



Township cuts back proposal

Once-high hopes for tough asphalt plant guidelines were grounded last week after township attorneys determined that some wording in a proposed ordinance was overly restrictive.

Township planning commissioners, staff, consultants, and attorneys last week continued to mull language for an asphalt plant ordinance. But they scaled back proposed setback distances and modified other language on the advice of attorneys.

The ordinance has evolved into an important issue due to Holloway Sand & Gravel's plan to operate a mining and asphalt plant business on property at Six Mile and Ridge roads. That proposal concerns township officials and nearby residents.

Township planners had hoped to set zoning standards that would insulate neighboring property owners from an asphalt plant that Holloway wants to place on its 177-acre Six and Ridge property.

Previously discussed guidelines included 1,300-foot setbacks from any adjacent residential district or occupied residence, and 500 feet from any other property line.

Those setbacks, so eagerly embraced recently by the planning commission, apparently sent chills up the spine of the township attorney.

"The attorney felt it went too far," said Brad Strader, of WBDC, the township's planning consultant.

Most township officials feel the Holloway asphalt plant case will some day be settled in court, and the current strategy is to develop a tough, but defensible ordinance.

Planners were disappointed by the attorney's verdict, but not surprised.

"If it has to be reduced to be defensible, (we) have to reduce it," said Charles DeLand, planning commis-

sion chairperson. "Based on the tone of his comments, we can forget about 1,300 feet."

Strader agreed, and added that attorneys have little case law to work with in the area of local governments squaring off against asphalt plants. He recommended the commission consider a 500-foot setback accompanied by a formula that included the plant's height multiplied by 10. Most asphalt plants stand 30-40 feet above ground. A basic setback plus a height formula would push the setback to 800-900 feet from residential districts, Strader said.

Attorneys also chafed at the commission's plan to create 500-foot setbacks from all on-site waterways.

"This setback is also extensive and beyond that required of other industrial uses," wrote township attorney Ronald Witthoff in a letter to the commission.

Planners then agreed to cut the waterway setback to 150 feet and require the developer to devise a system to prevent oils used in the asphalt process from leeching into the water table.

The planning commission must approve the proposed ordinance before passing the measure on to the township board. The commission is not scheduled to meet again until January.

Groups keep students on track

A bowl filled with yellow pieces of hard candy sits in a bowl in Charlie Stilec's office.

"The kids ate all the good ones," he said, re-filling the bowl with red, purple and green candy.

Moments later, a student enters Stilec's office.

"I quit smoking," he announces, popping a piece of red candy into his mouth on the way to his next class.

Stilec is Northville High School's student assistance coordinator.

With encouragement, support and often help from an outside therapist, Stilec tries to keep Northville students drug-free.

"The whole idea is to get them back on track so they can graduate," Stilec said.

Students sign up for one school-sponsored support group at a time. At the end of the semester, counselors evaluate students to determine whether they should sign up for

another group.

The groups are not a way for students to get out of class, Stilec said. Instead, groups are intended to help keep students on track so they can succeed in school.

Groups are optional — no one is forced to participate. Most groups meet during the school day, once a week on a rotating basis. Students in a group will miss each of their classes two times during a semester to participate.

They learn problem-solving skills,

gain support from their peers and counselors, and are provided information about their specific problem.

If more help is needed, counselors attempt to get the student into therapy outside of school.

When asked why in-school support groups are needed for a student who receives outside therapy, Stilec said he can help students get back on track temporarily.

Moments later, Stilec's point is il-

Township home suffers break-in

Thieves kicked in a basement window of a Waterfall residence last week, ransacked the home and eventually stole a car and thousands of dollars worth of electronic equipment.

Northville Township police are investigating the theft, which occurred late Nov. 23 or early Nov. 24. Robbery appears to be the sole motive, but police said they have no specific suspects and no warrants had been issued by Friday, said Det. Michael Wildt.

The vehicle and other stolen items had not been recovered by press time Friday.

Waterfall is a road that meanders along the north portion of the Lakes of Northville subdivision north of Six Mile Road. The owners were away from the residence at the time of the

theft, police said.

Police said they received a tip on Nov. 24 that a burglary had taken place at the Waterfall address. When they arrived, police found the front door unlocked and an east side basement window kicked in. The thieves apparently entered the home through the broken basement window, police said.

Several upstairs bedrooms were ransacked, police said. Dresser drawers were dumped, clothing tossed about, and mattresses were moved. Empty beer cans were found in an upstairs bedroom.

Among the items reported missing was a 1989 Toyota MR2, which was stolen from the residence's garage. Other missing items included a telephone answering machine, a head-phone amplifier, a compact disc player, a sterling silver pen and pen-

Board sets up policy review

The policy-making arm of the Northville school district, the school board, set up a two-year plan to review and revise district policy.

At a Nov. 25 meeting, two policies were revised and approved for their first reading.

Six policies were reaffirmed without change, including policies regarding school board meetings, board study sessions, board member attendance at conferences, school visits, the use of school buildings and properties, and smoking in district buildings.

Revised policies include a non-discrimination policy. The policy was rewritten to conform with the law: The board's old policy did not prohibit discrimination based on age, height or weight.

Board policy committee chair Richard Brown said wording in the proposed policy was taken directly from Michigan law "so there is no misunderstanding on what is our non-discrimination policy."

A second revised policy addresses the role citizens advisory committees play on the board of education.

The board may establish citizens committees to address specific areas of interest to the school district.

The old policy discussed the procedural aspects of forming citizens committees and receiving reports from them. Brown said the policy committee did not feel procedural issues belong in board policy.

The board is expected to vote on the revised policies at its Dec. 9 meeting. The meeting will be held at Old Village School, 405 W. Main St., at 7:30 p.m.

Zoning controls win OK

The state Senate has moved to stop local governments from zoning day-care centers and home music teachers out of residential areas. All bills go to the House.

Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, was sponsor of the bill to allow licensed family day-care homes (up to six children) and group day-care homes (up to 12) in residential zones in cities. (Similar laws affecting villages and townships were enacted last year.)

Senate Bill 486 was adopted on a 32-3 vote, with all area senators voting yes.

Sen. Gil DiNello, D-East Detroit, voted yes but protested that "it takes the right away of a local unit of government to govern locally... What you have is automobiles and vans coming and going, picking up children in the neighborhood."

