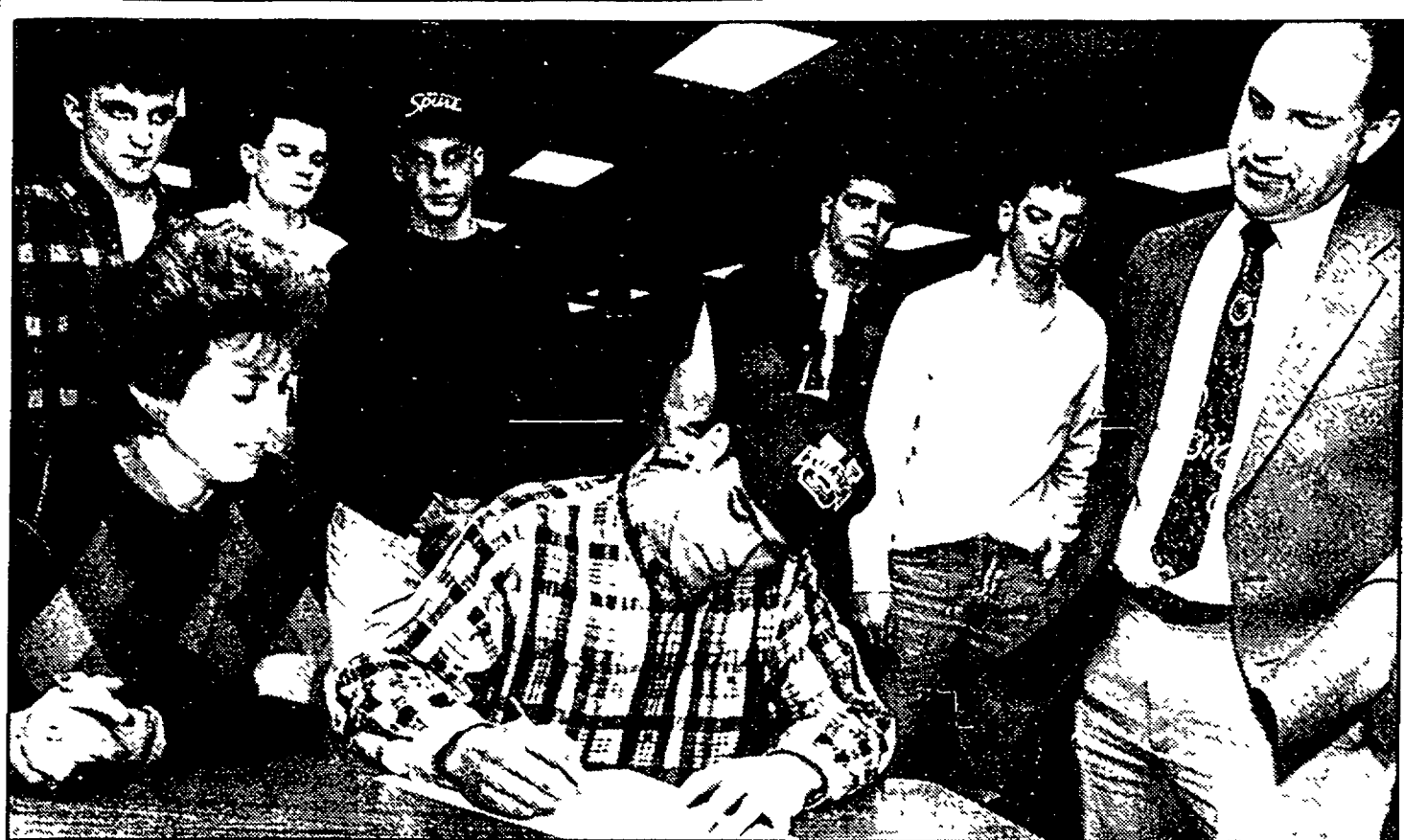

## Residents protest Randolph plan

Randolph Street and Potomac Road residents turned out in droves at last Tuesday's planning commission meeting to announce their opposition to a proposed rezoning at Northville Green apartments.

Northville Green owner Sheldon Gordon is seeking to rezone an acre of land off Randolph Street to allow the construction of a new eight-unit apartment building and adjoining 26 car parking lot just southeast of the present apartment complex.

Rezoning of the land from single-family to multi-family residential would allow its reuse as part of a larger parcel that would contain the new apartment complex. Renters would get to the complex off the existing drive into Northville Green.

Another piece of land would be developed as a single-family home, he said. Several acres of sloped land would be preserved as a conservation area, he added.

"The alternative we had looked at was building a drive over this property and developing... four or five single-family lots. Of course, that would use up a lot more land," Gordon said.

More than 30 neighborhood residents turned out for Tuesday's public hearing on the proposal,

and many voiced objections to it. Several noted the fact that it runs counter to the planning commission's own Master Plan, which calls for the land in question to remain single-family. Gordon pointed out that the entire area is currently a mix of single-family homes and duplexes.

Randolph Street resident James Larosa waved a petition opposed to the rezoning signed by "everyone on Randolph, and as many people on Potomac as I could reach," he said. But after handing the petition in to city officials, he took it back.

"There's enough apartments and multiple buildings in the city," he said. "This is a historic area and we want to leave it that way."

Fellow resident Tom Walsh added, "I would just like to remind the commission that a survey was done several years ago and 88 percent said they don't want more apartments in the city."

Added Randolph Street homeowner Barbara Raub, "I don't think I want to have a 26 car parking lot behind my home."

Despite the protest, the planning commission voted 5-2 to recommend that the city council approve the rezoning. Commissioners were swayed by Gordon's promise to preserve much of the area as conservation land.

"Here we have a developer who... has offered a

conservation easement, essentially taking a large piece of land and setting it aside to prevent future development," said Commissioner Steven Ball.

But Planning Consultant Donald Wortman, who recommended that the rezoning be denied, was quick to warn the commission that such a promise could not be made part of the rezoning approval. Wortman's recommendation against approval was based on the possibility of a negative impact on other Randolph Street residences, its inconsistency with the Master Plan, and the fact that there have been no "major changes in surrounding conditions which would warrant a change of zoning."

Commissioner David Mielock, who voted against the rezoning along with Mark Cryderman, pointed out that Gordon would not be held to his stated redevelopment plan.

"I think Mr. Gordon has shown a sensitivity to the site that a lot of people wouldn't," he said, "but I also have to remind the commissioners that, regardless of what we see on the plan, that has nothing to do with the rezoning whatsoever."

The proposed rezoning now goes to the city council, which will hold its own public hearing on the request.

