is not right for automatic pay hikes

There's no question the administrators in Northville city government deserve a raise. But there should be serious questions about actually getting it.



Government

With little discussion, the city council last week approved a 4.5-percent raise for all non-union city staff. It's actually a raise for the past year, since it's retroactive to June 1, 1990. All the other city employees have already received raises for that time period; the city delays settling on the administrators' pay hikes until after it has settled the contracts with all its unions.

So, in short, this is the same raise that all other city employees got, and it's not out of line. The increase roughly matches the inflation rate and no more. The administrators do a good job, and they probably deserve it.

In actually granting the raise, however, the council may have acted too hastily.

The city finds itself in a severe budget crisis these days. Layoffs of police officers and other staff loom threateningly overhead. Two police positions have already been cut. Uncertainty over what will happen with state-returned racetrack revenue adds to already severe worries over trash disposal and other climbing costs.

The situation is so bad that the city officials are asking all the employee unions to voluntarily defer raises for the 1991/1992 fiscal year for six months. In other words, raises to which the city has already agreed would not kick in until six months after the agreed date — Jan. 1, 1992, instead of July 1, 1991. Any department not agreeing faces a layoff threat. This sounds harsh, but there appears to be no choice.

In this kind of financial climate, giving raises to the administrators does not feel right. Even though the council's approach here to non-union employees and union employees deals with two different fiscal years, it still creates the uncomfortable situation of giving raises to the chiefs while seeking concessions from the Indians. That just shouldn't be.

Perhaps worst of all, the council did not even consider not granting the non-union employees' raises. Nor did they consider requesting voluntary deferrals from the administrators. The council passed the raises as a simple matter of course, without even looking for any other options.

The total amount of money involved in granting these raises is not a lot in the context of a \$8-million-plus city budget. All told, it amounts to something like \$20,000. But that's a good, solid step toward saving the job of a police officer or a public works employee.

Every little bit counts when the budget is as tight as the City of Northville's. Here was a chance to save a significant amount to help keep the city's level of service as high as it is. The council missed that chance.

Even though the administrative raises are well-deserved, council members should have considered not granting them at this time. At the very least they should have discussed the possibility.

The Mothers' Club outdoes itself

At this time each year, the Northville Mothers' Club always tallies up its year and the donations it has been able to make to the Northville School District. The results are always substantial, but this year is particularly special.

The group raised an astonishing \$16,000 through its fund-raising efforts this year, and it all goes to benefit Northville students. The money will buy a terrific wish list of technological goodies and other equipment for all seven public schools in the Northville district.

As usual, the big event in the club's fund-raising efforts was the Christmas

Open House. That was supplemented by other annual activities such as the ski-ski sale and the ongoing marathon bridge event.

Raising \$16,000 is obviously a lot of money, but it really falls into perspective when some of the club's life members comment that 20 years ago, having \$1,000 was quite a lot.

The Northville Mothers' Club has helped Northville schools and students for many years, and it always deserves a pat on the back. But this year was something special.

He stood up on his hind legs to get a better look, but he wasn't quite as social as the rabbit. He scurried off to the nearby woods.

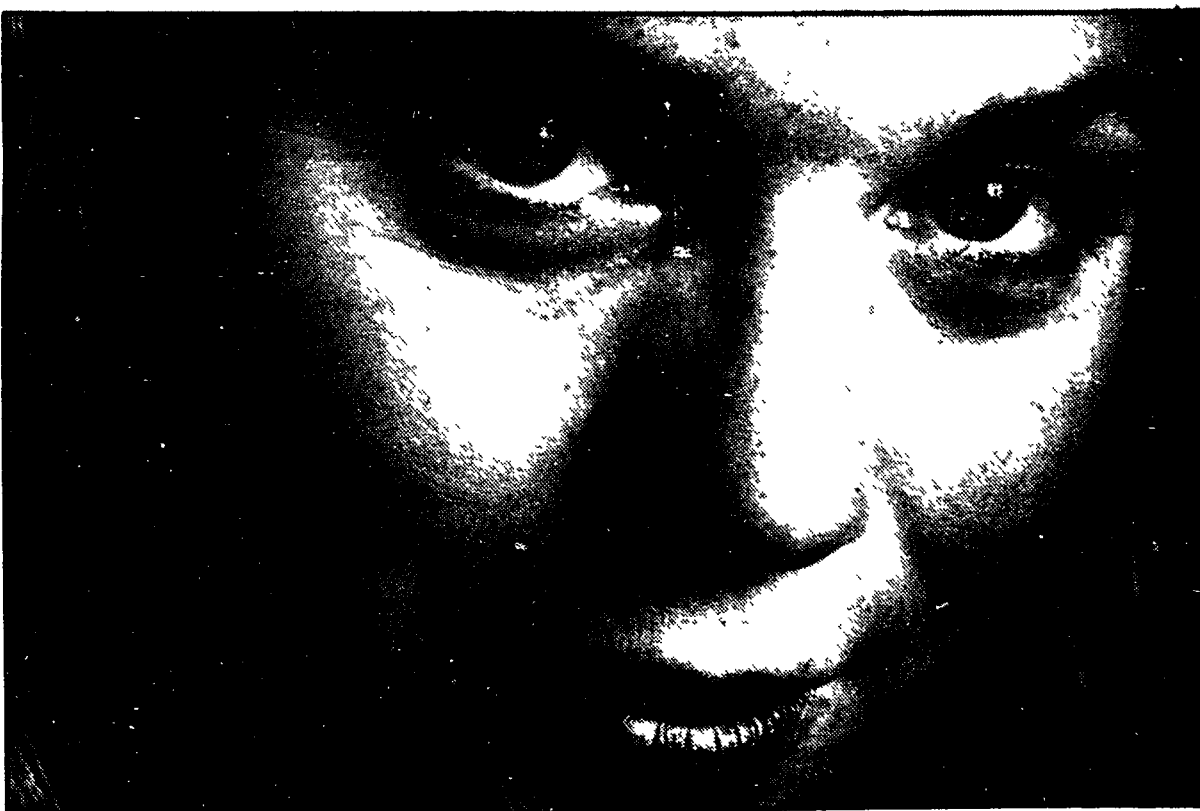
I followed briefly, saying, "Hey, woodchuck. Wait 'up. Whatsamatta witchoo? Where you goin'?"