Local units could still inspect the homes and restrict operating times to 16 hours a day.

The Senate gave 30-5 approval to bills protecting the right of music teachers to give lessons in their homes or the homes of pupils. All area senators voted yes.

Police need help of car-phone owners

Drivers on I-96 and outstate freeways will see new signs advising motorists with cellular car phones to dial 9-1-1 when they spot a highway emergency. State Police and the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) are cooperating to enlist car-phone owners as spotters for accidents, stranded motorists and other emergencies. The new system will replace the 13-year-old "Project BEAR" and an outmoded system of emergency phones along I-94 in Detroit. Motorists making the toll-free call are automatically connected with a local 911 emergency dispatcher in the area roughly south of a line extending from Muskegon to Bay City where cellular facilities now operate. The first signs to be installed in outstate Michigan are going up along I-96 between Detroit and Grand Rapids. William Lebel, MDOT's traffic operations engineer, said the department plans to erect 110 signs at 20-mile intervals along about 1,100 miles of rural freeways in southern Michigan. State Police have responded to thousands of calls in the Detroit metropolitan area since early

1990 when MDOT began installing signs saying "Emergency - Car Phone Call 911." "It's working extremely well," said Lt. Steve Brown, who is in charge of the State Police Operations Section. "Very often we get scores of calls from motorists reporting the same incident - a disabled vehicle or whatever." Along I-96, the cellular phone system will replace Project BEAR (Broad Emergency Assistance Radio), which allowed drivers of vehicles equipped with CB radios to communicate directly with a State Police or volunteer dispatcher at State Police headquarters in East Lansing. "Project BEAR served the citizens well, but the state's radio transceivers and supporting telephone lines are outdated and limited by their five-watt design," said Brown. "Certain meteorological factors also caused complications for the system." Bob Maki, head of MDOT's freeway operations group, said the effectiveness of cellular phones also will allow M-DOT to terminate the motorist-aid phone system along 13.5 miles of I-94 (Edsel Ford) Freeway in Detroit. The department began operating the system on an experimental basis late in 1980, installing

phones for reporting emergencies every one-third mile along the shoulders of both the eastbound and westbound freeway. The phones put callers in immediate touch with a State Police dispatcher in downtown Detroit. "The system is outmoded and not as reliable as it should be," said Maki. "Repair parts are no longer available and damage from vandalism, errant vehicles, the environment and other factors requires too much maintenance and repair." Motorists usually had to leave their cars and walk along the freeway shoulder to summon help, posing a safety hazard. Brown praised the nearly 300 citizen volunteers who staffed the Project BEAR dispatch center in East Lansing over the years. "They worked night and day, seven days a week," he said. "They deserve the thanks of thousands of motorists who encountered trouble on the freeway." Requests for assistance included 278 abandoned vehicles, 8,160 motorist assists, 4,472 accidents, 609 fires, 2,727 road hazards, 352 medical emergencies, 135 arrests and 3,057 traffic violations.

Board to wait on some action plans

Northville Public Schools has put on hold a few goals in its long-term plan — at least for the short term.

Four action plans in the district's Strategic Plan were postponed by the school board at a Nov. 25 meeting.

"The reasons are well understood," said Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski. He cited finances and a large number of transitions in the administrative staff.

The district has faced cuts by the state that have forced officials to trim the budget, and in the past year Northville has lost a superintendent, an assistant superintendent and an executive director for special education.

Rezmierski moved from the special education department to head the district and the high school principal joined the central office administration staff.

These factors forced the administration to ask the school board to defer three action plans to September 1992. The deferred action plans are found in three of the seven strategies formed to address specific issues in Northville schools.

The action plans that will be deferred include:

● Action Plan B in Strategy III, which hopes to reduce the overextension of human resources. Action Plan B instructs the district to "assess appropriate secretarial, aid, bus driver, and all other staff ratios and make appropriate changes where necessary."

The plan was to be completed by

Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services David Bolitho. Bolitho assumed the position as assistant superintendent this summer. He was the high school principal prior to his new assignment.

● Action Plan A in Strategy V, which hopes to evaluate and improve community support and involvement. Action Plan A instructs the district to develop and administer statistically valid surveys.

The plan was to be administered by Assistant Superintendent for Instructional Services Dolly McMaster. ● Action Plan B in Strategy V. Action Plan B hopes to "enhance reciprocal involvement and communication between Northville Public Schools and senior citizens, volunteers, parent and non-parent residents regarding the sharing of collective resources and recognition of accomplishments."

Rezmierski was assigned to complete Action Plan B.

A final action plan was deferred. Action Plan A in Strategy IV was put on hold because it was coming in conflict with state-mandated programs.

Strategy IV asked the district to develop and implement plans to meet the goals of all students.

Action Plan A asked the district to "initiate an educational planning team in each building whose responsibility will be to identify and recommend programming or a course of action to meet the special needs of all students."

Deferring the plan met with some resistance from board Treasurer Robert McMahon.

McMahon said Strategy IV is the core of the entire plan.

"I think that's the essence of what we're all about," McMahon said.

He wanted to move the action plan to another section of the Strategic Plan rather than removing it for the remainder of the school year.

Rezmierski said this plan, unlike the other three, was not removed because of resources.

Instead, the action plan was removed because it was conflicting with Public Act 25, which requires that school districts set up school improvement plans and committees to implement the plans.

He said the state committees and school district committees would be working toward similar goals.

"It's a matter of confusing staff," he said.

Board President Jean Hansen said the state act added a "new dimension to the Strategic Plan."

Public Act 25 asks school districts to examine what they expect students to achieve before graduation.

"Our Strategic Plan right now has not gone that far," she said. "Once you put students first its going to bring about this restructuring we've all been talking about."

Rezmierski said the action plan will always be part of the Strategic Plan. But the Strategic Plan looks at the educational process, he said. Plans that examine expectations for graduating students must look at the substance of education, he said.

The board will again discuss the expanded function of the Strategic Plan at its Jan. 16 meeting. The meeting will be held in Bryant School, 18000 Merriman Road, in Livonia.



DDA moves necessary, but questions linger

Bill Sliger and Margie Davis are both apparently leaving their positions as members of the Downtown Development Authority, the result of a request from city Mayor Chris Johnson for two of the group's four "snowbirds" to call it quits. Johnson's thinking makes sense, but a couple of aspects leave us with an uncomfortable feeling about the handling of the matter.

