## Polls are open all day for school election

Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. today in the Northville School District.

The election ballot includes a one-year property-tax proposal of 22.63 mills and two uncontested elections for seats on the Northville Board of Education. In addition, three races for the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees are also up for a vote.

The millage proposal comprises the district's total operating taxes. It is the same tax rate as the district levied this year, but higher property assessments will increase the budget by \$1.86 million.

Incumbent Robert McMahon and newcomer Richard Brown are the only candidates for two seats opening on the school board. Board President James Petrie decided not to run again in order to seek a position on the Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency's board (see related story).

Finally, Northville voters will help to choose three people to serve on the board at Schoolcraft College.

Voters will choose between Michael Burley, Subraman Ramamurthy and Jeanne Stempfen to fill two available six-year positions on the

Schoolcraft board. Burley and Stempfen are the incumbents.

Voters will also choose one person to fill a vacated position for four years until the term ends. Running are Ronaale Ruth Bowman, Willis Brauer, Paulette Cebulski, Robert Gordon, Bruce Patterson, Steve Ragan, M. Andrea Taylor and Patricia Watson.

All registered voters living in the Northville School District are eligible to vote.

School district precincts are not the same as city and township precincts. Anyone unsure of where to vote may call 349-3400 for more information.

## Police probing deaths

Northville City police on Friday continued their investigation into the Wednesday morning death of two joggers on Eight Mile Road.

Police plan to turn their results over this week to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office, which will determine whether charges will be sought against the driver of the Jeep Wrangler that hit the two men.

Police on Thursday said they were reinterviewing several witnesses to the accident which claimed the lives of Yusuf (Joseph) Hanania of Novi and Albert Abdelnour of Livonia.

"There's a little controversy in the stories here; we've got to get it narrowed down to one story," said Lt. Gerald Ryan.

The Jeep was reportedly driven by a 19-year-old Novi resident, who said he hit the joggers when he swerved to avoid a vehicle heading east on Eight Mile. The passenger was reported to be a 20-year-old Farmington Hills man.

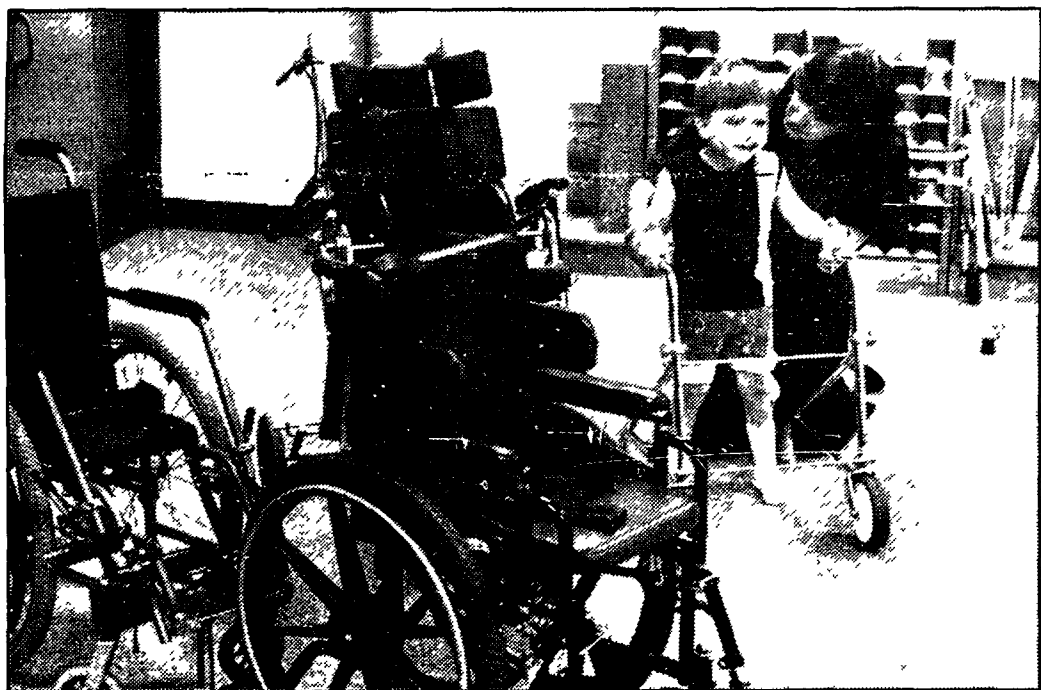
But police would not release the names or biographical information on the driver or passenger, or confirm the driver's story.

Preliminary information did not indicate the involvement of alcohol, drugs or excessive speed in the accident, police said.

Det. Sgt. David Fendelet said the driver passed a Breathalyzer test at the scene of the accident.

"There's no indication of alcohol or drug abuse; there's none," he said. "(The driver) had a Breathalyzer, and the results showed he wasn't drunk."

Fendelet said police had contacted at least four witnesses to the incident other than the Jeep's occupants. He said police questioned the driver and passenger for four hours Wednesday, and planned to reinterview them and at least two of the witnesses before completing their investigation this week.

## Hands across water Unused equipment goes to Kenya

Handicapped kids in Kenya were using bamboo for crutches and rusty metal poles for braces. Northville schools was storing thousands of dollars worth of perfectly good equipment.

Pediatric physical therapist for Northville schools Sandy Zuchlewski saw the irony and decided to do something about it.

As a result of her efforts, over 9,000 pounds of medical equipment valued at \$12,000 was donated to Feed the Children for use by handicapped kids in less-developed countries.

Zuchlewski got the idea when she saw a television program on handicapped children in Kenya. A little boy named Phillip had braces but could not walk because he did not have crutches.

She thought about the roomful of equipment Northville schools

had been storing, unused. Children's equipment frequently is donated to the district by parents after their child outgrows it.

Zuchlewski asked her supervisor, Old Village School Administrator Christine Clinton-Cali, if the equipment could be donated.

Clinton-Cali and Executive Director of Special Education Leonard Reznierski agreed.

Staff at Old Village and Moraine Elementary joined Zuchlewski in collecting, assembling, cleaning and repairing a total of 47 wheelchairs, 40 walkers and 18 pairs of crutches.

Bill Crosslin of Great Lakes Hospital Supply also volunteered.

An anonymous source donated \$500 to buy additional equipment. And some nearby school districts contributed equipment.

Zuchlewski hopes to get another donation together in a few years.

The extra initiative Zuchlewski

took as a Northville schools physical therapist was discussed by Reznierski at a May 13 school board meeting.

"It is this type of personal effort that marks the quality that exists in our district and our program," Reznierski said in a letter to Zuchlewski. "The extra initiative you displayed on this project is an excellent example for all."

But what Zuchlewski would most appreciate would be a picture of Phillip with his new crutches.

She specially designated one of the pairs of crutches just for him when she sent the equipment to Feed the Children.

She has requested that Feed the Children send her the pictures, which they agreed to do. She has not yet received them.

"The best thanks I could get would be some pictures of the kids using the equipment," Zuchlewski said.

## Township files new objection to home; move-in now on hold

Six developmentally disabled adults will not occupy a proposed township subdivision group home until the state responds to a formal township complaint.

The state Department of Social Services will respond to the township's complaint against issuance of a group home license "sometime in the next several weeks," said Jim Quigley, director of the DSS's Licensing Division.

