



## Muer buying eatery back

A spicy new menu and familiar ownership headline a popular Northville restaurant's comeback recipe.

Restaurateur Chuck Muer on Friday identified the defunct Northville Charley's on Seven Mile Road as one of eight restaurants his C.A. Muer Corp. has agreed to purchase in a tentative \$1.9-million deal.

The sale is pending the outcome of a federal Bankruptcy Court ruling and will not be finalized until late September, Muer said. He said no time frame has been set to reopen the restaurant.

"I can't really say when (the restaurant will open)," he said. "When we get possession, we'll know more."

The C.A. Muer Corp. last week bought back the eight restaurants from Richard Sikorski, who had purchased the restaurants in 1987. Muer retained leases on six of the sites — including the Northville restaurant — after the 1987 deal.

Northville Charley's closed suddenly in January, a month after Charley's Restaurants Inc. filed for protection under Chapter 11.

Muer was less than enthusiastic about reacquiring the restaurant at that time but a change of seasons apparently changed his mind.

"It's something we had to do," he said. "Now we'll roll up our sleeves and do something with it."

Muer's comments about the proposed reacquisition were liberally sprinkled with upbeat phrases.

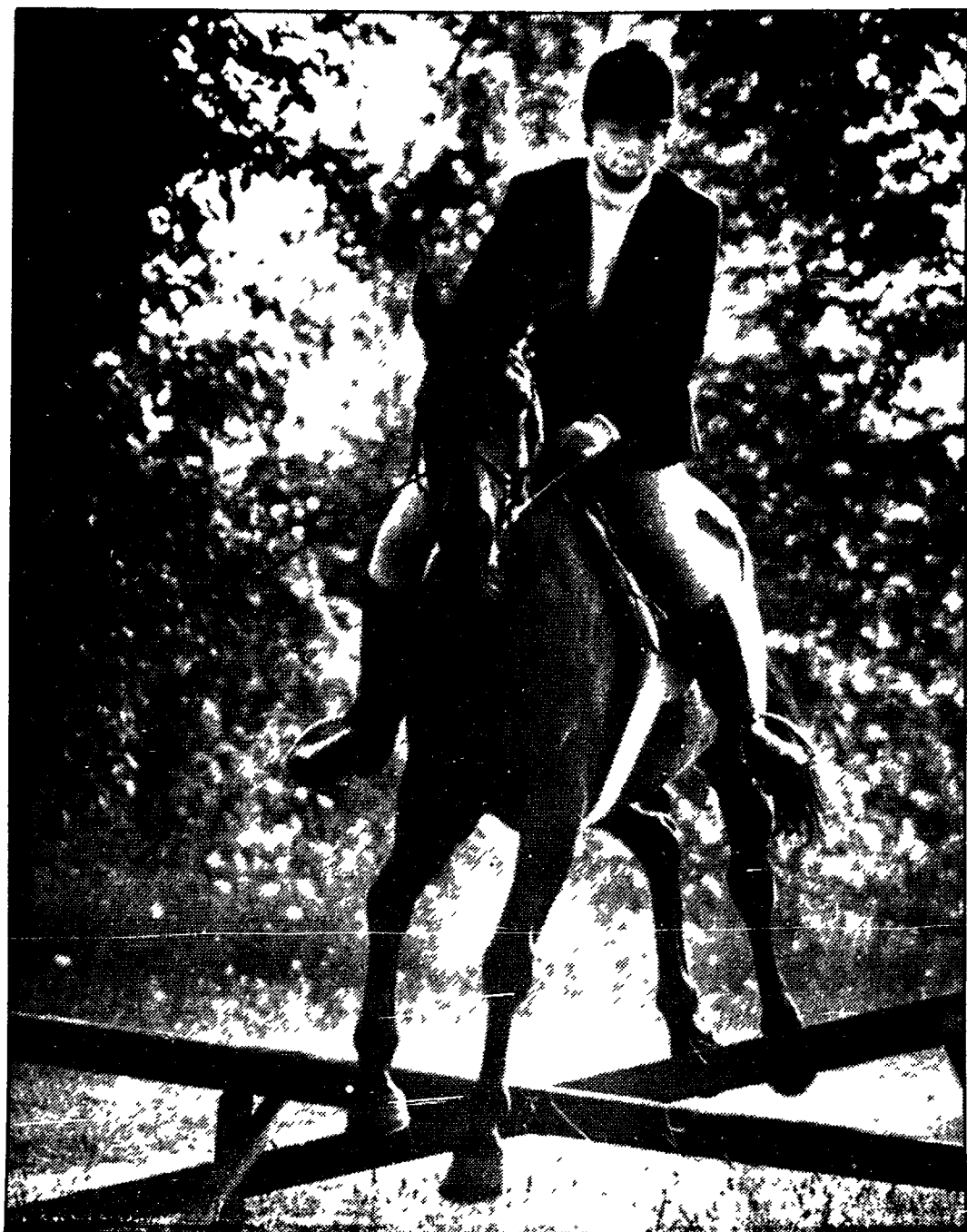
"We have some terrific ideas," he said. "I really can't give you (details), but we're planning some exciting things."

A new development staff will conjure up a new name and a user-friendly menu, he said.

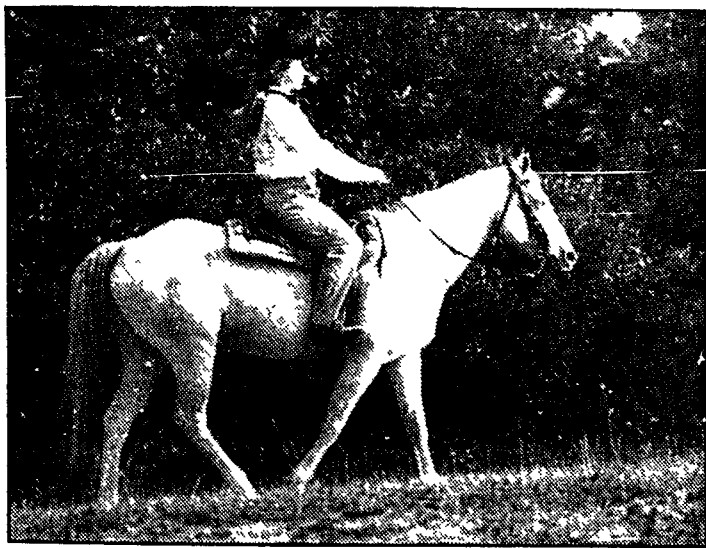
"Price-wise, it will be a place where you can go in and get a burger for \$4 or a (dinner) up to the \$15 range," Muer said.

The new restaurant also will vary from the old Charley's seafood-based stores.

"We'll have a broad range of product; you can't typecast it as just seafood," he said.

## Bell counts down to retirement

The final countdown begins today for Superintendent George Bell.

The retiring administrator will leave Northville schools in ten days after nine years at the helm of the district.

He said he will be "on call" until a new superintendent is hired at no cost to the district.

That is, when he isn't fishing, skiing or honing his duck-carving skills. Bell also will work with an educational consulting firm part time and teach a class or two in educational administration at Eastern Michigan University.

He recently discussed some of the highlights of his career.

The high school's renovation was at the top of his list. The school was producing high academic achievers when Bell arrived nine years ago, he said.

But the facilities were not well-maintained.

He said in one instance, community members had to come to the high school for flu vaccines. Many people were shocked, Bell said, with the poor condition of the building. Windows were broken, and doors hung crooked on one hinge, he said.

"The high school was old. It needed a renovation job," Bell said.

A citizens' committee was formed that recommended closing two schools, adopting a middle school system and renovating the high school. At the committee's recommendation a bond issue was put before the voters and passed.

Skilled maintenance workers were hired and high maintenance was made a priority, Bell said.

Bell will be leaving a district with computers and an interactive voice, video and data system soon to be implemented throughout the district.

"(This administration) leaves the district in very good shape and on the brink of the 21st Century," he said.

Another highlight of his career was the implementation of the district's Strategic Planning Initiative, a long-term planning process.

He said Assistant Superintendent for Instructional Services Dolly McMaster is the "sparkplug" behind the strategic plan's success.

"We set the tone for school districts across the state, and I think across the country," Bell said.

But the end result of the plan is it gives community members an opportunity to improve the schools.

"It's the kind of community where if someone wants to make a difference, they can," he said.

Bell's relationship with the district's staff is another thing he calls a highlight of his career.

"I think that I have enjoyed an outstanding relationship with the staff," he said.

Looking back further in his career, Bell said he found teaching very fulfilling. He left his position as a band director in the Wayne-Westland School District to become a principal in the district.