Four members of the DDA — Sliger, Davis, Mike Allen and Glenn Long — head south for the winter. On a nine-member board, the absence of four people makes it very difficult to reach quorum for any given meeting.

In other recent years, this hadn't been too great a problem; the DDA rarely met during the winter months. This year, however, promises to be something of a different story as work continues on the new city parking deck and the redevelopment of the Cady Street area.

The four people asked the mayor if he saw a problem in the impending absences, and he concluded that something should indeed be done. His solution was to ask two of the four — he did not specify which two — to voluntarily step down. Sliger submitted his resignation last month, and Davis has said she will follow suit (she isn't leaving town until after Christmas). Both Sliger and Davis agreed that absent DDA members can't fully perform their duties.

Sliger's resignation, in particular, should not pass without further comment. He was one of the original DDA members, actually beginning with its predecessor, the less-formal Downtown Development Committee. He's given close to 15 years of service on these bodies, always offering a thoughtful perspective, whether or not it happens to be the majority view.

As an aside, one aspect of this situation which raises disturbing feelings is this: City Manager Gary Word announced Sliger's resignation at a recent

meeting, but did not read the letter in which Sliger submitted that resignation. That creates the appearance of trying to accomplish these resignations quietly, without general knowledge of the reason behind them. It's foolish thinking, and unfair to the rest of the authority as well as the public.

But the reason did come to light, and has been the topic of some discussion. As some have said, the DDA is only an advisory body to the city council. But still, it does exist to perform certain important functions, and that can't fully happen with half the group away from the table.

With that in mind, it makes sense to ask for resignations. Even though all four "snowbirds" are valued members of the authority, absences during critical times just don't serve the public's interest.

It seems an odd solution to ask for the resignations of only two, however. If the absences are a problem — on this board, at this time — it seems like everyone should receive equal treatment. One might counter that it's the cumulative effect of four absences, not the individual cases, that really create the problem. But even the regular absence of two people will still make a quorum difficult and will still reduce the number of different perspectives offering opinions at a meeting. The resignation of two members reduces the concerns; it does not eliminate them.

Losing all four of these members would mean a tremendous drop in experience on the DDA. But as Johnson pointed out about Sliger and Davis, nothing should stop any departing members from contributing as interested citizens, and even to sit in on the meetings when schedules permit.

In short, the same logic which dictated the resignation of two DDA members really should dictate the resignation of four.

Maize-and-blue sees purple



Every once in a while, it's necessary to rely on anonymous sources. And this, loyal readers, is one of those occasions.

Yes, this week I am going to depart from my usual format of writing about relatively mundane matters to report on issues of great political and social consequence.

Please understand that I did not personally witness the events you are about to read. But I have it from a reliable source that what I am about to report is true.

The person we're talking about is Susie Heintz, former Northville Township supervisor, former Wayne County Commissioner and now a special representative to Gov. John Engler.

According to my sources, Ms. Heintz was the lone female on the podium at the University of Michigan's annual post-season football bash last week. Dressed in what was described as a very stylish purple dress, Ms. Heintz was at the banquet to read a letter from the governor, honoring the Wolverines for their fine season.

"That's right, Susie," he continued. "This is the University of Michigan football bash. And that's why there's a predominance of maize and blue in the colors you are seeing tonight."

MacKenzie had her cold. And, like the All-Pro offensive lineman he once was, he continued to press his advantage, driving the former Northville Township supervisor off the line of scrimmage and back toward the end zone.

"And yet, Susie, you show up tonight dressed in purple and gold — which just happen to be the colors of the University of Washington — which just happens to be Michigan's opponent in the Rose Bowl game this year."

Like I said earlier, I consider this information to be from a relatively reliable source. But, like the good journalist I try to be, I had to check it out with Ms. Heintz personally.

"Yes," she said when I called her Friday morning, she had been at the banquet. And, yes, she had been the only woman on the podium. And, yes, she had worn a purple dress. And, yes, she had been "picked on repeatedly" by the aforementioned offensive lineman throughout the evening.

The estimable Ms. Heintz denied emphatically, however, that she had been the only one to wear the colors of the Washington Huskies to the Maize and Blue Banquet.

"Lots of people were wearing purple," she asserted. "And they all came up to speak to me personally after my ordeal was over."

"Lots of people?" I asked. "Lots of people were wearing purple to the Michigan football bash? How many are 'lots' of people?"

"Oh, there had to be at least three of us," she said.

Veto messages show thinking



The left wing has been shrill and merciless: "John Scissors-hands," "Grim Reaper," "cruel," "mean-spirited," "destroyer of culture."

As the left curses Gov. Engler's budget vetoes, you would never guess:

1. Engler signed the biggest welfare budget in Michigan history — \$5.8 billion.

2. As of Nov. 1, he raised grant levels for Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC).

3. He increased state aid to public schools, community colleges and state universities 4 percent.

4. All this was done without a tax increase (though there are some fee increases tucked away).

Hardly the record of a scissor-handed meanie. What's going on here?

Engler's veto messages, rarely read, tell the story. He cut: ● Natural Resources money for the Conservation Corps and another job program because they should "be coordinated through the Michigan Department of Labor."

● The State Police secondary road patrol and local grants for a training council because lawmakers failed to act on "the additional civil infraction surcharge built into the revenue base."

● "Foreign student support." The state can't afford to support "a particular category of students which is inconsistent with the purpose of the school finance formula — to equalize available resources on a per-pupil basis."

● Five other line items in the education budget because the hefty school aid increase "should give most in-formula districts enough additional revenue to maintain the most important portions of these programs if they so choose."

(Did you note how Detroit school officials squawked about a \$231,000 cut for school security without mentioning their state aid increase?)

● Professional development for educators. "It funds services which can be assumed by the districts..."

● Westland's public library project and the Taymouth Township (Saginaw County) water decontamination project because "local governments (should) provide the necessary level of support for special local projects."

● \$190,000 for the math early placement test — "worthwhile" but "more properly allowed through the continuing expansion of Math-Science centers at the K-12 level, and extended support for K-12 operation in general."

Engler's budget style is to increase basic social programs and education, and to whack line items that boosted many political egos.

