Developer makes plans to repair eroded plot

The wheels of justice took a slow turn in favor of a township couple last week, as developers and attorneys tentatively agreed on a plan to repair James and Ann Malecki's erosion-wracked property.

An apparent settlement on the Shores of Northville-bordered Malecki land came after two days of negotiations between Shores developers and engineers, state Department of Natural Resources officials, and attorneys representing the Maleckis and Northville Township.

The preliminary plan would include funneling the waters of tiny Sump Drain through pipes in a current cavity in the Malecki property, and gaining an easement from a neighboring property owner.

Shores engineers and DNR officials say the plan would be a permanent remedy to massive erosion and property damage the Maleckis suffered when a culvert on Shores property gave way during heavy rains last December.

The developers and DNR also claim to be near accord on temporary repair plans for Sump Drain inside the Shores property and to property extending to near Ridge Road.

Negotiations were ordered by Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Pamela R. Harwood, who said she was "very pleased with what you all did" during head-to-head meetings Friday.

Harwood scheduled another session for 12:30 Sept. 27 to finalize the Sump Drain repair plan.

Shores engineering consultant William Thompson said he did not know what the proposed repair could cost, but said repairs could be completed in "days versus weeks," after a strategy is finalized.

The Maleckis, who last winter watched much of their backyard dissolve into a sudden Sump Drain torrent, were pleased but cautious about the tentative agreement.

James Malecki said he was "satisfied, with reservations. Basically, they're trying to restore as much as they can of the stream," he said.


Another drama in the controversial Shores case began to unfold while officials huddled over the Sump repair plan.

A team headed by West Bloomfield developer Gary Sawka reportedly is prepared to step into the Shores project. Current members of the Shores development team — known as the Seven Lakes of Northville Limited partnership — are said to be squabbling over financial matters, and Sawka's team could be looking to replace managing partner Vincent DiLorenzo, partner Angelo Evangelista, or one or both of the project's lending institutions.

Sawka on Thursday declined to comment on a possible deal, and DiLorenzo rejected suggestions that he was on the way out.

Judge Harwood brushed aside lending agency Alexander Hamilton Life's request to appoint a receiver for the 350-acre Shores property.

"I expect to get the relief drain issues finished next Friday," she said. "Then people will have to decide if they want to be part of this (development)."

SWAT school Officers train for tough situations

John Sherman balanced himself on the rung of a helicopter's landing bars, whirling blades above, the ground some 80 feet below.

Sherman, a sergeant with the Northville Township police department, leaned back in a crouched position. His partner on the opposite side of the chopper mirrored his moves.

Strong ropes anchored inside the helicopter wove through a buckle rig and wrapped around the men's

waists. The trailing ropes dangled to the earth.

Then the men jumped in unison, and smoothly slid down the ropes. No hitches, no problems.

And no worries, except for those students faced with repeating the task.

Sherman and Canton police Lt. Robin Cripe's jump from the helicopter last week demonstrated one of the final hurdles for a training class in a Special Weapons and Training (SWAT) school.

SWAT training was a grueling three-week test of physical and

mental endurance, said Sherman, who has years of such training under his belt and who headed up this training class.

"It's very physically demanding," Sherman said. "There's usually a high drop-out rate."

This recent class was no exception. Eighteen of 29 candidates for state SWAT certification jumped ship before graduation ceremonies last Friday.

Police departments in Northville Township, Livonia, Beverly Hills,

Incumbents all in race, but no other

This year's city council elections are shaping up to be little more than an exercise in ballot-counting.

Mayor Chris Johnson and council members Carolann Ayers and Paul Folino are up for re-election Nov. 5. As of Friday, only the three incumbents had pulled petitions for their positions.

All three plan to pursue their re-election bids. Ayers had been uncertain whether she would run again in August, but on Friday she declared herself a candidate.

Johnson is seeking a third two-year term, while Ayers is seeking her fourth four-year term and Folino his sixth.

City Clerk Cathy Konrad ex-

pressed some surprise at the apparent lack of competition in this year's race. "It seems to be typical that we don't get a whole lot of interest, but usually there's some competition," she said. "Usually there's three or four (candidates) running for two council seats. I was surprised that we had no interest this year. I guess people are satisfied with our government."

Candidates for the three positions must file nominating petitions at city hall by 5 p.m. on Oct. 1. The petitions may be picked up at the clerk's office at Northville City Hall, 215 W. Main St., and must be signed by 50-75 registered city voters before filing.

Nominees must be registered voters themselves, with at least two years of residence in the City of Northville.

Some answers on mining plan

Township and development officials have whittled down the list of questions surrounding a proposed gravel-mining operation, but could be weeks from a decision on the controversial issue.

The township planning commission last Tuesday again tabled the request for a special-land-use permit, and told the developer to provide more information on key issues such as future land use, property values, and water quality.

Residents jammed township hall to hear the latest discussion between Wixom-based Holloway Sand and Gravel and the planning commission. Many residents wrote letters asking the commission to reject Holloway's plan to develop a 177-acre mining operation at the corner of Ridge and Six Mile roads.

Others, like Docksey resident James Malecki, attended the meeting to speak their minds. Malecki, whose property borders the old Thomson gravel pit, complained about mining operation noise.

"Berms don't mean anything; it's just unbearable," he said. "Gravel pits (are) just raving the land."

Some residents, including Blue Heron Pointe subdivision dwellers, expressed concern about lake levels, water quality issues and property values. The planning commission and its consultants touched upon those fears.

Planning consultant Brad Strader of the WBDC Group called property value worries a "key issue." Strader said the rights of Holloway to develop its land had to be measured against the rights of neighboring property owners.

"How's it going to affect property values . . . ?" Strader asked.

A 10-year mining operation could have a negative impact on the community, according to the township's assessing firm.

In a letter to the commission, John

McLenaghan, of Wayne County Assessors, said similar operations have caused problems elsewhere.

McLenaghan said residents who lived near gravel mines in Lyon and Milford townships sued the townships for a 10-percent property-tax reduction. Residents in those communities were awarded reductions, McLenaghan said.

Commissioners also fretted about future land use on the site.

Holloway plans to leave a 55-acre lake in the wake of its mining operation, and many commissioners feel the property will be unsuitable for future industrial development.

"I feel the amount of loss from the lake itself is going to be a tremendous tax loss," Commissioner Larry Sheehan said.

