## Township gets look at new budget

Revenues are up, but so are expenses.

And a fund balance, that buffer between black and red ink, may soon be a thing of the past.

That's the word out of Northville Township after the Board of Trustees on Aug. 28 reviewed its preliminary 1992 budget.

The 1992 preliminary budget estimates total township revenues at just over \$3.92 million, while expenditures are set at \$4.05 million. With a fund balance pegged at \$56,275, the township's proposed budget lists an \$83,058 deficit.

The township must produce a balanced budget under Michigan law. A budget review committee, appointed last week by outgoing Supervisor Georgina Goss, will mull the budget and offer budget paring recommendations to the board before the Nov. 1 budget adoption deadline. The township fiscal year follows the calendar year.

Members of the budget review committee are Frank St. Louis, John Sassaman, Wes Henrikson, Betty Lennox, Richard Henningsen, Jack Hosmer, and new township Finance Director Dwayne Harrigan.

The committee will meet throughout September at township hall. No specific review dates had been set by Thursday.

Preliminary is the key term for this budget, Harrigan said.

Harrigan told the board the new budget remains in a state of flux, due to uncertainties over state revenue returns. The state returns portions of sales tax and other revenues based on population and other factors, but it's too early to tell exactly what Northville Township's slice of the revenue pie will be, Harrigan said.

Trustee James Nowka expressed concern over the dwindling fund balance and the projected budget deficit. Harrigan said expenditures had exceeded revenues "since 1986," and cautioned the board that by 1992 the fund balance could "dwindle down to nothing."

Trustee Thomas Handyside raised an eyebrow to anticipated burgeoning township legal costs. He also questioned the scheduling of conferences and seminars for township employees in 1992.

"Seminars and conferences (costs) are up and I know in these times (they) are down in private industry," he said.

Township revenues are generated by property taxes, state revenues, building department revenues, fees, and licensing and enforcement.

Expenditures cover all aspects of township business, and extend from \$1,050 allotted to township constables to the police department's \$1.64-million budget request.

## Lightning hits, starts fires in Friday storm

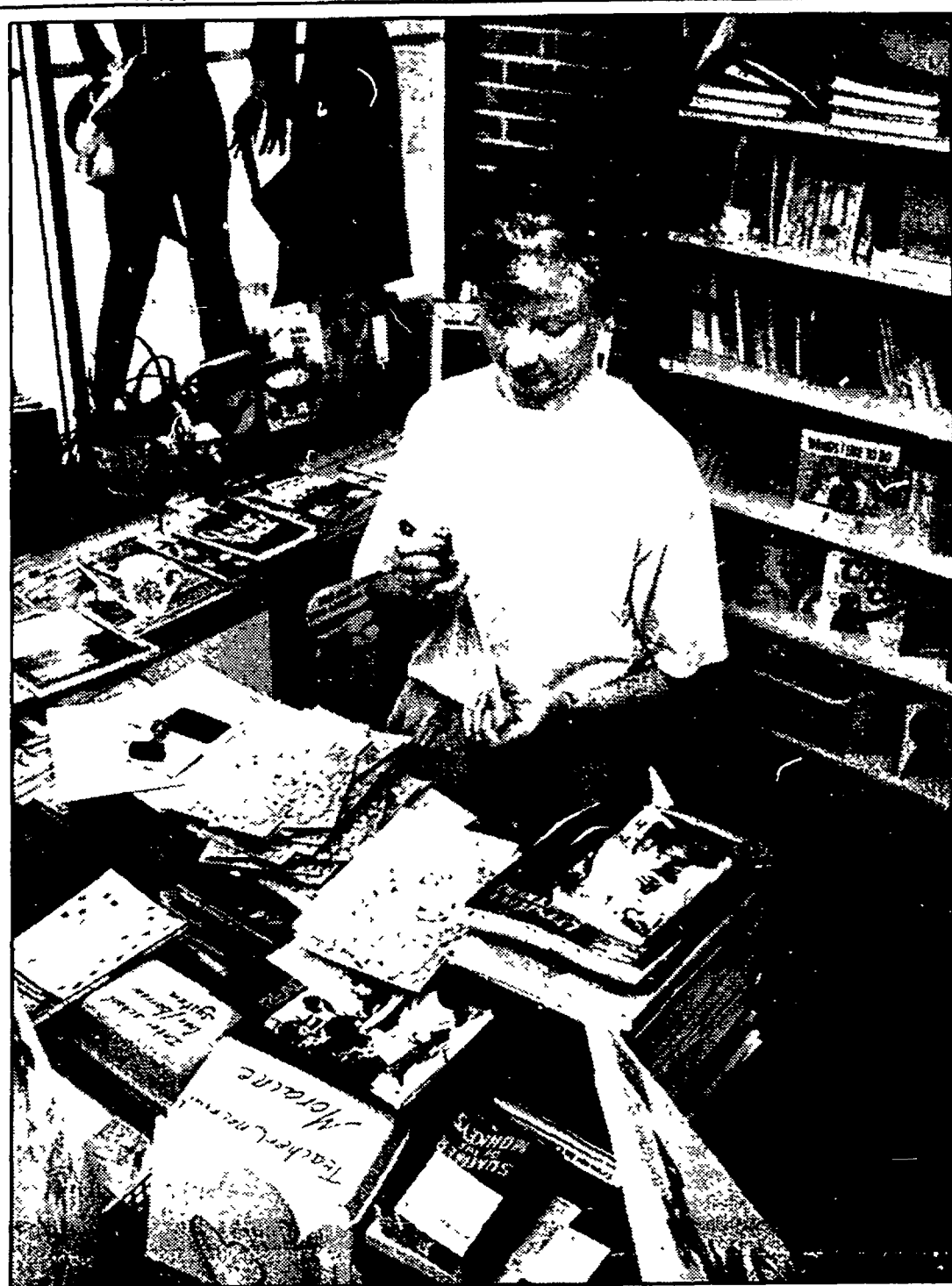

## Process set to replace Goss

**WANTED:** Township supervisor candidates. Duties include riding herd over local government in fast-developing Wayne County community with 17,000 population. Must be able to politic and arm-twist if necessary. Experience is relative. Part-time position with perks and mid-\$20s to start. Northville Township residents only need apply.

The township board put out the call for Georgina Goss' successor last week, saying it will accept resumes for a 10-day period starting immediately and will make a selection prior to the end of the month.

Goss, who last week was elected to the 36th District state House seat vacated in April by Gerald Law, chaired her final board session Aug. 28, and capped her five-year tenure by recommending a supervisor succession process.

Goss' plan, modified by Trustee James Nowka, would allow interested candidates to send resumes to Clerk Tom Cook in a 10-working-day period between Sept. 3 and 16.

At the end of the resume collection period, Cook will forward copies of the resumes to the balance of the township board. The board is to review the resumes and conduct interviews at an open board session. That session has yet to be scheduled, but likely would be set for Sept. 18 or 19.

The board could entertain nominations at that point and select Goss' successor. Nominated candidates would need votes from at least four of the six standing board members to claim victory.

Goss is scheduled to sever her township board ties this week. She will not vote in the succession process.

Board members can vote for themselves as successors, according to

## Minorities played part locally

Each Monday until the Victorian Festival, Sept. 13-15, the Record is publishing an article describing some aspect of life in Victorian Northville. Today's article looks at the minority population in early Northville.

Before the Yerkes family settled Northville in 1826, and even before Columbus sailed the ocean blue in 1492, historians speculate that Asian people may have crossed the Bering Strait from Asia to North America.

Some of these people may have made it as far as southeastern Michigan, leaving reminders of their existence for the European settlers to come.

In 1818, government land was opened to settlement in Southeast Michigan. Pioneers came mainly from New York to farm the land that is now Northville.

The number of American Indians in Michigan was small. It is unlikely



early settlers encountered many problems with native Americans, although one of Northville's earliest settlers, Abraham Markham, may have been an exception.