He did not leave because he was tired of working with kids, but because he began thinking he could of-

## Residents protest new garbage fee

Dozens of irate residents dumped on the city council July 15 for deciding to charge households a fee for curbside refuse collection.

Several complained that they were unaware of the city's decision earlier this year to switch from a millage-based to a fee-based curbside collection system.

"We do protest the charge for the rubbish pickup and how you came about with that figure," said Joan If-

versen, president of the North Lexington Condominium Association. "We think it's totally unfair . . . We think we're subsidizing the rest of the city."

Ifversen said many of the association's members are elderly people who generate little trash, and the per-household charge is unfair to them. "If they generate a bag (of rubbish) a week, that's a lot," she said.

Mayor Chris Johnson assured the crowd that the council's decision was

## Forum set for House election

Voters in the state House 36th District will get a chance to meet and grill three Republican hopefuls at a candidate forum this Wednesday.

The public debate will take place at 7:30 p.m. at the Plymouth Township meeting hall, which is located in the old Friendly Restaurant at the northeast corner of Ann Arbor and Lilley roads.

Northville Township Supervisor Georgina Goss, Realtor/Plymouth City Commissioner Jerry Vorva, and Ford Motor Co. executive/Canton Township precinct delegate Deborah Whyman will field questions and hope to woo voters in their attempts to succeed Gerald Law as 36th District state representative.

Law resigned his post in April and was named Plymouth Township supervisor.

The July 24 debate is the only

scheduled public meeting of the candidates. Voters will choose between Goss, Vorva, and Whyman at an Aug. 6 Republican primary. The winner is unopposed in the Aug. 27 general election.

The primary election is open to all registered voters.

The debate is an attempt to familiarize voters with the three candidates. Candidates will each make two-minute opening statements and will entertain written questions from the audience during the debate. Candidates also may make closing statements.

The event is co-sponsored by the Northville-Plymouth-Canton League of Women Voters and The Northville Record.

Omnicom Cablevision will tape the event for broadcast at a later date.

## Transportation posed challenges in Victorian era

Editor's note: Beginning today and continuing each Monday until the Victorian Festival, Sept. 13-15, The Northville Record will publish an article highlighting a different aspect of life during the Victorian era. Today's report is on transportation.

The dawn of the Victorian era began with Queen Victoria's birth in 1819. Locally the beginning of Victorian times, still celebrated in Northville, was marked as pioneers began to settle the area.

One year before the birth of Victoria, government land in Southeast Michigan became available for purchase. The same year, 1818, marks the first journey of the steamboat Walk-In-Water.

Traveling at 8 miles per hour, the steamboat chugged into Detroit from

Black Rock on Lake Erie, bringing adventuresome pioneer types mainly from New York. The Erie Canal opened in 1825, opening the route from the East even more.

Early settlers came by steamboat from the East to Detroit and traveled by foot or wagon to Plymouth, what

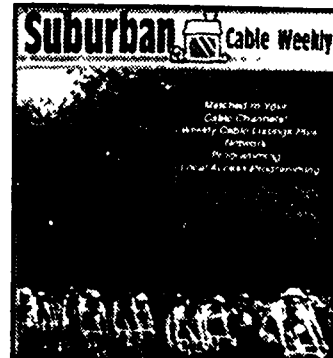

# Transportation posed challenges in the Victorian era

today has become the two communities of Northville and Plymouth.

Others traveled using the energy of their own body, traveling by foot or horseback from New York through Canada until they reached the Detroit River.

One Plymouth man's life was saved when he chose his feet over a ship.

A.B. Markham was about to buy a ticket to ride about the Goodfellow, a small schooner headed from Buffalo to Detroit. Before he paid for his ticket he had a premonition.

"I began to feel alarmed for my safety; . . . it seemed as though I was compelled by some power unknown to me to leave that vessel," Markham wrote.

The next morning, the ship was found in Buffalo with every traveler dead.

"Thanks to heaven and my good

legs, I was safe in Canada," Markham wrote.

His account can be found at the Plymouth Historical Museum in Volume 2 of the Pioneer Collections of the Pioneer Society of the State of Michigan, pages 549 to 567. It has also been reprinted in Jack Hoffman's *Northville — The First One Hundred Years*.

In 1830, a dirt road was cut through the thick forest surrounding Detroit. The trip from Detroit to Northville is about 20 miles, but early pioneers had to travel 30 miles to avoid swamps and streams. The trip required three days, according to reports gathered by author Hoffman.

The hazards of moving pioneer families are evident in a story told by Markham and retold by Hoffman:

"I was moving a man and his wife and their household goods. We came to a piece of bad road, and the man got off from the wagon, while his wife and myself remained on. We were sit-

ting on a chest, when the fore-wheel of her side dropped into a deep hole where the mud and water was one foot deep for some rods around.

"She went off headforemost and into the mud; her head went all under, but it did not hurt her. It was at this time that pride had a fall, and a muddy one, too. She washed, changed her dress, and then was all right, plus the first lesson in the art of pioneering," Markham wrote.

Early settlers attempted to ease the pain of travel. In 1828, plans for making a road of wood planks to link Detroit to Howell were rejected by President Andrew Jackson.

In a successful political move, backers of the road asked Jackson to support a "military" highway linking Detroit to Grand Rapids. Jackson, a military man, decided to support construction of the road.

A second plank road was built in 1850, joining Detroit to Grand Haven, and a third road joined Novi to

Commerce.

As the Victorian era progressed, so did transportation throughout Southeastern Michigan.

A steam engine street car has short-lived success in Michigan running between Ypsilanti and Ann Arbor. The line was owned by the brother of Northville's Frank Beal.

In 1886 the electric street car replaced the steam car.

Owners of the electric line came to Northville in 1898, attempting to sell local officials on a proposal to extend the line from Northville to Plymouth.

Township board members agreed to the plan, which would cost travelers five cents to travel from Northville to Plymouth and 35 cents from Northville to Detroit.

The deal was made at the second meeting of the Northville Township board, which was formed when Plymouth was divided into the two separate townships of Plymouth and Northville.

The electric car industry was booming. Soon after the township board approved the first plan to send an electric line through Northville, a second plan was approved linking Northville to Salem, Ann Arbor and Detroit. The second line would transport milk as well as passengers.

When the first line opened up in 1899, free rides were given the first day. Over 1,000 passengers used the train in its first weekend of operation.

Henry Ford was said to be a fan of the old streetcars. He would drive to Farmington, where he parked his car and road the streetcar into Northville, the site of a Ford Motor Co. plant.

But as much as Ford enjoyed the streetcar it was his motorcar that became popular enough to put the interurban streetcar services out of business. The streetcars lasted until 1927, when service to Northville was ended.

Northville businessman Jim

Spagnuolo remembered when the streetcar ran through Northville, and specifically a time when a prankster caused an accident in the center of town. His story was printed in Hoffman's book and later Kathleen Ripley Leo wrote a poem published in her book *Town One South* about the incident.

A portion of the poem reads:

"O, how the crowd used to dance to the bands till that day when a damn grown man — not some kid — greased the tracks from Griswold to Center. It smashed into Crow's Nest, slammed it off 20 feet.

"People in the Opera House balcony, front row center, toppled down. Cakes fell at Ina's Good Food; Lapham's clothes dropped off his racks; even Bruno Freydl skipped a stitch. The great Northville train derailing, where's our street-dancin' now?"

fer the school something as an administrator.

He led Wayne Memorial high school through the turbulent late 1960s.

"I spent hundreds of hours with kids talking values and still had a good relationship with them," he said.

Bell had his first job as a superintendent in the Van Dyke School District. He said the community was "terrific," with great pride in its schools.

Passing his first millage election was difficult just months after he was appointed to the job, especially because two board members were campaigning against the district's proposal.

But the district pulled out of its five-election losing streak and passed the millage, something Bell remembers with pride.

With retirement, Bell will pursue some of the activities that have been the highlights in his personal life.

He hopes to continue carving wildlife out of wood. He hopes to study with artists to make the figures more lifelike. He also wants to be able to

make a carving without using a drawing as a reference.

Bell and his wife Ruth recently completed their third golf lesson and went to a course for the first time with their children.

He also hopes to ski in Austria and

journey by donkey down the Grand Canyon.

The 63-year-old also wants to volunteer for environmental groups.

Bell has a few parting words for his replacement:

He hopes his successor likes kids —

"You have to work at seeing kids, but if you don't you lose the feel for what it's all about," he said.

A new superintendent also should realize the staff is of high caliber and the community is educated and supportive," Bell said.

