Working together

New 'proactive' group focuses on diversity

As the population profile of Northville takes on a new image, a handful of concerned residents are seeking members to help their newly formed group prevent racial discrimination and promote ethnic diversity and awareness.

Operating under the name ACORD, which stands for A Community Organization Recognizing Diversity, the 10 members are determined to take a proactive approach to promoting acceptance for ethnic diversity and preventing discrimination in a community that has traditionally been populated by middle- and upper-class white families.

Mary Ellen King, one of the founding members of ACORD, said the group — formed in late August — has recently drafted its mission statement, named officers, and adopted bylaws.

To gain support and membership, ACORD is holding its first general meeting at 7 p.m. Feb. 11 at 7 p.m. at Cooke Middle school. The meeting is open to the public and anyone interested is encouraged to attend.

ACORD hopes to become a resource group with representation in all facets of the community, King said.

Since its inception, the group has had several organizational meetings, but made its public debut at the Parent Education Workshop last Wednesday at Northville High school.

As part of the workshop, King said the group presented a panel discussion to parents, educating

them on changing demographics in the district and offering tips to prepare children for entering an ethnically and racially diverse world.

In addition, ACORD hopes to present diversity in a positive light by focusing on the benefits of living, working, and learning in a mixed culture environment.

"There aren't any major problems now in the community that deal with discrimination, but we are a proactive group that wants this thing in place before major problems arise," King said.

While the central focus of the group is promoting ethnic awareness, group members are ready to address recent reports of incidents involving ethnic slurs and racially motivated comments between students in Northville schools.

King and other members of the group recalled two separate incidents in which Korean and black students at the elementary level were teased or ridiculed by classmates because of differences in physical features, skin color, or ethnic characteristics.

"I talked to a mom who told me

her son was unhappy about the way he looked. He was pulling his hair out at night because he was being teased about the way he looked," she said.

Another incident involved a Korean child who had been playing her bedside for a "new face" because hers was different from the other kids and schoolmates were teasing her.

A black parent in the group said her two children had experienced "racially motivated teasing that was inappropriate."

For Connie Orr that was reason enough to get involved with ACORD.

"Those types of things are inappropriate," Orr said. "For me this is an opportunity to be part of a problem-solving, proactive group. I have a vested interest with my children in the district."

Racial discrimination, however, isn't the sole source of discrimination. Socio economic factors are also coming into play. Despite an increase in the number of minorities moving into Northville in the past decade, the 1990 census indicates there are 122 homes in the city valued at \$50,000 or less.

In contrast, 349 homes have a state equalized value of \$300,000 or more.

"My kids get it [discrimination] sometimes in the way they dress because of what they are or aren't wearing," said Al Qualman, another member of ACORD.

But the group views these incidents as symptoms of a potential problem. The members want to treat the symptom before it develops into the disease, a disease that has affected adjacent communities in recent months. Newspaper accounts of racial violence and recent reports from neighboring suburbs like Birmingham and West Bloomfield Township serve as warning signs for ACORD members and reiterate the need for their efforts.

"We are seeing it in surrounding communities and we don't want to be in the paper with those types of situations," said Tina Hwang, another member of ACORD. "We don't want to be known as that kind of community."

ACORD is a group dedicated to preserving harmony and unity while promoting and understanding diversity. As part of the group's strategic plan, monthly meetings with guest speakers, yearly conferences, and coordination with neighboring race and relations groups will all help ACORD's steering committee to foster a healthy multi-ethnic community.

City adds blue bags to pickup plan

The streets of Northville will soon be much more colorful — as long as residents take advantage of the city's soon-to-be-implemented curbside recycling plan.

Starting Feb. 10, six days later than originally planned, city residents with curbside collection service will be able to place their recyclable materials in special clear blue bags and set them out for collection at the curb.

The blue bags will not require the \$1.50 red stickers needed on curbside trash. But because curbside recycling is now being offered, residents will be required to place a red sticker on each bag of non-recyclable trash placed at the curb each week, rather than on just one bag as in January.

Under an interim agreement between the city and the waste hauling firm Painter & Ruthenberg, city dwellers needed only to put a red sticker on one of their bags of garbage each week. The agreement was a compromise between the city and the waste hauler, which had asked for a delay in the start of curbside recycling in order to use a state-of-the-art Material Resource and Recovery Facility (MRF) which was still under construction at the Arbor Hills landfill in Salem Township. The waste hauler agreed to subsidize part of the curbside refuse program in the meantime, and the savings were passed along to residents.

The silver lining in the system for residents is that they will now be able to reduce the amount of non-recyclable garbage by separating out their recyclables, and placing them in special blue bags. The waste hauler will collect the bags for free, and the blue bags of recycled material will be separated from non-recyclable trash at the Arbor Hills MRF.