Commission Chairperson Charles DeLand directed Holloway engineer Richard Zanotti to prepare a financial outlook analysis for the site.

Zanotti agreed to prepare an industrial plan, but wondered about the relevance of the request.

"There isn't a demand for (that) industrial property," he said. "Nobody came up to us and asked to buy (the property) because it's an industrial zone."

The township also trotted out experts in water quality and dust control, and DeLand asked the developer to prepare more information on water-related issues. He directed the developer and township staff to work together on the water plan.

Commissioners had the option of denying the plan, but opted to table the issue pending another review.

But DeLand did give Holloway a chance to raise a white flag.

"There are a whole lot of open issues," he said. He asked Zanotti if the firm wanted to "still go on."

"Oh, sure," Zanotti replied. "To some degree . . . I think we've gone from a great deal of issues to a few issues."

No date has been set for another hearing on the gravel-mining debate.

Baja seeks township supervisor post

Karen Baja is one of four Northville Township residents vying to replace Georgina Goss as township supervisor. Baja has served six years on the township zoning board of appeals, including the past two years as the ZBA chairperson. She also has served on the township planning commission since 1989.

Baja earned a bachelor's degree in geology, is working toward a master's degree, and is a certified K-9 teacher.

The township board will interview candidates beginning today and is expected to appoint the next supervisor at a Sept. 26 special session.

Record staff writer Mike Tyree and editor Bob Needham interviewed Baja last week.

RECORD: Why do you want to be supervisor?

BAJA: The opportunity arose, of course, with Georgina's leaving. I felt as that opportunity occurred, that I have many talents I feel would be good for the township. I would like to see a change. I would like to see more openness and communication, and if I were to be appointed . . . If someone could write an article about me similar to the one written about Mr. (city manager Gary) Word, I would feel a great success.

I have a similar philosophy in the sense that we need to work together and not in spite of each other, have communication lines greatly opened, just within the departments and department heads; everyone over there (township hall) does a good job and they're capable, and there's so much more that could be done to create a feeling of working together . . .

RECORD: You mentioned that you'd like to see a change. Where do you think this problem is? What fostered the need . . .

BAJA: I'm not so sure of a problem, but I think there's a feeling of mistrust, a feeling that perhaps is based on ignorance on the public's part. I'm not sure. I know I identify more with the public and feel more comfortable on the other side of the desk than on the political side of the desk in the sense that I feel more allegiance to how those people feel.

They haven't had the benefit of all the experts and consultants and the seminars on how things are done. They come in, their tax bills are high, or they see someone granted permission to do something that isn't in the





Man turns himself in to city police on warrant

A city police officer had seen the couple driving Aug. 4 and pulled them over, knowing that the man was wanted by Plymouth police for failing to appear in court on an alcohol-related driving offense. The officer saw the man driving, but by the time he got to the vehicle the woman was in the driver's seat.

The man said they switched seats because his license was suspended.

Meijer, 20401 Haggerty, told township police a white man in his 20s stole two bottles of cognac from the store Sept. 13 and threatened staffers when they attempted to apprehend him.

Port Huron, East Lansing, Dearborn, Wayne, Canton and Plymouth townships, and the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department were represented in the SWAT school, Sherman said.

SWAT trainees must complete rappelling courses, showcase agility on obstacle courses, be proficient in day and night firing of a bevy of different weapons, learn

hostage negotiations, and become skilled in building searches.

The goal, of course, is to act quickly in case of a hostage or barricaded gunman situation. Although such cases are rare in the area, they do occur, Sherman said.

Western Wayne County area special operations teams have responded to three gunman or suicide threat cases this summer, he said.

Homearama a bad influence?

There goes the neighborhood? Builders in pricey Chase Farms subdivision are concerned that the adjacent Riverbridge development, the site of Homearama 1991, will have a detrimental impact on the sales of their homes.

The issue came up when Riverbridge developer Herbert Lawson asked the Novi Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) for a variance to allow an identification sign on Chase Farms Drive just north of Eight Mile Road and just east of Novi Road.

His request was knocked out by Novi's ZBA on Sept. 3.

Last Monday, Lawson tried again—and did not succeed—with the Novi City Council. However, several members agree he has a problem.

A rear—or front—entrance to Riverbridge (depending on who describes it) is off of Eight Mile Road through Chase Farms. An alternative entrance to Riverbridge is off of Nine Mile Road through an industrial drive.

Lawson originally owned both sites, but sold off Chase Farms. He says the understanding calls for a joint entrance.

Lawson originally asked the ZBA for an 8-foot-by-8-foot sign saying, "Riverbridge, an exciting

collection of single-family homes, developed by Herbert Lawson, left at Ashbury Drive."

The second time, he submitted to the council plans for a 1-foot-by-4-foot directional sign reading "Riverbridge, left at Ashbury Drive." This would be placed at the corner of Eight Mile and Chase Drive. Lawson said the subdivision needs to be identified for emergency personnel and deliveries.

But the council was advised by City Attorney David Fried that they have no jurisdiction in this matter—unless they rewrite Novi's sign ordinance.

The problem as Chase Farms' builders see it is that their subdivision will offer homes in the \$300,000 range on 90-foot lots while the Riverbridge subdivision features houses on 75-foot lots in the \$190,000 to \$200,000 price range. Chase Farms has been billed as one of the area's premier subdivisions.

The builders turned out in full force at the Sept. 3 ZBA meeting to protest the sign variance request. Several said they lost home sales when customers learned of the proximity of the lower-priced Riverbridge.

Chase Farms developer Stephen Grande said he's spent \$250,000 to create a striking entrance-

way to the subdivision, complete with white picket fences, stonework and flowers.

Grande told the ZBA that Lawson's sign would be ten times closer to Eight Mile Road than his Chase Farms sign—and that he never knew the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan's Homearama was going in next door when he bought the site.

The ZBA decided to hold with the ordinance, saying that Lawson had not demonstrated sufficient hardship.

Mayor Pro Tem Edward Leininger said Monday he agreed with the ZBA's finding but suggested another location might be found for the Riverbridge sign, perhaps in the county's right-of-way.

"Homearama is a short-time, one-time activity that certainly needs some kind of notoriety," he said.

Lawson's dilemma points up a problem in the sign ordinance for subdivisions lacking direct access to a major street. Council Member Joseph Toth said: "If somebody called the police department and said I live in Riverbridge, you don't have any signs to direct you. I agree it is a problem. It may be something that has to be addressed in the sign ordinance."

