

Businesses start dialogue on city finances

Eight Northville business people have formed an ad-hoc committee to review the city's finances, following the city's recently enacted interim refuse rates.

The committee was assembled after an Aug. 1 meeting between about 30 downtown business owners and city officials to brief the business people on the new rates. The meeting turned into a discussion and critique of city finances in general.

Under the new rates, residents pay \$16.30 a month for refuse collection and commercial clients outside the downtown area are charged \$35.06 or \$57.46 each time their rolloff containers are emptied, depending on the size of the container. About 50 commercial property owners in the downtown area who share dumpster service are being charged a total of \$3,447 a month, divided among the owners according to their property values.

The fees are part of an interim plan to switch from a millage-based to a fee-based refuse system, and to pay for refuse service until a new curbside refuse / recycling service is in place later this year.

The business committee — made up of former mayor Mike Allen, Ray Casterline, Dr. William Demray, John Genitti, Chuck Keys, Jim Long, and Carol and George Miller — plans to draft a letter to the city to discuss its concerns regarding city finances. Several of the business people met Thursday to begin drafting the letter.

"We're going to meet among ourselves and put together some questions... and then meet with the city," said restaurant owner John Genitti. "We have some questions we're going to ask in the form of a letter."

He would not specify what the questions were.

Genitti referred to the group as an ad-hoc committee, and said he hopes the group's actions will be taken in a positive light.

"This is not a witch hunt, and this is not a lynch mob," he said. "We just want to be a little more aware and get a little more involved."

"It's just a review process to let them (city officials) know that somebody's watching them and watching where the money's gone, where it's going, and where it's going to go."

Genitti described City Manager Gary Word as "very cooperative" during the review. The manager sent copies of the city's budget and an end-of-the-month revenue and expense report to the committee.

"We didn't go point-by-point through the budget," Genitti said.

The idea to review the city's finances came to Genitti after reading a recent quote by Harold Polling, chairman of Ford Motor Co.: "He said, 'If we don't get involved in politics, we're going to be out of business.'"

Genitti said he hoped the review could result in a closer relationship between the city government and business community.

"Who knows, maybe we can help each other," he said.

Seven groups vie for planning job

Seven planning consultants, including the city's present one, have jumped at the chance to be Northville's consulting firm.

The city sought proposals from planning firms after consultant Don Wortman left the Ann Arbor firm of Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May in July. Wortman, who assisted the planning commission during its draft of the recently enacted Master Plan, left to join another Ann Arbor firm, Carlisle & Associates.

ALNM, through Wortman, has served as the city's planning consultant firm for three years. The firm has tapped consultant Glenn Bowles to take Wortman's place, but some planning commissioners have indicated they would rather stick with Wortman.

The seven consultants that submitted proposals by the Aug. 30

deadline were ALNM; Carlisle & Associates; Kennon & Company of Monroe; McKenna Associates of Farmington Hills; Wade Trim / Impact of Taylor; WBDC Group of Southfield; and Vilcan-Leman & Associates of Southfield.

The city had advertised for a firm with experience in general municipal planning, downtown revitalization and development, Historic District administration and general historic preservation, and "controlling and directing development in rapidly developing areas, particularly as related to the maintenance and preservation of established areas in the midst of rapidly growing areas."

The city council will decide which candidates to interview at its Oct. 7 meeting, and plans to interview the final candidates at meetings on Oct. 14-15. The new contract will be awarded shortly thereafter, to take effect Nov. 1.

Group may alter taping schedule

If you missed it live, you missed it all.

Last week's township supervisor selection process was not videotaped by members of Citizens for a Better Northville, the group that bills itself as a local government watchdog.

CBN members began videotaping regularly scheduled township board meetings last year, in cooperation with Omnicon Cablevision. Omnicon cablecasts the meetings on cable channel 10.

With an increasing amount of important township decisions being settled at special meetings, CBN's strategy may change. Last Monday's unexpected selection of Betty Lennox as supervisor may cause CBN to refocus its video outlook, said CBN's Jeff Hampton.

"We had debated taping it, but given the fact that it was already ordained, we didn't see a great need to do it," Hampton said. "In hindsight, yes (it should have been taped)."

Hampton said the taping sessions are meant to inform the public on how township government operates. But the public missed a treat with the Sept. 23 session, he said.

"(The board) did more to educate them than the last ten meetings we taped," he said. "This meeting was more instrumental on how the good ol' boy, good ol' girl network works."

Hampton called the video taping sessions "an experiment" and said CBN will seek input from the community to see if the project is worth continuing.

"If we find out that five or six or a dozen people are viewing the meetings, we'll discontinue it," he said. "We'll go on to taping meetings of special interest."

Hampton said the board should have made its vote at a regular meeting in front of the video cameras. Still, the decision may impact the group's future plans, he said.

"This will spur CBN to re-evaluate (taping) and we may do more special meetings than regular," he said.

Paper or plastic? If Shopping Center Market customers answer paper in the next few days, they may see a special message on their grocery bags.

Amerman Elementary second-graders wrote "Join PTA" on 100 grocery bags in the first PTA promotional activity in several years, said Barb Flis, PTA Coordinating Council membership representative.

The bags were borrowed from the Shopping Center Market, 425 N. Center St., and returned Wednesday and Thursday, Flis said.

Some second-graders still learning to spell wrote "Join PAT" or "Join TPA," Flis said. But she expects most shoppers to understand.

Anna Conti told her second-grade class to use bright colors in drawing the message.

"I think it will be a lot more readable," she said.

Conti told her class that shoppers from surrounding cities like Novi might be encouraged to join their parent group when they see the bag.

"Even someone from Farmington could come in and shop and join Farmington's PTA," Conti said.

Amerman has 86-percent parent membership and 100-percent staff membership, Flis said. Last year Winchester Elementary was the only school in the district to reach 100-percent parent participation.

In theory, parent participation could exceed 100 percent because in some cases, grandparents and even great-grandparents join.

Mary Mattis is a great-grandmother member. Mattis also is the grandmother of an Amerman PTA president with the same name.

Northville PTAs also have 11 business members. Last year only 32 businesses in the entire state joined a PTA.

Memberships are available to any community member, said PTA

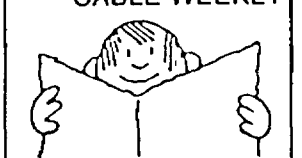

News Briefs

McGRIFF TO SPEAK: The First United Methodist Church of Northville will sponsor a one-hour presentation by new Detroit Public Schools Superintendent Deborah McGriff at 7 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 6.

BLEACHERS NEED REPAIR: Cooke and Meads Mill middle schools will receive nearly \$14,000 in repairs to bleachers. The bleachers recently were inspected by an outside company for the first time. Cooke installed bleachers in 1965. Meads Mill had bleachers installed in 1975.

The inspections were done as a result of concern statewide over bleacher safety, said Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services David Bolitho. An expenditure of \$13,942 for repair was approved at a Monday school board meeting.

School officials have inspected the bleachers in the past. But Administrative Assistant for Operations Tom Bailey said the standards for older bleachers were unknown. "We had no idea what we were looking for," he said.