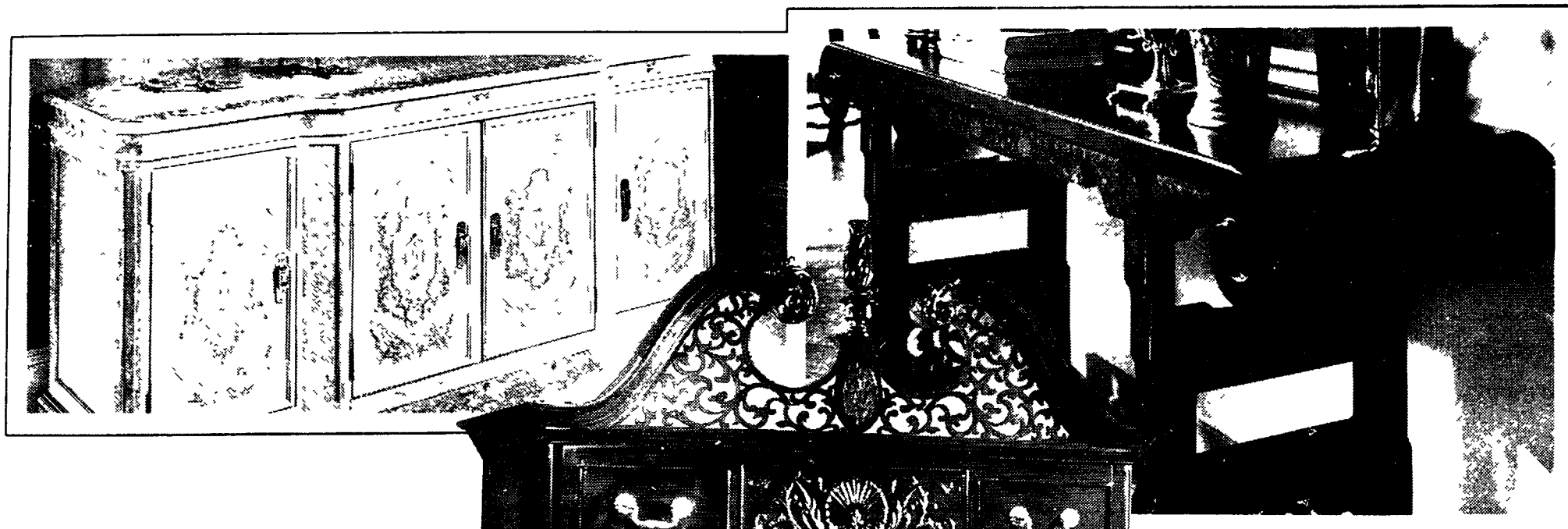

Elusive Quivira is now found in Michigan stores

Are you aware that as a metro Detroit wine consumer you have among the largest possible wine selections available to you? Wine lovers in Los Angeles, San Francisco, New York or Chicago do not have bragging rights.

Occasionally, a few brands with small production are unavailable in Michigan. Until now, this was the case with the estate-grown wines from Quivira (pronounced kee-vee-ah) Vineyards in Sonoma County's Dry Creek Valley.

