Hundreds network Northville

Visitors to this year's annual Northville Business Expo at Northville High School Wednesday were treated to a new location, new restaurant and business booths, and a seemingly non-stop barrage of raffle contests.

Local bank branches gave out televisions and free keys, a travel agency awarded free airline tickets, and jewelry stores passed out \$50 gift certificates like they were candy.

"I don't think there was a single stretch where the microphone was not in use," said Laurie Marrs, executive director of the Northville Community Chamber of Commerce. The Business Expo was sponsored by the chamber and organized by a ten-member committee of chamber members.

The first Business Expo, last year at Cooke Middle School, drew more than 600 visitors to booths representing 40 local businesses and 12 restaurants.

This year's show benefitted from a larger venue at Northville High School's cafeteria. The new site attracted an estimated 700 people, who sampled the wares of 61 businesses and 14 restaurants, as well as 18 non-profit booths.

"It was markedly improved from last year, because we had so much more space," Marrs said Friday. "We were just ecstatic with the turnout and with all the compliments we've received. The phones have been lit up all day with people calling to thank us."

Profits from the Business Expo are divided among participants and the chamber alike, with the gate from the \$5 door charge going to the restaurants to defray their food costs, and booth rental

charges going into the chamber's general fund for operating costs.

Toni Genittis, who runs Genittis Hole-in-the-Wall Restaurant with husband John, called this year's expo "unbelievably excellent." She attributed much of its success to the dedication of the food vendors who went all out for the occasion.

"I was shocked at what the restaurants brought; it was wonderful," she said. "Papa Romano's, they had a feast there. It wasn't just a snack."

Genittis also made a prediction for the next expo. "I think you're going to get double the people next year as the word gets out that you can go there and get all this great food," she said.

Despite having a booth at last year's expo, the Genittis themselves could not attend. Toni was glad they made it this year, to see and be seen by the community's other business leaders.

"I just felt really a renewed camaraderie," she said. "It was a community kind of thing and it really made me feel good about the town."

The Genittis' feelings were shared by others as well.

"I thought it was fantastic," said consultant Chuck Keys, "and everybody I talked to said it was great."

Keys said the expo's theme of "Networking Northville" held true for him. "It was nice to meet the

people in the community, and introduce my business to them. And it was very nice to meet all of the other business owners, most of whom I knew but many whom I didn't."

Keys did admit to one regret. "I'm sorry I wasn't in it last year," he said. "I never realized the value of it."

But now that he knows the value, Keys had a suggestion for the Chamber of Commerce, the organization which sponsored the event.

"They should do this more often," he said. "Do you think twice a year would be too much?"

Neighbors protest manure

Residents of Northville Estates subdivision say they don't really want to put up a stink, they're just yearning to breathe free.

But the massive mountains of horse manure hauled in daily since December to the Novi-based Zayt Trucking Co. property are making the air less than fresh. An estimated

150 to 200 Northville citizens live downwind from the firm at Beck and Eight Mile roads.

"I know exactly what they're talking about . . . We're like the second house from Beck Road," said Dun-sany Road resident and Northville Mayor Chris Johnson.

"When the wind is blowing, it is real obnoxious . . . With the break of good weather now, it's even worse."

Asphalt plant up for a vote

They're baaaaack.

Actually, Holloway Sand & Gravel's appearance tomorrow (March 31) before the township planning commission is considered wholly separate from its most recent trek to township hall.

Back on March 10, the planning commission recommended to reject Holloway's special land use permit request for a gravel mining operation on 177 acres at Six Mile and Ridge roads.

Tuesday, the two sides will talk asphalt. It's sure to be another sticky topic.

A public hearing on Holloway's request is scheduled for 7 p.m. Tuesday at 41600 Six Mile Road. Planning commission review of the asphalt plant request will immediately follow.

The township is expected to judge Holloway's plan on 11 asphalt-plant-specific criteria, said Carol Maise, township planning and zoning administrator.

Included in that list are items such as air quality, truck traffic, property value fluctuation, tax benefits, and future property development. Commissioners followed similar guidelines March 10, and eventually voted to reject the gravel mining application based on four counts.

But indications are that Holloway does not approve of that review system.

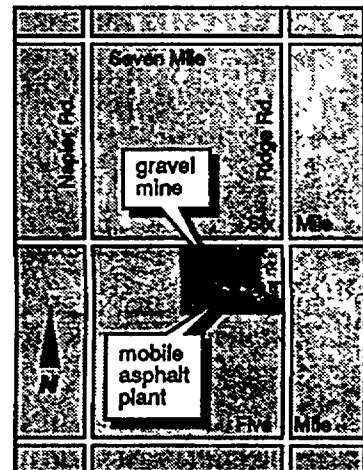
In a March 23 letter to the planning commission, Holloway engineer Richard Zanotti said his company believes the township must review the asphalt request under guidelines in place in April 1991, when the firm introduced its asphalt plan.

Any subsequent township action — including its new asphalt plant ordinance — should not be used as consideration for Holloway's plan, Zanotti said.

He also accused the township of foot-dragging on the original application, and called for the asphalt plan's approval.

"... (H)is site plan should have been reviewed and approved at our meeting of April 30, 1991," Zanotti said. "Not only did you not take action on that date, but you never took action either approving or disapproving the site plan during the entire

year of 1991, in spite of numerous requests . . . to do so."

Commissioners tabled the asphalt plant application last year, and struggled throughout 1991 to adopt an asphalt plant ordinance. They finally approved an ordinance last December, but not before Holloway filed suit in Wayne County Circuit Court.

Like the March 10 session, the planning commission is under court order to approve, approve with conditions, or reject Holloway's asphalt plan on Tuesday. The commission's recommendation will go to the township board, the body that holds the final say on the land-use applications.

Township officials reject Holloway's notion that the review should be based on pre-asphalt-ordinance guidelines.

"Holloway feels they're not under the new ordinance, (but) they don't have any vested rights; they hadn't started any construction," Maise said.

If approved, Holloway is expected to move its Salem Township asphalt plant to the Ridge Road property. Holloway officials have said that the plant will be mobile, based on on-site gravel mining operations.

Under current plans, Holloway intends to locate the plant in the southern portion of the Ridge Road property. The plant can stand up to 50 feet high, based on township standards, Maise said.

Project leader declines comment

What's Georgina Goss' spin on the controversy surrounding the Western Townships Utilities Authority sewer project?

For the record, the former Northville Township supervisor, top WTUA officer and current 36th District state representative isn't talking.

At least to this newspaper.

The Record recently asked Goss to respond to concerns about WTUA and other issues that involved her during her tenure as township supervisor. Goss flatly rejected this newspaper's attempt to schedule a telephone interview.

Goss instead asked a reporter to submit a list of questions and said she would try to return the responses before the newspaper's deadline.

"I am asking you to please put your questions in writing," Goss said. "If



you will just put them in writing. I will respond in writing."

Goss then said she was willing to talk freely about oil drilling legislation she is sponsoring in the state House.

But WTUA questions were off-limits. When asked why a state representative and long-serving WTUA board member would refuse an interview, Goss said: "Well, I feel that the residents do deserve to have the

whole story.

"Lately, you haven't been doing the whole story," she said.

When a reporter said he did not understand what Goss' implication was, she said: "I think you do, hon."

The Record then offered Goss the opportunity to take part in a tape-recorded, verbatim telephone interview. Again she declined. "I would prefer to answer your questions in writing," she said.

Goss was asked if she expects all media requests for interviews to be handled in writing. She eventually said "no" but would not elaborate.

Goss was informed that the proposed telephone interview would include questions about her free membership to Meadowbrook Country Club — which violated the township's ethics policy — and her political and financial ties to WTUA officials and those holding Dutch

contracts.

About the Meadowbrook gift, Goss said: "You know, that's a very fine question. Please submit it in writing."

Goss eventually charged a reporter with "malicious distortions of words" concerning a report that the former supervisor had vacationed at the township assessor's Florida retreat in 1990.

She said she "absolutely (did) not" vacation with assessor Glen Shaw and others at that time.

When the reporter told Goss that a telephone interview would allow follow-up questions and written questions would not provide that latitude, Goss said: "I think we've been over this about five times. I prefer to have you put your questions in writing."

