## Mining plan permit up for a vote

A verdict is expected this week in round one of an epic two-part battle between Northville Township and Holloway Sand and Gravel Company. Township planning commissioners are scheduled to rule Tuesday on Holloway's special land-use permit request for a 177-acre parcel at the corner of Six Mile and Ridge roads.

Commission approval of the permit request likely would pave the way for Wixom-based Holloway to develop a sand and gravel mining operation on the property.

Rejection of the plan could land the township and Holloway back in court. Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Richard C. Kaufman last week ordered the township to decide on the sand and gravel portion of the developer's controversial proposal.

## School board petitions out

Residents interested in running for a seat on the Northville Board of Education have until April 6 to submit nominating petitions to the board office.

Two board seats are open for election on June 8. Carol Rahimi's and Donald Klokken's four-year terms expire this June, according to John Street, director of business and finance.

Street said last week he had not yet received any nominating petitions from either newcomers or incumbents.

Neither Rahimi nor Klokken could be reached for comment to say whether they would be seeking reelection. Both are serving their first terms on the board.

To be eligible for election, a candidate must be a registered voter in the district. Petitions are available at the school board office, 501 W. Main. They must be signed by 20 registered school district voters.

Board members are elected to four-year terms. The board of education meets the second and fourth Mondays of each month.

## Senior dedication Hopp's gerontology work earns Jefferson

Frances Hopp, Northville housing director for the past 14 years, has been named the winner of a 1992 Jefferson Award for community service.

The award is given to "unsung heroes" for their efforts to improve the quality of life in the community.

Hopp and four other winners will be presented with their awards at a ceremony hosted by WJBK-TV 2 on March 18. As a local winner, Hopp is also entered into competition for a national Jefferson Award, to be presented by the American Institute for Public Service in Washington D.C. this summer.

Hopp, who said she was "shocked" to learn about the award, said, "I figured I was up against the likes of (Lee) Iacocca and Henry Ford."

"Publicity is not one of my big things," Hopp admitted. "I care about the cause but I don't care so much about my name being flung around. But (the recognition) feels good."

Hopp holds a bachelor's degree from Madonna College with certificates of achievement in gerontology and aging and mental health, and has done graduate work at the University of Michigan.

A mother of three, Hopp returned to college in the 1970s and became part of a pioneering cadre of students interested in senior citizens' issues. "Back in the horse and wagon days, when I was a student at Madonna, gerontology existed but no one knew what the word meant," she said.

She and other Madonna students

started the Gerontology Student Association and even had T-shirts printed up that read "Pioneers in Gerontology."

The T-shirts served two purposes, she recalled. Along with identifying their wearers as pioneers in a new field, they would lead people to ask what gerontology meant.

Hopp has served as director of the city's housing commission since 1978 and oversees operations at Allen Terrace, the city-owned 101-unit senior residence. She came to Northville after serving as director of the City of Plymouth's housing commission between 1972-78.

But her work with the housing commissions only scratches the surface of her involvement with senior issues. Hopp became the first Certified Housing Manager in the United States in 1976, after completing an intensive pilot training program with the National Center for Housing Management.

A member of the National Association of Housing and Redevelopment Officials (NAHRO) for years, she has served as NAHRO's Michigan Chapter President and as a member of its National Task Force on Elderly Housing Issues. She also served as a delegate to the White House Conference on Aging in 1981.

Locally, Hopp was a founding member and is chair of the Northville Area Senior Citizen Advisory Council's finance committee. She has been on the board of directors of The Senior Alliance since its inception in 1980, and a board member with the Michigan Nonprofit Homes Association between 1983-89.

"There are so many different as-

pects in gerontology," Hopp noted. She mentioned her current involvement in transportation and nutrition issues as well as her work with the Northville Senior Center and The Senior Alliance as examples.

"It's still a growing learning experience, not only serving on them but sensitizing people away from the stereotypes," Hopp said. "I believe in the independence of people no matter what their age, and not placing any barriers in their way. And I think sometimes people with stereotypes do place barriers in their way."

When considering the needs of senior citizens, Hopp said, "I sort of use my rule of thumb. How would I like to be treated and how would I expect to be treated? It puts things in a different perspective."

Hopp attributes much of her reflected glory to the five-member housing commission with which she works. Its members are President Ray J. Casterline, Constance J. Condor, Charlotte A. Holland, John Monagle, and William Robertson.

"We've got one of the most fantastic housing commissions I've ever seen," she said. "They hand-weigh over the decision-making each time an issue comes up. They're dedicated and they really care about the people they're serving."

She added that the award would not have been possible without the support she and the housing commission receive from city officials. "The award actually belongs to those folks," she said. "I'm just their servant, performing their duties."

## Video owners appear in exam

An obscenity case against Northville Video and its owners was adjourned Friday, as prosecutors and defense attorneys readied documents for an April 3 hearing.

Attorneys, including Wayne County Assistant Prosecutor Raymond Walsh and defense attorney Carl Rubin, are slated to present briefs to 35th District Court Judge James Garber by March 20. Garber is expected to entertain motions from both sides at the April 3 hearing.

Carl Lyle Wilson, 50, of Brighton, and his daughter Laura Annette Wilson, 26, of Northville, are charged with four counts each of second-degree obscenity.

The Wilsons and Northville Video were charged last month after township police raided their 43197 Seven Mile video store. Police confiscated jacket covers from four allegedly obscene videotapes, as well as glossy materials, a computer, and computer files listing videotape renters.

The raid was authorized by the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office, and came on the heels of a Detroit man's December complaint to township police.

The complainant had refused to state his name or discuss details of the Michigan Coalition on Pornography, simply saying he was the president of a "small organization."

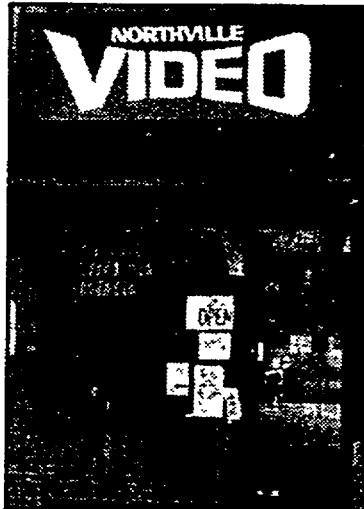
But the Record has identified the complainant as Michael B. Quinkert of Detroit. Quinkert was spotted at Friday's court hearing and cut short an impromptu interview after a few questions.

