



City seeks response to deficit cuts

City residents would face a millage hike of 3 to 4 mills and city hall would have to cope with the loss of between five and nine employees under 2½-year deficit reduction proposals now under consideration by the city council.

The council agreed after a public hearing Thursday to forward the three proposals to the state Department of Treasury and Standard & Poors Corp. of New York for comment and review. The city's final deficit reduction plan must be approved by the treasury department before the city can sell more than \$1 million in tax and state-shared revenue anticipation notes.

The notes are needed to cover the loss of a previously anticipated \$735,000, this year's state-returned racetrack revenue, a \$33,000 reduction in other anticipated state-shared revenue and \$430,000 in deficits from last year's general and capital project funds.

Financial adviser Al Diebel of Manufacturers National Bank had

warned the city Monday that Standard & Poors would likely downgrade the city's bond rating if the council approved previously proposed plans that took several years to reduce the deficit while the city had room under its millage cap to more quickly eliminate it. The council can levy up to 6.51 mills more than the current 9.48-mill operating levy without a Headlee override vote by city residents.

One mill equals \$1 in tax for every \$1,000 of assessed property value.

Under the three current proposals, the \$1-million deficit would be reduced by millage increases of 3, 3.5 or 4 mills, services would be cut, and several employees would be laid off.

The council rejected consideration of proposals that would raise the millage rate by 4.5 or 5 mills, despite City Manager Gary Word's recommendation of the 4.5-mill plan.

All the plans include the elimination of police services at Northville Downs, which will result in the lay-offs of one full-time and three part-time police officers. The plans also incorporate 70-percent cuts in the

Highland Lakes seeks attention

Sometimes subtle actions speak the loudest.

At least that's what two dozen Highland Lakes residents want to believe after they trooped to the township board's Dec. 12 session.

Residents calmly expressed their thoughts on free recycling collections and cable television negotiations — topics of real concern to Lakes residents and the 700-family-strong Highland Lakes Homeowners Association.

Board members took notice, especially by the sheer number of residents packing township hall for the normally tranquil board meetings.

Highland Lakes residents have a special interest in the free recycling program announced last spring amid great fanfare. The deal between the township and Browning-Ferris Industries originally was to include all

township residents, according to then-Supervisor Georgina Goss.

Since that time, confusion has cropped up over who exactly will benefit from the BFI/township deal. At last word, the contract was only to include single-family homeowners, apparently forsaking thousands of township residents and taxpayers who live in condominiums and multiple dwellings.

When it became known that condos and multiples were to be excluded from free recycling services, some residents complained, and township officials scurried to add that missing ingredient before the contract recipe was completed.

The township does appear to be working with the condominiums to solve the recycling question, said Russell Fogg, who lives in Highland Lakes and serves on the homeowner's association board.

Truscott explains Engler's stance

Last week was not a good one for the City of Northville in its continuing struggle to secure the city's share of state-returned racetrack revenue. Another potential meeting fell through between Gov. John Engler and local officials including Mayor Chris Johnson, and the governor vetoed a supplemental Senate appropriations bill that would have restored half the funds.

In a conversation with Engler press

secretary John Truscott, Record reporter Steve Kellman attempted to explore the governor's views on racetrack revenue, the racing statute that mandates the revenue's return to cities that house the tracks, and Attorney General Frank Kelley's recent ruling that such revenue could not be used in the state's general fund.

Governor's spokesperson discusses track tax questions

RECORD: We had heard that a meeting was going to take place sometime this week between the governor and the mayors of Northville and Livonia, and we wondered what happened with that.

TRUSCOTT: A meeting hasn't taken place. The last I heard they were going to try and do a conference call. I don't know when that's going to be scheduled, whether it's going to be this week or next week, but it is in the works. . . . It will be within the next couple of weeks.

RECORD: And that would be between the governor and the mayors . . .

TRUSCOTT: . . . and probably

Sen. (Robert) Geake (R-Northville) and Rep. (Lyn) Banks (R-Livonia).

RECORD: We had also heard that the governor opposed a senate bill, SB 213, which would have restored half the racetrack money and funded a lot of other things.

TRUSCOTT: Well, it was because of the whole bill. What it ends up doing is spending Michigan into a huge deficit. And we opposed it because we said the Legislature can spend every penny that we have but not a penny more, and what they did was try and overspend the budget by approximately \$60 million, and we weren't going to let them do that. And so instead of going back to the drawing board and trying to work on something that was acceptable, they just

went home for the holidays.

RECORD: What's the governor's attitude toward racetrack revenues at this point, in light of the attorney general's recent ruling?

TRUSCOTT: Well, there's really nothing we can do at this point because the Legislature hasn't given us anything to work with. And so really no action can be taken without the Legislature making a move. What we have to do is wait for them to come back and then see what they propose.

RECORD: Assuming that the Legislature does . . . cut the racetrack revenue out of everything else and deal with that separately, what are the governor's intentions regarding

racetrack revenue if it's not part of some "Christmas bill" like SB 213?

TRUSCOTT: It's really too tough to say until we get a whole bill like that, or one bill dealing with that issue or some type of other restoration or supplemental bill that has it as a part included in it. It's tough to take a position on something that's not there yet, so what we've asked them to do is put forth a proposal on paper and we can evaluate it from there.

RECORD: It seems that the attorney general's ruling, that the money from racetrack revenue could not be used in the state's general fund because it's a restricted fund, calls into question past attempts by this governor and other governors and legislators to cut the funds. The funds have been cut in the past. We know a number of times in the last decade the cities have not gotten their full share of the funds as the State Racing Statute outlines.

TRUSCOTT: Well, the attorney general's ruling does not mandate that it be spent either . . . and the opinion was not totally complete as far as what can be done with the money and the time frame in which it can be given back or held or anything, so we're just kind of waiting to read the opinion more thoroughly in discussions with the mayors and the legislators in the area. There will not be any moves in the next several weeks just because the legislature won't be around to offer anything up, so we're going to sit back, talk with the attorney general about it and see where we go from here.

RECORD: Has it been made clear to the governor the extent of the financial hole that his actions have put Northville in, in particular, because

racetrack funding is nearly a quarter of the city's entire budget? The city is now looking at laying off several members of the police force and cutting administrative, clerical and DPW positions, raising the millage rate by anywhere from 3 to 5 mills, and cutting other services. I'm just wondering whether he realizes that. I know that's one of the reasons that the mayor here wanted to meet and talk with him.

TRUSCOTT: Well, yes, he's aware of the impact, but at the same time we've been dealing with very serious financial difficulties at the state level, and if this money does have to be paid out it will create a hole at the state level, in our budget. And we'll have to make up for that hole somewhere else.

