



## Commissioners vote down CadyCentre project

The proposed CadyCentre building across from MainCentre suffered a setback last week as the planning commission narrowly rejected Singh Development's request for preliminary site plan approval.

Planners cited several problems with the proposal, including its construction on top of a proposed expanded version of the Cady Street parking deck and the fact that the commission has not seen the latest revisions to the deck.

The commission's rejection came despite Planning Consultant Glenn Bowles' recommendation that preliminary approval be granted. (Bowles has replaced former consultant Don Wortman while the city searches for a new consultant or a new contract with either Wortman or Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May, the Ann Arbor firm that employs Bowles.)

Bowles, in a written petition, cited several problems with Singh's proposal, including the lack of detailed plans for landscaping and sidewalks and the fact that the proposed three-story building likely would

violate the commission's planned building height standards. His report advised against granting final site plan approval. But in his comments to the commission Tuesday night, he recommended that the site plan be granted preliminary approval.

"It does meet the existing height standards and it's slightly under the existing floor area ratio requirement," Bowles said. "And it does provide the necessary parking project."

Singh's presentation began as architect

Greg Presley briefed the commission on the latest design of CadyCentre, explaining how the building, tower and pedestrian bridge across Center Street tie into the expanded parking deck.

The retail office center would be considerably smaller than the MainCentre building to which it would be linked, with 23,836 total square feet available, compared to MainCentre's 94,530 square feet.

The three-story building would also be shorter. MainCentre measures 61 feet from street grade to the highest point on the four-

story building, while CadyCentre would measure 46 feet tall, with the tower 50 feet tall, Presley said.

"My feeling is that this building softens the appearance of the MainCentre building," he said.

Commissioners were divided on that point. Several tried to imagine CadyCentre in connection with the existing MainCentre structure and did not like what they imagined.

Commissioner Rolland Stapleton said he

## Escapee gets three years for assault

Walkaway state hospital patient Terrance Jenkins was sentenced Friday to a minimum three-year prison term, three months to the day after he robbed and assaulted an elderly Northville man.

Wayne County Circuit Court Judge David Kerwin rejected a defense request that Jenkins be re-admitted to Northville Regional Hospital and sentenced the 27-year-old Detroit man to a 3-15-year term in the Michigan Department of Corrections.

"He was (at NRH) at the time and was an escapee," Kerwin said before passing sentence. "That doesn't persuade me (psychiatric incarceration) is in the best interests of Mr. Jenkins or society."

Jenkins last month pleaded guilty to walking away from the state hospital May 9, pulling 73-year-old Paul Diels from his car in the Northville Plaza Mall lot and throwing the man to the ground.

Jenkins then stole Diels' 1983 Ford Fairmont. Diels suffered a shattered left elbow, a broken finger and head injuries in the attack.

Police later found the vehicle damaged and abandoned in Highland Park.

Northville Township police records indicate Jenkins was admitted to the state hospital May 7 and walked away three times in the following two days. Hospital officials admitted a security lapse was to blame for the escape that led to the Diels encounter.

Diels traveled to Detroit for Friday's sentencing. He faced his attacker and then stood — propped by a cane — before the judge.

Diels then asked Kerwin for the chance to speak. "I'm 73-years-old; the only thing I needed was to be mugged by Mr. Jenkins," Diels said. "He deserves to be punished for that."

Kerwin agreed, but said he was unable to grant Wayne County Assistant Prosecutor Marilee Rayner's request that Jenkins pay restitution for Diels' medical and car repair bills.

Jenkins' repeated stays in prison and state hospital facilities left him unable to pay restitution, Kerwin said. A woman who identified herself as Jenkins' mother — she refused to tell a reporter her name — asked the judge for a lenient sentence.

"Terrance has had an illness. He needs more help," she said.

After her statement, the woman walked past Diels and whispered "I'm sorry."

Kerwin told the woman he empathized with her, but said his duty was clear.

"A (73)-year-old man was injured, thrown to the ground and his car stolen and wrecked," he said. "Given the options I have, I'm going to be sentencing your son to prison."

Jenkins also had his chance to speak to the judge. "It was a stupid thing for me to take someone's car," he said. Jenkins then asked Kerwin to sentence with compassion.

Jenkins did not mention the assault on Diels. After the sentencing, Diels said he "felt resentment" when Jenkins walked into the courtroom. He also characterized the sentence as "very light."

Township police Capt. Philip Presnell, who investigated the case and accompanied Diels to circuit court, emphasized the importance of Diels' appearance.

"On a serious case like this, we don't like our citizens to get lost in the shuffle," he said. "It's good for the judge to see and hear from the victim."

## Pig roast party turns to brawl

An annual pig roast at a township residence last week evolved into a fist-throwing, bat-swinging melee that sent at least one party-goer to a hospital emergency room.

Township police expect to charge a 19-year-old Brighton man with felonious assault after partiers and victims identified him as the man who struck at least two people with an aluminum baseball bat.

The Brighton man reportedly was among a large group of uninited guests to attend a keg party Aug. 4 near the Six Mile/Northville Road intersection, police said.

Police said they responded to a fight-in-progress call at approximately 1:30 a.m. Aug. 4. As police neared the scene, they noticed a 1981 Buick speeding from the site.

Police attempted a traffic stop, and as the car slowed to a halt, a young male with blonde hair and no shirt jumped from the back seat, rolled once on the pavement, and ran into a wooded area near the Six Mile Park Party Store, according to police reports.

Three Redford Township teens remained in the car, police said. They later said that no one was with them in the car, and said if someone was in the car, they did not know who it was,

police said.

A 23-year-old Plymouth man approached police while they interviewed the Buick's occupants and asked for medical attention, police said. The man told police he had been hit in the head with a baseball bat.

Township rescue workers and Huron Valley Ambulance staffers treated the man for cuts and other head injuries, police said. He was then transported to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia.

A 23-year-old Northville man then told police he had been beaten by three unknown males who punched and kneed him in the head. A 27-year-old Northville man who hosted the party then told police he had attempted to break up a fight between uninvited guests and had been struck in the back of the head with a baseball bat.

He identified his attacker as a white male with blonde hair, no shirt, and wearing baggy, black pants. He said he also saw the black man hit the Plymouth man with the bat.

As police attempted to sort out the incident, witnesses repeatedly stated that the Brighton man had become "belligerent" and had attempted to "pick fights."

## Earliest businesses supported farmers

Editor's note: Every Monday until the Victorian Festival, Sept. 13-15, the Record will take a look at one aspect of life during the Victorian era. Today's article examines business in Northville's early days.

Northville was settled with the dawn of the Victorian era by ambitious families who wanted to clear and farm the land.

Early reports speculated that the land was too swampy to permit cultivation, but in 1818 a government land office opened in Detroit making the purchase of land in Southeast Michigan possible.

Joseph Purdy Yerkes, whose family name is still familiar to Northville residents today, was 6 when he moved to the area (then called Plymouth) in 1826.

The early pioneers of Plymouth came not to prospect for gold or to speculate in lands or railroad, stocks or bonds, but to make a home.



"To fell the mighty forests, not to make merchandise of the timber, but to clear it out of their way that they might cultivate the soil to procure food for themselves and those dependent on them," Yerkes wrote.

But not everyone farmed for a living.

Northville's first grist mill was built in 1827. Before John Miller built that mill, area farmers had to take their grain to Ann Arbor or an Auburn mill east of Pontiac. Both

## Election signs have outlived welcome

Signs, signs, everywhere political signs. They clog up street corners and define yard lines.

But not for long.

Candidates for the 36th District state representatives seat had up to one week from Tuesday's primary to get their shiny apples and red, white and blue placards out of eyesight, Northville township and city officials said Tuesday.

"Our sign ordinance does regulate this," said Carol Maise, township planning and zoning administrator. "(Candidates) have 48 hours to take them down."

City officials take a bit longer to get itchy over political advertisements. Signs must "be removed five days following an election," said Chuck Altman, zoning ordinance enforcement officer.

"If they don't come down, we call the candidate and say 'come and get your signs,'"

Homeowners often yank yard ads from the ground the minute polls close, if not sooner. But signs posted on corners, near utility poles, and along country roads have a tendency to linger well after the election.

Especially those signs promoting failed candidates.

The Vorva's, Whyman's and Goss' have to come down in Northville, though. If candidates do not pick up their advertisements, "we get after them," Altman said.

Both the city and township pursue enforcement casually at first.

