## Mining plan on deck

Township planners will roll up their sleeves Tuesday evening and begin what promises to be an arduous review process for a sand and gravel mining application.

The planning commission is scheduled to mull applications from Holloway Sand and Gravel for a gravel mining operation and an asphalt plant on a 177-acre plot at the south-west corner of the Six Mile/Ridge Road intersection.

The proposed site is zoned industrial and lies less than a mile to the east of Arbor Hills East Landfill, and less than a mile southwest of the proposed Shores of Northville

development. A certain point of controversy will be Holloway's proposal to build an asphalt plant on the site. Township ordinances forbid the processing of any raw materials in the township.

## **Police** cite 3 in sting

Three local businesses were cited for selling alcohol to minors during a township police graduation-night

Police allege that the Six & Park Party Shop, 17071 Northville Road; Perry Drugs, 42401 W. Seven Mile Road; and Brooklane Golf Club, 44115 W. Six Mile Road, sold alcohol late June 14 to an 18-year-old woman serving as a police decoy.

Citations were forwarded last

week to the state Liquor Control Commission, police Capt. Philip Presnell said. Police do not plan to seek criminal charges against the businesses, he said.

Citations show up as a violation on a business's liquor license and could result in a hearing and revocation of the license, said police Det. Michael

The businesses were investigated as part of a continuing crackdown operation on sales of alcoholic beverages to minors.

The decoy made unsuccessful alcohol purchase attempts at three other establishments, Presnell said, including A & P on Seven Mile, and Cap 'N Cork and Lirato's Beer and Wine on Five Mile.

Those businesses will receive letters of commendation from the police department, Presnell said.

Responses from the businesses charged with underage sales ranged from surprise to remorse.

John Haio, owner of the Six and Park Party Shop, said he and his employees check identifications "more than anybody else.


"We didn't remember that we sold to anybody (underage)," he said.

## City mulling river walk on Rouge

The Northville City Planning Commission last week praised planning consultant Don Wortman's proposal of artver walk along the Middle Rouge

A river walk is one of the highpriority recommendations in the Parks and Recreation section of the commission's recently enacted Master Plan. The walk would "complement and coordinate with the Wayne County Cass Benton bikeway system and the Henry Ford Heritage Trail," according to the Master Plan.

Wortman said any such project along the Rouge River would likely re-ceive Department of Natural Resour-

ces funding.

The DNR has grant programs available that really would give preference to the city in terms of water frontage. The grant money can be used both for development and/or acquisition of property," he said.
"Some sort of pathway would re-

ally be a nice resource for the community," he added. Wortman proposed the drafting of a Middle Rouge Pathway Master Plan, a document that would set down a strategy for the planning and

eventual construction of a riverwalk or bicycle path along the river roughly from Hutton Street south past the Ford Plant to Beal Avenue. He presented the planners with an outline of the plan last week, showing three phases to the project. The first phase would be between Hutton and Griswold Street, and would run by the Mill Race Historical Village. The

second, from Griswold to Main

serted Ford Valve Plant. The third would run from the south side of Main opposite the Northville Well to the bridge at Beal Avenue.

Awork plan included in the outline lists a property ownership analysis and an investigation of access points as primary tasks in the project. The last task would be implementation. which would include obtaining DNR and LAWCON (Land And Water Conservation) grants and local funding, and coordination of the project with Northville Community Recreation and other community groups.

Commissioners recommended few changes to the plan. A preliminary map of the pathway placed the first phase of the walk on the north side of the Middle Rouge by Mill Race Village. Commissioner Steve Ball and audience member Greg Presley, both board members of the Northville Historical Society, said they feared po-tential vandalism to the historic structures of the village. They added that the path may also interfere with future security measures for the

Moving the path to the south side of the Rouge would also alleviate the need for a bridge somewhere between Hutton and Griswold, they said.

Ball also asked that a bridge across the Rouge on the Ford Plant property be closed or removed ac that people using the path could not cross and disturb waterfowl that use the

## Bealtown zoning stirs controversy

When members of the Northville City Planning Commission began implementing the recommendations of their just-released Master Plan, they decided to start with the least-

controversial items. Or so they thought.

A Bealtown resident at a recent planning commission meeting told commissioners emphatically that the Master Plan's recommended rezoning of Bealtown from R-2 to R-1B went against the wishes of many of her neighbors. The rezoning would ban the conversion of single-family homes to duplexes.

Bealtown is the area between Northville Downs and South Main Street, from Gardner to Beal streets.

Janice Smith presented a petition signed by 27 of the neighborhood's residents opposing the rezoning. They do not want it changed. They want it to remain as is," she said.

"One of the reasons that these peo-

ple signed . . . was because many of these people are elderly and they need to put apartments above their homes sometime so they can afford to pay their taxes," she said.

The commissioners had included the recommendation in the Master Plan based on the advice of the Bealtown Residents' Association, a neighborhood group which had submitted its own petition signed by 29 residents in favor of the rezoning, in October 1989.

Chairperson John Hardin and Commissioner David Totten assured Smith that she and all Bealtown residents would be notified before a change took place, and would have the opportunity to air their views at a public hearing.