Also, all recyclable materials except newspapers can be thrown into

one blue bag for later separation at the MRF. The recyclables that can be co-mingled include clear, green and brown glass, aluminum and tin cans, and clear and opaque plastic imprinted on the bottom with the number "1" or "2" inside the triangle-shaped recycling symbol. Newspapers must be placed in their own blue bag.

Each residence will soon receive a complimentary box of 25 blue recycling bags to kick off the new program. The boxes will also contain flyers explaining what can be recycled and what cannot, and how to prepare the material. They will be delivered to the doorsteps Monday and Tuesday of (this) week, and it may take into Wednesday," said Assessor Mark Christensen, who is coordinating the city's changing curbside collection service.

The curbside refuse and recycling program is part of the city's switch from a millage-based to a fee-based curbside collection system, and replaced a controversial \$16.30 monthly residential charge in 1991.

Residents are now charged a flat fee of \$4 each month on their bi-monthly water and sewer bills, and \$1.50 per bag of non-recyclable trash. With each household generating an estimated one or two bags of trash a week, or six a month, the total cost should be about \$13.

The \$1.50 red stickers are available from city hall and may also be purchased at Shopping Center Market at 425 N. Center St., Brookside Hardware at 1021 Novi Road, and the Good Time Party Store at 567 Seven Mile Road.

The city is still negotiating with area retailers to offer the blue bags for sale, but if retailers do not agree to sell the bags, the city will provide them. The cost of the initial 25 bags has been financed through the \$4 flat fee on residents' water and sewer bills.

The initial supply is expected to last between six months and a year.

Voters do the primary shuffle

Today's quiz — To vote in the March 17 presidential primary, Northville residents must:

A) Declare their party preference at least 30 days in advance of the primary;

B) Declare their preference only if they are a Democrat;

C) Register at the polls on the day of the primary;

D) Form a conga line and hop on one foot to the polls, chanting the name of their preferred candidate;

E) Just skip the whole thing, knowing the rules are impossible to interpret, or;

F) Simply pledge to vote against any incumbent politician in this year's primary and general elections.

If one thing is clear about this year's state presidential primary process, it's that confusion reigns.

State officials again flip-flopped on primary guidelines last week when Gov. John Engler urged Republican leaders to drop plans for forced party registration in the Republican primary.

If party leaders honor Engler's request, Republicans will offer an open primary, and those wishing to vote in the Republican primary do not have to indicate a party preference.

Those wanting to vote in the Democratic primary still must pledge their party allegiance by filing a party preference card with their local government office.

Democrats also can register for the

Meeting to discuss disagreement

The Northville City Council has agreed to a Feb. 10 joint meeting with the township board, to iron out "a fundamental difference" between the two municipalities' view of consolidating police services.

The dispute centers on whether both municipalities, or the city alone, would bear the brunt of layoffs in the event of a police department merger.

Mayor Chris Johnson outlined the issue during the Jan. 27 meeting at which the council agreed to the joint session, saying he first became aware of the dispute in recent discussions with Township Supervisor Betty Lennox.

"It seemed to me that we were operating under at least one important misconception, and that was whether the city was reacting to its most immediate financial need," Johnson said. "I've been assuming that we were looking at a merger of these functions, rather than the city going out of

business and contracting for the service [with the township]."

Johnson pointed out that the city and township had begun discussing a consolidation of police services long before the current fiscal crunch at city hall, where two full-time and four part-time police officers are already scheduled to be laid off as part of an overall deficit reduction plan.

The possibility of a jointly operated city-dispatching center was first raised during a joint city council/township board meeting between Sept. 19, 1990. City Police Chief Rod Cannon met several times with Chip Snyder, the township counterpart, and a joint committee was formed in November 1990 to explore the issue further.

A consolidation of police dispatching services was suggested, with the city's new dispatching console to be moved to township hall. But the estimated \$18,000 cost of the move has apparently derailed that plan.

Since then, the project has languished while both the city and township have undergone administrative upheavals.

"The topic of discussion on Feb. 10 is whether we're interested in a combination and what the parameters are," said Johnson.

He added that the city has recently received a letter from Plymouth City suggesting a four-community police service, covering the cities and townships of both Plymouth and Northville.

"If it would work between the city and township of Northville, it might work between the city and township of Plymouth as well."

But the question still exists whether a consolidation will work between the city and township of Northville. The Feb. 10 joint meeting, scheduled for 7:30 p.m. at township hall, may provide an answer.

Voters, clerks grapple with party preference rules

primary at the polling site on March 17.

Voters who already have registered as Republicans must change their designation by Feb. 18 to vote in the Democratic primary.