Goss then asked if the reporter would like to discuss oil drilling legislation.

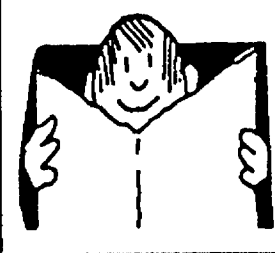

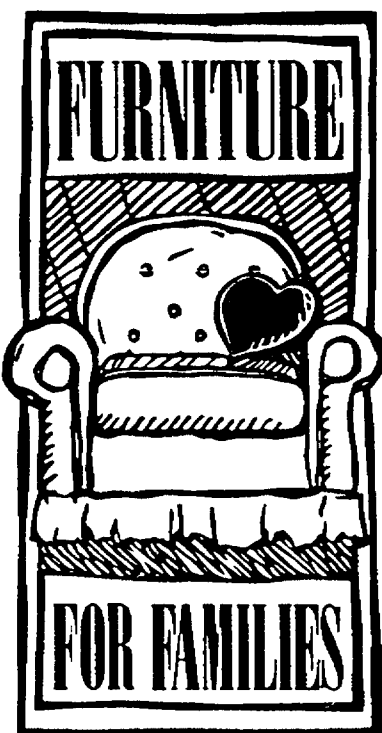

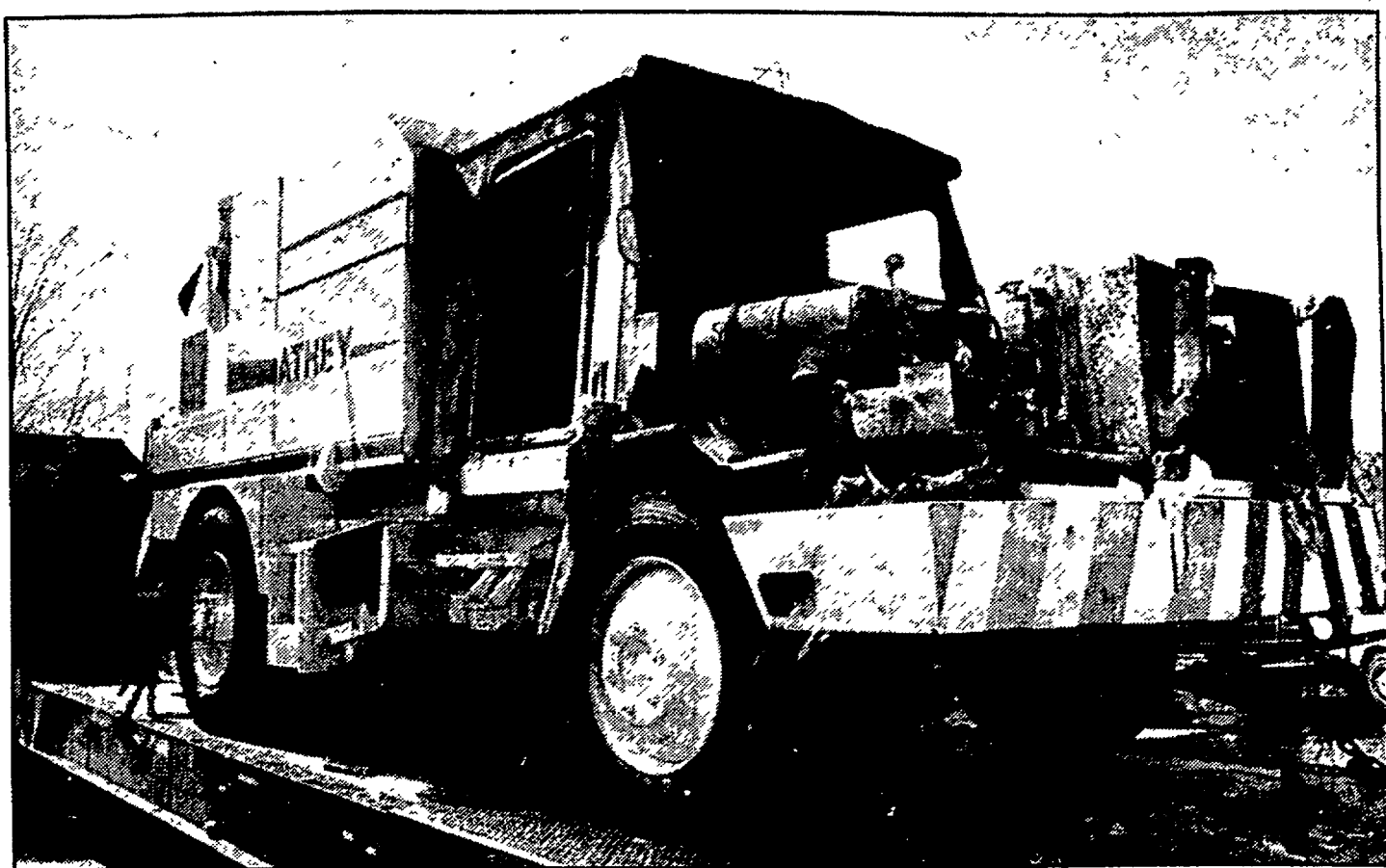

Swept away

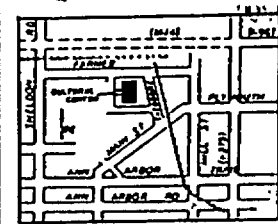

Arrogance, cronyism blight sewer project

"Mistakes were made," Ronald Reagan once said, referring to one of the many instances of questionable activity that accompanied his tour of Washington. But Western Townships Utilities Authority officials will need a lot more than the Gipper's infamous teflon coating to deflect criticism of their multi-million-dollar sewer project.

Residents of the three-community Western Townships Utilities Authority have had a month now to digest revelations of rampant cronyism, patronage, and nepotism that foul the huge, \$100-million project. Like us, many of those residents are angered and perhaps a bit fascinated by the unfolding of each flabby layer of back-patting and pocket-stuffing engaged in by our elected leaders.

And like us, those residents — taxpayers and voters — demand better answers than we've received to date.

Cronyism. Patronage. Nepotism. Those aren't pretty words, but we're not dealing with an attractive situation. The WTUA sewer project simply highlights the potential abuses of power and money that too often pervades local government.

Questionable ethical behavior predominates the WTUA storyline, but the tale doesn't end there. Arrogance and ignorance also played key roles in this whole mess, and should not be taken lightly.

Up to their necks in the sewer backwash are local politicians such as Wayne County Commissioner Maurice Breen and state Rep. Georgina Goss. Others, including the Northville Township Board, also must be held accountable, but Breen and Goss clearly were the WTUA ringleaders.

Breen, Plymouth Township's power broker, was a key designer of the project and skillfully dealt favorable hands to political and financial allies. Goss served longer on the WTUA board than any other individual, and dutifully, unquestioningly, signed checks, invoices, etc. submitted by the tight circle of consultants and attorneys employed by WTUA.

Goss also apparently failed to communicate details of this complicated project to her fellow township board members and township taxpayers. A slick group of attorneys may or may not have pulled the wool over Goss' eyes, but she cannot escape indictment on this issue. Goss is a cog in the powerful political machine that seized and held control of the Northville-Plymouth-Canton townships troika the past decade — a machine obviously built to enrich a core of individuals, not to benefit John or Jane Doe taxpayer.

Of course, elected officials were not the only driving forces behind the creation of WTUA. The partners of Law, Hemming, Essad, & Polaczyk exerted a great deal — an appalling amount — of influence and control over the project from the very beginning. And nobody elected them to anything.

The alarming list of WTUA actions uncovered thus far includes up to a dozen examples of unethical governmental behavior and downright lousy judgment. And we're to be appeased when WTUA officials say they didn't know any better than to pass around top-dollar jobs to friends and business associates? This is supposed to make us feel secure with a project whose bill taxpayers will be saddled with for years to come?

Think again, WTUA high rollers. We may be slow, but we're not stupid.

Among the most troublesome issues in this whole mess is the blatant disregard for any professional services bidding process. Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczyk was able to put its hands into virtually every pocket associated with WTUA, and with no scrutiny from Goss, Breen, etc., was probably able to invent a few pockets to reach into.

