Case is back to police

The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office has asked the Northville City Police Department for further investigation into the recent death of two joggers on Eight Mile Road.

The joggers, Yusuf Hanania of Novi and brother-in-law Albert Abdelour of Livonia, were running east on the north shoulder of Eight Mile Road just east of Beck Road early on June 5 when they were struck by a west-bound Jeep Wrangler.

Det. Sgt. David Fendelet, who discussed the case with the prosecutor's office Thursday, said he will resubmit the results of the city's investigation early this week.

"I've got about 10 items that I've got to do further investigation on," Fendelet said. "Further investigation is needed for the prosecutor, and (this) week further information will be presented for review."

The case is being handled by Assistant Prosecutor Charles Clause, who did not return phone calls by press time.

Though Fendelet would not comment on this specific incident, he said that a driver in such an accident could face charges ranging from negligent homicide to manslaughter or second-degree murder.

"It just depends on what the investigations show on each individual case," he said.

Negligent homicide is a misdemeanor punishable by up to two years in prison. Manslaughter and second-degree murder are felonies punishable by up to 15 years or life in prison respectively.

The Jeep was reportedly driven by a 19-year-old Novi resident, whose name is being withheld pending the completion of the investigation. He

'Buddy' shares wisdom

How old is author, philosopher, mother, grandmother, friend and teacher Maxine Wilcox?

She's not quite as old as black pepper, but she is at least as old as allspice, Wilcox said.

Wilcox eludes questions about her age, but it is the experiences and bits of wisdom she has picked up throughout her lifetime that are now available in a book.

A foster mother to 54 children, Wilcox goes by the name Buddy to all who know her.

"I've been many different things to different children, but to all I've been their friend, their Buddy," she writes in her book.

God granted her the ability to relate well to children, Wilcox said. And she is trying to make the most of her gift. Not only has she formally cared for 54 children, Wilcox has had approximately 200 children in her care over the course of her life.

She currently has Emily, a student at William Allen Academy on Eight Mile Road, in her charge. Wilcox found Emily via a classified advertisement.

Both of Emily's parents work outside of the home. Wilcox fills in as needed, picking up Emily from William Allen every day and driving the fifth-grader to her home in Plymouth.

But Wilcox is more than Emily's chauffeur.

"When I think of her, it's as a granddaughter. She is no different than Shannon," Wilcox said.

Shannon, son of Craig Wilcox, is the one biological granddaughter in Wilcox's family. Craig, an only child, grew up in a home that was filled with foster brothers and sisters. The Wilcox household was often home to as many as seven foster children.

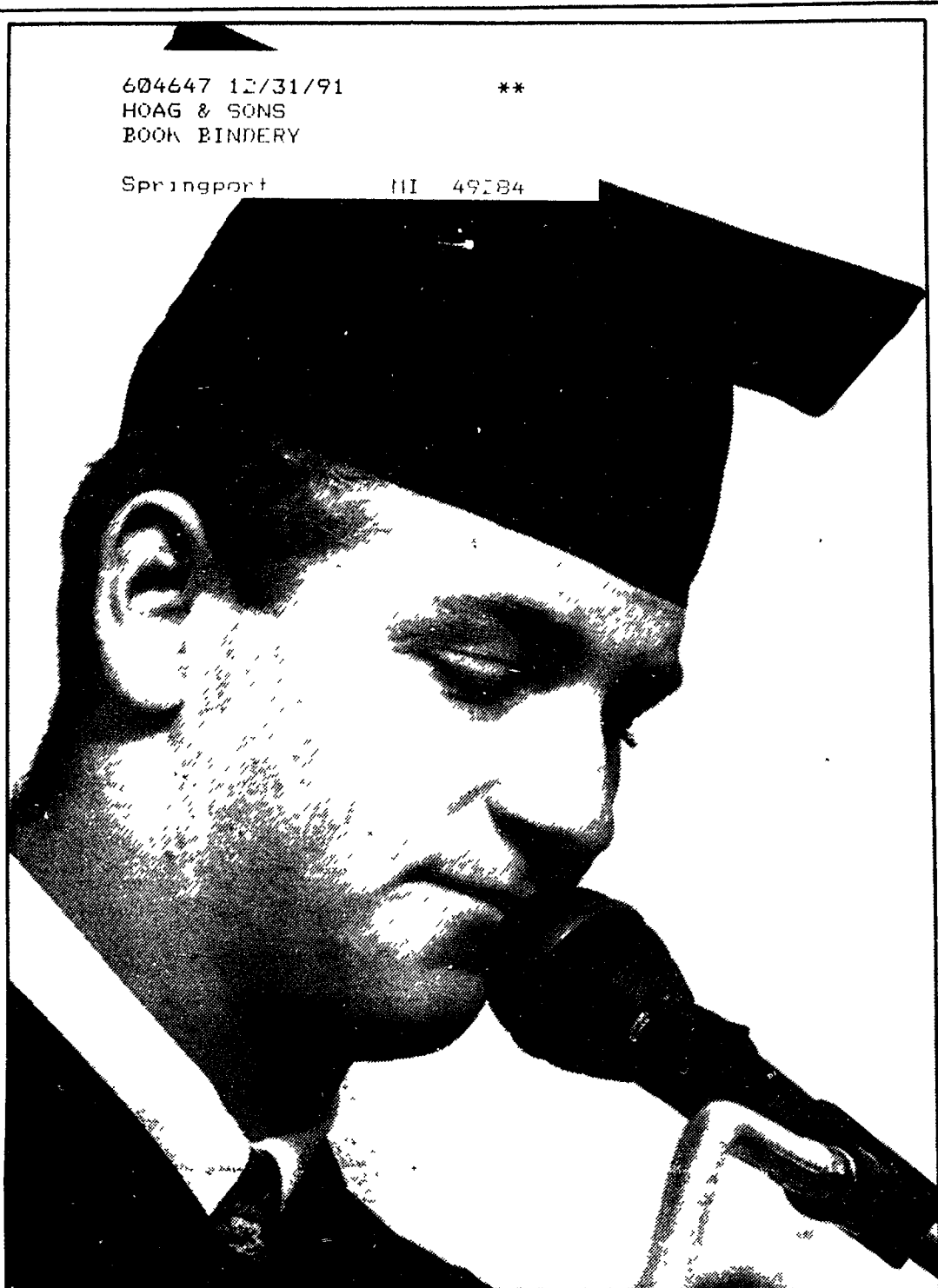

Seniors graduate from Northville High School

It was a night of goodbyes for 265 people at Northville High School on Friday.

Superintendent George Bell, school board President James Petrie, principal David Bolitho and 262 students bid adieu to the high school on the hill.

Bell delivered his ninth and final commencement speech. He plans to retire this summer.

Petrie's term on the board expires June 30, and he did not seek re-election.

Bolitho will leave the high school to take a position as assistant superintendent this summer.

But the departure of three officials was not the issue at hand Friday.

In a ceremony lasting over one hour, 262 graduating seniors walked across an outdoor stage on the Northville High School football field and were recognized for what Bolitho called their "unparalleled" achievements.

Not including trade and technical schooling 92 percent of Northville seniors will attend a two- or four-year college next year, Bolitho said.

He listed the football teams participation in the state semi-finals, the musical performance of "Evita" and the senior class representation on district improvement committees as examples of their success.

The class of 1990-91 also witnessed the school's first girls' golf team take 11th place in the state and the implementation of an incentive program for graduating seniors.

Eight valedictorians and four salutatorians also recapped the events of their four years at Northville High School and told friends and family members what they learned while in school.

Valedictorian David Smith reminisced about pre-high school fears that freshmen get taped to doors and stuffed in lockers.

Salutatorian and athlete Paul McCreadie shared a lesson he learned in sports at Northville.

"The only true failure results from the fear of failure," McCreadie said.

Another lesson was followed by salutatorian Robert Holloway, who also participated in sports while in school.

"I can do a few things, but we can do many things. We're stronger than I," Holloway said.

Valedictorian Sharon Abramovich also learned an important lesson in high school.

"My goals in life have gone from being successful to just being happy," she said.

Bell said the group, which was hired as superintendent, will be the last class he inspires with the "profundity" of his speech.

But he added that in nine years of giving speeches he has learned that brevity is more important

than profundity.

