



Anderson to leave Northville recreation

John Anderson is saying farewell to Northville after six years as its community recreation director.

Anderson, who came to Northville in 1985, said he has accepted an administrative position with the Roseville recreation department.

"It was an opportunity that came up," he said Friday. "The long-term opportunity was considerably better than I anticipated here."

Anderson said his final day in Northville is Sept. 4. He starts work the following day in Roseville.

Anderson said he will serve as an administrative program coordinator in Roseville. He said Roseville boasts a higher department budget than Northville, and said his salary will top his Northville rate.

Anderson's tenure in Northville was spotted by peaks and valleys. A highlight is a project that will not come to fruition until he has left his post, Anderson said.

"The fact that we're very close to moving dirt on the community park (on Beck Road between Five and Six Mile roads) is a big satisfaction," he said. "In 1985, the recreation budget had about a \$40,000 deficit and (now) we're building a park."

Northville's recreation program has "grown by leaps and bounds" since 1985, Anderson said. But community support sometimes has lagged behind program demand.

A 1989 recreation millage defeat in the city was difficult to swallow, Anderson said, but he was heartened with a prior recreation vote in the township.

"One of the best points was one time when the recreation millage was on the (township) ballot at the same time as a police millage," he said. "Ours passed and I think that said something."

Anderson submitted his resignation to the community recreation commission — the group that will seek his successor.

Recreation Supervisor Traci Gottschalk has been appointed acting recreation director. Gottschalk reportedly is a leading candidate to replace Anderson atop the department.

Art Market will highlight Victorian Fest weekend

Gov. John Engler may not think so, but Northville residents believe "you gotta have art."

The city's annual Art Market should provide ample evidence of that attitude. Nearly 50 artists are scheduled to display their works at the juried event Sept. 14-15, one highlight of the Victorian Festival.

Northville Arts Commissioner Michael Key, in charge of this year's Art Market, said the show draws artists from all over the country. Key is heading the market project for the second year in a row and has worked with the project for more than three years.

"We've been doing this for five years now," he explained. "We joined the Victorian Festival, or they joined us, when they started three years ago. We've been jurying artists from all across the states. We have artists from Florida, Arizona, Wisconsin, all over, for this festival."

A judge will appraise the artists' works Saturday morning of the festival, and artists will be named the best in several categories including best work and best design.

The Art Market continues to increase in size and variety each year, despite a minor setback last September when tornados and thunderstorms wreaked havoc with tents on the first day of the Victorian Festival.

"We've grown each year," Key said.

"Last year we had it set for 40 and we had about 32 show up after all the weather problems. This year we were shooting for 50 and we ended up with 47. We had to disallow several works that were listed as crafts, not as fine arts."

The show emphasizes fine arts rather than crafts, Keys said, because crafts are amply represented by other area events.

"We were emphasizing the fine arts part and not the crafts work because Northville has several other craft shows during the year, and this is the only fine art show, per se, that Northville has. So we're stressing that and we're jurying to make sure that we get

Long-standing buildings recall past

Each Monday until the Victorian Festival, Sept. 13-15, the Record will publish an article on some aspect of the Victorian era. Today's story looks at a few local buildings from the time of Queen Victoria, who held the throne of England from 1837 until her death in 1901.

The settling of Northville began with the dawn of the Victorian era. The grandeur and ornamental style of architecture associated with the time are still evident.

The first frame house in Northville was built in 1831 by William Dunlap. That house is gone, as are others built during Northville's Victorian days.

Many buildings were torn down when they fell into ruin, such as the



old stone schoolhouse that was in the center of town until the turn of the century. By then all that was left was the foundation.

A schoolhouse built later, in the 1860s, saw its demise in a fire in 1916. A defective chimney was blamed for the blaze.

Firefighters arrived in time to save the building, but considerable dam-

age was done to the structure because the fire hydrant was frozen. Another historic building was lost to fire in the 1960s when vandals set it on fire.

Known as the Whipple Place, the most elegant house in early Northville was on the property of Robert Thompson on the northwest corners of Nine Mile and Beck roads.

The three-story home had a ballroom and indoor water. In fact, it was the only country home in early Northville to have indoor water.

From a spring that today feeds the Randolph Drain, water was pumped via a ram to a cistern. The water was pumped into a sink in the kitchen.

Jack Hoffman writes in *Northville — The First Hundred Years* that a ram is a simple device that uses the energy of descending water to elevate the water to a height greater than its original source. No electric power is

needed.

Homes in early Northville were not the only structures that exemplified Victorian style.

Eastlawn Convalescent Center lost its patients to medical advancements in treating tuberculosis. It was a convalescent center for 20 years until the building was torn down in 1976, ending a long history.

The intricate details and ornamental fixtures on the building typified Victorian style.

Eastlawn was located on a site originally owned by John Buchner. He built a stately brick home on top of a hill on the south side of Main Street. Today's High Street owes its name to that hill once owned by Buchner, according to Hoffman.

Not all of Northville's early structures were lost. Many buildings were

Millage vote is tomorrow in township

Tuesday's general election may be anticlimactic in some 36th District circles, but Northville Township voters own a real say in their future.

Township voters will decide the fate of a 1.3921-mill police operations tax proposal. The proposed three-year tax, a rolled-back renewal of existing millage, is designed to generate approximately \$624,000 for the township police department.

The renewal request represents a tax of \$1.3921 per thousand dollars of assessed property value, and comprises about 40 percent of the police department's current \$1.5-million budget.

Township officials say they have not studied potential cutbacks in police and general administration budgets should the millage fail. Officials have promised another election if the request is defeated, though.

Police Chief Chip Snider said his department will lean toward equipment cutbacks and delay a planned patrol officer hiring in October if the

millage fails.

The police millage is a combination of two millages most recently approved by voters in 1986. Headlee rollbacks have cut the combined 2.2-mill taxes to 1.3921 by 1991.

The police millage question is not the general election's sole feature. Township Supervisor Georgina Goss is running for the 36th District state House seat vacated by Gerald Law last April.

Goss, fresh from an Aug. 6 victory in the Republican primary, is unopposed in the state House race.

Former Plymouth Township Supervisor Maurice Breen is an incumbent running unopposed for a seat on the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. throughout the township's polling sites. Those who may have voting questions can call township offices at 348-5800 for information.

Polls are also open in the Wayne County part of the city, but only for the uncontested House and County Commission seats. For more information on where to vote call city hall at 349-1300.

Goss successor search to start

Georgina Goss' presumed victory in tomorrow's 36th District state House race will mark the end of her five-year reign as Northville Township supervisor.

As for a succession plan, the political jockeying will begin Wednesday evening at a special township board session.

Some candidates have either already stepped forward, or are ready to join the race.

Township planning commissioner and zoning board of appeals Chairperson Karen Baja announced in June her interest in the position.

Treasurer Betty Lennox is awaiting official word of Goss' victory before announcing her plans, but reportedly is a leading candidate for the post.

And township administrative assistant Maureen Osiecki is slated to toss her name in the ring after Tuesday's general election.