The law firm was even allowed to write a clause into the project's primary financial document that allows the lawyers to collect a half-percent on all project bond proceeds, a figure that earned the firm close to \$1 million. This, of course, is in addition to its regular fees charged WTUA and the individual townships, fees for law-firm-owned public relations companies used by WTUA, and so on. What's even more mind-boggling is that the same firm represented all three communities and WTUA at the same time.

Think about that, taxpayers. Who was fighting for Northville Township's individual rights during WTUA's organizational years? Why, the same firm that was looking out for the best interests of Canton and Plymouth townships and WTUA. Is there anyone among us who believes every issue in this incredibly complicated scheme was mutually beneficial to all four entities?

Other issues are almost as troubling, especially Northville Township's improbable claim that future development will be able to pay off the township's \$30-million sewer bond debt. Quite frankly, we'll be surprised if township water and sewer users aren't belted by big hikes in their bills before the year 2000.

To support the claim of fiscal stability, officials take the word of Plante & Moran, a reputable auditing firm but one whose recent track record in Northville looks poor. This was the firm, remember, which assured city officials a little more than a year ago that city finances were on firm ground and likely to remain so. A year later they returned with a very different message, saying that a deficit of several hundred thousand dollars had cropped up somehow in the interim. When they tell us there's nothing to worry about in WTUA's finances, and a common-sense look at the figures shows otherwise, why should we believe them?

The list of reasons for concern goes on and on, but one other particularly worrisome item is the Washington lobbying firm working to acquire a federal grant for the WTUA project. Cassidy and Associates continues to bill the authority monthly, regularly adding to a bill which already totals about \$750,000. And not only do WTUA leaders seem uncomfortably unaware of what the company is actually doing for its money, an amazing number of officials in the three townships didn't even know the lobbyists were on the payroll.

WTUA politicians seem to have been an astoundingly arrogant bunch. Perhaps no single issue points out that attitude than does the list of WTUA beneficiaries who ponied up campaign contributions for the Laws, Breens, Gosses, Yacks, and Heintzes of the world. Contributors simply constitute a Who's Who of individuals and businesses who earned big money on the project — most of whom were required to do no bidding to attain taxpayer-funded jobs.

Continual donations by people on the WTUA dole amount to little more than kickbacks to politicians who set them up in cozy deals.

Mistakes were made, all right. We won't be surprised if the coming weeks will bring to light more painful WTUA revelations; the book hasn't been closed yet. Our feeling is that several chapters still remain.

Manure disposal causes problems

Oddly enough, this story has an international spin. Zayti officials argue that it's a case of American companies being pushed out of business by cheaper Asian imports.

Margaret Zayti, co-owner of the trucking firm and executive manager of Northville Downs — the source of the unsavory product — says good horse manure just isn't as easy to market these days as it used to be. "Years ago, we used to sell the manure to Campbell's Soup [to grow mushrooms] for their Cream of Mushroom soup. They found they could get it cheaper than they could make it on their farm," Zayti said.

But some county mushroom farmers have moved from Rochester to Inlay City, and stiff competition from Chinese mushroom growers has driven others out of business, she said.

"We've never put any manure there before," she said. "We were having a problem getting it to the mushroom farmers. I think all of the (racetrack) people are having a prob-

lem with their manure because it's getting harder and harder to dispose of... We have to pay to have it moved out now."

Manure generators like racetracks may need to cooperate to find a new place to dump the product, Zayti said.

Some Northville Estates families counter that the place should be as far away from their homes as possible. They've been complaining to the cities of Northville and Novi steadily since the aroma began wafting their way.

One says the odor is so bad that she had to stop putting up outdoor Christmas decorations at her home due to nausea from breathing the stench. Now that the weather's nice, people are staying indoors. Some are even considering selling their homes.

While the Zayti property is zoned residential / agricultural, it is used as a trucking operation — not a farm — which makes the manure seem particularly inappropriate to the neighbors, Johnson said.

The City of Novi on Nov. 2 ticketed

Zayti Trucking for the emission of odor from a business or residence. No trial date has been set yet, a spokesperson for the Walled Lake 52-1 District Court said Friday.

Zayti Trucking was given two more zoning violation tickets on Jan. 29 for continuing a non-permitted use and depositing litter on private property. That case will hit the fan on April 16, when a pre-trial is scheduled.

Meanwhile the daily dreck delivery continues, residents say, despite a letter of protest from the homeowners.

"Novi immediately took the letter to Zayti and asked them to stop," said a Northville Estates resident who requested anonymity. "Obviously, (Zayti's attitude) was, 'We're not going to move it. We're going to continue doing this.'"

"He (co-owner Jim Zayti, Margaret's son) was just being a stinker about this."

Margaret Zayti says the problem would be solved "as soon as the weather breaks."

"Probably in the next week or ten

days, when the frost is gone and the fields dry up, we'll get out there and plow that under," she said.

Northville Estates residents disagree with Zayti's assertion that this is the first time that the collective by-product of Northville Downs standardbred's digestive tracts has been dumped at the Beck Road property.

Three years ago, according to residents' letters, the stuff was also hauled in. The city and the state department of natural resources quickly quashed that, in part because the truckloads were placed in a wetlands, the Northville Estates resident said. This time, the homeowners contacted the DNR and the federal Environmental Protective Agency, but the DNR backed out because the material was not in the wetlands, the resident said.

"It steams and it's gross. Mrs. Zayti says, 'There's nothing bad about the smell of manure, I've been around it all my life.' That's true. It's not harmful. But it's sickening," she added.

"It just progressively gets worse as the pile gets higher."

Law firm had many WTUA ties

Due to a production error, a portion of this story was excluded from Thursday's newspaper. The article is being reprinted in its entirety today.

A law firm with extensive ties to the Western Townships Utilities Authority earned almost \$100,000 in public funds since 1989 by using "brother and sister" companies for WTUA public relations chores.

Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczyk — WTUA's ground-floor legal representative, and the firm that represents the three WTUA communities — owns the public relations firms Communications Management Corporation, Strategies Plus, and Power Associates.

Those companies operate out of the firm's Plymouth business offices and until December 1991 wrote newsletters, leased office space to WTUA officials, lobbied for state and federal grants, and sometimes managed WTUA day-to-day activities.

One firm even charged taxpayers to prepare minutes of an April 1990 WTUA meeting, though WTUA bylaws dictate that a WTUA officer handle meeting reporting tasks.

Like virtually every other professional services organization affiliated with WTUA, the public relations firms were awarded sewer project jobs without a bid or request for proposal process.

The physical proximity of the public relations firms to Law, Hemming and WTUA highlights the cozy relationships developed by WTUA insiders since the three-township, \$100-million sewer project was devised in 1986.

The firms and WTUA shared buildings, offices and personnel, and taxpayers footed the bill, according to WTUA financial records obtained this week.

Between Jan. 1, 1989 and Sept. 1, 1990, one public relations firm, Power Associates, charged WTUA \$21,000 to lease office space at 40600 Ann Arbor Road in Plymouth. WTUA headquartered in Suite 204, adjacent to Power Associates and Communications Management Company in Suite 202.

Additionally, Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczyk operated its law practice out of Suite 200 in the same building.

The law firm partners own the public relations firms, said Charles Fiedler, an attorney with Law, Hemming.

"They are affiliated companies with Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczyk," Fiedler said, and also referred to the firms as "brother and sister companies."

The firms performed a variety of jobs for WTUA, including lobbying efforts, administration of WTUA activities, and writing newsletters. Fiedler said. One firm, Communication



representation, billed WTUA for legal work, and had a partner, Robert C. Law, as a WTUA officer.

Law was tabbed in 1986 as WTUA secretary, and held that position until February 1989, when Canton Township's Thomas Yack was named WTUA secretary.

The authority then altered its bylaws and created an assistant secretary position, and appointed Robert Law to that office.

Law's duties were to include preparation of minutes and other administrative jobs, according to bylaws.

But taxpayers did not get a break on services, just because Law was a WTUA officer and his other firms were close at hand.

In addition to the \$500 monthly retainer, Communications Management Corporation was paid about \$57,000 for state and federal lobbying efforts. In May 1991, CMC upped its retainer to \$1,000 monthly, and WTUA minutes reflect nary a squawk from WTUA board members Maurice Breen, Georgina Goss, and Yack.