I think the city also can realize the financial straits that we're in, because now they're facing the same thing. It has not been an easy year for anybody, there's no doubt about that, and we're doing our best to balance the budget and try to help everybody at the same time.

RECORD: This funding is different from other fundings because there is a statute that specifies the percentage that is to be returned to the cities from the racetrack revenue that the state takes in. What's the governor's attitude towards the racing statute itself? It's legally outlined . . .

TRUSCOTT: Well, at the same time other restricted revenues have been held back as well, and this is a practice that has occurred in the past and we're not saying that this will be the final verdict for this year but we've got to take the total budget picture into account before we can consider any more moves. It's been a very

difficult time, and this has not been a decision or an issue that's been easy to deal with, and that's why the governor wants to talk with the local legislators and mayors.

RECORD: Has the governor given any thought to how police services at the racetracks would be funded if the cities were not being paid to provide that service any longer?

TRUSCOTT: No, we really haven't been able to look at local budgets or deal with those issues yet.

RECORD: Yet this is almost a local issue that would be determined by the state's actions, because the city would have no longer have those funds to provide the services.

TRUSCOTT: Well, we make the argument too that there is an economic benefit to having the track in the city. You do get spinoff economic increase as a result of the traffic and the people coming through Northville, and . . .

RECORD: A lot of local residents would argue just the opposite, that they get spinoff problems in terms of noise and litter and increased crime, especially in a community like Northville. At least here, the city argues that the economic benefits are not balanced out by what the economic benefits of all that free land would be if the racetrack wasn't there.

TRUSCOTT: Yes, it is kind of a prime location.

RECORD: Exactly. They argue that it takes up a lot of land, and if it was redeveloped as something else in terms of property taxes and other economic benefits, that would outweigh the benefits of the track.

TRUSCOTT: Well, there are a lot of arguments on both sides, and that's what we're trying to weigh at this point.

city's contribution to the Beautification and Arts Commission funds, \$111,000 in capital outlay reductions, \$97,000 in deferrals of equipment and vehicle replacement, the loss of a proposed deputy city manager's position and the implementation of joint police dispatching by July 1, 1992. Joint dispatching itself would likely require the layoff of a police dispatcher or dispatchers.

Where the plans differ is in the number of heads that would roll at city hall.

The 3-mill proposal would result in the layoff of three police officers, two clerical workers, two public works employees and one administrator. The 3.5-mill version would lay off one police officer, two clerical workers, two public works employees and one administrator. Under the 4-mill version, one police officer, one clerical worker, one public works employee and one administrator would go.

The police layoffs would take effect

April 1, while the others would take effect March 1.

The council's proposals did not pass without comment from the 20 residents and city employees that sat in on the public hearing.

Resident Richard Bohn protested the feedback from Standard & Poors that the city should raise its millage more than previous proposals had suggested. "That sounds to me like the banks saying to GM, 'Don't lay off people; raise the price of your cars,'" he said. "We're a small community with an awful lot of people working for it. I suggest you take another look at this and don't go over 3 mills."

Todd Hutchins agreed, saying, "The question is not how the bonds are rated, it's how do you raise the money, by laying off people or raising taxes."

Leon Bonner protested the deficit presentation as dishonest in light of increases in other city fees. "You're increasing the garbage pickup (fees), you're increasing the water bills, you're increasing the building fees," he said. "I think this is misleading,

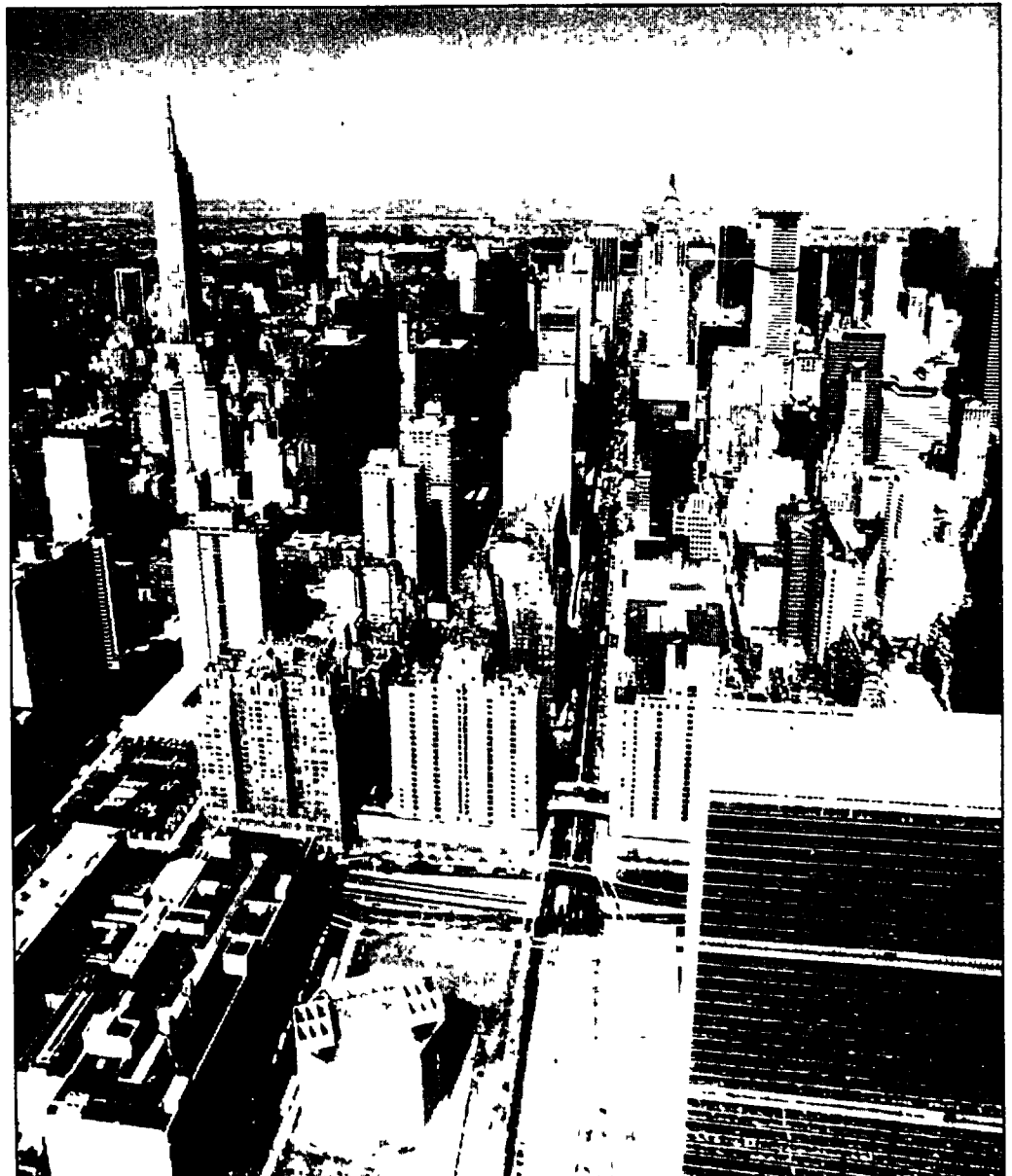
because you've been raising your revenues in other ways. . . . Obviously, the cost to the taxpayer is even far more than is shown here."

