Third judge edges toward reality

Now that the five communities within the 35th District Court's jurisdiction have passed verdicts in favor of a third judge, the state must rule whether to approve the funding. If approved, a new judge could take the bench as early as January 1993.

Northville city and township passed resolutions approving a new 35th District Court judgeship in January, following a lobbying effort by current 35th District Judges James Garber and John MacDonald at township hall. Plymouth city and township and Canton Township quickly followed suit.

The judges attributed the need for a new justice to the court's growing caseload, as well as new drunk driving legislation and mandatory state deadlines for processing civil cases.

They said a full-time judge would be more cost-effective than a visiting judge because the state pays all but \$4,100 of a full-time judge's salary. Local units would have to foot the bill for a visiting judge.

The state legislation to add the judgeship was introduced last month. If approved by the state, a new judge would be elected November 1992, with the judge taking office Jan. 1, 1993.

The cost of a new judgeship would be split among the five communities based on their caseloads, with Northville Township paying about 12 percent and the City of Northville paying about 8 percent.

But because the court typically returns thousands of dollars in revenue to the local municipalities, the net effect of a new judge will likely be a reduction in that revenue rather than an actual bill to the municipal units.

The courthouse at 660 Plymouth Road will undergo an estimated \$535,000 in renovations to accommodate the new judge's chambers, jury room and courtroom.

The architectural design work is being done by Carne & Associates of Plymouth. Bids for construction will be sought later in the spring.

The renovations are estimated to take six months.

Township reconsiders consultants

Revelations tying Northville Township and its consultants to financial and political dealings could prompt wholesale changes in township business practices.

Township officials last week confirmed that they will hasten a request-for-proposal (RFP) program designed to seek bids for township engineering and legal representation.

"We're going to hurry up the process," said Supervisor Betty Lennox, who announced a RFP plan in January. At the time, Lennox appointed a RFP committee and asked for a report after 30 days.

But committee Chairperson James Nowka earlier this month said

the deadline was unreasonable and asked for an extension.

Now the committee will be directed to shift the project into high gear.

Lennox denied that the push was caused by recent newspaper articles chronicling a web of ties between the township and its engineering and legal firms.

"There's no connection with that," she said. "Two months ago I appointed the committee; I'm going with my first thoughts."

Lennox said she will announce today (March 2) her intentions on the status of the township consultants.

Two firms are thought to be most vulnerable to the RFP move.

Schools mount raffle campaign

Tickets for a Spring Fling Raffle to raise money for the Partnerships for Education program are now available from downtown merchants, school employees, and community groups.

Proceeds from the raffle will be used to pay for field trips and cover substitute teacher costs for those involved in business/education partnerships.

Jan Purtell, Partnerships for Education director for the Northville schools, said the program needs the money to replenish funds lost through a state grant cut this year.

"The money will go to providing transportation for students to get to business sites," Purtell said. "Allowing students to go to the site gives them the opportunity to look at practical applications of what they are learning in the classroom."

The Partnerships for Education program, which started in the spring of 1989, was initially funded by a \$4,000 grant from the Michigan Department of Education. That grant, which paid the transportation and substitute teacher costs, is not available to the district this year, Purtell said.

Purtell said the district is eyeing the raffle as one avenue to raise the money in an effort to recoup its losses and maintain a critical aspect of the partnership program.

Of the 19 business partners that are coupled with Northville Public Schools, a number of them offer students the opportunity to tour plants, business offices, warehouses, and state parks.

For student partners who are coupled with Dow Corning Automotive Development Center, visits to the center allow them the opportunity to see how math and computer skills impact workplace.

"Our high school calculus students go to Dow Corning and see how technology influences the workplace," Purtell said. "It lets them see how math skills and computer applications are used and affect the workplace."

A visit to Maybury State Park, another partner in the program, lets students see lesson plans come alive through nature walks, plant and pond studies, and land surveys.

"At Maybury they get to touch, see, feel and smell the actual plant and pond life they are reading about. It's a big jump from a piece of paper to really see the actual life, to experience it first-hand," she said.

Purtell said the money raised from the raffle is critical to the survival of existing field trips and to implement new ones.

"Without the money we won't be able to take them on a trip or take them on different kinds of trips that we want to take them on," she said.

Tickets for the raffle will be distributed throughout the schools, to downtown merchants and businesses, to all business partners and to community groups. In addition, tickets will be sold at sporting events and be available from the Northville Chamber of Commerce and Parks and Recreation.

The drawing for the four prizes will be held during the "Networking Northville" Business Expo, March 25 at 8 p.m. at Northville High School. First prizes are dinners for four at MacKinnon's, Little Italy and Gertrude's in Northville; second prize is an overnight "Suite Stay" at the Embassy Suites in Livonia; third prize is 10 movie tickets from Laurel Park Theatres; and fourth prize is six large pizzas from the Pizza Cutter in Northville.

In addition to the winners' prizes, Purtell said, there are additional incentives for sellers.

"If the seller has written their name on the back of the ticket stub, an additional prize of a 'Suite Stay' at Embassy Suites will be awarded to the person who sold the ticket to the first prize winner," she said.

Also, the people who sold tickets to the second-, third-, and fourth-place winners will receive a free large pizza from Pizza Cutter.

Purtell said all of the prizes were donated by area merchants, and the printing services for the tickets was donated by 3PM/McKesson, another of the program's business partners.

Safe Home program on hold

Red Ribbon Week proceeds as NAC gets more background

Before implementing the Safe Homes program here in Northville, sponsors want to gather more information and seek advice from neighboring communities who have had success with it.

Roxanne Casterline, president of the Northville Action Council, said Thursday her group had considered introducing the program during this week's Red Ribbon campaign, but decided to hold off until they could get more information and tips on implementation.

"We thought it was going to be the main focus of the week, but we've decided to hold off until representatives from West Bloomfield and Troy can come out and tell us how to get the program started," she said.

Troy and West Bloomfield both have been very successful in launching the program and collectively have 2,000 homes involved.

Safe Homes seeks to provide kids with a safe, drug- and alcohol-free environment. Parents opting to participate sign a pledge form that says they will chaperone teens' parties and prohibit minors from drinking or using drugs in their homes or on their property. In addition, pledges hold parents accountable for what goes on in their homes and require cooperation with school and local law enforcement officials in creating a safe and healthy environment for teenagers.

Pam Feldkamp, president of Troy Families for Safe Homes, said Friday the key to getting the program accepted is educating parents first.

"In an effort to dispel any resistance to the program, we held a community forum," Feldkamp said.

A panel of officials—including assistant princi-

pals from the two Troy high schools, counselors, a police officer and a judge—met the night the program debuted in the community and talked with parents.

"Each of them spoke for 5-10 minutes and told the parents about the problems with teens drinking and using drugs they had seen in their jobs," she said.

