Driver guilty of lesser charge

An Oakland County Circuit Court jury took less than seven hours Thursday to find former Novi resident Kenneth Loveday guilty of negligent homicide in the June 5 deaths of Yusuf Hanania and Albert Abdelnour.

Loveday, 20, had faced the more severe charges of involuntary manslaughter with a motor vehicle for striking the two joggers with his Jeep on Eight Mile Road.

Manslaughter with a motor vehicle is a felony punishable by up to 15 years in prison. The maximum charge for negligent homicide, a misdemeanor, is two years. Sentencing is set for Jan. 22.

The jury's lesser verdict drew cries of outrage from the dozen family members and several friends of the joggers gathered at Oakland County Circuit Court. Abdelnour's brother Basim stormed out of the courtroom saying "It's not fair," while Hanania's wife, Angela, and her mother began sobbing and screaming in the front row of spectators.

One family member screamed "murderer," while another collapsed and had to be led out of the courtroom.

Hanania, 38, was an engineer and vice president with Singh Development Corp. in Birmingham. His three children attend Northville schools.

Abdelnour, 44, owned the Meadow Pharmacy and Party Store in Farmington Hills.

The charge of negligent homicide involves "ordinary negligence," O'Brien told the jury Thursday. "Slight negligence is not a crime at all," he said.

Loveday said after the trial that he believed the verdict was fair. "It's what I expected," he said, before being told by his mother not to say anything else.

He was released on \$100,000 bond.

Relatives of the two dead men continued to protest the verdict Friday.

"I was very, very ashamed of our justice system yesterday," Basim Abdelnour said. "What does it take to get a manslaughter conviction? ... Does it take more than two people being murdered?"

Angela Hanania said she feared the sentence would send the wrong message to other drivers.

"That verdict yesterday sent a message out to every kid that smokes pot and drinks that if you drive and kill somebody, the maximum you'll get is six months to two years," she said. "That jury and judge sent a message out to the kids that they won't be prosecuted to the full extent of the law."

Other family members were equally disgusted with the jury's verdict.

"He didn't get what he deserved,"



Higher taxes may protect bonds

The city administration is pushing for a new deficit reduction plan that includes a 4.2-mill tax increase in response to a meeting Thursday with a team of fiscal analysts.

The city must adopt a specific plan before selling more than \$1 million in tax and state-shared revenue anticipation notes later this month. The notes are needed to cover deficits in the city's general and capital improvement funds.

Standard & Poor's analysts spent more than eight hours with city officials Thursday, reviewing the city's financial history and the three deficit

reduction proposals that had already been sent to the firm for its review.

Standard & Poor's rates a municipality's general credit-worthiness, and the ratings affect the municipality's ability to sell bonds to finance special projects.

The three existing proposals call for millage hikes of between 3 and 4 mills and layoffs in the police, public works and clerical departments, as well as a host of other budget cuts.

But City Manager Gary Word said the deficit reduction proposals may not go far enough for Standard & Poor's in preserving the city's current level of service and planning for the future.

He said another deficit reduction plan may meet with the bond rating firm's approval.

"They're not being very specific with us, but what I'd like to consider is a different deficit reduction plan that would go slightly up from 4 mills, to 4.2," he said.

Word wants to turn a special meeting scheduled for tonight, planned for adoption of one of the three proposals, into a public hearing into the new 4.2-mill plan.

Another meeting has been scheduled for tomorrow, Jan. 14, for actual adoption of the plan.

Ethics talk sparks challenges

During the early moments of last week's workshop on ethics and the Open Meetings Act, township attorney C. Gerald Hemming joked that he expected event organizer Betty Lennox to be the lone township official in attendance.

He was wrong. And any humorous edge the meeting may have had ended right there.

What was intended to be an informal meeting steadily evolved into perhaps the most serious affront to the township board in recent memory.

Appointees to various township boards and commissions joined with township employees, former appointees and would-be commission members — nearly two dozen in all — to wag a strict and oft-accusatory finger at the township's elected officials.

In his discussion of conflict of interest and the township's ethics policy, Hemming mentioned that the township board also serves as the community's ethics board. All alleged cases of impropriety would, in effect, be tried by the board.

And Hemming said the township is a pioneer in local government ethics policies.

"I think Northville Township has basically taken the lead in... adopt-

ing this ethics and conflict of interest policy," he said.

But when it comes to ethics and conflict of interest matters, appointed township officials said that their elected brethren may not be the best judge of character.

Beautification Commissioner Judy Jambor said community confidence in the board had sagged. Jambor suggested forming a board "who judges the Board of Trustees."

"I think it's very important (to designate) an objective outside group to sit in judgment," she said.

Zoning Board of Appeals member Robert Willerer questioned whether the township board actually could serve as a non-partisan ethics board.

"Wouldn't that in itself be a conflict of interest?" he asked.

And Beautification Commissioner Carol Graves Sassaman suggested that an elected group should not hold the title of an ethics committee.

"(Being an) elected official automatically puts you in a conflicting situation," she said.

Blunter still was planning commissioner and ZBA Chairperson Karen Baja, who questioned the ethics policy, as well as Lennox and the board's reasons for holding an ethics workshop.

Handyside takes new job with BFI

A Northville Township trustee has taken a top management job with Browning-Ferris Industries. Just months after heading township negotiations for a recycling agreement with BFI.

But his role as district manager for the Michigan Landfills District won't place Trustee Thomas Handyside in a conflicting position, Handyside said last week.

Asked if he anticipated any potential conflicts of interest between his professional career and his roles as township trustee and chairperson of the township's Water and Sewer Commission, Handyside said, "no."

"I don't know what foreseeable things could come up," he said. "Anything that may present a conflict... I would request to be allowed to abstain."

Handyside played a key part in negotiations between the township and BFI that led to an agreement for sewer capacity in exchange for free residential recycling. Handyside worked closely with BFI officials during that time, but said the dealings were strictly business.

"I feel I've been fair; there was no bias... in any of the negotiations," he said. "We got as much out of this thing as BFI did. We got some tremendous benefits."

Handyside, who started work for BFI Jan. 3, will be in charge of three

Michigan BFI landfills, but said the company's operating structure will connect him only "technically" to the township/BFI recycling agreement.

What about any future solid-waste discussions between the township and BFI?

"If collection comes up for bid in four years, I'm not involved in the hauling company (which he said operates separately from the landfill)," Handyside said. "The only place I could see any influence is if we were going to negotiate some kind of contract as opposed to a low bid."

Handyside said BFI approached him about the position in late 1991. He decided to take the job in mid-December, and said the move to the Arbor Hills base in Salem Township brought him closer to home, as well as earning "financial rewards."

BFI and the township currently are enjoined in a consent agreement to clean a contaminated site off Napier Road in Northville Township. The township last week opened bids on a sewer extension from the landfill site to Napier Road, and BFI may attempt to negotiate with township condominiums and multiple family dwellings for solid waste collections — which could accompany an agreement granting free recycling for those residences.

Ice rink plan arises at hearing

Is there an ice rink in Northville's future?

There just may be if Farmington Hills business person Robert Picard can fulfill his vision.

Picard, a former National Hockey League player who now owns a sport shop in Farmington Hills, is eyeing several sites in and around the Northville area in hopes of developing a four-surface ice rink.

The idea arose at last Wednesday's public hearing of the Northville Recreation Commission. The commission is currently updating its five-year master plan as required for state government grant application and is holding public hearings to get input from community members.

