Engler again leaves out track money

Despite what Gov. John Engler called an effective presentation by the mayors of Northville and Livonia, the cities may not see a dime of state-recaptured racetrack revenues in this fiscal year or in 1993.

"We did not recommend it for '93. But it is one issue that is in front of the Legislature," Engler said in an interview with *The Northville Record* recently.

"That issue has been part of a \$1.8-billion problem I inherited in 1991," he said. "Now we have to ask ourselves, how do we restructure the budget to meet our obligations? I've put everything on the table including funds reserved for cities with racetracks and those with stadiums. The debate is ongoing, and that is one of the outstanding issues."

Northville Mayor Chris Johnson said he was disappointed when

Township bides time on cable

The township board has settled on a negotiating plan for its cable television contract.

The strategy seems simple: Board members decided to sit back and do nothing for a year.

Inaction may be the best way — for now — to deal with a complicated, costly, and possibly controversial issue, Trustee Richard Allen said at the board's Feb. 13 meeting.

Allen, who headed up a cable contract review committee, recommended the township eventually consider aligning itself with Canton Township and Municon, the New York-based firm that specializes in cable contract negotiations.

Canton Township represents the largest base of Omnicon Cablevision subscribers and last year hooked up with Municon to handle its negotiation chores. Now Canton is looking to share Municon expenses with other communities in the Omnicon coverage area.

Northville city and Plymouth Township reportedly have agreed to split negotiation costs with Canton, but Northville Township officials say their budgetary cupboard is too bare to pay its share of consulting costs.

But Canton may be willing to let the township join the negotiating squad next year. In the meantime, the township could budget cable ne-

gotiation funds for 1993.

Canton already has paid Municon more than \$50,000, and the bill is expected to rise. A proposed five-community agreement with Municon would see Northville Township paying just over 16 percent of Municon's costs.

Northville city would pay about 6 percent of the tab, based on the proposed agreement.

Township board members initially were wary of Municon, but Allen said his research indicated the group has been successful in cable renegotiations across the country. Allen said Municon was "capable of doing the job" in local cable talks, but he suggested the board "gather... material and sit" until the township can afford to pay for the service.

Clerk Tom Cook agreed with Allen, and noted that the federal government had recently renewed its interest in the cable television industry.

Northville Township last month held a public hearing to receive residents' input on Omnicon services. At that time, several residents voiced displeasure with costs and services associated with the firm that in 1979 gained the area's cable franchise.

Omnicon's contract with Northville Township expires in August 1994, and the city's contract is up shortly thereafter. Public hearings are part of a multiple phase renegotiation plan outlined under federal cable television statutes.



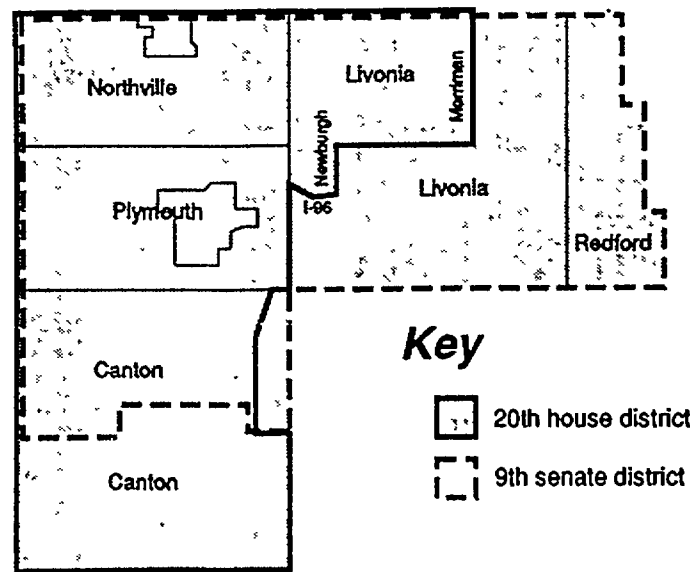

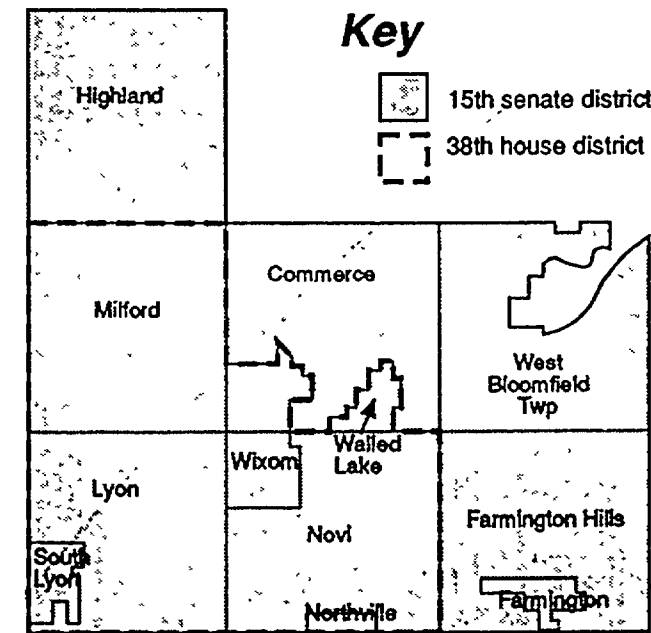

Redistricting plan released

A redistricting plan unveiled Thursday forces at least three of this area's state representatives into battling for re-election or moving to another district to keep their posts.

Rep. Georgina Goss, Rep. Willis Bullard and Sen. Jack Faxon all

must either move or face possible face-offs against other incumbent legislators under the new plan.

A Michigan Supreme Court-appointed panel of judges drew the new district lines. The plan has not been approved by the high court and will not go into effect until 1993, but already some local state legislators are shuffling to keep their jobs.

Northville likely will not lose Rep. Georgina Goss, R-Northville, in the House of Representatives. But as of Friday, Goss and Rep. Lyn Bankes, R-Livonia, shared the newly formed House District 20. District 20 covers Northville Township, part of the City of Northville, Plymouth, and part of Livonia.

Goss said the proposed lines put

her and Bankes in an unfortunate situation.

"I think it's a real shame that the only two female Republican legislators in Wayne County are pitted against each other," she said.

Goss said she has "the greatest respect" for Bankes, but added that she

Senator considers judge's conduct

Not everyone at the Feb. 11 sentencing of Kenneth Loveday was there to hear what Judge Francis X. O'Brien had to say about the case.

Some were there to hear how he said it.

State Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, sent two aides to the Feb. 5 date first scheduled for Loveday's sentencing to monitor the judge's performance. O'Brien's behavior during Loveday's trial was the subject of a column in the Jan. 13 *Northville Record*, a column that may have

caught the senator's eye.

"The conduct of the judge is what caught his attention," said Geake's top administrative aide Bill Sullivan, who monitored the hearing along with legislative aide Bill Kordenbrock.

The two men did not see the actual sentencing that day. O'Brien recessed the court just after 4 p.m. to read a number of letters sent to the court on the victims' behalf urging that Loveday be given the maximum sentence, and he did not return to court.

will run for the seat if necessary. But a runoff may not be necessary.

Banks said Friday she hopes to represent the new House District 19, which covers most of Livonia and north Redford Township. But her Livonia home is only eight blocks inside of the district she shares with Goss. She hopes the Supreme Court or the Legislature will slightly alter district lines to move her home into the unrepresented new House District 19.

If the lines are not changed, Banks said she may move so she can represent the vacant district.

Goss said Friday that Republicans are optimistic about the new plan, but both political parties face difficulties in some areas as a result of the proposed lines.

Republicans had control of the state Senate under the old plan, but Democrats maintained an 11-vote majority in the House.

Northville Sen. R. Robert Geake will continue to represent Northville residents. The new Senate District 9 includes Northville Township, the City of Northville south of Baseline Road, Plymouth, Redford Township and part of Canton Township.

The City of Northville north of Baseline, along with Novi and some other communities currently in state Rep. Willis Bullard's district, is left unrepresented by the new plan. But Bullard, R-Highland, said it is "very, very likely" he will move to the newly formed district.

Bullard said he has represented over 80 percent of the new House Dis-

trict 38 in the past. If Bullard decides to move, his new constituents would include Wixom and Walled Lake residents.