He advised the students to never stop learning.

The average person in the class of 1991 will change jobs three to seven times, he said.

"Find something you like to do. You'll know you're there when you can truly say: 'Thank God it's Monday,'" Bell said.

Class President Timothy Kerns had a few of his own words of wisdom to close Friday's ceremony.

He told his class members to remember the Latin words *carpe diem* which means "seize the day."

"Take advantage of every opportunity," he said.

Quoting from the class vice president, Charles Hugener, Kerns said Northville students may become Wolverines if they attend the University of Michigan or Spartans if they attend Michigan State University.

But every member of the Northville High School class of 1991 always will be a Mustang.

Shores dispute heading to trial

Vincent DiLorenzo faces a jury trial July 16 after a district court judge refused to dismiss criminal charges against the controversial developer.

Thirty-fifth District Court Judge James Garber on Friday brushed aside defense claims that DiLorenzo was unfairly targeted for prosecution by state Department of Natural Resources officials for his role in the Shores of Northville project.

Garber also rejected DiLorenzo's contention that Sump Drain — a tiny creek which winds its way through the Shores property and allegedly was illegally redirected — is outside the DNR's jurisdiction.

Garber told defense attorney Ken Slusser he was weary of "the foot-dragging going on here."

"(It's in) the best interest of the defendant to delay as long as possible ... (but) this case is going to be heard on the 16th of July," Garber said.

DiLorenzo and D & T Construction, the firm he heads, face charges that they failed to obtain necessary state permits prior to reclamation work last year on the 350-acre Shores site in Northville Township.

The DNR alleges the developer violated the state's Inland Lakes and Streams Act on or about Feb. 7, 1990. If found guilty, DiLorenzo and D & T could be fined up to \$10,000 per day for the alleged infraction.

Friday's hearing featured substantial legal jockeying by both the defense and prosecution.

Slusser said the DNR failed to hand over all of its Shores-related records as Garber had ordered last month. The defense could not adequately prepare its case without additional files, he said.

Garber then directed Assistant Wayne County Prosecutor Reilly Wilson to request any additional Shores material from the DNR.

The defense also sought the prosecutor's list of potential witnesses, and Garber agreed — to a point.

He told Wilson to provide Slusser a prosecution witness list, but told the defense attorney he has his own from there.

"He (Wilson) doesn't have to do all your research," Garber said. "There's no law in this state that says he has to prepare your case for you."

A constant defense theme focused upon an allegation that DiLorenzo and D & T were to blame for failure to obtain a permit and the actual earth-moving that led to massive on- and off-site erosion.

Slusser blamed the Sump Drain redirection on a subcontractor, B & V Construction of Wixom. The state should have aimed prosecution at that firm, instead of DiLorenzo, he said.

"Our contention is the illegal act is not a failure to get a permit; you do not violate statute until you actually go out and do the work," Slusser said. "That puts the onus on the person that's doing the work."

Slusser also wondered why the state chose to charge DiLorenzo and D & T, as opposed to the Seven Lakes of Northville Limited Partnership, the legal owner of the site.

Wilson's response was to the point: "We chose to charge D & T and Vincent DiLorenzo because of their roles ... D & T is the lead general partner (and) Vincent DiLorenzo was the manager of the property and was in charge."

D & T controls a 40-percent interest in the Seven Lakes partnership. Novi-based cement contractor Angelo Evangelista holds a 35-percent share, and two lending institutions — Alexander Hamilton Life Insurance and Home Federal Service Corporation — split the remaining 25-percent interest.

The defense then pulled what could be considered its trial trump card.

"I've got documentation that the DNR wanted Mr. DiLorenzo," he said. Slusser claimed the DNR has a vendetta against DiLorenzo because of previous court battles between the developer and the state.

Garber called the claim "irrelevant," because the decision to charge was the prosecutor's, not the DNR's.

Garber said he would huddle with the defense and prosecution prior to the July 16 trial to decide which — if any — of the other parties directly involved with the Shores project could be fingered by defense for testimony.

'Buddy' of academy students shares her wisdom

Of the 54 children that lived with their family, 40 still keep in touch. Wilcox has spent her life listening to the children in her care and relating to them with an understanding she said is a "special gift from God."

"People say, 'I'm listening,' but they do not hear what the child is saying. Children have so much to tell us," she said.

A section of Wilcox's book, *Trails and Tales*, is dedicated to the tidbits of wisdom children in her care have offered over the years.

"Mickey told me her eyes wanted to go back where it was dark. She wanted to sleep some more," Wilcox wrote.

Another child, David, asked Wilcox if she was alive in the great flood. He wanted to know if she had been on Noah's Ark.

A 5-year-old girl explained why Wilcox had lived so long.

"If you laugh you last," the girl said.

These anecdotes and many other are listed in Wilcox's book.

The book is available for \$9.95 at William Allan Academy, 49875 Eight Mile Road in Northville Township. The phone number is 349-5020.

A total of 500 copies of the book were published, with 150 sold so far. Each book is autographed and numbered. Proceeds benefit the academy's library.

Craig Wilcox, Buddy's son, purchased the first copy of the book at an auction held at William Allan.

"I said you were my first edition so I guess you should get my first edition," Wilcox told her son at the auction.

Buying books for children has been a dream of Wilcox's since she was a young girl in Missouri.

She has another dream, too. If all of the books from the first printing of *Trails and Tales* are sold, she hopes to have another series of books printed and sold to benefit a hospice in Howell.

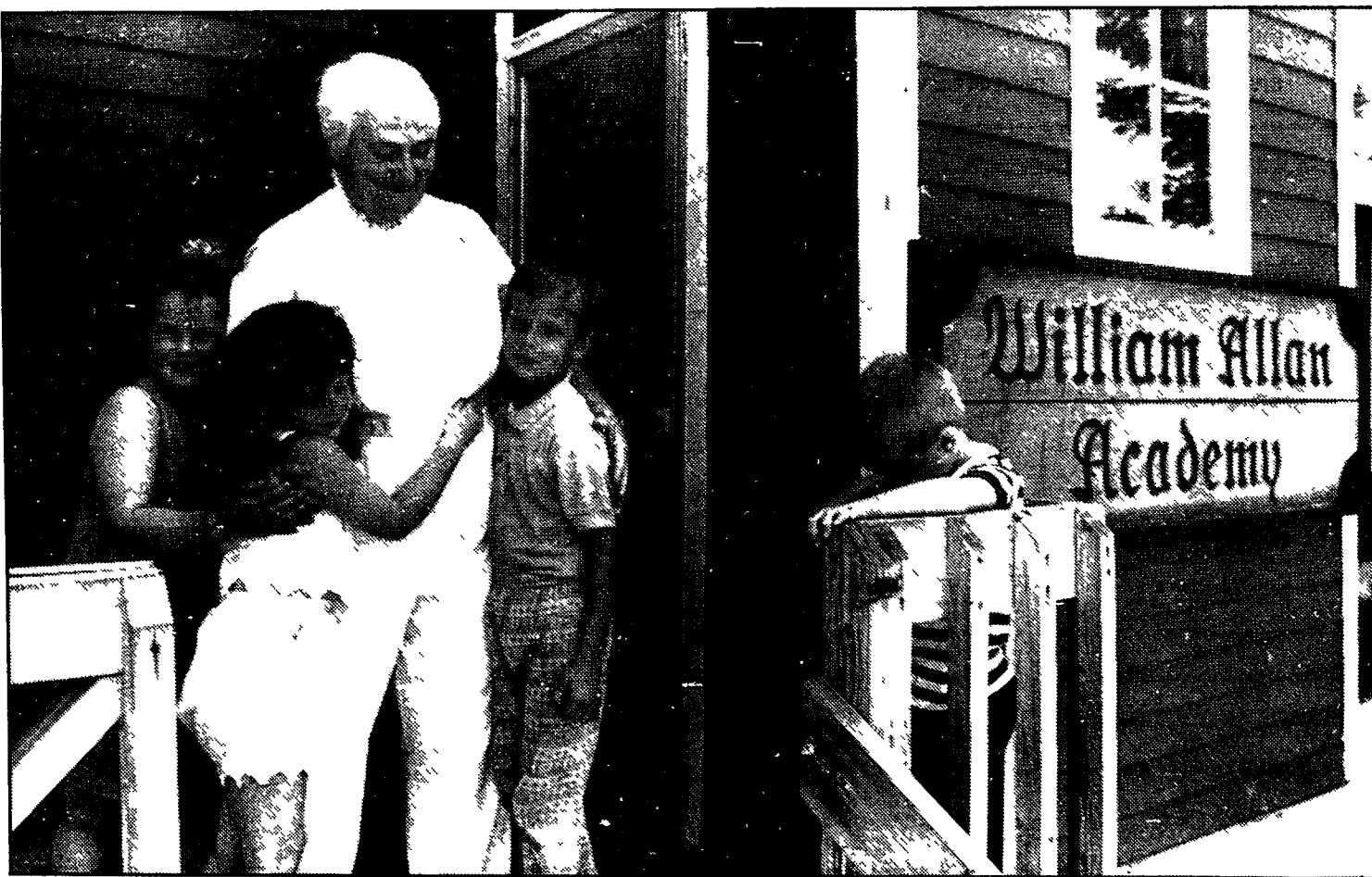
William Allan principal Valerie Hambleton, who said Wilcox is one of her mentors, wrote the foreword to the book.

