Developer to get year grace period

Huntington Falls developers and Wayne County are nearing accord on a plan to extend by one year a \$32-million purchase agreement for 930 acres of county land.

Developers of the proposed multiuse development in Northville Township will be granted a one-year grace period to settle financial matters, county and Huntington Falls representatives said Tuesday.

The one-year extension is part of a plan that "obligates both (parties) to a lot of things," said Gary Roberts, architect and vice-president of the R.A. DeMattia Company, a principal in the Huntington Falls Limited Partnership.

Roberts would not discuss particulars of the proposed agreement, but said the county land "purchase price will increase."

The county and developers should finalize the agreement within two weeks, said Dewitt Henry, director of Wayne County Jobs and Economic Development.

Henry was also mum on details of the plan, which is pending review and approval of the Wayne County Commission.

"We're negotiating an extension of the contract," Henry said. "We have a general concept and are working out a deal.

The county and Huntington Falls representatives last fall signed an agreement which required the developers to pay \$300,000 up front, obtain local zoning by May 1991, and pay the county the balance of the \$31.75-million purchase price by mid-May 1991.

percent on existing property and new developments added another 4.25 percent increase to the tax rolls. Northville schools will gain an additional \$1.86 million in revenue over

this year if the millage passes. That's a 9-percent increase over last year's income from property taxes, bringing the district's total to \$22,497,265. If the millage fails, Superintendent

The resident, Daniel O'Keefe, was reportedly sitting on the CSX tracks north of Doheny Drive just before 3 a.m when the train approached from the north.

Engineer Jeffrey Carter and brakeman Herbert Lewis said they saw O'Keefe about 200 feet away



Dirt roads get chemical coating

Relief is on the way for dustplagued residents living on Northville Township's southern border.

The township board last week agreed to apply a coating of chemical road treatment to four gravel streets that connect with Five Mile Road.

The treatment will be sprayed on 13.4 miles of unpaved county road on Marilyn, Maxwell, Fry and Parklane "around the second week of June." said Eunice Switzler, township deAn application of liquid calcium

chloride will cost the township \$13,413.50, based on a bid tendered by South Huron Industrial of Flat

The township has long applied palliatives twice a summer to unpaved roads, but financial shortcomings forced treatments from the 1991 budget.

Officials saw the handwriting in the dirt, though, after residents and Wayne County officials began to squawk about roiling township dust

clouds.
"We're taking a rather strong beating from people (that live on gravel roads)," township Manager Richard Henningsen said.

Henningsen also said county offlcials threatened to apply palliatives and bill the township. Henningsen said palliatives would be "substantially more expensive" if the county handled the chore.

Acknowledging the township's razor-thin difference between budgetary black and red ink, board members opted to pay for one treat-

tude toward a second coating.

"Our back is against the wall (with the budget)," said Trustee Richard Allen. "I grant it needs to be done (but) we're between a rock and a hard

Supervisor Georgina Goss supported the treatment plans.

We do have residents out there who are suffering," she said. "I think it's critical."

The board promised to keep an eye on the four roads to determine if a late-summer application will be

Train runs into, kills a local man

from the train and blew the whistle. O'Keese stood up but appeared to slip on the rocks by the side of the track, falling backward between the rails, they said.

The engineer said he immediately initiated an emergency stop. The train came to a stop just north of Seven Mile Road.

The engineer knew he hit something - he heard the thud," said City Police Chief Rod Cannon. "They stopped and tried to locate the body . . . but they couldn't find him."

O'Keefe was apparently dragged

more than 40 feet, and was found on the west side of the tracks just east of the well after a half-hour search in the dark by city police and firefighters. Township police also assisted in the search.

The train was traveling at 43 mph in a 50 mph zone when it struck O'Keefe, according to Carter. City police gave the engineer a preliminary breath test at the scene, part of the police department's standard operating procedure after a fatality. His blood alcohol level was measured at 0.000 percent.

The train was kept on the scene until 4:40 a.m. while police inspected

the site. A pipe, tobacco pouch, matches and eyeglasses were found between the rails when the train left. Several beer cans, including a full one, were also found along the

The County Medical Examiner's office ruled the death accidental and listed the cause of death as multiple trauma. O'Keese sustained "a complete skull fracture, broken neck, internal organ tears and punctures as well as extremities fractures," according to the police report.

O'Keefe's closest remaining relative, a cousin, was notified of the accident that day. His dog, a poodle accident.

named Mr. Morrison, was taken from his home to a veterinary clinic in Northville.

The bearded O'Keese had been a common sight around Northville, riding his bicycle along the city's streets.







Legal suits pile up on Shores site.

One certainty has emerged from the troubled Shores of Northville development in Northville Township: Local attorneys and their families won't go hungry.

Then again, the planet's tree population might be threatened.

A flurry of legal paperwork inspired by the controversial Shores project has settled in Wayne County Circuit Court of late, including a request for declarative relief by Northville Township.

The township is asking the circuit court for the right to use approximately \$520,000 in an escrow account it oversees to repair on-site damage caused by developer relocation of Sump Drain, a tiny creek that winds through western township residential property before dumping into the Shores site.

Township attorneys filed the declarative relief petition last month, hoping to stimulate action that would lead to resolution of the sticky Shores

In its complaint, the township claims the Seven

Lakes of Northville Limited Partnership and the estate of the late Arthur Thomson are to blame for massive erosion and other on- and off-site damage related to the diversion of Sump Drain.

The development partnership purchased the Shores site - formerly a gravel pit - from the Thomson family in 1989. Under terms of a mining permit, the township held Thomson family funds in an escrow account as insurance that Shoressite reclamation would be handled properly.

The township says in its suit that a court order is needed to "proceed with with use of funds of Defendant Thomson for the purpose of rehabilitation and reclamation of the property

The township also asks the court to appoint a receiver to apply for state permits to allow the township to complete Sump Drain repair work, in part because: "Defendants have taken no action whatsoever to relocate the Sump Drain in such a fashion as to stop the damage from continuing to occur and that adjacent property owners continue to suffer damage . . .

Township attorneys served notice of the action to Shores representatives and Thomson attorney John Ashton last month.

Ashton immediately filed complaints against the township and Shores developers.

"We have answered the township (and filed) a counter-claim against the township," Ashton said

Ashton said he will ask circuit court to release

the half-million in the escrow account. "Basically, their request to use the escrow funds is not in keeping with the permit language," Ashton said. "In fact, most of the funds should (already) be returned."

The complaint against the developer is a pre-

cautionary measure, Ashton said.
"It simply means that whatever recovery is made, if any, that Seven Lakes be required to repay (the Thomson family)."

No date has been set for the declarative-relief judgment or the counter-claims, Ashton said. Ashton refused to say who should pay for damages on the Shores site. He said his concern is with

We did not do anything to the Sump Drain; Seven Lakes did that," he said. "The escrow account does not address using escrow funds relative to the Sump Drain."

Annual rescue nets tons

The local branch of the Rouge River is a cleaner place this week, thanks to the efforts of the volunteers who waded into Northville's stretch of the river Saturday morning for the sixth annual Rouge Rescue.

"Boy, did we rescue it," said Community Recreation Director John Anderson. "We had about 72 people out there working."

Anderson has coordinated the Northville rescue for the past six

Volunteers Saturday dragged tons of debris, mostly tree limbs, out of the stretch of the river that runs along Edward Hines Drive south of Six Mile Road. "We were able to load three 30-yard dumpsters full," Anderson said. We did find one tire, one trash can, one bird feeder, one pallet, and a lot of tree parts."

The dumpsters were provided by Waste Management of Michigan.

The volunteers were aided in their efforts by workers from a local landscaping firm that annually provides equipment for the event. "Seven (volunteers) were from Mountain Top Green Ridge Tree Service, and because we had so many of them, we were able to use the rest of the volunteers more effectively," Anderson said. "Because of that teamwork between the tree service and volunteers, we did end early . . . When we

started, there was a nice jam in the river, and when we were done it was

But local students accounted for the largest portion of the rescuers, as they typically do. The biggest group that was there was from Northville High School science classes," Anderson said, with most of those coming from teacher Mary Culik's science class. This always coincides with the end of school and some people need extra credit," he said.

We also had some dignitaries," Anderson said. State Sen. Robert Geake and an aide attended, as did Township Supervisor Georgina Goss. Manager Dick Henningsen, Treasurer Betty Lennox and Trustee Don Williams.

City DPW employees Paul Vertrees and Alan Zielinski also assisted, and with the help of two other volunteers removed a logiam upstream between Mill Race Village and the Ford Valve Plant.

