## One township firm paid another

The lead engineering firm for Northville Township and the WTUA sewer project last year picked up a public relations tab incurred by then-Township Supervisor Georgina Goss.

Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May, the Ann Arbor-based firm that serves as Northville Township's engineering consultant and also holds a multi-million-dollar contract with the Western Townships Utilities Authority, paid a local company to write public relations copy for the township.

A \$500 check dated April 18, 1991, was sent by Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May to Goss, a Northville firm headed by local businessperson Chuck Keys. The engineering firm's check stub indicates the check was for a "P R Campaign."

Keys never performed public relations work for

Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May, he said last week. Instead, he scripted a public relations letter for the township fire department at Goss' request, at a cost of \$500.

Keys said he knew ALNM worked for the township, but he did not know why they sent him the check. He said he asked Goss to explain the payment, but did not press the issue.

"I trusted Georgina so much, I thought this was her way of getting the bill paid soon," Keys said.

ALNM personnel have been frequent and heavy contributors to Goss' supervisor and state House campaigns. But the payment to Keys is the only known instance of a private company paying for a township expense.

ALNM President Abe Munfah did not return a reporter's telephone call Friday. One of Munfah's employees said Munfah would have had to

approve the payment, though the check was signed by ALNM principal Donald W. Lystra.

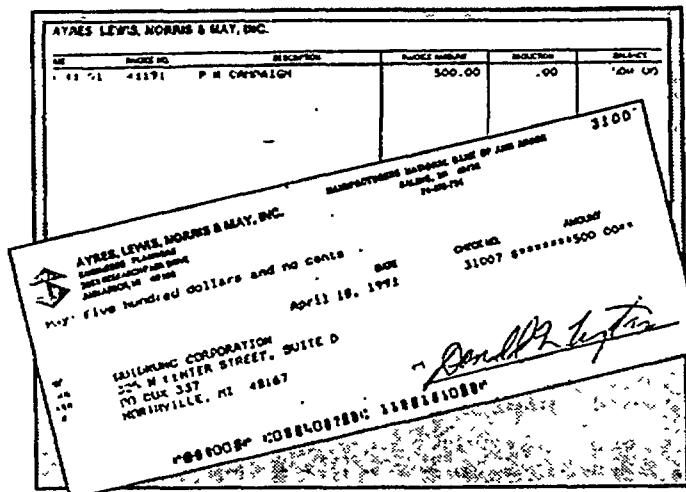
Goss was contacted at home Friday morning, but continued her recent stance of not responding to questions from the Record. When asked to explain why ALNM would send a check to Keys, Goss said, "I would be glad to; would you like to fax it to me at my office? I'll answer it in writing."

When a reporter asked Goss why she could not answer the question at that moment, Goss said, "I've got to go; I'm late for an appointment," and hung up.

Township Manager Richard Henningsen said he was unaware of the arrangement with ALNM.

"I didn't know that," he said. Asked if it was normal practice for consultants to pay township bills,

## Judge mulls motions

Defense and prosecution pitched their closing arguments in 35th District Court Friday during the motions segment of a video obscenity case.

Judge James Garber heard attorneys lobby for and against a motion to dismiss multiple counts of second degree obscenity against the owners of Northville Video, 43197 Seven Mile.

Garber has reviewed motions from defense attorney Carl Rubin and Wayne County Assistant Prosecutor Raymond Walsh and said he would offer his opinion by mid-April.

"I have a feeling no matter what I do it's going to be appealed," Garber said. "... I'll probably prepare an opinion on this in the next couple weeks."

Northville Township police last February raided Northville Video after a Detroit man complained that the store featured allegedly obscene videotapes and glossy materials.

Police, acting on a search warrant authorized by the county prosecutor, seized the jackets from four tapes, as well as glossy materials and a computer and computer records.

Rubin, representing defendants Carl Wilson and his daughter Laura Wilson, asked Garber to dismiss the case on the grounds that judges in at least five Michigan counties have repeatedly ruled that aspects of state obscenity guidelines are unconstitutional.

"We are dealing with very unclear, ambiguous language," Rubin said.

Walsh countered, and said the state Legislature set clear standards on obscenity issues.

Garber's ruling on the motion to dismiss likely will determine if the video store owners must face trial on the obscenity charges in the near future.

## Recycling muddle prompts letter

The city's new curbside refuse / recycling program has been in effect for several months, but some people have still not gotten the message.

So says Code Enforcement Officer Charles Altman, who has become the city's liaison with residents concerning the program.

The confusion has prompted a one-page letter to all city residents, which outlines what can and cannot be recycled.

"Some people are just not getting it straight," Altman said. "They're putting things in blue bags that we just can't take."

For the record, the clear blue bags delivered to residents' doorsteps by the city earlier this year are meant to hold recyclable materials, and only those recyclable materials that are being accepted

at Browning-Ferris Industries' material recovery facility in Salem.

"BFI is not accepting everything that can be recycled at this time," Altman noted.

The company, and thus the city, are only accepting green, brown and clear glass, metal cans, plastic containers with the number 1 or 2 within a triangle on the bottom, and newspapers.

All the items except newspapers may be mixed together in a single recycling bag, while the newspapers must be separated into their own bag.

Blue bags containing any other items, including paper milk cartons, cereal boxes or aluminum pie plates, will not be collected.

Another snag is that the city's initial batch of red refuse stickers, which cost \$1.50 a piece, do not stick to trash bags in the cold weather. But relief is on the way, Altman said.

"The new stickers that are coming are freezer-grade stickers, and once you get them on the bag you'll never get them off, cold or hot."

A third mistake, and a more costly one for residents, is that some residents are paying unnecessarily to have their recyclables collected, by placing the red stickers on the blue bags.

The stickers are only needed on bags of non-recyclable refuse, Altman noted: "Recyclables are picked up free."

All this confusion resulted in an initial flood of complaints into city hall from residents, which has gradually slowed to a trickle.

"When we first started, it was terrible," Altman said. The code enforcement officer said he fielded many of the complaints himself while out on his rounds.

"I'm really happy about the thing now," he said. "Days go by and we don't get a complaint."

## City orders condo developer to appear

The Selective Group, developer of St. Lawrence Estates, has been issued a notice of violation for design deficiencies at its Seven Mile Road condominium complex.

The March 27 notice cites deficiencies in St. Lawrence's streets and parking areas, site lighting, and sidewalks.

The notice, signed by City Building Inspector Joe Attard, orders Selective Vice President Matt Thurber to appear before City Manager Gary Word April 10, to show cause why an order should not be issued stopping all construction activities until the deficiencies are corrected.

Failure to appear will result in the issuance of a stop-work order, Attard wrote.

The violation notice was first announced at a March 16 city council meeting, following a heated defense of Selective by Michael Horowitz, president of the development firm. Horowitz argued then that St. Lawrence's streets, though they deviate from the city-approved site plan, have not been shown to be deficient.

He argued, too, that the firm had been working to correct a list of defi-

ciencies delivered to Selective by the St. Lawrence Homeowners Association in October, and that most St. Lawrence homeowners are satisfied with their units.

Also at the March 16 meeting was St. Lawrence Homeowners Association President Jim Steckel, who presented the council with a sheaf of let-

## Board asks for district library plan

Library Advisory Commissioners hope township officials this week will support their quest to branch out on their own and create a district library — a library funded entirely by a special millage.

A resolution asking for township approval of the idea appears on the board's agenda this Thursday, April 9. The resolution which plots the commission's plan of action was approved by the Northville Library Advisory Commission Thursday night.

A request for approval from the city council could come at its April 20 meeting.

The five members of the District Library Study Committee recommended the commission take initial steps toward asking voters to support a millage to fund a district library. If all goes as planned, voters could have a request for a minimum of 1 mill to a maximum of 2 mills before them by February 1993.