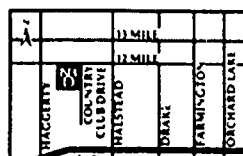

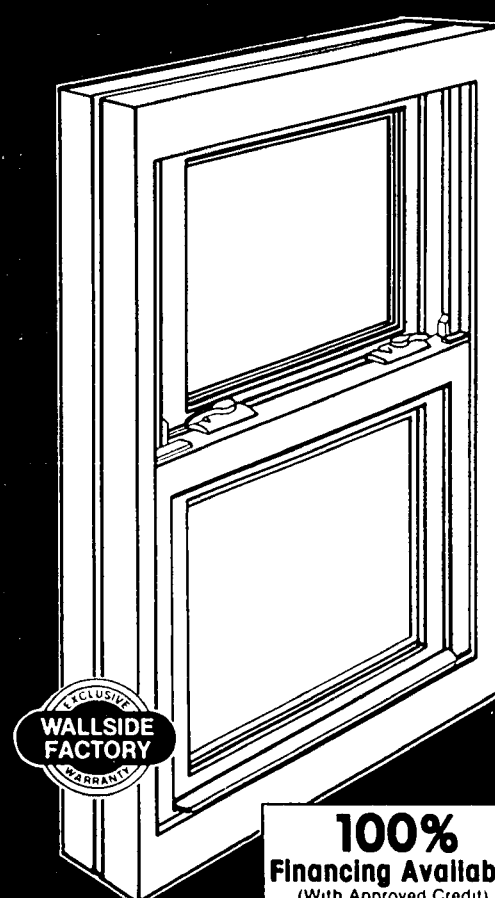

## Sports Briefs

**McGREW UPDATE:** Mark McGrew—the star of the Novi High School Tennis team as a freshman last spring—competed in the United States Tennis Association (USTA) Boys 16 Western Closed Championships in Indianapolis from June 30-July 5. The six-day tournament qualifies players from a six-state region to compete in the 1991 National Junior Tournaments.

McGrew was seeded 15th and reached the fourth round—or round of 16—before falling to eighth-seeded Brooke Blain of Bloomfield Hills 6-1, 6-4.

As in all qualifying tournaments, losers from the first four rounds are fed into a consolation draw. McGrew needed to win two more times to automatically qualify for the Nationals, but it didn't happen. He fell to Brad Goldberg 6-2, 7-5 in his next match.

"Unfortunately, the luck of the draw was against Mark," McGrew's father, Mike, said. "He met a higher seed in his first (consolation) match."

The loss placed McGrew in the top 24, but only 14 players qualify to move on (the top 12 finishers and two at-large picks) to the nationals. McGrew was number two on the alternate list for the National Clay Court Tournament in Nashville earlier this month, but did not make it into the draw.

"The tournament director told us that Mark is ranked around 70th nationally in the mid-year tentative rankings," Mike McGrew said. "This is his best showing in his first year of any age group."

McGrew has entered and will compete in the Western Open Championships at Ball State University in Muncie, Ind. from July 28-Aug. 3. He also hopes to get into the National Championships held in Kalamazoo in early August, just like with the Nashville tournament, McGrew's alternate status may again prevent him from making the draw.

"We are working hard to get him in," Mike McGrew said. "It's incredible that we have to fight to get him in because the field is 128 and Mark is ranked 70th. We are kind of frustrated."

