A new superintendent will be working in Northville schools by Jan. 1, 1991, if all goes according to

The Northville school board established a timeline Monday that should lead to approval of a superintendent contract by Oct. 4. A new superintendent is expected to be in Northville by January.

Retiring Superintendent George Bell will end his nine-year stay in Northville on July 31.

Northville residents interested in suggesting the qualities they would like to see in a superintendent will get their chance on June 3 and 4.

Township, BFI eying sewer swap

Northville Township and a national solid waste firm are eying a deal to swap excess township sewer flow capacity for perks worth millions of dollars.

Township residents would receive free curbside recycling, a cash payment aimed at reducing township sewer bond obligations and a landfill moratorium on property owned by Browning-Ferris Industries, Inc., the township's collaborator in the deal, township Supervisor Georgina Goss said Friday.

In exchange, BFI would gain access to 110,000 gallons per day of Northville Township sewer flow capacity in the Western Townships Utilities Authority (WTUA) sewer sys-

tem now under construction.

The sewer capacity would be used by BFI's Arbor Hills East Landfill site Salem Township.

The proposed deal will be reviewed by the township board at a special 6 p.m. Tuesday session.

Final approval of the proposal must be granted by the WTUA board. Goss is chairperson of the WTUA board and said that body will review the deal in June.

BFI representatives approached the township about acquiring sanitary sewer rights earlier this year, Goss said. Township negotiators and BFI reached a tentative agreement

last week, she said. Goss called the sewer rights sought by BFI "excess flow that does

Rouge Rescue set for June 1

The annual Rouge Rescue cleanup returns to Northville and surrounding communities Saturday, June 1.

This year's local rescue is being coordinated by Recreation Director John Anderson, who has overseen the event for the past six years.

Anderson said the annual event typically draws many environmentally-minded volunteers in Northville. "We've been averaging around 60-70 volunteers," he said. There's usually a group from the high school . . . the timing's good for

some extra credit in science classes." Volunteers for the Northville rescue should call the Recreation Department at 349-0203 by Friday. May 31, to allow the department to provide enough equipment, food and support for the rescue. Volunteers 16 years old or older.

Workers are being asked to wear boots, long pants and long-sleeved shirts to guard against poison tvy, and report to the Recreation Building, 303 W. Main St., between 8:30-9 a.m. Saturday.

They will be driven to the cleanup site on Hines Drive south of Six Mile Road, due to the lack of parking around the area. A shuttle service will run between the Recreation Building and the site as needed throughout the morning, and lunch will be provided at the end of the cleanup.

Volunteers will be wading into the Rouge from Novi and Birmingham downstream to Canton and Westland, said Carol Weihe, executive director of the Friends of the Rouge. The Livonia-based non-profit group coordinates the regional cleanup and sponsors school education programs to foster environmental awareness.

Cleanup sites this year are not confined to municipalities. Weihe said. "We have 25 sites, and that includes about 20 communities, Oakland Community College's Orchard Ridge campus, and another learning institute, Cranbrook."

Several community groups are involved as well, including three Detroit neighborhood associations, the Bonnie Brook Golf Course in Detroit, and the Holliday Nature Preserve Association in Canton, Westland and Livonia.

The Friends of the Rouge is aiming year's cleanup. About 2,700 turned

Youth Forum completes fourth year

Local organizations involved with Northville youths wrapped up their fourth year of official interaction recently.

The Northville Youth Services Forum meets

monthly to ensure that services intended to benefit local young people are not duplicated. Its final meeting of the school year was held May 8. The program will begin next year on Sept. 11. Run by local psychologist Judith Walters, the

forum provides an opportunity for organizations to discuss what they are offering for Northville's young people. Northville Youth Assistance Director Mary Ellen King said the program began to avoid a duplication of services.

not impact present or future development in Northville Township.

"It's a small amount of the excess capacity we have in the WTUA sewer project, she said.

Northville Township's allotment in the WTUA sewer system totals 6.43 million gallons per day, said Deloris substantially lower Northville Town-

The WTUA system, which includes Plymouth and Canton townships, is scheduled to begin operations in

Goss said terms of the proposed deal includes "monetary compensation in excess of \$1 million that will

The \$1 million-plus would be placed in the township's water & sewer restricted fund to retire the sewer bond, Goss said.

Township project costs currently stand at approximately \$26-million of the total \$87-million WTUA sewer project package, said township Manager Richard Henningsen.