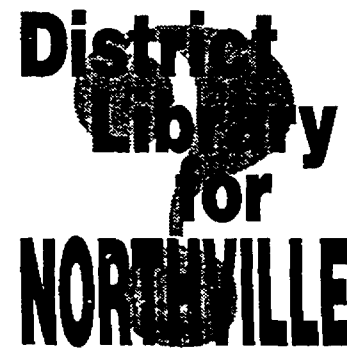
The study committee reached its verdict after seeing the impact deep budget cuts had on library staff and services last year. Moreover, a bleak financial picture sketched in next year's budget spoke volumes to commissioners.

Patricia Orr, director of the library, said the library suffered a \$72,000 loss this fiscal year. Deep budget cuts from the city and township's Shared Services Agreement equated to an elimination of three staff positions or 52 weekly hours of staff time. A 19-hour-a-week reduction in existing staff hours resulted in shortened business hours and a 20-percent reduction in book and materials purchases.

Added to that was an 8-percent increase in business and a 20-percent increase in neighboring libraries' business because Northville residents are going outside the community to use other libraries.

Committee members say creating a district library will solve the problem and give library staff an opportunity to restore services and add to its collection.

"Another important reason to do so is the growing inability of the general funds of the city and township to support a library operation which meets the increasing demand for service," committee members concurred



In their written recommendation to the commission.

Under Michigan's Library Establishment Act of 1989, two or more municipalities may opt to create a district library, funded by a district-wide library millage and governed by a district library board of elected or appointed members.

Orr said the district library board is empowered to place a millage request before the electorate, should the idea be approved by city and township voters.

The commission had considered two options for initiating its plan. A first would have put the issue before the voters during the August primary. But it was the later plan which captured consensus of the seven-member board. The time frame for approval of the plan works on the premise that the resolution goes before city and township officials and is adopted soon.

Simultaneously, if a district library is approved, municipalities will need to name people to sit on a district library planning committee to spearhead the campaign. That committee will then spend the next few months drafting an agreement subject to approval of the State Librarian in September.

Commissioners expect to nail down the details for an exact millage rate in October, and set the dates for public hearings and the election.

Orr said the idea of creating a district library was a reactive thought of the township's budget and finance committee last year in response to the cuts.

She said 1 mill levied in the township and city would raise \$623,000; 2 mills would generate twice that, or \$1,246,000.

Committee members are optimistic the millage will pass, Orr said.

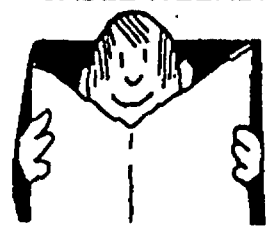

# Firm and township in pay dispute

State Rep. Georgina Goss hired a public relations firm for at least two pet projects in 1991, but controversy forced her to back away from spending thousands of township dollars.

Without the consent of the township board, Goss hired Northville businessperson Chuck Keys and Guidnunc Corp. to conduct public relations campaigns for the township fire and police departments.

Keys billed the township \$500 to script a letter about the township fire department last spring, after a switch in ambulance services created a mild stir.

Goss forwarded the check to township and WTUA engineering consultant Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May, who paid the tab for Goss (see related story, page 1-A).

Goss later hired Keys to push the township line for an August 1991 police millage election. Based on interviews, public records and other documents, Goss hired Keys in May 1991, weeks before a skeptical township board heard the Goss/Keys sales pitch.

In fact, a billing from Keys was sent to the township on May 29, two weeks before the June 13 meeting in which the board heard of the public relations campaign. Keys' initial bill to the township amounted to \$975.

Township records indicate that Goss introduced Keys to the township board June 13, 1991. At that time, Goss said the township executive board—supervisor, clerk, treasurer and township manager—had agreed to bring Keys on board as "community relations" consultant.

Goss said then-Treasurer Betty Lennox had agreed to give up her \$1,000 educational benefit, and with "a few other spare dollars" would pay for Keys' "start-up costs."

Keys' costs—which topped out at more than \$3,000—eventually would be repaid through fundraisers, Goss told the board. The board took no official action that evening, and did not agree to expend any township money for the police millage campaign.

But Keys went to work, and sent statements on June 1 and July 1. The three bills totaled \$3,225. By July, however, the public relations efforts were awash in controversy, due to

questions over using public funds to promote a millage proposal.

The relationship between Goss and Keys—who also was helping out on the Goss state House campaign—began to sour soon after.

Goss eventually bailed out of their agreement, Keys said.

"Georgina and I went out for breakfast and she told me she couldn't pay me with township money," he said. "She told me I would be paid with other funds."

"(Goss said) 'Politically, it's not right,' but she promised me that I'd get paid," Keys said.

Goss on Friday refused to answer a reporter's questions. She has insisted this newspaper provide her with written questions, an approach the Record has rejected.

Meanwhile, Keys continued to send bills to the township. Manager Richard Henningsen said the bills went directly to Goss.

"I handed them to the supervisor," he said. "I didn't know what all the charges represented, and at the time I was unaware of the operation."

"I think at the time (Goss) was handling that," Henningsen said. After Goss was elected to the state

House, Lennox began to send the Keys bills to Goss. In mid-November, Keys said he received a letter and a \$1,100.10 check from a group called Supporters of Police Millage.

The letter and check were signed by Sally A. Williams—wife of township trustee Donald Williams. The Sally Williams letter stated: "As instructed by Mrs. Georgina Goss, enclosed herewith is Check No. 105, dated November 15, 1991, in the amount of \$1,100.10. This check represents the balance of the account."

"Thank you very much for all your assistance,"

Keys said he was surprised to receive the check, but was not satisfied with the amount.

"I figured, how the hell did they get that figure," he said. He then sent the township a bill for \$2,124.90, but has not seen a dime since the November check.

Keys said he was troubled by the brief relationship with Goss and the township. He figures he was short-changed by the former township supervisor.

"You have to understand, I believed in her," he said.

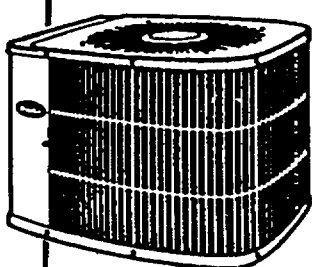

# Police take out phony McDonald's employee

## Group honors school board

Kudos to Northville Board of Education members.

That's what Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski is shouting from the rooftops these days. The Michigan Association of School Boards will make it official by bestowing honors on board members tomorrow.

Board President Jean Hansen will accept the MASA Award of Merit on behalf of the district tomorrow night at the Region 8 meeting of the Metro MASA at Stevenson High School.

The award honors state school boards on which more than half the members have received or are eligible for completion of the state's Standard of Excellence program. Board members who receive the award must take a prescribed number of training courses to better prepare themselves for school board duties, Rezmierski said.

In addition to recognition for the board as a whole, two individual

members will also receive honors. Vice President Glenna Davis and Treasurer Robert McMahon are both receiving the MASA Award of Distinction for successful completion of the Keys to Better Boardmanship program. That program awards board members who have accumulated 250-plus points in completion of the program, Rezmierski said.

"For a volunteer group this is an outstanding effort," Rezmierski said. "I'm very pleased that we have this kind of commitment from a group of people who are not paid and are strictly volunteers."

"Here are a group of people who have extended themselves away from the district on nights and weekends to pick up courses and better prepare the community and the board to be well-educated, and well-prepared," he said. "These are just examples of that commitment."

McMahon has been a board member since 1987. Davis was elected in 1981.

## County Commission districts challenged

Michigan Supreme Court justices struck down new Wayne County Commission Districts, giving a temporary victory to suburban commissioners who sued to block the districts.

In a move unrelated to U.S. House redistricting, the state high court rejected plans drafted by a county apportionment panel.