The commissioners called a July 2 public hearing on the proposed rezoning. Residents who would be affected by the rezoning will be notified of the hearing, and have a chance to air their opinions then.

## Bad timing leads to drug charge

A Canton man stands to lose his car, cash and freedom as result of a narcotics possession arrest in Northville Township.

Police Capt. Philip Presnell and Det. Michael Wildt arrested the 36-year-old man late June 14 in a parking lot at Six and Park Party Store, 17071 Northville Road, during a liquor sales surveillance

Police said the man was preparing to ingest a line of white powder suspected to be cocaine when officers approached his vehicle.

Police also confiscated a quarter-gram envelope of suspected cocaine, two packets of suspected marijuana, and a double-bladed knife. Police are seeking felony narcotics possession

charges against the man. In addition, the suspect's 1977 Pontiac Catalina and \$229.49 in cash he was carrying were confiscted under Michigan's drug forfeiture laws.

Wildt and Presnell reportedly noticed the man sitting in his car just before an underage police decoy entered the party store and attempted to purchase alcohol. The alcohol purchase was part of the township's Unlawful Sales of Alcohol to Mi-

nors program. The Canton man followed the police decoy into the party store, "staggering" and walking with difficulty, police said.

The decoy soon exited the store and met police at a prearranged site to discuss an attempted alcohol purchase.

Police then saw the Canton man get back in his car. Police said the man's unsteady behavior prompted them to check the car.

Officers approached the car and reportedly saw the man leaning toward the middle of the front seat with a rolled dollar bill in his left hand. A plastic credit card with a line of white powder sat on the

vehicle's armrest. The man clutched a knife in his right hand, po-

The suspect was preparing to raise the dollar bill to his nose when officers opened the door and pulled the man from his vehicle.

The man immediately dropped the knife and dollar bill, police said. The suspect reportedly blurted: "I don't know if it's real cocaine or not; I bought it from a guy at work."


Police then searched the vehicle, discovering additional white powder in a square, folded piece of paper. A search of the glove compartment revealed two packages of suspected marijuana.

## New Holloway mining plan on deck in township

The township may have to amend its mining ordinance and "most likely will take measures to address that type of use," said Carol Maise, township planning and zoning administrator.

In its application, Holloway estimates it will mine approximately 1.5 million cubic yards of clay mineral and 4 million cubic yards of sand and gravel during the life of the proposed

Such activity could spur less than desirable side effects.

The township will look closely at such issues as noise, dust, water quality, post-mining land use, and how the business would affect neighboring commercial and residential property values.

There are a thousand questions,"
Maise said. "They never end."

Another issue sure to arise during reviews is truck traffic to and from the mining site.

Holloway's anticipated haul-route scenario foresees trucks exiting the site at the southeast corner of the property and moving south on Ridge Road a half-mile to Five Mile Road. Trucks would then travel east on Five Mile to Beck Road and then approximately a half-mile south on Beck Road to M-14.

Anticipated frequency of trips is 200 round trips per day during the peak season. Trucks hauling sand and gravel will have a maximum weight of 154,000 pounds, according to Holloway's application.

But the township fears the firm may want to use a northerly exit route along Beck Road to reach I-96. Males said

"We'd want assurances that

they're going to use that (southern) route," Maise said.

The company says an industrial park and a lake will highlight postmining land uses. That concept "is compatible with the industrial zoning of the land," the firm said.

The prospect of a lake-dominated former mining site does not excite the township, Maise said.

"That's not giving the township anything back," she said.

Maise said the township will also aska very basic question: What is the commercial demand for sand and

grave

"They need to prove there is a need for sand and gravel," she said. "We're not adequately convinced (there is sufficient need); more information is needed."

Holloway proposes to remove a total of 152 protected trees, 80 of which are within a woodlands area in the southern portion of the site.

The company said, "No prudent and feasible alternative to the removal of the trees exists.

"The southern area of the site contains the sand and gravel deposits hall.

which extend to the greatest depth;"
the application states. "Sacrificing
this area of the site would cause an
undue hardship."

The firm proposes to transplant 28 trees and replace a total of 1,000 inches of protected trees. Estimated replacement and transplant costs reach \$100,000, the firm said.





## River walk concept deserves realization

The idea of establishing a river walk along the Middle Rouge River has come up before, but it's been given new life by the recent completion of the city's Master Rian. It's a great idea, and the concept deserves all the life it can get.

A proposal recently presented to the city planning commission refers to the Middle Rouge running through the city as an "untapped resource." Ain't that the

Annual Rouge Rescue efforts have dramatically improved the condition of the river a little farther south, as it winds through the township roughly along the course of the Middle Rouge Parkway. The park is a great resource, but as the river travels through the city, it remains largely hidden and inaccessible.

The excellent river walk plan developed by city planning consultant Don Wortman would change all that. It's an exciting prospect which would truly improve the quality of life in the community for residents of the township as well as the city, since the downtown area really belongs to the town as a whole.

The proposal is to eventually create a walkway along the Middle Rouge from Hutton Street, at the north end of Ford Field, to Beal Street, just north of the point where the river heads underground beneath Northville Downs. Wortmian recommends a phased approach, dbing the middle section first.

The plan includes some very encouraging points. Wortman feels confident that the project may qualify for grant money from a couple of different potential sources. There also appears to be more than one possibility to acquire the necessary land, through easements or outright purchase.