The district Bullard falls into under the new plan is shared with Rep. Thomas Middleton, R-Ortonville.

Bullard said Friday his final decision could be expected within a week. He said his "final, final, final decision" will not be made until after the Supreme Court approves the new district lines on April 15.

But he said the Supreme Court is expected to "rubber stamp" its panel's decision.

Bullard said he has not studied the new district lines thoroughly, but added that any kind of a fair plan

would give Republicans control of the state House of Representatives.

Bullard said he hopes to gain power, including a possible seat as chair of a committee, if Republicans gain control of the House.

Although northern Northville is left with a vacant seat in the House of Representatives under the proposed district lines, two state Senators find themselves sharing that area's one Senate seat.

Those Northville and Novi residents now represented by Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, fall into a new Senate District 15. And both Faxon and Sen. David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield, live in that new district.

Faxon and Honigman will be forced into a runoff, if Faxon does not move. Faxon said the district would be difficult to win for a Democrat.

But Honigman said he is considering tossing his hat into a race for U.S. Congress, depending upon how national redistricting works out.

Faxon said he may look to a vacant district, which includes West Bloomfield, Pontiac and Southfield.

But he stressed that the current lines are not cast in stone until the Supreme Court makes its decision.

Faxon said he is unhappy with the way his former district was divided.

"They didn't chop up anyone else's

district the way they chopped up mine," Faxon said.

Honigman said he looks forward to meeting his possible new constituents, including local residents. Honigman said he already is familiar with the area, in part because Novi City Council Member Tim Pope works for the senator.

The Supreme Court is accepting input on the new district lines. Comment must be filed with the court by March 2.

States must draw new district lines every 10 years when census figures are calculated to show shifting population counts. Michigan's total of 110 House districts and 38 Senate districts does not change.

The House Judiciary Committee last week voted to add a judgeship to the court which serves the City of Northville, Township of Northville, Township of Plymouth, City of Plymouth, and Township of Canton. All five local governments had earlier approved the addition, and it was recommended in a report from the state Supreme Court.

The full Legislature and Gov. John Engler must still give their approval.

The committee also moved ahead with adding two Oakland Circuit Court judges and judges in several

other Metro Detroit district courts — at the same time rejecting the Supreme Court's call for "sunsetting" three underworked urban judges.

Judge Cunningham, Oakland Circuit Court administrator, gave the panel charts showing the criminal caseload had risen nearly 10 percent a year — from 5,269 in 1985 to 7,856 last year.

Total circuit court filings in the same period rose from 22,985 to 30,762 or nearly 6 percent a year.

Oakland has 16 circuit judges and would elect two more in 1992 if the bill becomes law.

The committee had little to argue about as it added those judges to a House Bill 5437, sponsored by Rep

Claude Trum, R-Springfield.

Deadline is May 12 for candidates to file for the Aug. 4 primary.

The arguments were over whether to "sunset," through retirement, one district judge apiece in Pontiac, Flint, Lansing and Muskegon.

The panel dropped only a Muskegon position after judges in the other areas pleaded that the Supreme Court's figures inaccurately represented their workloads.

The judiciary committee left unresolved the Supreme Court's proposal to add nine Court of Appeals judges to the 24-judge bench, at least until the districting question is resolved. Michigan currently has three Court of Appeals districts, which

must have equal numbers of judges.

Some experts say Michigan's three-district system may violate the federal Voting Rights Act because it is so difficult for blacks, concentrated in Detroit, to get elected from their five-county district.

In addition, Gov. John Engler's budget for the fiscal year starting Oct. 1 provides no new money for a massive expansion of the Court of Appeals.

But Chief Judge Martin Doctoroff of Birmingham told lawmakers, "The Court of Appeals is drowning" in work.

Two years ago, its backlog was 1,400 cases; today it's 4,500.

"We're aware of the cost involved that's for you to resolve," said Doctoroff, who was elected by his peers less than a month ago.

New recreation official looks to add programs

Increasing teen involvement and the number of teen programs offered through the recreation department is one of several goals the new assistant director of the Northville Parks and Recreation department has set for himself.

John Powe, 25, said Thursday he hopes to have a number of new programs available to teens by the end of the year. Included on his priority lists are basketball, volleyball, and soccer tournaments for teenagers and a host of other plans targeted specifically to teens, preschoolers and some adult activities.

Powe started with the recreation department in January. Prior to his hire, he worked as a recreational programmer and intern in Independence Township. A December 1990 graduate of Central Michigan University, Powe earned his degree in Parks and Recreation Administration with a concentration in community recreation.

As an assistant director in Northville's department, Powe will have similar responsibilities to the ones he had as a programmer in Independence Township.

"I'm doing the same kind of thing, but I have more responsibilities here. Here I'm in charge of athletic and special events," he said.

Even though his job descriptions may differ, Powe sees similarities between Independence Township and Northville that have eased his transition.

"I like the community itself. I like the quaintness of it," he said. "It's very similar to Clarkston with similar demographics and layout."

Topping off his pet projects for the year is the advent of a 3-on-3 basketball tournament, identical to the Gus Macker Tournament which originated in Belding, north of Grand Rapids, and is played throughout the state.

Bringing national and state physical-fitness programs to Northville — the Punt, Pass and Kick tournament and the Hershey

Track program — are also some of Powe's personal goals for the job.

"It's good for youths to get involved. Programs like these promote physical fitness," he said.

Powe said he hopes to increase enrollment in community recreational programs by tailoring programs to meet the needs of youths. Outside of athletic programs, Powe is working on initiating and coordinating preschool day-camp programs, environmental awareness and recycling programs, and enhancing existing athletic programs.

"We are going to need more teen programs and team activities. I expect a big response for the 3-on-3 tournament because it follows the regular youth basketball league and the kids will still be pumped up from their league," he said.

Environmental issues are also a priority for Powe, who is an avid recycler. In addition to starting a recycling program, he hopes to organize a composting workshop, start a plant-a-tree program and make plans for Earth Day 1992.

"I'm very conscious of it (recycling). I'm more conscientious of it than most," he said. "Parks are a resource and are good for the environment."

Powe said he wasn't exactly sure what type of recycling program was in place in Northville, but he did say it was a goal of his to enhance it and make it more comprehensive.

"Depending on what it is, I'd like to add to it. And start a recycling program inside the office first so that we aren't hypocrites," he said.

The sentencing was held Feb. 11, and Sullivan was there to hear it. Geake said the aides were there in part "to provide moral support to the family and the community."

But other reasons included the nature of the crime and the fact that Loveday was convicted of negligent homicide despite the original, more severe charge of involuntary manslaughter with a motor vehicle.

Involuntary manslaughter with a motor vehicle is a felony punishable by up to 15 years in prison, while the maximum sentence for the misdemeanor charge of negligent homicide is two years.

"I personally of course have been very concerned that this seems to be a very light sentence, considering that two people were killed and that Mr. Loveday had a record of marijuana abuse and other driving violations," Geake said.

"There seems to be a widespread

feeling among observers familiar with the case that the sentence was very light . . . The prosecutor felt, and I believe most witnesses to the trial felt, that the most appropriate verdict would have been involuntary manslaughter with a motor vehicle," he said.

O'Brien sentenced Loveday to 15 to 24 months in prison Feb. 11 — one month less than the maximum — and credited him for the six months he had spent in jail awaiting trial.

Loveday, 20, was convicted Jan. 9 of negligent homicide in the June 5 deaths of Hanania and Abdounour on Eight Mile Road just east of Beck Road. His westbound Jeep Wrangler struck the two joggers after Loveday swerved off the road into their path.

He claimed that he swerved to avoid a gray pickup truck, but the claim was not supported by other witnesses to the incident. Passenger Michael Gibson testified that the two had smoked marijuana minutes before Loveday struck the joggers.

No track return in 1993 budget

news that the governor had not recommended the mayors' request for reimbursement of the track tax funds in the 1993 budget. He added that he had not been notified of the decision by the governor's office.

"I'm immensely disappointed," Johnson said Friday in reaction to Engler's comments. "I know they are trying to cut the state expenses, but I just don't think robbing local governments is the way to do it."