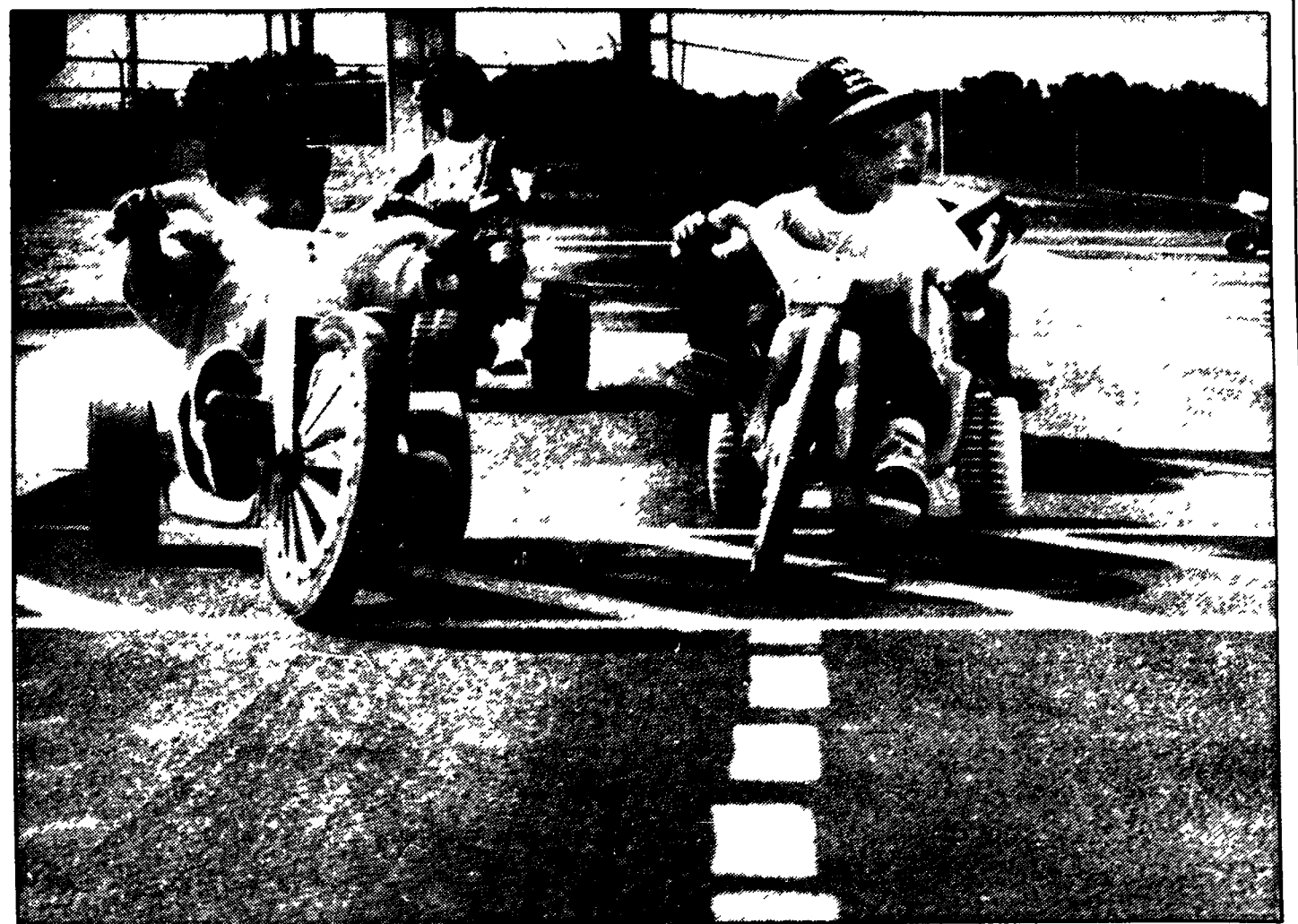

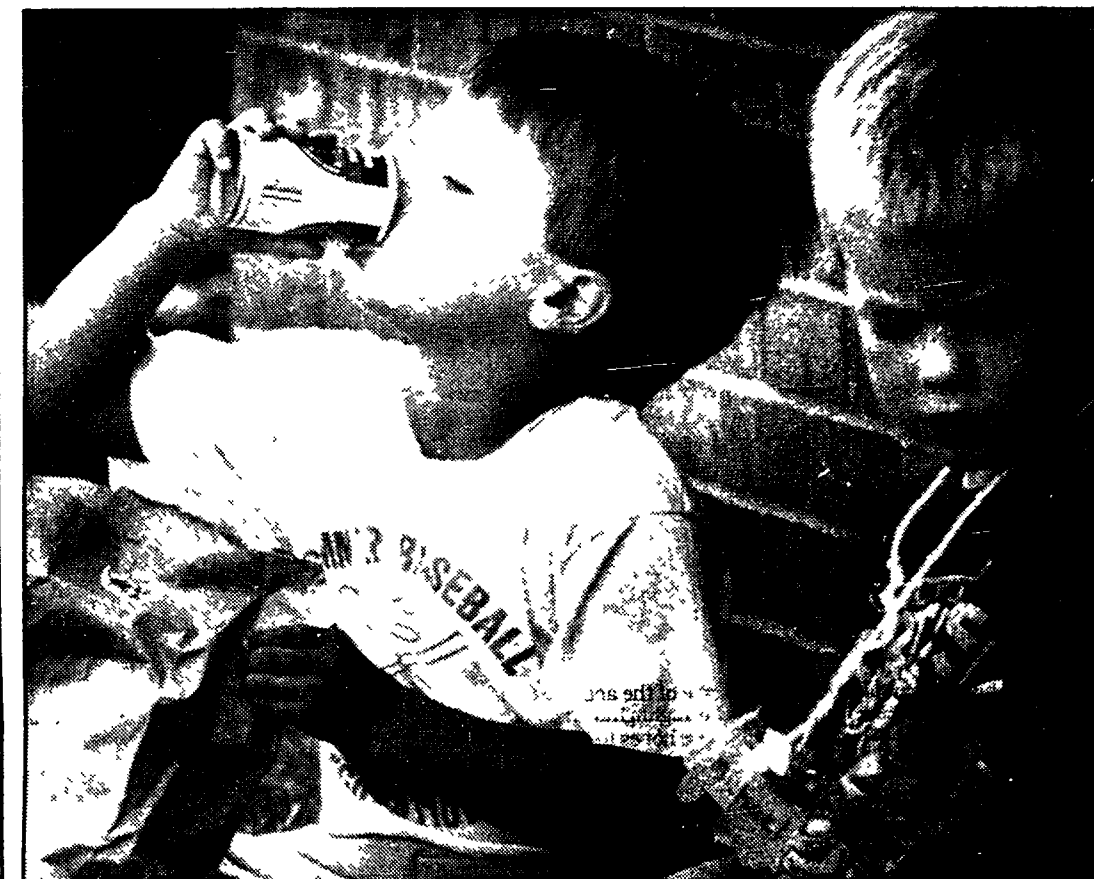

# Youths face charges after joy ride

Two Novi youths who allegedly piloted a stolen vehicle to a fiery resting place in Northville Township are feeling the heat from law enforcement officials.

A 17-year-old Novi youth faces auto-theft and arson charges, and his 16-year-old alleged cohort faces similar complaints under juvenile statutes stemming from an early June 21 joyride.

Northville Township police say the 17-year-old stole a Wixom man's 1990 Chevrolet Suburban from an apartment complex parking lot, met up with the 16-year-old, and embarked on a high-speed drive down Napier Road.

The journey ended just south of the Seven Mile/Napier intersection when the youths lost control and flipped the vehicle into a ditch and yard, police said.

The youths then crawled from the vehicle and set it on fire before running from the scene, police said.

Police are set to file a complaint in Wayne County Juvenile Court against the 16-year-old. Arson and auto-theft warrants are pending against the 17-year-old, police said.

According to police reports and suspects' statements, the youths met at the 16-year-old's home late June 20 and took off on bicycles along Grand River from Napier to Wixom.

The 17-year-old reportedly lagged behind the other youth, who told police he stopped at a late night party in the Wixom area. A short time later, the 17-year-old appeared at the party with a truck he claimed to have borrowed from his mother.

The 17-year-old told police he saw the Suburban in a parking lot with its keys in the ignition. He then decided to drive the vehicle to the party, according to police reports.

After leaving the party at 2:30 a.m., the youths took turns driving the Suburban. Just after 4 a.m., the youths hit the Napier/Seven Mile intersection at 65 mph and lost control.

The vehicle began to flip and roll and came to a rest on its roof at the edge of a residential lawn, the youths told police.

A short debate followed, and the youths decided to burn the vehicle, police said. One of the youths reportedly peeled off his shirt and soaked it in gas that had leaked from the Suburban.

The youths then hung the gas-soaked shirt on a broken tree branch, lit the torch, and tossed it into a pool of gas, police said.

As the vehicle burned, the youths ran north along Napier to their homes. The 17-year-old told police his alleged accomplice was drunk at the time of the incident, while he was only "buzzed."

Hearing dates on the charges had not been set by press time Friday, police said.

## Refuse charge ended long discussion

Northville City's switch from a millage-based to a fee-based curbside refuse collection system earlier this year followed one of the city council's toughest budget sessions in recent memory.

Two police positions were eliminated, equipment purchases were postponed and all city departments faced across-the-board budget cuts as the council faced the double whammy of increasing refuse costs and delayed payment of racetrack

revenues.

Council members met 10 times in May alone, five in one week, to wrap up the budget and select a successor to former City Manager Steven Walters.

Their decision to switch to a fee-based refuse collection followed huge increases in the city's refuse collection costs. Those costs more than tripled between 1986-1990, from \$149,686 to \$481,175. The cost for the 1991-92 fiscal year was estimated at \$563,955, and may have had to be increased with the addition of curbside recycling, a service man-

dated by the Wayne County Solid Waste Plan.

Rather than raise the millage, the council agreed in April to remove refuse collection from the millage-based system and charge a fee for the service.

The council's decision to switch from millage-based refuse collection required some funding source for the service. The council voted July 1 to charge residents \$16.30 a month for the service, with commercial businesses paying between \$35.06 and \$57.46 each time their rolloff containers are emptied. Downtown bu-

sinesses sharing dumpsters will be charged a fee based on the state equalized valuation of their properties.

The charges took effect July 1, and will begin appearing on Aug. 1 water and sewer bills.

The council decided in May to return half the money saved from removing refuse collection from the general fund to taxpayers, in the form of a 1.4-mill reduction in the city operating millage. The council also set up a \$150,000 budget stabilization fund with part of the remainder, fol-

lowing recommendations by the city's financial advisors.

"We've found that the single most expensive requirement for the city has been trash removal," Mayor Chris Johnson said. "Over the last few years, we have been taking funds from other departments to subsidize the trash (removal costs), because we could not predict how much the cost would go up."

"The amount of money that used to be assessed to the homeowner was reduced, and the fee-based system instituted," he said.

not arrived at lightly. "The decision to move from a tax-based system to a fee-based system is one which has been taken over several months," he said.

Johnson and other council members added that the per-household charge is a temporary solution, one which may be replaced by a per-bag charge as soon as the city contracts with a waste hauler to provide the curbside recycling required by the Wayne County Solid Waste Plan.

Several residents agreed that a per-bag charge would be more equitable than the per-household fee. "I think that that's the only honest way you can do it," said one.

The contracting decision has been delayed by Northville Township's agreement with Browning-Ferris Industries to have the national solid-waste firm provide the township with free curbside recycling in exchange

for a portion of the township's sewer capacity.

The city originally sought a joint city/township contract with a waste hauler, on the assumption that a larger service area would result in more efficient and less expensive curbside collection of both refuse and recyclables.

But the township's deal with BFI changed that, Johnson said.

"We were kind of left having to go back to the drawing board and see what other communities we can work with," he said.

The City of Plymouth, he added, "has not got a recycling program in place yet, and they're a potential partner."

Northville City Manager Gary Word has discussed the possibility of such a partnership with Plymouth City Manager Steven Walters, though no decision has been made.

In the meantime, the city council voted to charge residents \$16.30 a month for curbside refuse collection, with commercial businesses paying between \$35.06 and \$57.46 each time their rolloff containers are emp-

ted. Downtown businesses sharing dumpsters will be charged a fee based on the state equalized valuation of their properties.

The charges took effect July 1, and will begin appearing on Aug. 1 water and sewer bills.

Johnson admitted that the new fees do preserve part of a historical inequity in refuse collection costs. City homeowners have always paid a higher percentage of the refuse cost than they account for, in effect subsidizing commercial refuse collection. The recently instituted fee system reduces the inequity but does not eliminate it.

"These are not permanent fees; they're not meant to be a permanent situation, they're meant to be a first step," Johnson said.

When asked whether the addition of curbside recycling will increase the city's costs, Johnson said, "Yes, unfortunately," drawing groans from

the crowd.

Several residents complained that the city's monthly per-household charge is much higher than other communities, including Plymouth and Birmingham. Johnson said the residential fee will be reduced as the inequity between residential and commercial properties is further reduced, but he added that Northville currently differs from those other communities in one important way: "As far as we can determine, we're the only city at all that provides trash service to the downtown."

Council Member Carolann Ayers refuted statements from one resident, who said he believed that the new refuse fees are being used to fund other city budgets.

"This fund is not mixed up with other budgets or anything else," Ayers said. "What we pay to get rid of this trash is what is going to be passed on to the residents."

## Our Opinion

### Bell instilled pride in school district

Northville school Superintendent George Bell will work his last day in the district on July 31. His departure was met with some amount of dismay from school board members and the community.

Community meetings with consultants that help school districts replace superintendents easily could become sessions where complaints about the outgoing superintendent are vented. Northville's consultant heard a complaint or two, but mostly he heard: "We want another George Bell."

We believe the school district will undoubtedly survive without Bell. But there is little in his nine-year tenure that we can fault. Certainly his replacement would be wise to follow a few of the procedures the outgoing superintendent has established.

The changes and improvements seen in Northville schools in the last nine years were not the result of some magical powers possessed by Bell, nor some secret knowledge about education. Instead his success is the result of common sense and community input.