After Feb. 18, only those with no listed party preference may make a party declaration at the polls.

All of this, of course, is subject to change.

Continued haggling and posturing by state politicians over the primary have local officials reaching for the aspirin bottle. City and township clerks say residents are upset by the thought of declaring a party preference.

"We've taken a lot of abuse," said township Clerk Tom Cook. "(Residents) are saying that their party preference is nobody's business, especially not ours."

City Clerk Cathy Konrad agreed. "People don't understand it; they think their privacy is being invaded," she said.

Township officials took early steps to alert voters to since-changed state directives. The township sent instructions to voters and explained that they had to declare a party preference to vote in the March 17 primary.

Virtually all response received by

the township was negative, but some interesting statistics emerged. As of Friday, 3,569 Republicans had registered, compared to 1,370 Democrats, said township Voter Registration Clerk Jeri Moak.

No information was available on the number of township voters who indicated no party preference.

Although Republicans still far outnumber Democrats, the gap has narrowed.

"That's up a lot; there used to be about 200 Democrats," Cook said.

City officials did not have a Democrat/Republican registered-voter breakdown as of Friday, but Konrad said many city voters are not indicating a party preference.

Township officials are fretting that the confusion will extend right up to the day of the primary. They especially chafe at the idea of primary-day registration.

"Same day registration would be a nightmare here," Cook said. "We'd have to put a voter registration clerk at every precinct."

Cook said the township is not out to peek into the voting habits of its residents, despite comments to the contrary.

"We just want people to know how they can vote in the primary," he said. "All we're trying to do is follow what the law is."



Vacancies force cancellations

A shortage of planning commissioners has prompted the township to postpone Tuesday's scheduled review of a controversial Holloway Sand & Gravel project.

Planners were supposed to meet Feb. 4 to renew talks on Holloway's proposal to locate a gravel mining operation on 177 acres at the corner of Six Mile and Ridge roads.

But the township currently seats only five members on the seven-member commission, and officials want to put together a full board before wading further into the Holloway issue, said Carol Maise, township

planning and zoning administrator.

Holloway's proposal to develop a gravel mining operation and asphalt plant on the Six and Ridge tract has outraged some township residents, especially nearby homeowners. Holloway in December filed suit in Wayne County Circuit Court, charging the township with foot-dragging on its review process.

The township hopes to reschedule the Holloway review for March 10, Maise said, adding that the planner shortfall also has claimed the commission's Feb. 25 session.

Northville Township last year moved to drop its planning commission membership from nine to seven members, claiming at the time that

meetings would be more streamlined and quorum requirements would be more easily met.

Problems have cropped up almost continually since the end of November, when the appointments of three commissioners expired and two other planners resigned for personal reasons.

Commissioner Pat Wright was asked back, but declined another term, while Larry Sheehan and John Leinonen resigned their posts, though their terms had not yet expired.

Supervisor Betty Lennox sent Barbara O'Brien and Jerry Chisnell into an almost two-month limbo while she tinkered with the commission

roster. Chisnell eventually tendered his resignation, and the township board on Jan. 21 rejected O'Brien for a commission seat. The board also cast a negative vote against John Prentky, a Lennox nominee.

The juggling left the commission with five members, only three of whom carried planning experience.

Lennox said she hopes to round out the commission by appointing two additional planners at the board's February session.

It is not known if Lennox has targeted her new commission nominees. She did not return a reporter's telephone calls Friday.

Resolution sparks more speculation

Here comes a new round of speculation that Plymouth Township could be a new home for the Detroit Tigers.

That's because the word "stadium" appeared in a resolution before Plymouth Township trustees on Tuesday.

"Stadium" was included in a list of potential projects that a township building authority — created Tuesday by trustees — could pursue.

But township Finance Director Rosemary Harvey stressed that trustees passed a resolution last year saying they were against the building of such a stadium in the township.

"We're not interested in that kind of development in Plymouth Township," said Plymouth Township Supervisor Gerald Law. "The taxes that it would generate would not pay for the revenue it would produce."

Some have speculated that because the former St. John's seminary property at Five Mile and Sheldon is near major freeways — the property is up for sale by the Catholic Archdiocese of Detroit — it could be a prime site for a stadium.

But Law said "stadium" appears in the document accepted by trustees because it is stock language.

"This is pretty much standard language that is prepared for any building authority — it's probably language from the state statute," he said.

"It's definitely not a stadium," Harvey said.

"We don't have a building authority. If eventually we want to build anything, you have to have one in place," she added.

"We're still in a position that if we wanted to bond for the (new) fire station, we could also do that," Harvey said, adding creation of a building

authority allows the township to offer bonds to pay for equipment.