Johnson joined Livonia Mayor Robert Bennett, State Budget Director Patti Woodworth, Sen. Robert Geake (R-Northville), Rep. Georgina Goss (R-Northville), and Rep. Lyn Bankes (R-Livonia) in a Jan. 16 meeting with the governor to plead the ci-

ties' case for reimbursement.

"They made a very effective presentation," Engler said. "I'm sensitive to the impact it has on Northville, where it is very dramatic, and even in Livonia. The track takes a significant portion of the Northville's budget."

State taxes on racetrack revenues from Northville Downs have contributed a significant portion to the city's budget. The state keeping those funds decreases the city's annual revenues by 25 percent, which accounts for a \$735,000 net loss, city officials said.

In the state budgeting process, the Blanchard administration opted to keep an estimated \$20 million in annual taxes that the state takes from track revenues. Under the State Racing Statute of 1984, the state has the

power to return up to \$900,000 of track taxes from each community.

Though he didn't recommend return of the funds in the new budget which is going into effect Oct. 1, Engler did say the meeting between state and city officials offered some hope.

"Based on that meeting we are looking at some options," he said. "But the 1992 budget still has some unresolved issues which are difficult. The purpose of giving revenues to cities was to provide services to tracks and offset the loss of property tax."

Engler's decision to keep all of that money this fiscal year led the city to cut jobs and raise taxes as part of its deficit-reduction plan.

The consequences of Engler's de-

cision have yet to present themselves in full light. Traditionally, Engler said, state tax revenues pay for city services — police, fire, and utilities — at the racetrack.

"I'm not very happy. It means we have to go ahead with the deficit-reduction plan as designed — which is a worst-case scenario," Johnson said.

For Northville, the consequences have been passed on to the city's police department, which will lose two full-time and four part-time positions as a result of budget cuts and the outcome of the deficit reduction plan. On April 1, one full-time police officer will be laid off and another would go if the racetrack stops paying for police services.

High time for drainage dispute to be settled

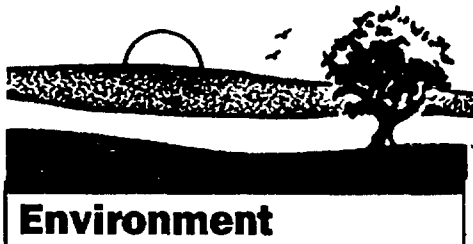
There comes a time when you just throw up your hands and say, "Enough is enough." In the ongoing disagreement between government officials and area resident Laura Lorenzo, that time is now.

How do things get so out of control? Because, at least in part, both sides can claim firm ground for their arguments. Lorenzo does have a serious drainage problem, and various governmental officials have spent a lot of time and money researching it.

Lorenzo's yard — within the City of Novi, but bordering Northville — suffers from severe flooding. She attributes this in large part to restrictive culverts involved in the construction of Northville's Pheasant Hills subdivision, but agrees that her property also falls in an unfortunate position regarding other drainage problems. Other lots in Lorenzo's Lexington Green subdivision apparently drain onto her land, and in extreme floods a nearby detention pond can overflow into her yard as well.

The City of Novi offered to redirect the Lexington Green drainage, an offer Lorenzo refused because it didn't address all the problems. This decision is puzzling, because although she's right — her property would still retain water — it would at least take care of the problems which, even by her analysis, involve the City of Novi.

At a Northville city council meeting last month, Lorenzo and the city council heard an overview report from the city engineers on all these issues. McNeely and Lincoln recommended that the city petition the Oakland County Drain Commissioner for a Pheasant Hills culvert-maintenance program, discuss future water discharge levels with Novi officials, and monitor the area to prevent any illegal filling or dumping.

Combined with Novi's offer, those actions would go a long way toward solving the drainage problems. But still Lorenzo speaks of filing a negligence lawsuit, and at the most recent meeting added an accusation of illegal wetlands filling against Singh Development and the City of Northville.

We can understand Lorenzo's frustration with her drainage problems and the delays involved in dealing with various local, county, state and federal bureaucracies. When she rejects partial solutions out-of-hand, however, she at least appears to be more interested in lawsuits than in problem-solving.

Having seen her genuine concern for environmental issues demonstrated often publicly in the past, we don't think that's her true feeling. But that is the impression she presents, with no recognition that Northville has spent upwards of \$8,000 looking into her problem, on top of Novi's effort.

Enough is enough. The City of Northville is getting opinions from its own attorney, the Department of Natural Resources, and the Federal Emergency Management Agency on whether it's done everything it's supposed to do. That's fine; and in the meantime we'd like to see both Northville and Novi pursue the partial remedies already suggested. If that's not enough, we don't know what is.

Animals are starting to act up



In the woods behind my apartment in Woodland Glen, the animals are starting to act up.

The management folks here are pretty easy-going as far as the landscaping is concerned. If you have a ground-floor apartment, they'll let you plant flower gardens and whatnot. As long as you don't bring in a backhoe and a contractor, they encourage exterior decorating.

One of the neighbors has installed a bird feeder, mounted atop a pole. There is some anti-squirrel netting on it, but apparently, it wasn't doing much good. I saw the resident doing something to the pole, but thought nothing of it until a day or two later when I spied one of the neighborhood squirrels trying to shimmy his way up the pole.

The poor critter would take a running leap at the pole, jump a couple of feet off the ground, and hug the pole for dear life. Just as quickly, he'd slide back down to the bottom. He'd stare at the pole, deep in thought, and try it again.

I'll say one thing for squirrels. They sure are persistent. This must have gone on for a half hour before he figured out that the reward of some stolen birdseed wasn't worth the frustration.

I, the dumb human, figured out after his second try that

this squirrel had been outwitted by a higher-order species. My neighbor had greased the pole of the bird feeder in order to spare the birds a meal.

However, the longer I watched this scene, the more I realized it was quite a metaphor for the City of Northville and its efforts to get the roughly \$800,000 in funds that the state has recaptured from the Northville Downs.

I think of the city as the hapless squirrel leaping up the pole time after time, only to find it greased by The Big Guy, and not really understanding why. He looks up, knows the reward is there and thinks he deserves it.

The birds want a meal, and so does the squirrel. Both have endured a pretty rough winter. In fact, the squirrel probably has been in hibernation all winter, and is probably looking for his first meal in a long time.

It made me wonder, how great a cost would it be for my neighbor to put out enough food for both the squirrels and the birds? It was then that I realized that maybe it isn't a matter of the cost of the feed.

Looking at the big picture, my neighbor probably views stocking his bird feeder as a charitable act. Problem is, he's got it set in his mind that he wants to feed birds, not squirrels. It doesn't matter that both are equally hungry and equally deserving.

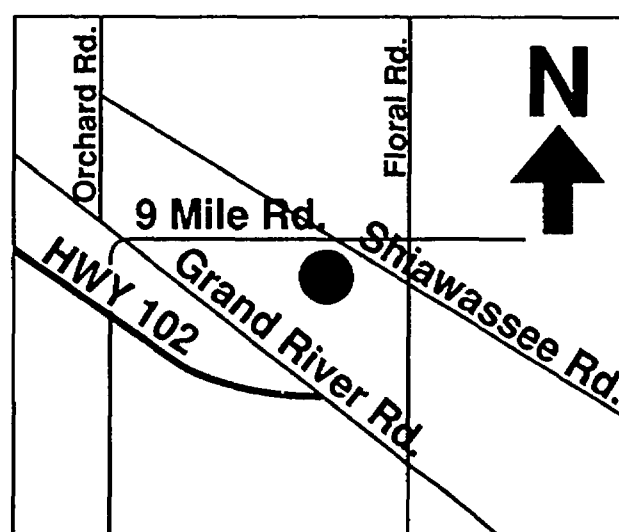

Nordic folk call vodka the 'water of life'

Nearly all regional beverages developed due to an abundance of a given raw material or because the beverage paired so well with the region's food.

Scandinavian aquavit and vodkas are no exception. Vodka and aquavit are primarily associated with northern European countries. They are well-suited to the region's hearty fare.

Aquavit, translated "water of life," is the national beverage of the Scandinavian countries and has been considered a cure for various ailments since the 16th century.

Production methods for aquavit are similar in Denmark (where it is called Akvavit), Norway and Sweden, although there are some variations in the proportion of the principal flavoring, caraway seed.