"It is truly an honor to be able to have such a lady as my friend, and I believe that everyone should include this book in their personal library," Hambleton wrote.

Besides anecdotes offered to Wilcox from children over the years, *Trails and Tales* includes bits and pieces of philosophy passed down through the generations, cooking tips and recipes, and household hints.

Bits of wisdom courtesy of Buddy Wilcox include:

- Treat wrinkled hands with vinegar.
- When making soup, remember, "Soup boiled is soup spoiled."
- If your light bulb breaks while still in the socket, cut off a slice from a potato, press over jagged glass and twist. "Be sure to turn off the switch, or you could have fried potatoes seasoned with fingers," Wilcox warns.

City considers trading land

The city council took a step toward approving a land swap with Benecke & Krue, the Birmingham development company that owns Tree Top Lofts and Tree Top Park Apartments on Novi Road.

The company is seeking a piece of city-owned land north of its properties to add three upscale apartment buildings to the complex and improve its overall appearance.

Company President John Benecke told the council in April that the changes were needed to make the complex economically viable.

"Right now our project is uneconomical; it was built in the 1970s for a market and people in an age group who have probably grown out of the need for these kinds of apartments," he said. "We have tried . . . to improve the management and tenant relationship and found we were unable to attract a good quality of tenant from an economic standpoint, and now we're unable to attract tenants at all," he said.

"We feel we need to come in here and redo our project. In order to do that, we need to make some fundamental changes in the way the project appears."

The company wants to add 14 loft apartment units with garages, in three separate buildings, to the complex. One of the new buildings would be on

the north parcel and the other two would be placed among the existing structures. The plan also calls for the company to spread out the parking and add more landscaping to parking lots throughout the complex, and remodel the buildings. The existing buildings would gain balconies, landscaping, covered entrances, new windows and siding, and renovated apartment interiors under the plan.

"This isn't just cosmetic," Benecke said. He said the company is attempting "be a little more diverse in the types of units we have."

"I think it's going to take something dramatic to make our project viable again," he said.

The land swap, involving .7 acre of city land between the Rouge River and Novi Road, and .33 acre of land now owned by Benecke & Krue on the west side of the Rouge across from the complex. The Benecke & Krue property is sandwiched between two city parcels designated as parkland.

"I didn't expect to get a permit tonight," Benecke said in April.

"I'm glad you didn't," replied Mayor Chris Johnson, "but I don't see any problems with instructing the city administration to enter into negotiations."

"I have a problem," Council Member Paul Folino said.

"So do I," said Council Member Jerry Mittman. The council members asked about the value of the landlocked piece of land being traded to the city, and about the current condition of the

complex.

Mittman said, "The exterior, of course, could use a serious facelift right now . . . it's badly maintained."

This month, Benecke agreed to provide a bicycle path through the city parkland between the south end of Novi Road and Brookside Hardware to the north, and estimated the cost of that project at \$12,000.

"I think it could be a much more suitable solution, at least from a safety standpoint and an aesthetic standpoint, than to put a ribbon of concrete along Novi Road," he said.

"If this is too cumbersome, we were willing to offer the cash equivalent of what it would cost . . . but we were also willing to take on the responsibility of building it," he said.

Council members approved of the bike path concept, though Carolann Ayers cautioned that the route should be cleared with Brookside Hardware. "I don't have a problem with the concept but I don't want it to just dead end somewhere," she said.

Folino asked Benecke to connect the south end of the path with the existing sidewalk on Eight Mile Road.

"We looked at that," Benecke replied, "but it's a significant additional cost."

The proposed changes to the complex must still be approved by the planning commission.

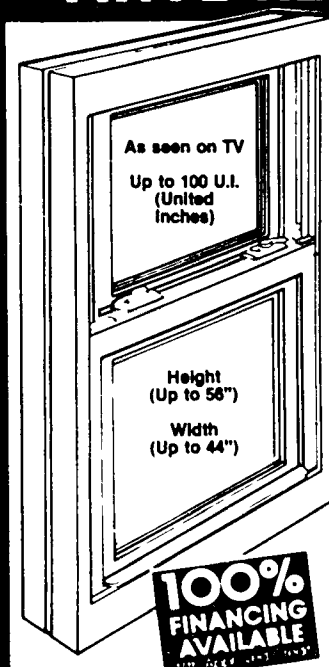

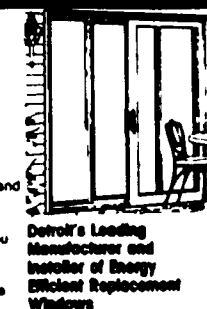

Two questioned about break-in at apartments

Death is still probed

A prosecutor's ruling in April's fatal shooting of a reputed drug dealer in Northville is still under consideration.

Ronald J. Melnyk, 33, of Westland, was fatally shot April 18 in the parking lot of the Eight Mile/Haggerty Meijer store by law enforcement officers after a failed drug bust. The Wayne County Prosecutor's office has been reviewing the case for more than a month in an effort to determine if Melnyk's shooting was justified.

A decision by the prosecutor was expected shortly after the completion of an investigation of the incident by Northville's Michigan State Police post. But the prosecutor's office decided that more investigation was warranted at the end of last month.

Doug Dwyer, an assistant prosecutor, was assigned to the case. He declined to comment directly on the case, but did say he wasn't sure when his investigation would be complete.

Dwyer will make a recommendation to the prosecutor's office in the matter. A final decision will then be made by the chief Wayne County Prosecutor.

Members of the Oakland County Narcotics Enforcement Team (NET) were conducting a "buy-bust" on Melnyk. NET Supervisor Dorothy McAllen said the team had purchased cocaine from Melnyk weeks before the incident and was going to buy more, but the Westland man attempted to bolt from the scene.

In doing so, Melnyk reportedly struck an officer with his vehicle. Officers opened fire at that point, and shot him fatally through the chest.

