Good time for all

People who came into Northville for the "Operation Welcome Home" Fourth of July activities gave high marks to the events. Thousands of spectators lined the length of the parade route through downtown Northville for the community's largest procession in memory. And many stayed around town for the festivities that

followed at the intersection of Main and Center.

The fireworks display at Northville High School drew the largest crowd. Internationally known pyrotechnics experts Zambelli Internationale provided a spectacle which brought "ooohs," ahhs," and loud applause from the thousands of people who watched the fireworks light up the sky.

Rally shows patriotism

The lawn inside the racetrack at Northville Downs, usually a deserted oval of grass sometimes surrounded by running horses, was filled on the Fourth of July with music and flags.

More than 200 people made the trek across the Northville Downs parking lot to the "Operation Welcome Home" ceremony and rally that afternoon, and jockeyed for the best tanning and viewing position on the grass. The appreciative audience heard a selection of patriotic songs by local vocalists and speeches by military officers involved in "Operation Desert Storm."

Paula Folino, daughter of Council Member Paul Folino and a singer with the Nashville Symphony Orchestra, overcame minor technical difficulties to sing emotional versions of "America, Keep Holding to God's Hand" and "The Star Spangled Banner."

Some in the audience held their breath over their heart, while the dozens of men in various uniforms scattered through the crowd saluted during the national anthem. Members of the Northville Veterans of Foreign Wars post served as color guard, hoisting the American flag and their own banner as Folino launched into her extended version of the anthem.

The rock band Larry Kneeshaw and Sand Aid, wearing T-shirts that said "I have NEVER been more proud to be an American," performed their own versions of patriotic songs, including "Desert Storm" and "Coming Home."

Air Force Lt. Col. Richard Sipp was next on stage to describe his role in Operation Desert Storm. "Our mission was to fly men, materiel, and munitions to small, outlying strips near the forward lines," he said. As the air bombardment and eventual ground battle wore on, Sipp's troops began ferrying wounded allied forces and Iraqi prisoners of war back

from the front as well. "Believe me," he said, "the Iraqis were very glad to be in U.S. hands."

Sipp sounded a sobering note during his presentation. "Let us not forget the nearly 300 men and women who gave their lives in this effort," he said. "This war did not solve all the problems in the Middle East, but I hope the fact that we stood up to tyranny will give people there the security to live their lives more freely."

Sipp thanked Northville resident Ginny Hathorn for organizing what he termed "the mother of all support organizations," saying, "For you and all the other people who've helped you, you've performed a great service for the country." Hathorn helped found the Northville-based chapter of the Michigan Military Family Support Groups, and was the driving force behind this year's expanded Fourth of July celebrations in honor of the returning troops.

Entire day is success

Thousands filled the streets of Northville for the community's biggest Fourth of July celebration ever.

"Operation Welcome Home" and a daylong series of special events brought locals and out-of-towners to the "model support city" on Thursday. Throughout the day and evening, the smiles flowed as freely as the patriotism.

No one will ever know exactly how many people were in town for the day, but the city police department estimated that 15,000 were on hand for the fireworks alone. Several longtime residents commented that the parade crowd was the biggest ever seen, with estimates hovering around 10,000.

The day began early with the pancake breakfast at Masonic Temple. The weather started out poorly, with early arrivals for the parade huddling under awnings along Main Street as the clouds opened up.

The rain stopped before doing any serious spirit-dampening, however, and by the time the Satin Sheets Bed Race hit Main Street the drying-out had already begun.

A long, varied parade excited spectators all along the route. City Mayor Chris Johnson commented that he had never seen such a large crowd for a Northville parade, and that the crowd continued to be thick all along the entire parade route.

Over 75 different units made up the parade, not counting individual participants. Bands, marchers, and a variety of floats participated, many picking up on the "Operation Welcome Home" theme supporting the Persian Gulf troops.

Winners of the parade judging were: Seniors first place, Order of the Alhambra Marchers; second place, Farmington Elks Motor Drill Team; third place, American Legion Post 147. Floats: first place, Northville Family Council; second place, the Military Family Support Groups West Side Chapter and Highland Lakes

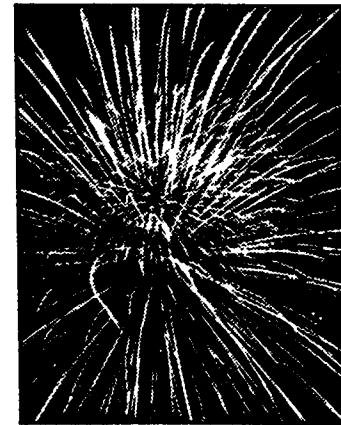

Gas line leak evacuates hundreds

A backhoe operator ruptured a high-pressure natural gas pipeline near the Sheldon/Seven Mile intersection early July 3, forcing the evacuation of hundreds of city and township residents.

Natural gas blew through a 6-inch-by-3-inch hole in a Consumers Power steel pipeline for nearly two hours Wednesday before workers were able to close gas feeder valves.

The aroma of natural gas wafted west along Seven Mile until a wind shift sent gas clouds northward into the city. Escaping gas from the 200-pounds-per-square-inch line created a sound similar to a waterfall,

witnesses said.

No injuries were reported in the mishap.

An employee of Ric-Man Construction of Sterling Heights reportedly tore a hole in the gas line while digging a trench adjacent to a Western Townships Utilities Authority sewer line.

"The sewer contractor was working down through here and he was trying to drain some excess mud down there and he hooked (the gas pipe) and put a hole right into it," said Consumers Power Distribution Supervisor David Hough, as he pointed toward the hole where a consumers crew labored to repair the pipe.

The trench was dug to allow water

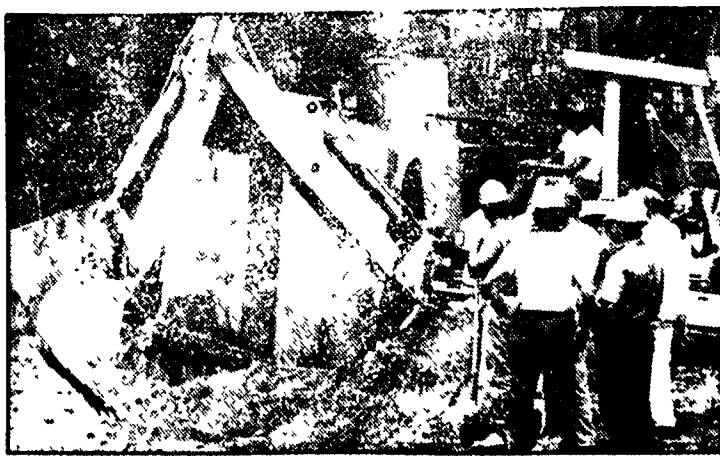

Dirt is excavated from around the pipe to allow repair work.

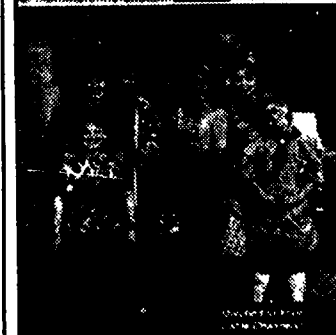

Leak forces evacuation

to flow from the actual sewer line path, a Ric-Man employee said.

"They were digging a hole so the wet, running sand would have a place to go," said the employee, who refused to give his name.

Ric-Man officials were unavailable for comment Friday. A woman who identified herself as a Ric-Man Construction receptionist said: "Everybody's out of town. I can't help you; call back Monday."

Consumers spokesperson Debra Dodd said the utility company is investigating the incident and may charge the contractor for the lost gas, but she was unaware how much gas was lost. She said the gas line should have been clearly marked before Ric-Man Construction began digging in the area.

"Whenever something like this is happening, any kind of construction project, we will go out and stake the area (to mark gas lines)," Dodd said. "Every construction project is staked by Consumers Power."

"I don't want to say right now that it was the fault of the contractor, but 99 percent of the time, it is."

The damaged line serviced Consumers customers from Seven Mile south along Sheldon Road to Five

Mile, said David Runge, a Consumers utility man who was among the first at the scene.

A three-foot "blue flame" erupted from the ground at the rupture point, Runge said.

A Ric-Man employee said she "just dropped everything and ran" when the pipe was torn.