"If they don't come down, we call the candidate and say 'come and get your signs,'" Maise said. "If they don't, we write a violation and proceed in the normal (through the courts) manner."

"They get them down then," she said.

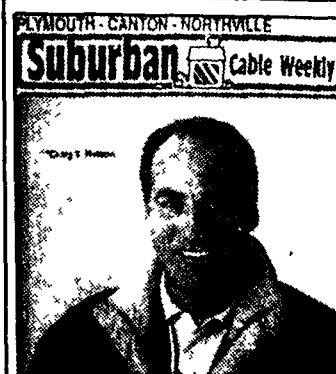
The city writes a letter to tardy sign collectors and can follow the circuitous violation/court route, but reserves the right to take a more pointed approach.

"We can just pick them up and charge (the candidates)," Altman said.

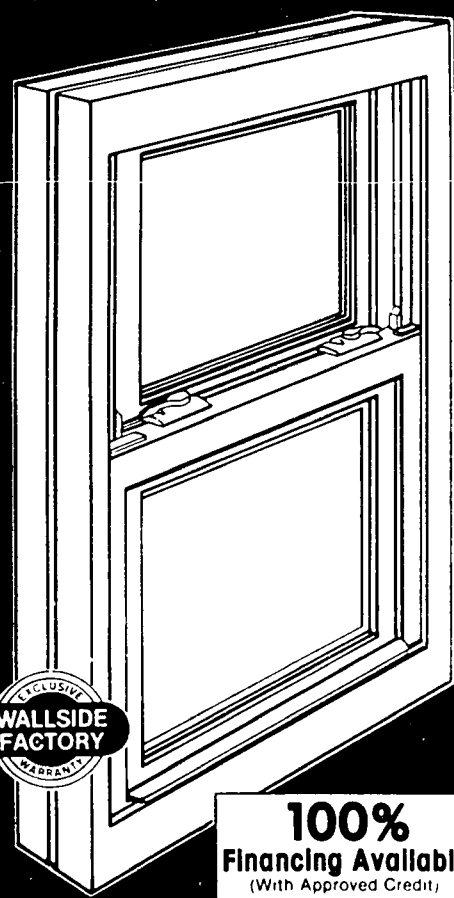

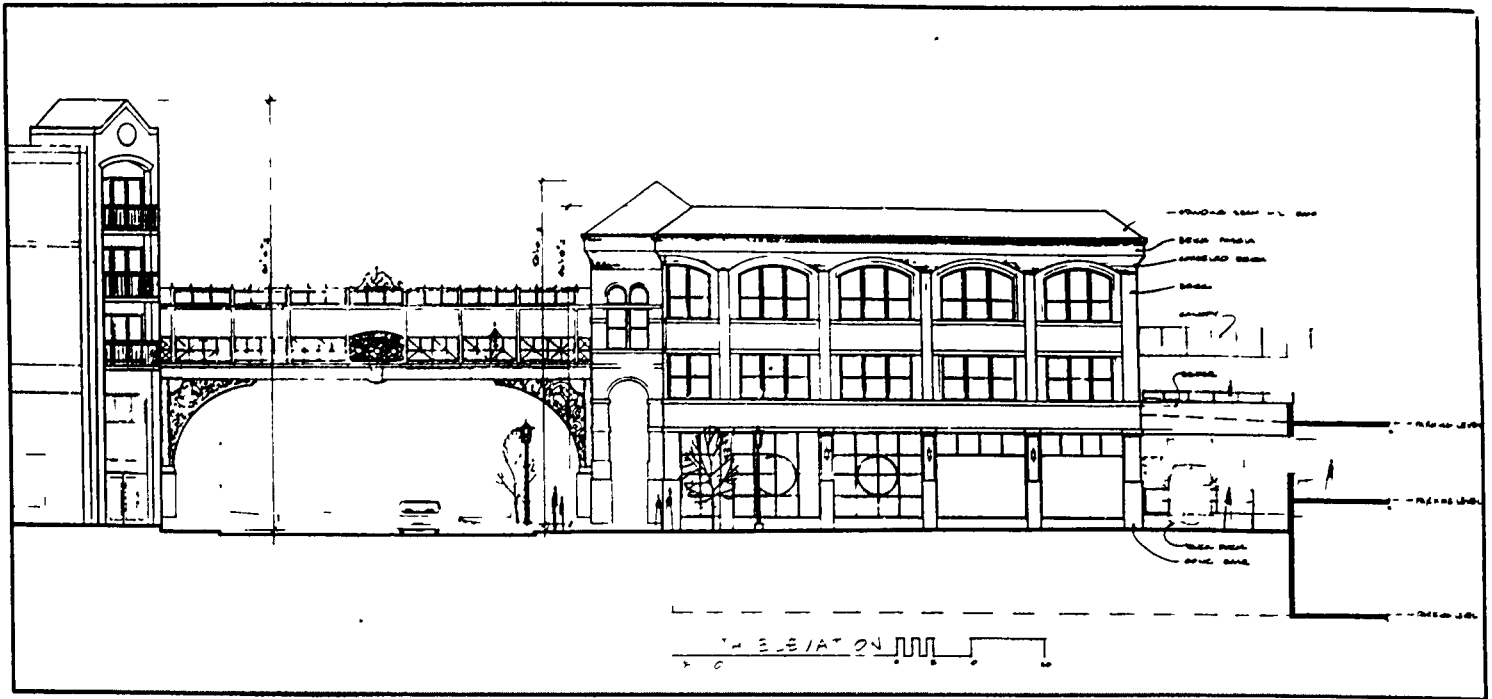

thought the addition of CadyCentre would make driving into the city from the south "almost foreboding."

Fellow Commissioner Steven Ball also feared that the addition of CadyCentre would present an overwhelming vista when combined with Singh's existing building.

"I think that the mass, as we look across here, is truly awful," Ball said. "The MainCentre building is an eyesore, frankly, and it's much too big."

"I would feel much better if this building was stepped down," said Commissioner Mark Cryderman. "It would also bring it in line roughly with the proposed (building height) ordinance."

But Commissioner Chris Gazlay objected to delaying the applicant while the commission implements a tighter set of building height standards, a process in which the planners are currently engaged. "I think that's unfair to the applicant," he

said.

Gazlay also approved of the existing design, saying, "I think it's a delightful thing, and I think it's a good stepping down . . . as soon as you start chopping up a roof line on a three-story building, it looks like garbage."

Gazlay did object to the fact that Singh was still negotiating property trades with the city for the deck, and that the developer did not yet own the entire parcel of land on which CadyCentre would sit.

"I can't approve something that the developer's going to build on city property," he said.

Commissioner David Mielock asked Singh Vice President Michael Kahn to provide the city with more information on how the building fits into its surroundings, including views of the overall area from several different perspectives.

"You're not going to see the building as shown," he noted.

Mielock did like CadyCentre's large windows and noted that a lighter color brick than that on MainCentre might further soften its appearance. "The darker-colored brick on MainCentre makes it look like a big chocolate box," he said.

Stapleton said he could not consider the proposal without knowing the present status of the proposed parking deck, despite assurances by Kahn that the deck's footprint had not changed in its relation to CadyCentre. The commission approved a parking deck plan earlier this year.

City Council Member Jerry Mittman said he thought the commission was overstepping its bounds in considering other aspects of the project besides the building itself. "It's not your function," he said.

Stapleton disagreed, saying he believed that the commission's function was to consider the building site as a whole, and its relationship to ex-

isting buildings.

He moved to submit the plan back to the petitioner in accordance with the consultant's written recommendation, and Dick Wilhelm seconded the motion.

But Commissioner David Totten, serving as acting chairman in John Hardin's absence, urged the commission to consider the application based on the zoning ordinance alone. "If there's nothing in the ordinance that speaks against this, I think we should give preliminary approval, subject to all the conditions we want," he said.

Stapleton's motion to reject still passed by a 5-3 vote, with Mielock, Totten and Kathleen Otton voting against it. Immediately following the vote, Stapleton suggested that the commission amend the evening's agenda to add a discussion of the proposed building height limitations, but the suggestion died amid confusion over the status of the proposed ordinance.

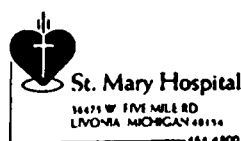

friends were asked to leave the party, a number of fights broke out, witnesses told police.