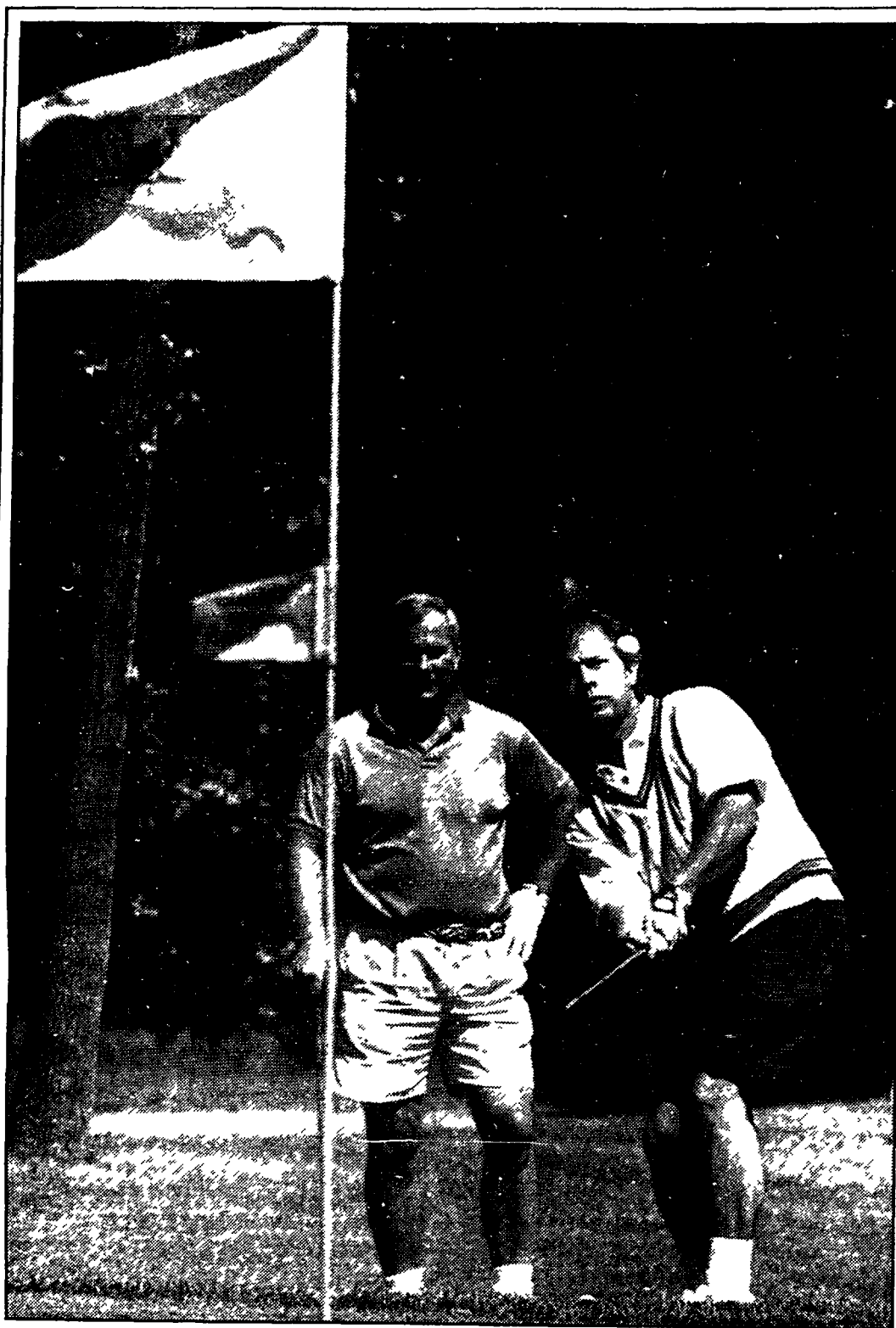
According to police records, Melnyk had a long previous criminal history.

In 1976, the Westland man was found guilty of attempted burglary. Eighteen years old at the time, he was sentenced to a year's probation.

A 1980 misdemeanor charge of stolen property was made by the Wayne County Prosecutor's office against Melnyk. He was again found guilty, and was forced to pay a \$200 fine.

Finally, in 1987, Melnyk served 30 days in jail after being convicted of a misdemeanor charge of "dangerous drugs," records said. He was also given two years of probation for the offense.

McAllen said in April that Melnyk was a "sizable" drug dealer in Novi. She said NET had been conducting an investigation of the man for several months before the shooting.

Civic Concern makes plea for funds

The head of a local relief group appealed for aid recently to members of the Merchants' Association.

Marlene Kunz, director of the Northville-based Civic Concern, told the association that the group provides a needed resource to area families and senior citizens. While the need is growing, she said, the group's resources are being cut.

"The bulk of our work is done with food," Kunz said. "We try to ensure that no family in the area goes with-

out food. A lot of these mothers have already lost 30 percent of their food stamps."

"We can't do it without you," she said. "We have already lost one total grant, and we lost \$2,500 from another grant . . . We got totally knocked out of Wayne County; they funded a homeless program instead."

Civic Concern had been entitled to a \$4,000 grant from Wayne County and a \$4,500 grant from Oakland. This year, the Oakland grant was sliced to \$2,000 while the Wayne grant was cut altogether, leaving Civic

Concern with a \$6,500 shortfall.

After a \$2,000 purchase planned for later this month, the group's coffers will be down to \$2,300 for the rest of the year, Kunz said. And the bulk of donations usually aren't made until the end of the year. "We get most of our (cash) donations at the end of November or December, and rely the rest of the year on people donating cans," she said.

"The cash donations this year were far less," she added.

Civic Concern was formed in 1983 by a group of concerned Northville residents. The group helps about 60

families in Northville, Novi, Livonia, Farmington and Farmington Hills, and distributes food to senior citizens through the state's Focus Hope program.

Civic Concern works in conjunction with local churches, other social service agencies, schools and individuals. The group provides emergency food, clothing, medication assistance, household goods, and some transportation assistance.

The non-profit agency spends about 95 percent of the money raised through donations and grants on food for those in need. The rest of the

funds cover overhead expenses like telephone and postage bills.

No staff members are paid for their work.

Food is distributed from Civic Concern's 215 W. Cady St. location on the second and fourth Friday of each month, between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. The group needs cash donations as well as donations of canned goods, paper products, soap, cereal, diapers and baby food.

All donations are tax-deductible.

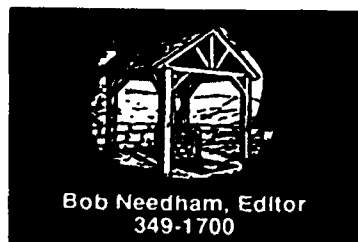

Voter turnout sends worrisome signals

Nobody expected a flood of voters at the polls in last Monday's school election. The ballot featured a rather uncontroversial tax proposal, the filling of two seats on the Northville School Board with only two candidates to fill them, and three races for the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees. On the surface, there's not a lot there to excite the average voter.

There should have been, though, and it was somewhat disturbing to hear the voter turnout figures.

Get-out-the-vote fliers distributed by Citizens for a Better Northville warned that the issues on the ballot might conceivably be decided by just 10 percent of the registered voters. The actual results weren't quite that bad, but still, only around 14 percent of those who could have voted a week ago chose to do so.

Actually, Northville did better than many. In Plymouth/Canton — where there were two contested school board seats in addition to a millage proposal and the Schoolcraft board — voters could not even muster 12-percent turnout. In Livonia, which faced a school board contest but no millage, the figure plummeted to just 2.69 percent. And in Novi — which had neither a millage nor contested board seats — turnout was just over one-half of one percent.

But 14 percent is nothing of which to be proud. In fact, it's unfair to the town as a whole.

Oddly, last September when the schools proposed a 1.28-mill tax increase, turnout was almost twice what it was last week — this in spite of the fact that the issue back then, both in terms of potential losses for the schools and potential impact on the wallet, was much smaller.

The millage question alone should have brought out the voters in droves last week. Here the entire tax revenue for operating the schools was at stake. It



means thousands of dollars in property taxes for individual homeowners in the school district. Aren't these things important enough to cast a vote on?

Now there are certainly many reasons for not voting. Lack of information is a big one. Lack of time is another. Simple lack of interest, while harder to understand, is probably just as important a contributor.

These reasons are not enough, however. It's everyone's responsibility to participate in the electoral process as often as possible. Sure, it's not always possible, but we should be able to get more than 14 percent at the polls. The schools got lucky this time, and will be able to open their doors in September. Next time, who knows?

That's not to say that it's just school votes that are important, and it's certainly not to imply that every millage proposal deserves passage. The point is simply that these decisions are community decisions; they are supposed to be made by the community as a whole. There is no way to feel comfortable the community's will is being carried out when only 14 percent of the voters do the carrying.

There are more elections coming up this year, including a Republican primary for the state House of Representatives and the nonpartisan election for the Northville City Council. Let's hope those important decisions get made by a larger share of the community than just 14 percent.

Heroes always been drivers



Willie Nelson's heroes may have always been cowboys, but mine have always been race car drivers.

I've always been a nut for cars and racing. My mom said that when I was just a baby, she hung a mobile over my crib that had all sorts of little blue and red trinkets hanging from it. Rocking horses, lambs, bears — you know, baby stuff.

