## Video store owners face charges

The owners of a Northville video store are expected to surrender to township police Tuesday on warrants charging them with violating state obscenity statutes.

Carl Wilson, 50, of Brighton, and his daughter, Laura Wilson, 26, of Northville, are scheduled to be arraigned at 35th District Court Tuesday on multiple second-degree obscenity charges.

Township police last week raided Northville Video, 43197 Seven Mile, and seized a computer, computer files, boxes of glossy materials alleged to be obscene, and the jackets from four allegedly obscene videotapes.

Both the Wilsons and their corporation face four counts each of second-degree obscenity. If the seized material is deemed obscene, the defendants could be guilty if the court determines they knew the "character and content" of the materials and attempted to possess and distribute the items, said township police Det. Michael Wildt.

The charges are misdemeanors and include penalties of up to a year in prison and a \$5,000 fine, said police Capt. Philip Presnell.

During a month-long investigation, undercover police rented four tapes and sent copies to the prosecutor's office. Police raided the business Feb. 11 and seized the materials without incident.

The raid and seizure were authorized by the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office and stem from a complaint by a Detroit man who identified himself as the president of the Michigan Coalition on Pornography, a small group the unidentified man said "investigates" area video stores.

Police and prosecutors charge that Northville Video stocked and distributed videos such as *Taboo*, *Taboo IV*, *Anal Angels*, and *Anal Alley*, which they allege violate state obscenity standards.

Carl Wilson deferred comment on the case to his attorney, Gregory Lord of Southfield.

Lord on Friday refused to comment "at this time" but did say the Wilsons would surrender on



Tuesday.

"We indicated (to police) we would voluntarily produce the persons named in the warrants," he said.

Police did not seize the four allegedly obscene video tapes, and

Northville Video may still rent the tapes, the township's Wildt said.

"We can't infringe on their right to distribute them," he said. "They're not yet found to be in violation."

## Near-Olympian watches, waits

One man watching this year's Winter Olympics ice dancing from the stands in Albertville, France just missed being out on the rink.

Northville resident Jerod Swallow, 25, and his 21-year-old partner, Elizabeth Punsalan, were one step away from making this year's Winter Olympics. The team came in third in Olympic trials in Orlando last month, just missing one of two spots for the U.S. Olympic Team.

Swallow, who has been skating and ice dancing for 14 years, described this year as his "first serious shot" at Olympic competition. "We were the returning national champions from last year," he explained.

Unlike most other pairs of skaters in the United States, Swallow and Punsalan continue their relationship off the ice as well.

"We date each other, and have for the past two years, and that's unusual, too, for American pairs," Swallow said.

But he said the off-ice relationship has helped the two relate better on the ice as well.

"It's really helped us with our skating," he said. "The emotions you portray on the ice are more sincere when you're romantically involved."

Though they only began skating together three years ago, the two have raced upward through the ranks of ice dancers.

They were the surprise winners at the 1991 U.S. Championships in Minneapolis, dethroning the reigning team of Russ Witherby and April

Sargent. They even graced the December 1991 issue of *Olympian* magazine, and were featured in a story titled "Rebels with a Cause." The story detailed the couple's unusual dance

style and their frequent breaks with tradition in competition, ranging from their creative costumes to the new wave music they dance to.

Internationally, the couple has drawn rave reviews. They placed

eleventh in the world championships in Munich, Germany last year.

"All the European judges were very excited about what we were doing," he said.

But it may have been their break with tradition that edged the couple out of Olympic contention, Swallow said.

"Both teams that are going are very traditional in style, and my partner Liz and I are very avant garde," Swallow said. "We skate more of the European style; we don't do the ballroom dancing style that the Americans are so used to seeing."

Ironically, Swallow and Punsalan skated with one of the other two pairs for months before the Olympics.

"It was frustrating for us because we helped them all year. They trained with us and they were the ones who went," he said. "Our own judges didn't support us, which was very disappointing."

As a result, Swallow said he had mixed feelings regarding this year's event.

"It's funny: your first reaction is just frustration and disappointment... but we've really enjoyed watching our close friends," he said. "To see them enjoying themselves is both exciting and disappointing because we know we should have been there."

Swallow's trip to France turned into a family affair, and he sat in the stands in Albertville with his brothers Adam and Seth. But he hopes to return to the next Winter Olympics, scheduled just two years from now in Lillehammer, Norway. And next time, he plans to be on the ice.

## City eyes adding tax downtown

The Downtown Development Authority debated last Tuesday whether to levy its own new tax on downtown property.

Members agreed to come up with a list of possible uses for the funds from such a millage, and also eyed possible expansions of the DDA district.

The discussion reflects a recent movement by DDA members to explore the boundaries of their powers and become a more proactive group.

Under the state statute governing downtown development authorities, a DDA the size of Northville's may levy up to 2 mills for operational, promotional or construction purposes. That levy would have to be authorized by the city council.

Northville's downtown development district is bounded by Wing Street on the west, Griswold on the east and Cady on the south, and includes land on either side of Dunlap.

A 2-mill levy on the district would raise about \$17,000 annually, based on the district's current property values. It would cost landowners within the district \$2 per \$1,000 of assessed value on their property.

"This is optional; it's not something the DDA has to do," said City Manager Gary Word. "The question is whether you want to do it and when."

he said.

"What does the DDA want to be? If you want to be more involved, you need funds to do that."

The DDA recognized that talk of raising taxes might rub some the wrong way. "Millage is a touchy subject with me right now," admitted Mayor Chris Johnson.

The city's overall millage rate is scheduled to rise by 4.2 mills next year under the recently passed deficit reduction plan.

But, said DDA Member Greg Presley, "Although a new levy against the property in the downtown area would seem inappropriate at this time, I think it's in their own interest to protect the downtown."

Presley also asked one of the meeting's most pertinent questions: "What are we going to use it for?" For one, the upkeep of the downtown area, he replied DDA Member Dee Richardson. "As a merchant, it kills me that the merchants have to pay the city to put up decorations in the downtown."

Johnson noted that, given cutbacks to the city's Beautification Committee and other organizations, requests for financial aid would probably increase. "I'm sure they're going to be walking around hitting you up for donations even more," he said. Presley cited last year's purchase

## Changes ahead for Recreation

A new name, a new face, a new beginning.

And maybe a new era of support for Northville Community Recreation. At least that's what recreation department Director Traci Gottschalk envisions.

Gottschalk last week unveiled a host of proposed changes for the recreation department, not the least of which is a change of names. Try Northville Parks and Recreation on for size.