NO MORE SALT CLUMPS: Northville schools will soon have its own salt storage building. A bid for \$22,718 was approved by the school board Monday to build the facility in the southeast corner of the district's Taft Road bus compound. Money to finance the construction will come from a 1989 voter-approved bond issue.

Salt used to defrost icy school driveways in the winter has been stored outdoors in the past, causing the salt to clump up in the rain and snow, said Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services David Bolitho. Wet salt also has caused clogging in the salt spreader.

Ferrara guides PTA council

Sharon Ferrara wanted to see more parental involvement in schools when she moved to the area seven years ago.

The mother of two boys decided to start with herself, and she joined the Amerman PTA.

Now Ferrara is this year's PTA Coordinating Council president. She will spend four to five hours a week this year as the council president coordinating PTA activities.

The council meets once a month to coordinate all the building-level PTAs in Northville, including Our Lady of Victory PTA. A forum is provided by the council for sharing information, providing leadership training and coordinating the efforts of all PTA groups.

PTAs provide extra activities and assemblies to students through the Junior Enrichment Series. Building-level PTAs also provide assistance to the media center, classroom helpers for teachers and organization of other volunteer efforts in Northville schools.

PTAs in districts poorer than Northville have to concentrate on raising money for educational materials like books. In Northville, PTAs can raise money for extras like playground equipment and landscaping, Ferrara said.

At the district level, the council works toward the established district goal of encouraging parental and community involvement.

But the main purpose of the PTA is to advocate for children, Ferrara said.

PTAs are different from the parent organizations found in some districts because they are affiliated with the state and national PTA.

The state and national groups lobby for and against legislation, and they take positions on political issues. For example, the national PTA took a stand last year favoring gun control. Several local PTAs withdrew their memberships in protest, according to the national PTA newsletter.

Northville PTAs tend to stay out of non-local issues, Ferrara said.

Two building-level groups formally gave support to the Michigan Model

for Comprehensive Health Education. The model is a series of lesson plans used in Northville that has caused some controversy.

But the coordinating council does not dictate what building-level PTAs will or will not support, Ferrara said.

Ferrara will be parenting school-age children for the next nine years. She has risen to the top of Northville PTAs. She wouldn't mind helping other school districts organize a PTA, but she doesn't think she will seek a position on the state or national level.

"At this point, I've been focused just on Northville," she said.

She hopes to continue working for the benefit of Northville students.

"I guess I don't have an aspiration for becoming the state president," she said.

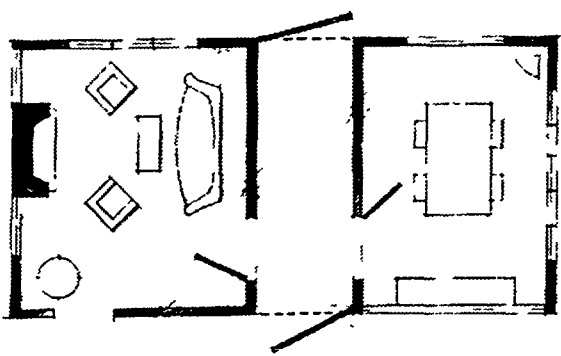

MAGIC offers help to parents of gifted kids

Sheila Darling's son is no dummy—he learned to read before entering kindergarten.

Reading wasn't his only early feat. Darling's son was smart enough to hide his reading abilities. He thought his parents would stop reading to him if they knew he could decipher words on his own.

Darling finally discovered her son could read when she caught him in the act.

"I saw him reading to his stuffed animals," she said.

That's when Darling knew she would have to handle all the problems and rewards associated with having a gifted child.

Five years later, she is still dealing with her gifted son, but she is not doing it alone.

Darling formed a support group, the Metro Area Gifted Information Consortium (MAGIC), last January.

Parents and educators meet monthly to discuss the problems and concerns of raising and educating gifted children.

"Many people assume gifted kids have no problems," Darling said.

But gifted children face a bevy of problems, including difficulties socializing with kids their age, learning disabilities, and sometimes even underachieving, she said.

Parents of gifted kids must cope with rapid development and a lack of information about rearing gifted children.

"I feel that just as below-average children have special needs, above-average children have special needs and different learning styles," Darling said.

The group meets once a month

with guest speakers and discussion groups filling the time. Upcoming topics include coping with perfectionism and gifted adults.

A group for members' children, the gifted kids themselves, also exists. A mystery party is in the planning stages.

MAGIC costs \$25 to join. Meetings are free to members and \$3 for non-members.

Darling's group is made up of about 10 teachers and 55 parents from the entire metro Detroit area. About 10 Northville residents are members. Their last meeting was in Northville, but the group has meetings as far away as Rochester. The next meeting will be held in Redford on Oct. 8.

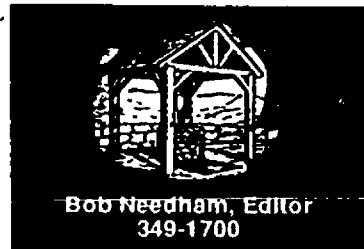

Long-awaited study leaves many questions

When the Northville City Council commissioned a \$12,000 study of the city's water system late last year, everyone thought that finally the city would get answers to the troubling questions concerning water loss.

Everyone was a little optimistic.

The report delivered to the city council is labeled "preliminary," even though it arrived several months later than promised. And significantly, the firm conducting the study — Ayres, Lewis, Norris and May — still has \$5,000 unspent and may therefore proceed with more work under the initial expenditure. In other words, they're simply not done yet.

Still, for nine months of work and \$7,000 in taxpayers' money, the preliminary study seems rather disappointing.

The report does raise some significant points. It questions the accuracy of the City of Detroit meters, notes some underreporting local meters already identified by the city, and points out that the practice of leaving some lines open during the winter to prevent freezing results in some water loss.

But that's about it, and points like these are things the city already knew to one degree or another.

The report's ultimate conclusion seems to be simply that the city's water system is a very bad one, losing nearly half the water put into it. According to Ayres, Lewis, a more reasonable water loss in a system the age of Northville's is 15 to 25 percent.

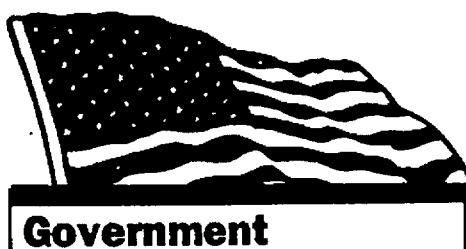
Taxpayers' pockets have just been picked

Your pockets have just been picked.

Who could be better or more practiced at this than the state Legislature? And in the way it has passed the tax-base-sharing bill, it has shown all the skill and finesse of the Artful Dodger.

Both houses have approved a tax-base-sharing bill which the governor will surely sign. It will force growing school districts, like Northville, to share half of their tax revenue generated by new commercial developments (Huntington Falls springs to mind) with other districts.

Of course, the Legislature did try to



Even a figure that high seems a little hard to swallow, but a 46-percent loss costing the city \$150,000 each year is much harder. What, however, are the options?