The state will not issue a license for a proposed group home at 19749 Scenic Harbour in the interim, Quigley said Friday.

The state's pronouncement comes a week after Wayne County Circuit Court Judge James Hathaway ruled that the DSS could issue a temporary license for the Scenic Harbour site.

Hathaway's decision apparently opened the door for residents to move from their current home at 42777 Eight Mile Road to Scenic Harbour. The judge did say the license was to be issued on a temporary basis, pending the outcome of litigation between the township and state.

Now a possible moving date is up in the air.

The formal complaint was filed to protect "the best interests of the township" after the township had filed preliminary objections to the proposed move April 8. Supervisor Georgina Goss said.

"We were concerned that the DSS might not know that the township

board wanted the state to respond to its objections," Goss said. "(The formal complaint) reiterates things that were in the last complaint."

The formal township complaint echoes its original opposition to the proposed move.

Among township objections is the contention that relocation of the group home to Scenic Harbour — which is in the Highland Lakes subdivision — could contribute to excessive concentration of state foster care facilities.

The township also claims laws regulating group homes do "not define the phrase excessive concentration."

Another point of contention is the township's belief that a family day care center located on Windsor Court is a similar state-run facility. According to state law, facilities operating under the same state net cannot be located within the same 1,500-foot radius.

The state has replied that it does not consider the day care and group home as similar operations.

The complaint forwarded to the state is basically the same 18-page document the township submitted to circuit court.

Quigley said he could not comment on differences between the township's initial and latest objection until the issue was discussed with state legal counsel.

No trial date for the state/township circuit court showdown had been set by Friday.

## Week marks fund drive for local Y

A 30-year dream will take another step toward reality this week when the Plymouth Community Family YMCA hosts a Family Fun and Fitness Week.

Street.

# Northville, SAE partner up

Northville schools has a new partner.

As part of a Partnerships in Education program, Northville schools will team up with the Society of Automotive Engineers to bring a piece of the working world into the classroom.

The program, called a World in Motion, combines classroom instruction with hands-on learning guided by engineers from Ford Motor Company, Nissan and Dow Corning Automotive Research and Development.

Tom Swigart, an engineer for Ford Motor Co., recently visited Winchester Elementary School as part of the program.

"I'm a different kind of engineer. I'm a human engineer," Swigart told Winchester students at a kickoff for the new partnership.

Swigart explained that he studies how to best design vehicles for the benefit of their human drivers.

"Do you think I design humans? No, someone else has that job," he said.

The World in Motion partnership begins with a teacher-directed section that takes five class periods to teach. The section includes hands-

on participation in "engineering teams." Students are asked to observe and record results of experiments.

Then students work with engineers in performing experiments.

Winchester teacher Jay Gilshire told students they would learn that engineering is not just something that can be done as a career.

"We're going to explore engineering not only as a career, but also as a fun thing to do," Gilshire said.

Dow Corning Automotive Research and Development Center visited Northville's elementary schools this week to show students a Ford vehicle run by "flexible fuels."

The objectives were to teach students about scientific concepts of

motion, to increase student awareness of environmental research, and to increase student knowledge of technology.

Dow Corning sent two engineers to each participating classroom to show a slide show. Following the show, the engineers will show students the Ford car fueled by substances not traditionally used in cars.

## State fighting to maintain Jaycees

Reports of the demise of the Northville Jaycees are greatly exaggerated, according to the Jaycees' new state president.

"Nothing's happened to it, unless we don't get two members by the end of the month," said Michigan Jaycees President Dave Allen. "I'm not going to twist anybody's arm to keep a chapter going... but there's enough people there who want to keep it going."

The Record reported on May 6 that the local Jaycees chapter had lost its state affiliation because its membership had dropped below the required number of 20. With 18 members, according to Northville Jaycees President Bob Cummings, the group was required to disaffiliate. "If we're dead or not, I'm not sure. We are disaffiliated," he said then.

Cummings more recently said that he based his statement on comments from former Jaycees state President Mike Rockefeller.

"I went by the national bylaws, which were quoted to me," he said. "According to the old president, when you dropped below 20 members you were disaffiliated."

"Last year's president was going by the national bylaws, and that's what I went by too. But Dave felt we didn't have to."

Allen said that the Northville chapter is not disaffiliated just yet. "That is the fate that they have coming to them if we don't get their membership up," he said.

The president said the local chapter has until the end of this month to boost its membership to 20, and he pledged the support of the state chapter and other local chapters to meet that goal.

The president is currently coordinating a recruiting drive, called an "assist" in Jaycees parlance, to boost the local chapter's membership. "An assist is when we come in and get 10 members in 30 days," he said.

"It's like any organization. It doesn't matter if you have 10 members or 100, about 10 or 15 percent do all the work. When the membership dropped to 20, there were three or four people doing all the work, and they just got burnt out," he said.

"What we're going to do is recruit a few more people and elect a new board of directors and president, and get the excitement going again."

The membership drive is being coordinated with the help of the state Jaycees' Star Training

And Recruiting (STAR) team, and the Westland and Royal Oak chapters, Allen said. Joe Hildebrand, the Jaycees' regional director in Pontiac, is also participating in the effort.

Cummings said a similar effort by the Westland chapter earlier this year failed when none of the new members showed up to meetings.

Cummings was also uncertain whether a recruitment drive that added to the existing membership rolls would result in a viable Northville chapter. He said he has shared that uncertainty with Allen.

"I told him there's no active members here," Cummings said. "There's basically two of us that have been pulling this thing together and keeping it going... These others, they're just not active. They don't show up to anything, they don't respond to anything. I told him, 'You're better off re-affiliating with all new members.'"

According to Allen, a Jaycees chapter provides its community with something different than other organizations. "Every community can really benefit from a Jaycees organization," he said. "We're different from other groups because we're a leadership training organization."

## Police seek warrants against youths for golf club thefts

Stealing flags from a Northville golf course probably seemed like fun at the time, but two Novi teens quickly learned the true meaning of penalty strokes.

Northville Township police are seeking larceny warrants for two Novi High School students who police say

admitted stealing golf flags, poles, a water fountain head, golf ball washer, a rake, a nine-foot chain and a trash can from Meadowbrook County Club, 40941 Eight Mile.

Police said the suspects, a 17-year-old male and a 16-year-old male, attended a party at a residence on Eight Mile Road in Northville early May 26 and decided to steal the items from the country club.

The youths later returned to the party, stashed the

items behind a building and told friends about the theft, police said.

A country club member later told police that a group of Novi High School students might have information about the theft. Police then interviewed students in the high school principal's office.

Interviews revealed the identities of two alleged thieves. The same two later admitted participating in the

larceny, police said.

If the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office issues warrants, the 17-year-old will be charged with larceny under township ordinance guidelines, said township police Lt. Gary Batzloff.

Police are seeking a juvenile petition for larceny against the 16-year-old, he said.

Items stolen from the golf course were valued at \$650. All items were recovered, police said.

## Residents offer advice for search

The Northville school board asked for comments on the qualities a new superintendent should possess, and it got just what it wanted.

The perfect superintendent should be independently wealthy, one resident said.

Or a new superintendent should be a Will Rogers type with administrative abilities.

Many residents said the district should hire another Superintendent George Bell, leading the district's consultant to joke that many residents believe Bell "walks on water."