Just making their introduction are the wines from a winery taking its name from a legendary kingdom of great wealth, believed by early explorers to have been in Northern California, in the area now known as Sonoma County.

Nobody relates the legend better than Quivira Vineyards owner Henry Wendt. "About 1540, the Spanish explorer Coronado on the expedition that discovered the Grand Canyon, befriended a wily Indian who described the extraordinary virtues of his homeland Quivira," he narrates. "Coronado spent the better part of a year searching in vain for the riches of Quivira. Eventually, under torture, the Indian admitted that the story was fabricated."

"Even after the confession, the legend of Quivira was in wide circulation in Europe. It remained an enticing mystery for nearly two centuries. To the attraction of a wealthy and civilized people was added the belief that a rich and active trade between China and Quivira existed. The belief stimulated the search for a northwest passage since the citizens of Quivira would certainly provide directions to China."

"The story inspired many explorers of the West Coast of America and was immortalized by all the great cartographers of the Age of Discovery."

The Quivira of today is a 90-acre wine estate founded in 1981 by international health care corporate executive Henry Wendt and his wife, Holly.

"We are developing a premium wine business from the vineyard up to the bottle on the shelf," Wendt maintains. "The California wine business is evolving toward regional specialization. The Europeans have understood this notion for centuries. In California, regions such as Cameros and Dry Creek Valley will find themselves, with respect to variety, vineyard practice and management. We would like Quivira to be at the vanguard of this trend."

"Quivira wines are a reflection of the estate vineyards that set the tone and distinguish the wines," winemaker Grady Wann contends. "Sound, ripe fruit with intensity and depth of varietal flavor is at the core of all Quivira wines. My goal in making these wines is to preserve the depth and character of the fruit."

Wann came to Quivira after six years at Sonoma-Cutrer Winery. At Quivira he is responsible for production of sauvignon blanc, zinfandel, cabernet sauvignon and a grenache-based wine.

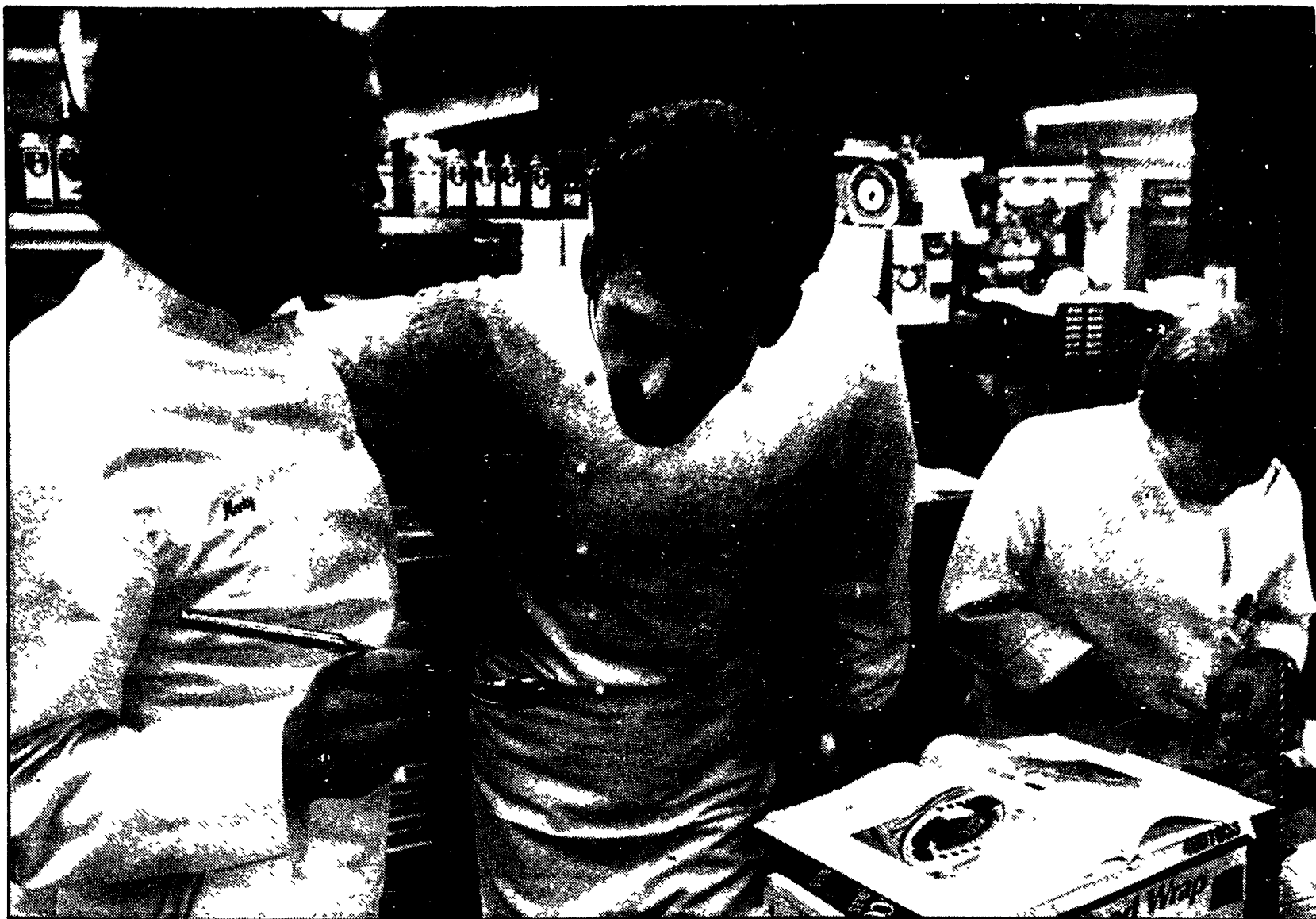
Since he made only chardonnay at Sonoma-Cutrer, Wann has spent his spare moments at home fermenting and blending red wines in his garage, conferring and tasting with other enologists.