Northville Township resident Jim Davis, a business associate of Picard, approached the commission with the ice-rink plan, seeking to garner public support and to assess public interest in the proposed facility.

"Rob Picard has the plans and financial backers. What he'd like to see is maybe an association developed. He needs that commitment," Davis said.

"We're just trying to get the word out... Even if we had 200 kids or whatever interested in playing — just some kind of an indication," he added.

Several adult leagues have already expressed interest in a new area facility, Davis added.

Commission members are considering a suggestion to include a questionnaire regarding the proposed rink in their March mailing to residents.

Also discussed at the public hearing was the need for more open recreation time at public facilities and scheduling of publicly sponsored teen programs and special events. Commission member Bill Braund said he doubts the success of such sponsored youth programs because "drugs and booze always start coming... They're very hard to control."

But one resident in attendance took issue with Braund's opinion.

"For the kids age 14 or so to the high school senior, there is nothing in this town for them to do. Absolutely nothing," she said, adding that youth programs, if organized and supervised properly, are of great benefit to a community.

New Assistant Recreation Director John Powe agreed that youth programs can very well be successful, especially those set up to keep teens

interested.

"You just need to use your imagination. That is my job. To use my imagination and find out what they like. Certain things catch on... Kids become attached to a group. Some real positive things can go on," Powe said.

The commission also fielded questions and comments concerning undeveloped recreational land sites in the community, such as the 44-acre Northville Community Park site on Beck between Five Mile and Six Mile roads. Commission member Carol Rahimi responded to one resident's request for increased development by citing a need for more financial support from the community and on a state level as well.

"Yes, we have the land available for recreational use," Rahimi said. "But we need money and vision to develop that land."

Commission Member Ken Romine added that there is an ongoing effort to find funding alternatives for recreation programs and urged residents to bring their comments and suggestions before the commission. The next public hearing is scheduled for 7:30 tomorrow (Tuesday) night at the Northville Community Center, 303 W. Main.



Jury finds Jeep driver guilty of lesser charge in deaths

said Anwar George as he waited on customers Friday at Meadow Pharmacy. George is first cousin to Lalla Abdelnour, Albert's widow, who now runs the family business.

Assistant Prosecutor Roman Kalyiak was hampered from the start of Loveday's trial by Judge Francis X. O'Brien's refusal to admit evidence Kalyiak deemed crucial to his case.

O'Brien ruled that testimony regarding Loveday's prior drug use and driving habits could be "more prejudicial than probative."

The judge also ordered testimony regarding the remains of a marijuana cigarette, or "roach," found in Loveday's Jeep 20 days after the incident

stricken from the record, after defense attorney Jerry D'Avanzo protested that Northville City Det. David Fendele obtained the evidence during an illegal search. The detective never obtained a search warrant.

The judge also barred testimony from Brian Eschbach, a former friend and roommate of Loveday's, regarding Loveday's past driving habits. Eschbach had previously testified said he and Loveday had been involved in several "near misses" while driving and that the two would swerve towards oncoming traffic and pedestrians as a game.

"We've had a few close calls," Eschbach said at a preliminary examination at Plymouth's 35th District

Court.

Eschbach did testify at last week's trial, over objections by the defense, that he saw Loveday use marijuana while the two were living together.

Loveday also had a previous criminal history of drug involvement, a fact never revealed at the trial. He pleaded guilty to possession of more than five grams of marijuana at Plymouth's 35th District Court June 3, two days before the joggers were killed.

Loveday was charged with killing brothers-in-law Hanania of Novi and Abdelnour of Livonia at about 8 a.m. June 5. Loveday was driving west on Eight Mile just east of Beck Road when he struck the two joggers with

his Jeep Wrangler, instantly killing them both.

Loveday told police after the accident that he swerved to avoid an oncoming pickup truck, but other witnesses to the incident did not recall seeing any such vehicle.

The prosecution's case hinged on proving that Loveday demonstrated "gross negligence" in his driving, and that the gross negligence was responsible for the joggers' deaths.

"When you think about a case like this, the term 'senseless killing' comes to mind," Kalyiak said during his closing arguments. "This is a killing that could have been avoided."

Defense attorney Jerry D'Avanzo, who characterized the accident as "an unfortunate tragedy," argued

during his closing statement Tuesday, "This is fate and circumstance, ladies and gentlemen. Nobody could have planned this sort of thing happening in a hundred years."

The prosecution called 12 witnesses during the two-day trial, including Jeep passenger Michael Gibson. Gibson testified that he and Loveday smoked a marijuana cigarette about 15 minutes before the incident.

But D'Avanzo punched several holes in Gibson's testimony, ridiculing his claim that he attempted and then Loveday succeeded in rolling the cigarette while waiting at a traffic

light, and showing that Gibson never actually saw Loveday smoking the cigarette.

D'Avanzo also suggested that Gibson changed his original story 20 days after the incident, when faced with potential prosecution for possession of marijuana.

Both Gibson and drivers who witnessed the incident or its immediate aftermath agreed that Loveday was driving properly right up until he struck the joggers.

The defense rested without calling any witnesses of its own, and Loveday did not take the stand.

"I find this all to be open to interpretation by various attorneys (and could be) used to single out certain people," she said. "It's a selective process of control."

"The people governing are held in no checks and balances," she added. Members of the township board clearly were surprised by the tone of many of the appointees' comments.

Trustee Richard Allen defended the board as an honorable body.

"I think the people on this board bend over backwards to be ethical and honest," he said. "I think people think all politicians are dishonest."

Lennox also attempted to build faith in the board.

"We try very hard not to put

ourselves in the position where there is a potential conflict of interest," she said.

Township board members agreed that they could try one of their own if an ethics question arose. But when the board was asked why no one challenged former Supervisor Georgina Goss' free membership to Meadowbrook Country Club—a seeming clear violation of the ethics policy she voted to approve in 1990—the board said it had no knowledge of that situation before it was reported in this newspaper.

Some board members tried to pass the Goss/Meadowbrook situation off as overblown, but appointees were in no mood for that type of reasoning.

"Perception is the key," Jambor said. "You don't deviate from (the policy)."

Several audience members suggested that the ballot box was the ultimate place to judge the township board.

The idea of an independent ethics board gathered steam amongst the audience as the evening wore on. When board members asked if anyone would volunteer to serve on a committee to study the ethics policy, several hands jutted into the air.

Lennox eventually agreed to "consider talking about an ethics committee," but was vague on specifics.

On Friday, she said it was a "good idea" to review the policy, but made it clear that she and the township

board would control the appointment process for such a review group.

"I will make recommendations and hopefully the board will concur (on a committee)," she said.

day evening to Police Chief Chip Snider's proposal to implement a weighmaster program in Northville Township. Snider's plan likely would target overweight trucks—including trash haulers—traveling township roads.

But Handyside had qualms about the township's financial investment in the plan and wondered if the prog-

ram would place undue hardships on the trucking industry, which he said "built Michigan's roads."

"I feel trucks have the right to go up and down the road," he said. "But they have no right to be in non-conformance."

The township board later tabled the weighmaster program request. Despite the proximity of the Arbor Hills landfill, the numerous ties between the township, local politicians

—some of whom have accepted industry political action committee funds—and the recycling agreement.