Those are just some of the ideas offered by the many residents who have participated in the superintendent search so far.

Bell plans to retire from Northville schools on July 31 after nine years of service.

Trustee Cierina Davis said the response from the public has been "excellent." She estimated that over 100 questionnaires regarding the search had been returned to the district.

She also had received many calls at home.

"A lot of the responses have been really thoughtful," she said. "I've been very pleased."

Finances are the key issue for many residents who offered input in what they would like to see in a superintendent.

A consultant to Northville schools talked to over 90 residents, parents and representatives from organizations Monday and Tuesday seeking input.

Carl Brautigam, a consultant hired through the Michigan Association of School Boards, said he was "very busy" Monday and Tuesday. Brautigam met with teachers, parents and administrators during the day and with staff and community members Monday evening.

Members of the public told Brautigam money is the No. 1 issue for out-of-formula school districts like Northville. State funding and local property tax increases are of concern locally, they said.

But Brautigam encouraged a deeper look into finances.

"We can't just say it's money, money, money," Brautigam said.

The group agreed that educating children with critical thinking skills and for a global economy would also be a major concern.

And handling development within the district is also an important issue, they told Brautigam.

A public meeting also was scheduled for him to receive input Tuesday night, but no one showed up on time.

The Northville Township assistant fire chief showed up Tuesday at 5:30 p.m. and was disappointed that the meeting was canceled when no one showed up immediately at 5 p.m. The meeting was scheduled to run from 5-6 p.m.

"I had input on things from fire department volunteers. . . I didn't get a chance to express them to anybody," Bill Zhmendak said.

Zhmendak said he wanted a new superintendent to be aware of the willingness on the part of township firefighters to volunteer in the schools. Zhmendak said fire safety lessons would require three hours of class time a year for elementary school children, but "15 minutes a year would be fine."

"I'm not trying to cause a problem. I'm just trying to prevent a problem."

Brautigam said in most cases the concerns he heard regarding what people wanted in the way of a superintendent were similar to what board of education members had expressed.

Community members Monday worked together to come up with the three most significant characteristics of Northville schools that Brautigam could share with a prospective candidate.

They decided a superintendent should know about the community's commitment to the schools, a desire for excellence in education and good facilities in the district.

The Monday-night participants also said the most important jobs a Northville superintendent performs are maintaining good community relations, handling finances and pursuing excellence in education through the strategic plan.

## New flag marks Tree Township

The fluttering banner atop the flagpole at Northville Township hall reads "Tree City," but Tina Sellas doesn't mind the misnomer.

Sellas, chairperson of the township beautification commission, probably wouldn't care if the banner read "Tree Unincorporated Village."

To Sellas, it's the thought that counts. The beautification commission put a lot of thought — combined with hard work and effort — into its quest to be honored among the nation's elite tree preservation groups.

That dedication paid off earlier this year when the township was awarded the Tree City designation

Only a handful of communities throughout the country are selected for Tree City honors by the National Arbor Day Foundation, Sellas said.

Northville Township was singled out because panelists judged the community to be outstanding in four tree preservation and promotional categories, she said.

Among criteria needed for Tree City recognition are a tree department (fulfilled by the beautification commission), a woodlands ordinance, a comprehensive community forestry program, and an Arbor Day observance.

The township adopted a woodlands ordinance in 1989 and upgraded woodlands guidelines earlier this year.

The beautification commission also sponsors an annual Arbor Day seedling giveaway.

What does the award mean to the average township resident? Community pride, at the very least, Sellas said.

"The significance is that very few cities in the United States get this award," Sellas said. "It shows that they've recognized this community as truly concerned about the environment."

"This is a feather in everybody's cap," she said. In addition to the banner, the township also received a plaque commemorating its selection as a Tree City.

The National Arbor Day foundation is a non-profit educational organization dedicated to tree-planting and conservation.

Tree City recognition began as a 1976 Bicentennial project co-sponsored by the National Association of State Foresters and the USDA Forest Service.

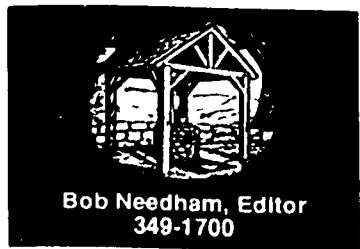

### A few characteristics for a superintendent

Last week the Northville School District held a series of sessions to gather public opinion on what the district should seek in a superintendent to replace outgoing George Bell. What follows is our two cents worth.



#### Education

Behind-the-scenes negotiation does not serve the public's interests.

● Relating well to all facets of the school community is another related yet distinct quality.

Northville's superintendent should be able to remain on good relations with all parts of the district: students and parents, teachers and administrators, business people and residents. The new person will deal with all these constituencies, and should be able to do so with equal aplomb.

● Interest in lobbying for the district is another important characteristic, particularly in these uncertain-school-funding times at the state Capitol. We elect legislators to look out for our interests, but they can use help.

Northville would do well to hire a superintendent willing to travel to Lansing to testify when a particularly damaging — or, although it's hard to picture, a particularly helpful — bill comes before the Legislature. Some superintendents make a habit of this type of activity, and it certainly doesn't hurt. Northville can use all the voices in Lansing it can get.

● Because of the uncertainties of financing, a new superintendent should have a working familiarity with these issues and other questions of school funding. Similarly, familiarity with the idea and process of strategic planning, while not essential, would certainly help the new leader keep the district on the course which it has set.

● There are certainly other, perhaps more obvious characteristics to consider: education, work experience, and so on. Perhaps we're expecting too much from the superintendent search; this editorial seems to describe something of a super-person. But Bell has exhibited most of these characteristics, and the district should certainly continue to set its sights high. Northville deserves the best.

One possible way to attempt strong ties between the superintendent and the community is to require residency in the district. This topic crops up in various governments from time to time; some require it and some don't. The Northville School District does not: Bell lives in Canton. Residency requirements have become a hot topic in the state Legislature. We believe it would not be appropriate to require Northville residency; there may be advantages but there may be disadvantages as well.

The important thing is to find someone who will be there — not for every little event, but who will go to enough of them to develop strong roots. This may sound like a statement of the obvious, but it's not. Superintendents in some districts prefer a much more detached approach, confining themselves to their offices and school board meetings. The reasoning may be that some professional distance from the community makes for a more professional operation. That's not an appropriate approach here, however.

● On a similar theme, we hope the school board finds a superintendent with a philosophy of openness.

A school district is at its heart a government, a government which takes by far the largest share of everyone's property tax dollars. The superintendent essentially serves as the chief executive of that government. It should be a position of public service, and therefore of openness to public scrutiny.

The new superintendent should be committed to conducting the business of the school district — the business of the people of Northville — in the open where everyone who wants a say can have one.

My question is, if we're not going to renovate the newsroom, can we at least have a new one that's on natural grass?

But mostly it's about Iris Sanderson Jones.

Okay, let's start sorting all this stuff out.

Bob Needham is editor of *The Northville Record*. Dawn Needham is editor of *The South Lyon Herald* and a longtime Northville resident. They are partners in life as well as partners in journalism. As far as I know, they are the first husband-wife team to hold editor positions with our company.

Bob and Dawn went to the Stratford Festival in Ontario over the Memorial Day weekend . . . which is where they met Iris Sanderson Jones, who is in charge of the Travel Page which appears every week in *The Record*.