The Wendts take their 18-acre sauvignon blanc vineyard Fig Tree Vineyard, in reference to a 30-year-old fig tree amid the vines and also to an interesting flavor component found in the ripe fruit. The entire vineyard is on the floor of Dry Creek Valley, in well-drained soils.

WINE SELECTION OF THE WEEK

1989 Quivira Sauvignon Blanc (\$10) has attractive apple blossom, spice and herbal aromas with a nice touch of flinty, mineral elements in the style of a Pouilly Fume. The clean, crisp, fresh fruit flavors are complementary to oysters, soft shell crabs or grilled white fish.

1989 Quivira Zinfandel (\$12.75) is highlighted by blackberry, black cherry and spicy black pepper aromas. It is generously extracted with a full, complex, lengthy finish. Serve it with grilled meats for a hit at your next outdoor barbecue.

In pursuit of excellence Competition teaches important lessons

Just as the student-athlete learns things on the field of competition that might not be learned in the classroom, so it is with the student-chef.

At Schoolcraft College, a group of students in the culinary arts department is competing today in the 21st Annual Culinary Arts Salon of the National Restaurant Association in Chicago. More than 200 chefs, apprentices and students are expected to compete in the event.

Schoolcraft cooking teams have fared well in competition at the regional, national and international levels, and sport numerous gold medals.

But according to Chef Dan Hugelier, one of the coaches of the team, gold medals aren't the real goal for these students.

"We're not trying to get the students to meet the judges standards," said Hugelier. "What we're shooting for, when they put together a food platter, is for them to say, 'Would I like to eat it?' For example, if we put a garnish on there, we want it to be one that makes sense. You wouldn't put raspberries with chicken or roast beef because they don't go together."

It may seem like an oversimplification to say that contest food should be created to be eaten. But the popu-

lar trend in competition hasn't always been to create what is tasty and enticing.

"There's a trend in contests to go back to proper cooking," said Hugelier. "They want good, unadulterated food. It hasn't always been that way. For a while there were these overconstructed, overdone things that you would look at but wouldn't want to eat. The creativity sometimes exceeded the practicality."

And the lessons of the Schoolcraft staff haven't been lost on the students. Helen Orloff of Northville, part of the team in competition, explained her own choices of mainly seafood in preparing a cold buffet platter for 8-10 persons. (Others on the team were Chef Martin Baity, Christopher Carl, Jeffrey Condit and Sylvia Hayes).

"American cuisine has changed,"

she said. "Instead of big, chunky pieces of meat, it's become lighter and more nutritious."

"There are more pastel colors," she added, showing a cross-section of a smoked salmon terrine, pale pink with flecks of yellow pepper.

Hugelier pointed out that colors shouldn't be there for their own sake. "You shouldn't look at a dish and say, 'well it could use something red or something yellow,'" he said.

And therein lies just one challenge for the students: making food that is colorful, and appealing to the eye, while also making it taste good. Orloff said the skills used are at a higher level than those used in, say, decorating a living room.

"We try to use the correct combi-

One dish meals meet modern needs

In this hectic world it is important to find short cuts to allow time with friends and family, not to mention time for ourselves.

One-dish meals are attractive for all of the obvious reasons and then some. Many families must have two breadwinners to make ends meet. One-parent households are common, and, as a result, time is limited for cooking. One-dish meals offer a variety of cooking methods, easy cleanup, easy on the checkbook, great-tasting and nutritious nourishment.

The fundamental rules are elementary: a protein, starch, greens and/or fruit, minimal utensils and time. The object is to streamline cooking to allow for enjoyable, leisurely meals. It is important that when families sit down to eat together quality time may be spent. One-dish meals get back to basic, homey fare.