If — as seems likely — the final report simply bears out and expands upon the preliminary draft, the only real answer is to start replacing water mains one by one. And apparently the culprits are widespread; fixing only the worst ones won't really address the issue. It sounds like the entire system could use replacement, and we shudder to imagine what a project like that might cost.

The only alternative, though, would be to continue to pay for disappearing water and for repairing an inordinate number of breaks in the system. Some choice.

The report submitted to the city is a vast disappointment, but that may not be the fault of those who prepared it. The real disappointment just might be the situation which the report describes.

make a tradeoff with the growing districts by agreeing to phase out its infamous "recapture." But the sharing concept will cost more — \$250,000 more for Northville in the first year alone. This will only increase over time.

It is pretty clear that although this is being paraded around as an attempt to achieve "equal education," it is in reality little more than theft. Our local senators did their bit to stop the thievery, but it wasn't enough. And the proponents who are offering their justifications sound like any other purloiner who tries to claim, "You have and I don't, so it's okay to steal."

They have participated in activities from bowling to the yearbook staff while in high school.

High school Principal Thomas Johnson began the recognition program this year, his first in Northville. Johnson said he plans to make the program an annual event to help focus attention on students who show exceptional abilities in academics.

Amerman/credit union partnership wins award

In its first year, a Community Federal Credit Union partnership with Amerman Elementary School won a first-place award in the state and sent the credit union into a national competition.

Community Federal received the 1991 Louise Herring Philosophy in Action Award for its partnership with Amerman.

The partnership, set up by school district business / education partnership supervisor Jan Purcell and Community Federal's Northville Branch Manager Mary Gyorke, was designed to teach kids about math, personal finance and working life.



Representatives from Amerman and the credit union gathered to accept the award.

A mini-credit union was set up at Amerman. The financial institution was run by students using computers and other technology used in the credit union industry. Student credit union staffers were required to apply and interview for their positions.

Amerman students in the third and fifth grade could deposit up to \$5 every other week. Fourth-graders joined later in the school year and are expected to participate again this year. Accounts earned 5-percent interest and were closed at the end of the year. Over \$4,300 was deposited this year by over 300 participating students.

Gyorke said the program was especially exciting at the end when students received their deposits combined with accrued interest in the form of a check.

"That's exciting to a lot of the young-

ger students. They don't often get checks," she said.

Michael Kelly, director of public information for the Michigan Credit Union League, presented the credit union the award Sept. 17 in recognition of the program.

A total of 593 credit unions exist in Michigan. About 12 made it through the process of applying for the award. The Louise Herring award is given only to one credit union each year. Only Community Federal received the honor this year, he said.

The practical social benefits of the program attracted Kelly.

"This is not an abstract project at all," he said. "They go through the whole process of creating an actual

viable entity."

The program also helped the credit union achieve one of its main goals — contributing to the community it serves, Kelly said.

"This is a wonderful example of a credit union doing just that," he said.

The credit union also benefited by receiving a constant flow of artwork to decorate its walls. Construction paper figures clad in Victorian clothes now decorate the inside of the Main Street building.

Community Federal will now compete in a contest sponsored by the Credit Union National Association in Madison, Wisconsin. Results of the contest will be announced in October.

Wayne County publishes rules for free lunches

Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency announces the policy for free and reduced-price meals and free milk which will be followed by all schools (public and non-public), pre-schools, child care centers, Head Start Programs and residential child care institutions in Wayne County participating in federally reimbursed Child Nutrition Programs during the 1991-92 school year.

These programs include the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, Special Milk Program, Commodity School Program and the Child Care Food Program.

All public school districts, non-public schools, child-care agencies, Head Start programs, and residential child-care institutions must use the following household size and income criteria for determining eligibility:

Total household size, 1: scale for free meals or free milk/year, \$8,606; scale for reduced price meals/year, \$12,247.

Household size, 2: scale for free meals, \$11,544; scale for reduced price, \$16,428.

Household size, 3: scale for free meals, \$14,482; scale for reduced price, \$20,609.

Household size, 4: scale for free meals, \$17,420; scale for reduced price, \$24,790.

Household size, 5: scale for free meals, \$20,358; scale for reduced price, \$28,971.

Household size, 6: scale for free meals, \$23,296; scale for reduced price, \$33,152.

Household size, 7: scale for free meals, \$26,234; scale for reduced price, \$37,333.

Household size, 8: scale for free meals, \$29,172; scale for reduced price, \$41,514.

Children from households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced-price meals or free milk. Organizations participating in the Child Care Food Program may make meals available at no separate charge.

Application forms will be sent to all homes with a letter to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced-price meals, households should fill out the form and return it to the school. Additional copies of the application form are available at the principal's office in each school.

NON FOOD STAMP HOUSEHOLDS: An application which does not contain all of the following information cannot be processed by the school: 1) monthly source of income received by each household member (such as wages, child support, etc.); 2) names of all household members; 3) social security number of adult

household member who signs the application; and 4) the signature of an adult household member.

FOOD STAMP/AFDC HOUSEHOLDS: If you currently receive Food Stamps or "Aid to Families with Dependent Children" (AFDC) for your child, you only have to list your child's name and Food Stamp or AFDC case number, and sign the application.

The information provided by the household is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility and verifying data. Applications may be verified by the school or other officials at any time during the school year.

If children are approved for free or reduced-price meal or free milk benefits, the household must report to the school increases in household income over \$50 per month (\$600 per year) and decreases in household size.

Households may apply for benefits at any time during the school year. If a household is not currently eligible but has a decrease in household income, an increase in household size, or if a household member becomes unemployed, the household should fill out an application at that time.

In most cases foster children are eligible for these benefits regardless of the household's income. If a household has foster children living with them and they wish to apply for free or reduced price meals or free milk for them, the household should contact the school for more information.

Under the provisions of the policy, each public school district, non-public school, pre-school, child care agency, Head Start Center, the residential child care institution determines an official or officials to review applications and approve or disapprove eligibility. A parent or guardian dissatisfied with the ruling of the official may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis.

The household also has the right to a fair hearing. This may be done by calling or writing the hearing official whose name and address is in the letter to parents. Each district, school, center or agency's main office has a copy of the complete policy which may be reviewed by any interested party.

In the operation of the child feeding programs no child will be discriminated against on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, sex, or handicap. If any member of a household believes that the household has been discriminated against, he/she should write immediately to the Secretary of Agriculture, Washington D.C., 20250.

German wines should not be overlooked

Germany, the northernmost European wine growing region, makes lovely, drinkable, white wines that are perfect for modern, light cuisine. If you have not sampled German wines lately, now is the time.

Warm harvests in 1988, 1989 and 1990 yielded grapes ripened to perfection. The wines show expressive fruit aromas and refreshing flavors with the added attraction of lower (7.5-10 percent) alcohol.

You may have avoided German wines because the labels are difficult to read. One of 11 German growing regions appears on each label as well as a village name, a vineyard name, the grape name and the producer.

You can simplify label reading by focusing on the grape and the producer. Look for the wine estates named in this column and riesling, the finest wine-grape varietal grown in Germany.