All these people were in Stratford at the same time as part of a promotional tour. What's happening is that *The Northville Record* (along with all the other HomeTown and Observer & Eccentric Newspapers) is the print sponsor of the Stratford Festival this year. In case you were wondering, WJR-AM is the radio sponsor.

Got that? Good. Now I can start my story.

All of us in the newspaper business have different aspirations within in the field of journalism. It's not unusual, for example, for a lot of young reporters on weeklies to aspire to a job with a daily newspaper. There are others who aspire to be editors . . . to run their own newspaper.

But during the time she has been doing the Travel Page, I've come to have more and more respect for what a travel writer has to do and how hard Iris works.

She prepares for a story about cruises by walking around checking baggage tags to see if there's anybody from Northville aboard she can interview. I've known a lot of young reporters who could learn some lessons from Iris about working to dig out stories.

My observations were validated by the Needhams after their return from the trip up to Stratford.

"You should have seen her work," commented Dawn in amazement the other day. "I saw her spend 30 minutes cajoling the visitor information bureau into showing her the guest registry so she could get the names of local people."

"We were up there three days and Iris worked every minute. She was going all the time."

"Bob and I used to think being a travel writer would be a pretty easy job. But after seeing Iris at work, we don't think any way anymore. It's a tough job."

"She can have it."

# MainCentre to use old deck

Singh Development plans to breathe new, if temporary, life into the crumbling Cady Street parking deck by renovating the lower level for the private use of MainCentre residents.

The City Council last week approved a Singh proposal to renovate the deck at an estimated cost of \$50,000. The development company agreed to front the money for the project, though the cost will eventually be figured into the city bonds financing an expanded Cady Street deck.

"The chances of the new deck going in this year are pretty remote, if not altogether gone," said Singh Vice President Michael Kahm.

Kahm called the deck refurbishment "an alternative to putting in carports, which none of us really wants to see happen." Singh officials had proposed building carports for residential tenants on the lot south of

their building if the new deck was not constructed soon.

"The cost that we're anticipating there is the same amount that we would otherwise have spent on the carports," Kahm said. "We propose anything beyond that number we would pay, but eventually it would be part of the capital costs of the deck. We would advance the funds in this case... identical to the MAGS lot resurfacing that we proposed at the last meeting." (see related story)

Kahm said he inspected the deck recently with Department of Public Works Superintendent Ted Maples and an official from Rich & Associates, the city's parking deck consultants. "The majority of the work listed here was developed during that meeting," Kahm said. "We feel that it is possible to provide covered parking there for a temporary period... It's obviously not as convenient as the ultimate solution is going to be."

The \$50,000 in repairs would in-

clude the addition of column supports to reinforce the structure, installation of a new ceiling to protect cars from flaking concrete, a decorative brick facade on the deck's west side, roll-down security grilles and screens to keep non-residents out of the deck. The grilles would be reused in the new deck.

The renovated area would house 85 cars. The new entrance to the lower level would be on the west side of the deck. Singh's proposal also calls for the removal of the company's leasing trailer on Center Street and the paving of that lot, to provide an additional 17 spaces until the expanded Cady Street deck is built.

Council Member Paul Folino asked why the city should ultimately pay for the repairs. "I don't recall where the city was to pay the cost of the carports," he said.

"I knew that would be your first question," Kahm said. "It's our opinion that this is really a project cost

and not a Singh cost, and it would be unfair for us to pay the costs for temporary parking which would be used for less than two years," he said.

Kahm said the city agreed to pay the cost of interim covered parking in its original agreement with Singh more than two years ago. "The need for that parking is still there. Quite frankly, we've lost several tenants because of the lack of covered parking."

Covered parking is needed to effectively market the 74 luxury apartments at MainCentre, Kahm said. "People who can afford to pay that kind of rent a month also have expensive cars, and they are concerned for the safety of those cars," he said.

As if to illustrate his point, a MainCentre resident later asked Kahm when the deck would be available. "We're going to start immediately... I hope to have it done by August," he said.

The council gave unanimous approval to the proposal.

## Lot may contain designated spaces

Singh Development officials are seeking restrictions on the parking lot south of their MainCentre building to set aside spaces for MainCentre's retail customers.

The city council on last week approved in concept the request by Singh Vice President Michael Kahm to set aside about 70 spaces for retail customers.

The parking lot was closed Wednesday for resurfacing and should reopen within a few days. Reconfiguration of the lot will add 71 parking spaces to the present total.

Kahm said the reserved spaces would allow customers to park near MainCentre during shows by the Michigan Association of Gift Salesmen and during Northville Downs meets, when the lot would otherwise be full.

MAGS shows are held three days in a row each month and attendees typically take up every space in the parking lot. Northville Downs patrons often use the lot at night during the racing season.

"Today was an excellent example, when every single space in that parking lot was taken up," Kahm said.

"We think that creates a rather unique situation in the city," he said. "Quite frankly, the success of the retail businesses depends on the availability of parking... We have some prospective tenants who have raised that concern and consider it a necessity."

Kahm had no specific plan on how to close off the parking. "My concern is the encumbrance of the spaces for a long period of time by a lot of people," he said. "I'm open to ideas."

One idea advanced by the council was to put a time limit on the parking spaces.

Council members were receptive to the overall concept, and authorized the city administration to work out a potential arrangement with Singh officials.

"It seems to me that Mr. Kahm's concept proposal makes a lot of sense," said Mayor Chris Johnson.

"This is an issue that the Downtown Development Authority has looked at as well," he said. One

of the DDA's concerns about Singh's previous proposal of carports on the north end of the lot was that they would take up prime retail space for MainCentre, and could harm retail business, he said.

Johnson raised one concern, saying the reserved spaces should be for the use of customers, not store owners or employees.

Johnson agreed that the six months of racing at Northville Downs could hurt business at MainCentre. "No retailer can take that kind of a hit," he said.

Council Member Carolann Ayers asked why Northville Downs customers, which typically begin arriving after 6 p.m., would impact MainCentre retailers. "How late are those stores going to be open?" she asked.

Kahm said he hoped that the stores eventually would stay open as late as 9 p.m. once more stores were open for business.

Ayers agreed with the idea itself, saying, "I think as a concept it's an exceptional idea, and something you need and we need you to have."

## Project sees tough, but improving, times

Singh Development officials concede that their MainCentre project hit the retail market at a bad time.

"Coming onto the market, our timing could have been better," said Singh Vice President Michael Kahm. "Unfortunately, I think we hit the market when the retail market was slumping."

But he said the economy has picked up speed since the end of the Persian Gulf War, particularly within the last two months.

Leasing at MainCentre has picked up as well, as more potential downtown merchants pick up lease forms for the 11 remaining retail spaces along Main and Center streets.

Four store owners have signed leases and one, Glenna Drennan of Illusions Replica Jewels, is already open for business.

The largest remaining hole in the

27,000 square feet of retail space is the full-service restaurant location at the south end of the building. Kahm said filling that cavity may help bring other businesses into the building. "The restaurant is really perceived as an anchor, for whatever reason," he said.

But Leasing Director Judy VanNewKirk said restaurant owners are a skittish bunch to pin down because of the nature of the business. "The difficulty is that restaurants have the highest rate of failure," she said.

Singh currently has several leases out for the restaurant space.