The council itself was somewhat divided over the different proposals. Council Member Jerry Mittman insisted on inclusion of the 3-mill plan in the submissions to treasury and Standard & Poors, saying he thought more money should be trimmed from the existing budget.

"I really feel it's too much business as usual as of yet; we really haven't gone and done a thorough cut," he said. "I think there's more that can be done here with a 3-mill increase to bring this in line without as big a reduction in the head count."

In contrast, Council Member Carolan Ayers said she thought the 3-mill plan was "unrealistic," and Mayor Chris Johnson worried that the plan would not leave enough police service to respond to a potential increase in crime at Northville Downs.

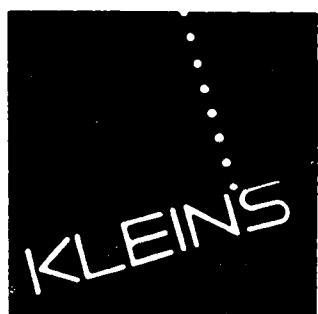

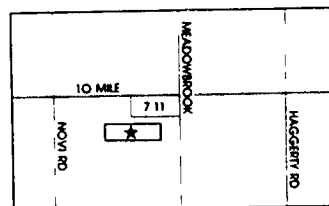

"So far, we have no reason to believe the township isn't going to be cooperative," Fogg said. "We want them to be aware of us and I think we just reinforced it [at the board meeting]."

Supervisor Betty Lennox says she is indeed aware of condo and multiple residents. The township is working for those homes to be added to the recycling contract, she said.

But Lennox would offer no guarantees that the chore could be accomplished.

Fogg did make it clear that condominium residents have special needs that must be addressed. Residents cannot simply place recyclables and solid waste out in front of their homes.

But Highland Lakes residents are not just sitting back and waiting for the township to take care of them.

Fogg said a committee of Lakes residents was formed to offer possible solutions and suggestions to the township.

The key to a successful program will be a working plan, education, and sufficient lead time to pull it all together, Fogg said.

"We've got some difficulties in how they're going to pick up," he said. "We've looked at trash compactors and dumpsters, but you have the problem of people driving through and dropping off garbage."

"We have come up with so many possibilities, but everything we come up with has some kind of problem with it," he said.

The committee will continue to meet and bounce ideas off the township, though residents are not privy to current township/BFI negotiations.

"We're not involved with any of that, but the township does seem to

be in sympathy with us," Fogg said.

Fogg also said residents have put together a committee to discuss the township's negotiations with Omnicom Cablevision, the township's contracted cable television outlet.

Research has indicated that Omnicom's rates are the area's highest, and Lakes residents are with frequent blackouts and sometimes poor service, Fogg said.

"(Omnicom's) not to everybody's satisfaction," he said. He said the township has pledged to give Lakes residents a voice in cable television negotiations.

"At present, we're satisfied the township is listening to us," Fogg said.

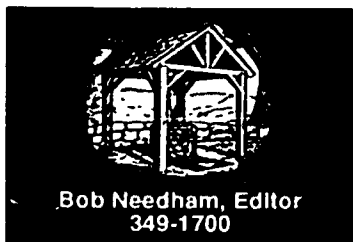

Ethics discussion fine, but integrity counts, too

Ethical behavior and conflict of interest are significant topics of discussion in Northville Township these days.

Supervisor Betty Lennox has scheduled a Jan. 8 workshop for members of all township boards and commissions. The workshop, to be presented by a township attorney, is supposed to focus on the roles, obligations, and duties of township elected and appointed officials.

This special session will precede any further appointments, Lennox said, and likely will affect the makeup of the township's many governing boards.

Why the sudden interest in ethics and potential conflicts of interest? Good question, and the answers are complex.

The township — Lennox specifically — is desperately seeking remedies to right what must be considered a sinking political ship. The plan to review members of the boards and commissions for potential conflicts and other issues is a commendable step, if the process is carried out in a well-defined, structured manner, with above-board intent.

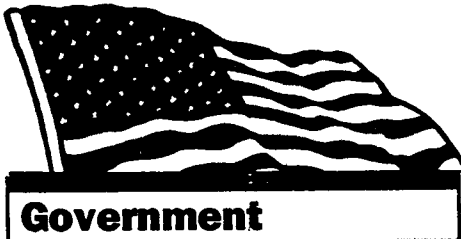
However, if it's merely an attempt to justify dumping certain individuals from their township appointments, other questions emerge.

Who, if anyone, is the township after? If it is after someone, those individuals should be confronted and specifics discussed. If it's determined that ethics violations or conflicts have occurred, the offending parties should be removed from their position.

If the township simply wishes not to re-appoint someone, like, say, Barbara O'Brien, whose planning commission appointment has expired, the township should discuss the situation with the person and make a decision. Beating around the bush and subjecting appointees and elected officials to an ethics charade in order to justify a pre-ordained mission is not the preferable way to do business.

We have some real reservations about the validity of the ethics-revisited program. It was a scant two years ago that the township put together a similar policy, which came in the aftermath of the Ken Hardesty/Tom Cook gun sale snafu.

Not much has actually changed in the wording of the township's ethics policy except for some tightening of language concerning possible financial malfeasance.

And since the township board adopted that ethics policy, the township awarded a \$268,800 library architectural contract to a member of the township's zoning board of appeals. That contract process was shaky from the start and looks uglier with the passage of time. Other ethical questions have emerged, such as former supervisor and current state Rep. Georgina Goss' gratis membership to Meadowbrook County Club.

Goss claims innocence on the issue, saying she hasn't used the membership for golf and has only taken advantage of the dining and socializing privilege a few times. Sorry, that explanation does not wash. Goss was the chief assessor for the township and Meadowbrook is an assessable property. For her to accept any gift from the country club potentially places her in a compromising position.

And it surely violates the same ethics policy she put her stamp of approval on in 1990.