Traffic stop yields cache of hubcaps

You're an Inkster resident, cruising through a Northville Township subdivision in the darkest, early morning hours, and your van — with expired license plates — is nearly overflowing with hubcaps.

Some things are tough to explain, especially to a police officer.

Such was the case for a 35-year-old Inkster man charged Jan. 7 with the theft of 47 hubcaps. Township police said the man allegedly stole hubcaps from vehicles in Northville Township, Plymouth, Plymouth Township, and Romulus.

The man faces larceny charges Jan. 28 at 35th District Court.

Police said Officer William Helke was on patrol

on southbound Northville Road just before 2 a.m. Jan. 7 when he noticed a suspicious 1984 Ford Econoline van parked on Jamestown Circle in the Kings Mill subdivision. Helke reportedly returned to the scene, but the van had left the area.

Police located the van at the Mobil Gas station at the corner of Northville Road and Seven Mile, and the driver of the vehicle then headed south on Northville.

A computer check revealed that the van's license plates had expired, and Helke attempted to pull the man over using first his patrol car's flashing lights and then its siren. The Inkster man continued a steady southerly course until he finally stopped on Starkweather near Dunn in Plymouth, police said.

Helke and Sgt. Raymond Garbarino approached the vehicle and Garbarino reportedly

discovered "a pile of hubcaps in plain view in the middle of the van," reports indicated. A large screwdriver also reportedly was located on the floorboard near the front of the van.

The man told police that the hubcaps were not his, but that he had not stolen the items. He later confessed that he had stolen the hubcaps, after police had arrested him on driving with a suspended license and improper license plate charges.

Police said hubcaps were stolen from at least four vehicles inside King's Mill. The owners then identified and retrieved the hubcaps. Computer checks also helped locate hubcap theft victims in Plymouth city and township and in Romulus, police said.





Ethics meeting response should clue in board

Last Wednesday's ethics and Open Meetings Act workshop surely served as a rude awakening for any township elected official who may have slept through the tumultuous past few months.

No longer could township board members shrug off complaints about their governing abilities as the jabbering of malcontents. No longer could perceived splinter groups — or those soaked in sour grapes — be brushed aside by board members. And no longer were individual board members claiming that a few misguided opponents were "parroting" the local press.


No, Wednesday's get-together was more ominous. Simply put, the brightest and the best of the township's appointed officials — those people who donate endless hours to serve on the planning commission, or zoning board of appeals, or beautification commission — told the board to get its act together. Or else.

The fact that these appointees and potential appointees took such a strong stance had to shock the board members. And maybe it will make them realize that the board inevitably answers to its constituency, and not the other way around.

The original intent of the workshop was to refresh appointees' memories to the township's ethics policy and the state Open Meetings Act, and to alert them to potential conflicts of interest. Instead, the intended audience turned the tables, basically telling the board to clean up its own back yard.

Some board members had to be troubled by the pointed comments offered by the appointees. After all, no one could dispute that those who attended the session were among the core of the politically moderate, intelligent, active, and professional wing of the township voting community. And it had to hurt that not a soul stood and offered blanket support to the board as it attempted to withstand tough questioning and biting commentary.

It didn't take observers long to realize that appointees — residents and taxpayers, really — want to play a more important role in the operation of township government. Significantly, many promoted the idea that the township should



establish an independent body to judge township board members who may stray from the ethical path.

Appointees also want to have input to the previously adopted, and now slightly altered, ethics policy. And they seem willing to roll up their sleeves and get to work on such a plan.

Both ideas are intriguing, and we would wholeheartedly support the study of such an independent ethics board and tougher, more inclusive ethics policy language. In fact, were financial times not so tight, we would ask that the township scrap its current ethics policy and start from the ground floor.

Here's why. The township's law firm pieced together the existing ethics policy, based on snippets of state law, ethics codes from other municipalities, etc. But the policy carries with it enough vague language to spring virtually any ethics code deviant. Let's face it, the document was drafted at the behest of township officials to fit their purposes, not to ensure that no one would ever stray from the straight and narrow.

We're also troubled by the fact that the township's law firm drew up the document. The firm itself falls under the guidelines of the ethics policy and should not be the architect that designed the document.

We urge the township to move ahead on a revamped ethics policy and possible formulation of an independent ethics board. Repeated questionable behavior by some members of the township board and other entities that should be answerable to the ethics policy are reason enough for further study.

Those township residents who attended the ethics meeting should be proud they stepped forward. In effect, they had seen enough and faced their bosses with an ultimatum. It couldn't have been an easy, or painless, decision.

Justice takes a hit in Oakland



After following Kenneth Loveday's manslaughter trial for six months, I can only shake my head at the state of Oakland County's judicial system as reflected by the court of the honorable Judge Francis X. O'Brien.

Leave aside for the moment the matter of whether Northville City's police department and the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office built a credible case against Loveday, charged with killing two joggers on Eight Mile Road last summer. Leave aside also whether Loveday was in fact guilty of manslaughter, as opposed to the lesser charge of negligent homicide of which he was convicted.

The most serious question raised by the case was whether the last week's events amounted to a legitimate trial or a travesty of justice.

Throughout the trial, Judge O'Brien seemed more intent on blocking testimony and badgering witnesses than getting to the truth.

For starters, the judge seemed unable to keep his mouth shut as he listened to the testimony of any witness involved with drugs. While trying to recall who had the rolling papers used to roll a marijuana cigarette, one witness was interrupted in mid-sentence by O'Brien, who snapped, "If you know who had them, young man, tell the prosecutor."

As another was describing the odor of marijuana, using words like "pine" and "pungent," the judge interrupted again, saying "What did it smell like... Did it smell like a Christmas Tree?"

"You could say that," the witness replied.
"No I can't, you're the one under oath," the judge shot back.

But the third witness's experience was the most humiliating. As he began to testify, the judge leaned over the bench toward him and demanded a precise history of the man's drug involvement, starting with when he first took drugs; continuing through the types of drugs he had taken, and concluding with how long the man had "totally abstained" from taking drugs. The witness was quickly reduced to tears.

Perhaps the judge's most disturbing trend from a legal standpoint was the way he downplayed the number of "hits" that Loveday and the Jeep's passenger, Michael Gibson, allegedly took off the marijuana cigarette before Loveday's Jeep drove into the joggers. While Gibson first testified that the two passed the joint back and forth "four or five" times, O'Brien referred to "three or four" hits the first time he recalled the testimony, and then talked of "two or three" hits when he next recalled it.

Defense Attorney Jerry D'Avanzo split the difference during his closing arguments, referring to the "three or four" hits the two men may or may not have taken.

Also galling was O'Brien's seeming inability to pronounce anyone's name in the trial. On Thursday, after two days of testimony regarding Loveday, O'Brien said, "All right, we call the case of People versus Lovejoy."

Victim Yusuf Hanania became Hanana under the judge's nimble tongue, while Albert Abdelnour became Abdelvic. Detective David Fendeleit, pronounced "Fondelay" by everyone except the judge throughout the trial, became "Fender-Lett" Thursday in the judge's mind.

If O'Brien can't even get the pronunciation of a defendant's or witness's name right, what else is he getting wrong?

In a scene that seemed to epitomize the phrase "falling down on the job," the judge tripped and fell to his knees on his way to the bench. "Shouldn't have had that extra drink," he said, as he climbed to his feet.

If the judge's comment was a joke, it was in extremely poor taste. If not, heaven help our judicial system.