When Bell came to Northville the high school had broken windows and doors hanging on one hinge. Graffiti was allowed to remain on walls until even more joined it. It is not hard to understand why community support of the schools was somewhat lacking a decade ago, despite academic achievements made by district students. Bell instilled community pride in Northville's public schools, in part by hiring skilled maintenance workers and renovating the high school.

But he knew the improvements would cost money, and that he would need community support to pass a bond issue. Bell formed a committee of community members to make recommendations on school district needs. Based on the committee's findings, he closed two school buildings with low enrollment figures, renovated the high school and adopted a middle school program, phasing out the junior high school system in Northville.

Closing schools and changing to a middle school system could have been

disastrous. But Bell was acting on the advice of community suggestions made in the committee. He did not need a committee to tell him what needed to be done. But had Bell acted without public input the support may not have been there when a bond issue was put before voters.

That concept has led to the integration of strategic planning, or long-range planning, into the district. With strategic planning committees in place, community members with concerns or ideas about any area of the district's operations may jump in and promote change.

Bell also maintains a high visibility in Northville. Parents can find him at most school functions. Students and teachers see Bell in the classroom frequently. A pride in the schools that was instilled through the renovation and maintenance of Northville schools is reinforced by Bell, who acts as the district's public relations man. In fact, board member Glenna Davis recently joked at a school board meeting that she was surprised that no public relations firm had snatched Bell away from Northville.

Bell has done much to improve the image of Northville schools. Academic achievements of students remain high, and the high school was recognized this year as an exemplary school by the state. It's no wonder school board members and some members of the community suggested that the district hire another George Bell. But as the board searches for a new superintendent, and Bell packs his personal belongings from his Main Street office, we should remember the superintendent not as a miracle worker or magician, but as a good listener who works with the community. We wish him all the best.

### LWV forum a chance to become informed

Wednesday night in the building which used to house Friendly restaurant in Plymouth, the three candidates for the 36th District state House of Representatives will gather for an informational forum.

Sponsored by the League of Women Voters of Northville/Plymouth/Canton and cosponsored by *The Northville Record*, the forum is an ideal opportunity to learn about the candidates and issues in this important race. The winner of the Aug. 6 Republican primary (no Democrat is running) will take the place in Lansing vacated by Gerald Law, who resigned his seat to become Plymouth

Township supervisor.

Maybe we don't really need to emphasize the importance of the election; it should be obvious. The person elected two weeks from tomorrow will be Northville's voice in Lansing on everything from property tax reform to school finance to state-returned racetrack taxes.

This newspaper is doing, and will continue to do, the best job possible to inform voters on the candidates for this and any other public office. But there's no substitute for seeing and hearing for yourself, and Wednesday's forum is the chance to do just that.

### A lesson the state could learn



A Lansing debate over welfare "vending" brought back two conversations about poor folks:

● An Oakland County politico once took me around a "south end" neighborhood and sketched the locals' biographies. This one couldn't hold on to a job; this one to a spouse; that one frittered away money. "A neighborhood of losers," the politico said.

● A copy desk colleague told why he moved his family out of the south end to one of Westland's nicer neighborhoods. "Back there, they're all losers," he said. The difference wasn't so much income as it was "luck." Everything turned out badly in the old neighborhood, fairly well in Westland.

The point, relative to welfare vending, is that there are two groups of clients.

One is temporarily down and out — hubby skips out, and the wife and kids need state help until they build a new life.

The other group has multiple problems — loss of a job; obesity; inability to budget money; drinking; health problems; unsavory appearance; inability to handle money; cranky personality; blotchy skin. In short, they're chronic losers.

"Vending" is the practice in which the state Department of Social Services writes a rent check directly to the landlord for a welfare client.

State Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, would like to end vending. As chair of the Senate Appropriations subcommittee on social services, Geake said halting vending would require poor folks to be self-reliant and less dependent on

government.

Gov. John Engler wanted to end vending, too. It costs the state millions to process those checks and maintain files. Engler would rather pump the money into schools than into DSS administrative help.

At least one welfare rights group agreed with them.

But Engler's DSS chief, Gerald Miller, backed down before the July 1 deadline for halting vending.

One reason was welfare careerists, like Rep. Dave Hollister, D-Lansing. He warned of people winding up homeless.

Landlords probably had more influence. I heard them testify in Geake's subcommittee. Without vending, they said, they would have to camp on welfare tenants' doorsteps the day the check arrived, or else the party store would absorb the state's largesse. Groups of landlords vowed that without "vending" their apartments would be unavailable to DSS clients.

There was another interesting twist in the debate. With DSS vending, landlords could afford to charge substantially lower rents. They were assured their revenue.

But if tenants were trusted to pay on their own, landlords would have to raise rents, and only tenants who could budget would be soaked.

It was a fascinating study in human nature, this whole vending debate. It put Michigan's most liberal politicians and the landlords in one camp, conservatives and welfare recipients in the other.

The two people I cited at the beginning — the Oakland politico and the newsroom colleague — were both liberals, by the way. But their liberalism didn't interfere with their unblinkingly view of human nature.

The Engler administration could learn much from the debate it lost.

# WHAT WE LEARNED FROM THE JULY 7 STORM.

## LOOKING BACK.

It was the worst storm in the 88-year history of Detroit Edison. When the 70 mile-an-hour winds, rain and lightning stopped, more than one in three of our customers was without power. And all of us had learned some unforgettable lessons.

Among the most vivid lessons is the most obvious: Nature at its worst is more than a match for man at his best. Quite simply, when a storm can rip trees apart like inconsequential twigs, power lines are going to go down. Lots of them.

Detroit Edison people can tell you first-hand how destructive this weather front was. Over 5,000 of them worked up to 16-hour days repairing the damage and restoring power. Over a thousand employees who usually work in offices were out guarding power lines to warn people away. Dozens of retirees came in to help with the task. Within 12 hours, we were arranging to get help from other utilities. Crews from Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and Ontario helped with restoration efforts.

During the week, we handled more than 175,000 outage-related phone calls from customers.

When the power went out, many of us learned about how many things electricity does for us. And tragically, we were also reminded of its hazards.

## LOOKING AHEAD.

If any good came of this storm, it told us how important it is to continue our aggressive programs to speed restoration, improve communication with customers, minimize the impact of damage and prevent the damage in the first place.

In the third year of a six-year, \$1.3-billion program aimed at putting us among the most reliable companies in the nation, we're speeding up our tree-trimming, maintenance and reliability construction cycles.

We're building new substations and adding hundreds of new circuits to improve the reliability of our system.

We're training more people on our computerized storm outage analysis system every day. And while NO electrical network could have handled the massive destruction of the July 7 storm, under anything approaching "normal" storm conditions, our outage analysis system can save precious hours and days in restoring power. Because it allows us to localize trouble spots, even down to specific pieces of equipment, like transformers, instead of going out and searching for them.

We're even working on technology that will allow us to turn off power to downed lines remotely.

By the end of the year, we also will have a whole new computerized phone system. One that will work with more speed, and more lines. So customers can get through to report outages more easily and more quickly.

Like you, we hope we never see another storm like this one. But because we learn a little more every time out, if something like this does come again, maybe it will disrupt your life a little bit less. And things will be back to normal a little bit sooner.

### Bargetto rises to the top of the Santa Cruz area

Unique geographical characters, a marine influence and the elevations of the Santa Cruz Mountains combine to yield distinctive wines not duplicated in other California wine regions.

Although virtually all winegrowing in the Santa Cruz Mountains ceased with Prohibition, there were a few local vintners who continued to believe in the future of the region. Two among them were brothers Philip and John Bargetto, emigres from the renowned mountainous winegrowing region of the Piedmont in Italy.

Because of their understanding of the quality of grapes grown in the Santa Cruz Mountains, they decided to establish a winery in the region, in 1933, at the end of Prohibition. By the mid-1940s, American wine consumers had become more knowledgeable about wine. Consequently, in 1946, John Bargetto launched a major winery expansion which was to become the winery's main storage cellar. It is still used today.

The Bargetto family winemaking traditions continued with John's son Lawrence, after whom the winery is named. Through the mid-1960s, the winery was able to produce all its wine from Santa Cruz Mountain vineyards.

Tending mountain vineyards is difficult work and a labor of love. By the late 1970s, the Bargettos realized the mountain grape supply had so diminished that they had to source grapes outside the region. However, by the mid-1980s, new vineyards came into production and the winery returned to its roots with the production of wines with the Santa Cruz Mountain appellation.

Today, the Lawrence J. Bargetto Winery continues to be owned and operated by the Bargetto Family. Limited annual production enables the winery to produce vineyard-designated wines from the unique Santa Cruz Mountain and other select viticultural areas.