BFI also would agree not to construct landfills on property it owns in Northville Township, Goss said. BFI owns parcels totaling 131 acres on the southeast corner of Six Mile and Napier in the township.

The main benefit to township residents may come in a BFI plan to provide free residential curbside recycling for a "multi-year" period, Goss

Goss would not discuss details of the recycling proposal, but recycling bids tendered by BFI during a May 17 bid-opening for community solid waste handlers could reflect potential savings for residents.

BFI's bid for township recycling totaled nearly \$725,000 under a

four-year proposal.

'axon's effort to revive arts grants rebuffed

The state Senate rejected Sen. Jack Faxon's effort to re-establish the Michigan Council for the Arts (MCA) as a semiautonomous agency.

The Senate voted 15 in favor and 20 against the effort by Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, whose district includes part of Northville.

Faxon wanted to force the Senate Government Operations Committee to allow a full Senate vote on his resolution that would overturn Gov. John Engler's executive order putting the MCA under the Department of

An executive order stands unless overturned by the Legislature.

"Don't look at it as embarrassing the governor," Faxon told the Senate. "Look at it objectively. The governor's order has had a devastating effect on the cultural life of this

"Why has he (Engler) asked for the re-creation of the entire structure? Why do we need to abolish the arts council and re-create a new agency?

Faxon's discharge petition came as arts supporters rallied on the Capitol Building steps in Lansing for continued state subsidies.

In all, 18 Republicans and two Democrats sided with the governor in voting no. State Sen. R. Robert Geake, R-Northville Township, voted no.

Sen. Phil Arthurhultz, R-Whitehall, who chairs the Government Operations Committee, called Faxon's motion premature while saying he shared some of the sena-

Arthurhultz, Senate floor leader, addressed what he said appeared to be the big concern of the arts community — that under Engler's governmental structure, Michigan would be ineligible for grants from the National Endowment for the Arts.

But Arthurhultz reported that the NEA said that structure, moving the MCA to control of the Department of Commerce, does meet criteria for NEA funding.

Engler's plan consolidates the MCA, the Committee for Art in Public Places and the film office under the Department of Commerce. The MCA and the committee previously have been semiautonomous under the Department of Management & Budget.

The three agencies share related roles so they belong together, not only for administrative efficiency but also as


a cost saver, Engler says.

The open question, Arthurhultz said, is whether Engler will agree to matching state funds for the arts and to adequate staffing for the arts office.

Sen. Harry Gast, R-St. Joseph, who chairs the Appropriations Committee, asked Faxon, "Do you want cuts in home health care, foster care, mental health and ADC? If you do, dammit, get up and say so and stop all these

Replied Sen. Lana Pollack, D-Ann Arbor, "We can get the money from the Silverdome, aid to cities with race tracks, the lottery money — a lot of things which aren't priorities."

Cities with race tracks include Northville, Livonia and Hazel Park.

Whyman announces candidacy

A desire to promote professionalism and business-like sensibilities in government has convinced a Canton Township woman to pursue state

Deborah Whyman will run as a Republican candidate for 36th District state representative because "there needs to be a sense of accountabilty and professionalism" among state and federal elected officials.

Whyman, who has earned a master's degree in business and currently works in data processing. is a state Republican party precinct delegate and self-described "political person.
"I'm up on the issues," Whyman said Wednes-

day. "I'm concerned about what's going on in the schools (and about) red tape and bureaucracy in small business.

Whyman is slated to square off against a pair of would-be successors to former state representative Gerald Law. Law resigned his post in April to accept a job as Plymouth Township supervisor. man. She feels changes are needed to ensure qual-

Northville Township Supervisor Georgina Goss and Plymouth City Councilman Jerry Vorva are also announced Republican candidates. Filing deadline for 36th District hopefuls is May

28 at 4 p.m. A proponent of the "less government regulation,

more personal freedom" school of thought, Why-man is a strong advocate of Gov. John Engler's proposed — and stalled — 20-percent property tax

"Americans need to keep more of their money," Whyman said. "I support (the tax cut) now."

Many residents mouth the words but are not willing to follow through on tax-cut proposals, Whyman said. Real tax relief will not occur until eople realize such cuts can be painful.

Whyman was set to campaign for Goss, but a telephone conversation between the two changed her thinking.

"I disagreed with her on everything," Whyman said. She would not elaborate on the discussion.