The forum was announced by a direct mailing sent to every parent with students enrolled in the middle and high schools. That mailing included a letter from the district's superintendent endorsing the program, a sample pledge form, and an advertisement for the forum.

Some 350 parents attended the forum, Feldkamp said. And eventually more than 400 signed pledge forms in the first year of the program. That was three years ago. Today 821 families are involved in Troy Families for Safe Homes.

"It was successful. We created a lot of awareness by educating parents first," she said.

In addition to the forum, Feldkamp said the district in 1985 polled students in an anonymous survey quizzing them about their knowledge, experience, and use of drugs and alcohol. Though the results showed no serious problem and usage no higher or lower than national averages, Safe Homes organizers went ahead with the program.

"What we found out from that survey is there was a lot of drinking going on, and at younger ages," she said.

The program originally was targeted to middle school and high schoolers, but now Feldkamp is revising a pledge form to meet the needs of parents and students at the elementary level.

Specifically, parents of elementary-age students will sign pledge forms saying that they agree to store alcohol, firearms, and toxic chemicals in

safe places, out of the reach of visiting children.

Parents who opt to participate have their names published in a local directory and in the local newspaper.

"By publishing their names we encourage parents to network, to call and get to know other parents, and open up the lines of communication," Feldkamp said.

Casterline said the NAC is postponing the debut of the program until spring break and graduation, when teenagers are more apt to be tempted by parties and partying. By then, she hopes the NAC will have already had representatives from nearby districts out to share their experiences.

"We are going to bring West Bloomfield and Troy out to pre-empt the program and between now and then, put the word out and try to create an awareness, and get some public relations for the program," she said.

Preliminary plans had the NAC targeting only students at the middle schools and high school, but Casterline said district officials have requested that the program be implemented at all grade levels.

"The pledges will be different because they are asking parents to commit to different things. Pledges to homes of elementary students are very relevant to little kids," she said.

Casterline said she hoped the council could put a public meeting together in the next month so it could be in full swing by the spring.

"We can all get together and learn from each other, coordinate our efforts and parenting skills and then create a safe environment," she said.

Center building wins narrow OK

By the slimmest of margins, a local man won the right to build a new medical/professional office near the corner of Center Street and Rayson Road.

City planning commissioners on Feb. 18 heeded the advice of their planning consultant and approved by a 4-3 count Donald Petricca's much-debated plan to construct an office building at 339 N. Center.

Petricca's plan had floated from the planning commission to the city Board of Zoning Appeals and back again since it was submitted in

November 1990. Some contention stemmed from the fact that Petricca's new building will take on a much more modern appearance than usually found in downtown Northville.

"(He's) removing a building that fits within the city character and replacing it with a more modern building," said Donald Wortman, city planning consultant. "(The building) may not conform to personal taste or city standards... but it falls within zoning ordinance standards."

Wortman told commissioners that the city would open itself to a lawsuit if Petricca's plan was rejected. The consultant added that it was doubtful

the city would fare well in court. Petricca's lot falls within central business district (CBD) zoning guidelines. Holes in the CBD zoning area apparently left the city vulnerable to a court challenge if the site plan request was rejected.

"It's just not strong enough," Wortman said. "You'd be better off amending the zoning ordinance."

Petricca did offer several alterations to his original plan. Parking spaces were reduced to 20 after a BZA variance was granted and the amount of landscaping fronting Center Street was increased. Approval also was based upon an agreement with the city over a 10-foot-by-

57-foot easement along Center Street.

Commissioners Chris Gazlay, Kathleen Otton, David Mielock, and David Totten voted to approve the project. Opponents included Stephen Ball, John Hardin, and Richard Wilhelm.

Mark Cryderman and Rolland Stapleton were absent.

Despite opposition to his plan, Petricca's perseverance apparently paid off.

"I give him credit," Totten said. "He's stubborn, came in and wanted it his way, and he's going to get it his way."

Haggerty restaurant plan denied

The bottom line was money.

Developers of the proposed Romano's Macaroni Grill Restaurant said they need access to their easterly off Haggerty Road to ensure the restaurant's financial success.

But the Novi Planning Commission said 4-2 that other concerns were more important than the financial success of the Macaroni Grill developers.

City traffic consultant Rodney Arroyo said the restaurant's proposed Haggerty Road access just north of Child's Restaurant would create a traffic hazard when the remaining vacant land on Haggerty is developed as an office complex. Macaroni

Grill would face Haggerty and sit south of the Novi Hilton.

The proposed office complex is on hold due to the economy, planning consultant Brandon Rogers said. But when it was first proposed, the plan did not include a Haggerty Road access point.

Commission Secretary Timothy Gilbert said he is tough on health and safety issues.

"Introducing another curb cut on Haggerty does not meet my standards," Gilbert said.

"It's up to the commission to ensure harmony and proper function, and all I see is disfunction."

Commissioner Ernest Aruffo said the final decision should be up to the City Council. Aruffo suggested approving the plan contingent on council approval of the Haggerty Road entrance.

In the final vote, Aruffo and Commissioner Judith Johnson were the sole supporters of approving the project.

Commissioner Kathleen McLallen voted against the plan.

"Our ordinance does not address your economic needs," McLallen said.

The plan failed 4-2, with Macaroni Grill developers planning to appeal the decision to the City Council. But assistant city attorney Dennis Watson said that the only avenue to council in this case is through positive commission approval.

Commissioners Lodia Richards, Gilbert, Steven Gorgas and McLallen voted against the plan and refused to give Macaroni Grill permission to appeal to council.