In all, taxpayers shelled out at least \$17,000 to keep CMC — the law firm's own offshoot company — on retainer between February 1989 and December 1991.

Additionally, CMC in January 1990 changed its name to Strategies Plus, and billed WTUA \$4,000 in retainer costs, along with over \$16,000 in fees for public relations efforts before switching back to CMC by September 1990.

Hourly rates for CMC and Strategies Plus ranged from \$73 to \$100 per hour, based on WTUA financial

records.

Records indicate that Strategies Plus often would charge WTUA about \$80 an hour to prepare for WTUA meetings, discuss strategy with WTUA officials, and on one occasion in 1990, compile the WTUA minutes, a job that supposedly belonged to Law.

By October 1990, CMC and Power Associates had moved to 217 Ann Arbor Road. Law, Hemming's new address was 215 Ann Arbor Road, which also became the political campaign headquarters of politicians such as Goss and Breen, local supervisors who had served for years on the WTUA board, and eventually moved on to state and county elected offices.

CMC wrote a pair of newsletters in 1991, charging WTUA \$2,000 each for those documents. The public relations firms were dropped by the end of 1991, but Fiedler, of Law, Hemming, was not sure why the relationship ended.

"I don't have the answer to that," he said. "Their services were no longer required, I'm assuming."

The Record on March 16 filed a request with Northville Township under the Freedom of Information Act to determine whether the township has used Power Associates, Communications Management Corporation, and Strategies Plus for township public relations work.

On March 23, the township asked for a 10-day extension to that request, based on the recommendation of its law firm, Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczyk.

MOTOR VEHICLE SIZE, WEIGHT AND LOAD RESTRICTION ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO CONTROL THE SIZE AND WEIGHT OF MOTOR VEHICLES UPON
ROADS, HIGHWAYS OR STREETS WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH-
VILLE AND TO PROVIDE DEFINITIONS FOR CERTAIN WORDS; TO PROVIDE GENERAL PROHIBI-
TIONS; TO PROVIDE FOR A MAXIMUM WIDTH OF VEHICLES; TO REGULATE THE TRANSPOR-
TATION OF FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION OF THE LENGTH OF
VEHICLES; TO PROVIDE FOR REGULATIONS REGARDING THE TRANSPORTATION OF MOBILE
HOMES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE GENERAL RESTRICTIONS OF WHEEL AND AXLE LOADS; TO
PROVIDE FOR INFORMATION ON CERTAIN TRUCKS; TO PROVIDE FOR AUTHORIZATION TO
STOP A VEHICLE; TO PROVIDE FOR FINES; TO PROVIDE FOR SPECIAL PERMITS FOR UN-
USUAL VEHICLES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE DESIGNATION AND IDENTIFICATION OF WEIGHMAS-

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE ORDAINS:

SECTION 1.0 SHORT TITLE AND CITATION

This ordinance shall be known as the Motor Vehicle Size, Weight and Load Restriction Ordinance

SECTION 2.0 DEFINITIONS

This section provides for the definition of the following terms: "Axle"; "Civil Infraction"; "Driver"; "Gross Weight"; "Highway or street"; "Implement of husbandry"; "Maximum axle load"; "Person"; "Peace Officer"; "Roadway"; "Semi-trailer"; "Spacings between axles"; "Special mobile equipment"; "Tandem axle"; "Tandem axle assembly"; "Trailer"; "Truck"; "Truck tractor"; "Vehicle"; "Weighmaster".

SECTION 3.0 GENERAL PROHIBITIONS

This section provides for the general prohibitions for violations of this ordinance relating to size, weight and other limitations on the operation of vehicles.

SECTION 4.0 MAXIMUM WIDTH OF VEHICLES; EXCEPTIONS; OPERATION OF CERTAIN BUSES

This section prohibits the operation of vehicles in excess of certain specified maximum widths. It provides for the exceptions to the general requirements for agricultural implements, buses and certain other types of vehicles.

SECTION 5.0 RESERVED

SECTION 6.0 HEIGHT OF VEHICLES; POSTING OF CLEARANCE; LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES TO BRIDGE OR VIADUCT

This section prohibits the operation of vehicles in excess of 13 feet 6 inches in height. This section also provides for the liability for damages to bridge or viaducts for vehicles operating in excess of the height requirements.

SECTION 7.0 PROHIBITION AGAINST TRANSPORTATION OF FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS IN BULK; FLASH POINT; AND HEIGHT LIMITATIONS

This section provides that a truck, truck tractor, semitrailer, or trailer manufactured on or after July 27, 1978, shall not be used to transport flammable liquids, in bulk, having a flash point at or below a 70 degree Fahrenheit, if the truck, truck tractor, semitrailer or trailer exceeds 11 feet 8 1/2 inches in height.

SECTION 8.0 LENGTH OF VEHICLES; COMBINATIONS

This section provides for the length restrictions on vehicles, truck tractors, trailers, semitrailers and combinations thereof.

SECTION 9.0 MOBILE HOMES; LENGTH, WIDTH, HEIGHT, PERMITS, OVER-LENGTH AND OVER-WIDTH; EXCLUSION FROM HIGHWAYS PERIODS, LIGHTS, SIGNS, ESCORTS, AXLES, TIRES; DEFINITIONS

This section provides for the restrictions for length, width, height of mobile homes. It provides for the issuance of permits and for the exclusion of mobile homes from highways during certain periods. It also provides for the placing of lights, signs, escorts, axles and tires requirements for all mobile homes.

SECTION 10.0 RESERVED

SECTION 13.0 WHEEL AND AXLES LOADS; GENERAL RESTRICTIONS

This section provides for the general restrictions for all wheel and axle loads. It also provides for the exception to such requirements.

SECTION 14.0 INFORMATION PAINTED ON CERTAIN TRUCKS AND OTHER VEHICLES AS TO OWNER OR LESSEE

This section prohibits the operation of motor trucks, tractors, trailers or semitrailers without the name and address of the registered owner on the vehicle (or lessee of the vehicle if the vehicle is being operated under a lease) in letters of not less than three (3) inches in height and conspicuously placed upon the vehicle.

SECTION 15.0 WEIGHING OF VEHICLES, WEIGHMASTER AUTHORIZED TO ORDER VEHICLES STOPPED

This section authorizes the Weighmaster to stop certain vehicles and cause the weighing of the same.

SECTION 16.0 OVERWEIGHT FINES

This section specifies the fines for overweight vehicles.

SECTION 17.0 SPECIAL PERMIT FOR UNUSUAL VEHICLES

This section provides for the issuance of special permits for the moving of unusual vehicles.

SECTION 18.0 WEIGHMASTER; DESIGNATION AND IDENTIFICATION

This section provides for the designation and identification of the Weighmaster.

SECTION 19.0 RESTRICTIONS AS TO USE OF CERTAIN COMMERCIAL VEHICLES ON POSTED HIGHWAYS

This section provides for the restricted use of certain commercial vehicles on posted highways.

SECTION 20.0 CITATIONS

This section provides that Weighmasters may issue citations for violations of the ordinance in accordance with the procedure set forth in Section 741 to 750 of the Michigan Vehicle Code, Act 300 of the Public Acts of 1949, as amended.

SECTION 21.0 PENALTIES

This section provides for the penalties, costs, and excess weight fines for a person who commits a civil infraction under this ordinance. This section also provides that a person convicted of violating a misdemeanor under the ordinance may be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or both, such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

SECTION 22.0 REPEAL

This section provides for the repeal of all conflicting ordinances.

SECTION 23.0 SEVERABILITY

This section provides that if any portion of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed to be a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION 24.0 SAVINGS CLAUSE

This section provides that the repeal provided for herein shall not abrogate or affect any offense committed or done, or any penalty or forfeiture incurred, or any pending litigation occurring prior to the effective date of the ordinance.