Meanwhile, Lawson is headed back to the ZBA.

Schedules ironed out the hard way

An Amerman Elementary School kindergartner got on the wrong bus and instead of going home after school he went to the district bus garage.

Brian Moriarty sat in his seat on Amerman's bus C for its entire trip. When he realized he was not going home, he remained seated. His mother told him not to stand on the bus, and on his third bus-riding day ever he was not about to break the rule.

Maureen Moriarty knew something was wrong when her son didn't

get off the bus on his third day of school.

She flagged down the second bus that passed her bus stop and had the driver phone the bus garage. Brian was safe in the back seat of a bus. He arrived home about 30 minutes late.

Apparently, district bus drivers told some Amerman kids riding bus C to begin riding bus P to alleviate some overcrowding.

Brian, however, was the only kindergartner. Kindergartners, who carry tags identifying their bus, are put on buses by teachers. Because no one changed Brian's tag, and the school was not notified of the change, he was put on the wrong bus.

Maureen Moriarty said she was surprised such a mix-up could happen and blamed those school staffers in charge of getting kids on the bus.

"Putting him on the completely wrong bus was just unacceptable," she said.

Moriarty said she felt the school principal was blaming the transportation department and not taking responsibility for the error.

"Mr. (Milton) Jacob didn't seem like he was bothered," she said. "I think somebody's got to be responsible."

Jacob said the school has an excellent system for getting students on their correct bus. In fact, officials

from other school districts have visited Amerman just to study the bus system, he said.

The mix-up occurred only because the school was not informed of the change in bus scheduling, he said.

"It's a very controlled system," he said.

Transportation supervisor Jim Hyman agreed that the system is good, although mix-ups can occur in any system in the first few days of a school year.

And on occasion kids fall asleep and are responsible for missing their bus stop.

"That is something that can happen from time to time," he said.



Good government is involved government

"The government is us; we are the government, you and I."
Theodore Roosevelt

As John F. Kennedy said, "My experience in government is that when things are non-controversial and beautifully coordinated, there is not much going on."

Is that the case in the City of Northville? Do the citizens of the city really believe that their local government is beautifully coordinated and its decisions free of controversy?

To judge by the upcoming elections, one would believe so.


This year's race for two city council seats and the mayor's position so far looks like a stroll for the incumbents, who as of Friday faced no competition. An optimist might take this as a sign that the city's current leadership is performing flawlessly, and that citizens are happy with the direction the city is headed.

A pessimist might see it as another example of voter apathy, the widening chasm between politicians and their constituents — citizens who believe they have no impact on government policy and so do not bother to try.

We prefer to take a position somewhere in the middle.

Without casting aspersions on the current mayor and city council, we know full well that not all Northville citizens are happy with the way things are being handled at city hall. In July, the council heard harsh words from residents faced with new fees for trash collection as part of an interim solution to the city's conversion to a fee-based refuse collection system.

Downtown business owners, too, made known their displeasure with the new fees at a meeting with the city manager and council members in August. The business people are currently reviewing



the city's budget to see for themselves whether the money being taken in by the city is being properly allocated, in their opinion.

So why hasn't this frustration translated into candidates for the upcoming elections?

This is where the apathy theory comes in. Perhaps residents believe their two cents worth would not make a dime of difference on the city council, or in city affairs. If so, they're wrong. The Northville City Council has seldom been a rubber-stamp body for the city administration, and the five-member board has often struck its own course on important issues.

In fact, citizens anxious to have an impact on their daily lives and the lives of others in their community probably cannot do better than win a position on a local board.

Our attempt to stir up a political contest is, of course, selfish. There are few news stories more monotonous than an uncontested election. And there are few more exciting than a hotly-contested one, where candidates must speak their minds, answer criticism of past decisions and lay a more detailed platform for future policy.

So do everyone a favor. If you've got strong feelings about the way your local tax dollars are spent, and believe you could provide a competent voice on a local board, run for local office. Democracy only works when there are choices.

"They don't have a day-to-day schedule," Steve told me. If memory serves me correctly, this isn't standard operating procedure on jobs of this nature. Most contracts for road construction and whatnot have contingencies for dates of completion, bonuses for finishing early and penalties for finishing late.

If no schedule was stipulated in the contract, it should have been. If there is a schedule, then perhaps the city should look into enforcing it.

I mean if the post office can get into the habit of putting the Wood Duck on a postage stamp every couple of years or so, you'd think the city could make it a habit to demand schedules from contractors.

ordinance and they don't understand why. They don't understand you can't stop a person from using their property; they merely think the government's gotten together and had a little secret meeting and they don't really understand. And yet there are a lot of people out there who do understand and are still upset with the way things are going.

RECORD: What would you do to try to change that? Is it something that could be immediate, or is it something that's going to take time to develop?

BAJA: Of course, both can be done. There's things immediately that can be done to show that old approaches are going to be modified in direct response to the people. That can be an immediate change. The fact that all board members are up for re-election in 1992... There is the opportunity for people's voices to be heard in 1992.

I do think that trust is something that gets built up in time. It's deteriorated for whatever reasons and for whatever's fault. I'm not even sure if there's fault. But it has deteriorated. There needs to be a group that sits down, maybe of citizens, board members, department heads, township manager, press, and decide how this happened and what steps can be taken to make it better, what kinds of communication could be re-opened, so that we can build that trust again.

RECORD: Would that be at the top of your agenda, to put together such a group?

BAJA: Yes. I think not only for this issue but for many others. I think the township people... I feel there's a great amount of suspicion. People just aren't sure why things are happening and they're suspicious of it. And that's not a good forum to work from. If you could do nothing more than to educate or let people realize that there's always an open door.

I realize it's a part-time job, but I would try to have specific hours... and anyone could come in for whatever reason, to voice their concerns. I think that trust is a key element of government and it's been violated from the top down. Maybe it's idealistic, but I'd like to see that changed.

RECORD: What else would be on your agenda?

BAJA: I think people need to understand what's happening with our tax dollars. The biggest cry that you hear... is, "What's going on with these taxes? You're taxing us right out of here. We don't see any services being compatible" — and again, it may be an education process. You have to put it in language people understand. Lawyer-ese doesn't cut it, for me and for many other people.