When asked what Singh is seeking in potential tenants, VanNewKirk said, "You kind of want a variety... You have to attract the people who appreciate downtowns."

"We'd like to see more soft goods here in town, your clothing apparel, anywhere from children's to women's to men's, even a shoe store, though a shoe store is a tough nut to crack."

Feedback from community members suggests that local people would like to see a store selling recorded music, a book store, or another card store in town, she added.

VanNewKirk said that MainCentre probably would not be able to attract large retail chains because of the amount of traffic such retailers typically require, up to 25,000 potential customers a day.

"Center Street has 17,000 cars a day... so you can't go after that type," she said.

"Northville itself is your biggest marketing tool, because everybody has heard of it and are intrigued by it. When you say 'a business development in downtown Northville,' people's eyes open."

Though two of the first three businesses to sign retail leases have been jewelry stores, in a town with a jewelry store across the corner from MainCentre and another one block away, VanNewKirk said the types of

jewelry being sold at the new locations should give them a niche in the marketplace. Illusions sells less expensive replica jewelry, while the forthcoming Goldsmith Gallery will make custom pieces in gold and precious gems, she said.

"You don't want to see too much overlap, and I'd rather bring some fresh blood into town than just juggling places in town," she said.

But Kahm defended some overlap, saying, "Competition is healthy for everybody, people can compare... Instead of driving to Novi Town Center, say, they can walk across the street."

"In general, they're all going to benefit as a result."

Kahm also said that MainCentre may start a trend toward longer business hours in downtown Northville, though Singh Development is moving away from requiring MainCentre businesses to stay open late.

### Markham's merlot no flash in the pan

Every few years since the late 1970s, we have stopped by the humble stone structure of Markham Vineyards just north of the town of St. Helena in the Napa Valley. To be quite blunt about it, we tasted the wines, yawned, mumbled a ho-hum to each other and left as quietly as we entered.

Last year, we blind-tasted the 1987 Merlot and were surprised because it stole the show. Fearing a flash in the pan, we've been tasting Markham regularly and are now prepared to declare the wines consistent, right on target and undiscovered Napa Valley values.

"In 1978, the winery lacked vineyards with premium grapes," remarks winemaker Bob Foley. "It has taken us 10 years of planting and replanting to have vineyards worthy of premium bottlings."

The stone building housing Markham Vineyards was constructed by Bordeaux emigre Jean Laurent more than 100 years ago. It is the fourth most continuously used winery in Napa County. In 1978, Markham Vineyards was founded by Bruce Markham. It was purchased in 1988 by Mercian Corp., a Japanese conglomerate and largest producer of wine in Japan.

To match its new wine image, the winery is undergoing a massive reconstruction to double the size of its production facility. When the project is completed in 1992, the winery will be 75,000 square feet to accommodate fruit from the winery-owned vineyards. The 85-acre Napa Ranch is planted chardonnay and sauvignon while the 110-acre Yountville Ranch, and the 60-acre Calistoga Vineyard at the base of Mt. St. Helena yield the classic Bordeaux red grapes, cabernet sauvignon, merlot and cabernet franc.

Led by president Bryan del Bondio and winemaker Foley, Markham wines show the excitement of a new breed of California producer, respectful of winemaking traditions but willing to experiment and question the old assumptions.

They approach winemaking like a puzzle, fitting together the interlocking pieces of separate vineyards, clones and vinification techniques into an integrated, complex picture.

In addition to outstanding merlot, Markham produces cabernet sauvignon, sauvignon blanc, muscat blanc and chardonnay. "In the future, I'd like to produce varietal semillon," Foley maintains.

"Both Bryan (del Bondio) and I have technical winemaking degrees from the University of California at Davis, but we believe taste buds can measure much more than the lab. Joe Heitz once told me that chemists make lousy winemakers."

"We determine grape ripeness by walking the vineyards and sampling the fruit. We also watch where the birds are hanging out. This gives us more information about grape ripeness than a refractometer."

A current tasting of the 1989 Markham Napa Valley Chardonnay (\$15) reveals a wine with apple and citrus aromas happily married to solid melony, tropical fruit flavors and balanced oak. It's lush and opulent.

"We employ 100-percent barrel fermentation and sur-lie aging for eight to nine months," comments Foley. "This greatly improves the wine's breadth on the palate. The cooperage comes from a small barrelmaker in Southern Burgundy who uses Troncais oak from France's central forest. We are using about 20 percent new barrels each vintage. The oak should just tease the palate and not dominate."

Markham's 1990 Sauvignon Blanc (\$10) is complexed by the addition of 25 percent semillon. The wine is finesseful with a generous mouthfeel and refined finish.

## Make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem

### Family store stocks specialties

Bored with the routine foods lining the shelves at the local supermarket? Are the high-rent prices at your favorite gourmet food shop putting the pinch on your taste for the exotic?

Now there's a grocery store for imported foods that won't empty your wallet. It's Jerusalem Imported Groceries, located at 13080 Inkster Road at I-96 in Redford. If you're looking for some of the finest in Mediterranean specialties, you'll find it here.

Once only a wholesale operation at the Redford location, Jerusalem Imported Groceries expanded six months ago to include a retail outlet. Although the building looks like most of the other warehouses in the neighborhood, stepping through the door of the retail shop is like stepping into a family grocery store.

Indeed the store is a family operation, owned by the Batshon family of Northville. Melodic Arabic music plays in the background as patriarch and president of the company, Albert Batshon, greets customers.

His sons, Sam and Ron, are in charge of the day-to-day operations of the business.

"I think we're doing pretty well because of our prices and our friendliness," said Sam. "We're always eager to talk to customers about a recipe, or if they need help with something."

"One of the things we do is encourage people to have a taste before they buy. For instance, if you're not sure about that feta cheese, how about a taste?"

And the feta in Jerusalem's deli case is fabulous. The store stocks a rich, smooth Bulgarian feta that Sam calls "the world's finest."

Or perhaps you'd like some mellow, flavorful Italian mortadella, or a spicy salami. For something new and unique, try the Armenian spiced

beef known as bastirma. It's hard to find, but once you've sampled an aromatic slice you'll mark the days until your next.

Elsewhere in the store, you can find Greek olives, dates and a wide range of spices available for bulk purchase. The prices for the spices are far below what you'd pay in a supermarket.

A variety of imported nuts and dried fruits are also available in bulk.

Shelves are stocked with hard-to-get Progresso canned goods, jars of tahini (mashed sesame seeds) and grape leaves for stuffing, and pasta in practically any size or shape.

In the refrigerated section you won't find any Coca Cola, but you will find cool, sweet and refreshing Saudi Arabian guava and mango juices.

The freezer houses Jerusalem's own brand of frozen falafel, ready to cut up and fry.

"It's real easy to make," said Sam, "and it's a whole lot more nutritious, filling and satisfying than McDonald's."

Perhaps the greatest resource at Jerusalem is the variety of olive oils. A number of brands is available from a half dozen nations — in sizes up to one-gallon cans.

From the shelves at Jerusalem, you can tour most of eastern Europe, the Mediterranean and the Arabian peninsula without ever leaving your kitchen, and the clientele reflects that international flavor as well.

"We see a mix of people," said Sam. "Mostly it's people who just catch a glimpse of our store and want to see what we have. But the nationalities, we see all kinds — Mexicans, Greeks, Arabic people."