"Right now, I'd say we're in pretty good shape as far as the river flowing through the public portions," Anderson said. There aren't any big jams at this time."

The Northville volunteer effort was part of an annual event involving 25 sites throughout the Rouge River basin. The effort is coordinated by the Friends of the Rouge, a Livoniabased non-profit group that also sponsors school education programs to foster environmental awareness.







Township engineering consultant Abe Munfah of Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May, said Painter & Ruthenberg appears to have the inside track for the township's wastehauling contract, based on bids submitted by five firms. "On numbers alone, their bid is the best," Munfah said

Painter & Ruthenberg have handled Northville city trash collections since 1981. The firm also collects garbage in Plymouth.

Munfah, who has spent much of the past two weeks attempting to sort out the township's complicated bid process, said questions regarding Painter & Ruthenberg's ability to secure landfill space must be answered before findings are forwarded to the township board.

"The best numbers are coming from Painter-& Ruthenberg, but I have some concern about their

ability to provide service over a five-year period," Munfah said.

The low bidder does not own a landfill, but claims Wayne Disposal will accept its trash; Munfah said.

Wayne Disposal operates a landfill near I-94 and Belleville Road. That landfill accepts hazardous waste — a more lucrative product than residential solid waste and Munfah wants assurances that Painter & Ruthenberg has ample disposal capacity.

Munfah said he was awaiting further comment from the apparent low bidder Tuesday. He said he expects to provide the township board a detailed breakdown of bid figures and a recommendation at its June 13 session. Other firms still in the running for the preferred status contract include Laidlaw Waste System Corp. of South-

field and Browning-Ferris Industries of Wayne.

Two other firms — City Management of Detroit and Waste Management of Michigan of Southfield - submitted bids considered too costly, Munfah said.

Under Component A, a portion of the bid process concerned with collection and disposal of residential solid waste, the bid tendered by Painter & Ruthenberg was

\$6.08 per month per household.

Laidlaw's bid was \$6.76; BFI's \$6.80 for the city and \$7.35 for the township; Waste Management's \$7.53; and City Management's \$10.98.

Painter & Ruthenbergs bid reaches \$7.18 per household per month by 1995-96. That figure is more than a dollar per household per month less than its competitors over that same period.

The low bidder's estimates hold true in other areas of the township's waste-hauling proposals. One exception

the residential recycling program.

Waste Management's bid for recycling services came in lower than its competitors, but Northville Township officials recently inked a separate deal with BFI that would provide township residents a free. four-year recycling

The township's decision to accept free recycling from BFI could isolate township and city collections, a proposal officials from both communities have eyed the past several months.

The township/BFI deal took city officials by surprise. and may send the city looking in different directions, said

Ted Mapes, director of the city's Department of Public Works.

"I don't know how to handle (the recycling issue)." Mapes said. "We were hoping we'd have a joint venture." Mapes said the city is awaiting results of the township's findings before deciding which path to take for its solid waste collections.

"It's just a little early to say," he said. When asked if the city might have to choose a course that differed from the township's, he said, "That's possible; maybe we could go with another city.

"The whole thing is up in the air," he said. Munfah said his firm currently is researching several

outstanding issues, including contracts the candidates have with other communities, the financial stability of ne potential haulers and the status of landfill space.

But Munfah feels he is close to a recommendation. "I hope I'll get a lot of these questions resolved (soon)," he said.

Northville Township has targeted Sept. 1 as its preferred status solid waste start-up date.

Officials ponder curbside recycling for city

What's good for the goose may not be so good for the gander, the Northville City Council has discovered.

The council on Tuesday tried to figure out how to provide the city with curbside recycling in light of the township's apparent abandonment of a joint curbside recycling contract with the city.

. Township officials agreed last week to give Browning-Ferris Industries a portion of its future sewer capacity in the Western Townships Utilities Authority sewer system for perks totaling in excess of \$2 million.

One of those perks requires BFI to provide township residents with approximately \$730,000 worth of free curbside recycling services for four years starting in 1992.

BFI also is in the running for the township's preferred-status trashdisposal contract.

contracting process earlier this year. hoping that the larger service area for solid waste hauling and curbside recycling would result in more favorable bids for both municipalities. But the recent surprise agreement between the township and BFI has left city council members wondering where to turn.

"Nobody knew this special arrangement was going to be made, except them," said Council Member Carolann Ayers, "and it just didn't work out the way we thought it would before the special arrangement."

The officials are also straining to figure out the bids submitted by the five waste haulers for trash collection and curbside recycling. The five were Painter & Ruthenberg of Inkster, City Management of Detroit, Waste Management of Michigan in Southfield, Laidlaw Waste System Corp. of Southfield and BFI.

"This one I wish I could explain,"

said Acting City Manager Mark Christiansen. "It was apparent that several of the bids had to be taken together, and we confirmed this with the bidders.

"Further analysis . . . was done to take into account what the township is doing with BFT.

The five bidders had been asked to provide bids on seven separate services, including collection and disposal of solid waste from residential units, commercial units, Northville Downs and special events, as well as a residential curbside recycling program, residential composting program, and servicing of a stationary recycling center.

The curbside recycling and composting are required by the Wayne County Solid Waste Plan, which requires individual communities to develop and implement solid waste and recycling strategies by specific. county-ordered dates.

The township also asked the bid-

ders to provide specific figures on city-only curbside recycling, foresha-dowing its eventual agreement with BFI to provide that service in the township.

Christiansen presented the council with a report on the city's analysis, prepared with the help of former manager Steven Walters, that attempted to make sense of the many

The report noted several "problems" resulting from the bios and the township's deal with BFI.

The Township's separate agreement with BFI leaves the City with no viable bid for curb-side recycling," according to the report, "since the City would have to pay a substantial premium to contract with BFI for that service, and Waste Management has advised that it cannot provide the service to the City — only at the prices which it bid to the City and Township

The report also noted that the BFI

contract would only provide the city with curbside recycling for three years, at which time the city would have to find someone to provide the service for the next two years while other parts of the contract were still

The report concluded, "it appears that if the Township is committed to the separate curb-side recycling agreement with BFI, then the best course of action for the city is to consider re-bidding for the entire refuse service package, preferably with one or more governmental units to provide a sufficient number of customers to be an efficient service area for

Christiansen said the next step may be a meeting between city and township administrators to determine the township's intent. "The administration needs to get with the township to get this straight," he If the township agrees to go with BFI for all its refuse needs, the city may have to look elsewhere, he said.

"It works to our disadvantage to accept the bid of BFI," Christiansen said. "BFI had a three-year contract. where Painter & Ruthenberg, Waste Management and one other had five years. This would leave us in the untenable position of having to go out for bids on curbside recycling again in three years . . . and force us three years down the road to rebid recycling only, and for the city only, which would leave us open to considerably higher rates.

Mayor Chris Johnson agreed, saying. There's an economy of scale for the total number of units to be served, and that's in the area of about 5,000 units . . . We still need the economies of scale with some other municipality to make this thing fly.

"It's something we may want to explore now."



McMahon holds a bachelor's degree in history from the University of Connecticut and a master's in social work from Wayne State University. He works for the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments as the manager of community and economic development.

His experience includes one full term on the board; serving as the board representative to Strategic Planning Strategy One Committee dealing with finance; two years as school board representative to Northville Youth Assistance; and two years as representative to Northville Recreation Commission. He serves as school board representative to the Metropolitan Association for Improved School Legislation.

Following is an interview on some of the issues facing the district. What do you see as the biggest issue facing Northville schools in

the next year? The number-one responsibility of the board of education is the selection of the superintendent of schools. That is going to be a major responsibility ... Not only have we lost (Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services) Burton Knighton. but also (Superintendent) George Bell. And the board's responsibility is providing leadership during the interim as well as the selection. I think that is the No. 1 issue, the selection of the superintendents.

What are you looking for in a superintendent?

Another George Bell. A lot of the qualities that George showed over the last nine years, involvement in the community, his grasp of the Northville community, his awareness of the issues before they even come before the board. It seems like he's always one step ahead of us as far as anticipating what's coming down the road so we're all prepared to respond to those situations. He's been an excellent superintendent over the last nine years. To replace him is going to be a task. I would say that is number one

about the millage in June, but we're (also) talking about a renewal during (next) year because that is only a oneyear mill. That's going to be another issue.

And I think the third would be the continuation of the Strategic Planning process. We're completing our first year, and we just received the First Annual Update and we have the recommendations for the 1991-92 period. I think that's going to take a lot of our time as well, making sure we stay on track.

What about hiring a new high chool principal? How important is that going to be this year?