I think one of the skills I bring to the job is I'm a willing and quick learner. I didn't know anything about government before I went into these positions. But I feel my attendance record and performance shows that I do my homework... I try to come from an informed base, and I'll be the first one to admit I don't know and let's find the answers.

RECORD: You've been involved in planning and zoning issues for quite some time. How do you look at some of the major developments proposed for the area? How should the township approach those developments?

BAJA: Going on what I feel is the climate of the people... People want to get more solid tax base, so the burden doesn't fall so much on the property owner. But at the same time, they don't want development in their backyard. They want development, they want the tax base, if it's over there.

There's going to have to be a controlled-growth approach, maybe those are dirty words, (but) I don't think Northville should be afraid of being sued. It should be prepared, if that's the threat, but if you're prepared, there shouldn't be a standing fear of being sued.

The developer has to show some responsibility that they're not going to come into Northville and not grossly change it. There's got to be a way for it to be symbiotic relationships and not one-sided either way. You can't have a bedroom community and not have high taxes. You can't have development that comes in and destroys the very bedroom community that is the draw....

RECORD: Should the city and township seek to more closely align themselves on shared services issues or are some things just mutually exclusive?

BAJA: That's a difficult question. I personally have never understood in the 13 years that I've lived here,

why an area the size of Northville has two complete, separate governing bodies. Two complete separate fire departments, two police departments, and now recycling areas. To me it's ludicrous, a great waste of money, time, manpower, and it makes it very difficult to communicate.

I've been taught over the years that it's entrenched; there are people who live in the city that do not wish to be identified with the township (and vice-versa). There's that faction. There's people that live in the city that feel their taxes would go up (and vice-versa). This may be political suicide, but so be it — because I really feel my interests are for the betterment of Northville as a whole — I think maybe the time has come to address in 1992, get an opinion poll from the public, put it to popular ballot. What about combining again?

That would be after much research, looking into the problems and what it would entail. I certainly would need to do a lot of homework, but with all board members up for re-election in 1992, with the police chief just being hired in for the township, with Mr. (Steven) Walters leaving, with the mayor being up for grabs again... and a lot of board members in the city, there's no reason why this couldn't be a perfect time to see if this is something the people want. It wouldn't be something to cram down the people's throat.

RECORD: One government?

BAJA: One government. I realize some jobs would be lost. There could possibly be some way to consolidate to make it less shocking to those who it would directly affect in the beginning, but I think that long-term — unless there's information I'm totally unaware of right now that would make it detrimental — I don't see any reason why it couldn't happen and at least be looked at, if this is the people's wishes. If not... at the very least there should be more joint services, and I would welcome more open communication between the mayor and whomever was supervisor and the various boards.

RECORD: If you don't get appointed to the position this time, will you run in 1992?

BAJA: Being a mother of four... there's lots of changes always going on in my life, and if I had to answer today, I'd say yes, I want this job and I'd be interested in running in 1992. However, it's not something that I

can promise at this time. Yes, I'm most desiring of this job. Not as a political stepping stone... at this point I'm not looking at a political career. I'm simply saying I have talents, the time, the energy, and a certain level of intellect I can donate, in a way, and hopefully make a change.

RECORD: Any other real key issues that you can isolate that need to be looked at in the township?

BAJA: We have the Holloway Sand and Gravel issue coming up, which I feel is a very key issue for the future of Northville Township. Yes, a property owner has the right to do things and expect a reasonable rate of return... but I haven't been convinced... that this would be what's best for Northville Township and the surrounding property owners. It's like a dump, it's like a prison... they have to go somewhere (but) I think the way the township has evolved in the last five years that this is not a use that is conducive to what's happening in the township. We've certainly got our share of those things people don't want in their backyard.

This directly affects the future of the township... and I'm very distressed that there aren't more homeowners associations and residents at these public hearings.

Another key issue is that our police and fire services are going to have to grow... Nobody likes to hear that if we're going to keep this a relatively safe community.

RECORD: Any final comments?

BAJA: This isn't a campaign, but I'll sound like one. My pitch is that I think what I could bring to the township is more the common man approach. My resume will speak for itself. I don't do anything expertly, but I do a lot of things pretty good. I'm a very willing learner, I'm very open-minded. I have definite opinions, but I am also very good at listening, and hearing. I would much rather shoot from the hip and know where each other stands... than to dance around issues. I would rather get down to the nitty-gritty and I think that's what the general public is crying for these days. Can we cut through some of the red tape? There's a lot that could be streamlined, and if every person in the township felt they could come in and talk to the top person in government, at any time... I think it would be great growth for the township.

Michigan celebrates winning wine

Annually, the wines produced in Michigan are reviewed by an experienced panel of professional wine tasters. Wines are awarded medals to be worn as bragging rights for the next 12 months. The annual competition is sponsored by the Michigan State Fair, and organized by the Michigan Department of Agriculture's Grape and Wine Industry Council. This year's competition included 112 wines, seven of which received gold medal awards.

Michigan's grape and wine industry has existed for more than a century. Today, Michigan's 16 wineries and 35 vineyards are located principally along the western edge of the state, benefiting from the climatic influences of Lake Michigan.

In early spring, cool winds from the lake retard budbreak until the danger of spring frost has passed.

The opposite occurs in late fall, when the prevailing winds provide warmth for the vineyards and extend the growing season.

In sub-zero weather, lake effect snowfall provides natural insulation for vine roots and trunks.

Demand for wine grapes is exceeding the supply, and several new vineyards have been planted in the last three years.

A second pocket of wine effort is in southeast Michigan. The Seven Lakes Vineyard is north of Detroit in Fenton.

Sharon Mills Winery, the only producer specializing in *methode champenoise* is in Manchester, west of Ann Arbor.

However, grapes for these sparkling chardonnays and rieslings come from the Old Mission Peninsula.

Lake Michigan climatic advantages aside, it still remains a fact that Michigan grape vines, with their late budbreak, have the disadvantage of a short growing season. Some winters are harsh with little snowfall and spring frosts have occurred in mid-May and as late as June 10.

Faced with such adversities, winter-hardy French-American hybrids were deemed the logical choice for grape cultivars in the late 1960s. St. Julian, Michigan's oldest winery, responded to the heightened period of interest in drier wines by encouraging growers to make extensive plantings of French-American hybrids in the 1970s.

Since 1978, St. Julian has become the state's largest single buyer of the hybrid grape varieties chambourcin, chelois, cayuga white, dechaunac, marechal foch, chancellor noir, seyval blanc, vidal blanc and vignoles.

