Attorney general backs city

An attorney general's ruling may help break the state's stranglehold on more than \$3 million in racetrack revenue earmarked for the cities that house the tracks.

For the City of Northville, slated to receive up to \$900,000 in annual racetrack revenue under the State Racing Statute of 1980, the ruling may help avoid a financial disaster.

The city council is already considering raising Northville's operating millage by up to 3 mills, laying off five city hall employees, deferring wage increases and reducing city services as part of a five-year plan to reduce the city's \$1-million deficit.

The cuts are being made to cope with Gov. Engler's line-item veto of state-returned racetrack revenue from the state's 1991/92 budget earlier this year, a \$33,000 reduction in other anticipated state-shared revenue, and \$430,000 in deficits from last year's city general and capital project funds. Gov. Engler's veto alone will cost the city \$725,000 in anticipated racetrack revenue.

But the attorney general's recent ruling may kill the governor's incentive for vetoing the revenue return, by preventing him from using the revenue in the state's general fund.

Attorney General Frank Kelley was asked by House Speaker Lewis (D-Monroe) Oct. 15 to rule whether the state-returned racetrack revenues can be used in the general fund or whether they would remain restricted funds as stipulated by the State Racing Statute.

Kelley ruled Thursday that the horse racing revenues would remain restricted funds rather than lapse into the general fund after a year. In other words, the funds could not be used to help balance the state's budget.

"(Under) The Racing Law of 1980 . . . certain monies received from racing license fees and specific taxes on all sums wagered on certain horse races and breaks shall be placed in special funds to be used for certain designated purposes," Kelley wrote. "It is my opinion . . . that monies appropriated from the horse racing revenue special funds and vetoed by the Governor, unless the vetoed items are re-passed by the Legislature . . . remain in the special funds and do not lapse into the general fund at the conclusion of the 1991-1992 fiscal year. It is my

further opinion that these funds may be expended only in accordance with future appropriations made by law."

Kelley's opinion was greeted with cautious optimism by local officials. "It appears to be what we hoped it would be," said Mayor Chris Johnson. "I suppose it really doesn't make any practical sense for the Legislature to withhold the revenue or the executive office to veto it, because it would just start piling up in a pile and couldn't be spent other than in accordance with the law."

The attorney general's opinion may also bolster the city's case for a return of racetrack revenue withheld from last year's budget. Last year's racetrack revenues were cut by about 20 percent after the governor threatened to cut them by half. Also, many of the funds that were received came months after they were due, forcing the city to sell a tax anticipation note in the meantime.

"That's been a real point of contention between the state and us, and amounts to well over \$100,000 for the city," Johnson said. "That's a real good question that ultimately I think we're going to have to refer to our various attorneys."

Johnson said the city may continue with its budget-cutting measures even with a promise from the state for the funds. "Even if they tell us they're going to give us the money, that's not the same as having the money now," he said. "The check's in the mail won't make it. A check in hand is a different story."

The mayor, together with Livonia Mayor Robert Bennett, will meet with the governor in a closed session sometime next week to discuss racetrack revenue. The meeting follows several proposed meeting dates between Johnson and Engler that have been canceled by the governor.

Learning about others

Exercise opens students' eyes to disabilities

First- and second-graders made their way through crowded and often cluttered classrooms on crutches and in wheelchairs.

Other students laughed as they clumsily stumbled between desks attempting to carry books under their arms.

Winchester Elementary students were participating in an exercise to help them learn what it's like to have a disability.

The exercise was just a small part of Handicap Awareness Week from Dec. 9-13 at Winchester. Kenny Rehabilitation, Health and Advocacy Board (REHAB), sponsored by United Way of Michigan, was one group leading students down the path to awareness last week.

Brenda Steinberg, Kenny's director of community education, asked students why they laugh when a friend is struggling with crutches or a wheelchair.

Students answered by saying it is funny to see a non-disabled person using equipment designed for a handicapped person.

They would never laugh at the truly disabled, they said. But Steinberg asked them to practice

not laughing at all when faced with an issue relating to disabilities.

She explained, in second- and first-grade terms, how the disabled get by in a world created for the able-bodied.

And she taught a few words in sign language that are necessary for every first- and second-grader.

"I want cookies," they signed. Kenny REHAB, based in Rochester Hills, has worked with 30,000 first- and second-graders since the Attitudes program began two years ago.

The program incorporates a cartoon television video, disability simulations and drawing lessons into a 45-minute program intended to teach disability awareness.

Students are instructed to draw a picture of themselves with a handicapped friend at the end of the class.

"Kids learn through drawing," Steinberg said. Also at Winchester last week was Kids on the Block, a program that uses puppets to teach students about disabilities.

Parents Naomi Brandon, Mary Menghini and June Giebel brought their 3-foot-tall puppets to

Winchester.

The Northville trio got a grant to learn to use the puppets to teach kids about disabilities. They are one of many similar groups found all over the world.

"How can a blind person ski?" one student asked the puppets.

"Is dyslexia a problem with eyes or with the brain?" another student asked.

The puppets answered that a blind person skis with the help of his or her parents. And dyslexia is like a temporary short-circuit of the brain.

Students learned about differences. But they also learned about being the same.

Steinberg showed them the sign language symbol for the words "different" and "same."

"Kids with disabilities are different," she said. "But they use crutches and wheelchairs so they can do the same things as other kids."

After a week of lessons and instruction, the activities ended with a sign-a-long. That is sign, not sung.

Note the difference, but realize that both activities really are the same thing. That's what the lessons were all about.

Ward returns to ZBA tonight to seek extension

Ward Church representatives this evening will appear before the township zoning board of appeals (ZBA) to ask for an extension of a controversial variance.

The ZBA will consider Ward's request to allow front-yard parking, which is not permitted under township ordinance. The variance origi-

nally was granted before Ward received site plan approval for property it owns on the northwest corner of Six Mile and Haggerty roads.

The Livonia-based congregation had intended to build a church on the site, but the project has stalled in part because of environmental impact questions. Church representatives reportedly are also considering a deal for the St. John's Seminary

property in Plymouth Township.

Neighboring residents and individual members of the planning commission and ZBA opposed the church site early on. Controversy raged over various portions of the site plan, culminating in a court battle based on the height of the proposed church's steeple.

Church officials later redesigned the building cap, causing it to fall

within township height limits. All parties — developers, township officials, and residents — seemed appeased.

But tonight's meeting may prompt different feelings. Ward is moving to keep its project alive, while the ZBA may find new issues that could affect the front-yard parking variance.

The original variance was granted because Ward officials claimed front-

yard soils were too poor to support the church structure and related facilities. The ZBA okayed the variance, but several issues impacting the site — as well as the Six Mile/Haggerty intersection — have cropped up since.

A list of changes on the corner includes the McDonald's Restaurant scheduled to open today. At the time the variance was granted, the McDo-

nald's site was intended to be a hotel. The ZBA may feel that the traffic impact is much greater with a fast-food restaurant adjacent to a large-congregation church site.

Adding to the list of possible ZBA concerns is Kirko Development's decision to abandon its adjacent project. Ward and Kirco were to share parking lots on the site, and the

Board seeks third district judge

There may be a third person swinging a gavel at the 35th District Court in 1993.

The 35th District Court advisory board met Thursday and agreed to pursue a new judgeship for the Plymouth court. The five-member board is made up of a representative from each of the five municipalities served by the court: Northville, Northville Township, Plymouth, Plymouth Township and Canton Township.