It's easy to get carried away thinking

about the possibilities of the river walk. At the most basic level, it would be a wonderful stroll in all seasons. In addition, though, think about the eventual redevelopment of the Ford plant site including some additional chances for public access; the walk and plant site would enhance each other, becoming a terrific community center based on natural

Finally, consider the possibilities of linkage: The river walk would tie Mill Race and Ford Field more closely to Main Street, but the future could hold even greater things. If the initial walk gets completed, why not think about additional connections to the north and south? It wouldn't take much (in the way of distance) to link the walk with Hines Park, and on the other end, the City of Novi is considering a Middle Rouge River walk of its own. Couldn't the two conceivably be connected someday?

Sure, we're getting carried away, but at this point we see no reason not to. Real vision regarding the river walk plan could result in a final project which is the envy of metro Detroit.

All this - even the first phase of Wortman's plan — lies well into the future.

For now, we strongly support the commission recommendation that the city council start the long process of accomplishing the river walk. The vision may become reality.



## Northville school reports provide information

Public Act 25, passed in March 1990, requires school districts to publish annual reports for every building in a district. Districts also must publish an all-encompassing district report

The Northville School District has published seven reports on individual schools, with each including a copy of the district report. The reports are available at the board of education office, 501 W. Main St.

Highlights of each report follow.

#### OVERALL DISTRICT REPORT

Northville schools have a population of 3,899 students in kindergarten through 12th grade, 227 students in special education and 550 students in preschool programs.

Northville schools employ 260 full-time teachers, 30

clerical staff members, 65 plant and cafeteria staff, 17 administrators and 58 other staff members.

All millages and bond issues since 1982 have successfully passed.

School improvement is driven by the Strategic Planning process which began in 1988.

Northville schools began to align the district's math curriculum with the state's math core curriculum this year. The process will be complete next year and other areas of the district's curriculum will be brought in line with the state curriculum outcomes

Based on state calculations, Northville Public Schools have a 1.72-percent dropout rate.

The district operates three special education programs for severely multiple-impaired and dually diagnosed students serving 227 students from 11 Wayne County

Parent participation is high, with 300 parents involved in the decision-making processes of the district.

#### NORTHVILLE HIGH SCHOOL

The district's only high school has a population of 1,124 students, 51 general education teachers, five special education teachers and one media specialist. A social worker, psychologist, four counselors and a student assistance program coordinator also are on the staff.

An athletic director monitors and manages five ninthgrade, seven junior varsity and 22 varsity sports. The director also manages athletics for both middle schools.

The school employs six secretaries, a special needs assistant, a special education assistant, two media assis-

tants, two hall monitors, a study hall monitor, parking lot attendant, cafeteria and custodial personnel.

A school improvement team was formed three years ago. The team served this year as the North Central Association Steering Committee. North Central and the University of Michigan have accredited Northville High

Seventeen Northville students attend the William Ford Vocational Center in Westland. Northville also contracts with the Virginia Farrell Beauty School in Livonia for students interested in becoming state-licensed cosmetologists.

Between 30 and 35 parents are involved in a Parent Advisory Committee. Last year, a fall teacher conference with parents had 74-percent parent participation. At a spring conference, 61 percent of parents participated.

Parents also are involved in the Athletic Booster Club, Music Booster Club, school committees, senior party committees, and student activities as chaperones. Parents also serve on the Northville Action Council.

School goals include increasing student course selection options, reducing class sizes and expanding the school's business partnership program. As part of the program, the high school is partnered with Maybury State Park, The Northulle Record, Ford Motor Company and Dow Corning.

#### COOKE MIDDLE SCHOOL

Cooke was closed for five years due to declining enrollment. The school opened this fall to serve 410 students in grades six through eight.

Fifteen general education teachers work at Cooke. Also a part-time gifted and talented teacher, two special education teachers and a part-time learning consultant are assigned to Cooke.

Non-certified staff include a secretary, a typist, custodians, lunchroom personnel, a teacher's assistant and a media assistant.

Parental involvement includes 81 percent of families participating in the Parent/Teacher/Student Association.

In Cooke's first year since reopening, 90 percent of families participated in a fall conference for parents and teachers. In a spring conference, 65 percent of families participated.

Teachers are encouraged to plan schedules with other teachers in their "team." For example, seventh-grade teachers might meet to plan an interdisciplinary lesson on rain forests. Each teacher would work the lesson into

their class.

#### MEADS MILL MIDDLE SCHOOL

Meads Mill serves 462 students in grades six through

Eighteen general education teachers are employed at the school. Also a part-time gifted and talented teacher. three special education teachers and a learning consultant are assigned to Meads Mill.

Non-certified staff include a secretary, a typist, custodians, lunchroom personnel, a teacher's assistant and a media assistant.

Parental involvement is high, with 76 percent of families participating in the Parent/Teacher/Student Association.

In Meads Mill's first year since reopening, 80 percent of families participated in a fall conference for parents and teachers. In a spring conference, 65 percent of families

Teachers are encouraged to plan schedules with other teachers in their "team." For example, sixth-grade teachers might meet to plan an interdisciplinary lesson on ancient Greece and Rome. Each teacher would work the lesson into his or her class.