While township police questioned witnesses, city police stopped a pick-up truck on Hines Drive south of Seven Mile. One of the occupants included a white male with blonde hair and baggy red pants matching the description of the bat-wielding attacker, police said.

One of the victims later positively identified the Brighton man as his assailant, police said.

Police then arrested the Brighton man, who admitted attending the party but said he had no knowledge of a fight and that he had not used a bat.

Police said the man then waived his Miranda rights and issued a written statement.

In the statement, the man wrote: "... When leaving the party, I was confronted (sic) with a per-

son with a bass (sic) ball bat that person swung at me with bass (sic) ball bat and hit me barley (sic). I grabbed (sic) the bat from him after he swung and took the bat away and threw it into the bushes."

Police said the suspect told them he had had "about eight beers" prior to the incident.

The man was lodged in a township police cell until 1:30 that afternoon—after his blood-alcohol level dipped below the legal intoxication limit.

The man was released pending issuance of a felonious assault warrant, police said.

# Chamber addition OK'd by planners

The Northville Community Chamber of Commerce will build an addition onto its 195 S. Main St. building under a proposal approved last week by the city planning commission.

The 20-by-16-foot addition will add a conference room and meeting area to the building.

Architect Greg Presley, who designed the addition, said it will relieve a longstanding shortage of room for chamber members.

"They have been short on storage space for a long, long time, and short on administrative space," he said.

The chamber has been seeking approval of such an addition since January, when a request for approval was granted subject to the chamber obtaining a right-of-way permit from

the Wayne County Road Commission

The proposal in its original incarnation required an expanded parking area, on land owned by the county. But the county refused to grant the chamber permission to add parking unless two large trees were removed, a retaining wall built into a hillside, and the community well moved. "It was just too costly," Presley said.

Last week's proposal differed from the one in January only in that the

commission would reduce occupancy of the new conference room from 33 to 24 people. Under the city's zoning ordinances, that occupancy combined with the existing building's occupancy limit would reduce the number of needed parking spaces to 11. That number can be provided in a restriped version of the existing parking area.

Don Mroz of the chamber of commerce said the 24-person limit would be more than enough for the confer-

ence room, and the building as a whole. "We've never had 24 people in there, other than at chamber Christmas parties, which have been moved to other locations because of that," he said.

The commission approved the plan subject to the addition of sufficient storage space to reduce the usable floor area to the level that would require 11 parking spaces.

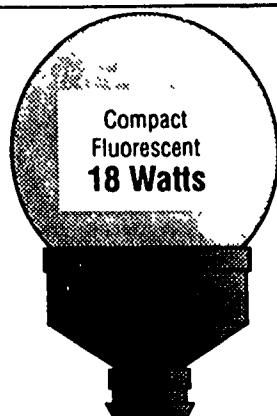
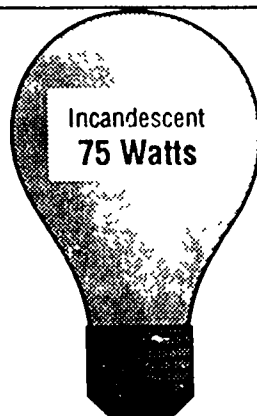
The commission is proceeding with plans for the addition despite a preliminary plan to provide a new chamber of commerce building at the north side of an expanded Cady Street parking deck. Presley explained that the addition is being viewed as a temporary solution, until a more permanent one like the new building is found.

"There's a lot of hurdles left to be crossed for that to happen," he said.

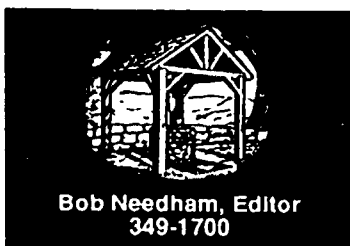

## Investigation's length may create doubts

Wayne County Prosecutor John D. O'Hair's recent clearing of a Pontiac police officer in the fatal shooting of a suspected drug dealer has brought some questions to our minds.

Ronald J. Melnyk, 33, of Westland, was shot to death April 18 in the parking lot of the Northville Meijer store by Pontiac officer Patrick D. Fortin. The shooting occurred after a failed drug bust on Melnyk by members of the Oakland County Narcotics Enforcement Team (NET), including Fortin.

NET had purchased cocaine several times from Melnyk before the incident and planned to buy more that evening. Officers then planned to arrest the Westland man.

The buy was first arranged for the parking lot of the Elias Brothers restaurant at Eight Mile and Haggerty. Melnyk decided to change the venue of the transaction after they met at the restaurant, to the Meijer store lot.

Melnik decided to call the deal off after reaching the Meijer lot. Undercover officers left the scene after he ended the deal.

At that point, other officers attempted to move in and arrest Melnyk. Before police could apprehend the 33-year-old, he got into his car and began to speed out of the lot.

Melnik hit an officer with the car in his desperate attempt to flee. Officers opened fire on Melnyk's vehicle at that point.

A shot from Fortin caught Melnyk in the chest. The Westland man was pronounced dead on arrival at Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills.

An investigation by the Michigan State Police followed. After the completion of the investigation in mid-May, the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office received the state police's report and recommendation in the matter.

Prosecutor John O'Hair ruled July 16, finally, that the shooting of Melnyk was justified.

"It is our conclusion that (Fortin) reasonably believed that his life or the life of others were endangered and, under the

circumstances, was legally justified in using deadly force to protect himself and others," he said in his decision on the case.

We have no quarrel with O'Hair's finding in the matter. The probes by both the state police and the prosecutor's office seem thorough and proper. But we are concerned with the amount of time it took to make the decision.

O'Hair explained last week that his office goes through a "detailed process" before making decisions on prosecution in police shootings. That process includes a separate investigation, reviews of the incident and recommendations by assistant prosecutors.

O'Hair said the case load of the office, coupled with the investigative and review process, are the main reasons for slower decisions in police shootings.

While it's proper and necessary to conduct thorough investigations, we think the public is owed faster decisions in police shootings. Law enforcement must be accountable to the public for its actions to ensure credibility.

When final decisions take months, nearly three in the Melnyk case, that credibility is called into question.

The public may begin to wonder if something is being covered up, if the delays are just a ploy to make people forget about the incident. And the priority of shootings by police also takes on the appearance of occupying a low position on the prosecutor's agenda.

We don't think either of those things are true. But speeding up the process, whether by rearranging schedules, shifting responsibilities or just working a few more hours, would eliminate some public doubts.

But don't be deceived. There are plenty of subdivisions, but not enough neighborhoods.

I looked at some of the literature our friend had saved when he purchased the home. The builder touted the fact that this subdivision has winding boulevards so that you can only see the houses of your immediate neighbors. How can you call something a neighborhood when you can't even see your neighbors?

I look at the house this guy has bought, and I see an island disengaged from his own block and his neighborhood, not to mention the rest of the world. He's been living in his home for six months and the only reason he can name three other homeowners on his block is because their kids come to play in his pool.

Look at the description of the home. The pool is in the back. The garden's in the back. The deck, the family room,

practically the family's entire existence is in the back of the home.

I can remember growing up in my old neighborhood where the homes all had stoops in the front where neighbors would gather to chat and watch the kids. The living room was in the front of the house, and there were large windows (even if the view was only of the street and parked cars).

In my grandmother's neighborhood down in Redford, most of the homes have sizable front porches where people gather in the evenings for a drink, a smoke, a conversation or just to watch the world go by.

Not surprisingly, the area sees almost none of the crime that we get here in Novi. Who's going to vandalize your car or mailbox, or break into your garage when your neighbors are all out on their front porches until 11 p.m.?

Take a look at the old neighborhoods of downtown Northville. Porches. People walking on sidewalks in the evening. There's a strong community feeling there.

How many condominium complexes have you seen around here where the garage door is the most prominent feature on the front of each unit. Sounds familiar doesn't it?

Novi has struggled with its PUD (planned unit development) ordinance for the past several months, with the noble goal of trying to create thriving neighborhoods. The first attempt didn't have the desired effect and it's soon to be pitched. The new PUD ordinance will probably be voted on in a month, and I hope those who are preparing it can remember a couple of things.

Neighborhoods aren't about bricks and mortar and RIBs and C3POs. Neighborhoods are built on people.

If Novi planners are serious about creating neighborhoods — and I think they sincerely are — I'd suggest they to start small. Start with the people. Get the people out of their backyards and back rooms and into the front of the house and out on the front porch.

Maybe then when others think of Novi, they won't think of subdivisions with nice homes. They'll think of neighborhoods and good people.