Another employee said he "heard the noise and saw everybody running. I just ran like hell."

Police and firefighters cordoned off the area and evacuated residents within a quarter-mile of the scene. Homes on Sheldon Road, Country Lane, Thornapple Lane, and Fairbrook Street, and the barn area at Northville Downs were cleared.

City residents were sheltered at the recreation building on West Main, and township residents were placed at Meads Mill Middle School.

City police were notified of the accident at 10:02 a.m., and were on the scene at 10:06. City and township police and firefighters set up roadblocks at Six Mile and Sheldon, the intersection of Seven Mile and Edward Hines Drive, Center and Fairbrook, and Edward Hines at the entrance to St. Lawrence Estates.

The Farmers' Market in the parking lot across from Northville Downs was shut down while police sealed

the area.

As the fumes drifted west, police and firefighters ordered residents at St. Lawrence Estates to leave their homes, and evacuated one resident who had no transportation of his own. Township Firefighter Chris Campbell broke the news to a work crew at the condominiums, some of which are still under construction. "You guys have the day off," he told a man in a pickup truck.

"We don't want the day off," the man replied, but he left anyway.

The emergency response was directed from a command post at Fairbrook and Center. Firefighters searched maps for the closest water hookups so they would be prepared for the worst. "Once the (Consumers Power) crew gets here and they downgrade the leak, and get in there to fix it, they're going to need some coverage," said City Firefighter Scott Allen. "So we're looking for some water."

Once the crew had arrived and shut off gas to the line — about two hours after the pipe was ruptured — a work crew excavated around the ruptured section and welded a new section in its place.

"We had it repaired by about 12:15 p.m.," said Dodd. "About 50 customers were affected by the incident, (and) their pilot lights were all relit by about 3:30 that afternoon."

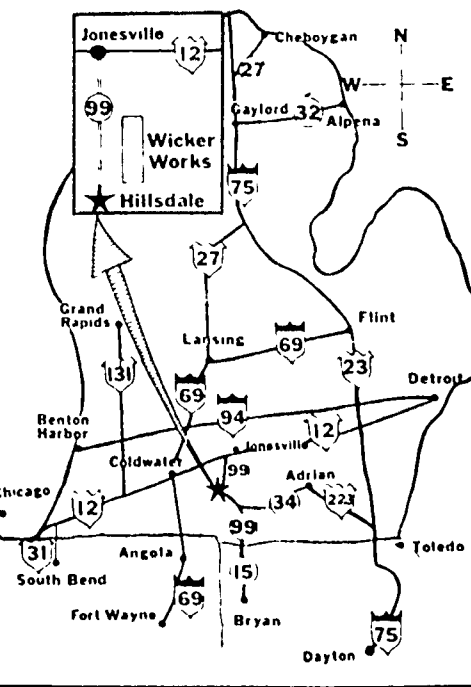

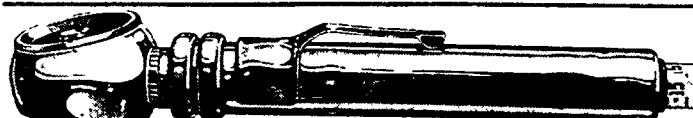

Hearing Thursday on deaths

The Jeep driver charged with manslaughter in the June 5 deaths of two joggers on Eight Mile Road is slated to return to 35th District Court Thursday for a preliminary examination into the case.

The July 11 examination will be heard before Judge John E.

MacDonald.

Kenneth Loveday, 19, stood mute at his July 2 arraignment on two counts of manslaughter. He was turned over to Oakland County Jail on a \$100,000 cash bond, and remained in custody as of press time Friday.

Loveday was charged with killing Yusuf Hanania of Novi and brother-in-law Albert Abdelnour of Livonia,

who were running east on the north shoulder of Eight Mile Road just east of Beck Road on the morning of June 5 when they were struck by Loveday's westbound Jeep Wrangler.

Loveday originally faced charges of negligent homicide, a misdemeanor offense punishable by up to two years in prison per charge. But further investigation by city police revealed evidence of possible marijuana use by

the defendant just before the accident. The evidence consisted of a "roach," the remains of a marijuana cigarette, found in the Jeep's ashtray.

Manslaughter is a felony punishable by up to 15 years in prison. Loveday was scheduled to be sentenced on an unrelated charge of marijuana possession at 35th District Court July 10.

Shores trial subpoenas 32 people

At least 32 witnesses could be called to testify in the Vincent DiLorenzo/Shores of Northville trial, prosecutors said Friday.

Potential witnesses include a dozen state Department of Natural Resources officials, plus representatives from Wayne County, Shores developers, engineers, and financial backers, subcontractors, township officials, adjacent developers and township resident James Malecki, said Reilly Wilson, assistant Wayne County prosecutor.

Jury selection and trial are set for July 16 at 35th District Court. Judge James Garber is scheduled to hear the case.

The state is prosecuting DiLorenzo for allegedly violating the state's Inland Lakes and Streams Act. The prosecution claims DiLorenzo and D & T Construction of Mt. Clemens failed to apply for and obtain permits before beginning reclamation work on the 350-acre-plus Shores site in western Northville Township.

Reclamation chores included temporary rerouting of Sump Drain, a tiny creek that winds from

the west through the Shores property. The developer's alleged illegal diversion of Sump Drain is blamed for massive erosion on the Shores site and on property to the west owned by Malecki.

DiLorenzo could face fines ranging up to \$10,000 per day dating back to February 1990, if convicted of the misdemeanor charges.

Wilson said he is putting the finishing touches on his case against DiLorenzo and D & T Construction, the Mount Clemens firm headed by the controversial Shores of Northville developer.

"I'm conducting depositions right now," Wilson said. "Subpoenas have been served, but it doesn't mean each one of them will be called."

"The list consists of people who might be called," he said.

Wilson forwarded a list of would-be witnesses to DiLorenzo attorney Kenneth Slusser June 18. The list literally is a who's who of players in the troubled Shores project.

DNR officials expected to testify include Cliff Johnson, Robert Zdzieniak, David Pingel and Barry Horney. Pingel and Horney reportedly were the DNR's point men in the Shores case.

Also subpoenaed were Angelo Evangelista, 35-percent owner of the Seven Lakes of Northville Limited partnership, and Terry West and Lynnwood Hamilton, representatives of project financial backers Alexander Hamilton Insurance Company and Home Fidelity Service Corp.

Edward Jacobs, of JCK & Associates, the original engineering firm the developers fired last summer, was served, as was Bill Thompson of Lehman & Associates, the current project engineer.

Mick Kruszewski, township building official, and Carol Malse, planning and zoning administrator, were subpoenaed along with Donald Weaver, the township's engineering consultant from Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May.

Wilson also called four representatives of B & V Construction, of Whom, the developer's subcontractor which allegedly handled the actual creek diversion.

The final subpoena was to be delivered to Dennis Park, president of Blue Heron Construction Company, a residential development located just east of the Shores site, Wilson said.

Consultant will donate services

A \$75-per-hour consultant hired to help push Northville Township's upcoming police millage will donate his services to the township cause.

Chuck Keys, of Quidnunc Corp., a Northville-based consulting firm, said he will forgo his standard fee to help promote the township's August police millage vote.

Keys originally was to be paid at least \$3,000 from the township general fund. The decision to work as a volunteer came shortly after questions surfaced about the township hiring a consultant to ride herd over a political campaign.

Keys last week lashed out at The Northville Record, which he said "abused" the township board and forced him to volunteer his time.

"I think Georgina Goss and the township board didn't deserve the treatment they got for their community relations effort," he said. "They were abused by The Northville Record; my assignment was community relations, not totally for police and fire."

Keys said his task was to "inform the public" about township issues, including a police millage question on the Aug. 27 general election ballot. He denied that he was hired to sell the millage to township voters.

"There was no intent to use township money to get the millage passed," he said. "The Record used slanted, negative coverage (when the) intent was so honorable."

But a proposal Keys forwarded the township in June ranked a police millage campaign second on a list of items he could accomplish. The police

millage also was a prominent topic when Keys faced the township board at its June 13 session.

The state Attorney General's Office has ruled that local governments may not use public funds to promote political campaigns.

No specific hourly rate or funding strategy was brought before the board June 13, and the board did not make a motion to spend money to hire the consultant.