## Township hears report on sewers

Plymouth, Canton, and Northville Township residents, this is your sewer project:

- Eighty-one million dollars in construction costs, including more than \$3.6 million in engineering fees paid an Ann Arbor-based firm.

- Bond costs of over \$30 million and more than \$850,000 in legal fees, as well as almost \$870,000 in lobbying expenses.

- A meandering sewer line trail which leads from western Northville Township, south along Haggerty Road through Plymouth Township and west through Canton Township to a treatment plant on the fringe of Ypsilanti.

The major players in the Western Townships Utilities Authority sewer project converged on township hall last week to update township board members on the status of their multi-million dollar project.

Attorneys, engineers, lobbyists and others associated with the project discussed the sewer program on Feb. 6.

The task at hand was to resell and reassure the board on its earlier commitment of nearly 30 million Northville Township dollars in a program supporters say will satisfy the township's wastewater transport obligations well into the 21st Century.

Borne of a desire to break away from the North Huron Valley/Rouge Valley sewer system — and the Detroit Wastewater Treatment Plant — members of the WTUA communities joined in 1986 to develop an alternate plan.

Now, nearly six years later, WTUA

is nearing completion of a first-phase construction plan, and is scheduled to kick off a massive phase-two construction program this spring.

Wastewater flows from WTUA communities to the Ypsilanti Community Utility Authority treatment plant are supposed to begin in 1993; the entire project is scheduled for completion in 1994.

Northville Township residents witnessed considerable WTUA sewer-line construction here last year. The WTUA route in Northville winds from western Northville Township just south of Six Mile up to Seven Mile and Sheldon south into Plymouth Township along the Hines Park/Northville Road area.

Each township supervisor serves in a position on the three-person WTUA board. The supervisors report back to their respective township boards on the progress of the sewer system, but an army of consultants are the actual architects of the program.

Those consultants last week told board members that the project is moving along on schedule, and the nation's recession may play a cost-cutting role in phase-two construction, as firms are tendering lower bids for construction services.

But the nature of such a wide-scale project — what a WTUA-paid, Washington, D.C.-based lobbyist said is "breaking new ground in a lot of ways" — may bring its share of pitfalls.

"This is a very large construction project, carrying with it all the problems of a large construction project," said Ernest Essad, an attorney with

## Jeep driver back for sentencing

Kenneth Loveday's sentencing for negligent homicide in the deaths of two joggers last June was postponed to tomorrow, Feb. 11.

His sentencing had been scheduled for Feb. 5 but was delayed after Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Francis X. O'Brien recessed to read letters sent to the court on the victims' behalf.

The letters, including one from the Northville Action Council urging "an appropriate sentence that lets (Loveday) know his actions are unacceptable," were among about 20 received regarding the case.

Loveday was convicted Jan. 9 of negligent homicide in the June 5 deaths of Yusuf Hanania and Albert Abdelnour on Eight Mile Road just east of Beck Road. His westbound Jeep Wrangler struck the two joggers after swerving off the road toward them.

He had faced the more severe charge of involuntary manslaughter with a motor vehicle, a felony punishable by up to 15 years in prison. The maximum charge for negligent homicide, a misdemeanor, is two years

A probation supervisor's report recommends sentencing Loveday to the State Prison of Southern Michigan for 16 to 24 months, the maximum advised by state sentencing guidelines. The report cites Loveday's prior misdemeanor convictions for disorderly conduct, trespassing, and possession of marijuana, as well as the fact that a marijuana cigarette was found in the Jeep's ashtray after the incident.

Jeep passenger Michael Gibson testified during the trial that he and Loveday smoked a marijuana cigarette just prior to the collision.

Loveday's defense attorneys, Jerry and Ronald D'Avanzo, wrote in their own sentencing memorandum that the incident occurred when Loveday's Jeep "veered off Eight Mile Road to avoid oncoming traffic." The attorneys asked the court to take into consideration the fact that the road narrows to two lanes just prior to the point where Loveday's Jeep struck the joggers, and that the narrow shoulder where the men were jogging was not designed for that use.

The joggers' family members, who expressed outrage when Loveday

## Letter campaign averts transfer

Anna Sylvester owes Northville fourth-graders a debt of gratitude for saving her job.

Sylvester and fourth-graders across the district met in Maybury State Park this year through a cooperative program between the state park and the school district under the auspices of Partnerships for Education.

Since that meeting, Sylvester and the fourth-graders have formed a relationship that has taught students a lot about ecology and politics, and Sylvester something about friendship.

That's why when the state Department of Natural Resources told Sylvester she was being transferred to Escanaba as a cost-cutting measure within the department, fourth graders came to her rescue with a letter-writing campaign that might have played a key role in her keeping her Northville post.

Betty Parker, a math, science, and technology resource teacher who coordinated the Partnerships for Education program between Maybury and the district, said students and teachers sent 150 letters to Sylvester's boss asking that she be spared from the transfer.

"We wrote letters to her boss before Christmas asking him to reconsider his decision," Parker said.

Even though the district received a polite thank you and a terse explanation for the transfer and it appeared Sylvester was packing for the great white north, Parker said it was enough that the students got involved.

But in the end students got more than involved; they won their fight. On Jan. 29, Sylvester got word she could stay at the Northville post, and continue with the mentorship program she started in the district.

"I was quite shocked, dismayed

and upset when I heard of the news about the transfer, but now I'm quite elated. They (the students) took up a campaign to save Anna, and they did," Sylvester said.

"They went beyond the call of duty and put me high upon a

pedestal that I'm not sure I deserved to be there. But they were quite impressed with me," she said.

Parker said Sylvester was responsible for designing the curriculum that allows fourth- and fifth-graders to explore the park grounds and learn about life science in a hands-on exercise rather than reading about it in a textbook.

"They retain more than what I think they would have by reading a science book. Textbooks are fine and dandy, but I think kids learn more by seeing things first-hand," she said.

Under the partnership program, students in the fourth grade spend an entire day at the park with Sylvester learning about ecology, trees and leaves, plant and animal lifecycles and food chains, and aquatic life.

Students take nature hikes, conduct pond studies, plant trees, and observe insect colonies, all under Sylvester's supervision. In conjunction with the outdoor activities, Sylvester is active in teaching students the importance of gardening, planting trees, preserving wildlife and woodlands and wetlands.

There are a lot of lessons to be learned here, Parker said. The program between the schools and the state park is an integral program that ties math, science, and language arts together. Fortunately for Sylvester, it also incorporates a lesson in government relations.

"It was an important lesson for our students. Now they know in our democratic system your voice does make a difference," Parker said.

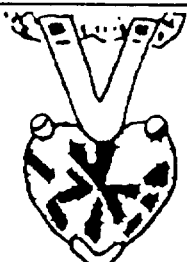

# Shared-services group to meet

A blue-ribbon committee this week is scheduled to take a close look at the future of Northville shared services programs.