Many other possible conflicts have emerged and the township needs to take an extremely close look at the way it does business. A true examination of ethical behavior and possible conflicts can only be constructive, and we hope that is what Lennox and the township have in mind.

Our goal is not to push good people away from the oft-thankless task of community service. Quite the opposite is true.

But we do insist on honesty, accountability, and responsibility from township officials, and the taxpayers of Northville Township should demand the same. Light must shine on political favoritism, self-improvement, financial misadventure and cushy perks embraced by some township officials.

If Lennox and the township board can kick-start that process, more power to them. But considering past performances, excuse us if we don't hold our breath.

New restaurant fills a niche



Like little kids with their faces pressed to the glass of a toy store window, we here in the newsroom have watched out our windows overlooking Main Street for the past few months.

We've been watching the building across the street in anticipation, like children wishing and hoping for his Santa Claus to deliver the goods. And by God, His Big

Red Oneness has come through for us.

Joseph's Coney Island opened for business on Thursday.

The Joseph whose name is on the awning is Zef Drešević (Zef is the Yugoslav version of Joseph), and if you drop by the shop, you'll have to look hard to find him. He camouflages himself as a busboy/stockboy in the same black pants and aqua polo shirt as the rest of the staff. Wife Vicki works the counter, where you can rub elbows with everyone from downtown business people to construction workers to Record staffers.

The inside of Joseph's looks like a 1950s diner on a collision course with the 1990s. Modern furnishings and fittings appear in aqua and grey with streaks of maroon trim. At 12:30 p.m. on opening day, nearly every counter stool and table was taken.

This is what downtown Northville really needed: a clean, modern sandwich shop where you can eat in or carry out a filling meal on the cheap. For a newsroom that runs on its stomach, it's something we've lamented the absence of for some time.

Oh, sure, Edwards and the Rose Cottage Tea Room can set out a lunch with panache, Genitti's and the Center Street Cafe do well with the basics, and they stack a mean turkey sandwich at the Northville Pharmacy. But none of them can sate a manly man's hunger for under five bucks the way Joseph's can.

And speaking from experience (urp!) Joseph's dishes up a righteous Coney Island. It comes to you slathered in spicy, if slightly runny, chili, with a smattering of freshly chopped onions (pack your breath mints). The hot dog itself is high-quality with a good bite to it.

I had one Coney, a large Coke and an order of fries (cooked just right — soft on the inside, crunchy on the outside), and the bill came to \$2.86.

There are plenty of other interesting items on the menu, too. Though Coney Island is the mainstay, you can find some thick, tasty sandwiches — a number of them on pita bread owing to the owner's heritage.

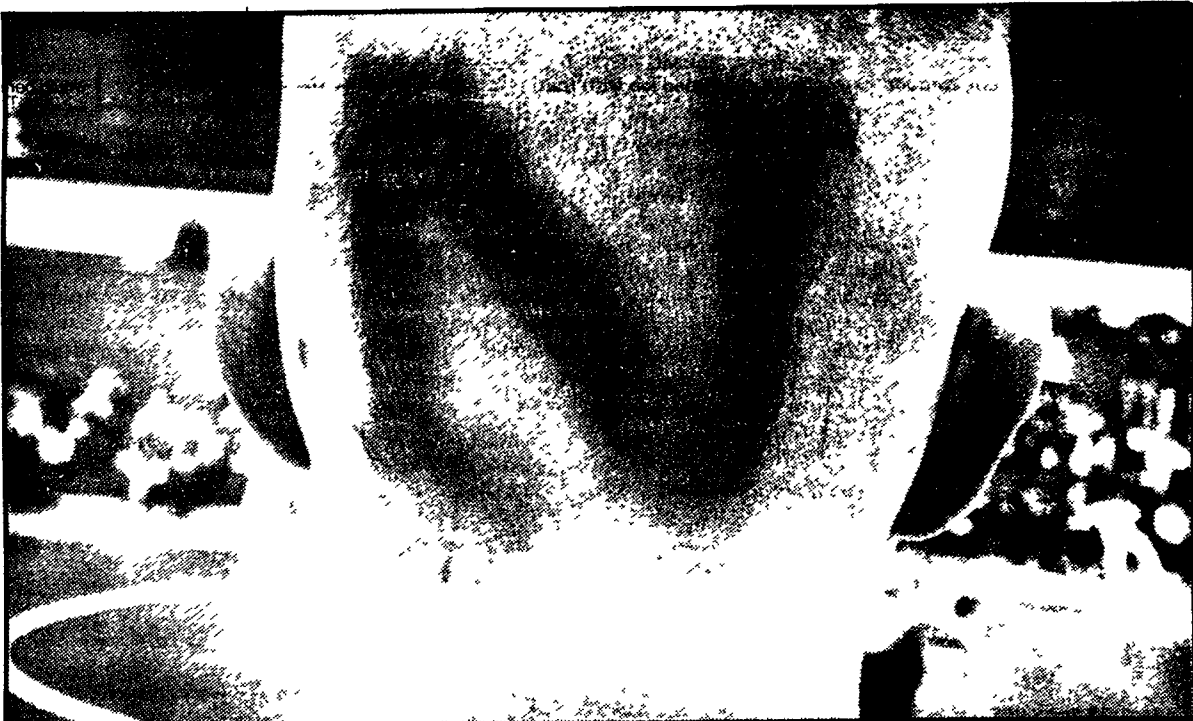
The origins of the Coney Island are intriguing. In New York, since we already have the real Coney Island (the place), we simply call Coney Islands (the food) chili dogs. Chili dogs bear little resemblance to the Coney Islands folks around here are familiar with.

When Bill Bonds left Channel 7 to go to New York and anchor WABC's news broadcast, he said the thing that brought him back to Detroit was that he couldn't get a good Coney Island in New York. Maybe because he wasn't asking for a chili dog.

Somebody ought to give old Billy a call. If it's a good Coney Island he wants, tell him to come to Joseph's in Northville.

All cognac is brandy; not all brandy is cognac

"Brandy is the heart of wine — its quintessence," said Claire Coates, communications director for the Cognac Bureau. "People who drink wine and are attracted to its taste, eventually continue this enjoyment with brandy. Although cognac can be produced only in France, brandy can be made anywhere in the world. All cognac is brandy, but not all brandy is cognac."

Ugni blanc, known elsewhere as Trebbiano, White Hermitage or St. Emilion, is the principal grape variety in Cognac. "Only natural yeasts are used in the fermentation process," Coates said. "Any chemical additions are concentrated during distillation and would give poor tastes and aromas. We add nothing; everything is perfectly natural."

