Cutters trim police and fire budgets

One department recaptured funds and two others suffered stinging cutbacks during Thursday's township budget review session.

The seven-member review committee sliced a total of \$170,000 from the township police and fire department budgets. Meanwhile, the committee restored nearly \$25,000 in building department salaries and benefits after hearing an impassioned plea from building official Michael Kruszewski. Almost \$250,000 was pared from

the proposed 1992 township budget during review meetings last week. The committee must recommend another \$100,000 in cuts to achieve a balanced budget as mandated by state law.

Next target for budget cutters: Community shared services programs including library, recreation, senior citizens and youth assistance. Combined 1992 budget requests for those programs total nearly \$364,000, topped by a library request of \$194.126.

Committee members will mull shared-services cuts Tuesday afternoon at township hall.

Substantial shared-services cuts are likely to occur, if budget reviewer sentiment holds true.

"Personally, I think the parks and recreation might be able to operate with what we rave them last year," committee member Frank St. Louis said. The same with senior citizens

"If anything should be cut, it should not be police and fire," he

But the committee did not exclude emergency services departments from its hit list. In fact, more money was cut from the proposed police department budget than from any other township department.

The fire department witnessed the second-highest cut among township

You can't afford that this year." St. Louis said. 'It's not even worth talking about it."

In addition to the expansion plan. the committee scaled back on police requests for everything from ammunition to legal fees and office supplies. Reviewers sliced a total of \$112,400 from Snider's \$1.7-million 1992 budget.

Snider did not walk away emptyhanded, however. A request for three dash-mounted computer terminals for squad cars and an accompanying hookup fee to a computer data base was approved at a total cost of \$22,400. Also approved was a sixspace carport (down from a 15-space carport request).

The fire department was not spared the budget knife. More than \$57,000 was cut from the department's proposed \$422,599 budget. Reductions were made in areas ranging from equipment and building maintenance to fire clothes to radios.

A \$27,500 request for a new fire support vehicle was nixed, and budget committee members lamented the cost of operating two fire departments between Northville Township and city.

"When I see the money sitting in the township and I see the money sitting over on Main Street in the city . . said John Sassaman. The community could be better served with a combination of fire services, he said.

The committee did sheath its knife during one segment of Thursday's session. Kruszewski asked the committee to reinstate about \$25,000 in salaries and benefits to township building inspectors. Committee members had slashed building funds Oct. 15, but recanted after Krus-

Enrollment up again in schools

Enrollment figures were down from the first of the school year when school officials calculated figures on the fourth Friday of September.

Enrollment figures on the fourth Friday are used to determine state aid. The figures must be reported to the Michigan Department of Education.

This year on Sept. 27, a total of 4,029 students were enrolled. That figure was 4.048 on the first day of school, Sept. 3

Last year Northville Public Schools had 3,887 students enrolled on the fourth Friday count. The rise in enrollment this year continues a sixyear growth trend.

Some building enrollment figures had changed by plus or minus one student, but district wide enrollment was holding steady as of Oct. 14. when the student population was 4.029.

Enrollment figures reported to the state are used to establish per-pupil funding of school districts. Northville does not receive per-

pupil aid because the district is considered property wealthy by the state funding formula.

The property tax rate and state equalized valuation of money in Northville will be used in conjunction with the student enrollment figures to determine the amount of money to be recaptured from the district.

Recaptured money refers to funding the state supplies to some school districts to fund state-mandated programs.

Districts like Northville are required to run programs like special education and transportation but are not reimbursed for the cost.

Keeping the faith

New owners at Parmenters expect to maintain family style of business

Perpetuating a 118-year-old tradition is difficult, but Northville sisters Diane Jones and Cheryl Nelson will try at Parmenters Northville Cider Mill.

The two sisters, along with their husbands, Mel Jones and Rob Nelson, bought Parmenters on Aug. 28 from longtime owners Vern and

Ruth Bodker The two families have been

friends since they both lived in Redford. "We've known the Bodkers. . . can't remember not knowing them. Our fathers used to go to school together," Diane Jones said.

The Bodkers and their son Chris have owned and operated the cider mill since 1968, when they bought it from Robert Parmenter. Located on Baseline Road east of the railroad tracks, Parmenters is Northville's oldest continuously operated retail business.