Wine selections from Bargetto fall into three tiers. In the lowest tier, with pricing about \$7, are sauvignon blanc and cabernet sauvignon with a California appellation. Priced mid-range, about \$11, are chardonnay and cabernet sauvignon with a "Cypress" designation. These wines are produced from grapes grown in California's Central Coast.

Bargetto's super-premium offerings bear the Santa Cruz Mountain designation and carry a price tag around \$20 for chardonnay, cabernet sauvignon and pinot noir. "It's Bargetto's aim to make elegant wines from mountain-grown fruit," John Bargetto states. "Without special care, mountain grapes can end up as a clumsy, angular pour. We're looking for a generous palate impression from well-extracted fruit. We want the wine to come across rich, finesseful and ageable."

Flavorful fruit wines constitute about 15 percent of Bargetto's production under the Chaucer's label. Among these, the Plum Wine (\$9.75) is fragrant and delicious. Serve it chilled after dinner. The method of producing this wine from Santa Rosa plums has not changed from the original created by John's father Lawrence.

It is produced utilizing whole fruit without the addition of artificial flavorings, concentrates or colorings.

**1989 Bargetto Cypress Chardonnay (\$11)** offers lemony and citrus impressions in the aroma and on the palate. Vanilla accents add an attractive touch. This fruity, crisp, light and appealing chardonnay is perfect for summertime drinking with seafood salads.

**1988 Bargetto Santa Cruz Mountain Chardonnay (\$20)** makes a bold statement and is a perfect accompaniment for lobster with drawn butter. Concentrated and extracted with depthful flavors, its creamy style will match well with any buttery sauce preparation for seafood. ## BURGER BASICS

### How to create the grill of your dreams

Quick. What's the most popular sandwich? Roast beef on an onion roll? Ham and swiss on rye? Pastrami? BLT?

Wrong on all counts. The most popular sandwich is the simple hamburger.

"The hamburger is the most popular sandwich in the country—in the world, really—followed by the hot dog," said Mary Brady, an executive chef, Northville resident, and owner of the soon-to-be-opened Diamond Jim Brady's in the Novi Town Center.

Her family has previously hung the Diamond Jim Brady's name on beer-and-burger pubs in Detroit and Southfield, attracting a large and loyal following at both locations. Their good reputation was built on burgers, and the need for a good burger restaurant prompted the move to Novi.

"That's the big complaint I hear from people," said Brady. "For a lot of people, it's very important to get a good beer and a burger. And there's really no place around here that specializes just in burgers."

And making a good burger doesn't come easily, despite what most backyard grillers may think. Many elements go into a tasty, juicy bur-

ger, and the pitfalls can turn a good burger into a just another unmemorable slider.

The history of the hamburger has been largely unresearched. As near as we can find, it evolved from butchers who needed something to do with their scraps of meat. They ground them up and sold them to minimize waste. Who knew that centuries later hamburger meat would evolve into a way to maximize profits.

By definition, a hamburger is ground meat that has nothing added to it in terms of spices and thickeners. Adding things to the meat makes it a meat loaf.

The first step is finding the right meat. Chef Brady calls for ground chuck. It's leaner than the basic ground beef, but not as lean as ground round.

"Ground chuck is moderately priced, and it's got a real good fat content," said Brady. "It's about an 80-20 mix. That's pretty much what's used in the business."

Some fat watchers would sooner eat ground glass than something with a 20-percent fat content, but Brady insists that the fat is necessary.

"You need that fat for the juiciness," she said. "If you want to use leaner meat, you can

## Butcher case guide

If the variety of ground meat available at the butcher is a mystery to you, don't feel bad. The U.S. Department of Agriculture's standards governing meat labeling are quite complicated. To help you learn the differences, here's the simplified version in plain English (compared to the 19 pages that the USDA uses to identify the differences).

● **HAMBURGER:** Any ground beef with this label may contain up to 30 percent fat. This fat may consist of natural fat attached to the flesh, or it can be "loose" fat from the trimming process.

● **GROUND BEEF:** This is where it gets confusing. The amount of fat allowed under this label may also be 30 percent. The big difference between ground beef and hamburger is that

ground beef can only contain fat that was already attached to the flesh. No fat can be added to bring the ratio up to 30 percent. Thus ground beef usually has less than 30 percent fat.

● **GROUND CHUCK:** This meat is usually lean ground beef bearing 20 percent fat.

● **GROUND ROUND:** This is ground beef containing about 15 percent fat.

● **GROUND SIRLOIN:** This is what most restaurants and some butchers and supermarkets call ground steak. It contains only 10-12 percent fat.

● **GROUND TURKEY AND GROUND CHICKEN:** These products combine both white and dark meat of the fowl, combined with no more than 15 percent fat, usually from the ground skin.

### Essences, extracts can sub for salt

Welcome to Flavorings 101 Part Two. Last week we spoke of herbs, spices, condiments, olives and capers. All are superb additions to sauces, main courses and accompaniments.

However, the American Heart Association cautions about the excessive use of salt. "Adding salt to your food could subtract years from your life. Because in some people, salt contributes to high blood pressure, a condition that increases your risk of heart disease."

The above flavorings are sodium intense. This is not to say that it is bad if they are used instead of salt rather than in conjunction with salt, or in moderation. There are alternatives which we will touch on today. Known as essences or extracts, these extremely aromatic flavoring ingredients are derived from plants, fruits or spices. Most essences and extracts are diluted with alcohol to tone down their strength. Because alcohol evaporated with heat it is preferable, when possible, to add these extracts to cold food. There are over 2,000 essences or abstracts available on the commercial market, most of which are com-

mercially manufactured.

Vanilla and almond extract are the most common. Vanilla is to sweet cooking what salt is to savory cooking. Vanilla is a bean, the pod of a tropical orchid. Pure vanilla extract is expensive, but worth it. The smell, flavor and richness are unsurpassed. The pods are picked while still yellow-green and cured in the sun for up to one year. The whole bean imparts the most flavor. Vanilla extract available in Europe is much more intense than that obtainable in our country. I feel it is worth the expenditure to obtain whole beans for certain things. A good vanilla custard becomes sinful with a whole bean, homemade kahlua is superb (save the bean and soak in alcohol for vanilla extract), and vanilla flavored powdered sugar can be at your finger tips by adding a bean to a jar of 10X sugar. To use a whole bean, slice lengthwise and infuse it in a hot liquid (milk, sugar syrup, poaching liquid) for 30 minutes. Remove and scrape the seeds from the pod and add them back to the liquid. The pod may be rinsed, dried and used again.

Coffee also plays a role as a flavoring in-

gredient. Any recipe or dish labeled "mocha" means coffee. The strength of coffee depends on how it is roasted. A dark roast is best. Coffee flavoring is most popular with desserts. A pungent coffee ice cream is a simple but delectable treat. A basic comfort food.

Some wines, spirits and foods are natural partners. The addition of red or white wines to foods imparts a natural richness in soups, stews or sauces. Wine can impart a remarkable richness when it is simmered with meat or fish. To avoid a winy taste, the wine should be cooked thoroughly. First, the alcohol evaporates and then the wine reduces to a mellow, sublime seasoning. Only use a wine good enough to drink in your cooking. An expensive wine is a waste, but a salty cooking wine is just as much a sin. Red wine gives a greater intensity to foods: sparkling wines impart their flavor only as bubbles are lost with the heat; white wine is most suitable to delicate fish, veal and chicken dishes.

Beer, liquors and cordials play an important role also. Brandy is used to flambe Steak Diane or Crepes Suzette. As the liq-

uor is heated the alcohol boils off and can be ignited. Caution should be given to the ceiling height, hair and draperies before attempting to flame food. Be ready for your smoke alarm to go off. Brandy is traditional for Christmas fruit cakes, rum is slightly sweet and used with fruit combinations and a gin flavored pink grapefruit ice as a palate refresher can not be beat. Cordials, such as green creme de menthe and kahlua, are favored over ice cream or as a blended after-dinner drink. A cordial, because of its sweetness, is superb as a marinade for fresh fruits.

Finally, comes the flavored vinegars. The word vinegar means "sour wine" in French. Since there are so many vinegars available it is important to match the complementary flavors. Cider vinegar is mildly sweet with an apple flavor, red and white wine vinegars are mild and go with most dishes, rice vinegars are mild and sweet with less acid, malt vinegar is a mature barley-malt-caramel mixture and flavored vinegars can run the gambit from herbs to spices to fruits. Experimentation is the key.