Panel members are expected to file a revised plan with the court in two weeks.

"The court will put them under a microscope," said Bryan Amann, D-Wayne, one of four commissioners who challenged the new districts. "If they're still not happy, the justices hold the wild card."

Amann and the other commissioners brought an alternative plan before the court, but it's uncertain whether any part of that plan would be included in the county panel's revision.

"There's no guarantee our districts would be saved," Amann said. Court arguments centered on Livonia's division into two districts,

as well as other boundary line issues. But the suburban commissioners — all Democrats — have also said the proposed districts make them more vulnerable to Republican challengers.

Amann was placed in a district with GOP incumbent Maurice Breen, R-Plymouth Township. That district includes Northville Township and the Wayne County portion of the City of Northville. Breen is the only Republican currently on the commission.

The state Supreme Court ruled the suburban commissioners had shown it was possible to adopt a valid restricting plan that provides for more Detroit-only districts. Districts are to vary no more than eight percent in population, while also providing adequate minority representation under state and federal laws.

Commission districts will go into effect for the 1992 elections, but they won't give potential candidates too much time to decide on running. The filing deadline is 4 p.m. Tuesday, May 12.

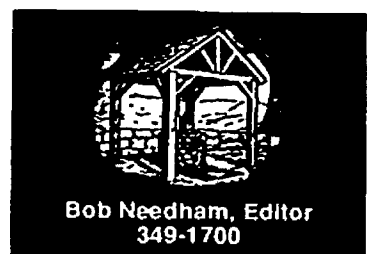

### St. Lawrence scuffle masks real concerns

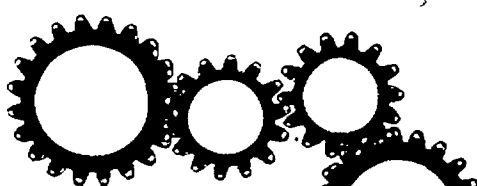
Neither side has been fully forthcoming, either to the city officials who have been dragged kicking and screaming into the mess, or to the press which has sought to glean the truth from all the posturing on both parts.

Both sides have been responsible for delays in the installation of street lights and sidewalks, with the homeowners association seeking to save some money and the developer consistently touting his firm's willingness to address legitimate concerns but failing to address them in a timely manner.

This is not to say that the argument does not include some serious allegations regarding the developer's performance. A recently released list of 22 "open construction issues" mentions seemingly minor items like downspouts discharging over walkways and driveways and a lack of metal edging between lawns and planting areas, and makes absurd requests like "correction of extremely steep grade behind Buildings 4-6."

But the list also addresses more severe problems like cracked roads and sewers dropping below the roadway's surface, standing water throughout the complex and a rock retaining wall built near the Johnson Drain that was not shown in the original site plan.

We do not know what lies underneath all the posturing on either side. Is the homeowners association attempting to force the city into accepting St. Lawrence

streets as public roads without upgrading them to the standards typically required by the city; or just seeking reduced property assessments? Is the aim to use the sidewalk and street light issues as bargaining chips to leverage more money out of the developer, without ever intending to have sidewalks and the balance of street lights installed?

Do a majority of the homeowners even want sidewalks? No one knows, because the issue has never been put to a formal vote.

Neither has the issue of street lights. Both sides agree that homeowners association officials asked that the developer delay installing all the lights, with the homeowners' rep saying the main reason was to correct deficiencies in those already installed and the developer claiming it was due mainly to the rep's desire to save money.

Nearly lost in the feud have been the concerns of individual St. Lawrence residents which, judging by a sampling of letters from irate homeowners, are legitimate. One complained of heating problems that dragged on for months before the source was discovered, while another charged that the developer misrepresented the homeowners' points of view to city officials.

Many agree that the development firm's response to their concerns has been lackadaisical, marred by a failure to respond, failed attempts to repair defects and some promises of repairs being countermanded by others in the development firm.

One resident suggested that the developer hire an owner advocate, who would investigate the homeowners' complaints and have the authority to order repairs. The suggestion seems like an excellent one.

Whatever the reasons behind the dispute, the continued mud-slinging and name-calling does not advance anyone's cause, least of all the homeowners'.

ters and a petition signed by disgruntled homeowners.

Steckel, at previous meetings, charged the city with failing to enforce its site plans regarding St. Lawrence streets, and argued that the city should dedicate the streets as public roads and either provide a host of city services to the complex or reduce the property owners' assessments.

City officials countered then that St. Lawrence was built as a private development and that dedication would require the roads to be upgraded to match the city's standards for public roads.

Since then, the homeowners' association and developer have locked horns several times, and Steckel has sought the city's help in mediating the dispute and enforcing the site plans.

City-initiated inspections of the roads in January and February revealed that they were poured over large pieces of crushed concrete rather than the Michigan Department of Transportation-approved gravel specified in the site plan. Selective agreed to test the roads again in May to ascertain whether the deviation from site plan increases or reduces the roads' strength and, subsequently, their life span.

Horowitz argued, as he had to the council, that St. Lawrence's street system is not deficient and was installed the way it was due to the site's conditions.

"We've tested it until we're blue in the face," he said. "To the extent that there's a determination that they're not satisfactory, we'll correct them. But the site conditions were such that had we done what the specs called for, the road would have collapsed by now... The inappropriate thing to do would have been to put in what the spec called for."

The installation of sidewalks was delayed at the request of homeowners' association attorney Robert Meisner, Horowitz said, though Steckel argued that the developer never intended to install the sidewalks in the first place.

"There was never any indication that they would put them in based on where they put the light poles and landscaping," he said. "The real issue is, based on the site plan, they're not going to be installed to the specifications."

But the actual landscaping plan allows flexibility in the sidewalks' placement.

The homeowners association also objects to the lack of concrete foundations and underground conduit on the street lights, and their use of two different types of light fixtures.

While the street light plan shows concrete foundations, it also notes the use of "conduit to next unit when required." The National Electric Code does not require the conduit.

Horowitz and Steckel agreed that Selective delayed putting up many of the complex's street lights in response to a request from the homeowners' association, while the association protested the design deficiencies and considered whether to ask for fewer street lights and save electricity costs. As Steckel said, "The association may want to look at the cost of operating the street lights and may not want as many as on the plan."

Steckel said the homeowners association wants to see a final plan for the sidewalks' placement before their installation.

Selective is now prepared to install the sidewalks and street lights to the site plan's specifications, Horowitz said.

Section 1. Sections 12.03, PR-1, and 13.03, PR-2, Storage of Materials, Section 15.04m(4), Small Car Parking, and 16.18 b(b), Permitted Wall Signs, of Title IV, Chapter 12, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Northville are hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 12.03, PR-1 and 13.03, PR-2, STORAGE OF MATERIALS — ADD: Section 12.03 - Special Land Uses Permitted After Review and Approval The following uses shall be permitted by the Planning Commission pursuant to Article 17 and subject to the following provisions:

Storage of Materials

The location or storage of materials shall be regulated as follows:

(1) The outdoor storage of materials within any right-of-way is prohibited.  
(2) The outdoor storage of materials shall be screened from adjoining public right-of-ways or from adjoining residential uses. A five and one-half foot (5 1/2') screening wall, fence or landscape buffer shall be used to provide effective screening and shall conform with Section 16.09 (b and c) of this ordinance.

(3) Such storage shall not be located within the required front yard set back, or any required side or rear yard.

Section 13.03 - Special Land Uses Permitted After Review and Approval The following uses shall be permitted by the Planning Commission pursuant to Article 17 and subject to the following provisions:

Storage of Materials

The location or storage of materials shall be regulated as follows:

(1) The outdoor storage of materials within any right-of-way is prohibited.  
(2) The outdoor storage of materials shall be screened from adjoining public right-of-ways or from adjoining residential uses. A five and one-half foot (5 1/2') screening wall, fence or landscape buffer shall be used to provide effective screening and shall conform with Section 16.09(b and c) of this ordinance.