When asked to describe his organization, Quinkert responded, "No, I don't want to. I'm not particularly interested in that, you writing this article."

Quinkert then was asked his reasoning behind filing a complaint about four allegedly obscene videotapes he found at Northville Video.

"I'm only interested in justice," he said. Asked to define justice, Quinkert said, "I don't know; look it up in Webster's (dictionary). Don't quote me on that, either."

Quinkert then refused further comment on the case. He previously had told a reporter that his complaint was borne of an "investigation" of the video store.

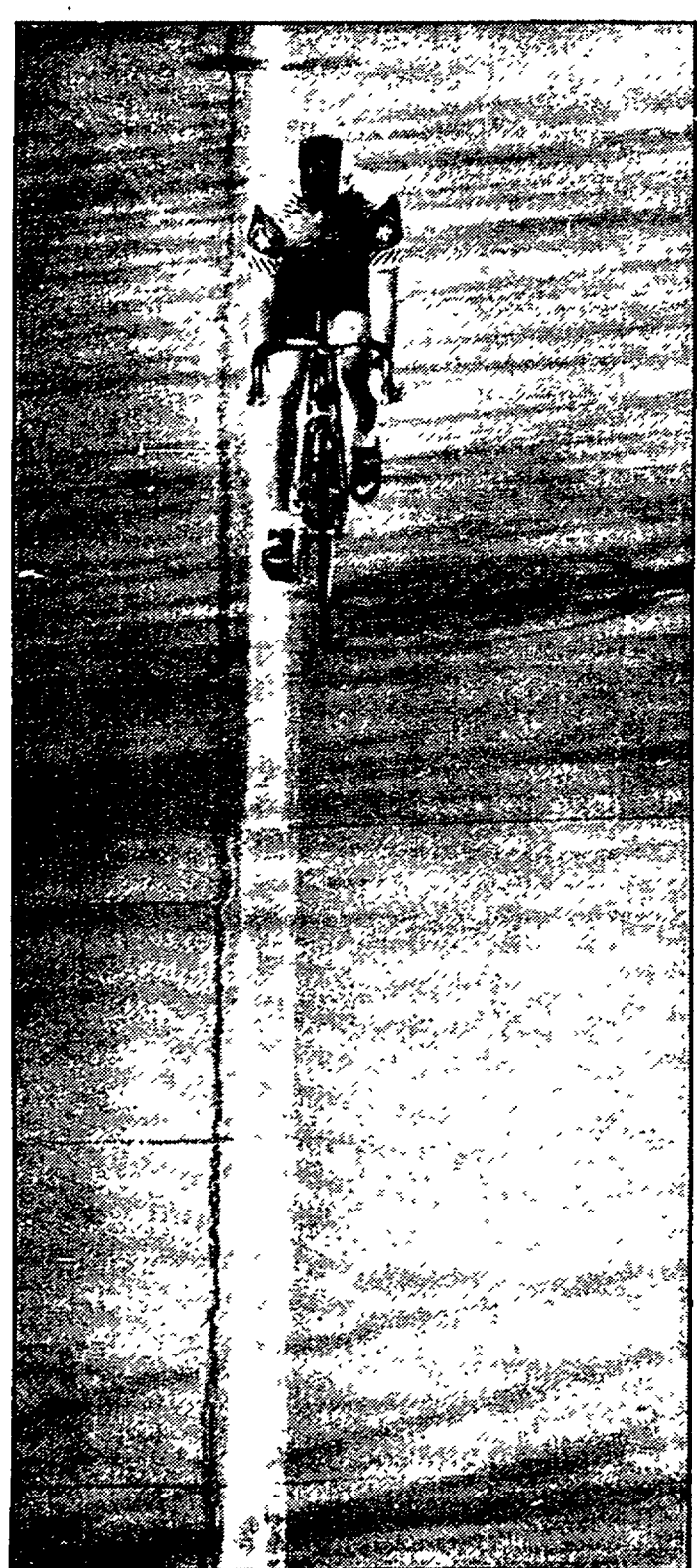

## Recreation plan hearing this week

Perhaps they haven't discovered their field of dreams, but Northville recreation officials believe they're finally in the right ballpark.

The public will get a glimpse of their vision Wednesday, when the Northville Recreation Commission reviews its 1992 Master Plan.

The master plan provides a blueprint of Northville Parks and Recreation future plans, and includes passages on park and program development, goals, and conditions of existing facilities.

A five-year action plan accompanies the master plan, which will be discussed at 8 p.m. Wednesday. After recreation commission screening, the plan will be on display before the township board Thursday, and before the city council next Monday, March 16.

A draft of the master plan already has been forwarded to the state for review, said Parks and Recreation Director Traci Gottschalk.

Recreation's most pressing need is no mystery, Gottschalk said. Athletic field space is in great demand, and

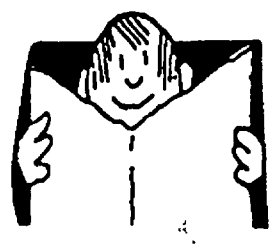

## Planners consider permit

Holloway had charged in a suit filed last December that the township dragged its feet on the land-use permit.

Another hotly debated issue is scheduled to be decided March 31, when the planning commission will vote on Holloway's plan to construct an asphalt plant on the site.

Both planning commission votes will come in the form of recommendations to the township board, which has the final say in each plan.

The proposed mining operation and asphalt plant have inflamed the passions of township residents and some officials since last summer, when industry heavyweight Holloway introduced its special land use plan.

Residents from Blue Heron Pointe and other locales along the Beck, Six Mile, and Ridge Road corridors consistently have packed planning commission meetings to speak against

the development plans.

The township also has geared for battle, offering up a wide array of consultants opining on such issues as engineering, traffic, water quality, dust, noise, and property values. Several of those consultants are expected to speak Tuesday, said Carol Maise, township planning and zoning administrator.

"We could go back to cover all those issues," Maise said, adding that the planning commission is staffed by four new members, none of whom have reviewed a Holloway site plan.

"Groundwater is the biggest concern, as well as the on-site and off-site impacts," she said.

Township officials question Holloway's post-mining plans. According to the developer's proposal, a 50- to 55-acre lake will be created as sand and gravel is removed. A lake of that size in an industrially zoned area does not appeal to some township officials.

Holloway considers that stance a moot point, contending that much of the area near the proposed lake is unsuitable for any type of industrial development.

But township water quality experts are expected to report that water levels could be affected in nearby wells and lakes, due to the fact that Holloway would be digging into the water table.