"We agreed to bring (the proposal for a new judge) to local policy-making bodies for a final determination," said Northville City Manager Gary Word, an advisory board member. "The advisory board had to be convinced that it was warranted, and secondly had to convince the local bodies that it was warranted."

"If that happens and the state then passes all the necessary provisions, then yes, it will happen."

The state must be notified by early next year whether the local municipalities want a third judge, in order to push through legislation needed to authorize the new position and elect a new judge that year. The new judge would take the bench in 1993.

The advisory board had agreed in 1990 not to pursue the new judgeship then due to tight local budgets, despite a recommendation for the position from the Michigan Supreme Court Administrator in 1990. A state report called the Plymouth court the third-busiest district court after Detroit and Dearborn. The court's 38,000 cases in 1989 were a 10-percent increase over the 1988 figure, which was a 15-percent jump over the previous year.

The cost of the new judge's seat has been estimated at between \$350,000 and \$450,000 for architectural renovations to the courthouse and \$20,000 to \$30,000 for a new phone system.

The costs would be split among the five communities based on the court's caseload from each area, with Northville Township paying about 12 percent and the City of Northville contributing about eight percent.

In 1990, the 35th District Court Building Authority had approved the formation of a renovation fund with court revenues between 1990-1992, to fund the renovations needed in part to house a third judge in 1993. A total of \$600,000 would be withheld over the three years.

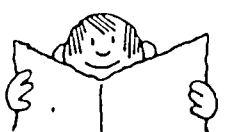
The advisory board approved the renovation fund in 1990.

A part-time Northville resident recently charged with breaking into a township home was arrested last week after allegedly phoning death threats to a former employer.

William Aaron Brady, 28, was arraigned in 35th District Court on Wednesday after he allegedly threatened to kill a 23-year-old Northville man he claimed owed him \$1,500, said township police Det. Michael Wildt.

Brady's alleged threats were recorded on the

victim's voice mail service and were relayed to township police. The threats reportedly were made Dec. 1, Dec. 6, and Dec. 7, police said.

Police said Brady's alleged messages changed slightly, but the theme remained the same.

On Dec. 1, Brady allegedly ran into the victim at a township party store on Five Mile Road. Brady, who police say broke into a home on Waterfall and stole a car and several other items in late November, reportedly said he would place a contract on the man's life if he did not pay him \$1,500 by 11 a.m. Dec. 2.

Brady then reportedly pushed the man against a car and repeated the threat, police said. He also allegedly put his hands on the man's throat and told him he could kill him "three different ways" in a half-second, according to police reports.

Other death threats indicated that Brady allegedly would plant an explosive device in the man's vehicle.

Police later arrested Brady and charged him with malicious use of a telephone, a misdemeanor

Panel appointed for reapportionment in state

The Michigan Legislature has a court-imposed deadline of Jan. 15 to reapportion itself.

Otherwise, a special panel will do the job by Feb. 15, the state Supreme Court said.

"There's a low probability the Legislature will agree on a plan by Jan. 15," said state Rep. Willis Bullard, R-Highland, a ranking Republican on the reapportionment issue, whose district includes part of the City of Northville.

"This year we're done by Thursday I guess we're going

to be in session Jan. 8 for a couple of days.

"You don't have to be in session for the leadership to agree," Bullard said, but he indicated chances of agreement look dim.

"The Democrats haven't even gotten together on their own plan," he added.

The State Supreme Court Monday appointed a three-judge panel to reapportion the Legislature if lawmakers themselves reach a stalemate.

The high court gave the judicial panel until Feb. 15 to act.

Members of that panel are Harold Hood, Detroit, a judge of the Court of Appeals; T. John Lesinski, retired

Court of Appeals judge and former Democratic lieutenant governor; and William R. Peterson, former circuit judge from Missaukee and Wexford counties in northern lower Michigan.

The high court's action seems to assure Michigan will have new districts in place long before filing deadline for the August primaries. Ten years ago, a primary had to be delayed because of a deadlock on reapportionment.

About all the political parties can agree on, at this point, is that districts may be 8.2 percent larger or smaller than the ideal: 224,613 in each Senate district, 84,503 in each House district.

The ruling doesn't cover congressional districting,

which is before a federal court panel. Congressional redistricting is expected to be far tougher because Michigan loses two of its 19 U.S. representatives due to population stagnation.

The Supreme Court told lawmakers to follow guidelines set in its 1982 reapportionment decision and in the federal Voting Rights Act. The latter guarantees minority populations can't be split to dilute their strength.

The high court told the three-judge panel to begin proceedings "as soon as possible after the issuance of this order. The special panel shall have the powers of a circuit court and may permit the intervention of other persons or groups."

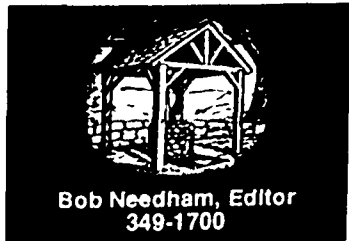

Our Opinion

Make sure the tax hike does solve the problem



Government

Right up front, let's make it clear that we don't like tax increases. Residents of Northville already pay high taxes for the quality of life here, and the pressures seem to increase constantly with rising property values.

But the City of Northville is in a tremendous financial hole, and a property tax increase will certainly be part of the shovel needed to dig it out. The city is already pursuing the elimination of regular police patrols at Northville Downs. It will delay the purchase of some needed equipment. And the layoff of at least a few employees seems a certainty. Those measures, however, aren't nearly enough to fill the gap left by a series of recent financial crises.

Higher taxes must, unfortunately provide part of the remedy. The question of how large an increase is needed now provides the city with its single toughest decision in the deficit-reduction picture.

The city's financial wizards recently presented the city council with a set of several different plans to reduce the roughly \$1-million deficit. Among the choices, the basic difference is the size of the millage increase — and, accordingly, the amount by which that hike would reduce the deficit in five years.

For years the city has levied a tax rate below the maximum which the famous Headlee Amendment would allow, so in theory the council could add as much as 6.51 mills to the current operating rate of 9.48 mills without a Headlee override vote. According to the deficit reduction plans, a tax increase of 5.24 mills would close the money gap with the city operating pretty much as usual.

Members of the Northville City Council don't like tax increases any more than we do, for reasons of both principles and politics. Therefore, they informally

agreed last week to hold any tax increase to 3 mills. That's an understandable stance, but it may be just a bit on the conservative side.

Under the 3-mill reduction plan, the city would still face a deficit of \$440,000 after five years. The original deficit would barely be cut in half.

The next option, however, puts the tax hike at 3.5 mills. That extra half-mill works wonders: The same five years would cut the deficit to "just" \$94,000 — a far more comfortable result.

What would the difference be to the average homeowner? A half-mill would translate to 50 cents per \$1,000 of assessed property value. So to a \$150,000 home, assessed at \$75,000, the half-mill would mean \$37.50 per year.

That number is not insignificant. But when it essentially means the difference between solving the budget problem and only chipping away at it, we think it's probably defensible. It certainly merits further thought.

Of course, this entire deficit reduction business is all tentative, subject to change as the years pass and as financial conditions shift. But as long as some sort of long-range plan is necessary, it ought to be one that at least has a chance to solve the problem.

Incident provided me a lesson



Let me tell you about the first and last time I drove drunk. All in all, the outcome was pretty tame, but it scared me enough that I can say I'll never drive if I've been drinking.

I was a sophomore in college. Forget for a minute that I wasn't of legal drinking age in Michigan. I was still listed as a full-time resident of New York, where the drink-

ing age was 18, so I had this cockeyed notion that local laws didn't apply to me.