A funding plan had already been approved by township Supervisor Georgina Goss, however. Goss had directed Treasurer Betty Lennox to find money in the general fund budget to pay Keys.

Lennox located \$3,000 that was to be used to pay the consultant. The money eventually was to be returned to the general fund through fund-raisers, Goss said.

No fund-raisers have been scheduled to date, Goss said Wednesday.

Keys said he worked "roughly 20 hours" before his township employment plug was pulled. At \$75 an hour, the consultant is due approximately \$1,500. He said he has not sent the township a bill for his services.

Goss promised that Keys would not be paid with township money.

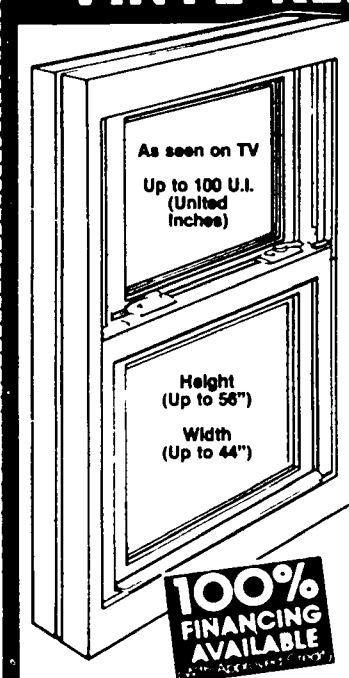
"He will not be paid out of the general fund," she said. "He is volunteering his time."

Despite Goss' pledge to hold fund-raisers to pay Keys' bill, the shift from paid consultant to volunteer will prompt changes in the way Keys handles his job, he said.

"It's sad because I will not be able to devote the kind of time I would have," he said. "That's because of the unfair treatment from that article."

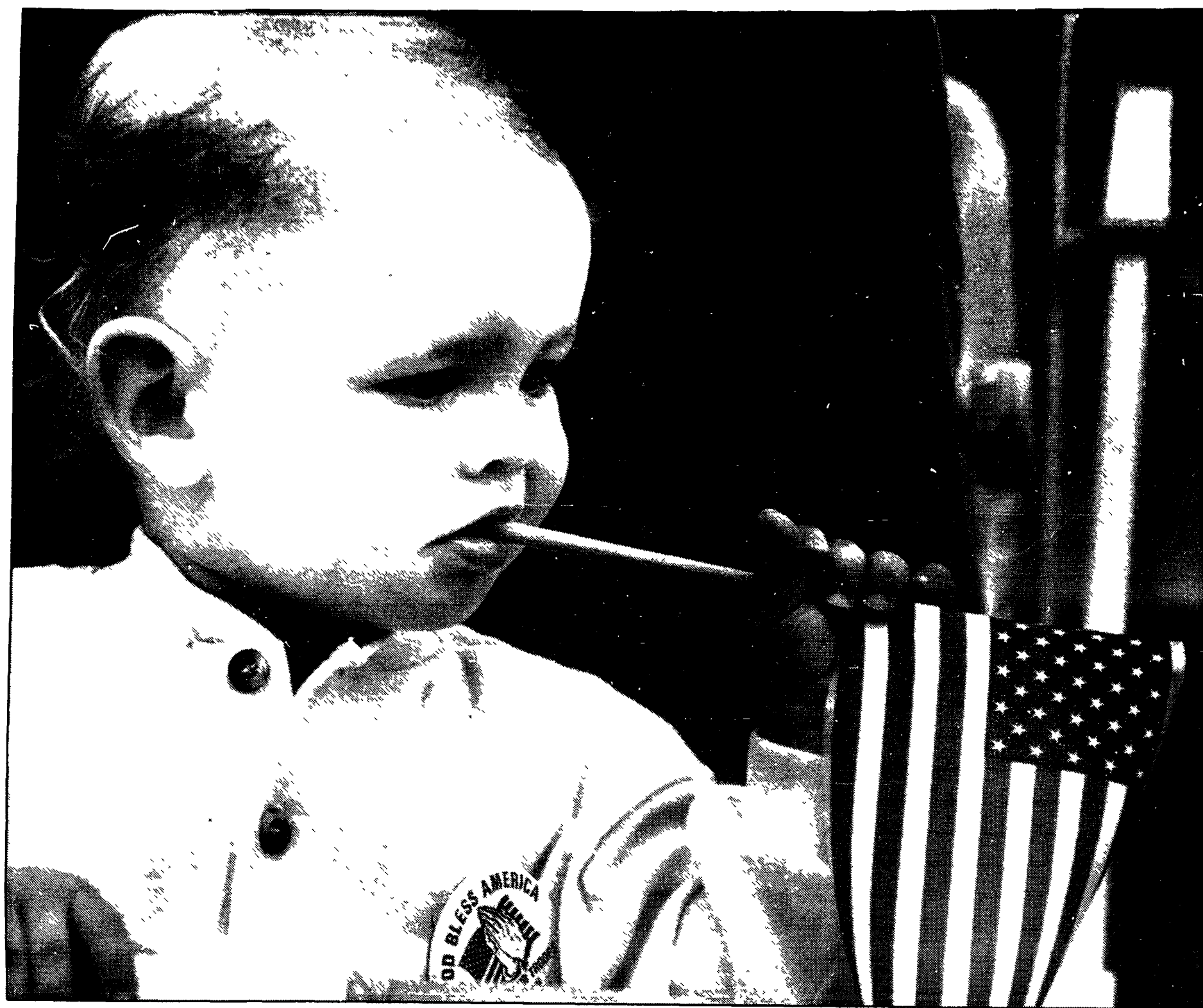

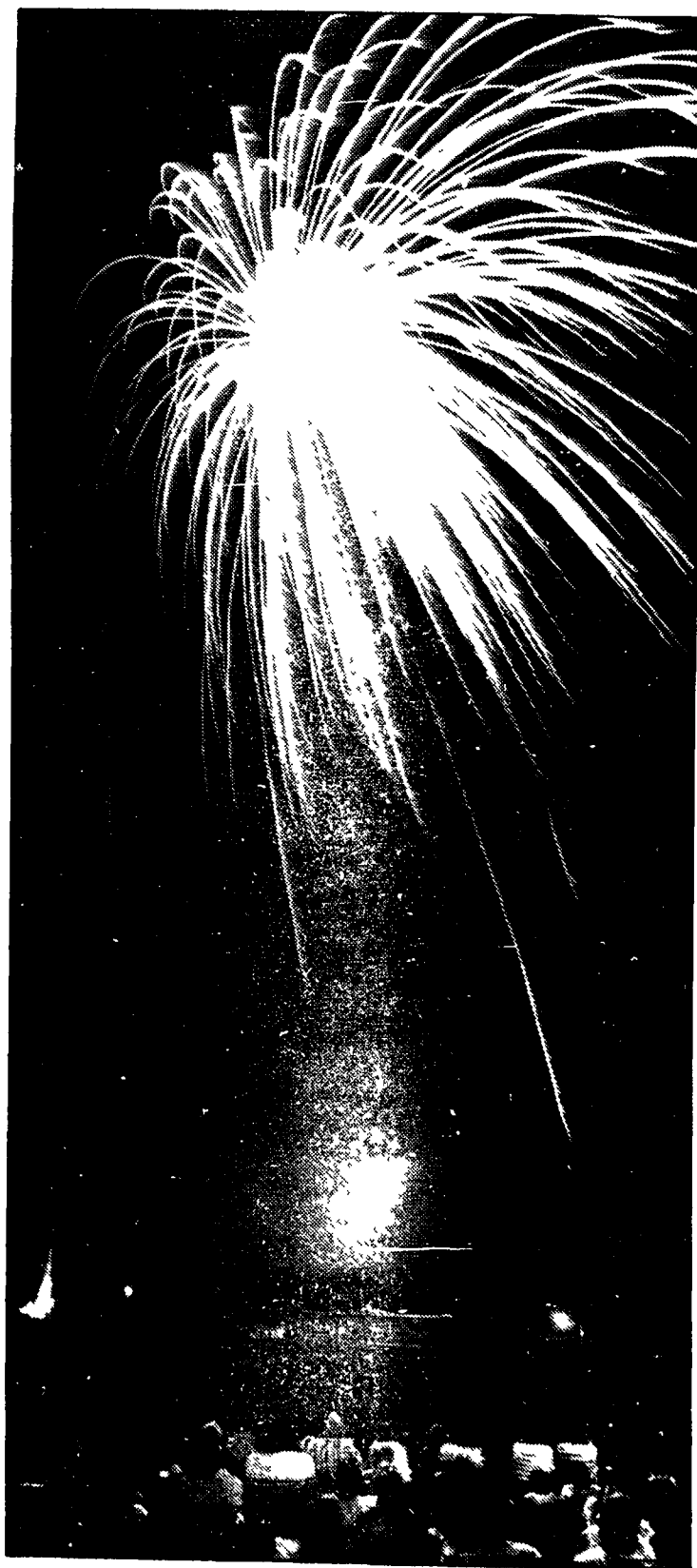

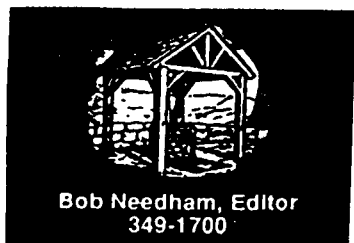

Man faces charge of felony assault

A Canton man was charged with assault with a dangerous weapon June 28 after allegedly hitting another man in the back with an ax handle.