You may have heard that all riesling is sweet. It is true that Germany is very cool and therefore it is difficult to ripen grapes. Adding sugar balances the acidity of under-ripe grapes, but not all German wines are sweet.

In years where mature grapes are harvested, German wine producers make wonderfully dry, fruity white wines that have balanced fruit and acid. That means they taste refreshing, not too sweet and not too tart.

The driest German wines are labeled trocken (dry), half-trocken (half-dry) or Kabinett. Spätlese is a label term that means late harvest, and the wines usually have noticeable sweetness. The spätlese recommended below are extremely well-balanced.

We recently tasted 23 wines from seven estates in seven different winegrowing regions. The best examples are recommended below. Unless otherwise noted, these wines are all riesling.

The wine estate of Dr. Fischer is in the picturesque village of Ocken in the Saar region. Here, the slate soils rise steeply behind the village. Vines were actively cultivated in Ocken as early as 1958. The vineyards have perfect southern exposure and are planted almost exclusively to riesling.

Dr. Fischer's 1989 Ockfener Bockstein Kabinett (\$13) exhibits fresh apple and apple blossom aromas and flavors. The Spätlese (\$17) boasts riper fruit and mineral accents in a style that emphasizes balance.

The 1989 Wawerner Herrenberger Spätlese (\$17) is a delicious wine also made from riesling, but grown on different soils.

The wines of Dr. Heidemanns-Bergweiler are grown in the villages of Bernkasteler, Wehlen and Graach, along the Mosel River on sunny, south-facing, slate-covered slopes. Dr. Heidemanns' 1989 Bernkasteler Lay Kabinett (\$15) showcases fresh, crisp apple characters that are a great accompaniment for fresh white fish.

The 1989 Bernkasteler Badstube Spätlese (\$19) has supple textures with nuances of peaches and pears. The 1989 Bernkasteler Alte Badstube am Doctorberg Spätlese (\$25) has aromas of orange peel and a supple mouthfeel.

Clean rieslings, rich in extract, is the goal of the famous Rheingau estate Schloss Schonborn. Most of the 148 acres of gently sloping estate vineyards, scattered over 13 communities, are planted

Hail to the tailgaters Fans make pregame parties a fall ritual

What's the best way to beat game traffic when attending a football game?

Simple. Arrive three or four hours early and host a tailgate party. Then stay late and polish off the leftovers.

When it comes to tailgate parties, Lou LaChance of Northville gives 110 percent. A dyed-in-the-wool Michigan Wolverines fan, LaChance has been hosting tailgate parties at the same location on South Main Street in Ann Arbor since 1975.

His van, decked out in maize and blue with a block "M" motif, rolls into town every Saturday and welcomes friends from all over.

"We lay out a spread for every game," he said. "We have our own private section now. People who come by are friends I went to college with. They come in from New York, California, Hawaii."

A 1966 U-M graduate, LaChance began his tailgating when the Wolverines became a national power.

"The thing that motivated me was that, at the time I went to U-M, they didn't do well in football," he said. "People find it hard to believe that they weren't always that good. But when Bo Schembechler became head coach, he turned them around, and they started to win some games."

And the party hasn't stopped since.

The van, equipped with a sink, TV, refrigerator, pop-out tables and a horn that plays "The Victors," hauls all the necessities for a parking lot party. LaChance recommends that cheese and crackers, chips and dip and deviled eggs be included on the menu. There should be hot coffee and cold drinks both alcoholic and non-alcoholic. An umbrella is also handy for keeping rain and sun off the food.

Another item that comes with the LaChance seal of approval is Guernsey's chicken. "We can't be without it," he said. "We serve 30 or 40 — 50 for the Notre Dame game."

And of course, everything is served up on U-M plates. Ice comes from an "M" bucket and salad comes from a bowl shaped like a Wolverines helmet.

You don't need a van, or even go out of town to enjoy a tailgate party though. You can pop the hatch on your beat-up old Escort at Northville or Novi high school on Friday evenings, pull out a hibachi and revel in the pregame camaraderie.

Area stores can outfit your soiree with party trays and deli meats. Maria's Bakery and Deli in Novi (41652 Ten Mile Road) does a brisk business in pregame fare.

"Football fans sure like to eat," said owner Maria Paccocco. "What they usually get are the 3- to 6-foot party subs, some salads and lots of cookies."

Galen Anderson, the "Andy" of Andy's Meat Hut in Novi (24150 Novi Road) sees a lot of football party traffic in his store as well.

"We do party trays that go to football parties, and we did a three-foot sub last week that I know went for a football party at somebody's home," he said.

If you're planning your own party, pregame strategy is the same outside the stadium as it is on the field: You have to be prepared.

Besides paper or plastic plates, you'll need plastic knives, forks, spoons and glasses. Big napkins are essential because this is often a stand-up-and-eat affair. Those disposable cleanup cloths will allow you to arrive at kickoff with non-sticky hands as well.

Here are some basics for making sandwiches which allow everyone to enjoy the festivities. They are gleaned from "The Sandwich Book" by Judy Gethers (Random House).

Toasted bread should be spread with butter or other spreads as soon as possible to prevent drying and breaking.

Butter, margarine or cream cheese should be at room temperature for easier spreading.

A sandwich can become a complete meal if filled with meat, cheese or other protein foods and vegetables and/or salad greens.

The time is 9 a.m. on a warm, pretty Sunday before the Chargers' home opener. The main partying body will not begin to arrive until 9:30 or so. But motor homes already fill one curb along the island, and backed up to the opposite curb are a number of supply vehicles. Those partyers already in residence are wearing new white T-shirts proclaiming this the date and site of "Pigmillion V." It is a site that, on approach, invites assumptions.

Cut eggs in half lengthwise; remove egg yolks to small mixing bowl, reserving whites. Add remaining ingredients except garnish to egg yolks and, using a fork, mash until combined. Spoon an equal amount of yolk mixture into each egg white half. Cover and refrigerate until ready to serve.

To serve, garnish with diced red bell pepper. Each serving provides: 1 fat, 1 protein, ½ vegetable.

Onto bottom half of each roll arrange 1 lettuce leaf and 1 burger; then top each with 1 tablespoon ketchup, 2 tomato slices, 2 avocado slices, 2 tablespoons sprouts, and remaining half of roll. Serve each burger with pickle half.

Burgers can also be cooked on the barbecue grill.

Tailgaters take preparation

It is best to prepare sandwiches as close to serving time as possible. However, if you must prepare them ahead of time, wrap well and store in a cool spot. Save "wet" ingredients, such as tomato slices or lettuce leaves, for the last minute so moisture doesn't seep into the bread.

Following are recipes for sandwiches ideal for casual tailgate parties. Bowls of olives and dry-roasted nuts can provide snacks during setup. Just add beverages. Don't forget a bottle of sparkling water to cleanse the palate, in addition to any other beverages.

The next three recipes are from "Finger Foods" by Mable Hoffman (Price Stern). The first offering, a three-decker sandwich, is served warm.