There was a Friday afternoon happy hour in someone's room in my dorm. It was the weekend of the Michigan-Michigan State football game, so everyone was getting an early start on their attitude adjustment.

I'd knocked back about three or four healthy-sized concoctions in under an hour when Jill came to me asking if I would drive her to the bus station to pick up her friend from MSU. With my resistance at a low ebb and Jill smiling sweetly, the word "no" vanished from my vocabulary.

I drove across campus, and through downtown Ann Arbor, picked up Jill's friend, and returned them both to the dorm safely. Parking being at a premium around U-M dorms, I considered myself lucky to find two open spaces right in front of the building. So lucky, in fact, that I parked in both of them.

It wasn't until the next morning, when I saw what a lousy job of parking I'd done, that I understood the effects of the alcohol. Further evidence was given by a police officer, who had

kindly placed three parking tickets on my windshield. One for parking too far from the curb, one for straddling two parking spaces, and one for an expired parking meter.

If you'd asked me, when I returned to the happy hour, if I had parked my car OK, I would have said yes. I was pretty good at parallel parking anyway, and at that age we compared driving abilities the way younger kids compared baseball cards. To this day, I'm still a whiz at parallel parking. I can put a 20-foot car in a 21-foot space on the first pass.

But looking at the car, parked halfway between two spaces, at an angle to the curb, and far enough from the sidewalk to throw out a gangplank, I got an understanding of just how much alcohol warps your perceptions. Furthermore, if I could misjudge parking that badly, in what kinds of danger had I placed Jill, her friend, or any of the thousands of people we'd driven past on the way to the bus station.

I consider myself fortunate. A few dollars' worth of parking tickets was a very cheap lesson in the dangers of drunk driving. Others have paid a much higher price learning the same lesson.

If there is anything I want to get across here, it's that if you've been drinking, you can't always trust your own judgment. This holiday season, when the roads turn slick and people drink, no matter how much you drink, be honest with yourself. If you've had more than two or three drinks, and haven't given yourself time to sober up, don't take any chances.

I'm not telling anyone to turn down a drink this holiday season (I'm a journalist, remember). If you do drink, just don't turn down any offers of a ride home. Accept my wishes for a safe and happy holiday.

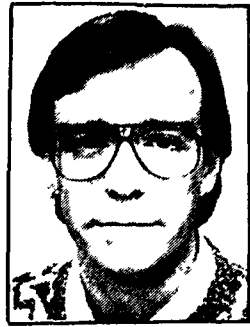

I will never understand cruelty



For the life of me, I don't think I will ever be able to understand the mindless cruelty some people manage to perpetrate on animals.

Considering the number of intentional slights, instances of unfairness and downright abuse humans managed to inflict upon other humans, perhaps I should not be surprised at the way they treat animals. But I cannot help but be amazed at the casualness with which people subject animals to pain, suffering and death.

On one recent Sunday, I returned home from a routine late-night milk-and-bread run to the store to find a kitten prowling around in my front yard. I'm not a veterinarian, but this cat was so small, so young it could have been no more than four to six weeks old.

It was a cute little cat, and seemed to be well-kept — no fleas, clean, apparently healthy, obviously well fed and seemingly contented. What this cat was doing out in my front yard on a freezing cold winter's evening, I had no idea.

We canvassed the neighborhood to see if anyone had lost a kitten, but we turned up nothing. One neighbor suggested it might be the offspring of some feral cat he said he believed

lives nearby. I had trouble accepting that. It seemed much too comfortable with humans to be the product of a wild feline. And, well, it was litter-trained. They don't have litter boxes out in the wild, do they?

Well, I think I have now solved the mystery. This past Sunday, during a walk through the woods with my daughter, we discovered more kittens — many more.

All told, there were four more kittens roaming about in the woods. We found the pile of branches and dead leaves where the kittens had been sheltering. One of the kittens bore a striking resemblance to the cat I'd found two weeks earlier in my yard.

And these just were not wild cats. Each one eagerly approached us and wanted to be petted. And there was no sign of a mother cat anywhere in the vicinity.

Well, it doesn't take much to figure it out. Somebody had abandoned the litter of barely weaned kittens out in those woods. And the kittens, only weeks old, were on their own, expected to fend for themselves out in the woods.

Fortunately, three of the four kittens were in pretty good shape, even after having apparently spent two weeks in the woods by themselves. They were getting skinny, but they were energetic and still apparently healthy. Only one appeared to have reached a weakened state. Somehow, it had suffered a broken tail and it was shivering from the cold.

Even more fortunately, I managed to give three of the cats away. I've got room at my house for one of the little critters, but we've still got one to give away.

But can someone explain to me what the point of abandoning a litter of kittens that young was? Why leave kittens in the woods when there are numerous places they can be left if one has to give them up — shelters, Oakland and Wayne county animal control, the Michigan Humane Society.

Yes, it is true that animals often have to be put to sleep at such shelters if they are not adopted. And it is true that the adoption rate at such shelters ranges from 12 to 33 percent. But what percentage chance would you give these cats to survive the winter out in the woods all on their own? I rate it at about a zero percent chance they would have made it another two weeks.

And if they have to die in a shelter, at least it is a quick, painless death. Starvation is a horrible way to go.

Of course, whoever did this could have had their pet neutered or spayed. But that would seem to be way beyond their capacity.

I don't understand. And yet, the officials at Animal Control and the Humane Society tell me this happens to hundreds of thousands of animals each year.

It's just inconceivable.

from Ward's contention that front yard soils were too poor to build on. The ZBA never has been afforded soil tests to prove or disprove the church's contention, and may direct



Alsace region yields wines at good values

Alsace is the most beautiful wine region in France. Almost isolated, Alsace is situated between the Vosges Mountains on the west and the Rhine river on the east.

The best-kept secret in wine is the dry, fruity, long-lived white wines of Alsace. They accompany the great cuisine of 36 Michelin-starred restaurants in Alsace — a greater number than anywhere else in Europe.

Recently, we discussed Alsace wine with Etienne Hugel, whose family has made wine continuously since 1639.

"We have produced Alsace wines in Europe's favorite battlefield for over 350 years," said Hugel. "Imagine our task. Each time the Alsace region exchanged its relationship with Germany and France, we had to start over."

"As a consequence of having our boundaries changed so often, the wines of Alsace lost their identity. We sell dry, French wines in a German-style bottle made from grapes that sometimes sound French (pinot blanc) and sometimes sound German (gewurztraminer)."

Most French wine regions use two or three grape varieties planted on a single soil type. Alsace has seven wine grape varieties (sylvaner, riesling, pinot gris, gewurztraminer, pinot blanc, pinot noir, and muscat d'Alsace) planted on a patchwork of granite, sand, clay and chalk soils that allows each variety to be appropriately matched by type.

Hugel emphasizes that to appreciate Alsace wines, the consumer must understand the grape varieties, the unique northern climate and the region's extended growing season.

"The best introduction to Alsace wines is pinot blanc," said Hugel. "It is versatile and affordable, great with food and is styled like a chardonnay without being too aromatic. Pinot gris is more complex — a step up. This wine shows exuberant fruit, not wood. Gewurztraminer has lively spice aromas and flavors that complement smoked salmon and oriental cuisines. Ultimately, people should enjoy the elegant balance and finesse of riesling, the king of Alsace varietals."

Hugel insists that the key to producing fresh, balanced Alsace wines is the long, cool growing season. Grapes can hang on the vine until biological maturity is attained. This slow ripening explains how Alsace wines maintain crisp acidity, retain fresh fruit and achieve the body of world-class wine.