He eliminated most of general assistance (adults) to save AFDC (kids). (I would fault him, however, for terrible timing. The economic recovery that started with the stock market still hasn't been felt at the bottom. And it would be more merciful to whack GA in warm weather than on Oct. 1.)

Engler is far different from ex-Gov. James Blanchard, who constantly put a dime into a tuition program, a quarter into a neighborhood corps program, a nickel into a youth program — all with much ribbon-cutting and PR hullabaloo.

Engler knows precisely where the political skeletons are closeted and is cleaning them out, for better or worse.

Support groups help students stay on track

illustrated when a student comes to his office in tears. He talks to her briefly. Then he sends the girl on her way, only minutes late for a class she might otherwise have skipped.

Thursday at 2:30 when she has an appointment with her therapist, she might not have the same problem," he said.

Another student, "Pam," came to Northville High School in ninth grade already a heavy user of drugs and alcohol. She was unable to deal with her peers and was earning bad grades in school.

Pam, who is now a senior, no longer uses drugs or alcohol. Her grades have improved, and she recently quit smoking and began seeing a therapist.

Pam is involved in a school support group focusing on stress and relationships. Pam has learned it's not her fault if a friend or parent has a bad day.

She would be dead, in jail or "messed up on drugs," if not for the high school support groups, Pam said.

"Shauna," a Northville High School junior, was referred to therapy after joining a high school group for chemical awareness.

She began smoking at 11 because she "just wanted to see smoke blow out of (her) mouth." Her problems with substance abuse progressed from there.

Now she goes to Alcoholics Anonymous meetings every week. She has been sober for as long as four

months. This time it has been nearly two months since her last relapse.

"There's always another relapse out there, but hopefully I'll stay sober through it," Shauna said.

Besides the chemical awareness groups, Northville High School offers support for students dealing with divorce.

The school also has two groups for students who smoke. Both groups are called Fresh Start. One group is for students who want to quit smoking—they are the "wannabes," Stilec said.

The "haftabes" are required to participate in Fresh Start for once a week for four weeks or face a three-day suspension because they were caught smoking on school property.

In the past, groups have been formed to discuss eating disorders, and grief and loss.

Stilec works with substance abuse problems. Counselor Jack Wickens helps run the self-esteem groups.

Northville High School has been running guidance groups on and off at least since 1969, when Wickens began.

Sometimes the groups are more guidance based.

"We talk about how to make choices," Wickens said.

They work under the theory that a group can reach better solutions than an individual.

Suspended students are given the choice of shortening their suspension from five days to three days by agreeing to participate in an after school, 10-week chemical awareness class.

Organizations help furnish rooms

Northville High School's group sessions have found a new home.

Groups designed to help students sort out their problems have met in classrooms, closets and even hallways in the four years Charlie Stilec has been running the show.

"We've been everywhere," Stilec said. Now 42 students in support groups have a room described as "cozy and comfortable" by those who use it. Stilec has an office and a waiting room for private visits with students.

The Northville Action Council, the Community Commission on Drug Abuse and Students Against Driving Drunk donated money to redecorate the

former storage room. The school district found space for the program where a closet had once been.

NAC donated money for the furniture, carpeting and ceilings.

"We wanted it to be aesthetically pleasing," said NAC member Roxanne Casterline.

Casterline said the program was a community effort between SADD, NAC and the drug abuse commission.

"If it hadn't been for them, it wouldn't have been done," Stilec said.

Pamphlets and booklets donated by the Northville Mothers' Club fill a rack on one side of the room. Bean bags, chairs and a table sit on the other side.

Counselor Jack Wickens said the room is small

enough to give a feeling of closeness to group participants. The bean bags and carpeting help make the room cozy, he said.

Casterline said she hopes to add some plants and other touches that will make the room even more comfortable.

She said NAC also hopes to set up a trust fund to make needed purchases for the room in future years. The action council raised its contribution to the room, in part, through donations by Northville families.

NAC will hold its Dec. 19 meeting in the student assistance room at Northville High School. The public is welcome at the meeting, which begins at 7 p.m.





Australian wines are definitely worth a taste

In the 1980s, Australia and things Australian — two Crocodile Dundee films, film stars, recording artists, America's Cup races, the golfer Greg Norman, and wine captured America's interest. Although vegamite never caught on, Australian wines became an infatuation.

The wine industry in Australia began in the late 18th century when the first vine cuttings were brought from South Africa. Today, vineyards abound throughout southern Australia from between the 32nd and 39th parallel.

For white wines, Australia grows principally chardonnay, riesling, sauvignon blanc, and semillon. Principal reds include cabernet sauvignon, malbec, merlot, and shiraz (syrah or hermitage).

The wine regions of Australia have a Mediterranean-type climate. Australia is a country the size of the contiguous 48 states with a population about half that of the state of California. But Australia is a wine-drinking nation with a per-capita consumption more than twice that of the U.S. Sixty percent of the wine is sold domestically as bag-in-the-box and referred to as "cask wine." The premium wine market constitutes about 10 percent of the total production.

Australian wine labels carry name of grapes, growers, makers, districts, vineyards, vintage dates, and the infamous "bin numbers" (a method of indicating style to those in the know). This can frighten the uninformed consumer.

It has been falsely stated that vintage years mean very little in Australia; that all years are very similar. This is not true. Climatic conditions change considerably region to region. This should be a prime focus when choosing Australian wines.

In this assessment of the wine from the Land Down Under, we're choosing to focus on Central Victoria, situated just north of Melbourne.

Here, the Goulburn Valley provides ideal climatic conditions for growing premium varietal fruit. The Goulburn River runs through the valley, providing a moderating climatic influence for many of Australia's "boutique" wineries such as Mitchelton, one of the region's leading producers.

Established in the early 1970s, Mitchelton has successfully combined the great European ideology of developing extremely high quality vineyards and married them to California state-of-the-art technology.

Since 1974, Central Victoria native Don Lewis has been the winery's only winemaker. He crafts intensely flavored wines with staying power from vines planted in the rich, alluvial, well-drained soils of the region.

Long before Rhone varietals became the darlings of the wine industry, Mitchelton was producing Marsanne, a popular white Rhone.

Along with this varietal, the estate vineyards are planted primarily to chardonnay, cabernet sauvignon and shiraz.

Winemaker Lewis confesses his personal wine preference is well-aged shiraz. "The versatile flavors of Marsanne, however, allow it to be harmonized with a wide variety of foods, even a lamb dish," he said.