That's another issue. With that whole transition, with (high school principal David) Bolitho taking Knighton's job, that's a very key issue as George mentioned, and as (board President James) Petrie mentioned. That's a very key position. That's going to be another task that is going to be before the administration and the board: replacing Bolitho at the high

What are you looking for in a principal?

I think it's a continuation. There have been a number of improve-ments over the last several years, and I think it's a continuation of that. I guess we have an excellent example: Bolitho. The administration is the one that's responsible for replacing the principal. They've identified the characteristics of the person, what the job requires.

It's the function of the superintendent, one of his responsibilities to hire that person. It's the board's responsibility to oversee that process, but we don't do the hiring. There's a fine distinction between the administration of the district and providing policy direction to the superintendent. The only person we hire is the superintendent. The superintendent then hires, in this case, the principal. So, hopefully we'll have some-body in place by September. I think that's the timetable the administration has.

So, when you ask "what are the characteristics," I think that's spelled out in the job description. Those are the characteristics that the new principal should have. The selection and the hiring of that person is the responsibility of the superintendent.

How big of an issue do you consider state funding of schools to be for Northville?

It's one of the reasons we're only going to go for one year. You know, we're going for a renewal for one year because one doesn't really know what's going to happen.

funding of education?

The district is a member of this Metropolitan Association for Improved School Legislation. It's a group of school districts in western Wayne County and southern Wayne County that meets on a regular basis. monthly, to monitor legislation. Not only funding, but also school quality. reorganization leglislation, to monitor the impact it's going to have on Wayne County and on our district.

I serve on a Michigan Association of School Boards state legislation committee. I'm on my second year. The function of that group is to really monitor legislation to provide direction to the staff of the Michigan Association of School Boards on testifying or lobbying. I guess that's basically what they do, giving presentations before committee hearings on legislation.

So, I think, as individuals and as a board we're trying to stay on top of this, c.1 what's happening in Lansing, but it's difficult. From one day to the next you really don't know what's going to happen. We're going for one year, during that year a lot is going to happen. There could be tax base sharing. We really don't know. We have to go back to the voters in a year. and I think it's going to be as uncertain a year from now as it is now. That is a major problem. They're problems, but they're also opportunities.

How would you feel about a constitutional amendment requiring equitable funding of school

. . Education is a state function. School boards and districts were formed to carry out that responsibility which is a state function. Currently, I think the state provides approximately 40 percent of the total funding for education in the State of Michigan. Sixty percent is picked up by the local districts. It's quite different in most other states where it's closer to 50/50. In the case of Minnesota, it's 60/40. Sixty percent of the funds come from the state. In those

What can you as a school board districts or those states where there member do about stabilizing state are more funds coming in from the state, they tend to allocate more funds to provide equitable funding between districts.

In this state they can't do that because they don't have the resources. So, what they're left with doing is the Robin Hood approach, taking from wealthier districts and providing those funds to the poorer districts, the in-formula districts. They take it from the out-of-formula and give it to the in-formula. The whole method of financing education in this state is such that it needs to be looked at. It isn't providing adequate funding for the education of the kids in this state. That's a state issue. In this district where over 90 percent of the funds are locally derived, they're not from the state, it's a local issue. I would like to see the state get more involved in the funding of education.

But would you like to see the state require that the same dollar amount is spent on every student in the state?

There are several proposals in Lansing. With several of them there is a floor. Well, right now there is a floor. Let's say \$4,000 for each student. Each district would have the opportunity to provide additional funds. If a district wants some special programs or whatever, that opportunity should be there. I think the state should guarantee a set amount of dollars for each child. Right now they're doing that, but what they guarantee is too low.

(With current funding), you have some districts that are at less than \$2,000 per child and then there are other districts that are at \$7,000 per child. The way you do it, you don't take the \$8,000 and bring them down. What you try to do is provide more funds to the in-formula school districts to increase funding. Would a constitutional amendment be the answer? I doubt it. Because even if there is a constitutional amendment, where do you find the resources. The state doesn't have the money.

Do you think this year's millage

proposal in Northville is something the voters will be able to accept?

If it's voted down, there is no money for opening the schools. There would have to be another

election. Which is expensive. Every time

you go to the voters for another election it just delays. Do you expect the millage to

pass as it is proposed right now? I believe so, because it's really holding the millage for one year. This is where we are at the end of this year. I think the voters will support it.

If you had been able to recommend a less-conservative budget, what kind of programs would you have wanted added to the district?

First of all, we would have to go back to the Strategic Plan. There are a number of elements in there. The school day, a number of activities suggested. When you're talking about evaluating the high school program and implementing changes, some of the changes are going to cust money. I think that is one thing. There is a cost in every one of these things. The continuation of the software, bringing that on board. There is the improving the curriculum.

Improving what in the curriculum?

I was going to bring up the point about the cost of books. When I was first on the board four years ago, as part of the curriculum subcommittee they bring in books. I remember back then, four years ago, they would be like \$25 a book, \$26. The other day, we received some requests for additional books. I think it was chemistry. biology and one other area. It was \$43. \$44. \$45 a book. That's the cost. Everything is going up in cost. You're going to invest in these new books, if you want to keep your curriculum up to date. It's going to cost money.

tary school that we have to start thinking about. That's going to be a cost. That's 'wo years down the road. The other area, not knowing where the state's coming from as far as recapture, I think it's advantageous to the district to have a reserve. I think we have to protect that reserve. That's another issue. We need that. Not only because we can't anticipate where the state's coming from, but also anything that happens where you might use those resources.

Why do you want to be on the school board?

Four years ago when I got involved. I offered my service to the district. saying I'd like to be involved in the district as a member of the board of education because I felt at that time I had a great deal to contribute. After four years. I've been treasurer, secretary and vice president over that period of time. I think I've gained a great deal of knowledge on what this system is all about. I think I've contributed a great deal and I can contribute a great deal more.

The other thing is, as I mentioned, one of the most important functions of the board is the selection of the superintendent. Candidate runs for Petrie's position

Newcomer Richard Brown, 47, is running uncontested for the four-year school board seat currently held by Jim Petrie, who decided not to seek reelection.

A 13-year Northville resident. he has three daughters: an eighthprader at Meads Mill Middle School, a 10th-grader at Northville High School, and a freshman at Northern Michigan University who attended Northville

Brown holds a bachelor's degree in labor relations from Cornell University and a master's degree in industrial labor relations from the University of Illinois. He has worked for Ford Motor Co. for 22 years, currently serving as employee relations manager in the public affairs department.

His experience includes serving on the district's Strategy One Strategic Plan Committee dealing with funding since the committee was formed two years ago.

Following is an interview with Brown on issues facing the district. What does the Strategy One committee do for Northville schools?

Strategy One is one of the eight strategies, but it's primarily financing. I think the key one is state funding of education. But more so, and more importantly, was trying to increase tax base within Northville and not to the homeowner — we get that without advertising - but through commercial and industrial properties. The DeMattia sale six months ago of that tract of land north of (Five coming up June 10, 22.63 mills, the

Mile) will considerably help our tax base. And (recently) in The Northville Record, 16 acres donated (near) the police station and the old prison being shut down and all that for commercial and industrial. All that will help us as taxpayers.

What can the schools do to encourage that kind of development?

We have a very good relationship with both the city and the township planning commissions and the city governments. They understand our positions. (Superintendent) George Bell has gone to the township planning commission. I know specifically, to talk about how we need to enlarge our retail, commercial and industrial tax base. Unfortunately, I don't have the exact figures, so I don't want to quote it. Most of our taxes are paid by homeowners. You go to Novi, Livonia, Plymouth/Canton, they have a very large industrial tax base to draw upon, and, therefore, taxpayers and individual homeowners don't have to pay quite as much. We need to reduce that more, but again, controlled growth. If someone said you have McDonald's down on Six Mile, we'd prefer office buildings, like the industrial park DeMattia has.

What do you see as the biggest issue facing Northville schools in the next year?

I think there are two issues. The first one certainly is financing. Financing both in the short term, the 1991-92 school year, and in the longer range, which is really a state problem.

We have a renewal of our millage

same as we had last time. That has to pass. It's either zero or 22.63, nothing in between. I feel confident the homeowners, the parents understand that is necessary. That will

take us through one year. The state can still promptly recapture some of the money they are providing to us now indirectly through pensions. That's the really large chunk of money they could take away from Northville. Last year, as you know, it caused chaos when we had to have a special millage in late September to get back the money they recaptured, which was social security.

Short term is the passage of the millage. Longer term, some way, I wish I had a solution. I don't have a solution that's going to solve state funding of education. Very controversial. There are a number of bills pending.

But a principle is rather than take from the rich to give to the poor, let the rich stay where they are, bringing the poor up to our standards, versus bringing our standards down to average out the total. I think it's very, very important that everyone can attempt to come to the level of education in Northville.