The wines of Hugel are bottled by increasing quality and labeled "Hugel," "Cuvee Tradition" and "Jubilée." The day-to-day process of vinification and maturation is undertaken entirely by family members. Contrary to popular opinion, the aging potential of the great Alsace white wines is limited only by the lifespan of the cork.

WINE SELECTIONS OF THE WEEK

The Alsace wines of Hugel are served in every Michelin three-star restaurant in Germany, Italy and France. That is just about the best recommendation a wine producer can have. The 1989 Pinot Blanc "Cuvee Les Amour" Hugel (\$15) shows lively fresh fruit qualities with an attractive steeliness. The 1988 Tokay Pinot Gris "Cuvee Tradition" Hugel (\$22) boasts a touch of spice in the nose and a rich palate impression backed by solid fruit. It was an excellent accompaniment to Pke Quenelles with Crayfish Sauce served at the Golden Mushroom. The 1989 Gewurztraminer, Hugel (\$20) has typical aromas of spice and lychee fruit complemented by good balance and body. This Alsace wine is particularly adaptable to oriental cuisines.

For those who are fortunate enough to have gourmet cooks to procure gifts for, the offerings available are enormous. I took a poll of chefs, gourmet home cooks, customers, culinary students and various others involved in the wonderful world of cooking. Their answers will help you decide what to get for your cook.

Anna Skupski, the manager of the new Kitchen Glamor in the Novi Town Center, has the world at her fingertips when it comes to cooking equipment. She has used about every pot and pan, utensil, appliance and gadget known to modern day cooks. Her suggestion for the gourmet is an electric Gaggia Cappuccino/Espresso machine. Imagine the fun. At \$175.99, the Gaggia is a coffee lover's dream. Just think, after an elegant meal, of sipping rich, sumptuous Cappuccino.

This machine is durable and easy to use. Pretty much, plug it in and go. It is pump-driven with turbo frothers. Sounds like an expensive sports car. The cleanup is nil.

Anna also suggested Trident knives for the starting chef. New to the line are the lovely carrying cases now available. And for the home enthusiast she recommended an electric ice cream maker as a fun addition to the kitchen.

Ronnie Cambra, owner of the Kitchen Witch in Northville, submitted some superb ideas: "A good cookbook is always appreciated."

Favorites this season are the beautiful picture books available on French cooking and chocolate. Something new is the "Menus and Music," a cookbook/cassette combination. Choose the type of music that suits you and turn to the corresponding chapter in the cookbook. Sounds interesting. The tunes range from old to present-day and are performed by the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra.

According to Ronnie, Tom MacKinnon wants one of the chef pewter wine corks that just came in. She says that pepper grinders and gourmet peppercorns are definitely popular this year.

Kathie Briggs and her husband, Bill, love to cook and eat. Kathie and I chat about food and restaurants each time she is in. We compare notes on this cookbook and that new piece of equipment. I'll run into the kitchen, grab the latest Culinaire and we'll flip through the pages "oozing" and "aahing" over the glorious color photos.

She didn't hesitate when I asked her what was on her wish list for Christmas. A "good" saute pan. "One that is just big enough for two veal chops." Cuisinart or Chantal are excellent choices. They conduct well and will last a lifetime. Or a stockpot that is large enough to make a decent amount of stock. Her cookbook choice is Patricia Wells' "Simply French." "It is perfectly beautiful," she said.

Last, but not least, she would like an exquisite robe to lounge in after a day of cooking. I think silk is in order, Bill.

Now for some professional opinions. Ed Janos, executive chef at Too Chez, wants a F. Dick Sausage Stuffer from J.B. Prince. The catalog description reads like a jet plane. "Stainless steel cylinder and base plate, plastic piston, plastic-coated gear box and support rods. Piston provided with a patented air valve. Fast back stroke. Four stuffing tubes included." All this for a measly \$800. If Santa is good to you, Ed, can I share?

Milka Haggerty, chef/owner of Minchelle Lamour in West Bloomfield, would be happy with a few new Brigard chef coats. Brigard is a French company with offices in New York. They are known for their fine line of chef's uniforms, made from the finest Egyptian cotton. They fit like a glove. A frog could pass for a prince in one.

The cost? \$125 for the low-end jacket. I certainly wouldn't cook in one of these; they are for dress-up. His son, Eric, the main cook, wants a professional

Cuisinart. I don't blame him. They make life a lot easier.

My sous-chef, Laura Merglewski, would love a set of professional pans for her kitchen. "Once you get used to the restaurant quality saute pans it is hard to use the 'home cook' variety," she says. Calphalon is her choice. She would also like some specialty cutlery.

Kelli Lewton, executive chef for the Miesel-Sysco Company, wants some Misono Japanese ice carving chisels. They go for about \$1,500. Good luck, Kelli.

I can offer a variety of recommendations. Cooking classes are an excellent choice. Kitchen Glamor has a wonderful variety of one-day sessions. Flyers are available in the stores. Schoolcraft College offers classes geared for professional and home cooks. Call the continuing education office for more details.

Restaurants are getting into the act too. Les Auters in Royal Oak features Master Chef Jeff Gabriel as its instructor. Kathie just finished one and gives Jeff an A-plus.

In January I will begin teaching a few classes that will feature hands-on experience in a professional kitchen. The classes will be limited to 10 so that individual attention can be given. Menus are designed according to the wishes of the students. Pupils then prepare a five-course meal and invite "company" to dinner.

At the end of a busy day, the meal is served with wine to the cooks and their guests. In the past this has been the most popular and pleasurable of my classes.

My choice of a class would be to return to Ireland for

another six weeks of classical cookery. Mater Chef Peter Timmons was great.

The Food and Wine Library in Ann Arbor offers a variety of unique and valuable cook books. Jan Longone is proprietor extraordinaire. She offers for sale some of the oldest cook books in the world. She is extremely knowledgeable about each and every one.

I recently purchased a complete set of the Time-Life series of Cooking Around the World. It was the last one available in the United States, maybe the world. I am enjoying them. The Wine and Food Library is located in Ann Arbor. Visits are by appointment only. A shopping spree here takes all day; the choices are mind boggling.

For those who are into eating rather than cooking, a rare opportunity recently became available. The Michigan Culinary Team has four practices open to the public. The \$30 ticket includes cocktails and hors d'oeuvres for two hours. Pieces that will be entered in the October 1992 Frankfurt, Germany, World Culinary Arts Salon, will be on display. Team members will be available to talk about the competition. A set of four tickets is available for \$100 and is tax deductible. This is a great and reasonable gift. Florida fish are for those with a 'sweet' tooth

I have spoken of Foley's in Boston, the wonderful fish house, on several occasions. It is so much fun to order from them. I feel like a kid in a toy store.

Well, there is now another toy store to go to. Mr. Seafood, located in sunny Pompano, Fla., has been added to our order sheet. Peter Jarvis calls each Monday with his list of fares.

At first, I would just order the more "usual" or "recognizable" varieties, because if people are not familiar with a species the chance of them trying it are fairly nil. I have found this to be so true with fish. Americans still eat less fish than any other flesh protein.

Many of us remember the obligatory Friday night fish dinners that usually consisted of fried fish and chips or frozen cod filets soaked in milk to rid them of their fishy smell. For the last several weeks we have offered fresh grouper, mahi mahi, and snapper. Red snapper is generally acknowledged as the most favored and is difficult to buy due to the "blackened" phase that we experienced several years ago. Yellowtail snapper is becoming popular now.