"I think the township board and the residents have indicated they should locate the stadium in Detroit if possible," Law said.

"We're not interested in big development. We've spent a lot of time developing zoning to create nice residential areas and small industrial parks."

"A stadium does not fit into the character of Plymouth Township," Law said.

Officials debate higher gas tax for state's roads

The Engler administration plans to sell bonds rather than raise fuel taxes to meet the state's share of road construction costs in the next six years.

"Now is a very good time for bonding. Interest rates are at an all-time low," said Patrick M. Nowak, director of the Michigan Department of Transportation.

Nowak told an audience in Farmington recently that his administration had saved a total of \$150 million in cost from a \$1.2-billion budget.

"We're going to plug the leaks before we turn on the faucet," he said. "But it doesn't mean we'll never have an increase in fuel revenue."

Gov. John Engler disappointed many local and outstate officials in his Jan. 21 state of the state address when he said "now is not the time" to raise fuel taxes. Michigan's tax was raised to 15 cents in 1983.

Engler left unanswered how the state will meet its 20-percent match of \$3.1 billion in new federal revenue over six years from a 5-cents extension of the fuel tax. State revenues have been flat and even declining for several years due to fuel efficiency.

Nowak, a former Oakland County commissioner and deputy county executive, declined to be specific about a bond issue, promising Engler himself would unveil the plan "in the next few weeks."

Nowak promised a total state-local construction program next year of \$490 million. "After that we'll see a 20-percent increase. The governor is determined to match every dollar," Nowak said.

Unlike past generations when Michigan got back 85 cents of every \$1 in fuel taxes it sent to Washington, now the state will get 90 cents and probably more, thanks to bipartisan work by its congressional delegation, he said.

Some "leaks" Nowak said he has plugged:

- One-fifth of all management positions. Previously, MDOT had one supervisor for every two workers. "A span of control should be much broader," he said, using an industry analogy.

- New management systems for pavement and bridges.

- New computer systems. "When I got to Lansing, I asked my computer some questions, and it gave me obsolete information."

- \$1 million in savings through more efficient salt delivery. "We went around the trucking regulations."

- \$20 million in new revenues by catching truckers who were evading taxes.

- Privatizing grass mowing at \$20 an acre instead of using state workers at \$50 an acre. "It doesn't sound like much, but we have 50,000 acres. That's a savings of \$1 million. I could tell you some real horror stories on maintenance."

In answer to audience questions, Nowak said:

- Work on the Haggerty Connector (between Farmington Hills and Novi) is being held up by "environmental and political problems. I can't do much about the political problems." The federal Environmental Protection Agency rejected a state plan to take a wetland in the Haggerty corridor in exchange for enhancing St. John's Marsh on Lake St. Clair. "We're still negotiating."

- Amtrak, the federal rail company, is planning a depot in Detroit's New Center area. "With Amtrak over-nighing its trains in Pontiac, there's a good possibility of commuter service. I was surprised to find Amtrak expects to be breaking a profit by the turn of the century."

Besides 9,550 miles of interstate highways and state trunklines, Nowak's department is responsible for the International, Mackinac Straits and Blue Water bridges, airport finance and many abandoned railroad lines.







You have to give state credit for creativity

What a unique and interesting way to circumvent the Headlee Amendment. Whether or not you agree with what the state administrators are doing with the I-275 bike path, you have to give them credit this time for creativity. Most of the state's previous attempts to turn over funding of state government programs to the local communities have been... well, a great deal less subtle than this.

State Transportation Planner Terry Eldred wrote a letter to the Oakland Parks and Recreation Commission recently, explaining that the Michigan Department of Transportation may close the bike path, or at least portions of it, because the state can no longer afford the \$35,000 in maintenance that path requires each year. Eldred cited low use of the path and the fact some sections are in need of resurfacing, as well as the currently poor economy, as some of the reasons for shutting the path down.

And of course it doesn't take very long for the idea that perhaps the local communities, through which the bike path runs, might want to pick up the cost of maintenance in order to keep it open.

Now, you may remember that the Headlee Amendment, tacked on to the state constitution in 1978, included a provision which barred the state from mandating spending programs for the local units of government unless it was also willing to pay the costs. Well, for years the state has by and large ignored that provision and only recently have the courts begun to enforce it.

So now, apparently, the state is taking the tack that if it just threatens to close the facility, perhaps the local communities will step forward voluntarily to pick up the tab.

We do not buy the state's poverty plea. There are some large holes in its argument. First, it is not clear how the state has determined that the path is underutilized. Access to the path is free. There is no one at the gates to count cyclists or pedestrians, so there is no way of determining the number of people who actually use the path. Some cyclists argue that the path is indeed well used.