The mill was established by Benijah Parmenter in 1873 and stayed in the family for five generations. Parmenter, a Civil War veteran and Congressional Medal of Honor recipient, erected the mill for the manufacture of cider, apple butter and vinegar. He paid for the mill from money he received from the government for being mustered out of the Civil War. Although Parmenter's original building was destroyed by fire in 1977, the new building, which is shaped like a barn, stands on the original site.

Parmenters has been a family business ever since.

"If you look around here, twothirds of the people working here are family. We all have large famillies and they are all excited about being involved with the cider mill

right now," Diane Jones said. Besides Cheryl and Rob Nelson, their son Rob and daughter Amanda; and Diane and Mel Jones; sisters Pam, Debbie and K.C. also work at the mill as well.

The cider season, which opened on Labor Day weekend and traditionally closes just before Thanksgiving, requires long hours and a great deal of food preparation. Weekends are especially busy, and it is not uncommon to see lines of patrons formed outside the front doors waiting to buy apples and related products. The work load combined with the families inexperience with the cider business has made this season a quick learning experience.

'We really didn't know anything about the business at all. And it is more involved than we had originally anticipated." Diane Jones

Why would a family with no cider business experience want to own Parmenters? Diane Jones explains:

We knew they (the Bodkers) were thinking of doing something different and they were getting near retirement age. They are now teaching us the cider business. Without them it would not be possible."

The Bodkers are assisting the new owners with the transition throughout the rest of the season. But the technology that Vern Bodker added to the business may be their most important asset. Adapting some of the technology he used at the now-defunct Bodker Dairy Company, Bodker updated the cider storage method.

Instead of using an old rack and ciour style storage bin. Bodker introduced a stainless-steel drum for storage. When the apples are loaded in to the back of the mill from a truck, they are first placed into a washer, then ground into a pulp resembling applesauce and immediately stored in a stainless-steel drum and regrigerated. From this process, Bodker developed Parmenters slogan, "Keep it cold and keep it clean.

But Parmenters has much more to offer than just plain apple cider. From apple cider they can make vinegar, hard cider and a secret recipe for hot cider - not to be confused with cider just heated up.

Parmenters receives its three types of apples - Jonathan, Deliclous and MacIntosh — from across the state at Lowell, Michigan.

The apples are the best in the State of Michigan," Mel Jones said.

Other apple related products consist of apple butter, apple pit,

May retires from warden position

When Lloyd May steps from behind the walls and razor wire-lined fences at Scott Regional Correctional Facility next week, he'll be a free man.

But May's departure marks the achievement of a goal, the end of a rewarding 35-year career, and duly separates him from the thousands of convicted criminals who have been forced to call the facility home.

May, Scott's warden since 1987, last week announced his retirement. He officially will step down Oct. 31. Joan Yukins, warden of the Huron

Valley Women's Facility at Ypsilanti. recently was named acting warden at

May leaves Scott after more than three decades of state employ. including 25 years with the state Department of Corrections. His presence in the Northville community has been felt since 1980, when he was named warden at Phoenix Correctional Facility.

"It's (retirement) something Id been planning for quite some time." May said Friday. "It's a time that arrives in everyone's life."





Local officials object to SEMCOG conclusions

Many suburban officials are offended at charges that racial bias is "the dominant social factor" behind urban sprawl in the seven-county region.

The conclusion states that racial discrimination is the prime cause of urban sprawl," said Trustee Richard Allen on behalf of Northville Township. "I think nearly uncontrolled crime is a more significant factor that seems to be neglected throughout the

(report). It painted us unfairly," an angry Plymouth Township Trustee Abe Munfakh said at the executive committee of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

used too broad a brush in describing and that the improvements be built urban sprawl. Peckens described the RDI study's attitude as one of "reinvest in urban areas at the expense of suburban and rural aras."

Livingston, he said, would recognize that "many portions of the per-imeter counties have real needs for roads, sewers, schools and other services brought about by decades of

Other RDI recommendations that generated letters of protest were: Tax-base sharing — RDI calls for municipal tax-base sharing (on top of the school tax-base sharing enacted recently by the state Legislature). Mandatory regional review of major developments - Many see this as intrusion into local home rule.

• "Concurrency" — RDI proposes that developers be charged for neces-Livingston County board Chair that developers be charged for necessary infrastructure improvements, at the same time as development.