Vineyard sites in the Cognac region are arranged in concentric circles with the very best, those with chalkiest soil, at the center and those of lesser distinction near the perimeter. In decreasing order of importance the sites are Grande Champagne, Petite Champagne, Borderies, Fins Bois, Bons Bois and Bois Ordinaires.

In the Cognac region, the term "champagne" translates as "open field" and has no reference to sparkling wine.

Demand for cognac produced exclusively from the Grande and Petite Champagne is increasing. The term Grande Champagne refers to cognac produced entirely from grapes grown in the appellation Grande Champagne. The same is true for Petite Champagne. Fine Champagne contains at least 50 percent Grande Champagne, the remainder being only Petite Champagne. The term Fine Cognac on some cognac labels has no legal meaning.

The distiller uses a traditional pot still, made entirely of copper, to separate the essence of the wine. A first distillation results in a milky, 28-percent alcohol liquid.

In a second distillation, the head and tail distillates are separated from the heart having an average strength of 70-percent alcohol. It is then aged and blended to produce the brandy called cognac. Distilled water is gradually added over a period of years to bring the cognac to the desired 40 percent alcohol before bottling.

Cognac is aged entirely in 90-gallon Limousine or Tronçais oak barrels, some as old as 50 years. Barrel aging gives tannin, allows oxidation, and adds color to the otherwise colorless spirit. Approximately four percent (28 million bottles) of cognac evaporates annually from the aging barrels as "the angels' share."

Cognac's consistent taste is maintained by a master blender who has at his disposal a flavor bank of more than 350 cognacs of different age and origin. The process of blending these cognacs depends more on the blender's nose than his taste. Very little is tasted in the task that requires many years of training and apprenticeship. The skill is frequently passed from father to son for generations of master blenders employed by a given cognac house.

HOMEMADE FOR THE HOLIDAYS Goodies from the heart make good presents

Gifts from the home equal gifts from the heart at times like these. With the economy in a recession, excessive glitz seems inappropriate to some. More than one friend or business associate has announced she is taking the gift list to the kitchen this year.

As one person put it: "All that fancy stuff went out with Trump."

One caterer said some of his regular clients have told their employees, "It's a big party or a bonus this year." The caterer added: "The employees say, 'Give the bonus and make the party a potluck.'"

If you've decided "homemade for the holidays" will be your motto this year, here are some suggestions and tips to make sharing easier.

Give your food gifts — homemade or store-bought — special treatment by wrapping them in a seasonal dish towel or pretty napkin instead of the usual paper. Or wrap it in an apron. For an added

touch, include the recipe. (Or at least include a note with serving suggestions if the recipient needs to finish the preparation, such as with a rice mix or homemade spices.)

With a minimum of preparation and expense, you can make your own gourmet food items as gifts. Packaged in attractive baskets, bowls or glass bottles, and dressed up with colorful ribbons and fabrics, they'll look like they came from an expensive food emporium.

Containers need not be expensive. Card shops and supermarkets sell plastic and cardboard ones imprinted with holiday designs for about \$1 each (or less).

Also consider straw baskets. In particular the tight-woven and multicolored ones with lids, and inexpensive ceramic bowls, all of which are useful once the food is gone. Cover the bowls with clear or colored plastic wrap, tied at the center with a ribbon. Wicker baskets lined with

colored plastic wrap or foil become beautiful gift baskets when filled with cookies, candies and other small treats.

Inexpensive decorative tins and holiday cookie jars can be purchased in supermarkets and dime stores. Both can be used again by the recipient. Empty jelly jars are easy to decorate with acrylic paint and ribbon, making festive candy jars. Oversized tumblers and coffee mugs are other examples of attractive containers that can be used again and again.

You can make your own labels with colored paper, cut with pinking shears, or buy fancy labels at a stationary store. What better way to express good wishes this holiday season than to offer a gift under your own label?

Busy cooks have to do some of the gift cooking in advance. Here are some storage ideas so you can set up your calendar for preparation.

STORING COOKIES AND CANDY

To store cookies short-term for one week: Cool cookies completely. Do not mix soft and crisp varieties in the same container or the crisp cookies will soon become soft. Store soft cookies in a container with a tight-fitting lid. Store crisp cookies in a container with a loose fitting lid. Store bar cookies in the pan in which they were baked; cover pan tightly with aluminum foil or plastic wrap.

To store cookies long-term for six months: Both frosted and unfrosted cookies can be frozen and stored up to six months. Arrange in a container lined with plastic wrap or aluminum foil; separate with layers of aluminum foil or plastic wrap. Tightly seal container, label and freeze. Thaw cookies by allowing them to stand loosely covered on a serving plate for about 20 minutes.

To store candies: Individually wrap

Soup will warm the soul this Christmas Eve



I am very happy that it is the Monday before Christmas. We decided a few weeks ago to give everyone a break and close down for Christmas Eve. Hopefully the video store will have a few good movies to rent.

It's time to "veg out" for a few days. Since most of my family will be out of town, there will be no big get-togethers. No leftovers either.

I have been elected to do the Christmas Eve dinner. Usually this is a lavish affair ending with everyone moaning that they have

eaten too much. Well, I swear this year I won't do it. A good pot of soup and assorted sandwiches will be just fine. Add a salad and a light dessert, and the meal is complete. Better yet, I can sit on the couch most of the day while the house fills up with the smells of the soup cooking itself.

Lucky for me, I can bring some of the stock home from the restaurant and have a head start. The only thing I need to figure out is what flavor to make.

One of my favorite soups is a consommé of clear bouillon. One swallow warms me from head to toe, and it is good for you. In the old days, clear broths were thought to have medicinal powers. Understandably so. They revitalize without heaviness.

Soups of vegetable purees are also very nourishing and nutritious. When is the last time you made a carrot or parsnip soup? Or better yet, a combination. Swirl one into the

other for a real taste treat.

Or minestrone. I always think of the original Larco's in Detroit, which made a lovely soup, chock full of vegetables and pasta in a rich broth. It was sprinkled with some fresh parmesan, and that great Italian bread was perfect for dipping. I haven't been able to duplicate it yet, but I'm still experimenting.

Or how about a good fish chowder, full of fresh fish or clams?

Last week we had a request for borscht. Admittedly, neither myself, Laura or Pat had ever made it. Well, we pulled out the cookbooks, found a good recipe and went at it. I don't care for beets at all. Never have and never thought I would. Borscht changed my tune. We took a chance and ran it for the soup of the day, and the raves are still coming in.

Even chicken noodle sounds good, with big chunks of chicken and thick egg noodles.

Add a grilled cheese with tomato sandwich and some rice pudding for a real comfort food meal that's right at your fingertips. Or... I could go on and on.