"We have an identity problem in the community; people think we're community education," Gottschalk said. "We need to make a statement (and) become a bigger force in the community."

Gottschalk inherited the recreation department reins last September from former Director John Anderson. Though usership of recreation facilities and programs is on a steady upward swing, the department was saddled with a bogged-down park development program and funding cuts from local government sources.

Enter a new, more aggressive attitude.

Gottschalk opened discussions with Northville Township planning and building officials to get the Beck Road park plans back on track. She pushed for the parks and recreation

name change — earning positive responses from the recreation commission and township board — and laid the groundwork for a recreation support group.

Dubbed "Friends of Northville Recreation," the support group is patterned after the highly successful Friends of the Northville Library program, Gottschalk said. Although it's still in the fledgling stage, the group is expected to advise the nine-member recreation commission on a wide variety of recreation issues.

"We need additional community

# DDA discusses new tax levy, district expansion

of the Northville trolley by the Wyandotte DDA as an example of a potential DDA project.

New DDA Member David Larsen said its own revenue could allow the DDA to woo potential developers or business people. "We'd need to take them in, show them around, buy them lunch," he said. "That wouldn't be a lot of money."

Addressing Johnson, he added, "It expands the number of options that you and the council have in assigning us tasks if we have some funds of our own."

Word said the DDA's governing statute gives the group a wide latitude when spending such funds.

"There are very few limitations," he said.

DDA members also discussed whether to expand the district's boundaries. Possible areas that were cited for expansion included the former Northville Ford Plant, Northville Downs and Northville Driving Club property south of Cady Street, and the semicircle of land east of Griswold Street between South Main and Cady if Cady ran straight east from Griswold.

"The Downs and the Driving Club have no objection at this time to being in the DDA district," said Lou Carlo, the racetrack's director of operations. "We've said in the past that we

think that land should be developed, and this may be one of the things that would further that."

The DDA was fairly unanimous in its opinion that the proposed three-floor Cady Street parking deck should be included in an expanded district.

Though Cady Street was seen as a logical place for commercial expansion, "the Ford Plant presents a more unique situation," Johnson noted. The plant will likely remain on the property and be redeveloped, rather than torn down for a new structure, he said.

"If you took the building off, the buildable area is less, much less... with the new zoning ordinances that

have gone into effect in the last 20-30 years," he said.

"I think it's clear that if the DDA is going to expand, it's to the south," Johnson said. "If the community is looking at a future expansion of the downtown to accommodate the growth in Northville, Novi and surrounding areas, this is definitely the area to expand."

"The essential rationale to include it would be to try and spur economic growth on the south side of the DDA district," Johnson added. But Word listed some negative factors to an expansion, including the loss of future tax base from the city at large.

Johnson and other DDA members also agreed that the time to plan for

growth is now, despite any short-term vacancies in the city's existing commercial stock.

"We're going to undergo some profound change, particularly with the development in the township," the mayor said. "I think it's in our interest to attempt to accommodate that rather than force (potential customers) to go somewhere else."

"Of course, that doesn't mean five MainCentres on the south side of Cady Street," he added.

Presley did cite some potential hazards to commercial growth. "Suppose we double the size of the downtown over the next 20 years," he said. "How do we handle the infrastructure?"

He noted that one of the major concerns of downtown businesses now is the lack of available on-site parking.

Presley suggested a simple study of the potential areas for expansion. "It'd be interesting to have a planner look at that area to see if it's viable for commercial activity," he said.

Johnson agreed, and said Planning Consultant Don Wortman would be directed to compile such a study.

The DDA plans to discuss the issues further at its March 10 meeting, and review suggested uses for the funds

support," she said. "I really feel the need for a separate group (to supplement the recreation commission)."

Gottschalk said the recreation friends group would work with the commission to help devise a long-range strategy for local recreation goals and needs. The group would be

considered a non-profit entity that may hold fundraisers and tackle other chores as a non-political wing of the department.

Perhaps the most pressing problem for community recreation is dwindling space for almost every local sporting venture. Soccer and baseball fields are a precious commodity — moreso since residential

development claimed the former Lapham Field site on Six Mile and Beck roads — and the numbers of sports-crazy youths and adults are on the rise.

Enter the proposed community park on Beck Road between Five Mile and Six Mile. Bureaucratic pitfalls have slowed development of the site, but Gottschalk solicited township

planning and building department support to put the park back on the fast track.

At a recreation commission meeting last week, Gottschalk offered a bold proclamation for the 39-acre park site, the initial phase of which is to house three soccer fields and two

baseball diamonds:

"You'll see grass out there in 1992 if I have to go out there and plant it myself," she said.

Anderson made similar statements during his tenure as director.

# Township adds truck enforcement

Relief may be on the way for Northville residents troubled by the rumbling and clattering of large commercial truck traffic. The township board last week bit at police Chief Chip Snider's second offering of a motor carrier enforcement program for Northville Township. The program would place township police officers in the role of weighmasters and truck safety enforcement personnel. Snider said the program could debut April 1. Police raised the weighmaster question in January, in response to numerous complaints from residents, especially those who call the western portion of the township home.

Those residents were worried that several factors — including the paving of Beck Road from Eight Mile to Seven Mile — were creating increasing numbers of large trucks along Beck, Ridge, and the mile roads west of Sheldon. Another factor, Snider said, was that surrounding communities had developed their own weighmaster programs, sending truckers bound for the Arbor Hills landfill and other Salem Township sites scurrying through Northville Township to avoid detection of overweight loads and safety defects. Plymouth Township, Novi, and Canton Township all feature weighmaster programs. Snider said local district court documents indicate that most truckers are being fined for safety violations, as opposed to overweight loads.

That comment seemed to mollify Trustee Thomas Handyside, who last month tangled with Snider over perceived possible harassment of the trucking industry by local law enforcement. "Safety issues are very important," Handyside said. "It's not something where (police) strictly are going after overweight vehicles." The weighmaster program is a non-budgeted item, but township officials feel revenues earned through fines will offset the estimated \$10,000 start-up costs. Treasurer Jack Hosmer said the township should act soon to put the "mechanism in place to pay for the investment." Snider said his department will try the program "for a six-month pilot period" to determine the weighmaster's cost and effectiveness.





# Soliciting groups not affiliated with city police

City police have received reports of two groups claiming to solicit money on behalf of police. The department has no affiliation with either group.

One group, calling itself the "Michigan Association of Police," is seeking \$12 donations to help provide bullet-proof vests to police officers, and fingerprinting and photographing of children for identification purposes. But, said Senior Police Clerk Sue Hatch, "This department will fingerprint children at no charge, and a family photograph will usually suffice."