How would you feel about a constitutional amendment requiring equitable funding of school districts in Michigan?

I'm not sure what equitable funding means. Right now, the state already has something in place that says every school is entitled to X dollar amounts. We're out-of-formula schools. We're above that X dollar amount. I think in any way, shape or form, a constitutional amendment

would hurt the good school districts, has been through the process. I think the Grosse Pointes, the Birminghams, the Bloomfield Hills, the Northvilles. There needs to be some other method rather than Robin Hood, take from the rich and give to the poor. I don't have the solution right now. I think we have to be diligent in following the legislature in what they propose to make sure it does not do harm to Northville.

But let me get back to the first part. You asked what is one of the major problems, major concerns. Let me answer one other one, because it is immediate. We have two vacant positions. George Bell on July 31 will retire, and (Northville High School principal) Dave Bolitho at the end of June will get a new position. That is in the immediate future two very important positions that need to be filled. It's something that I'm going to get deeply involved in and have been already. As a proposed trustee for the school board, I've been invited to all the meetings, and that would be true of anybody who was running for election. So I'm in the process already of deciding how we're to go about searching for a principal.

What kind of recommendations will you make to the board when it's looking for a new superintendent and principal?

Well, as far as background, certainly someone who has worked with the Strategic Planning. Someone who understands that this is your guideline, this is your roadmap for operating the school system. Someone who


that is critical. We do believe in excellence in education. I think we have some good internal candidates, but we're going to do a much wider search than just Northville schools to make sure we have the best, and to see what else is out there. So in that respect we will do a nationwide search to see who might be available.

Why do you want to be on the school board?

Well, let me generalize initially. Philisophically, I believe anybody in a community should give something back to that community to make it a better place to live. . . . I've done that since my early days in Northville from the homewowners association, soccer coach for my children, to the Strategic Plan. I figure this is just one more step in the process, albeit a big step because the time commitment is considerable for the board of education.

But I think I bring an understanding of how the Strategic Plan should work and how we need to keep following that as our road map.

Secondly, from my business background being in human resource management, maybe the ability to facilitate problem solving, to assist in problem solving, do mediation, try to bring parties together. The most important thing is involvement of the community. If there's an issue, if there's a problem, talk to the community, get them involved. It takes much longer, but the solution gener-


Certainly, monitoring the educational process. Very importantly, follow the Strategic Plan or making sure the Strategic Plan is followed based upon the recommendations of the Strategic Plan committees. I think certainly to review curriculum as it impacts the students. The most important one . . . to select a superintendent and to ensure that the superintendent is performing his or her duties. That's critical. That person is the day-to-day operations person.





into the school system. The word empowerment is a key word or catch word, but I believe our school system and our individual schools have that. I feel strongly about letting them make their decision knowing full well that they have to live with their decision.

As a father, do you see areas in the school district that you would like to see improved?

I've thought about this. I, quite frankly, am very pleased with the school system in Northville. From having three children going through it or in it right now, the involvement of the parents, the PTA level, the volunteer level, the community at large. the businesses involved, I've been pleased.

There've just been so many things the school district has done that, quite frankly, I was not aware of until I started attending the board meetings. I'm not sure the community is aware of some of these things either, but the program with business people talking to people in the calculus class about how they use calculus in the real world. A lot of people think this is a throw-away class — "I have to take it to graduate," or to get some placement into college. Dow Chemi-cal is showing them where they actually use it. It makes a big difference where theres a practical side of the learning.

Overall, I've been pleased, but, as I said, continuous improvement is critical. We shouldn't live on our laurels or look at the status quo as what we want to do because it's working now. Continue to review the raised questions. There may be better ways.

As a member of the Strategy One committee you helped prepare this year's preliminary budget recommendation. If you had been able to recommend a lessconservative budget, what would you have wanted to add to the

We're not adding growth. We're not adding new programs. But one of the things we talked about in Strategic Planning is there are some things we don't need to do right now. We should stop those and add new programs versus constantly adding new programs but never quite letting go of the old ones. I think that's a factor that parents and the community understand.

If elected, would you give up your seat on the Strategic Planning committee?

Right now there are two board members on the Strategic Planning committee. (Secretary Robert) McMahon and (Vice President) Jean Hansen. Should there be a third one out of 25? That's probably not unreasonable. I'm willing to stay on it. If you have others who would like to participte, I am willing to step back. I will review the plan regardless on an



CBN admits distributed flier is 'misleading'

A Citizens for a Better Northville flier distributed in Northville is misleading, CBN school coordinator Jeff Hampton admitted.

But the main purpose of the flier was to encourage people to vote in a June 10 millage election, he said.

"I hate to do this, but I have to admit the flier was put together so quickly that we could have done a better job." Hampton said.

"I think the overall theme of the flier is correct. The point we try to pound home is to vote."

But Northville Superintendent George Bell said, through use of inaccurate information, the point CBN tries to pound home in its fliers is to vote no.

The CBN flier — which was printed in Highland Lakes and Kings Mill subdivision newsletters, distributed on cars and posted on walls in Northville - said the district will be getting nearly \$3 million additional revenue as a result of increased property assessments.

The district is getting additional revenue as a result of increasing property taxes. But it .s only an additional

Assessments on existing property increased by 4.75 percent this year. Assessments on new developments brought a 4.25 percent increase in district revenue. Hampton admits the \$3-million figure printed in the flier and advertisements was "misleading."

He said CBN arrived at the figure by subtracting this year's proposed budget from last year's budget before the September approval of a 1.28-mill increase.

"We're very concerned that this 1.28 mills was supposed to be a temporary. This is now becoming a permanent." Hampton said.

He said the flier did not make it clear that CBN was including the September millage increase in its

calculations.

The flier also said the Headlee Amendment would have cut the millage rate by 1.52 mills, which is a figure the district has used in Truth-in-Taxation advertisements.

". . . if Headlee had been taken into account the requested rate would be 1.52 mills lower. Passage of the 22.63 millage will in effect override Headlee," according to the flier.

Not so, Bell said.

If the district's millage had not been expiring, the Headlee Amendment would have permitted the district to increase the millage rate. The amendment would not have required a millage reduction, Bell said.

The amendment permits school districts to increase their millage so that total revenue from existing development increases at the same rate as the consumer price index, which is currently at 5.4 percent. The amendment requires school districts to lower millage rates

their assessments increase at a rate above the CPI. Because Northville taxpayers will pay an average additional 4.75 percent in taxes this year, the district could have increased its millage rate to make up the difference between the 5.4 percent CPI and the 4.75 percent increased assessments, Bell said.

Again, Hampton said the flier was "somewhat mis-leading" but that the overall theme was correct.

"Regardless of what authority (the school board would have to increase the miliage rate), everybody's taxes will be going up, Hampton said.

Hampton said officials from Richard Headlee's Tax-

payers United organization explained to CBN that Truth-in-Taxation legislation and the Headlee Amendment are intertwined.

The district is required to publicly announce it will be increasing taxes by 1.52 mills because Truth-in-Taxation legislation requires the district make an announcement any time it will receive additional revenue on existing construction.

Truth-in-Taxation and the Headlee Amendment are intertwined, Hampton said, because Taxpayers United worked toward having both passed in the state

Legislature.
We have it right from Headlee's office that the two are intertwined. (The flier) might be somewhat misleading. but we still stand by the fact that this is a tax increase," Hampton said.

The district has never denied that it will be getting additional money, Bell said. But the fact that Taxpayers United supported both pieces of legislation does not make the laws the same.

"They are not intertwined. They are absolutely different affairs altogher," he said.

ters," Bell said.

Hampton said CBN will not distribute all of the fliers it had printed "because we admit they are somewhat misleading.

The information has already been printed in a Highland Lakes and Kings Mill newsletter, but Hampton said the bottom-line message is to vote.

We don't tell them anywhere in the flier to vote no. We say it's abysmal that only 10 percent of the voters are making the decision.

But the inaccurate information in the flier already has done its damage to the school's millage-renewal

*Certainly, if you distribute misinformantion, damage is done. Bell said, pointing out that putting fliers on cars is against a city ordainance.





School millage plan is a reasonable request

It's all-or-nothing time for the North-ville Public Schools, with the voters deciding which of those options will become reality. We strongly recommend

On Monday's ballot, along with two uncontested seats on the local school board and some Schoolcraft College races, is a proposal to renew the current Northville Public Schools tax levy of 22.63 mills. After cutting through all the numbers and all the rhetoric surrounding this proposal, it's clear that the question deserves passage.