WINE SELECTIONS OF THE WEEK

If you've been thinking about giving Australian wines a try, you couldn't start your sampling with a better producer than Mitchelton.

1989 Precoce Chardonnay (\$14) is a Mitchelton wine named after Colin Precoce, the major force behind the establishment of Mitchelton in the early 1970s. The wine has a generously fruity nose with distinct woody elements that last through the lengthy finish. It balances nicely with just about any seafood preparation.

1989 Mitchelton Cabernet-Shiraz-Merlot (\$9.50) is a fine example of a wine built to be attractive when young, but one that will easily age 10 years. Likeable and soft, named "Triple Blend" in Australia, this wine is smooth and approachable with a solid finish.

A seasonal favorite
Holiday season brings the return of Guernsey eggnog

Road maps are probably the best indicator of success for the Guernsey Farms Dairy.

Road maps sitting on the front seats of cars in the parking lot, with either Northville or Novi circled in pen. It's an indicator that people are traveling a long way to visit the dairy, which has been part of the area landscape since 1940. This time of year, the travelers are hot on the trail of Guernsey's cool and creamy eggnog.

"We had a fellow just come in this morning from Oil City, which is up near Traverse City," said John McGuire, patriarch of the family business. "He said every time he gets down this way he picks up a case of something. He got some buttermilk and eggnog today."

Though Guernsey sells ice cream and other dairy products year-round at the store and dairy at 21300 Novi Road, the eggnog is only made on a seasonal basis.

"We'll make the first batch on the first Wednesday in November — this year it was Nov. 6," said Marty McGuire, John's son, and manager of the dairy operation. "We'll make the last batch the last week of December, but Christmas eve is the biggest day of the year for eggnog."

John added, "People will come in and carry it out in boxes. They'll buy 10-15 half-gallons at a time, for big parties I suppose."

John knows what he's talking about when it comes to eggnog. He cooked up the family formula while still a student in the dairy program at Michigan Agricultural College (now known as Michigan State University).

Right around the time he completed his studies, farmers John Applehoff and John Livingston purchased the Red Rose Dairy at 125 S. Center St. in Northville as a way to process and sell the milk their cows produced. Eager to try out his recipes for ice cream, buttermilk, chocolate milk, sour cream and eggnog, McGuire convinced Applehoff and Livingston he was the right man to manage their dairy. He was hired on May 5, 1940, and the name of the dairy was changed to Guernsey Farms.

"I'm not 100 percent sure, but I believe I may have been the first in the industry to start making eggnog at the dairy," he said. The recipe, a family secret, uses fresh eggs and real ground nutmeg in the base, as well as Guernsey's prized cream.

And from the beginning, Guernsey's has made ice cream from the eggnog base as well — again, a pioneering move in the industry.

Though John McGuire and Fred Russell bought the dairy in 1945, and McGuire took sole ownership in 1952, the pioneering spirit continued at Guernsey Farms. Some 10-12 years ago the dairy began producing an eggnog sweetened with honey.

"That started when we were in stores in Ann Arbor," said Marty. "The people in Ann Arbor are very health conscious, and they wanted to stay away from the refined sugar."

Guernsey Farms had been a purveyor of honey from Adams Honey Farm in South Lyon for nearly 20 years at that point, so it was a natural move to mingle the sweet tastes of two successful products.

Each holiday season, Guernsey Farms sells 10,000 gallons of eggnog. Though that may sound like enough to float a destroyer, Marty insists that it's a small amount compared to that's produced by the major dairies in Michigan.

"In 1951, there were 600 dairies in the state of Michigan," said John. "Now, there are only five or six, not counting a few small farm dairies. There are a lot of labels, but they're all coming from the same plant."

Microwaved drinks can heat up the holidays

If eggnog is not quite your cup of — well, eggnog — there are plenty of other wintertime drinks to usher in the season, and your microwave oven makes their mixing a snap.

Whether you are returning from a brisk day on the slopes, from a shopping expedition, or just slogging home from the office, you can warm your insides and your spirits with a hot beverage — alcoholic or not, as you prefer — within minutes.

One drink sure to take the chill off a wintry evening is microwave-quick hot buttered rum. Fill a mug three-quarters full with apple cider. Stir in 1 tablespoon brown sugar and microwave 1 to 2 minutes for one mug, 2 to 4 minutes for two mugs, 4 to 7 minutes for four mugs. Then add 1 jigger of dark rum to each mug and stir. Top with a teaspoon of butter and serve immediately.

Scandinavians are well-versed in dealing with the rigors of winter. They have come up with a flavorful way to light the long arctic nights. Glogg is a

warm spiced wine traditionally served with raisins and almonds. You can purchase prepared mixtures at your liquor store and simply heat in your microwave, or try the flavorful non-alcoholic cran-apple glogg recipe that follows. (Add spirits or not, as you choose.)

Many fruit juices you favor chilled in summer may be spiced up and microwaved to warm you in the winter — great at breakfast time or any time of the day. To prepare for one, just fill a microwave-safe mug about three-quarters full of fruit juice (try apple, pineapple, cranberry, orange, guava, mango or lemonade). Stir in 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice and 1 teaspoon granulated sugar. Add 2 or 3 whole cloves and a dash each of ground cinnamon and nutmeg, then add hot tap water to fill mug. Most to the top. Stir briefly. Microwave at high (100 percent power) setting 1 to 2 minutes, or until very hot. Sip and enjoy.

If your microwave has a tempera-

ture hold setting, it is ideal to use for hot punches. Mulled wine and glogg can be held at 165 F without losing their alcoholic content.

Recipes that follow are tested in 625- to 700-watt microwave ovens.

CRAN-APPLE GLOGG

8 cups apple juice
2 cups cranberry juice cocktail
2 cups orange juice
1/4 cup golden raisins
4 whole (2-inch) cinnamon sticks
6 whole cloves
2 tablespoons granulated sugar
1 orange, sliced thin (with peel)
Yields about 3 quarts.
Preparation time: 5 to 10 minutes
Cooking time: 15 to 20 minutes
Oven setting: High (100-percent power)

Pour apple juice, cranberry juice cocktail, and orange juice into a 4-quart non-metallic, microwave-safe punch bowl. Stir in raisins, cinnamon sticks, cloves and sugar. Microwave, uncovered, 15 to 20 mi-

Remove cloves and cinnamon sticks. Garnish with orange slices. Serve hot.