They can be simple or elegant enough for company. As a general rule they are much more reasonable and nutritious than a frozen entree or trip to the corner fast-food chain. The options are incredibly

varied and range from soup, salad, casseroles, sandwiches, pizzas, pastas, and stews. Assorted cooking methods and utensils may be employed: crock pots, pressure cookers, woks, microwaves and ovens.

When planning a one-dish meal choose as many fresh ingredients as possible. Although convenience foods are an important part of saving time, they are often expensive for what you get. For instance, a two-pound bag of white rice is one-fifth the cost of a boxed rice mix.

Another point to bring up is the additives and high salt content of prepared foods. There is a place for prepared foods and it is wise to have some on hand, but spend a few extra minutes when shopping to read labels and compare prices. I like to plan my meals for a week and then go shopping. I wait trips to the store and less lines I follow in the happier I am.

Most fruits and vegetables will last at least a week if stored properly. Celery, onions, carrots and peppers are staples in my crispier. Ground turkey or beef, a chicken,

soup and fish bones, and reasonable cuts of meat that can be slow cooked stock the refrigerator and freezer. Dried beans (kidney, black and northern), rice, different pastas, tuna and good quality tomatoes fill the pantry.

Watch for bargains. Recently, uncooked turkey breast was on sale and, after pulling out my handy wallet calculator, I found it to be half the price of luncheon meat. A turkey requires little attention while cooking, is much more nutritious than prepared meats, supplies a soup carcass and is a treat in the lunch box. I bought two.

The moral of the story is to pre-plan and save money, time and supply a higher quality nutritional meal.

After the grocery trip has been handled, the other half of the war is ready to be waged. The cooking.

It is so important to be organized. If you are making extra chill, pre-soak the beans overnight. Make extra and freeze for a future meal. Determine what will be served as an accompaniment. Homemade cornbread and a simple green salad would

round out the meal. Fresh fruit salad for dessert, maybe with a bit of yogurt for dessert.

Have the proper utensils. If soups are a favorite, have an appropriate-sized stock pot. It can double as a pasta cooker. Casserole dishes are invaluable. Pull out the crock pot that is stored and start to use it again. Pressure cooking is seeing a revival, and justly so.

If considering purchasing pots and pans choose sizes suitable to your family size and favored cooking styles. A large wok doubles as a steamer when a basket and cover are used.

An excellent source of recipes, I've found, is 365 Easy One-Dish Meals by Natalie Haughton. It is available at the Kitchen Witch here in Northville, and at Kitchen Glamour Stores and Borders bookstores as well. So, fill the pot and unwind — dinner is taking care of itself.

EGGPLANT PARMESAN

2 medium eggplants washed, stem end removed
2 eggs or 3 egg whites mixed with ¼ cup water
1 cup Italian bread crumbs, purchased or homemade
1 large can tomatoes, crushed
¼ teaspoon each oregano, basil, thyme
salt and pepper to taste
1 cup parmesan cheese, freshly grated preferable

Slice eggplant lengthwise into ¼ inch slices. Dip in egg white, then bread crumbs. Broil on a cookie sheet until crisp and brown on both sides. Mix tomatoes and spices. Taste and adjust seasonings. Layer eggplant to cover bottom of casserole, sprinkle with parmesan and cover with sauce. Continue layering until ingredients are used. Finish with any remaining sauce. Cover and bake for one hour at 350 degrees. Serves four.

NOTE: A caesar salad and garlic toast are possible accompaniments. The only fat in this recipe is from the cheese and that is minimal. Approximate preparation time is 20 minutes.

CLARIFICATION: The recipe for Fat-Free Fresh Fruit "Shortcake" that appeared in the May 13 edition of "Creative Dining" had a line of type missing from the directions. It should have read: Add to flour mixture; stir until smooth. Pour into prepared pan. Bake in 350-degree oven 20-25 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

nation of herbs," she said. "If it doesn't look good enough to eat, then it's not what we want to put out."

The planning process for the salon is extensive. Students actually began planning their entries over a month ago, and through trial and error, refined the final product.

The actual food preparation and cooking began last week. On Friday the students began their final cooking, and were prepared to work right up until the time their plane left for Chicago.

"We're going to fly, but the food will be driven in a refrigerated truck," said Hugelier.

The final setup in Chicago was done at 2 a.m. Saturday.

But the most difficult part of the whole process is coordinating the logistics. How do you move 400 to 500 pieces of food in 85-degree weather some 250 miles, and keep it fresh? Throw in directions for the students, travel, lodging, displays and tools, and you've got a nightmare on your hands.

"In the end, you do what has to be done," said Hugelier, a sentiment his students echoed.

That the lessons of the teacher were so well taken goes to prove that winning isn't everything.