Regardless of the outcome of Tuesday's vote on the special land-use permit, the township board will hold a public hearing prior to issuing its own vote on the project. The board generally follows along with the planning commission in such issues.

Settlement of a second major issue is set for March 31, when the commission is supposed to hear and vote on the proposed asphalt plant. A resignation-wracked commission hastily approved an asphalt plant ordinance in December, after Holloway had lodged its circuit court complaint.

the department soon will advertise for bids on phase one of the new community park on Beck between Five Mile and Six Mile roads.

**SCHOOL BOARD TO CONSIDER MILLAGE CAMPAIGN:** The Northville Board of Education meets Monday night to consider a proposed millage campaign package which would ask voters to approve a 25.41-mill package in a special election April 28. Included in the proposal is a request for a renewal of 22.63 mills, which expired in the 1991 tax levy, and a 2.78-mill increase. The board meets Monday at 7:30 p.m. in the board of education room at the Old Village School, 405 West Main Street.

**NORTHVILLE GREEN REZONING HEARING:** A public hearing has been called for Monday, March 16, on the proposed rezoning of a plot of land owned by Northville Green Apartments owner Sheldon Gordon. Gordon is seeking to rezone land off Randolph from single-family residential to multi-family residential, to give him the acreage needed to build a new eight-unit apartment building and 26-space parking lot southeast of Northville Green.

The 8 p.m. public hearing, before the city council, follows a heated debate at a Feb. 4 planning commission public hearing over the proposal. Residents there protested the plan, citing concerns over increased pedestrian and vehicular traffic and a desire to retain the residential feel of the neighborhood. The planning commission voted 5-2 in favor of the rezoning. Final approval rests with the council.

# Students, parents compare views

A panel of seven Northville high schoolers fielded questions from parents and aired their views on a host of issues in their daily lives at the "Parent to Parent" meeting Tuesday.

"Timely Talks with (and About) Teens" was the third this school year in a series of parent workshops sponsored by the Northville Action Council and the Northville Counseling Center in cooperation with the Northville PTA Coordinating Council. The teen panel discussion, which lasted nearly two hours, was one of many events planned for Red Ribbon Week.

"I feel it was comfortable for everybody," said Jacques Martin-Downs, one of two adult moderators on the panel. "Things like that can get off track and crash and burn, but it didn't, and I think it was a positive experience for everybody."

Panelists were chosen randomly from the student body, but Martin-

Downs said participants were not selected as randomly as they could have been.

"We tried to get a total random sampling to represent a broader cross-section of the students, but as time got closer we just asked for volunteers and called Charlie Sulec from the Student Assistance Program to recommend students for the panel," she said.

While Martin-Downs had prepped students for the panel discussion the night before, she said topics of discussion took on more personal issues derived from the spontaneous interaction between teens and parents.

"I think it worked well because the students they were working carefully to not disrupt the parents, and I think were very respectful of their audience," she said.

During the course of the panel discussion teens and parents talked candidly about curfews; comprom-

ises and negotiating decisions; mutual respect; fostering of decision-making skills; peer, teen, teacher, school, and parent pressure; and the acceptance of constructive criticism.

In actuality parents and teens echoed each other's sentiments and often agreed that with a little more cooperation and respect for each other, there might be fewer and less severe conflicts.

Teens and parents agreed to be respectful of each other's space and judgment, and to give teens an opportunity to grow by trusting them to make their own decisions.

Evaluation forms completed by the 18 parents who attended the panel discussion illustrated the need for an encore performance of the teen panel in next year's "Parent to Parent" program.

Parent to Parent was a program started in the fall of 1990. Originally, similar programs were held once a month in every school within the district. Facilitators, like Martin-Downs

from the Northville Counseling Center, led activities which sought to promote self-esteem, assertiveness and discipline. In addition, parent workshops addressed critical issues like academic success, peer pressure and teasing, and provided a foundation for a parent network.

Martin-Downs said the pilot program got a lukewarm reception from parents last year. A low turnout prompted a reduction in the number of sessions planned for this year. This year's program was limited to three sessions, two of which were forums with guest speakers. Programs this year saw a larger audience with more parent involvement, Martin-Downs said.

Funded entirely by the Southeastern Michigan Substance Abuse Services, the program will return next year. In response to what Martin-Downs billed a "win-win" situation for both parents and teens, an encore teen panel will be held in May.

# Denny McLain pitches a message

While the details of his story were unclear, the morale of the parable Denny McLain told students at Our Lady of Victory Tuesday rang through like church bells.

"You must take advantage of the education you have in front of you," the former Detroit Tigers pitcher told elementary students last week.

McLain's visit to the school was part of the annual Red Ribbon Week campaign which promotes drug and alcohol awareness in elementary and secondary schools.

"Life is too difficult without an education. If you can read and can write, you have a chance."

Education offers every student an equal opportunity to succeed at a career and in life, he said.

For some, completing an education is an opportunity they have taken advantage of. For others who dropped out, it's a missed opportunity. An opportunity, McLain said he has seen fall by the wayside one too many times.

In 1985 the one-time star pitcher was indicted on charges that landed him in prison for 2½ years. Those 2½ years, served in shared time between facilities in Atlanta, Ga., and Birmingham, Ala., introduced McLain to the tragedy of illiteracy.

In recalling his time in prison, McLain told a story of a fellow inmate who was arrested for bank robbery. John, the inmate, couldn't read or write and often asked McLain to read letters for him.

While in prison, McLain said 70 percent of the people he met were illiterate. Sixty percent of the individuals who are in prison, once released are

repeat offenders, he said. Contrary to what others believe, the prison system doesn't rehabilitate people before mainstreaming them back into society.

"You have a terrific opportunity here. Take advantage of what is given to you," he said. "I did a lot of stupid things — some true, some not — but I learned a lot while I was there," he said.

McLain, now a well-known radio talk show host on WXYT and celebrity co-host of "Elfi and Denny" on Channel 2, was once an avid speaker at schools in and around the Metro Detroit area. He says he does fewer speaking engagements now than he did before.

"I used to do it a lot. At least 25-35 schools a year," he said. "The message is clear that I want these kids to use what is available to them. To use their education to learn to read and write."

## Thousands in goods reported stolen from home

Thieves ransacked a Westmeath home and stole up to \$20,000 in jewelry and electronic equipment late last month, township police said.

Police said the thieves apparently used a tire iron to break a door pane sometime between Feb. 20 and Feb. 24. The homeowners were away on vacation and the house alarm was deactivated at the time of the break-in, police said.