The township in the past has held interviews for board openings, but could choose one of several options.

The board must appoint a successor within 45 days of Goss' resignation. If the board fails to make a move within that period, the township must contact the Wayne County clerk, who would notify Gov. John Engler's office of the vacancy. Engler would then call for a special election, township Deputy Clerk Eunice Switzer said.

Odds are that the township will not take the roundabout approach to fill the seat.

Goss, who likely will resign shortly after Labor Day weekend, said she will suggest a replacement plan at Wednesday's meeting.

"I'm going to recommend to the Board of Trustees that they open the process of selecting a supervisor," she said Friday. "I would request that any person interested in becoming supervisor submit a short resume to the clerk's office."

Clerk Tom Cook would then distribute the resumes to the balance of the board prior to the board's Sept. 12 session. A special session likely would be set after that meeting to review resumes and interview candidates, according to Goss' plan.

The board likely would need 10 days to receive and review resumes, Goss said.

A committee mulled resumes when the township treasurer position opened in the fall of 1989. That group sorted through a dozen potential candidates before deciding on Lennox.

Goss said her plan will quicken the selection process, which she says is necessary due to a number of important issues confronting the township.

"I feel this is a faster process (and) allows each candidate an opportunity to meet the board," she said. "And every board member is involved in the decision."

The Northville Township supervisor currently operates as a part-time position. Goss earns \$25,000 for her role as the township's top administrative and law enforcement official.


Wednesday's special board meeting is scheduled to begin at 7 p.m.

some of the better artists in the area. And we're growing each year to do that."

The fine arts are not limited to oil paintings, he said.

"We have woodwork; we have several different media stained glass, some (artists) are doing windows, some are doing panels, some are doing jewelry in stained glass; we have photographers; we have watercolor

and acrylic and oil portraits and paintings; and we have silversmith and a couple lapidarists (artists who work with precious stones). And this year we have two that are doing batik, the fine cloth work," he said. Batik is a method of dyeing cloth which uses wax to coat parts of the cloth not meant to be dyed.

The Art Market will be held on Main Street east of Center and on Mary Alexander Court near the

bandshell, 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Saturday and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday. The Northville Arts Commission will sell raffle tickets throughout the show. First prize is a romantic getaway to a bed and breakfast in Union City, complete with a picnic lunch, champagne and roses.

"Other prizes will be artworks from local artists," Key said.

The raffle will serve another purpose this year, by raising funds for

future Art Market productions. The funds are needed to offset losses in grants expected from the state, following Engler's cutback on funding for the arts.

"We put in an application with the Michigan Council of Arts, and this year everything got cut back from them," Keys explained. "So we have to build our own support. We do get some funds from the city but they are short of what we need to provide com-

plete operation."

On Sunday of the festival, the arts commission will host a brunch at the bandshell from 10 to 11 a.m. At the same time will be an awards presentation for Art Market work.

Key said the Art Market has come to mean a lot to Northville, both in terms of artistic recognition and cultural support.

"It means putting together and collecting a number of artists from the

area and statewide," he said. "It gives Northville a particular showcase for these artists and it gives the community a chance to come together in Northville to view these instead of having to travel all around different areas. We send to every art organization throughout the state, and... we go to the different art fairs and recruit artists also. So we are involved with the Michigan Arts Council and continue to promote fine arts throughout the state."

preserved in the Mill Race Historic Village, including the home of William Purdy Yerkes, which was first lo-

cated on Cady Street southwest of the First Presbyterian Church.

And the 165-year-old Presbyterian Church possesses another still-standing example of early

architecture.

The appearance of the structure has changed over the years, although, Hoffman writes, the superstructure is still intact. The original

building cost \$300 to construct.

The First Baptist Church of Northville also has gone through many changes in the many years it has existed on its to accommodate growth.

The church was established in the early 1830s. In the later part of the same decade a new building was constructed for the church on the same site its exists today, the southwest

corner of Randolph and Wing streets;

School board sees candidates

Seven candidates for the position of Northville Public School superintendent were scheduled for interviews last week. The school board interviewed the final four candidates Wednesday and Thursday. Following are short summaries of each interview. Summaries of the first three interviews appeared in the Aug. 22 edition.

LEONARD REZMIERSKI, Ph.D.

Rezmierski was one of two internal candidates interviewed by the school board Wednesday.

He has been the district's executive director for special education since 1976. Prior to his hire in Northville, Rezmierski worked as a director and assistant principal at Children's Psychiatric Hospital and an instructor at the University of Michigan medical center.

He began as a teacher in Lawrence, Mich. He also taught in the Lakeshore Public School District and the In-Patient School at the Children's Psychiatric Hospital.

Rezmierski earned his bachelor's degree at Western Michigan University in special education with a minor in English.

He earned his master's degree and doctorate at the University of Michigan. He received the master's degree in 1969 in special education and administration. Work for his doctorate was completed in 1982. His doctorate is in education and anthropology.

Rezmierski told the school board Thursday he has watched three superintendents in Northville run millage campaigns. He said he would cross what he has learned with the styles of Mark Twain, Will Rogers and Adlai Stevenson.

He also would attempt to make funding issues easily understandable to the public.

The district needs to maintain a fund balance "upwards of 10 percent" of the total budget, he said. A fund balance is a savings account maintained by school districts to carry them through times of financial crisis.

Rezmierski said "outcomes-based" education concerns him because Northville schools already are working toward establishing expected outcomes for graduating students.

He said many theories exist directing schools how to go about establishing expected outcomes for students.

"I'm concerned that we don't lose track of our goals," he said. "I would hate to have us chasing those other goals that are misdirected but well-funded."

Rezmierski said his relationship with students would be personal if he were chosen to be superintendent. He said visiting classrooms is "therapeutic."

"I gain so much from being in the classrooms. Much more than the students. They say, 'Who is that guy?'"

Responding to a question from the audience, Rezmierski said he would continue work as the district's special education director if not chosen to fill the superintendency.

He said he has been offered jobs elsewhere in recent years, some in the field of finance, but he has chosen to stay with Northville schools.

"The challenge in education is still there," he said. "I still have my name and trust associated with this."

MARGARET "DOLLY" McMASTER, Ph.D.

Northville Assistant Superintendent for Instructional Services Dolly McMaster was the second internal candidate interviewed by the school board Wednesday.

McMaster has worked in Northville since 1984, serving as director of curriculum and administrative assistant for instructional services. She has been assistant superintendent since 1986.

Prior to her hire in Northville, McMaster was an

assistant principal in Brighton and West Bloomfield. She began her career in education in 1966 as a middle-school teacher in the Plymouth/Canton Community School District.

McMaster received her bachelor's degree in 1966 and master's degree in 1973 from Eastern Michigan University. Her bachelor's degree is in social science with minors in geography, English and mathematics. Her master's degree is in reading.

McMaster earned a doctorate in 1986 from Michigan State University in administration with a minor in personnel management.

McMaster said she has been involved in running elections in Northville for the past few years. In fact, she said she has been involved in millage campaigns in every job she has held.