Update of popular book debuts

Twelve years ago, Mimi Sheraton published *From My Mother's Kitchen, Recipes & Reminiscences* of her loving family and the times and foods they shared.

This memoir of family recipes includes traditional Jewish cuisine, Austro-Hungarian baking, and a wide array of seafood and shellfish dishes. Now, the cookbook has been expanded, revised and re-released with additional salad recipes and a new chapter on Jewish-Chinese food.

In Sheraton's second edition of *From My Mother's Kitchen* (Harper Collins Publishers, \$22.50, hardcover), she adds recipes that satisfied her family's yen for Chinese dishes including descriptions of how her mother prepared them as a creative use of leftovers. Although it is impossible to find Egg-Roll Blintzes and Chinese-Romanian Tenderloin Pepper Steak served at your average Chinese take-out or in a traditional Jewish home, you will find them in this revised edition.

Sheraton combines the tastes of two cultures by adding a Jewish twist to East Asian recipes of Subgum Chicken Chow Mein and Shrimp with Lobster Sauce. It seems like an unusual mix, except that both cuisines share the common use of chicken broth, celery and onions tea and dishes seasoned with garlic.

Sheraton comes from an Austro-Polish Rumanian-Jewish family of food lovers and cooks. *From My Mother's Kitchen* is not a kosher cookbook but includes recipes for traditional Jewish dishes as well as those that are strictly American. Each recipe is linked to a family gathering, where

the talk of food was as plentiful as the feast that was offered.

Formerly restaurant and food critic for The New York Times, Sheraton is the food editor and restaurant critic for Conde Nast Traveler magazine and has for the last 30 years written about food, travel and design. Sheraton has been trained in cooking at Cordon Bleu in Paris, China Institute in New York and privately in Bangkok, Istanbul and Beirut.

HALIBUT SALAD WITH DILL

My mother liked to serve this as a main course at luncheons. "They all thought it was crab meat," she would boast if it had been particularly successful. While no one could quite make that mistake, if the fish is firm and not finely minced it does have a meaty texture that can let it pass as mock crab meat for those who are kosher and cannot eat shellfish. Generally it was prepared as it is described here, but sometimes my mother added shrimp for a touch of additional flavor. The same recipe works well for a salad made only of shrimp, crab meat, or lobster meat. It was also a favorite sandwich filling on toast or thinly sliced pumpernickel.

1 quart water
1 large stalk celery with a few leaves
1 thick slice lemon
5 or 6 peppercorns
Salt
3 pounds halibut, preferably cut in a thick

steak or chunk with center bone in
2 or 3 teaspoons lemon juice
¼ to ½ teaspoon white pepper
2 tablespoons minced fresh dill
¾ cup mayonnaise, as needed
Boston or romaine lettuce

Bring 1 quart of water to boil with the celery, lemon slice, peppercorns and 2 tablespoons salt. Gently lower the fish into the boiling water, then cover the pan and reduce the heat until the water is at a barely perceptible simmer. Poach the halibut for 10 to 12 minutes, depending on thickness, until firm and white through to the bone; do not let it fall apart, but be sure there are no traces of blood close to the bone. Remove from the liquid and drain. Let stand until cool.

Trim off the skin and break the fish away from the bone. Remove all small bones from the edges if there are any. Working with two forks or your fingers, break the cooled fish into small clumps or pieces. Try not to shred or mash it. Sprinkle with 2 teaspoons lemon juice, a pinch of salt, and white pepper. Add the dill and toss lightly with a fork to distribute the seasonings. Add the mayonnaise and fold it in gently with a wooden spoon, being careful not to break the fish any more than you have to. There should be enough mayonnaise to bind the mixture, but it should not be a creamy excess. Check the seasoning. Chill thoroughly, preferably 5 to 7 hours. Serve on cold, crisp, washed leaves of Boston or romaine lettuce. Yield: 6 servings.

Awrey to halt pastry sales

Cookies, cakes and other sweets produced by Awrey Bakery will be available in only one retail location—the company's thrift store in Livonia—after Saturday.

Plans announced by Awrey in March to freeze pastry as it came off the line, then wholesale to an independent distributor for delivery to 800 retail outlets in Michigan never materialized.

"In exploring the economics of the whole program, it wasn't feasible for the distributor, retailer or us," said Rick Pedit, Awrey president.

No additional job losses beyond the 95 announced in March will result from plans to cease retail operations, said Betty Jean Awrey of Northville, spokesperson for the family-owned company. More than 400 will continue to work at the bakery.

Over 80 percent of Awrey's sales in recent years has been to national chains in the hospitality in-

dustry. Major customers include Marriott Foodservice Management Corp. and American Airlines.

Awrey has been looking for ways to streamline its production process and better incorporate its local business into an expanding national line. A distribution change was a big part of that strategy.