#### FRUIT VINEGAR

1 pound ripe berries or fruit

3 cups rice or white vinegar

Soak fruit or berries with vinegar in a sterilized jar for two weeks in a cool place. Shake every other day to infuse flavors. Strain through cheese cloth, add 2 T. sugar and simmer 8 minutes. Pour into sterilized jars, cork or cap, and store in a cool place.

Herbs may be substituted for the above recipe but heat the vinegar before pouring over the herbs. Then follow the same directions as for the fruit vinegar.

# Mexican food on the mild side

Mexican food is very popular in the United States today. However, there are still many people who think all Mexican food is hot and spicy.

It's easy to think that way if you're totally unacquainted with anything but tacos, burritos and other Tex-Mex favorites.

But a visit to Mexico may uncover a lot of false beliefs about Mexico and the Mexican people, as well as the food they eat.

There are crystal-clear waters, coral reefs, giant turtles and tropical fish that will eat from your hand as you swim among them.

There are 80-degree temperatures that are never uncomfortable because of the constant breezes scented by the perfumes of tropical flowers.

There are mariachis in big sombreros, who serenade you wherever you go.

And, believe it or not, there is fantastic food, some of it mild enough to please an Englishman with an ulcer.

The breakfast menu at one restaurant offers eggs with seafood sauce. These proved to be poached eggs on top of tortillas, smothered with creamed shrimp, lobster, crab and scallops.

Another item featured there was "bananas Tabasco." It sounds horrible, but it has nothing to do with the hot sauce.

Tabasco is a county in Mexico, just as is Quintana Roo. Tabasco sauce and bananas Tabasco are both named for that county where they originated.

They have nothing else in common.

On the little island of Isla Mujeres (Island of the Women), visitors are served a delicious turtle soup.

Visitors may find they like cactus, cooked with any kind of meat at all. And there isn't a tomato or hot pepper in it.

But a favorite food is the quesadilla, which in no way resembles those you get here at Taco Bell or Chili's. They are simple to make and are really nothing more than a Mexican version of a grilled cheese sandwich.

### QUESADILLAS (Pronounced Kay-sa-dee-a)

Place a slice of mild, meltable cheese on a flour tortilla. (Provolone, Monterey Jack or Muenster are all very good.) Fold the tortilla once (as you would an omelet). Fry in a small amount of hot shortening or oil in a heavy skillet. Turn over once to brown both sides until the outside is crispy and golden brown and the cheese inside is melted.

These are delicious eaten plain, but they may be served with a salsa, mild or spicy hot, as your own taste dictates.

### SALSA RAPIDA (Quick Sauce)

2 tomatoes peeled and chopped  
1 onion peeled and chopped  
1 clove of garlic, crushed

3 sprigs of fresh parsley, finely chopped  
1/2 teaspoon ground coriander  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
a pinch of marjoram  
a pinch of ground cloves

Mix together and allow to sit at least 1 hour before serving.

### BANANAS TABASCO

These make a delightful dessert or company treat and are really just crepes filled with fried bananas and flamed with rum.

### CREPAS

Makes about 16 pancakes

4 eggs  
1 1/2 cups milk  
1 1/2 cups sifted flour  
1 teaspoon salt  
2 1/2 teaspoons melted butter

Beat eggs and add milk, flour, salt and butter and mix well (I use my blender), using a crepe pan or a small cast-iron frying pan (6-7 inches) which has been well-buttered and heated. Add just enough batter to thinly coat the bottom of the pan (tip the pan to spread it evenly). When lightly brown on one side, turn and brown on the other. Repeat until all the batter is used.

### Filling

6 bananas, peeled and sliced  
1/2 pound butter  
10 tablespoons brown sugar

Melt butter in a skillet. Add sliced bananas and cook for 1 minute, stirring carefully so as not to break the bananas, while sprinkling with the brown sugar.

Cook until butter and brown sugar make a syrup that coats the bananas well. Fill the crepes with the banana mixture and flame with rum. (Tip: Heat the rum to just warm before igniting it.)

Garnish with whipped cream and chopped nuts if desired.

### TURTLE SOUP

3 pounds turtle meat (you may substitute lean beef)  
1 1/2 quarts of water  
2 cups milk  
1/2 cup butter  
1 cup heavy cream  
1 tablespoon flour  
1/2 teaspoon mace  
1/2 teaspoon dry mustard  
Salt and pepper to taste

Boil meat in water until 1/2 of the liquid is gone. Add milk and butter. Remove the meat and allow it to cool. Grind it and return it to the stock. Let it cook down a little more and stir in the flour dissolved in the heavy cream. Add mace, mustard, salt and pepper. Mix well, simmer a few more minutes and serve hot. If you like, you may garnish with parsley, chopped chives and/or croutons.

# Burgers benefit from a variety of add-ons

mix in some ice or use beef stock to give it some juice." A coarse grind of meat is best. Too fine a grind will make for tough meat.

"Too much grinding breaks down the tissues," said Brady. "You should also try not to handle the meat too much because that will make it tougher."

"You'll see the burgers that come prepared in patties. They've been pressed by a machine, but it makes a big difference when you hand-press them."

Machine pressing makes for a tough burger, too. If you want to grind your own meat, be sure to use a grinder, not a food processor. The meat should be as cold as possible when grinding to minimize breaking down the flesh.

By the way, if you want to spice the burgers, it's best to wait until after they've cooked. Adding salt and pepper prior to cooking will draw the fat out of them and dry them out.

Nothing can spoil a backyard barbecue like an overcooked hamburger, but without some care and patience, overcooking is an easy trap to fall into.

To avoid overcooking, heat your burger in two steps. The late Chef James Beard recommended searing on a very high heat first, then reducing the heat to cook the meat to the desired doneness — rare, medium or well-done. Chef Brady concurs.

"You have to sear it first to seal in the juices," said Brady. "The mistake a lot of people make on the grill is not getting a high enough temperature."

When grilling, allow the coals to get good and hot. This takes a minimum of 20 minutes from the time you light them, so plan ahead. Sear the burger once on each side, then either raise the grill or move the burgers away from the center of the flame to allow them to cook.

How do you know when your burger is done? Well, there's the old rule of thumb that too few barbecuers use which says, "When you think it needs a minute or two more, take it off because it's done."

Chef Brady recommends pressing on the middle of the burger with your finger to test for doneness.

"When it's still squishy, it's rare," she said. "The less give it has to it, the more well done it is."

When it comes to toppings, there really aren't many limitations to what will go on a burger. Chances are if you like something off a burger, you'll like it on a burger. Just don't overdo it.

"Putting too much of something on there will take flavor away from the meat," said Brady.

Cheese is, of course, the most popular burger add-on, especially among kids. A recent Gallup poll sponsored by ConAgra found that children aged 3 to 11 chose cheeseburgers as their favorite food 42 percent of the time.

Plain old American cheese is popular because it's convenient, but one of the most popular choices at

## Burger babies just the right size

The following recipes were developed by the American Dairy Association. Taken together, they make a great menu for a kids party.

The small size of the burgers is just right for preschoolers, while older kids can enjoy trying several of the variations.

### CHEESEBURGER BABIES

Yield: 8 small burgers

1 pound lean ground beef  
8 small hamburger buns (2 1/2-inch diameter)  
Assorted cheeses and condiments

Divide ground beef into 8 equal portions; shape into patties 3-inches in diameter. Place patties on grid over medium coals. Grill 6 to 7 minutes for medium or to desired doneness, turning once.

● To broil, arrange patties on rack of broiler pan so surface of meat is 3 to 4 inches from heat. Broil 4 to 6 minutes for medium or to desired doneness, turning once.

**Sail Burger Babies:** Arrange lettuce leaf and small tomato slice on roll bottom; top with burger and pickle slice. Cut a 1 ounce slice of American cheese into quarters to form triangles; insert pretzel stick along one side to form sail. Carefully push bottom of pretzel stick through pickle and into burger. Serve roll top alongside.

**Tex-Mex Burger Babies:** Top burgers with one-half of a 1 ounce slice of Cheddar cheese folded in half 1 minute before end of grilling. Place shredded lettuce and small tomato slice on roll bottom; top with burger, mild taco sauce and crushed corn chips. Cover with roll top.

**Inside-Out Burger Babies:** Divide ground beef into 16 equal portions. Shape each portion into 3-inch diameter patty. Top one patty with one-half of a 1 ounce slice of Mozzarella or American cheese folded in half; top with second patty sealing edges gently with fingers. Repeat with remaining meat and cheese. Grill or broil as directed above. Serve on rolls with catsup and pickles.