Strolling the aisles at Jerusalem Imported Groceries, you may see a lot of unfamiliar food items.

Ever wonder what tahini is, or what to do with those fava beans? If that's the case, ask for a copy of the Sahtein Middle East Cookbook (\$10).

Store owner Albert Batshon's wife Antoinette was one of the eight women who collaborated on the book, and it's packed with tasty recipes.

Here's a sample meal that can be made with products available at Jerusalem Imported Groceries. It might also be noted that Jerusalem stocks prepared mixes and ready-made versions of some of these items.

In typical Middle Eastern fashion, we've included three appetizers, baba ghanouj, tabbouleh and falafel. All can be enjoyed with pita bread for dipping or spreading. For a main course, there is mousakhan. For dessert, there's zalabyeh, a doughnut-like fried dough.

# Summer means it's sandwich time

Dear Mary,

"From our perspectives as chefs, the world is a seemingly endless variety of foods, dishes, recipes, and tastes. When I think back, one of my earliest (and perhaps foremost?) exposures to vastness was when I was just a kid lugging my sack lunch to elementary school. Well, as I now know all too well, life and food is not always what you expect it to be. Just as you cannot tell a book by its cover, you cannot tell a lunch bag by its bag. Whatever I had did not sound nearly as good as what everyone else had. But, as we all discovered, there was a solution to this dilemma. The answer, of course, is the 'sandwich swap.' By the time I was seven, my repertoire of sandwich varieties was as complete as a New York deli. They tell me this elementary school is where I learned to read and write, where I developed my social skills. I have no doubt its lunchroom cafeteria gets a good measure of credit for developing my appreciation of variety. In honor of this tradition of sharing, and knowing how our burning, instinctive, almost obsessive desire for culinary knowledge leads us to the most ridiculous things... (like becoming chefs) I introduce the 'Detroit Sack Exchange.' Here is your part, pack one of your favorite cold lunches in the enclosed bag. Your meal should include an appetizer, main course, an accompaniment (starch or

vegetable) and a dessert. Bring your lunch to Opus One at 6:30 for a champagne and hors d'oeuvre reception. At 8:00 p.m., we will walk the few short blocks to Hart Plaza and board the 'Helene,' a beautifully restored 106-foot cruising boat for a two-hour cruise on the Detroit River. On the boat we will exchange the sacks. I hope you can enjoy us for a terrific evening

Well, needless to say, I couldn't refuse. Neither did many other of the area's finest chefs. All the "Who's Who" of cooking from restaurants, clubs and schools RSVP'd.

Peter Loren of Opus One was the host. Guests included Lorraine Platman of Sweet Lorraine's, Greg Goodman of Cafe Bon Homme, Jeff Gabriel and Joe Decker of Schoolcraft College, Gayle Hart of Gayle's Chocolates, Brian Polym of Pike Street Station, Pat Dunn of the Van Dyke Place, Steve Schopan of The Whitney, Kelli Lewton of Miesel Sysco, Rick Halberg of R.I.K.'s, Steve Allen of the Golden Mushroom, and Lon McCracken of Meadowbrook Country Club, just to name a few. And of course myself.

What do you cook, knowing one of the most discerning palates in Detroit will be eating your fare? Even more distressing, the bag sent with the invitation was traditional lunch-sack size. I wondered if we re-

ally had to use it. (As it turned out, two or three of the original bags showed up.)

The reception before the boat ride was elegant. Champagne flowed and the hors d'oeuvre table was exquisite. It also served as an ice breaker for those who didn't know each other. Conversations started at 6:30 were still going strong at 11:30. What a perfect way to get to know your associates.

The "lunches" were sumptuous. Exclamations of "try this," "incredible," and "wow" were heard the length of the yacht. A common vein was apparent with all of the food: simple with good taste. From meat loaf to duck salad, sushi to morel mushroom custards, oatmeal cookies to red-skin potato salad, it all was wonderful.

My favorite was crispy almond softshell crabs with a roasted garlic mayo from Zachary Smith, Executive Chef of One 23 in Grosse Pointe Farms. Who could ask for more?

A smattering of meals are as basic as those made with the simple building blocks of bread and filling. They are quick and convenient, can be made ahead and enjoyed at a leisurely pace; eaten hot with a knife and fork, or cold on the run.

Hamburgers are the king of sandwiches, but perhaps it's time to re-evaluate their imaginative value.

Remember the three Fs when creating sandwiches: form, filling, and fixin's. Gone

are the Wonder bread days. Pita, cracker bread, frozen bread dough cooked around fillings, Lebanese flat bread... the possibilities are endless.

Tacos are a form of a hand-held sandwich as are the savory Italian filled pastries calzones. Roll, fold, layer, bake, broil, grill, slice. Fill. With whatever your heart, or stomach, desires. A liverwurst and onion with a gourmet mustard is as welcoming as an exotic soft-shell crab BLT.

Salads are popular stuffings: crab, tuna, egg, shrimp, chicken. All bring back fond memories. My grandmother made the best crab salad and served it as a warm weather meal on sourdough buns. Hudson's shrimp salad on cheese bread is a classic and Karen, the barmaid at Ruffe's, serves a great chicken salad on toasted rye.

I've taken to grilled fresh tuna sandwiches instead of the traditional tuna salad, just because it is different. Grilled vegetables brushed with pesto stuffed into a french loaf is another favorite. The prospects are infinite.

Fixin's are as crucial to the sandwich as form and fillings. Flavored mayo, chutney, cheeses, lettuce, pickles, marinated salads, slaw, potato salad, macaroni salads or vegetable salads are appropriate. Search out recipes that are easy to make ahead and improve with age.

**ITALIAN COUNTRY LOAF**  
4 teaspoon butter or olive oil  
2 teaspoon minced garlic  
1 head escarole, cleaned, blanched, drained or 1 bunch basil leaves cleaned (1 1/4 cups)  
1 pound sliced mushrooms  
1 pound ricotta cheese  
3 tablespoon chopped oregano and thyme  
2 eggs  
1 loaf crusty Italian bread, round or loaf  
1/4 pound prosciutto, sliced thin  
1/4 pound Italian salami, sliced thin

Saute garlic in oil. Add mushrooms and cook until tender. Season with salt and pepper. Mix in basil or escarole.

Mix ricotta with eggs, oregano and thyme. Cut top off bread horizontally. Pull bread from inside leaving a 1" border. Layer prosciutto over bottom and sides. Top with mushroom mix, salami, cheese and prosciutto. Replace top and brush with olive oil.

Bake at 350 for 30 minutes or until set. Let rest at least 10 minutes before slicing. Serve hot, room temperature or cold.

### BABA GHANNOUJ "Eggplant Dip"

1 large eggplant  
¼ cup tahini  
2 tablespoons oil  
1 clove garlic, minced  
Juice of 1 lemon  
Salt to taste

Cut 1-inch slits in eggplant to prevent splattering while baking. Bake eggplant at 500 degrees until tender (or boil in water 10-15 minutes). Split the eggplant and scoop out inside pulp and juice.

Mix tahini, lemon juice, garlic and salt to make tahini sauce. Add water, if needed, to make a thick sauce. Add mashed eggplant to tahini sauce.

Place in a salad bowl and pour oil on top. Garnish with parsley and tomato slices, if desired.

Note: squash, baked or boiled, can substitute for eggplant.