The report of the Regional Development initiative task force was intended to be "provocative," said Gerald McCassrey, Macomb County school official who chairs SEMCOG. But while SEMCOG leaders ex-

pected controversy over perceived attacks on local home rule, they appeared startled at the furor stirred up by the RDI panel's racial charges.

"Negative . . . degrading to the mi-nority population," said Bloomfield Township Supervisor Fred Korzon, who in written comments urged SEMCOG to tone down the racial charges.

There are a multitude of social factors - crime, education, economics - which are factors in fringe development and urban abandonment,* said a Macomb County board resolution. To cite only race as the dominant factor masks many other equally relevant social issues."

Macomb commissioners offered an amendment to cite racial discrimination as "a factor."

The contention that racial discrimination is the cause of this (sprawl) problem is presumptuous and incorrect." said Plymouth Township's Munfakh.

The RDI report addresses urban sprawl — the eating up of 40 percent more land to serve a 6-percent population growth by 2010. It calls "business as usual" wasteful of future taxes and an abandonment of older

cities' infrastructure. While Munfakh and the Macomb delegation were ready to do battle, the SEMCOG executive committee voted only to "accept" the report and forward it to the General Assembly in

There it will be shuffled through the committee structure. Months of debate lie ahead.

Munfakh tried to have the report kicked back to the RDI panel, but McCaffrey ruled the motion out of

McCaffrey did, however, accept Plymouth Township's resolution, which blamed sprawl on "the degraded quality of life in the urban core and the extremely high cost of supporting an aging infrastructure."

A few official, and many non-

official, comments praised RDI.

Southfield City Administrator Robert Block: "I believe the cultural, ethnic and economic attitudes of southeastern Michigan's middle class toward race drive the decisions of investment in the metro area. All other issues evolve as a consequence

of these attitudes."

Frank E. Smith, president of the Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce: "Excellent work," except for reservations about tax sharing.

Douglas Winkworth and Robrt Bednas of Kirco Realty and Development, Ltd., Troy: "As representatives of a private sector, market-oriented view, we also wanted to make it known that we share the concerns of. the community regarding urban sprawl and the challenges of regeneration in our mature urban-suburban

Karen DeGrendel, Rochester Hills, president of the metropolitan area League of Women Voters: The League supports all recommendations except "concurrency," which it hasn't

Wortman has proven abilities as consultant

The Northville City Council may decide at its meeting tonight which of four finalist firms will act as the city's planning consultant for the foreseeable


The WBDC Group; McKenna Associates; Carlisle Associates; and Ayres, Lewis, Norris, and May pleaded their cases before the council in hourlong interviews last Monday and Tuesday. Consulting duties in the city are up for grabs because of a job switch earlier this year by Don Wortman, who had been serving as the city's primary planning consultant for a few years as an employee of ALNM. When he left that company for a post with Carlisle Associates, that presented the city with the question of whether it should continue its contract with ALNM, move to Carlisle with Wortman, or go elsewhere.

During the interviews, all four firms mounted reasonable arguments for the city to hire them. In fact, the overall impression was that any of the four would do a better-than-adequate job meeting the city's planning-consulting needs.

WBDC offers the advantage of serving as planning consultants to Northville Township; that presents the attractive notion of closer cooperation between the two local governments. McKenna Assoclates is known to the city; it came in second when the council first hired Ayres, Lewis, and it's headquartered close by. ALNM is, of course, the current contractor. And Carlisle can boast that the city's primary consultant, Wortman, would be a major player in the firm; it also points to a specialization in just this type of work. All four therefore have a particular advantage, and all four boast good reputations.

If the companies are roughly equal and they are - then the individual consultants themselves loom as the important question. And while any of the people proposed by the four firms would probably prove capable, there's no reason to leave - and good reason to stay with - Don Wortman.

First and most obvious is his familiarity with the community, with the planning commission, and with the city's or-



Development

dinances and organization. Wortman knows Northville relatively well; he developed (with the planning commission) the community survey of a couple of years ago, and the commission relied on him a great deal in writing and revising the recently adopted master plan. He has been instrumental in working through various site plans and ordinance revisions in his time here.

This experience does not come easy. It takes time for a planner to get up to speed in a new municipality, and Wortman is there. Hiring any new planner, no matter how competent, will require a breaking-in period. For a time, the city would be playing catch-up. There's simply no reason to do that.