LAYERED TUNA-EGG LOAF

- 1 20-inch French bread baguette
- 4 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
- ½ cup chopped ripe olives
- 2 tablespoons canned diced green chilies
- ¾ cup (2 ounces) can tuna, drained and flaked
- ¼ cup mayonnaise
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped green onion
- 2 tablespoons chopped red bell pepper

Yields 8 to 10 servings.

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Slice bread lengthwise into 3 equal pieces. In small bowl, combine eggs, olives, chilies and cheese. Spread mixture on cut side of bottom layer of bread. Top with second bread layer.

In second small bowl, combine tuna, mayonnaise, green onion and red pepper. Spread on middle layer of bread. Cover with top of bread. Wrap entire loaf in foil.

Bake in preheated oven 20 minutes or until hot. Remove from oven; cut loaf crosswise into 2- or 2½-inch slices. Serve warm.

BARBECUED BEEF ON A BUN

- 2 pounds beef stewing cubes or beef chuck roast, cut in pieces
- 1 small onion, peeled and diced
- 1 cup ketchup
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

Party hearty, but party healthy, too

Whether it's a Sunday noon potluck before a professional game or a buffet brunch in advance of the Saturday college game, this is the fall tailgate party season.

When you're eating—and often cooking—away from home, food safety becomes even more important.

Nothing can spoil school spirit like a good dose of food poisoning. With that in mind, we offer some helpful hints for a healthy tailgate.

For tailgate parties, cook meats thoroughly and refrigerate promptly. Slice the meat just before departing and wrap well in foil or place in airtight containers. Hot and cold foods should be transported separately in well-insulated coolers. Cover cold foods with plenty of ice.

When transporting hot foods, wrap them with double sheets of aluminum foil and cloth towels, which are helpful in retaining heat. Try to keep hot foods at least 140 degrees. Don't let food stand out in the hot sun; use an umbrella or other device to provide shade.

Use a net food cover to protect food from flies and other pests. If electricity is available, crockery cookers can be very useful in holding hot foods.

Dry ice also can be used when transporting and holding chilled

foods. It always should be wrapped in newspaper and secured with tape. Never touch it with bare hands.

Don't haul leftovers home. Anything that's been sitting out for more than two hours should be thrown away due to harmful bacteria growth.

Try grilling kabobs for your next party. Ingredients can be marinated earlier and transported in airtight plastic or glass containers. While the marinade will help preserve the ingredients, it is still important to keep them chilled. Do not use aluminum or copper containers to marinate and transport mixtures that contain acidic ingredients, such as lemon or lime juice, vinegars, barbecue sauces and wine. Also, cover marinating ingredients with plastic wrap rather than foil.

Kabobs cook quickly and can be presented attractively. If using bamboo skewers, soak them in water one hour before using, this will prevent charring and fire.

Grilling is still popular in autumn, particularly at tailgate events. Keep in mind that ground beef receives more handling than other meats and is vulnerable to bacteria. For complete safety, make sure hamburgers are cooked brown or at least brownish-pink in the center before serving.

- ¼ cup beef stock or bouillon
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 10 Kaiser rolls or onion rolls, split, warmed

Yields 10 servings

In a 4-quart Dutch oven, combine meat with remaining ingredients except rolls. Cover and simmer over low heat 2½ to 3 hours or until meat is very tender.

Place warm meat mixture in a food processor fitted with metal blade. Process briefly to shred, or shred by hand using forks. Spoon about ½ cup meat and sauce onto each roll. Serve hot or warm.

GRILLED CHILI-DOG BURRITOS

During football season it's not unusual for the stadium parking lot to be dotted with barbecue grills. Everything in this hearty entree is heated or

cooked on the barbecue. Let the beans heat on the edge of the grill while the hot dogs cook over more intense coals.

- 1 (8-ounce) can refried beans
- 10 beef or turkey franks
- 10 5-inch corn tortillas
- ¾ cup (3 ounces) shredded Monterey Jack cheese
- 1 cup shredded lettuce
- Fresh Salsa (recipe follows)

Yields 10 servings

Heat beans in small pan on hot barbecue grill. Split franks lengthwise, but do not cut completely in half. Place on a hot grill 4 to 5 minutes or until hot and sizzling. At last minute, heat tortillas on grill. Turn when hot but still soft and heat other side. Place 1 frank on each tortilla. Top with beans, cheese and shredded lettuce; then with salsa.

FRESH SALSA

- 1 large tomato
- 1 California green chili or jalapeno pepper, chopped
- 2 green onions, chopped
- ¼ teaspoon salt

Yields 4 servings

In a small bowl, combine tomato, green chili, cilantro, green onions and salt. Stir to blend. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

CHEDDAR-CHILI SPREAD

This cheese spread is great on specialty breads, especially party-size rounds, and it has an added advantage—it can be made several days before game time and stored in the refrigerator.

- 2 (3-ounce) packages cream cheese, at room temperature
- Two-thirds cup milk
- 1 pound (4 cups) finely chopped jalapeno chilies; seeded or (for a milder, flavor) canned chopped green chilies
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped pimiento

Yields 3 cups

Combine cream cheese and milk in medium bowl. Beat with electric mixer until smooth. Add cheddar cheese, chilies and pimiento. Stir until well blended. Spoon cheese mixture into bowl. Store in airtight container in refrigerator up to 1 week. Allow to soften at room temperature 15-20 minutes before serving.

Annual bash is the ultimate tailgater

"Pigmillion," for example, must be a play on "Pygmalion," the idea here being that a common swine becomes elevated in a play of culinary theater to a golden, succulent love object.

"No," says Greg, telling how the Pigmillion got started several seasons ago. The Chargers' home opener that year was against the Washington Redskins, who, for reasons better known around D.C., had become affectionately associated with "Hogs."

"Since they were the 'Hogs,' we thought it would be a good idea if we roasted a whole pig," Greg says. "Everybody liked it, so we kept doing it, once a year, every home opener. You can only do one Pigmillion a year."

The pig tasted like a million, he says, and there was the name.

Okay, then, so the pig probably was a name, like Eliza or Henry Higgins.

"Nope," says Greg, but Boris contradicts him.

"Yes, the pig has a name," Boris says. "His name is Tasty Tasty."

Boris, a machinist, is the Pigmillion's chief of staff for barbecue. He built the pit, which features chain-driven spits powered by automobile windshield wiper motors. The motors get their power from a single marine battery under the pit.

Greg, Boris and a few others have been at Section P-1 since 2 p.m. Sa-

turday, getting the heavy work done. The pig went on at midnight, and there was some trouble. The spit threw its chain.

"Hey," says Boris, a Yugoslav native with a well-used grin, "they can't get the space shuttle off the ground; we can have a few problems too."

Greg, in his mid-30s, is the Pigmillion's commanding general. He has been a Chargers fan since childhood, when his father was a player scout for the team.

Greg recalls going down to a practice once and meeting All-Pro receiver Lance Alworth and "kind of going nuts." He has been in groups going to the games ever since, and now he runs the Pigmillion. His wife, Kathy, shares only a portion of his enthusiasm for this kind of tailgating. He says, "She is a football fan, but unfortunately she is kind of a Denver Bronco fan."