(3) Such storage shall not be located within the required front yard set back, or any required side or rear yard.

Section 15.04m — Small Car Parking ADD:

m. (4) The number of permitted small car spaces and stall configurations shall be subject to site plan approval by the Planning Commission.

SECTION 16.18 b. PERMITTED WALL SIGNS WITHIN THE CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT (CBD)

b. Permitted Wall Signs within the Central Business District (CBD)

(1) Each tenant within a business site may have one (1) wall sign displayed on the exterior wall of that building.  
(2) Total signage area per building or site frontage may be calculated in either of the following methods:

(a) Thirty-two (32) square feet for the single tenant, 50 square feet total for two tenants and an additional fifteen (15) square feet for each additional tenant, or  
(b) One (1) square foot of total building sign area for each lineal foot of building frontage with a maximum height of three (3) feet.

(3) A business site may erect an additional twelve (12) square foot wall sign to be placed on any other exposed building surface or wall other than the street frontage.

(4) A tenant with a second means of access directly onto a public alley or parking lot may opt to use the wall sign area allocation in 16.18 b for the front, rear or combination thereof. The total rear or the total front may not exceed the maximum allowance for front.

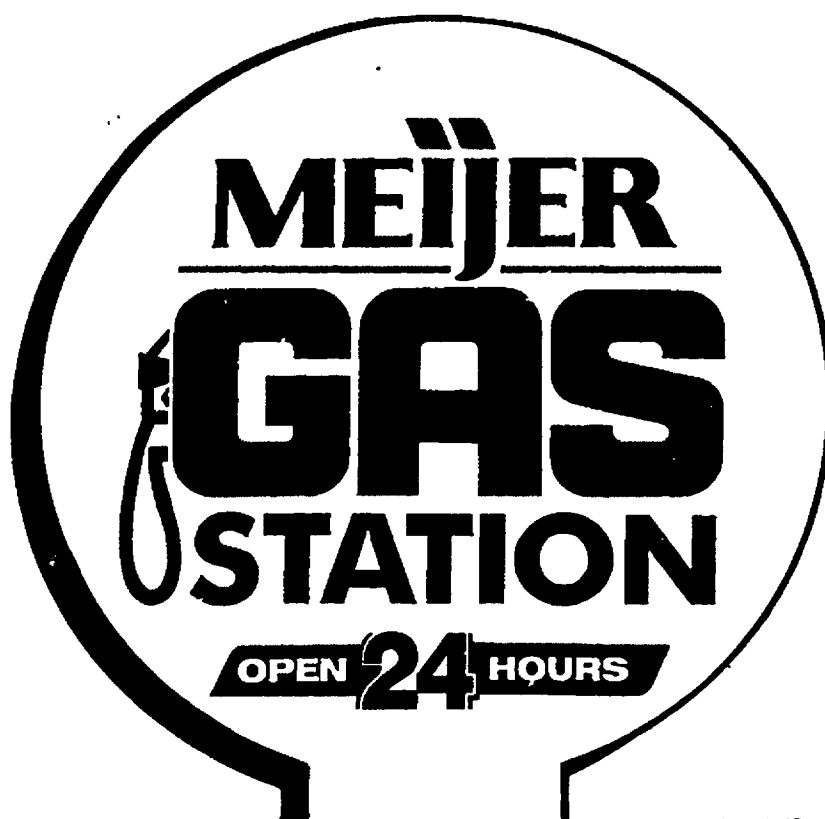

## For great value seek Southern Rhone wines

Chardonnay and cabernet sauvignon are fashionable wines; so are the wines of Bordeaux, Burgundy and Champagne. Rhone wines are not fashionable in the same sense, but they are recognized by connoisseurs as some of the world's best values.

Single-handedly, author Robert Parker may have increased the fashionability of Rhone wines in the United States. For several years, he glowingly praised the wines of several Rhone estates in his bimonthly periodical "The Wine Advocate." He furthered the reputation of several Rhone producers in his book, "The Wines of the Rhone Valley and Provence," Simon and Schuster (\$22.95).

Kermil Lynch, a wine retailer and importer based in Berkeley, Calif., is responsible for introducing Rhone wines to an expanding number of small, artisan winemakers in California. Lynch's book "Adventures on the Wine Route, A Wine Buyer's Tour of France," Farrar, Straus and Giroux (\$19.95), gave readers an insider's view of several of the Rhone's superior producers.

The hottest wines from California continue to be Rhone-style wines made from grapes originating in the Rhone Valley such as mourvedre, syrah, cinsault, grenache, roussanne, marsanne and viognier.

France's Rhone Valley runs south from Lyon to the Mediterranean Sea and is divided into two distinct sub-regions — north and south. The principal grape variety in the north is syrah.

Although Americans are accustomed to identifying wines by the name of the wine's principal grape variety, red wines of the southern Rhone are blends of several grape varieties, grown in a warmer climate. They are softer and more approachable when young. Northern wines tend to be more muscular and tannic, with greater longevity.

Learning about the red wines of the southern Rhone requires a certain familiarity with the place names used to identify these wines. Cotes du Rhone (coat dew rone), Cotes du Rhone Villages (vee-lajh), Chateaufort-du-Pape (shot-toe-nuff dew pap), Cotes du Ventoux (coat dew vawn-too), Vacqueyras (va-kay-ras), and Gigondas (jhe-gone-das) are wines most frequently found in Michigan.

J.C. Mathes, a professor of technical writing at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, has also developed a fondness for the wines of the southern Rhone. Rather than write about his wine passion, he has established a small importing company, J et R Selections Ltd., specializing in southern Rhone wines.

**1988 Cotes du Rhone Le Mas des Collines** (\$7) is a medium-bodied red wine with abundant, attractive red fruit aromas and generous, juicy flavors. The noticeable tannins make it an ideal match to hearty food flavors.

**1988 Cotes du Rhone Domaine de La Grangette Saint Joseph** (\$7.75) showcases black cherry, chocolate and cocoa aromas. It's spicy with good tannins, balanced acidity and an appealing peppery finish.

**1988 Gigondas Cotes du Rhone Le Mas des Collines** (\$13) is higher priced than the first two recommendations, but the extra dollars bring a complex wine with smoky, blueberry and violet accents. It's a rich, multi-dimensional mouthful with guts and flavor.

# Making the historical novel

## Dinner gala is society's social event

Just think of it as an intimate dinner party for 158.

It's the Northville Historical Society's Progressive Dinner, an annual fundraising and social event that spotlights the society with a unique culinary spin.

Rest assured, however, that all 158 people didn't show up at the same house for the same dinner party. This year's edition was held Saturday night at various sites around Northville.

Beth Beson of the Historical Society explains that though the group mustered at Mill Race Park (at the Cady Inn, the Church and the Yerkes Home) for appetizers, diners broke up into groups of 12 for their main courses. The dinner groups were chosen at random by a computer.

"Each couple brings a dish, which might be an appetizer or dessert," Beson said. "And others bring a main course. At each house, there are six couples, so six different dishes go into each meal."

In previous years, chefs who prepared the menu for the progressive dinner have included Tom MacKinnon of MacKinnon's Restaurant and Sue Baker of the Rose Cottage Tea Room. This year, however, the "Surprise Chef" remained a secret right up until the time of the event.

Fourteen homes hosted main courses for the progressive dinner. Most of the host homes were in the city's downtown historic district, although hosts weren't necessarily members of the Historical Society.

"Sometimes they've volunteered, or we give them a call and ask them if they'd like to host," said Beson. "Usually it's just someone who's interested."

The hosts don't do much in the way of cooking, though as you'll see by the recipes, some dishes received final preparation at their destinations. Hosts simply had their tables set and sitting rooms ready for a party of 12.