"Vignoles is an interesting wine," St. Julian's president David Braganini contends. "People are unfamiliar with it and are surprised to learn how comparable it is to a straightforward style of chardonnay. Seyval blanc is our most popular wine. We call it Paw Paw Riesporter because we make it off dry."

St. Julian has been the leader in the production of red wine from the chambourcin grape. "A gold medal award for St. Julian's 1989 Chambourcin is a satisfying reward for several years of pioneering effort," Braganini said.

Half of the production at L. Mawby Winery in Suttons Bay is vignoles. "My goal is to make the best barrel-fermented vignoles I can," said owner/



Area herb growers are getting ready for winter; now's the time to order next year's

Herbal Esoterica

Fall's harvest brings herbal delights

I am expecting a good harvest from the herb garden so I can make many herbal concoctions to use when winds howl and the garden is asleep for the winter.

Like a squirrel storing nuts, we herbalists must store our bounty when it is at its peak in the herb garden.

Tarragon, thyme, basil, chives, lavender (for an exotic flavor), savory and mints are other herbs that can be made into vinegar.

For a different flavor I will spear a clove of garlic with a toothpick and put it in the bottle along with the basil as it steeps.

Vinegar is very easy to make, for use in salads and marinades. After picking the herbs I will wash them well and twirl them in a salad spinner to dry, fill a glass container at least two-thirds full, twisting the stems and leaves to release the oils.

Then the container will be filled with a 5-percent-acidity vinegar (white if I'm going to add an herb for decoration or if I'm making coal or chive blossom vinegar, and regular cider vinegar for the others), cover with a non-metal lid and set in the sun for about a week.

Then the vinegar solution will go to a cool dark place for four to six weeks to cure (the garlic comes out now, so the flavor won't be too strong). Strained and bottled the vinegar will be ready for use. Wine vinegars are especially nice.

Many culinary herbs dry well when they are spread out on a screen or laid in a basket lined with a paper towel. I will put many of them in bunches, secured with a rubber band, arrange a brown paper bag around them to keep the dust off, and hang them to dry in a warm, dark area with good air circulation.

Sage and other woody-stemmed herbs, such as rosemary, tarragon, thyme and

mints, are particularly successfully dried this way. As soon as they are dry, I will lightly roll the bag so the leaves fall to the bottom of the bag. By this time they will be corn-flake crisp and won't mold when put into jars for further use.

When I have a small quantity, I put the leaves on a paper towel on a flat dish and set it uncovered in the refrigerator. They are dehydrated in a few days, and the color is good.

Fifty-percent power is recommended, and a glass of water in the corner will protect the element.

Do not dry them to the very crisp stage because of the threat of fire and loss of oils. I will finish the drying in a basket set in a warm place.

Oven drying is a pretty quick method with the pilot light only, or set the temperature in an electric oven very low (180 degrees). If I can smell the herbs, it means the

oils are evaporating and the oven is too hot.

Sometimes I freeze the leaves on a tray and package them in small containers, or blend about 1½ cups of water to a cup of loosely packed leaves, whirl them in a blender for two minutes, then freeze in ice cube trays.

A mixture of eight ounces of soft margarine and about one-half cup of a preferred herb, one-half teaspoon lemon juice to bring out the flavor, frozen in the original container enables me to scoop just the right amount to use in many dishes: stews, vegetables, casseroles and on bread.

I use either one herb or a mixture such as summer savory and chives or tarragon; salad burnet, thyme and parsley; oregano and garlic granules; dill and garlic; or chives, chervil and parsley.

I will remember to label everything I preserve as I store it away. Chopped, frozen and dried herbs look surprisingly alike.

How to make a cereal killing at breakfast

A stroll down the supermarket breakfast cereal aisle can be a challenge to the most informed shopper. Health pledges, great taste, cereal fun, toys and promises of athletic prowess stated on the boxes add to the confusion of seeking a nutritious breakfast for children and adults.

Cereal provides several nutritional benefits. It is a good source of carbohydrates, which gives us energy (calories) to start the day. Getting energy from a carbohydrate source low in fat, such as cereal, is one way to lower fat in the diet. If you're concerned about blood cholesterol levels, focus on the fat in the milk. For anyone over the age of 2, use skim or 1 percent milk rather than whole milk. When a cereal is fortified, that provides an excellent source of iron, and many women frequently have diets low in iron.

Advertisements have done a good job confusing the fiber issue in cold cereals. There

are two types of fiber, soluble and insoluble. Oat bran is a source of soluble fiber. Wheat bran is a source of insoluble fiber. We need both soluble and insoluble fiber in our diets. Information is available about the insoluble fiber content of foods. Unfortunately, scientists have not developed tables that tell us the amount of soluble fiber in foods. However, we do know generally that oat bran, rice bran, dried beans and peas, and some fruits and vegetables are good sources of soluble fiber.

Many cereal companies would have us believe that their cereal products are the key to lowering cholesterol. Though there is truth to the claim that cereals may help lower cholesterol, the amount we would need to eat to achieve this is incredible. If oat bran were your only source of soluble fiber, you would have to have 100 grams of it each day to lower your cholesterol by 15 percent.

One serving of a popular cereal that advertises it contains oat bran has only 8 grams of oat bran per serving. This means you would have to eat about 15 cups of that cereal to get 100 grams of oat bran. If you are serious about lowering cholesterol, it would be better to add oat bran to various foods that you cook, besides a cooked cereal made from oats, rather than to rely on a cold cereal.

Insoluble fiber in whole grain cereals is important to help prevent constipation. Some nutrition scientists believe that insoluble fiber may have a role in helping to decrease risk of colon cancer. The National Research Council, the American Cancer Society and the National Institute for Cancer Research recommends that we obtain between 20 and 30 grams of fiber a day. Children's cold cereals are generally not a good source of fiber, despite what the box claims.

Rather than rely on cold cereal for fiber, give them high fiber foods such as beans, fresh fruits and vegetables and whole grain breads throughout the day to ensure adequate fiber intake.

Another cereal-related issue is the amount of sugar that cold cereals contain. This may be especially important when children are eating several bowls of cereal each day. Try to choose a cereal that has no more than one to two teaspoons of sugar (4 to 8 grams sucrose indicated on the label per serving).