Danes have been producing a nearly neutral, colorless spirit from both grain and potatoes for about 400 years. Today's Akvavit from Aalborg is typical of the Scandinavian favorite drink.

Each potato used in its production has sufficient starch for a single shot. Aalborg makes more than 10 types of potato spirits, using the flavored caraway as well as dill, coriander, bog myrtle, fennel, angelica and cinnamon.

At their inception, Scandinavian vodkas were distilled in primitive alembics from any available carbohydrates, grains as well as potatoes. They probably had little appeal by today's refined standards.

All spirits are perfectly colorless when they run off the still. In whisky, color comes later, by extraction from wooden casks during aging or by addition of caramel.

It may be assumed that northern Europeans did not practice aging and thereby mellowing their spirits in wooden barrels because the rigors of the climate made it impractical.

Eventually, improved production methods and strict quality controls allowed even northern Europeans to produce colorless spirits like vodka that have a singular character.

Production methods for vodka differ from one country to another and from one producer to another. Basically, as in the case with whiskey, the grain is made into a mash, fermented and put through a continuous still.

The distillate is collected at about 190 degrees F. and is almost entirely free of the congeners that impart distinctive flavor characteristics to whiskey.

Ingestion of these congeners, or flavor elements, also happen to be the root cause of the headache experienced by many people, even those consuming at moderate levels. Dyed-in-the-wool vodka drinkers claim they never experience headaches. This is not a myth. The headache claim has its basis in scientific fact.

Absolut vodka from Sweden is our personal favorite. It has distinctive, yet delicate aromas with substantial body and elegant, sophisticated finish. Finlandia from Finland has slightly more body and flavor than American vodkas.

It's clean and dry, but in our opinion, lacks a taste distinction. Denaka from Denmark is similar.

Wine aficionados are always looking for taste and distinguishing flavors. It's in our genes!

The Eskimo word for glacier gives Germeq, a vodka from Denmark, its name. It symbolizes the fact that its water content comes from the

Downhill saucier Local chef heats up the slopes for charity

Chefs around the Midwest will be trading in their oven mitts for ski gloves next weekend at the Grand Marnier Chefs Ski Race at Boyne Highlands.

This tongue-in-cheek charity event began 18 years ago when a few New York chefs got together to raise money for an injured colleague. Since then, it snowballed into a national event, which this year is expected to draw 1,500 culinarians to five regional (of which the Boyne event is just one). Top finishers advance to a national final at New Mexico's Taos Ski Valley in April.

The competition isn't limited to chefs either. Any professional in the hotel, restaurant and bar business is welcome, from culinary student up to restaurant owner.

While NASTAR amateur skiing rules govern the competition, organizers throw in a few curves to spice things up. Skiers must race down the slalom course in a complete chef's coat, toque blanche (the traditional tall chef's hat) and an apron bearing his or her racing number.

Competition is divided into five age groups for men, and three for women. Tom MacKinnon, owner of MacKinnon's restaurant in Northville, calls the Chefs Ski Race "a blast."

"I won two years in a row, then last year I went about 20 feet and did a bunch of barrel rolls," said MacKinnon. "But even if you don't ski, there's things like the chef's coat competition."

Yes, there are points for style on the slopes. A separate award is given for the best decorated chef's coat. The coats may be festooned with feathers, lights and fur or whatever the creator has in mind. MacKinnon has won before with a hand-

painted coat.

"This year I've got a hot one," he said. "My partner is an artist, so he's painted one with likenesses of Bacchus and Venus."

The artwork is somewhat revealing, so MacKinnon has also designed wings onto the coat to shield the revelling Romans. When the wings open, blinking strings of LED lights frame the portrait.

Near the bar in his restaurant, MacKinnon has what he jokingly refers to as the Chefs Ski Race Museum. Past chef's coats are displayed in wooden cases, and newspaper clippings commemorate previous races. A page from the Guinness Book of World Records also appears.

"We made the world's largest crepe one year in Aspen (at the national finals)," said

MacKinnon. "I was one of five guys who worked on it, so I was in the Guinness Book of World Records for a year."

Other awards include the Grand Marnier Golden Egg Beater Award for the chef who takes the best tumble on the slopes, the Battered Sauce Pot Award for "courage in the face of alpine adversity," and the Spice if not Speed Award for the skier/chef who best exemplifies the race's spirit, camaraderie and enthusiasm.

But while the competitors are soaking up the skiing and apres-skiing, there's one guy at the event who's having a lousy time. MacKinnon said.

"The worst job is to be head chef at

Recipes take chill off skiers

In the spirit of the Grand Marnier Chefs Ski Race, here are some apres-ski or pre-ski recipes for you to try on your next trip to the lodge.

SPICY GRILLED CHICKEN THIGHS

- 1/2 cup reduced-sodium soy sauce
- 1/2 cup Grand Marnier
- 2 scallions, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 tablespoon honey
- 2 teaspoons oriental sesame or vegetable oil
- 2 teaspoons grated fresh ginger or 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon dried red pepper flakes
- 8 chicken thighs
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 2 tablespoons orange juice or water
- Cooked rice, as accompaniment

In a non-reactive container, combine the soy sauce, Grand Marnier, scallions, garlic, honey, oil, ginger and red pepper flakes. Add chicken thighs and marinate, covered, for at least one hour, or up to 24 hours, turning often.

Position broiler rack about six inches from heat source. Broil thighs (reserving marinade), turning often, until bone shows no sign of pink when prodded with a knife (about 20-25 minutes).

Thursday marks the five-month anniversary of Diamond Jim Brady's in Novi. Response has been very rewarding, in more ways than one.

Last evening was a perfect example. While working "the floor" a woman told me how much she envied me my job. I'm not one to disagree, but asked out of curiosity, "Why?"

"Because, I hear the replies that you get. Everyone is so happy that you check on their food. There are such positive reac-

tions. I wish that my job was as fun." She is right. Each day is full of accolades. This is not to say that there is never a mistake made.

For the most part the food that leaves the kitchen is exactly what we start out to do. However, something bothers me about the scenario. There are a lot of employees behind the scenes that never get to hear first hand the praise that is an inspiration to keep plugging away.

Over 40 people keep this restaurant going. Every one of them has an important role to play. Each part must be rehearsed and then the whole must fit together like a stage play. If one actor is missing, or weaker than the others, we all pitch in to fill the hole.

Ultimate respect for each other's perfor-

mance is mandatory, as is support from all. There cannot be one more important than the next. This philosophy must prevail for this many different personalities and backgrounds to coexist.

My crew has done an excellent job of keeping their cool during some pretty scary times. Imagine cooking in front of very warm grills, broilers, stoves and ovens for hours, never getting a break until it is time to clean up.

Some nights there are five people on the front line that walk a thousand steps within their one-foot area. And they do it extremely well. Their pride in the food that is served shows. Very seldom does any ever come back. This is their goal. No food to be returned.

On busy nights they prepare more me-

als than most people will make in a lifetime. Nine times out of 10 nothing is replaced. They care.

Then there are the "back of the house" kitchen people that support the front line. For hour upon hour they prepare food to restock what is being used at what seems to be an unearthly pace. They are continually bringing refills to the line cooks. The beautiful part is that it is done ungrudgingly; just part of the performance.

And hats off to those that wash countless dishes, pots and pans — and don't let me forget the silverware. It's a monstrous job on any shift. There is a rule of thumb, no matter how much silverware you have it is never enough. On a weekend 10,000 pieces get washed, sorted, then washed again without complaint.

The front of the house staff has a tremendous part too. Only they are "on stage," right out in the audience. They must leave their troubles at the door. Nothing can jeopardize the guest's experience. From the front door, to the bar, to the table, each phase must be flawless. Their "station" becomes their business for the shift. The rest of us are here to support them.

And let's not forget our fabulous bus-boys, without whom life would be less pleasurable. None of this comes without continuous drive, on my part and theirs.

Every person that works with us deserves a standing ovation. Please, take a bow. You're great.

Boyer Highlands," he said. "Would you want to put on a banquet for 250 chefs every year? If one person gets his meat too rare, they hear about it."

The hosts perform well under pressure, though (see sidebar for recipes from the event).

"The food is great," MacKinnon said.

