Just say SWAP

Program aids at-risk teenagers, and they love it

Poised on the cusp of adolescence, over 50 sixth-, seventh- and eighth-graders jump, twirl and flap their arms in complete disregard of their established images.

Just when self-consciousness can become all-consuming, these young teenagers "energize" with group activities that leave no room for maintaining their image.

And image-breaking is important for the students involved in SWAP, an area Summer Workshop for Awareness and Prevention. SWAP, in its sixth year, is an alternative to summer camp for "at-risk" youth. The program is targeted to students having problems with academics, family members or peers.

The program's emphasis is on therapy to help kids learn to keep themselves out of trouble down the road.

Kids should leave the program with skills necessary to improving relationships with their family members and friends. The program also helps increase self-esteem of participants and helps students avoid future problems with drug and alcohol dependence.

"We found that 15- and 16-year-olds were coming to school with problems," said program director Lynn Kleiman.

SWAP targets younger students who look like they might be headed in the same direction as the older students who are already in trouble.

Students are recommended to the five-week summer workshop by parents, counselors and peers. If they choose to join SWAP, they will spend their mornings at John Glenn High School in the Wayne-Westland Community School District for five weeks.

Library usage skyrocketing

Use of the Northville Public Library is rising while the library's money supply is holding steady, library Director Patricia Orr said.

Circulation for May and June was 18 percent higher than one year ago. April's circulation was up 22 percent from a year ago, Orr said.

But the number of books available for the increasing number of library users is remaining steady.

Orr said it's "ironic" the library has

been forced to cut the book budget by 20 percent to combat rising costs for keeping the library open, Orr said. She said library usage increases in times of economic uncertainties.

"In tight economic times people start looking around for services," she said.

Program participation also has increased: Summer programs have seen a 100-percent increase in participation this year over last year, Orr said.

She attributes the growth to rising

populations and a higher quality of programs.

Residents of the city and township pay one-half mill in tax to support the library. A proposal to raise the millage rate to build a new library failed last year.

Orr would like to see the issue of a new library come up again soon, but she understands a successful millage would not likely occur until the economy has completely recovered.

"It's difficult when you're not even sure about your job," she said. "Now

is not the appropriate time to ask for new millage."

She said Northville library is not the only local library going through tough economic times. And she is afraid that decreasing availability of books and space will send Northville book readers to other libraries.

If over 7 percent of a library's users are from another municipality, then the library can set up conditions for usage including charging fees and imposing restrictions on users from

Victorian women played key role

Every Monday until the Victorian Festival, Sept. 13-15, the Record will publish an article on one aspect of life during the Victorian era. Today's piece concerns the role of women.

Tracing the role women have played in history is not always easy. And

learning about some of the women who lived in Northville during the Victorian era is even more difficult.

"Women have constituted the most spectacular casualty of traditional history," wrote historian Arthur Schlesinger Jr. in an introduction to the book *Pioneer Women* by Joanna Stratton.

"The forgotten man is nothing to the forgotten woman."

But the historians are not at fault for leaving at least one group of women out of Northville's written history: The Northville Woman's Club was formed in 1892, near the close of the Victorian era.

Northville's population was a mere 2,100, but the club's organization was never covered in *The Northville Record*. The group wanted it that

Polls open tomorrow for House

Voters in the 36th District tomorrow will troop to the polls to choose a successor to former state representative Gerald Law.

Northville Township Supervisor Georgina Goss, Realtor and Plymouth City Commissioner Jerry Vorva, and Ford Motor Co. consultant/Canton Township precinct delegate Deborah Whyman will battle it out in the Aug. 6 Republican primary.

The primary winner can reserve a seat in the state Capitol. Democrats failed to field an opponent for the Aug. 27 general election.

Wayne County Commissioner

Maurice Breen is also listed on the Republican primary ballot. He is running unopposed in both the primary and general election.

Tuesday's vote will determine who fills a state seat vacant since Law resigned in April to assume the Plymouth Township supervisor's job.

Candidates in recent weeks have carved out political niches based on their background and personal philosophies.

Goss is backed by the bulk of the western Wayne County Republican political establishment, including Breen, Law, U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, former county commissioner Susan

Meijer wins OK for gas station

The police chief and the fire chief opposed it. So did a traffic consultant hired by the township.

Three planning commissioners added their names to the list of naysayers.

But Meijer will facilitate a new gas station and convenience store by adding a new Haggerty Road driveway to its Northville Township site, thanks to last Tuesday's 4-3 planning commission vote.

Chairperson Charles DeLand and commissioners Richard Allen, John Leinonen, and Larry Sheehan voted to approve the Grand Rapids-based firm's curb-cut proposal, which will allow only right turns into and out of the new entrance.

Commissioners Pat Wright, Barbara O'Brien and Karen Baja opposed the plan.

The curb cut and new entrance will be constructed approximately 300 feet south of Eight Mile on Haggerty.

Opponents claim the curb cut — a lane to usher traffic into an entrance — will further clog the already congested Eight Mile/Haggerty intersection.

But Meijer argued that the gas station is not viable without the driveway. Supporters on the commission said the store had compromised on other issues, and said the plan should not worsen conditions at the corner.

Township fire and police officials clearly feel the cut will pose problems.

"(The) access drive to Haggerty (is) still a problem," Fire Chief Rick Roselle said in a review letter. "We believe a service drive using an existing Haggerty access would be less hazardous."

Police Chief Chip Snider agreed. "This office still maintains the previously expressed concerns of public safety in regards to the traffic situation and enhanced opportunity for

larceny," he wrote the commission. Commissioner Karen Baja blasted the curb-cut proposal, as well as its supporters on the commission. She said the board should have heeded the advice of consultants and public safety officials who opposed the curb cut.

"It's very improper of us to override their safety concerns," Baja said. "(That's an) extremely dangerous corner already."

"We're opening ourselves up for a horrible situation," she said.

Meijer representative Chuck Payton said the financial viability of the gas station hinged on the curb cut.

"We feel that curb cut (on) Haggerty is essential for the business," he said. "... It should not impede traffic or create a hazard."

Meijer representatives fervently negotiated the curb cut, agreeing to alter the appearance of their proposed gas station, which they intend to build in the north central portion of their sprawling parking lot.

Meijer also agreed to landscaping changes requested by the commission and will drop its large pylon sign in favor of ground signs.

Those offerings suited the township's needs, according to the voting majority.

"Right turns in and out are acceptable to me," DeLand said.

"I have no real problems with rights only," Allen said.

Leinonen said he feared Meijer would face a "torturous" traffic rerouting plan without the curb cut.

The swing vote came from Sheehan, who in May said he opposed the cut.

Sheehan last week called Eight Mile and Haggerty "probably one of the worst intersections in the state," but added: "I think I can accept right turns in and out."

Curb cut approval came down to tradeoffs, in the end.

"I feel they've made an honest effort to satisfy some of our concerns," Allen said.

way; its constitution prohibited publicity for the club.

The club was founded by Lucy Stout Dowd to study and critique literature. Dowd was a writer who was "always championing the role of womanhood," local historian and former *Record* editor Jack Hoffman wrote in his book *Northville — The First 100 Years*.

Dowd is represented in a book of poems by Northville poet Kathleen Ripley Leo. In 1988 Leo published *Town One South*, poems written from the perspective of Northville's founders.