Drinking wine in moderation benefits health

We don't watch TV often. However, if there was one time we wished we had the tube tuned to "60 Minutes," it was Sunday, Nov. 17.

We're assuming that like us, many of you were busy that evening and missed the "French Paradox" segment exploring the benefits of moderate wine and alcohol consumption.

A transcript of the topic reveals interviews with leading French and American researchers. Morley Safer highlighted the following points as possible reasons for the up to 40 percent lower incidence of coronary heart disease among the French, as compared to Americans:

- The French regularly eat three meals a day, consume more fresh foods and do not snack between meals.
- The French put more emphasis on food preparation and enjoyment.
- Alcohol, particularly red wine, is consumed in moderation as part of French midday and evening meals.

"Several things contribute to heart attacks," Safer commented. "Diet, of course, is one of them. So why is it that the French, who eat 30 percent more fat than we do, suffer fewer heart attacks, even though they smoke more and exercise less?"

"If you're a middle-aged American man, your chances of dying of a heart attack are three times greater than a Frenchman of the same age. It's obvious that the French are doing something right, something Americans are not doing."

A voice-over took the viewer to Lyon, the gastronomic capital of France. Food preparation in this city of 2,600 restaurants, 2,300 meat shops and 115 retail wine outlets would send the American Heart Association into cardiac arrest!

Dr. Astier-Dumas, a Parisian nutritionist and head of the Lyon Centre, believes that the difference is eating habits. "In the U.S. generally, people are going to eat something every two hours," he contends.

Safer comments that American nutritionists agree that dairy fat, including cheese, is a major enemy to a healthy heart. The annual French per capita consumption of cheese is 40 pounds. Does cheese deserve its bad reputation?

Dr. Serge Reynaud also from Lyon Centre has spent 15 years searching for an answer. He maintains milk is the culprit. "Surveys in different countries show a very, very strong relationship between the intake of milk and the mortality rate from heart disease; while for cheese, there's no relationship at all," Reynaud reports.

He has experimented with the relationship in rats and found that cheese-fed rats eliminated virtually all the dairy fat in their feces. Dissections determined that milk-fed rats' arteries

Pepper takes center stage in two familiar forms, and one relatively new one; all will still make you sneeze

Pepper is comin' right achoo

The familiar spice has taken on new colors

I speak severely to my boy, I beat him when he sneezes; for he can thoroughly enjoy the pepper when he pleases.

—Duchess' song, "Alice in Wonderland."

The Duchess' cook, thought Alice, used entirely too much pepper.

"When I'm a Duchess," Alice said (not in a very hopeful tone, though), "I won't have any pepper in the kitchen at all. Soup does very well without."

A modern-day Alice might feel very differently, for pepper in vast quantities pleases the modern palate. Americans, along with other Western peoples, have sharply increased their consumption of spices of all types, especially those that add a fiery taste to food, and they reach for the pepper shaker more than ever.

Americans import more than 31,576 metric tons of pepper. And this bit of data leads to one of those zany statistics without which an article of this type would not be complete. That was enough pepper to provide 1,578,780,000,000 sprinkles from heaven knows how many shakers.

However common it has become on our dinner tables, pepper remains a precious commodity.

The subject also remains highly confus-

ing. The word "pepper" has been given to a number of other spices, while true pepper itself has traditionally appeared in two guises, increased to three in recent years.

Here we are not going to consider the great family of the so-called chili peppers. New World natives that have now spread their incendiary influence all over the world. We are going to narrow the subject to the classic black pepper, its relatives and some pepper-like interlopers.

The tropical shrub *Piper nigrum* provides us with true pepper, and today we can enjoy it in three varieties:

- Black Pepper—by far the most common—is made from the berries of the Piper bush, picked while still green, allowed to cure in the sun, then dried. When whole, they are called peppercorns. Black pepper has both the hotness and the characteristic aromatic taste of the spice.

- White pepper is made by letting the Piper berries mature until they turn red and then removing the skin. This leaves the peppercorns a pale tan color. Much of the special flavor of the pepper is taken away along with the skins, but the hotness of the kernel remains. White pepper has little use except in light-colored dishes, where dark flecks of dark pepper would be unattractive.

- Green peppercorns are a more recent addition to the spice shelf. The immature berries are canned in water, brine or vine-

gar, or they can be freeze-dried. Green peppercorns bring a sharper, fresher version of the aromatic pepper flavor.

When the previously xenophobic French chefs began to accept new ingredients in the late '60s, they embraced green peppercorns with such enthusiasm that eventually you could hardly open the menu of a fancy restaurant without encountering this nouvelle spice. The fad has died back, but you still see such dishes now and again.

Leaving true pepper, we find several spices claiming a relationship:

- Pink peppercorns came in about the same time as green peppercorns but faded more rapidly from culinary fashion. These are not from the Piper plant but the berries of a subtropical shrub, said to be regarded as a nuisance in parts of Florida. The spice has a mildly peppery flavor and a sweet pungency. They are sold in brine and freeze-dried.

- Szechwan pepper arrived with the popularity of the spicier varieties of Chinese cooking. These dark red-brown seed pods don't look much like true pepper on close inspection, and, indeed, they come from a totally different plant—*Zanthoxylum armatum*. The spice is mildly hot, with its own character. It is used extensively in Chinese dishes, and Western chefs sometimes experiment with it.

- Jamaican pepper is another name for

allspice. This familiar spice isn't particularly peppery, but the Jamaicans call it "pimiento," after pimiento, the Spanish word for "pepper." The Spanish, for their part, call allspice pimiento de la India, "English pepper," and, to close the circle of confusion, "pimiento" also refers to a kind of sweet red pepper.

In any event, allspice is usually included among the "sweet spices," such as cinnamon and cloves. Occasionally, however, you will see the larger round berries of allspice mixed with true pepper in proprietary blends.

- Purchase and storing: Spices and herbs in general do not benefit from aging. The oils that give these products their flavors dissipate with time, so you are better off keeping only a few months' supply on hand.

Whole spices always retain their qualities longer than ground spices. After a few months, ground pepper becomes about as flavorful as so much sawdust.

The best green peppercorns are packed in water or brine. Once opened, the spice must be refrigerated and covered with liquid.

Those in water will last about a week, those in brine or vinegar about a month. They should be discarded when they turn dark. Green peppercorns in water or brine

Irish whiskey punch packs winter wallop

It is hard to believe that one year ago that I was taking a classical cooking class in Ireland.

There hasn't been a time that I've thought about the trip that I didn't have a desire to return. There was wonderful fresh salmon, considered the best in the world; great breakfasts with butter that tastes like butter should; homemade jams; thick rashers of bacon; and the best bread I've ever had.

Food was only a small part of the experience. The beautiful countryside and people make up the magnitude of our memories. The bed and breakfast route is almost a necessity unless you are willing to pay much more for fairly mediocre rooms. I realized the first night how spoiled we are when it comes to lodging in the states.

It was unseasonably cold on the Emerald Isle last January. They had not seen snow for years. Well, it never stopped. Obviously, with snow comes dampness and cold. When checking into a B & B, the proprietor's first duty is to stoke up the

furnace. The Irish are very used to living without central heat. It has just become popular over the last few years. There is no such thing as a storm window. The fierce wind whips through the uninsulated frames, further diminishing the room's comfort level. The first thing that came to mind was to take a hot shower, get into some warm clothes and curl up under an Irish woolen blanket.