But whenever she watched me in the crib, she said my eyes would always follow the bright red race car as it turned slow, lazy laps over my head. A developmental psychologist might disagree, but Mom contends that the car on the mobile was imprinted on my brain for life.

I can remember watching the Daytona 500 on ABC's Wide World of Sports when I was just 6. Donnie Allison won it, driving a Dodge Charger. You can look it up.

By the time I was in first grade, I was a subscriber to Hot Rod Magazine. In second grade, I got into serious arguments with Elizabeth Lamma (she was a girl, but she was cool 'cause she liked cars) over the relative merits of the Dodge Charger vs. a Dodge Challenger. She made such a good argument for the Challenger that 10 years later I bought one — a bright red '72 — as my first car.

So you can understand why I was reveling in the nostalgia when I attended last Wednesday's induction dinner for the Motorsports Hall of Fame of America, which is based in Novi. From beginning to end, the entire evening was a class act.

After a fine meal, racing commentator and writer Ken Squier took the stage as master of ceremonies. The inductees

were announced one by one. We were treated to brief videos highlighting each man's career and contribution to motorsports.

For each inductee, someone was called to the stage to present the "Horsepower" statuette commemorating their status as a Hall of Famer. The presenters, in some cases, were as famous as the inductees themselves.

In the case of air racer Roscoe Turner, the presenter was perhaps even more of a household name than the man he was chosen to honor. Stephen Tate, the pilot who shot down the first Iraqi jet in the Persian Gulf War, spoke of Turner's contribution to the development of World War II fighting aircraft, and how he's revered and emulated among all combat fliers. Tate received the evening's only standing ovation.

Nobody spoke for long, but when men like Al Unser, Junior Johnson and Don "The Snake" Prudhomme took the stage, I listened intently. I never once doubted their sincerity.

Therein lie some of the reasons I admire professional racers. When you compare them to other sports stars, they somehow seem more genuine and approachable.

And they are almost always a class act. To date, racing is still the only major sport not to have been blemished by some major scandal. Racing has no Black Sox, no point shaving in its history.

Broadcaster Chris Economaki summed it up for me Wednesday night. He was called on to present the award for three-time Indy 500 winner Wilbur Shaw to Wilbur's son, Bill.

He said Wilbur was the first man to change the public misconception of race car drivers as "hot-rodders just trying to kill themselves" to the more favorable images we have today. They're hard workers, professionals and corporate spokespeople.

And, yes, even role models and heroes.

Sewer project stretches on

The backhoes and earthmovers that have clawed a twisted path through the heart of Northville Township in recent months have become a symbol of the times.

Progress. Development. Population hikes.

Resultant demands for services. Six Mile Road between Northville Road and Sheldon was closed for a time as crews cut a sewer line path. Workers currently jockey traffic through one lane on Northville Road between Six and Seven Mile as the chore continues.

Huge cement cylinders line the roads, awaiting burial and connection to miles of similar pipe.

Countless trees and shrubs along

both shoulders of Northville Road have fallen. The same fate met trees inside Edward Hines Park.

Residents sandwiched between the northern township portions of Beck and Sheldon witnessed the steady stride of construction and its less-than-eye-pleasing wake earlier this year.

Many more trees will fall before the Western Townships Utilities Authority's (WTUA) sprawling sewer line is complete.

But the \$100-million project to connect Northville, Plymouth and Canton townships with an Ypsilanti-based sewer system is a necessary evil of population boom times, project overseers say.

When completed in late 1993, the WTUA sewer line will be ready to service the bulk of township land west of

Northville Road.

Much of the land is undeveloped, but large tracts including proposed developments on the old county land (Huntington Falls) and the former Thomson Sand & Gravel (Shores of Northville) sites will soon be in need of advanced sewer capabilities.

Major developers will pay the WTUA sewer system tab through capital connection fees, said Northville Township Supervisor Georgina Goss, who also sits atop the WTUA executive board.

"The system will be paid for by new construction, not by existing residents," said Goss, who called the line "an environmental enhancement project."

If the economy continues to falter and development lags, the project's 30-year bond obligation will initially

be met with funds from a township Water & Sewer Department restricted account.

"We have been planning this for many years," Goss said. "We will not come up short."

And the project is chugging along on schedule, said Ann Bollin, WTUA executive director.

Bollin said contractors setting pipe are maintaining "an aggressive schedule."

Bollin did not know exactly how long crews would work in Northville Township, but said: "I don't expect it to be long."

And lengthy, barren strips of dirt left upturned by heavy machinery will not stay that way long, she said.

"There will be a complete restoration plan," she said.

Compost site now open — sort of

There is good news for township residents who closely follow the travails of the Western Townships Utilities Authority's composting center.

It's open for business.

The bad news is Northville Township residents can't use it.

A 70-acre composting site near the Michigan Avenue/Sheldon Road intersection in Canton Township opened in April, but because the North-

ville Township board has not implemented a curbside collection strategy, residents here will have to hold on to their leaves, twigs, branches and grass clippings a while longer.

The Canton Township board and planning commission okayed the composting site off Michigan Avenue at the end of March, ending more than a year's quest for a site that could meet community, WTUA and state Department of Natural Resources approval.

The site is owned and operated by Composting Systems of Ypsilanti and currently is open to Can-

ton and Plymouth township residents, the balance of the WTUA triumvirate.

Residential yard wastes are shipped to the site, processed by WTUA-owned equipment, and stored in WTUA-leased space, said Ann Bollin, WTUA executive director.

Eventually, WTUA community residents will be able to rid themselves of yard wastes and retrieve garden-ready compost from the site, Bollin said.

But township residents will have to wait at least until September — the target date for preferred status curbside collections — to use the facility.

Walters will provide a project list for the June 3 meeting.

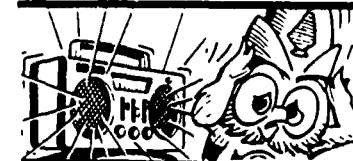

Mumm's the word in the Napa Valley

Around the country, Mumm Napa Valley wines are making more than mere splashes in champagne glasses.

In 1986, Mumm Napa Valley made a modest debut with 10,000 cases of its non-vintage Mumm Cuvee Napa. Today, it is still considered among California's newest methode champenoise sparkling wine producers but one of the top sellers, producing slightly more than 100,000 cases after only five years.

Mumm Napa Valley is a joint venture between the Champagne house of G.H. Mumm & Cie. of Reims, France and the Seagram Classics Wine Co. Classics, a premier producer and marketer of fine wines, also owns and manages Sterling Vineyards and the Monterey Vineyard. It also imports and markets Champagne Mumm.

"While it carries the name of its prestigious parent company, at Mumm Valley we're not trying to make an expression of a French product," said winemaker Greg Fowler. "Mumm Napa Valley is a fruit-oriented style of sparkling wine."

"In any non-vintage sparkling wine, such as our Brut Prestige, the house style must dominate. Ours is an artistic expression of California fruit. We source from 56 vineyards and contract with 34 growers to produce the Mumm-Napa Valley style. For other wines in the product line, the vineyard or the vintage can be staged."

This was done exceptionally well in 1989 when Mumm Napa Valley introduced the country's first vineyard-designated sparkling wine, Winery Lake sparkling wine, said Fowler. "In this wine, the plurality of pinot noir (60 percent) offers the backbone. The chardonnay (40 percent) adds zest and livens the overall presentation."

"Each year, this vineyard-designated release represents both the character of the vintage and the expression of the vineyard."

The proof of Fowler's statement is immediately perceived when the 1987 Winery Lake sparkling wine (\$24) is assessed. It was a relatively cool vintage in 1987 — just what grapes destined for sparkling wine need. They maintain their vibrant acidity while developing full aromas and flavors.

The top of the line packaging from Mumm Napa Valley is the Vintage Reserve, made only in years exhibiting special qualities. Current release is the 1987 Vintage Reserve (\$24). It is lean, streamlined, elegant and finesseful. "I'm extremely pleased with this wine," said Fowler. "I think we got it just right."

What's next? "We made a 1989 cuvee," Fowler said. "But I'm not sure yet, if it will be released as a Vintage Reserve or not."

While Fowler said that his product is not an imitation of a French champagne, it must be noted that the company's president and chef de caves Guy Devaux was born in Epemay, in the heart of France's Champagne district. Devaux has devoted more than 40 years to creating fine still and sparkling wines in France and the United States.