About Dowd, Leo wrote:

"We studied and read, did what we could to hope they'd see our need for more than milking, butter-churning, and making hair knot jewelry."

"To be more than flowers, fragile gardenias or night-blooming cereus. Our beauty hidden until once a year

we bloomed, birthing again."

"How does it all end?"

Women in the club, under Dowd's direction, studied history, religion and world cultures. The club sponsored, and still sponsors, lectures on a variety of topics. But researched studies were not written past the 1930s.

The Woman's Club was not the only organization available for women living in Victorian-era Northville.

A non-denominational, religious New York group came to Northville in 1888. The group was called the King's Daughters and the Order of the King's Daughters when formed. Seven years later a group of young women formed a group of King's Daughters calling themselves Mizpah.

Women in Mizpah did the work the Salvation Army does in many cities today. They fed the poor on holidays, provided Christmas presents for poor

families with children and held cookbook sales. The Mizpah Circle still meets regularly in town.

Many last names still familiar in Northville today can be seen in the club's early records. Mrs. Bruno Freydl, Mrs. W.G. Yerkes and Mrs. Ethelwyn Lapham were early members.

The first names of many of Northville's early women may have been lost forever when they identified themselves in club records only by their husband's name, but they left their mark on the area in other ways.

Hoffman writes that the Northville Woman's Club members, being of a literary persuasion, "probably ignored or pretended to ignore the regular horse-racing events that took place on Dunlap Street."

"For most women it was an uncouth activity," Hoffman wrote.

Residents were encouraged to give prize money to the winners and many of Northville's men did "even though

I'm sure the Northville Woman's club must have found the practice revolting if not sinful," Hoffman wrote.

The attitude of moral superiority held by some women was a result of years of treating women as "passionless" and asexual beings, according to one historian.

Catherine Clinton in *The Other Civil War* said women were conditioned to a pattern of emotional expression that required repression of sexual urges.

Women then used this repression to their own ends, Clinton writes.

"By denying their own sexuality, middle-class matrons hoisted themselves up from the mundane into an unassailable spiritual domain . . . Moral superiority allowed woman a larger voice in family matters."

And some women found superiority and excellence in other areas of life as well. The second president of the Northville Woman's Club deserves mention.

Stowell, in 1896, was a suffragette working with Susan B. Anthony. But it wasn't until 1920, five decades after the suffragist movement began, that women were given the vote with the passage of the Nineteenth Amendment.

She studied the subject anyway, and on his death in 1893 she traveled to Europe to earn a degree.

A sanatorium for tuberculosis victims was established by Lapham when she returned to this country.

She later donated the first books and the building for Northville's Old Library Building, now standing in the Mill Race Historical Village.

Another woman of special interest was Louisa Reed Stowell.

While her brother E. Roscoe Reed edited the *Record*, Stowell worked at the University of Michigan as a prominent microscopist.

Reed was a prohibitionist. His sister also was involved in a battle to change the law.

Many beliefs of earlier feminists (known as advocates of women's rights in the 19th century) were discarded to make the enfranchisement of women more palatable to the mainstream.



City again eyes joint disposal

A Northville City official has again asked Northville Township to consider including the city in a joint refuse collection service, but the township may not have gotten the message.

The city's latest overture follows its apparent severing of potential trash-collection ties with Northville Township. The township recently entered a deal with Browning-Ferris Industries to have the waste giant provide the township with four years worth of free curbside recycling.

Curbside recycling was one of several recycling and refuse collection services on which the township and city sought joint bids earlier this year. Bids were received from five firms, including BFI, Waste Management of Michigan in Southfield, and Painter & Ruthenberg of Inkster.

The two municipalities must provide residents with curbside recycling under the recently enacted Wayne County Solid Waste Plan.

City Mayor Chris Johnson notified Township Supervisor Georgina Goss of the city's intent to seek its own refuse bids in a June 4 letter, writing, "It appears to the City that if the Township proceeds with the BFI agreement, then the joint bids which we have received are no longer valid, and the City will have to seek new bids . . ."

Johnson analyzed the apparent results of the township's agreement with BFI in his letter, and

he speculated that the agreement left the city "with no viable bid for curbside recycling, since the City would have to pay a substantial premium to contract with BFI for that service, and Waste Management has advised that it cannot provide the service to the City alone at the prices which it bid to the City and Township together."

Other potential problems included the fact that if the city entered a joint refuse agreement with the township for the remaining services, the city would have to obtain its own bid for curbside recycling. Johnson surmised that the smaller service area would result in greater expense for city-only curbside recycling.

Johnson wrote that the city would seek joint bids with another municipality to provide an economically feasible service area. Since then, city officials have approached the City of Plymouth about jointly contracting for curbside refuse and recycling services.

But Johnson's letter was not the last word on the possibility of a joint refuse program with Northville Township. City Manager Gary Word informed Abe Munfah of Ayers, Lewis, Norris & May — the planning firm analyzing the waste haulers' bids for the township — that the city still may be interested in working with the township. Munfah passed the word along to the township board at a July 25 study session on the bids. Word said the renewed overtures may not

necessarily indicate renewed cooperation between the two governmental units. "I don't know what the city's position on this is going to be yet," he said.

But a joint city/township program remains a possibility, he said. "The intent will be to go with the township if at all possible."

Word said bids by Painter & Ruthenberg do remain viable for the city despite the township's deal with BFI, and the fact that the Inkster contractor would not be providing the township with curbside recycling.

"Apparently, the contractor is very flexible in this regard," he said. "The feedback I got is that he's willing to accommodate the township's concerns and the city's concerns."

Painter & Ruthenberg, which currently provides the city with commercial and curbside residential collection services through its Midwestern Sanitation subsidiary, is considered the front-runner in the township's search for a waste hauler. The company offered a \$6.08-per-household monthly fee for refuse collection, or \$7.01 including the collection of compostable materials. The bid was well below those tendered by the other waste haulers.

Whatever the city's next move, Word said the time has come for a decision. "Either we go with the low bid or reject the bids and readvertise. I think this has sat for long enough," he said.

The city council plans to readdress the refuse collection issue at its Aug. 19 meeting.

Township awaits official word

The township has adopted a wait-and-see attitude toward the city's latest overtures regarding a joint refuse program, preferring to see a more formal announcement.

City Manager Gary Word informed township engineer Abe Munfah of the city's interest in jointly contracting for curbside refuse collection and

other refuse services, following a letter to the township from Mayor Chris Johnson that seemed to rule out the possibility.

Township Supervisor Georgina Goss, while saying that she did hear of Word's interest in a joint program through the township's engineering consultant, said, "The last official communication I got was the letter from Chris Johnson, where they stated they would like to rebid, per-

haps with the City of Plymouth."

But she saw no problem with a joint program, provided it is in the best interests of both municipalities. "The township has always been ready to work with the city in any way that would be most beneficial . . . If they come back to us, we will be happy to listen."

She said the door to a cooperative program remains open. "We would

never close the door . . . as soon as we have some kind of official notification. The last notification we had was that they were no longer interested."

Goss said that timing is not crucial, despite the township board's intent to award the solid-waste contract to a specific hauler at its meeting this Thursday. "We have a 30-day extension, so we have some time to decide," she said.

Governor signs land-swap bills

State and local officials last week inked a pact to trade Northville Township-controlled prison population caps for a host of perks, including a \$1-for-16-acres land sale.