If your child likes to add sugar to cereal, then the lower the sugar in the cereal to begin with, the better. There is nothing wrong with a cereal containing some sugar, but whether and how much additional sugar you add is important.

To figure out the amount of sugar in the

product, divide grams of sugar by four to determine the number of teaspoons per serving. For example, if one serving provides two grams that equal one-half teaspoon sugar, or if one serving contains 11 grams, that is two and three-fourths teaspoons of sugar.

Read the label on the box carefully if you are interested in assessing nutrition value. Look at the actual volume measure in cups that correspond to the one-ounce serving size. The carbohydrate breakdown provided by most companies gives specific amounts of complex carbohydrates, sucrose and other sugars and fiber.

We eat cold cereal because it is quick and easy to prepare in the morning or anytime for a snack. Whether you eat cereal because you are a kid or a kid at heart, it does have some nutritional value for your diet. Just read the label.

Just outside the northernmost boundary of the Lake Michigan Shore wine region is the Fenn Valley Winery.

Established in 1973, this winery's specialties are its de-alcoholized wines. These are wines which have had the alcohol removed, not non-alcoholic wines.

Among its quality traditional

wines, Fenn Valley's '89 Chancellor received "Best of Show" for red wine at the Michigan State Fair. Last year, the '88 Chancellor took the same prize.

Further up the coastline is the Leelanau Peninsula wine area, which includes the wineries of Boskydel,

Good Harbor and L. Mawby Vineyards and Leelanau Wine Cellars. For peak fall color, visit the area from late September to mid-October.

Chateau Grand Traverse winery is within the Old Mission Peninsula wine region. Award-winning Johannisberg Riesling and Chardonnay are among Chateau Grand Traverse's most popular wines.

Autumn is the perfect time to tour Michigan's four wine regions — the Lake Michigan Shore, Leelanau Peninsula, Old Mission Peninsula and Fennville.

A visit to Michigan wineries can be as short as a day or as long as a week; it's up to you. Most wineries are open for tours and tastings throughout the year, but it is wise to call ahead of time.

For more information about Michigan's wineries call (517) 373-1058. For Michigan travel information, call 1-800-5432-YES. Here's a sampling of Michigan wineries.

You don't have to travel way up north to visit a winery. For an early to mid-October color and winery tour, visit Seven Lakes Vineyard in homey Fenton. Located within Oakland County, the winery produces limited quantities of premium, well-crafted white wines.

Seven Lakes is a "bonded" estate winery which means they grow all of their own wine grapes on 96 acres of their own land.

Winery hours are 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Wednesday to Saturday, noon to 6 p.m. on Sunday.

Open weekends, noon to 5 p.m., Sharon Mills Winery in Manchester, near Ann Arbor, specializes in champagnes and sparkling wines. The fall colors in this area peak in mid to late October.

Sharon Mills buys most of its grapes from Chateau Grand Traverse's vineyards, and use a labor-intensive method for producing wine. Methode champenoise involves hand turning each bottle several times to settle the sediment before it is withdrawn from the finished product. Every bottle of Sharon Mills wine is perfectly aged in private wine cellars.

For a longer drive, about three hours, drive west on I-94 to the largest of Michigan's wine regions which runs from Saugatuk south to the Indiana border. Peak color times are mid to late October.

Lemon Creek Vineyards, Madron Lake Hills, Peterson and Sons Winery, St. Julian Wine Company, Tabor Hill Winery and Warner Vineyards all make their homes within this area.

To the west near Kalamazoo are two of the state's best-known wineries — St. Julian Wine Co. and Warner Vineyards.

Founded in 1938, family-owned and -operated Warner Vineyards was one of the first to plant wine grapes in Michigan. This year's winner of the "Best of Show" white wine at the MI-

winemaker Larry Mawby.

Because of limited chardonnay plantings, St. Julian was able to release only 80 cases of 1989 chardonnay. Grapes were purchased at the premium price of \$1,500 per ton. To make the slimmest profit, it must be sold at \$14 a bottle.

In 1982, with the intent of 100 percent vinifera production, Jim Eshner and his partners Jim Lester and Bernie Lickteig founded Madron Lake Hills Winery in Buchanan with a 20-acre vineyard site. It is principally planted to chardonnay, white riesling and gewurztraminer.

The chief promoter of vinifera in Michigan is

Chateau Grand Traverse owner Ed O'Keefe.

"Michigan will not be recognized as a serious wine producer until we get at least 2,000 acres of vinifera planted," O'Keefe states emphatically. Chateau Grand Traverse received a silver medal for its 1989 Merlot. The wine represents a promise for the future with this vinifera varietal.

Only three percent of the wine drunk in Michigan is Michigan wine. "With these statistics, our biggest stumbling block is getting Michiganders to drink Michigan wine," Lemon Creek's Jeff Lemon said.

Let's see a showing of grass roots pride, Michiganders! October is Michigan Wine Month and

Basil dazzle

The herb of royalty packs in the flavor

Basil's very name attests to the popularity of the herb that is so familiar to us today. The Greeks gave it the name basilikos, meaning "royal," to indicate its lofty status among other leafy seasonings. Only the so-called (basileus) was allowed to cut it.

The leaves have a strong flavor of lemon and jasmine and are much used for flavoring in the cuisines of southern France and Italy. It is usually paired with tomatoes but can also be used to flavor salads, stuffing, sauces, omelets and soups.

And if basil wasn't a household word before, it became one with the popularity of pasta and the basil-based pesto sauce in trendy cuisine in recent years.

If you're planning on growing your own, gardening experts say the biggest mistake home gardeners make is overwatering. Remember these plants come from the Mediterranean, so they are accustomed to dry soil. Wait until the plants look like they need a watering before giving them a soak. Basil needs well-drained soil and prefers full sun, though it can tolerate some shade.

The tops of basil should be pinched regularly so that the plant grows full and does not flower. Experts also report the herb's flavor is most intense in the late morning.

Here are several methods of preserving the fresh herb for later use in cooking.

OIL PRESERVING

Basil preserved in oil is a tasty seasoning for sauces, potatoes, meats and chicken and soups. It is also an unusual addition to sandwiches and a decorative touch for canapés.

To prepare, separate basil leaves from stems; discard stems. Wash leaves thoroughly and pat dry with paper towels.

Pour thin layer of olive oil into small or medium-size jar. Place layer of basil leaves on top of oil. Sprinkle leaves with salt.

Repeat layering of oil, leaves and salt until jar is filled.