With such a grand gathering of chefs, it's not surprising that culinary supply companies show up to display their wares. They send the chefs home with samples and door prizes, and event organizer Grand Marnier liqueur donates a complimentary gift package.

"If there's something new in the food business that you want to try, this is a good way to find it," said MacKinnon. "I'd encourage anybody who's in the food industry to join up."

The best reason to participate, though, is for the charities. Marnier-Lapostolle, French producer of Grand Marnier liqueur has sponsored the event since 1984. Through its philanthropic arm, the Grand Marnier Foundation, it has raised \$350,000 in the last four events.

The midwest regional at Boyne Highlands will benefit COTS (the Coalition on Temporary Shelter) in Detroit, the state's largest shelter for homeless men, women and children. Other regionals will donate to anti-hunger groups as well.

It's a satisfying event, even for those who have fallen on unsavory times.

Meanwhile, bring reserved marinade to a boil in a small saucepan over medium heat. Dissolve cornstarch in juice or water; stir into boiling marinade. Cook until thickened. Serve thighs and cooked rice with sauce.

CAZUELA, SPANISH PORK AND CHICK PEA STEW

1 tablespoon paprika
1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper.
plus more to taste
1 teaspoon salt, plus more to taste

3 pounds of boneless pork shoulder (picnic), cut into 2-inch cubes
1/4 cup olive oil, plus more as needed

1 large onion chopped
1 large red bell pepper, seeded and chopped
3 garlic cloves, minced
2 tablespoons flour

1 1/2 cups chicken broth, canned or homemade

1 1/2 cups dry white wine

2 tablespoons tomato paste

2 teaspoons dried rosemary

2 bay leaves

1 1/2 pounds new potatoes, cut into 1 1/2-inch cubes

2 (16-ounce) cans garbanzos, drained and rinsed

1 (10-ounce) package frozen baby peas, defrosted

1/2 cup pitted green Spanish olives, rinsed

In a medium bowl, combine paprika, salt and cayenne. Add pork cubes and toss well to coat meat with spice mixture. In a large Dutch oven, heat 2 tablespoons of oil over medium-high heat. In batches without crowding, cook pork cubes, turning occasionally until browned, about five minutes per batch. Transfer browned cubes to a plate. Add more oil, if necessary.

Heat remaining 2 tablespoons of oil in Dutch oven. Add onion, sweet pepper and garlic. Cover and cook, stirring occasionally, until softened, about 5 minutes. Uncover, add flour and cook for 1 minute, stirring constantly. Add chicken broth, wine, tomato paste, rosemary and bay leaves. Bring to a boil, stirring to release browned bits from bottom of dutch oven. Add potatoes and reserved pork; return to a boil. Reduce heat to low, cover and simmer, stirring occasionally, until pork and potatoes are tender, about 1 hour. During the last 5 minutes of cooking time, stir in garbanzos, peas and olives. Season stew with additional salt and cayenne, and serve immediately.

GRAND MARNIER CHOCOLATE AND ORANGE BROWNIES

1 cup non-alkalized cocoa powder, such as Hershey's

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter

1/2 cup plus three tablespoons Grand Marnier, divided

2 cups granulated sugar
3 large eggs, at room temperature
1 teaspoon vanilla
Grated zest of one orange
1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1 cup (4 ounces) coarsely chopped pecans

Line the bottom and sides of a 9-by-13 baking pan with a long piece of aluminum foil, letting the excess hang over the sides. Fold up the side flaps of foil to form "handles." Lightly butter and flour the inside of the pan, tapping out excess flour.

Sift cocoa, baking soda and salt into a large bowl. In a medium saucepan, over low heat, melt butter. Add 1/2 cup Grand Marnier and heat until simmering. Gradually whisk butter mixture into cocoa to form a paste. Whisk in sugar. One at a time, whisk in eggs, then vanilla and zest. Whisk in flour, just until blended, then stir in nuts.

Position rack in center of oven and preheat to 350 degrees. Spread batter evenly in prepared pan and bake 25 to 30 minutes, just until toothpick inserted one inch from edge of pan comes out with a moist crumb. Do not overbake, to preserve fudge texture. Brush or drizzle remaining Grand Marnier over top of warm brownies. Cool completely on wire rack before slicing. Run a knife around inside of pan, lift up on handles to remove brownies from pan, then cut into bars.

Getting to know beans about cocoa

Cocoa beans are the third largest international cash crop, after coffee and sugar. The United States doesn't grow any of these beans, but does lead in the manufacturing of chocolate. Chocolate has indeed become a sweet obsession, and we are quite willing to pay outrageous prices for chocolate for special occasions. Easter, Christmas, Valentine's Day, Mother's Day and birthdays seem to call for a box of special chocolates. For a chocolate, anytime is appropriate for eating chocolate!

Several hundred years ago the Aztec and Mayan Indians of Central and South America discovered they could make an exotic beverage by crushing the cocoa bean and mixing the resulting liquid with wine. They called this drink "xocolatl" or "chocolatl," meaning warm liquid. Emperor Montezuma served cold chocolate spiked with vanilla, honey and spices at the end of the meal because he believed it had mystical power. In 1847 an English confectioner introduced eating chocolate in a solid form, and then in 1902 a wholesale candy business started in the United States.

After the cocoa seeds have been removed from their pods, they're fermented, dried, roasted and cracked, separating the meat or "nibs." The nibs are ground and in the heat of this process, cocoa butter melts to produce chocolate liquor. The liquor then receives an initial refining. Depending on the product they want to make, if additional cocoa butter is extracted from the chocolate liquor, the solid result is ground to produce unsweetened cocoa powder.

If other ingredients are added such as milk powder or sugar, the chocolate is refined again.

The final step for most chocolate is conching, a process by which huge machines with rotating blades slowly blend the heated chocolate liquor, ridding it of residual moisture and volatile acids. The conching continues for 12 to 72 hours (depending on the type and quality of chocolate) while small amounts of cocoa butter and sometimes lecithin are added to give chocolate its smooth texture.

Unadulterated chocolate is sold as unsweetened chocolate, and also called baking or bitter chocolate. United States standards require that a unsweetened chocolate contain between 50 to 58 percent cocoa butter. The addition of sugar, lecithin and vanilla (or vanillin) creates, depending on the amount of sugar added, bittersweet, semisweet or sweet chocolate. Bittersweet chocolate must contain at least 35 percent chocolate liquor; semisweet and sweet can contain from 15 to 35 percent.

Adding dry milk to sweetened chocolate creates milk chocolate, which must contain at least 12 percent milk solids and 10 percent chocolate liquor. Though bittersweet, semisweet and sweet chocolate may be used interchangeable in recipes with little textural change, milk chocolate — because of the milk protein — cannot.

Liquid chocolate, developed especially for baking, is found on the supermarket shelf along side other chocolate. It's unsweetened, comes in individual one-ounce packages, and is convenient because it requires no melting.

White chocolate is not true chocolate because it contains no chocolate liquor and, likewise, very

little chocolate flavor. Instead, it's usually a mixture of sugar, cocoa butter, milk solids, lecithin and vanilla. Read the label: If cocoa butter isn't mentioned, the product is confectionery (or summer) coating, not white chocolate. Products labeled artificial chocolate or chocolate-flavored, are not the real thing and both flavor and texture confirm that fact.

If you plan to make your own chocolate treats for a gift, follow these suggestions. Chocolate is very temperamental; it burns easily and should always be melted slowly. Constantly scrape and stir chocolate to ensure even melting. Don't hurry the process. Take care not to let the water boil or allow steam to rise and settle in a pan of chocolate. If there is a speck of water in the container, the chocolate will tighten (seize) into an unmeltable mess. To salvage, stir in one teaspoon of vegetable shortening per ounce of chocolate. Do not use butter or margarine. The fats contain moisture that could also affect the chocolate.

Candy molds are available for any holiday you can mention. Candy making at home is an ideal hobby that the entire family can do.

Keep solid chocolate, wrapped tightly in a cool dry place, up to four months. Chocolate kept refrigerated will sweat when brought to room temperature and may not melt properly. Higher temperatures or humidity may cause a grey appearance called "bloom," but it is harmless and the chocolate may safely be used.

Whether you call chocolate "food of the Gods" or "food of love," chocolate has a place in history and in our hearts and is a sweet obsession.