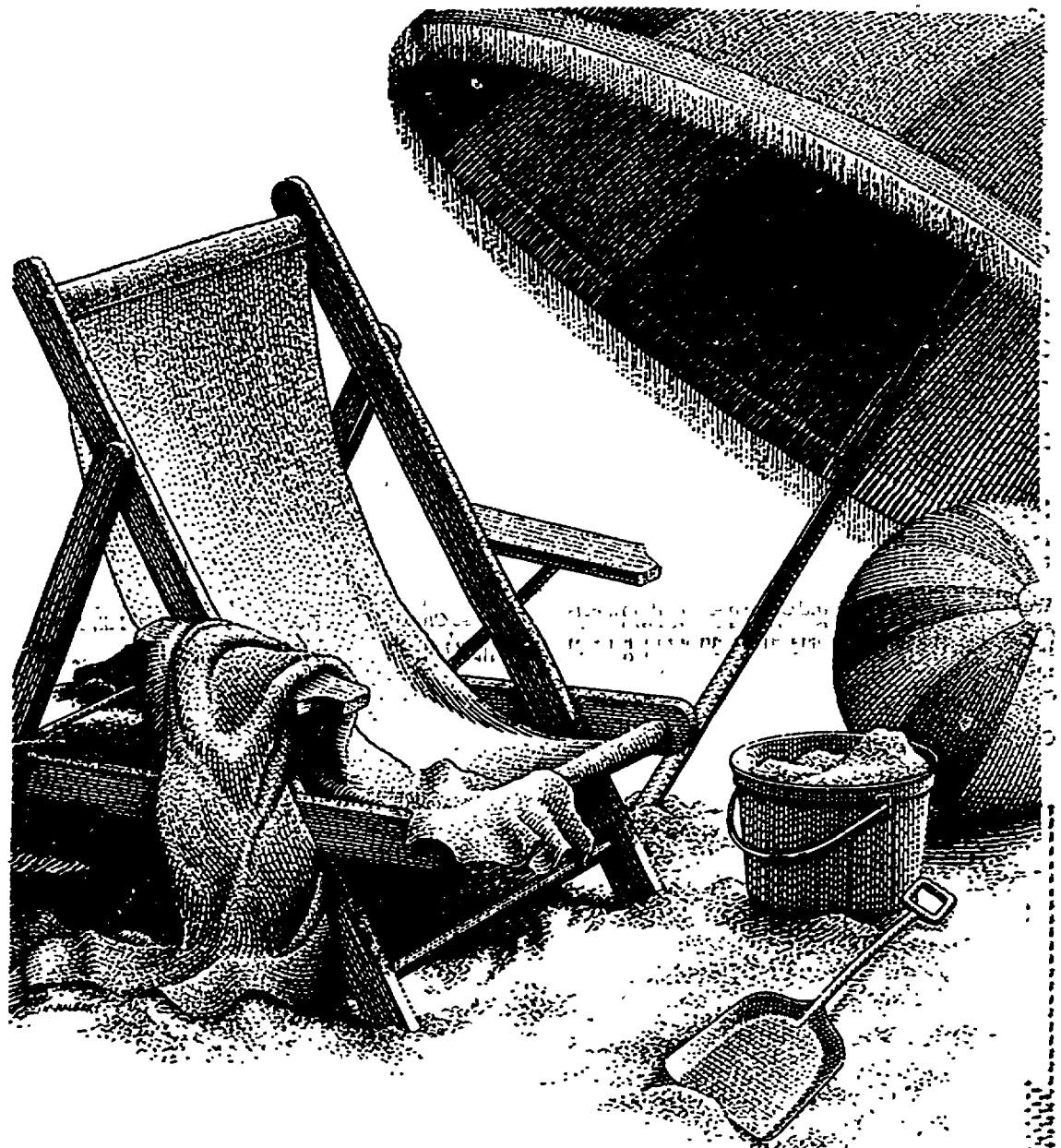
The three authors are also at work on three original screenplays slated to be filmed in Russia in 1993.

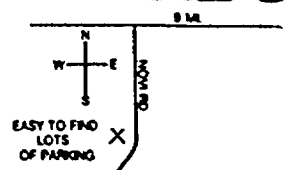

Hearing on Engler education budget tomorrow

Local school officials and the public will have their first shot at Gov. John Engler's school aid proposal tomorrow before a state Senate panel.

The \$3.5-billion spending plan has Engler's fingerprints all over it: ending categorical aids like Social Security and a special Detroit program, increasing the general aid pot, adding money for "schools of choice."

The hearing will begin at 1:30 p.m. in Room 301 of the Capitol. Sen. Dan DeGrow, R-Port Huron, set a second hearing for early April and plans to have the bill before the full Senate later in April.

DeGrow chairs the K-12 appropriations subcommittee that handles school aid. Other members are Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, and John Schwarz, R-Battle Creek.

The bill, which senators studied for the first time Tuesday, impacts all districts, even those which get nothing from the state aid formula.

Reason: Engler proposes to shift the state's burden of \$442 million in Social Security payments to local districts. He would put all that money into the state aid pot. The 70 percent of districts that get state aid would get the pot.

The 30 percent out-of-formula — including Northville, Plymouth and Novi — would have to pay for Social Security themselves out of local property tax revenues.

In return, Engler proposes to:

- Abolish the tax-base-shares law passed last year at the urging of DeGrow and Schwarz, and bitterly opposed by Faxon. The "Robin Hood" law requires richer districts to share half the growth of their business tax base with poorer districts.

- Quit "recapturing" categorical aid money from richer districts to the tune of \$60 million. Categorical aid covers special education, transportation, bilingual, pregnant teen and other specialized programs.

Here are other major changes, according to a Senate staff analysis:

- The school aid formula would be raised to assure an average district (levying 34 mills) \$3,810 per student, 7 percent more than the current \$3,544.

- A \$20 million "municipal overburden" program aiding Detroit would be killed. The program was hatched in the 1970s to help schools in cities with extremely high city tax loads.

- \$20 million is allocated for transportation for "schools of choice" programs. Under these, parents could elect to send their children to any school in a district and, in some

cases, within an intermediate district. Purpose is to encourage specialized programs and competition. The "choice" program would continue to get \$600,000.

- \$6 million would go for pilot "extended school year" programs — adding several days to the current 180-day school year.

- \$2 million would go for "charter" schools. Under this Engler plan, a faculty of certified teachers would contract with an elected school board to set up a specialized school. It's a management variation of the "schools of choice" plan.

Under Michigan's complex financial system, K-12 schools would get a total of \$3.5 billion from Lansing — up 4 percent.

The breakdown: \$2.36 billion from the school aid fund, which includes allocated taxes and the lottery; \$1.03 billion from the general fund; and \$80 million in federal aid.

Closing Northville hospital not on mental health agenda

Michigan will continue to shift mental health dollars from big institutions to community health programs in Gov. John Engler's 1993 budget.

"The day of the big institution is past," the governor said in an interview — but he also said no plans exist to close the big local institution, Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital on Seven Mile Road.

His mental health proposal for the year starting Oct. 1 is \$959 million — up \$49 million.

Community boards would get \$141 million more for a total of \$465 million under his proposal.

"Again, this is not a policy that was decided by my administration but was one we found half-done," Engler said.

"We were trying to be all things to everyone without the money. It has become a major jobs issue, obviously, with the employees at state institutions. But we're trying to do this, as we did with education, from the interest of the person needing care."

His mental health chief, Jim Haveman, said he would cut administrative costs \$1.2 million to put more money into direct care.

The speed with which Engler and Haveman have shifted from institutions to community-based care has drawn more criticism than anything except perhaps his general assistance welfare cuts.

Here are the questions and answers:

Q. Any plans to close Northville

State Hospital?

A. No.

Q. What about Clinton Valley Center in Pontiac?

A. Ah (pause), the real challenge right now is to see Oakland and Macomb counties decide what type of mental health providers they're going to be. Macomb is moving along; Oakland is the remaining county where they're not (pause) in the same status as other counties.