Area residents honored by Livonia schools

JOAN BAHL

It could be the water in Northville, or it may have something to do with soccer.

Livonia teachers Mike Abbott and Joan Bahl don't know why two Northville residents were chosen to be teachers of the year in Livonia Public Schools, but they have their theories.

Bahl, a middle school teacher, and Abbott, a high school teacher, were each chosen as the Livonia district's teachers of the year. They each call Northville home.

"We decided it was the water," Bahl said. They both have daughters involved in soccer at Northville High School, which Bahl jokingly said also may fig-

ure into the equation. "We tell people, if you want to be teacher of the year, this is what you do," she said.

Bahl, an 18-year Northville resident, calls herself a late bloomer because she had 40 years to decide what she wanted to be when she grew up.

She has taught in Livonia for four years. She was hired after student teaching in Northville under the direction of middle school teacher Mary Freydl. Freydl is this year's

"kind of an ironic fact."

Bahl interrupted her career to raise four daughters.

She calls her time at home the "mommy years." Bahl teaches language arts and social studies, and she co-teaches a class mainstreaming special education students into a class for remedial students.

She also works facilitating Livonia teachers' professional development.

Bahl is not sure why she was chosen to be one of the three teachers of the year in Livonia, but it could be her enthusiasm for teaching middle school students.

"I'm so busy wondering what I can do for these little darlings. There isn't anything you can't teach them if you

use their energy," Bahl said.
Bahl, who has a life-sized portrait of Tom Selleck attached to a hanger in her closet, does not have trouble relating to students.

"I'm always surprised I get paid to do this. It is so much fun," she said. Abbott, a 32-year Northville resident, also relates well

to his students. He teaches students in an alternative high school program called Alpha.

Abbott, like Bahl, began his teaching career in Northteacher of the year in Northville, something Bahl said is ville. After two years with Northville schools, he went to

work in Livonia

He has worked on the Alpha program since 1978. The program teaches goal setting and problem solving in twohour blocks.

"I like to say it's the most important class you will ever take," Abbott said.

The program was begun as a strategy for fighting low attendance. Michigan law requires students attend school until they are 16 years old.

Before Alpha, students were being removed from classes for having too many absences. The biggest problem was some of the kids who were dropped from classes for poor attendance were under 16 and in violation of the

The Alpha program was designed to teach kids to lead more effective lives, Abbott said.

But the class is not just for students who have attendance problems. Half of the students in the program are chosen because they are good role models.

"People wonder, are we a class for losers?" Abbott said. But he enjoys teaching the class and said if it were a dumping ground his attitude might be different.

"I look at it as a leadership class," Abbott said. "We're soft on people, but we're big on issues.

Abbott teaches one two-hour Alpha class. When asked how he spends the remaining hours of the week, Abbott laughs. It is a question he has heard before.

Abbott has no trouble filling his days, or nights for that He works with the two other ALPHA teachers in Livonia

schools, acts as a counselor to the students in his class, he reads the journals that his students write, and meets with students when a crisis arises. "If they have a car maybe we meet at McDonald's." he

"It's a job that I can get a call in the middle of the night

from a kid kicked out of the house." His job is more of a lifestyle than a career, Bahl said.

Abbott will represent the district in a state-level teacher of the year competition. Abbott writes an Alpha newsletter and is on the Livo-

nia Education Association staff. He credits the visibility he receives as a result of those activities for his receiving the teacher of the year nomination.

Bahl and Abbott agree that they were not the only teachers qualifed to be Livonia's teachers of the year. "Any number of people could have been awarded this." Abbott said. "There are a lot of good teachers."



Hearing on reduction makes positive steps

public hearing June 13 to solicit response to a proposal to cut planning commission membership from nine to

Bravo on two counts.

First of all, the board should be commended for scheduling a public hearing without prompting. We've chided board members on occasion about shying from the public process, but recent public hearings on potentially controversial issues have proven effective public information tools.

A public hearing last month on a controversial ambulance switch and an April hearing on a proposed group home application provided residents ample opportunity to voice their views. Residents turned out en masse for the group home debate, but apparently cared not a whit about the ambulance issue.

And now they can speak out about the planning commission.

Township officials have kicked around the idea of cutting back on planning commission membership since vice chair Karen Woodside left in January. Officials originally intended to replace Woodside — Supervisor Georgina Goss even asked interested residents to submit resumes — but somewhere along the line, replacement evolved to reduction.