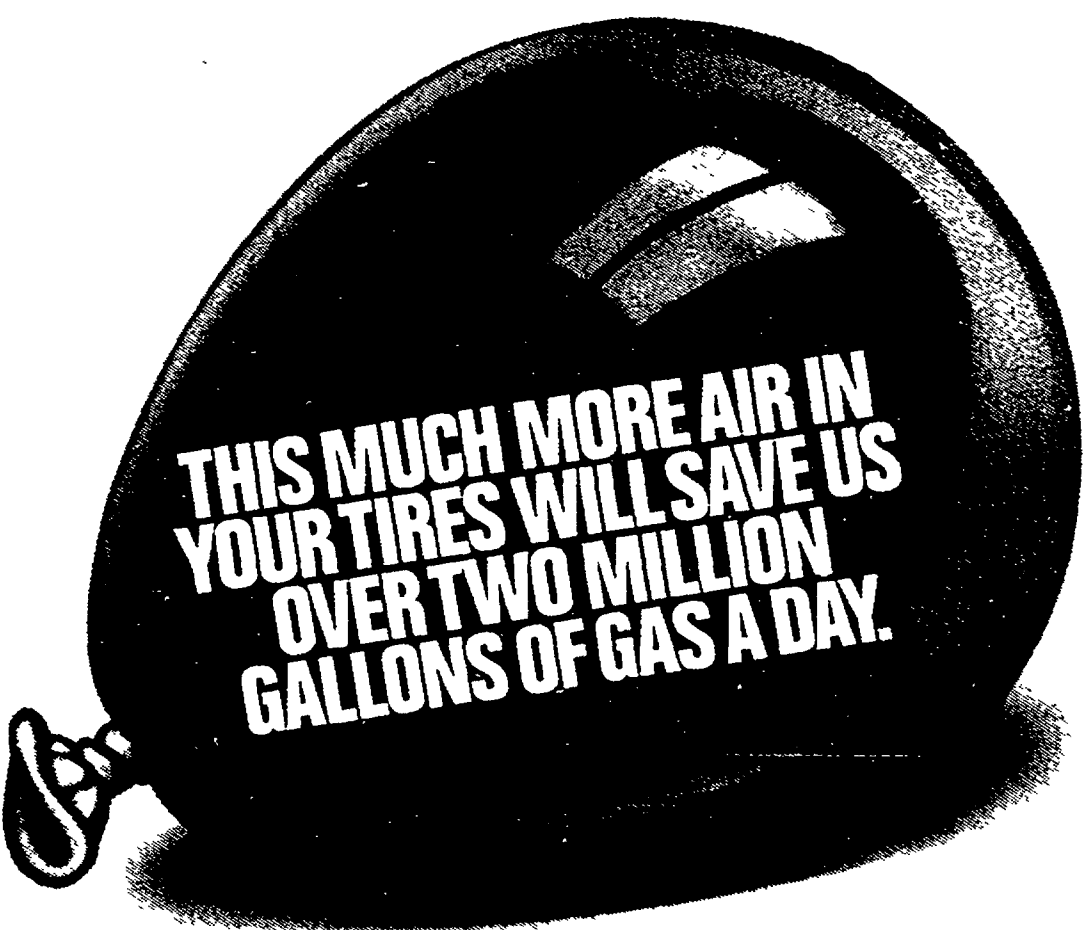
SECTION 25.0 EFFECTIVE DATE

This section provides that the ordinance shall take full force and effect upon publication.

WineFest '92 to benefit art programs

What's the appeal of wine auctions? We suspect it's the drama because at the best of them, you rarely find a bargain.

At least that's what the organizers of WineFest '92 are hoping. Saturday, April 11, marks the 10th anniversary of WineFest, an auction sponsored by the Ann Arbor Art Association to raise money for art programs designed for senior citizens and underprivileged children exhibiting art talent.

With the cutback in state funding to the arts, WineFest '92 revenues will go a long way in keeping the Art Association's programs afloat for the coming year.

According to the February 1992 issue of *Connoisseur*, in 1990, at Sotheby's London, the Romanov Imperial cellars were finally auctioned, 73 years after Czar Nicholas II and his family were murdered by the Bolsheviks.

Approximately 13,000 bottles were sold for a total of \$1,074,544. Those who garnered highest bids included a Swiss who paid a record \$12,705 for three bottles of 1891 Port. Why?

A link with history, perhaps. Tasting something remarkable? That could be, since this bottling was fit for a king.

While the Ann Arbor WineFest can't promise wines of this stature, they do contend that some of the area's finest wine collectors have dug deep into their cellars for some rare bottlings to keep the paddles raised at this year's event.

Ed Sbragia, Beringer Vineyard's winemaker is the 1992 auction honorary chairperson. WineFest attendees will have the opportunity to meet Sbragia and to sample an array of Beringer wines.

Over the past several years, we've recommended many of Beringer's Knights Valley wines as Wine Selections of the Week. Recently, we had the opportunity to sample a vertical of Beringer Knights Valley Cabernets from the 1980s and were impressed at their ageability given their modest release price—modest, that is, by current Napa Valley cabernet sauvignon prices from many producers.

Knights Valley is a small appellation 17 miles north of the Beringer Winery in St. Helena. Flanked by Alexander Valley to the north, this small area is widely recognized for premium cabernet sauvignon and sauvignon blanc because the microclimate and gravelly soils are ideally suited to the varietals.

Although the Beringer family planted grapes in Knights Valley in the 1960s, the region's name didn't appear on a Beringer label until 1974. The winery was so enamored with the fruit emerging from this region that it, in concert with other growers in the region, petitioned for the establishment of a new appellation. Knights Valley was granted this status in 1982.

The following is a sampling from our tasting notes referring to Beringer Vineyard's Knights Valley Cabernet Sauvignon produced a 100 percent varietal.

1982: "Inherent to all Knights Valley cabernet sauvignons is a rich, ripe berry flavor — almost reminiscent of raspberries," commented Winemaker Sbragia. We agree. Age has added a significant bottle bouquet and aromas of black cherries, blackberries with fragrant spicy oak. Almost 10 years after the vintage, the wine is hanging in there with abundant soft fruit and good balance.

1985: "The Knights Valley vineyard is characterized by low-yielding, rocky soils producing fruit of rich, cassis-berry flavors and good acidities," Sbragia remarked. This wine is elegant, refined and aging gracefully with mature blackberry and black cherry fruit and an appealing herbal background.

1987: Exuberant black cherry aromas, spicy oak with dusty, smoky hints. Finesseful yet powerful fruit is accented with hints of black olives and a delicious lengthy finish.

1988: This wine mirrors the same attractive fruit

Nix the mix

Homemade concoctions can replace 'conveniences'

Progress brought us indoor plumbing, and modern conveniences to free us from the kitchen, or so they told us in civics class.

But who really thought of the kitchen as a prison anyway? Probably the same people that think the invention of Hamburger Helper is progress.

In truth, the development of pre-mixed, pre-cooked and instant foods has benefited the modern home cook. Instant foods from a mix have a long shelf life and quality control is improved when compared with homemade (have you ever heard of anyone burning Kraft Macaroni & Cheese?)

Unfortunately, there's a tradeoff. Nutritionists are getting the word out that packaged and prepared foods are often high in fat, sodium and cholesterol. In addition, environmentalists point out that packaging used to both contain and market the items are a liability in the solid waste stream.

Though instant foods are sold on the premise that they are economical and convenient, a little experimentation shows that the economics favor homemade, and the time savings is negligible.

Witness the recipes we've included below. Most require only a couple more ingredients than their instant counterparts, and an extra preparation step or two, often at a significant cost savings. None require any fancy culinary techniques.

Oh yeah. We nearly forgot. The real thing tastes better, too. That still counts for something, doesn't it?

If you've ever mixed ketchup, mayo and relish together to make your own Russian dressing (add a teaspoon each of horseradish, Worcestershire and grated onion to make it really special), or sliced your own potatoes for french fries, you've taken the first step towards ridding your kitchen of bottles, boxes and polypropylene bags.

Try some of these recipes and nix the mix.

TACOS

Well, this is one place the major corporations may have the time factor licked. There isn't much easier than browning meat in a skillet, zipping open a packet of Torito Grande or whatever, and simmering.

Or is there? Though you'll need some time to mince garlic for this mixture, you could use the kind in a jar. Also, this taco seasoning recipe needs no simmering.

Just cook through and you're ready.

It's also our guess that ground cumin and Mexican oregano are not spices found in everyone's rack. But take hearty Italian oregano substitutes just fine for Mexican, and you'll find uses for cumin once you've tried it.