QUICK MINTY HOT CHOCOLATE

1 (single serving) envelope hot chocolate mix
6 ounces hot water
1 ounce vodka
half ounce peppermint schnapps
whipped cream
sprig of fresh mint for garnish

(optional)
Yields 1 serving.
Preparation time: 5 minutes
Cooking time: 1 minute
Oven setting: high (100 percent power)

Combine hot chocolate mix and water in microwave-safe mug. Microwave about 1 minute — do not boil. Stir in vodka and schnapps and top with whipped cream. Garnish with sprig of fresh mint, if desired. Serve hot.

HOT BUTTERED LEMONADE

1 (6-ounce) can frozen lemonade concentrate, thawed
3 cups water
8 whole allspice
8 whole cloves
3 tablespoons rum or brandy (optional)
4 teaspoons butter or margarine
4 sticks cinnamon
Yields 4 servings
Preparation time: 5 minutes
Cooking time: 6 to 8 minutes
Oven setting: high (100 percent power)

Combine lemonade concentrate, water, allspice and cloves in a 2 quart microwave safe glass measure; stir. Microwave 6 to 8 minutes, or until hot. Stir in optional rum or brandy. Pour into warm mugs. Top each with 1 teaspoon butter. Place cinnamon stick in each mug as stirrer. Serve hot

Anything goes into cioppino

Avila Beach, California — Cioppino, the hearty stew packed with fish and seafood, has a history as colorful as its appearance. And a cioppino cook-off here proved that the sea is the limit when it comes to ingredients.

Traditionally based on tomatoes, basil, garlic and assorted fresh fish and shellfish, cioppino dates to the beginning of this century, when it is believed to have been created by Italian and Portuguese fishermen in San Francisco.

"It's a fisherman's stew, just a hearty, tomato-based soup with all the fresh fish you can throw into it," said Jim Gannon, executive chef for Scoma's restaurant in San Francisco, where cioppino has been a menu mainstay for 25 years. "It's an old San Francisco dish."

Cioppino (variously described as a sauce, a soup or a stew) was a simple, rib-sticking way for the fisherman to combine standard Mediterranean ingredients such as tomatoes and olive oil with the catch of the day. Several species of rockfish indigenous to the Bay Area usually were added to the stew, and fresh Dungeness crab was another popular addition.


Sourdough bread generally was served on the side or mixed right into the bowl for added texture and flavor. Today, crusty sourdough bread still is the bread of choice for sopping up the broth.

The name cioppino is said to derive from an Italian word, ciuppin, a variety of fish soup. A more fanciful story says the soup was named for hungry people who solicited the fisherman for a free crab or small fish to toss into their stewpots, demanding, "Chip in! Chip in!"

The traditional rockfish and Dungeness crab may be supplemented by salmon, halibut, shark or any other firm fish. Lobster and large prawns have become popular additions to cioppino, as have New Zealand mussels, several varieties of clam, squid and octopus. The only common thread shared by most cioppino recipes is the addition of fresh or canned tomatoes to make a rich, reddish base.

Whatever its origins, cioppino is an ever-popular dish that can be simple or elaborate as you wish to make it. For eight chefs at the Cioppino Cook-off here, that meant anything goes.

The cook-off, sponsored by the Olde Port Inn restaurant, featured chefs from eight California restaurants, each given carte blanche to create his own version of this West Coast specialty. Avant-garde ingredients

included cilantro, white wine, chipotle chilies, creme fraiche and snow peas.

The first-place winner, from Cafe Vallarta in Santa Barbara, had a definite Mexican accent. Restaurant owners Liliana Parra and Justo Gracia said they drew on their Hispanic backgrounds to create their Cioppino de Mariscos.

"We set out to make it different," Gracia said. "We used a lot of Mexican spices like cumin, oregano, rosemary, cayenne ... and, of course, a lot of lime."

The result was an eye-pleasing, green-gold soup that packed plenty of firepower. Octopus, New Zealand mussels, halibut and clams were among the treasures to be plucked from the spicy broth.

The lone San Diego entry, from George's at the Cove in La Jolla, won second place.

"I've never made cioppino before. I couldn't believe I placed!" said Scott Meskan, executive chef at George's.

Meskan said he sampled some of the best cioppinos in San Francisco to gain inspiration, but decided he didn't care for the traditional tomato-based stew. "Every cioppino I've seen has tomatoes," he said. "I decided that I might as well do something completely different."

Meskan's innovative entry featured enormous prawns, sliced seafood sausages and assorted vegetables in an aromatic broth flavored

with tarragon, Pinot Blanc wine and creme fraiche. Snow peas and saffron threads provided a colorful garnish.

While unusual cioppinos took the top two places, a more traditional version was awarded third. The Bay-side 240 restaurant in Redondo beach earned raves for its classic red cioppino made with plum tomatoes, red wine, fresh basil and lots of shellfish.

Cioppino has come a long way from its humble origins, but it still can be a hearty, down-to-earth meal. Using fingers to attack the shellfish is encouraged, and you shouldn't be afraid to ask for a bib.

"It can be a little messy," said chef Jim Gannon, "especially if you're wearing a business suit."

While most people enjoy cioppino only in restaurants, it's fairly simple to prepare at home. Fresh or frozen seafood can be used, and it's no problem to substitute one variety of seafood for another. If you don't care for clams, for example, just add more mussels or toss in a handful of shrimp. Fresh lobster is a great addition.

You can make seafood stock at home with fish carcasses purchased from a fish market. Or purchase frozen fish stock concentrate at the supermarket.

Many chefs recommend adding a splash of wine, using the same wine you plan to serve with the meal to help the food and drink complement

each other. Tomato-based cioppino marries well with Pinot Noir or with other spicy red wines such as Zinfandel or Petite Sirah.

If you make a white cioppino such as the one prepared by Scott Meskan, serve a white wine. At the cook-off, Meskan matched his elegant cioppino with a superb Pinot Blanc from Chalone for an excellent wine-food match.

Above all, don't forget the sourdough bread. You'll want to mop up every drop of your cioppino, and the old San Francisco fisherman would approve.

Here are two recipes for cioppino: one for the white cioppino created by Scott Meskan and one for a traditional tomato-based version.