In Northville, McMaster has written brochures to publicize upcoming elections, and she said she would continue to try to make millage issues understandable to voters.

Discussing other financial matters of the district, McMaster said a fund balance of more than 5 percent of the budget is "obscene."

"If it's over 5 percent the money is not going where it should," she said.

She said money should be going to instruction. Ensuring the fiscal solvency of the district in the next three years will be difficult, McMaster said.

"If I had the answers I wouldn't be sitting here. I'd be making a lot of money writing a book about it," she said.

As a superintendent she would keep the community educated about matters of state finance. McMaster hopes to provide a good role model for students by maintaining high visibility in school buildings.

"This is the part I am looking forward to most if I'm your superintendent," she said.

"I will be in the schools, as I have been. I want to talk kids. I want to talk to parents."

Responding to a question from the audience, McMaster said she does not know how her job status would be affected in Northville if she is not offered the position of superintendent.

She has been encouraged to apply for superintendency positions in the past at other school districts, but "I have put all my eggs in this basket," she said. If not selected, she said she would have to re-evaluate that position.

ERROL FRANK, Ph.D.

Frank was one of the two out-of-state candidates interviewed by the school board Thursday. Frank completed all of his education in Ohio.

His bachelor's degree was earned in 1960 at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, with a major in education.

He earned a master's degree in guidance and counseling in 1969 from John Carroll University Heights in Cleveland. He earned a doctorate in education in 1983 from Toledo University with a major in administration and supervision and a minor in guidance.

Frank has been superintendent in the Southwest Local School District in Harrison, Ohio, since 1980.

His claim to fame is the success of the district, which spends just \$3,400 per student each year. He credits the district's success with active recruitment of teachers through local universities.

"If you would come down to visit, you would see the most enthusiastic, hard-working bunch of teachers you're going to find anywhere," he said.

Prior to his superintendency, Frank worked as an assistant superintendent, principal and assistant principal in Ohio. He worked as a graduate assistant in 1973-74 at University of Toledo.

Frank's first job in education was as an assistant principal and guidance counselor in Kfar Shmuryahu, Israel, in 1969-73.

He was unfamiliar with Michigan's system of finance, but Frank said his basic theory of millage campaigns says to put confusing fiscal issues into

the simplest terms possible when explaining them to the public.

He said he refuses to dwell on the negative even when discussing finances. He recommends an ongoing public relations campaign with the community to ensure support for schools.

"There are a lot of things you can do," he said. Developing good relationships with state legislators is also important, he said. "I think I have a good knack at that — developing those relationships," he said.

Frank said he would get to know the community in the first half year of his superintendency, if hired in Northville.

Any changes would be begun in the next year, he said.

In response to a question by a board member, Frank said he would feel comfortable working with established strategic planning goals and initiatives rather than implementing his own changes. Frank said he favors strategic planning and he was his district's strategic planning facilitator.

LARRY BEARD, Ed.D.

Beard was the second out-of-state candidate and the last of seven candidates interviewed by the school board last.

Beard has worked as a superintendent since 1976. His first superintendency was in the Hudson Community School District in Iowa. His second as a superintendent in the Charles City Community School District in Iowa. Charles City's district is about the size of Northville's, Beard said.

He began his professional career as an accountant in 1962. In 1968 he switched careers to become a debate coach and teacher in Iowa. Beard later was a counselor and principal.

Besides serving as superintendent, he currently works as a college instructor at four Iowa colleges and universities, and as a consultant to the U.S. Department of Education.

He got out of accounting because of a love of kids. His favorite job so far has been counseling. He said counselors get to become friends with kids more than any other school district staff members.

"My philosophy of education comes from the heart," he said.

He said motivation is important to him. He likes to motivate teachers to participate in decision making. Dictatorial superintendents are a thing of the past, he said.

"Dictators are gone. Godfathers have long since been gone in education," he said. "There's no way I have all the answers, but if I bring everyone else in we can get real close."

His motivation extends to district support staff including custodians and secretaries, he said. "Many times the support staff are the forgotten heroes," he said.

Making budgets understandable to the public is easy, he said. Making budgets acceptable is the problem.

"You've apparently been doing that, but you have to be very honest, and be very clear and be very approachable," he said.

He said maintaining a fund balance of between 5 and 10 percent is important. In case of an emergency expenditure, a district must be able to continue to make its payroll, he said.

Beard's experience with millage elections has been minimal due to the funding arrangement in Iowa. He said he did run one campaign recently for the first time. He credits the election's success with a little luck and a little design.

Involvement in the community is important year-round, Beard said. He would be involved with several community groups and maintain accessibility to the public.

He would also be actively involved with students, attending plays, sporting and musical events.

Trio arrested after thefts at store in township

Social Security seeking those due for review of SSI claims

The Social Security Administration (SSA) is sending notices to more than 450,000 children who are entitled to reviews of their Supplemental Security Income (SSI) claims. Over 500 are being sent to children in the western Wayne County area.

The notices are a result of the Sullivan v. Zebley court agreement. The agreement requires Social Security to notify children whose disability applications were denied because of disability rules. Children denied ben-

efits January 1980 through February 1990 are in this group.

The notice informs children of their right to a review. It asks them to return a reply form within 120 days. Once SSA gets the reply form, it will contact the child (or parents) to set up an interview.

It will take several months for Social Security to review the cases of all the children who respond. SSA will

eventually get to everyone.

The claims of children asking for review will be reexamined using SSA's new rules for determining disability in children. If found eligible under the new rules they will be entitled to back benefits. SSA estimates it will pay more than \$2 billion over the next five years to children found eligible under the new rules.



Lessons to be learned from Cajunfest fiasco

It may be tempting to do some Monday-morning quarterbacking in the wake of the Cajunfest which took place, sort of, a week ago at Northville Downs. It may seem attractive to point some fingers, saying the whole thing could have been avoided if this or that had been done.

But at this point that's not a very productive approach. The appropriate response is to try learning from this event so that it's not repeated in the future.

To briefly recap, Cajunfest swooped into the Downs on a Friday evening after pre-publicity promises of incredible food, a wealth of bayou music, pony rides and much more. Festival organizers backed themselves up with a list of references and a publicity kit which included articles about successful Cajunfests in other locales.

The event flopped. Poor organization led to late-arriving food, less music than promised, and a host of other problems. Most people who did attend went away unhappy.

But it didn't end there. After Cajunfest left town, the real problems began to surface: Organizers had passed out checks to several different entities for several different things, and the head of the bank on which the checks were drawn said there was no money to cover them.

Now, it's certainly possible that Cajunfest organizer Cy Holley will still make good on his debts. We certainly hope that happens, but we're not holding our breath. And even if he does, the bad taste from the event itself will remain in the community's mouth for a long time.

The list of all those who might feel conned by Cajunfest is long: anyone who attended and got less than they expected; Northville Downs, of course, to which Holley owes \$5,000; the Muscular Dystrophy Association, supposedly a beneficiary of the event, which supplied free workers in exchange for one of Holley's checks; this newspaper, along with the *Detroit Free Press*, *The Detroit News*, and a couple of television stations, all of which publicized the thing; the City of Northville, which approved a permit for Cajunfest to take place; Holley's bank; and assorted vendors including Porta-John, Waste Management, and a beer distributor — all paid by checks from the empty Louisiana bank account.