Snappers are so named because they shut their mouths with an energetic snap. The flesh is firm and white. When possible it is best to purchase the fish whole. The skin is a beautiful red which intensifies with cooking. Whole fish may be broiled, baked, grilled or steamed.

The flesh of the grouper closely resembles snapper. Although their weight ranges from two pounds to hundreds of pounds, most of the commercial catch is in the fifty-pound area. The larger the grouper, the coarser the flesh.

Anyone who has ever spent time in Florida has eaten grouper. A grouper sandwich is the state's mainstay. Grouper is mild in taste so it lends itself to many presentations. We prefer to cook it Italian style, dipped in tosa batter, quickly sauteed then finished in the oven. Accompanied with homemade cheese tortellini and a fresh tomato basil sauce it is wonderful.

Mahi mahi is growing in popularity. Mahi, or dolphin fish, is not related to the true dolphin which is a mammal and a protected species. It is also referred to as dorado. Mahi,

when cooked properly, has pink flesh which is mild and sweet. Our version was simply grilled, served with basmati rice and garnished with Florida fruit — oranges and grapefruit.

Two simple but elegant sauces finish the plate, a beurre blanc (white butter sauce) and beurre rouge (red butter sauce). The presentation was visually outstanding and the mahi delectable.

I hesitated to order pompano because the price is much more than what I like to commit to. The more my cost, the higher the selling price. But I couldn't resist. The worst that could happen is that I'd be forced to eat it myself. No such luck. We sold out the first night. Pompano is noted for its rich sweet flavor. Sumptuous is more the word. What a treat.

We cooked it in a traditional manner. The fillet or baked in a parchment case. The case keeps the moisture in and also allows the addition of vegetables and herbs to steam along with it. Our version included Julienne leeks, carrots and mushrooms. Just a touch

of white wine was added along with fresh chopped herbs. When the fish was served the packet was opened at the table and all those magnificent aromas rushed out. Heavenly.

Stone crab claws never made it to the specials board. Our regulars know that I bring them in every 10 days or so and place their orders ahead of time. Even though I add on an extra they never seem to stay around for more than a few hours.

I'm sorry to keep using the word "sweet" to describe the above Florida fish but there is no other way to convey what my taste buds remember. As a testimonial I saw Michelle, who "hates" fish, take second bites during our show and tell session. We are expecting another shipment from Peter this week.

As a final note I like to relay a "restaurant" story. I took Tuesday off. It was my second day off since we opened. Laura, my sous chef, takes over the expediting position at night. Joe, a former student at Schoolcraft and now a valued employee, runs the floor. Joe was so good in the dining room class that he took my spot when I went to Singapore. Pat, my day

sous chef, handles the lunch. The place is in good hands.

Well, anyway, I had to stop in just for a moment to wish an employee good luck. It all started three weeks ago. A couple of the wait-staff wanted to play Secret Santa. As it was explained to me everyone's name goes into a bag and each person pulls a name. You are then to buy your pick a gift. There is a \$10 limit.

How creative can you be with \$10? There was some moaning and groaning and then someone had a great idea. A waitress had just been diagnosed with breast cancer. We all waited anxiously for the verdict and when the test came back positive we felt devastated. In addition to the illness she was faced with a month off work and no insurance.

Why not give our secret santa money to her? We did on Tuesday. It was very emotional. When she started to cry so did most of us. I am very proud of each and every one of my staff for the wonderful thing you did. You're to be commended for your kindness and generosity. Thank you

Get the lead out at your table

If one took to heart all the alerts reported in the papers, we'd give up eating and drinking. Even jogging at times seems suspect.

Often confusion sets in, so we do nothing. That's silly. Warnings are to be taken seriously, but judiciously. There is no need to panic. However, at times, just by altering our habits a little we can reduce risk.

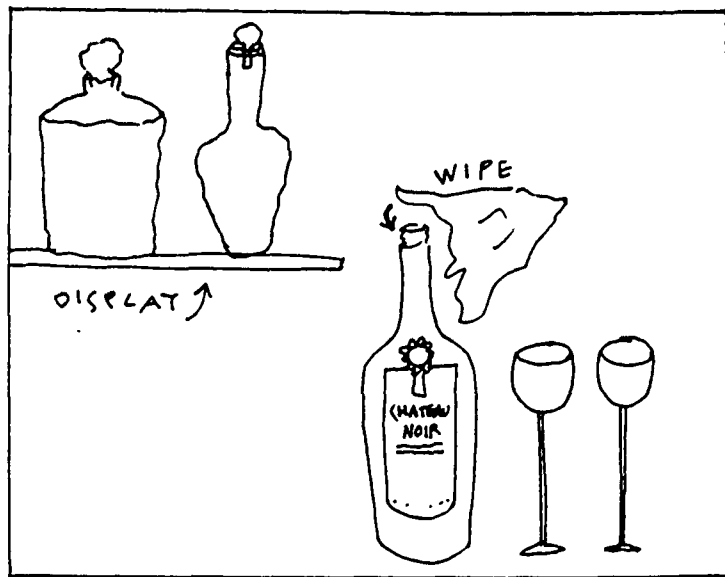
Beyond just the dishes from which we eat, lead also can be a problem in the glasses from which we drink. Even the wine that is decanted gives some people concern.

In the late 19th century lead was added to crystal ware to produce brilliant glass of a high density and durability. Ever since, lead crystal has been the ultimate in glassware.

Bad news came earlier this year from Lancel, the esteemed British medical journal. Lancel printed a report on studies conducted by two Columbia University physicians that showed the correlation between alcohol in crystal decanters and elevated levels of lead in the liquid inside.

How often have you seen episodes in sophisticated movies where the hero pours after-dinner brandy from a handsome crystal decanter that has been sitting on the sideboard? Since a little bit of brandy goes a long way, that decanter can sit on the sideboard for many a month. Actually, that brandy can be pretty poisonous stuff, depending on how long it remained in the decanter.

The research doctors poured port wine into three crystal decanters that had been made in France, Ireland and West Germany. When newly poured, the port contained 80 micrograms of lead per liter, a compart-

tively safe amount.

After reposting the crystal decanters for four months, the lead content leaped dramatically. The 80 micrograms had skyrocketed to between 2,162 and 5,333 micrograms per liter. And sure enough, the decanter with the highest degree of lead oxide (32 percent) resulted in the highest figure.

Still, it's nothing to cause hysteria. Few people are going to sit down and drink a liter of port. Besides, if they attack alcohol like that, they wouldn't sit around very long in the decanter.

However, common sense tells us to relegate our heirloom crystal

decanter to decorative roles. They can be used for decanting wine that will be poured within the next hour or so. Just forget the display lineup of spirits standing at the ready in glamorous crystal decanters.

But we're not through with the lead alert. Poor wine, everyone is attacking it these days. Now comes the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms with a test it conducted at the request of the Food and Drug Administration.

The FDA stated that lead in the foil around the top of the wine bottle contributed amounts of lead to the wine itself. They were right. But programs were already under way, here

and abroad, to replace the foil caps, usually with plastic. Many American wineries switched some time ago.

Now for some good news. If your cellar holds bottles with lead capsules, there is no need to worry. It's very easy to avoid any contamination from the lead. And it's proper service, besides. All you have to do is cut the foil well below the lip of the bottle, remove the foil cap and wipe the top of the bottle.

Have you ever watched a well-trained wine steward open a bottle of wine? Then you noticed that after removing the foil cap he wiped the top of the bottle with a napkin. Then again, once the cork has been pulled out, he wiped the lip of the bottle, reaching inside a bit.