Gov. John Engler, state Sen. Robert Geake, and Township Supervisor Georgina Goss met at township hall Wednesday to sign a pair of Geake-sponsored bills trumpeted as "win-win" measures for the state and township.

The township agreed to soften prison cap restrictions and allow double-bunking of prisoners at Scott Regional Correctional Facility on Five Mile Road in exchange for a state pledge to permanently close and eventually raze neighboring Phoenix Correctional.

The state will also sell the Phoenix property and additional state land on Seven Mile Road for fair market value, as part of the agreement.

In addition, the state will transfer to the township the deed to 16.5 acres of land sandwiched between Northville Regional Hospital and the Michigan State Police post on Seven Mile.

The deal was initiated last spring as a remedy to

a federal court order to reduce prison overcrowding in Michigan. The state faced daily \$10,000 fines as it searched for a way to close outdated, costly prisons while dealing with increased prison populations.

The state eventually decided to create an all-female facility at Scott, but needed the township's approval to double-bunk its female prisoners. The township agreed, and population caps were boosted from approximately 550 to 850.

"(We) worked together to develop a plan to get Michigan back in control of its prisons," Engler said. "This is a step forward in terms of state and local relations."

"This is a decade-long debacle that's ending," he said.

Goss was happy to play host to the governor's party.

"It's a great pleasure to welcome the governor to Northville . . . to sign this most important bill," she said.

The township has no immediate plans for its new parcel, Goss said, but said the property will be used for "municipal" purposes.

She suggested recreational and senior-citizen

uses for the site, and said nature trails could be developed over the rolling property.

She discounted a suggestion that a new township hall would be constructed on the land.

And the idea of \$1 for the property is not entirely accurate: The township is stuck with a \$4,850 bill for an environmental inspection.

"We ordered an environmental assessment (and told the state) we would not accept the property if there was any ground contamination at all," Goss said.

The township will pay the bill — despite the state's dire straits on the prison-cap issue — because the assessment was "initiated at our request," she said.

"The state felt that in giving us the 16 acres they were going above and beyond what they needed to do," Goss said. "They felt the property was not contaminated, (but) we would not put the residents at risk."

The property was found to be contaminant-free, Goss said.



Man picked up on larceny charge in township

SWAP offers program for students at risk, and the kids say they love it

About 20 percent of the participants come from Northville Public Schools. Wayne-Westland and Livonia public school students also participate.

The cost of the program is covered by the Community Commission on Drug Abuse.

At the beginning of the program,

students were somewhat reluctant to break out of their images. The jumping and twirling energizers done with enthusiasm at the end of the program were ignored in the beginning.

"The first day nobody did anything," Kleiman said. Not everyone participates even after five weeks, but they can't help but learn something, Kleiman said.

"Whatever their level of participation, we know they're soaking something in," she said.

One Northville girl participating in the program said she has learned how to get along a little better with other people.

She chose the program as an alternative to summer school. The program may not help her improve her grades, she said, but SWAP has taught her to communicate better.

"Before I used to try and hide

what was wrong," she said.

Another Northville student said he has no problem with grades. But he expects to use what he has learned in SWAP to get along better with others.

Besides the morning energizers, students participate in art, recreation and group therapy.

Therapists and peer counselors lead the program.

Sara Wolin, a peer counselor from Northville, had a victory during her fourth week of therapy with her group of kids.

"Everyone talked in group today. The first day everyone was like, 'I'm fine. I'm good,'" she said.

Her job was to open the sessions up by sharing her own experiences. Talking in front of a group was not a problem, Wolin said. "I'm a talker." Art therapy is her favorite time in

SWAP. "It's my time to find some serenity, and the kids like it too," she said.

Group leader Lisa Anderson is a 16-year Northville resident working on her master's of social work degree.

She got involved with the program on the recommendation of Northville High School's Student Assistance Program Coordinator, Charlie Stillec.

With all the talking and bonding that goes on in the five-week session, it would be easy to assume that the last day is a little traumatic for the students.

But Kleiman said program organizers are aware of the attachment students form to one another in SWAP. "By the last day we've already cut the cord," she said.

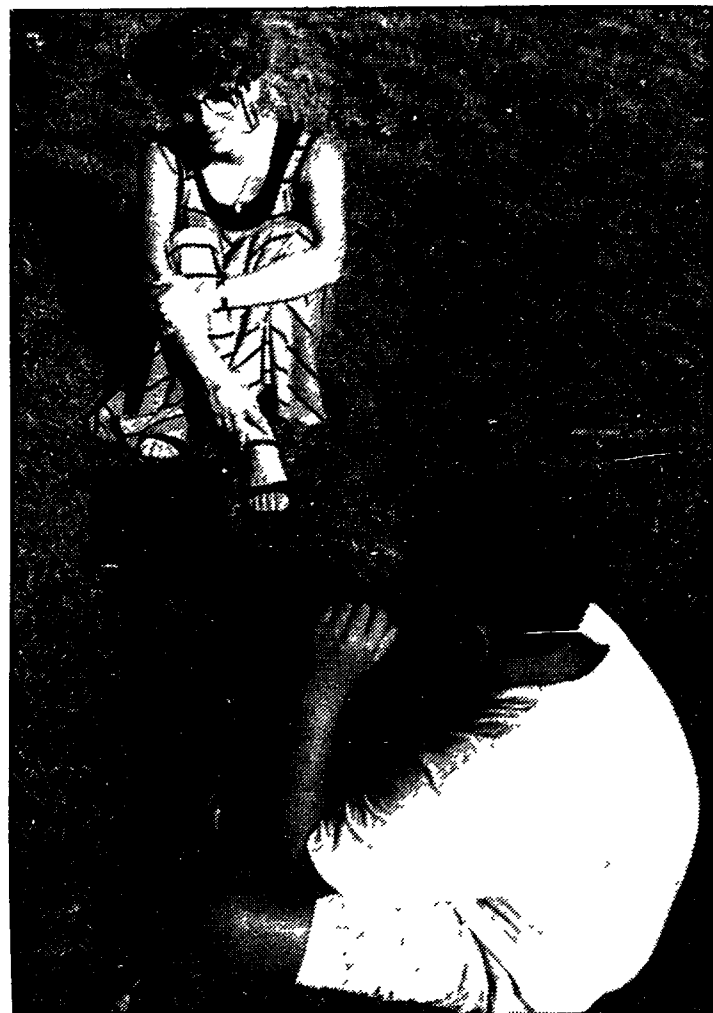
Final group meetings and activities are held before the last day of SWAP. On the last day a swimming party is held.

"The last day is as light as we can make it," Kleiman said.

For those who don't use the library, Orr has a message.

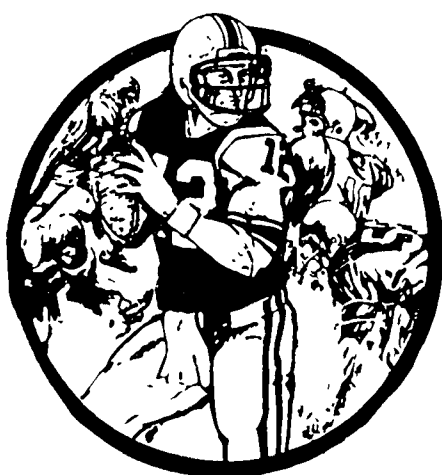
"I tell them they don't know what they're missing," she said.