"It's a good time to meet new friends because for the dinner, it's all random," said Beson. "You could be dining with your next door neighbor or a total stranger. Even people from out of state come along."

Dessert followed at three more homes, where representatives from each of the dinner homes donned a chef's hat, decorated and signed by the diners.

The event was surprisingly inexpensive to put on. The majority of the cost is beverages, both alcoholic and non-alcoholic. The society also complements each of the host homes with flower arrangements to brighten the dinner table.

Proceeds from the event go to support the Historical Society's renovation efforts at Mill Race Park. But money isn't what drives the progressive dinner.

"Actually, the whole idea is to make it a social event — that raises money," said Beson. "It's a very nice social event."

## 'Surprise' recipes revealed

Here are the menus and recipes from the Northville Historical Society's Progressive Dinner last Saturday.

**Appetizers:** Stuffed mushroom caps, sweet and sour meatballs, fresh fruit kabobs with cream dip, herbed cheese tarts, Spanish sparkling wine.

**Salad:** Michigan Autumn salad

**Before dinner:** California Chenin Blanc

**Dinner:** Glazed, apple-sage stuffed pork chops, spinach fettuccine with Parmesan and garlic, cauliflower au gratin, assorted rolls, French Moreau Chardonnay and red Cotes du Rhone

**Dessert:** Amaretto cheesecake, giant strawberry flan, chocolate sin.

### STUFFED MUSHROOM CAPS

50 medium-sized mushroom caps  
1 pound pork sausage  
¾ cup dried bread crumbs  
1 teaspoon Lawry's seasoned salt  
1 egg  
5 green onions  
5 tablespoons chopped parsley  
Parmesan cheese  
Remove stems from mushroom caps, cut small flat on bottom of mushroom cap to prevent rolling. Wash caps well, place on paper towel, open-side down, to drain.

In small mixing bowl combine sausage, bread crumbs, salt, parsley, egg and onion. Fill each mushroom cap with sausage mixture. Smooth top of mixture slightly with teaspoon. Place mushroom caps on baking sheet and sprinkle tops with Parmesan cheese. Broil for 3-5 minutes in preheated oven until mushrooms are just cooked and golden brown.

Transfer mushrooms to a self heating covered chaffing dish for delivery to Mill Race. Bring a small glass of fancy toothpicks for serving.

Mushroom caps and filling may be prepared ahead of time and refrigerated. Broil mushrooms just prior to leaving for Mill Race.

### SWEET AND SOUR MEATBALLS

2 pounds ground beef  
1 egg  
¾ cup bread crumbs  
¼ teaspoon garlic salt  
¼ teaspoon pepper  
1 teaspoon basil  
1 small onion

Mix together ground beef, egg, bread crumbs and seasonings in a bowl, mix well. Using a spoon and hands, roll into ½ inch diameter balls (yields 60 balls) place on non-stick cooking sheet. Keep balls separated and bake in a preheated oven at 375 degrees until brown. Remove from cooking sheet and drain on paper towel.

### Sauce

1 pound box dark brown sugar  
1 ten ounce bottle catsup  
¼ cup white wine vinegar  
¼ teaspoon allspice  
¼ cup sweet Vermouth  
Mix together in large saucepan brown sugar, catsup, vinegar and allspice. Bring to a boil stirring constantly to ensure sugar does not stick to bottom until dissolved. Reduce heat to simmer, add meatballs, stir carefully to ensure all are coated with sauce, simmer covered for 1½ hours, stir carefully every ½ hour. Add the Vermouth and carefully stir. Simmer covered for one hour.

Transfer meatballs and sauce to self-heating, covered chaffing dish for delivery to Mill Race. Bring a small glass of fancy toothpicks for serving.

### FRUIT KABOBS WITH CREAM DIP

oranges, pineapple, quart strawberries, crenshaw or musk melon, kiwi fruit, star fruit

Note: the fruits listed are suggestions, pick three or four fruits you want to prepare.

50 4-6 inch skewers (Fairgrove mini bamboo skewers available at Shopping Center)

Clean and prepare fruit as noted below

low and arrange on skewer with a minimum of four different pieces per skewer. Arrange prepared skewers on platter. Chill before serving.

Oranges should be sliced in half lengthwise then cut into ¼ inch slices. Discard the end slices.

For pineapples, remove ends, cut off skin a small width at a time from top to bottom ensuring to remove leaf pockets from fruit. Slice into ¼ inch thick rings, remove core and quarter.

For kiwi fruit, peel the skin from the fruit and cut into ¼ inch slices, discard end slices.

Rinse star fruit and slice into ¼ inch thick star shaped slices, discard end slices.

Split melon, clean out center, cut into ¼ inch slices, cut off skin and cut into chunks.

### Fresh fruit dip

¾ oz package vanilla instant pudding  
1 cup milk  
1 teaspoon almond extract  
1 pint whipping cream  
4 tablespoon powdered sugar

Pour milk in a medium mixing bowl, add almond extract and pudding, mix well and refrigerate for five minutes or until pudding begins to thicken, whip briefly. In electric mixer, whip whipping cream on medium until firm. With mixer on low, add powdered sugar. Whip till blended in. Add whipping cream to pudding mixture; fold together until blended. Chill fruit dip well. Pour dip into serving bowl. Set bowl in center of service platter, arrange fruit skewers around. Bring a serving spoon for the fruit dip.

### HERBED CHEESE TARTS

¾ cup fine, dry bread crumbs  
2 eight ounce package cream cheese (softened)

# Make-ahead beef speeds dinner

Rush-hour dinners don't have to be a hassle if you cook once on the weekend and freeze the makings for several meals.

Cover containers tightly and freeze. Use beef mixture in the following recipes. Yield 6 to 7 cups cooked beef.

### WEEKNIGHT BEEF STEW

Preparation time: 5 minutes  
Cooking time: 15 minutes

1 container (2 cups) Triple Batch Beef, defrosted  
2 medium red potatoes, cut into ¼ -inch thick slices  
½ cup water  
1 teaspoon dried oregano leaves  
¼ teaspoon salt  
1 cup frozen peas  
1 tablespoon lemon juice  
2 teaspoons cornstarch

Place beef pieces and cooking liquid, potatoes, water, oregano and salt in medium saucepan. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low to medium-low, cover tightly and simmer 10 to 12 minutes or until potatoes are tender; add peas. Meanwhile combine lemon juice and cornstarch; stir into beef mixture. Bring to a boil; cook and stir 1 minute. 4 Servings.

1 teaspoon dried thyme leaves  
¼ cup quick cooking barley  
1 cup each frozen cut green beans and sliced carrots

Place beef pieces and cooking liquid, water, bouillon granules and thyme in large saucepan. Bring to a boil; add barley, green beans and carrots, stirring to combine. Return to a boil; reduce heat to low to medium-low, cover and simmer 12 minutes or until barley is tender. 4 Servings.

1 can (15 ounces) kidney beans, drained and rinsed  
1 cup shredded Cheddar Cheese  
¼ cup sliced green onions

Place beef pieces and cooking liquid, salsa and chili powder in medium saucepan. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low to medium-low, cover tightly and simmer 10 minutes. Add beans; heat through. Serve with Cheddar cheese and green onion. 4 Servings.

Because we are Rhone wine fans, we asked Mathes to let us taste through his wines and recommend our favorites in the Wine Selections of the Week. These wines represent

excellent values. If you have yet to be introduced to Rhone Wines, you would be well advised to begin here. Mathes' selections can be found in many area wine shops.