# He knew all along he'd be a Trooper

Unlike most of his high school peers, Robert Clark knew what he wanted to do with his life. And, for the past dozen years, he has been doing it.

The 36-year-old knew during those teenage years that he wanted to be a Michigan State Police officer. But don't ask him why.

"I knew from high school on what I wanted to do and what department I wanted to work for," Clark said. "But there wasn't one specific reason why."

The Monroe resident is in his second week as assistant post commander at Northville's state police post. Clark replaced recently retired Lt. James Hostutler.

Clark began his career with the state police in 1979. Since then, his duties have ranged from highway patrol to his current assignment.

The lieutenant said his work has been both dangerous and difficult at times. Clark said, however, that he hasn't regretted becoming an officer.

"There are a lot of tedious times, but a lot of rewards," he said. "The rewards outweigh everything else."

After graduating from the state police academy, Clark began work as a trooper at the Niles post. From there, he moved on to the Flat Rock post in 1981.

Clark spent four years at the downriver post. A Lincoln Park native, he said he had a special feeling about working in and near his hometown.

"I wanted to make an impact in my hometown," Clark said. "I wanted to give something back to the area I grew up in."

Clark continued to give something back to the downriver area as an undercover narcotics agent for the state police beginning in 1985. He continued his narcotics work, off and on, until earlier this year.

The 36-year-old said the focus of the undercover assignment was to apprehend mid- to upper-level drug dealers. He said he and his partners were successful in busting many dealers.

Despite the nature of the work, Clark said he felt safe.

"I always felt comfortable doing narcotic deals," he said, "because I knew my surveillance (officers) were taking care of me."

"In narcotics it's always a team," Clark said. "You rely on your partners."

Highway patrol, he said, can actually be more threatening than undercover narcotics dealings.

"It's just as dangerous, if not more so to work the road," Clark added, "because of the uncertainty."

Clark's duties will be a little less

dangerous at the Northville post.

As assistant post commander, his main duties will be day-to-day operations. Administrative work, such as scheduling of troopers, will be included in those duties.

Clark said his immediate goals are to learn the ends and outs of the post and make sure it runs smoothly. He added that he will try to make the troopers jobs a little easier.

"The work atmosphere has to be comfortable and compatible for them," Clark said.

The state police officer said he has met most of the troopers at the post. Clark said he knew several of them from his days as an instructor at the state police academy in Lansing.

Clark added that he has been impressed with the work ethic at the post. He said the first few days have gone well on his job.

Despite his many moves within the state police, Clark said he is happy. But he would like to stick around in Northville for a while.

"I hope to stay," Clark said. "I'm looking forward to the job. It's going to be a challenge."

trips took several days.

Miller's business was located at what today is the southern edge of the Mill Race Historical Village. Because machinery was difficult to obtain, Miller used a boulder he found near Linden and Randolph streets to grind the grain of farmers throughout the region.

An employee, William Hickox, established his own shop just south of the mill. Hickox, known to be a religious fanatic, was a wheelwright.

A blacksmith shop also was located nearby.

Jack Hoffman, in his book *Northville—The First Hundred Years*, credits Miller's grist mill for the development of homes and shops in the northern section of Plymouth Township, today the City of Northville.

Hoffman also credits a later lumber mill with being one of the most important of Northville's early industries.

The J.A. Dubuar Lumber Company was built on the site of what later became the Ford Valve Plant, but Dubuar's company was located in several different places in downtown Northville during its 50-year existence.

Besides processing lumber, the mill manufactured air guns until James Dubuar died in 1919.

He was the principal stockholder and no one wanted to continue the business when he died.

Another early business was a milk condensery, first opened in 1833.

"This became the first plant in America, if not in the world, to successfully condense milk and sell it commercially," according to a written history by Frank Harmon published in the *Record* in 1927 and again in Hoffman's book.

The *Northville Record* is among Northville's the earliest businesses established in Northville that still exist today.

The *Record*, established in 1869, is Wayne County's oldest weekly newspaper.

Irish-born Samuel Harkins Little founded the newspaper when he was 57. No record of his birth exists, and no cemetery in Michigan claims his body.

The year he founded the newspaper, Northville was a bustling town with many well-established businesses, including a wallpaper hanger, a millinery, a barber, a jeweler, a doctor and a grocer.

The list goes on and on showing that most every need of Northville residents in the mid-Victorian era was filled locally.

Issues of the 1880 *Northville Record* are missing. No one knows why Little left, but he is thought to have died in Muskegon at the end of the century.

Other businesses that were begun in Victorian Northville and still exist today include:

- Freydl Cleaners and Men's Wear and Fredyl Women's wear, formerly called Freydl the Tailor. The shop was opened by German-born Bruno Freydl in 1894. A dry cleaning business was added in 1911. The store is still run by his descendants.
- Lampham's Men's Wear was opened in 1910 by Charles Ponsford. The business was closed for five years in 1937 when the daughter of the original owner closed the store. The business was re-established by Ponsford's son Charles Lampham in the 1940s.
- Parmenter's Cider Mill was sold to a dairy company by the fourth generation of the family that founded the business. In 1880, Benajah Aldrich Parmenter established the cider business and began grinding 10,000 bushels of apples a year to make cider, vinegar and apple butter. His son and grandson took their turn running the business. Parmenter's great-grandson, Robert, sold the business to Bodker Dairy Company.

Information for this story was taken from Jack Hoffman's *Northville—The First Hundred Years*. The book is available at the Northville Public Library.

## Sports Briefs

**GOAT FARM ULTRAMARATHON:** Don Gjurasin, 46, of Holland, Ohio and the Toledo Roadrunners, captured first place in the Fifth Annual Goat Farm Ultramarathon with a finishing time of 5 hours, 43 minutes, 47 seconds. The 44-mile race was sponsored by Mr. B's Farm, McNish Sporting Goods and the Novi Parks and Recreation Department.

Forty runners started the race at 6 a.m. on Aug. 4 at Mr. B's Farm and proceeded along the I-275 bike path for 22 miles before returning along the same course. Thirty-nine runners finished the race, and the last to cross the finish line did so at 5:04 p.m.

In 1987, the race was inaugurated as a 40th birthday event for Luther Rackley, who is one of the race directors. Each year, one mile is added to the event.

For Gjurasin, it was a satisfying victory. In '90, he led much of the race only to drop to fourth after suffering a hamstring injury. His next major competition will be the Toledo Roadrunner's 24-hour race in September. Gjurasin is the defending champ.

Previous winners like Al Zeller (1988) of Holt, and Rob Appel (1989) of Lewisburg, Ohio, competed in the race and finished second (6:01.30) and 20th (7:42.35) respectively. Last year's winner, Tom Taylor of Plymouth, and the 1987 champ, Jim Maganis of Southfield, did not run in the race.

The Goat Farm Ultramarathon is one of only two races in Michigan that are longer than the standard marathon distance of 26.2 miles.

Of interest in the '91 race is the growing rivalry between the Michigan (21) and Ohio (12) participants. The winner's trophy has been traded back and forth between the two states and is becoming the object of this rivalry.

Area participants included Bob Robins, 58, of Northville (30th place, time of 8:53.03); Bob Ranta, 59, from Northville (31st, 8:53.03); and Jim Wahl, 44, from Novi (37th, 10:26.45). All are members of the Redford Roadrunners Running Club.

**METRO BEACH BIATHLON:** Northville resident Bill McGuire, 57, finished first in his age division at the Fourth Annual 1991 Metro Beach Biathlon on Aug. 3 at Metro Beach in Harrison Township. McGuire's finishing time of 43:42 placed him first in the men's 55-59 division, and it also set a new record by 14 seconds.

A total of 86 runners finished the event.

**Sequoia Grove makes wine in old-world style**

Sequoia Grove Vineyards is just north of Robert Mondavi Vineyards and Cakebread Cellars along Highway 29 in Napa Valley.

Until the 1987 crush, the winery was housed in a remodeled, century-old barn, nestled among a small stand of towering sequoia trees.

In the early 1970s, owner Jim Allen had been looking for a place to grow grapes and make wine.

He considered Virginia and participated in a grape growing feasibility study in New Mexico. Making wine in New Mexico became a reality, but with grapes shipped from California.

For four years, the winery functioned in the Allen family kitchen, where Allen produced California cabernet sauvignon, chardonnay and zinfandel.