With spoon, push basil leaves down into jar, gently pressing them together. A coating of oil, about 1/4-inch thick, should be on top of jar to prevent leaves from turning brown. Put lid on jar and refrigerate.

Basil preserved in oil will stay fresh for about 6 months under refrigeration.

FREEZING

Cubes of frozen basil can be dropped into soups, minestrone, stews and sauces.

Wash and pat dry several cups of basil leaves. Snip or chop leaves and pack them tightly into ice cube trays.

Top trays with water and freeze. When frozen, remove basil cubes from trays and store them in plastic bags.

DRYING

Dried basil can be used as an ingredient in a bouquet garni or fine herbs or sprinkled on scrambled eggs, sliced tomatoes and salads.

To dry, cut basil plants close to the earth. Loosely bundle three or four plants on a sheet of newspaper and wrap the newspaper around the plants. Tie the newspaper with a string and hang the bundle upside down in a dry place for about a week. When thoroughly dry, remove basil leaves from stems and store leaves in tightly closed glass jars.

BASIL QUICHE

Crust:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 pinch salt
- 1/4 cup chilled, unsalted butter
- 4 1/2 teaspoons vegetable shortening
- 3 tablespoons ice water
- Dried beans (for weight)

Crust: Combine flour and salt in mixing bowl. Cut in butter and shortening until mix resembles oatmeal. Add ice water to hold dough together. Roll out and press into 9-inch tart pan with removable bottom. Overlay dough with foil and weight with dried beans. Bake 10 minutes in 375 F preheated oven. Remove beans and foil and continue to bake crust until brown. Remove from oven.

Filling: Melt butter with olive oil in skillet. Add onions, cook five minutes. Combine ricotta cheese, eggs, salt, pepper and nutmeg in large bowl. Add sautéed onion and beat smooth. Spoon onto crust and bake 25 to 30 minutes or until knife inserted in filling comes out clean.

Pesto Topping

Puree two cups packed fresh basil, three tablespoons pine nuts or walnuts and three cloves of peeled garlic. Mix into 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese, then gradually add five tablespoons olive oil.

Spread on top of baked quiche pie. Garnish with sliced cherry tomatoes and basil leaves made into "flower-like" formations.

This dish can be served as an appetizer, if cut into diamonds as described below or, if cut into larger squares as an entree.

ZUCCHINI AND BASIL FILO WITH PINE NUTS

- 1/4 package frozen filo pastry
- 5 to 6 medium zucchini (1 1/2 pounds)
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup (3 to 4 ounces) pine nuts
- 2 tablespoons virgin olive oil
- 1 small red onion, peeled and sliced into 1/4-inch pieces
- Pepper to taste
- 2 cloves finely chopped garlic
- 1/2 cup chopped basil, loosely packed
- 3 tablespoons minced parsley
- 1/2 cup white wine or water
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup (about 2 ounces) grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 ounces crumbled feta cheese
- 8 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted, or a mixture of melted butter and olive oil

Crust: Remove filo pastry from freezer, let thaw to room temperature while filling is being prepared. Unfold dough and cut stack of sheets in 2. Refold half the dough, wrap in plastic and refreeze (it can be kept for a few days in the refrigerator). Cover sheets to be used with sheet of waxed paper, then with damp towel to keep them from becoming dry and brittle.

Filling: Grate zucchini on large side of hand grater or in a food processor. Toss with salt and set aside for 30 minutes. Drain and squeeze dry in clean kitchen towel.

Roast pine nuts for five to eight minutes in 350 F preheated oven, chop finely, set aside.

Heat olive oil in large skillet and sauté onion for about two minutes until it begins to soften. Add zucchini and season as desired. Add garlic, basil, parsley and white wine or water. Cover and cook for three to four minutes, then remove from heat.

Beat eggs and stir in cheeses and then cooked vegetables. Season to taste.

Brush a 9-by-13-by-2-inch pan

with melted butter and lay down one sheet of filo pastry. Brush pastry with melted butter (or butter and olive oil mixture), and continue layering and buttering until you have used half the sheets. (During preceding layering process, scatter half of the pine nuts between several of the sheets.) If butter begins to congeal, reheat it so that it continue spreading easily.

Spread filling mixture over entire top of filo pastry stack. Then, continue layering process with remaining thawed filo dough sheets, melted butter and remaining pine nuts.

When pastry assembly is completed, cut assembled pastry into 3-inch squares, then diagonally into diamonds, making sure you cut through all layers. Refrigerate unless planning to bake right away. Bake in preheated 400 F oven for 40 to 50 minutes or until browned. Serve warm from oven, slightly cooled or at room temperature.

BASIL TAPENADE

- 4 cloves garlic
- 3 cups loosely packed basil leaves
- 1/2 cup pine nuts (toasted)
- 1 cup Italian parsley
- 4 ounces anchovies
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 1/2 cup chopped pitted black olives

Combine garlic, basil, pine nuts, parsley and anchovies in food processor. Puree and add olive oil with motor running. Blend until smooth. Stir in olives. Serve as dip for vegetables or crackers.

FETA AND WALNUT SPINACH SALAD WITH BASIL DRESSING

- 1 bunch spinach torn into bite-size pieces
- 1 small avocado, thinly sliced

- 1/2 medium-size red onion, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese (about 4 ounces)
- 1/2 cup coarsely chopped walnuts

Basil Dressing (recipe follows)

Toss spinach, avocado, onion, feta cheese and walnuts into large bowl. Pour basil dressing over mixture and toss. Serve immediately.

BASIL DRESSING

- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 1/2 cup red wine vinegar
- 1/2 cup fresh basil, finely minced
- 1 teaspoon honey
- 2 large garlic cloves, minced
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper

Yields about 1/2 cup

Combine all ingredients in blender or food processor and mix well. Store in refrigerator, tightly sealed. Shake well before using.

BASIL BARLEY PROVENCAL

- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1 large onion
- 2 zucchini (about one pound) cut into 1-inch cubes
- 4 garlic cloves, peeled and coarsely chopped
- 1/2 cup chicken stock or canned broth
- 6 ripe plum tomatoes, seeded and chopped
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 cup pine nuts, toasted
- 1 cup (loosely packed) slivered fresh basil leaves
- 1/2 cup (loosely packed) chopped fresh Italian (flat leaf) parsley

Yields about six servings

Heat oil in large skillet, add onion,

zucchini and garlic. Cook over medium heat, stirring frequently, until zucchini is tender and onions are wilted (about 8 minutes).