The alleged incident took place at 7 p.m. May 31 inside the Veterans of Foreign Wars Hall at 438 S. Main St.

David Aldon Wilder, 42, commander of the Northville American Legion post, turned himself in to Northville City police June 28 and was arraigned on the charge at 35th District Court in Plymouth. He was released on a \$5,000 personal bond and returned to court July 5 for a preliminary examination before Judge John E. MacDonald. MacDonald found sufficient evidence to proceed with the charge, and bound the case over for trial.

Wilder faces up to four years in prison and/or a \$2,000 fine if convicted of the felony charge. He declined to comment on the alleged incident or the charge.

Wilder allegedly struck a 44-year-old Northville resident in the back May 31 after an argument between the two.

The Northville man told police he and Wilder began arguing after entering the VFW Hall that night. The dispute was reportedly over Wilder's previous refusal to serve alcohol to the man's friend, because the friend had not married in the local Memorial Day parade.

After taking their argument out into the parking lot, the man returned to the bar and sat down. Wilder came back into the bar and immediately struck the man in the back with the axe handle, according to the alleged victim and six witnesses. The man said he heard someone shout "Look out," but in the words of the police report, "All witnesses advised that (the man) did not see the attack coming."

The following account of the fight that followed the first blow was taken from the man's statement to city police: "Using both hands, Wilder took a baseball swing at (the other man) who then raised his arms in order to protect himself. (The man)

stated that the ax handle glanced off his left forearm. (The man) then stood up from his chair and with his right fist punched Wilder in the face and then jumped on him with both subjects falling to the ground. A brief scuffle continued on the floor until both combatants were separated by patrons."

As Wilder left the bar, according to the man's account, he said, "If that didn't work, I'll shoot you with a gun."

City police observed a long welt on the man's back after the alleged incident, and a medical report indicated that his shoulder blade was broken.

Wilder, in a June 2 interview with city police, said the other man punched him in the head while the two were arguing outside and then called his wife and mother names. When the man bad-mouthed his mother, Wilder told police, "Something snapped. (Wilder) said he got the ax handle. He never admitted striking (the other man), but did admit that he knew there were witnesses and that he should not have done what he did."

Man charged with 'fighting words' against police officer

A Northville man's alleged drunken bravado has earned him a trip to district court on an assault and battery rap.

The man faces a July 22 hearing at 35th District Court after he allegedly challenged a township police officer to a fight early June 30 outside township hall.

No blows were struck, but the man was charged with assault and battery/fighting words, under township ordinance.

Police records state that the man

appeared at township hall at approximately 5 a.m. June 30 searching for an officer who repeatedly had attempted to interview the Northville man for a criminal investigation of an April incident.

He allegedly demanded to speak to the officer, who was on patrol and was dispatched to meet with him.

When the officer arrived, the man was standing in the front parking lot at township hall and was "immediately verbally abusive," according to the officer, who said the man was "highly intoxicated and would not state why he wanted to make a statement now."

The man then allegedly bragged how he beaten another man and said he would not mind giving the officer some of the same.

The police officer then reportedly told the Northville man to make a statement when he was sober. The officer reported that the man replied by asking what time the officer got off work "so he could kick my a--."

The officer then placed him under arrest on the assault and battery/fighting words complaint.

The suspect later was released on \$100 personal bond, police said.

Col. Richard Atchison, a Northville native, was applauded as soon as his name was mentioned. Atchison recently returned from six months in Dhahran, Saudi Arabia, where he worked directly under Gen. Norman Schwarzkopf during the height of Operation Desert Storm.

"I think I've just realized a boyhood dream," he said as he took the stage. "When you can come home from a successful military effort and be invited to participate in a parade in your home town, that's the peak."

Atchison's U.S.-led coalition's military victories drew several bursts of applause from the appreciative audience.

He gave some credit for the coalition victory to public support for the troops. "The support that we received from this country and our people was absolutely phenomenal, especially from this state and this town," he said.

Atchison was followed by local singer Michael Brandon, who performed "America the Beautiful," and Northville poet Raghu Das, who read his work, "The American Freedom Anthem."

A man in the audience held up a plaque to remind the rest that the war is not quite over. It read, "Until Jim and all the troops return home safely!" According to Atchison, as of Wednesday 5,684 U.S. ground troops remained in the Persian Gulf theater, with 1,456 still in northern Iraq.

More music followed, including a rendition of "The Impossible Dream" by Air Force Staff Sgt. Sam Vitale, a South Lyon resident who served in the Persian Gulf.

Atchison returned to the stage to present a Chris Johnson to Northville Mayor Chris Johnson. He asked that the city plant the tree "in a place of honor" as a memorial

Sauvignon Blanc merits respect

Jackie Cakebread, owner of Cakebread Cellars in Napa Valley, is so taken by the charm of sauvignon blanc that he has made it the winery's specialty.

"Sauvignon blanc has been kicked around by the wine press," he explains. "Early in the production of varietal sauvignon blanc, wine writers referred to it as the poor man's chardonnay. This comment immediately imposed second-class citizenship on these wines."

"Sauvignon blanc is much more versatile with food than chardonnay because it is never over-oaked and the wine remains lean, clean and fresh. It accompanies food and refreshes the palate."

Cakebread's wife, Delores, has created exciting dishes to complement sauvignon blanc. Through this effort, the Cakebreads have discovered the ageability of sauvignon blanc and how it matures.

Bruce Cakebread, the winemaker for his parents' winery, uses the following as descriptors for Cakebread Sauvignon Blanc: citrusy, lemony, floral, spicy and herbaceous. "Young wines have a grapefruit assertiveness with hay and melon accents," he contends. "As the wine ages, the fresh, crisp, fruitiness complexes to yield a golden color with toasty, smoky aromas and flavors."

According to the Cakebreads, there are rules of thumb that help when designing recipes to accompany sauvignon blanc:

- Avoid using cream. Substitute yogurt. Sauvignon blanc has good acidity, but cream covers the wine's richness.
- Delicate use of tarragon accents shrimp flavors when served with sauvignon blanc.
- Substitute wine or lemon juice for vinegar, especially in salad dressings.
- Shallots pick up any herbaceous quality in the wine.
- Fresh cracked pepper accents the wine's spiciness.
- Cilantro, used judiciously, emphasizes the lightness of a young wine and its lavender flower makes a colorful plate accent.
- Smoked chicken or turkey will enhance a smoky character in the wine.

A tasting of Cakebread Sauvignon Blanc with specially designed cuisine illustrates the versatility and ageability of this varietal.

The 1990 Cakebread Cellars Sauvignon Blanc, served with an appetizer of Spinach Balls with Mustard Sauvignon Blanc Sauce, is a classic harmony for a young sauvignon blanc.

"The wine has a liveliness due to good acidity and balanced fruit," Dolores Cakebread says. "It isn't overpowered by the mustard, and the spinach enhances an herbal quality in the young wine. One year of bottle age adds a complexity to sauvignon blanc that I describe as toasty."