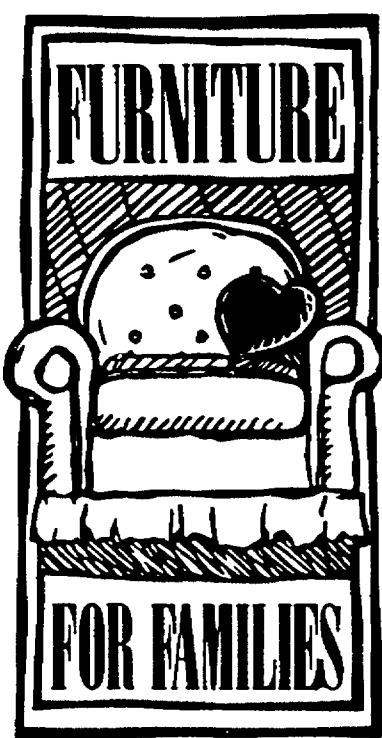
The wines of the southern Rhone are perfect for heartier-style meals like a French cassoulet or Beef Burgundy.

# 'Surprise chef' makes social event special

1 ½ cup cream-style cottage cheese  
1 cup shredded Swiss cheese  
2 tablespoons flour  
¼ teaspoon dried basil, crushed  
¼ teaspoon garlic powder  
4 eggs  
Nonstick spray coating

For crust, spray 48 1½ inch muffin cups with non-stick spray coating. Sprinkle bread crumbs onto bottom and sides of cups to coat. Set aside.

In a mixing bowl, combine cream cheese, cottage cheese, Swiss cheese, flour, basil and garlic powder. Beat with electric mixer on medium speed until just fluffy. Add eggs, beat on low speed just till combined. Do not overbeat.

Fill each bread crumb-lined muffin cup with one tablespoon of the cheese mixture. Bake at 375 degrees in a preheated oven for 15 minutes or until center appears set. (Tarts will puff during baking, then deflate as they cool.) Cool in pans on wire racks for 10 minutes. Remove tarts from pans. Cool thoroughly on wire racks.

If you do not have 48 muffin cup pans and are working with a smaller number, the mixture can be prepared for all 48. Using the pans you have, after removing finished tarts for final cooling, cool pan in water, completely dry and repeat until all filling is used.

## MICHIGAN AUTUMN SALAD

2 heads romaine lettuce, julienned 1-inch thick  
1 head bibb lettuce, julienned 1-inch thick  
2 heads Belgium endive, julienned thin strips  
4 carrots, peeled, julienned 1-inch strips  
1 cup chopped walnuts  
2 cups dried cherries

Retain 12 firm, clean leaves of the bib lettuce for garnish, wash, pat dry and set aside for use at the dinner house. Wash, and pat dry and prepare the remaining letuces and carrots. Toss together in a large bowl. Chill well.

**Dressing**  
¼ cup sugar  
¼ cup salad oil  
¼ cup white wine vinegar  
2 teaspoons salt  
3 large cloves of garlic, crushed and minced fine (mince garlic in salt, salt will absorb oils)  
1 tablespoon finely grated onion

Place all ingredients in blender. Blend together well. Refrigerate overnight.

At the dinner house, arrange the bibb leaf on a chilled salad plate. Add dressing to remaining salad in bowl, do not over wet salad, toss gently. Divide between salad plates. Sprinkle salads with walnuts and dried cherries. Serve immediately. Serve remaining dressing in side dish for passing.

## GLAZED, APPLE-SAGE STUFFED PORK CHOPS

12 pork chops (one inch thick), cut with pocket for stuffing  
1 cup water  
1 cup finely diced apples (2 medium Granny Smith)  
5 slices dried white bread, cubed ½ inches (set out slices three hours before preparing stuffing)  
¼ cup finely diced onion  
¼ cup finely diced celery stalks  
¼ teaspoon ground sage  
¼ teaspoon salt  
¼ teaspoon pepper

Combine apples, bread, onion and seasonings in bowl, mix together well. Mix in water until all is absorbed by stuffing. Spoon stuffing lightly into pork chop pockets. Arrange in 9x13 baking dishes, 6 chops per dish (pretreat baking dish with non-stick spray.) Cover dishes tightly with aluminum foil.

(Transfer to dinner house for cooking, within three hours of dinner.)

Hostess, keep baking dishes covered tightly with foil. And let pork chops set out until room temperature. Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees. At 6:30 p.m. place pork chops in oven to cook. About 8:15, remove pork chops from oven, remove foil and discard. Carefully turn over chops keeping all stuffing in chop. Bake for additional 45 minutes at 350 degrees. Brush chops with glaze once

every five minutes for the last 15 minutes. Turn off and leave pork chops in oven with door closed until ready to serve.

## Glaze

2 cups apple juice  
4 tablespoons sugar  
4 tablespoons A-1 Steak Sauce  
Combine juice, sugar and steak sauce in small saucepan. Over low heat, simmer stirring constantly until sugar completely dissolved. Simmer covered for ¼ hour, reducing sauce by ¼ of original volume.  
(Sauce can be cooled and reheated with dinner.)  
Preparation time is about one hour.

## SPINACH FETTUCCINE WITH PARMESAN AND GARLIC

2 12 ounce packages spinach fettuccine  
¼ cup grated Parmesan  
½ cup butter (one stick)

Add pasta to large pot of boiling water. Stir to ensure pasta does not stick to bottom of pot. After water returns to boil, test in 2 to 3 minutes. Do not overcook, pasta should be al-dente, tender but firm to the bite. Drain in colander. Dry pot, return to stove, add butter and melt over medium heat. Add pasta and Parmesan cheese on top. Toss well to coat all fettuccine. Cover pot to keep warm, toss before serving.

Place serving of fettuccine on dinner plate, sprinkle lightly with garlic croutons.

**Garlic croutons**  
4 slices white bread (no crust)  
¼ cup butter (½ stick)  
2¼ tablespoons garlic powder

Finely crumble bread in bowl, add garlic powder and mix. In medium skillet melt butter over medium high heat. Add bread crumbs, stir to coat all crumbs with butter. Sauté until light golden brown. Remove from heat and store in bowl until needed. Microwave on high for 30 seconds before serving.

## CAULIFLOWER AU GRATIN

Sesame Vegetable topping  
4 tablespoons oil  
4 tablespoons finely-chopped onion  
4 tablespoons sesame seed  
1 cup buttery round cracker crumbs

Heat oil in small skillet. Add onion, sauté over moderate heat until tender-crisp. Add sesame seed. Cook stirring constantly, 1 minute. Remove from heat, stir in cracker crumbs. Set aside to use later.

2 large or three cauliflower (fresh)  
1 cup water  
1 medium tomato, peeled, seeded and chopped  
2 teaspoon dried parsley flakes  
4 tablespoons oil  
4 tablespoons all-purpose flour  
¼ teaspoon salt  
¼ teaspoon pepper  
2 cup milk  
2 cup shredded cheddar cheese (about 8 ounces)

Cut cauliflower to bite size flower buds (8 cups), rinse and clean. Bring water to rolling boil in vegetable steamer add cauliflower to cover and steam till tender but still crunchy. About two minutes, depending on size of steamer and amount of cauliflower being cooked. Do not overfill steamer.

Remove cauliflower immediately from steamer and put in large oven-proof bowl pre-coated with nonstick cooking spray. Add remaining cauliflower to steamer, repeat until all is cooked. Lightly stir in tomato and parsley.

In small pan blend oil, flour, salt and pepper until smooth. Slowly stir in milk. Cook over moderate heat, stirring constantly until thickened and bubbly. Add cheese, stir until cheese melts. Sauce will have a creamy texture. Pour over cauliflower mixture. Sprinkle with Sesame Vegetable Topping. Bake in preheated oven at 350 degrees 25 to 30 minutes or until bubbly. Reheat at dinner house in microwave.