Add chicken stock and cook two minutes. Add tomatoes, salt and pepper. Cook one minute, stirring frequently.

Add barley, pine nuts, basil and parsley to mixture. Stir well and cook until heated through (about 2 minutes). Adjust seasonings if necessary and serve immediately.

TOMATO BASIL BISCUITS

- 1 cup unbleached all-purpose flour
- 1 pinch sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons baking powder
- 4 tablespoons (1/2 stick) unsalted butter, cold
- 1/2 cup half-and-half
- 2 ripe tomatoes, peeled, seeded and coarsely chopped (1/2 cup)
- 1/2 cup basil leaves, coarsely chopped.

Yields six biscuits.

Preheat oven to 425 F. In large bowl, sift together sugar, flour, salt, and baking powder. Cut butter into 1/2-inch cubes and work into the flour mixture until it resembles coarse crumbs.

Add half-and-half and tomatoes, stir to combine and add chopped basil.

Transfer dough to lightly floured surface. Knead for about 30 seconds, then pat it out one inch thick. Cut into 2-inch circles with cookie cutter. Arrange one inch apart on baking sheet. Bake about 15 minutes, until puffed and golden. Place on wire rack to cool.

Lamb is quick and easy dish

Take some delicately flavored ground lamb, add a dash of Italian taste, and a touch of appetizing crisp autumn weather, and you have a winning recipe with which to celebrate National Lamb Month.

The American Lamb Council has designated September for National Lamb Month — an ideal time to buy lamb because of plentiful supply and reasonable prices. One of the most popular lamb selections this season is fresh American ground lamb.

Usually, you'll find packages of ground lamb in the meat case of your supermarket. However, if you don't, be sure to ask your meat manager or butcher to grind it for you.

Inexpensive and quick to prepare, ground lamb can help shape a variety of dishes from down-to-earth meatloaf and burgers to the more elegant stuffed pastas and ethnic casseroles.

Ideally broiled or grilled in 8 to 10 minutes, lamb patties can adapt to a variety of flavors by adding seasonings and herbs, vegetables or sauces. Actually, you can use ground lamb in the same way you cook with ground beef or pork.

Lamb patties also may be prepared in advance and refrigerated for 24 hours or frozen for up to three to four months, and later defrosted and reheated for a really quick meal.

When taken from the leg, ground lamb has health appeal with only 176 calories per 3-ounce serving and 17 percent of the adult Recommended Daily Allowance for iron. Many dietitians recommend the meat for weight-loss programs or plain nutritious eating, when simply prepared and broiled.

To keep pace with the latest trends, the American Lamb Council suggests trying "Stuffed Ground Lamb Italiano," with its reminiscences of Old Italy seasoned to fit contemporary American preferences.

Using only convenience foods such as dry salad dressing mix, frozen spinach and prepared pasta sauce, along with Parmesan and ricotta cheese, basil and garlic salt, the entree takes only 30 minutes preparation and cooking time of less than 10 minutes. If you find yourself with any leftovers (although this may be unlikely), you can freeze the patties and later reheat them in the microwave.

STUFFED GROUND LAMB ITALIANO
(6 servings)

- 1 1/2 pounds lean fresh American ground lamb
- 1 package (0.7 ounce) dry Italian salad dressing mix
- 1 package (10 ounces) frozen spinach, defrosted and squeezed dry
- 1 cup (8 ounces) ricotta
- 3 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 1/2 teaspoons dried basil leaves, crushed
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt
- 1 teaspoon white pepper
- 2 cups prepared pasta sauce, heated
- 1 1/2 pounds cooked pasta, kept warm

In medium bowl, blend lamb and Italian salad dressing mix. Divide lamb into 12 portions and form into thin patties, 3 inches in diameter; set aside.

In medium bowl, blend spinach, ricotta, Parmesan cheese, basil, garlic salt and pepper. Divide into 6 portions and form into thin patties, 2 inches in diameter. Place cheese patty between two lamb patties, press edges to seal. Repeat process, making 6 stuffed lamb patties.

Broil 4 inches from source of heat 5-6 minutes per side or to desired degree of doneness.

To serve: Pour 1/2 cup pasta sauce on plate and place broiled lamb patty on sauce. Serve with pasta.

PEARFECT PEACH TART —

2 cups flour
1/2 teaspoon salt

- 4 tablespoons unsalted margarine
- 1/4 pound unsalted butter
- about 4 tablespoons ice water

Feach Filling:

- 8 peaches, cut in halves
- 5 tablespoons sugar
- 2 tablespoons butter

Glaze:

- 1 6-ounce jar apricot preserves (homemade, if possible)
- 1 tablespoon plain gelatin
- 1/2 cup St. Julian Cream Sherry
- 1/2 cup slivered almonds

Put flour and salt in bowl of food processor. Cut the butter and mar-

garine into small pieces and add to flour. Process 10 seconds or until it resembles coarse meal. Add the water little by little. Dough should just hold together, not wet or sticky. Wrap with plastic wrap, form ball and chill 1 hour.

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Press into lightly buttered 10-inch tart pan or springform pan. Line tart with aluminum foil and weight with beans or rice. Bake in oven for 15 minutes. Do not brown.

Reduce oven heat to 350 degrees. Sprinkle the tart pastry with 3 tables-

poons of the sugar. Arrange peeled peach halves on the pastry, cut side down. Sprinkle with remaining sugar. Dot with butter. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes or until peaches are tender.

To prepare glaze, heat the preserves in a saucepan. Dissolve gelatin in the St. Julian Cream Sherry and add to preserves. Stir over low heat until the mixture is clear. Spoon over the peaches. Sprinkle with slivered almonds. Chill until ready to serve. May be served with fresh whipped cream.

- 32 to 40 baby carrots, peeled and trimmed
- 1/2 cup (1/2 stick) butter
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 to 2 tablespoons finely chopped mint leaves

Steam carrots 12 minutes (Not: 10-12 full-sized carrots, cut into 1-inch pieces, may be substituted for baby carrots; they should still be quite firm. Melt butter in heavy large skillet over low heat. Stir in sugar. Add carrots and cook until well glazed, turning occasionally. Stir in chopped mint. Continue cooking until carrots are crisp, 5 to 8 minutes. Serve immediately.