#### AMERMAN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Amerman has the largest elementary population in the district, serving 600 students in kindergarten through

The district's elementary gifted and talented program is housed in the school, serving 94 students in third through fifth grade.

Twenty-two classroom teachers are employed at the school. Teachers also are employed to teach art, music, physical education and health. A library staff member, two consultants, a speech and language teacher, a psychologist, a social worker, a bilingual teacher and a teacher for the hearing impaired also are employed at

Non-certified staff include a secretary, four custodians, lunchroom and playground supervisors, instructional assistants and a media assistant.

Most families are involved in the Parent/Teacher Association, which has a 98-percent parent membership. In fall and spring conferences with parents, 100 percent of families participated.

#### MORAINE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Moraine serves 333 students in kindergarten through participated.

fifth grade.

A special education program also is housed in the building as well as a before- and after-school child care program. Neither program is included in the school's enrollment count.

Thirteen classroom teachers are employed at the school. Teachers also are employed to teach art, music,

physical education and health. A part-time learning consultant and a part-time special education teacher are assigned to Moraine. Also a speech and language teacher, a psychologist and a social

worker are employed at the school.

Non-certified staff include a secretary, teacher aids, custodians, lunchroom workers, and a media assistant.

The school's Parent / Teacher Association has 240 parents involved.

In a fall conference with parents 100 percent of families participated. A similar conference in the spring had 98-percent parent participation.

#### SILVER SPRINGS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Silver Springs serves 460 students in kindergarten

through fifth grade. Seventeen classroom teachers work with instructors in physical education, music, art and media. Two consultants and a speech and language specialist work at Silver Springs. A psychologist and a social worker are employed at the school.

Non-certified staff include a secretary, teacher aids, custodians, lunchroom workers, and a media assistant. The school's Parent/Teacher Association has 240 parents involved.

In fall and spring conferences, 99 percent of parents participated.

Inchester elementary school

Winchester serves 510 students in kindergarten through fifth grade.

Twenty-six teachers work in the building including a media specialist, art, music and physical education teachers, a learning consultant a resource room teacher and a special-education teacher.

A speech and language teacher works at Winchester as

## Bill asks limits on teaching

Elementary school teachers will need a special endorsement on their certification to teach foreign languages if legislation introduced June 11 by Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, is successful.

Faxon, whose district includes part of Northville, said he introduced the bill because more and more elementary schools are offering foreign-language instruction. In Northville elementary schools,

some teachers who know a foreign language might teach a unit or lesson on the language, but no languages are officially taught at that level, said Dolly McMaster, assistant superintendent for instructional services.

Foreign-language teachers currently must be certified at the secondary level. If a teacher is certified to teach foreign language, he or she is not required to have any experience with elementary school age children. Faxon said.

We are starting to see more and more elementary schools offer foreign language instruction to their students," he said. "This is linguistically sound, as a young child learns a foreign language much more easily than

But foreign language may never be all that common at the elementary school level. McMaster said the idea of foreign language classes for elementary school students has been discussed "in earnest" for the last 20

But many problems stand in the way of those interested in seeing foreign language lessons in the elementary school classroom.

The elementary school day is already full, McMaster said.

There are only so many hours in the day, and everybody has these grandoise plans about adding this

program or that program," she said. Another problem with elementary foreign language education is stu-dents have trouble maintaining their knowledge of the language, McMas-

In European countries, where many students learn to speak foreign languages in school, students get a chance to practice because of the multi-lingual nature of their country. McMaster said. But in the United States, English is the only language spoken in most areas.

Burnout is another potential problem for elementary students who learn foreign languages, McMaster said.

McMaster cited studies that show students who take foreign languages in elementary school drop out of language lessons later in their education.

Finally, the cost of implementing foreign language programs in middle school could be prohibitive. At least one additional teacher would be needed, McMaster said.



## Wine grab bag yields pleasant Calif. surprises

We are introduced to new wines in restaurants, at wine tastings, at interviews and while traveling to wine country. The number of ways we become aware of new wines is sometimes surprising. People know that we delight in discoveries and frequently introduce us to wines they have enjoyed.

Recently, while planning a party for some friends and neighbors, we called our wine retailer and asked that he put together a mixed case of value-priced chardonnays — four different producers, three bottles of each. We agreed on a price range and left it up to him. He knows what we like, but also knows that we appreciate a surprise or two.

Among the mixed case was the J. Lohr Estates Riverstone Chardonnay (\$12). Our friends liked the full aromas of tropical fruit and buttery, toasted oak. It disappeared fast. For the money, the wine is uncommonly lush with abundant flavors of pear and apple, featuring a long, lingering finish.

After our experience we were very happy when J.

Lohr winemaker Jeff Runquist came to Detroit. We had
the opportunity to meet him and discuss his wines at
the Rattlesnake Club where sommelier Madeline Triffon was featuring the Riverstone Chardonnay at a bythe-glass pour.

Rundquist explained that to achieve full, lush chardonnay flavors he harvests the grapes when they are fully mature. He judges this by walking the vineyard and tasting the berries. The grapes are machine harvested at night, when the fruit is cool. They are pressed immediately in the vineyard within one to two hours after picking.