Some quick soup facts before you start. The best soups are made from the best ingredients. Meat soups should use cuts from the neck, hocks (shank) or short ribs. Depending on the soup, beef, lamb or pork are the common animals used. Stewing hens provide the best meat for chicken-based soups. Fish and shellfish should be fresh and odor-free.

Choose beautiful vegetables with good flavor. Too many people use the "garbage" left in the vegetable bins in soup just to get rid of it. The soup suffers.

Spices and herbs, called aromatics in the business, are added to soups to increase flavor, and in many instances to reduce the need for salt.

Cook soups at a gentle simmer, just long

enough to develop good flavor and appropriate body. Stir the soup to prevent scorching, and use a ladle to remove and skim that forms. Don't be afraid to taste the soup frequently as you go. When the soup is done, either serve or store it. There is no benefit to having soup cook away for hours. Flavor deteriorates.

Finally, don't forget the garnish. Garnishes make a good soup great. They should be added just at service. A sprinkle of fresh herbs, grated cheese, homemade croutons or chopped bacon are some examples. Use your imagination.

Merry Christmas to all. Have a wonderful holiday.

The Refrigerator Door

NOTE WELL: For those of you who tried the low fat pie crust recipe featured in last week's Creative Dining section, expect the dough to feel differently than a pie crust made with shortening. Lois Thieleke, home economist for the Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service, Oakland County office, said the dough will be a little harder to handle because of the oil.

Linda Popovic of Bloomfield Township said she has a pie crust recipe that's even lower in fat. "This recipe works out real well," said Popovic. "It's good with apples, and contains less than 80-90 grams of fat per pie."

TENDER PIE CRUST

1½ cups whole wheat flour
pinch of salt
¼ cup vegetable oil
2 tablespoons low fat margarine
2 tablespoons yogurt
1 tablespoon honey
2 tablespoons cold water

Combine flour and salt. Cut in butter and oil until mixture is coarse. Add yogurt, honey and water. Mix until it forms a ball. Wrap in plastic, chill one hour. Roll out between sheets of plastic wrap. Makes a double pie crust.

TIP OF THE WEEK: From Betty Crocker, children delight in making gingerbread houses and they make beautiful centerpieces for holiday dinners. Prepare the molasses cookie dough and make patterns one day; next day cut and bake cookie pieces. Then decorate and assemble.

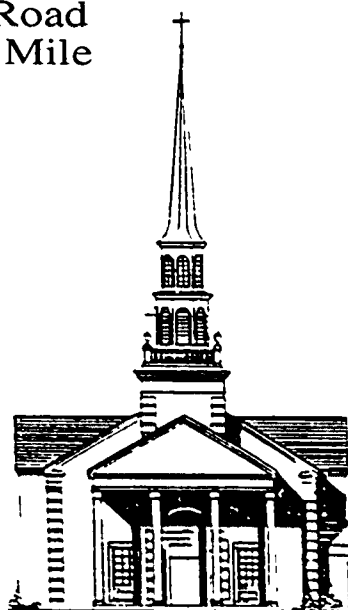

candies in waxed paper or plastic wrap; nearly all candies will stay fresher longer. Store individually wrapped candies in boxes, tins or cartons with tight-fitting lids.

Exceptions: Store small, hard candies together in a jar with tightly fitting lid after dusting with finely ground (not powdered) sugar. Do not mix candies that absorb moisture (caramels, mints and hard candies) in the same container as those that lose moisture (fudge, fondants, meringues). Use waxed paper to individually wrap or separate layers of fudge to avoid sticking.

Create homemade successes by following a few rules from the experts. The dairy people from the test kitchens of Minnesota-based Land O'Lakes have come up with the following tested methods.

Use a dependable candy thermometer. Hold it upright in the candy mixture, making sure the bulb is completely covered with liquid while not resting on the bottom of the pan. If you do not have a candy thermometer, use the cold water test. Drop a small amount of the candy mixture into a cupful of very cold water. Remove candy drop from water and form into a ball with fingers. The firmness of the ball determines the candy temperature and is an indication of doneness.

Thread stage: 223-234 F — forms a 2-inch soft thread.

Soft ball: 234-240 F — forms a soft ball that does not flatten when removed from water.

Hard ball: 250-268 F — forms a hard but pliable ball.

Soft crack: 270-290 F — Separates into hard but pliable strands.

Hard crack: 300-310 F — Separates into hard, brittle strands.

Another important rule is to follow the recipe directions carefully. Often a recipe calls for a heavy cooking pan of a certain size. Be sure to use the one specified. Candy is cooked at very high temperatures, so be sure the pan is large enough to prevent candy from boiling over.

Finally, watch candy carefully. Candy recipes often instruct the cook to add ingredients at precise temperatures. Many recipes are ruined because the ingredients were overcooked, burned or boiled.

Here are some recipes for holiday gift-giving.

SNOWBALL COOKIES

2 cups all-purpose flour

2 cups finely chopped pecans

1/4 cup sugar

1 cup unsalted butter, softened

1 teaspoon vanilla

Powdered sugar

Yields 3 dozen

Heat oven to 325 F. In large mixer bowl combine all ingredients except powdered sugar. Beat at low speed, scraping bowl often, until well mixed, (3 to 4 minutes).

Shape rounded teaspoonfuls of dough into 1-inch balls. Place on cookie sheets. Bake for 18 to 25 minutes or until very lightly browned.

Roll in powdered sugar while still warm and again when cool, or shake powdered sugar through a strainer held over cookies.

OLD WORLD RASPBERRY BARS

2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour

1 cup sugar

1 cup chopped pecans

1 cup unsalted butter, softened

1 egg

Filling: 10-ounce jar raspberry preserves

Yields 2 dozen

Heat oven to 350 F. In large mixer bowl, combine all ingredients except raspberry preserves. Beat at low speed, scraping bowl often until mixture is crumbly (2 to 3 minutes). Reserve 1/4 cup crumbs mixture; set aside.

Press remaining crumb mixture on bottom of greased 8-inch square baking pan. Spread preserves to within 1/4-inch of the edge of unbaked crumb mixture. Crumble remaining crumb mixture over preserves. Bake for 42 to 50 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool completely; cut into bars.

BUTTERY PECAN CARAMELS

2 cups sugar

2 cups half-and-half

1/4 cup light corn syrup

1/2 cup unsalted butter

1/2 cup semisweet real chocolate chips

64 pecan halves

Yields 64 caramels

In 4-quart saucepan combine sugar, 1 cup half-and-half, corn syrup and butter. Cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until mixture comes to a full boil (7 to 8 minutes). Add remaining 1 cup half-and-half; continue cooking, stirring often, until candy thermometer reaches 245 F or small amount of mixture dropped into ice water

forms a firm ball (35 to 40 minutes).