City and township representatives will join shared services department heads Thursday morning in an attempt to further dialogue on programs jointly funded by local governments.

Committee members are to focus upon bettering communication with program directors and also will discuss directors' salaries and appraisals.

Possible reorganization of shared services governing bodies may be debated, as well.

Northville city and township currently provide funds to community services such as the recreation department, library, senior citizens program, and Northville Youth Assistance.

Funding for those programs is based on a formula which includes the township and city evenly splitting a certain percentage of costs and the balance based on township/city population levels.

Woeful city and township budget forecasts prompted officials to consider carving funds from shared services programs. The township cut 5 percent from shared services 1991 budgets during

its 1992 budget adoption process and city officials have ordered program directors to ready individual department budgets showing 5-, 10- and 20-percent cuts.

Potential losses of thousands of dollars of government revenue could create havoc for the shared programs, a topic officials discussed during the blue ribbon committee's inaugural session last November.

The committee has not met since, but users of shared programs have felt the effect of government belt-tightening.

A committee directive that the recreation department boost user fees was quickly implemented, for example.

Additional changes may be in the offing. Committee member and township Trustee James Nowka has suggested altering the roles of shared services commissions.

Nowka, the township's representative on the recreation commission, has tossed out an idea which would remove the individual commissions from much of the decision-making process.

Under Nowka's plan, the individual shared services department heads would report to either the city or township manager, instead of reporting to a commission and a manager. Scrapping the layer of bureaucracy associated with a commission

would potentially streamline communications and increase understanding between government and department heads.

Specific commissions would assume a role more befitting a support or advisory group, according to the Nowka plan.

Commissions currently are the primary policy-setting bodies for the shared services departments. Nowka's plan apparently would remove some of the authority from appointed commissioners and increase the decision-making power of the program directors and government officials.

Nowka explained his position in a letter to township Supervisor Betty Lennox.

"I see a better chance of meeting wider future public need with new initiatives," he wrote. "I feel this type approach can benefit each director, the service, the programs and the principals involved."

The committee is scheduled to meet at 8:30 a.m. Committee members include city Mayor Christopher Johnson, Manager Gary Word, and Council Member Carolann Ayers. Township representatives are Nowka, Lennox and Manager Richard Henningsen.

Shared services programs are represented by Traci Gottschalk, Mary Ellen King, Patricia Orr, and Karl Peters.

# Local teacher wins science grant

Phil Demski, a third-grade science teacher at Silver Springs Elementary, has a green thumb, but even the best gardener knows you can't grow anything without sunlight.

Since Silver Springs has no windows, Demski's idea of cultivating plant life indoors for his students has no roots.

So exhausting all efforts, Demski decided to use an alternative light source to help him and his third-graders grow plants indoors and

compare the results with those grown under normal conditions.

The alternative light source, which has been deemed possible in part by a grant from the Detroit Edison Foundation and by Carolina Biological Supply, which manufactures the plant growing apparatus, will allow students to grow plants inside the classroom to feed class pets and study the effects of artificial light on plant life.

The grant, which totals \$453.70, was awarded to Demski and the district Friday at Detroit Edison's Wayne-Monroe Division Headquar-

ters in Belleville.

Betty Parker, a math, science, and technology resource teacher for Northville schools, said the grant "Use Energy-Go Grow," which she wrote, was available to the district under the Foundation's Energy and the Environment 1992 Mini-Grant for Educators Program.

Representatives from Detroit Edison's public relations office said the mini-grant program, now in its third year, enables teachers to offer their classes more creative, original projects that school budgets can't afford.

Mini-grants are given to area teachers for energy-related teaching projects that encourage environmental awareness.

The grant application which outlines Demski's plan for the plant growing apparatus calls for a 12-week study of bean and marigold plants. Students will use the artificial light source to grow the plants and then keep a daily log of their observations and data. The results of the artificial study will be compared with those of another in-district colleague who will be growing plants in natural light.

# Man walks away from plane crash

A Northville man escaped serious injury Feb. 6 when the small plane he was flying crash-landed in an Oceola Township field.

According to Michigan State Police at the

Brighton post, Raymond Charles Barry, 36, suffered only minor cuts and abrasions after the Cessna 152 he was piloting nosedived at 2:38 p.m. in the Musson Road area, north of M-59 and west of US-23.

Barry told police the plane, owned by Free Spirit Aviation of Howell, lost power in midair. He tried to land, but the plane suffered extensive damage. Barry, the only person in the plane, was able to walk away.

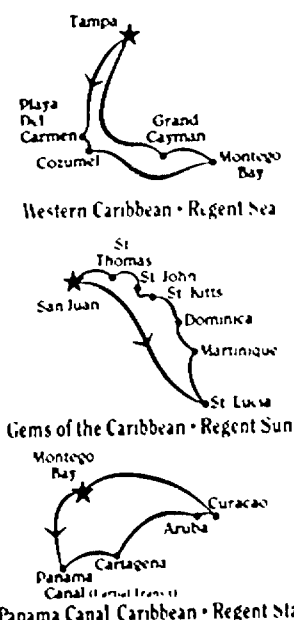

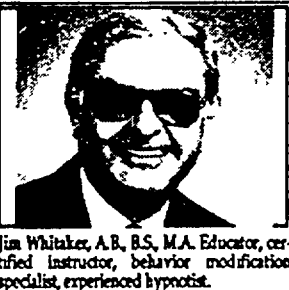

## Former bus driver's license suspended

A former Northville school bus driver won't be driving legally for another year under a sentence that follows her Oct. 14 drunk driving charge.

Thirty-Fifth District Court Judge John E. MacDonald Tuesday suspended the license of Lori Norsworthy for one year, and sentenced her to four weekly alcohol abuse classes.

"I paid my dues and will be paying for the next year. Hopefully that will make the people of Northville happy," Norsworthy said after being sentenced.

In addition to a suspended license for one year, Norsworthy will pay \$675 in court costs and fines, \$300 in probation costs, and a \$75 screening and assessment fee. As ordered by MacDonald, Norsworthy is on a one-year reporting probation period

during which she is required to attend four weekly Alcoholics Anonymous meetings, enroll in an outpatient treatment program, and a drug therapy program.

During that period, probation officer Susan Secorski said, Norsworthy is not allowed to drink alcoholic beverages or enter into any establishment that sells them. She is also required to submit to random alcohol tests as requested by the probation department.

Any violation of the probation terms, Secorski said, will require incarceration for a minimum of 26 days or a maximum of 90 days.