The proposed levy is the same as this year's levy, after voters in September approved a special one-year increase of 1.28 mills. It's reasonable to include this again in next year's levy, because the situation which led to its proposal and passage - state "recapture" of aid payments to local districts - will likely continue or increase as time goes on.

If the proposal Monday passes, and the school tax rate remains the same next year as this year, the school district will see a revenue increase of more than \$1.8 million. There are two reasons for that, both of them tied to rising assessments: One, assessments on most homes in the district saw assessment increases again this year; two, Northville has continued to experience new construction, and building always raises a property's assessed value.

When you multiply the same tax rate by a higher assessment, the tax bill goes up. This proposal is a tax increase in the truest sense of the term. But it's a necessary one.

The district faces financial pressures from several sides. That new construction, while it brings in new revenue, also brings in new students, thereby increasing the district's costs. At the same time skyrocketing costs for liability insurance, rising prices for employee health insurance, and other factors beyond the district's control pinch the budget further. Add to it the funding mess in Lansing, and the district's finances become even shakler.

The total assessments on property in the district rose by 9 percent, just over half of which comes from higher assessments on existing construction. That rate - 4.75 percent - is less than the official consumer price index rate of 5.4 percent. The Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment does not apply to Northville this year, because the amendment deals with increasing assessments combined with a multi-year millage levy. But it's interesting to note that if Northville's 22.63-mill levy was not expiring this summer, the Headlee Amendment would actually allow the district to slightly increase its millage rate (that .65-percent gap) without a vote of the people.

Instead, this year the millage does expire and the people do indeed have a vote. It's the district's entire operating package, and if it doesn't pass, there's essentially no money to run the schools.

The proposal is fair and reasonable. We urge all district voters to cast ballots Monday, and we strongly recommend a YES vote on the Northville Schools

McMahon and Brown will serve district well

Once again, it's disappointing to see seats on the Northville Board of tion. Voters deserve a choice, and it might have made for some interesting discussion of issues had there been a race or two for this vitally important

That said, though, Northville may comfort itself with the high quality of the two candidates it does have. Robert McMahon sits on the board already, currently as secretary, and acts as a wellinformed and valuable trustee. The fact that he works for the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments gives him an interesting perspective on issues. He certainly deserves the re-election he seeks, and we fully support his

Just as encouraging is the arrival of only two candidates run for the two open Richard Brown at the board level. He has been deeply involved in the district of late as a part of the district's Strategic Planning team, and so will come to the board with a strong sense of the district's mission and goals. His particular post in the planning effort has involved him in the schools' budgeting process and familiarized him with vital statewide questions of school funding. He is well-informed and thoughtful. And his experience in labor relations may well prove useful. Brown, too, deserves the support of the voters.

> With no contests for the board seats. these endorsements may not mean much. Nonetheless, we do recommend voters Monday cast their ballots in support of ROBERT McMAHON and RI-CHARD BROWN.

Art education appears vibrant



Professional- and semiprofessional-level activities in the arts are enjoying an amazing period of success in the Northville area. But it seems to me that student work is in the same sort of boom period as well.

All manner of artists in the schools are doing good work. We've kept our photographers busy taking pictures of students who have won various competitions, many of

them related to the arts. You've seen some printed already, others will show up in the next few issues.

I'm not going to attempt anything close to a comprehensive list, but some recent honors have included Northville High School bringing home 11 of 64 awards given for writing at the Michigan Youth Arts Festival in Kalamazoo; the 22-member jazz band at the high school earned straight As from every judge at the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association Jazz Ensemble Festival at Henry Ford Community College in March; and a good collection of honors in the Southwestern Scholastic Art Competition earlier this year.

Meanwhile, a series of classes begun this summer at Mill Race Historical Village include successful ventures in creative writing and visual

Education is one more way in which Northville's arts community may feel justifiably proud.

POSTSCRIPT: The new Friends of the Arts group held its second meeting Tuesday night, and it was another success. Some basic groundwork was laid for organization and structure, with a planning committee further considering such matters. Three other committees will soon begin looking into activities in the areas of trips to museums, theaters and the like; music/art appreciation classes and lectures; and finding public space for art exhibitions and gatherings.

The group present tentatively set dues for the new group at \$5 and set a regular meeting time of 7:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday of the month. The next meeting is at 7:30 p.m. July 2. at the J. Giordano Gallery, 332 E. Main. All are welcome.

Terrorist tactics

To the editor:

Congratulations to George Bell on his recently announced retirement. He has been an excellent pitchman for the Northville School District (NSD) during his tenure. Dr. Bell could lease the school playgrounds as nuclear waste dumps and convince enough people to approve of it, believing that is the best thing for their children. It will be hard to replace him.

I am writing, however, to respond to statements which he made in The Northville Record interview published last Thursday. Last September, the voters approved a "temporary" tax increase of 1.28 mills. We were told of so many new students entering the system resulting in class size increases and program cuts if the millage were defeated. Well, the increase of students was overestimated, and the program was overbudgeted.

The board claimed to have cut for school finance reforms. The some \$700,000 from the upcoming only one to put the schools at risk of budget, but there has been no talk of program cuts. Now, by making the "temporary" increase a part of the permanent millage base, the NSD will see revenues of approximately \$3,000,000 more than (originally budgeted) just one year ago. In a recessionary climate where everyone else is trimming the fat from their budgets, it is difflcult to see the justification for ANY increase in tax revenues, let alone

\$3,000,000 worth. Dr. Bell stated that "Truth-in-Taxation is one of those laws that came out of Lansing that was just a real difficult thing to deal with." The Headlee Amendment and Truth in Taxation were not born in Lansing, but brought to life by the petition signatures of Michigan oters. They belong together.

Dr. Bell said, "It's virtually impossible to explain to people, particularly when it's mixed up with Headlee." "When you talk about the two of them you sound like an absolute dolt because it doesn't make much sense." With all due respect, Dr. Bell is the one who sounds like a dolt when he demeans the public with statements like "very few people in the community understand it and "it's virtually impossible to explain to people.

Patrick L. Anderson, who works with Richard Headlee, describes Truth-in-Taxation as a law requiring "a vote of local officials at a public hearing before allowing any increase in property tax revenue, above that caused by new construction." "If officials vote at a Truth-in-Taxation hearing to increase tax revenue above the limit. this means that more local tax revenue will be raised than last year. after adjusting for new contstruction." This is not difficult to understand.

Dr. Bell is wise as an owl, sly as a fox. He knew that there has to be 30 days between elections. And, he knew that, contrary to the truth, he could convince enough people that the ultimate goal of Citizens for a Better Northville (CBN) is to close the schools. Although he prefers not to listen to CBN, Dr. Bell has been told before that CBN does not want to shut down the school system. Like President Bush, and Governor Engler, CBN is looking

being shut down is Dr. Bell himself by scheduling the election as he did. If the election had been set two weeks earlier, he would not be holding all of our children hostage for "YES" votes to keep the schools

This is not the type of leadership that the NSD needs in the 1990s. Next Monday, Dr. Bell's tactics will have worked again, and the millage will pass. We can only hope that our new superintendent is open to the concepts of financial reforms rather than tactics of terrorism.

During his recent interview with The Northville Record, George Bell stated with pride that the district will be operating (adjusted for added students) with an increased budget of 5 percent. Given the current economic environment I found this quite interesting.

I wonder how many households in Northville are fortunate enough to have an additional 5 percent of disposible income? Not many. Not only must we contend with smaller pay raises, if any, smaller bonuses, any, but also with the double whammy of higher taxes. Unfortunately, individual families do not have the ability to dip from the weel of perpetual tax reserve that the school administrators seem to feel entitled to.

It's time for school adminstrators and employees to get in step with the realities of the market place. They can at times be unpleasant. If the tax-paying public can live by its dictates then those associated with the school district can too. When money is tight, you cut, you don't go to the nearest street corner with a tin cup.

It can be said that the citizens of Northville are getting a quality product. But at what cost? People are being forced out of homes they have lived in for years because of high taxes. Where is the compassion here? Excellence at any cost, without an incentive for efficiency. is not a valid mandate.

Hopefully the search committee in charge of finding a replacement for Dr. Bell will place a high value on an administrator who is knowledgeable of and willing to work within the confines of a market economy.

State's reluctance burdens locals



According to top-siders in Gov. John Engler's administration, Michigan faces the biggest financial crisis since the famous *payless paydays" of the 1950s.

Over the weekend, the governor himself announced that an unexpected \$234

million tax collection shortfall could drive the projected year-end deficit as high as \$664 million.

Budget director Patricia Woodworth said. The problem is really going to get to a crunch at the end of the year, where we may not have the cash to pay our bills." She would not rule out payless paydays for state employees.