We can't pretend that he was making a conscious effort to remove traces of lead. With the first swipe, he removed any dust particles from under the cap. The second cleanup took care of any bits of cork that may be clinging to the neck.

To put things in perspective, and avoid panic, just remember that many chemicals that scientists warn us about occur naturally in the foods we eat and drink. Good foods, too. Among many other foods, lead occurs naturally in apples, oranges, chicken, popcorn and even President Bush's detested broccoli.

So when a particular problem is pointed out, correct it. Begin by putting the handsome decanters on display and wiping wine bottle tops. Don't eye everything you put into your mouth with suspicion. Relax. Enjoy.

Pie crust makes a low fat dessert

Holiday cheer is in the air, people are smiling more and whistling carols. The release of the last American hostage, Terry Anderson makes all a little more hopeful that there really is such a thing as "peace on earth, good will toward men (women)."

Stop, before you try the Best Fruitcake recipe, there's a missing ingredient, 1 pound of 3/4 or dark brown sugar which equals about 3 1/2 cups. The Best Fruitcake recipe fills 4 loaf pans or 2 bundt cake pans. Aunt Phyllis' Nutty Fruitcake fills 2 loaf pans or 1 bundt cake pan. Selma Dunivant of Livonia and Frances Moritz of West Bloom-

field called to point these errors out to me. While we were talking, Moritz gave me a recipe for low-fat pie crust. "I sent away to Puritan Oil for a cooking oil, this was one of the recipes," said Moritz. "It's real nice and flaky."

Since he likes pie so much, Moritz leaves making the crust to her husband. This recipe works every time. It makes one crust, double it for two crusts.

LOW-FAT PIE CRUST

- 1 1/2 cups all purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt (optional)
- 1/2 cup Canola oil

3 tablespoons skim milk

Combine flour and salt in one bowl. Blend oil and milk in another bowl. Gradually add to flour. Stir with fork until mixture forms large clumps.

Press with fingers to form ball. Flatten between hands to form a 5- to 6-inch pancake. Roll pancake between unfloured sheets of wax paper. Peel off top sheet, flip into 9 inch pie plate.

Better crepeur tip of the week: Crepes have the distinction of being a very dry dessert without being difficult. Fill crepes with vanilla pudding, drizzle with raspberry sauce and top with a dollop of whipped cream and a sprig of mint.

Almond dishes are a natural for the holidays

The almonds you love to munch have a long and fascinating history. We know they were cultivated in Greece and throughout the Middle East long before the Christian era — in fact, a history of plants written about 300 B.C. describes the almond tree.

Almonds have historically been associated with feasts and special occasions. The practice of presenting wedding guests with candy coated Jordan almonds — still common today — began with the Fabian family of Rome in about 177 B.C.

For a special treat this holiday season, try White Jordan Almond Bark, which combines colorful pastel Jordan almonds and unblanched almonds in luscious white chocolate.

Over the centuries, almonds have become an essential ingredient in the holiday specialties of a number of different European countries, from English mincemeats and puddings to Austrian and Czech braided breads.

In Denmark and Holland, the baker hides a whole almond in Three Kings' Bread; whoever gets that piece is sure of good luck. Swedish Christmas rice pudding also boasts a secret almond. Tradition says that the one who finds it will also find romantic happiness and marry in the coming year.

Almonds are essential to German Lubker-

chen, Italian torrone, Danish wienerbrod and kransekager, Swedish bondkakor (Country Lass Cookies), and kronanskaka (crown cake), and Finska pinnar (Finnish shortbread). And almond extract is a favorite flavoring, adding holiday flavor to baked goods and desserts.

Almonds are available in a number of forms — in-the-shell; almonds look pretty in a wooden bowl, (alone or in assortment with other nuts), as a centerpiece. Swedes float slivered almonds in glogg, the traditional hot spiced holiday wine. Ground marzipan (almond sugar paste) is the basic ingredient in many traditional cookies, candies and sweets, while chopped toasted almonds are used to top English toffee or to garnish French chocolate truffles.

Wrap White Jordan Almond Bark in colored cellophane and present in a holiday tin tied with ribbon for a special homemade gift. A beribboned jar of fancy Sugar 'n' Spice Almonds makes a handsome hostess gift, and they're a tasty treat to serve guests at your own holiday parties, too. Almonds can even add a holiday touch to meals. Green Beans Amandine dressed up an ordinary vegetable for holiday presentation.

Recipes in this column are tested in 625- to 700-watt microwave ovens.

Micro-Tip of the week

To roast whole almonds in your microwave oven, toss almonds with vegetable oil to coat lightly. Arrange in a single layer on microwave-safe plate and microwave 2 minutes at HIGH (100 percent power) setting. Toss and let stand 1 minute. Microwave 2 minutes longer at HIGH setting, or until almonds are golden brown. Drain and cool on paper towels.

WHITE JORDAN ALMOND BARK

1 pound bulk white chocolate
1 1/2 cups Jordan Almonds
1/2 cup unblanched whole almonds
Yields about 1 1/2 pound candy.
Preparation time: 10 minutes
Cooking time: 4 to 6 minutes
Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power).
Line cookie sheet with foil; set aside.
Break up chocolate and place in a 2-quart microwave-safe casserole or mixing bowl. Microwave, uncovered, 4 to 6 minutes, or until chocolate melts, stirring every 2 minutes. Stir in Jordan and unblanched almonds. Immediately turn mixture onto lined cookie sheet; spread into thin layer and allow to cool thoroughly. Break into pieces and store in airtight container. Store in cool, dry place.

SUGAR 'N SPICE ALMONDS

1 cup granulated sugar
1/2 cup water
1 cup honey
1 pound unblanched whole shelled almonds
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon allspice
1/4 teaspoon ground cardamom
1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
Yields 1 pound fancy sugared almonds
Preparation time: 10 to 15 minutes
Cooking time: 10 to 14 minutes.
Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power); MEDIUM (50 percent power); LOW/DEFROST (30 percent power).
Combine sugar and water in 2-quart microwave-safe casserole. Microwave on HIGH setting 3 minutes. Stir in honey and microwave 2 to 4 minutes longer on HIGH, or until mixture is thickened and hot.
Stir in nuts and microwave on MEDIUM setting 3 to 5 minutes, or until nuts begin to crackle. Remove from oven.
In a small bowl, combine spices; stir to blend. Sprinkle hot nuts with spices; toss to coat evenly. Microwave at LOW setting 2 minutes longer, then in 1-minute increments (as necessary), until mixture is dry, stirring every minute. Spread on paper tow-

els to cool, then store in airtight container in cool, dry place.

FRENCH GREEN BEANS ALMONDINE

1 (10-ounce) package frozen French-cut green beans
1/2 cup slivered almonds
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
Salt and pepper to taste
2 tablespoons shredded mild cheddar cheese
Yields 4 servings
Preparation time: 5 minutes
Cooking time: 7 to 10 minutes
Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power)

Place green beans in a 1 1/2-quart microwave-safe casserole. Cover and microwave 5 to 6 minutes, or until beans are tender and heated through. Drain and set aside.

Combine almonds and butter in a 1-cup glass measure. Microwave 1 to 2 minutes, stirring after 1 minute, until butter is melted and almonds are lightly browned. Add to green beans, tossing to combine. Cover and microwave 1 to 2 minutes. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Transfer to serving dish, if desired, and sprinkle shredded cheese over top. Serve immediately.

Take these tips for safe cooking

Does "tradition" put your family at risk for food poisoning?

When you look at the faces around your holiday table, think about this. Nearly one in five of the people you see could face special risks from food poisoning.