And even if the state is suffering from the economic downturn to the point it must reconsider its upkeep of the path, it could simply pare back a bit. It could cut

the weeds along the path a little less often. Perhaps the resurfacing projects could be deferred until the economy recovers a bit.

Instead, the state is considering closing the path outright. But of course before it does, it wants to let the local communities know. And maybe they'll decide to pay the cost.

Back when the 30-mile bike path — which starts at I-96 and runs along I-275 nearly to Monroe — was built some 15 years ago, the state never envisioned that the local communities would eventually pick up the tab. The state does often construct paths and other recreational facilities with the thought in mind that the local communities will pay for them once they are complete, but in those cases the communities get a chance to decide whether they are willing to pay before the construction gets under way.

What really worries us is whether this is going to be a trend. It was not that long ago that the state sought, and won, voter approval of a bond issue to pay for the construction of new parks and recreation developments all across the state. Does the state plan, once these are done or a few more years down the road, to turn the upkeep of these facilities over to the local communities as well?

Obviously, we think the state should keep the path, and keep it open. Maybe maintenance will have to be curbed this year. Maybe it won't be as nice as in previous years. And maybe the resurfacing will have to be put off.

But then when the economy turns around, the communities won't be stuck with cost of the facility while the state runs off to create even more recreation facilities, which it will then feel compelled to turn over to the communities during the next downturn.

Chinese celebrate with food

Good fortune and long life are traditional wishes for practically everyone.

But in this case, they are the wishes that accompany the bountiful feast to celebrate Chinese New Year, fixed by lunar movement on Feb. 4 in the Year of the Monkey, 4690.

The Chinese lunar year has a month of 29 or 30 days. The 15th of the month was always a full moon. Twelve months totaled 357 days, making it somewhat less exact than the solar calendar. Accordingly, leap years were given an extra month to compensate. The western calendar has been used in China only since 1910.

According to the Chinese Zodiac, each successive year is named after one of 12 animals. In this order: rat, ox, tiger, rabbit, dragon, snake, horse, sheep (or goat), monkey, rooster, dog, boar (or pig). The Chinese believe that the year a person is born influences personality.

Feb. 4 ushers in the year of the monkey. Chinese astrology describes people born under this sign as achievers, with cleverness, intelligence and even genius. According to Shen Yu, proprietor of New Peking restaurant in Garden City, "Chinese people regard the monkey as smart. In this year, people should follow the monkey's lead and develop ingenious ideas to make money."

The celebration feast exemplifies the rich heritage of Chinese cuisine, with nuances of preparation and taste based on a creative blending of religion, custom and mythology.

The Chinese regard eating as a spiritual event, and the creation of a feast nothing less than a work of art. At no time of year is this art practiced more perfectly than during the lunar new year celebration, a customary time of renewal when the Chinese reaffirm the importance of family, tie up loose ends and begin new projects.

All members of the family, old and young, are seated at the table to partake of the sumptuous reunion feast made up of all the delicacies the family purse can afford.

Ordinary dishes are often re-named with lavish new names meant to bestow blessings of luck, long life and prosperity.

Delicate names are often used in naming food, and this tradition is complemented by the symbolic meanings of individual ingredients.

Mushrooms mean opportunity and happiness. Eggs symbolize life and the numerous seeds of the pomegranate, many children. Chicken is the symbol of rebirth. Shrimp is joy and fish means abundance and plenty. Onions and heads of lettuce are produce bursting forth from the earth and portend new beginnings.

Tangerines wish good luck, their succulent juice symbolic of continued sweetness in life. Tangerines, complete with leaves intact, are hidden in the beds of children, wishing them, "the sweetest issue of life," according to mythology, the sweetest of blessings and the best of good luck.

Food preparation also carries meaning. Meat, fish and poultry are called into balls to symbolize har-

CRABMEAT RANGOON APPETIZER

(New Peking Restaurant)

1 pkg. wonton wrappers
8 oz. cream cheese (softened)
¼ pound finely chopped crabmeat

¼ teaspoon garlic powder
¼ teaspoon white pepper
¼ bunch chopped green onions

Mix all ingredients together. Place a generous teaspoon of the mixture on a wonton wrapper and seal in any shape. Deep fry in vegetable oil until golden. Serve hot.

HOT AND SOUR SOUP (Mon Jin Lau Restaurant)

¼ cup tiger lilies
2 dried black mushrooms
¼ cup wood ears
boiling water

¼ cup lean pork
¼ cup bamboo shoots
¼ teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon cornstarch
2 tablespoons oil
6 cups chicken stock

2 tablespoons light soy sauce
¼ teaspoon pepper
3 tablespoons vinegar

2 tablespoons cornstarch, dissolved in ¼ cup water

2 pieces fresh bean curd, cut in strips

2 beaten eggs
1 tablespoon sesame oil
2 scallions, cut in 1-inch pieces

Put mushrooms in stainless steel bowl, cover with boiling water and let soak 3-4 hours or overnight. Remove stems and woody parts from mushrooms. Finely julienne

mushrooms, pork and bamboo shoots and held separately.