Township trustee and planning commission member Richard Allen first publicly mentioned the scale-back idea. and it quickly gained favor with other officials. Board members, with backing from planning commission Chairperson Charles DeLand, seemed to like the thought of a more streamlined planning body.

Goss has been careful to avoid public statements about the proposed move, saying she wants input from residents and the balance of the planning commission before a decision is made. That's the politically savvy thing to do, but since we're not running for office, we'll speak our piece now.

We support the move to a seven-

WAYNE COUNTY COMMISSION

The township board has called for a member commission because the body that reviews, considers and votes on township building projects has become too ponderous. Nine divergent personalities — eight at present — discussing, dissecting and sometimes showcasing their perceived dramatic abilities on site plan reviews are simply excessive.

Commission meetings too often have dragged until midnight or later, even with the now-standard scheduling of "spillover" sessions. Pontification - on the part of some planners and/or developers - is the culprit.

One need only hearken back to last summer, when planners racked up an astonishing amount of contemplation time over renovation of a gas station at the corner of Seven Mile and Northville roads. Planners literally took hours debating the merits of various styles of gas pump covers, awnings, landscaping, etc. Far, far too much time was wasted with other site plans steadily backing up on such a minor project.

Another problem with a nine-member commission is that five members are needed for quorum. Five are also needed to hear site reviews while the group holds at eight. Quorum problems have plagued the township commission of late, and a move to seven members would bump quorum requirements to

The township board presently plans to reduce the commission through attrition. Terms of four commission members expire by the end of the year, and decisions on the future of the group will be made at that time.

Actually, we'd like to see the commission whittled to seven now. For the most part, planners are a well-informed outfit, but exceptions exist. The township should cultivate its best representatives and weed out the rest. Politically, such a move could cause some problems; realistically, it could benefit the township.

Either way, residents have a wonderful chance to speak their piece. And they should not complain if they don't.

I'm a little incensed over the proposed land swap between the City of Novi and Amoco Oil Co.

But now I hear that the Amoco station will be closing down. In their infinite wisdom, the City of Novi and Amoco have settled for replacing the closed station with one station at Novi and Twelve Mile, and another at Twelve Mile and

I could go to the Amoco on Six Mile and Haggerty. That would resolve the convenience issue. But if you want someone to pump the gas for you there it'll cost you six bucks a gallon or something like that.

There was plenty of conversation at last week's Novi City Council meeting over the issue of putting two stations on Twelve Mile. For the most part it was agreed there was a lack of gas stations on that corridor.

But what about Grand River? Now where do you go for gas on Grand River? Or the whole southeastern corner of Novi for that matter?

To be honest. I've got a better selection of supermarket chains within a mile of my house (A & P. Meijer, Shopping Center Market and Farmer Jack) than I have among gas

I don't need that kind of choice among supermarkets, but if you or your car are finicky about gas the way I am, you know more choice is needed.



Treat your flag properly today

The current wave of patriotism prompting the display of the American flag also could result in some instances of improper display.

For instance, although the flay may be displayed 24 hours a day, it should be properly illuminated at night. If the flag is to be flown during bad weather is should be made of an all-weather

The protocol is established by the Federal Flag Code enacted as Public Law 94-344 by the 94th Congress on July 7, 1976.

Among the items of protocol specified include: It is the universal custom to display the flag in the open only from sunrise to sunset. When a patriotic effect is desired, the flag may be displayed 24 hours a daily if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness.

 The flag should not be displayed on days when the weather is bad unless an all-weather flag is

 The flag should not be draped over the hood. top, sides or back of a vehicle or of a railroad train or boat. When displayed on a car the flag should be fixed firmly to the chassis or clamped to the right

• No other flag or pennant should be placed above, or if on the same level, to the right of the American flag.

• The flag of the United States should be at the center and at the highest point of the group when a number of flags of states or localities or pennants of societies are grouped and displayed from staffs. The American flag should be hoisted first and lowered last.

• When flags of two or more nations are displayed, they are to be flown from separate staffs of the same height and should be of approximately equal size. International usage forbids the display of the flag of one nation above that of another in time of peace.

 When displayed horizontally or vertically against a wall or in a window, the union should be uppermost and to the flag's own right (the observer's left).

• The flag should never be used as a covering for a statue or monument.