On Jan. 28 Norsworthy pleaded guilty to having an unlawful blood alcohol level when the bus she was driving hit a "no parking" sign on Orchard Drive 20 feet north of Thayer Boulevard Oct. 14. After returning with the bus to the district garage that day, blood tests showed Norsworthy had a .35

blood alcohol level.

Norsworthy has already completed a 21-day inpatient treatment program at Brighton Hospital, her court-appointed attorney said Thursday.

Judge MacDonald granted a 60-day grace period for payment of court costs and fines until Norsworthy is accepted into a general assistance program or until she gets a job.

Barbara Flis, Health and Safety Chairperson for the Northville Council of PTAs said she thought the sentencing would be good therapy for Norsworthy.

"I think she got a pretty good deal," Flis said. "It was a horrible thing she did and it could have been a tragedy. But I think the sentencing will give her an opportunity to straighten out her problem."

"At least this way she'll solve her problem. I didn't really want to see her go to jail, and I guess she's not going to solve it sitting in jail," she added.

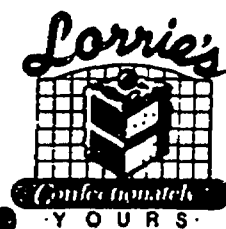

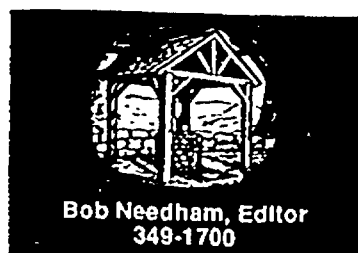

### City lot purchase sends terrible message

Morale at Northville City Hall can't be too high these days. The ongoing city budget crunch has been bad for many months now, but things recently got a lot uglier with a new round of layoffs and a tax increase to boot.

It's open to debate how much blame the city can take for the fiscal shape it's in. The loss of state-retained taxes from the racetrack provided the most recent, most obvious cause.

Regardless of how it got there, however, the city is without question in the soup. And once you're in the soup, common sense and awareness of your situation dictate that you behave in certain ways.

With the recent purchase of yet another lot on the west side of Wing Street, city leaders forgot that. And probably lowered city hall morale even further.

To recap: The city agreed to pay \$93,000 for 226 S. Wing, the second lot south of the post office. The city already owns the lots on either side of the new purchase; that is, it now owns a strip of three lots immediately south of the post office. The purchase comes on a five-year land contract, with no money down but annual payments required.

Why is the city playing land baron? Well, the post office needs more space, and some time in the relatively near future it will expand. If the land is available, it might expand its present location on Wing Street. If land is not available, the Postal Service will send it who-knows-where — Plymouth's new main facility in an industrial area on Beck Road offers a clue. City officials rightly want to encourage the post office to stay in the downtown area, and owning these lots offers some leverage.

Makes sense on one level — one not entirely rooted in reality. The budget crisis is so severe — layoffs and other cuts have hurt so much — that any expense above basic operations needs a compelling reason behind it. We don't see that here.

City officials figured the lot was a good opportunity; too good to pass up. Well, is it really? How valuable is the leverage the city has gained? The post office has not guaranteed, at least not publicly, that it will remain in its present location even if it has the room. If the postal service decides it would be more cost-effective to move out of the center of town, it will do so.



## Government

Even if it does decide to stay, we haven't seen anything indicating how much extra land would be required for its expansion. This most recent purchase was the second lot south of the current post office. Mightn't one lot — the first one, which the city already owned — have been enough for an expansion?

With these questions outstanding, the purchase sends a very negative message to city residents, city employees, laid-off employees and their families: We can work out a way to play real estate agent, but we can't work out a way to save your job, maintain services at current levels, or keep your taxes down. It's easy to point to the fact that the city spent no money up-front, but it will be spent eventually. Why couldn't this creativity have gone into saving someone's city job?

Of course, investing in land in the middle of Northville is not going to be a losing proposition. We're sure the city will recoup its investment eventually, whether the money comes from the post office or not. But in the meantime, the city has added yet one more financial obligation during what is probably its worst fiscal crisis ever. One more weight around its neck. A small one, to be sure, but every little bit hurts.

We wonder how the folks at Standard and Poors would react to this most recent news. Showing financial prudence was such a vital issue a few weeks ago, in order to prove to the S&P raters that the city was serious about getting its fiscal house in order and maintain a decent rating on city bonds. How responsible is this purchase? It's as if the city was a struggling family who was just forced to take out a second mortgage on their house to make ends meet — and then promptly went out to dinner at MacKinnon's, putting it on the credit card.

In ordinary times, buying this lot probably would have been a good decision. But these aren't ordinary times, and the city really has no business making a move like this.

### State should fight gag orders



Lynn Orr, reporter and editor nearby from 1976 to 1981, was a tenacious firebrand who constantly inspired her older and taller colleagues.

She covered a case where Ms. Teacher, passed over for promotion, sued a Redford school district for gender bias. Embarrassed, the board settled out of court for a sum — on condition that Ms. Teacher not reveal the amount.

Orr thought — correctly — that the amount should be public because the school district (a) squandered human talent and (b) paid for it with tax dollars.

But the sly devils on the school board never wrote a check directly to Ms. Teacher. They lumped her settlement in the fees they paid their lawyer, and the lawyer paid off Ms. Teacher.

Two Jackson County prisoners, beaten in their cells by other prisoners, charged jailors were negligent. One asked damages of \$50,000 to \$100,000; the other, six figures.

The county paid up but demanded an agreement that neither side reveal the amount, covering up official ineptitude.

The *Jackson Citizen-Patriot* blistered the county and opined the deal may have been illegal because no law allows such confidential agreements.

Enter state Rep. Michael Griffin, D-Jackson. His House Bill 5436 says: "An agreement to settle a claim or lawsuit against this state or a local unit of government that prohibits disclosure of the agreement or any terms of the agreement is against public policy and is void."

Strong words. It's now before the House Judiciary Committee.

I would go a step further and ban secret settlements by publicly traded corporations, too.

That would be fine with Stanford C. Stoddard, the Birmingham financier who was offered a settlement in five suits against Michigan National Corp. in return for a gag order.

Nuts, said Stoddard. Good for him. Stock in Michigan National is widely held.

Stoddard's publicist noted that a stockholder has filed suit in U.S. District Court against Michigan National for its failure to notify shareholders about extensive litigation and the potential large liability (\$57 million) to the corporation and its directors.

Corporate secrecy over suits in public courts has been growing since 1986, according to Texas attorney Bob Gibbins, president of the Association of Trial Lawyers of America.