## AMARETTO CHEESECAKE

4 tablespoons butter (at room temperature)  
¼ cup finely ground Italian macaroon cookie crumbs (Vicerzi - Amaretto d'Italia)

2 pounds cream cheese (at room temperature)  
¼ cup fresh lemon juice  
1 tablespoon amaretto liqueur  
1½ teaspoons grated orange rind  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1½ cups granulated sugar  
4 large eggs (at room temperature, slightly beaten)

Place oven rack in center of oven, heat to 325 degrees. Coat bottom sides and ends of a 9x5x3-inch metal loaf pan with butter. Melt 2 tablespoons of butter in small sauce pan, in small bowl mix butter with coolie crumbs. Place ¼ cup of the crumbs in pan, tilt and turn pan to evenly coat bottom, sides and ends with crumbs. Gently press crumbs into place. Refrigerate pan while preparing batter.

Cut cream cheese into 1-inch cubes, place in large mixing bowl, beat at medium speed until completely smooth. Continue beating while slowly adding lemon juice, liqueur, orange rind and vanilla, scraping down sides as needed.

Beat until mixture is smooth. Continue beating cheese mixture at medium speed while very slowly adding sugar, beat until sugar is absorbed. Continue beating while slowly adding eggs, about ¼ cup at a time, beating well and scraping down sides of bowl after each addition.

Quickly dust inside of prepared pan with 2 tablespoons of the remaining crumbs. Pour batter into pan. Tap gently on counter to settle batter. Place pan in a larger rectangular baking pan. Add hot tap water to larger pan of depth of 1 ½ inches. Carefully place pans in oven. Bake until center of cake is just set and edges are slightly brown, about 1 hour and 15 minutes.

Carefully remove pans together from oven. Let loaf pan stand in hot water for 20 minutes. Remove loaf pan from water, transfer to wire rack in cool place away from drafts. Let cool undisturbed until sides and bottom are completely cooled, four to five hours. Do not refrigerate cake in loaf pan. To unmold cheesecake, tilt loaf pan onto side to loosen cake and form air pocket between cake and pan (it should not be necessary to use a knife). Center serving platter on top of platter on counter once or twice, lift off pan.

Refrigerate cake uncovered until firm, about 4 hours. Cover cake loosely with plastic wrap and refrigerate at least six hours. Before serving, sprinkle cake with remaining crumbs, filling in any wet spots. Cover cake loosely with plastic wrap for delivery to dessert house.

## GIANT STRAWBERRY FLAN

### Pie crust:

Prepare your standard double pie crust. On floured surface roll pastry into a 13 inch circle, fit into a 12 inch pizza pan. Trim and flute edges, making pie about ½ inch deep, prick pastry with fork. Bake in a preheated oven at 450 degrees 12 to 14 minutes. Pastry should be golden brown on edges.

**Cream cheese filling**  
2 cups milk  
1 ¾ ounce custard dessert mix by Jell-o  
1 8-ounce cream cheese (cut into cubes)  
¼ teaspoon vanilla

In medium saucepan combine milk and vanilla pudding. Cook and stir until mixture comes to a rolling boil. Remove from heat. Stir in cream cheese and vanilla. Using rotary beater, beat until smooth and creamy. Cool 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.

### Fruit:

2 cups of halved strawberries (washed with tops removed)  
1 8-ounce can peach slices (drained)  
1 medium Kiwi Fruit (peeled and sliced)

### Fruit glaze:

2 tablespoons sugar  
1 tablespoon cornstarch  
¼ teaspoon ground mace  
¾ cup orange juice  
¾ cup currant jelly

In small saucepan combine sugar, cornstarch and mace. Stir in juice, add jelly. Cook and stir until bubbly. Cook 2 minutes more stirring constantly. Cool to room temperature.

When crust is cool, spoon cream cheese filling onto pastry, smooth with spatula. Refrigerate 20 minutes or until firm. Arrange fruit on top, with two rows of strawberries on outside edge, a fan ring of peach slices then fill center with the Kiwi slices. Spoon glaze over fruit. Refrigerate for three hours minimum.

## CHOCOLATE SIN

10 ounce semisweet chocolate, broken into small pieces.

¼ cup butter (1 stick, cut into 8 pieces)  
6 large eggs, separated, at room temperature  
1 cup granulated sugar  
2 tablespoons Kahlua liquor  
¼ teaspoon vanilla  
1½ cups whipping cream, well chilled  
3 tablespoons powdered sugar  
¼ teaspoon cream of tartar  
Spray non-stick cooking oil  
Flour

Place oven rack on lower third of oven, heat to 375 degrees. Spray well and flour bottom and sides of an 8-inch springform pan, set aside.

Slowly, melt chocolate with ¼ cup butter in double boiler with simmer water in bottom to keep chocolate warm by removing both pans from heat, yet keeping chocolate in upper pan, covered.

Beat egg yolks in large mixer bowl at high speed, gradually adding ¼ cup of the granulated sugar. Beat until yolk mixture is pale yellow and thick, four to six minutes. On medium speed slowly add chocolate mixture to the yolk mixture, beat until completely smooth. Add Kahlua and vanilla, beat until blended.

Beat egg whites and cream of tartar in medium mixing bowl at high speed until soft peak form. Gradually beat remaining ¾ cup granulated sugar into whites, gently but thoroughly into chocolate mixture. Pour batter evenly into reserved pan. Smooth top.

Bake for 15 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees and bake another 15 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 250 degrees and cook for 30 minutes longer. (Total baking time is one hour.) Turn off oven, prop open oven door and allow cake to remain in oven for 30 minutes. Remove cake from oven and cover top with damp paper toweling, let stand for five minutes. Remove toweling and cool cake completely on wire rack. Dome of cake will crack and collapse slightly, this is normal. Remove cake from springform, run knife around edge of pan and release. Remove cake from springform pan and transfer to serving platter. Dust top of cake with powdered sugar.

Whip cream in chilled mixing bowl on high speed until soft peaks form. Continue beating, gradually adding 1 ½ tablespoons of the powdered sugar, until soft peaks form. Serve cake at room temperature with whipped cream.

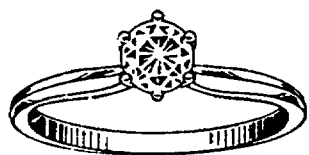

The latest Barney is a foam-rubber, purple-lycra dinosaur, former star of children's home video, future star of PBS' *Barney & Friends*, a weekday series premiering Monday, April 6.

Appearing on the playground in a puff of glitter and smoke, Barney is summoned whenever his little human buddies are in need of some serious entertainment, which, in the case of preschoolers, is every other second. Fueled by either a box of chocolate cupcakes or supernatural enthusiasm, David Joyner, the man in the Barney suit, and the show's young performers dance, sing and whoop it up in a classroom and schoolyard setting for the entire 30 minutes.

Program themes deal squarely with what it means to be 3, 4 and 5 years old, with little acknowledgement of adults, either as viewers or on-screen role

models. In fact, anyone over the age of 7 will feel left out. This show belongs to the little ones; it's the private property of an age group that can claim few other things on television as their own.

## **Whitfield, Van Peebles head good ensemble**

On March 12, 1926, in the middle of that cultural flowering known as the "Harlem Renaissance," the Savoy Ballroom opened its doors. Like the Cotton Club, the Savoy was a haven for black musicians, singers and dancers, and instrumental to the careers of entertainers like Ella Fitzgerald and bandleader Chick Webb. Its closing in 1958 truly marked the end of an era.

Now, the sophisticated ballroom comes back to life in "Stompin' at the Savoy," premiering Sunday, April 12, on CBS. Directed by Debbie Allen, the film is set in the years just before World War II and focuses on four young women whose lives are punctuated by cherished

nights spent at the Savoy.