• When flown at half-staff, the flag should be hoisted to the peak for an instant and then lowered to half-staff and before it is lowered should be raised to the peak. On Memorial Day the flag should be half-staff until noon only. On other occasions a flag may be flown at half staff only by order of the President or of a governor.

When used to cover a casket, the flag should be so placed so the union is at the head and over the left shoulder. The flag should not be lowered into the grave and not allowed to touch the ground. • The flag should never be displayed with the union down, except as a signal of dire distress in instances of extreme danger to life or property. • The flag should not touch anything beneath it. such as the ground, the floor, water or

It should not be embroidered on such articles as cushions or handkerchiefs, printed or impressed on paper napkins or boxes designed for temporary use and discard. No part of the flag should ever be used as a cos tume or athletic uniform. A flag patch may be affixed to the uniform of military personnel, firefighters, policemen, and members of patriotic organi-



Phelps vineyard broadens appeal

Spring Valley, a small fold in the hills east of St. Helena in California's famed Napa Valley, is home to Joseph Phelps Vineyards.

When the winery project started in the early 1970s, only 175 acres of a 670-acre ranch were

planted with grape vines in order to preserve the natural beauty of Spring Valley.

In addition to the Spring Valley ranch, the winery owns a 50-acre parcel south of Yountville and a 30-acre plot in the Stags Leap District planted to cabernet sauvignon. Additional cabernet sauvignon, merlot and cabernet franc are planted on 35 acres west of Rutherford. A 40-acre Carneros sight has been planted with full chardonnay production expected in 1994.

Even these diverse holdings cannot satisfy the demands for Joseph Phelps Vineyards' wines, which include chardonnay, sauvignon blanc, gewurztraminer, johannisberg riesling, scheurebe, semillon, cabernet sauvignon, zinfandel and several native Rhone Valley varietals such as grenache, syrah and viognier sold under the Joseph Phelps Vin du Mistral label.

Phelps Vineyards is known worldwide for the vineyard-designated cabernet sauvignons from the Backus and Eisele vineyards. Insignia is a blend of at least 50 percent cabernet sauvignon and, depending on the vintage, may contain 10 to 40 percent merlot and zero to 30 percent cabernet franc. Insignia is considered one of the more exciting Bordeaux-styled wines produced in California. The 1987 Insignia carries a \$45 price tag.

However, when you refer to most exciting at Phelps, the Rhone-styled wines are in the fore. Winemaker Craig Williams has a personal passion for these wines. He has been producing syrah under the Phelps label since 1974. Since 1986, the Vin du Mistral (a reference to the windy conditions of the Rhone Valley) has been used as the special brand for Phelps' Rhone-styled wines.

Our work with syrah has been a journey of discovery," Williams maintains. "We've learned that if we employ production techniques similar to those for cabernet sauvignon or zinfandel, the wine is excessively tannic. We now imitate several Rhone vinification techniques including whole-berry fermentation, stem retention and gentle pressing to reduce tannin extracts."

Today, the wine is recognized as soft and approachable with heightened spicy flavors.

Tavel, a small Southern Rhone appellation, is famed worldwide for its grenache rose. With its recognizable color and fresh, lively, dry flavors, it is best consumed young and well chilled. The 1989 Vin du Mistral Grenache Rose produced from grapes grown in Monterey is a close rival of Tavei (see Wine Selections of the Week).

Condrieu, a small Northern Rhone appellation is the home of the celebrated white varietal viognier. In 1983, Joseph Phelps Vineyards obtained 10 vio gnier buds from the Experimental Fruit Testing Station in Geneva, N.Y. From those buds, they developed a "mother" block of two-dozen vines that has expanded into a 10-acre vineyard at the Spring Valley ranch. Currently, three acres are bearing and are the fruit source for a scant 200 cases of 1989 Vin du Mistral Viognier.

Production of Rhone-styled wines is miniscule compared to the wines bottled under the Joseph Phelps label, but it should be recognized as a milestone in California wine production. If Phelps and winemaker Williams are able to consistently pull off the exotic wildflower bouquet and delicate flavors of French viognier, we're in for a special treat in years to come.

WINE SELECTIONS OF THE WEEK

1989 Vin du Mistral Grenache Rose produced by Joseph Phelps Vineyards (\$12) is a blend containing five percent mourvedre, another Rhone varietal. The wine is pleasantly peppery and spicy and what we refer to as a "think light and drink right" wine. Serve it well chilled with summertime lentil or bean salads.