### TABBOULEH

¾ cup fine bulgar (cracked wheat)  
2 large tomatoes, diced  
1 bunch green onions, chopped  
4 bunches parsley, chopped  
¼ bunch mint, chopped (or 2 tablespoons dried mint)  
1 large cucumber, peeled and chopped (optional)  
¼ cup olive oil  
Juice of 3 lemons  
1 tablespoon salt  
¼ teaspoon pepper

Wash bulgar. Drain and place in large bowl. Add chopped vegetables and herbs and mix well. Add oil, lemon juice, salt and pepper.

Allow bulgar mix to soak and absorb liquid (about one hour). Serve over fresh green lettuce. Eat with lettuce leaves, tender grape leaves, or with a fork. Makes a refreshing appetizer or picnic salad.

Makes four servings.

### FALAFEL "Fried Bean Cakes"

4 cups chick peas  
2 large onions  
1 whole head of garlic  
2 bunches parsley  
Hot green pepper to taste  
2 teaspoons cumin powder  
salt and pepper to taste  
1 teaspoon baking powder  
¼ teaspoon baking soda

Soak chick peas overnight and drain. Combine beans, onions, garlic, parsley and hot pepper. Grind twice with electric meat grinder or food processor. Add salt, pepper, cumin, and baking powder. Mix thoroughly.

(Note: at this point, mix may be frozen and used as needed.)

When ready to fry falafel, add baking soda. Shape into patties 1½-inch in diameter and ¼-inch thick. Fry in deep hot oil until brown and crisp.

Serve hot with tomato slices in pita bread as a sandwich. Add tahini sauce and slices of onions if desired. Garnish with parsley.

(To use frozen batter, thaw and add the baking soda just before frying.)

### MUSSAKHAN "Baked Chicken on Bread"

2 frying chickens, halved  
3 tablespoons ground sumac  
Juice of 1 lemon  
1 teaspoon salt  
¼ teaspoon pepper  
¼ teaspoon cinnamon  
¼ teaspoon nutmeg  
2 large onions, quartered, sliced thin  
2 tablespoons pine nuts  
3 tablespoons olive oil  
2 loaves pita bread

The Batshons have a long tradition in the wholesale and retail food business. They ran a falafel restaurant in Ann Arbor until 1984, when they realized they could manufacture and freeze more falafel than they could use.

They created their own label, Jerusalem Foods, and began wholesaling falafel, and a number of other pack-

aged foods.

"We've been in many businesses," said Sam Batshon. "It was retail in the beginning. But how we got into the importing was through our Middle Eastern restaurants in Ann Arbor."

Eventually, the Batshons plan to bring in products from an even greater variety of nations — Indian, German, French — each with its own small sections of their store.