ALNM argues that Wortman is just one member of a team which has been serving Northville. Well, maybe. But he's certainly the leader of the team and the one who has guided the work. He's also the one who has sat through all the meetings. Occasionally the firm's Glenn Bowles has filled in, but he wouldn't be the primary contact if the city was to continue with Ayres, Lewis.

When Wortman announced his move to Carlisle Associates earlier this year, the planning commission itself asked the city council that he be maintained as planning consultant. The commission deserves its wishes, assuming Wortman does a capable job.

And that's beyond question. Wortman has demonstrated abilities to handle all the various planning concerns the city has faced during his tenure. The planning commission is comfortable with him. It's a good relationship which deserves to be maintained.

Michigan Bell wants ever more



Money, money, money. Michigan Bell, which used to be the telephone company, has money coming in from every direction these days. And it wants even

The state's population has been stagnant for a decade, but Bell hasn't heard the bad news. In four years, its number of customer lines has increased 2, 2.5, 2.6 and 2.2 percent. Has anyone else's customer base grown 9.7 percent in

four years?

How? Spot the homes with teenagers and sell them a second phone line (so they can get ripped off by those 900 numbers). Sell more lines to businesses. Our economic pie may not be growing, but Bell is widening

If you think Bell is a great place to look for a job, think again. In 1989 it cut 600 jobs, in 1990 it whacked 900 more and this year will slice 200 jobs — 1,700 lost jobs, or more than one-tenth of its current 16,000 work force.

How's that for a money-making machine in tough times? Nowadays, only 90 percent of Bell's revenue comes from "communications services." The rest comes from "billing and

collection services, rents and directory advertising. Those yellow pages have so much advertising that they're unwieldy. The business is so huge that it's organized as a se-

parate subsidiary, Ameritech Services. Michigan Bell is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Ameritech, one of seven regional companies created after the 1984 breakup of the AT & T Goliath. But that's not stopping Ameritech, which last year joined Bell Atlantic to acquire New Zealand's state-owned telecommunications company. Money,: money, money from the far corners of the globe.

It's all in the Bell's IRS report, a difficult document to obtain if you look in the Ameritech directory.

With so much money coming in and so many workers go. ing out during such bad times, you'd think Bell would be low in fear of a backlash.

Bell is more aggressive than ever, launching a vehement attack on the state's "nearly 80 years old" telecommunications law. Bell wants to invade even more industries — cable TV. fiber optics, two-way video, services for the hearing impaired, and so on.

Like the beat-beat of a tom-tom, Bell's fleet of lobbyists chants "competition, competition, competition." Why? Don't we have several giant cable TV companies?

Don't we have plenty of competition in all the fields?

The real danger is that Bell, as a near monopoly, might misuse its current protected position. It could use phone workers to install other telecommunications equipment; then hide the latter costs in the telephone end of the busici ness, undercutting the competition.

The bill's sponsor, state Sen. Mat Dunaskiss, R-Lake Orion, assures us the bill would "strictly prohibit crosssubsidization."

And who's going to regulate Bell to make sure it doesn't cook its books to compete unfairly against the little guys? Michigan has record welfare and education spending, but is constricting its regulatory budget.

We shouldn't trust Bell And we can't trust the state to regulate Bell's cost accountants.

Money, money - and more of it for Bell.

In fact, Players Choice, a video arcade and sometimes pizza joint nestled in the Highland Lakes Shopping Center, attracts a highly questionable crowd, said township Trustee Thomas

*I had the opportunity (recently) to go into Players Choice," Handyside said at the board's Oct. 12 meeting. I was really appalled at that place.

"That place is questionable," he said. "We've got kids, people, hanging around Players Choice that I would question their integrity.

Players Choice co-owner Rose Haddad on Friday disputed Handyside's claims.

We have the best people here," she said. "If (patrons) smoke and drink, we kick them out." Players Choice caters to young and old alike, said Haddad, who called her clients wellbehaved.

It's like a church; everybody says what a nice the it is for kids," she said.

Not everyone agrees. Township police are well in tune with complaints about Players Choice. Police regularly cruise the mall area, breaking up gatherings of youths and responding to occasional reports of vandalism and other usually petty crimi-

But police Lt. Gary Batzloff said Players Choice is not a major cause of concern in Northville Township. He said the department has responded to 25 complaints at the 43003 Seven Mile Road site in 1991, nine of which were requests for assistance from people locked out of their vehicles.