The Pigmillion is one of those major-league tailgate parties that spring up across the parking lot during football season, usually around a week that changes from week to theme. Even Greg and Kathy agree that eight Pigmillions a season might take the bloom off.

The thesis underlying the themes is one of doing something well, of ensuring oneself of a good time, regardless of fate or incompetence inside the stadium.

Tofu is protein-rich meat substitute

Tofu or bean curd is a highly nutritious soybean product that has been used in East Asia for over 2,000 years. It was invented in China and introduced to Japan by Buddhist monks.

Tofu is an important source of protein for billions of people in the world. It has made its way into some American diets because of its versatility and nutritional value. Tofu has been called a "culinary chameleon" because of its ability to change flavors with every use.

Tofu is made by a process not unlike that of making cheese. The soybeans are soaked, pureed, cooked and filtered through cloth, producing soy milk. The soy milk is curdled with a coagulant, typically magnesium chloride or calcium sulfate, and the curds are pressed into soft blocks as the whey drains off.

Four ounces of this custard-like cake contains about 10 grams of protein and provides the eight essential amino acids. Tofu is free of cholesterol and very low in total fat. Its only shortcoming is that it has no dietary fiber which is found in the whole soybean.

Tofu is available in three textures:

soft, firm and extra firm. Soft is best used for pureeing and blending. Firm tofu holds its shape better during cooking and can be sliced or cubed. Extra firm holds together really well for stir-frying. All of these types can be used for mashing or crumbling.

Tofu is a good source of iron, potassium, phosphorus and calcium (when calcium salts are used to precipitate the curd). It provides B vitamins and vitamin E in varying amounts.

Tofu compares favorably with cottage cheese, which has more sodium and less iron than a soybean product. The texture is smooth, moist, silky and easy to digest. The firmer the tofu, the more nutrients and calories it provides because it contains less water per ounce.

Fresh bean curd is highly perishable and sours when past its prime. Check the expiration date to determine freshness. After buying water-packed tofu, slit the package and drain off the water (replace water daily).

Ideally, tofu should be in the dairy or deli case. The exception is an especially packaged tofu that requires no refrigeration until opened. Refrigerate unused portion, covered with ample water in a covered container. Use within two to three days of purchase. If unable to use tofu quickly, freeze it.

Freezing changes the texture to a spongier and chewier one when defrosted but is still useful in many dishes.

Rinse tofu briefly under cold running water, then cube, dice or slice as the recipe directs. Tofu can be used as a meat extender or meat substitute. Combine a half pound of crumbled tofu with an equal amount of ground beef when making hamburger, meatballs, meatloaf or tacos.

In a stew, substitute chunks of tofu for some of the beef cubes. Combine diced tofu with chopped eggs in egg salad or crumble in a tuna salad. To cut the calories and fat in a peanut butter sandwich, mash tofu with peanut butter, add some chopped raisin and spread on bread. Pureed tofu can be added to soup to make it creamy. For the real adventuresome, blend tofu with juice and a banana for a fruit shake.

Probably the most popular way to serve tofu is to add to a stir-fried dish. However, if you are using lots of soy

sauce, tofu will pick up the salt and flavor of the soy sauce. It can be deep fried, but by doing this it certainly adds additional fat. Tofu can be substituted for cheese in many dishes but remember, it does not melt.

Tofu is tasteless and bland on its own, but has the ability to take on the flavor of whatever food or spice that surrounds it. It can be used in salads, shakes, soups, sauces, sandwiches, stir-fry, stews, dips, dressings, burgers and desserts. Replace mayonnaise, sour cream, eggs, meat and cheese in recipes with tofu, it lowers saturated fat and cholesterol in the dish.

Tofu is probably a more familiar product to consumers. It has a similar taste and texture to ice cream but is a non-dairy frozen dessert, high in protein and lower in calories. Since tofu is a soy-based product, it contains no cholesterol, but does contain a vegetable fat.

If you have been stumped at what to do with this white block of bean curd, be adventuresome and try it in any kind of a dish. It is a versatile and nutritious alternative to other high-calorie, high-fat protein sources.

1 refrigerated ready-to-bake 9-inch pie crust
2 tablespoons confectioners' sugar
1 teaspoon grated orange peel

Preheat oven to 425 Fahrenheit. In 1-quart saucepan combine apples, lemon juice, granulated sugar, and cinnamon and cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until apples are very soft, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat; set aside.

On work surface roll pie crust into a 16-by-8-inch rectangle; cut rectangle into eight 4-by-4-inch squares. Spoon an equal amount of apple mixture onto center of each square. Fold square in half, forming a triangle. Using tines of fork, press edges to seal.

Arrange turnovers on nonstick baking sheet and bake in middle of center oven rack until golden brown, 8 to 10 minutes. Remove to wire rack and let cool.

While turnovers cool, prepare icing. In small bowl combine confectioners' sugar, orange peel, and 1 teaspoon water, mixing to form icing; decoratively drizzle icing over turnovers.

State chili champ shares his secrets

On his third try, Paul Huyck of Farmington Hills won the Michigan Chili Crown at the 13th annual cook-off Sept. 15 at the Lark Restaurant in West Bloomfield.

"I went to my first cook-off in 1985, and after three years as a spectator, I thought, wouldn't it be fun to cook," said Huyck, who has competed in 12 cook-offs. "You have a good time, and they reward charities."

In 1989 he entered a cook-off at the Livonia Spree which benefits abused children. He won second place at a cook-off in Sumpter Township and has competed in New York.

At the Michigan State Fair in 1989, he won the "Belly Burner Championship" for the best hot chili. "That chili was much hotter than I would enter in normal competition," he said.

According to rules of the International Chili Society, the major characteristics to consider when judging chili are the flavoring and chili pepper taste (not too hot or mild), the texture of the meat (not too tough or mushy), the consistency (not too thick or thin), the blend of spices, and how well they have permeated the meat, the aroma and color.

"One major tip is it's extremely important to de-

velop a tasty stock. I use condensed beef broth. After the first hour of cooking, my chili doesn't taste like chili, but then you convert it by adding spices. You've got to know when to stop adding seasonings, when enough is enough."

Huyck will represent Michigan at the World Cook-off to be held Oct. 20 at the abandoned Topco gold mine in California's Mojave Desert.

"I already got plane tickets for my team, we're ready to go. We're going to give it our best shot." Huyck is a CPA and part owner of Carter Technology Inc. in Farmington Hills. He said his wife, Lynne, helps him cook.

Second place was awarded to Joe Swiderski of Wyandotte and third to Ken Horn of Plymouth. A sellout crowd paid \$30 per person attend the cook-off. Event proceeds are used to award \$1,000 scholarships to 10 culinary arts students.

Here's the winning recipe:

MICHIGAN HEAT

2 lbs. ground chuck
2 lbs. lean chuck steak bits
1 lb. chorizo
42 oz. beef bouillon (condensed)
18 oz. tomato paste

8 oz. red cooking wine
8 garlic sections
2 large white onions
2 large Hungarian peppers
2 large jalapeno peppers
2 cayenne peppers

SEASONING

6 tablespoons chili pepper
4 tablespoons cumin
2 teaspoons Hungarian paprika
2 teaspoons celery salt
2 teaspoons Mediterranean oregano
1 tablespoon salt
1 tablespoon white pepper

Salt and pepper the meat, and brown it in about 2 1/2 ounces of suet. Remove suet, but reserve drippings.