We have a commitment to trying to help people who are developmentally disabled or people with mental illness either remain in the community or return to the community as quickly as they can after treatment.

Community-based models, I think, are in the interest of the person needing care and the interest of the

family. The day of big state institutions is really past.

Q. Ralph Slovenko, professor of law and psychiatry at Wayne State University, calls community mental health "a dismal failure" and says the fallacy is that there's "a 'community' where the patients could return" and that "treatment is undefined." Comment?

A. I think Mr. Slovenko is also one

of the advocates of the current mental health code, which makes involuntary commitment of an individual virtually impossible. So the same person that is required by law to be put on the street is the person we're trying to provide networks to deal with.

Nobody's come forward to advocate a change in the mental health code like the old days where someone

could be picked up and put in an institution for months and years.

Absent that change, the state is incapable of holding them. This is the problem that has perplexed law enforcement agencies for some time. What do you if you find someone on the street having an episode? Where do you go? The fact is they can't be held. They receive overnight treat-

ment and decide they don't wish to stay.

I think the mental health code might be changed. We might have a different approach; some of the advocates on the legal side have to be held accountable in part to address the solution. I don't think community or institutional care can make a difference to the person he's citing because neither can help.

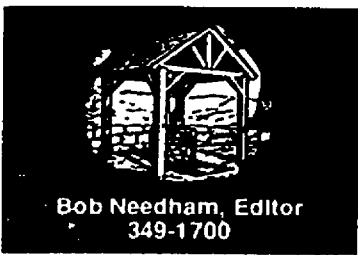

Video store arrests raise host of questions

As the owners of Northville Video sit idle, waiting for their pretrial examination Friday on obscenity charges, members of the community have a chance to reflect on what their arrests mean to us. The situation has ignited considerable interest and a degree of anger, and its resolution will probably only come after a lot more of each.

For those who may have missed the news, this began in December when a Detroit man (who so far will not publicly admit his name) apparently came to town looking for dirty videotapes. He found some, at Northville Video, and complained to the township Police Department.

The police took copies of four tapes, including two with some rather unsavory titles, and presented them to the Wayne County Prosecutor's office. The prosecutor told them to go ahead with a raid, and the police recently carted out from the store the jackets from the tapes in question, boxes of allegedly obscene printed material, computer records showing who had rented the tapes, and the computer itself.

The owners of the store have since turned themselves in to be arraigned, and now await their pretrial examination in 35th District Court. And that's about all that's happened so far.

These actions touched off a flurry of questions in the news room here as soon as we heard about the situation, mirrored in the community when the news hit the streets. Many of the questions remain unanswered today. Among the points which have been raised:

Why did a Detroit resident, even if he does head an anti-pornography group, come out to Northville for this purpose? Why won't he identify himself in public? Who is he?

Why did the police pursue his complaint? Why did the prosecutor authorize a raid? What standards are used in these matters? Who sets them?

Why did they take the jackets of the tapes but leave the tapes themselves? How can these tapes have been copied — isn't that copyright infringement? Why did they take the computer records? For what possible reason could the police/prosecutor need to know who rented those tapes? Is that information now available to anyone?

What type of material is illegal to sell or rent? Where are these rules written down? How are they enforced? Who has the right to decide what we can watch in the privacy of our own homes?

Some answers, and partial answers, have surfaced to some of those questions. As far as the mechanics of the

complaint and the raid, the police department has an obligation to follow up on accusations of lawbreaking, as does the prosecutor's office. They can only work with what they have in front of them, in this case the state obscenity statutes. They left the tapes in the store because the court has not, at least yet, found them to be obscene. They took the records because they need to know that the tapes were indeed rented; the names are supposed to stay private. And on the question of copying the tapes — we're not sure, but we really wonder if the makers of these gems find it worth their while to copyright them. And even if they do, we really wonder whether they'd find it useful to object to the copying and thereby get themselves in the middle of an obscenity fight.

But the larger questions still hang in the air. The court system will help decide them, but even then we expect some issues will remain unresolved. Because any court decision on obscenity will likely take into account the standards of the community, that concept raises a flock of questions all its own.

Community opinion may look like a good standard in the abstract, but how in the world can anyone put it into practice? Northville's image falls on the conservative side. But individual opinions in matters of taste can differ from one house to the next, and from one family member to the next within a single home. Even if everyone in the community considered themselves conservative, which they don't, there would be two classic conservative reactions to this situation: On the one hand, some people might find the presence of these videos a threat to strong family values; on the other, some people will find such a raid an unconscionable governmental interference in private life.

We hope the process of pursuing these charges through the legal system provides answers to some of the larger questions which have suddenly hit home. Maybe it will and maybe it won't. But at the least, we have a hunch we're all in for a real-life, very fascinating civics lesson.

Adding appeals judges absurd



The judges and lawyers don't get it. They simply don't get it.

Michigan's economy is flat, if not shrinking. So is most of state government. Colleges aren't getting an increase. State parks are tightening their belts, maybe closing. Liquor inspectors are spread thin. Recently the attorney general charged a bunch of southeastern Michigan stations with cheating at the gasoline pumps, and you wonder how many were missed.

So what is the state Supreme Court doing but asking for more Court of Appeals judges. Appellate law rivals welfare as our biggest growth industry. Our 1964 Constitution created the Court of Appeals with nine judges. Today there are 24.

And they want 15 more — a 62.5-percent increase. They want nine this election and six more in 1994. That would make 39 — more than quadruple the original gang of nine. The high court administrator says we really need 80!

Chief Court of Appeals Judge Martin Doctoroff of Birmingham and Judge Roman S. Gribbs of Detroit got a sympathetic hearing before the House Judiciary Committee last week.

"The Court of Appeals is drowning in work," Doctoroff told lawmakers. Two years ago, its backlog was 1,400 cases; today it's 4,500.

"We're aware of the cost involved. That's for you to resolve," said Doctoroff.

"What's the story?" asked committee chair Perry Bullard, D-Ann Arbor. "Is the law so unsettled that attorneys have to appeal?"

"Crime and drugs," said Doctoroff. There are automatic appeals when a judge departs from sentencing guidelines, but that's not the core of the problem.

"The litigiousness of our society is not something we can control," Doctoroff said. He said the court had tried alternative methods of dispute resolution, but those don't work during the appeal process because the winner at trial is less

likely to win on appeal.

Lawmakers left the issue undecided only because a redistricting question needs to be resolved.

Gov. John Engler's budget for the fiscal year starting Oct. 1 provides no new money for a massive expansion of the Court of Appeals. Engler does get it.