And Treasurer Doug Roberts told me the situation is already tough. In an interview last week, he said, "Right now we're close to not having enough cash to pay our bills."

It is seldom sheer coincidence when three top hitters in an administration make a big

point of producing gloom and doom. Engler repeatedly blames the Democraticcontrolled House of Representatives for the budget mess. "The failure (of the House) to act threatens financial chaos," he said last weekend.

House Democrats, of course, blame the governor for bypassing the Legislature in unilaterally setting the state's budget when he convened the seldom-used State Administrative Board to ram through budget cuts without a legislative vote. Whether that's legal is still in the

But there is no doubt that Engler has brought relations between himself and Democrats in the Legislature to rock bottom. Former Gov. James Blanchard once seriously considered using the Ad Board maneuver during a crisis with the Republican-controlled Senate, but backed off.

That appears to be just what Engler now

On top of this very political situation came a little noticed aspect of state Treasurer Roberts' decision last month to defer for a month more than \$300 million in state cash payments due to cities, school districts, universities and community colleges.

All plan their cash flows assuming the state will pay its obligations timely. When the state is late, local units and colleges must either take the cash out of reserves or borrow.

That costs time, aggravation and money. Just how much money is unclear. Most experts I talked with said that if they had to borrow, 5 percent was a reasonable rate for tax-exempts. So if only one-quarter of the \$300 million must be borrowed for one month, interest costs would total \$312,000.

Why force local units and colleges to borrow especially when the usual pattern for a state short of cash is to issue "tax anticipation notes" and maintain the cash flow?

I asked Roberts that question. He's a longtime Lansing hand, smart and a straight shooter. His answer was direct:

"I did it because the cost of interest paid or foregone was less than the political cost of seeing Michigan's credit rating downgraded."

Michigan's current Standard & Poor credit rating, achieved during the Blanchard administration, is AA. The state is now on a "credit watch," which means there is risk the rating could be downgraded. What Roberts said is that it would be politi-

cally embarrassing to the Engler administration to have Michigan's credit rating cut, especially when getting a good rating was one of Blanchard's boasts.

It's sad that the cost to Michigan taxpayers of maintaining an administration's image is \$312,000, but you've got to admire Roberts' honesty.

She is a behind-the-scenes mom who helps the program work in the Huron Valley Girl Scout Council. which includes one-third of Wayne County and all of Livingston, Washtenaw and Monroe Counties.

Some of the things she does "take time," she said, and "some hardly any time at all."

For example, some of the ways she's involved are these:

1. As Junior badge workshop coor dinator, she recruits people to teach girls so they can earn a particular badge in five or six hours on a

2. As a training coordinator, she helps put together a weekend for new and old leaders who want to learn leadership and camping skills.

3. As chairperson of the annual council meeting, she does behindthe scenes work in regard to food, program and opening and closing

4. As a member of the Day Camp committee, she goes to meetings, starting in January, to help plan for the two one-week sessions in July.

5. As cookie manager for Northville, she trains the 37 mom leaders so they can train their girls on how to sell cookies, and then she follows through on sending in the orders and later distributing the cookie boxes to the leaders.

6. As chairperson of a besidescookies fund raiser, she coordinates selling of new and renewal magazine subscriptions

Rice has seen Hartford perform before, as a supporting act at Meadow Brook. "He just stole the show." Rice recalled.



Midnight Musher

Program on dogsled race nets Emmy for Northville alum

They raced down ancient Indian trails on snowmobiles. They drove on frozen rivers and climbed heights up to 60 feet. They braved a blizzard and freezing temperatures.

And the result was an Emmy Award for Mike Settles, a Northville High School graduate who now works as a television producer.

Settles was one of three producers of a show called "Midnight Mushers," which covered the first annual "U.P. 200° sled dog championship — a grueling, nighttime, three-day race through the heart of Michigan's rugged upper peninsula.

Midnight Mushers was one of only three television productions outside the metropolitan Detroit area to win an award in the 13th annual Emmy Awards presentation (Detroit/Michigan Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences) May 11. The show won in the Special Event Program category.

"It was very surprising to us," Set-tles said. "It won over (WDIV Channel 4's) 'Mandella: Mission of Freedom.'

Settles, a 1980 Northville High School graduate, is the son of Maureen and Don Settles. He graduated from Northern Michigan University in 1984 and began working for WLUC, Channel 6 in Marquette, during his junior year of college. He continued there as reporter, anchor and producer until March 1989. At that time, to further his career as a producer/director, he transferred to public television - WNMU, Channel 13 in Marquette - and continues there at present.

"My whole interest in television came out of a high school class taught by 'Ma Dwyer,' " he said. "We called her 'Ma.' That Emmy goes to

that class," Dwyer said of Settles. "I'm led to the award, Settles speculated. glad he's doing so well and enjoying what he's doing.'

Dwyer added that she plans to send him a note and a tape so he can send her a copy of Midnight Mushers." She plans to use it in her

Filming the race was no easy task. Settles and co-producers Frieda Waara of Wixom and Jackie Calcaterra of Fenton, along with a 15-person crew, followed the entire race from beginning to end, facing numerous physical challenges along

"What we did was follow the race." Settles said. "It started downtown (in Marquette) - they closed the streets and put snow on them — then it followed along old Indian trails and rivers to Escanaba. It was a three day trip. They spent the night in Escanaba, then the next day they headed

The WNMU crew consisted of only 15 people, a much smaller crew than most stations would use for such an event. "But it was actually quite large for us," Settles said.

The race coverage that won the award was for the January 1990 race, which was the first one. Settles also covered the recent 1991 race.

"Almost all of the race is run at night," he explained. "The dogs run better at night, in the cold weather. That's what sets this race apart from the others.

But the nighttime racing makes it trickier to film the event.

"We had to figure out a way to shoot in the dark," he said. One way they overcame the challenge was with infrared film.

Another challenge was the fact that the race was constantly moving. and the film crew had to keep up.

"It was tricky, shooting an event that was moving all the time." Settles recalled. They had to keep ahead of the race, traveling in snowmobiles. One crew member was actually run over by a snowmobile during the

That the crew pulled it off in spite "He was an outstanding student in of the difficulties may have been what

"Logistically, it was recognized as being very difficult to cover," he said.

"We had a lot of people who came up to us (at the award ceremony) who knew the kinds of problems (a film crew faces) with an event like this because they covered the Iditarod."

On the first night of the U.P. 200. the racers and crew traveled through a blizzard that dumped a foot of snow on the ground. The second night the snow stopped, but temperatures reached 14 degrees below zero.

Settles said he loves the upper peninsula and has no plans to move out of the area, even though he's been told there's more opportunity

elsewhere.

We were thrilled to go down there (to Detroit) to accept the award," he said. "We said, 'It's about time someone from outside Detroit won.'

"Personally, I didn't feel any differently about the program because it won an award," he said. "But it felt really good to be recognized by other TV stations."

Settles was also nominated for his work as producer in the documentary program "Superior Destiny." which focused on the sinking of the Coast Guard cutter Mesquite.



The Stratford Festival opened officially last week in a flurry of black tie events and premiere showings. I say "officially" because the plays have been performing daily since the season opened April 29.

That's when the swans were released from their winter quarters behind the arena, the ducks started dropping in on picnic dinners and the water birds began their daily parades across the roads.

By mid-May the pedal boats were busy on the Avon River. spring flowers were blooming in the Shakespearean Gardens and the bed-and- breakfast places had their signs out for the

summer. I saw three of this summer's plays during the unofficial pre-view season: "Much Ado About Nothing at the Festival Theater, "Our Town" and "Les Belles Soeurs" at the Avon Theater. I didn't get into the Tom Patterson Theater, named after the Stratford journalist who was largely responsible for launching this festival; the theater was formerly called the Third Stage.

I predict that "Les Belles Sœurs", written by Canadian playwright Michel Tremblay and performed for the first time in English, will be the main topic of conversation this summer. It is a funny, angry, loud, unusual play about a group of French Canadian women who gathered to help paste into booklets the one million gold stamps won by a housewife

People either love it or hate it, think it has too much swearing or is realistic, etc. Whether you like it or not, you should see it and join the conversation at the festival this year.

Getting off the highway

Riverboat towns make interesting stops when headed south

Travelers driving south on interstate highways often don't know-or forget-what they're missing as the miles go by and the countryside turns into a blur.

Small towns, for instance, can provide a refreshing change; many are interesting, easy to deal with and fun to explore. They're pleasant places for a walk, a little sightseeing and shopping, lunch or dinner or an overnight stay.