Again, one might think something could have been done. But frankly, some

of the checks and balances which might seem obvious wouldn't necessarily have prevented anything, even if they had been pursued more vigorously.

For example, Northville Downs did check some of the references Cajunfest supplied before the track agreed to host the event. At least one reference on the list was very angry with Holley, but others were not. The Better Business Bureau in Louisiana had no complaints on record against Cajunfest.

The single biggest change to consider for the future is demanding a bond or actual payment up-front, before the event, instead of accepting checks of undetermined value. Perhaps the city should even require documentation that local vendors have been paid before issuing a permit for an event like this coming in from out of state. We have a hunch that if Holley had actually sunk a lot of money into this event, he would have made sure it ran more smoothly.

And perhaps we can learn something from local Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4012, which Holley said would share in festival profits along with the MDA. The VFW got offered the same deal as MDA: a check to the group in exchange for volunteer workers. But the local post wisely declined, simply because the whole setup didn't feel quite right.

So the lessons, at least in part, appear to be these: When you don't know the people involved, check their references as thoroughly as possible. Make sure that payment for services or "donations" is guaranteed, preferably with cash on the barrelhead. And listen to your instincts, or maybe to the instincts of the VFW.

The next time an out-of-state festival wants to come into Northville, it will have to jump through a whole lot more hoops in order to do so. And that will be a very good thing.


And that was that.

Waterford talks slated Wednesday

State, county and local officials will huddle with developers and local residents Wednesday morning to discuss the future of Waterford Dam.

Waterford Dam eroded and burst last January, sending a torrent of water, mud, ice and fish into the Middle Rouge River near the Six Mile/Northville Road intersection.

Waterford Pond, a 40-acre water body created by the dammed Middle Rouge flow, emptied overnight.

Residents have since howled in protest over perceived bureaucratic entanglements that have prevented dam repair plans.

The Jonna Company, owners of the aged dam, say the state Department of Natural Resources has placed overly stringent and expensive restrictions on dam repair. Jonna Company President Frank Jonna says his engineers are working on potential repair strategies, but said the firm has no plans to sink a large amount of money into the project.

For its part, the DNR says it has no specific regulatory powers over the failed dam. Its moment in the spotlight will arrive when a repair plan is presented.

Wayne County officials also say they have no real authority over Waterford Pond, dam, and a troubled lake downstream from the dam site. The county has suggested a special assessment district be created to dredge Phoenix Lake, the downstream water body that has witnessed widespread silting and filling since Waterford Dam failed.

Northville Township Manager Richard Henningsen rounded up the cast for Wednesday's meeting at the urging of angered township resi-

dents. Residents will be represented by Ginni Britton, president of the Lakes of Northville Homeowners' Association, and Gary Sipple, of the Whisper Woods Homeowners' Association.

Britton's interest lies with Waterford Pond; Sipple lives near Phoenix Lake. Both will be anxious to hear who can do what to restore the lakes and dam to their former status.

Britton has hinted that her association will take legal action to force restoration of Waterford Pond. Sipple hopes common sense will spur all parties' interest in a resolution.

Expected to attend the 9 a.m. meeting are DNR officials, Wayne County Commissioner Maurice Breen and a host of county department heads, Henningsen, township attorneys, Jonna representatives, Britton and Sipple.

The meeting will be held at township hall, 41600 Six Mile Road.

Pouilly is just one wine from Chateau Fuisse

Chateau Fuisse is headquartered in a magnificent, 15th-century edifice in the Macon region of southern Burgundy. But do not let the property's age and the traditions surrounding Chateau Fuisse deceive. It is a sophisticated and diversified modern winemaking operation directed by fifth-generation owner Jean-Jacques Vincent.

During the 127-year ownership of the property by the Vincent family, Chateau Fuisse has garnered a reputation as the finest producer of Pouilly-Fuisse. The best wines from the 50 acres of Vincent family holdings in Pouilly-Fuisse carry the name Chateau Fuisse.

The Chateau Fuisse vineyards encompass about 100 separate parcels of land midway up slopes in both the Pouilly and Fuisse districts. Each offers a distinct character to the wine and is vinified separately to maintain the original identity of the vineyard section.

After vinification, lots are blended to offer the consumer the consistent and inimitable Chateau Fuisse style. A limited 13,000 cases of Chateau Fuisse are produced each vintage.

The 1989 Chateau Fuisse (\$38) is pricey by the mere fact of its rarity. It's generous and extracted, mirroring the characteristics described for the regular Pouilly-Fuisse (see Wine Selections of the Week), but is a significantly bigger wine.

If you decide to buy this wine, remember the directive on Chateau Fuisse's cellar wall, inscribed in 1955 by the local tax collector. It translates, "It's better to put your nose in a glass of Chateau Fuisse than in your neighbor's business."

A vineyard in nearby St. Veran yields fruit for a St. Veran chardonnay, also produced at the chateau. This vineyard may be described as a *clos*, a single, demarcated vineyard producing grapes of consistent and uniform quality.

Three negociant wines, Pouilly-Fuisse, Macon-Villages and St. Veran, are also made from grapes bought from local growers. They are selected under the supervision of Jean-Jacques Vincent, who monitors the growing, harvesting, blending and bottling of these wines.

Pouilly-Fuisse vineyards occupy about 1,700 acres in the southern Maconnais. Vincent's vineyard sources in Fuisse, constituting about 1/2 of the blend, are selected for their lively chardonnay, fruit, producing a wine of depth and richness.

"Pouilly-Fuisse chardonnay is not as sophisticated as a Meursault or Puligny," Vincent contends. "It is also not as pricey and is a perfect wine for fish and lighter food preparations. It is a soft, pleasant white wine that makes a good value for aging."

Macon-Villages is the largest appellation in the Maconnais, with nearly 6,000 acres. Vincent's wine (100 percent chardonnay) is a blend of three villages. The first offers a muscat character elevating the wine's aroma. The second lends structure to the wine, and the last gives finesse and elegance to the wine as a whole.

"Blending wines from three villages builds a more harmonious wine," Vincent said. "The 1990 Macon-Villages is one of the best in the last 10 years. The acid levels are balanced and the wine overall is much better than the 1989."

The vineyard sources for the St. Veran wine are in the northern part of the appellation. The area produces chardonnay wines with both pear and peach aromas and flavors.

WINE SELECTIONS OF THE WEEK

J.J. Vincent 1990 Pouilly-Fuisse (\$18) is highlighted by hints of toasty bread aromas with well-structured chardonnay flavors that are well-balanced and delicious. This is a handsome chardonnay from southern Burgundy.

J.J. Vincent 1990 Macon-Villages (\$11) has appealing apple, pear and melon aromas with vanilla accents. The expressive flavors and generous finish make it a value-priced wine.