And by making your own, you cut out a lot of the monosodium glutamate, preservatives and stabilizers.

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1/2 teaspoon crushed red pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon minced garlic
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon oregano (the Mexican variety if you can find it)
- shells
- toppings

Combine ground beef and seasonings in a skillet. Cook until beef is thoroughly cooked. Drain and serve.

BROWNIES

Open up a box of brownie mix and what do you see? Some brown powder and some chocolate syrup generally. You toss those in a bowl, add your own eggs and either milk or water, and bake.

Homemade brownies, on the other hand require two bowls — one for liquids, one for dry stuff — and a longer list of ingredients.

This recipe simplifies things, however. Not only do you mix it all in one bowl with the help of your microwave. The ingredient list contains just six items, not counting the optional nuts.

- 4 squares Baker's unsweetened chocolate
- 1/2 cup (1 1/2 sticks) margarine or butter
- 2 cups sugar
- 3 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 cup coarsely chopped nuts (optional)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Microwave chocolate and margarine in a large microwaveable bowl on high for 2 minutes, or until margarine is melted. Stir until chocolate is completely melted.

Stir sugar into melted chocolate until well blended. Stir in eggs and vanilla until completely mixed. Mix in flour until well blended. Stir in nuts. Spread in greased

13-by-9 pan.

Bake at 350 for 35 or 40 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out almost clean (CAUTION: do not overbake). Cool in pan; cut into squares. Makes 24 brownies.

PANCAKES

Let's face it. None of us is ready to be the Galloping Gourmet in the morning. But you can be a Frugal Gourmet of sorts by foregoing pancake mix for this batter.

If you're using a popular brand of mix, you're probably already combining the mix with milk and eggs. What we've done here is identified the components of the mix and added them separately. As a side note, you may want to make up your own mix. Sift together enough flour, sugar, salt and baking powder in a big enough quantity to last you a while. Then store in an airtight container in the space in your cupboard where the big yellow box used to be.

- 1 cup all-purpose flour (sifted)
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup milk
- 2 1/2 tablespoons butter (melted)

Sift flour, baking powder, salt and sugar. In a separate bowl lightly beat the eggs. Add the milk and melted butter.

Quickly combine the dry ingredients with the liquid, using as few strokes as possible. The mix will be lumpy, but ignore that.

Using a greased grill over a medium heat, cook pancakes on one side until air bubbles appear, then flip. Yields 24 pancakes.

Variations: Add half cup sliced apples, blueberries, mashed ripe bananas or other fruit.

CROUTONS

If there's one thing you want to avoid, it's store-bought croutons. If you're watching your intake of fat, cholesterol or sodium, you'd almost be better off drinking hemlock.

Dear Tom,

You would thoroughly enjoy Paris and should make the effort to learn a few key phrases and take the plunge into the diverse delights of Parisian life.

I write this letter to you well knowing that Chef Mary is busy and this may give you a reason to converse other than for necessity (since it is "show time"). This letter is somewhat urgent as I have just completed "dinner" and must record the experience lest it become but a numbing in my stomach.

The dining room was French service "parfait" (perfect) and I the only guest until my decaf and bon bons were served (9 p.m.). The entree, first course here, was a picture! Not expecting the scallops to be raw they were nonetheless delectable. Sliced into thin rounds, mirrors of their origins, they were layered succinctly upon a drizzle of olive oil to resemble a circle. Crunchy ginger was diced and sprinkled on top along with tiny chives, sparse chopped tomatoes, and likewise the nicotise olives that crowned the main portion of the plate. But the true jewels were the tiny sprinklings of Beluga

caviar placed ever so careful in intervals much like the numbers on a clock. Each trinity of caviar was then blessed by the tiniest leaf of Italian parsley.

You can understand, I am sure, that the surprise of raw St. Coquilles became oblivious in the palatious pleasure that ensued. The main dish was an elevation of the entree. A delicate filet of turbot placed upon a layer of saumon mousse within a pocket of phyllo. This was then pan fried to cook the fish, surrounded by a crunchy crust, more caviar daubed with chopped nicotise and served atop mixed herbs, including mint, with no dressing.

The lovely baby vegetables, the most amazing infant anise root, were steamed to perfection with no butter. Dessert was nothing special and the French do not make good decaf. It can be likened to non-alcoholic

wine to them.

It will remain as an experience in writing for a lasting memory to become, as this must be shared with someone I love (i.e. Jeff) (Her husband.)

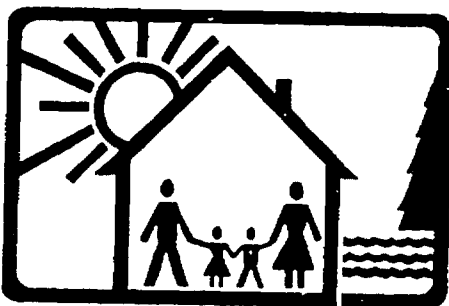

Microwave with soup mix

Dry onion soup mix is one ingredient most microwavers take care not to run out of. It's easy to keep on hand and comes in serving-size packets just right for one recipe, adding a rich onion flavor to a variety of recipes.

"Soup" mix seems a bit of a misnomer — who actually makes soup with it? One classic use is onion dip: one (1 1/4 ounce) envelope onion soup mix blended with 2 cups sour cream and served with a big bowl of potato chips.

But for microwavers, dry onion soup mix is perhaps most useful as a browning agent. Sprinkle over roasts or roll uncooked chicken in the mix before microwaving. Not only does it add a delicious oniony flavor, but it gives otherwise pale foods a glaze of appealing brown color, too.

For onion-lovers, try this special corn on the cob. Combine 2 tablespoons butter, 2 tablespoons dry onion soup mix and 1 tablespoon water. Microwave about 30 seconds, or until butter melts; stir. Arrange four ears of fresh corn in an 8x8 inch microwave-safe baking dish. Drizzle with butter mixture. Cover with waxed paper and microwave five to eight minutes, or until corn is tender.

To make a tasty onion butter, combine one 1 1/4 ounce envelope dry onion soup mix with one 8-ounce tub soft margarine or whipped unsalted butter. Blend thoroughly. Refrigerate until ready to use. Adds flavor to hot microwaved vegetables; toss with hot

cooked noodles or dab onto microwave-baked potatoes.

Following are some microwave recipes made extra-appetizing with onion soup mix.

(Recipes in this article were tested in 625- to 700-watt microwave ovens.)

ONION PARMESAN CHICKEN

1/3 cup butter or margarine
 1 (1 1/4 ounce) envelope dry onion soup mix
 1 tablespoon grated Parmesan cheese
 1/2 teaspoon paprika
 2 1/2 to 3 1/2 pounds chicken pieces, skinned

Yields 4 to 6 servings.

Preparation time: 5 to 10 minutes (plus 5 minutes standing time).

Oven setting: High (100 percent power).

Place butter in small microwave-safe dish and microwave about 1 minute, or until melted.

In separate dish combine onion soup mix, Parmesan cheese and paprika. Toss with fork. Dip chicken pieces in melted butter, then roll in onion soup mixture.

Arrange chicken pieces in 12- by 8-inch microwave baking dish. Microwave 15 to 20 minutes, or until chicken is tender and meat near bone is no longer pink. Let stand, covered, 5 minutes before serving.

EASY FREEZER-TO-TABLE POT ROAST

1 (3- to 3 1/2-pound) beef chuck pot roast
 1 (1 1/4-ounce) envelope dry onion soup mix
 1 (10 3/4-ounce) can condensed cream of mushroom soup
 1 (4-ounce) can mushroom stems and pieces, drained
 1/3 cup red wine

Yields 6 to 8 servings.

Preparation time: 10 minutes.

Cooking time: (see instructions).

Oven setting: High (100 percent power); Medium (50 percent power).

Place unwrapped roast in a 12x8x2-inch microwave-safe baking dish. (If wrapping is difficult to remove, wait until meat is partially thawed.) Cover with plastic wrap (turn up one corner to vent) and microwave at high setting 3 minutes. Reduce power to medium and microwave 9 to 14 minutes per pound. Rotate dish after 20 minutes.