A smattering of criminal activity - including a larceny complaint, two assault and battery reports, a malicious destruction of property report. three disorderly person investigations, and four loitering complaints — warrants a close look, but does not send red flags unfurling before police.





Flint native find success in Napa Valley

Charles Shaw was born in Flint, graduated from Davison High School in 1961, graduated from West Point in 1965, and in 1978 founded Charles F. Shaw Vineyard and Winery in California's Napa Valley.

Shaw's interest in wine began during a two-year stint in France, where he worked as an investment banker. While in France, with his wife Lucy, Shaw had the opportunity to visit the French wine regions and was enchanted by the wines of Burgundy, especially Beaujolais.

In Napa Valley, Shaw specializes in making wines styled after the French Beaujolais he came to love. Since the origins of the California grape varietals,

Napa Gamay and Gamay Beaujolais, are in doubt, Shaw devised an elegantly simple solution to his problem of using the genuine varietal. In 1981, he succeeded in procuring vine cuttings from Beaujolais and thus imported to California the first vines that are unquestionably the true grape of Beaujolais, namely gamay noir a

Shaw's winemaking technique duplicates the methode beaujolaise to achieve the characteristic fresh-fruit quality of true Beaujolais wine. In this method, also called carbonic maceration, whole grape bunches are put into a deep, stainless steel fermentation tank and blanketed with carbon dioxide gas, the same gas produced during fermentation.

Crushed by the weight above. 20 percent of the grapes at the bottom of the tank release their juice. which begins to ferment. The remaining 80 percent of the grapes begin carbonic maceration, or fermentation within the whole, uncrushed berries.

The carbonic maceration technique preserves the full, fresh, fruitiness; spicy, peppery nuances; ripe berry aroma, and bright garnet color of the wine. Brief aging in large oak tanks imparts the structure and backbone necessary for increased longevity. Don't be-Heve the myths that nouveau wines won't age for more

than six months, "Shaw says. You can test this by trying the 1990 Harvest Wine Gamay Beaujolais Nouveau. In France, the wine-growing region known as Beaujolais sat the southern end of Burgundy. Several styles of Beaujolais include: light and fruity nouveau, released the week before Thankershing, always the first wine of the week before Thanksgiving, always the first wine of the harvest; Beaujolais Villages, released about one year later, richer with greater depth; Cru Beaujolais, the most serious and ageable wine of Beaujolais, with one of 10 village names on the label. The 10 "cru" villages are Fleurie, Regnie, St. Amour, Chiroubles, Morgon Moulin-A-Vent, Brouilly, Cote de Brouilly, Julienas and Chenas.

Charles F. Shaw Winery offers three levels of Califor-

Charles F. Shaw Winery offers three levels of California Beaujolais — a nouveau-style released in mid-October, a Villages-style regular bottling and a superpremium estate bottling in the style of a Fleurie.

Not to be known as "Johnny One Note," Shaw also produces estate-bottled Napa Valley sauvignon blanc and chardonnay. The 1988 Sauvignon Blanc (\$11) is a delicately soft sipper that highlights citrus, melon and a touch of hay. The 1988 Chardonnay (\$12) is a tasty, well-infeed wine that exhibits fresh fruit with a bawell-priced wine that exhibits fresh fruit with a balanced touch of oak.

1990 Charles Shaw Harvest Wine Gamay Beaujolais Nouveaup (\$6) boasts beautiful fresh raspberry aromas with exuberant flavors of raspberries and cherries. This is the most French-like nouveau from California.

1988 Charles Shaw Gamay Beaujolais, Napa Valleyp (\$8.50) shows characteristics of raspberries, cherries and strawberries with the depth of a Beaujolais Villages. While most red wines are served at cellar temperature (65 degrees F), we recommend serving these wines slightly chilled.

Game birds offer wide variety

Ready. Aim. Clean out your freezeri It's time to make room for the special delicacy of the season — wild game.

Whether you're a hunter or not, you can still enjoy the flavor of a well-cooked pheasant, the buttery taste of quail or even plain holiday goose.

As well as having a special flavor, wild game birds are healthier than farm-raised birds. The U.S. Department of Agriculture estimates that wild duck has only five grams of fat per serving, compared with 25 grams for domestic duck. Pheasant and quail are similar in fat content to chicken.