Markham wrote his history at nearly 80 years of age. The history is in Volume 2 of the Pioneer Collections of the Pioneer Society of the State of Michigan, located in the Plymouth Historical Museum and reprinted in Jack Hoffman's *Northville — The First Hundred Years*.

"One day . . . an old Indian came to my shanty while I was cooking some pork and beans. It was raining and he stopped during the rain and then went on, and I went to my work."

"When I came in from work I thought I would have a fine supper, but there was no food in the house. That old 'red skin' had returned and taken everything eatable, pork and beans, and all that I had in that line, leaving me not a morsel for my supper or breakfast," Markham wrote.

Markham later met a tribe of Indians whose chief, Blue Jacket, was a graduate of Hamilton College. He was guided by member of Blue Jacket's tribe in a journey to Ypsilanti. During the trip, Markham killed a bear, whose fur was traded by two other Indians in Blue Jacket's tribe for "fire water" that they later shared with Markham.

The natives encountered by Markham were among the 10,000 American Indians who inhabited the entire state of Michigan in 1815, Hoffman speculates. These 10,000 were

spread out in small groups of non-warring tribes who lived by game hunting, according to Hoffman.

The existence of American Indians also fueled speculation about some local mysteries.

Six miles to the north of Northville lies Walled Lake. The lake was named for a four-foot-high stone wall that bordered its eastern shore.

Early local inhabitants believed the wall was built by an even earlier American Indian race. That belief was reinforced when a copper spear head and an iron ball were found nearby, Hoffman writes.

Hoffman said the theory is not baseless. Early Asian settlers were known to mine copper on Isle Royale, and these people could quite possibly have settled the area.

But today, a more popular theory says the wall was formed by glacial deposits, according to Arthur Hoffman's *Oakland County Book of History*.

the replacement outline, which brings up a possible dicey issue. Treasurer Betty Lennox, who sits on the board, would be able to vote for herself, review other candidates' resumes, and potentially ask questions that other candidates would not be able to ask her.

Lennox was not available for com-

ment Thursday on whether she would consider removing herself from the review process. Township attorney Ernest Essad was also unavailable for comment on whether Lennox's participation in interviews would create a conflict.

Lennox, who township insiders say is Goss' hand-picked choice, should be able to sit in on all inter-

views, Goss said Thursday.

"I think Betty Lennox is an honorable lady," Goss said. "I don't think she'd ask any questions that would put other candidates in a difficult situation."

"But the board could take care of any potential problems," she said. "Really, this is all at the discretion of the board."

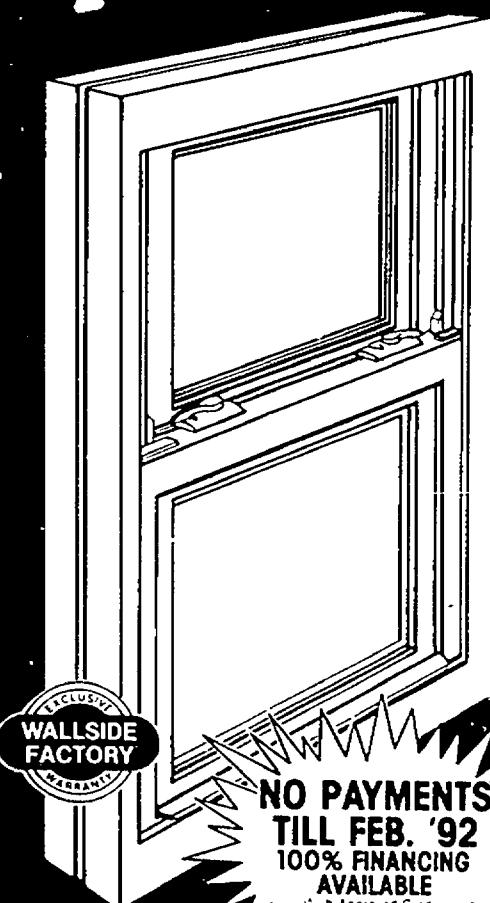

"It did burn through the roof," Allen said, but the firefighters were able to confine the damage primarily to the attic.

Next came a similar strike and fire on Bradburn near Springfield. The

residents were not home at the time, and neighbor Tom Lahiff helped contain the flames with a garden hose until the fire department arrived.

That house suffered damage to the attic, roof, part of an eave and part of a bedroom ceiling, Allen said.

The city firefighters also answered

a call of a lightning strike on Lexington south of Eight Mile. That bolt blew a hole through the house's roof, but did not start a fire, Allen said.

Meanwhile, in the township there was a report of a lightning strike and fire at a booth in Maybury State Park. Details were not available by press time.

City and township firefighters worked together throughout the storm, and Allen emphasized that the help was "very much appreciated."

"We did call the township for mutual aid. We're very thankful for them; this is what the ball game's all about," he said.

# Minorities played historic role here

Markham determined in the course of his travels and encounters with American Indians, "I am sure I was as well treated as wild men of the forest are capable of treating a human being."

Markham's treatment of native Americans in his memoirs may seem insensitive today, but over 40 years later Northville was more hospitable to minorities.

A community known as both Waterford and Meads Mill was located south of Six Mile Road and east of Northville Road. The community lost its labor force and by late in the century had disappeared from most maps.

But mid-century a manufacturing plant and wheat mill prospered in the village and were a link in the Under-

ground Railroad, protecting escaped slaves on their journey into Canada.

The mill burned in 1850 and was later replaced by an even larger and more prosperous mill. In the fire, an escaped slave working in the mill was trapped in a second floor office.

Robert Wallace jumped to save his life. Both his legs were broken and he was handicapped for life. Wallace later became a minister, according to Hoffman's account.

Another local man was reported to have been a former slave who came to Northville via the Underground Railroad. Early stories circulated that John Lewis used the Underground Railroad in his journey north, but Hoffman said Lewis was born in Ohio to a black Virginian who was born free and the half-white, half-black daughter of a white plantation owner

who freed his children upon his death.

Lewis was raised in Canada, and was one of the first settlers of Salem after serving in the first Colored Michigan Regiment. His son Frank Lewis said his father was the last Civil War veteran to die in Michigan, although the recognition has escaped him because of his race.

John Lewis died in 1941 and was buried in a family lot in Thayer Cemetery. Services were held at the

Casterline Funeral Home.

An obituary printed in *The Detroit News* said, "As honest as John Lewis" became the countryside yardstick when trying to establish the worth of someone. The white folks trusted him with their money, their livestock, their children."

## Area boy places in competition

No one can accuse Joey Spagnuolo of being just like all the other kids his age.

While most of his friends are out playing baseball, football or any other sports common to 11-year-olds, Spagnuolo spends time with his horses, a 2-year-old gelding named Trouble With Vern and a 4-year-old mare named Siera's Cover Girl.

Since April, the New Hudson resident has been showing his horses in competition around the state and the nation. So far he has proven quite successful.

The Tulsa competition, held at the Tulsa State Fair Grounds, is scheduled to be aired on ESPN.

Spagnuolo also rode Siera's Cover Girl in competition recently in the 13-and under novice class at the Michigan Quarterhorse Show's Western Pleasure competition in Sandusky, Mich.

In his first outing there, Spagnuolo placed fourth out of 15 riders.

Spagnuolo leads the state in 11-and-under showmanship competition.

Despite the numerous awards he's collected, Spagnuolo still hasn't reached the ultimate challenge of placing in a world competition.

"He'd like to get to a world show and win a class," said Janisse Spagnuolo.

Joey Spagnuolo also plays hockey at Lakeland Ice Arena and was an A student at Ann Dolsen Elementary School in New Hudson. As far as playing football, his mother said he's always wanted to play, but prefers to stick to horses for the moment.

"We don't try to pressure him into anything," she said. "If he wanted to play football I wouldn't object to it. If that's what interests him, that's fine."

## Bullard, Engler address tax sharing

State Rep. Willis Bullard, who represents part of Northville, in July joined eight state legislators in asking the governor to veto tax-base-sharing legislation.

But Gov. John Engler's recent response did not indicate he would join the opposition to tax base sharing.