This is well illustrated when a mature sauvignon blanc is served with Seafood Terrine with Roasted Bell Pepper Sauce. The wine maintains good acidity and keeps its varietal characteristics without being overly herbaceous. The Seafood Terrine is kept light by the use of only fresh white fish, scallops and prawns, with a minimum of butter. The tangy bell pepper sauce not only makes a great accompaniment for the wine, but it also brightens up the presentation of the white terrine.

Cafe Days Edward's goes *al fresco* for summer

Edward's Caterer has been in Northville for five years, but somehow, it always seems new.

The menu has grown along with the clientele, who have always sought out the restaurant at 116 Dunlap St. for lunch.

Of course, it used to be that only lunch time was the right time for Edwards. But now the downtown Northville eatery is offering extended hours, opening for breakfast, and remaining open through the dinner hour.

According to owner Edward Postiff, the decision was prompted by some regular customers.

"So many people said they like to sit somewhere outside at night when they're in town," he said. "A lot of them are people who live in town and just walk here."

He added that with the summer festival in full swing and people shopping nearby, staying open until 9 p.m. should prove to be a wise move. Postiff has committed to the later hours through the Victorian Festival in late summer. The longer day has also allowed Edward's to debut a number of enticing new items, including a cappuccino machine.

Selections for dinner are known as Blue

Plate entrees, and they come to the table on delightful Fiestaware art deco plates. All the entrees include french bread, butter and a helping of fruit. A longtime favorite at Edward's, the crusty mustard chicken, is available this way, as are the chicken burritos, tortelloni with tomato basil sauce, and vegetable lasagna.

What makes Edward's even more attractive is the addition of outdoor seating. The cafe experience is something that's been missing in downtown Northville since Holloway's bakery burned last year.

"It's nice for people who want to linger and wait for friends," said Postiff. "I like the idea of people meeting and lingering here. A lot of people come here alone, and you see a lot of people who sit and read their newspapers."

The light and easy atmosphere is evidenced in the menu. Postiff has chosen to highlight appetizers like the artichoke and three-cheese dip, and the carrot and celery sticks served with a spicy clam dip.

Cafe desserts are also an outdoor favorite, and an excellent accompaniment to cappuccino, espresso or mocha. Postiff said cappuccino cafes are springing up all over Ann Arbor, and adding it to his menu seemed like a logical step for Northville.

Summer isn't the ideal season for coffee, however. Postiff said the popular items right now are his cool, refreshing salads. The chicken caesar salad is a big favorite, and is made with a low-fat asiago cheese that is far lighter than it tastes.

Right now, the outdoor service is using plastic utensils, but Postiff said that won't

last long. Already food is being served in glass bowls and stoneware plates.

"We're trying to get away from serving things in plastic," said Postiff. "We wanted it to look nicer, and we wanted to make less garbage. As we get better, we'll begin serving with real utensils."

Also new at Edward's is the "Morning Breakfast Call," which includes muffins and scones.

"We make what I call American scones," said Postiff. "They're a cross between biscuits and the British scones. I know so many people who've tried them in England and didn't like them that much. They said they were too dry."

"These are kind of biscuity, and they're not as dry. The batter makes a good drop scone. The English make the rolled scones."

If all the diversity of Edward's menu seems a little schizophrenic, Postiff said thinks that's a tribute to the creativity of his staff.

"We have a really good example of what I call a 'team,'" Postiff said. "It's almost like a family. We're all close, really close. If someone has a lot to do, say someone on the pastry table in the back, we'll all pitch in and get together to help them."

Fulfilling some fruitful fantasies

Frozen yogurt is my favorite treat during the summer. At least for the first six months. Then I burn myself out.

Many days I will eat a medium no-fat for lunch. Who needs a sandwich? Then after dinner, I must go for a small cone.

Actually, times when my husband is out of town I'll eat a diet of frozen yogurt for several days. Cooking for myself isn't appealing.

Then about the middle of July, it's time to ease off a bit. Not that I would ever totally give up on the delightful light flavors—but a bit of a change is good for the soul.

There are many options for low-fat summer desserts for the person with a sweet tooth. The simplest are chilled fresh fruits, served in beautiful glass bowls or wine goblets. A wedge of lime nestled onto the glass adds a touch of elegance. A dollop of no-fat plain yogurt and a sprinkle of granulated brown sugar add new dimensions.

Low-fat desserts depend primarily on the intense flavors of fruit, fruit juices and flavorings. It is not appropriate to ever dilute flavors with water unless they are extremely tart, such as lemon or lime. If a liquid is needed to dissolve gelatin, or to thin out a too thick sauce, use orange juice, a

fruit liquor or a sweet wine, such as port or sherry.

Citrus zest can add a tremendous amount of flavor to desserts, thus eliminating the need for sugar. Tossing blueberries with the juice of a lemon gives the fruit the lift it needs. The same is true for strawberries, mangoes, papayas or melons.

On several tropical vacations, breakfast was simply local fresh fruit with a wedge of lime. Yes, the lime can flavor something other than a gin-and-tonic.

Other tricks include whipping skim evaporated milk and using as a replacement for whipped cream. Gelatin can be softened and added to part of the juice or fruit puree being used for an airier dessert.

For a quick, low-calorie treat, mix sugar free Jell-O with no-fat yogurt and allow to set. Using fruit juice instead of water adds pizzazz. Before the Jell-O is set, layer with fresh fruit in a parfait glass.

One of the simplest methods of all is the poaching of whole fruit. Pears, peaches and apples simmered in juice just until tender, then cooled and served with the natural syrup, can't be beat.

Guests and family will appreciate the

delicate taste of real fruit. Reduce poaching juices in half to intensify flavors. Add a cinnamon stick, allspice and nutmeg to the cooking liquid for zip.

In the past, whipping egg whites and adding them to a base has been popular. A word of caution concerning this. Eggs are no longer considered safe in the raw state. Alternatives are being tested, and a popular alternative is to warm egg whites to lukewarm over hot water, beating in a hot sugar slowly to prevent the coagulation of the whites.

Fresh fruit is normally high in natural sugar, so it is not necessary to load it down with sugar. Confectioner's sugar goes much farther than granulated because it is so fine.

A pleasant trick is to fill a small jar with 10-X sugar and add a broken vanilla bean or nutmeg clove. Seasoned sugar is then always at a hand's reach.

If a harder dessert is required, consider the use of angel's food cake. Use it instead of the traditional shortcake for crushed strawberries or raspberries. Or, layer alternating cake, a sprinkle of flavored liquor, berries and then yogurt. Let sit a few hours to allow the essences to work

together.

Make fruit sauces by processing fruit to a liquid state, straining and sweetening if desired. Substitute ricotta or neufchatel cheese for cream cheese when possible. Calorie savings can be as high as 30 percent.

When buying fruits beware and be aware. Don't assume that fruit at a roadside stand or farmer's market is local. If it is too early in the season for peaches, chances are high that they were imported from a warmer climate.

By the same token, fruit grown at a nearby orchard isn't necessarily better than if shipped. Look for telltale signs of quality indicative of the fruit type, and judge for superiority versus origin.

Choose fully ripe fruit for eating "raw," and a bit firmer if it is to be baked or poached. Peaches, plums, melons and strawberries will not ripen after cooking. Their texture will soften, but natural sugars do not develop further, so choose ripe fruit to begin with.

Finally, use your nose to help you choose. A fruity, pleasant aroma means a tasty fruit.

FRESH FRUIT AND RICOTTA PARFAITS

- 1 cup part-skim ricotta cheese
- ¼ cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons amaretto liquor
- 1½ teaspoons vanilla
- 1 teaspoon unflavored gelatin
- ½ cup non-fat yogurt
- 2 large, ripe peaches, peeled and pitted, cut into ¼-inch cubes and tossed with a squeeze of lemon juice.
- 1 cup halved strawberries
- ¾ cup blueberries

Combine first four ingredients and blend until very smooth. Chill at least one hour, and up to 24. Mix 1 tablespoon amaretto with 1 tablespoon water and sprinkle gelatin over. Let stand for five minutes to soften. Heat the mixture over a medium-low heat, stirring until gelatin dissolves. Place the mixture in a large bowl and whisk in yogurt. Set the bowl over a larger bowl of ice and stir until the mixture thickens and begins to gel. Immediately beat with an electric mixer on high speed for 4-5 minutes or until mixture has tripled in volume. Whisk in chilled ricotta mixture by hand. Do not beat or all the air you just whipped in will be lost. Toss fruit together. Spoon a layer of ricotta mixture in the bottom of a parfait glass. Top with fruit. Continue finishing with a layer of fruit. Serve immediately or chill for up to two hours. Serves four. 159 calories, 3 grams of fat.