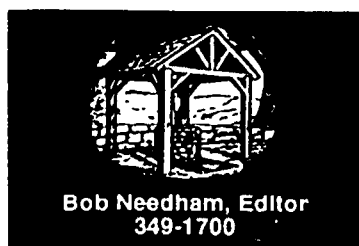

Let's hope latest thaw turns into a full melt

The city's latest renewal of interest in a joint refuse program with Northville Township is a welcome thaw in what has threatened to become an icy relationship between the two municipalities.

But so far, the city and township remain frozen in their positions, unwilling to do more than insist to others that they are willing to work with each other, provided that the other makes the first move.

City officials are still peeved at the township's deal with Browning-Ferris Industries to exchange sewer capacity for free curbside recycling, believing that the deal skewed a proposed joint city/township refuse program. And the deal, worked out in secret without any apparent hint to the city that a major portion of the just-bid joint program would be made null and void, did come as a shock.

But the city's subsequent decision to dump the township for another municipality, summed up in a letter fired off to the township supervisor by Mayor Chris Johnson, was based more on assumption than cold, hard fact.

Johnson noted in the letter that one waste hauler would not stand by its joint bids in light of the township's separate deal for curbside recycling. But the city assumed too soon that the stance of one bidder would represent the stance of all. In subsequent communications, Painter & Ruthenberg — the low bidder and apparent front-runner for the township's solid-waste contract — has pledged to stand by its original bids to both the city and township even without the town-

ship's curbside recyclable collection as part of the package.

While Township Supervisor Georgina Goss waits for an engraved invitation to work with the city, and city officials pout over the township's curbside recycling windfall, the chance for a mutually beneficial joint program is slipping away.

Both sides in this potential agreement need to sit down together and determine whether a joint program is feasible, and in the interest of both sides.

No more hastily-written letters, no more relying on third-party intermediaries to get the message across, the time has come for a mutual understanding, or a parting of the ways. We continue to believe and hope that a mutual understanding is possible and indeed the best option for both sides — particularly when one remembers that there is an expiration date on the township's free recycling deal.

But that can't happen unless the appropriate heads get together, and quickly. If indeed a thaw has begun, let's hope it signals a final end to the winter of uncertainty over Northville's trash collection.

Maybe larger means efficient



My father recently moved to the Los Angeles area after living in Atlanta for four years. When I talked to him last, he said he was glad my youngest sister is getting ready to graduate high school because the district she attends is being consolidated with another.

Kathy will do her senior year at a new school which isn't fully equipped to handle the influx of students. She'll be doing some class time in portables, an idea she's looking forward to as much as she looks forward to peas for dinner. (That's how I know we're related. We both hate peas.)

Dad said that the enrollment numbers at the high school had gotten too low to maintain it. How low I asked, expecting him to say something like a couple hundred.

"Oh, about 1,000 students," he said.

It shocked me to think that in California, they'd close a high school that had about the same number of students as Novi and Northville. I probed further, asking Dad if this was a result of being in a populated metropolitan area like Los Angeles.

No, he said. His new home was in a pretty sparsely populated suburb. Rural and urban districts alike could be consolidated when the enrollment got too low to run the schools efficiently.

When he lived in New Jersey, he was on the local school board for a few years. During his tenure, he reviewed a number of studies that concluded that something around 1,000 students was the minimum enrollment at which a high school could operate efficiently. At that level, the district

could offer the greatest quality and diversity of programs for the fewest taxpayer dollars.

And the efficiency increased algebraically with enrollment. What keeps us from trying to cram 10,000 kids into a high school are things like transportation, logistics, people-management concerns, and of course the psychological impact on the students.

After that conversation, I reflected on the problems we'd been having in the last couple of years in Northville and Novi, and around Michigan in general — funding woes, millage votes, the recapture. More than three-quarters of the high schools in Michigan are below an enrollment level that education experts agree is the *minimum* to operate efficiently.

Is it any wonder, then, that the Michigan taxpayer is being choked to death, and yet the schools come around every couple of years begging for alms just to keep their doors open? Why does Michigan continue to operate in a fashion that other states have long since abandoned?

Granted Michigan is not like New Jersey. In Michigan, they say you're never more than six miles from a body of water. In New Jersey, I think you're never more than six miles from a major freeway. Longer travel distances could keep many Michigan districts from achieving an efficient enrollment level.

But many Western states, California among them, have far greater travel distances than we do. Yet they still manage to fill up their school buildings.

The state board of education is charged with unraveling the school funding mess, and I'm sure the board members have seen the same studies my father has. So let this be food for thought for them. Let's hope the board gives it more consideration than my sister gives to peas.

The Candidates' Views, State House, 36th District

Voters in the 36th state House district will head to the polls tomorrow to choose a successor to former state representative Gerald Law. The three Republican candidates were interviewed by the Record staff, and summaries of some of the responses are compiled here.



GEORGINA GOSS has served as Northville Township supervisor the past five years. Prior to her role as supervisor, she served as township clerk. Goss currently attends Madonna University and expects to earn a bachelor's degree next fall.

Property tax

Goss called property taxes "one of the major issues in people's minds today." An overhaul of the property tax structure must go hand-in-hand with school finance reform, she said. She supports "any type of property tax relief," including Gov. John Engler's proposed 20-percent property tax cut. "Real property tax reform can only come with good, hard work at the state government level," Goss said.

School finance

Goss said school financing "should be the state's number-one priority for the '90s." But education funding is directly tied to property taxes, she said. Residents do not favor property tax cuts at the expense of local school districts, Goss said, but the state must find a way to offer tax relief and maintain equitable school funding. "The only way we can ensure quality throughout the state's school districts is if the state puts more general fund money into the school districts," she said.

Abortion

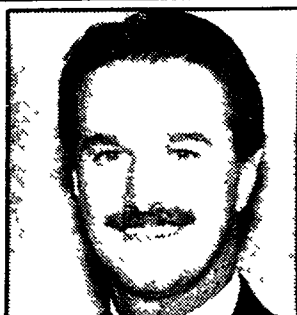
Goss said she "would not personally choose abortion," but does not believe government should be making personal decisions. She said the issue is clouded by a "number of different views." Abortion is not a "black and white issue," Goss said, and promised to look at any abortion-related legislative concern from "both sides." She views herself as taking a "middle road" stance on the issue.

Local issues

Goss said state-run facilities such as Northville Regional Hospital and Scott and Phoenix correctional facilities drain Northville Township services without providing reimbursement revenues. "That makes it a drain on the residents' pocketbooks," she said. Goss said the township has taken steps to change the impact of state facilities on the Northville community by negotiating deals that will permanently close Phoenix Correctional and prompt the sale of excess state lands in Northville Township. Goss also thinks the state should improve security measures at the state hospital. Goss feels the state's failure to promptly return racing revenues to Northville city sets a troublesome precedent.

Other issues

Goss said local government should retain as much control of quality-of-life issues as possible. She lists traffic congestion, development, and natural resources as areas that can be best served by local municipalities. "As a local official, I have been frustrated by the state's ability to come in and do as they choose in so many areas. I think local destiny belongs in local government hands," Goss says her experience would benefit 36th District residents. "I have the ability to work with diverse personalities and groups and bring them to consensus," she said.