"We have no affiliation with them and we don't get any benefit from their group at all," she said.

A man claiming to be with another group, called the "Michigan Professional Police Association," drew the

ire of one Northville resident recently by making repeated calls to the resident and demanding a donation. The group also sent the resident a bill for a \$15 donation.

The resident informed city police, who sent a letter to the association about the complaints and threatening legal action if the complaints continued.

## Farmington teacher sentenced in case

A local high school teacher convicted of exposing himself to a woman in Hines Park was sentenced for the crime last week.

Northville Township police arrested Scheer after a 24-year-old Plymouth woman reported that a man had exposed himself to her while she painted a watercolor in Hines Park.

Scheer originally denied the charge, and told police he was urinating and mistakenly came upon the woman. But Scheer later agreed to the guilty plea before Judge James Garber on the disorderly conduct/ indecent exposure charges.

North Farmington High School suspended Scheer with pay after hearing of the charges. School officials were awaiting the outcome of sentencing and an internal investigation before rendering a decision on Scheer's employment status, school officials said.

4. Fourth and each subsequent false alarm resulting in response by Police Department - \$500.00

## Our Opinion

### Joint meeting offers a new glimmer of hope

No blockbuster decisions were made, but considering the lengthy history of poor communication between city and township officials, last week's discussion on a possible shared police services plan must be viewed in a positive light.

Members of the city council and township board huddled Feb. 10 to renew shared police services talks — a debate that began way back yonder in 1990 and was shunted to the side as the township mulled cat ordinances and the city opened its arms to a southern huckster selling Cajun food.

The original idea behind police talks was to devise a money-saving strategy to combine city/township police dispatching operations. Police chiefs Chip Snider and Rod Cannon met on several occasions early last year and seemed to reach some measure of consensus on a dispatching plan. The township reportedly was to have become a host and vendor for dispatching operations, with the city kicking in its new communications equipment.

Some sort of accord seemed near, but Township Supervisor Georgina Goss and City Manager Steven Walters were busy job-hunting, no one picked up the slack, and the police chiefs were left holding pages of statistics and stale newspaper clippings quoting June 1991 kick-off dates for combined dispatching.

The ramifications of a joint program are many: Combined dispatching could lead the way to a full-blown community police department, a sensible and most likely cost-effective program for all Northville taxpayers. With both the city and township in deep financial trouble, exploration into combined police services makes all the more sense.



## Government

Last week's meeting did offer glimmers of hope that talks could heat up again. The two political bodies agreed to send their police chiefs out in search of requests-for-proposals — with no promise that money would be spent on the bids — and asked them to have the RFPs detailed to four scenarios, including city and township combined dispatching, city and township combined police departments, and two measures that also would include Plymouth city and township in the menu.

Plenty of posturing came before that decision, though, as the respective boards argued over their own recollections of the direction which came from the 1990 meeting. And the most often-heard quote — and most agreed upon — from politicians at the recent meeting? "We've got to walk before we can run." That's true, but you also have to get up off your, uh, backside to do anything at all.

It was a good idea to put the police chiefs in charge of the RFP talent search. Both have worked hard to outline possible benefits and downsides to joint services plans, and they seem to get along well. And both were anxious — as were we — for the politicians to get off the stick and offer direction for a program that's been too long in coming.

That's a good first step, although the light shuts off at 10 p.m. most nights. If you're a late-night shopper at Meijer, as I often am, and you happen to be leaving at about 11 p.m., good luck making that left turn onto Eight Mile.

My guess is that someone at the road commission measured traffic volume on Eight Mile during the summer. That doesn't take into account the racetrack traffic that flows east when Northville Downs lets out every night from November through March.

And to think all this fine work is going to be negated by the Township-approved driveways to the new Meijer gas station going in on the corner.

But I digress.

Sure we need better traffic lights and left-turn signals up and down Haggerty in Northville Township.

But the long term solution will probably come from Oakland County. As I see it, the best way to eliminate the traffic accidents along Haggerty is to eliminate the traffic.

## Sellas leaves post as commission chair

A driving force behind local conservation and beautification efforts has tossed in the towel — partially, anyway.

Catherine Sellas recently gave up her post as township beautification commission chairperson, a title she held since 1987.

Sellas said the decision to step down from her activist's position was based on a desire to expend more time and energies on family matters.

"I thoroughly enjoyed my tenure as chairman of the beautification commission and will remain active," Sellas said Tuesday. "I loved being chairman, but I feel a fresh approach is good for any organization."

The beautification commission thrived and grew during Sellas' reign, much like the many trees, flowers and shrubs planted by the group. Sellas and other commissioners worked to gain a strong voice and presence in Northville Township, and in many cases, their efforts took root.

Sellas said the commission played a vital role in development of the township's woodlands, sign, and property maintenance ordinances.

The sign ordinance provided guidelines which lead to much smaller signs in the township, Sellas said, and the property maintenance

plan gives the township authority to fine those who keep their lots in a less-than-unmaculate state.

A crowning achievement was the role the beautification commission played in the implementation of the township's woodlands ordinance, the only such tree protection plan in Wayne County, Sellas said.

"It's not so terribly restrictive as (guidelines in some Oakland County communities)," Sellas said. "But it lets developers know we are serious about trees."

A judging and awards program brought city and township beautification commissions closer during her term, and Sellas also points to the annual Arbor Day tree seedling giveaway as a high point in her term.

Sellas said the commission has served a "visionary" role in maintaining and upgrading the rural quality of the Northville area, both through its plantings and prodding of local politicians.

"People were always so positive about the things we were doing," she said. "The commission was such a positive thing in the township."

Celia Larsen will replace Sellas as commission chairperson. Other officers include Vice-Chairperson Carol Graves Sassaman, Secretary John Sassaman, and Treasurer Judy Jambor.

## ACORD meeting draws crowd

If the turnout at ACORD's first general meeting Tuesday was any indication of the community's concern, the notions of the founders of the citizen's group were right on target.

A Community Organization Recognizing Diversity, ACORD, is a group dedicated to taking a proactive stance to prevent racial discrimination and promote ethnic diversity.

Twenty-five people attended ACORD's first general meeting last Tuesday, at which the group welcomed two guest speakers — Northville Public Schools social worker Valerie Kaplansky and First United Methodist Church Assistant Pastor Tom Beagan — to share their experiences with racial integration.