Runquist introduced us to the 1987 J. Lohr Estates Seven Oaks Cabernet Sauvignon (\$12), a wine with distinctive blackberry and cherry aromas followed by fresh fruit flavors and a rich, velvety texture. "We are very proud of the cabernet fruit we get from our Seven Oaks Vineyard located in Paso Robles," Runquist emphasized. "Napa Valley cabernet sauvignon is reminiscent of cassis and black currant, Alexander Valley exudes plum, Santa Barbara has an olive note, but Paso Robles, boasts intense black cherry character."

Paso Robles has a climate similar to that of the Alexander Valley in Northern Sonoma County. The main difference, according to Runquist, is the soil. Paso Robles boasts a rich, clay-loam topsoil over a sub-soil of limestone and slates.

"We harvest cabernet in the warmth of the day to aid in extracting flavor and color from the skins," Runquist said. "We age the wine in small American oak barrels which contributes a delightful cinnamon, vanilla bouquet. The wine has sufficient tannins to give structure and ageability, but not so much to interfere with the

silky finish."

J. Lohr Winery was founded in San Jose in 1974. The original winery now produces only white wines. In 1988, a new red wine facility was built adjacent to the Seven Oaks Vineyard in Paso Robles. Here, Runquist is armed with the best winemaking equipment and technology available. This allows him to produce an attractive, fruity, Beaujolais-style red wine, J. Lohr Wildflower Gamay (\$9), which reminds us of a cru Beaujo-

 Runquist also introduced us to the Cypress Brand of affordable varietal wines produced by J. Lohr Vineyards. These wines are handcrafted by blending estate grapes with fruit from selected coastal vineyards.

The following Cypress brand wines are produced by J. Lohr and represent excellent values in their

1990 Cypress Fume Blanc (\$6) exudes fresh honeydew melon and grapefruit aromas in the style of a clean, summertime refresher.

# Suited to a tea New tea room is perfect fit in Northville

Sue Baker, part owner of the Rose Cottage Tea Room in Northville, wears a countrified print dress to work, but it's teamed up with running shoes.

with running shoes.

Well, they say if the shoe fits . . . And those shoes definitely fit the energetic Baker as she darts around the restaurant, answering the phone, tending to customers in line, checking things in the kitchen.

Her eyes flash like lightning as she explains how she started the Rose Cottage Tea Room.

"I've been in the food business for 20 years," she says. "I loved doing food, but I needed something more stimulating."

She decided a tea room was her goal, but needed a place to do it. At just about that time, neighbor Tony Rizzo had a vacancy in the building he had been leasing. He offered her the space, and the two teamed up as business partners.

And the Rose Cottage Tea Room is definitely the shoe that fits Northville, too. "You know, the thing I hear most often from people is "Northville needed this."


"You know, the thing I hear most often from people is, 'Northville needed this,' she says.

Onen for just two months, the tea room

Open for just two months, the tea room is a new concept in Northville. Places like the Townsend Hotel in Birmingham and the Sweet Afton Tea Room in Plymouth have offered proper afternoon tea, but the Rose Cottage seems to fill a niche between those two.

In the proper British tradition, tea is served with separate pots for water and tea. In addition, the guest may dine on a platter of nine assorted finger sandwiches, two pastries, and fresh scones with fruit preserves. Devonshire cream and fresh fruit are also included.

The pastries are made fresh daily by

Chef Joseph Eggly, formerly owner of Joseph's Bakery on Mary Alexander Court in downtown Northville.

If the complete tea is too much for one stomach to handle, there's a light afternoon tea available with a smaller pot of tea and a smaller assortment of goodless.

Rizzo, co-owner of the Rose Cottage with Baker, manages the business end of the operation, and he likes the way the tea room has grown rapidly.

"We've had days where we've had to turn people away," he says.

He also points out that the informal atmosphere at the Rose Cottage is slightly different from a place like the Townsend Hotel.

"At the Townsend, for \$12.50 per person, they control it," he says. "They bring the sandwiches and pastries around on a cart, you select a couple of things and they're gone. It may be 15 or 20 minutes

before they get back to you.

"Here, for \$12.50, we place a huge dish in front of you, and we'll let two people split that."

The light tea, which is for one person

only, goes for \$7.50.

The decorations give the Rose Cottage a true Northville feel. From the minute you step up to the building, you can smell the rosebushes growing in the front yard. Entrance is in the back, as the front porch is used as a seating area.

Inside there is plenty of print wallpaper and clean linen tablecloths, and pastel hues abound. Lace curtains adom the windows.

Each room of the converted frame house has its own flavor. One is large and busiling, another small and intimate. In the near future, upstairs rooms will be open as well. Smoking is prohibited everywhere, even on the porch.

"What sells the place is the decoration and the ambiance," says Rizzo. "We get lots of compliments on the decorating. We used all local people where we could."

The clientele isn't entirely local, though. Wise customers call ahead with reservations for the lunch hour (11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., with tea being served from 3-5 p.m.), and they've been known to call from Mt. Clemens, Troy, Birmingham, Trenton and Grosse Pointe. That people will drive an hour to do afternoon tea is not surprising to Baker, a confessed fiend for teas and tea sandwiches.