JERRY VORVA is a former Plymouth city police officer who was dismissed from the force but then won a wrongful-discharge lawsuit. Vorva later won a seat on the Plymouth City Commission. He currently works as a Realtor and is working toward a degree at Madonna University.

Vorva said 36th District residents repeatedly complain that they cannot afford to pay property taxes on homes they grew up in. He calls the property tax issue "the number-one complaint" he has heard while on the campaign trail. Vorva favors a "multi-faceted" approach to property tax reform/school financing. Such reform could be brought about by receiving taxes "from a variety of places so that it can be more evenly and equitably spread over the population." He also says that property tax reform and school financing are closely-related issues. "We absolutely need to change the way we do our taxing for services that we feel we want," he said.

Vorva said it is time residents realize "that education is our number-one priority." He says "education actually is the solution to most of our problems . . ." whether the problems are of a social or employment/workforce nature. Vorva feels education "report cards" should be given out to teachers, parents, and school administrators; "everyone is going to have to be accountable," he said. Vorva favors an increase in overall education spending, but says individual districts need to comb their budgets to cut fat. Education-based spending could be increased if social service programs were more streamlined and cost-effective, Vorva said.

Vorva said he has always favored "a woman's right to choose" on the abortion issue. He said he "can't imagine" changing that stance "for any reason." Vorva also has gone on record as saying "women need to make these choices."

Vorva said poor planning on the part of township officials is the reason so many government facilities call Northville Township home. "What were they doing?" Vorva asks of township leaders. "Was someone missing out on the boat here?" Vorva said state facilities need to be more evenly spread across the state. He also wonders about evaluation techniques and proper facilities at Northville Regional Hospital. Vorva thinks the state's slow return of racing revenues puts the city police department in a difficult position. "You have a problem here that needs to be resolved," he said. "You need to have money to operate . . ."

Vorva claims Goss is part of a "back room" local political machine that operates mainly behind closed doors. "I'm not part of the inside group," he said. "I owe no allegiance to anyone, except to the taxpayers who elect me." He says he will be accessible to 36th District residents and rails against legislators who work part-time for full-time pay. "We're going to have to have our legislators work for their money . . ." he said. He promises to speak his mind as a freshman legislator and effect change. "I changed politics as usual in the City of Plymouth, and I can change it in the state."



DEBORAH WHYMAN has served as a Republican precinct delegate from Canton township and is making her first run at public office. She works as a systems analyst for a Ford Motor Co. consulting firm and earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Central Michigan University.

Whyman favors a statewide 20-percent property tax cut and says she would support such a proposal from the governor's office. But Whyman points to wasteful government spending as the state's most identifiable ailment. "The state wastes a lot of money. We have a huge pork-barrel list," she said. Whyman favors wide-scale cuts in various government programs over property tax cuts that would adversely affect school financing.

Whyman said school financing is threatened by "foolish government spending." She would eliminate or reduce costly state programs such as a \$500-million program to educate high school dropouts. She also supports cutting welfare benefits and says general assistance should be withheld from those who have not attained a high school degree or are working on a general education degree. She also says schools should tighten their belts and feels money raised through property taxes should stay in the individual districts that generated those funds. "I would not send money from this district outside," she said.

Whyman said recently she considers abortion murder. She said she is "the lone pro-life candidate in the race." Whyman is supported by Right to Life of Michigan and would approve of abortion "only in cases . . . to save the life of the mother." Whyman supports a United States Supreme Court overturn of Roe vs. Wade.

Whyman said she was not well-versed on the issue of state-run facilities in Northville Township. She did not answer questions about the state hospital and the state's failure to promptly return racetrack revenues.

Whyman points to her educational background — she has a master's degree — as a major difference between herself and the other candidates. She also says her business career has taught her budgetary responsibilities. "I can't run a business and not be accountable for the money that is spent," she said. "I've demonstrated . . . an ability to learn and get things done." Whyman also proposes a tax credit for those who would donate to the arts. "I don't think government should be funding the arts," she said.

Heintz, and state Sen. R. Robert Geake. She also lists a wide array of political action committees as financial supporters.

Goss has served the past five years as Northville Township supervisor, and has served 10 years in local government. She attends Madonna

University.

Vorva was elected to the Plymouth City Commission in 1989, shortly after that city dismissed him from the city police department. Vorva and the city later settled a wrongful-dismissal suit with Vorva receiving a \$150,000 settlement.

Vorva is a Realtor who lives in Plymouth and attends Madonna University.

He lists a Realtor PAC and a police union as financial supporters.

The 36th District race is Whyman's first attempt at elected office. The Canton Township resident is a systems analyst for a firm that contracts with Ford Motor Co.

Whyman holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Central Michigan University. Right to Life of Michigan is listed as a significant supporter of the Whyman campaign.

Buckle Up

Avoid the summertime blues

Only logical for food experts to open winery

Like just about every business in the world, the wine industry has its buzz words. It's "in" today to say that Winery XYZ is "stylizing" its wines to harmonize with food.

Doesn't it make sense, then, for a winery to be established by internationally known food professionals?

Founded in 1979, Napa Valley's Lakespring Winery is family-owned by brothers Frank, Harry and Ralph Battat, internationally known food professionals who grew up in San Francisco, about an hour's drive from the winery.

Some wineries, even those bearing the world-renowned Napa Valley appellation, aren't hyped.

They go on vintage after vintage, quietly making super-premium bottlings because they were founded with this principle in mind.

Lakespring Winery is one of these, producing about 18,000 cases annually of cabernet sauvignon, merlot, chardonnay, sauvignon blanc and Elida, a rare dessert pour.

An element of the Lakespring winemaking philosophy is production of 100 percent varietal wines.

"In Bordeaux, complexity is achieved by growing complementary grape varieties on the same property," Frank Battat said.

"In California, this is not necessary. A 100-percent varietal wine gains its complexity if there are multiple sources for the grapes or if the vineyard is sufficiently large to offer multiple microclimates.

"We believe the latter is the case with the 700-acre Yountmill Vineyard, a label-designated source for both Lakespring sauvignon blanc and merlot.

"Both grape varieties need a cool climate. It is my opinion that merlot should not be grown next to cabernet sauvignon. Cabernet needs a much warmer climate."

In essence, Battat is philosophically opposed to vineyard-designated wines, unless the source represents special microclimates and unusual features from a sufficiently large vineyard parcel.

"In California, we've learned how to make wines that can be drunk young," Battat said. "They're delicious without long years of cellaring."

This fits the modern American who has been brought up buying pop and orange juice, opening it and drinking it immediately.

"This concept is the true California wine revolution. Additionally, California wines have the added dimension that, in the main, these wines can also age and do become better with time."

When discussing wines, Battat makes a lot of sense. This is revealed in large measure when he discusses the "fractional composition" production method for chardonnay.

California chardonnays are produced in one of four ways: cold, stainless steel fermentation to preserve fruit; barrel fermentation followed by extended barrel aging *sur lie*; barrel fermentation followed by barrel aging without *sur lie*; and barrel fermentation accompanied by malolactic fermentation.

At Lakespring, all four production methods are used, in approximate 25 percent "fractional" portions.

"We've learned how to better barrel ferment chardonnay keeping ambient temperatures low to preserve fruit," Battat said.

Cooking dinner at home may be the best way to impress a date

Men, consider cooking at home for your date

Fellas, I've got the perfect dinner spot for a romantic evening rendezvous with that special woman you've been dying to get to know better.