Separate tax-base-sharing plans have passed in both the state house and senate. Both plans are sitting in conference committee. The plans would take half of new revenue from commercial and industrial property taxes and share them among school districts within large regions established by the state.

For example, 50 percent of all school taxes paid on new commercial or industrial developments in Northville would be shared throughout one of the state's two regions. The district also would share half the taxes gained from increased assessments on commercial and industrial property.

The plans are an attempt at equalizing state funding of school districts.

"We strongly urge you to veto (House Bill) 4267 if it arrives at your desk. We also urge you to veto any parts of the School Aid bill seeking to establish tax base 'sharing,'" the representatives told the governor in a July 11 letter.

The governor responded by saying he will not lower his school aid budget recommendations if the bill becomes law.

Engler also supported the idea of tax-base sharing to help alleviate funding inequities.

"This disparity is severe, and it continues to grow," he wrote.

"As governor, I have a responsibility to ensure, within the fiscal limits of our state, equal educational opportunity for all our children."

Engler said tax-base sharing is a good way to ease some of the differences in per-pupil spending between districts.

The representatives' letter said tax-base sharing destroys the "no-oor" school districts.

Engler responded that the bill will phase out the recapture of money from districts, like Northville, that are considered out-of-formula or property wealthy by the state funding system.

"Tax base sharing was designed so as to phase

out the categorical recapture on a district-by-district basis, largely because of the intense criticism of recapture by residents of out-of-formula districts," he wrote.

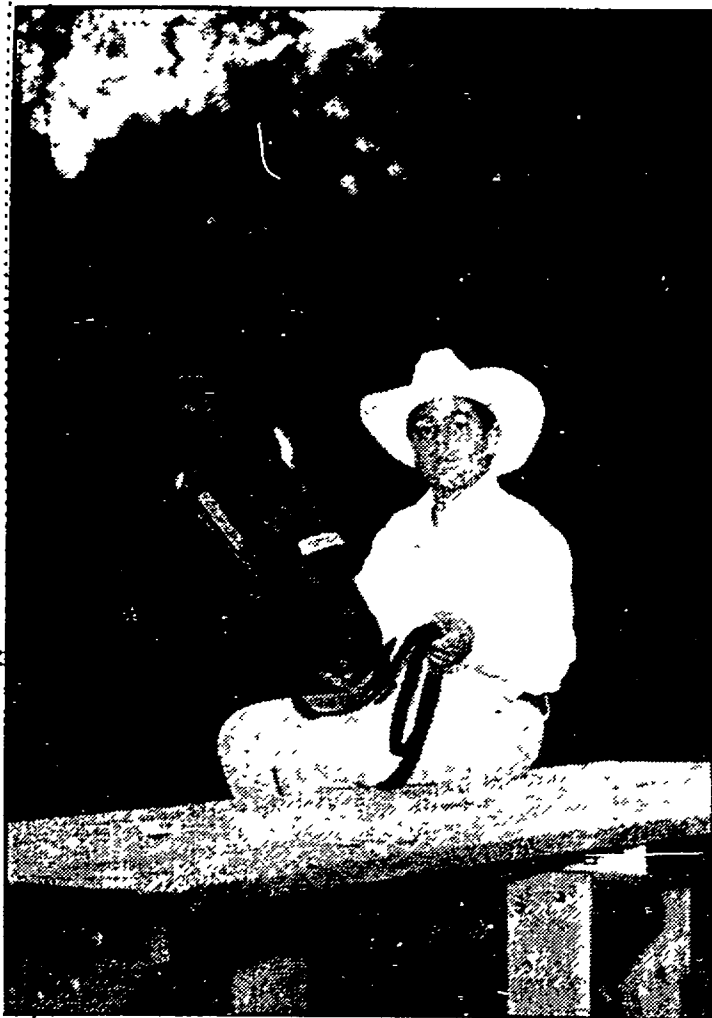
Part of the controversy holding the bills up in committee is over what percent of recaptured money will be returned to out-of-formula districts like Northville.

The representatives said in their letter that tax-base sharing sets a precedent for the state to take local property taxes.

"The establishment of the principal that local units' local property taxes no longer belong to them is a terribly wrongheaded and dangerous concept with which future legislatures and courts may toy at will," the letter said.

Engler's response disregarded the idea that local commercial and industrial taxes can be considered local.

"Is it fair that all school property taxes paid on a power plant or shopping mall are retained locally when the properties derive their economic value from a wide, regional consumer base?" Engler wrote.

### Any dam repair looks very far in the future

Last week's face-to-face gathering of state, county and local players in the Waterford Dam/Phoenix Lake drama appeared at surface level to be an encouraging step toward resolution of a troublesome issue.

A handful of Wayne County officials showed for the meeting. All voiced concern, primarily over downstream silting that has created an unwanted marsh at the mouth of Phoenix Lake. The state Department of Natural Resources sent two representatives, who actually made it half way through the 90-minute skull session before complaining that state budget cuts had sapped them of vital manpower.

Northville Township, which says it is without much influence in the issue, was represented by its manager, township attorney, and engineering consultant.

Frank Jonna, president of the firm that owns Waterford Dam, also was there, as were several residents who live on or near Waterford Pond or Phoenix Lake.

All the ingredients seemingly were in place to hash out a solid strategy for dam repair and downstream silt removal.

Alas, all that was accomplished was a promise that the Wayne County Commission would forward a resolution to the DNR requesting investigation and aid for a down-the-road cleanup and repair plan.

And we mean down the road. Assembled officials agreed to set a February or March 1992 deadline for state perusal of the resolution. Any real remedies could be delayed years, depending on the number of bureaucrats involved in the project.

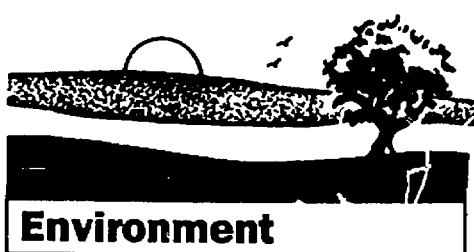
Waterford Dam gave way last January, and the contents of Waterford Pond dumped into the Middle Rouge River. The pond now is but a grassy meadow, with the Rouge trickling through. Phoenix Lake's mouth has dramatically filled with silt, and residents would be less than heartened to hear the DNR say that a swamp isn't all that bad.

If anything, the Aug. 28 meeting should send a loud and clear signal to Waterford/Phoenix residents: Government agencies will not provide a solution for this headache.

A cynical viewpoint, perhaps, but most likely accurate. County Commissioner Maurice Breen and some of the other officials seemed genuine in their concern, but it's obvious their power to force a remedy is limited.

Jonna holds the real hammer. He has made it clear that he would like to see Waterford Pond return, but by law, he doesn't have to rebuild the failed dam. His motivation to rebuild stems from a desire to develop about 39 acres on the northwestern portion of the pond site, and he needs access to his property. That access, by the way, would come in the form of a bridge/dam in the place of the current structure.

But a dismal economic outlook has

slowed Jonna's development plans. And the cost of a new dam and bridge could range between \$250,000 and \$500,000. If a new dam is to be built, he'd like some help from those who also would benefit from a second coming of Waterford Pond. Ideally for Jonna, that help would come in the form of a special assessment district comprised of pond area property owners.

Thus far, those property owners seem cool to special assessment district banter. Coughing up money to help Jonna build access to his developable land chafes some of those property owners. But they most likely will have to play ball with him or get used to Waterford Meadow.

The future may be brighter downstream. No one seems to disagree that tons of Waterford Pond lake bottom was swept into the Rouge and ended up as a silt bar at the mouth of Phoenix Lake. The county and state seem amenable to some future dredging plans, however vague their current language. And downstream residents have riparian rights, which may allow them to sue Jonna for upsetting the delicate balance of their waterfront property.

We think dredging Phoenix Lake is an idea that could be implemented fairly quickly. The DNR and county should embark on a study and prepare a plan to scour the lake. Dredging likely would be handled by the county, and could provide real relief by next summer. And before the county attempts to force a special assessment district on Phoenix Lake area residents, it should consider this: Shores of Northville developer D & T Construction was fined \$100,000 for its part in the Shores fiasco. The fine allegedly was to go into a special Wayne County fund for environmental projects.