"I know I'd drive across town for tea," she says. "I've always loved tea and tea sandwiches. I've gone to places on the East Coast that served tea, and Canada has some great tea rooms.

"But I always thought, if I had one, what would I do? Now I can do it."

Though the afternoon tea has its following, the real smash hit has been the lunch menu. Baker planned all the menus herself, and while flavor and elegance abound in items like a Londonderry Grill (slivered beef tenderloin with ham, turkey, Jarlsberg cheese and pepper chutney on eggdipped rye) or the non-dessert streudels (chicken or mushroom, with risotto), nutrition is a big factor as well.

## It's our berry favorite time of year

Every year when my friend Roz picks her first batch of strawberries we celebrate with a fresh strawberry daiquiri. It is tradition.

tradition.
One usually leads to two and the afternoon is spent reminiscing and relaxing.
When it is time to leave I am presented with
a bag of berries large enough to use on
icereal, eat "straight" as a low-cal snack, or
to bake a batch of biscuits and whip some
ifresh cream for shortcakes. There is nothing quite so wicked as a couple of shortcakes spread with butter, smothered with
crushed fruit and slathered with fresh
cream — for dinner. I have been known to

Sometimes I'll have an ear of fresh corn and a few sliced tomatoes first. Sometimes

I won't.

Strawberries are taken for granted because of their availability. However, they have only been cultivated for a short period. They are a recent development resulting from the cross breeding of small wild

American strawberries with a juicy Chilean variety.

Strawberries have multiple uses. Pureed as a sauce, blended with yogurt for a cold soup, mixed with salad greens, in a souffle or crushed, their fragrant essence is prized the world over. The prime season for strawberries is now, late spring to early summer.

Choose berries with a uniform red color and green, moist hull. The larger the container, the more chance that the berries will be crushed by their own weight and damaged.

Strawberries are high in vitamin C and low in calories. a 3½ -ounce portion contains only 30. Do not wash berries until you are ready to use them. Washing ahead of time is asking for mold. Remove the stem unless it is needed for decorative

Strawberries provide, in my estimation, the most dramatic presentations. A huge glass bowl filled to the brim accompanied

with a honey-cream cheese dip, brown sugar and whipped cream is a simple, delicious and elegant dessert. A silver tray filled with white and dark chocolate-dipped berries is another suggestion. For a sumptuous cocktail, add a strawberry to glass of white wine or champagne.

Strawberries are very rarely cooked except for preserves. There is nothing that compares to homemade strawberry jam

freshly baked bread and creamy butter.
Blueberries are likely the next most popular berry. They are commonly eaten raw or baked in pies or turnovers. Blueberries, like strawberries, make a wonderful cold sour.

soup.

Raspberries and the not-so-common blackberries are classified as multiple fruits. They are made up of many tiny segments, each of which contains a seed. These berries are at their best plain or with just a sprinkle of sugar. All share a common peak season, summer.

on peak season, summer.

Choose fruit that is vibrant and deep in

color. Small containers will assure a lessdamaged product. Check for mold or rot. The berries should be dry and fairly firm. Avid mushy or too-soft fruit. Wash berries just prior to service. Refrigerate loosely wrapped for up to three days after purchasing.

All berries freeze well. Wash and dry well. Place on a cookle sheet in one layer and freeze until solid. Package in plastic hose Bernous and use as needed.

bags. Remove and use as needed.

Berries that are frozen are primarily good for sauces as their structure changes after freezing. The following recipe can be used with any berries. The fruit vinegar and liquor may be omitted, but they are flavor enhancers. The soup is low caloric and low fat. Serve as a first course or a main light meal. If made ahead of time, store in the blender cup and reblend just before service. Enjoy berry much.

1 pint fresh berries

% cup buttermilk% cup non-fat yogurt

1 ounce maple syrup

2 ounce chambord or other fruit liquor

1 teaspoon raspberry vinegar 2-4 tablespoons sour cream, if desired

Mint leaves for garnish

Wash and drain berries, puree in blender. Add buttermilk, yogurt, syrup, liquor, and vinegar to the blender and mix until smooth. Strain through a sieve that is large enough to catch seeds but not strain out the soup's body. Or, leave the seeds in. Serve in chilled bowls or wine glasses. Garnish with sour cream and mint leaves. Makes 4 cups or 2 bowls of soup.

Folloing are some recipes for the grill, as well as a light dessert treat.

#### COFFEE ICE CREAM

- 1/2 cups espresso coffee beans
- 3 cups half-and-half I cup heavy cream
- egg yolks
- 1 cup sugar
- I teaspoon vanilla Optional: I tablespoon chocolateflavored liqueur

Yields 1 1/2 quarts.

Put beans in food processor or coffee grinder and grind to very coarse texture. In heavy 3-quart saucepan combine half-and-half, cream and coffee beans.



## Try flowers as colorful summer garnish

Here comes the rosiest time of the year. Days are warm. The light stays bright outside well into the evening. Gardens are in flower. And celebrations are going on everywhere - graduations, bridal showers and weddings.

Florists deliver heaps and heaps of long-stemmed roses since they are universally loved and regarded as one of nature's most regal beauties. Brides have been known to softly tread on rose petals as they glide down the aisle.