Greenland ice cap. Infusions of arctic plants are the supposed origins of its special character which is slightly citrus.

While it remains the marketing claim of vodkas that the product is not supposed to overwhelm the flavor of other drink ingredients with any distinctive flavor of its own, flavored vodkas are escalating in popularity. Several brands have created products flavored with pepper or citrus.

Our favorite flavored vodka is the Swedish Absolut Citron. It has the bright aroma of fresh lime with tastes mirroring the aroma. Absolut Pepper is flavored with natural jalapeno pepper and paprika and tastes like Loui-

siana Hot Sauce. It makes a wonderfully spicy Bloody Mary — no Tabasco needed.

Finlandia Punch is made with 4 parts sweet vermouth, 1 part Finlandia vodka and 3 parts water. Combine vermouth, vodka and water and chill. About a half hour before the party, pour punch over ice into a large glass punch bowl. Garnish with lemon strips.

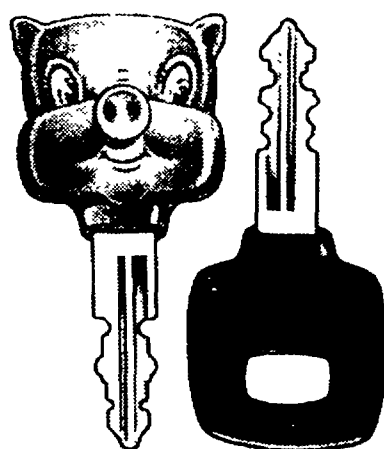

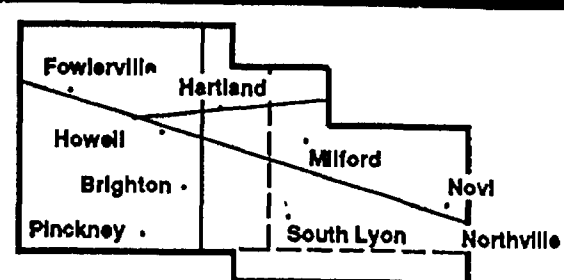

Boyer Highlands," he said. "Would you want to put on a banquet for 250 chefs every year? If one person gets his meat too rare, they hear about it."

The hosts perform well under pressure, though (see sidebar for recipes from the event).

"The food is great," MacKinnon said.

With such a grand gathering of chefs, it's not surprising that culinary supply companies show up to display their wares. They send the chefs home with samples and door prizes, and event organizer Grand Marnier liqueur donates a complimentary gift package.

"If there's something new in the food business that you want to try, this is a good way to find it," said MacKinnon. "I'd encourage anybody who's in the food industry to join up."

The best reason to participate, though, is for the charities. Marnier-Lapostolle, French producer of Grand Marnier liqueur has sponsored the event since 1984. Through its philanthropic arm, the Grand Marnier Foundation, it has raised \$350,000 in the last four events.

The midwest regional at Boyne Highlands will benefit COTS (the Coalition on Temporary Shelter) in Detroit, the state's largest shelter for homeless men, women and children. Other regions will donate to anti-hunger groups as well.

Meanwhile, bring reserved marinade to a boil in a small saucepan over medium heat. Dissolve cornstarch in juice or water; stir into boiling marinade. Cook until thickened. Serve thighs and cooked rice with sauce.

CAZUELA, SPANISH PORK AND CHICK PEA STEW

1 tablespoon paprika
¼ teaspoon cayenne pepper, plus more to taste
1 teaspoon salt, plus more to taste

3 pounds of boneless pork shoulder (picnic), cut into 2-inch cubes
½ cup olive oil, plus more as needed

1 large onion chopped
1 large red bell pepper, seeded and chopped
3 garlic cloves, minced
2 tablespoons flour
1½ cups chicken broth, canned or homemade
1½ cups dry white wine
2 (16-ounce) cans garbanzos, drained and rinsed
1 (10-ounce) package frozen baby peas, defrosted
½ cup pitted green Spanish olives, rinsed

In a medium bowl, combine paprika, salt and cayenne. Add pork cubes and toss well to coat meat with spice mixture. In a large Dutch oven, heat 2 tablespoons of oil over medium-high heat. In batches without crowding, cook pork cubes, turning occasionally until browned, about five minutes per batch. Transfer browned cubes to a plate. Add more oil, if necessary.

Heat remaining 2 tablespoons of oil in Dutch oven. Add onion, sweet pepper and garlic. Cover and cook, stirring occasionally, until softened, about 5 minutes. Uncover, add flour and cook for 1 minute, stirring constantly. Add chicken broth, wine, tomato paste, rosemary and bay leaves. Bring to a boil, stirring to release browned bits from bottom of dutch oven. Add potatoes and reserved pork; return to a boil. Reduce heat to low, cover and simmer, stirring occasionally, until pork and potatoes are tender, about 1 hour. During the last 5 minutes of cooking time, stir in garbanzos, peas and olives. Season stew with additional salt and cayenne, and serve immediately.

GRAND MARNIER CHOCOLATE AND ORANGE BROWNIES

1 cup non-alkalized cocoa powder, such as Hershey's
½ teaspoon baking soda
½ teaspoon salt
1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter
½ cup plus three tablespoons Grand Marnier, divided

2 cups granulated sugar
3 large eggs, at room temperature
1 teaspoon vanilla
Grated zest of one orange
1½ cups all-purpose flour
1 cup (4 ounces) coarsely chopped pecans

Line the bottom and sides of a 9-by-13 baking pan with a long piece of aluminum foil, letting the excess hang over the sides. Fold up the side flaps of foil to form "handles." Lightly butter and flour the inside of the pan, tapping out excess flour.

Sift cocoa, baking soda and salt into a large bowl. In a medium saucepan, over low heat, melt butter. Add ¼ cup Grand Marnier and heat until simmering. Gradually whisk butter mixture into cocoa to form a paste. Whisk in sugar. One at a time, whisk in eggs, then vanilla and zest. Whisk in flour, just until blended, then stir in nuts.

Position rack in center of oven and preheat to 350 degrees. Spread batter evenly in prepared pan and bake 25 to 30 minutes, just until toothpick inserted one inch from edge of pan comes out with a moist crumb. Do not overbake, to preserve fudge texture. Brush or drizzle remaining Grand Marnier over top of warm brownies. Cool completely on wire rack before slicing. Run a knife around inside of pan, lift up on handles to remove brownies from pan, then cut into bars.

Getting to know beans about cocoa

Cocoa beans are the third largest international cash crop, after coffee and sugar. The United States doesn't grow any of these beans, but does lead in the manufacturing of chocolate. Chocolate has indeed become a sweet obsession, and we are quite willing to pay outrageous prices for chocolate for special occasions. Easter, Christmas, Valentine's Day, Mother's Day and birthdays seem to call for a box of special chocolates. For a chocolate, anytime is appropriate for eating chocolate!

Several hundred years ago the Aztec and Mayan Indians of Central and South America discovered they could make an exotic beverage by crushing the cocoa bean and mixing the resulting liquid with wine. They called this drink "xocolatl" or "chocolatl," meaning warm liquid. Emperor Montezuma served cold chocolate spiked with vanilla, honey and spices at the end of the meal because he believed it had mystical power. In 1847 an English confectioner introduced eating chocolate in a solid form, and then in 1902 a wholesale candy business started in the United States.

After the cocoa seeds have been removed from their pods, they're fermented, dried, roasted and cracked, separating the meat or "nibs." The nibs are ground and in the heat of this process, cocoa butter melts to produce chocolate liquor. The liquor then receives an initial refining. Depending on the product they want to make, if additional cocoa butter is extracted from the chocolate liquor, the solid result is ground to produce unsweetened cocoa powder.

If other ingredients are added such as milk powder or sugar, the chocolate is refined again.

The final step for most chocolate is conching, a process by which huge machines with rotating blades slowly blend the heated chocolate liquor, ridding it of residual moisture and volatile acids. The conching continues for 12 to 72 hours (depending on the type and quality of chocolate) while small amounts of cocoa butter and sometimes lecithin are added to give chocolate its smooth texture.