For Mary Ellen King, one of 10 founding members of the group, the turnout was encouraging. "Isn't this great? I was really surprised," King said.

Parents, teachers, and members of the community at large sat in on the brief presentations

guest speakers made and then shared ideas, experiences, and suggestions to help the group target its efforts.

For some, roundtable discussions shed light on the existing problems — a few isolated incidents in classrooms where students exchanged racial slurs. For others, the conversation stimulated ideas on how to ease tensions and anxieties that surface in schools, business, and in the community over racial and economic discrimination.

Parents, counselors, and district officials alike agreed that each has a responsibility to reinforce positive behaviors in the classroom and at home.

An added emphasis on multi-cultural activities and lesson plans being introduced into the curriculum would teach students about other cultures, foster an awareness and appreciation for ethnic diversity, and create a respect for others, they believe.

Cooperative learning and providing an environment that fosters a respect for each other is critical to reducing the frequency of racially motivated comments and experiences, according to Ka-

plansky, whose expertise is in peer relationships.

"We need to provide an environment where each person is respected," she said. "Make it a cooperative learning experience where children are encouraged, if not forced, to work together."

Cooperative learning encourages students to work together, be team players, and share ideas, she said.

But the ideas didn't stop there.

Some thought instituting a school policy to handle racial discrimination was a useful tool. Still others were convinced the schools were a starting point for educating people and believed increasing multi-ethnic programs, concentration, and representation in the schools would have the positive outcome the group hopes to achieve.

ACORD's next meeting is March 10. New members will be charged a \$5 membership fee. The meeting will be a brainstorming session from which the group hopes to develop a platform and adopt a direction for its efforts.

## Disney finds goldmine with Silverado label

After 10 years in the wine business, the Disney family is no longer prospecting in the Napa Valley. They have struck paydirt.

Although fantasy permeates other Disney projects worldwide, Silverado Vineyards, the Disney family winery, has been quietly and consistently producing some of California's great wines.

In the mid-1970s, Walt Disney's widow Lillian Disney, in partnership with her daughter and son-in-law, Diane and Ron Miller, purchased vineyards in Napa Valley and grew grapes that Napa's finest vintners converted to award-winning wines.

By 1981, encouraged by success and confident that their estate vineyards would yield quality wines, they built Silverado Vineyards winery on the east side of Napa Valley's Silverado Trail. With vineyards in the prestigious Stags Leap District, the wines exhibit significant consistency throughout the product line.

The winery name, easily pronounced and suggestive of the west, originates from the Silverado silver mine, operated on Mount St. Helena near Calistoga in the 1870s. Robert Louis Stevenson popularized the name Silverado in his book *The Silverado Squatters* and inextricably linked it to Napa Valley and, as such, was the first writer to romanticize Napa Valley wines.

From chardonnays boasting balanced oak and fruit to mildly varietal sauvignon blanc with accents of honeydew melon to velvety, blackberry-laden cabernet sauvignon, the wines of Silverado Vineyards speak for themselves without glitz, glamour or hype.

The man who has molded the Silverado style is winemaker Jack Stuart, a native Californian whose first love was English literature rather than a French oak barrel.

Stuart earned a bachelor's in English at Stanford University, taught English in Japan and was editing books prior to becoming a winemaker. "In the early '70s, I was working as a manuscript editor for a small publishing company in San Francisco," he relates. "I wasn't getting anywhere. I didn't enjoy the books, and I wasn't well paid. It was fun living in the city, but I wasn't going anywhere in publishing."

"My interest and enthusiasm for wine grew as I tasted and read about wine, but the event that pushed me over the edge was a night school wine class I took at San Francisco State University taught by a University of California-Davis graduate. Suddenly, drinking wine wasn't enough. With my wife's blessing, I quit my job and enrolled at U.C. Davis, working each harvest at a different winery."

In 1981, Stuart joined Silverado Vineyards as its first and only winemaker. Stuart modestly proclaims that the style of Silverado wine has been molded around the quality fruit grown in the Stags Leap District estate vineyards.

## Making sense of the scare

### Area merchants think report was fishy

Some area fish market owners and managers are reeling over a *Consumer Reports* study of fish in February's *Consumer Reports* magazine. A few have noticed a drop in business and fear some of their customers are assuming bad things about fish.

The article focused on the bacteria counts of 113 samples of seven different kinds of seafood — salmon, flounder, sole, catfish, swordfish, lake whitefish and clams, bought at 40 randomly selected stores in New York and Chicago. *Consumer Reports* said their analysis showed 30 percent of the fish was "already spoiled" and "9 percent was on the verge of spoiling."

The magazine also reported it found harmful levels of mercury in 90 percent of the swordfish samples it tested. Investigators found polychlorinated biphenyls, or PCBs — potential cancer-causing and reproductive hazards — in 43 percent of the salmon tested, 25 percent of the swordfish and 50 percent of the lake whitefish.

In conclusion, the report said there were abuses in handling seafood, which is largely unregulated by the federal government.

Brad Vargo, manager of Jack's Seafood Market in Farmington Hills, said some of his customers were talking about the article. Anna Georgiou, owner of Anna's Fresh Seafood Market in Redford, said the same thing.

"We run a very clean store," said Georgiou. "I get compliments galore. Customers say this doesn't smell like a fish store. My employees do not touch fish without gloves."

Vargo invited us to visit his store, and meet Roy Phillips, vice president of purchasing for Salasnek Fisheries, processors and packers of fish and sea foods, based in Detroit. Salasnek supplies fish to Jack's Seafood Market, Meijer, A&P, Kroger, Farmer Jack, and lots of area restaurants.

The store was immaculate, and didn't smell fishy. A table near the entrance was filled with helpful information about buying and cooking fish. There were lots of recipes too.

"Our fish is federally inspected," said Phillips. "We have a full-time inspector on our payroll. He checks it, watches how we handle fish, he smells it, cooks it, tastes it, and will reject it if it's bad."

Vargo, Phillips, Georgiou and other fish sellers have said they were upset with the article in *Consumer Reports* because the conclusions were based on a small sampling of markets. Fish markets in Michigan were not tested.

"I'm not arguing we have problems," said Phillips. "But we work very hard to educate people to put out high quality fish. This is a very competitive market. People in the industry work very hard to have a good quality product."

On the positive side, Phillips said the article brought out the need for mandatory seafood inspection.

"A few people aren't doing a good job and they're ruining it for everyone," said Phillips. "This is a wake-up call for the retailer. We all want to see regulation; we welcome it."

Fish markets in Michigan are inspected by the Michigan Department of Agriculture Food Inspection Division at least once every four months. If violations are found, the markets are inspected more frequently.