The lower fat content also means that you should cook

wild game birds either in a liquid or fat covering, such as bacon, or use a cooking bag to keep the meat moist.

Robert Baure, manager of propagation at the Illinois Department of Conservation, reminds hunters that, for safety's sake, the birds should be field-dressed right away, cutting open the stomach cavity to remove the

"Most hunters stuff the body cavity with dry grass to cool the body temperature," Bauer said. Grass can also be used to clean out the bird.

"If a bird does not act normal and has a lackluster appearance, I would not take it home to eat. That bird is probably diseased or injured," Bauer said. "Look for a bird that flushes well, and has bright eyes and a good appearance."

Baure estimated that 75 percent of all the game birds harvested each year are young. The age of a wild bird is important: A younger bird will be tender enough to broil

important: A younger bird will be tender enough to broil or saute, while an older bird will need to be stewed. A good way to estimate the age of a bird is to grab the rear tip of the breastbone (not the backbone). If it is flexible, the bird is young. If it is brittle, plan to stew the bird. On pheasant and quail, you can also tell the age of the bird by the length of its spurs.

Buck and Mike started hunting with their fathers and grandfathers when they were kids, and have continued to include hunting as a family event. "We take our dads and enlow ourselves."

enjoy ourselves.

Mike said the flavoer of wild game birds is so special he tries not to add much seasoning. I like the basic. Salt and pepper, maybe some paprika or garlic powder. Game birds just don't need much seasoning. I wouldn't want to cover up the flavor of the bird."

Diners shold watch out for lead shot left in the birds. "My kids think it is a big thing to get shot." Mike said. so when we sit down to eat the kids jsut start looking for

What's the difference between farm-raised and wild? "It's hard to describe, but there is a definite difference," said Mike. "For example, the meat is very rich and lean. Unlike farm-raised birds, the meat on wild duck or goose is all dark meat. That makes a big difference when you start cooking them. You have to keep in mind that they are pretty dry to start out with. You have to add moisture when you cook them, or they will be inedible."

Because it is illegal for restaurants in some states to buy wild game from hunters, restaurants often purchase both wild game imported from other countries such as

Scotland and farm-raised game birds. Pheasants from the wild have a flavor reminiscent of chicken, but with something more. If the birds are wild, you may marinate them in liquor overnight to eliminate the heavy gamey flavor.

A popular dish is pheasant served with a brandy-orange sauce and chestnut dressing. This sauce is a reduction of brandy, with a base of orange juice and pheasant stock (made from the bones/caracass). If necessary, the pheasant stock could be replaced with chicken stock. The sauce could also be used over other wild game birds.

- cup brandy
- cup orange juice
- 1 cup stock
- Salt, pepper, Worcestershire and Tabasco, to taste 1 tablespoon arrowroot or cornstarch
- cup heavy cream or half-and-half
- 1/2 pound butter, room temperature, cut into tablespoon-size servings.

Yiekla 4 servings.

Reduce the brandy over heat down to a tablespoon or so. Add orange juice and stock and season with salt, pepper, Worcestershire sauce and Tabasco. Stir in arrowroot or cornstarch to thicken.

Cream the sauce by stirring in the cream. Continue stirring until thickened. Once the sauce has returned to a low simmer, remove from heat. Add butter, one tablespoon at a time, and stir. Serve over pheasant.

The next glaze, like the brandy-orange sauce, uses a cordial for added flavoer. You'll be suprised by the taste of Kahlua combined with the strong flavor of wild game birds. Kahlua Glaze

1/3 cup apricot jam



Game birds offer many opportunities for a different type of entree.

1/3 cup Kahlua (or other coffee-flavored liquor) Yields enough for two large geese or four smaller birds. Strain jam through a sieve or smooth it in a food blender. Add Kahlua and mix well. Use it as your baste throughout. Make gravy as usual. Can be used for any

This is the type of dish that is easy to make, yet has an elegant touch. The sauce has a light, lemony flavoer that works well with the heartier flavor of wild pheasant. One pheasant often retains a few small feathers. These should be removed by hand, and if the flesh has any visible hairs, carefully pass the bird over a low slame and brush the singed hairs away.