Breen and Northville Township officials should insist that the \$100,000 go toward a Phoenix Lake dredge plan. Those funds could significantly reduce local resident out-of-pocket expenses, and should be used right here in Northville Township, not in Ecorse, not in Romulus, and not in Detroit. The township needs to gain county assurances — and now — that the fine will be used here.

The Waterford issue is a difficult one, and residents who really wish to effect change must band together to push bureaucrats and Jonna into real action. Unless the threat of lawsuits or other line-in-the-sand measures are implemented, our county and state employees likely will respond like, well, government employees.

### Judicial voters split the ticket



In 1990, I reported on the gulf on crime issues between state Supreme Court Justices Patricia Boyle and Michael Cavanagh, both seeking re-election. Although both were Democratic nominees, Boyle usually voted for prosecutors, Cavanagh for defendants. Republican nominee W. Clark Durant ripped into Cavanagh on issues — to no avail: Michigan voters stuck with the Irish incumbents, philosophy be damned.

Last week it happened again. Boyle sided with Justices Robert Griffin, Dorothy Comstock Riley and James Brickley (all Republicans) in favor of the prosecution. Cavanagh, now chief justice, dissented, joined by Justice Charles Levin.

In a Berrien County case, a woman was charged with telling police, falsely, that someone had shot at her at a local school. Her husband, W.C. Collins, allegedly offered an acquaintance, Earl Jordan, \$500 to lie in court that he had seen a rifle-carrying man flee the school grounds. Jordan told State Police, who, with his consent, monitored and recorded his telephone conversation with Collins. Police also equipped Jordan with a concealed radio transmitter.

State Police obtained a warrant which, for unexplained reasons, turned out to be legally defective. So when Collins was charged with obstruction of justice, Circuit Judge Ronald Taylor threw out that evidence, citing a 1975 state Supreme Court decision: Electronic monitoring, without a warrant, violates the Michigan Constitution — "unreasonable searches and seizures." (That sentence is similar to the Fourth Amendment of the U.S. Bill of Rights.) Our Supreme Court, with Boyle in the majority, reversed Taylor. The evidence can be used when Collins is re-tried.

Justice Griffin's 34-page majority opinion with 57 foot-

notes is heavy reading. It reversed the 1975 ruling, citing a 1979 U.S. Supreme Court ruling upholding conviction of one Caceres for bribing an IRS agent. Without a warrant, the agent wore a concealed radio which transmitted his chats with Caceres for recording by another agent. In that case, Justice John Paul Stevens (a Gerald Ford appointee) said Caceres had no constitutional right to rely on flaws in the agent's memory, or to challenge the agent's credibility, without being beset by corroborating evidence — the recorded conversation. In other words, if a witness can be asked to testify to what he remembers, he should be able to back up his memory with electronic surveillance — no search warrant needed. Griffin noted a 1968 national commission (established by Congress while Griffin was a U.S. senator) said such monitoring can be crucial in establishing the credibility of an informant, particularly since informants can be of dubious character. Monitoring also can protect the life of an agent or informant.

Cavanagh's dissent said the U.S. Supreme Court ruled only because of a change of justices, not for good reason. Cavanagh said the Michigan Supreme Court is "a sovereign, independent judicial body with ultimate authority to interpret Michigan law" that need not follow the U.S. court's lead "unless their reasoning is intrinsically persuasive on the merits." Cavanagh accused the majority of "expanding the rights of the police force to invade the privacy of the people without warrant or probable cause." He added some liberal rhetoric about courts being a "protector of the powerless," meaning defendants, not crime victims.

You don't care about my view of the court decision because I'm neither a judge nor a candidate. But I suggest Michigan voters habitually fail to do their homework and blindly vote for Irish names. Voters should have picked Boyle or Cavanagh — not both.

### Italian wines add flavor to meat dishes

We love Italian wines. They harmonize well with food.

Cook what you want. It doesn't have to be Italian cuisine. Prepare meat and potatoes, meat loaf or hamburgers. Italian wines will make anything you prepare taste better.

You probably don't believe that French wines require coq au vin or veal cordon bleu, so you needn't insist on veal parmesan or fettuccini with porcini mushrooms as matches with Italian wines.

The following are wine recommendations based on a recent tasting of two dozen Italian wines from a broad spectrum of Italian wine regions.

The wine firm of Mastroberardino is south of Rome in the region known as Campania.

**Lacryma Christi del Vesuvio**, grown in the volcanic ash at the foot of Mount Vesuvius, is a generous white wine. The 1989 version (\$13) boasts fresh, juicy apple and pear aromas and flavors.

Lungarotti is a winery in Umbria, near the hill city of Perugia, the only landlocked province of Italy.

Here, Theresa Lungarotti has taken over the winemaking reins from her father, Giorgio and is producing world-class wines.

Among Lungarotti's superb red wines are **1986 Rubesco** (\$13) and the **1980 Rubesco Riserva** (\$29).

Made from the same grapes as chianti, Rubesco is a versatile red that features good berry aromas and flavors — a wine to open and enjoy.

Lungarotti's Rubesco Riserva is a serious wine (with a serious price), released after eight years of aging in Lungarotti's cellar.

The red berry character is still there with added dimensions of leather, mushroom and spice. It's a big well-structured wine for the person who wants a real mouthful.

From personal visits with the Ceretto brothers in the Piedmont, we have learned first-hand their dedication to producing quality, value-price wines.

One of the outstanding white wines from this region is the **1989 Ceretto Arneis "Blange"** (\$20). It boasts fresh aromas and flavors with a freshness that is unbeatable either as a refreshing sipper or as an accompaniment to food.

The **1986 Ceretto Barolo "Zonchera"** (\$21) is undoubtedly the best value among Barolos on the market. Barolos are big red wines that frequently cost \$30 and more.

This wine has lots of flavor and is drinkable now. It has good structure in case you should want to age it for another year or two.

In Chianti are seven sub-regions or zones. Most people think Chianti Classico makes the best wine, but the word classico simply means the heart of the region. Capezzana, for instance, makes Chianti in the Montalbano zone, northwest of Florence.

The **1988 Capezzana Chianti Montalbano** (\$8) is blended with 10 percent cabernet sauvignon. It exudes fresh, supple fruit and is very easy to like.

Monsanto is a producer of chianti in the classico zone that stretches south of Florence to Siena.

If you prefer a big, chewy red wine with the added advantage of some age, try the **1982 Monsanto Chianti Classico Riserva "Il Poggio"** (\$28).

## Frozen yogurt

### 'Guilt-free' treat regains popularity

"Frozen yogurt? It's ice cream without the guilt," said a friend of mine during the late '70s as he considered financing one of the first stands in the Los Angeles area.

Ultimately, he decided against the deal, probably a wise choice because the product went through a rapid initial boom-and-bust cycle before it made a roaring comeback that continues apace today.

His observation about frozen yogurt remains acute. I would go further: Yogurt in general is not only food without guilt but a source of positive virtue in the diet.

It shows up in any course, from appetizer to dessert, and always it bestows a kind of nutritional benediction. It's the ingredient of choice for converting a fattening recipe into a dish you can eat with a clear conscience. Yogurt has become a talisman of health, warding off all sorts of dietary evils.

Since 1970, yogurt consumption in this country has increased six-fold, and it is growing at about 10 percent annually, according to the California Milk Advisory Board. Californians eat more than their share, 6.6 pounds per person in 1988, compared with the national average of 4.6 pounds.

Right now, the action concentrates on frozen yogurt, for which sales figures make heady reading. The product has shown an 800 percent gain in the past five years to an estimated total of \$1.2 billion. Industry analysts predict a total of \$2.6 billion in 1993.

Major chains such as McDonald's, Baskin-Robbins and Dairy Queen have joined in the scramble for the frozen-yogurt dollar, and dispensers turn up in an increasing number of supermarkets. Packaged frozen yogurt, as yet a minor factor overall, is the fastest-growing item in the freezer case, up 280 percent last year.