"Our primary objective was to merge production systems," Pedit said. "It's a bittersweet decision. Obviously, it is difficult to leave behind our retail tradition, but the market has changed."

"Our national food service and contract manufacturing businesses have evolved to the point where they represent a majority of our overall business. We are now ready to focus all of our efforts and resources on these areas," he said.

Only products Awrey bakes for food service clients will be available in the thrift store. The keepers include Long John Coffee Cake and Date Nut

Bars. Sugar cookies, oatmeal cookies and fruit coffee cakes will be discontinued.

Awrey is checking into the possibility of selling its most popular products in in-store sections of retailers' stores.

Pedit declined to comment on specifics under consideration.

Gilbert Borman, spokesperson for A&P/Farmer Jack, said that while displaying Awrey brands in-store wouldn't be consistent with that company's practice of baking from scratch internally, he wouldn't speculate on what the future might hold.

"I know there's a demand for Awrey products. It's a good name in the marketplace," Borman said. "We've only done business with them for 60 years. There's a strong relationship there."

Veri-Best of Ferndale has been producing, marketing and distribut-

ing bread and bun products with the Awrey label since November after acquiring licensing rights.

"The company is profitable, and has been for 15 or 20 years and today (Monday) as we speak," Pedit said. He declined to reveal sales or income figures, but *Crain's Detroit Business* reported 1989 sales of \$53 million.

Whenever you seafood, you should eat it

For many people, fish begins and ends with canned tuna.

The next time you're in the store, look around. There are more than 150 fish varieties, either fresh or processed, available.

Good nutrition is the key to good health so be adventurous. Try adding fish and seafood to your menus.

Because fish products are easy to digest, they play a major role in the diets of young children and the elderly, where the ease of digestibility is critical. Fish products also can supply many of the nutrients that are required.

Fish or shellfish are excellent sources of high-quality protein. Most fish and shellfish fall into the low-fat, high-protein group. These have less than 5 percent fat and more than 15 percent protein. Included are tuna, halibut, cod, flounder, haddock, pollack, mullet, ocean perch, whiting, crabs, scallops, shrimp and lobster.

Tuna and meat are even better sources of protein. White meat albacore tuna is a good source for the now-famous oils known as Omega-3 fatty acids.

Medium-fat high-protein fish contain 5 to 15 percent fat and more than 15 percent protein. At 15 percent fat, they are still less than meat. Besides, the fat is the polyunsaturated type. Included are anchovies, herring, mackerel, salmon and sardines. These fish are also rich in vitamins A and D.

Shellfish are considered lean. Only shrimp remains relatively high in cholesterol. However, a 3-ounce serving is only one-third the cholesterol in one egg yolk.

Generally, seafood is low in calories and is a good source of complete protein. Besides supplying many minerals, including phosphorus, iodine and calcium, all seafood supplies B-complex vitamins.

Fish may be cooked in a variety of ways, poaching, steaming, baking, broiling, pan frying or microwaving. Almost any fish can be used in any recipe. Buy whatever type or species of fish is available, frozen or canned.

Do not overcook seafood. Fin fish cook in 6-12 minutes per inch of thickness. Cook fish only until it is firm, still juicy and has turned from translucent to opaque (like cooked egg whites). Cooking fish until it flakes can make it tough and dried.

Seafood tastes great with many herbs. Basil, bay leaf, dill, oregano, paprika, pepper, tarragon, thyme, rosemary, sage, marjoram, chervil, chives, fennel, ginger or garlic are nice complements to fish. Marinades, sauces, condiments and flavored butters also complement fish but can add calories.

Seafood can be extremely helpful to dieters. Serve a seafood appetizer or soup before dinner to cut your appetite. Try boiled shrimp spritzed with lemon juice, or smoked salmon with a tray of fresh vegetables.

Surimi products are an inexpensive addition to a diet plan. Surimi is made from white fish (probably pollack) and is low in calories. These products have been made to taste like imitation crabmeat. Surimi is a low-calorie addition to an appetizer or a hot or cold soup. If you buy a pre-cooked product such as crab, shrimp or surimi, plan to serve it chilled or simply warmed through. Do not overcook.

To purchase fish, use this guideline per person: three-fourths to one pound whole or drawn fish; one-half to three-fourths of dressed or clean fish; one-third to one-half fillets or steaks; one-fourth to one-third pound of cooked crab meat, lobster meat and raw scallops. Figure one to two pounds of live lobster per person or 6-12 oysters, depending on size.

Keep refrigerator and shellfish loosely wrapped in the refrigerator and cook within one to two days. If it is frozen, keep in original wrapper, thaw in refrigerator and use immediately. Never thaw and refreeze fish since this will cause moisture loss, texture and flavor changes. It's not a good idea to thaw fish in the microwave because parts may start to cook.