Drain liquid from dish. Sprinkle half of onion soup mix over top of roast; turn over and sprinkle with remaining soup mix. Top with condensed mushroom soup, mushroom stems and pieces, and wine.

Cover with vented plastic wrap and microwave at medium setting 9 to 14 minutes per pound, or until tender. Stir sauce and spoon over roast halfway through cooking time. Let stand, covered, 10 minutes before serving.

ONION MEAT LOAF RING

2 pounds lean ground beef
 2 eggs, lightly beaten
 2 slices white bread, torn into small pieces
 1 (1 1/4-ounce) envelope dry onion soup mix
 2 tablespoons milk
 1 (8-ounce) can tomato sauce
 1 tablespoon brown sugar
 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

Yields 6 servings.

Preparation time: 10 minutes.

Cooking time: 13 to 16 minutes (plus 5 minutes standing time).

Oven setting: High (100 percent power).

In medium mixing bowl combine beef, eggs, bread, onion soup mix, milk and half of tomato sauce. Blend well with hands. Pat lightly into 4- or 5-cup microwave-safe ring mold. Microwave 12 to 15 minutes, rotating dish 1/4 turn every 5 minutes.

Meanwhile, combine remaining tomato sauce, brown sugar and Worcestershire sauce in 1-cup microwave-safe measure. Microwave about 1 minute, to heat. Invert meat loaf onto serving platter. Top with sauce and serve.

But seriously. When you make your own croutons, you know what's going into them. If you want to limit cholesterol, use olive oil to fry them. If you want to limit sodium, substitute other spice for the salt. Use a more nutritious wheat bread, or even pumpernickel if that's your taste.

1 loaf hard-crust bread such as Italian or French
1/2 cup butter (or half butter, half margarine)
1 teaspoon salt and pinch pepper
1 clove garlic, minced

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Cut bread into half-inch cubes, (or bigger if you like) leaving the crust on, and set aside to dry, approximately 15 minutes to a half hour.

In a saucepan melt butter, add salt, pepper and garlic and cook for approximately 3 minutes on medium heat. Toss croutons in hot butter until they are coated, then place in oven to brown, 5 to 7 minutes. Let cool and store in an airtight container.

Variations: Use olive oil instead of butter or margarine. Also add other seasonings while sauteing, or sprinkle with grated cheese after removing from the oven.

BARBECUE SAUCE

There's little advantage to eschewing the bottled brands of barbecue sauce in order to make your own. It's messier and takes longer, and there's little nutritional advantage.

But, oh, what an ego boost when you host that summer barbecue and you get to field all the compliments when you tell everybody the barbecue sauce is your own recipe. Even if you're eating it alone, barbecue sauce just seems to taste better when you know you made it.

The recipe offered here is just a suggested starting point. Feel free to experiment, especially with different types of vinegar. You can gather your whole family around the pot and argue over what to add in or exclude.

1 tablespoon butter

1 medium onion, minced
1 small garlic clove, minced
1 12- to 14-ounce bottle ketchup
1/2 cup vinegar
2 tablespoons brown sugar
1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1/4 teaspoon allspice

In a saucepan, melt butter and add minced onion and garlic. Cook over medium heat until golden brown, 3 to 5 minutes. Add ketchup, vinegar, brown sugar and cayenne. Cook all ingredients over medium heat for half an hour. Stir frequently or until sauce is reduced by a third.

MAYONNAISE

Again, here's another case where time and convenience lose the battle for flavor supremacy. Mayonnaise made fresh is a special treat to spread on sandwiches for a fancy picnic lunch.

1 egg yolk
1 teaspoon hot (not sweet) mustard, such as Dijon
1/4 teaspoon salt
pinch of cayenne or white pepper
1/4 cup oil (see note)
1 teaspoon lemon juice or wine vinegar

In a bowl whisk together egg yolk, mustard, salt and pepper. While mixture thickens, slowly pour in oil. Continue to whisk vigorously. When oil is blended in, slowly add lemon juice or vinegar; season to taste. Yields one cup.

Note: To help prevent fresh mayonnaise from breaking up in the refrigerator, add several teaspoons of hot water at the very end while whisking. It is best to blend olive oil with vegetable or peanut oil at a ratio of roughly one to six. Too much olive oil may be overpowering in flavor and cause the mayonnaise to harden in the refrigerator.

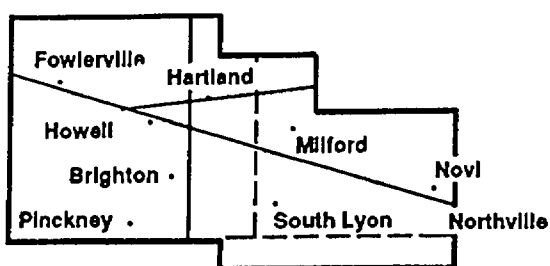

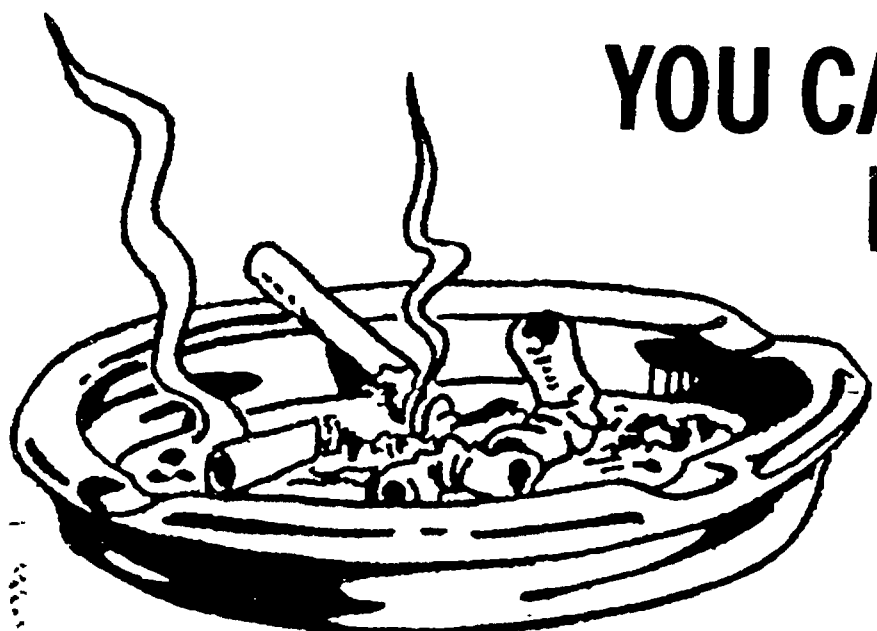

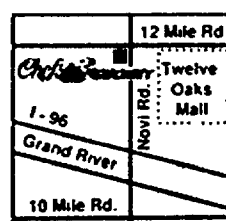

NBC's "Machine"

smarter than you think

Unlikely premise yields watchable series

Somewhere, maybe in some small Eastern European country, there's a heavily guarded vault. Inside are reels and reels of vintage video tape, preserving forever a vital part of our viewing heritage: the Really Bad part. Not just poor programming, of course, that's too large and varied a category. Instead, this vault is devoted to the preservation of the preposterous, those historic TV movies and series with premises and plotlines so outlandish a child wouldn't believe them. Children didn't believe them, in fact, and so we bid an abrupt adieu to shows like "Manimal," "Cop Rock" and "The Powers of Matthew Star."

After decades of stuff like "Hull High" and "The Immortal," audiences have become jaded to dubious programming. They feel they can "see it coming" and change the collective channel. While this is often a smart move, it can deprive viewers of a worthwhile show and deny the program a fair shot. Viewers are always well-advised to watch any program...once.

One viewing is all it should take to garner a following for NBC's "Mann & Machine," a new adventure-drama series premiering Sunday, April 5. Produced by the prestigious team of Dick Wolf ("Law & Order," "Miami Vice") and Bob DeLaurentis ("St. Elsewhere"),

the series has enough talent, taste and intelligence, both before and behind the camera, to make its unlikely, even silly-sounding premise palatable.

The premiere episode, titled "Prototype," sets up the story. In a not-too-distant future, police officers are aided and protected in their dangerous work by human-looking artificial intelligence units. Call them robots, call them cyborgs, call them a nuisance, says hard-bitten Bobby Mann, a second-generation cop with old-fashioned ideas.