Finally, Allen and his wife, Barbara, decided to be practical and move to California to continue winemaking near a reliable grape source.

Sequoia Grove grows 25 acres of grapes (chardonnay, cabernet sauvignon, merlot and cabernet franc) in the vineyard surrounding the winery.

Wines from this parcel are estate bottled.

Other grapes used to make the wines that have attracted an enthusiastic following are bought. The chardonnay is sourced from the Carneros region and the cabernet from Napa Valley.

Sequoia Grove estate-bottled chardonnays are made in a Montrachet style from 35-year-old vines. They are complex, layered and structured with oak nuances.

"I want a classic, old-world chardonnay," Allen said. "It's important to me that the Sequoia Grove style showcase regional charm."

"I also want the wines to age well. Consequently, malolactic fermentation is avoided."

Sequoia Grove's Carneros appellation designated chardonnays are intentionally crisper and fruitier with earlier approachability.

Acids are higher due to the Carneros climatic influence, and the wine as a whole is tight-knit with upfront fruit and a crisp finish — a perfect accompaniment to shellfish.

"Monstrous wines are not my favorites."

To avoid a big, tannic style, Allen applies his winemaking tools to the Napa-designated cabernet sauvignons to keep them immediately supple and simultaneously complex. They finish with delicacy and depth.

"Estate wines, deserving a separate bottling should be unique."

Sequoia Grove Estate Cabernet Sauvignon is consciously made as a Bordeaux blend (90 percent cabernet sauvignon blended with 10 percent cabernet franc, merlot and petit verdot).

A 21-day extended maceration has given the wine complexity with a delicate finish.

"Aging cabernet in small oak cooperage allows the wine to extract wood tannins that make the finish hard."

"Following fermentation, all Sequoia Grove cabernet spends the first six to eight months in large, neutral oak upright tanks."

"After this, the wine is aged further in small cooperage of which only 10 percent is new oak."

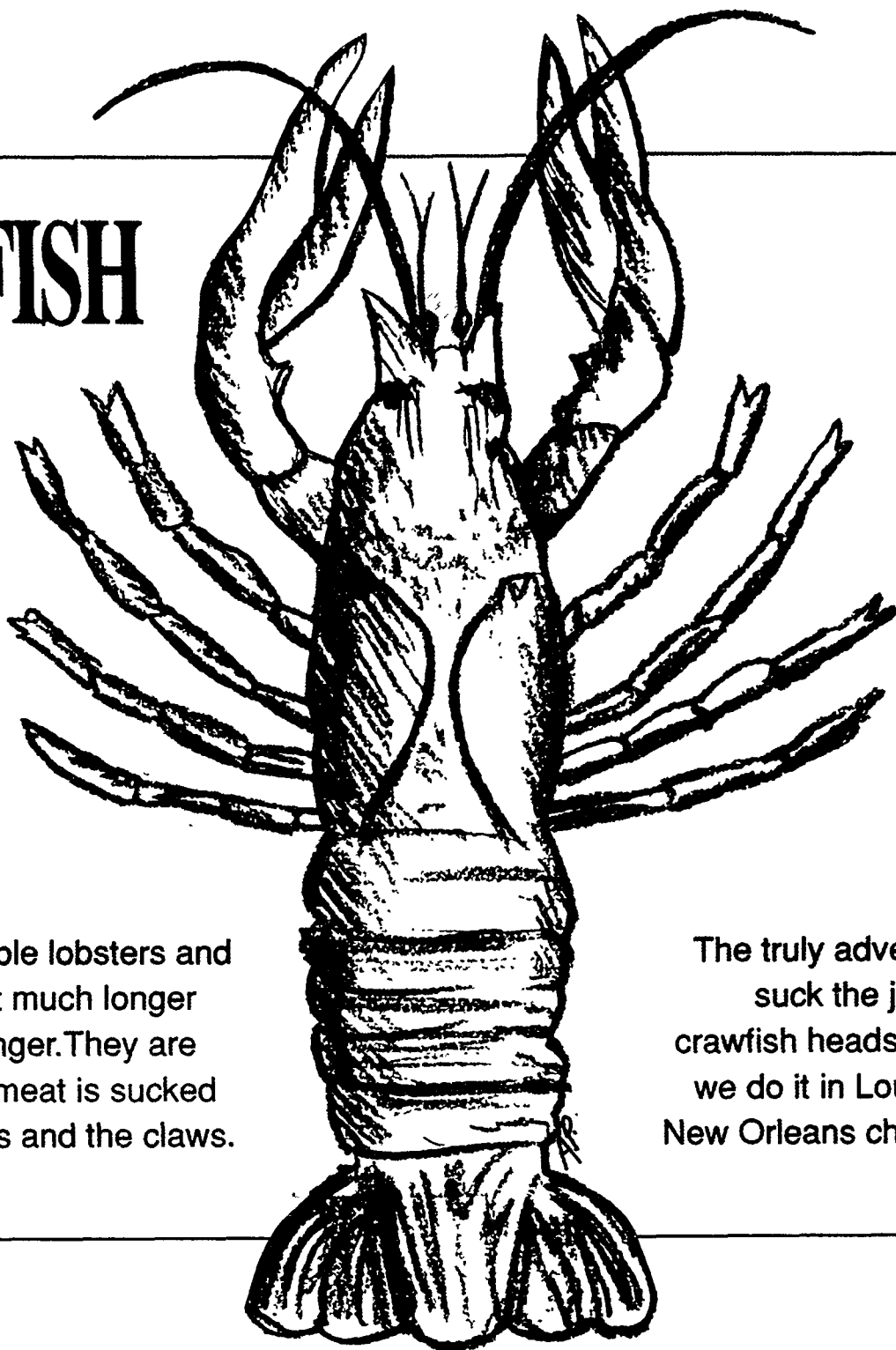
Since Allen was wearing the hats of winemaker, CEO and marketing director at Sequoia Grove, it became necessary to search for a wine marketing company.

**RAGIN' CAJUNS**

**Cajunfest '91 promises good food, good times**

Tourism experts say that the No. 1 reason people go to Louisiana is for food.

This weekend, though, you'll only have to go as far as Northville for the taste of Cajun cooking as Cajunfest '91 hits town.

Cajunfest is a kind of traveling party of food, entertainment and music that has proven a hit in places like Orlando, Fla., Washington, D.C. and Norfolk, Va. Some 20 Cajunfests have taken place throughout the South and East, but the show at Northville Downs Friday, Saturday and Sunday is a first for the Detroit area.

"It's a big time and a good time," says Cy Holley, head of Cajunfest Productions of Metairie, La. "We've done 20 festivals, and at only two did we ever bring food back. One was when we had a torrential rain in St. Louis."

The other time food came back was the result of an astounding success at the most recent festival in Nor-

folk. So many people came that more food had to be ordered. The result was some excess.

In one five-hour period at the Norfolk festival, the Cajun cooks served some 20,000 people.

"That's about one person per second," says Holley. "We just couldn't produce it fast enough. We never expected people would bomb us at one time like that. We cooked up about 4,000 pounds of crawfish."

With a persuasive Southern tinge to his talk, Holley described the menu for the weekend.

The biggest draw is undoubtedly the crawfish, known as crayfish just about everywhere except Louisiana. Holley and his staff of authentic Cajun cooks will prepare a crawfish fettucini that will bring tears to your eyes — and not just from the Cajun spice.

"They're sweeter than shrimp, and have a softer texture than lobster; that's how we describe them," says Holley, who got his start in his family's seafood restaurants. "They're high in nutrients, and low in fat like most fish."

For the neophytes, Holley will be glad to demonstrate how to eat the boiled and spiced crustacean. The meat is sucked out of the tails and claws. A true Cajun will also suck the juice out of the head.

"We like to show people a little bit more and explain a little bit more about Cajun cooking," says Holley. "When we're out on the road everybody misses home, but when I'm home, I miss people bothering me about how to eat them. When I was in Norfolk I showed about 2,000 people how to eat crawfish. Then I went on television shows to demonstrate. We had them sucking the heads."

There's just one hitch with the crawfish. They're only in season from November to May. The Detroit stop for the Cajunfest won't have as much fresh, live crawfish as other shows have had. The majority will be tailmeat prepared from frozen.

Holley hopes to plan next year's Cajunfest for June, when he can get all the fresh crawfish he wants.

**American style gaining respect**

Like any other profession, cooking has its "buzz" words. Classical cooking is as it sounds — cooking using classical procedures and methods that are hundreds of years old. These classical techniques are the basis for modern cooking.