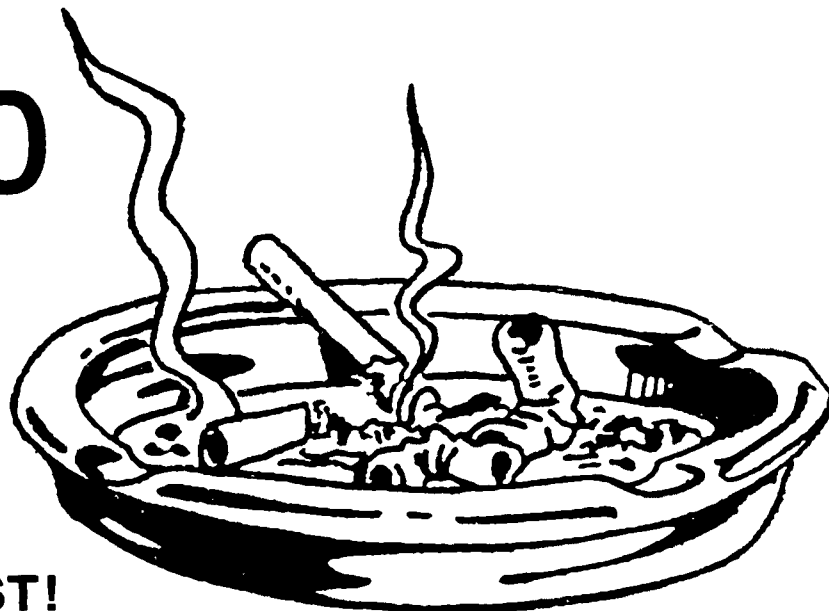

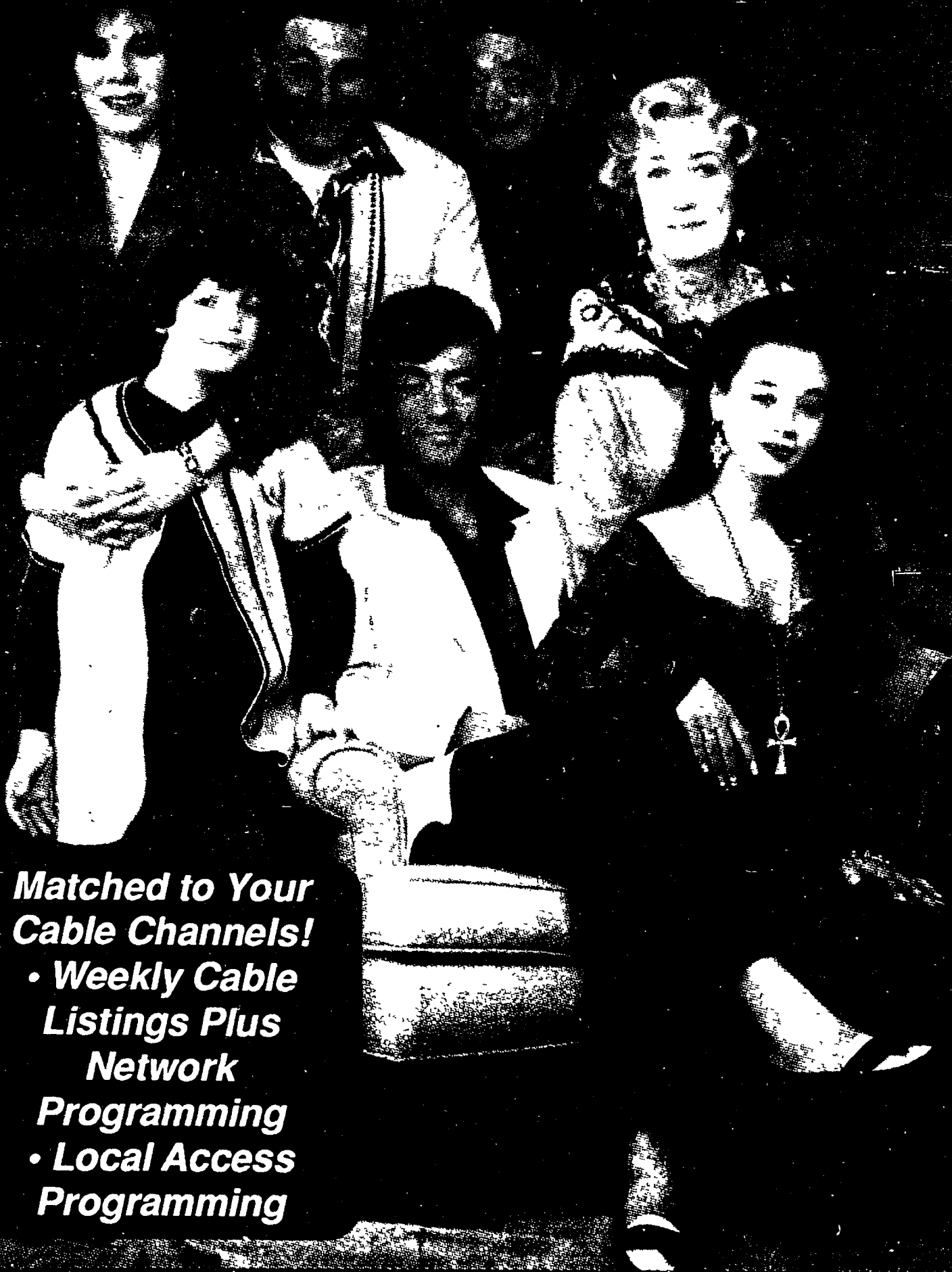

# From card shark to 'The Man in the Family'

## Ray Sharkey gets domestic role

Family tensions, family tumult and family ties (with apologies to the Keaton clan) are time-honored fodder for TV. Running the gamut from zany misadventures with sitcom tribes like the Cleavers to heart-tugging drama in series like the cleverly titled "Family Ties" and the late, lamented "A Year in the Life," familial ups and downs have been the stuff of television since it started. And TV, in its way, has mirrored the changing makeup, dynamics and responsibilities of American family units, as well as reflected the more serious sides of the ties that bind.

Such is the case with ABC's new "The Man in the Family," premiering Wednesday, June 19. Ray Sharkey stars as cocky Sal Bovasso, a charming ne'er-do-well called back to his Brooklyn home from a life of luck and leisure in Las Vegas. The reason? Sal's dad is dying and has one request: that his son take charge of their small, family-operated grocery store.

The young man promises to honor his pop's request, maybe realizing what a change it will make in his life. To be in charge of the Bovasso family business, Sal soon learns, is to be in charge of the Bovassos. Veteran character actress (and appropriately named) Julie Bovasso plays Sal's fiery mother, Angie. Leah Remini and Anne De Salvo are featured, respectively, as Sal's sisters Tina and Annie, with Billy L. Sullivan as Robby, Annie's rebellious sons and reliable Louis Guss as irascible Uncle Bennie. Don Stark rounds out a list of series regulars as Cha Cha, a boyhood chum all too ea-

ger to welcome Sal back to the old neighborhood, but heedless of his pal's new responsibilities and resolve.

In Wednesday's premiere episode, aptly titled "Honor Bound," Sal makes his commitment and begins to figure out how to live with it. He must also assert himself in the unlikely role as head of the tempestuous Bovasso household. Sal's agenda is further complicated when Cha Cha and another chum, Vinnie, arrive proposing a wild get-rich-quick scheme. Guest stars in "Honor Bound" include Joe Cortese as Vinnie, veteran Sylvia Sidney as Mrs. Panetta and Al Ruscio as the fading patriarch, Carmine Bovasso. The premiere installment was written by Ed Weinberger, from a story by Weinberger and Gina Wendkos, and directed by John Rich.

Ray Sharkey brings a wealth of experience to his portrayal of Sal Bovasso, both personally and professionally. Like his charac-

ter in "The Man in the Family," Sharkey is an Italian-American from Brooklyn, N.Y. Seeing acting as a means to better himself and leave his tough adolescence behind, Sharkey studied for several years and then took off for Los Angeles. Since then, he's had roles in "Who'll Stop the Rain," "The Idolmaker" (winning a Golden Globe Award), "The Lords of Flatbush" and last year's critically acclaimed "Class Struggles in Beverly Hills."

Sharkey is perhaps even more familiar to television audiences after well-received work in "Wiseguy," "The Neon Empire" and "Behind Enemy Lines." He's played the title role in "The Revenge of Al Capone," appeared in Tennessee Williams' "27 Wagons Full of Cotton" for cable's Arts & Entertainment network and played a recurring character in "Crime Story," NBC's intelligent critical fave of a few seasons back.

**Spike Lee fans filmmaking flames**

Just as the commotion from one of his film begins to die down, Spike Lee builds it up again with yet another movie presenting a portrait of America from his view.

The controversial director was born in Atlanta as Shelton Jackson Lee and was later nicknamed Spike by his mother. His family moved to Brooklyn, N.Y., in the early 1960s. Lee's interest in films developed during his years at Atlanta's Morehouse College. One of his early films was *The Answer*, about a black filmmaker hired to remake *Birth of a Nation*. His senior thesis, a film called *Joe's Bed-Stuy Barber Shop: We Cut Heads*, won him a Student Academy Award.

Lee's first feature film *She's Gotta Have It*, about an independent woman pursued by three men, was shot in 12 days on a budget of about \$175,000. It won critical praise, turned a nice profit and established Lee as an important filmmaker. His next film, *School Daze* didn't do well at the box office but received good reviews and is available on video.

Undaunted by the public's lukewarm response to *School Daze*, Lee went on to make *Do the Right Thing*. While critics liked the film, opposition and concern for its message was vocal.

Lee's newest film, *Jungle Fever*, focuses on an interracial relationship.

**One team may emerge as NBA team of decade**

Every year it seems like there's some team that sports media-types try to anoint as the next great pro dynasty, a bunch of guys who dominate their profession with the same methodical coolness that characterized the untouchable New York Yankee baseball teams through four decades.

But not since the Boston Celtics defined the game in the 1960s has a team come along that could truly claim to be a National Basketball League dynasty. However, when the last two teams left standing after three grueling playoff series collide for the NBA Championship on NBC this week, one will undoubtedly inherit the burden of being compared to the great teams of the past.

The Detroit Pistons know what it's like to stand at the pinnacle for two straight seasons, but the chances of Isaiah Thomas and company holding off the likes of the Portland Trail Blazers and Chicago Bulls for an entire decade seem remote at best. The Los Angeles Lakers, a team that habitually makes it to the Western Conference finals, are in the midst of transition. And even with players like Magic Johnson and Kareem Abdul Jabbar, the Lakers managed to win just five titles in the 1980s. That's an impressive feat, but it is still a far cry from the 10 championship banners that Red Auerbach and company brought home to the Boston Gardens between 1959 and 1969.

An animated *Back to the Future* with the voices and likenesses of Michael J. Fox, Christopher Lloyd and Tom Wilson will premiere next fall on the CBS Saturday morning lineup. The series will expand on all three *Back to the Future* films with new characters and wacky new inventions.

"Frugal Gourmet" Jeff Smith is moving the production of his PBS cooking show from Chicago to his home city of Seattle. The reason: "I just cannot stand one more United Airlines morning omelet," said Smith.

The rap group Byches With Problems won't be allowed to use the videotape of Rodney King being beaten by Los Angeles police. The group had offered amateur cameraman George Holliday \$1,000 for the rights to use the footage as a backdrop for its new music video "Wanted." Holliday says the video's storyboards and lyrics struck him as too anti-police.

The U.S. Supreme Court has thrown out a \$16 million libel case against 60 Minutes commentator Andy Rooney. Rooney was being sued by an Arizona manufacturer for saying that Rain-X, a wipe-on windshield product designed to repel rain, sleet and snow, "didn't work." The court has ruled such comments are protected by the First Amendment.