Reported as stolen were a stereo system, speakers, a laser printer, computer disks, and jewelry, police said. Thieves apparently cut the home's telephone wires during the incident, police said.

## New store offers decorating ideas between Friends

Are you looking to redecorate a lifeless living room, a drab dining room or a frumpy foyer?

A new shop at MainCentre provides ample examples of redesign ideas, and its owners can add even more.

Friends, which bills itself as a "unique furnishings and design center," recently held its grand opening at 126 MainCentre. Friends is owned and operated by Jean Rooney and Beverly Maisano, and is their first retail venture.

The shop is made up of six "vignettes," spaces decorated in distinctly different ways. Rooney, an interior designer, said she and Maisano wanted to reflect as many styles as possible in their store.

"We do everything from the ridiculous to the sublime," Rooney said. "We tried to cover Contemporary, Country, English, Rustic, French, Cabin . . . We went from Versailles to Vermont, just to give the customers an idea of what's possible."

One possibility, as the shop de-

monstrates, is a room furnished by a bed made from fallen white birch logs, complete with moss on the bedposts, and a birch dresser that uses branches for drawer pulls.

Off to one side is a loveseat constructed of a log slab and a gnarled grape vine as thick as an arm. An antiqued bird cage with a white crackle finish, inhabited by four noisy finches, completes the scene.

But the shop resembles an art gallery as much as an upscale furniture store, with watercolors and oils lining the wall and eccentric ceramic masks and busts staring from pedestals. The owners hope to display and sell the works of a wide variety of local and Michigan artists.

"I don't think you would call it a store, it's really more of a gallery," Rooney said.

"The heart of it really is the design," Maisano agreed.

Maisano added that the store already seems to be finding its niche in interior design in Northville.

"We've had about nine appointments already . . . and those were just from people walking in the last couple of days," she said. "The comments we're getting are that they're

really glad to see something like this in Northville."

Rooney had a design studio of her own in Livonia for several years, but as she recalled, "It was strictly de-

sign services [and it really wasn't open for retail]. . . My clients before were all referrals, so I didn't really have any spot to show people what I could do.

"I've had this idea for a shop in the back of my head for a few years. I've just been looking for a location and Northville is so vital and upbeat that it seemed like a natural."

As for the name, Rooney said, "It seems that my clients become my friends, and my friends helped me put this [shop] together, so that's where we got the name for the store."

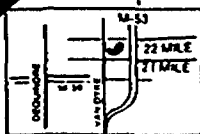

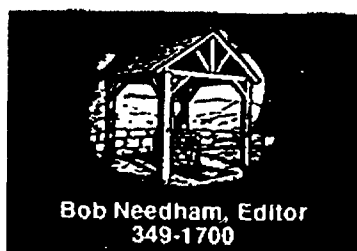

## Our Opinion

### Library supporters taking active role

We've noted here before that budget cuts in our local governments have hit the Northville Public Library particularly hard. The library's annual report for 1991 puts the picture into clear focus: Demand for and use of services continue to increase; staff levels and hours of service shrink. It's a bad pinch, and likely to remain so for the foreseeable future.

How to cope? A special study group, arising from the Friends of the Library, is considering funding alternatives. Early indications are that the group may find good success.

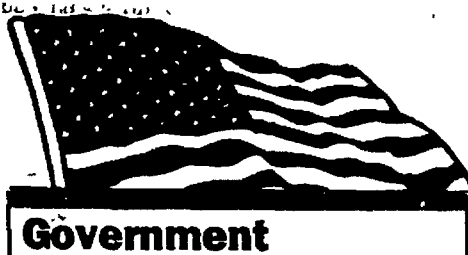
The idea of a district library, which has come up from time to time in the past, will very likely be among the final recommendations. It's certain to be the subject of a great deal of discussion within the study group, at the library commission, and among the members of the city council and township board. The study committee appears to be taking exactly the right approach: heading in the direction of a district library, but keeping an eye open and an ear cocked to any other ideas.

Options certainly exist. For one example, the Ann Arbor community — which is of course very different from Northville — runs its entire public library system, including a main library and branches, as part of the public school district. An obvious disadvantage to that plan here is that people who live within the Northville School District and the City of Novi would get taxed twice for libraries. But perhaps that problem could be worked out somehow.

We're not recommending such an arrangement, only remarking that creative options are there for the consideration. Of course, the options may just take the form of finding ways to supplement existing library funding from the city and township, with no major shakeup in organization or form of funding.

If it becomes clear that a major systemic change is warranted, though, at first blush a district library seems like the most obvious, if not the best, way to restructure. Under such a plan, the library would become an independent entity, run by its own unit of elected government, levying its own property tax approved by voters.

Ideally, a library millage would accompany a reduction in the city and township levies to reflect the removal of that obligation from their budgets. At the same time, the dedicated library millage could make up some of the money which



has been squeezed from the library budget.

The overall result to the taxpayer, therefore, might mean a tax increase, but it could be a small one. (The library's current budget translates to roughly one-half mill of tax levied across the township and city. On a \$200,000 home, that's \$50 of tax a year. The library budget could increase 10 percent for the price of a sandwich from each property owner.)

But the beauty of a special library millage is that voters know exactly what they're paying, and exactly what they're getting for it. It's difficult for the township board and city council to decide to what degree they should fund the library at the expense of other services. Under a district library, the voters would make those decisions. From the library's perspective, it might even look like a risky move — what if every funding proposal, no matter how conservative, gets turned down flat? But that's not likely to happen, and even if it did, at least the will of the people would prevail.

To look further down the road, the library still needs larger quarters. All the campaigning for expansion that took place before and during the consideration of the Haller Library plan has faded somewhat, but the pressures that drove it only increase with the passage of time. A governing library board might be in the best position to accomplish a library move/expansion, some day down the road when economic conditions permit.

The library study group is not operating in a vacuum. At the annual Friends of the Northville Public Library meeting, scheduled from 10 to 11:30 a.m. Saturday, March 14, the major agenda item will be brainstorming on library funding. Here's a vital chance for everyone to put their own two cents in — figuratively — on all these issues.

The study group is off to a strong start and pointed in a good direction. This weekend's meeting might provide some added momentum. If things continue on course, the community has a great chance to see this problem solved.