Unadulterated chocolate is sold as unsweetened chocolate, and also called baking or bitter chocolate. United States standards require that a unsweetened chocolate contain between 50 to 58 percent cocoa butter. The addition of sugar, lecithin and vanilla (or vanillin) creates, depending on the amount of sugar added, bittersweet, semisweet or sweet chocolate. Bittersweet chocolate must contain at least 35 percent chocolate liquor; semisweet and sweet can contain from 15 to 35 percent.

Adding dry milk to sweetened chocolate creates milk chocolate, which must contain at least 12 percent milk solids and 10 percent chocolate liquor. Though bittersweet, semisweet and sweet chocolate may be used interchangeably in recipes with little textural change, milk chocolate — because of the milk protein — cannot.

Liquid chocolate, developed especially for baking, is found on the supermarket shelf along side other chocolate. It's unsweetened, comes in individual one-ounce packages, and is convenient because it requires no melting.

White chocolate is not true chocolate because it contains no chocolate liquor and, likewise, very

little chocolate flavor. Instead, it's usually a mixture of sugar, cocoa butter, milk solids, lecithin and vanilla. Read the label: If cocoa butter isn't mentioned, the product is confectionery (or summer) coating, not white chocolate. Products labeled artificial chocolate or chocolate-flavored, are not the real thing and both flavor and texture confirm that fact.

If you plan to make your own chocolate treats for a gift, follow these suggestions. Chocolate is very temperamental; it burns easily and should always be melted slowly. Constantly scrape and stir chocolate to ensure even melting. Don't hurry the process. Take care not to let the water boil or allow steam to rise and settle in a pan of chocolate. If there is a speck of water in the container, the chocolate will tighten (seize) into an unmeltable mess. To salvage, stir in one teaspoon of vegetable shortening per ounce of chocolate. Do not use butter or margarine. The fats contain moisture that could also affect the chocolate.

Candy molds are available for any holiday you can mention. Candy making at home is an ideal hobby that the entire family can do.

Keep solid chocolate, wrapped tightly in a cool dry place, up to four months. Chocolate kept refrigerated will sweat when brought to room temperature and may not melt properly. Higher temperatures or humidity may cause a grey appearance called "bloom," but it is harmless and the chocolate may safely be used.

Whether you call chocolate "food of the Gods" or "food of love," chocolate has a place in history and in our hearts and is a sweet obsession.

Greenland ice cap. Infusions of arctic plants are the supposed origins of its special character which is slightly citrus.

While it remains the marketing claim of vodkas that the product is not supposed to overwhelm the flavor of other drink ingredients with any distinctive flavor of its own, flavored vodkas are escalating in popularity. Several brands have created products flavored with pepper or citrus.

Our favorite flavored vodka is the Swedish Absolut Citron. It has the bright aroma of fresh lime with tastes mirroring the aroma. Absolut Pepper is flavored with natural jalapeno pepper and paprika and tastes like Loui-

siana Hot Sauce. It makes a wonderfully spicy Bloody Mary — no Tabasco needed.

Finlandia Punch is made with 4 parts sweet vermouth, 1 part Finlandia vodka and 3 parts water. Combine vermouth, vodka and water and chill. About a half hour before the party, pour punch over ice into a large glass punch bowl. Garnish with lemon strips.

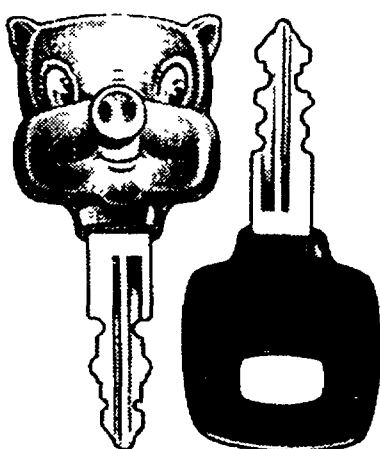

It's easy to imagine him engrossed in the pages of "Custer's Last Stand," "Teddy Roosevelt and the Rough Riders," "Sequoyah: Leader of the Cherokees" or "Napoleon and the Battle of Waterloo," filling his mind with tales of romance and adventure.

Easy, too, to imagine how those stories would return to fuel the creative fire of a grown-up George Lucas, Oscar-winning filmmaker and motive force behind the "Star Wars" and "Indiana Jones" sagas.

Beginning Wednesday, March 4, Lucas hopes to bring his love of history to another generation with "The Young Indiana Jones Chronicles." It is not, he says, "an action-adventure series like the features are. I've burned out on writing action-adventure. This is more of a personal, coming-of-age kind of project.

"It's a series designed to ask questions. It will bring up subjects and introduce certain kinds of characters and make them come alive. I hope it will be helpful to young people, to introduce them to the fascination of history."

Viewers should be prepared for a few changes in Jones' own history as well. For those who make the leap, there are rich rewards to be claimed in the currency of possibilities.

Three actors star as Indiana Jones: Corey Carrier as the youngest Indy traveling the globe with his parents; Sean Patrick Flanery as the teenage Indiana; and George Hall as the 93-year-old archaeologist and adventurer looking back on his life. This oldest Indy could easily be relegated to voice-over status or dropped altogether. After all, it's "Young Indy" we've tuned in to see.

The stories take place on four continents during a period from 1908 to 1917. The two-hour pilot and 15 episodes that follow have been shot on locations from the Great Wall of China to the pyramids of

Egypt. This season, Indy will meet T.E. Lawrence (Lawrence of Arabia), Teddy Roosevelt, Sigmund Freud, Winston Churchill, Mata Hari, Albert Schweitzer, Pancho Villa and a 14-year-old Norman Rockwell. (Lucas has 29 more story ideas already percolating.)

The project boasts top-notch writers and directors including Rosemary Ann Sisson ("Upstairs, Downstairs") and Gavin Scott ("Ragtime"); Jim O'Brien ("The Jewel in the Crown"), Simon Wincer ("Lonesome Dove"), Billie August ("Pelle the Conqueror") and Terry Jones ("Monty Python").

Vanessa Redgrave guest stars as a suffragette and Margaret Tyzack

(Claudius' mother in "I, Claudius") plays young Indy's tutor.

Having done his logistical homework, Lucas makes the most of every location, shooting scenes for two or more episodes at each stop. Every penny of the \$1.5 million-per-episode budget seems to be on the screen.

The stories involving 10-year-old Indy are the most engaging, capturing the wonder of childhood at its best, a glorious gift of opportunity and a bookish boy's dream come true.

"You can't create a character," Lucas reflects, "and then not have it be your alter ego. I would like to have had a boyhood like this one. I guess I did, in part."

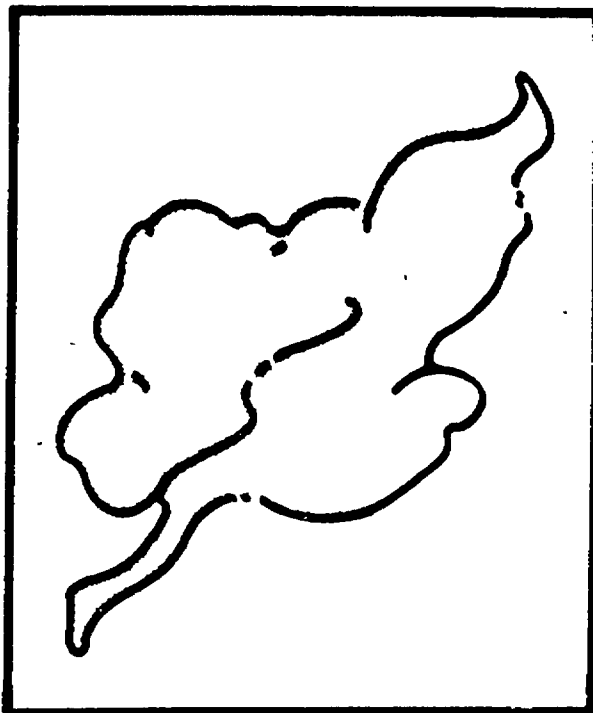
Paint a leaf and 'Save the Earth'