No way. Yes, there was a shower. No, the water wasn't hot. I was devastated. Tired, cold, shivering and shivering, I tried crawling into bed, but that didn't work either. The wind screaming around the corners of the house was a psychological disaster. It was time to go check out some eateries. That would ease the pain.

We had landed 10 hours earlier and driven from Dublin to Limerick city. Luckily the plane had made an early morning stop in Shannon, and the famous airport bar, the home of Irish coffee, was open. The coffee was piping hot, the belt of booze warming, and the fresh whipped cream a de-

light. Too bad the layover time only allowed for one.

I noticed that many of the old-timers were slipping on a hot water beverage with lemon and cloves. As my stay went on I would learn more about this concoction.

Upon arrival in Dublin, we procured our rental car and set off for the adventure of a lifetime. The car was toy-like. Fuel is exorbitant (which is why there is little heat), so the cars are purposely runty. Driving is no minimal feat. The driver is on the opposite side of the car on the wrong side of the road. In other words, backwards.

There were some tense times those first few days. The roads are narrow; no super-highways here. When we made it to our destination, it was time to do some exploring.

On the recommendation of the owner of the B & B, we ended up in a restaurant

named "The Texas Steak-Out." We were dubious, but decided to give it a try. A big, crackling fireplace greeted us as we entered. We opted to have cocktails relaxing on a couch within the range of its warmth. Finally, heat. Things were looking up.

Then began the meal. There was nothing "Texas" about it except the portions. There was excellent seafood, great bread and wonderful service. It was a delight.

Then we were back to the fire for a nightcap. I inquired about the drink I had seen earlier at Shannon. "Hot whiskey punch," was the reply.

It is more popular even than Irish coffee. Every pub has a kettle going with boiling water and the garnish of lemon and cloves ready. I tried it. The "punch" became my extra sweater for the next 10 days. It was warming, great for the weather we'd been experiencing. It's simple and satisfying. Here is our recipe.

HOT WHISKEY PUNCH BRADY'S STYLE

- 2 cloves
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 measure of whiskey
- 1 slice of lemon

Warm a stemmed whiskey glass with very hot water. Pour in boiling water and sugar to taste. Stir to dissolve the sugar. Add a good measure of whiskey and a slice of lemon studded with the cloves. Relax and enjoy.

are superior to those in vinegar.

Freeze-dried green peppercorns are much more convenient and long-lasting but the flavor is not as good. ● Grinders: Feinschmeckers, who argue about almost everything in the culinary field, are as one in urging that black and white pepper be freshly ground.

The shaker should give way to the peppermill in both kitchen and dining room. Many types of peppermills are now on the market, and there are even pocket-sized models for the discriminating to carry with them.

The best type of mill allows the user to adjust the grind from fine to coarse.

In grinding pepper, don't turn the knob back and forth; turn in consistently in one direction or the other.

This most familiar of spices, often an accent, can play a main role.

Pepper appears in countless dishes, almost as ubiquitously as its traditional partner, salt. But there are some recipes that highlight the use of both true pepper and some of its namesakes.

One of the classic uses in the French kitchen is beefsteak coated with coarsely ground black pepper and then sauteed until done to taste. The dish is often flamed with brandy. The noted Provencal chef Roger Verge has used these flavors in a new way:

FILET OF BEEF WITH RAISIN AND PEPPER SAUCE

1/2 cup golden seedless raisins
1/2 cup Armagnac or brandy
1 1/2 pounds of beef filet, cut into steaks of desired thickness
2 tablespoons coarsely crushed black peppercorns (see note)
Salt
Butter, cooking oil
1/2 cup strong beef stock or bouillon

Yields 4 to 6 servings
Bring raisins to boil in water and simmer for about five minutes. Drain well, rinse in cold water and drain again. Place a small container with Armagnac and set aside.

Roll steaks in crushed peppercorns. Press peppercorns into meat so they will adhere. Sprinkle steaks lightly with salt.

Heat butter and cooking oil in a frying pan and saute steaks over medium heat until done to taste. Reserve.

Pour raisins and their soaking liquid into pan. Stand well back, because alcohol might flame up. Stir to release coagulated juices from pan. Add beef stock and reduce somewhat over brisk heat. Reduction has gone far enough when the sauce has pronounced flavor. If you wish to thicken sauce in Verge's manner, beat in 2 tablespoons butter a little at a time off heat.

Serve the steaks with the sauce. Verge accompanies this dish with fresh spinach, and fried potatoes would be excellent.

Note: To crush peppercorns, place a layer on paper towels and roll and pound with a rolling pin. Cracked peppercorns also are available in markets, but these are subject to loss of flavor as with ground pepper.

Chef Rene Verdon of Le Trianon in San Francisco came up with an elaborate chicken dish with a sauce of green and pink peppercorns. Here we simplify it a good deal.

CHICKEN WITH GREEN AND PINK PEPPERCORN SAUCE

1 roasting chicken
1 onion
1 carrot
Parsley
Herbs
Butter, cooking oil
1 cup cognac or brandy
1/4 teaspoon green peppercorns, drained if necessary
1/4 teaspoon pink peppercorns, drained if necessary
1 cup rich chicken stock
1/4 cup heavy cream
Salt to taste
Yields 4 to 8 servings, depending on the size of the chicken.
Preheat oven to 350 F.

Rinse chicken inside and out, removing packages of giblets. (The giblets and scraps from chicken can be used to make stock.) Stuff chicken with chopped onion and carrot, together with sprigs of fresh herbs, such as thyme, parsley and bay leaf. This stuffing is for flavoring; it is not to be eaten. Truss chicken and rub with mixture of softened butter and cooking oil.

This is the formula for determining the cooking time: Allow 45 minutes plus 7 minutes per pound.

A 4-pound chicken will thus take about an hour and 15 minutes. Chicken is done when the last juices drained from cavity are clear and no longer red. Remove chicken to a carving board.

While chicken is resting, make sauce: Heat 1/4 cup of cognac in small saucepan with pink and green peppercorns. Stand well back in case it flames up. Simmer until you can no longer detect alcohol fumes.

Pour fat from chicken roasting pan and pour in remaining cognac. Again, stand well back.

Use cognac to release coagulated juices from pan. If pan is heat-proof, place it over a flame as you do this. Otherwise, pour into another saucepan. Simmer cognac and chicken juices until somewhat thickened. Strain into cognac-peppercorn mixture and bring to simmer. Make sure that mixture no longer tastes of alcohol.

Add chicken stock and reduce slightly. Add cream, adjust seasoning. Carve chicken and serve with sauce.

Verdon advises a complex garnish of green beans, mushrooms, turnips and zucchini, any one or two of which would be a good choice. As a starch, serve steamed rice.

This rather less elaborate preparation exploits the affinity of pepper for poultry.

PEPPERED TURKEY LOAF

2 slices firm-textured white bread
2 large celery ribs, cut in chunks
1 large carrot, cut in chunks
1/2 medium green bell pepper
2 tablespoons minced onion
1 pound ground turkey
1 egg, beaten and 1 (8-ounce) can tomato sauce
Salt
1/2 to 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
Apricot Mustard Sauce (recipe follows.)

Yields 6 to 8 servings.
Preheat oven to 400 F.

In food processor, grind bread into fine crumbs. Reserve. Process celery, carrot and green pepper until finely chopped.