### DIPPER'S DELIGHT

6 servings

1 1/4 pounds frozen crinkle cut french fries  
12 cherry tomatoes  
4 ounces snow peas, strings removed, cooked until crisp-tender, chilled  
1/2 large red bell pepper, cut into strips  
3 large carrots, cut into sticks  
Ranchero Dip (recipe follows)  
Choo-Choo Chili Dip (recipe follows)

Prepare french fries according to package directions; arrange in napkin-lined basket. Arrange

vegetables on large platter. Serve with dips.

**Ranchero Dip:** Combine 1/2 cup plain lowfat yogurt, 1/4 cup dairy sour cream and 2 to 3 teaspoons ranch dressing mix. Refrigerate, covered, 1 to 2 hours to allow flavors to blend. Yield: 1/2 cup dip.

**Choo-Choo Chili Dip:** Combine 1/2 cup each dairy sour cream and chili sauce. Refrigerate, covered, 1 to 2 hours to allow flavors to blend. Yield: 1/2 cup dip.

### COOKIES 'N CREAM-WICHES

6 servings

12 graham cracker or chocolate covered graham cracker squares (about 2 1/4 x 2 1/4 inches)

About 1 1/2 cups ice cream OR frozen yogurt, slightly softened

Miniature chocolate morsels or honey crunch wheat germ.

Arrange 6 crackers flat side up on waxed paper. Top each with small scoop ice cream or frozen yogurt (about 1/4 cup). Top with remaining crackers, pressing gently. Use knife to smooth edges of ice cream even with cracker edges. Roll two sides of ice cream in chocolate morsels or wheat germ. Wrap each ice cream sandwich tightly in plastic wrap. Freeze until firm, several hours or overnight.

some nice flavors to burgers, and brie is marvelous, too. Add a slice of mozzarella and a little fresh spaghetti sauce and you have an Italian burger.

If you're cooking a burger and forget to put the cheese on, there's a shortcut to melting it without overcooking the burger. Use the old restaurant trick of dropping an ice cube on or next to the burger, and covering both with a pan lid. This steams the cheese, and

melts it in mere seconds without changing the flavor. Since Southwest style is all the rage in everything from food to furniture, it stands to reason that its influence would extend to hamburgers.

A "California" burger is tasty with thin slices of avocado and a few alfalfa sprouts. Or just spoon on some guacamole or salsa. Grilled or roasted peppers go well, too, and Chef Brady also recommends trying a corn relish on burgers.

Grilled mushrooms go well on burgers, and shiitakes or black forest mushrooms can put a modern curve on this old favorite.

Cole slaw or marinated cucumber salads add a nice crunch to an otherwise soft hamburger, or you can spread on some gourmet mustards to perk up your taste buds.

Stuffing burgers is a fun way to get cheese and vegetables on the patty. Use about two-thirds of the meat you usually would for a patty, then make a depression in the middle with your thumb. Add your ingredients and then seal the hole with the remaining one third of the meat.

Cheese will melt in the middle of a burger, but vegetables will not cook through. You must pre-cook them before use in a stuffed burger.

Another cheeseburger method gaining in popularity is to mix shredded or chunked cheese with the meat when forming the patty. This makes for cheese flavor all the way through.

Believe it or not, you also have options on the kind of bread you serve your burger on. Why flop a good burger on plain old white bread buns when you can try it on an English muffin, a sourdough roll or some flavorful grilled rye?

Any bread should be grilled or toasted before the meat is added. That way the juices won't go through and soak the bun.

Some healthy alternatives to beef — and even red meat — are making inroads into the traditional realm of hamburgers.

Salmon burgers can be made from canned salmon meat mixed with one egg yolk and some breadcrumbs. Lamb is popular, but needs some breadcrumbs added to keep it from drying out. Ground veal is available, too.

Ground turkey makes good burgers as long as you buy the kind freshly ground from a butcher. Brady advises that the ground turkey sold in tubes is often laden with ground up skin and turkey fat, and the same is true of ground chicken.

Finally, if all these suggestions sound good to you, but you can't make enough burgers to try them all, simply make smaller burgers. We've included a kids' recipe for smaller burgers. An adult alternative is to make smaller patties and serve them on halved dinner rolls, each with a different topping.

Like the commercial says, when it comes to hamburgers, sometimes you've gotta break the rules.

## Main dish salad can star at picnic

When you need a break and blue skies and warm sunshine beckon, one of the more pleasurable ways to relax and while away the hours is to have a picnic. Instead of packing sandwiches and the like, opt for a change of pace with a nutritious main dish salad. The salad featured here contains all the necessary ingredients for satisfying summer fare, as well as providing protein, minerals and vitamins. Dessert could be wedges of melon or any other fresh fruit.

### TWO-BEAN GARDEN SALAD

Makes 6 Servings

#### Dressing

1/2 cup olive or salad oil  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
2 tablespoons wine vinegar  
1 teaspoon paprika  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon instant minced garlic  
1/2 teaspoon dry mustard  
1/2 teaspoon sugar  
Dash freshly ground pepper

#### Salad

One 18-ounce can kidney

beans or small white beans

One 19-ounce can garbanzo (chick-peas) beans

4 green onions with 6-inch tops, sliced

1/2 cup chopped celery

1/2 cup finely chopped red or green pepper

2 tablespoons coarsely chopped parsley

One 6 1/2-ounce can tuna, drained

Salad greens

Place dressing ingredients in jar with tight lid; shake well. Allow to stand 30 minutes for flavors to blend. Shake again when ready to use.

Drain beans. Rinse with cold running water; drain well. Combine with onions, celery and pepper. Add dressing and toss thoroughly. Cover and chill. When ready to serve, stir well and spoon into salad bowl lined with greens. Flake tuna and mound in center. If desired, garnish with tomato wedges, onion slices, parsley sprigs or olives.

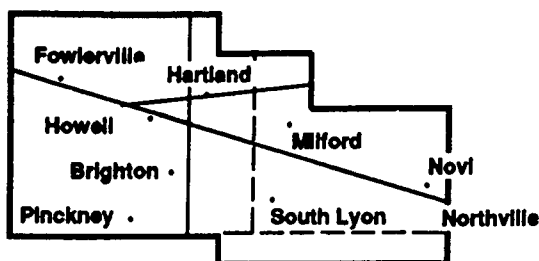

# LeMond shoots for fourth Tour win

The road to a fourth Tour de France championship has been anything but smooth for Greg LeMond. But you might say things are just running true to form for the defending champion from the United States.

First, LeMond blew a tire as he was making a move to take the lead on the second day of the race. Then, he became involved in a war of words over tactics with Italian rider Claudio Chiapucci, who finished second to LeMond last year. However, those problems are nothing compared to the obstacles LeMond faced after 1986, when he became the first American ever to win the world's most famous and challenging bicycle competition.

LeMond's victory made him an instant celebrity, but near tragedy struck the following year when he was wounded in a hunting accident that left serious doubt as to whether he would ever compete again. While turkey hunting on an isolated farm near Sacramento, Calif., LeMond was accidentally shot by his brother-in-law, and he nearly bled to death before help finally arrived. It was two years before LeMond was able to return to the tour, but when

he did, it was in a most dramatic fashion. Trailing by 50 seconds on the final day, LeMond overtook leader Laurent Fignon with a 15-mile sprint to win by a mere eight seconds, by far the closest finish in the 88-year history of the race.

The 30-year-old native of Wayzata, Minn., has had his troubles this year, first with minor injuries, then with fatigue brought on by a rigorous training schedule. He dropped out from the Giro d'Italia earlier this year, and then finished far behind the leaders in the Tour de Switzerland. However, the course through France, which has only four tough mountain stages, favors LeMond, who is at his best on the open road.

This week LeMond is attempting to join Frenchmen Jacques Anquetil and Bernard Hinault and Belgium's Eddy Merckx as the only four-time Tour de France winners, and ABC Sports will be there with same-day coverage when the riders cross the finish line on the Champs Elysees in Paris. The broadcast Sunday, July 28, will mark the climax of the most extensive coverage every by an American television network.

ABC first televised France's premier sporting event in 1989, and has

expanded its coverage every year since. The network has devoted seven telecasts to this year's race, including two segments on ABC's Wide World of Sports, Sunday, prior to the conclusion, ABC will present a one-hour special recapping the events of the 22-day race that began in Lyons, France, July 2.

The Tour de France, which is run in 22 stages, is considered the most grueling of all bicycle races. It stretches over a 2,462-mile course through France and neighboring countries that includes 15 mountain-top passes and four mountaintop finishes. The oldest of all the major international bicycle races, the Tour de France was first run in 1903, but was not held during the years covering the two world wars.

Other cyclists to watch include Chiapucci, Tour du Pont winner Erick Breukink, Rolf Sorensen of Denmark, Russian Djamolidine Abdoujaparov and Canadian Steve Bauer, who wore the polka-dot leader's jersey for nine days in 1990.