Who? A lot of people are especially vulnerable to food poisoning. Most of them don't know it. People over 65, pregnant women, infants and people with chronic illnesses all stand a greater chance of getting sick from food poisoning and suffering complications.

But here's the most important part. You can cut those risks, protecting yourself and family. Most foodborne illness can be prevented by safe food handling.

Check out your family traditions. According to Diane Van on USDA's Meat and Poultry Hotline, one of the riskiest things people do is something they've seen done for decades — leave the cooked turkey out all day.

"It's on the counter, it's on the table. People pick at it after dinner and there it sits for hours," said Van. Unfortunately, while it's sitting

there bacteria are multiplying, doubling every 20 minutes in the right conditions.

"If just one bacterial cell got on the meat after you pulled it out of the oven at 1:00, by 8 that evening you could have over 2 million," Van said.

So here's the food safety rule: Two hours after you pull the cooked bird out of the oven it should be back in the refrigerator. To speed cooling and limit bacterial growth, cut the meat from the bone, remove the stuffing and store both in small, shallow containers.

Turkey like Grandma Made. "For as long as we've been having holiday turkeys, we've been looking for ways to save time with the fixings. Sometimes these old time-savers end up costing us more than time," Van said.

All-night cooking. Van reports callers say, "Mom's turkey always cooked all night. We'd wake up in the morning to the smell of roasting turkey."

Van explains, "Overnight cooking is popular when people are having a lot of guests. A big turkey takes a long time to cook. Rather than get up at

the crack of dawn, they cook the turkey all night at a low temperature. But it's not safe."

Thorough cooking kills bacteria. But cooking at low temperatures — less than 325 F — has the opposite effect. The warmth of low heat actually helps bacteria grow.

But how do you get your turkey cooked? According to Van, there are a couple of good alternatives to overnight cooking. Cook two smaller turkeys, or use a cooking bag or covered roasting pan to speed cooking.

"Lots of callers to the hotline get confused about cooking bags," Van said. "They remember their mother using brown grocery bags. Don't use them for cooking. It's not safe and toxins from the glue in the seams could make you very sick."

"Eggstra" cautions. Because of emerging problems with salmonella bacteria in unbroken eggs, people need to take precautions when preparing foods made with eggs, especially some desserts, like pumpkin or custard pies made with eggs.

Foods like custards, containing eggs, milk and high moisture con-

tent, need to be cooked to 160 F or until firm. They must also be refrigerated after cooking — a precaution that's necessary with most cakes, breads or cookies.

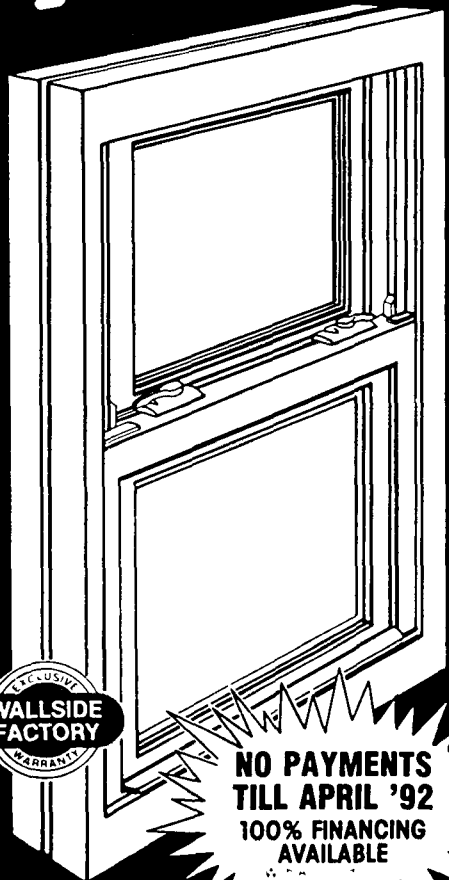
It's also important not to consume raw eggs. Use commercially pasteurized eggnog or make your own eggnog with a cooked custard base, Van said.

For safe Holiday food:

- Thawing a frozen turkey — Don't thaw on the kitchen counter. Thaw in the microwave or refrigerator.
- Snacking — Snacking off the turkey is fine, but don't leave it out more than 2 hours.
- Leftovers — To speed cooling, debone the turkey and refrigerate it in small, shallow containers.
- Cooking — Don't cook turkeys overnight at low temperatures. Cook at 325 F.
- Desserts — Cook custard to 160 F and refrigerate pies made with eggs.
- Eggnog — Don't use raw egg recipe. Use commercially prepared, pasteurized eggnog or make your own with a cooked custard base.

'La Pastorela' best of heaven, hell Angels battle devils in Latino fantasy

When the smoke clears and the shouting dies down, there is a birth to welcome, for art is born of revolution. Conceived by migrant farm workers during the Great Grape Strike of 1965, Luis Valdez's El Teatro Campesino presents a very non-traditional film production of the traditional Latino Christmas play about the shepherds' journey to visit the newborn Jesus Christ, the world's greatest revolutionary. Aired as part of PBS' "Great Performances," the musical "La Pastorela" debuts on Monday, Dec. 23.

With a performance history dating back to the infant days of Christianity in Spain and England, pastorelas, or shepherds plays, were brought to Mexico in the 16th century by Franciscan missionaries. Focusing on the attempts by Lucifer and his demons to sway the pastores (shepherds) from their pilgrimage with temptations of riches and plea-

tures of the flesh, the pastorela celebrates the triumph of good over evil, while, in typical Mexican versions, taking the time for satirical references to deserving local figures.

Writer/director Luis Valdez ("La Bamba," "Zoot Suit") has modernized the story by utilizing a device which has become a cliché in films: the dream induced by a blow to the head. The young protagonist Gila (Karla Montana), after complaining to her mother about their family's poverty being perpetuated by the birth of yet another sibling, reluctantly attends the village mission's production of "La Pastorela," where she is accidentally knocked unconscious. Gila is thus cast into the experience of the play; she is now one of the shepherds in a confused setting where Bethlehem is a migrant workers' camp and hell a toxic-waste dump.

The shepherds are visited by the armor-clad archangel Michael (Linda Ronstadt), who announces the birth of the Christ child. The good pastores gladly embark on their journey to the scene of the nativity, but Lucifer (Robert Beltran, of "Eating Raoul") has sent his motorcycle-riding devils to stifle their intentions and divert them from the path of righteousness.

Paul Rodriguez is wonderfully terrible as Satan, leader of the pack of devils, and Cheech Marin is

hilarious as the singing sultan El Cosmico, who delivers twisted lines like "Cosmic love and peace on you." Fans of Tex-Mex music will enjoy the appearances of Texas Tornados' Freddy Fender and Flaco Jimenez as shepherds, and Little Joe y La Familia as El Cosmico's harem band; this in addition to songs throughout this musical by Los Lobos. Perhaps the oddest bit of casting in this Latino fantasy is that of the mission priest, played by Don Novello in his "Saturday Night Live" alter ego, Father Guido Sarducci.

"La Pastorela" offers entertainment on many levels and in two languages (the songs are in Spanish with English subtitles, while the dialogue is in English with Spanish sprinklings). When this colorful pinata bursts upon the small screen, viewers will be showered with gifts of comedy, drama, romance, horror and inspiration. The shepherd's journey proves to be an analogy for our own trek through life, for the best rewards are the hardest to reach. Feliz Navidad.

Bridge clubbers want to know more about Charles Bronson

Q: For many years, Charles Bronson has been making movies, but not much has been written about him. I would love to have some information about him. —Grandma Taylor and the Bridge Club members, Horseshoe Bend, Ark.