Gibbins' article, "Secrecy versus Safety," appeared in December's *American Bar Association Journal*. He cites federal court gag orders that did specific damage to the public interest:

● *Stern v. Dow Corning* — a breast implant case where Stern won a jury verdict. A gag order "prohibited plaintiff's attorneys and expert witnesses from telling government regulators or anyone else what the discovery documents showed about safety tests." Even a medical school professor was gagged.

● *Grundberg v. Upjohn Co.* — a Halcion case. Plaintiff had killed her mother while under the influence of the sleeping medication. The gag order "leaves an unknown number of patients and doctors wondering what caused side effects."

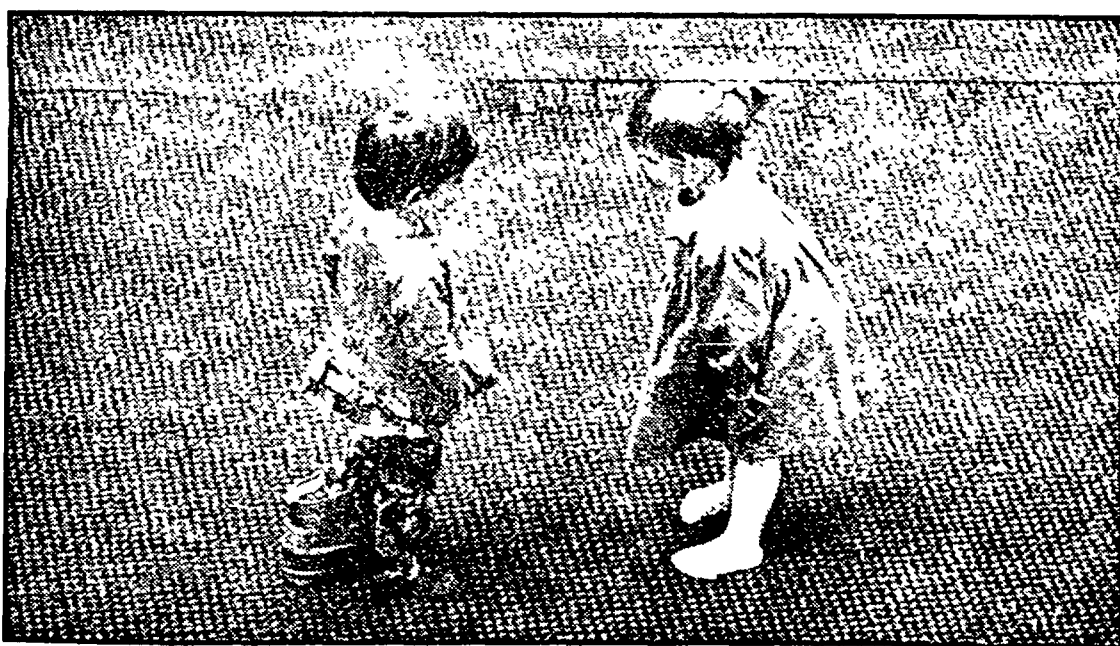
● *Davis v. McNeilab Inc.* — "A scientist who herself suffered a potentially fatal allergic reaction to a painkiller — later withdrawn from the market — discovers that other victims were similarly affected several years earlier but were sworn to secrecy." The gag orders "even prohibited discussion of adverse reactions in scientific journals."

Gibbins said Texas, Florida, North Carolina and Oregon have moved, either by court rule or legislation, to limit gag orders.

Michigan should be a leader. And thanks, Lynn Orr, for the idea.

the firm Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczyk

Essad's firm handles WTUA's legal chores, and also serves as sole legal representative for Northville Township, as well as extended legal duties in both Plymouth and Canton townships. Legal representation for the WTUA project will earn Essad's firm close to \$1 million by 1994.

Potential headaches have resulted or could result from land purchases; easement requirements; perceived interference from county, state, and federal authorities; and inflation and a bevy of other financial landmines, including court-ordered funding of programs to address overflows in some communities, including Plymouth Township.

But the WTUA program is well worth the move away from the Detroit wastewater plant, consultants said.

WTUA auditor Kenneth Kunkel, of Plante & Moran, said the Ypsilanti plant will receive 8.9 million gallons of WTUA community wastewater per day, once the system is on-line. The Ypsilanti plant also has the capacity to accept more flow in the future.

The Ypsilanti plant also has the capability to provide more effective treatment of wastewater. Ypsilanti treatment plant water also is more readily adaptable for return to the Rouge River system, consultants said.

Bond sales financed the WTUA project, and WTUA communities are liable for payment beginning in July 1993. WTUA officials say the costs associated with the projects will be paid by sewer tap fees from new development.

WTUA has not received any federal grants to propel its project. The authority has paid a Washington lobbyist \$744,000 to sniff out federal funds.

The lobbying firm, Cassidy and Associates, has not yet secured any federal dollars for the program, but is seeking a \$20-million grant, said the firm's Don Smith.

Five firms handle engineering tasks for the WTUA project. The lead engineer is Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May of Ann Arbor. That firm stands to earn \$3.6 million from the project, according to auditors Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May handles Northville Township's engineering duties, as well, and its vice-president, Abe Munfah, is a Plymouth Township trustee.

### Get away to a feast of food and wine

The awning of The Rowe — Michigan's Country Inn reads "La Maison des Champignons, Le Gout du Nord." (The house of mushrooms, a taste of the north). Inside, and out of the chill of a winter storm, The Rowe Inn's owner Wes Westhoven and his *haute cuisine* crew are preparing the day's feasts that will accompany one of Michigan's best restaurant wine lists.

We are attracted to The Rowe for the wine as well as the food. The impressive list includes 800 labels and 14,000 bottles. The quality of Westhoven's wine list is not only our opinion. The Wine Spectator has awarded The Rowe Inn its "Best of" Award of Excellence.

"Americans have been spoiled by year-round availability of tomatoes and other fruits and vegetables," Westhoven maintains. "In Michigan, we appreciate the flavor of each fruit and vegetable in their own season. When we taste local apples and morel mushrooms, we are happy that we live here."

"Some may say The Rowe is influenced by French or Italian cuisine, but we really prepare what's grown locally. We are aware of trends and try to select the best, but we don't have to copy anyone else."

The philosophy at The Rowe Inn is to prepare good food, serve the best wines and be delighted by the response of customers.

"Some people take this whole food thing too seriously," Westhoven said. "This ain't art; it's eatin'." Even Andre Soltner, chef at New York's Lutece, isn't an artist, he's a craftsman. Most techniques of food preparation have been known and used for centuries."

As practiced purveyors of food and spirits, The Rowe attracts local customers as well as those from the Detroit Metro area and northern Ohio.