Pheasant In Onlon Sauce

- 1 cleaned, ready-to-cook pheasant, about 2 1/2 pounds.
- Salt and freshly ground popper to taste
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil 2 sprigs fresh thyme or 1/4 teaspoon dry thyme
- 1 small bay leaf 1/4 cup dry white wine

Several factors become important when buying fish

call from the Foley's salesman in Boston. I believe I mentioned that our fish is flown in fresh several times a week. At first this seemed extravagant to me. It is not reasonable to ship fish packed in ice. I questioned my judgment. Was it worth it? Would our guests be able to tell the difference?

There are several factors that are extremely important when purchasing fish. A basic rule of thumb is to buy from a reputable house. Foley's has been in business since 1906. Not a small accomplishment these days. Fish is, and has been, their only concern for the last 80 years.

The process starts with the buying of fish. Buyers are positioned at all the key New England ports so that the highest quality for the fairest prices can be obtained. All fish must pass the "eye, smell, and touch"

They look for fish with a natural shine. Yellowing or

Soon after writing my article last week I received a browning is an indication of age. Many fishermen engage in the practice of soaking fish in a brine to mask off odors, add weight and induce a fake shine.

The saying "the nose knows" could not be more true than when procuring fish. Fresh fish does not smell. Any fish with uncharacteristic odors are rejected. Fishy, sour or ammonia odors are not natural.

The touch test indicates whether fish have been brine-soaked. Brined fish are tacky and sticky. Brining hides imperfections.

After purchase, the fish is transported to the plant in refrigerated trucks, where it is iced in special 12-degree flaked ice. The plant itself is kept at 50 degrees

The importance of temperature cannot be overemphasized. Fish should be stored at a minimum of 32 degrees. One day of shelf life (and thus flavor) is lost with every two degrees above 32 in which you store fish during a 24-hour period. With the best fish there is about a five-day maximum.

The fish we receive is layered in metal, versus plastic, containers and packed in ice. Metal is a much better conductor of cold than is plastic, so the fish has a better chance from the start.

All fish is processed by hand. This ensures workmanship, since the employees share in the profits. There are no ragged edges or blood spots in the fillets. Foley's employs a bacteriologist to monitor bacteria counts and to ensure the effectiveness of the bacteria retardation system.

Unlike the meat industry, which is regulated by the USDA, the fish industry is not governmentsupervised. As a result, handling practices, and consequently quality, vary tremendously among boat owners and fish processors who are free to set their own standards. This is scary. It also brings us back to the first rule: Buy from someone you trust.

Getting back to the phone call from the Foley's tive chef.

Sausage can be microwaved

There once was a newspaper article that suggested, "If you want to see something sickening, cook sausage in a microwave...it comes out gray.' Well, yeah, it does. Tastes fine, but doesn't look so hot.

One solution is to brush link sausages with a browning agent (equal parts water and brown bouquet sauce works well) or cook on a microwve-safe browning grill for

more appetizing color. Browning dish: To microwave sausage patties or links in a browning dish, preheat utensil according to manufacturer's instructions. Add sausages or patties and microwave on high setting three to five minutes for four sausage patties, 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 minutes for four uncooked saus-

age links. Turn over halfway through cooking time. To microwave sausage patties: ar-

range six sausage patties (1/2- to 3/4-inch thick) on a roasting rack. Brush with equal parts brown bouquet sauce and water. Cover with waxed paper and microwave on high setting two minutes; turn over and brush with browning mixture. Cover and microwave two to three minutes longer. Let stand several minutes before serving.

Bulk sausage microwaves as quickly as ground beef, and spicy Italian sausage can be a tasty change of pace in your favorite microwave spagnetti sauce.

To defrost 1 pound of frozen raw bulk sausage, place in a 1-quart microwave-safe casserole and microwave three minutes at defrost (30 percent power) setting. Let stand three to five minutes. Scrape off any thawed portions, break up block, and return to oven for one to three minutes longer; let stand several minutes before checking.

To micro-cook 1 pound raw bulk sausage, crumble into a 1-quart microwave-safe casserole. Microwave on high setting three minutes; sur and microwave one to three minutes longer. Drain off fat and break up large chunks with the back of a

Lots of opportunities with Oriental-styled sauces

Love the flavor of your favorite Chinese restaurant dishes? You can replicate some of these flavors at home when you add prepared Chinese sauces to your own cooking.

In addition to the well-known soy sauce, some other popular Oriental concoctions are plum sauce, hoisin sauce, oyster sauce, chili sauce and sesame oil. All of these prepared sauces are available at Oriental markets, and most can now be found in larger grocery stores.