The appellate court is trying new ideas to resolve issues more quickly, but mere efficiency can get you only so far. The Michigan Constitution provides an accused in criminal cases "an appeal as a matter of right."

One committee member, Rep. Michael Nye, R-Litchfield, thinks that flood should be halted rather than creating more judgeships. His view isn't popular among lawyers, judges and lawmakers, but Nye is right. The growing flood of appeals isn't a geometric given. The court needs to look, Engler-style, at focusing on basics and doing them well.

Thomas E. Daniels, an Ann Arbor lawyer, writing in the February issue of the Michigan Bar Journal, argues that the quality of criminal defense work is declining in Michigan.

"Because almost 90 percent of all felony defendants are too poor to hire their own lawyer, the ability of lawyers to perform competently is critical not only to their clients but to the proper functioning of the criminal justice system."

"Yet, the methods we use to appoint, pay, train and supervise appointed counsel virtually guarantee that many will not perform their role effectively, to the detriment of their clients and the criminal justice system itself."

What solution does The Bar offer? No. 1, of course, is to pay lawyers more. In the next article, on funding indigent criminal defense, Barbara R. Levine, administrator of the Michigan appellate assigned counsel system, tells us:

"The amount of compensation paid for appointed counsel is widely disparate between counties and shockingly low throughout the state."

The lawyers don't get it either.

Particularly pleasing about the Winter 1992 edition was that there were several short stories about the efforts of The Record and The Novi News to obtain governmental records through the Freedom of Information Act.

The real point of all this is not to spend a whole lot of time patting ourselves on the back. What's in my mind right now is something John Reddy, our executive vice president of editorial, was saying last week about the Freedom of Information and Open Meetings acts.

In a nutshell, John said he had the feeling that too many people look at these matters as items which don't really concern them personally... as items that government and newspapers fight about because they have nothing better to do.

The point, he said, is that when we get involved in a battle with some governmental agency for access to their records we're really fighting for the people's rights to access that same information.

He's right, of course. And I thought it was something worth repeating here.

township's engineering firm, serves as lead engineer in the \$100 million Western Townships Utilities Authority sewer, and stands to earn almost \$10 million from the project. The firm's president, Abe Munfah, is a Plymouth Township trustee who voted for the WTUA project, and also contributed to former Northville Township Supervisor Georgina Goss' 1991 state House campaign.

Three others with ties to Ayres, Lewis also contributed to Goss, who served on the WTUA board during her years as township supervisor.

Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczuk currently serves as the legal representative for Northville, Plymouth, and Canton townships. The same law firm also handles legal chores for WTUA, a task which will earn the firm in excess of \$1 million.

"Obviously there's been a committee formed to study professional services in the township," Essad said. Asked if he expected the township to sever ties to his firm, Essad said, "I don't know yet; I haven't talked to anyone [in the township] about that." Some township officials last week

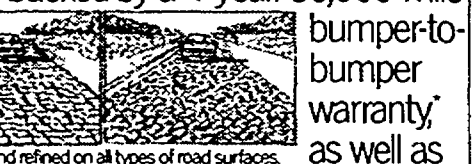

Ruffino seeks to make its Chianti classy

For well over 100 years, the House of Ruffino has maintained and nurtured its position at the forefront of the Italian wine industry. Founded by cousins Ilario and Leopoldo Ruffino in 1877, the young company set up headquarters in the Tuscan village of Pontassieve, 10 miles from the city of Florence.

Ruffino grew rapidly, acquiring vineyards yielding top quality grapes and expanding throughout Italy and other parts of Europe. They became official purveyors to the Italian and Swedish Royal Houses as well as the Vatican.

In 1913, the Ruffino name and wineries were purchased by the Folonari family. From the beginning, they had a 20th century approach to both viticulture and marketing. Ruffino was the first firm to market chianti worldwide before World War I.

Today, third-generation Ambrogio Folonari oversees all facets of the family's wine business. In fact, the Folonaris are largely responsible for a proactive role in seeking a deservedly serious image for chianti, the wine many Americans still equate with old-style pizza parlors.

As a wine-producing company, Ruffino realized that the picturesque straw-covered bottle detracted from perception of chianti as a well-made, serious yet versatile wine. In 1975, they were the first producer to introduce chianti in a new, stylish Florentine bottle.

Production and warehouse facilities are thoroughly modern. However, original 18th century cellars are still in use since they offer optimum wine aging conditions.

With 3,000 vineyard acres in the Tuscan hills, the heart of Chianti Classico, Ruffino is one of the largest land holders within this appellation. Here they have their Montemasso and Zano estates, the origin of most of the limited supply of Ruffino's flagship brand Chianti Classico Riserva Ducale.

Prior to 1957, when it was first launched in the U.S. wine market, it was the wine reserved for the private use of the Duke of Aosta who, during his frequent journeys to visit the pope, would travel through the Ruffino estates. The wine became his favorite, hence the name Riserva Ducale, the "Duke's Reserve."

This classically made Chianti Classico with its handsome gold label is produced only in the finest vintages and showcases elegant fruit maturity with a soft, appealing finish. It is 90 percent sangiovese, 7 percent canaiolo and 3 percent trebbiano.

Some Chianti prices have gone through the roof, but priced at \$14.50, the 1987 Chianti Classico Riserva Ducale is a price winner highlighted by dark cherry aromas and flavors.

Plentiful Peppers Exotic varieties hit mainstream

Peppers are hot. But then, you already knew that if you're a fan of the fiery chili and pungent jalapeno varieties.

What we're talking about are peppers of all varieties, and we're talking about hot, as in trendy.

Once considered exotic, red bell peppers are now as plentiful in most grocery stores and supermarkets as their green brothers. The yellow, purple, orange and brown varieties, once only found in out-of-the-way gourmet groceries, can be found at Kroger and Meijer. They even go on special occasionally.

But before you go stocking your crisper with this shiny vegetable, it might help to know your pepper nomenclature.

Indeed the word pepper itself is confusing. Sweet peppers — also known as bell peppers — are botanically related to chilis, but vary in their usage.

Sweet peppers can be the centerpiece of a dish, as in stuffed peppers. Drying a sweet red pepper and grinding it up gives you fresh paprika. Chilies, on the other hand, are prized for their hot, spicy qualities. The potent ground cayenne pepper is made from dried, ground chilies.

A friend of ours once said, "If you want your guests to think yours is the best salad they've ever eaten, dice up some red bell pepper in it."

In truth, there's nothing quite so magical about red peppers. They're simply matured green peppers. They are left on the vine longer, and in the process of turning bright, fire-engine

red, they acquire a sweeter, milder taste.

All the other colors have been grown for their color only, and have no appreciable taste difference. The possible exception here is the golden variety, which is supposed to be the sweetest of all.

Since we eat with our eyes, though, most stores command a premium for the colored peppers — two, three, even four times as much as the green variety.