Today, those petals are more likely to be made of paper. These pretend petals have also replaced rice as the accepted tribute thrown at the united

Celebratory tables often are dressed up in soft pastel hues, pale pink being one of the most favored. Menus, too, are lighter and brighter, often with a sentimental dish of some sort included. It could be a favorite of the honoree or an unusually pretty presentation of food.

By carefully looking over products on supermarket shelves, you can come up with little touches that carry a big visual impact.

Consider perky edible flowers, which are widely available now. Scatter the posies for an instant designer touch to cold first courses, salads and, most naturally, on desserts. Varicolored pansies are the variety most often seen, and just a few petals over a mixed green salad lifts the presentation from predictable to an unexpected treat.

Enoki (ee-nok-ee) mushrooms are almost too decorative to be real. But,

indeed they are, and delicious, too, in their very subtle way. These white superskinny strands with a tiny puff of a head come packaged in tightly sealed plastic bags. They need no

preparation, just snipping off the root ends and a quick rinse.

A jellied consomme takes on exotic airs with an enoki garnish. They are expensive, about \$3 for a handful, but just a few are needed for each

That shirty star-shaped fruit, the carombola, doesn't have a whole lot of flavor, but what a pretty five-point

alice it makes for garnishing every-thing from cold fish dishes to salads

While at the fruit counter, don't forget the now-familiar kiwi fruit, which not too long ago was pretty ex-otic. Peel and slice into rounds for a dash of bright green flecked with tiny black seeds. It is also quite effective when cut into wedges, and tucked beside the major dessert.

If you've never deep-fried Oriental rice noodles, you're in for a surprise. They expand voluminously into a puffy bed for sauced dishes or just to hold sauteed filets of fish, meat or poultry. Don't fry too large a batch at a time because they are done in a flash and need plenty of expansion

Desserts, of course, are where prettiness shines, and that brings us back to the realm of roses. Rose wine to be specific. This is also one of the lightest desserts you can serve your guests; each serving contains only 35 to 38 calories.

A jelly is made of the pink wine and it is molded in custard cups. The special surprise is the whole strawberry suspended in the middle. If serving wine with dessert, one might be tempted to pour the same wine. Don't.

The rose wine is sweetened and flavored, so a wine that is somewhat sweeter and richer is the perfect partner. Look for a French sauternes, or some of the excellent dessert wines from California.

ROSE JEWELS

3 1/4 cups rose wine 1 to 2 tablespoons sugar, depend-

ing on sweetness of wine

- teaspoon nutmeg
- tablespoons water 3 tablespoons kirsch
- 2 tablespoons gelatin 1 pint strawberries, stemmed

12 small parsley sprigs Optional: 12 large leaves — ivy, grape or similar, 36 strawberries for

Ylelds 12 servings.

Pour rose wine into enameled or tin-lined pot; add sugar and nutmeg and bring to boil. Reduce heat and simmer gently, uncovered, for 1

Meanwhile, pour water and kirsch into small bowl and sprinkle gelatin over it; put aside to soften gelatin. Remove pot from fire and immediately stir in gelatin to dissolve it. Cool.

Place 12 custard cups on cookie sheet and fill with wine to depth of about 1/2 inch. Chill until fairly firm.

Meanwhile, fill stem hole of berries with parsley sprigs. Place 1 parsleytopped strawberry in center of each cup, parsley and down. Chill until

Pour in remaining rose-gelatin to fill cups. Chill again until firm. If berries are large and their tips show above the level of the jelly, slice off to

To serve: Shine leaves by rubbing with a little oil. Put a leaf in center of each plate. Unmold each Rose Jewel, place on leaf, and garnish with 3 fresh strawberries.

## Microwave cookers rely on soup mix

Dry onion soup mix is one ingredient most mirowavers take care not to run out of. It's easy to keep on hand and comes in serving-size packets just right for one recipe, adding a rich onion flavor to a variety of recipes.

"Soup" mix seems a bit of a misnomer - not many people actually make soup with it. One classic use is onion dip: one (1 1/4 ounce) envelope onion soup mix blended with 2 cups sour cream and served with a big bowl of potato chips.

But for microwavers, dry onion soup mix is perhaps most useful as a browning agent. Sprinkle over roasts or roll uncooked chicken in the mix before microwaving. Not only does it add a delicious oniony flavor, but it gives otherwise pale foods a glaze of appealing brown color, too.

For onion-lovers, try this special corn on the cob. Combine 2 tablespoons butter, 2 tablespoons dry onion soup mix and I tablespoon water. Microwave about 30 seconds, or until butter melts; stir. Arrange four ears of fresh corn in an 8-by-8-inch microwave-safe baking dish. Drizzle with butter mixture. Cover with waxed paper and microwave five to eight minutes, or until corn is tender.

To make a tasty onion butter, combine one 1 1/4 -ounce envelope dry onton soup mix with one 8-ounce tub soft margarine or whipped unsalted butter. Blend thoroughly. Refrigerate until ready to use. Adds flaveor to hot microwaved vegetables; toss with hot cooked noodles or dab onto






No violence or racy humor, Jacoby's show encourages honesty, respect and the Golden Rule.