Soy sauce is an excellent addition to marinades and gives a nice, deepbrown color to microwaved meats. Made from fermented soy beans, wheat flour, yeast, salt and sugar, the soy sauce used by Chinese cooks comes in three grades: light, dark and black (the last is not really darker in color, but is instead thicker in texture with added solids, including molasses). Japanese soy sauce is a cross between light and dark, and may be substituted in most recipes.

Plum sauce, also known as duck sauce, is sweet, red and spicy. Made from plums, sugar, vinegar, hot peppers and spices, it is often used as a dipping sauce for finger foods like spring rolls. It is also blended with other ingredients as a binding sauce for stir-fry dishes. Plum sauce may be purchased in bottles or cans, flavor varies according to brand) or you can make your own microwave ver- Use this sparingly, as well.

hoisin sauce is indispensable because so many recipes call for it. Hoipork (it's a big ingredient in many marinades and barbecue sauces), although it also frequently flavors chicken, vegetables and fish. You'll also find it used at the table as a gamish for dishes like mu shu (those wonderful little savory meat-filled pancakes).

A typical bottle of hoisin sauce (a product of Hong Kongl contains sugar, vinegar, soybean water, salt, flour, garlic, sesame seed, chili and tested in 625- to 700-watt microwave spices. The sauce is thick, smooth ovens.) and dark brownish-red, and smells sweet and spley.

Dreyfuss plays one of history's imperfect heroes

Actor's fascination began in childhood

What's in a name can shape a lifetime's quest. Take, for example, actor-producer Richard Dreyfuss, who long believed himself related to French army captain Alfred Dreyfus, the central character in a 19th-century political scandal that shaped the Zionist movement and led to the separation of church and state in France.

Thanks to the Paul Muni film "The Life of Emile Zola," Dreyfuss (whose family name is Dreyfus) became fascinated with the Dreyfus Affair while still a child. Although he has since learned he has no blood ties to Alfred Dreyfus, the actor has clearly been drawn in spirit to pursue the questions of honor and justice the story raises.

Alfred Dreyfus' Jewish heritage and unbending personality made him a target for fellow officers conspiring to frame him in 1894 as a traitor to the government. Convicted and banished to Devil's Island, Dreyfus became a symbol in France of the movement against corruption in the military, the government and even the church.

In 1898, novelist and social philosopher Emile Zola ("Therese Raquin," "Nana") became obsessed with clearing Dreyfus' name and wrote a tract, "J'accuse," which stirred public sentiment. Meanwhile, Col. George Picquart, the newly appointed head of army counterintelligence, discovered Dreyfus had been framed for crimes committed by another officer. Despite his anti-Semitic sentiments, which were typical of the times, and a personal dislike of Dreyfus, Picquart chose to pursue the truth.

In his own film on the Dreyfus Affair, "Prisoner of Honor," debuting Saturday, Nov. 2, on HBO, actor Dreyfuss plays Picquart, an "imperfect hero," because Picquart stepped out "of narrow, blinkered provincialism, to something greater"—honor.

"What really does fascinate


me...with his character...is that nothing is simple. We each have a tendency to compartmentalize everybody. These are the good guys, and those are bad guys. I find myself drawn, in the films that I develop and in the stories that I want to produce, to people who are a bit more complicated than that.

"It pleases me to irritate those people who say, 'How can you make an anti-Semite a hero?' I like to take that opportunity as much as I can."

Dreyfuss, a political activist and consciencious objector during the Vietnam War, warms to his subject as few actors do. Addressing a room full of reporters, he leaves his seat to pace the small stage as he answers questions. Like a dedicated professor among freshmen, he is fully engaged in the issue at hand, and his enthusiasm carries the hour.

So well does Dreyfuss understand his subject that he was not afraid to introduce other strong influences to the film, not only with repeated screenings of "Emile Zola" and "I Accuse," a 1958 Jose Ferrer film, but in the distinctive style and "camera vision" of director Ken Russell as well.

"I hoped that we would find some-



one who would bring something eccentric and particular to the film," says Dreyfuss. "And my first thought was Ken. ...That was the reason for picking him."

The supporting cast is similarly strong, with Oliver Reed and Brian Blessed as French generals and Peter Firth as Major Henri. Kenneth