1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
¼ teaspoon horseradish
Dash tabasco
½ cup plain lowfat yogurt
½ pound raw shrimp, shelled and deveined
½ pound scallops
½ cup medium shredded spinach
3 tablespoons minced shallots
2 green onions with tops, chopped
½ teaspoon fresh thyme or dill
White pepper to taste
2 dashes of Worcestershire sauce
Red bell pepper sauce (recipe follows)
Red, yellow, green bell pepper for contrast
Sprig of thyme or dill for garnish
Edible flower such as Johnny Jump Up or Nasturtium

Place whitefish, egg whites, bread crumbs, lemon juice, Dijon mustard, horseradish, tabasco into food processor with steel blade. Process on and off until coarsely ground. Add yogurt; process until smooth. Keep refrigerated.

Dice shrimp and scallops. In medium mixing bowl, combine remaining ingredients. Stir in shrimp and scallops. Fold in whitefish mixture until thoroughly mixed.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray ten 4-ounce souffle cups with non-sticking vegetable spray. Lightly dust each cup with flour; shake out excess. Fill cups ¾ full; place in 2-by-13-by-19-inch baking dishes. Add boiling water to a 1-inch depth. Cover with waxed paper. Bake until a metal skewer comes clean 15-18 minutes. Remove to wire rack; cool to room temperature.

To serve, spoon 3 tablespoons red bell pepper sauce onto salad plate. Loosen terrine from cup by running a sharp knife around edge. Tap gently out of mold onto prepared plate. Garnish with strips of peppers, a sprig of thyme or dill and/or blossoms.

RED BELL PEPPER SAUCE

1 medium onion, chopped
2 clove garlic, minced
2 teaspoons homemade chicken stock without salt, defatted
4 medium red bell peppers, seeded and chopped
1 ½ cup Cakebread Cellars Sauvignon Blanc
1 cup defatted homemade chicken stock (no salt added)
1 sprig thyme
1 bay leaf
1 tablespoon plain lowfat yogurt
1-2 teaspoons lemon juice

Book calls for curbing 'fat tooth'

What if you could have your cake, cookies and ice cream and stay healthy and slim? In "Controlling Your Fat Tooth," Joe Piscatella suggests we rethink our eating habits and cut down on dietary fat — without sacrificing the foods we love.

Piscatella is the author of two best-selling books, "Don't Eat Your Heart Out" and "Choices for a Healthy Heart," which combined have nearly 1 million copies in print. He has been a keen observer of American eating habits since 1977, when an open-heart bypass at age 32 forced him to recognize the intimate connection between dietary habits and overall health.

Recently, Piscatella has observed a strange dichotomy in American eating habits. Despite a growing awareness that a diet rich in fat increases risk of heart disease, obesity and certain cancers (breast, prostate and colon), statistics reflect practically no change in the way we eat. In 1980, fat constituted 40 percent of the calories typically consumed. Today that figure is still 37.5 percent — substantially higher than the recommended 30 percent or less.

"We are better educated today about nutrition and health than ever before, but we don't practice what we know to be in our best interest."

Weight-loss dieters go on and off low-fat plans, and even high-risk heart patients can't seem to maintain low-fat eating. The real question is "why?"

In "Controlling Your Fat Tooth," Piscatella translates the latest medical research into prose for the layman; he analyzes dietary habits, explaining why we like fatty foods, and teachers readers how to custom design a "personal fat budget" to manage daily intake of dietary fat without depriving one's choice of foods.

Throughout our lives, we have been conditioned to associate cravings for chocolate, ice cream and candy with an irrepressible "sweet

tooth." But recent studies show that most "sweets" actually derive the bulk of their calories from fat — not sugar.

Because most people don't know where their dietary fat comes from, "Controlling Your Fat Tooth" helps readers identify and budget sources of fat. It features more than 200 recipes that specify calories, fat, percentage of calories from fat, cholesterol and sodium content. Piscatella's recipes are designed to meet low-fat dietary goals while still pleasing discerning taste buds.

For everyday eating, the book also provides charts that break down the grams of fat in typical foods consumed, including brand-name items and menus from fast-food chains.

To assure that what you're reading is what you're eating, Piscatella teaches readers to analyze "light"-labeled products and "low-fat" foods, including "2-percent milk," which actually derives 38 percent of its calories from fat, and "95-percent fat-free ham," which can contain more than 40 percent caloric fat. (In both cases, the percentages advertised refer to overall weight, not calories.)

"It's important to remember that it's not the fat content of any one food that matters most, but how all foods go together to produce a meal (and a day) in which fat constitutes less than 30 percent of total calories."

By using the book's charts to calculate your "personal fat budget" in grams, as well as your recommended daily caloric intake, you can easily regulate the percentage of fat calories in your diet.

CHICKEN-AND-VEGETABLE CASSEROLE Makes 6 Servings

2 chicken breasts, skinned, boned and quartered
2 teaspoons powdered rosemary
2 tablespoons dried parsley

¼ teaspoon black pepper
1 whole head garlic, separated into cloves and peeled
12 baby carrots
1 large onion, cut into rings
4 small red potatoes, halved
1 pound fresh green beans, stemmed
1 cup dry white wine (Soave Bolla is good)

In a covered casserole dish, arrange chicken on bottom. Combine rosemary, parsley and pepper. Sprinkle ½ of mixture over chicken. Top with garlic, carrots, onion and

potatoes. Top with green beans. Sprinkle remaining third of seasoning over top. Pour wine over all. Cover tightly with foil, then cover with lid. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour or until chicken is cooked and vegetables are tender.

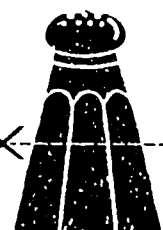

Not enough people say ahh to asparagus

The figure seemed hard to believe. Americans consume about 1 pound of asparagus per person per year. Since I am likely to enjoy that much in a single sitting, this leaves the inescapable conclusion that an awful lot of people are not doing their share.

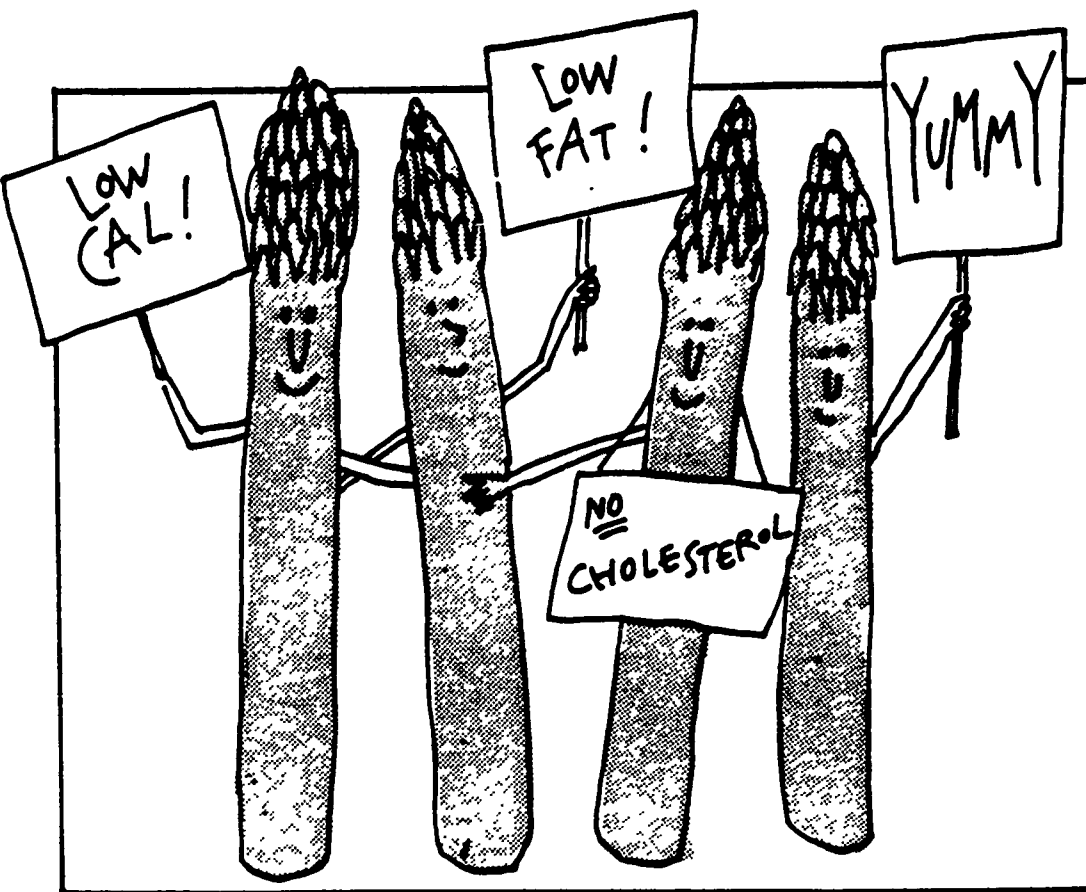
But this member of the lily family can be addictive. A friend's cat, Spike, is a compulsive asparagus eater. Once he smells it in the shopping bag, he demonstrates totally unfeelinlike behavior. The cat screams until the asparagus is cooked and served to him. Spike, being a connoisseur, likes it plain.