Chili peppers are another story, though.

"Chili peppers differ in flavor and spiciness, depending on type," says Sylvia Treitman, home economist with the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service. "The more mature the chili, the hotter it is. If you don't want ones that are really hot, pick ones that aren't as developed."

Treitman adds that all peppers are rich in Vitamin C. Red peppers are a good source of Vitamin A as well.

All peppers are also low in calories. A whole green or yellow bell pepper has just 35 calories, while a large red bell pepper has about 50. The long, thin, green chili peppers pack about 21 calories apiece, while it would take about four little jalapenos to equal that number.

Treitman advises shopping for peppers carefully.

"Basically, they should be bright and glossy and firm and well-shaped," she says. "There should be no soft spots, gashes or visible decay. If peppers are spoiled, they will show black, gray or soft indications."

"Also, get one that is heavy for its size rather than light for the same

size. With more flesh it will be meatier.

"You should avoid anything that looks shriveled up," Treitman adds. "Peppers also freeze well, according to Treitman."

"They're one of the few vegetables you can freeze without blanching," she says. "You can cut them up and put them in the freezer and they'll do fine."

The popularity of Southwestern and Tex-Mex styles of cooking have also introduced us to the option of roasted peppers. This technique, often used by gourmet chefs, is easily imitated at home for a chic snack, and works with all varieties and colors of pepper. Chef Mary Brady of Northville uses it in dishes at her restaurant, Diamond Jim Brady's.

"At the restaurant, we roast any peppers that we're not going to cook any further," she says. "We have a goat cheese appetizer that uses roasted peppers."

"The reason you're roasting the peppers is to take off the skin. You couldn't peel a pepper unless you roasted it. It intensifies the flavor, and some caramelizing occurs."

The best way to roast peppers, Chef Brady advises, is to put the whole peppers under a broiler. Keep turning them until all the skin is black, and then remove them to a brown paper bag. In the bag, they will continue to steam so that the skin peels off with ease.

Another pointer when roasting and peeling peppers: as you take off the skin, do so on a dish or in a bowl so as to collect the juice that runs off. It makes a sweet and tasty ingredient for marinades (see recipes, page 2B).

What I admire about each of them is their unselfish sharing of knowledge. Also, they still have the desire to learn. Last week, while attending a Culinary Olympic Team meeting at school, I had the opportunity to watch Chef Leopold work. He was teaching an international cooking class. What a delight. He can work many of the younger people under the table, and he is "retired." What a wonderful role model for our profession.

As chefs, we need to be teachers on a daily basis. Our kitchens are our classrooms. If we nurture our "students," they

will one day do the same for the next generation, only with their own little twists and shortcuts. Although it is important to let them experiment, the basics must always be adhered to. The classical methods will never die. There may be variance, but the fundamentals won't change.

Cooking in a restaurant is no different than at home, only it's on a larger scale. Recipes must be followed, quality products purchased and proper procedures observed. Consistency is so important. If your family likes your meatloaf one day, and the next time you make it you leave an ingredient out, chances are they'll notice. The same goes for a commercial kitchen. The equipment is bigger, but it does the same job. Pots and pans must still be washed, the dishwasher loaded. Some

things never change.

Monday, March 9, is an opportunity to learn from some of these innovative chefs. They will share their skills in the established art of food preparation. Eight chefs will teach, of which students may choose any four. Each of the eight chefs has his or her own style and area of expertise.

All are expert cooks, and have tremendous knowledge in all areas of culinary arts. They have been educators of food science for years, and can share what they have had to learn through trial and error. Give yourself a treat and spend a day at school.

Colorful peppers sweeten any pot

MARINATED ROASTED PEPPERS

2 green, 2 red, 1 yellow pepper
1/4 cup olive oil
1/4 cup balsamic vinegar
4 cloves of garlic, finely minced
2 tablespoons chopped fresh herbs (mix and match your favorites from among parsley, basil, rosemary, thyme, chives or whatever)
6 chopped scallions

Roast peppers, then remove skin and seeds, saving juice. Julienne roasted peppers, then mix with remaining ingredients and pepper juice. Let marinate overnight.

Serve cold or at room temperature with a loaf of good french bread, spread with goat cheese or your favorite soft cheese. Make a meal out of it. Roasted mushrooms also make a good addition, too.

PEPERONATA

5 medium tomatoes
5 sweet bell peppers (green and red, or red and yellow)

2 medium onions, thinly sliced
1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil
1 tablespoon tomato paste
salt
fresh black pepper
1/4 cup red wine vinegar

Chop tomatoes. Seed and cut peppers into strips. Slice onions thinly.

Heat oil in a large, heavy skillet. Add onions and peppers. Saute over medium heat until onions are light gold and peppers have softened, mixing occasionally.

Add tomatoes, tomato paste and salt and fresh pepper. Cover and cook over medium heat 30 to 35 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add vinegar and mix well. Cook, uncovered, 10 minutes longer. Mixture will become thick. Taste and adjust for seasoning. Serve hot or at room temperature with mixed boiled meats, or over pasta.

Yields 3 1/2 to 4 cups, or 8 to 10 servings.

CUMIN RICE WITH PEPPERS

4 bunches scallions, or enough

to make about 1 1/2 cups chopped
1 each red, yellow and green bell pepper
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
2 garlic cloves, minced
2 cups long-grain rice
2 teaspoons cumin
1 teaspoon oregano
3/4 cups chicken broth

Chop scallions. Halve, core, seed and coarsely dice peppers into 1/4- to 1/2-inch pieces. Melt butter in a large saucepan. Add onions, peppers and garlic and saute, stirring for about 4 minutes. Add rice, cumin and oregano. Stir to coat rice well. Pour in chicken broth. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to very low, cover and cook for 20 minutes, or until all liquid is absorbed.

Yields 12 side dish servings.

PAN-FRIED TROUT WITH BLUE CORNMEAL, RED CHILIES AND GARLIC

1 tablespoon vegetable oil
2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
6 whole river trout, 10 to 12 ounces each
1 egg
1/4 cup milk

1/4 cup blue cornmeal
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon black pepper
1/4 cup red chili powder
4 tablespoons (1/2 stick) unsalted butter
2 dried red chilies, seeded, stemmed and cut into 2-inch strips
6 garlic cloves, halved

Mix together oil and chopped garlic. Brush onto each trout. In a bowl, beat together egg and milk.

In a separate bowl, mix together blue cornmeal, salt, pepper and red chili powder. Dredge each trout first in egg and milk mixture, then in dry mixture so that each is thoroughly coated.

In a large skillet over moderate heat, melt butter and add dried red chilies and garlic halves. Saute 1 minute. Add fish. Saute fish 3 minutes, flip over and saute another 3 minutes until golden brown.