A: Bronson was born Charlie Buchinsky in Ehrenfield, Pa., on Nov. 3, 1921. He helped support his family by working in the coal mines until he was drafted into the Army in World War II. At 27, he decided to become an actor and later enrolled in the Pasadena Playhouse. He made a number of films in Hollywood but didn't become a star until 1968, when he began making films in France and Italy. In 1963, he met future wife Jill Ireland. (Both were previously married.) The couple appeared together frequently in films and had five children. On May 18, 1990, Ireland died after a six-year battle with cancer.

Q: What has happened to Wheel of Fortune? It was my favorite game show. I can't find it listed on any network or cable stations. —Geraldine Doyle, Chanute, Kan.

A: According to an NBC spokeswoman, the recent cancellation of the daytime edition of *Wheel of Fortune* "was a programming decision based on ratings."

Q: "I Wish I Knew," the theme music for The Trials of Rosie O'Neill, is the prettiest since an early 1950 episode of Studio One with the theme music "Let Me Go Lover."

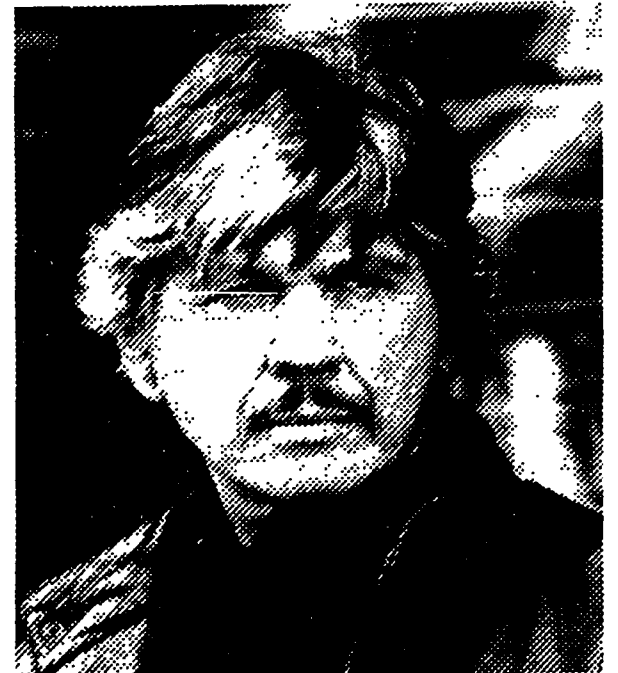
A: What an accolade! I'm sure the people responsible for the *Rosie O'Neill* theme thank you. Unfortunately, you may not be able to hear it much longer. The show is in danger of being canceled.

Q: I watch Mr. Ed and The Patty Duke Show. Is Mr. Ed still alive? Could you tell me about Patty Duke? —Angela Newland, Macon, Mo.

A: Not surprisingly, the horse that played Mr. Ed in the 1961-65 series is dead.

Duke was born Dec. 14, 1946. Her parents divorced when she was very young and she went to live with a husband-and-wife manager team, the Rosses. Diction lessons, singing lessons and drama classes led to toothpaste commercials, television shows and theater appearances for the child actress. Duke won acclaim, first on Broadway, then in film as the young Helen Keller in *The Miracle Worker*. Although she played a "normal" fun-loving teen on *The Patty Duke Show*, she was isolated and miserable. Her adult life, which was marked by broken marriages and recurrent bouts of depression, has taken a turn for the better in recent years. Duke's story is recounted in her 1987 book, *Call Me Anna: The Autobiography of Patty Duke*.

Q: I am a very big fan of Jean-Claude Van Damme. I have all of his movies and daily watch him. If you could please



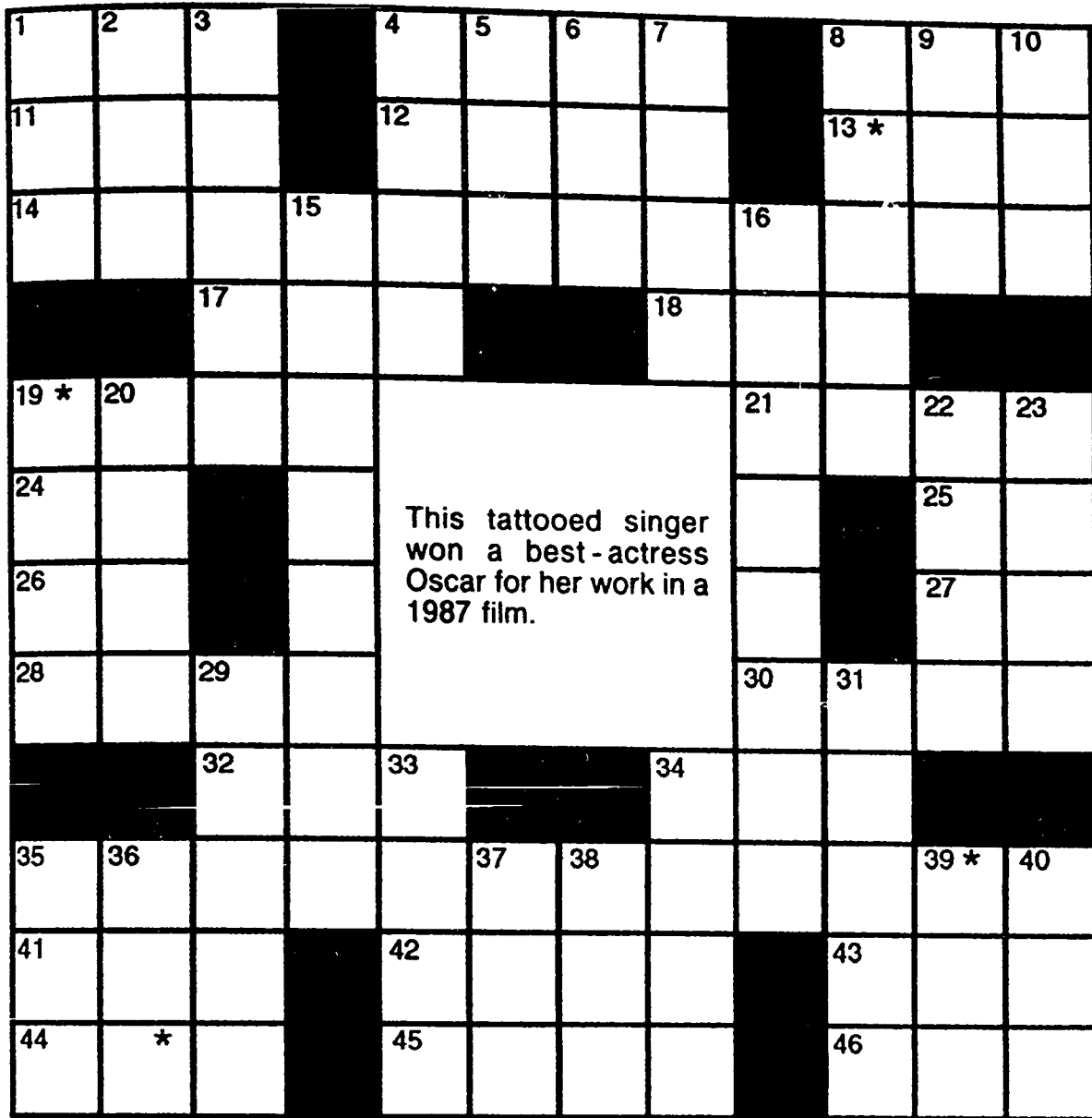