Each nation has its rudimentary foods and recipes. Sausage is indigenous to Germany, sauces to France, tempura to Japan, cacciato to Italian. What then is "American" food?

Until recent years American chefs were not taken seriously by their peers throughout the world. We were looked upon as a nation of fast food, McDonald's and Burger King being our staple diet.

Things are changing. For instance, the American team took the gold cup in Luxembourg last fall. It is fairly unheard of to have an American team come to Europe and take first prize.

Our attitudes are changing. We are go-

ing back to basics. Simple food that tastes good. Just what is "American" cooking?

In nearly three and one half centuries, American cookery has evolved into a cuisine that can be called its own. Its formation is the result of early 19th and 20th century settlers — the English, French, and Dutch.

Native cooking traditions have evolved with strong regional undertones. For example Cajun, which is a result of French Canadian immigrants into Louisiana. Creole cooking differs in that it was developed by rich New Orleans planters and is much more refined than Cajun.

In the last century large waves of immigrants into this country introduced various ethnic cuisines. Now, after 350 years of borrowing, melding, and innovating we are ready to establish a style to call our own.

In addition to the abundant inheritance

of native and foreign dishes, we are fortunate in the quality and bounty of food products available to us. Our meat is considered to be the finest in the world. We have spent time and financial resources to develop our herds. Fruits and vegetables from all over the United States are available nationwide due to superb marketing and transportation.

Our wine industry is growing by leaps and bounds. Game animals are now farm raised and processed assuring superior quality. Fish and seafood from all waters are easily procurable in all areas. In addition to commercially available foods, we rely on our home gardens and food still to be found in the wilds — morels, fiddleheads, nuts and berries. We are blessed with food from all over the world including ingredients from tropical, arctic and sub-tropical regions.

As the saying goes, "You never know

how lucky you are until you're in another country." Last year I traveled to Singapore, Luxembourg and Ireland to compete. We took much of our food, preserved with cryovac packaging.

Singapore imports all of her food. The country is small and very populated so there is little land available for farming. Luxembourg is very much the same. When importing food the price goes up and the quality suffers in many instances. We were able to substitute local produce which was advantageous. Ireland is fairly self sufficient but the variety of food stuffs is limited.

American cooking is etched out of the past. It begins with the Indians and English settlers and rises through the strata of German, Italian, Dutch, Irish, French, and other immigrant influences. When I think of "American" food a farm house meal comes to mind. Fresh and simple. Good flavor. Honest.

**CAESAR SALAD**

The real story of how this salad got its name is somewhat a mystery, but it is believed to have originated in southern California in the 1920s.

2 cloves garlic, peeled  
1 small tin anchovies  
1 egg yolk or coddled egg  
1 teaspoon dry mustard  
¼ cup olive oil  
juice of 1 lemon  
dash wine vinegar  
dash tabasco  
dash Worcestershire  
salt and pepper to taste  
parmesan and croutons

Mash garlic in wooden bowl. Add the anchovies and mash. Add egg and mustard incorporating well. Slowly add the oil to form an emulsion. Add lemon juice, tabasco, Worcestershire, vinegar and salt and pepper. Toss romaine lettuce with dressing. Garnish with croutons and cheese.

# Cajunfest adds spice of life

"The crawfish fettucini will be the talk of the festival," says Holley. "Our other big draw is the shrimp etoufee. Etoufee, in French, means smothered, so it's a smothered shrimp."

The etoufee is cooked slowly with vegetables over a low heat.

Barbecued shrimp will be another favorite, but in spite of the name, it's not cooked over a grill.

"We boil the shrimp with country morning blend, seasonings, lemon juice, thyme, rosemary and Worcestershire," says Holley. "The shrimp are whole, and you peel them yourself. Leaving the shell on holds the flavor in."

"For me, that's the only way to eat shrimp because it's hard to season shrimp. And to this day I've never had shrimp that's too hot."

"We're not going to make it real hot, though. We'll make it hot just enough to keep it exciting."

Blackened fish (either mako or blacktip shark) will be prepared fresh on the grill. For those who fear that blackening is synonymous with burning, fear not. Expertly blackened fish has only a thin, black crispness at the corners. And unlike the carbon you scrape off your morning toast, this black edge has a lively, zesty taste to it.

Redfish was once the prime seafood to blacken among Cajun chefs, but Holley explains that redfish is now protected. It can only be fished by sportsmen. Commercially available redfish is farm-raised, like catfish.

Jambalaya is yet another staple at the festival. A traditional Creole dish, it is rice cooked through with season-

ings and a mild Cajun smoked sausage.

"The smoked sausage is not hot," says Holley. "It just has a rich, smoky flavor. We use the sausage a lot for gumbo and anything we want to season. It's cooked with green peppers, green onions, garlic and the rice."

The spice in jambalaya comes from the rice, which is prepared with Cajun seasoning.

Among the other good time food being brought north from Bourbon Street are Cajun grilled chicken and hot sausage po' boys, heaping side orders of boiled potatoes, corn and Cajun potato chips, and traditional festival favorites like hot dogs and hamburgers.

It's a big production to get all that food out (not to mention all that great Cajun music and entertainment), but well worth it for the uniqueness.

"We used to go to a lot of towns that had Italian festivals, German festivals, Greek festivals," he says. "But nobody had a Cajun festival."

"We just like going to these towns, showing them some things, and then giving a little something back," he adds, noting that a portion of the weekend's proceeds will be donated to the local Muscular Dystrophy Association.

*Cajunfest '91 will begin Friday from 4-9 p.m., and continue Saturday from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Sunday from Noon to 7 p.m. Admission is \$1, and includes music by Joe Young and the Cajun Review, and the Bontemp Roulet Band. There will also be land hermit crab races with the winner receiving a trip to New Orleans, and free pony rides and balloons for children. Soft drinks and beer will also be served.*

## Pasta salad can be made ahead

### PASTA SALAD

- ½ pound elbow macaroni, uncooked
- 1 cup chopped celery
- 1 small cucumber, seeded and sliced in halves
- 6 cherry tomatoes, quartered
- ½ cup thinly sliced radishes
- ½ cup chopped green bell pepper

- ¼ cup sliced green onion
- 4 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
- 1 cup mayonnaise or reduced-calorie mayonnaise
- ¼ cup low-fat milk
- 1 teaspoon prepared mustard
- 1 teaspoon seasoned salt
- 1 teaspoon dillweed
- ¼ teaspoon pepper

Prepare elbow macaroni according to package

directions; drain. In large bowl, combine cooked macaroni, celery, cucumber, tomatoes, radishes, green pepper, onion and hard-cooked eggs.

In a small bowl, blend mayonnaise, low-fat milk, mustard, seasoned salt, dillweed and pepper. Add to salad mixture; toss to coat. Cover; chill thoroughly. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