Put meat and drippings in a big pot and add the bouillon, tomato paste and wine. Finely chop garlic, onions and peppers, and add to the mixture. Let it cook for one hour. Then add seasonings and cook for two hours over medium heat. Yield — one gallon

'Newton's Apple' looks at Olympic training

Newton's Apple, the Emmy Award-winning PBS family science series, begins its ninth season this week with an informative and entertaining half-hour special, "The Science of Olympic Sports." The episode airs Saturday, Oct. 5, on most PBS affiliates.

Host David Heil and field reporter Peggy Knapp take viewers to the United States Olympic Training Centers in Colorado Springs, Colo., and Lake Placid, N.Y., where each year between six and eight thousand athletes combine training and technology in pursuit of the single-minded goal of representing the United States in the Olympic Games.

In the opening segment, Knapp lumbers around a running track while physiologist Jay T. Kearney explains how a volume-of-oxygen mask measures the chemical efficiency of a runner's lungs. Then, Heil takes a turn in a swimming flume to demonstrate various ways cameras and computers are used to dissect and analyze a swimmer's technique. In quick succession, the show touches on training advances in weightlifting, racewalking, softball and the luge.

Despite all the technological advances, it is mental preparation that most often decides which competitor takes home the gold medal and which is just an "also-ran." Heil and Knapp address this aspect in a conversation with Olympic Training Center psychologist Shane Murphy. TV Listing Inc.

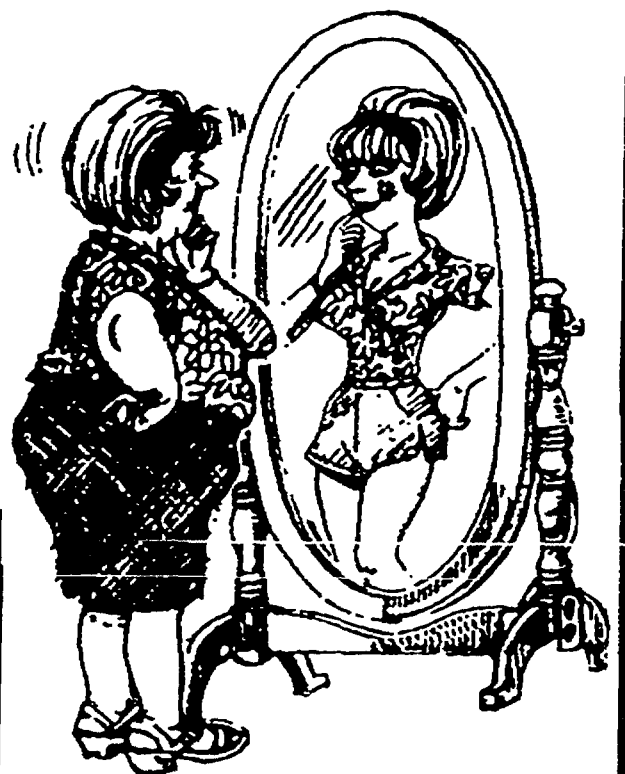

NBC's 'Babe Ruth'

takes a swing at a legend

Small-screen effort hits the high points

"The book on Babe," says actor Stephen Lang, "is that he was a simple man, but I've never really met a simple man." First and foremost, George Herman "Babe" Ruth was a giant among baseball players. He shook the game to its foundations, and he personified the era in which he lived. Often, the forces that drove him sent him out of control. A man of lesser strength would have succumbed.

Born six years before the century, young George Ruth was left by his father at a Baltimore orphanage, and he never stopped being a kid. When he left Baltimore, his one thought was to play baseball, or, as the script of NBC's "Babe Ruth" puts it, to "have fun." His exuberance spilled over into his private life, which was largely unreported in the press at the time. He ate, smoked, gambled and womanized. And when he went to the ballpark, he hit home runs.

Lang's task in portraying Ruth in the movie, which airs Sunday, Oct. 6, began with the challenge of learning to play ball like Ruth. Ordinarily a right-handed hitter, Lang spent four weeks at Hall-of-Famer Rod Carew's California

baseball camp, perfecting his Babe Ruth swing, as well as the patented Ruth trot as he circled the bases.

"The job was not to turn me into a left-handed slugger," Lang says with an ironic grin. "The job was to turn me into the greatest ballplayer that's ever played the game.

"Hitting seemed to me to be the central metaphor for his life. When the hitting began to fall into place, then playing the role began to fall into place." (Ruth himself modeled his swing after that of Chicago White Sox slugger "Shoeless" Joe Jackson. "He had the perfectest swing I ever saw in my life," Ruth said.)

With Ruth, everything must be raised to a higher order of magnitude. He was not only physically big (Lang gained 35 pounds just to play the young, relatively slim Ruth), but he had a big heart as well. And, while many of his records have since been broken, no one player has equaled his performance on the field. As he said of himself, "I swing big, I hit big, or I miss big, and that's the way I live my life, as big as I can."

"Babe Ruth" paints its hero in broad, quick strokes. Lang gives the part his all, but he can't overcome the glibness of the script, which catches the flavor of the era, yet makes the movie a series of tableaux. Too many scenes are set up simply to shoehorn in a famous

quote, either by the Babe or about him. Screenwriter Michael de Guzman apparently expects the viewer to come into the living room with a checklist in hand. At that, "Babe Ruth" offers nothing of his seasons with the Boston Red Sox, when, as a pitcher, he set a shut-out record that still stands.

The film's finest moments come when Ruth is with children (the apocryphal hitting-the-home-run-for-Johnny scene is not here, thank goodness) or with his own hero, Yankee manager Miller Huggins (Bruce Weitz). Pete Rose appears, in a much-publicized cameo, as Detroit Tigers player-manager Ty Cobb. Due to the producers' licensing agreement with Major League Baseball, Rose, who is currently banned from the game, was not allowed to appear in uniform.

Also starring are Lisa Zane ("Freddy's Dead") Ruth's second wife, Claire; William Lucking as Brother Matthias, the monk in charge of the Baltimore orphanage; Yvonne Suhor as Helen Ruth; and Neal McDonough as the up-and-coming Lou Gehrig.

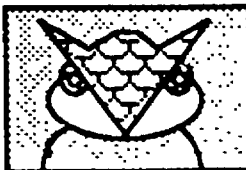

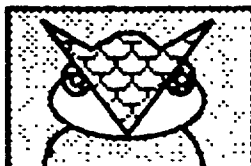

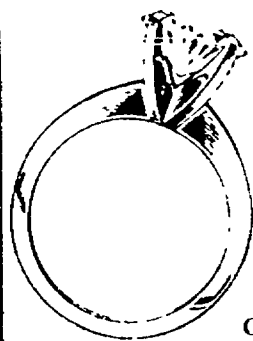

SOAP TALK

Soaps meet the ear as well as the eye

Lights! Camera! Music? Have you ever stopped to think why you feel a certain way while watching a soap?