"I feel proud to be associated with this department," said Harold Zorlen, regional supervisor. "We do a tremendous amount of sampling. Michigan is one of the leaders in food inspection. We feel good about our fish industry. I've been with this department for 30 years, and I've noticed a tremendous improvement in fish quality and handling."

Here are some tips for buying and handling seafood from the National Fisheries Institute.

When purchasing whole fish, look for eyes that bulge a little and are clear. This is usually a good indication that the fish is fresh. Some varieties of fish have naturally cloudy eyes, such as walleyed pike.

When purchasing whole fish or fish fillets, look for firm, shiny flesh. Dull flesh

"It's very simple, you can make it in one pan," said Vargo. "This recipe is lean and healthy."

#### RAINBOW TROUT VALENCIA

- 4 large boneless rainbow trout fillets
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 2-3 cups seasoned bread crumbs
- 1/2 cup frozen concentrated orange juice
- 1/2 cup white wine, Chablis or Pinot
- 2 oranges, sectioned

Brush trout with oil. Dredge trout in bread crumbs, coat well. Blend wine and orange juice. Place trout in non-stick oven tray with sides. Pour wine and orange juice around trout. Bake in 375 degree oven for 12 to 15 minutes. Be sure trout is thoroughly cooked.

Transfer trout to serving platter. Top each trout with sectioned oranges. Pour orange sauce over trout.

Each morning I started off with a soothing cup of tea. My husband is usually downstairs first, and has turned into quite a brewer. The wonderful smells of a fruit-based blend are a great eye-opener.

The drive to work affords me just enough time for the second cup, a nice relaxation technique before a hectic onset.

During the day, tea gives me a lift when the energy flow is low. And at night, a cup of Sleepy Time acts as a slumber provoker. I don't care if it is my imagination. It works for me.

Kristi and Michelle, two of my waitresses, even gave me a tea garden for Christ-

mas. The seeds are just starting to poke through the soil. By the spring, peppermint and spearmint will be ready for transplanting to the outdoors. I look forward to brewing tea with the minty leaves.

Although tea will never be as popular as coffee in our country, over the past several years, we have seen the trend toward less caffeine and more flavored teas. The Lip-ton "Flow Thru" bags are no longer the norm. Now it is Oolong, Lapsang, Darjeeling, Rose Pouchong — much more exciting than the standard "breakfast blend."

Tea drinking originated in China centuries ago, but did not come to America until the 17th century. Tea has been cultivated there for more than 1,500 years. China dominated tea trading until 1850, after which other countries started to nose their way into the market.

China still grows what are considered the most marvelous teas in the world: black, green and oolong are manufactured

commercially, along with smoked and scented. They are best without milk, and with a bit of lemon. Oolong is considered a cross between a black and a green.

India is the world's largest producer and exporter of tea. The British planted tea as early as 1830. There are three main teas that are indigenous to India: Assam, Darjeeling and Nilgiri. Assam, the first and largest amount of land devoted to tea-growing, produces strong black teas. The medium grades are the mainstay of blended English teas and hold up well to milk.

Darjeeling in the foothills of the Himalayas, produces India's most prized teas. Due to the high altitudes, some of these varieties take up to 10 years to mature.

Nilgiri is the high plateau in the south of India. Its teas are used exclusively for blending.

Ceylon (Sri Lanka) is the world's third largest producer and second largest ex-

porter of teas. Tea was first planted there in the 1870s and became a principal cash crop when blight wiped out the country's coffee crop. Early growers and merchants set a high standard of excellence which is still recognized today. Ceylon teas are "high grown," and are strong but delicate, with a bit of bitterness. They are good with milk, but not so with lemon.

Tea has been grown and drunk in Japan since the 9th century. It has long played an important role in Japanese life. Green tea is principally produced and the demand is so great that little, if any, is exported.

Exotic teas have been produced for centuries. An early example is Earl Grey, a recipe given to the second Earl Grey in 1830 by a Chinese Mandarin. It is a blend of fine black teas covered with the oil of the Bergamot orange. Ginger, mint, spices, honey, lavender and almond are illustrations of other essences.

Fruit teas, such as lemon, orange, apple and coconut are some of my favorites, although flower teas are lovely too. Rose and jasmine can fill a room with summer.

Tisanes, or herb teas, have been used for centuries to relieve every form of distress known to man. They can be made from almost any edible plant. Elderflower is a mild stimulant, chamomile is a sedative, orange blossom helps ulcers and gastric problems, rosehips are a rich source of vitamin C, cowslip is recommended for skin disorders, and the list goes on and on.

Herbs such as fennel, a blood cleanser, peppermint, good for headaches; and rosemary, a spirit lifter, have been in medicine throughout the years for those who believe in their powers.

# Recipe grew by trial and error

For the debut of our new HomeTown Cooking feature, I thought I'd put my own culinary skills on the line.

People think it's kind of amusing that I'm as serious as I am about cooking. Young, single guys, they say, can't be trusted in the kitchen. Most of us think the four major food groups are Hamburger Helper, frozen TV dinners, pizza and beer.

Well, I'm here to debunk the myth, and perhaps offer some encouragement to my brethren. Mainly through trial and error, and a little hustle, I've learned that cooking is not only possible, but fun and a lot easier than other single males might think.

My own foray into that Adventureland known as the kitchen began when I was in high school. I'm the only son of a single mother, and when I was old enough to take care of myself, she decided to go back to night school to complete her degree in economics.

As many as four nights out of the average week, she'd leave me a five-spot to get my own dinner. In the beginning, I took the easy route: pizza from the local pizzeria, a burger at the diner on the corner, maybe a TV dinner. Usually it soaked up most of the five bucks.

As I cruised the aisles of the supermarket, though, I realized I could get a jar of sauce and some spaghetti for about two bucks, and pocket the difference. Then I bought a 35-cent can of tomato sauce and made my own spaghetti sauce, increasing my dividend.

Soon I developed into a cooking fiend. The shrewder I was with my food shopping, the richer I got. Mom was getting the degree in economics, but I was getting the lesson.

The cat got out of the bag when she figured out who was rilling her cookbooks all the time (how many suspects could there be?). Before long, she had me cooking dinner for the both of us.

Nowadays, the same principles apply. I can be shrewd and economical (I get by on less than \$100 a

month for food), and watch my nutrition as well. I get that sense of accomplishment from making something all my own. I've also learned what a sensuous pleasure dining in can be.