Place in mixing bowl with bread crumbs and minced onion. Add turkey, egg, tomato sauce, salt to taste and black pepper. Toss lightly just until mixed. (Excess working will result in dense texture.) Form mixture into an oval about 10 inches long and place in baking dish; or turn into 9-inch loaf pan. Bake until fully cooked, 50 to 60 minutes. Cool in pan 5 minutes before turning out to serve.

Apricot Mustard Sauce: In blender or food processor, place 1 (16-ounce) can of apricots, drained, 1 cup chicken broth, 2 tablespoons Dijon-style mustard, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper and 1/4 teaspoon paprika. Blend until smooth. Transfer to a saucepan and heat, stirring occasionally. Yields 2 1/2 cups.

Here are two ways of making pork chops:

PORK CHOPS WITH GREEN PEPPERCORNS

4 thick pork chops
Butter, oil
2 tablespoons minced onion
1 clove garlic, minced
1/2 cup dry white wine
1 sprig fresh thyme or large pinch dried
1/4 tablespoon green peppercorns, drained if necessary
Salt
1 tablespoon Dijon-style mustard

Yields 4 servings.

In a large frying pan with cover, brown chops in hot butter and oil. When browned on both sides, reserve chops and remove excess oil from pan. Sauté onion and garlic until tender but not brown. Return chops to pan.

Add white wine and thyme and bring to simmer. Cook, covered, until chops are done. Depending on thickness, this can take from 20 to 30 minutes or longer. Chops are done when they are no longer pink in center; cut into a chop to check.

Remove chops to hot platter and turn heat to high.

Reduce juices to about 1/2 their original volume.

Add green peppercorns, salt to taste and mustard, and simmer briefly.

Serve over chops.

PORK CHOPS WITH ALLSPICE

4 thick pork chops
Butter, oil
4 pinches ground allspice
Salt
Pepper
1/2 cup white wine
1/2 cup chicken stock
Yields 4 servings
Brown chops in hot butter and oil. Season each with pinch of allspice, salt and pepper. Add wine and stock to pan and cover. Simmer until chops are done, about 20 to 30 minutes, depending on thickness. Chops are done when they have lost all traces of pinkness. Remove chops from pan and quickly reduce juices until they are rich-tasting and somewhat thickened. Pour over chops.

Pepper occasionally gets into desserts. People sometimes sprinkle it, along with salt, on melons, and a grind of pepper is a surprisingly attractive addition to sliced, sugared strawberries.

Here's a traditional German cookie, especially appropriate during the holidays. This one of innumerable recipes for this specialty.

Ammonium carbonate, also called baker's ammonia, is an old leavening agent that gives a characteristic texture; it is available through pharmacies.

PFEFFERNUSSE (PEPPER NUTS)

1 cup butter
2 cups sugar
2 eggs
1 teaspoon crushed ammonium carbonate
1 tablespoon lukewarm water
3 cups sifted all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper (or more)
Powdered sugar
Yields about 50 cookies

Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in eggs one at a time. Soak ammonium carbonate in water until dissolved. Add ammonium water to creamed mixture.

Sift dry ingredients, including spices, together and stir into creamed mixture. Chill dough at least 30 minutes.

Preheat oven to 375 F.

Roll out dough to form four long ropes about one inch in diameter. Cut off 1/4-inch pieces. Roll each piece into a ball and place about one inch apart on greased cookie sheets.

Bake about eight minutes or until lightly brown.

Remove from pans to cool. When still slightly warm, roll in powdered sugar. Store tightly covered.

Szechwan pepper is often encountered in the following dip, often served in China to go with fried foods.

Barbara Tropp, the noted authority on this cuisine, suggests using it on hot buttered ears of corn.

ROASTED SZECHWAN PEPPER-SALT

Combine one part Szechwan peppercorns with two parts coarse salt (such as kosher salt). Stir in a dry frying pan or wok over moderate heat until mixture becomes fragrant, about five minutes. Peppercorns will smoke but do not let them scorch.

Grind mixture to a fine powder in a mortar and pestle or a food processor.

This mixture can be sprinkled on foods or used as a table dip—but use sparingly, for it is quite strong.

SZECHWAN PEPPER BEEF

1 1/2 pound tender beefsteak
2 sliced fresh ginger
1 1/2 tablespoons soy sauce
1 1/2 tablespoons hoisin sauce
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 teaspoon coarsely crushed Szechwan peppercorns
Vegetable oil
1 green pepper, cut into chunks
Yields 4 to 6 servings
Cut beef into slices one-sixteenth-inch thick, trimming away any fat or gristle. Finely chop ginger. Mix soy and hoisin sauces and use to marinate beef. Add salt, minced ginger and Szechwan pepper. Allow to stand for 30 minutes. Heat oil in a wok or large skillet. Quickly fry green pepper until crisp-tender. Reserve. Add marinated meat to pan, spreading slices out flat. Cook over brisk heat for two minutes, then turn the slices over for another minute. Add peppers and any remaining marinade. Stir-fry for 30 seconds. Turn onto a serving dish. Serve with steamed rice.

where clogged, while those of cheese-fed rats were clear.

OK, we get the message about cheese, but what about all the butter and cream the French consume in their food preparations?

"My explanation is, of course, the consumption of alcohol," maintains Reynaud. "It's well-documented that a moderate intake of alcohol prevents coronary heart disease by as much as 50 percent. There is no other drug as efficient as moderate intake of alcohol. By moderate, I mean a few glasses of wine per day."

Safer goes on to comment that consumption of wine per capita in France is higher than anywhere else in the world — this is principally red wine. U.S. consumption is among the lowest. In France, wine is part of every lunch and dinner.

If the U.S. is among the lowest consumers of red wine in the world, it is

among the highest victims of heart attack, about one million deaths annually. The section of the country that consumes the least wine is known by doctors as Stroke Alley; the so-called "Bible Belt," which ignores the admonition of St. Paul to Timothy, "Use a little wine for thy stomach's sake and thine other infirmities."

The evidence of the benefits of moderate consumption of alcohol continues to grow. As part of a continuing study, researchers at the Harvard School of Public Health studied 44,000 Americans between 40 and 75 years old and found that those who drank light to moderate amounts of alcohol had a 25-40 percent less chance of developing heart disease.

Remember, moderate is defined as two drinks a day — make it red wine. Enjoy its flavor with real cheese at lunch or dinner and stop snacking!

Corvette Sting Ray III surges ahead

The Chevrolet Corvette Sting Ray III concept car incorporates the best of past Corvettes while surging into the future.

Born at General Motors' Advanced Concept Center in California, Sting Ray III represents a substantial change from the already exotic Corvette platform. A coil-over-shock front suspension design replaces the transverse leaf spring version.

The design contemplates use of a sophisticated and powerful engine usually found in a Corvette. The gear-box is positioned between the rear wheels for more even weight distribution.

And Sting Ray III's stance is even more aggressive than a production Corvette. The wheelbase is nearly


seven inches longer, yet the overall length is two inches shorter.

Lower side sills ease entry and exit and passenger room is greater.

From the front, Sting Ray III's dramatically angled headlights point up the car's extraordinary styling. Even the color is different — dark black cherry.

Inside, there's more room and a cockpit-like area for the driver. Efforts at optimizing driver comfort include the outside armrest being on the seat rather than the door. The seat itself is fixed, but the pedals move with a memory for preset positions. The height of the center console can be adjusted.

Instruments are viewed over the steering wheel rather than through it.