Humans have been eating clabbered milk products for almost as long as they have been gathering milk from animals. Leave raw milk at normal air temperature for a few hours, and it will ferment into a tart, thickened mass. Today, we know that the process is caused by several bacilli ubiquitous in the environment, primarily *Lactobacillus bulgaricus* and *Streptococcus thermophilus*.

The food must have seemed like a gift from the gods. The clabber kept much better than liquid milk, and it was less likely to make you sick. Folklore linking fermented milk to good health and longevity goes back to time immemorial.

The same idea is conventional wisdom in much of America and Western Europe today, thanks to advocates who have attributed the supposed longevity of Bulgarians and other remote peoples to the happy effect of ingesting *Lactobacillus bulgaricus*.

Modern science holds a much more skeptical view, but no one doubts that yogurt is a very good food.

"Yogurt in and of itself is a healthful food," said Isabelle Hunt, professor in the University of California at Los Angeles School of Public Health. "Low-fat yogurt — or better still, non-fat yogurt — is a great source of nutrients such as calcium, and it's convenient."

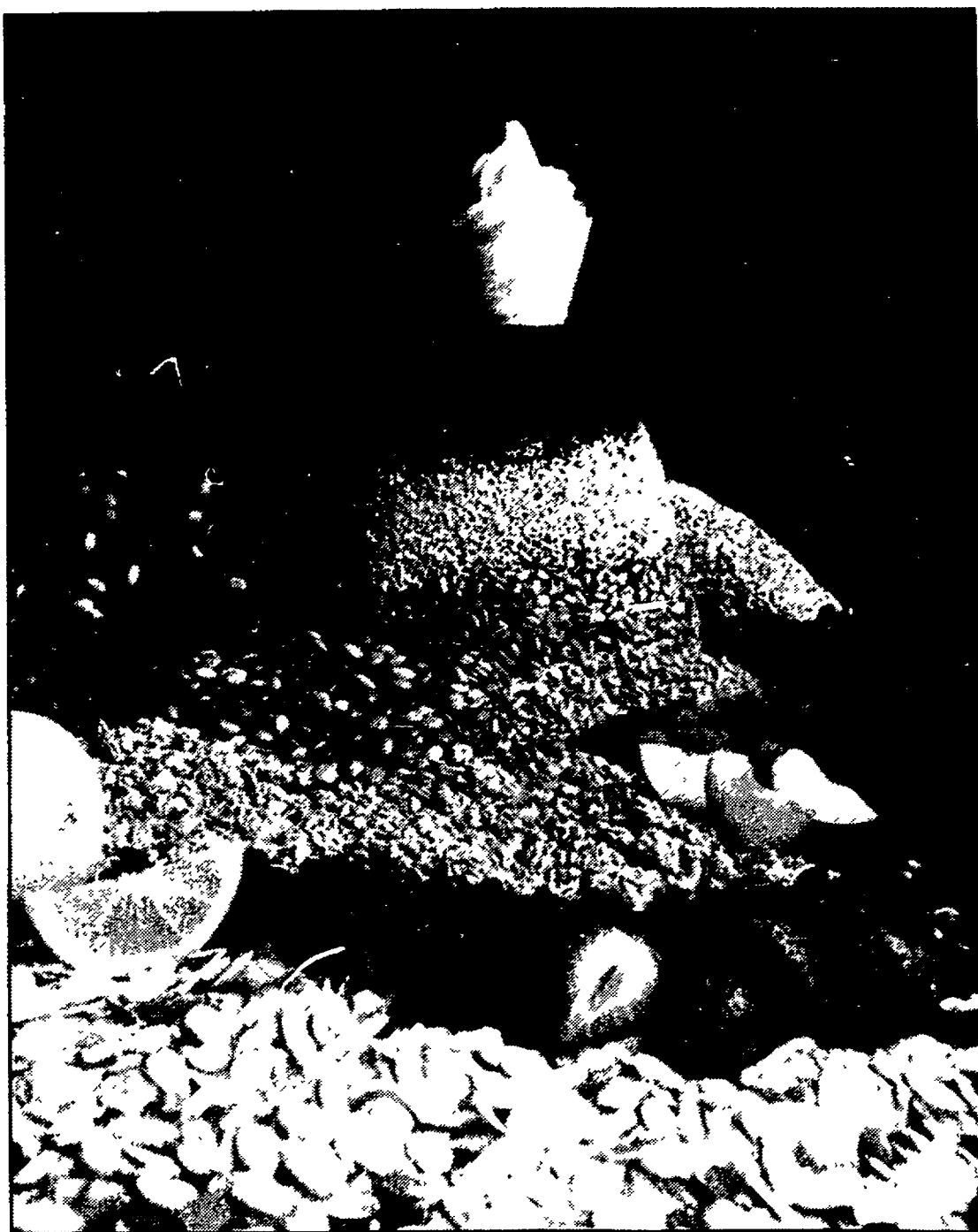
It's also a dairy food that can be eaten by a large number of people who cannot tolerate the milk sugar lactose.

"When yogurt is being fermented, about 70 percent of the lactose is converted to lactic acid," said Genevieve Ho, home economist and nutritionist with the UC Cooperative Extension in Los Angeles. "That's not 100 percent OK, but most people can tolerate it."

It may well have been the reduction of lactose that gave yogurt much of its reputation as a remedy for chronic indigestion. Another reason would be its antibiotic qualities. The bacilli that cause milk to ferment into yogurt aggressively repel other microbes that could cause disease.

Advocates of yogurt frequently have claimed that the friendly bacilli keep up their good work while in the human system. "Have you had your *Lactobacillus bulgaricus* today?" asks the National Yogurt Association.

Mainstream science has long scoffed at special

health claims being made on behalf of yogurt, but recent research suggests there may be something to the idea. Yogurt and other forms of cultured milk may help fight disease, studies indicate, and thereby could enhance life expectancy.

Several theories link fermented milk foods and cancer prevention, while other researchers see evidence that such products enhance the immune system and combat maladies from vaginitis to dysentery.

Whether such effects make a significant difference remains to be seen, and it's worth noting that none of the nutritionists I contacted — including one who worked for the dairy industry — was aware of any special virtue in yogurt aside from the widely agreed nutritional value.

The supposed benefits of *Lactobacillus bulgaricus* and other benign microbes in fermented milk products raise the question of whether that dish of frozen yogurt, enjoyed as a healthy dessert, really was yogurt.

The first boom in frozen yogurt petered out when customers tired of a taste that many found too sour or even bitter. The second wave, which started in the mid-'80s and has yet to crest, began to roll when manufacturers came up with new and more popular formulas.

These, critics charge, are really ice milk products with a bacterial cultures added at the end. The U.S.

Food and Drug Administration is working on a formal definition of frozen yogurt that could, in principle, deny the name to many such products now on the market. Most industry observers believe that the agency will end up sanctioning whatever the market now allows.

Whether true yogurt or not, the frozen product is being pressed by new competition by reformulated ice milk products that appeal to customers looking for a guilt-free treat, low in fat and cholesterol.

These brands, sold by the package in freezer cases, are too new in the market to have made much of an impact, but some industry observers believe they could provide tough rivals for frozen yogurt.

So-called yogurt candy is another product made from essentially unfermented milk solids with some bacteria added. Yet other products begin with a true cultured milk but kill the bacilli with heat treatment at the end of the manufacturing process; these can not offer the benefits, such as they are, of a live culture.

In many European countries, heat-treated products cannot be called "yogurt." The U.S. government, so far, is more tolerant although the Food and Drug Administration does require labeling as "heat-treated after culturing" in these cases. Yogurt with live cultures will carry the words "with active yogurt cultures" or similar language.

People have been making yogurt for millennia, and many keep up the custom today. You begin with pasteurized milk, heated until tepid, and add a prepared bacterial culture. Or you can stir in a few spoonfuls of commercial yogurt or buttermilk as a starter. Fermentation should take place in a few hours.