Westhoven grew up in a restaurant family in Toledo, Ohio. His parents operated a country club dining room. In 1972, he and his wife Arlene bought The Rowe, and Arlene became the first chef. Pete Peterson, owner/chef at Tapawingo (Ellsworth) was chef from 1980-84 and Jim Millman, now of Hattie's Grill in Sutton's Bay, served in the kitchen at The Rowe from 1985-1988. Since then, Kathleen Ruis has been resident chef.

"I could tell Kathy was talented the first day she walked in the kitchen," said Westhoven. "I really prefer female chefs, they have less ego to overcome."

Long before they became popular in the Detroit Metro area, The Rowe sponsored wine-maker dinners in Ellsworth, featuring the Italian wines of Angelo Gaja, the Rhone Wines of Guigal and the Bordeaux of Chateau Mouton-Rothschild and Chateau Cheval Blanc.

Although open year-round, the "1992 Season" for The Rowe's wine extravaganza begins Friday, April 24. The Rowe will present a menu to accompany the wines of Chateau Lynch-Bages, a fifth-growth Bordeaux with first-growth quality. Currently available wines (1989, 1988 and 1985) plus wines from great older vintages (1961 and 1970) will highlight a seven-course meal.

And practically since the time that man discovered that fact, his myths and fantasies have contended that it's not just a coincidence. Legends of secret elixirs with the Cupid-like power to sway indifference into passion have fueled beliefs that even common everyday foods are aphrodisiacs.

The term "aphrodisiac" is derived from the name of the Greek goddess of love and

beauty, Aphrodite. Though her legend is believed to be Oriental in origin, the Greeks glorified her in their mythology. She was said to have been born from the foam of the sea, and indeed her name derives from the word *aphros*, meaning foam.

Classical literature and philosophy from Shakespeare to Tennyson is replete with references to aphrodisiacs. Many of history's great lovers have testified to the powers of their own favorite munchies as well.

While we doubt the existence of any secret drugs that arouse interest and induce romantic prowess (let's be honest; can you

imagine anyone keeping such a thing a secret?), there is evidence, both scientific and circumstantial, that certain foods can enhance the romantic experience.

There are, after all, certain behaviors and body responses common to all people who are in love. The heart races, the pupils dilate, and we even break into a barely noticeable excited sweat. That tingly feeling you get when you're close to your Sweet Baboo isn't just your imagination. It's your neurotransmitters doing the slam dance of romance across your synapses.

Your energy level rises, and your senses become more sensitive to stimulus. Taste

being one of the five senses, it's easy to see where the food association originates.

One of the most pungent vegetables around, asparagus, may have some aphrodisiac effect. Asparagus contains a diuretic that increases the amount of urine excreted, and excites the urinary passages. It is rich in potassium, phosphorus and calcium, minerals which are either neurotransmitters or play a role in maintaining a high energy level.

However, asparagus also contains aspartic acid. This substance counteracts

# Expert chefs fine tune for peak performance

The question of the week has been, "How did your practice go?"

It is so exciting to have so many of you interested in the Culinary Olympics. It is time to expound on the competition.

The contest is held every four years in Frankfurt, Germany. Chefs from all over the world practice, practice, then practice more with hopes of winning a coveted gold medal. Or, better still, the gold with distinction. A perfect score. What a thrill that would be.

Literally thousands of cooks descend upon the city for 10 days in October. That gives us just nine more months to perfect our food. Scary. In that nine months we will do our food a hundred times and be able to reproduce it in our sleep. Without flaw.

The Internationale Kochkunst Ausstellung is the world's oldest and largest culinary competition. Started as a local cooking

contest in 1896, it has grown to a monster of an event. In 1988 Frankfurt was host to over 1,000 competing chefs. Included were individuals, regional teams and 30 official national teams.

In 1956 the first team to represent the United States was entered. Our food was not taken seriously, and it wasn't for the next 20 years.

Then, in 1976, the U.S. team brought home 28 gold medals to celebrate its bicentennial year. The food had changed drastically. We were suddenly world class leaders with our American cuisine.

Since that year, the team has done better and better. This year the intensity and degree of precision will be at heights never experienced.

There are four major categories: show platters, hot meals displayed cold, pastry and hot food competition. The first three categories consist of food prepared off-site

of the convention hall and displayed cold.

There are deadlines set for "having your food on the table." Being late will cost a gold medal. It can be compared to falling while doing the triple loop. Points off after months of rehearsal. Time is the number one enemy.

Judging is done without tasting the food. Proper presentation, utilization, correct cooking methods and new, innovative ideas are the criteria.

In the hot food cooking, a team consisting of five chefs prepare food for 150 consisting of soup, entree and dessert. The food is tasted by a judging panel that watches every move that the chefs make during each stage of preparation. Cleanliness is next to godliness as are professionalism and creativity. To win the hot food is a true measure of a chef's ability.

Michigan sent its first team in 1988.

That team brought home more golds than any other state except Florida, that sent their entire team from Disney World. Although Michigan chefs have been winning medals since 1968, this is only the second team to be sent to the Olympics representing Michigan.

So, Back to the practice. As there were two slots to be filled, this was also a tryout.

Everyone had to do their best. The food displayed was awe-inspiring.

Better than many judged shows. The two empty slots were filled by chefs Kevin Gawronski and Joe Decker, both of Schoolcraft College. Schoolcraft has been designated as our team headquarters.

We will eat, sleep and work there for many hours before October.

Yesterday we all met and talked about the commitment involved. War stories were told by the seasoned master chefs.

Blisters on toes that caused such bleeding that blood oozed from shoes; working in ankle deep water for days in old, dangerous kitchens; divorces and lost jobs.

But the bottom line was this: commitment.

Chef Milos gave an analogy to commitment using bacon and eggs. The chicken makes a contribution to the meal while the pig makes a definite commitment.

The significance of committing to a project such as this is profound. I know that I speak for all my team members. Kelli Lewton, Mario Entemad, Ray Hollingsworth, Kevin and Joe when I say that we are proud to represent our state and this area of Michigan. We are so fortunate to have the team behind the team.

Electrifying, exhilarating, inspiring. Only nine more months.

# Spice up love life with aphrodisiacs

excess amounts of ammonia in the body, which may result in apathy and disinterest.

Caviar, the precious eggs of the freshwater sturgeon, may reinforce the theory that wealth is an aphrodisiac, but chemistry may be at work here, too. It is highly nutritious and boasts over 30 percent protein. Caviar's place in the reproductive process appeals to the more philosophical-minded.

In fact, fish and their byproducts comprise the single largest group of foods that claim aphrodisiac effects. Not only does this fit into the Greek myth of Aphrodite rising from the sea. It also concurs with scientific findings.