Here are two to consider: Augusta. Kentucky, and Marietta, Ohioriverboat towns on either side of the

AUGUSTA, KENTUCKY

Augusta, Kentucky, only 35 miles from Cincinnati and I 75, is a little (pop. 1,400) world of its own, nestled on the banks of the Ohio River.

The last time we were there, the sky was blue, the river shone in the sunlight, fishermen waited patiently on a shady bank with their lines out, and the ferry from Boudes Landing. Ohio, came in to dock with its flag fly ing in the breeze.

It was such a happy scene that a man strolling down Riverside Drive suddenly stopped and began sere-nading a woman he didn't know. 'Come on-a my house!" he sang. "My house a-come on!"

The woman, who was sitting on the stoop of her house, enjoying the sun, smiled and waved. "You're off-key but I love it," said singer Rosemary Clooney. ("Come on-a My House" was one of her biggest hits).

This is Rosemary Clooney country; there's a Rosemary Clooney Street in Maysville, not far away, where she was born. A show of watercolor and oil paintings by Gabriel Ferrer, her son, is on display at Augusta's small but prestigious Piedmont Gallery.

Augusta is also pioneer country; founded in 1797 and built on the site of an ancient Indian burial ground. It has survived wars, cholera epidemics, floods and fires, and a blight that finished off the promising vineyards planted by German settlers. (The Winery, a massive limestone strucbottled, remains; it's just off Route 8

on the way to Maysville.)
Parts of the TV series "Centennial" were filmed in Augusta, as well as

Augusta's oldest remaining house, on the corner or Ferry Street and Riverside, was built in 1800 by General John Payne, a calvary officer in the War of 1812. Houses from the pioneer, Federal and Victorian periods, graced with flowers, boxwood and brick walks, overlook the river; a 1795 log cabin, known as Broshears Tavern, was frequented by Daniel

Boone and Simon Kenton.

The Piedmont Gallery has a fine ture where the wine was made and collection of crafts, folk art and paintings of late 19th century artists from northern Kentucky. Within a few blocks, visitors will find the Lamplighter Inn and several bed-&-The Adventures of Huckleberry breakfasts; the Beehive Tavern,

Marietta, Ohio, is another historic Finn" movie made for public televi- which offers regional dishes, like river town, situated where the Mu-

skingum river flows into the Ohio; just off I-77, with Parkersburg, West Virginia, across the river.

Compared to Augusta, Marietta is a metropolis, with a population of nearly 17,000. It's Ohio's oldest town; the home of Marietta College (founded in 1835) and Rossi Pasta.

Rossi Pasta? This is one of Marietta's surprises: a factory producing handmade, all-natural pasta for Nieman-Marcus, Williams-Sonoma, gourmet cooks and, of course, the rest of the world. (Visitors can check our the pastas in the wonderfulsmelling retail shop; others can order by mail)

Spinach-basil, saffron, black olive, jalapeno and garlic are a few of the selections, and the company is generous with recipes and cooking tips written in a light-hearted style. (Ask for the Rossi Pasta Prima: "A (Simple) Guide for the Kitchen Frail").

Marietta, named for Queen Marie Antoinette of France, was founded in 1788 by veterans of the Revolutionary War and became the gateway to the Northwest Territory (land which later became the states of Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin and part of Minnesota) and its first

permanent settlement. The town survived the bloody battles of the last Indian Wars (from 1790 to 1794) and became a busy and prosperous ship building center and steamboat port.

This part of Marietta's heritage is reflected in the popularity of the Valley Gem, a sternwheeler providing hourly trips on the Muskingum and Ohio rivers, and melodramas presented during the summer on the showboat "Becky Thatcher."

Sternwheelers from around the country will race on the river during the Ohio River Sternwheel Festival, held the first weekend after Labor Day. The festival features live entertainment, spectacular fireworks and craft booths along the riverbank.

Marietta is an appealing tree-shaded town in a pleasant countryside of hills, valleys and river views. There are two museums, the Ohio River Museum and the Campus Martius, fine old Victorian houses, and some remaining brick streets and alleyways.

Trolley tours of Marietta, located on Green Street near the historic Lafayette Hotel, conduct regular guided

Tours are also offered free at the Fenton Art Glass Company, in nearby Williamstown, West Virginia, where glass is blown and handshaped by master craftsmen.

The Middleton Doll Factory is

another popular place to visit. The dolls, created by Ohio artist Lee Mid-dleton, have faces sculpted from the images of real children and are prized by doll collectors. (An outlet with near-perfect dolls is at 268 Front Street in Marietta). For more information, contact the

Kalamazoo's aviation museum gearing up for annual air show

Glen Miller once had the country stompin' to "I've Got a Gal in Kalamazoo-zoo-zoo .

H.L. Mencken said the name added "barbaric brilliancy to the American map.

Carl Sandburg must have reckoned such a moniker had wicked connotations. Although he wrote a poem called the "sins of Kalamazoo," it is suspected that Sandburg never came to town, let alone tried out the local sins.

Residents of today's Kalamazoo proudly pop it all in their tin whistles (kazoos) and blow a tune called There Really is A Kalamazoo," debunking the myths and laughing at the bad jokes.

The name, they will tell you, comes from an Indian word meaning "mirage of reflecting river." Kzoo is a walker's place, easy to stroll from midtown shopping and parks to heritage streets with Italianate, Queen Anne or Sears-catalogue houses.

Including Western Michigan University, there are five colleges, dozens of churches, excellent shopping, art late Thomas Schippers, who conducted the Metropolitan Opera, grew up here).

And, for the record, Kalamazoo puts on a totally non-alcoholic annual New Year's Eve party. Nothing wicked about that.

AVIATION MUSEUM

Tigercat, Hellcat, Bearcat, Grasshopper, Warhawk, Aircobra . . . The "air zoo" of Kalamazoo hunkers down in a gleaming hanger of its own; a fighting menagerie with engines that purr and hearts ready to take off. These are the flerce sky creatures of World War II, gathered at the Kalamazoo Aviation History Museum.

even pink, the trim fuselages and taut struts evoke admiring stares as their individual exploits are recounted by the guide. Beneath bright banners and flags, you meet such veterans as a Grumman F4F Wildcat, a plane with a victory-to-loss ratio of

The F6F-5 Hellcat (victory-to-loss ratio 19 to 1) turned the tide in the air war over the Pacific.

Designed to intercept Japan's kamikazes, F8F-1 Bearcats continued to serve into the '60s. The Sweetheart of Okinawa" (Corsair), the Aircobra with an Oldsmobile cannon in its nose, the Douglas Skyraider used in Korea and Vietnam, a Douglas Skytrooper transport, etc.

One of the most stared at planes on the museum floor has a light pink body, flerce mouth painted with teeth ready to rip into its prey and stenciled eyes (with eyelashes). The Curtiss-P-40N Warhawk, reported to have been the only U.S. plane launched when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor, turned into a Flying Tiger against the Japanese in China.

It is credited with shooting down theaters, a superb music hall (the 297 enemy aircrast, with a loss of 12 planes in combat. You'll notice that the Warhawk pictured on the Aircraft Museum's brochure has a lady pilot, Sue Parish, a grandmother and one

military planes from factory to bases. Their future includes flight. Daily at 2 p.m. during the summer (weather permitting), one of these veterans will roll onto the runway to do a flyover. If you want to see a particular plane in the air, you might try calling ahead to see when it is

scheduled. The museum has engines, uniforms, model planes, vintage photos and memorabilia from both sides of the battle. Dioramas depict air. ground and sea forces in action together. Veterans of Guadalcanal designated the Kalamazoo showcase to contain their own collection of maps, clippings, photographs and personal diaries for public view.

Visitors can sit in a Link Trainer, see aviation films in a small theater and purchase air books, models and a T-shirt in the gift shop. The Kalamazoo Air Show, held June 8 and 9 this year, has long been one of the most popular air events in the nation. Aging warbirds fly, modern jets soar in precision aerobatics and daredevils walk on wings.



Northville had just one hit in the first six innings and wound up batting 2-for-25 as a team (.080 average). Catholic Central scored seven earned runs on just six hits.





Lyme disease culprit: deer tick

The season for hiking, camping and fishing has arrived. With it comes the arrival of bugs: mosquitoes, flies and the dreaded deer tick.

Known for spreading Lyme disease, the deer tick has infected 439 Michigan residents since doctors were required to begin reporting all cases of the disease to county health officials two years ago.

Lyme disease is characterized by joint inflammation, flu-like symptoms and a rash. The disease is spread by ticks that travel on the bodies of deer and sometimes dogs. Deer ticks grow to a size slightly larger than the head of a pin.