Serve on plates with sauteed garlic and peppers. Yields 6 servings.

on racks. This addition produces a secondary fermentation which adds not only softness, but enhanced body to the wine which is complexed by a nine-month oak aging period.

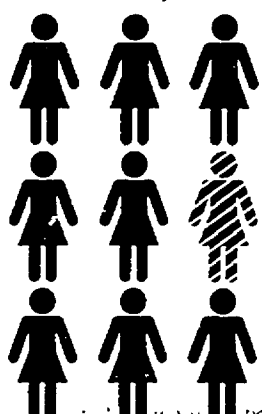
With its substantial body, it is ex-

Comfort foods meet '90s style

Delicious and soothing, comfort foods bring back memories of the cozy childhood meals mom made. And for the past few years, cooks have delighted in finding their way home to these friendly, nostalgic favorites.

Why all this yearning for basic, home-style cooking? Some trend-watchers see it as an antidote to our fast-paced, frenzied lifestyles. Others point to the economy, the mini baby boom with its stay-at-home tendencies, or even the weather.

Whatever the reason, the outcome is the same: comfort foods speak to the soul to reassure and soothe us at any age.

Today, heliroom recipes are being retrieved from recipe files and old cookbooks and updated so they are less time-consuming to prepare and lower in fat.

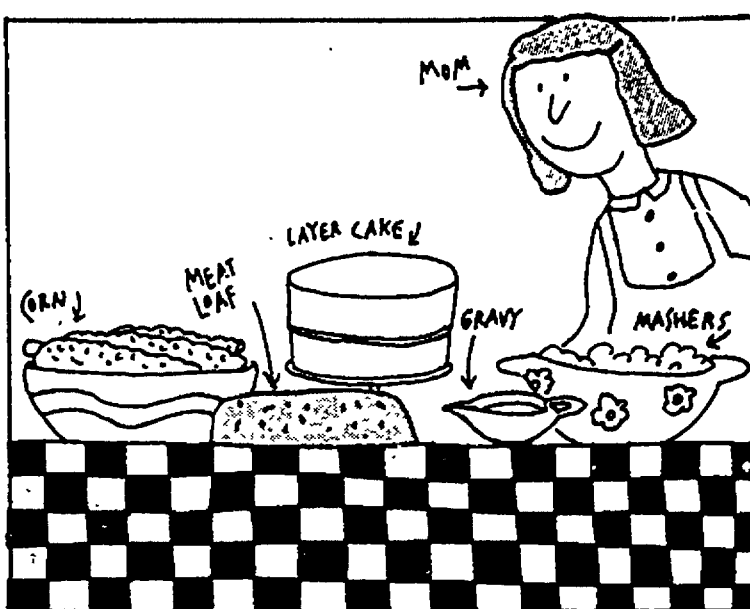
Few foods are as soothingly rich as macaroni and cheese. 1990s Mac 'n Cheese, developed in the Quaker Kitchens, still has the requisite creamy cheese sauce but contains less fat and more fiber than the classic.

Wheat germ also is naturally low in saturated fat, sodium-free and a source of eight essential vitamins and minerals.

Easy-to-make, this dish needs little more than a salad or vegetable and fruit dessert. Leftovers reheat well in the microwave oven.

Like macaroni and cheese, bread pudding has comforted young and old for generations. Pear, Raisin & Walnut Bread Pudding is more convenient because it's prepared in one

dish. A few ingredient changes make it more healthful. Skim milk and egg whites cut the fat and cholesterol; a combination of fresh and dried fruit, whole wheat bread and wheat germ add fiber.

Because wheat germ has a texture similar to that of finely ground nuts, just a sprinkling of chopped walnuts is needed for flavor.

Serve the pudding warm with a generous spoonful of the creamy cinnamon-flavored sauce that's made with low-fat yogurt. You won't even miss the more traditional whipped cream.

1990S MAC 'N CHEESE

2 tablespoons margarine
¼ cup finely chopped onion
¼ cup flour

2 cups skim milk
1 cup low-fat cheddar cheese
2 tablespoons Parmesan cheese
¼ teaspoon hot pepper sauce
¼ cup wheat germ, any flavor
2 cups cooked macaroni
3 tablespoons wheat germ, any flavor

Heat oven to 375 degrees F. Melt margarine in medium saucepan. Stir in onion; cook over medium heat until tender. Add flour; heat until mixture is smooth and bubbly, stirring constantly. PEAR, RAISIN & WALNUT BREAD PUDDING

1½ cups toasted whole wheat bread cubes (2-3 slices coarse textured bread)
¼ cup wheat germ, any flavor
1½ cups diced fresh pears
3 tablespoons raisins
2 tablespoons finely chopped walnuts
1½ cups skim milk
½ cup firmly packed brown sugar
3 egg whites, slightly beaten
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
¼ cup low-fat vanilla yogurt
¼ teaspoon ground cinnamon

Heat oven to 350 degrees F. Lightly spray 1½-quart casserole with no-stick cooking spray. Combine bread cubes, wheat germ, pears, raisins and walnuts in casserole. Combine milk, brown sugar, egg whites, vanilla and 1 teaspoon cinnamon; mix well. Pour milk mixture evenly over bread mixture.

Let the microwave zap cholesterol from your diet

Many of us are more careful about cholesterol these days, and that's smart. Yet your body does need some cholesterol to function properly, so it's not a total villain.

Cholesterol is a waxy substance that your body produces in small amounts to aid in digestion and other functions. A healthy body produces enough cholesterol on its own, but you can end up with excess cholesterol from the foods you eat — animal products like whole eggs, poultry, meat, butter.

As excess cholesterol is carried through the bloodstream it can form deposits (plaque) along the interiors of artery walls, increasing your chances of heart disease.

Americans tend to eat lots of saturated animal fats high in cholesterol. It's estimated that the average American diet consists of 40 percent fat. Many of us begin building up excess cholesterol even in childhood, and after we reach age 30, most of us have well-developed plaque deposits inside our artery walls.

Heart disease is the number one cause of death in this country — more than half of all deaths are related to heart disease. But this is one of the most preventable of health problems, and you can reduce your risk by getting regular exercise, maintaining your ideal weight, not smoking and controlling your diet.

Cholesterol travels through the bloodstream by attaching to lipoproteins LDL and

HDL. LDL helps circulate and deposit cholesterol where you don't want it: along artery walls.

Some foods tend to raise LDL levels and increase deposits of "bad" cholesterol: organ meats (like liver and kidney); lobster, shrimp and sardines, bacon and sausage; luncheon meats; "prime" and other heavily marbled and fatty cuts.

Instead of these, choose fish, lean meats and lean poultry (skin removed). Substitute ground turkey for ground beef. Or use tofu and textured soy products in place of meat.