In 1960, Devaux came to the United States to work at Gold Seal Winery in Hammondsport, in New York's Finger Lakes. Gold Seal was a pioneer in the production of sparkling wines. In 1979, Devaux drew on his sparkling wine knowledge and became involved in the development of Mumm Napa Valley.

WINE SELECTION OF THE WEEK

Mumm Napa Valley Brut Prestige (\$17) showcases ripe, fragrant fruit aromas over gentle toastiness. It offers a full palate impression of flavorful fruit with a lengthy finish. It is a blend of 60 percent pinot noir, 33 percent chardonnay, 5 percent pinot meunier with pinot gris as the balance. The latter, albeit small percentage, adds a spice element to the nose and sets the house style apart. This sparkler will please those toasting the bride, celebrating a June anniversary, or simply enjoying the gift of friendship.

Playing Chicken Variety for a poultry sum

Chickens are dying these days for busy cooks. Not that all their parts are needed — quite the contrary. It's the chicken breasts, especially boneless, skinless chicken breasts, that have captured the market.

Skinless, boneless chicken breasts, which first appeared in supermarkets in the early 1980s, now account for 24 percent of all chicken sales. That compares to 10 percent in 1980. Whole chickens, by the way, have slipped to 19 percent of sales, compared to 50 percent 10 years ago, says Dot Tringali, director of consumer research for the National Poultry Council.

For cooks, skinless, boneless breasts are almost too good to be true. They're quick, half the calories and a third the cholesterol of chicken with skin, and so versatile you can practically eat them Monday through Friday without, as the saying goes, sprouting wings.

They are the "fastest-growing segment of the chicken industry," says Tringali. "I think they're nutritious, cook so quickly and you can do most anything with them, including substituting them for other meats that aren't so nutritious."

She has watched the chicken market evolve from whole chickens to cut-up chickens, then packaging in parts to the current piecemeal of breasts, nuggets and patties. But the leader is clearly the boneless, skinless breasts.

"A lot of people only buy them and no other cut of chicken," says Tringali.

Some families practically live on chicken breasts because they're healthy, easy to cook and can be prepared in so many different ways. One tasty after-work trick with chicken breasts is to marinate them in Italian dressing and grill them. Other ways are to stir-fry with fresh veget-

ables, fix them like fried chicken or combine them with artichokes.

Italian flavors work well to spice up the otherwise-bland white meat. Substitute them for veal in Chicken Parmesan by pounding the breasts first and browning them, then adding a good tomato sauce and covering them with mozzarella and Parmesan. Or roll chicken breasts with a slice of prosciutto in Italian Rolled Chicken Breasts.

Like fish, chicken breasts seem to need a marinade or strong seasoning for best results. Use chicken breasts instead of whole chicken in making fried chicken by rubbing seasoned salt, salt and pepper, over the breasts, then rolling them in flour that has also been seasoned with seasoned salt and pepper, doublecoating the chicken before frying it traditionally.

A few tips for foolproof chicken breasts:

- Don't cook chicken too long or it will dry out.
- When grilling chicken, keep the grill oiled so the chicken doesn't stick.
- To cut down on cost, buy bone-in breasts and bone yourself. Save the skin and bones to make homemade chicken stock.
- Chicken breasts seem to marry well with Oriental flavors as well as Italian. Ginger, garlic, soy sauce, honey, lemon or lime juice combine for a simple marinade.

A few recipes follow:

Birdwatchers guide to the butcher counter

Rock Cornish hens, broiler-fryers, roasters, capons and stewing hens — all rule the roost on America's dining tables.

Thanks to the versatility and economical status of chicken, it fits into a budget family meal or the most elegant formal dinner party. You can poach, roast, grill, broil, saute or simmer it, dress it up or down. Not only is chicken easy to prepare, but it's easy on the pocketbook and gentle on the waistline.

Who are these rulers of the roost?

• Rock Cornish hens are the smallest and youngest members of the chicken family. These are a cross between two breeds that usually weigh 1½ pounds or less. They are wonderful roasted whole, or split and grilled or broiled. Usually figure on one hen per person.

• Broiler-fryers are all-purpose chickens. They are young meaty birds that weigh 3 to 4½ pounds. These tender birds are best broiled, fried or grilled but can be roasted, steamed or poached.

• The roaster is a little older and larger than the broiler-fryer. Generally, they weigh between 4½ and 8 pounds with more meat. These are perfect for roasting but

also can be cut up and sauteed, broiled or poached. Look for plump-breasted birds with creamy white or yellow skins and short bodies.

• A capon lives a lazy life and grows big and fat. They have a delicate and tender abundance of white meat. Usually, a capon weighs between 8 and 10 pounds and is perfect for roasting.

• Stewing hens are older birds and weigh between 3 and 7 pounds. These are basically soup chickens and sometimes are hard to find at the store. Because they are older the meat is stringy but loaded with flavor. They require slow, long moist cooking to tenderize the meat to produce a rich, wonderful broth.

Choose chicken with moist skin, tender flesh and fresh smell. Since many times you are unable to smell the chicken because of packaging, check the expiration date for freshness. The feed a chicken has been fed accounts for the skin color, but the taste is the same.

Figure three-quarters to one pound of bone-in chicken for each serving. A 3½-pound bird will

Look for low fat alternatives in dairy case

June is recognized as National Dairy Month to celebrate dairy products and the importance they play in our daily diet.

Milk and other dairy products supply protein as well as a variety of vitamins and minerals essential for good health.

Vitamin A, vitamin D, phosphorus, riboflavin and vitamin B-12 are among those necessary for healthy skin and hair.

The most commonly known benefit of milk and milk products is calcium — the mineral vital for strong teeth and bones.

While it's important to choose dairy products for the vitamins and minerals they provide, it's equally important to choose from the low-fat selections available in today's market.

Many delicious low-fat dairy products can be found in the dairy case for the health- and diet-conscious consumer.

Low-fat and skim milk, reduced-calorie margarine, low-fat and part-skim cheese, and the many low-fat frozen dairy desserts are all excellent choices.

Yogurt, which gained popularity as a "health food" in the '70s and '80s, has been perfected to taste wonderfully good as a snack or frozen treat. Frozen yogurt, which is low in calories and fat and high in calcium and protein, is one of my favorites.

Other low-fat dairy tips to try: Substitute 2 tablespoons plain yogurt for 2 ta-

blespoons sour cream to top your baked potato.

Spread 1 ounce part-skim ricotta cheese on a bagel instead of 1 ounce cream cheese and cut the calories in half.

Spoon into chocolate frozen yogurt (105 calories and 2 grams fat per ½ cup) instead of high-fat premium chocolate ice cream (230 calories and 8 grams fat per ½ cup) for dessert. Go ahead and celebrate National Dairy Month by choosing low-fat dairy products. Healthy selections make all the difference in fat and calories.

BUTTERMILK-WALNUT SOUP

Makes 2 servings, about ½ cup each
1½ cups low-fat buttermilk (1 percent milk fat)
1 ounce finely ground walnuts
½ teaspoon minced scallion (green onion)
1 garlic clove, minced
½ packet (about ½ teaspoon) instant chicken broth and seasoning mix
¼ teaspoon salt
Dash white pepper
1 ½ teaspoons minced fresh dill

In blender combine all ingredients except dill and process until smooth; stir in dill. Cover and refrigerate until flavors

blend, at least 1 hour.

1 tablespoon dark rum

¼ teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 medium banana (about 6 ounces), peeled and diagonally sliced
1 cup plain low-fat yogurt
2 teaspoons grated orange zest

In 1-quart microwavable shallow casserole combine butter and margarine and microwave on high (100 percent) for 30 seconds, until melted.

Stir in orange juice, rum, sugar and cinnamon and stir to dissolve sugar. Microwave on High for 2 minutes until mixture is reduced by ¼. Add banana and turn to coat; microwave on high for 30 seconds, until banana is heated through (do not overcook).

In small mixing bowl combine yogurt and vanilla. Into each of 2 dessert dishes spoon half of the yogurt; top each portion with half of the banana mixture and 1 teaspoon orange zest.