I have some cookbooks and my own recipe box (albeit a small one). The curried chicken recipe I've included here is typical of what I prepare, but it's unique in that I thought it up entirely on my own about five years ago.

I didn't even write down the recipe until about two years ago. It was one of those little-of-this, little-of-that kind of creations.

It can be prepared in 20 minutes, cooked in one skillet and served on one dish over rice. That's what the single man wants: quick preparation and a minimal clean-up.

I originally used whole, real sour cream, but switched to the light variety (Land O'Lakes makes a good one) to cut the fat. I've also tried substituting plain lowfat yogurt, but that experiment hasn't worked out. If anyone can tell me how to keep the yogurt from curdling, I'd appreciate a call.

### RICK'S QUICK CURRIED CHICKEN

- ½ cup white onion, chopped
- ½ cup green pepper, chopped
- ¼ teaspoon ground ginger
- One whole breast of chicken, filleted and fat removed, cut into bite-size chunks
- One teaspoon chicken bouillon mix
- ¼ cup water
- ¼ of an Ida Red or other cooking apple, diced
- ½ cup light sour cream
- ½ tablespoon curry (or more, to taste)

Prepare bouillon with base mix and water and set aside. Sauté onion, pepper, garlic and ginger in a little bit of oil until tender. Add chicken, and continue cooking until chicken is almost cooked through.

Add bouillon to chicken and vegetables. Bring to boil over a medium flame.

Turn heat to low and add apples, sour cream and curry (I use a full tablespoon of curry, but that's too spicy for most tastes.)

Heat through (about five minutes) then serve over a bed of cooked brown or white rice with a little chutney on the side.

AND SOUR SLAW  
(2 servings)

3 cups finely shredded red cabbage  
 1 cup shredded carrots  
 1/4 cup julienne-cut (matchstick pieces) red or yellow bell peppers  
 2 tablespoons each thinly sliced onion and celery  
 2 tablespoons golden raisins, plumped  
 2 teaspoons vegetable oil  
 1/4 teaspoon each granulated sugar, apple cider vinegar and honey  
 1/4 teaspoon lemon juice  
 Dash pepper

In large glass or stainless-steel bowl combine all ingredients; stir to combine. Cover and refrigerate until flavors blend, 30 minutes or overnight.

In small nonstick saucepan combine lemon juice, 1/4 cup water, the orange juice, sugar and lemon peel; sprinkle gelatin over juice mixture and let stand 1 minute to soften. Stir mixture to combine; cook over low heat, stirring frequently, until gelatin is dissolved, 1 to 2 minutes.

Transfer mixture to large mixing bowl; stir in whipped topping and set aside.

Using mixer on high speed, in large mixing bowl beat egg whites until frothy; add cream of tartar and continue beating until whites are stiff but not dry. Gently fold egg whites into gelatin mixture until mixture is thoroughly combined.

Into each of four 6-ounce dessert dishes pour 1/4 of gelatin mixture. Cover and refrigerate until firm, at least 1 hour (when gelatin mixture is chilled it will form 2 layers). Garnish each portion with 2 tablespoons raspberries.

## Blow the lid off pressure cooking myth

Mention "pressure cooker" to a dozen people, and 11 of them will respond — "My mother had one; they explode."

Toula Patsalis is doing her best to dispel the old fears about pressure cookers. "High tech has entered the kitchen," said Patsalis, cooking school director of the Kitchen Glamor stores in Novi and elsewhere. "The same technology that brought us compact disc players and microwave ovens has been applied to the pressure cooker which ranges in price from \$100 to \$200. Please put it in capital letters: THERE IS NO WAY A NEW PRESSURE COOKER CAN EXPLODE — EVER, EVER, EVER!"

About four years ago, Kitchen Glamor was approached by eight manufacturers of pressure cookers, proposing that their products be used in the cooking classes conducted in the four Kitchen Glamor stores in Rochester, West Bloomfield, Redford and Novi.

"We try to be open to anything new, so we agreed to test them and consider classes in pressure cooking. Well, they're a great toy; I played with them at home for a whole summer, and while I loved the cookers themselves, I also saw how ineffective were the manuals that accompanied them. They were either so simplified that the user was limited, or so technical that the user was put off entirely."

Patsalis began collecting recipes, sometimes modifying them to taste, and developing recipes of her own. The results, 235 recipes ranging from soups to chutneys to cheesecake, were compiled into a cookbook, "Joys of Pressure Cooking."

"I was really a convert to pressure cooking," said Patsalis. "It's the ideal cooking method for today's lifestyle. We're all concerned with nutrients. Pressure cooking offers one of the best ways to cook vegetables; the colors remain vibrant, the nutrients are retained, and most vegetables cook within a few minutes."

"And we all work. It's hard to get a meal on the table, synchronized with everything else we do. A pressure cooker can reduce the cooking time by as much as 70 percent."

Patsalis has offered the pressure cooking class in each store twice a year for three years. Average class size is 70 people, ranging in age from 25 to 70. Some of the older women

CHICKEN WITH TWO  
PEPPER NOODLES

1 cup sliced white onion  
 1/2 cup olive oil  
 3 clove garlic, crushed  
 4 chicken breast halves, each cut in halves (2 inches thick)  
 1 red bell pepper, seeded and sliced lengthwise  
 1 green pepper, seeded and sliced lengthwise  
 3 cups canned or fresh chicken broth  
 1 8-ounce can tomato sauce  
 1 tablespoon lemon juice  
 2 tablespoons brown sugar  
 2 teaspoons salt  
 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper  
 2 teaspoons dried basil  
 1 1/2 teaspoons oregano  
 1/4 teaspoon ground fennel  
 1 bay leaf  
 6 cups uncooked fettuccine noodles  
 1/2 cup (2 ounces) grated Fontina cheese  
 1/2 cup (2 ounces) grated Parmesan cheese 1 1/2%

Place heat diffuser over range burner. In pressure cooker, sauté onion in hot oil for 3 minutes. Add garlic, chicken pieces and peppers. Sauté on medium high for 3 minutes, stirring occasionally. Stir in broth, tomato sauce, lemon

juice, sugar and seasonings. Add noodles and stir again.

Secure lid. Over high heat, develop steam to high pressure. Reduce range heat to medium and cook for 10 minutes.

Release steam according to manufacturer's directions. Remove lid.

Combine cheeses. Remove bay leaf. Stir chicken and noodle mixture and transfer to serving bowl. Sprinkle with cheese.