1987 Vin du Mistral Syrah produced by Joseph Phelps Vineyardsp (\$16) has distinguished toastedbarrel aromas with lively blackberry fruit character. Intense flavors mirror the aromas in a generous wine with good body, structure and finish. It will stand up nicely to barbecued red meat.

PLAYING WITH FIRE Cookoff is spice of life for chili lover

Check the charge on your fire extinguisher because the subject today is chili. We're not talking about the garden variety canned stuff. We're talking serious, footstomping, clear-you'r-sinuses chili.

There exist, in this world, people who view

chili the way a connoisseur views fine wine. They can detect subtle variations in flavor despite the combustion going on in their mouths and stomachs. And when these people get together for a cookoff, hang onto your 10-gallon hat because the competition is as fierce as an unbroken colt.

One such competitor is James Sgriccia of Northville. A veteran of seven years of chili cookoff competition. Sgriccia has done well with his "Day Later Chili." He competes four to five times a year.
There are about 20 of them that you can

get into around the state," said Sgriccia. "I Windsor, those kinds of places.

The big show is the annual North Central Regional Cook-Off, held at the Washtenaw Farm Council Grounds in Saline. The Saline cookoff is sanctioned by the American Chi Society. The winner there takes home a \$500 first prize, and earns the right to travel to California for the ACS national competition, pitting some of the best chili cooks in the country.

Some 80 cooks gather for the regional cookoff, and about 60 more come together for an unsanctioned competition on the sec-

In sanctioned competition, there are rules the cooks must adhere to. They must use meat, tomatoes and chili peppers in their chili, and no thickeners like beans, pasta or rice are allowed. They're given three hours to prepare their goods before the judg-

The unsanctioned or "renegade" competition is wide open, and anything goes. Cooks can use beans or anything else they can fit into the pot. Some even prepare vegetarian

from his unique preparation.
"I cook mine at a really fast simmer because you only get three hours," he said.
"Then after I boil it for an hour, I pull it off the fire and put it on a bed of ice to cool it down. Then just before we're ready for the judging, I reheat it."

Not all cooks agree with his method. "Others are skeptical," he said. "But I know when I make a bunch of chili at home. I like to come home and have chili waiting for me, and to have it reheated."

He has his own preferances on flavors,

"I like it meaty, thick and dark - and it will be dark if you use a lot of meat anyway." he said. "And chili should be hot, not like baby food. That's a balance you have to strike for the judges. His own chili recipe has changed many

times over the years, and he acknowledges that cookoff regulars change their recipes "I rarely do any radical things," Sgriccia

said. "The taste just changes on you, and you end up having to go back to square one. "Mostly I've cut things out of my recipe.

When I started I had so many things in it. but I've since eliminated a lot of things "When I have some little changes I want to make, I try it out on my brother and sister-

Sgriccia had the opportunity to judge the renegade competition this year at Saline, and he said it gave him a new perspective on the competition, too.

There's a lot of grumbling (among the cooks) that goes on after the names of the winners have been picked," said Sgriccia. That's especially true if you've tried theirs and didn't like it.

"After judging though, I can see how ran-

To place well, he said, it is essential to make it through the semifinals, where the field of 80 is trimmed to just 15 finalists. Sgriccia also thought that as a competi-

tor, he made a conscientious judge.

I was usually the last one finished judging at my table," he said. "I would swirl it around with the spoon, smell it, look at it, and then close my eyes and take a taste.

There were a lot of soupy chilis. And there were some that were extremely hot. One had so much garlic it was ridiculous. But there was a lot of quality, too."

As a competitor, Sgriccia respects a qual-

ity product. There's a lot of work, money and time that goes into it," said Sgriccia. "People have no idea what goes into it. But it's fun, and we always have a good time."

There's a lot of heartbreak, too. Many cooks go for years without even placing in

"It's amazing to me that some of the people can consistently finish well," said Sgriccia. "They're doing something right."

Sgriccia labored for three years before taking a fifth place in 1987. Then in 1988, he won twice. He also enjoyed third place finishes in 1989 and 1990. This year, after several tries, he earned his best finish in the regional cookoff, an 11th.

One of these days I'll go to California, and get kicked around out there," he said with a

A turkey gets you out of the kitchen

I don't want to cook on Memorial Day. In fact, there are lots of days that I get home too late to prepare a meal or eat a big lunch and just want a snack for dinner. A nice sandwich or salad will do just fine in these cases.