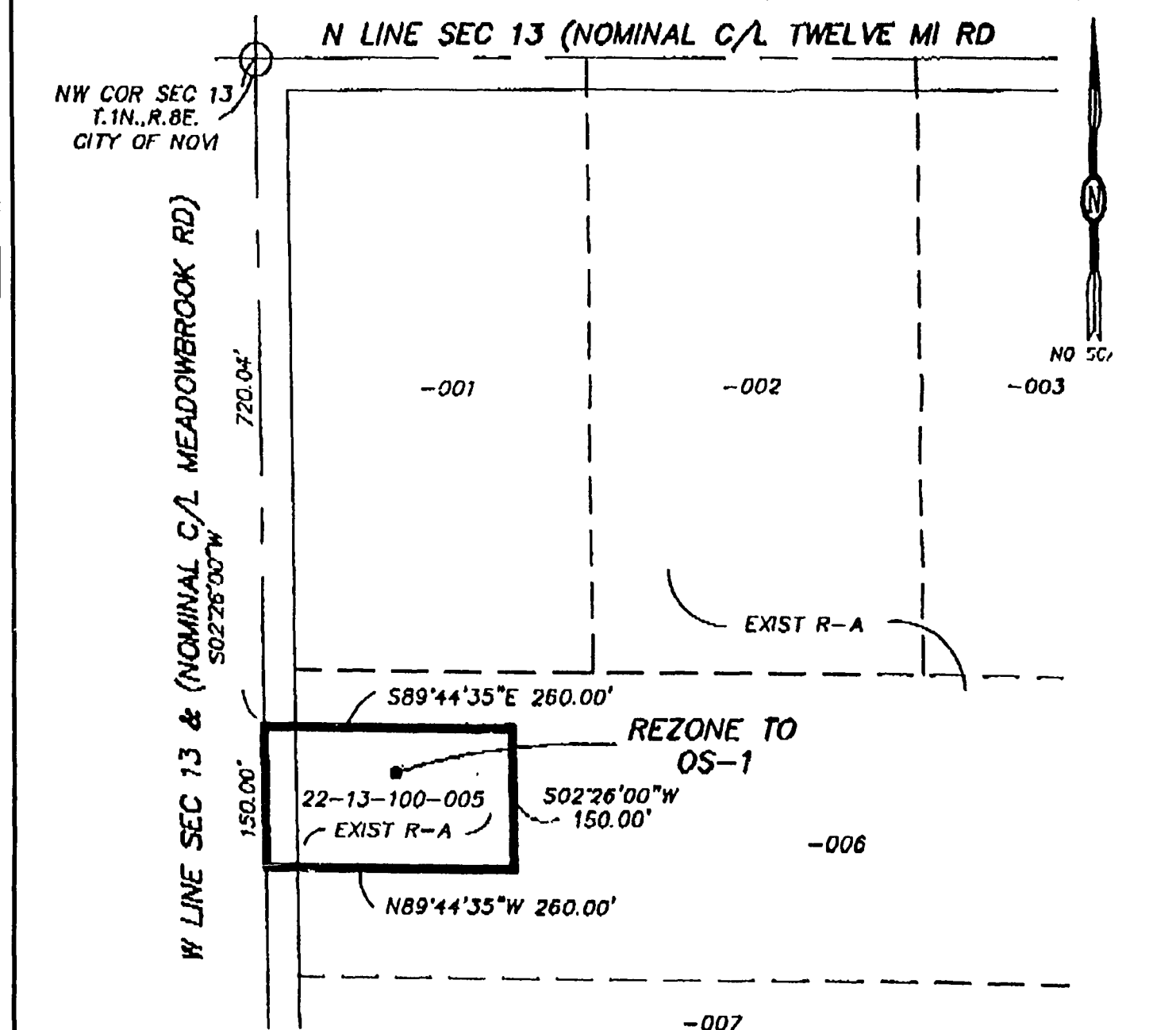

# Breakfast is time for a scone call

There's a new trend dawning on the breakfast front. It's the scone. Sort of a homey cross between the baking powder biscuit and the blueberry muffin, the scone has been a standard in Britain for hundreds of years. But while the Brits traditionally take their scones at teatime in the afternoon, scones are most popular in America as breakfast foods. Dozens of San Diego businesses use scones purchased from the House of Tudor bakery. This wholesale operation, owned by sisters Judy and Cheryl Fellows, deals solely in scones.

The sisters are English emigres who adapted their mother's scone recipe to suit American tastes. Neither of them had a background in baking, but their scones have been a hit on the Southern California scene.

Cheryl described the scone as a semisweet biscuit.

"It's a simple taste often found in grander surroundings," she said, alluding to the scone's position as a staple at elegant high teas.

When the sisters opened their bakery in 1984, they made only one kind of scone, a raisin-studded variety based on the traditional scone with currants. Gradually, Cheryl said, "We got caught up in a whirl of 'let's try something else.'"

They now offer five flavors: blueberry, apple cinnamon, cranberry, chocolate chip and raisin.

Scones are fairly simple to make, Cheryl said, but they need to be watched carefully during baking.

"Basically, you have to bake with the eyes and hands. You can't rely on a clock to tell you when they're done," she said.

Scones should be firm, not hard, and just baked to a golden brown. If overbaked, they probably will bounce, she said with a chuckle.

While the typical scone served in Britain is plain or dotted with currants, the variations are almost endless. In addition to dried, frozen, or fresh fruit, adventurous scone bakers can add shredded coconut, chopped pecans, candied fruit or applesauce.

Cheryl and Judy have experimented with pumpkin, fresh strawberries and apricots, banana nut and pineapple coconut versions. For a more savory scone, they've tried combinations of herbs and shredded cheese.

When mixing scones, remember not to overbeat. The batter should be stirred just until the ingredients are combined and moist. Do not use a food processor, which will ruin the characteristic crumbly biscuit texture of a well-made scone.

While traditional scones often were rolled out and cut with round cookie cutters or sliced into triangles with a knife, there's a quicker way to shape the dough. The bakers at House of Tudor suggest scooping out the dough with an ice cream scoop and placing it on the baking tray, which results in a large, round scone.

For breakfast, high tea and after-school snacks, scones may be served plain or topped with honey, butter or preserves. Judy and Cheryl Fellows suggest presenting them in true English fashion: split, then filled with clotted or whipped cream and fresh strawberries.

Here are some basic scone recipes, and one for a more exotic scone.



To impress families and guests, serve scones British style with berries and cream

## BASIC SCONES

1 1/4 cups sifted all-purpose flour  
2 1/2 teaspoons double-acting baking powder  
1 tablespoon sugar  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/4 cup cold butter  
2 eggs, beaten  
1/2 cup cream  
Yields about 10 scones.  
Preheat oven to 450 F.

Sift together flour, baking powder, sugar and salt into a large bowl. Add cold butter. Cut into these ingredients, until size of small peas, using pastry blender or two knives.

In separate bowl, combine eggs and cream. Make a well in the dry ingredients. Pour eggs and cream into it. Combine with a few swift strokes.

Handle dough as little as possible. Place it on lightly floured board. Pat until 3/4-inch thick. Cut with knife into diamond shapes. Place on lightly greased cookie sheet and bake for about 15 minutes.

## DROP SCONES

2 cups flour  
1 tablespoon baking powder  
1/4 cup sugar  
Pinch of salt  
1/2 cup cold butter  
2 eggs, beaten  
1/2 cup cream  
1/4 cup raisins

Yields 10 to 12 scones.  
Preheat oven to 400 F.

Mix flour, baking powder, sugar, salt and butter together. Beat briefly until dough resembles coarse meal.

In separate bowl, combine eggs and cream and beat together.

Pour egg mixture into flour mixture and blend until dry ingredients are just moistened. Add raisins and mix briefly.

Drop batter in 3-ounce rounds (about half the size of a tennis ball) onto well-greased cookie pan. Bake until tops are golden brown (about 18 to 20 minutes).

Variations: Other ingredients can be substituted for raisins, such as:  
• 1/4 cup of currants or chopped dates  
• 1/4 teaspoon almond extract or 1/2 teaspoon vanilla. Sprinkle top with slivered almonds

• 1 teaspoon cinnamon and 1/4 cup chopped walnuts  
• 1/4 cup blueberries (well-drained). Stir in after other ingredients.

## POPPYSEED CREAM SCONES STUFFED WITH APPLE

### Filling:

1 large apple  
1/4 tablespoon butter, melted  
1 tablespoon sugar  
1 teaspoon vanilla extract  
1/2 teaspoon almond extract

### Scones:

2 cups all-purpose unbleached flour  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
2 1/4 tablespoons sugar  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
4 tablespoons cold butter  
2 large eggs, well beaten  
1/2 cup cream  
1 1/4 tablespoons poppy seeds.

Yields six large scones.

Preheat oven to 375 F. Butter cookie sheet and set aside.

### Filling:

Peel apple, core it and dice into small squares. Squares should be about size of small sugar cubes. You should have about 1 1/2 cups of diced apple.

Toss diced apple with melted butter, sugar and extracts and set aside.

### Scones:

In large mixing bowl, combine flour, baking powder, sugar and salt. Mix well.

Using pastry blender or your fingers, work cold butter into flour mixture until mixture resembles coarse meal.

Combine eggs, cream and poppy seeds. Stir into flour mixture, making heavy sticky ball of dough.

Turn ball of dough out onto lightly floured surface and gently knead for about a minute. Divide into 2 balls, one slightly larger than the other. Take larger ball of dough, dust top lightly with flour, and then, using rolling pin, roll it out into circle about 1/4- to 1/2-inch thick. Cut circle in half, then cut each half into 3 wedges, so that you have 6 pie-shaped wedges of dough.

Transfer each wedge to buttered baking sheet. Cover each with generous amount of apple filling. Roll out other ball of dough. Cut into 6 wedges. Drape these wedges over apple filling, enclosing filling as much as possible.