Those interested in trying the process would be well advised to follow instructions with the culture, available at health-food stores. You also can find specialized equipment for keeping the mixture at a temperature favorable to fermentation.

Most cooks will be satisfied to use yogurt in recipes, which exist today in multitudes. It's fair to say that the product has become a standard ingredient in the American kitchen.

We can begin a yogurt menu with a yogurt spread. In this case, we turn yogurt into a simple cheese by draining it of its whey. For other uses, the yogurt industry re-

Many articles have been published and documentaries broadcast recently concerning the hazards of ingesting raw foods.

Last year, an outbreak of Salmonella poisoning at the Hyatt in Chicago was the culprit which caused dozens of people to become ill. Uncooked eggs were determined to be the cause. Needless to say, the Hyatt lost millions in lawsuits and lost business.

Salmonella is routinely found in poultry products. In this case, an egg, which had a dirty shell, was cracked and the inside came in contact with the soiled shell. Of course, it was added to the batch of eggs being prepared for cooking.

At this point, the eggs were left unrefrigerated in a warm area and the bacteria grew to such levels that it poisoned many who ate them, even though they had been cooked.

A common but serious mistake was made. It has changed the way the food service industry uses eggs. Now we purchase pasteurized out-of-the-shell products. They are guaranteed to be Salmonella free when

delivered. With proper handling they will remain that way.

Sixty minutes did a segment several Sundays ago admonishing the practice of eating of raw shellfish. It was enough to make me a believer. The waters in which many of the oysters, mussels and clams are netted from are horribly filthy and the hepatitis virus is prevalent. It made sense.

In addition, our system of grading fish and shellfish is poor to say the least. With all the government regulations imposed on us in day-to-day life, there is a minimal quality check imposed on much of the food we buy. For this reason it is becoming more and more popular for markets and restaurants to purchase farm-raised fish and shellfish. We are guaranteed that the product we buy is disease free.

What can you do to protect yourself? Here are several suggestions.

The bottom line is that sanitarians (health officials) are convinced that serving

raw foods is hazardous to your health and can lead to an epidemic of food borne illness. Note that the word "epidemic" is defined as two or more people, not dozens.

Cooking is one of the critical controls against infection from food bacteria. Cooking in many cases will kill harmful bacteria. In some instances, it will not.

Keep foods refrigerated. Body temperature is the optimum temperature for bacteria to grow. Keeping food at 40 degrees (refrigerated temperature) will slow the growth. Cooking food to 140-165 degrees will stop development of bacteria.

If cooking large batches of soup, chili or sauces, place the pot in a sink of ice water to cool rapidly. Stir often. If a considerable amount of food that is warm is placed in the refrigerator, several things happen.

First, it cools from the outside to the inside. As this cooling process takes place, the center remains warm for hours and affords a perfect environment for the bacteria to grow.

It is not uncommon for the middle of the product to be warm the next morning.

In addition, placing hot food in the refrigerator causes the overall temperature to rise and jeopardize any other food. Follow the time and temperature rules.

Another common mistake is using the same cutting board for both raw and cooked foods and both for meat and non-meat items. Buy several boards, preferably non-wood, and label them for meat, poultry, vegetable/fruit and dairy. Sanitize them after each use in a solution of one cap of household bleach to one gallon of water.

In a recent study in New York State, it was determined that one of three outbreaks were caused by improper cooking.

Purchase shellfish from a reputable dealer. Keep them chilled between 32-40 degrees and do not store for prolonged periods of time. The ten fold increase in Salmonella has led the Centers for Disease Control to recommend that only pasteurized raw eggs be

used in salads and the like. All other eggs should be cooked completely — boiled for seven minutes, fried for three minutes on each side or poached for five minutes.

Raw fishery products as popular with Sushi are posing a relatively new problem — tapeworm and roundworm infection. These parasites are killed with cooking and are not harmful unless eaten raw. The Food and Drug Administration ruled last year that fish that is to be served in an uncooked state must be first flash-frozen to 10 degrees below zero or lower for seven days or blast frozen to 31 degrees below zero or lower for 15 hours.

Finally, a word of caution about meat. The rarer it is served, the higher the likelihood of ingesting harmful bacteria. It is still the rule to cook pork through to kill any trichina that may be present.

The key is to minimize eating raw foods. It will take only one instance of food poisoning to convince you.

commends stirring back in the whey that separates from it stands — the thin liquid contains nutrients.

## SOUTH-OF-THE-BORDER YOGURT SPREAD

2 (8-ounce) containers plain non-fat yogurt without gelatin (see note)  
1/4 cup reduced-calorie mayonnaise  
2 tablespoons chili powder  
1/8 teaspoon salt  
Dash red pepper

Yields 1/2 cup.

Line large strainer with double thickness of cheesecloth; set over 1/2 gallon bowl. In another bowl, combine yogurt, mayonnaise, chili powder, salt and red pepper. Turn into prepared strainer. Pull up corners of cheesecloth and twist so that mixture is completely covered.

Refrigerate until mixture has drained and taken on spreadable consistency. Turn mixture into small bowl. Serve with vegetables or crackers.

Note: Yogurt sometimes contains gelatin to give it more body; it will be listed on the label. Gelatin will inhibit necessary drainage.

Using the same technique, you can make a yogurt cheese to be flavored as you like.

Yogurt cheese: simply turn yogurt into strainer, lined as in preceding recipe, and allow it to drain, refrigerated.

Blue Cheese Dip: fold 2 tablespoons crumbled blue cheese into 1 cup yogurt cheese.

Fruity Yogurt Spread: fold 1/3 cup jam into 1 cup yogurt cheese. Spread on muffins, toast or the like.

In the Middle East and India, yogurt is often cut with iced water to make a drink. Sometimes, fruit, such as mango, is added. This is an American adaptation of this idea.

## YOGURT SHAKE

1 cup plain yogurt  
1 small banana  
1 tablespoon frozen orange juice or apple juice concentrate (or sugar or honey)  
4 ice cubes

Yields about 2 1/2 cups.

Place all ingredients into blender or food processor. Whirl until smooth.

Variations: instead of banana, use 1 cup cubed

1 cup plain yogurt  
1 tablespoon chopped fresh dill  
1 tablespoon Dijon-style mustard  
1 teaspoon lemon juice  
1/4 teaspoon red pepper sauce (to taste)

Yields about 1 cup.

Mix together all ingredients.

## YOGURT MUFFINS

1 cup rolled oats  
1/3 cup oat bran  
1 cup boiling water  
1 cup sugar  
1/3 cup oil  
2 eggs  
2 cups low-fat or non-fat yogurt  
2 cups flour (either all white or half whole-wheat and half white)  
2 teaspoons baking soda  
2 cups bran cereal

Yields 18 to 24 muffins.

Preheat oven to 375. Combine oats, bran and water. Mix in sugar, oil, eggs and yogurt. Combine flour, baking soda and bran cereal. Stir into liquid mixture until just blended. Spoon into greased or paper-lined muffin tins. Bake 15 minutes, or until muffins test done.

The batter will keep, covered and refrigerated, for 10 days.

Variations: add 1 cup fresh or frozen blueberries, raspberries or cranberries and 1 tablespoon grated orange zest.

Add 1 cup chopped nutmeg and optionally, 1/4 cup diced ham.

Add 1 cup shredded zucchini and 1/4 cup crumbled cooked bacon or sausage.

Yogurt does duty as a salad dressing, too.

## PASTA SALAD WITH PARMESAN YOGURT DRESSING

8 ounces rotini, uncooked (see note)  
1 1/2 cups plain non-fat or low-fat yogurt  
1 cup cubed cooked chicken  
1 cup thinly sliced sweet pepper  
1 cup thinly sliced carrots  
1 cup broccoli florets  
1 cup halved cherry tomatoes  
1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese  
1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
Dash pepper

Yields 4 servings.

Cook rotini according to package directions. Rinse in cold water and drain well. Put in large bowl. Add remaining ingredients and toss until well mixed. Serve at once or cover and chill until ready to serve.