CIOPPINO WITH SHRIMP AND SEAFOOD SAUSAGE

- Court Bouillon:**
 2 cups dry white wine
 2 cups water
 2 carrots, washed and cut into 1-inch pieces
 1 medium onion, peeled and quartered
 1 rib celery, washed and cut into 1-inch slices
 1 clove garlic
 1 bouquet garnish (1 bay leaf, 1 sprig each thyme and parsley)
 1 tablespoon coarse sea salt



Guernsey eggnog is well-known annual treat

With a handful of huge processors pumping out thousands of gallons of products a day, it raises the question of how a small operation like Guernsey Farms can compete. The answer is it doesn't, at least not directly. "We can't compete with those big dairies, so our emphasis is on quality," said Marty. "We try to make it the best, and we constantly taste test all our stuff. Even with the ice cream, the flavoring companies might change

their flavors, so you have to see if it's good, or if you want to change it. We look for quality; price comes second." Attention to such details has brought laurels to the dairy. Guernsey's butter pecan Ued for fifth-best in the country, in a judging by People magazine in 1984. Guernsey's ice cream was judged "Best in Detroit" by WJBK-TV Channel 2 last summer. Marty said the butter pecan ice cream is a perfect example of why quality is so important. He pointed out that the pecans he uses cost \$4.25 a pound, more than most

people would pay for pecans in the supermarket. John added, "We could pay as little as \$2 a pound for pecans, but you don't want to use those nuts. They won't win you any prizes, that's for sure." Quality is also important because Guernsey Farms is a family operation. John and wife Pat had 14 children, and can count 43 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren as their own. Among other things, it means there's never any shortage of labor at the dairy, store and restaurant.

Three brothers drive the three trucks that deliver Guernsey Farms products around Southeast Michigan. Sisters, in-laws and nieces run the office, and grandkids spend summers in the restaurant and in the dairy. This year, Marty and four of his brothers are in the process of buying the operation from their father. John said he was happy to see it stay in the family, and Marty said the dairy will continue to strive for optimum quality. "That's what we have over the other guys," said Marty. "Besides, that's the way we were taught."

Cioppino may use many different ingredients

Broth:
1/4 cup olive oil
3 shallots, finely chopped
1 clove garlic, finely chopped
4 teaspoons tomato paste
1 bay leaf, pulverized
5 to 6 black peppercorns, crushed
4 tablespoons unsalted butter cut into small pieces
2 tablespoons creme fraiche
1 tablespoon chopped tarragon
1 tablespoon chopped basil
1 tablespoon finely chopped chives
Pinch of thread saffron
Salt and freshly ground pepper

Mussels and vegetables:
1 pound mussels, scrubbed clean
4 small, red-skinned potatoes (about 3/4 pound)
1 medium zucchini
1 rib celery
1/2 medium eggplant
1 tomato
1/2 to 1 cup olive oil
12 lightly steamed snow peas or garnish (optional)
Several saffron threads for garnish (optional)
4 extra large raw shrimp, peeled and deveined
4 or 5 seafood sausage (recipe follows)
Yields 4 servings.

Prepare court bouillon: In large pot, combine wine and 2 cups water. Add vegetables and seasonings. Bring to boil and simmer over medium heat for 30 minutes. Strain through fine-mesh sieve; discard solids. Set clear bouillon aside.

Prepare broth: Heat oil in large saucepan over low

heat. Add shallots and garlic and cook until soft, about 5 minutes. Add tomato paste. Pour in 2 cups of reserved court bouillon. Stir in ground thyme and bay leaf and crushed peppercorns. Bring to a boil over high heat. Boil for 10 minutes. Whisk in pieces of butter, one by one. Stir in creme fraiche. Add fresh herbs and saffron. Season with salt and pepper. Add more creme fraiche if thinner broth is desired. Keep warm.

Prepare seafood and vegetables: Place mussels in large non-reactive pot with 1 cup of reserved court bouillon. (Add water, if necessary, to completely cover bottom of pot.) Cook, covered, over medium-high heat until mussels open, about 10 minutes. Remove mussels to bowl with slotted spoon. Keep warm. In same pan, slowly poach shrimp and sausages for about 4 minutes, until shrimp lose translucency. Poach snow peas (over low heat) so sausages do not explode. Drain and slice sausages about 1/2 inch thick. Strain cooking liquid from mussels and shrimp through fine-mesh sieve lined with a doubled layer of dampened cheesecloth. Add this cooking liquid to reserved creme fraiche broth. Cut potatoes and zucchini into uniform pieces about size of garlic clove. Cut celery into thin slices. Cut eggplant and tomato (it is not necessary to peel) into 1/2 inch cubes. Heat olive oil (start with about 1/2 cup) and saute each vegetable group separately (potatoes will take longer than others). Cook until tender but still firm (5 to 10 minutes). Season each vegetable group with salt and

pepper to taste and drain on paper towels. **Assemble dish:** Add cooked vegetables (but not snow peas) to reserved broth. Dilute with water to taste, if milder flavor is desired. Bring to simmer over low heat. Ladle broth into 4 shallow individual soup plates. Arrange mussels and sliced sausages on top. Garnish each bowl with 1 shrimp, 3 snow peas and several threads of saffron, if desired. Serve immediately.

SEAFOOD SAUSAGE

3 pounds scallops or salmon
1/2 cup chopped fresh basil
1 tablespoon Jamaican jerk spice
1 1/2 teaspoons salt

3 egg whites, lightly whipped
3 feet sausage casing
Yields 10 to 12 sausages.
Add seafood to food processor, with sharp blade, and puree for 2 minutes.
Add basil, jerk spice and salt. Puree until mixed. Remove to large bowl.
Fold in whipped egg whites with spatula.
Pipe mixture into casing (not too tight).
Blanch sausage in simmering water for about 4 minutes. When ready to assemble dish, steam or saute or poach slowly or sausage will break.

CIOPPINO
1/4 cup olive oil
1 garlic clove

1 onion, minced
2 (1-pound) cans whole tomatoes
1/2 cup water
1 (15-ounce) can tomato sauce
1 to 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh basil leaves
1 cup dry white wine
Tabasco sauce to taste
salt to taste
12 to 24 cherrystone clams, thoroughly scrubbed and washed
1 to 2 pounds striped bass, black drum or other fish fillets
1 to 2 pounds king crab legs in the shell, defrosted and cut into 1 1/2 to 2 inch lengths.
1/4 pound medium-sized raw shrimp, shelled and deveined
Garlic bread and butter
Yields 6 to 10 servings.