Salad Days
Cool off hot days with main dish salads

Californians put spin on old favorite salad

Anyone silly enough to want a heated debate need say nothing more than, "I make the perfect martini" or "I make the perfect bloody Mary."

Those are the cocktail hour's version of who makes a really authentic beef stew, purest crab cake, or just how firm should scrambled eggs be. The latter runs from saucethin to superfirm.

Another guaranteed subject for rigid guidelines is the Caesar salad. The ingredients range all the way from every crisp thing in the refrigerator, to the classic anchovy-Parmesan-dominated toss, to current light-and-lean versions.

California has long been a leader of food preparations that depend more on quality of produce than any set recipe. The cooks there were trimming away calories years before it became a national pastime.

Add the great seafood available on the Golden Coast and one quickly understands why there was keen interest in a recent Shrimp Celebration held in 13 Marriott hotels in Southern California.

All the hotels featured Fried Shrimp Jubilee, Carnival of Sautéed Shrimp and, of course, Shrimp Caesar Salad Jamboree. Notice that there's not a straight name in the trio. It's the California touch that makes the difference. All these entrees were served with Bel Arbors wines from Fetzer, a partner in the celebration.

Classically, Caesar salad should contain croutons freshly fried in garlic-flavored olive oil. The Marriott version makes croutons optional. After all, they are just sponges for fat. The traditional oil-packed anchovy in the salad has been replaced by sprightly cooked shrimp. The chefs plucked from California's vegetable basket mushrooms, tomatoes, red, green and yellow peppers — all interlopers.

Parmesan cheese does remain, but just a whisper, not a wallop. And, of course, there is crisp romaine lettuce, without which no Caesar salad is worthy of the name.

During these warm days, the main dinner course can be a simple salad.

It can be made early in the morning, or prepared the night before and put together just before mealtime.

Preparation time is minimal in most cases — especially if you use leftovers. The result is suitable for any warm day.

Today's first recipe is a variation of the classic French Salad Nicoise, based on the recipe in Pierre Franey's "The 60 Minute Gourmet."

The original Salad Nicoise has cooked potatoes and steamed string beans in it and calls for the ingredients to be placed carefully on a large platter in a decorative pattern. This recipe calls for everything to be mixed in a large bowl, which makes it even easier.

**SALAD NICOISE
AUX POIRES D'AVOCAT
(Tuna and Avocado Salad)**

- 1/2 pound fresh mushrooms
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
- 1 large or 2 small avocados
- 2 (7-ounce) cans tuna fish packed in oil
- 1 (2-ounce) can flat anchovy fillets
- Rind of 1 lemon, cut into very fine strips
- 8 stalk olives
- 8 stuffed green olives
- 1 red, ripe tomato, about 1/2 pound
- 1 small red onion, peeled
- 6 tablespoons olive oil (preferably extra virgin)
- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 1 teaspoon finely chopped garlic
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh parsley
- 2 hard-cooked eggs, peeled and quartered

Yields 6 or more servings.
Thinly slice mushrooms. There should be about 3 cups. Put mushrooms in mixing bowl and add lemon juice, salt and pepper. Toss to blend.

Peel avocados and cut in half. Remove pits. Cut each half into 4 lengthwise slices. Cut slices into large cubes. Add this to mushrooms and toss to coat.

Drain tuna and break into bite-size chunks. Add this to bowl.

Drain anchovy fillets and cut into small pieces. Add them to bowl. (You can add less if you want.) Add lemon rind and olives.

Core tomato and cut into 1-inch pieces. Add this to bowl. Cut onion into thin slices. Break slices into rings and add to bowl.

Blend oil, vinegar, garlic, salt and pepper to taste. Beat well to blend and pour over salad. Sprinkle with parsley. Toss well before serving. Garnish with hard-boiled egg quarters.

If you are a fan of Caesar salads, you will really like this version.

CHICKEN CAESAR SALAD

- 4 boneless chicken breast halves with skin, fat and tendons removed (or left-over, simple cooked chicken)
- 2 tablespoons olive oil

1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley

1 garlic clove, minced

Salt and freshly ground pepper

Croutons (you can use store-bought)

1 tablespoon olive oil

1 small garlic clove, minced

10 slices day-old Italian, whole-wheat or other firm whole-grain bread, cut into 1/2-inch cubes (about 2 cups)

Dressing:

3 anchovy fillets, drained, patted dry, chopped

1 garlic clove, minced

2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

1 tablespoon red wine vinegar

1 tablespoon beaten egg, coddled

1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil

Salt and freshly ground pepper

1 large bunch romaine lettuce, washed and torn into bite-size pieces

4 tablespoons freshly grated Parmesan cheese

12 cherry tomatoes, halved

Yields 4 servings.

For chicken: place chicken on plate or in pie dish. Drizzle with olive oil. Sprinkle with parsley, garlic, salt and pepper. Rub seasonings into chicken, turn to coat with oil. Cover, refrigerate 1 hour.

For croutons: preheat oven to 350. Combine olive oil and garlic in small bowl. Add bread cubes and toss to coat. Spread on baking sheet. Bake until lightly toasted, tossing once, about 10 minutes. Be careful not to let them burn. Set croutons aside. They can be made a day ahead kept in an airtight container.

Dressing: Puree anchovies and garlic with lemon juice, vinegar and 1 tablespoon coddled egg, beaten lightly in blender or food processor using steel blade. With machine running, add oil through top in thin, steady stream. Blend until dressing is emulsified and smooth. Season with salt and pepper. Set aside.

Heat large, heavy non-stick skillet over medium-high heat. Add chicken and cook until tender, 3 minutes per side. Chicken can also be grilled. Cool chicken slightly, then cut into long, 1/4-inch strips. If using leftover chicken, remove all skin and bones and cut into 1/4-inch strips. Use about 10 ounces of chicken.

Toss lettuce with half of dressing, croutons and 2 tablespoons cheese. Mound mixture on 4 large plates. Arrange chicken strips atop lettuce. Sprinkle with remaining cheese. Garnish with tomatoes. Pass remaining dressing.

Catch up on your knowledge of tomatoes

Tomatoes are everywhere. My mother's garden abounds. Friends bring bags when they visit. Rich, red, luscious beefsteaks abound. Luckily, I did not plant any this year. There are more than enough to go around.

The tomato has a special place in the American kitchen — in sauces, soups, salads and ketchup, the widespread condiment. The only fresh vegetables eaten more often are lettuce and potatoes. In fact, they are a major source of nutrients, not because they are so nutritious, but because we eat 18 pounds per person per year.

Tomatoes have been enjoyed for over 2,000 years. Up until 1820 they were thought to be poisonous and not consumed in America. A Col. Robert Johnson ate several tomatoes in the town square to prove their safety. The earliest cookbooks that list tomatoes as ingredients date to 1824.

Throughout those early years different varieties were crossed producing hybrids that are still grown today. In the late '60s and throughout the '70s the quality of to-

matos took a nosedive. Tomatoes were now being bred for high yield and long storage times instead of quality.

Picked while still green then gassed and shipped thousands of miles, the modern cultivated tomato is the most complained-about item in the produce department.