There is no denying the fact that this skinny stalk is among the more expensive of our vegetables. Even at the height of the season (March through May) the price will hover around \$1, though I often see sales at 69 cents. Out-of-season prices, of course, spiral upward as the flavor goes in the opposite direction.

Part of the pricing problem is the cultivation. Each asparagus stalk is carefully hand-picked. White asparagus is more expensive still, because it requires time-consuming mounding of sand around each stalk to prevent the sun from developing the green chlorophyll in the plant.

Then, of course, the stalk has to be dug out of that mound. This laborious treatment is not done just for visual aesthetics, the flavor is milder and quite mellow.

My own theory for the lack of enthusiasm for this "king of vegetables," as it is known, has to do with unfamiliarity. If one's first experience

with asparagus is jarred or canned, you hardly want to pursue it further. Frozen examples are a tad better in flavor but a far cry from the real

thing. I'm all for starting a campaign, right at home. Have an asparagus party. This does not mean a meal of

asparagus, just one or two dishes, but have everyone bring an asparagus recipe to be exchanged among the other admirers. And if your

guests were not asparagus aficionados when they arrived, they will be thoroughly converted by the end of the evening.

You might also let it be known that Madame Pompadour combined egg yolks with her asparagus to maintain sexual vigor. And, yes, the green stalks have been inevitably described as an aphrodisiac.

The many attributes of this harbinging of spring should be considered: Four cooked spears contain a mere 14 calories, trace amounts of fat, and — like all vegetables — no cholesterol. The French are partial to covering asparagus with rich Hollandaise sauce or Maltese sauce (Hollandaise with orange juice), which of course wipes out the caloric advantage.

Italians like to gratinee the cooked stalks with fresh Parmesan shavings or a sprinkling of fine olive oil and balsamic vinegar. Belgians are partial to chopped hard-boiled egg and melted butter. Each has its culinary allure.

When selecting asparagus, look for fat examples; they are more tender. Try to get them in uniform width so that they will cook evenly. If they are to be refrigerated, store upright in a few inches of water and covered with a plastic bag, or wrap in a damp paper towel.

To prepare them, snap off the tough woody bottom and discard. If the asparagus is to be served whole, the stems must be peeled. A swivel-bladed vegetable peeler works particularly well. Cutting them Chinese fashion is a time-saver: Snap off the bottom, but do not peel. Cut the stalks and the tips into long, thin dia-

gonal slices with a sharp knife. The longer the better.

Many cooks like to cook whole asparagus standing upright; others steam it. I have one method for either whole or sliced asparagus: Lay the vegetable in a large flat skillet. A single layer is best; overlapping should be kept to a minimum. Sprinkle lightly with salt and pour in enough water to reach a depth of 1/4 inch. Cover, place on high and once the water boils, cook for about 2 minutes for sliced and 3 minutes for whole. Drain and continue with your favorite sauce or dressing.

Here is another cooking method that will change the mind of even confirmed vegetable haters.

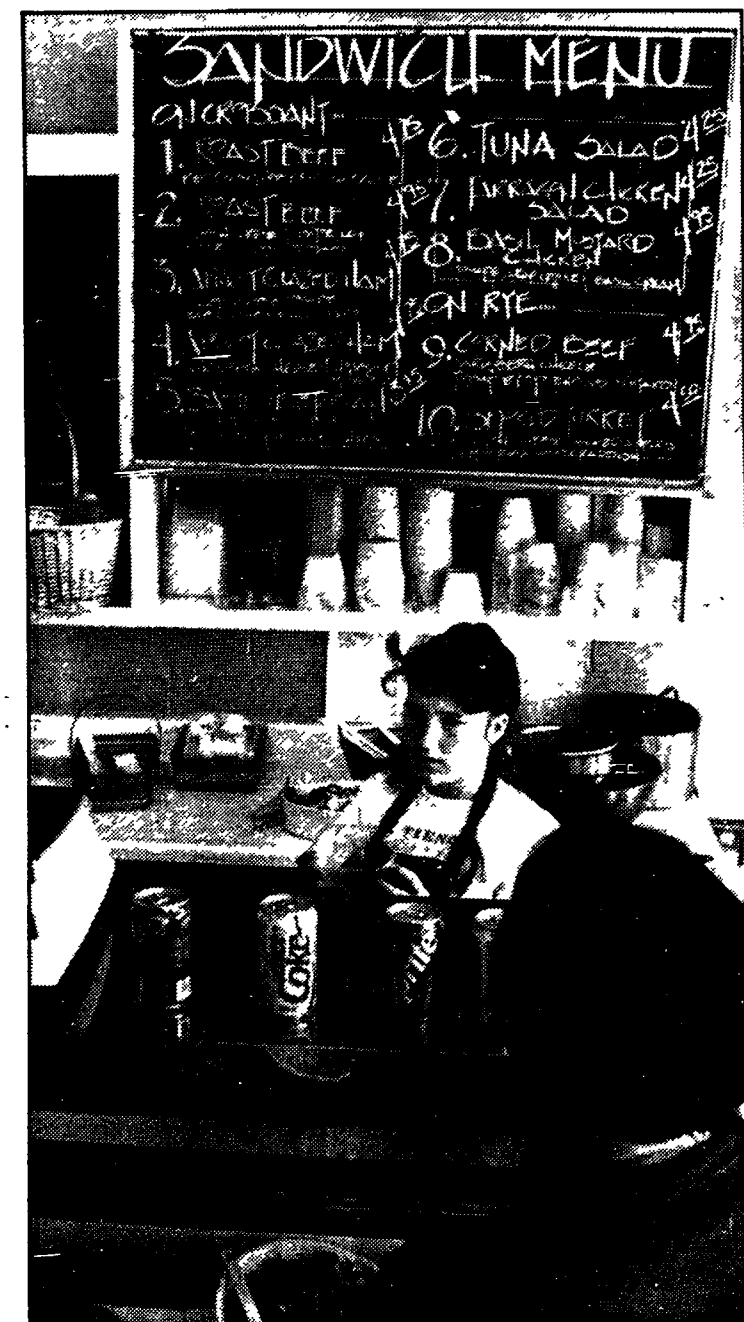
ASPARAGUS, PURE AND SIMPLE
1 to 1 1/2 pounds asparagus
Salt and pepper
3 tablespoons butter, cut into small bits

Yields 4 servings as a vegetable side dish.

Preheat oven to 300 F. Prepare asparagus as described above and rinse. Select a shallow baking pan that will hold the spears compactly and butter it well.

Place asparagus in pan, sprinkle with salt and pepper and dot with butter. Cover dish tightly and bake 30 minutes. The asparagus will still retain some crispness and its lively green color.

New menu items often come about in a similar fashion.

"Somebody will see something somewhere that they liked, and we'll try it," he said. "Or we'll have a situation where it's like 'We have all these red peppers. We ordered too many. Let's make something up.' It's very experimental."