In a bowl, mix pork with salt and cornstarch. Heat wok to 375 degrees Fahrenheit, lightly drizzle in oil and stir-fry pork until the color changes. Bring chicken stock to a boil, add mushrooms, pork and bamboo shoots. Stir constantly. Add soy sauce, pepper and vinegar. Chicken with dissolved cornstarch, stirring constantly over moderate heat. Add bean curd and bring to a boil.

Turn off heat, add beaten eggs and stir quickly for 30 seconds. Add sesame oil. Remove to soup dishes and garnish with scallions.

SHITAKE MUSHROOMS WITH SNOW PEAPODS AND OYSTER SAUCE

(Mon Jin Lau Restaurant)

¼ pound Shitake mushrooms
8 oz. snow pea pods
1½ tablespoons oil

1 tablespoon Mirin or rice wine
¼ teaspoon light soy sauce
2-3 tablespoons oyster flavored sauce

¼ cup beef or chicken stock
¼ teaspoon sugar
1 teaspoon cornstarch

3 tablespoons water
¼ teaspoon salt

Rinse mushrooms and trim stems if woody. Cut into 1-inch pieces. Stem, string and blanch snow peas. Transfer to serving platter. Combine cornstarch, sugar, salt, soy sauce, oyster sauce and water. Heat skillet or wok to high heat, add oil and saute mushrooms with Mirin or rice wine, for 1-2 minutes until mushrooms are tender. Then add stock and bring to a boil. Add cornstarch mixture, thicken and remove from the heat.

Pour mushroom mixture over snow peas and serve. Serves four.

mony, much like the meaning of the round wedding ring.

The origins of Chinese feasts stem from the 12th Century B.C., with banquet guidelines evolving from feasts of the fourth century A.D.

A typical royal banquet menu during the 18th Century Ming Dynasty commonly featured 26 courses, including rarified summer sparrow, braised silver scales and deer smothered in five spices. Dishes carried such tempting names as Floating Bud in the Lake, Petals on a Moonlit Pond and Heavenly Fair.

Today, Chinese banquets such as the one honoring the new year are much simpler. The 16 appetizers of yesteryear are down to half a dozen now, followed by even fewer entrees that are likely stir-fried. At least one appetizer is cold, and often one will be vegetarian in traditional Buddhist atonement.

Entrees are followed by several heavy dishes, braised or red-cooked Peking duck, steamed chicken, or suckling pig served in a heavy sauce. An elaborate soup nearly always ac-

companies the meal, as does wine and grain spirits. The meal concludes with tea and dessert, once eschewed as inappropriate.

Soy sauce is used in virtually every dish the Chinese prepare, with the exception of sweets, and it frequently appears as a condiment at the table. The product, the residue of fermented soy beans, can be traced back many centuries where it was developed to add flavor to a mostly bland diet of rice and vegetables.

In addition to a salty depth of flavor, soy sauce contributes a little protein (about 7 percent) and some "friendly" bacteria (like those in yogurt) to aid digestion.

To make soy sauce, the manufacturer mixes ground, roasted beans with roasted grain, usually wheat. This is allowed to ferment for a while before being augmented with brine, yeast and a lactobacillus starter. The mash may be fermented for a year or two before being strained and bottled.

There are two varieties of soy sauce available. The light soy is most



familiar to Westerners, who are used to seeing it as a condiment at restaurants. Dark soy has been blended with molasses for a thicker texture and darker color.

Not all soy sauces on the American market are true fermented products. The La Choy brand, for example, is made by the process of hydrolyzation. Purists object to the use of the ersatz

soy sauces, but they're useful for those allergic to fermented foods.

Japanese (or shoyu) soy sauce is comparable to a light Chinese soy, but the flavor is somewhat different due to a higher proportion of wheat in the blend. They are interchangeable, and you may find the difference in taste appealing. The Kikkoman brand, made in Wisconsin, is the

most widely distributed shoyu here.

Tamari soy sauce often sells for high prices in health food stores. If authentic, it is a dark soy made without wheat. There seems little objective reason to buy it unless you have an aversion to wheat.

Chef Mary Brady

Express yourself with this bracing brew



Yea!!! The espresso machine arrived today. It was ordered in the beginning of December and was due to arrive for the holidays. No such luck.