Supposedly, the green tomatoes ripen as well as those left on the vine until sufficiently colored. Several studies have shown otherwise. A vine-ripened tomato contains two to three times more vitamin C and carotene than those picked green.

Happily we do not have to settle for the horrid, hard, pinkish rounds during this time of the year. Good ones are plentiful in stands and farmer's markets and many are home grown. The tomato is the most widely planted vegetable in family gardens.

When purchasing tomatoes, the key phrase is buy local. The best tasting tomatoes are sometimes the worst looking. Avoid choosing those with moldy areas, black spots, bruises and green tops. Small blemishes and cracks do not affect flavor. Colors range from deep red to pink to

yellow. Color is determined by pigments which are found just under the flesh. At their peak they are soft, but not squishy and emit a pleasing fragrance. A tomato is about 95 percent water and various sugars make up over half of the rest. Carbohydrates, vitamins and acids are also present.

The compound that causes the "fresh-tomato" taste is lost within one hour after slicing and destroyed with heat so eat your cut tomatoes fast and avoid cooking when possible.

To preserve the harvest, several methods may be suggested. Home-canned tomatoes put in glass jars are tastier than the commercial brands if they are made from flavorful tomatoes. However, USDA safety guidelines call for the addition of ascorbic acid and long cooking times which leech much of the flavor. Spicy products such as chili sauce and ketchup are best for canning.

Home-dried tomatoes are an alternative. Choose fleshy varieties, halve them, remove seeds if desired and lightly salt. Arrange on cake cooling racks cut side up

and place the rack on cookie sheets. Bake in a 200 degree oven for six to eight hours or until leathery. The tomatoes are done when still pliable but so dry that no juice can be squeezed from them.

For short term storage pack in an airtight container arranged in layers that are separated by waxed paper. Keep in a cool, dry place. Longer storage requires refrigeration or freezing. Packing in a sterilized jar and covered with olive oil is also permissible.

To freeze tomatoes simply wipe, place in freezer bags and freeze. The end product is not beautiful but tastes fresh. To peel place the frozen tomato under running water and the skin will slip off. These are good in any recipe calling for cooked tomatoes.

Tomato time is certainly here. Eat your fill while the getting is good. I'm heading for the kitchen now. Dinner will be easy tonight. A tomato sandwich on thick, crusty bread, drizzled with the best olive oil in my kitchen, sprinkled with kosher salt and fresh cracked pepper. Heaven.

FRESH FROZEN TOMATO SAUCE

- 2 large peeled frozen tomatoes per serving
- Salt, pepper and lemon juice to taste
- 2 tablespoons butter

Allow tomatoes to thaw. Drain the juice that accumulates and save for soup or tomato based sauces. Chop the tomatoes coarsely and heat in a stainless steel pan until just warm. Flavor with the salt, pepper and lemon juice. Add the butter. Toss with fresh cooked pasta and serve immediately.

1/2 pound spaghetti
1/2 cup grated Parmesan
Fresh pepper

Yields 5 servings.

Cook shrimp, but do not overcook. When done, in about 3 minutes, cool, then peel and refrigerate. Drain tuna.

In large skillet, saute chopped onion, garlic, broccoli, mushrooms and oregano in oil and butter (do not overcook).

Cut zucchini into 2-by-4/4-inch sticks; cut tomato into eighths. Add both to pan and cook briefly. Break tuna into chunks and add it to vegetables.

Add shrimp, mix, stir in sour cream. Keep warm if desired.

Cook spaghetti *al dente*. When cooked, drain, then pour spaghetti into large serving bowl. Toss all ingredients into it. Add Parmesan cheese and fresh peppers to taste. Mayonnaise may be used instead of sour cream, or perhaps a little bit of both.

MARINATED STEAK SALAD

1 1/2 pounds sirloin steak (or leftover roast beef, medium rare)
2 (4-ounce) cans mushrooms, sliced
2 green peppers, sliced in rings
2/3 cup red wine vinegar
1/2 cup salad oil
2 teaspoons salt
1 teaspoon onion salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1/2 teaspoon tarragon
3-4 cloves garlic, crushed
2 tomatoes, cut into eighths

Yields 6 servings.

Broil steak—medium rare, cool. Cut meat into thin slices. Arrange meat in 13x9-inch baking pan, layer mushrooms over meat, top with pepper rings.

Combine vinegar, oil and seasonings in jar with tight lid. Shake jar well.

Pour dressing over meat and vegetables, cover; refrigerate at least 3 hours. Spoon dressing over vegetables occasionally. One-half hour before serving, add tomatoes, or garnish with tomatoes when serving.

SALAD A L'ADAM

2 cups onion, sliced very thin
2 cups Swiss cheese (not with big holes, however), cut thin
2 cups boiled ham, julienned
2 cups green pepper, julienned
6 tablespoons wine vinegar
6 tablespoons olive or salad oil
Salt and pepper to taste
Pimiento for garnish (optional)

Yields 8 servings.

Combine well wine vinegar, olive oil, salt and pepper. Pour this marinade over other ingredients and marinate overnight.

FRANCOIS' CRAB AND AVOCADO SALAD

2 ripe avocados
1 lemon
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1 teaspoon ketchup
10 ounces Alaskan king crab meat
2 hard-boiled eggs, roughly chopped
1 1/2 tablespoons vodka

Yields 4 servings.

Halve avocados the long way. Remove seed and rub exposed surfaces with lemon juice. Scoop out

flesh, leaving 1/4 to 3/4 inch of flesh as shell in avocado skin. Slice scooped flesh. Combine mayonnaise with ketchup.

Pick over crabmeat, if necessary, for bits of shell. Add crabmeat to mayonnaise and toss carefully. Add chopped hard-boiled eggs and sliced avocado, toss well and heap into avocado shells. Just before serving, sprinkle each half with some vodka.

4 ounces romaine lettuce

3/4 ounce red, green, yellow peppers, julienned

2 ounces Caesar dressing
CROUTONS (optional)

Caesar dressing:

1 egg yolk

Anchovies to taste, chopped

Yields 1 salad serving; Caesar dressing yields 1 generous cup.

To prepare salad, wash and chop lettuce; chill well in mixing bowl. To the lettuce, add mushrooms, peppers and shrimp. Drizzle Caesar dressing over mixture and toss gently so as not to bruise the lettuce. Arrange salad on serving plate with tomato wedges opposite each other.

Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese and add croutons, if desired.

While lettuce is chilling, prepare dressing. In mixing bowl, beat egg yolk and mustard together. Drizzle in salad oil. If it becomes too thick, squeeze in the lemon juice. Add black pepper, Parmesan cheese and anchovies.

Refrigerate remaining sauce to enliven other salads.

On the lamb

The hip summer grill

To keep that summer party exciting, you might want to try serving something a little different this year from the usual hamburger or chicken fare. One suggestion is grilled lamb—one of the "in" foods for 1991.

Leaner than ever before, this meat offers great taste and nutrition in a variety of recipes requiring only minutes of preparation.