While LDL contributes to plaque buildup in the arteries, HDL works to carry cholesterol from artery walls to the liver, where it can be processed and removed from the body.

"Good" cholesterol, the kind that promotes a high HDL level, is found in fatty fish like salmon, trout and herring — foods you'll want to eat more of.

And here's good news for garlic lovers: Garlic has been found to raise levels of HDL and thus reduce levels of blood cholesterol.

Cut down on foods prepared with butter, whole eggs, refined sugar. Avoid hydrogenated fats and oils like palm and coconut oils, which can raise blood cholesterol levels. Instead, use monounsaturated oils like olive and canola, or polyunsaturated oils like corn, sunflower, safflower.

Use low-fat (1 percent) milk products, especially fermented ones like yogurt, and substitute egg whites for whole eggs or egg yolks. Eat plenty of fresh fruits and vegetables, raw or lightly cooked — microwave steaming is a particularly easy and healthy method. And remember to roast, stir-fry or microwave instead of frying.

Your microwave can help steer you on the road to a healthy heart. Microwaving brings out the natural flavor in foods, retains vital nutrients, is ideal for cooking vegetables (which you want to eat more of).

Microwaving actually draws out more fat from meats that do other methods of cooking. Moreover, many foods that conventionally require fat for cooking can be microwaved with no additional fat at all.

The following recipes are "heart-smart" — easy to prepare and guaranteed to please your palate, too.

Recipes in this column are tested in 625- to 700-watt microwave ovens.

Micro-tip of the week

If you love microwaved popcorn, you can still include it in a heart-smart diet. But packaged, pre-bagged popcorn is often quite high in fat and salt. The solution: Buy your own inexpensive V-shaped microwave-safe popper and pop your own from scratch (follow manufacturer's instructions carefully).

Without added butter or salt, popcorn

makes a filling, low-calorie, high fiber, healthy snack. And from scratch is cheaper than prepackaged brands, too.

GARLIC AND PASTA FRESCA

2 whole heads of garlic (about 30 cloves), peeled and coarsely chopped
¼ pound fresh mushrooms chopped
1 cup chopped fresh parsley
¼ cup olive oil
¼ cup red wine
¼ teaspoon dried basil leaves or one tablespoon chopped fresh
Dash freshly ground black pepper
1 pound hot cooked vermicelli
1 tablespoon grated Parmesan or Romano cheese

Yields 4 servings
Preparation time: 20 to 25 minutes
Cooking time: 7 to 10 minutes (plus time to cook pasta).

Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power)
In 2-quart microwave-safe casserole combine garlic, mushrooms, parsley and olive oil. Cover and microwave 4 to 5 minutes, stirring once, until vegetables are just tender.

Stir in wine, basil and pepper. Cover and microwave 3 to 5 minutes longer, until vegetables are tender, stirring once. Toss with hot cooked pasta and garnish with grated

cheese. Serve immediately.

LEMONY TARRAGON SALMON STEAKS

4 (¼ inch-thick) salmon steaks (about 1 pound total)
1 tablespoon polyunsaturated margarine
2 teaspoons lemon juice
¼ teaspoon dried tarragon
Dash ground pepper
Paprika

Yields 4 servings
Preparation time: 10 minutes
Cooking time: 7 ½ to 10 ½ minutes
Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power)

Line 12x8-inch microwave-safe baking dish with paper towels; arrange salmon steaks in dish with thickest portions toward outer edges.

Measure margarine into a microwave-safe custard cup. Microwave 30 seconds or so to melt. Stir in lemon juice, tarragon and pepper. Brush mixture over salmon steaks and cover dish with waxed paper.

Microwave 7 to 10 minutes, rotating dish ¼ turn every 3 minutes. When done, salmon will flake easily with fork. Brush with additional lemon-tarragon sauce and sprinkle lightly with paprika to garnish. Serve immediately.

Strange as it may seem, those are words most advertisers think they'd rather not hear, even though viewers are unlikely to associate a pain reliever with unrest in the Middle East. So the Network Television Association has distributed a 16-minute video to ad executives nationwide specifically to sell them on the idea of advertising during crisis coverage. The video points out that an audience that's glued to the set — even by tragedy — is an audience that's paying attention, a prerequisite for every successful sales pitch.

"In Sickness and in Health" aims to be fair

Actress appreciates sensitive script

"When I first read this script," reveals actress Marg Helgenberger, "it was just too much, I had to put it down." The script in question is "In Sickness and in Health", premiering Sunday, March 8, on CBS. But when she finally finished reading the work by Alan Hines and Joyce Eliason, she knew she had to take the role of friend and caregiver to a woman suffering from multiple sclerosis, a neurological disease that causes difficulty in speech, muscle strength and coordination.

Helgenberger, who won an Emmy for her work on "China Beach" after roles in "The 'Slap' Maxwell Story" and "Hill Street Blues", says there were several reasons she was drawn to the project, but her attraction to the story was largely personal.

"My father suffered from multiple sclerosis," she explains, adding that she had identified strongly with the teenage daughter

when she first read the script.

In the drama, Lesley Ann Warren and Tom Skerritt star as Anita and Jarrett Mattison, a couple who have forged for themselves and their teenage daughter Holly (Robin Lively) a simple, quiet life in Greenville, Texas, despite Anita's degenerative multiple sclerosis. Underneath a cheerful facade, Anita feels badly for the burden her deteriorating condition places on her family. Helgenberger says the character is "longing for companionship as well as caretaking."

Help arrives when the Mattisons hire Mickey (Helgenberger), a single mother who's recently inherited a home in the neighborhood and is struggling to make ends meet. Warm, optimistic, Mickey soon infuses the Mattison household with hope, freeing Jarrett's mind from constant worry. Mickey also becomes Anita's truest friend, volunteering for the arduous task of taking Anita out of her home. A handful of visits to nearby flea markets makes Anita feel more alive than she has in a very long time.

Dormant feelings in Jarrett are also stirred, and his attraction to Mickey is reciprocated. An affair seems inevitable, despite Jarrett's love for and devotion to his wife and Mickey's genuine affection for her newfound friend.

While the characters of Jarrett and Mickey might easily emerge as unsympathetic, it is a strength of the script, Helgenberger says, that they do not. Jarrett's frustration is understandable, she says, and Mickey is simply trying to assuage her own loneliness.

Too often in cases like this, the actress points out, the feelings of others are forgotten in caring for the one who is sick. "You don't deal with the other issues," Helgenberger explains, adding, "If these things aren't discussed, the results are unhealthy."

As for playing Mickey, Helgenberger describes it as a "difficult role, but rewarding." The actress acknowledges the moral ambiguity of Mickey's actions, saying, "That's life... I don't like stories that tie up neatly with a bow at the end."