# CBS Bob Simon reports on the war he 'missed'

# Simon and crew were prisoners for 40 days

By Suzanne Gill

"I spent six months sitting in Saudi Arabia waiting for the (Persian Gulf) war to happen, and more than that, I've been covering the Middle Easton and off since 1973, and here was the cataclysmic event that had been building for a long time, and then I missed it," says CBS correspondent Bob Simon of the air and ground war in the Persian Gulf.

Simon "missed it" when he became a story himself on Jan. 21, just four days after the start of the air war. Unable to get the information he wanted through the pool reporting system, Simon and his three-man news crew were out having "a good look around" in the non-man's-land between Kuwait and Iraq when they were taken captive by Iraqi soldiers.

In "Back to Baghdad," airing Thursday, July 4, Simon returns to the scene of the war to tell the story he missed the first time, giving those at home a new perspective on the aftermath of the gulf conflict.

In the special, Simon examines current conditions in four countries: Kuwait, Iraq, Saudi Arabia and Israel, and the Occupied Territories. During a recent telephone interview from Tel Aviv, Israel, where Simon has made his home since 1987, he said conditions in each country were about as he expected.

Saudi Arabia, says Simon, has changed the least, Kuwait the most. With its continuing oil-well fires and official recriminations against those suspected of having sympathized with the Iraquis, the tiny Arab kingdom is still hostile territory, both environmentally and politically. But, he adds, "I think that, of all the countries we visited, in Kuwait there is the most serious possibility of political change."

By way of contrast, most Israelis are eager to put the war behind them, says Simon. The average citizen wants to forget about gas masks and sealed rooms, but the country's leaders are undoubtedly preparing for the future. Israeli

resolve was sorely tested during the SCUD attacks, and Simon observes that the government feels it has political "credit in the bank" with the United States for abiding by its early promise not to take independent military action.

Iraq, meanwhile, is the most interesting case of all. With Saddam Hussein still in power and the rebuilding of Baghdad and other cities being carried out as rapidly as possible, Simon spoke candidly, about the victory of the Allied force led by Gen. Norman Schwarzkopf.

"President Bush is perceived all over the Middle East as the Emperor of the Middle East. He's the man who won the war, and there is nothing that is respected (here) as much as victory.

"The Iraqis do not love George
Bush. There is enormous resentment
of Bush for bombing Iraq but not
getting rid of Saddam Hussein. "But
they respect him. They're perfectly
aware that Bush's Gen. Schwarzkopf
could have gone all the way to
Baghdad, but chose not to. (Iraq) is a
nation that has been bred on fear,
fear of Saddam, and if Saddam had
been removed, Bush and
Schwarzkopf would be the heroes of
Iraq."

Simon spent much of the war, 25 days, in solitary confinement in a Baghdad prison. His cell had no bed and only the crudest sanitation. The only source of light and fresh air was a small vent. Once a day, a small metal door would be opened and an anonymous hand would leave a single meal. On Feb. 23, the building was bombed by Allied jets. On another day, Simon's colleague Peter Arnett of CNN reported a rumor that Simon and his team were alive. It was the first such news Simon's wife and daughter had heard since his disappearance in the desert.

"I've covered so many wars and haven't been hurt," Simon reflects. "Maybe my number was just up."

He is not so philosophical about the system of pool reporting imposed by the Allied command. "It was an inadequate way to cover the war, and my colleagues who stayed in the pool system ended up very, very frustrated."

Simon draws a distinction between the censorship of the pool

reporting system and an embargo, or hold on reporting the news for hours or days at a time, "with which we were all prepared to cooperate.

"I think the verdict now is that it's unfortunate that one of the grea American military victories of our time went largely uncovered."

In an age of prolific amateur and professional video record-keeping, there will, ironically, be no counterpart to "Victory at Sea" and other newsreel series that documented the battles of World War II.

"The Americans who did the fighting will not have many pictures to show their grandchildren because the newsmen who were in Saudi Arabia and would have been very eager to have been at the front lines weren't there, because they weren't taken there."

On Independence Day, Simon takes us back to Baghdad to see some of what we all missed.



Joan Rivers has worked long and hard to get to the top. Her unfailing energy and determination have made her talk show a success, seen in 80 percent of the United States.






Broadway star Evan Handler walked off stage in the middle of a perfor-





#### Wimbledon crown lures tennis' best



The changing of the guard that marked the tennis world in the late 1980s may just about be complete, but the queen will still be looking down on the best players in the world this week when the royalty of tennis gathers at the All-England Club for the 66th Wimbledon Lawn Championships.

Each era has had its own personal stars dominating center court, and the men's finals duels between Boris Becker and Stefan Edberg that ushered out the 1980's marked the beginning of a new day. Gone from the top of the rankings are such legendary names as Bjorn Borg, Jimmy Conners and John McEnroe, and in their places sit young lions like Edberg, Becker and Ivan Lendl. Just behind them comes another group of pretenders to the throne led by Michael Chang and Andre Agassi.

The old guard has been slower to surrender on the women's side, where Martina Navratilova won for a record ninth time in 1990. However, Navratilova, who lost to Steffi Graf in the 1988 and 1989 finals, will have a tough time holding off the challenge of younger players such as Graf, Monica Seles and Gabriela Sabatini in her bid for a 10th title.