Some studies suggest that as few as two fish meals a week may decrease the risk of developing heart disease. Don't limit yourself just to canned tuna, as good as that may be for you.

ABC to present 75th running of Indianapolis 500

Speeds set at trials already topping records

If the speeds posted during the time trials are any indication of things to come, this year's Indianapolis 500 promises to be one of the fastest and most competitive in the race's 75-year history.

Records began falling on the first day of practice for the biggest single-day event in racing, which will be televised live on ABC Sunday, May 26, when three-time champion Ricky Mears shattered Emerson Fittipaldi's qualifying record with a sizzling four-lap average of 227 mph. In fact, five other drivers were clocked at speeds in excess of the 223.8 mph record, including defending champion Arie Luyendyk, 1989 winner Fittipaldi, Gary Bettenhausen, Mario Andretti and son Michael Andretti.

Those showings are a far cry from the inaugural race in 1911 when Ray Harroun piloted his Marmon Wasp the 200 laps around the fabled Brickyard with an average speed of 74.6 mph. It wasn't until 1930 that Billy Arnold crashed the 100 mph barrier, and it was another 35 years before Jim Clark exceeded 150 mph in his Lotus Ford. Last year Luyendyk smashed the old record set by Bobby Rahal in 1986 by over 15 mph with an average clocking of 185.9 mph.

The sentimental flavor created by the presence of such longtime veterans as Fittipaldi and Darrell Waltrip intensified earlier this month with living-legend A.J. Foyt passed his mandatory physical exam and was cleared by doctors to drive in his 34th Indy, which he has indicated will be his last. The 56-year-old Foyt, sidelined since he suffered extensive injuries to his arms and legs in a crash last September, is racing's all-time winningest driver with 67 victories on the CART circuit. His four Memorial weekend victories tie him

for first place with Al Unser atop the list of Indy champions.

Mears, a three-time winner who finished first in 1979, 1984 and 1988, will be looking to join that elite group of two after almost accomplishing that feat in 1989. That year a clutch problem sent him to the pits as he battled Fittipaldi and Al Unser Jr. for the lead. Fittipaldi, one of this year's favorites along with Mears, Unser and Luyendyk, survived a tire-bumping incident less than two laps from the finish line that sent the junior Unser into the wall and out of the race as Fittipaldi took the checkered flag.

More than 300,000 racing fans are expected to converge on Indianapolis to watch the field of 33 drivers burn rubber for more than

\$4.5 million in prize money. Millions more will be tuning in to ABC for live race coverage complete with commentary by three-time Indy winner Bobby Unser and racing experts Paul Page, Sam Posey and Jack Whitaker.

This will be the sixth consecutive year that ABC Sports, which has earned four Emmys for its Indy specials, has presented live coverage of auto racing's most prestigious event. From 1971 through 1985, ABC provided exclusive same-day network coverage, and prior to that the race was carried on a delayed basis on "ABC's Wide World of Sports." This year ABC will be in the pits, the hospital area and garage to bring up-to-the-minute reports in addition to the telecast of the race.

ABC Sports televises the 75th Indianapolis 500, the greatest auto race in the world, Monday. Defending champ Arie Luyendyk heads a field of 33 drivers.

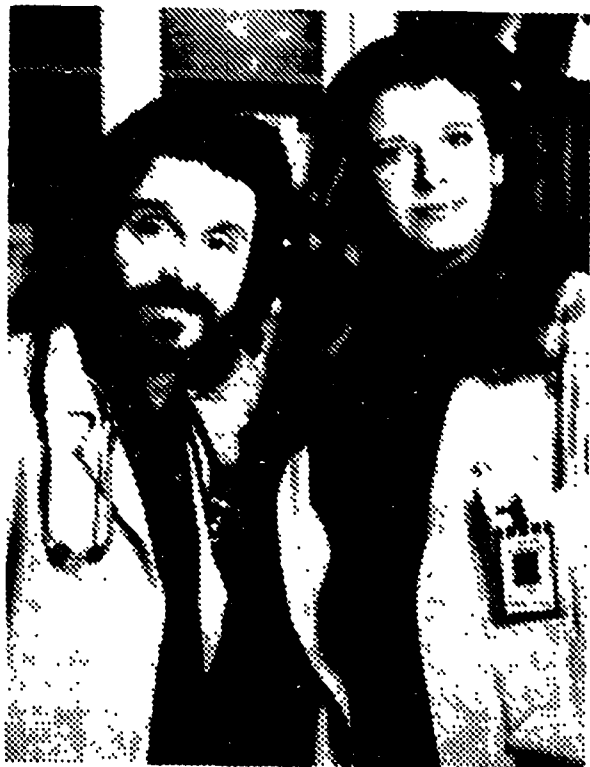