"During the Depression," says Actor Michael Warren, "the Savoy was one of those surreal places that, when you walked in, whatever was happening outside those doors ceased to exist." Warren appears as Calvin Hunter, a ruthless entrepreneur ("opportunistic slimeball," the actor laughs) who determines to romance Pauline, an aspiring singer played by Vanessa Williams.

Lynn Whitfield ("The Josephine Baker Story") plays Esther, whose romance with handsome restaurateur Walter Turner (Mario Van Peebles) is secondary to her fierce determination to open her

own beauty salon. Jasmine Guy is Alice, a country girl in love with New York and a guy named Ernest, played by Darnell Williams. Vanessa Bell Calloway completes the quartet as Dorothy, a mild-mannered housekeeper unprepared for interracial romance with successful white actor Bill Jerome (John Di Aquino).

The Savoy, itself almost another character in the film, is the scene of several enjoyable musical sequences. When it came to choreography, Allen deferred to Norma Miller and Frankie Manning, two of the original Savoy dancers and founders of the New York Swing Dance Society.

Actress/singer Dawnn Lewis, a longtime Allen associate on "A Different World," appears as jazz great Ella Fitzgerald. For Lewis, playing the inimitable, innovative singer was an unforgettable experience.

"They were well into shooting," Lewis says, "and Debbie called me and said, 'I need a favor.'" Lewis admits that playing Fitzgerald was intimidating, particularly on short notice. Still, she leapt at the chance, and familiarity with the music was no problem. "As soon as I hung up the phone, I went over to my CDs and cassettes. I've got Ella forever."

In Warren's estimation, the "Stompin'" script written by Beverly Sawyer, "really warranted being a feature film." He credits Allen with assembling "an exquisite cast on a shoestring budget," and says costumers and art direction people "went to great pains to duplicate the period."

Costumes and period details, of course, do not a movie make. "Stompin' at the Savoy" is at its best when doing just that: swinging and dancing to the timeless music for which the club was known. Less engaging, however, are scenes advancing the four intertwining stories, which seem to lack energy and aim. Of the actors, only Whitfield, Van Peebles and Warren consistently deliver urgency and appeal.

**Q: My son, who has cerebral palsy, is a great fan of Garth Brooks. He's learned a lot of his songs and sings them all the time. Where can I write to him? **A:** For basic fan information, you can write to Garth Brooks Fan Club International, 27 Music Square East, Suite 172, Nashville, Tenn., 37203. But in this instance, I would suggest you write to him in care of Doyle-Lewis Management, 1109 17th Ave. South, Nashville, Tenn., 37212. This is his management group and they will probably be able to get you a faster response. Other fans, please use his fan club address as their office will no doubt turn the mail over to the fan club anyway. And if Doyle-Lewis Management is flooded with mail, it will only slow down the response time to this letter.

**Q: I am writing to say that I would like to see the two television shows Matlock and In the Heat of the Night continue. Both are great family shows with a lesson for all of us ... a show the whole family can watch.**

**A:** Enough noise was made about these two shows being canceled by NBC to prompt other networks to sit up and take notice. ABC has picked up *Matlock* and CBS will air *In the Heat of the Night*.

**Q: Will you explain to me why the television stations have so many problems? They go off the air for a week with no explanation. This morning, the three major stations flashed off and on. This happens so often, I decided to write. The other stations have also had problems.** —M.A., Madelia, Minn.

**A:** It sounds like this is not the problem of the actual television stations but a problem at your cable company, at least the stations flashing on and off. As far as the three networks are concerned, their signals reach your area by satellite transmission, and are then broadcast through the air waves by the local affiliate and/or sent out over cable lines by your local cable company. The networks' satellite feeds can be interrupted by various causes, but if more than one station is affected, most likely your cable supplier is having satellite reception or coaxial transmission difficulties. If you are not a cable customer, you may be having problems with your antenna or live in an area where the combination of elevated terrain and bad weather can cause poor reception. When local TV stations go off for a week or more, it's probably a problem with their transmitter. When these problems occur, call your cable supplier or the local stations involved.

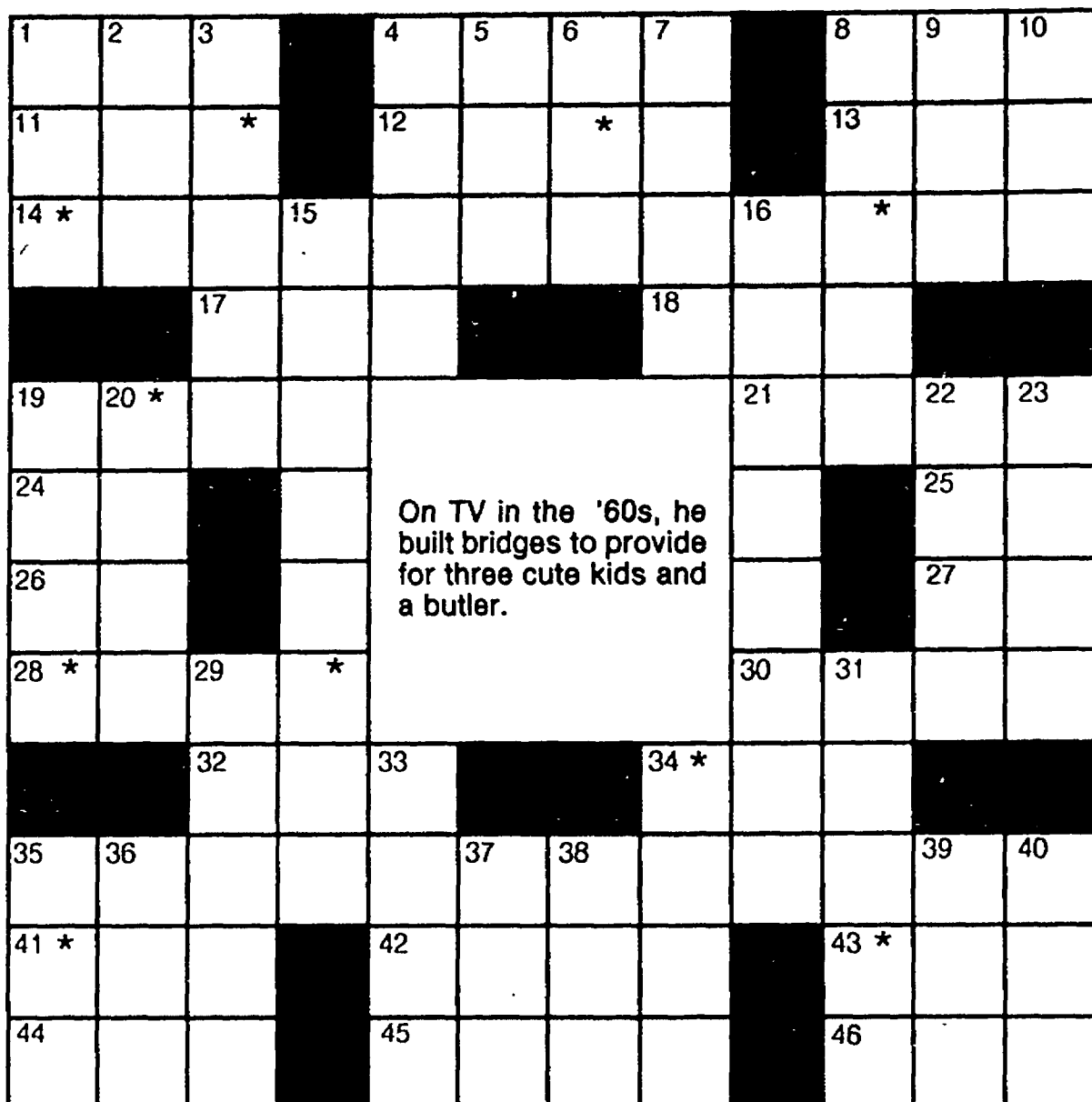