Bake for 15 minutes until tops of stuffed scones are lightly brown. Serve warm with apple butter or unsalted butter.

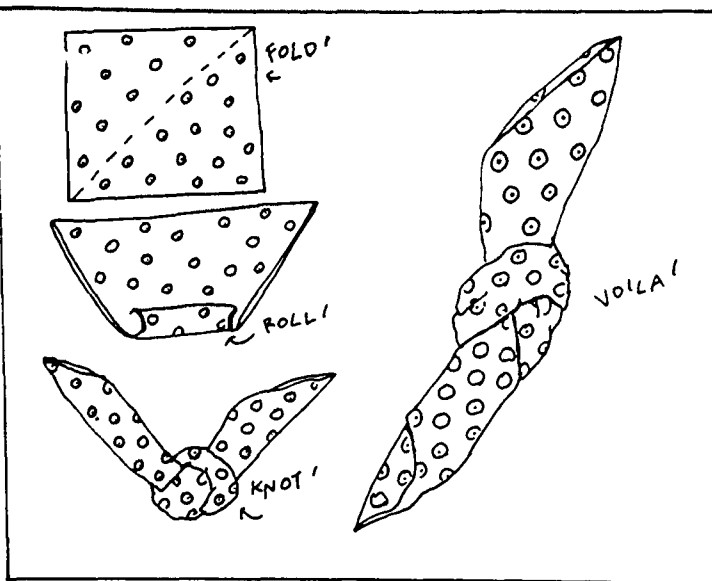

## Tying the knot

### Napkin folding can add elegance or fun to table

For a seemingly frivolous subject, "The Simple Art Of Napkin Folding" (Hearst Books, \$13) is a very practical little book.

Author Linda Hetzer supplies a stain-removal chart that is very complete, even spelling out different methods for attacking washable fabrics and dry-clean-only materials.

More information-loaded chapters illustrate the proper setting of tables as well as how to make our own napkins, napkin rings, table accessories, and even provide instruction on embroidering initials.

Another chart lists an index of the 94 fancy folds with notations of their degree of complexity, size and fabric. And this book is modern enough to include special folds for paper napkins. Now even the simplest occasion can be given a small table face-lift.

Just the way restaurant guidebooks award stars for the excellence of the cuisine, "The Simple Art of Napkin Folding" uses a one- to four-star rating for complexity of folding. This device is a handy guide for beginners.

Some of the one-star designs have an extra notation — quick. So if you can take a paper napkin, quickly give it a festive fold and brighten the table. It certainly seems worth the few seconds to add a small touch of polish to the everyday ritual of dining.

The reproduction of an illustration from a 1639 Italian book graphically demonstrates what an ingenious art napkin folding once was. These simple lengths of fabric were transformed into boats, fish, and even fortresses complete with flying banners. Of course these napkins were adornment for royal tables and the staff probably included one expert who did nothing else but develop such designs.

Although these far less intricate folds still take some practice, there are a number of good reasons to try your hand at it. The visual pleasure is a given, but consider these practical reasons as well. There are two folds specifically designed to hold silverware for a buffet service, thus consolidating into one neat package items

that otherwise would have to be juggled. Other practical folds incorporate place cards or flowers.

Once you master the technique of a truly elaborate Bird-of-Paradise, Diamond or Preening Peacock (yes, all 94 folds have names), you certainly don't want it destroyed in one quick shake by a dinner guest. Instead, use it for the centerpiece, thus saving money on flowers.

You could use a pair of peacocks with a few polished stones between them. Or use a single peacock poised beside a pretty crystal bowl holding a single large bloom.

If you've been to bread parties and have admired the catted basket fashioned out of a napkin, puzzle no more about how it is done. Ditto for the napkin turned into a wine bottle coaster, trivet, place mat, or even a wrap for a less-than-pretty vase with flowers.

Children's Party Folds, a delightful section suggests paper as the material of choice for making animal faces like Brave Bull, Kindly Kitty and Regal Rabbit. These amusing two-star folds would turn any birthday party table into a merry menagerie. Perhaps the birthday honoree could be pressed into service to fold the napkins. Do one or two for a demonstration and let him take over, for better or worse.

The old British and current French word for napkin is serviette. In French, serviette also means towel and, indeed, many kings ago that is just how the piece of cloth was used at the table. When cutlery was first developed, there was not much of it available — only one set of utensils per diner.

Since dinners in those leisurely days consisted of at least a dozen courses (usually more), each guest neatly wiped off the knife and fork on the serviette artfully draped across his arm.

Napkins today play a neater role in protecting the clothes of the diner. They will not protect any less well if they start out with an attractive image.

# Out of the backfield, 'Coach' scores

## Success can't spoil Craig T. Nelson

Success is about to find both coach Hayden Fox and his fiancée, anchorwoman Christine Armstrong. This fall on ABC's "Coach," the fictional Minnesota State Screaming Eagles football team has an unheard of 10-1 season, while Christine is offered a network job that keeps her commuting to New York. The couple, played by Craig T. Nelson and Shelley Fabares, will live together, but their win-win professional situation puts an unexpected strain on their happiness.

As the series enters its fourth season, Nelson is worried success will somehow spoil "Coach," too.

The half-hour comedy started as a mid-season replacement in the spring of 1989, but was put on the bench behind "Chicken Soup," a star vehicle for Jackie Mason. When "Soup" sank early in the 1989-90 season, ABC called Nelson and Fabares, with co-star Jerry Van Dyke, to hold the line against declining ratings in the half-hour after

"Roseanne" on Tuesday nights.

Though it began as the story of a middle-age jock at the helm of a struggling college football team, the show has developed a subtext of emotional growth spurred by the angst of its central character and his relationship with the smart, sophisticated lady in his life. Diamond-in-the-rough Hayden is nothing like the other men Christine has known, while she offers him the warmth and encouragement he's missed along the way.

"She's extraordinarily drawn to him," says Fabares, "and her good sense tells her that this is it, this guy is great." The fact that Hayden faces his own shortcomings without urging from Christine is attractive to her character, Fabares feels.

Nelson is excited by Hayden's journey of self-discovery after a lifetime of emotional blustering.

"For a man who's never examined that and is quite afraid to do so, it can be a tremendous revelation.

"We've been trying to get to that and put it in some sort of form that's funny. These are the things I want to explore in this guy."

More than most stars, Nelson is involved in the development of his

show, which will take several plot turns in the coming season: Daughter Kelly (Clare Carey) gets a divorce; the team's success turns Luther's (Van Dyke) head; and the university hires a new budget-slashing president.

Asked if he considers the show a success, Nelson shifts uneasily in his chair. "There's so much more polish to give this show, and so many more attitudes to explore."

Even Emmy nominations (Nelson has been nominated twice) for the show, which consistently ranks in Nielsen's top 20, don't satisfy him. "That's great, but we can't rest on that."

"I'm scared to death that I love this thing. I loved "Call to Glory," and they took it away. And it broke my heart."

"I'm not grown up enough to say, 'Just love it while it's here.'"

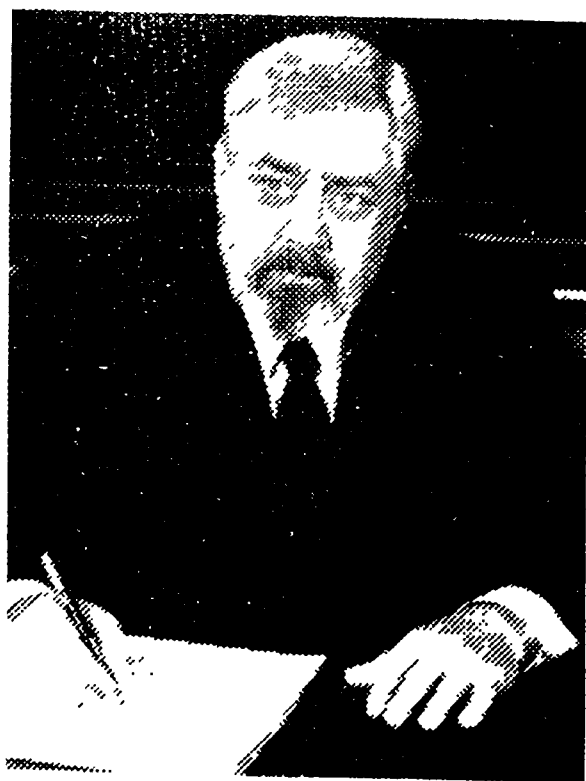