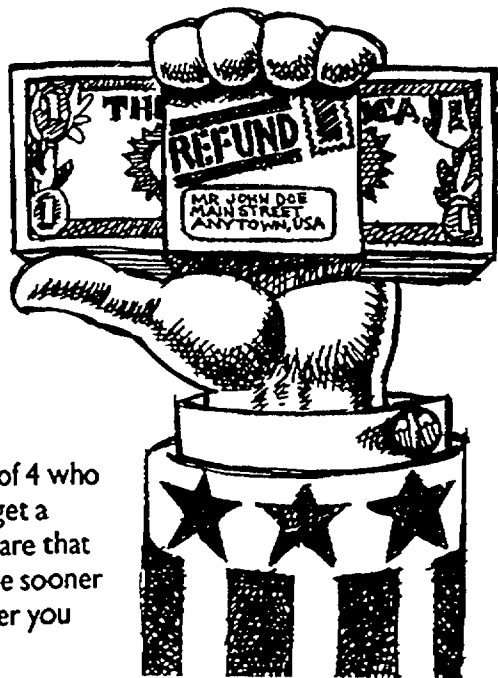

### Sample flavors of Scotland's single malts

Single Malt Scotch whiskies have joined the league of upscale spirits frequently ending a great meal. Served in a snifter, they are offered after dinner at trendy restaurants.

Consumers are finding the same variety and flavor in single malt Scotch whisky they enjoy with wine or a fine cognac.

What is drunk all over the world and known as Scotch is not malt whisky, but a blend of grain whisky with a proportion of malt (the better the whisky, the larger the portion of malt) to give it flavor and character.

A single malt is an unblended whisky from a single distillery made only from barley malt.

Malts run the gamut from light and delicate to heavy and robust, with sufficient flavors and styles to keep the most avid fan intrigued.

Some are deeply amber, rich and concentrated while others are light and subtle. Many have oak, smoke and pungent peat (Scotland's fossil fuel) notes as contrasted with those that are redolent of apples and vanilla.

Like wine, Scotland's single malts are grouped by region and offer an approximate guide to style, aroma and richness.

The Lowlands provide the consumer soft, gentle, finesseful malts with an apple fruitiness. The Lowland taste is considered one of the most elegant.

The largest producing region is the Highlands, boasting a variety of malt styles ranging from light and subtle (The Glenlivet) to big and sherry-like (The Macallan), but generally smoky and smooth.

Because of its proximity to the sea, the Campbeltown malts have a sea mist aroma with a fresh, tangy taste commonly described as briny or salty.

Campbeltown malts are rare since this region has the fewest distilleries. Islay, (pronounced "eye-luh") malts, noted for their rugged, robust aromas, are unusually heavy with peat and have an iodine-like bouquet from the sea.

We have tasted a range of quality single malts that do not suffer from the look-alike, taste-alike syndrome. We like to nose and taste malts neat, in a brandy snifter. Addition of several drops of cold mineral water releases a bouquet of flavors and aromas.

To experience light, smooth, all-purpose malts, try Glenkinchie, Glenlivet and Cardhu. Graduate to fuller-bodied, more complex malts such as Knockando, The Macallan and Highland Park.

Lastly, after you've gained appreciation, taste Laphroaig, a heavily peated Islay malt which stands out as a bold dram even among other Islay malts.

Long before Simon and Garfunkel recorded the Herbalist's National Anthem, "Scarborough Fair," people have valued herbs for their fragrant, medicinal and culinary uses.

There are plenty of botanical definitions for herbs, but Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service horticulturalist Gregory Patchan has compiled a pamphlet wherein he gives his admittedly broad definition of herbs.

He defines herbs as plants used for flavoring foods, providing fragrance, repelling insects, suspected medicinal benefits and fabric and yarn dyes.

Before the days of refrigeration, meats were preserved in marinades of citrus juices and oils and herbs like garlic, basil, marjoram and thyme.

In the modern kitchen, herbs are primarily an additive, used to complement the flavors of foods. For example, what would spaghetti sauce be without oregano, or a stir fry without green onion?

"Americans have gotten away from savory foods. Why? I don't know," says Patchan. "But the full, subtle richness of herbs still is the mainstay of flavor in ethnic cooking. The Orientals like green onion and ginger. East Indians are known for curries. Italians and basil are synonymous. French cuisine calls for shallots and chervil."

"Among others, Spanish requires oregano, Polish dill, and on and on."

Yet with a rising interest in ethnic cooking, more and more people are experimenting with herbs; not the canned and dried variety, but fresh, flavorful herbs which are becoming more readily available in supermarkets and grocery stores.

In this area, where people have some property around their homes, herb gardens are springing up as well.

And why not? Even if you're the type that tortures houseplants to a slow death, herbs should be a snap. Most herbs come from Mediterranean regions where the soil is sandy, dry, loose, poor in plant nutrients and the weather is tempered with humid air and lots of sun, but little rain.

For herb growers in Michigan, says Patchan, "It means that with a little work at soil preparation, we can grow our own culinary delights right in our own backyards or on our patios."

Growing herbs can be fun and easy for kids, too, according to Pam Palechek, herb expert at Brickscape Gardens in Northville.

"Children are delighted with dill and its three- to four-foot plants," she says. "Take a bottle of Italian salad dressing, put in a couple of the mature heads, and they'll be surprised that it tastes like a fresh homemade dressing."

"Children also like chives. Kids like the purple flowers and are amazed the way they smell like onions. They can cut them up while mom scrambles their eggs, and be delighted with the change it adds to that."

Spring is a good time to get started on growing your herbs, Palechek says, though she warns that first-timers probably shouldn't attempt to grow them from seeds. Garden stores like Brickscape offer a variety of small plants that can be transplanted and raised easily at home.

"If they are going to start dill or parsley from seed, they can wait until the ground warms because they'll have plenty of time for a harvest," she says. "But if they're going to do basil, thyme or bay, they should come in and buy some small plants. For rosemary, sage or oregano, I'd also recommend the small plants if they're new herb growers."

Palechek is an avid user of fresh herbs herself. Not only does she like to use dried sage for ornamentation, but it and other herbs show up in her cooking.

"One of my favorite ways to use basil..."

## Getting fresh with the culinary herbs

### BASIL QUICHE

#### Crust

1 cup all purpose flour  
1 pinch salt  
1/4 cup butter  
4 1/2 teaspoons vegetable shortening  
3 tablespoons water  
dried beans (for weight)

#### Filling

2 tablespoons butter  
1 tablespoon olive oil  
1 cup minced onion  
15 ounces ricotta cheese  
4 eggs  
1 pinch each salt, white pepper, nutmeg  
Pesto topping (recipe follows)

Crust: Combine flour and salt in mixing bowl. Cut in butter and shortening until mix resembles oatmeal. Add ice water to hold dough together. Roll out and press into 9-inch tart pan with removable bottom. Overlay dough

with foil and weight with dried beans. Bake 10 minutes in 375 F preheated oven. Remove beans and foil and continue to bake crust until brown. Remove from oven.