Chevrolet will unveil Sizing, a concept Lumina all-purpose vehicle, at the Detroit auto show.


Presented as a future possibility for family transportation, Sizing has advanced convenience and flexibility. Special features include reversible seats, track seating, dual sunroofs, a sliding table with a TV and VCR, a credit-card-type ignition, hidden running boards and halo lighting.

Track seating allows the second and third row of seats to slide forward to provide storage space. Or the

seats can be removed for even more cargo room. Driver and passenger seats also have storage space underneath.

The second row of seats revolves 360 degrees so that rear passengers can use a table that slides along a track down the center of the van. The driver isn't disturbed by halo lighting around the perimeter of the passenger area.

Outside, Sizing has a rounded nose and a curved glass windshield. Running boards provide easy entrance and exit.

Nissan FEV: Future electric vehicle

Detroit will see the North American introduction of Nissan's new Future Electric Vehicle (FEV) at the North American International Auto Show.

The FEV is an urban family car that can be re-charged to 40 percent capacity in six minutes and 100 percent capacity in under 15 minutes, one-fifth to one-fourth the time of conventional systems.

The concept vehicle is a 2+2 coupe with sufficient range for normal daily urban usage. It has creature comforts and conveniences to which car buyers are accustomed, including ample interior and luggage space.

The FEV was specifically designed as an electric vehicle and features an aerodynamic design.

Powered by an advanced high torque electric motor, the coupe provides performance comparable to today's high mileage economy cars. It boasts a top speed of 81 mph and a cruising range of 100 miles at approximately 45 mph.

The FEV's advanced Super Quick Charging battery system, weighing only half as much as conventional electric car batteries, not only reduces re-charging time, but cuts vehicle weight and increases range.

Sound systems benefit from high-tech gadgets

Function follows form, they say.

Remember when an automobile sound system consisted of an analog AM radio and a monaural speaker? Life was simpler then, too.

Today's high-tech gimmickry allows a car sound system to play enough non-stop music for a day's driving, decipher your location, reveal existing local radio stations, baffle would-be thieves and convert your automobile into Carnegie Hall.

A car's stereo system can be as big a selling point as a multi-valve engine. The spillover: slashed prices on CD players; the development of affordable digital signal processors (DSP), and speakers boasting separate woofers and tweeters.

But whether you're a new-car buyer deciding whether to splurge on a factory audio system or own an older model but are unhappy with an obsolete sound system, be forewarned.

Choosing audio for your car is trickier than a home-bound system.

Why? Because the interior of a car is a far cry, acoustically, from an audio dealer's showroom — a rarified world of sound indeed.

The passenger compartment, for example, make variations in the musical spectrum different from what you hear at home. And the music fights for attention against wind, road and engine noise.

RADIO/TAPE PLAYERS

Not to belabor the past, but it wasn't so many years ago that most car/radio tape players offered only a single tone-control knob, which adjusted treble/bass (you still might have one).

Standard features now include digital tuning with presets — programmable buttons that allow you to lock in 12 to 30 radio stations — and station scan/seek buttons that give newcomers to any locale a chance to see what radio stations the area has to offer.

Tape players, meantime, although waning in popularity because of the affordability of in-dash CD players, boast standard features such as auto reverse and song selection scan.

Models favored by Consumer Reports magazine for ease of use and affordability include: Sony XR-7280; Pioneer KEH-5100GR, and Sherwood XR-2704.

COMPACT DISC PLAYERS

Supply-meeting-demand has made car stereo CD players available at in-dash tape player prices, averaging \$500, but often on sale for \$299.

A CD player doesn't have to be installed in-dash, either. Personal portable players can be inserted by hooking them up to a car radio's cassette tape player.

Many in-dash AM/FM cassette players have front panel jacks specifically made for use with portable CDs. Manufacturers include JVC, Panasonic, Profile, Proton, Radio Shack and Sansul.

Sony, in fact, says one-third of all CD portables are used this way. Portables are commonly available for less than \$300. They can even be plugged into a home stereo system.

If you don't want to fuss with discs and plastic boxes while driving, higher-end audiophiles are opting for multiple-disc changers, which mount in the trunk but are controlled by the in-dash receiver.

LOUDSPEAKERS

Those on a severe budget can greatly enhance their mobile sound systems by simply replacing their speakers, which come in oval, rectangular and round shapes, and various sizes (as measured by how many watts of power they can accommodate).

Your first order of business when considering new speakers is to determine how much amplification your in-dash receiver/amplifier pumps out. Also decipher how you will mount the speakers for the particular make and model of your automobile.

An example: Hatchbacks and wagons contain no trunk enclosures, per se, so you must settle for door or kick-panel mounting. Do your homework before you shop.

Top 6-by-9-inch speakers rated by Consumer Reports include: Jensen JXL693; Roadmaster RS 1990; Kenwood KFC-6982, and Polk Audio MM-6920. Stellar 5-inch performers: Polk Audio MM-3a; Radio Shack 12-1708; Pioneer Maxxdal TSA1390, and Boston Acoustics 757.

AMPLIFIERS

Increasing power in your stereo system will help overcome background road noise and preserve dynamic variances from soft to loud to make the music "live."

Add-on amplifiers amplify the signal as cleanly as possible, while adding an absolute minimum amount of distortion and noise.

Amplifiers usually pump out anywhere from 25-100 watts per channel, besting the job of any self-powered in-dash units.

DIGITAL SIGNAL PROCESSING

To repeat, automobiles are terrific places for sound because music reflects off the glass and is absorbed by the seats, not to mention ambient road noise.

That's where DSP comes in. Signal processors digitally delay sound waves for fractions of seconds, which results in broader "sound stages," thereby eliminating the need to lean into the middle of your car at every stop light to hear the best sound.

In fact, DSP units offer special effects or ambience programs, such as Hall Chamber, Church, Stadium, Jazz Club, Rock Concert, Disco and Live House. Just imagine Frank Sinatra in a DSP-induced disco.

Currently the rage among obsessed audiophiles, prices on DSP equipment will fall (now \$600-\$1,500) and new features will appear and signal processing will become as commonplace as AM/FM cassettes.

Stereo Review magazine lists three favorites: the Clarion DSP-959E, the Eclipse EGS-1001 and the Technics DS3000.

PHONE HOME



A new truck in the driveway?

Domestic automakers unveil new models, options, upgrades

Over the past few years, the light truck and van market has been the only real growth area that many manufacturers have had.

Sales of full-size pickups, compact trucks, sport utilities and minivans have been strong. Many people have found that the practicality and comfort of today's trucks make them near-ideal vehicles.

While most of the big changes in the import trucks were made during the past couple of years, 1992 is important for the changes domestic manufacturers are offering. New models, options and upgrades abound, making this an excellent time to consider parking a new truck in your driveway.

GENERAL MOTORS

The focus at General Motors has been to continue model development on the full-size trucks so that they all share styling and the full-frame construction of the current full-size pickup line. To that end, Chevy and GMC are introducing new-bodied Suburban, Blazer/Jimmy and Crew Cab versions.


In addition, the popular Chevrolet Lumina APV line (along with Pontiac Transport and Oldsmobile Silhouette) gets a big power boost when ordered with the new optional 3800 V6 engine and four-speed overdrive automatic transmission — a gain of 45 hp over the standard engine.

Additionally, Astro minivan and S-10/S15 pickup and utility vehicles will be available with a new 200-hp version of GM's 4.3-liter Vortec V6 engine.