It's a place where you'll always get the best table in the house, the lighting is just right, the menu and the wine list always have just what you want and there's no tipping. Best of all, it's close to home.

Yes, if you really want to impress a date, work for her in your own apartment. I've found that this works for two reasons.

First of all, the average young, single female dines out somewhere between 2 and 21 times a week. If she's dating actively, she may never cook for herself (this is called the Jennifer Marlowe Syndrome, and the motto is "I date for a living"). Taking her out to a restaurant is hardly a novelty. She'd be more impressed if you offered to do her laundry.

Secondly, most women believe a man's cooking repertoire consists of spaghetti and anything that comes in a box (which is unfortunately true in all too many cases). If you can show a woman that you know how to use a kitchen appliance other than the microwave, she'll be convinced that you are no longer an adolescent, and truly deserving of her attentions.

I became convinced of the power of the home-cooked date in college. The first time I ever prepared a meal for a female companion, it was a lunch of grilled cheese and

cream of tomato soup.

It wasn't a date. It was just a bitter cold, mid-winter day, and that was what I felt like for lunch. There was enough for two and I was feeling social, so I invited her to join me. Our friendship caught fire from there, and months later, she confided that our grilled-cheese-and-tomato-soup lunch was one of her most romantic memories of the two of us.

Truth be known, it's not that most guys can't cook. They can — they just have to "wanna." And a date with the right woman sure can generate a lot of "wanna."

The key to good menu planning is the KISS method (no pun intended): Keep It Simple, Stupid.

Remember, this meal is supposed to be a casual, friendly, get-to-know-you affair. Things like Coquilles Saint-Jacques and Lobster Newburg are fine if you're on your way to your execution, but most dates have better prospects than that.

For a meal *chez moi*, I've selected and adapted recipes that have short lists of easy-to-find ingredients. For the less common items, and some appropriate accessories, I've noted some local sources.

None of these recipes require any special cooking techniques, either. Oh, you can try to make Saganaki Flaming Cheese if you want, but your "Opal" is likely to become an "Oops" if you're new at this sort of thing. You'll end up ordering pizza as the two of you cuddle in front of the fire which was once your dining room set.

Not that preparing dinner for a date is easy. For one thing, you'll have to clean the apartment. For another

thing, after you've done the appropriate shopping, you'll need to assume the roles of chef, maître d', waiter, wine steward, busboy, disk jockey and conversationalist.

For that last one, you're on your own. For the rest of it, you can take some of the load off yourself in two ways. First, follow a technique that is a fundamental practice of all the world's best chefs: have all of your ingredients out and in front of you (pre-measured if possible) before you start doing any cooking.

Second, time the serving of the hors d'oeuvre or appetizer for your date's arrival. When she arrives, pop open the wine, serve the appetizer and let her slip and nibble while you cook and converse. You can even let her watch if she promises not to kibbittz.

The appetizers included here are practically failsafe. The Epicure Baked Brie on a dish of crackers has a definite European flare. As for the Artichoke Dip, I've never met single soul who didn't like it — even those who claimed not to like artichokes.

If you don't toss a good salad, you might as well toss the whole date. Experience has taught me several rules on the subject of the ultimate dating meal.

First, don't make a big production out of it. Stick to a small number — say four or five — of non-controversial ingredients. Choose things that are easy to like, or easy to discard.

Cooking requires proper equipment

Each cooking class I teach is started with a spiel — the importance of cooking equipment. It is impossible and not enjoyable to cook without the proper pots, pans and knives.

A truly enjoyable afternoon for me is spent wandering about a cook's store or browsing through catalogs.

There is an entire room in my house devoted to cooking equipment. Luckily for me, there is still room to grow. Some items are used maybe once a year, and others haven't been used yet, waiting for just the right moment. Some things are new, others old. But all are treasures.

Several years ago, my grandmother moved from her home of 40 years and I was fortunate enough to inherit all of her gadgets. They included nifty tools made before the food processor or blender. On occasion, I use them. The results are often times better than the new-fangled time-savers. Maybe it's my imagination, maybe not.

Manufacturer's use many different materials to make cookware and utensils. Pots and pans, for instance, are made of aluminum, aluminum alloys, stainless steel, copper and cast iron. Each brings its own properties to the kitchen.

There are several important factors to remember before purchasing new pots and pans.

Number one is to do your research. Go to a store, such as Kitchen Glamour or the Kitchen Watch. It is their business to keep up on the latest equipment. Don't buy on impulse. Spend some time looking, ask questions, pick up the pieces — do they feel good in your hand? Are they too heavy? Can you live with their looks for a long time?

The most beautiful is not necessarily the best.

Cost is a major factor. Most quality merchandise will cost a lot of money, hundreds of dollars in some cases. It is worth the investment if you want to enjoy your cooking to its fullest.

My first set of pans was a 10-piece set that cost \$20. They made it through the first year at college. . . . and I lived in a dorm. You get what you pay for.

Heat distribution is the most important factor to consider.

Copper has the best heat transmissions and distributes it evenly. This, coupled with its good looks, makes it a favorite for display purposes. Extra maintenance is required because it discolors and, due to

its relative softness as a metal, care must be taken to avoid dents and scratches.

Copper also must be lined with stainless steel or another non-porous metal to be used for cooking. Many older pieces were not. Copper is poisonous on its own. And yes, it is very, very expensive.

Aluminum is a relatively good heat conductor and, when coupled with alloys, is very durable. Its price is fairly reasonable. A disadvantage is that it will discolor with age. Aluminum or aluminum alloys are the usual choices for commercial kitchens.

Stainless steel is the worst heat conductor on the market. It is pretty and shiny, but it is also costly and inefficient.

Many manufacturers are adding copper bottoms to their stainless steel pots and pans. The cuisinart line of cookware is one example. Again, it can be considered expensive, but your money will be well spent.

Cast iron is enjoying a revival, and for good reasons. It is economical, practical and proficiently conducts heat. I find myself reaching for my cast iron more and more.

Caution must be given with the care of cast iron. Season your pans well before their first use. Fill with oil and salt and

heat at 250 in the oven for several hours. This will seal all the invisible "holes" and notches and prevent sticking.

Never use soap, simply wipe and dry. Then rub with a paper towel dampened with oil to renew the finish. Allow to air dry on top of the stove before putting away.

The only major disadvantage of cast iron is its weight.

A recently introduced cookware line, Enamel, combines cast iron with an enamel finish. The finish is guaranteed for life.

And, speaking of finishes, many people prefer coated pans to reduce clean-up time. Again, you get what you pay for.

In general, the more expensive coated pans will last the longest. Teflon is out. There are several newer finishes available that are more durable. Be sure to use plastic utensils to prevent scratching.

In a future article, I will write about knives and utensils. I cannot emphasize enough how important good cooking equipment is. Fortunately, I have tried them all. My home kitchen is a hodgepodge of pots and pans. It is not necessary to buy a "set" that matches. Buy a little of each. It's fun.

Catching up on burger histroy

Rick Byrne's recent article on burgers was very enlightening and informative.

The history of burgers is somewhat of a mystery. There seems to be little information available. Thanks to Jan Longone, food historian and owner of the wine and food library in Ann Arbor, I was able to put together these facts.

Hamburgers are not indigenous to America. They are named after a city in Germany — Hamburg. The originals were pounded steaks, not ground meat.