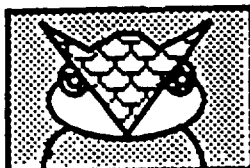

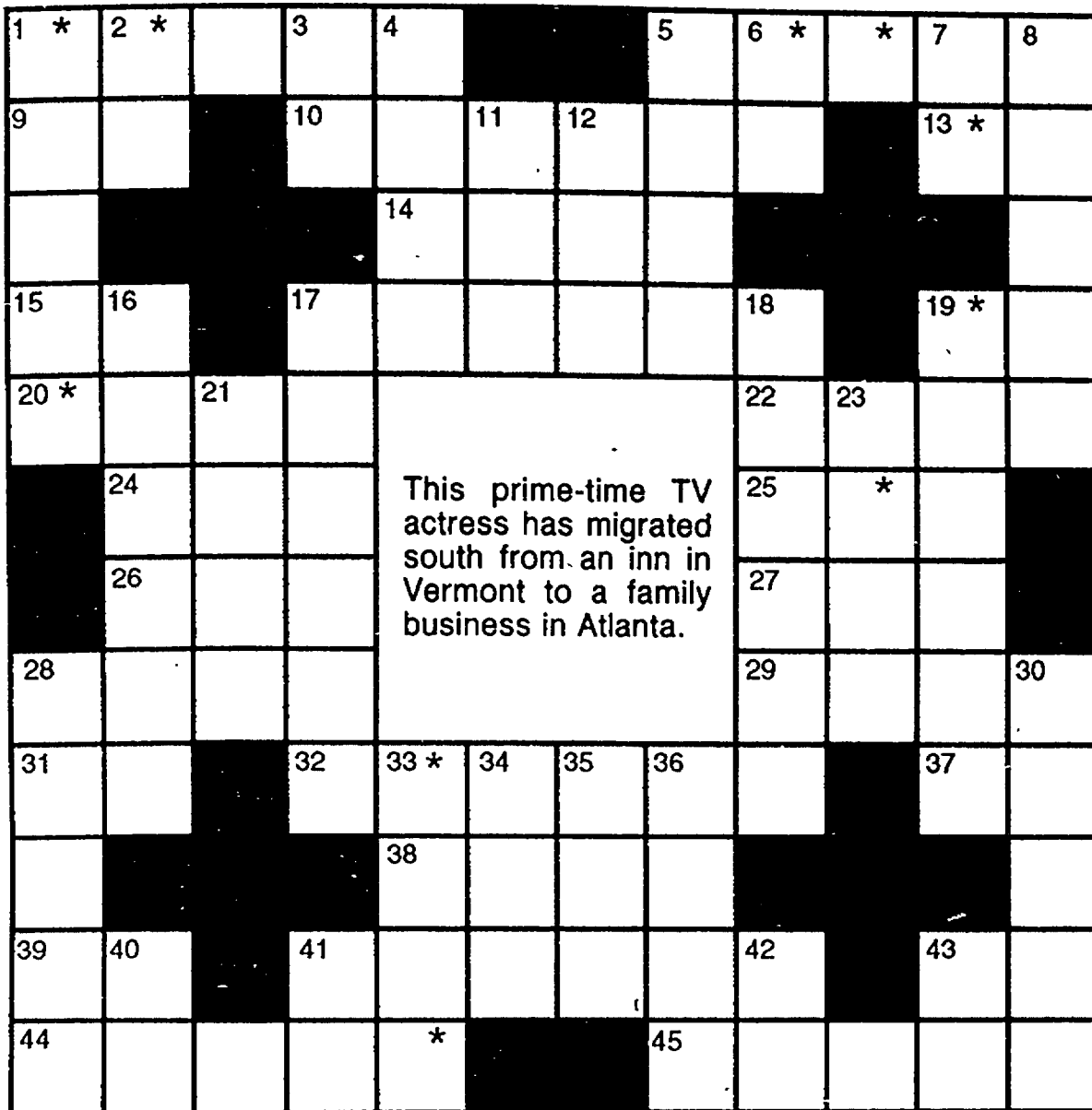

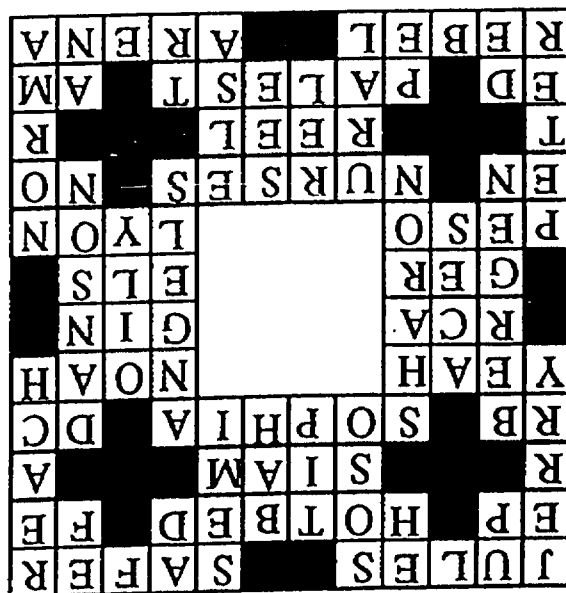

Virginia's Staley rules the court

In her three years at Virginia, Dawn Staley's just about done it all. The Cavalier guard is a three-time All-American who two years ago led her school to its first final-four appearance and, last year, took them to within three points of a national championship.

Staley was already being heralded as the most exciting women's basketball player ever when she arrived on the Virginia campus in 1988. She immediately began living up to expectations, thrilling fans with her no-look passes and near-magical ball handling as much as her 18 points per game scoring average. Last year, Staley's scoring dropped by more than three points a game, but her seven assists and six steals per game made her arguably the nation's most complete player.

If Virginia is, as many preseason publications predicted, on a collision course for a championship-game repeat with Tennessee, it will be far from a one-woman effort. Not only does Tammi Reiss combine with Staley to give Virginia one of the nation's top backcourts, but the trio of center Melanie Wagener and 6'5" twins Heidi and Heather Burge gives the Cavaliers a dominating inside game.

Fans at home will see Staley in action when Virginia and North Carolina State clash Saturday, Feb. 29.

Q: Could you give me an address for Oliver Stone? I am very impressed with his films and admire people who have the courage to examine controversial issues. I often want to write to movie stars or authors and am wondering if there are any directories available to the public so I can do this. —Betty Hawkins, Silver City, N.M.

A: You can write Stone care of CAA, 9820 Wilshire Blvd., Beverly Hills, Calif., 90212.

There are many books available with addresses of authors, actors, directors, etc., but they are not always accurate or up-to-date, so I always call the appropriate guild or agency to check my facts. Reference books can cost anywhere from \$5 to \$500; periodicals such as *Entertainment Weekly*, *Hollywood Reporter* and *Variety* can offer needed background information, too.

If you are trying to reach an author, you might contact the publisher for information. Sometimes, it can be like Sherlock Holmes looking for clues, and you'll seldom find the information you need on the first try, but most research just takes common sense. You might begin by checking at a local library or bookstore for reference books already on the shelves, then ask for more help at the counter. If you have the name of a book, its author or publisher and want more information, check a copy of *Books in Print*. Happy hunting!

Q: My friends and I would love it if you would give us the address where we could write to Edward Furlong. —Sophia Theresa, Ridge Crest, Calif.

A: You can write the young star of *Terminator 2: Judgment Day* in care of Susan Smith and Associates, 121 North San Vicente Blvd., Beverly Hills, Calif., 90211. Incidentally, his agency reports that the volume of fan mail for Furlong has been phenomenal.

Q: I am a big fan of MacGyver and want to know if there is any way to bring


the series back. Also, are there any Richard Dean Anderson fan clubs? He is a great actor and MacGyver is a wonderful series and shouldn't have been canceled without real cause. We fans were never given a chance to give our say-so. I would like to know where I can get a hold of photos and information about Anderson and the rest of the MacGyver crew. —C.M., Greenville, Texas.

A: After debuting on Sept. 29, 1985, *MacGyver* aired on ABC for seven seasons. While never an out-and-out hit, it certainly had a loyal viewer following. What viewers may not know is that any series will become more and more expensive to produce the longer it airs, chiefly because of a built-in system of annual raises for the stars. A series like NBC's *Cheers*, for instance, which is now in its 10th season and has a large cast, will at some point become too costly to produce in comparison to the revenue expected in return. In an interview last summer, *MacGyver* creator Lee Zlotoff said he had been surprised each year to find the series was renewed, not the reverse.