Finally, the Olds Bravada gets a new balance-shaft in its 4.3 liter engine for smoother running.

CHRYSLER

The new utility vehicle replaces the aging Cherokee model and features more aerodynamic lines while keeping the visual familiarity of the previous model. Available with both four- or six-cylinder engines, the ZJ will come with driver's-side air bag and anti-lock brakes as standard.

Another significant change for Chrysler is the addition of integrated child safety seats in the Caravan/Voyager minivans. The fold-down, integrated safety seat is a first for the industry and will hold children up to 40 pounds. And for larger children, the seat is easily transformed into a booster for use with the minivan's standard rear shoulder harness.

FORD

■ **Ford Econoline** — The new full-size Econoline van is the first major revision of the vehicle in its 17 years

and reflects a \$1.2 billion commitment by Ford to modernize the vehicle.

Apart from the aero design of the exterior, the Econoline gets a new dashboard, flexible seating plan and comes with a choice of nine power plants. The new Econoline has more carlike features, softer ride and driver's side air bags.

Additionally, Ford has restyled its popular F-series trucks and the big Bronco. Each receives a new grille, new nose, new taillights and new interior.

■ **Mercury Villager** — Ford unveils the Villager, its all-new front wheel drive minivan built through a joint venture with Nissan. The Villager includes upscale features, a 3.0 liter, V6 engine and a four-speed electronic transaxle.

Alfa Romeo Proteo makes debut

Developed in 18 months by fully computerized design systems, the Alfa Romeo Proteo is slated to make its North American introduction in Detroit.


The Alfa Romeo concept car was conceived as a two-seater performance sports car.

A cross between a coupe and convertible, the Proteo was designed with a completely automatic system to remove the roof and store it out of sight. The hydraulic system is capable of reassembling the roof

automatically.

The vehicle has a transverse six-cylinder, 24-valve, naturally aspirated engine, with three-way catalytic converter and lambda sensor.

The Proteo's glass surface — the single roof/rear window and side window unit — was built with special Solectra solar control glass, cutting the solar energy transmitted inside the car to 40-42 percent, compared to 63 percent achieved through the use of normal tinted glass.

Pontiac's Salsa: Chameleon-like


Pontiac's Salsa, Pontiac's seventh concept car in as many years, will make its worldwide introduction in Detroit.

The concept car features chameleon-like transformations from an all-weather, five-seat hatchback to a five-seat convertible or a two-seat panel delivery.

The fluorescent orange concept vehicle measures 70 inches at front and rear tires and 155.6 inches front to back.

Salsa's glass treatment includes a bronze-colored windshield along with driver and front passenger windows that feature outside rearview mirrors mounted right on the glass. It also has dual-intensity neon stop, turn and tail lamps enclosed in black lenses.

The sliding cargo drawer and drop gate, which can be opened when the drawer is fully extended, makes for easy rear storage. The drawer slides in and out and can be latched on each tooth of its track to lock in a number of positions.

Mitsubishi meets changing needs

The Mitsubishi HSR-III concept car will be seen for the first time in North America at the North American International Auto Show in Detroit.

The concept car is third in a series by Mitsubishi, named HSR for Human Science Resource — an attempt to mold the needs of car drivers around the changes taking place in the environment.

Small is the underlying theme to the HSR-III. The overall dimensions are 4.14 meters long, 1.75 meters wide and 1.13 meters high. The wheelbase is 2.5 meters with a vehicle weight of 1100 kg. and seating for

two.

The HSR-III has gull-wing type doors, which open and close about hinges at the waist and door mirror sections. Designed for greater side-impact safety, the doors are shaped like and have characteristics similar to a rubber ball, proposing improved occupant and pedestrian safety.

The cockpit is absent of accelerator and brake pedals. Lever-type controls on the steering wheel replace the pedals, enabling the driver to operate the vehicle almost as if it were a motorcycle.

Toyota AVX-IV: Ultra-lightweight

The Toyota AVX-IV concept vehicle will be the highlight of a display focusing on the automobile and the environment.

The AVX-IV, making its North American introduction in Detroit, is an ultra-lightweight commuter designed to give high fuel economy without sacrificing driving performance and comfort.

It is powered by Toyota's experimental S-2 804 cc two-stroke engine. Aluminum, magnesium and other

lightweight materials are used extensively in AVX-IV's body.


Other features of the environmental exhibit include Toyota's chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) refrigerant recovery machine, designed to remove ozone-threatening CFCs from air conditioning systems before servicing and a new environmentally sound coolant, HFC-134a, which will be used in all new Toyota vehicles equipped with air conditioning by 1994.

“Against Her Will” Finds Matthau in top form

Slow start yields fascinating story

Multiple award-winner Walter Matthau is seen all too rarely on television, so it's good to report that his latest project for the small screen is as good as the last.

In 1990, Matthau starred in “The Incident,” playing small-town lawyer Harmon Cobb. Harry Morgan played irascible Judge Stoddard Bell and Susan Blakely co-starred as Harmon's daughter-in-law, Billie. “The Incident” was praised by critics and viewers alike and won the Emmy for Outstanding Dramatic Special. Brothers Michael and James Norell, who scripted the film, were honored with Christopher and Writers Guild awards.

Now, Harmon Cobb returns, when CBS presents “Against Her Will: An Incident in Baltimore” on Sunday, Jan. 19. Matthau reprises his role, as do Morgan and Blakely. Delbert Mann directs from a teleplay by the Norells.

In 1947, Harmon moves to Baltimore to take a position with Judge Bell, now retired.

Accompanying him are Billie (widowed in the last film) and his granddaughter, Nancy. Although grateful for the opportunity, Harmon soon finds the practice of civil law dull and unfulfilling. Then, by chance, he meets an anguished young man and learns of Marika. Five years previously, the young woman had voluntarily committed herself to a state hospital to be treated for depression. (A psychiatrist had advised the movie, since private care was unaffordable.) Trouble is, now they won't let her out. Her angry, devoted fiancée implores Harmon to free Marika from the asylum. But how?

Harmon's task is complicated because of Maryland's status as a commonwealth, which adheres to “sovereign immunity”; the state cannot be sued. An arduous search through history may reveal a precedent allowing him to bring suit, but he still will have to convince the jury Marika is “cured” or that the hospital is unfit.

The Norell brothers' skillful script balances intelligence with strong emotional resonance.

Harmon still grieves over his son's wartime death; his resentment when Billie starts dating comes as no surprise. The alternately warm and combative relationship between Harmon and crusty Judge Bell is fascinating, particularly as the judge's real reason for taking Harmon into his practice comes to light. When Harmon meets Marika in the refurbished coal bin that is her room at Walnut Hill, he is stunned by what he encounters: a place of ceaseless noise and palpable misery.

The acting in “Against Her Will” is first-rate. Matthau endows Cobb with a craggy nobility, making him a plain-spoken soldier for justice. Morgan is an endearing curmudgeon as Judge Bell and Susan Blakely fares well as Billie. Among supporting players, Barton Heyman is brilliant as Donald, another “patient” and Marika's devoted friend. Heyman's timid testimony is moving and powerful.

Viewers should be advised that “Against Her Will” starts slowly and seems unpromising. Once it catches fire, however (in a fine clash between Matthau and Morgan), the movie never stops and emerges as a vivid reminder of what television is capable of achieving.