Note: rotini is spiral-shaped pasta. Other shapes, such as shells, can be substituted.

And finally, here's a way to make your own freezer yogurt. Fair warning: it may not be quite like what you can buy at the store, because commercial products use stabilizers and other ingredients unavailable to the home cook.

## VANILLA FROZEN YOGURT

2 cups plain whole-milk yogurt  
1/4 cup honey  
1 cup evaporated milk  
2 tablespoons vanilla

Yields 4 servings

Mix ingredients together, chill thoroughly. Process in ice cream freezer according to manufacturer's instructions.

Less than an hour, Door 2 Door will deliver gastronomic bliss to your doorstep from any one of 40 popular Oakland County eateries listed in its 80-page restaurant menu guide. . . Satisfaction guaranteed.

Door 2 Door delivers lunch and dinner from restaurants in Birmingham, Bloomfield, Bloomfield Hills, Franklin, Huntington Woods, Orchard Lake, Royal Oak, Southfield Troy and West Bloomfield.

Think of the possibilities. Pizza from Buddy's, Charley's Louisiana Shrimp, Fox and Hounds or burgers from Matt Brady's.

All this, and more, brought to your home or office by drivers dressed in waiter-like uniforms who will even set the table.

Leave the driving to them while you unwind. Place an order from your car phone or when you get home. Take a shower, shuck your suit for a comfy pair of sweats, open your mail, relax. Don't worry about fumbling for money when they arrive.

"For the safety of the drivers, we don't accept cash," said Kirk Scott, 31, president of Door 2 Door based in Clawson. "We accept Visa, MasterCard or personal checks."

# Flowers give pleasure in so many ways

Flowers give pleasure in so many ways. Gardeners get enjoyment from growing them. They are fun to receive as a bouquet or corsage on special occasions. They please the eye with their beauty. They caress the nose with their fragrance. And some are even good to eat.

For instance, edible sunset-colored nasturtiums are tart and slightly spicy—a popular addition to salads or to decorate desserts. Nasturtium seeds and leaves are also edible.

Sun-dried marigold centers can be used as a substitute for saffron, the most expensive spice.

Saffron, by the way, also comes from a flower—from the stigma of the bluish-purple *Crocus sativa*. The small, reddish stigmas must be picked by hand (there are three per flower) and it takes at least 75,000 flowers to make a pound of saffron. No wonder it's so costly!

Also edible are young marigold leaves, sometimes used in salads, and geranium leaves, used to flavor some desserts.

Tender spring dandelion greens may be steamed and served as a vegetable, or added to salads and omelets. Roses and violets are often used to make confections, and a variety of chrysanthemum grown by the Japanese is served pickled.

Never eat a flower or plant unless you are absolutely certain it is safe—it may look harmless, but it could be dangerous, even poisonous.

Avoid, for instance, lily of the valley, morning glory and periwinkle.

Even when you are sure that a flower is edible, take care to use only blooms and leaves that have not been sprayed with any pesticides.

Fresh spring flowers are lovely while they last, but you can preserve them by drying them in your microwave, so they will give pleasure all year round. Choose brightly col-

ored blooms to dry: carnations, daffodils, roses, violets, zinnias.

Select fresh, unblemished flowers. Sturdier flowers should be at the peak of bloom; more delicate blossoms should be only partially opened, such as fully blown flowers will lose petals more easily. Older flowers, past their prime, may brown during drying process.

Cut stems of flowers down to 1 inch. (Use floral wire and purchased artificial leaves to reconstruct stems after drying.)

To microwave-dry flowers:

You may use one of three ingredients to dry flowers. The cheapest (and you may already have it on hand) is kitty litter. Or use an equal mixture of borax and cornmeal, or silica gel grains (available at most hobby shops). Silica gel is best for flowers with smooth, fragile petals, such as daffodils, roses and orchids. Wear rubber gloves to protect hands from drying agent.

Measure an inch of drying agent into the bottom of a wide-mouth jar (to dry one flower) or casserole (to dry several at a time). Place the flower(s) bloom-up in container, then carefully spoon in drying agent to cover. Use a toothpick or small screwdriver to gently separate petals, being careful that they do not bend out of shape with the weight of the drying agent. Make sure flower is completely covered with drying agent.

To dry, place a 1-cup glass measure full of water in the rear of the microwave (water will absorb microwave energy). Place container with flower(s) and drying agent in oven and microwave at high (100 percent power) setting approximately 1 1/2 to two minutes for smaller flowers (daffodils, roses, violets) and 2 1/2 to three minutes for carnations or zinnias. (Note: Always dry two to three carnations at a time.)

Remove from oven and let stand five to 10 minutes,

then carefully pour drying agent from container. Remove flower, tapping gently to remove any remaining grains of drying agent. Set flower aside. Let drying agent cool completely before reusing. This is a nice way to preserve June wedding bouquets.

You can also microwave potpourri from sweet-smelling flower blossoms, to scent drawers, closets and suitcases. Or place in a pretty bowl to decorate and scent an entire room.

Use rose-scented sugar in baked goods or to sweeten tea.

Glazed violet blossoms make pretty decorations for cakes and desserts—and they're edible, too. (Remember to use only roses and violets that have not been sprayed.) (Recipes in this column are tested in 625- to 700-watt microwave ovens.)

## MICRO-TIP OF THE WEEK

How safe is your microwave? When used properly, it is one of the safest appliances in your home. Governmental restrictions set strict limits on the level of energy that can be emitted by microwave ovens, and as soon as the door is opened, microwave production ceases.

Keep your oven clean, for safety! A clean door that closes and seals properly is important for safe operation.

## SPRINGTIME POTPOURRI

- 2 quarts rose petals
- 1 quart geranium petals
- 1 cup peppermint leaves
- 1 cup lavender petals
- 8 whole cloves
- 1 tablespoon ground nutmeg

- 10 drops rose oil
- 2 teaspoons Orrisroot

Yields 60 ounces.

To dry flower petals for potpourri, pick them in the morning right after the dew has dried. Layer petals on a microwave-safe tray and dry on low (30 percent power) setting for 4 minutes. Stir gently to rearrange and repeat 4-minute cycles until the individual petals are brittle to the touch.

Combine all ingredients and store in glass jar, tightly covered, and let potpourri sit for 5 to 6 weeks. Turn and rotate jar to rearrange contents once a day.

## ROSE SUGAR

- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 fragrant rose

Yields 9 ounces.

Pour sugar into microwaveable bowl. Bury rose in sugar and microwave on medium (50 percent power) setting for 1 minute. Pour immediately into clean, dry glass jar with tight-fitting lid. Cover tightly and place jar in full sunlight and shake it every other day for 2 to 3 weeks, as the flavor works its way through.

Use this sugar in place of regular sugar in tea or in dessert recipes—the sugar will seem a bit sweeter.

Variation: To make powdered rose sugar, place 1 cup of flavored sugar (without blossoms) in your blender with 1 teaspoon cornstarch and blend on high speed for 2 minutes, or until sugar is a fine powder. Let mixture rest for a week or so before using.

## Easy dishes for tight schedules

More and more is heard these days about moving back into the kitchen. Even though most people don't have as much time to cook as they would like, eating in has nevertheless become as popular as eating out.

For anyone with a particularly harried schedule who wants to entertain friends from time to time, there is one stratagem that is fiendishly efficient. Give a cooking demonstration in the kitchen.

You don't have to be a superb cook to pull it off. Just have one good dish that you are particularly proud of and put it together in front of your guests. It could be as simple as crab salad, as fast as stir-fried chicken, as exotic as passion fruit soufflé. All that is needed is that you be comfortable with the recipe procedure.

A huge kitchen is not required. I know one excellent French cooking teacher who instructs four or five students in her kitchen that is smaller than a lot of walk-in closets. If there isn't a center island for demonstrating, it doesn't matter. Friends can look over your shoulder.

Guests can also participate. This is where practicality comes in. If a sauce needs stirring, someone can do that while you are beating egg whites. Neat friends will also pitch in and start cleaning up a bit.