Favored for the grill are some of the new, smaller lamb cuts now sold in your local supermarket. Very popular for the summer cookout are kebabs, which may be sold prepackaged or easily cut from a sirloin roast or leg.

Taken from the leanest part of the lamb, with only 176 calories per three-ounce serving, kebabs offer a lot of fun on a skewer accompanied by a medley of vegetables or fruits.

To cook your kebabs to perfection, stack briquets in a pyramid and pre-heat coals 20-40 minutes until bright red and covered with gray ash. After spreading briquets evenly apart, you can test for the proper moderate temperature when you comfortably can hold your palm approximately four inches above the coals for four seconds.

In the recipe, "Stars and Stripes Lamb Kebabs," lamb cubes are marinated in dry red wine or orange juice, broth, grape jelly, red wine vinegar, garlic, rosemary, marjoram, bag leaf, salt and ginger.

When you're ready to start the meal, skewer alternating pieces of lamb and onion, ending with a red pepper star. Once placed on the fire, the kebabs grill in 10-12 minutes.

Serve with a Blueberry Rice Salad of fresh blueberries, cooked rice, sliced almonds and a sweet vinaigrette.

LAMB KEBABS

(4 servings)
1 1/2 pounds fresh American lamb sirloin roast, cut into 2 inch cubes
1 small onion, cut into 2 inch strips
1 red pepper, cut into 4 star shapes
1 recipe marinade

Marinade

1/2 cup dry red wine or orange juice
1/2 cup broth
3 tablespoons grape jelly
3 tablespoons red wine vinegar
3 garlic cloves, minced
2 teaspoons dried rosemary leaves, crushed
2 teaspoons dried marjoram leaves, crushed
1 bay leaf
1 teaspoon seasoned salt
1 teaspoon finely-minced fresh ginger

In medium bowl, blend marinade ingredients. Add lamb cubes, cover, refrigerate and marinate 4-24 hours. Mix several times.

Remove meat from marinade and thread on skewers, alternating meat and onion, ending with red pepper star.

To broil: Place lamb kebabs on cold broiler pan. Broil lamb 4 inches from source of heat 5-6 minutes per side for medium rare.

To grill: Ignite coals in barbecue; allow to burn until bright red and covered with gray ash. Grill lamb kebabs 4 inches from coals 5-6 minutes per side for medium rare.



BLUEBERRY RICE SALAD

3 cups cooked rice
1 cup fresh blueberries
1/2 cup toasted sliced almonds

1/2 cup sweet vinaigrette

In medium bowl, combine blueberries, almonds and vinaigrette. Toss and serve with kebabs.

1 1/2 cups thinly sliced mushrooms
1 cup diagonally sliced celery
1/2 cup sliced green onions with tops (1/4 inch pieces)
1/2 cup salsa
1/2 cup bottled teriyaki sauce
1 to 2 teaspoons finely shredded fresh ginger, as desired
4 cups thinly sliced Chinese cabbage or Romaine lettuce
1 tablespoon toasted sesame seeds (optional)

Place beef, peppers, mushrooms, celery and onions in plastic bag. Combine salsa, teriyaki sauce and ginger, mixing well; pour into bag. Fasten bag securely and refrigerate 2 to 3 hours, turning bag occasionally. Drain and reserve marinade. Place cabbage on serving platter or in salad bowl; top with meat and vegetable mixture. Sprinkle with sesame seeds, if desired. Serve with additional picante sauce. Makes 4 servings.

CARIBBEAN SHRIMP AND BLACK BEAN SALAD

1 pound cooked, cleaned and deveined medium shrimp
1 can (15 ounces) black beans, rinsed and drained
1 small green pepper, cut into short, thin strips
1/2 cup thinly sliced celery
1/2 cup very thinly sliced small red onion rings
1/2 cup salsa
2 tablespoons chopped cilantro
2 tablespoons vegetable oil
2 tablespoons honey
Shredded peel and juice from 1 lime (1 teaspoon peel and 2 tablespoons juice)
1/2 teaspoon salt
Lettuce leaves
1 cup cherry tomato halves

Combine shrimp, beans, green pepper, celery and onion in large bowl. Combine remaining ingredients except tomatoes and lettuce; mix well. Pour over shrimp mixture; toss lightly to coat. Cover and chill at least 2 hours or up to 24 hours, tossing lightly occasionally. Spoon salad onto lettuce-lined serving platter; garnish with tomatoes. Serve with additional salsa. Makes 6 servings.

For serious fans only: flavoring with horseradish

If you are looking for something to add surefire "punch" to your cooking, horseradish is one ingredient that will never let you down. People either love or loathe its rather extreme flavor, but if you are a fan, there is just no substitute for this pungent root.

Where other condiments may subtly whisper, horseradish loudly proclaims its presence. Most folks like it best when it's tamed down a bit—blended with a healthy portion of something mild, like sour cream. It's a delicious accompaniment to meat, poultry, fish and vegetables and is also prized for use in potato salad, egg dishes and hors d'oeuvres.

Horseradish is grown for its taproot, which is grated and frequently mixed with vinegar or lemon juice, salt, and sometimes oil. The flavor of the fresh root is definitely superior, and if it is available, by all means grate your own.

Fresh horseradish loses its pungency and will turn brown if kept for a long period. To preserve, combine 1 cup grated fresh horseradish with 1/2 cup white wine vinegar. Store in a tightly covered clean jar and refrigerate. Use within a month or so.

The prepared horseradish you can find in the market is usually made with salt, yet it has a fairly low sodium content. Combine with applesauce for a traditional Austrian accompaniment to beef, or with mayonnaise or sour cream to prepare a condiment for meats or hors

d'oeuvres. And in case you were wondering, red bottled horseradish is colored with beet juice.

Powdered horseradish (found on the spice shelf) can be mixed with water or condiments (like mustard) to make a variety of sauces. The powdered form is also used as a seasoning in making appetizers, meats, salads and stews.

It is best to reconstitute the ground dried root about 30 minutes before serving time. Soak about 1 tablespoon of dried horseradish in 2 tablespoons of water and add 1/2 cup heavy cream. The flavor will approximate freshly ground but will be stronger and not as desirable as fresh.

To substitute for 1 tablespoon grated fresh root, use 2 tablespoons bottled prepared horseradish. For 6 tablespoons dried horseradish, use 6 ounces bottled.

For a horseradish dill dip: combine 1 cup sour cream, 1 1/2 tablespoons chopped fresh dill, 2 tablespoons grated fresh horseradish and prepared mustard to taste. Blend well and serve with meats, sandwiches or appetizers.

To make horseradish mayonnaise for sandwiches, blend 1 cup mayonnaise with 1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh parsley and 1 tablespoon prepared horseradish. Add a little minced onion if you like.

If you are out of cocktail sauce, blend prepared horseradish with to-

mato ketchup and lemon juice to taste and serve with steamed shrimp for classic shrimp cocktail.

(Recipes in this column are tested in 625- to 700-watt microwave ovens.)

MICRO-TIP OF THE WEEK

Some tender meats may be cooked at high (100 percent power) setting, but for best results, less tender cuts should be microwaved for a longer time at medium (50 percent power).