The first time a "hamburger" showed up on a menu was 1836 at Delmonico's Restaurant in New York City. In the 1890s, fried onions were added.

In 1902, in Miss Aurora's cookbook, Hamburg is described as meat put through the grinder twice, with the addition of onion and pepper.

In 1904, the hamburger made its national debut at the St. Louis World's Fair.

The first burger chain emerged in the late '20s — White Castle — and had the most impact on the popularity of America's favorite sandwich.

And in the 1950s, McDonald's came into being. Not being a fast food lover, I go to Dunleavy's Pub N' Grub in Farmington, Casey's in Ann Arbor, and The Speed Boat Inn in Wyandotte when the urge hits.

The Refrigerator Door

LOW-FAT BEEF: GFI America, a Minneapolis-based meat processor, has introduced SmartMeat, beef which it says has less saturated fat, total fat, cholesterol and calories than grain-fed beef. The company says it uses solid muscle meat from selected lean cattle, then makes it tender and flavorful through a process called Vacu-Marble. GRILLED BEEF: A recipe folder from the Meat Board Test Kitchens offers guidelines for marinating and grilling beef. "Marinate and Grill Beef Recipes" contains a grilling guide for beef chuck steaks and three complementary marinades.

The flavor of economical beef chuck cuts such as top blade, chuck eye and shoulder blade steaks can be enhanced with marinades. Recipes include Hot 'n Spicy Beef Steaks, Caribbean Style Steak and Beef and Plum Kabobs.

Second, make it colorful. Someone once said the way to make a run-of-the-mill green salad into the best you've ever eaten is to chop up some red bell peppers in it.

Third, mix your lettuces. Mixing equal portions of crisp, crunchy iceberg with one of the leafier varieties (green leaf, red leaf, Bibb, escarole, spinach) gives a nice blend of textures.

Fourth, make sure you cut the lettuce and all other ingredients into bite-size pieces. It's early in the meal, and neither of you wants to commit any embarrassing faux pas.

Try a salad of lettuce, sliced celery, diced cucumber, and diced red peppers. Or you can try my personal favorite of lettuce, julienned yellow peppers, and sliced red onions. It comes out looking like the cover of Prince's "Purple Rain" album.

Or use your own imagination by mixing in black olives, shredded carrots and wedges of tomato. Just remember the KISS rule.

The only thing more lively than the suggested Raspberry Vinaigrette dressing is a good conversation. The difference is that you can't make the conversation ahead of time and refrigerate it.

The main courses are pretty simple, too. Case in point, the Orange Glazed Chicken Nuggets. Just mix up the sauce, spill it on and broil. The Spanish Rice is even easier. Toss all the ingredients in a pot and let the range do the rest. You can test for doneness by tasting. Again, this is a technique used by the world's best chefs.

Of course you can't go wrong with pasta. While this recipe calls for shrimp, you can easily substitute prepared lobster, crabmeat or whatever. If you do use the shrimp, save yourself some trouble by buying the peeled, deveined kind. If the shrimp you buy are precooked, you need only cook until they're heated through.

Garlic bread is a good accompaniment, and easy to make. Buying a jar of minced garlic is handy in this instance. Stir a half teaspoon in a cup of melted butter. Split the bread in half and swab on the butter. Heat it in the broiler or oven for just a couple of minutes. Be careful not to burn it. With pasta on her plate, candles on the table

and Luther Vandross on the CD, your date will melt like a cheese omelet.

The Tomato-Curry Chicken is a pungent, flavorful dish that adapts well to other uses. You can leave out all the sauce ingredients, substitute your favorite spaghetti sauce, add some slices of mozzarella and you have Chicken Parmigian. Then switch veal cutlet for the chicken breast and you have Veal Parmigian.

If your sticking with the original recipe, cook up some brown rice. Start the rice first if you're using the long-cooking kind. It takes about 40 minutes to cook through. Then steam some green beans, served with a lemon wedge and a pat of butter.

As to your choice of beverage, beer can work well with just about any of these dishes. A sauvignon blanc or a decent blush wine will accompany the chicken, while a merlot or chianti classico is more appropriate for the Shrimp Marinara.

Wine, though, is more a matter of preference than anything, so don't rely on my judgement. Skip the grocery store and head straight for a good wine merchant. The Northville Wine Shoppe at 680 Eight Mile Road, Jonna's at 43035 Grand River in Novi and The Vintage Wine Shoppe at 41455 Ten Mile Road are some good local sources.

If you tell the merchant what food you are serving and whom you are serving it for, he'll set you up

with something that will enhance your romantic interlude.

That's why I suggest a simple dessert of pastries from one of the area's bake shops. Besides, if things are going well at this point, who wants to interrupt the conversation to go cook?

When selecting pastry for her, think chocolate. Just trust me on this one. Edward's Caterer, 116 E. Dunlap in Northville, makes some dazzling tarts that can win any heart. Crawford's at 144 Mary Alexander Ct. has a wide selection of everything. In Novi, Maria's at 41652 Ten Mile Road can set you up with more sweet stuff than any dating service.

Cap it off with a fresh-brewed gourmet coffee from the Coffee Beanery in Twelve Oaks Mall.

Finally, if this all seems rather sexist to you, I can assure you that there are plenty of women out there who could burn water without a recipe. They too should be encouraged to try cooking for their dates. After you've tried it, a restaurant just won't seem the same.

Recipes offered for dates at home

RASPBERRY VINAIGRETTE DRESSING

1 cup salad oil
1/2 cup raspberry vinegar
1/2 cup fresh raspberries or strawberries, chopped
1/4 teaspoon orange juice
dash sugar
dash cayenne pepper
dash Lea & Perrin's Worcestershire sauce
salt and pepper to taste

Mix oil, vinegar, berries and orange juice, then add other ingredients, a dash at a time, to suit your taste.

SPICY BAKED BRIE

1 (14 ounce) petit Brie wheel
1/2 cup bottled hot pepper jelly
2 tablespoons blanched sliced almonds

Remove rind from top of Brie. Spread with hot pepper jelly (Great Impressions makes a good one, and is available in most supermarkets). Arrange almonds in a circular pattern over the cheese. Bake at 400 degrees for 10 to 20 minutes, or until center becomes soft. Serve with crackers.

HOT ARTICHOKE DIP

1 can (10 1/2 ounce size) of artichoke hearts packed in water
1 jar (8 ounce size) mayonnaise
1 can (3 ounce size) parmesan cheese

Drain water from artichoke hearts, then mash with a fork. Mix with mayonnaise and cheese until it reaches the consistency of lumpy oatmeal. Spread in a small casserole dish or oven-safe crock and bake at 400 degrees for 12 minutes. Serve with crackers or restaurant-style tortilla chips.

TOMATO-CURRY CHICKEN

1/2 cup all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
4 chicken breast fillets
1/2 cup (1/2 stick) butter or margarine
1 1/2 cups finely chopped onions
3/4 cup finely chopped green peppers
1 1/2 teaspoons curry powder
1 garlic clove, minced
1/2 teaspoon dried thyme, crumbled
2 cups canned stewed tomatoes.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix flour, salt and pepper in a small bowl. Coat chicken fillets with mixture on all sides. Melt butter in heavy large skillet over high heat. Add chicken and cook until browned, about 2 to 3 minutes. Turn chicken over and cook until lightly browned, 1 to 2 minutes. Transfer to a 9-by-13-inch casserole dish.