"We get a script, and it is like choreography," says music supervisor Sue Beth Markowitz of *Another World*. "I determine what emotion should be enhanced, and I select music cues that will enhance that emotion and the coloring it will give a particular scene."

"We produce most of the music utilized on the show ourselves from our own library, except for some outside music we select. We have about 3200 music cues in our library that we can use, running the gamut of emotions, in

time frames anywhere from 20 seconds to four minutes."

The fact most of us don't realize music is even playing means Markowitz is successful at her job. The music's sole purpose is to help us feel more intense about what's happening on the screen. "There are special moments like montages and love scenes, in which case the music should be more dominant," says Markowitz.

A music supervisor's job is never done. The week I spoke with Markowitz, she was working on Dean's music video (a full-time job in itself) to air on the soap and laying the tracks for the song "I'll Do Anything for You" from *Robin Hood*, the summer film release. *Another World* was given the rights to use the music as the love song for the characters Frankie and Cass.

"I heard that song, and it was so perfect for Frankie (Alice Barrett) and

Cass (Stephen Schnetzer) and all they have been going through. They have truly risked their lives for each other," says Markowitz.

Purchasing of the rights to "I'll Do Anything for You" and other songs is a long, expensive process. Consequently, most of the music used on the show is expressly written for it by staff artists.

The song used in Dean's (Ricky Paull Goldin) video, "Lady Killer," was specifically written for the show by John Leffler and John Siegler. "We don't have the time to do a music video the way it is really done, but considering the time element that we have, I think they are really doing a super job on it," says Markowitz.

Viewers, I would like to know what you thought of the "Lady Killer" video and if you would like to see more of this kind of thing.

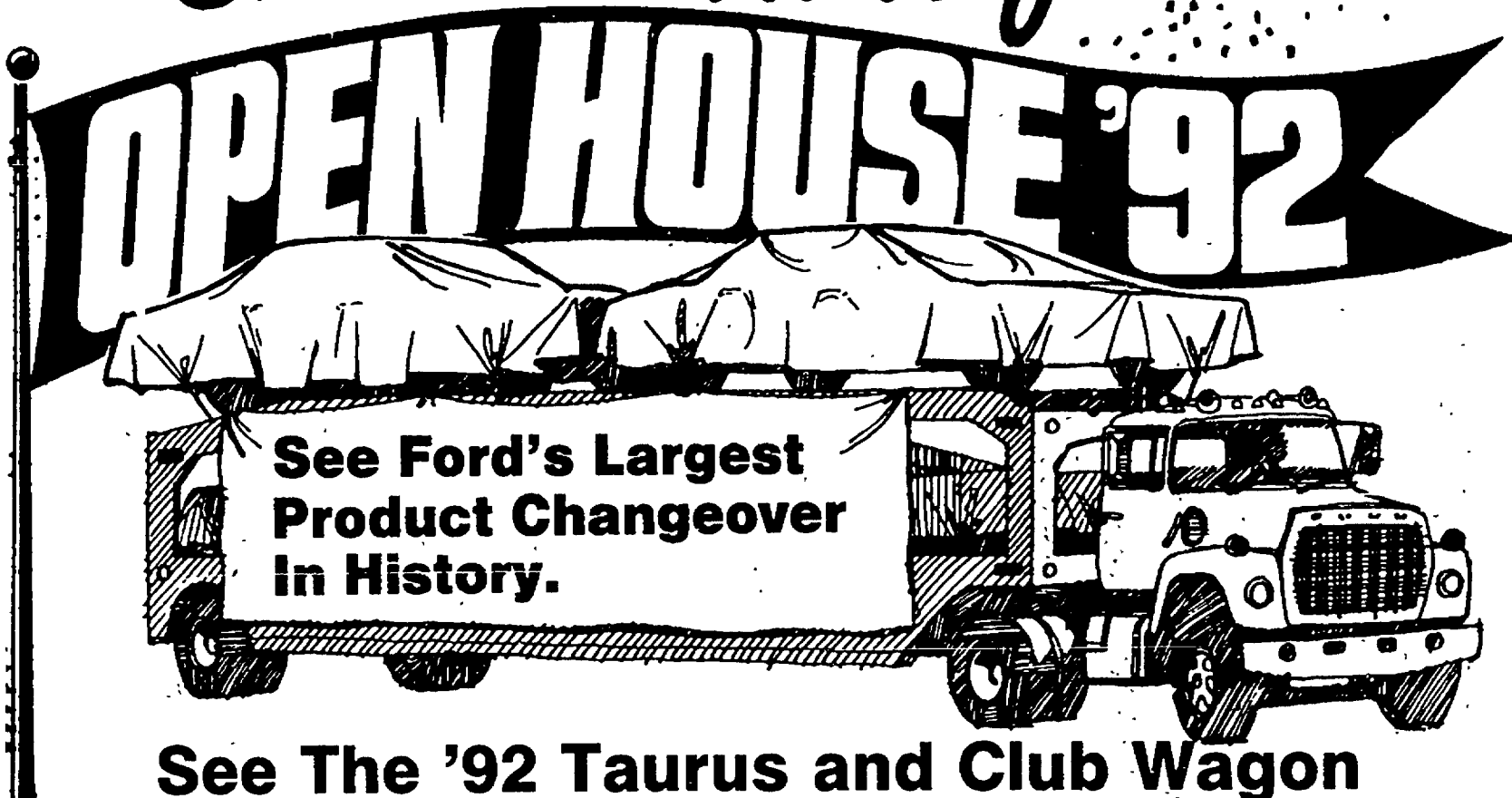

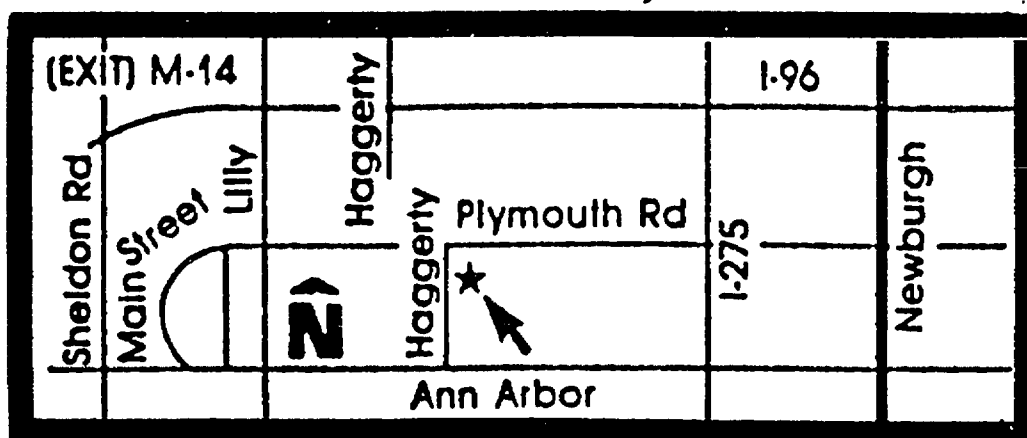