Everyone and their brother had the same idea. Of course, nothing is easy. As with many other things in this business it required a lot of planning. A 220 plug had to be installed, shelving in the side station rearranged, demitasse menus developed. But now we are ready to go.

The reason for acquiring an espresso machine was simple. Requests for this exquisite

beverage were numerous. In addition to espresso, we have the capabilities to prepare cappuccino, cafe au lait and "espresso-choc."

The word espresso is from an Italian word meaning fast. It is a rich, full-bodied drink. Because it delivers a powerful burst of flavor a first timer will love it or hate it. There is no in between.

Because of the large amount of coffee used espresso is very potent. A twist of lemon peel and a cube of raw sugar help to eliminate the bitterness if you prefer. I like it straight from the pot.

Espresso is made by quickly forcing hot water and steam through finely ground and firmly compressed coffee bean granules. Today there are modern machines that accomplish this. However the two-tiered moka pot has been around for hundreds of years and can be used anywhere there is sufficient

heat. It demands much more attention than the electric machines.

At the end of the 19th century the demand for bigger and better machines increased. Luigi Bezzer was the first producer of commercial machinery. His espresso maker, introduced in 1906, could produce unlimited amounts of the coffee. He was forced to sell the patent and the purchaser began to mass produce the machines in 1910.

In 1935 the first automatic machine was introduced. One of today's most popular brands, the Gaggia, was first made in 1945. Modern machines allow more control of temperature and reduce the risk of burning.

A most important component of espresso is the bean. Dark roasts are preferred. Freshness is imperative. There are many levels of "roast." Full City, French and Italian are the best. The most desired beans are those that

are ground immediately after roasting and used at that moment to make coffee. With all of the little coffee shops sprouting up it is relatively easy to find fresh roasted beans.

Beans should be stored in airtight containers out of direct light and heat. Brewed coffee should be available for tasting. If in doubt about the beans ask to sample one. Fresh beans are brittle and break apart when bitten into. Stale beans are rubbery.

There are numerous types of espresso beans, and mixing and matching is permissible. Costa Rican, Colombian, Guatemalan and Kenyan are some examples. The latter two should be limited to 15 to 20 percent of the total blend because of their full flavor. Prepackaged beans in an airtight bag and ground to order are acceptable. Freshness means better flavor.

The grind is also important. Fine, fine,

finer is the rule. Equally important is to keep your equipment spotlessly clean.

Cappuccino is a traditional combination of one-third espresso, one-third hot milk and topped with one-third foam (not whipped cream). Cafe au lait is a French breakfast coffee that combines equal parts strong, robust coffee and steamed milk. Espresso is a blend of espresso, hot chocolate and steamed milk. All are absolutely delicious.


A dash of Kahula, Grand Marnier or rum adds to the fun. If you have never experimented with the espresso coffees do so. Be open-minded. They are great for a quick afternoon pick-me-up or for sipping while relaxing. Enjoy.

'Billy' gets a green light from ABC

Connolly starts fresh in new series

When "Head of the Class" needed a substitute for Howard Hesseman in its final season, producers Michael Elias and Rich Eustis hired Scotsman Billy Connolly to mentor the misfits of academe.

At the time, Connolly was gaining a national reputation as a funny but foul-mouthed stand-up comedian, but fortunately for Elias and Eustis, he was much more — an experienced musician, writer and comic actor with credits stretching from the Scottish Opera to the West End. When "Class" ended its run last spring, the producers dismissed their younger stars and hung on to Connolly.

And so "Billy" landed on cat feet in the ABC Friday-night schedule two weeks ago, marking the start of a particularly strong-looking spring season for the network. With some fanfare but very little hype, the series slipped unpretentiously into the schedule.

It is the kind of series that belies

the desperate notion that there is a "formula" for success in situation comedy. The premise, about a marriage of convenience between a struggling single mom and a college professor in need of a green card, is contrived, unoriginal and even illegal. None of that mattered to its test audiences, nor does it matter on the home screen.

Everything about "Billy" looks "broken in" and comfortable. The cast looks at home on the set, the set isn't a distraction and the story lines jump right into the middle of the family's life, without self-conscious exposition. Add to this Connolly's occasional ad libs, and "Billy" has an unforced spontaneity that's truly lifelike.

"The qualities that are written for me in the show just suit me lovely," says Connolly in his native burr. Though his character, Billy MacGregor, is technically married to divorcee Mary Springer (daytime drama veteran Marie Marshall), she considers him a boarder. Her children, a teenage boy (Johnny Galecki) and two younger girls (Clara Bryant and Natanya Ross), accept him as a sort of black-sheep uncle. Connolly especially likes the give-and-take between his character

and Galecki's 14-year-old David.