The zest of the orange is the peel without any of the pith (white membrane). To remove zest from orange, use a zester or vegetable peeler; wrap orange in plastic wrap and refrigerate for use at another time.

HONEY-MUSTARD CHICKEN TERIYAKI

2 tablespoons honey
1 tablespoon prepared Chinese mustard
4 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves
3 scallions, chopped
1 tablespoon minced fresh ginger
¼ cup dry sherry
3 tablespoons teriyaki sauce
Yields 4 servings.

In a cup, mix honey and mustard; set aside. Cut lengthwise pocket along side of each chicken breast. Fill pockets with scallions and ginger; press to close. Lightly score tops of chicken breasts, if you like.

Place chicken in medium glass casserole. Sprinkle chicken with sherry and teriyaki sauce; turn once to coat. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour or overnight.

Preheat broiler or grill. Place chicken on rack 4 to 6 inches from heat source. Brush with honey mustard. Broil or grill for 8 to 10 minutes or until cooked through, brushing with remaining honey mustard and turning once.

MAPLE CHICKEN

4 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves, salt and pepper to taste

1 tablespoon chopped onion
¼ cup orange juice
1 tablespoon orange peel
3 tablespoons maple syrup
Yields 4 servings.

Saute chicken breasts, which have been salted and peppered, in a little bit of oil. When done, take out

and keep warm.

Top same pan, add onion, orange juice, orange peel, maple syrup and additional pepper. Boil sauce down until it begins to thicken.

Return chicken breasts to the sauce. Serve breasts and sauce, topped with parsley.

CORNFLAKE CHICKEN

1 stick margarine or butter, melted
1 teaspoon garlic powder
¼ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon pepper
¼ teaspoon poultry seasoning
3 pounds chicken breasts
1 cup potato chips
1 cup cornflakes
Yields 6 servings.

Mix butter, garlic powder, salt, pepper and poultry seasoning. Dip breasts in mixture. Crunch chips and cornflakes and mix together, then dip chicken in the mixture.

Place in a casserole dish. Extra batter may be poured over the chicken breasts. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until flakes are golden brown.

ARTICHOKE CHICKEN BREASTS

3 pounds chicken breasts
1 to 1½ teaspoons salt
¼ teaspoon paprika
¼ teaspoon pepper
6 tablespoons butter
1 (8 ounce) can whole mushrooms, drained
2 tablespoons flour
1 cup chicken broth
¼ cup dry sherry
1 (14 ounce) can artichoke hearts, drained
Yields 6 servings.

Season chicken breasts with salt, paprika and pepper. Brown in butter and remove chicken breasts to casserole dish.

In same dish as chicken was browned, saute mushrooms and blend in flour. Stir in broth and sherry. Cook until thickened.

Add artichokes and pour sauce over breasts. Bake at 350 F oven for 35 to 45 minutes.

ITALIAN ROLLED CHICKEN BREASTS

3 whole chicken breasts
6 slices prosciutto
¼ cup flour
¼ cup grated Parmesan
¼ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon pepper
3 tablespoons olive oil
1 can cream of mushroom soup
½ cup dry white wine
Yields 6 servings.

Cut each breast in half. Place between foil or waxed paper and pound until thin. Place 1 slice prosciutto over each breast and roll up. Secure with skewers or toothpicks.

Mix flour, cheese, salt and pepper. Roll each breast in mixture.

Heat olive oil and brown rolled breasts.

Place meat in crockery cooker and pour soup and wine over. Cook for 4 hours on low. Sprinkle remaining flour in pot and stir to blend.

CHICKEN HULA

2 whole chicken breasts, split
2 cloves garlic, pressed
Salt
1 (20 ounce) can pineapple slices
¼ cup honey
2 to 4 tablespoons fresh lime juice
2 tablespoons soy sauce

1 tablespoon cornstarch
Grated peel from 2 limes
Yields 4 servings.

Rub chicken with garlic and sprinkle with salt. Broil or grill chicken until cooked, about 10 minutes. Keep warm.

Drain pineapple juice into large saucepan. Combine with honey, lime juice, soy sauce and cornstarch. Cook, stirring until thickened. Add pineapple slices and heat through. Serve pineapple and sauce with chicken. Sprinkle with lime peel.

GRILLED CHICKEN BREASTS WITH MANDARIN ORANGE SAUCE

2 whole chicken breasts, skinned, halved and boned
2 tablespoons margarine, melted
¼ teaspoon ginger
¼ teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon grated orange peel
1 cup orange juice
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1 (11-ounce) can mandarin oranges, drained
Yields 4 servings.

Place chicken breast halves between waxed paper and pound until thin. In small bowl, combine margarine and ¼ teaspoon cinnamon. Set aside.

In small saucepan, combine cornstarch, brown sugar, ginger, ¼ teaspoon cinnamon and orange peel. Stir in juices. Bring to boil, stirring constantly. Boil for 1 minute. Remove from heat. Stir in mandarin oranges. Cover and keep warm.

When ready to grill, cook chicken breasts 8 to 10 minutes or until done. Brush with margarine mixture. Serve with mandarin orange sauce.

Know your chicken before buying

feed four comfortably, but a 1½-pound Rock Cornish hen will only serve one person. If you're serving chicken parts, a half breast or two drumsticks or thighs per person is a sufficient amount.

Small chickens (broilers and fryers) and Cornish game hens are the leanest poultry, as small young birds tend to be leaner than large, older ones. Chicken broilers have less than 10 percent fat, roasters have 12 to 18 percent and large hens have 20 to 30 percent, so you may want to use two small birds instead of one large. In poultry, the white meat has less fat and cholesterol than the dark.

Lately, stories have surfaced regarding salmonella bacteria in chickens. Don't kick the chicken habit because of these stories. Instead, take extra precautions. At the grocery store, put chicken in a plastic bag, even though it is wrapped. Most meat counters will have a bag readily available. This way no drippings will contaminate other foods while you are shopping or while it is stored in the refrigerator. You may want to refresh the chicken by squeezing fresh lemon juice over the skin and into the cavity prior to cooking.

Refrigerate or freeze chicken as soon as possible. To keep it longer than two days, re-wrap and freeze. Defrost chicken in the refrigerator, never at room temperature. A 3½-pound bird will thaw in about a day in the refrigerator, or thaw quickly in the microwave and cook immediately. Make sure you clean everything that touches the raw meat: knives, cutting boards, countertops and especially your hands. Clean up thoroughly with soap and warm water.

Never eat chicken that is still pink in the center, whether you are eating out or in your kitchen. Since heat destroys salmonella, the chicken has to be cooked to at least 180-185 degrees Fahrenheit on a meat thermometer. Using a common-sense approach to handling chicken will give you a safe product. From drumstick to breast, chicken provides high-quality protein in your diet. Chicken also is kind to your diet (calories), easy to digest, requires no cooking fat and has a tender, flavorful taste.

Remove from the heat and stir in vanilla extract. Pour the custard mixture into a bowl, place a piece of plastic wrap directly over the top and cool completely.

Refrigerate the custard mixture, covered, until well chilled, about 8 hours. (The custard can be made up to 1 day in advance.) Stir the peach puree into the custard mixture. Whip the cream until firm peaks form. Stir a large spoonful of the whipped cream into the fruit mixture, then fold in the remaining cream.

Pour the mousse mixture into a freezerproof bowl, cover tightly and place in the freezer to firm up, about 8 hours. (The mousse may be prepared up to 4 days in advance.) Alternatively, the mousse may be spooned into individual bowls or ramekins and frozen; smaller portions will firm up in about 1 hour and 15 minutes.

FROZEN PEACH MOUSSE

This mousse is made from simple ingredients; egg yolks, sugar, cream and a fresh peach puree.

To make the puree, peel, halve and pit 3 large, ripe peaches; cut the fruit into chunks and process in the bowl of a food processor fitted with the steel blade.

Other purees, such as nectarine, mango or strawberry, are made in the same way. Apricots or pears, canned in natural juices and drained, can also be pureed to form a delicious fruit base.

Cooling spoonfuls of this mousse are delicious served with thin butter wafers.

¼ cup granulated sugar
4 extra-large egg yolks, at room temperature
1 ½ cups light cream, scalded
1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
1 cup fresh peach puree
¾ cup cold heavy cream

Whisk the sugar and egg yolks in a heavy saucepan (preferably enameled cast iron).