Filling: Melt butter with olive oil in skillet. Add onions, cook five minutes. Combine ricotta cheese, eggs, salt, pepper and nutmeg in large bowl. Add sauteed onion and beat until smooth. Spoon into crust and bake 25 to 30 minutes or until knife inserted in filling comes out clean.

#### Pesto Topping

Puree two cups packed fresh basil, three tablespoons pine nuts or walnuts and three cloves of peeled garlic. Mix into 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese, then gradually add five tablespoons olive oil.

Spread on top of baked cooled pie. Garnish with sliced cherry tomatoes and basil leaves made into flower-like formations.

# No shuck and jive when it comes to shellfish



There has been so much discussion on the quality of shellfish that I feel the subject must be addressed. The bottom line is this: If you purchase your fish from reputable dealer there should not be any problem.

I have written before about Foley's, Boston's real again, only because I believe in them. There has never been any question about their products. They are impeccable.

Some facts: There are several types of problems associated with eating shellfish. Bacterial and viral agents present in shellfish harvested from polluted waters are killed when cooked. This doesn't leave a lot of room for error when the shellfish is served raw.

Natural toxins not caused by pollution include red tide, domoic acid and vibrio vulnificus, big names that can cause big difficulties.

Red tide occurs worldwide. Cooking does not kill the toxin which can cause paralytic shellfish poisoning. Outbreaks occur mainly during the months of April through October when toxic plankton can bloom. Each of the maritime states that is affected by red tide has a toxicity monitor-

ing program. If the toxin reaches an upper level, the beds are closed and not reopened until deemed safe.

Domoic acid is also a natural toxin. The shellfish from Prince Edward Island and the Pacific Northwest are said to be affected. It has not been reported in Massachusetts or Connecticut, the source of our shellfish.

Vibrio vulnificus, a saltwater organism, is found mainly in summer in waters of the South Atlantic and Gulf of Mexico. The good news is, it is killed by cooking. The bad news is if people choose to eat raw seafood from this region they better watch out. The outcome can be disastrous.

Since the latter 1980s, inspection programs have been significantly strengthened

by increasing their control of harvest and testing. The surveillance system is much more vigorous and extensive. If testing proves that a particular area is above approved ratios for bacteria, it is shut down. No questions asked.

As a chef I am saddened that a natural resource must be so closely monitored. We can't go out "just fishing" anymore. The consequence of making a mistake when choosing a purveyor could be disastrous.

Some hints: Only buy from a reputable dealer. They have a reputation to uphold and will not send any product that is unacceptable.

The shellfish distribution chain is closely monitored. All containers of shellfish must be marked with a permanent

number of the original shipper. Ask to see it. The law states that tags are to be kept until all contents are sold. If the store opts not to retain your tag, don't buy from them.

Do yourself a favor. Research your purchases. It is well worth the effort. Be sure that your clam, oyster and mussel acquisitions are harvested from approved waters which are strictly monitored under state and federal regulations.

# Learning label nomenclature

Acidulant, humectant, methyl silicone, sequestrants or xanthan gum listed on a food label certainly do not sound appetizing. There are about 3,000 different additives, ranging from sugar and salt to preservatives. Interestingly, the additives consumed by Americans in largest amounts are sugar and other sweeteners and salt.

The thousands of food additives serve more than 40 different functions. The main reasons for having additives are appeal, nutritional value, processing and freshness. Coloring agents, natural and synthetic flavors, flavor enhancers and sweeteners stimulate the senses for appeal.

Foods such as bread and milk have been fortified with vitamins and minerals lacking in the diet or enriched to replace vitamins and minerals lost in processing. Stabilizers, thickeners and emulsifiers give body and texture to foods. They blend liquids evenly, help retain moisture and prevent lumping. Preservatives also retard spoilage, help retain color and freshness and keep oils and fats from turning rancid.

Acidulants or acidifiers enhance flavor or adjust the natural acidity of foods. They inhibit growth of microorganisms and prevent discoloration and rancidity. Humectants help retain moisture, freshness and texture. These are glycerol, propylene glycol and sorbitol and are common in candies, shredded coconut and marshmallows.

Methyl silicone prevents oil from foaming, while sequestrants are chemicals that bind trace amounts of iron and copper that might cause discoloration or rancidity. Xanthan gum stimulates the texture of sugar or oil in low-calorie products and can replace starch in pudding and pie fillings.

Here are more key terms you'll encounter on a food label. Get your chemistry book out — it is all complicated.

**Agar** is a tasteless vegetable gum that stabilizes or thickens food, including some pastries.

**Alginate** is made from seaweed that thickens many salad dressings.

**BHA/BHT** Keep oils from turning rancid and currently under review by the Food and Drug Administration.

**Calcium Propionate** occurs naturally in Swiss cheese. It is commonly used in cheese, bread and baked goods to keep the product fresh by retarding mold growth.

**Carob Gum** can also be listed as

locust bean gum. It is a thickener that improves texture and blends ingredients in products such as ice cream, salad dressing or sausage.

**Carrageenan** is an extract from seaweed that stabilizes the size of ice crystals in ice cream. (It is also an ingredient in the McLean burgers.)

**Cellulose Gum** enhances texture and helps maintain moisture. Derived from plants it converts liquids to granular form or smooth spreading gels. Common in candy, pastry fillings and jellies.

**Guar Gum** is a thickening and stabilizing agent made from a plant that resembles a soybean plant. It adds texture and fullness to a product such as gravies, sauces and pet food.

**Hydrolyzed Vegetable Protein** is a product prepared from soybeans, wheat or corn that helps bring out the natural flavors of food.

**Lecithin** is found in plant and animal tissue, particularly eggs and soybeans and helps to keep foods well-blended. For example it keeps mayonnaise from separating and prevents food from becoming rancid or losing flavor.

**Modified Food Starch** are thickeners made from grains, potatoes or tapioca. Helps prevent

lumps from forming in powdered foods.