Postliff is something of a success story with regard to his menu planning, as he has no formal training in food service. He confesses that dental school didn't work out for him, so when he graduated from University of Michigan, he parlayed a summer job at the Avrey Bakery's catering division in Cleveland into full-time work.

He picked up some ideas along the way, and soon had his own business catering mainly to corporate clients from his Northville location. He continues to serve business functions

throughout the western suburbs.

"It's all been trial and error and on-the-job training," he said.

The take-out business is no experiment, though. He said it's one of the sure things of the '90s.

"The '90s are it for carry-out, that's what all the trade publications say," he said. "People have all these kids and they want to spend time with their families instead of cooking."

And for now, the 116 Dunlap location will remain Edward's home.

Plans to move to the new Main Centre building were axed when Postliff decided he was happy where he is.

"Main Street does get a lot of foot traffic," he said. "But where we are, we catch a lot of people going home and walking around the back."

"We may rearrange the space just a little bit."

That makes sense since, if there's a new way to do something, Edward's will try it.

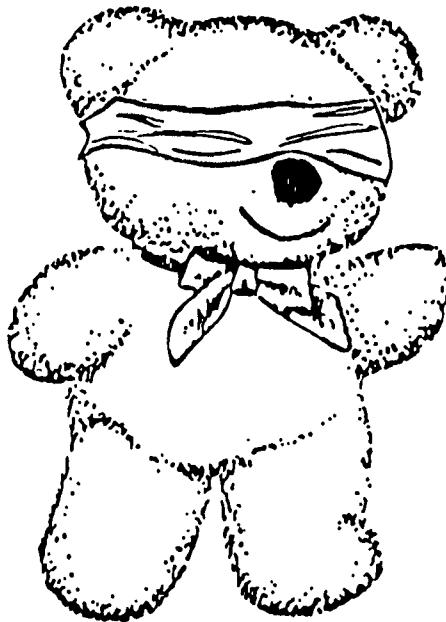

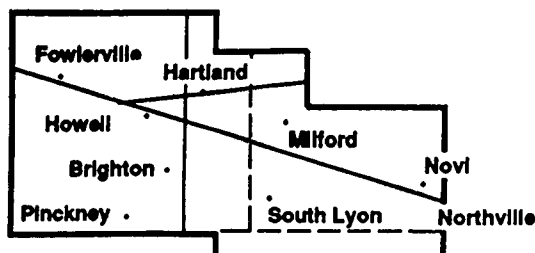

TV's past meets the present in 'Hi, Honey, I'm Home'

Comedy draws upon series of decades past

Author and essayist Penny Stallings is straddling a generation-and-a-half of popular culture in the making of "Hi, Honey, I'm Home," a new half-hour comedy she is writing and producing with partner Rick Mitz. The series, which debuts Friday, July 19, on ABC, is meant to be an enjoyable comment on the gap between the TV reality of the 1950s and the facts of life in the 1990s.

In "Hi, Honey, I'm Home," a newly divorced mother of two is struggling to make ends meet and keep her wits about her when into her life step the Nielsens, a picture-perfect family of four that's been cancelled from a TV neighborhood that presumably included Donna Reed, the Beaver and a father who always knew best. Now they're living in the '90s, where they must learn the realities of safe sex, animal rights, gun control, homelessness and family troubles that can't be solved in half an hour.

Stallings, who is the author of several books on popular culture and a regular contributor to "The MacNeil/Lehrer Hour," confesses a deep sympathy with both the '50s sitcom mom, Honey Nielsen (played by Charlotte Booker), and the '90s mom-with-a-job (Susan Cella). "They're both me," she says, adding that "Rick and I actually believe those people (the Nielsens) are real people" living today.

Mitz is a veteran of seven years' work with producer Norman Lear and the author of *The Great TV Sitcom Book*. Together, the partners have forged a production deal that may pave the way for the future. "Hi, Honey" is being financed by both ABC and cable's Nick at Nite, which will re-air each episode on the Sunday following its ABC debut. Initially, the deal allows them to make a full 13 episodes—an

increasingly rare commitment for any single network.

Stallings and Mitz not only draw upon their body of knowledge, but they have incorporated vintage sitcom actors as guest stars in each episode. To date, Gale Gordon ("The Lucy Show"), Barbara Billingsley ("Leave It to Beaver") and Jim Nabors ("Gomer Pyle") have paid visits to their old friends the Nielsens.

In one episode, Honey calls Lucy Ricardo for advice, which inevitably backfires when put into practice. In another episode, Grandpa Munster (Al Lewis) explains depression to stalwart Lloyd Nielsen (Stephen Bradbury), the men-don't-cry sitcom dad.

This lighthearted approach helps make the shows appropriate for both kids and adults. "The idea," says Stallings, "is that both parts of the audience should be able to watch it, no matter what the issue. This is rather a sweet show. It's not 'Married...With Children.' It's not black humor, or anything that's meant to offend."

The cast of "Hi, Honey, I'm Home" is largely unknown to TV audiences because its members were recruited from the New York stage. The show is in production at the new Universal Studios lot in Orlando, Fla., and has the feel, says Stallings, of summer stock. The players give three performances a week in front of a live audience. In addition, the set has become a point of interest on the studio tour.

"We are a ride here at Universal," she says. "The crowds pass over us, watching from a sky window." It's a vacation idea worthy of "The Jetsons."

"It's an awful lot of fun, this TV business," Stallings says. "It's much more pleasant than sitting in your room trying to think up cute things to put on the page by yourself. That's a lonely thing to do, and this is all collaboration, and so far it is really fun."

"In many ways this show is a comment on pop culture and television in particular. Also, what

you find out is there's not necessarily any right or wrong (between the two differing points of view). We don't resolve (every story line), and that's sort of a sly comment on the '50s sitcom, too, where there was always an answer to every problem.

"Every week, ideally, (the Nielsens) learn a little something about the way things are, and that's incorporated by the end of the first 13 episodes."

Letterman makes late-night TV varsity

As "the world's most dangerous band" plays, David Letterman appears on stage. He mugs for the camera, adjusts his tie and checks his hair in the monitor. They laugh and moan and sympathize and so begins another *Late Night With David Letterman*.

Letterman was born in Indianapolis on April 12, 1947. Even as a child he wanted to be on either radio or television. While a student at Ball State University, he got a summer job as a replacement announcer at an Indianapolis television station. Following graduation, he worked at WLWI-TV as host of a Saturday morning children's show and late-night movie, weatherman and news anchor. After a year as a radio talk-show host, he moved to Los Angeles in 1975. While there, he made his stand-up comedy debut at the famous Comedy Store nightclub.

He made his network debut as a member of the cast of *Mary*, a comedy-variety show featuring Mary Tyler Moore. Although *Mary* left the

air after only three episodes, Letterman made a strong impression and was invited to be a guest on *The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson*. Eventually, Letterman became one of the show's guest hosts and Carson's heir apparent.

In 1980, NBC made Letterman the host of a short-lived morning program, *The David Letterman Show*, which earned Letterman his first two Emmy Awards.

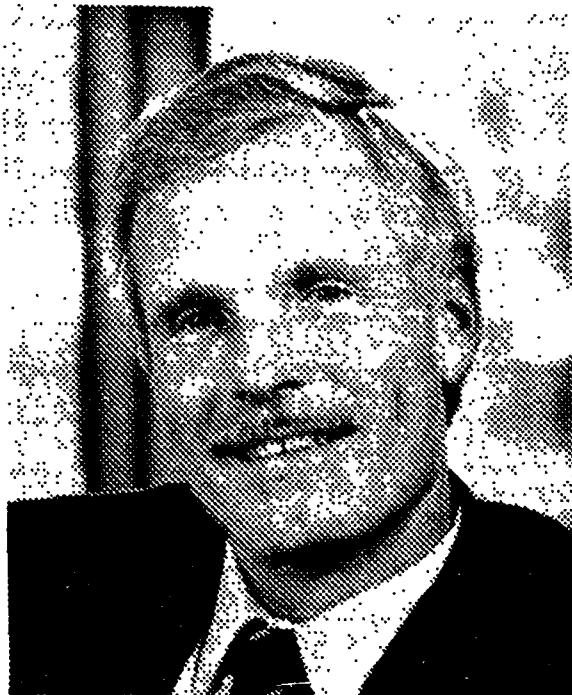