'Bob Barker emcees Daytime Emmys in first-ever prime-time slot'

'Twelfth time may be the charm for Susan Lucci'

A couple of firsts marks this year's Daytime Emmy Awards, airing Thursday, June 27, live from New York City: One, the ceremonies will be presented during prime time for the first time in the show's 18-year history; two, "All My Children" star Susan Lucci will compete for an unprecedented 12th time in the Outstanding Lead Actress category.

CBS leads the field with 78 nominations. ABC trails with 37 — less than half. NBC scored 29, PBS 22, Cable 14 and Fox 3.

Not new to the show is this year's repeat-host, Bob Barker ("The Price Is Right"). Barker, a five-time winner, could win his sixth game-show trophy during Thursday's CBS telecast.

What does Barker think of Lucci's chances? "If I were Susan Lucci," says Barker, "I would be sitting around hoping I did not win, because she gets more publicity for not winning the Emmy than the winner gets for winning the Emmy." "Cheers" Ted Danson had been running neck-in-neck with Lucci for winless Emmy nominations until pulling away last season with a victory in prime-time Emmy competition.

Far from bitter about her dubious honor, Lucci has, in fact, capitalized on the scenario. Most recently she appears on a Nutrasweet commercial as a pampered, powder-puffed star who gets everything she wants — "except the Emmy!" she suddenly shouts, throwing an on-set temper tantrum. The creative spot also copped a Clio nomination.

The actress has also introduced a new line of hair-care products known as The Susan Lucci Collection with the help of Rodeo Drive salon owner Fernando Romero.

"If she (Lucci) wins an Emmy," says Barker, looking at the contest from all angles, "it's going to end her commercial career. Once she's

won, well, then she's just another actress with with an Emmy. But as long as she doesn't win, she's an actress with 12 or 13 nominations."

But Barker is upbeat about his own prospects of winning. "I have five trophies. I think a half-dozen would be a nice number, don't you?" he goads in his optimistic "Price-Is-Right" tone of voice.

"Someone asked me, 'Have you ever hosted the Emmy Awards when you were nominated,'" tells Barker. "I have not only hosted when I was nominated, I've hosted the Emmys when I've won, I've hosted the Emmys when I lost, and I've hosted the Emmys when I was disqualified. So I don't think they'll have any surprises for me, but if I have my choice, I'd prefer to do it when I win."

And if Barker's competition, Alex Trebek ("Jeopardy!"), should win? Well, Trebek can just "come on down," says Barker. "I think that if I don't win, and Alex is there, I'm just going to say, 'All right, if you're so good, you just do the rest of the show,'" he chuckles.

The Daytime Emmy Awards honor excellence in network, cable and syndicated programs in diverse areas such as drama series, game/audience participation shows, talk/

service shows, children's and animated series and specials.

Besides best drama series and lead actor and actress honors, a plethora of other technical and creative crafts comprise the total number of Emmy Awards — everything from Outstanding Achievement in Lighting Direction to Outstanding Achievement in Hairstyling, and Graphics and Title Design honors. Winners in some of those categories, primarily in the creative arts, were announced Saturday, June 22, in Los Angeles.

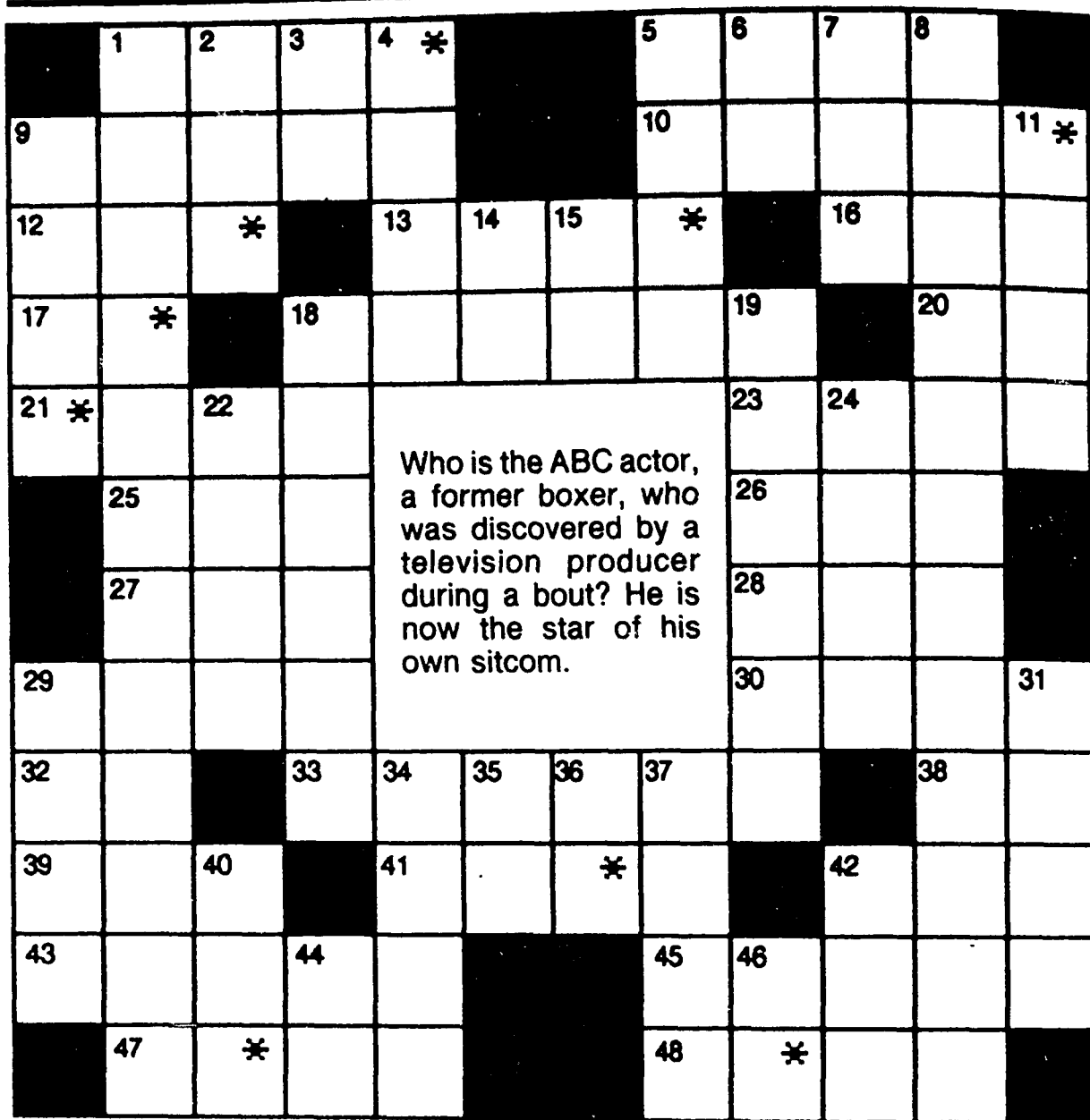

Hale Irwin shoots for fourth U.S. Open win

Defending champion Hale Irwin will be trying to link his name with some of golfing's great legends this week, when he goes after his fourth U.S. Open championship.

ABC Sports will be broadcasting live from Chaska, Minn., as Irwin attempts to become only the fifth golfer to win the granddaddy of American professional tournaments four times since Horace Rawlins captured the first U.S. Open in 1895. Willie Anderson dominated the event between 1901 and 1905 when he won four titles. Since then, only Bobby Jones, Ben Hogan and Jack Nicklaus have duplicated that remarkable feat.

However, Irwin, who narrowly missed winning his first tournament of the year when he lost to Kenny Perry on the first hole of sudden death at the Memorial Tournament in May, could crack that elite foursome with a victory at Hazeltine Golf Club. Irwin won the Open twice in the 1970s, but it was more than a decade before he broke out of the pack to become a three-time champion.

A victory by Irwin, a former All-American defensive back at Colorado, would also make him only the fourth

player ever to win two U.S. Opens back-to-back.

Jim McKay, Roger Twibell and Jack Whitacker will anchor the nine-person team that will provide stroke-by-stroke coverage of Sunday's final round.