If the kitchen has a dining alcove that is large enough, serve right there. Entertaining and eating in the kitchen have become quite stylish. There is something wonderfully warm and cozy about the atmosphere since the kitchen is an honest workplace.

Obviously the rest of the menu will have to be prepared—or bought—in advance since you will be thoroughly occupied. With pasta

being so popular these days, let's plan a menu around a spaghetti main course.

One spaghetti dish that is not encountered very often when dining out is as simple, basic and inexpensive as you can get—pasta aglio e olio. In case your Italian isn't up to snuff, it's spaghetti with a peasanty garlic-and-oil sauce.

With no meat in the main course, an assortment of Italian salamis and sausages makes an appropriate beginning. Place bowls of oil-cured olives and marinated mushrooms along with the meats.

A large mixed green salad is all that is needed with the pasta. If you would like to spark it a little, add fresh grapefruit sections to the salad. The greens can be prepared in the bowl, covered with a dish towel and refrigerated until dinnertime. Toss the leaves with the dressing just before serving.

If you want to finish the meal in Italian style, serve fresh fruit and perhaps some walnuts in the shell. Digging out the sweet nut kernels becomes sort of a reward for the chore of cracking the shells. An angel food cake with lemon custard sauce is another finale with flourish.

Move the cocktail hour into the kitchen so friends can sip and watch at the same time.

Now suppose you are not really comfortable about cooking in front of people. Look among your friends. Is there someone who loves to cook and is a bit of a showman? Star that person as the chef and plan the menu around his or her specialty.

## Keep those mayo dishes safe

You had a great time at last weekend's picnic, but you heard that several people ended up sick afterward.

There was a tasty-looking mayonnaise-based salad on the table, but you passed it by, and now you're thankful you did.

You've heard that mayonnaise can be dangerous at summer picnics, and you were right to avoid it. Weren't you?

Actually, it's not likely that the mayo was the culprit. Mayonnaise is slightly acid, and the bacteria that cause food poisoning don't grow in an acid environment. In fact, adding mayonnaise to a meat, fish, poultry, pasta or potato salad may actually slow the growth of bacteria present in other ingredients. (That is, if the mayonnaise is commercially produced. Commercial mayo is more acid than homemade recipes.)

Still, during the hot summer months, extra precaution should be taken when handling any food—including mayonnaise-based dishes—to prevent food poisoning. Food poisoning bacteria multiply rapidly in temperatures of 80 degrees Fahrenheit and above. The incidence of food-borne illness increases during the summer because many people leave food sitting out on picnic tables where it's fair game for those busy bacteria. To be safe, serve hot foods hot and keep cold foods on ice, in a refrigerator or ice chest, until it's time to eat.

Again, for safety, avoid recipes for homemade mayonnaise that call for raw eggs. Raw yolk is the central ingredient in mayonnaise, which also typically contains vegetable oil, an acid (lemon juice, vinegar), seasonings and perhaps sugar. Salmonella bacteria could be present in uncooked egg yolks, and the combination of a low-acid mayo recipe and a hot summer day could lead to problems. Commercially produced mayo is fine, though, because it contains pasteurized eggs.

If you really want to make your

own, try mayo's close cousin, a cooked salad dressing. The easy microwave version below has a rich, creamy consistency, and eggs are cooked, so any bacteria present will be killed. It's great in salads and spreads smoothly over sandwiches. Be sure to refrigerate unused portions promptly and use within a week. In other recipes below, use commercially produced mayonnaise.

There's no reason to "hold the mayo" during summer months—if you play it safe. (Recipes in this column are tested in 625- to 700-watt microwave ovens.)

## MICRO-TIP OF THE WEEK

When microwaving mayonnaise for sauces, etc., heat gently at MEDIUM-LOW (30 percent power) setting to ensure smooth and creamy results.

## MICRO-COOKED SALAD DRESSING

- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon each dry mustard and salt
- Dash each ground white pepper and paprika
- 3/4 cup light cream

- 2 egg yolks
- 2 tablespoons white vinegar
- 1 tablespoon butter or margarine, softened

Yields about 1 1/2 cups.

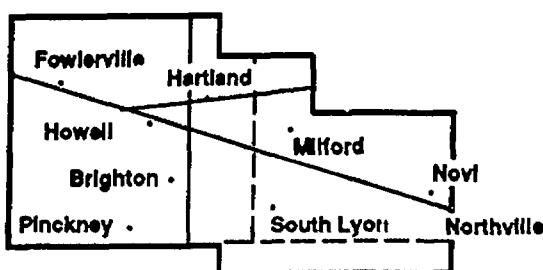

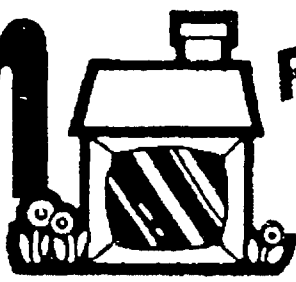

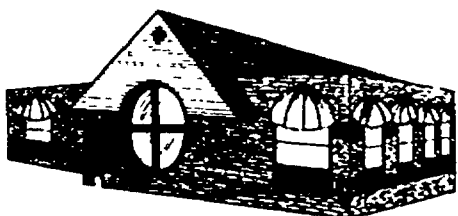

# Ed Asner hopes to color ratings 'Rosie' on CBS

## Young Lisa Rieffel sees expanded role

The appeal for higher ratings may be the most trying aspect of "The Trials of Rosie O'Neill," but the defense has not rested. Thursday, Sept. 12, is the appointed date for the fall premiere of the CBS drama, and the cast and crew have been hard at work all summer to ensure their second season summons enough viewers to deliver a positive verdict.

Sharon Gless, a two-time Emmy winner for "Cagney & Lacey," returns as Rosie O'Neill, a corporate lawyer who becomes a public defender after a difficult divorce from her husband and his law firm. Her series, which is produced by her real-life husband, Barney Rosenzweig, has won critical acclaim for the reality of its situations and portrayals, but its Thursday night time-slot puts it up against NBC's Cheers, the leader of the pack.

When Rosie went into summer repeats, the show dropped even further behind in the ratings, prompting talk of cancellation.

The call went out for a hired gun, an actor with more Emmys than anyone and a glare that could reduce Mary Tyler Moore to tears. Yes, none other than dramatic heavyweigh. Ed Asner, two-term president of the Screen Actors Guild and outspoken stalwart of liberal political causes.

Asner comes on board to play Walter Kovatch, a bigoted ex-cop who ended his 35-year police career after arresting his son for selling drugs. Hard-nosed Kovatch had always believed the public defender's office to be his nemesis, but is persuaded to join Rosie's team as an investigator. Asner reports "the chemistry is working well" on the set, but character-wise, we viewers know we're in for an explosive personality conflict. He is proud his new series "isn't

sugarcoated" and presents life as it really is; this is from a man who tells it like it is.

After having successfully transferred his popular Lou Grant character from a comedy to a dramatic series, CBS canceled Lou Grant amid controversy that Asner was perhaps using his fictional-newsman credibility to further his own political causes. Rather than let his spirit be broken, Asner continued his campaigns, even joining a boycott against Maxwell House (which buys El Salvadoran coffee), bringing threats from their parent corporation, the ultrapowerful TV sponsor Proctor & Gamble. CBS has forgiven him, proving that when the chips are down, a man's worth is undeniable.

Another change in the series

involves an expanded role for Rosie's former stepdaughter Kim Ginty (Lisa Rieffel). In a forthcoming episode, Kim moves in with Rosie, thereby further exploring their relationship and giving Rosie more stress to talk over with her shrink. At age 16, Rieffel is already a veteran of Broadway and films, as well as other TV series, and says she loves the work.

"I wake up at five, work a 10½ hour day, and come home and just sleep and get ready for tomorrow. It's so cool!"

In the fall, Rosie O'Neill will still face off against Cheers, but it will also serve as the lead-in to Nielsen-favorite "Knots Landing." With a one-two punch like that, CBS may well win Thursday night after all.