**Potassium Sorbate** helps prevent microbes from spoiling foods such as cheese, wine, margarine and fruit juice drinks.

**Sodium Benzoate** prevents microorganisms from spoiling processed foods.

**Sodium Erythorbate** is used in cured meat products to maintain flavor, aroma and color.

These are just a few of the scary and mysterious words on food labels. However, don't panic! If a food label was put on a fresh succulent cantaloupe it would read like this: "Water, starches, cellulose, pectin, fructose, sucrose, glucose, malic acid, citric acid, succinic acid, anesyl propionate, amyl acetate, ascorbic acid (vitamin C), beta carotene (vitamin A), riboflavin, thiamin, niacin, phosphorus and potassium."

You as the consumer have the final choice on what and how many food additives you'd like in your diet. You also have to decide if they are a plus or a minus to your health.

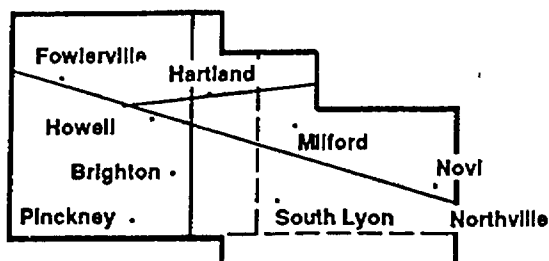

He admits he doesn't have an easy time conversing with people. "I just can't walk up to someone and say, 'Hi, I'm Matt, blah, blah, blah,'" says Borlenghi. But when it comes to acting, he has no problem talking about his craft and the recognition that goes along with it.

From the early age of 7, Borlenghi knew he wanted to be an actor, but he also didn't want to make an idiot of himself. So he took acting classes until he felt he was ready.

"I was apprehensive about taking the role of Brian, because I knew I was replacing somebody who just didn't work out for the role," says Borlenghi. "I understand that the guy was real nice and sweet, but he didn't cut the role. I figured a lot of people probably liked

him and wouldn't appreciate me coming in to take his place. I never expected the kind of response I've been getting.

"The No. 1 question fans ask besides 'Do you have a girlfriend?' and 'How old are you?' is what is it that I wear around my neck," says Borlenghi. "I guess it looks like it could be a lot of things, but it is actually a Chapstick. I am addicted to the stuff."

While he appreciates all the attention he gets from fans, he wants people to know that to him it is all just a job. "It has always been my dream to act, but in order to keep my head straight I have to stay aware of the fact that I'm just an actor and nobody special. All of this could be gone tomorrow."

The person in his life who helps Borlenghi keep his feet on the ground is his girlfriend, Shellie, whom he met while living in Beverly Hills. Although he has trouble trusting people, he knows Shellie is the real thing, because she knew him before he hit the big time. In fact, right before he joined *AMC*, she asked him to move in with her. So when he moved to the East Coast he asked her to come with him. They have been together ever since.

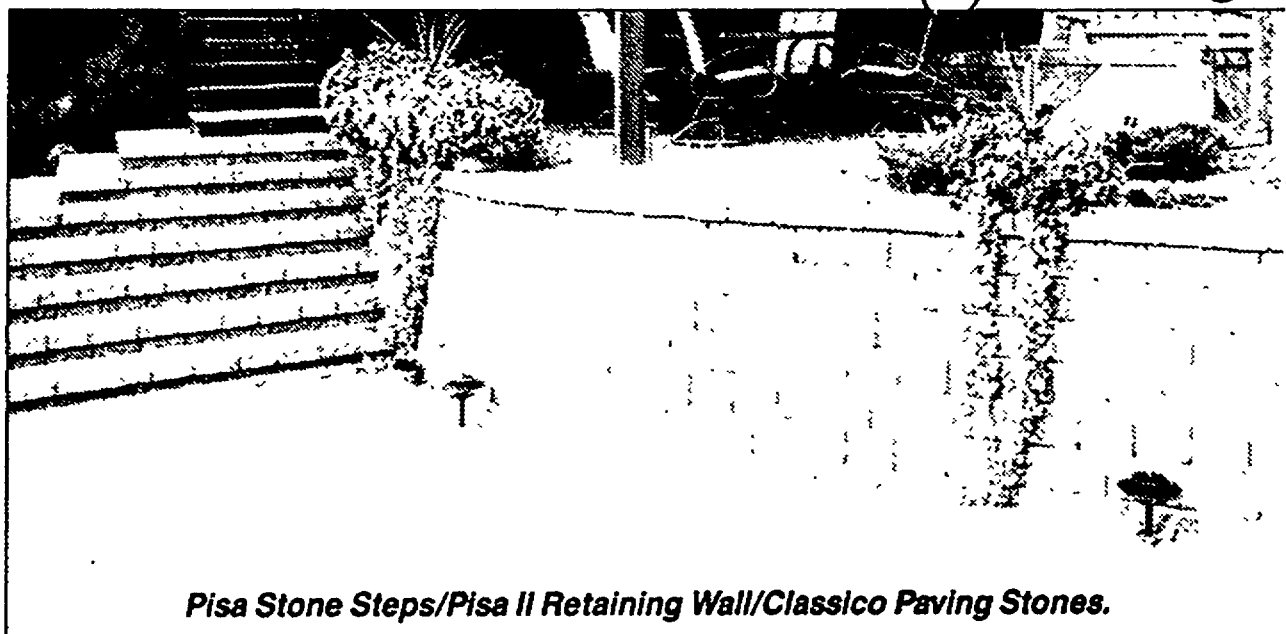

# 'Astronaut's View' a global perspective

## Images from shuttle humble the viewer

By Dan Rice

"We set out to explore new worlds, then looked back at an even more startling sight. On the way into space, we discovered the earth." With these words narrator William Shatner introduces us to a most thrilling vision, "An Astronaut's View of Earth," debuting Tuesday, March 17, on PBS.

Produced, written and directed by Joseph Blatt, "An Astronaut's View" is the literal height of planetary perspective. The out-of-this-world experience is further elevated by background music composed and performed by the Talking Heads' David Byrne, which appropriately rings both global and extraterrestrial at once.

The program begins with a brief history of aerial photography, which had its start less than 150 years ago.

Camera-carrying hot-air balloons, kites and even carrier pigeons whetted our fascination with views of Earth from space.

Today NASA has loaded the state-of-the-art IMAX film system into our highest-flying craft, the space shuttle. Providing 10 times the image size of conventional motion-picture cameras, the IMAX camera is the largest in the world, but in zero gravity astronaut Kathy Sullivan has no trouble maneuvering it within the ship. (IMAX films are shown on wrap-around screens in specially built theaters in many American cities.)