When first bitten, a red dot may appear that will expand into a reddened area sometimes several inches in diameter. In some cases the bite is never noticed.

Symptoms like fever, headache, fatigue and muscle pains usually develop. Joint inflammation follows with redness and swelling usually affecting large joints like the knee.

Symptoms may continue for several years unless the disease is diagnosed and treated.

There is usually no permanent damage to the joints but complications affecting the heart or nervous system occur in some cases. The disease can be remedied with antibiotics if diagnosed before joint inflammation occurs.

But diagnosis is the problem, said Wayne County Medical Director Donald Laurenchuk.


False positives indicating a patient has been infected with Lyme disease occur 10 times more frequently than true positive results, Laurenchuk

No infected deer ticks have been found in Wayne or Oakland counties or the entire Lower Peninsula, Laurenchuk said.

Uninfected deer ticks have been found in five Lower Peninsula counties: Kent, Oceana, Clinton, Jackson and Lapeer. Uninfected deer ticks have also been found in eight Upper Peninsula counties.

In Michigan, Lyme-diseaseinfested deer ticks have only been found in Menominee County in the Upper Peninsula.

A young boy who has never left Wayne County but who tested positive for the disease would most likely not actually have the disease,

Laurenchuck said.

In 1990, 18 cases of Lyme disease were reported in Wayne County and 10 cases in Oakland County.

Both county health departments have received 4 reports of Lyme disease so far this year.

The key word is "reported," said Oakland County epidemiologist Joel Blostein.

Lyme disease has been a legally reportable disease for two years, which means doctors are required to report cases of the disease to the county. Blostein said.

But the county still does not hear about every case of Lyme disease, Blostein said.

Campers and hikers can avoid the Lyme-disease-carrying deer tick by taking a few simple precautions.

A Michigan Department of Public Health environmental sanitarian in the insect and rodent control section. Herb Zinser, recommends avoiding areas where infested deer ticks have been reported.

He also recommends wearing light colored clothing to make spotting the ticks easier.

Ticks that get on the skin should be removed immediately. If the tick has begun to burrow in the skin, it should be removed with tweezers and brought to the county health department to be tested for Lyme disease, Zinser said.

He recommends bug sprays containing N,N-diethyl-meta-toluamide or DEET. Sprays containing permethrin also are effective, but are intended for use on clothing only, Zinser said.

Bug sprays cannot be sprayed on the face so they cannot guarantee keeping deer ticks off every inch of a person's body, said Christopher Lufkin, extension associate for sci-

ence and agriculture at the Tollgate
4-H Education Center in Novi.

Wearing long pants tucked into socks or boots is a must even in hot weather and even in the Lower Peninsula, Lufkin said. Although no infected deer ticks have been found in the southern part of the state, but Lufkin urges caution.

"They're finding out more and more... A dog can carry the tick," he said.

If a rash forms soon after a person has been camping or picnicking, then see a doctor, he said.

Lyme disease is a problem, he said. "If you have the disease it's going to put you up. It's going to debilitate you."

But there is no reason for Michiganians to avoid the great outdoors.
"It's not something to cancel plans

"It's not something to cancel plans for," Lufkin said. "People still have to enjoy themselves."

Delwal to sponsor new LCBL entry

The big news this summer concerning the local collegiate baseball scene is that the team sponsored by Tom Holzer Ford — a longtime member of the Livonia Collegiate Baseball League (LCBL) — is no more. Coach Bob Peterson has moved the Northville-based franchise to Novi and now has a new sponsor: Delwal Corp.

Clearly, Northville's loss is Novi's gain.

The new Delwal team will play its home games at Novi High School this season as a member of the eight-team LCBL. Although Peterson was the coach of the old Holzer team, only one player from last year's squad is currently on the Delwal roster.

"The league has given me the same franchise, but we are really a whole new team with a new sponsor and new players," said Peterson, who is a Northville resident.

Delwal was originally slated to play this summer as a member of the Detroit Adray Baseball League — a collegiate league rival of the LCBL. But the Adray league lost its sponsorship this winter and closed shop after more than three decades of sandlot ball. Adray produced nearly 100 major-league players, including former Detroit Tiger Pat Sheridan and former Boston Red Sox World Series hero Bernie Carbo.

With Adray out of the picture, Delwal went to the LCBL and took the spot left open with the exit of the Hol-

zer team.
"Our team started out as the summer team for most of the University of Michigan players, but new NCAA rules prohibiting more than four col-

lege players from playing on the same summer team changed our plans," Peterson explained. "We now have four U-M players, plus others from Michigan State, U-D and Eastern Michigan."

The lone holdover from the Holzer team is pitcher Andrew Margolick, a North Farmington High School graduate. The top area player is Brighton High's All-American second baseman Ron Hollis.

"We're optimistic about this season," Peterson said. "We have six Division I pitchers (two from U-M and MSU and one each from U-D and EMU) and that's the key to winning in this league: pitching."

DELWAL 9, WINDSOR 3: Delwal opened the 1991 season on May 24 at Novi High with a convincing win over Windsor, the other new franchise in the LBCL this spring.

Tim Bruce (U-D) pitched six innings of three-hit ball to notch the victory for Dewal, who overcame a 3-0 deficit with nine runs in a two inning span. Eric Sumpler (MSU) and Troy Young (Ferris State) led the attack with two hits each, including a pair of home runs.

Starter Darrin Clarke took the loss for Windsor. Bruce issued five walks but struck out six.

Delway will get back into action on June 5 at Novi High against Little Caesars at 6:30 p.m.





Smaller real estate firms phasing out

Large real estate brokerage firms are growing larger. And many smaller firms are phasing out.

The trend is sparked by the increasing importance of computers in today's real estate operations. An effective computer system is expensive, and it's drawing a line in the operational sand for brokers.

The trend was revealed in a recent survey conducted by the National Association of Realtors. Information was collected and analyzed from 1,800 firms nationwide.

While only 3 percent of all real estate firms had a sales force of more than 50 agents, those firms account for over half (53 percent) of all sales agents. A decade ago, those large firms accounted for only 38 percent of all sales agents.

There are still many small real estate firms out there. In fact, about 90 per-cent of firms nationwide are single-office operations. And half of those firms have five or fewer sales associates.

The friendly, neighborhood real estate broker is still in business, and probably

will be a permanent fixture in the marketplace. But only about 8 percent of all salespeople in the industry are now affiliated with small firms, and that proportion is decreasing

*Clearly, the survey shows that real estate brokerage is becoming an increasingly big business," said Glenn Crellin. vice president of NAR's Economics and Research Division.

He pointed out that much of the growth seen in larger firms stems from two cost-related factors. Computers, fax machines and other high-tech equipment make it increasingly expensive for brokers to set up shop. And the cost of support services for sales associates including educational courses —has been increasing significantly.

One important factor in the real estate brokerage field has not changed during the past decade. Nearly three-quarters of agents still focus primarily on the residential market-listing and selling

The survey showed that 71 percent of sales associates, in large and small firms, now concentrate on residential real estate. A decade ago, it was also 71

percent.

The use of computers was a particularly interesting part of the NAR survey. It showed that 78 percent of real estate firms now use computers But the way they are used is changing.

The last time we did this type of survey in 1986, we found that computers were primarily used to access information from a Multiple Listing Service." Crellin noted. The recent survey indicates for the first time that the most likely reason a firm has a computer is to manage its day-to-day operations.

Another new trend revealed by the survey related to environmental factors. It showed that the three top liability issues facing today's real estate firms

- Groundwater contamination
- Wetlands and other environmentally zoned areas
- Waste disposal.

Q. Are more home sellers buying warranty contracts to cover the home they are selling?

A. The number of sold home warranty contracts is increasing, along with the amount of claims paid out by warranty companies.

A record \$51.47 million in claims was paid out last year on service contracts issued by member companies of the National Home Warranty Association. That reflects about a 14 percent increase over the \$45 million paid out during the previous year

Those NHWA member firms sold about 194,000 warranty contracts last year for a total sales figure of approximately \$58.3 million. Based on these figures, about 88 percent of revenues was paid out in claims. It leaves a respectable profit for the warranty companies.

9. What types of buyers are purchasing houses in today's market?

A Here's a response from Harley E. Rouda, president of the National Association of Realtors:

*Buyers in all income ranges are going ahead with their purchases They are snapping up low mortgage rates. And we are seeing more first-time buyers making their move."

One caveat: Sisal is a natural product that is especially susceptible to stains like grease and water. Check before you buy to see if your carpet has been treated with a protective finish.

cause there are ways we go about things a little differently," says Goldberg. We leave space in our schedule knowing we're going to get some of these rush jobs . . . We don't jampack the rack so every tailor is committed.