Pour into buttered 8-inch square pan. Cover; refrigerate 1 to 1 1/2 hour to cool. Cut into 64 pieces. Drop 1/4 teaspoon melted chocolate on top of each caramel; press pecan half into chocolate. Cover; store refrigerated.

ENGLISH TOFFEE

1 cup sugar

1 cup unsalted butter

6-ounce package semisweet real chocolate chips

1/4 cup finely chopped pecans

Yields 1 1/2 pounds

Line 15x10-inch jelly roll pan with waxed paper. In 2-quart saucepan combine sugar and butter. Cook over low heat, stirring occasionally, until candy thermometer reaches 300 F or small amount of mixture dropped into ice water forms brittle strands (25 to 30 minutes).

Quickly spread into prepared pan. Sprinkle chocolate chips over hot candy; let stand for 5 minutes. Spread melted chocolate evenly over candy; sprinkle with nuts. Cool completely; break into pieces.

BUTTERY PEANUT BRITTLE

2 cups sugar

1 cup light corn syrup

1/4 cup water

1 cup unsalted butter, cut into pieces

2 cups raw Spanish peanuts

1 teaspoon baking soda

Yields 2 pounds

In 3-quart saucepan combine sugar, corn syrup and water. Cook over low heat, stirring occasionally, until sugar is dissolved and mixture comes to a full boil (20 to 30 minutes). Add butter; continue cooking, stirring occasionally, until candy thermometer reaches 280 F or small amount of mixture dropped into ice water forms a pliable strand (80 to 90 minutes).

Stir in peanuts, continue cooking stirring constantly, until candy thermometer reaches 305 F or small amount of mixture dropped into ice water forms a brittle strand (12 to 14 minutes).

Remove from heat; stir in baking soda. Pour mixture onto 2 buttered cookie sheets; spread about 1/4-inch thick. Cool completely; break into pieces.

Each producer establishes, maintains and jealousy guards the signature house style. This style combines aroma, body and taste characteristics integrated into a harmonious flavor. Aroma is very important to a cognac's style and may emphasize flowers, fruits, nuts or wood. The body, texture and mouth-feel may range from medium to full and should be smooth and silky.

Since cognac is always a blend, the law prohibits any mention of age as part of the label. Quality grades, established by law, guarantee the minimum age of cognac used in a blend and the minimum aging period.

The following designations are found on cognac labels: Three Star or Very Special (VS) means that the average aging period of the cognac is five to nine years. Very Superior Old Pale (VSOP) contains cognac with an average age of 12 to 20 years. Cognacs labeled Extra Old (XO), Napoleon, Extra or Vieille Reserve apply to older cognacs with ages up to 40 years. The top of each producer's line includes a 50-year-old cognac, given a house name and marketed in a special crystal decanter.

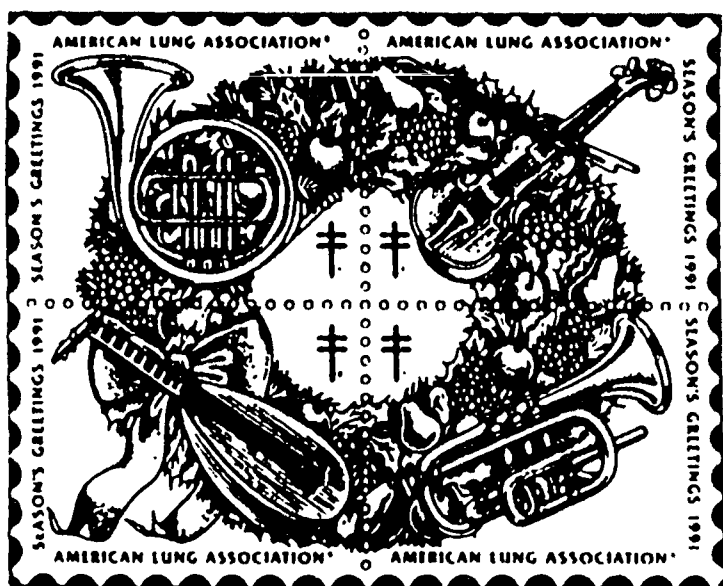

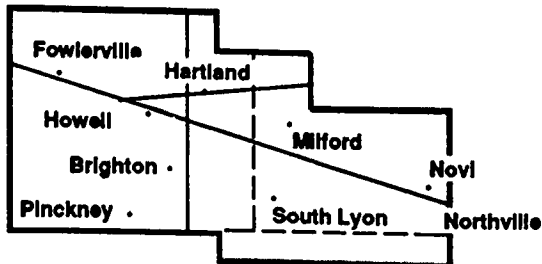

Once upon a time (say, in Rob and Laura Petrie's heyday), it was almost de rigueur for New Year's Eve to be a Big Night Out, a dressed-up, party-down, pull-out-all-the-stops event. Even moms and dads (like Ward and June Cleaver) would join the smart set for a gay evening and maybe a lamp shade or two atop their heads. The point is, or was, on Dec. 31, one had to live it up, get on with it, do it up right and see the year out with a bang.

Nowadays, economics and justified concerns about safety have altered New Year's Eve practices and expectations. One way to mark the year's passage is simply to stay at home, and television increasingly offers a variety of inducements to do just that. This year, especially, television seems to have something for everyone.

PBS begins the evening in style,

airing "New Year's Eve With the Berlin Philharmonic." Claudio Abbado conducts an all-Beethoven program featuring soloists Cheryl Studer and Evgeny Kissin.

Mainstream TV viewers will likely tune in "The Tonight Show New Year's Eve Special," but don't expect Johnny; Carson has opted not to mark a final New Year's on the air. Incoming host Jay Leno will man the desk and welcome several special guests.

Popular music will be amply represented. Hammer serves as host for MTV's year-end blowout, a hard-edged showcase featuring EMF, Marky Mark and the Red Hot Chili Peppers. CBS aims to shake the rafters with "The Hard Rock Cafe's 20th Anniversary New Year's Eve Special." (Midnight may arrive before they finish with that title.) ABC plays it safe with "Dick Clark's New Year's Rockin' Eve '92." Stephen Baldwin and Shannen Doherty are the hosts, and musical acts include Simply Red, DJ Jazzy Jeff & the Fresh Prince and, no foolin', Barry Manilow.

Country fans should catch TNN's "New Year's Citrus Eve '92," live from Sea World in Florida. Travis Tritt and Tanya Tucker headline the all-star show. VH-1 presents holiday and party music videos in its "New Year's Eve Countdown Party."