BLACK EYED PEA  
AND SAUSAGE SOUP

2 cups (12 ounces) dried black-eyed peas  
 water  
 1/4 pound bacon, cut in 1 inch pieces  
 1 cup minced red onion  
 2 teaspoons chopped garlic  
 6 cups canned or fresh chicken broth  
 3 tablespoons tomato paste  
 2 teaspoons dried Greek oregano  
 1 bay leaf  
 1 teaspoon coarse sea salt  
 1 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes  
 3 tablespoons brown sugar  
 1/4 pound turkey kielbasa, cut in 1 inch pieces  
 1/2 cup chopped green pepper

Sort dried peas and remove any foreign particles. Place in large

strainer and rinse under warm running water, tossing to thoroughly clean peas. Pour into bowl and add water to measure 2 inches above peas. Let soak for 6 hours. Drain peas and set aside.

In pressure cooker, combine bacon, onion and garlic. Cook over high heat until bacon sizzles. Reduce heat to medium high and cook until onion is transparent, about 3 minutes.

Add peas to bacon mixture and stir well. Add broth, tomato paste and seasonings. Stir until thoroughly mixed.

Secure lid. Over high heat, develop steam to high pressure. Reduce range heat to medium high and cook for 5 minutes.

Release steam according to manufacturer's directions. Remove lid.

Add kielbasa and green pepper to pea mixture. Bring to a boil over high heat and cook, uncovered, for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Serve soup with chunks of hard-crusted bread.

Prepared soup may be frozen.

For a quick presoak of peas, combine peas and 4 cups water in pressure cooker. Secure lid. Over high heat, develop steam to high pressure. Turn range heat off and allow steam to slowly decrease. Remove lid. Drain peas and set aside until ready to use in soup recipe.

Patsalis insists that it's all a matter of confidence. "Most problems come from overcooking; that means you don't have the timing down pat. It's essential that you acquire a good timer along with the cooker. You can't put it on the stove and go to church."

"Everyone looks for different textures in foods. If you love veggies crisp, shave a few seconds off the time. Experiment — you'll be forever grateful."

are still using their 50-year-old Prestos.

"The new generation of pressure cookers are stainless steel with an aluminum core," said Patsalis. "Aluminum conducts heat, but if there is acid in a recipe, cooking in aluminum alone will impart a metallic taste to the finished dish."

"If I have a class of 80 people, and ask how many are afraid of pressure cookers, 40 people will put up their hands. If I ask how many of them have never cooked with a pressure cooker, the same 40 will show their hands," said Patsalis.

An enthusiastic alumna of Patsalis' class is Shirley Nachman of Southfield.

"I never put my pressure cooker away. I even bought one for my daughter who lives in Florida so I can cook with it when I visit her," said Nachman. "She's a working mother, and she's converted to pressure cooking also."

Nachman, who's working to establish a local chapter of the American Institute of Wine & Food, owns upward of 1,000 cookbooks. She gives the highest praise to Patsalis' book.

"It's a wonderful book to read as well as cook out of. Everything I've tried has been a success; the recipes are foolproof, and the flavors are intense because the cooking time is minimal. The cheesecake is the creamiest ever."

## Cut fat, calories but keep the flavor

Remember munching on cookies dunked in whole milk, pie à la mode, chips 'n dip and homemade candy? Those are food memories of yesteryear's foods, but times are changing as the link between diet and health become very important. Food alone can't make you healthy but good eating habits can help and even improve your health. Good nutrition is not torture or dull!

Hectic lifestyles allow us little time to cook, yet we're unwilling to settle for second rate food. Consumer confusion over facts and fallacies of good nutrition choices add to the food and eating dilemma.

We need to keep in step with the trend toward leaner, lighter foods by modifying what we already eat. Make modification and adjustments in the types and amounts of ingredients in recipes. Very few recipes need to be followed exactly to assure a good quality product.

Cut back on fat in a recipe. Fat provides flavor and richness, improves texture, tenderness and flakiness in baked goods. Fat is also full of calories and usually cholesterol. Try reducing fat by one-fourth to one-third in baked products.

Decrease the proportion of oil in homemade salad dressings. Try one-third oil to two-thirds vinegar. Use skim or low-fat milk instead of whole milk or, for richness, try evaporated skim milk. Eat fresh fruit for dessert rather than pies and other hidden fat concoctions.

Use two egg whites or an egg substitute product instead of one whole egg. In some recipes simply decrease the total number of eggs. Look for margarine in which the liquid vegetable oil is the first ingredient. To substitute liquid oil for solid fat, use about one-fourth less than the recipe calls for.

If a recipe calls for one-fourth cup of solid fat, use three tablespoons of oil. For best results for a cake or pie, use a recipe that specifically calls for oil because liquid fats require special mixing procedures and a different proportion of sugar.

There are also nutrition-wise kitchen tools. Use non-stick pans for sautéing meats, or making omelets. These pans allow foods to be fried

with very little oil or use a non-stick spray. Using an inexpensive vegetable steamer can limit the nutrient loss as they cook with a moist steam heat.

A kitchen scale can help with portion size. It is particularly helpful if you're watching calories and want to control the intake of fatty foods. A skimmer/strainer removes congealed fat from the tops of stews and soups. This can substantially reduce fat content and number of calories in soups and stews.

Don't forget the microwave oven for helping to reduce fats and calories. Since the microwave cooks with moist heat, there is no need to use butter or oil. The fast cooking also helps preserve vitamins and minerals in foods. A hot-air popcorn popper keeps the popcorn snack low in calories and free of fat since no oil or butter is required.

Reduce sugar by one-quarter to one-third in quick breads, cookies, pie filling, custards, puddings and fruit crisps. Do not reduce sugar in yeast breads as it acts as food for yeast. Sugar provides flavor, volume, improves texture, tenderness and browning in baked goods. However, lowering the sugar amount will not destroy your product. If you have decreased the sugar, increase the amount of cinnamon or vanilla in a recipe to enhance the impression of sweetness.

When using a non sugar sweetener, it is best to choose recipes especially tested for use with them.

Do not omit salt in yeast breads because it helps control the rising action of yeast. Do not reduce or omit salt in cured meats or pickled or brined vegetables but, salt may be omitted or reduced in most recipes. If a recipe calls for one teaspoon of salt, try one-half teaspoon. Reduce the amount gradually and you'll adjust quickly to the less salty flavor.

Choose fresh or low sodium version of soup, broth, soy sauce, canned vegetables and tomato products. Use garlic or onion powder instead of garlic and onion salt. Rely on herbs and spices rather than salt for flavor. Instead of using broth or bouillon, use fruit juices or wine for cooking liquid.