Tve discovered that cooking a turkey once every ten days or so fills a niche in my refrigerator. It doesn't have to be Thanksgiving or Christmas to enjoy a full-blown "holiday dinner. Turkey is less expensive now than around high demand times of the year.

There are many forms in which turkey can be purchased: legs, tenderloins, whole breasts, boneless roasts or the traditional whole bird. Cooking methods are not limited to the oven. Tenderloins can be sliced and sauteed as in a veal marsalla, or cut into cubes and skewered with vegetables for an excellent kabob; marinate the legs and barbecue; cook whole birds in the oven or

And the leftovers are marvelous. Turkey

salad, sandwiches, hash, soup, cool green salads with vegetables, sliced meat and cheese. The list could go on and on.

The most reasonable way to purchase turkey is a whole bird. If specific parts are wanted cut up the bird yourself at home. I remove the breast and stuff and roll it. Legs and thighs are great in a fricassee. Wings and bones produce excellent stock.

Roasting is the less labor-intensive method of cooking. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees. Place the turkey, breast side up, on a rack in a shallow pan. If desired brush the turkey lightly with oil or butter. Cover with a loose tent of aluminum foil made by tearing off a sheet slightly longer than the turkey. The tent prevents the bird from browning too much and helps to keep the meat moist.

After the first hour baste the bird with the pan drippings every 30 minutes. Basting is a matter of preference. If I'm not around the kitchen while the bird is cooking I just skip

the basting procedure. Allow 15-20 minutes per pound for an un-

stuffed bird under 16 pounds and 13-15 minutes per pound for those over 16 pounds. Remove the foil the last 30-45 minutes so the turkey browns nicely. Test for doneness with a meat thermometer at the thickest point in the thigh. It should register 180 degrees. Alternative, but as reliable, methods in-

clude piercing the thick part of thigh with a long fork. If the juices run clear the meat is done. Or, press the thigh with your fingers and move the leg up and down. If the meat is soft and the leg moves easily the bird is ready.

Allow at least 20-25 minutes of "resting" time outside of the oven before beginning carving. This allows the juices to be reabsorbed and not lost with the first knife cut.

If carving the turkey in the kitchen, not ceremonially, press the leg of the turkey away from the body until the joint snaps and cut the thigh and leg completely away from

the body with a sharp knife

Place the drumstick and thigh on cutting board and cut through the connecting joint Slice individually. Cut thigh slices parallel with the bone. Remove half the breast at a time by cutting along the center keel bone Slice breast evenly against the grain of the

If old-fashioned pomp and circumstance is important follow the above procedure, but instead of removing the breast make a deep cut, right to the bone, parallel and as close to the wing as possible Carve downward, mak ing slices as thin and uniform as possible

Stuffing and gravy are integral parts of a turkey dinner but not necessary if the bird is going to be used for a variety of purposes or meals. It is recommended that the stuffing is not cooked inside the bird for health reasons. It is impossible to have the dressing reach a temperature high enough to kill bacteria even when the thigh temperature reaches

tasty meat. Cook the dressing separately and moisten with turkey or chicken stock for the flavor of being roasted inside the bird.

Gravy is the final, and to many the most critical, step. There are four basic steps.


Remove meat from the cooking pan and pour meat juices and fat into measuring cup. Pour 1/2 cup fat into a clean saucepan. Discard the rest of the fat but save the juices. Pour 1 cup of stock made from giblets into a roasting pan and scrape to loosen the brown bits. Much of the flavor is pre-

sent in these pieces.

Over medium heat add 1/4 cup of flour to the fat and stir until smooth. Finally, stir in liquid from cooking pan to roux made from flour and fat. Add one more cup juices, stock or water, heat to boiling, stir until thickened and season to taste with salt and peppor.

I'm cooking my turkey on Sunday and enjoying the holiday on Monday. The rest of the week will be interspersed with leftovers, some will go into the freezer, stock will be made and nutritious meat will be available in an instant.

Pita the Great Everyone loves middle eastern specialty

Ten years ago, the Beirut Bakery served mostly Middle Eastern customers who grew up savoring the versatile pita bread.