When his mechanical partner is destroyed in an ambush, Bobby is quickly assigned a newer model, one allegedly far superior to the old one. Designed to look like a young woman (and cleverly named Eve Edison), Bobby's new partner is truly a high-tech marvel; her "brain" is downloaded daily into the police department's main computer. And she's learning, Bobby is told. Day by day, observant Eve is learning to be human.

The dialogue between Bobby (played winningly by David Andrews) and Yancy Butler's wonderfully poker-faced Eve is the center of the series' charm. Bobby reluctantly accepts his role as partner, teacher and first friend. Eve, meanwhile, is already more human than her makers suspect. She's not just assimilating human traits because she's programmed to do so, she wants to. Another plus is the delightfully combative

relationship between Bobby and his sharp-tongued captain, played by S. Epatha Merkerson.

Crisp dialogue and skillful acting alone aren't enough to keep "Mann & Machine" from succumbing to the inherent silliness of its premise. Intelligence and a measure of taste and sensitivity do the job, helping to avoid obvious pitfalls and guiding the show to several wise decisions.

There's no denying that Yancy Butler is attractive, and the script acknowledges this. It avoids, however, the incessant leering so common to prime-time TV, especially when the female character in question is innocent or unaware. In one scene, Eve begins to disrobe before Bobby has left the room. Instead of gawking, he leaves, later admonishing Eve to practice modesty. Similarly, Eve's innocence is never used as a springboard for mean or inappropriate humor.

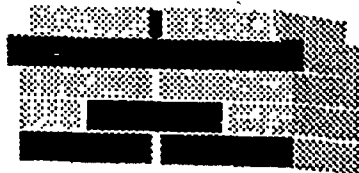
The makers of "Mann & Machine" are also to be commended for casting an African-American woman as a police captain. The decision, and Merkerson's fine performance, presents viewers with a genuinely new character, and a welcome change from the stock library of loud-mouthed, cigar-chomping men.

Tim Matheson has long track record

Q: Could you please give me some information on Tim Matheson? How old is he, is he married or single, what is the name of his latest movie and how did he get started? —Bertha Favreau, Chicopee, Mass.

A: The actor was born in Glendale, Calif., on Dec. 31, 1947. He got his career start during high school with the meeting of a producer, who was the father of a friend. By 1961, he had landed his first role, in the Robert Young series *Window on Main Street*. He continued to work steadily, appearing in episodes of *The Twilight Zone*, *My Three Sons*, *The Farmer's Daughter* and *Leave It to Beaver*. He also provided the voices for many Hanna-Barbera cartoon characters, including Jonny Quest. In 1964, the actor made his film debut in *Divorce, American Style*, then, in 1969, after six months in Marine Corps Reserves, Matheson accepted a four-year contract with Universal Studios. During that time, he helped found the improvisational troupe The Groundlings. In 1978, his career really took off when he appeared in the mega-hit film *Animal House* as frat leader Eric "Otter" Stratton. After much TV and stage work, he produced his first feature film, *Blind Fury*, in 1988. His latest television endeavor is the Fox series *Charlie Hoover*. He lives in Bel Air, Calif., with his wife, Megan, and their two daughters, Molly and Emma.

Q: Would you tell me where to write to Janet Jackson? —Ora Grant, Nashville, Tenn.

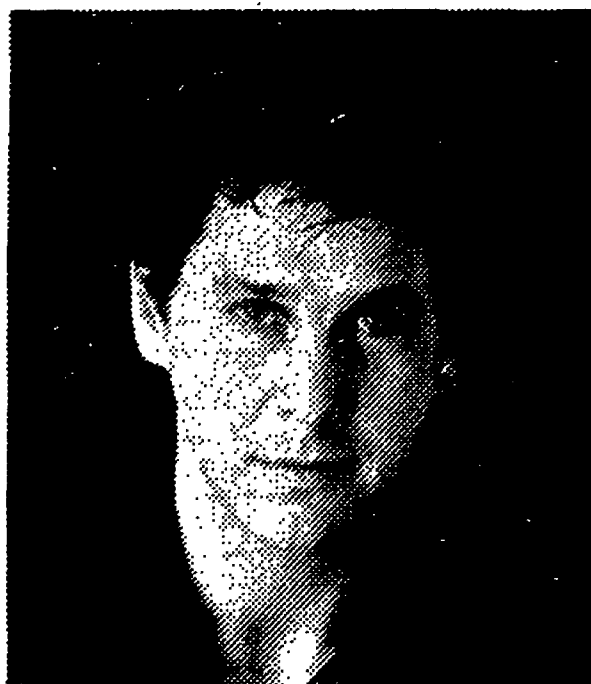
A: Write to the singer in care of Virgin Records, 9247 Alden Drive, Beverly Hills, Calif., 90210.

A: I think you're just confusing his movies with his real life. Van Damme has a sister but no brothers. He played twins Alex and Chad in his latest movie, *Double Impact*.

Q: Could you give me the ages of the four Golden Girls? Are they married? Do they have children? —Marie Feese, Creston, Iowa.

A: Bea Arthur was born May 13, 1924. She has two sons. Estelle Getty was born July 25, 1923. As far as I know, she has never been married or

Q: I've never written to any magazine about a show. I think you made a big mistake when you replaced Frank Faison with Cleavon Little as Ron Freeman on True Colors. There was a chemistry that is now missing. Even though I continue to watch, I feel there us something missing. —D. Reid, Portland, Ore.

A: Well, I'm glad you picked me to write to. But, as I've said before, I have no control over the content of television. The reasoning behind the casting change was that Fox felt because there were no "big" names on the show, it wasn't getting the ratings it should. They felt if they put a better known actor on the show, the ratings would improve. (Cleavon Little is well-known from his role in *Blazing Saddles*.) Perhaps it would also do better in a different time slot. Many people tune in just for *Married ... With Children* and miss *True Colors*. As I've said before, Fox is better than the other networks in that it lets shows stay on while they are developing a following rather than yank it off the first time it gets a low rating. 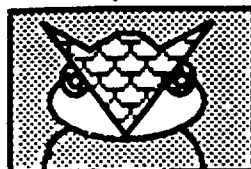

'Simpsons' can't shake animated series label

"All we want for *The Simpsons* is that they be treated like human beings," James L. Brooks, the series' co-executive producer joked with the press last summer.

But the animated family still has a long way to go. On the same day that the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences broke new ground by allowing a Best Picture nomination for the animated feature *Beauty and the Beast*, the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences announced that *The Simpsons* would not be allowed to compete for an Emmy in the Best Comedy series category. "I think that we'll have to make a *Simpsons* feature to get the credit we think we deserve," creator Matt Groening told the trade journal *The Hollywood Reporter*.

The prime-time series, in spite of its wide appeal to adult viewers, is not only denied equal standing with live-action comedies, but its writers and sound editors have also been confined to the animated series category. In addition, the academy is expected to announce that the actors who have done voice-over performances for the show will no longer be allowed to compete in the comedy series acting divisions of the Emmys. Henceforth, a new jury award will be created for voice-over artists.

Copperfield has more tricks up his sleeve

You won't catch illusionist David Copperfield pulling a rabbit out of a hat. The 35-year-old performer prefers to work on a grander scale, say, making the Statue of Liberty disappear. His newest collection of awesome feats, *The Magic of David Copperfield XIV: Flying ... 'Live the Dream,'* airs Tuesday, March 31, on CBS.

Copperfield holds the distinction of being the youngest (at age 12) inductee to the American Society of Magicians. His start in the world of prestidigitation came only two years earlier. Surprisingly, it wasn't masters like Houdini or Blackstone who were his greatest influences.

"My idols were Gene Kelly and Fred Astaire. What they did with dancing, I try to do with magic," Copperfield relates.

Copperfield's latest prime-time act is centered about the illusion of him flying around the stage. His own best publicist, the brash wizard reports that flying is "the fulfillment of a lifelong dream of mine."

The Tuesday show also features a mass mind-reading experiment with home viewers asked to touch their screens, a la Robert Tilton, and the conjuring up of an interactive, 26-year-old Orson Welles.