Most fish is rich in phosphorous and has an excitant effect on parts of the urinary tract. Such is the case with oysters, perhaps the most renowned of all aphrodisiacs. Though they're not a high source of energy, they are easily digestible. The notorious Casanova vouched for oysters, calling them "a spur to the spirit and to love."

Lobster also has its supporters as well. Novelist Henry Fielding made mention of its amorous effect in the bawdy tale, "Tom Jones."

Among herbs and spices, garlic, despite its intrusion on kissing, was trumpeted by both Greeks and Romans, and the Chinese. Also favored by the Chinese is ginseng, which they called the "elixir of life." Medical opinion is sharply divided as to its merits, but Russian experiments in the 1970s claim ginseng increases romantic energy and has a general healing and rejuvenating influence on the body.

Honey is a highly nutritious food, rich in minerals, amino acids, enzymes and B-complex vitamins. Ancient Greek physician Galen and the Roman poet Ovid cited the outstanding aphrodisiac powers of the sweet syrup of the bees.

Though many have claimed peaches to have amorous powers, it's more likely mind over matter. Its all-over fuzz is soothing to the touch, and several cultures have compared its cleft to a nicely shaped derriere. Indeed, the English word "peach," and

## Sample the amorous flavors

### LOBSTER FRA DIAVLO

2 lobsters (1 to 1½ pounds each)  
6 tablespoons olive oil  
4 sprigs of parsley  
1 teaspoon thyme or oregano  
1 small onion, finely chopped  
1 clove garlic, finely chopped  
pinch of cloves  
pinch of mace  
salt, pepper  
2 cups cooked tomatoes  
¼ cup brandy

Split the live lobsters and cook them in hot olive oil until the color has turned. Continue cooking gently for about 10 minutes. Add the seasonings and herbs and tomatoes. Cover and cook for about 15 minutes, stirring often. Arrange a ring of rice on a serving dish. Put the lobster halves in the center and pour the sauce over them. Add the brandy and ignite just before serving. Serves two.

### OYSTERS ROCKEFELLER

¼ cup chopped shallot or green onion  
¼ cup chopped celery  
1 teaspoon chopped chervil  
¼ cup chopped fennel  
¼ cup chopped parsley  
¼ pound butter  
2 cups watercress  
¼ cup bread crumbs

½ cup Pernod or anisette  
salt, pepper  
cayenne pepper  
2 dozen oysters on the half shell

Saute the onion, celery and herbs in 3 tablespoons of butter for three minutes. Add the watercress just long enough to let it wilt. Put this mixture in with the remainder of the butter, the bread crumbs and the Pernod/anisette in an electric blender or food processor. Season to taste with salt, pepper and a few grains of cayenne. Blend for one minute. Put about 1 teaspoon of the mixture on each oyster, place the oysters on beds of rock salt in individual serving-size containers and dampen the salt slightly. Bake at 450 to 475 degrees for about four minutes, or until the butter is melted and the oysters are heated through. Note: Tin pie plates are excellent for baking this dish.

¼ cup lemon juice  
¼ cup honey  
2 tablespoons soy sauce  
1 tablespoon dry sherry  
2 cloves of garlic, minced

Combine marinade ingre-

dients; pour over chops in heavy plastic bag; seal and refrigerate 4 to 24 hours

Prepare covered grill with drip pan in center banked by medium hot coals, or cook under broiler in oven. Remove chops from marinade. Reserve marinade. Grill chops 12-15 minutes, turning once and basting occasionally with reserved marinade. Or broil chops five inches from heat source, turning once, 12-15 minutes.

### BROWN SUGAR-BOURBON PEACHES WITH VANILLA ICE CREAM

6 tablespoons bourbon  
¼ cup firmly packed dark brown sugar  
2 tablespoons (¼ stick) butter  
1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice  
1 teaspoon vanilla extract  
2 peaches, peeled, pitted and sliced  
Vanilla ice cream

Combine first five ingredients in a heavy medium skillet over medium-low heat. Stir until sugar dissolves. Add peaches and stir until heated through.

Scoop ice cream into bowls. Top with peaches and sauce. Serves two, but may be doubled or tripled.

its translation in many languages, is a slang word for an attractive woman. Herbalist Nicholas Culpeper wrote, "Venus owns this tree . . . the fruit provokes lust . . ." in a treatise on peaches.

Some amorous arousal has also been attributed to truffles, the expensive underground fungi. They are similar to oysters in that they are composed mostly of water, and are rich in

protein. Casanova, Marquis de Sade and Madame Pompadour are a few of the historic notables who have praised the truffle's aphrodisiac powers. A French proverb warns: "Those who wish to lead virtuous lives should abstain from truffles."

Included here are some recipes for some of the aforementioned possible aphrodisiacs. Try them paired with

an appropriate liqueur or wine, which Shakespeare said arouses desire. While we can't vouch for the veracity of any of claims of aphrodisiac effect, as the saying goes, "it couldn't hurt to try."



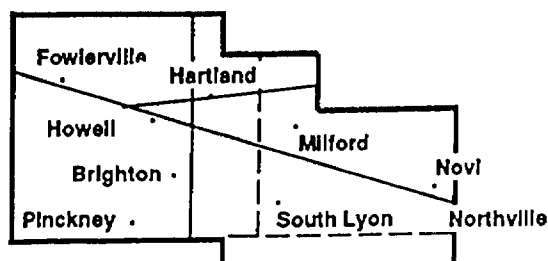

# ADVERTISING UNSELLS.

In 1986, drug abuse officially became America's number one concern.

In that same year, the Partnership for a Drug-Free America was organized by the American Association of Advertising Agencies (AAAA). Its mission: to decrease drug use in this country by changing attitudes.

Many of the country's top persuaders—members of the AAAA—were enlisted by the Partnership. Some 200 ads created for all major media have been donated by the agencies. The messages have been run by the media on a pro bono basis at an estimated weight of \$310 million since the program began in April 1987. Massive consumer surveys have tracked the results.

Some highlights:

From 1987 to 1989, children who think "it's easy to get hooked" rose 5 percentage points. Those who are "scared of drugs" rose 4.

Teenagers who "don't want to hang around drug users" increased 6 points. And those who think "doing cocaine occasionally is risky" went up 4.

Most significant: Changes in attitudes and consumption were greatest in markets where the advertising appeared the most:

	Among Adults	Low Media	High Media
Basic Attitudes	+5.2%	+9.7%	
Fear of Drugs	-1.0%	+3.7%	
Act Against Use	-1.7%	+4.5%	

Two independent studies confirm declining usage. One, from the

University of Michigan, found drug use among high school seniors to be down. Marijuana usage dropped from 21.0 percent in 1987 to 16.7 percent in 1989. Cocaine use fell from 4.3 percent to 2.8 percent in the same period.