"I like the way MacGregor handles the situations, especially with David. Little kids are easier to get along with, but you can't pull the wool over his eyes at all. So that's a bit I really enjoy."

The head of an off-screen household that includes five children between 2 and 20, Connolly downplays his experience at parenting.

"I'm not one of those guys you see in commercials fawning fatherly on their children. But I'm a pretty good monster from time to time; you know, growling behind you up the stairs and all that."

"I have a kind of Victorian side, (too), and I say, 'Where are you going? Where have you been?'"

As for the expletives, he's managed to delete them from his television persona because, he says, he accepts the "parameters" of the medium.

"In the last episode we did, there was a big ad lib where I'm speaking to people who want to be citizens of America. And when I came off, Rich Eustis said, 'That was 16 minutes and three seconds and you didn't swear once!'"

Peterson back as U.S. hockey coach

When the subject is modern history, the question is, "Where were you when Kennedy was shot in 1963?"

When the subject is space exploration, the question is, "Where were you when Neil Armstrong stepped foot on the moon in 1969?"

And, when the subject is great Olympic moments, the question is, "Where were you when the United States hockey team won the gold medal in 1980?"

America's storybook victories over Yugoslavia and the Soviet Union against overwhelming odds in 1980 raised the country's spirits during the hostage crisis in Iran. But they also

raised expectations for the future that have dogged American Olympic teams that followed. A second consecutive seventh-place finish in 1988 had the media looking for a scapegoat, and they finally settled on coach Dave Peterson.

Criticism of the three-time coach of the U.S. hockey team became so harsh during the 1988 Games that even Peterson was surprised when he was selected to coach this year's team in Albertville, France. His experience with the media four years ago has caused him to be cautious when talking to reporters, but he insists that it didn't leave him bitter.

"A lot of people have the idea that 1988 was a bad experience, but it really wasn't," Peterson said. "They're surprised to learn that it was one of the greatest experiences of my life."

Diminutive actor stars in tall tale

"Quite often when I work, I am the special effect," says 3-foot, 7-inch actor Michael Anderson, who won fame as the Red Dwarf in *Twin Peaks* dream sequences.

Anderson, who was born and raised in Denver, says he did not pay special attention to his size until he was an adult. "I grew up in a wheelchair. I had a genetic bone disorder (that caused) over 300 broken bones before I was 25. So I didn't really realize the fact that I was a little person. It wasn't the biggest obstacle at hand."

After a decade on the road earning his living as a street musician, Anderson entered technical school, eventually working on NASA computer systems. *Little Mike*, a film documentary about his work on the space shuttle, won international awards.

The two talents Anderson demonstrated in *Twin Peaks* — speaking backward and dancing — were picked up along the way as well, the former in high school, the latter in New York discos. Anderson will reprise the role in David Lynch's film *Fire Walk With Me*, which is due out this spring.

Also this spring, Anderson will appear on PBS' *American Playhouse* in *Fool's Fire*, an adaptation of an Edgar Allen Poe short story.

Winter Olympics: CBS has it covered

Roughly 1,500 of the world's best amateur athletes will gather in Albertville, France, for the 1992 Winter Olympic Games, which begin on Saturday, Feb. 8. Following them will be hundreds more reporters, many with radio and television production crews in tow.


CBS, which has not covered a Winter Olympics since Squaw Valley in 1960, has dispatched an army of news and sports personnel to cover these Games, offering 116 hours of coverage over 17 days. The network has sold an additional 50 hours of weekday coverage to TNT, marking the first time an Olympics has been carried on cable TV.

Anchoring CBS' prime-time coverage of the Games are Paula Zahn and Tim McCarver. Highlights of the evening coverage will include a pre-Olympics special on Thursday, Feb. 6, the opening ceremonies on Saturday, Feb. 8, a variety of skiing and skating events, including pairs figure skating

on Tuesday, Feb. 11, and ice dancing finals on Monday, Feb. 17.

Coverage begins each weekday during the *CBS Morning News*, with Harry Smith and Greg Gumbel at the International Broadcast Center in Moutiers, France. Live events during these hours will include ice hockey, alpine skiing, speed skating and biathlon. In addition, half-hour wrap-up shows will air each weekday at noon (Eastern time) and once again after the late news. Correspondent Pat O'Brien anchors the late-night show, while announcer James Brown holds forth at midday.

Reporting and feature stories will be done by CBS stalwarts Mike Wallace and Morley Safer, Charles Kuralt and Charles Osgood, Andy Rooney, John Madden and former Olympic gold medalist Scott Hamilton. Their stories range from the sublime (French cuisine) to the insidious (the doping of athletes) and include dozens of athlete profiles, plus stories of tragedy and triumph in Games past. ©TV Listing Inc.