Looking for laughs? Try A&E's "New Year's Eve Comedy Fest," with Frank Gorshin fronting a new installment of "An Evening at the Improv" and a repeat of "Late Night With David Letterman's" acclaimed "360 Degree Show."

Movie fans should note three night-long marathons. USA takes the low road, offering the full complement of "Porky's" films, while AMC pulls out the comedic stops with a Marx Brothers marathon including "Horse Feathers" and "Duck Soup." Sophisticates likely won't budge from The Movie Channel's showing of all six "Thin Man" movies, starring William Powell and Myrna Loy as elegant detectives Nick and Nora Charles. (And don't forget Asta.)

Regional sports channels score ads

Southern California's Prime Ticket Network has emerged as the leader of a group of more than two dozen regional networks that are luring viewers and advertising dollars away from the three major networks and national cable sports leader ESPN. Prime Ticket, which just three years ago relied on viewer subscriptions for 85 percent of its revenue, can thank its

advertising flexibility for its greater appeal to major sponsors.

According to the *Wall Street Journal*, Prime Ticket received over half of its revenue from advertising in 1990, and that figure is expected to rise to 80 percent within two years. Other regional networks such as Madison Square Garden, Home Sports Entertainment and Florida's Sunshine Network are doing almost equally as well by staking out specific geographic regions and aligning themselves with local college and professional sports teams.

Prime Ticket has also become the leader in innovative programming under the direction of former ABC Television president John C. Severino. After acquiring broadcast rights to Los Angeles Clippers and Lakers basketball games, as well as Kings hockey, the network cemented a 10-year deal with the PAC-10. In 1990, Prime Ticket launched Southern California's first live, nightly half-hour sports show and in 1991 produced *Baseball's Greatest Games*, the most successful cable sports program to date. — TV Listing Inc.

While the lawsuit causes him a great deal of stress, he also has much joy in his life. He loves working on *Santa Barbara* and with the cast of the show. "I have to say I am very happy to be doing *Santa Barbara*, and from what I can gather from my other friends in daytime, this is about one of the nicest sets to work on."

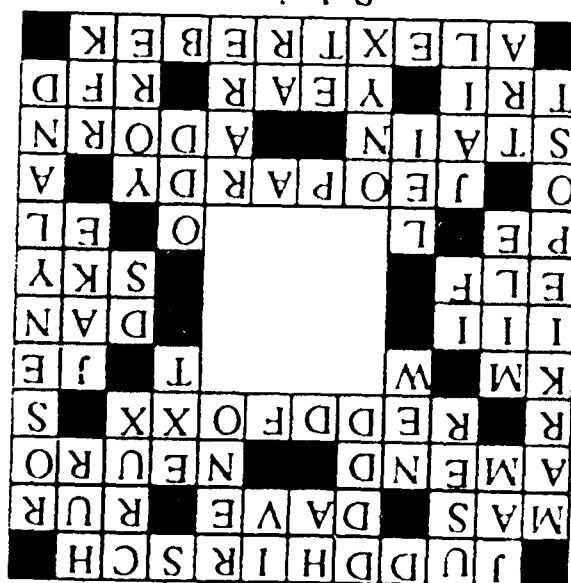

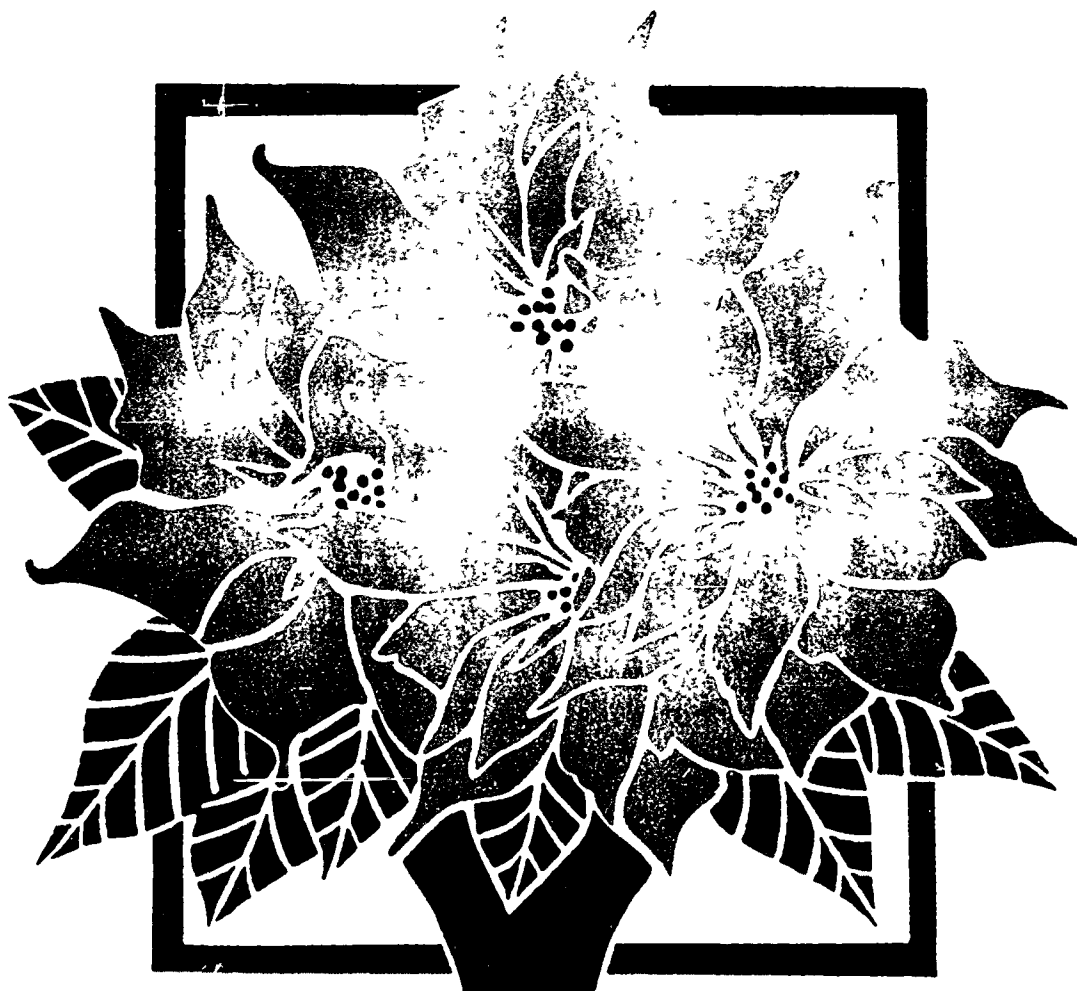