Heat olive oil in very large pot. Add garlic and onion, and saute lightly. Add tomatoes, water, tomato sauce, basil and wine, and stir. Taste and add Tabasco sauce and salt. Simmer 50 to 60 minutes, or until sauce is a nice consistency. It should be thick enough to cling to fish. Add clams, cover, and simmer 9 minutes. Then add king crab legs and shrimp. Cioppino is ready to serve when clams open, bass flakes easily, king crab legs are heated through, and shrimp has turned a more or less opaque pink and white. 





Jessica Tandy shines in otherwise tepid 'Story Lady'

Some good moments, but mawkish approach misfires

Watching TV during Christmas and the holiday season inevitably reminds us of the best and worst of which television is capable. On the one hand, there are great, inspiring specials, like PBS' yearly "Festival of Carols," or an encore of the moving "The Homecoming." Even Christmas episodes of regular series can be memorable, such as last holiday's "Murphy Brown" installment.

On the other hand, too many programmers apparently feel the season gives them license to air shamelessly manipulative fare having little to do with genuine emotion and everything to do with cheap sentiment. Who among us has not wearied of programs promising to illuminate "the true meaning of Christmas"?

That brings us to "The Story Lady," a new made-for-Christmas-TV movie airing on NBC on Monday, Dec. 9. Multiple-award-winner Jessica Tandy stars as Grace McQueen, a New Jersey widow who comes to live with her daughter and son-in-law (Tandy Cronyn and Richard Masur). Frustrated in her attempts to find volunteer work, it occurs to McQueen that her lifelong skill at storytelling could be the basis for a pleasant local-access TV show. Reading selections by the Brothers Grimm and Hans Christian Andersen, the "Story Lady" quickly nabs a devoted viewership, largely among latch-key children home alone in the afternoons.

One of those children is Alex Pollard (Lisa Jakub), the daughter of ambitious advertising executive and single mom Julie Pollard (Stephanie Zimbalist). Told that Alex and all her friends are devout "Story Lady" fans, Pollard has an idea: Perhaps McQueen could be transformed into Granny Goodheart, the storytelling mascot for a large toy company and one of the agency's major accounts. Pollard pitches the idea to her boss (played cartoonishly by Ed Begley

Jr.) and co-workers, who embrace the idea, especially since "the old lady won't want too much money."

Keeping their cynicism to themselves, the advertising folks woo McQueen with promises of entertaining millions of children and the novelty of not having to pay for her weekly broadcasts. McQueen signs a contract, then reveals her decision to her amazed family. "Are you strong enough to do this, Mother?" asks McQueen's daughter. "Of course," comes the reply.


McQueen's confidence, however, doesn't prepare her for what is in store when she submits herself to the fast-paced machinery of big-time advertising. An impatient acting coach barks instructions at her ("Brighter, brighter!"), totally ignoring the warmth in McQueen's low-key delivery. The day of the first taping, New Jersey's former "Story Lady" emerges from her dressing room an over-the-top confection of puffed sleeves, petticoats, rouged cheeks and white hair. McQueen gamely tries to go on, but realizes the jaded child actors gathered around her are not

her audience.

Eventually, the pilot episode is completed and sold; that's when McQueen's troubles really begin, especially as Begley bullies her endlessly. She draws the line, however, when ordered to get false teeth. "They'll look better," she's told. Without a pause, McQueen counters, "The Good Lord gave me these teeth!" At length, she knows the project must be ended, for she sees how far she has strayed from her original intent.

Tandy gives a fine, endearing performance, creating in Grace McQueen a vivid figure of dignity and charm. At the film's end, we'd like to know more of her. The same, unfortunately, cannot be said of Stephanie Zimbalist's by-the-book, harried-working-mom bit, or the contrived machinations of the plot.

Christopher Gartin is quite winning as McQueen's original producer at the cable company. Charles Durning exerts considerable appeal in the film's last quarter as a crusty New York judge (don't ask how he figures in the story), but it's too little, too late.







Goldin may be busy, but he definitely has his feet on the ground, and it's a good thing — his career is taking off like a shooting star.

First lady Barbara Bush, *Sesame Street*'s Big Bird and anchorman Jim Lehrer were on hand in Dallas on Oct.




Q: Is the program *Houston Knights* still on the air? —Vi Yates, White, S.D.

HBO reviews history of sports on TV

More than anything else, television is responsible for the phenomenal popularity of sports in America. That's why the HBO special *Play by Play: A History of Sports Television* is an important contribution to the field of sports sociology.

The two-part documentary, airing Tuesday, Dec. 3, and Tuesday, Dec. 10, was seven years in the making and involved an unprecedented joint effort by ABC, CBS, NBC and the cable industry. The programs are broken into six segments, each examining a different genre of sports broadcasting.

Broadcasting greats such as Roone Arledge, Mel Allen, Harry Coyle, Lindsey Nelson and Red Barber were interviewed, and 500-plus hours of film viewed in preparation for this retrospective of the first 52 years of sports television.

Six of television's most widely recognized sports announcers — Bob Costas, Curt Gowdy, Jim Lampley, Jim McKay, Brent Musberger and Pat Summerall — serve as hosts for the special. The segments featuring Gowdy and McKay should be particularly interesting. Gowdy, one of the truly great voices in broadcasting, has seen just about everything possible in his 40-year career. McKay was the voice of ABC's *Wide World of Sports* for more than 25 years and has covered virtually every major sporting event.

Sensible advice on raising kids


Lifetime's weekday parenting program, *Your Baby and Child With Penelope Leach*, debuting Monday, Dec. 2, abandons the notion that babies should come with instructions and preaches instead the virtue of taking it as it comes. Dr. Leach, a best-selling author on child rearing, stresses "kids don't need perfect parents, they just need the parents they've got." Her soothing advice is grounded more in common sense than computer analysis.

The program's format is as informal as the set, where the studio audience's questions are answered simply and directly and punctuated by an occasional outburst from the toddlers enjoying a pile of toys beneath Leach's stool. Though the audience members pose their inquiries in an obviously prepared manner, it is Leach we want to hear, after all.