'It wasn't as popular as it is now," said Iskandar Alex Wakim, one of the owners of the family-run

bakery based in Redford. Nowadays, people of all backgrounds enjoy the round, slightly chewy pita, which sometimes is

called pocket bread. Pita may be eaten plain, used as a food scooper or sliced open to form a pouch or pocket, then stuffed with meat or salad.

'As people became educated, the business expanded," said Wakim, who was born in Lebanon. A visit to the bakery on Schoolcraft Road just east of Beech-Daly can mean a crash course in Middle Eastern and Mediterranean specialties.

There are stacks of the popular pita, so prevalent in Lebanese and Syrian cuisines. There are stuffed grape leaves and tangy tabbouleh, a salad which mixes bulgur cracked wheat, parsley, tomatoes and onions in a dressing of olive oil and le-

Also sold is the so-called Lebanese pizza, dough topped with ground lamb, onions, tomatoes and onfection known as baklava.

The specialties are prepared fresh by members of the Wakim family, who emigrated from Beirut during the 1970s and came to Redford. Although they were trained for other jobs, they decided to open a bakery, "to keep everybody busy," said Iskandar's wife Hala.

"When we started the business nobody knew about bread," Hala Wakim said. "It took a lo' of experimenting. This is a family business. It keeps us

The bakery opened in 1979 at Schoolcrast and Inkster roads. It moved to its present, larger facility around 1983.

Although Beirut Bakery's breads are available in many supermarkets, "Many people prefer to come here to buy it," Hala Wakim said.

One new customer came in just days after tasting pita for the first time.

"I was on a flight," he said, picking up several packages of bread. The airline served us a sandwich on pita. It was good."

Pita is made with flour, water, yeast, salt and

spices. And trays of the sweet, honey-and-nuts sugar. It contain no fats or preservatives. The pocket is formed by steam which is gener-

ated during the baking. The dough is shaped and rounded by machine. It is baked quickly, at very high heat, in a conveyor oven. The dough puffs into a ball. When it cools,

the dough collapses, leaving a hollow center. "It comes out puffed like a football," said Iskandar Wakim, formerly of Redford, now living in Northville. The dough weakens in the middle. You cut it along the middle and it will open into a

Each pita is called a loaf. A large loaf, at 21/2 ounces, contains 185 calories. Party pita is somewhat smaller.

Pita is sold in packages of 10 loaves. A 1-pound, 9-ounce package sells for 85 cents in the bakery. Supermarket prices range from around \$1 to \$1.50 per package. Pita freezes well for six

'Miss Saigon,' Will Rogers' duel for top Tony honors

Broadway's stars roll with punches By Amy Schmidt

Broadway can be a nasty place. Take for instance last month's "I Hate Hamlet" incident in which Nicol Williamson lectured co-actor Evan Handler in front of the audience, then hit him with a sword during a dueling scene. Handler, outraged, walked off stage (undoubtedly to rehearse for "I Hate Nicol"), and an understudy finished the performance.

But don't expect high drama like that on Broadway's biggest night of the year: Tony night. The 1991 Tony Awards will be doled out Sunday, June 2, and everyone will exhibit their best behavior for CBS' cameras.

This year's big vote-getters are "Miss Saigon," a Vietnam-set "Madame Butterfly," and "The Will Rogers Follies," a kudo to the American actor and humorist. The two are tied with all 11 nominations each. Leading actors and actresses in both shows are contenders—Jonathan Pryce and Lea Salonga for "Miss Saigon" and Keith Carradine and Dee Hoty for "Will Rogers." (Despite rave reviews for his "I Hate Hamlet" performance, Nicol Williamson found himself left in the cold.)

A total of 27 productions opened this season, including 14 new plays, seven musicals, five revivals and one special attraction—a good year for Broadway. Playwright Neil Simon also won his first Pulitzer for "Lost in Yonkers."

Julie Andrews and Jeremy Irons will co-host the soiree. Both are acting-award vets. Irons won a Tony for "The Real Thing" and copped an Oscar this year for "Reversal of Fortune." Andrews has two Tony nominations to he credit and won an Academy Award for "The Sound of Music."

A montage of talents will help present the awards to the winners. On hand will be Joan Collins, Whoopi Goldberg, Steve Guttenberg, Audrey Hepburn, William Hurt, Raul Julia, Shirley MacLaine, Penn & Teller, Lily Tomlin, Carol Channing and Denzel Washington.




In 1977 she was a singer on Name That Tune and then co-starred in Hee