Reduce heat to medium and add onions, peppers, curry, garlic and thyme to skillet. Cook until onions are soft and golden, stirring occasionally, about 9 minutes. Add

stewed tomatoes, increase heat and bring to boil, scraping up any browned bits with serving spoon.

Spoon sauce over chicken. Bake uncovered until juices run clear when meat is pierced, about 30 minutes. Serve hot.

ORANGE GLAZED CHICKEN NUGGETS

1 1/2 pounds skinless, boneless chicken nuggets
3 tablespoons orange marmalade
3 tablespoons honey
3 teaspoons soy sauce
1 1/2 teaspoons steak sauce

In a small bowl, combine marmalade, honey, soy and steak sauce; mix thoroughly and spread over chicken pieces. Broil about three inches from heat element about three minutes. Turn chicken pieces over, brush with pan juices and broil another two or three minutes. Do not overcook. Serve with pan juices on the side.

SPANISH RICE

1 cup rice
3-4 green onions, chopped
1 green pepper, chopped
2 cups canned tomatoes and juice
1 clove garlic, crushed
1 teaspoon paprika
1 teaspoon soy sauce

Combine all ingredients in a large pot. Cover and bring to a boil. Reduce

heat and simmer over low heat until all liquid is absorbed. Instant white or brown rice works well, and cooks quickly. But if you are a little more experienced you may want to try a long-cooking variety. Experiment with basmati, texmati or whatever sounds good to you. If you use a long-cooking rice, you may want to add a little extra liquid in the form of water or tomato juice.

SHRIMP AND PASTA MARINARA

Cooked pasta for 2
8 ounces cleaned medium shrimp, peeled, deveined and thawed
1/2 cup chopped onion
2 tablespoons chopped green pepper
1 clove garlic, crushed
2 tablespoons cooking oil
1 (8 ounce) can tomato sauce
1/2 can (3 ounces) tomato paste
1/2 cup water
1 teaspoon sugar
1/2 teaspoon basil
1/2 teaspoon oregano
1/2 teaspoon pepper

Cook onion, green pepper and garlic in oil until tender in a 1 quart skillet or soup pot. Add tomato sauce, paste, water and seasonings. Cover and simmer for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add shrimp, and simmer for about 3 minutes longer, or until shrimp are tender. Serve over cooked pasta.

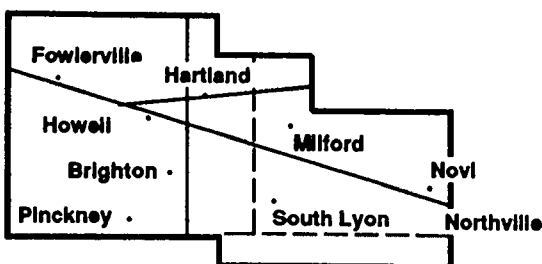

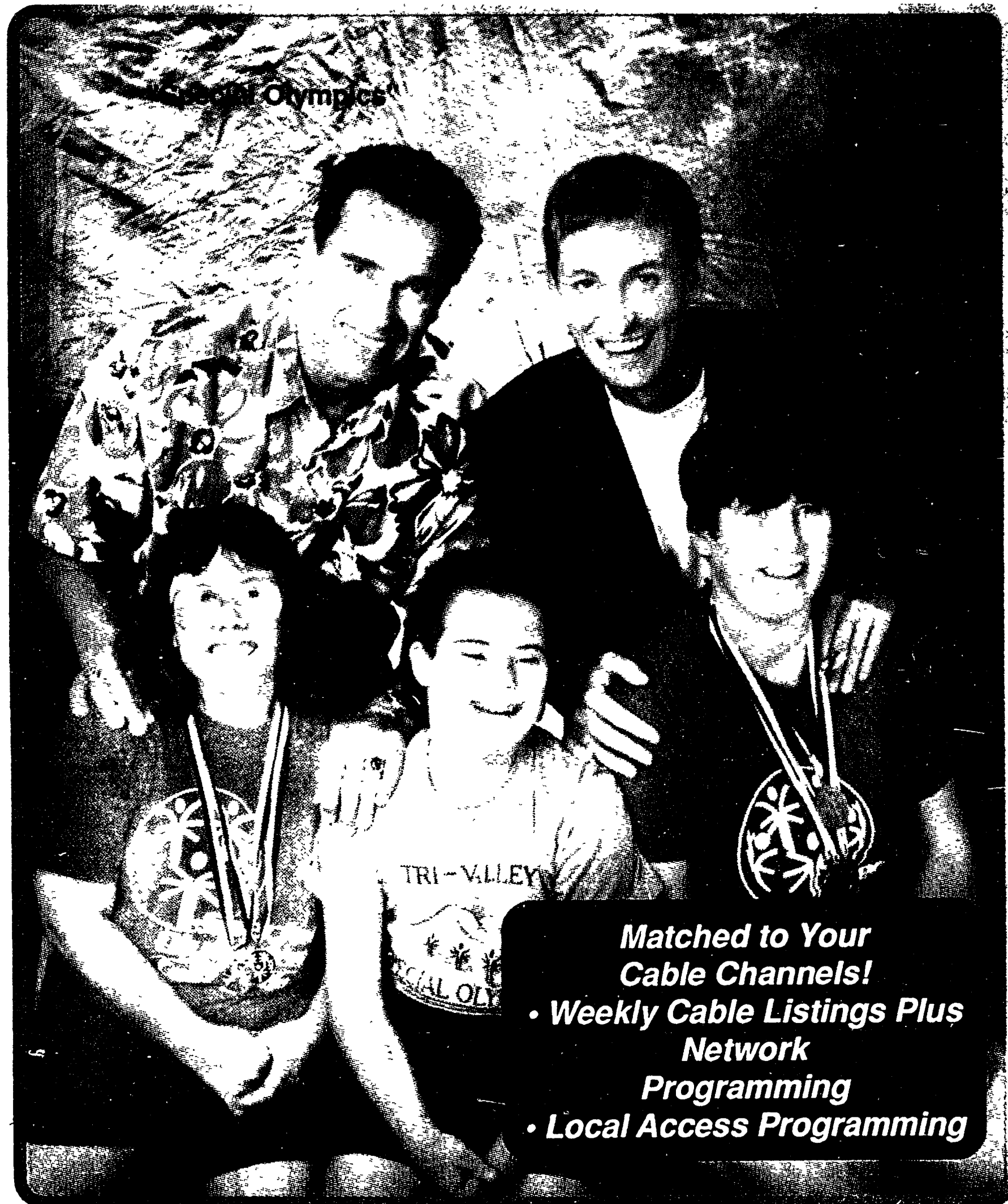
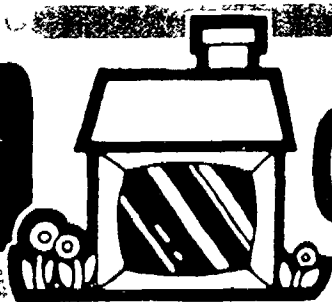

In his spare time, Harris performs magic and is a lifetime member of Hollywood's Magic Castle. He hopes one day to perform on Broadway and is scheduled to star in *New Memories*, an ABC telefilm about a Nevada teenager recovering from a rare head injury.