Admittedly, wines are born in the vineyard, but they are raised in the cellar. Silverado wines are essentially Stuart's skillful interpretation of what the Silverado vineyards deliver.

"My job has been to listen to what the vineyard is telling me," Stuart contends. "It is my goal to make the wine in a manner that best expresses the qualities and characteristics of the vineyards. This is especially true of our cabernet sauvignon, a single-vineyard wine."

Silverado's style of cabernet sauvignon is characteristic of the Stags Leap District and, more particularly,

of Silverado's estate vineyards. "There is a thread of distinctiveness from vintage to vintage," Stuart reports. "Our young wines showcase cherry, cassis, raspberry and blackberry fruit plus notes of cedar and mint with a soft structure."

In 1986, Silverado initiated a Limited Reserve wine program that highlights exceptional wines from excellent vineyards. The decision to bottle a Limited Reserve is made after the wine has been produced and evaluated. These are not single vineyard designations and are not made in every year. They are Stuart's selections as the best wines of the year — what he calls his "super-selections."

## Checking for fresh fish

may mean the fish is old.

Check to make certain that there is no darkening around the edges of the fish or brown or yellowish discoloration, especially if these areas appear dry or mushy.

If you are still uncertain about how fresh the fish is, ask to have it rinsed under cold water and then smell it. Fresh fish should have no fishy or ammonia smell.

Shellfish should be lively. The shells of hard clams, mussels and oysters should be closed, or close when their shells are tapped. The necks of steamer clams should twitch when their shells are tapped. Crabs should move when touched, and when picked up, lobster tails should curl under their bodies.


When buying frozen fish, whole fish should be clear of ice crystals with no discoloration. Fillets or steaks should be solidly frozen in the

package. There should be no signs of frost or ice particles inside the package. If ice crystals are present, the fish has either been stored for a long period or thawed and refrozen.

After shopping, get seafood home and into the refrigerator as soon as possible. Keep it in the "meat keeper" drawer or the coldest part of your refrigerator. Eat it within 24 hours or freeze it. Use frozen fish within one to six months.

Do not thaw frozen seafood at room temperature. Thaw it in the refrigerator or defrost in the microwave oven.

Rinse seafood in cold water for several seconds to remove surface bacteria before cooking. Fish is done when the flesh is opaque and begins to flake easily when tested with a fork at the thickest part. You can also check with a thermometer. Fish is ready when its internal temperature reaches 145 degrees F.



# Grammys track evolution of musical culture

## Awards keep up with times (almost)

In a culture that seems to be award-happy, the ever-growing variety of statuettes, plaques, trophies and obelisks almost cheapen the tribute, to everyone but the honoree, of course. Fortunately, there are awards recognized by everyone as the pinnacle of accolades: Pulitzers for journalism; Oscars for motion picture achievements. For the music industry, nothing beats a Grammy. "The 34th Annual Grammy Awards" will be presented on CBS Tuesday, Feb. 25, live from Radio City Music Hall, with Whoopi Goldberg acting as host.

Besides bestowing acclaim upon artists, composers and engineers, the Grammy awards serve as a mirror for popular musical culture. Looking back at the awards' history of categorization, one can determine the relative importance and acceptance of disparate genres, as well as the musical climate of the time. While we may wax nostalgic to recall that the Best New Artist of 1964 was the Beatles, it is hard to believe that 1962's Best Rock 'n' Roll Recording was "Alley Cat" by Bent Fabric.

The evolution of Grammys categorization since those first ceremonies for the year 1958 has largely been the distillation of catch-all divisions into its specifics. With the exceptions of the years 1961 to 1964, Rock 'n' Roll was lumped into the Contemporary/Pop divisions until 1979, when it was granted four categories of its own. (Hard Rock/Metal was defined in 1988.) Folk yielded Polka in 1985 and Bluegrass in 1988. Other divisions, such as Rhythm & Blues in 1968, were expanded along with their audiences.

Some categories have been created to embrace new or newly popular genres (Jazz Fusion, 1970; Reggae, 1984; New Age, 1986; Rap, 1988), but only one flash-in-the-pan category was ever deleted because the musical form lost its relevance: 1979's Best Disco Recording. (Its ironic title was "I Will Survive" by Gloria Gaynor.)

Michael Greene, president and CEO of the National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences, explains that category revisions are done by committee vote.

A prime example of change is in one of this year's new categories.

"World Music was a problem in the terms that those artists were being thrown into either Latin or Pop, and they really didn't have any chance of competing in those areas because they just weren't appropriate," Greene said. "As the record companies got more involved in World Music internationally, then it was the appropriate time to add the category."

Coming full circle, the once omnibus division of Pop will reach maturity this year with the addition of the Traditional Pop category, which will accommodate the likes of Harry Connick Jr. And the Grammys still are playing catch-up; consider the long-overdue Lifetime Achievement awards granted this year to the late guitar virtuoso Jimi Hendrix and bluesmaster Muddy Waters, and the belated entrance to the Hall of Fame of Patsy Cline's "Crazy" (1961) and Ravel's "Bolero" (1937). In an industry in which the product is timeless, sometimes recognition comes a little late.

Host Whoopi Goldberg holds the most prestigious award in the music industry: the Grammy. On Tuesday, Feb. 25, "The 34th Annual Grammy Awards" presentation will be broadcast live on CBS from Radio City Music Hall.

### UCLA Bruins seek new glory

It all started in 1964, the year a future NBA Hall of Famer named Walt Hazzard led UCLA to its first NCAA basketball championship. The Bruins continued to dominate the game for the next 12 years, winning 10 national titles under coach John Wooten.

Players Lew Alcindor (Kareem Abdul-Jabbar) and Bill Walton led their team to numerous victories during those years, but since then, the Bruins have never again reached the heights attained by their illustrious alumni.

When UCLA goes up against Notre

Dame on NBC Saturday, Feb. 22, the Bruins will be led by a 6'10" senior who hopes to return his team to its former glory. In three seasons, forward Don MacLean has emerged as the Bruins' most prolific scorer since Alcindor, and last year he became the fourth UCLA player ever to score more than 700 points in a season. At his present pace, MacLean will hold both the school and PAC-10 career scoring records by NCAA Tournament time in March.

But the Bruins, who became the PAC-10 frontrunners when they upset preseason favorite Arizona, are far from a one-dimensional team. With players Tracy Murray and Derrick Martin in supporting roles, they may be the ones to put a stop to the current nonsense about a Duke Blue Devils dynasty when the final four meet in Minneapolis.