CORNEED BEEF WITH HORSEADISH SAUCE

1 (3- to 3 1/2-pound) corned beef brisket
3 cups water
1 medium onion, sliced
2 cloves garlic, minced
2 bay leaves
1/2 teaspoon whole peppercorns
1/2 cup sour cream
1 tablespoon or more freshly grated horseradish
1 tablespoon minced onion
1 teaspoon Dijon-style mustard
Salt and ground white pepper to taste

Yields 6 servings.
Preparation time: 15 to 20 minutes.
Cooking time: 1 hour and 25 to 35 minutes.

Oven setting: High (100 percent power); Medium (50 percent power).

Place brisket in 3-quart microwave-safe casserole and add 3 cups water. Add onion, garlic, bay leaves and peppercorns. Cover and microwave at high setting 25 minutes. Turn meat over. Microwave, covered, at medium setting 60 to 70 minutes longer, turning meat over again halfway through cooking time.

To make horseradish sauce, combine all remaining ingredients in small bowl. Cover and refrigerate until serving time.

To serve, slice meat across grain and garnish with horseradish sauce. Serve with boiled cabbage and potatoes, if desired.

SPICY HORSEADISH MUSTARD

1 cup dry mustard
1/2 cup white wine vinegar
1/2 cup water
1/2 cup sugar
3 tablespoons brown sugar, lightly packed
2 teaspoons onion salt
1 teaspoon caraway seeds
2 eggs
1 tablespoon grated fresh horseradish

Yields 16 ounces.

Preparation time: 10 to 15 minutes.

Cooking time: 18 minutes (plus overnight standing time).

Oven setting: low (10 percent power).

Combine all ingredients except eggs and horseradish in glass or ceramic bowl and microwave 15 minutes, so that flavors will blend. Cover and let stand at room temperature overnight.

In separate bowl lightly beat eggs; then stir them into mustard mixture. Microwave mixture 3 minutes more until mixture thickens.

Stir in horseradish and cool for 10 minutes. Pour into sterilized jar and refrigerate for 24 hours before using. This mustard will keep in refrigerator up to 3 months.

8 ounces cream cheese
6 ounces canned shrimp, drained
1 tablespoon finely minced onion
2 teaspoons horseradish mustard
2 teaspoons ketchup
1 teaspoon lemon juice
1/2 teaspoon garlic salt
Dash freshly ground black pepper

Yields about 1 1/2 cups.

Preparation time: 10 to 15 minutes.

Cooking time: 5 to 7 minutes.

Oven setting: Medium (50 percent power).

Combine all ingredients in 1 1/2-quart microwave-safe casserole or mixing bowl; stir. Microwave 5 to 7 minutes, stirring every 3 minutes, until heated through.

BLUE CHEESE PARTY DIP

8 ounces cream cheese
1/2 cup crumbled blue cheese (about 2 ounces)
3 tablespoons half-and-half
1 tablespoon minced fresh parsley
1 tablespoon minced onion
1 teaspoon prepared bottled horseradish
1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

Yields about 1 1/2 cups.

Preparation time: 10 minutes.

Cooking time: 3 to 5 minutes.

Oven setting: Medium (50 percent power).

Combine all ingredients in small microwave-safe bowl; stir. Microwave 3 to 5 minutes, stirring every 2 minutes, until heated through. Serve with party crackers and freshly cut vegetable sticks.

NBC hopes to breathe new life into 'Real Life'

New season to feature harder-hitting stories

She may be America's TV-journalism sweetheart, but how have real ratings treated NBC's "Real Life With Jane Pauley?"

"Lousy," says Steve Friedman, producer of "NBC Nightly News" and now "Real Life With Jane Pauley." "That's why we're changing it. Most people who saw the show last year thought she was great and the show wasn't."

"Real Life" makes its season premiere on a new night, Friday, Sept. 6, and the new producer plans to do right by his star. There's no reason not to, given the fact that Pauley holds more audience appeal than just about any other female journalist on TV. "If you just do an acceptable program, she's enough to carry you over the top."

Part of the problem has been that "Real Life" lacks a format. People don't know what they're going to see when they tune in, says Friedman. This year's new model will feature additional journalists building an ensemble news group around Jane, a signature piece by Pauley at each show's end, and tougher issues.

"I think what they did last year was what I would call 'nice pieces'," says Friedman. "What they tried to do is only deal with little problems affecting a lot of people. When they

talked about real life, it was with real people not in real trouble. There was very little conflict and very little emotion," says Friedman.

Last season's profile of Pete Rose went so well, Friday's premiere episode will feature another celebrity—talk-show host, Oprah Winfrey, her life, her loves and her successes. The following week, how to spot steroid use by sons, brothers and boyfriends will be the topic, and "scud-stud" NBC correspondent Arthur Kent will be on hand putting out oil fires in Kuwait.

"Friday night is definitely going to be a more hospitable time period for us," says Pauley. The former "Today" host admits her husband, cartoonist Garry Trudeau, might be watering geraniums in the yard, she could be reading inside, and both would forget to watch her show on Sundays. "Sunday is just an odd time, not to mention highly competitive, so Friday will definitely be better for us. But the flip side of that is that the expectation will be higher, too."

As the new television season begins to fire up, "Real Life" will face opposition from ABC's "Family Matters," CBS' "Princesses," starring Twiggy Lawson, and "America's Most Wanted" on Fox.

"Real Life" will aim for an older

"thirtysomething" audience, leaving "Family Matters" and "Princesses" to the kids. Pauley believes Friedman will also draw a bigger following with more promotional spots this season than last. "I call Steve the 'promotion meister.' He believes in banging the drum, so we'll probably get the drums banged a little better," says Pauley.

Friedman, however, is careful to point out that all news and information series take time to find an audience, and that no program including "60 Minutes," "20/20," and "Primetime Live," scored big its first year. "What we're going through, everybody else has already gone through," he says—but no matter what the ratings, don't look for Deborah Norville to sub-host anytime soon.







Barker scores high for 'fur flap'

In a recent interview with Bob Barker for the Daytime Emmys (he served as host and also won his sixth Emmy), the conversation turned to his anti-fur campaign. Barker, remember, in 1987 created what came to be called the "fur flap" when he quit hosting pageants because the contestants wore furs.

"Hey, that has worked!" said Barker, obviously pleased to talk about it. Indeed, it *has* worked. Live Aid, Farm Aid and Nancy Reagan's "Just Say No" to drugs campaign have come and gone, but Barker's pet project (pardon the pun) has had lasting impact.

"There are people who say that it got more media attention than any single incident in the animal rights movement," said Barker. "From that day forward, we began to concentrate our efforts on educating the consumer. Once consumers know the animal torture involved, they're not interested in buying furs, and today the fur industry is on its last legs."

Cruelty to animals used in movie productions is Barker's latest concern. 1987's *Project X* and this year's *Wild Hearts Can't Be Broken* are among the films, he contends, in which animals suffered mistreatment. And please don't even mention *The Adventures of Milo and Otis*, a Japanese-made, dog-and-cat film released last summer.