The IMAX feature "The Dream is Alive," which has been described as the closest thing to living and working with the shuttle crew, was followed last year with a second shuttle-shot film, "Blue Planet," a once-around-the-block trip that will forever change your mind about geography.

"An Astronaut's View of Earth" includes portions of "Blue Planet" and gives insight to its production. "Blue Planet" producer Graham Ferguson had to plan each shot carefully from the ground in

Houston; the small supply of heavy IMAX film aboard the shuttle didn't provide for many second takes.

Sullivan and fellow crew members Charlie Bolden and John Blaha widen our views of Earth with historical, geological and personal commentary. In the midst of such beauty, as Sullivan relates, anything ugly, like pollution, sticks out. The Blue Planet is marred by the brown haze enveloping large cities. The warm hues of nurturing soils are rapidly being overtaken by cold patches of lifeless concrete. The marvel of seeing the entire western hemisphere at night turns to sadness when it is revealed that the continental outline is made up not only of city lights, but also of fires destroying our rain forests.

Still, astronaut Bolden finds hope in this global panorama.

"The perspective that you get from space is that it (Earth) is happy...it is one. There are no dividing lines between peoples and nations."

Share "An Astronaut's View of Earth" and take a thoughtful look at the big house we all live in."

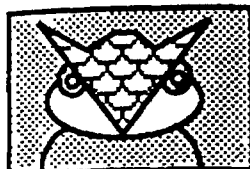

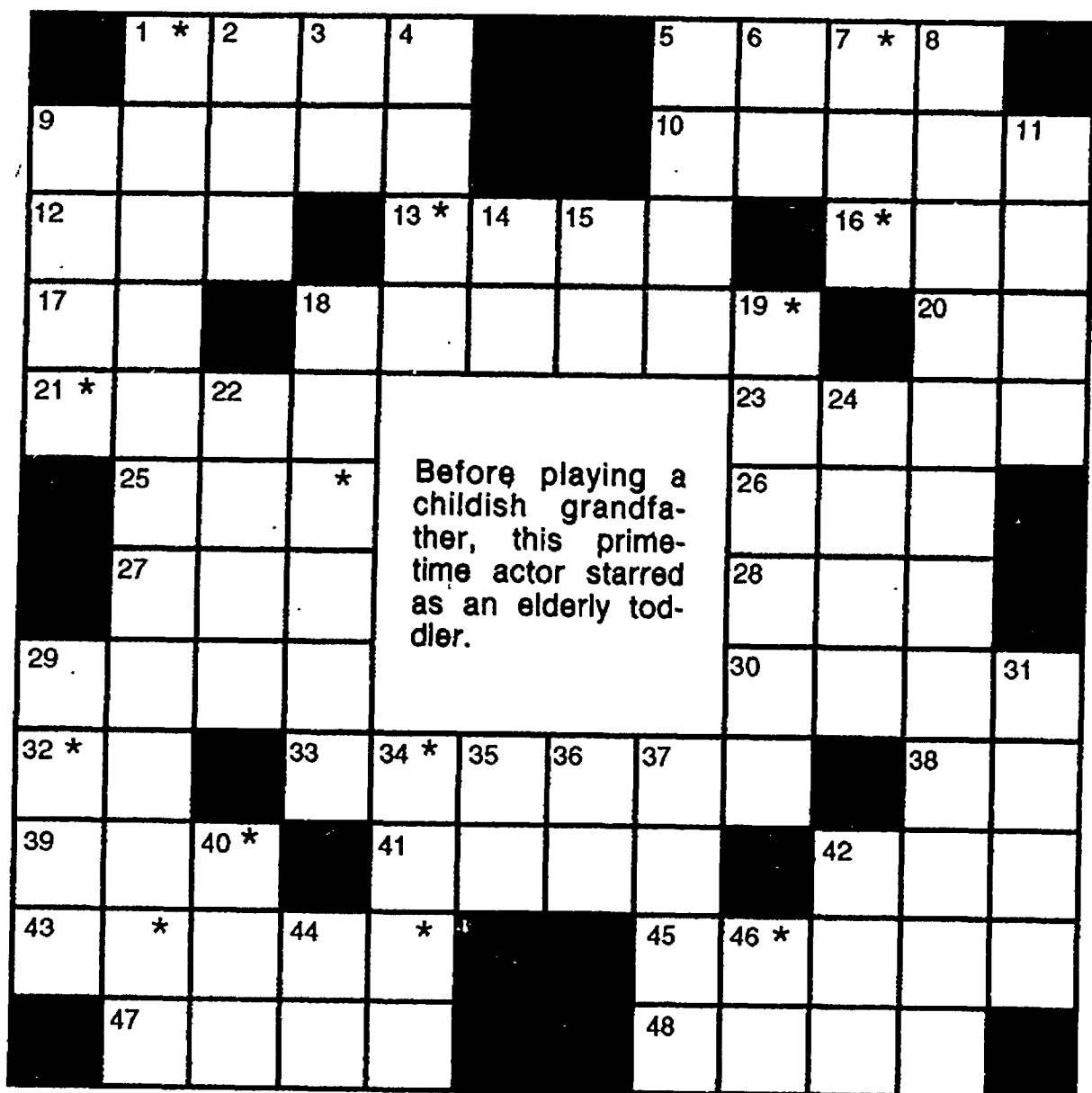

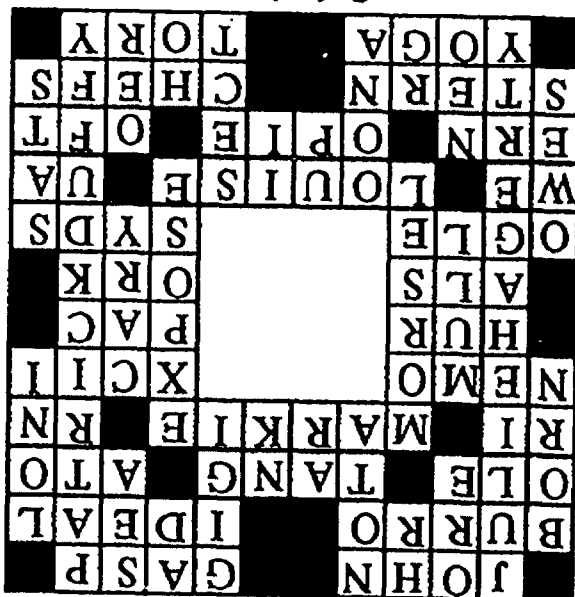