The second was conducted by The National Institute of Drug Abuse (NIDA). It found that, between 1985 and 1988, trial of marijuana and cocaine among people 18 to 25 declined at a significant rate.

Releasing this data, NIDA's director, Dr. Charles R. Schuster, said, "...a significant decrease in trial and occasional use of illicit drugs is a result of major changes in social attitudes. In my opinion, the Partnership's messages have had a direct impact on these attitudes and usage declines."

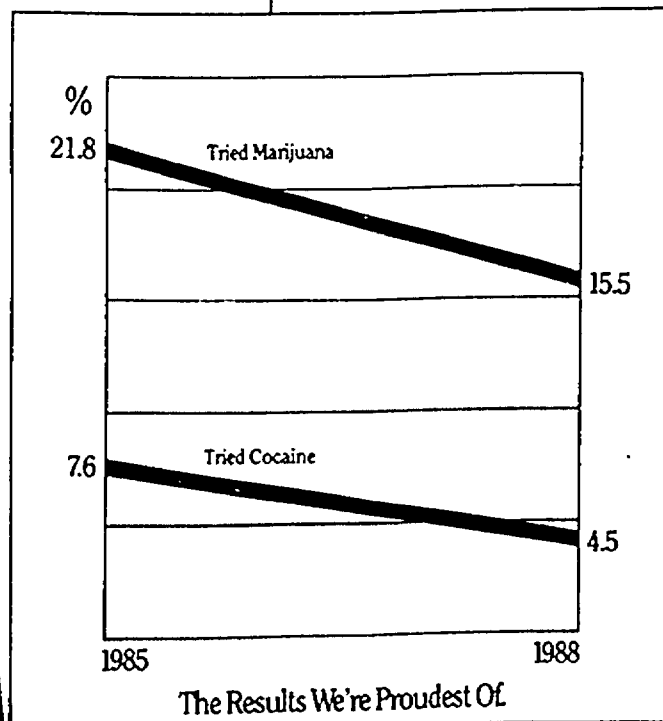
At a special White House conference, Gordon S. Black, Ph.D., president of the firm that conducted the Partnership research, concluded, "If these were the results of a tracking study for one of your own advertising campaigns, I think your advertising director would be rather pleased, to say the least."

# Who speaks in the children's 'Best Interest'?

## True story of family in crisis

The foster care programs of America and elsewhere are intended to provide suitable temporary homes for children in need, yet sometimes even the best of intentions can be thwarted. NBC has dramatized an actual case in point with the story of good people at odds who all claim to be thinking "In the Best Interest" of the Children." The movie airs on Sunday, Feb. 16.

Sarah Jessica Parker ("Equal Justice," "Square Pegs") stars as Callie Cain, an acute manic-depressive whose string of romantic trysts has left her with four young daughters and an infant son. She returns to her Iowa hometown with her brood hoping to start life afresh, but instead her family slips into squalor, living on food stamps. The role of adult is performed by her oldest girl, Jessica (Lexi Randall). It is Jessica who feeds the baby in the middle of the night, Jessica who reminds her mother to take her birth control pills, and Jessica who comforts her siblings in times of distress. She is clearly the backbone of the family, but, as she reminds her sisters, she is also just a little girl.

When Callie's illness flares up, her brother John (Gray Graham of "Alien Nation") suggests she needs more treatment and assures her he will care for her children while she is away. The paranoid Callie accuses him of wanting to steal them. Crowded by a social services investigation, Callie finally agrees to commit herself, but only on the condition that her brother isn't granted custody of her family.

The children enter the foster care program and are placed in the farm home of Patty Pepper (Sally Struthers) and her husband, a salt-of-the-earth, childless couple whose unconditional and stable love gives the children a family life they never dreamed possible. With the state-forced visits to Callie proving more and more disturbing to them, the children want to keep their new home with the adoption-minded Peppers. If it had been left to the

children to decide what was in their best interest, the story might have ended here.

But Callie is feeling better and wants her kids back. Brother John thinks they would be better off with him and his family, but there are other forces at play in the situation. The social services department must adhere to a strict case plan, the children's court-appointed attorney (Elizabeth Ashley) seeks to protect them from all parties, and Patty Pepper has initiated a media campaign to help her hold on to what she's got.

For Parker, the role of a character afflicted with poverty and mental illness was quite different from

her previous acting endeavors, but there were elements of her own past that she could draw upon.

"My grandmother was raised in Appalachia, and my mother always said we were white trash wannabes," she explains. "So I guess there is a bit of blood in me that understood that sort of upbringing and experience. And I was a product of the welfare system myself."

Parker's performance is one of understated brilliance, and Struthers' perky monument to maternal instincts warms the soul. But Randall's guardian big sister, who longs for someone to take care of her, is the heart of this very emotional film.

## SOAP TALK

### Soap writer creates 'Bold' characters

Will Nikki and Victor marry again? Will Jill ever convince John to give her another chance? Is Faith going to cause big problems for Ridge? There's one man who knows the answers to these questions and much, much more. He's William J. Bell, executive producer and head writer of the highly rated CBS series *The Young and the Restless* and *The Bold and the Beautiful*.

Bell, one of the most respected men in daytime television, isn't afraid of controversy. He's tackled tough and sometimes taboo subjects such as AIDS, date rape, incest and crack-addicted babies. While he listens to his audience, he has his own ideas about what's going to happen on his shows.

"Very often the people who write in will tend to react negatively to what you are doing," Bell says. "What you ultimately have to do is follow your own judgment. That is what I've done since I first started writing. I'm not going to do what someone else suggests, I'm going to do what I believe in. If I'm wrong, then I won't stay in the business. If I'm right, I'll save myself a lot of money in psychiatric bills."

The formula seems to have worked for Bell, as he has written over 10,000 episodes of daytime drama since 1957. He began his career writing for *The Guiding Light*, with the great Irna Phillips. (The pair also co-created *Another World*.) Bell has served up stories for *As the World Turns* and *Days of Our Lives*, pulling both soaps up from the bottom of the Nielsens. Not one to rest on his laurels, Bell went on to co-create *The Young and the Restless* and *The Bold and the Beautiful* with his wife, Lee Phillip Bell.

The strength of his stories, as Bell explains, comes from well-developed characters. "You want characters that the audience can relate to, in some cases be furious with and at the very least be interested in. But in most every case, you want some strong emotional involvement between the audience and your character. Then you need good stories to support them," says Bell. He must be right, for *Y&R* and *B&B* stay in the No. 1 and No. 5 five spots on a consistent basis.
