# City hearing on cable tomorrow

Northville City residents can get a direct line to their cable company at 8 p.m. tomorrow, April 14. That's when the Northville City Council has scheduled a special public hearing to gather public input on the service provided by Omnicom of Michigan.

The hearing will be held in city council chambers at Northville City Hall, 215 W. Main St. Omnicom's general manager, Lisa Boland, will be on hand to brief the council about the company and hear what residents

have to say.

A similar hearing in Northville Township in January drew complaints from about nine residents on high rates, signal loss and poor customer service.

Omnicom raised its basic rate 7 percent to \$21.50 in January, citing increased company costs for stations like The Discovery Channel, MTV, VH-1 and Nickelodeon. The rate hike amounted to a 4.5-percent increase for the average customer, who pays for premium channels as well, Boland said.

Tomorrow's hearing is the first of

three steps needed to renegotiate the 15-year cable contract that grants Omnicom exclusive rights to offer cable service in the city. That contract expires in December 1994.

City officials agreed Feb. 24 to buy into a Canton proposal to hire Muntcon, a New York-based legal firm, to renegotiate the contract.

The council authorized the city's administration to pay up to \$10,000 for Muntcon's legal services. The agreement came after Canton restructured its proposed fees for Muntcon, from a flat fee to one based partly on cable subscribership.

Under the flat fee, Canton would have paid the same amount as smaller communities like Northville.

Northville Township officials had decided earlier to wait a year before deciding whether to sign on with Muntcon. The township's cable contract expires August 1994.

Northville City houses about 6 percent, and Northville Township about 18 percent, of Omnicom's 25,500 customers in the Northville-Plymouth-Canton area. Canton Township houses the highest share of Omnicom's customers, with over 11,000.

# Omnicom survey shows satisfaction

A city-requested survey by Omnicom of Michigan found the majority of the city's residents satisfied with the cable company's service.

Omnicom, which performed the telephone survey at the request of the Northville City Council, released its results Friday. The survey was based on calls to 161 city residents, 87 of whom agreed to participate.

Of those 87 cable subscribers, 68 residents — 78 percent — rated Omnicom overall as good to excellent. While two residents rated the company as poor, 13 gave it excellent ratings, with the rest of the responses falling in between.

A survey of residents' attitudes toward Omni-

com's representatives found a similar level of satisfaction, with residents most pleased by installation representatives.

About 80 percent of the respondents were satisfied with the reliability of Omnicom's cable equipment, while more than 85 percent were satisfied with the quality of cable reception.

More than 92 percent of the residents who had experienced cable problems were satisfied with the company's responsiveness.

One area where Omnicom drew criticism was in the time it took to contact the company after hours and on weekends. While 77 percent of the respondents were satisfied with the time required during business hours, only 35 percent were satisfied after business hours. Only 36 percent were happy

with their efforts to reach the company on the weekend.

The survey also focused on subscribers' viewing habits, and found more than 90 percent satisfied with the quality and variety of Omnicom's programming.

City residents are keeping their eyes on world events and the entertainment industry, with CNN the most watched channel and HBO a close second. ESPN, USA Network, The Discovery Channel and Nickelodeon also garnered a few votes apiece as the most watched channels.

Omnicom's most-requested channels not now offered were World Monitor and The Sports Channel, followed by E! Television, The Travel Channel, Comedy Network and Sci-Fi Channel.

# Board to decide on Holloway

The Planning Commission verdicts are in, after a year of debate. Now the Township Board will serve as judge and jury on Holloway Sand & Gravel Co.'s asphalt plant and sand and gravel mining proposals.

The township board last Thursday targeted April 30 as a public hearing date for the final local step in the Holloway review.

The board will hold public hearings at 7 p.m. that evening for Holloway's asphalt plant and sand and

gravel applications.

After the public hearing, the board will meet to review the applications, hear expert testimony from township and Holloway hired guns, and render a decision on the 177-acre development plans targeted for Six Mile and Ridge roads.

The board most likely will follow the recommendations of its planning commission — the commission last month rejected both Holloway plans — but will not just rubber-stamp the decisions, said Carol Maise, town-

# Police seeking suspect in rape

A former apartment complex maintenance worker is being sought in connection with a violent rape last week in Northville Township.

Police want to question a white male, 25-30 years old, 6 feet tall and up to 200 pounds; in the April 8 rape of a Silver Springs Drive resident. Police said their top suspect is a maintenance worker who left his job at the Swan Harbour Apartments complex within the last two to three weeks.

The man had work-related contact with the 24-year-old woman in the past, police said. The victim's statements to police and evidence that pass keys may have been used to enter the victim's apartment have led police to focus on the former maintenance man, said township police Capt. Philip Presnell.

The victim indicated it may be a former maintenance worker of the apartment complex, he said.

Police have not located the man and have not interviewed any other

# Township teddies help kids in danger

Can a savage beast save the fears of a frightened child?

Perhaps not, but township police and fire officials are hoping that a more modest animal — a teddy bear — will do the trick.

Township emergency workers have augmented their supply of pistols, handcuffs and firehoses with a softer approach of late. They're carrying little bears, sometimes called "Trauma Teddys" on their rounds these days.

The bears are used in traumatic or emergency situations. The idea being that children will readily accept a cuddly friend in times of stress, said Paula Sherman, township fire department administrative assistant.

"When a child is hurting, holding a teddy bear reduces stress," Sherman said. "It takes the child's mind off their injury."

The teddy bear program works,

and is in use across the state and nation, Sherman said. The township's shipment of bears is courtesy of the Telephone Pioneers of America, a volunteer group staffed by Michigan Bell retirees.

Emergency workers could find a number of reasons to hand out the

bears, including injuries to the child or family member, or in a situation where the child may have been the victim of some form of abuse, Sherman said.

To a child, clutching a teddy bear is usually preferable to answering questions from a big adult in a uni-

form. In such a case, the bear is there to break the ice, Sherman said.

"It's really for any age child and any situation," she said. "It's meant to be a calming (influence) for the child, and we thought it was a service we can provide."

# Word on the street for vote: variable

If results of a candid sidewalk survey taken last Wednesday are any indication of taxpayers' mindset, school district officials have at least two votes from area seniors but have lot more campaigning to do to sell their tax hike to the younger crowd.

Residents informally polled last week on the streets of downtown Northville had mixed responses to the school district millage proposal on the ballot for an April 28 special election. Voters will cast ballots on a one-year, 25.41-mill tax for school operations. That's a 2.78-mill increase over the current levy.

Of the 10 people randomly selected, some were committed to the idea, some were still undecided, others said they hadn't received enough information on the matter, and still others weren't even aware of the upcoming election.

Loyal millage backers like Beth Bischof and Jenny Watson, both senior citizens, said they've always supported school millage proposals and this election would be no different.

"I feel every child is deserving of a good education," Bischof said. "I don't think they are getting as good of an education as they could be at the current millage rate."

Bischof, who moved to Northville four years ago, said even though she didn't have any children in the district, she has always supported district millages.

"I've always supported millage," Watson said. "I guess everybody needs a good education; it's hard

finding a job now. It's kind of a large increase, but it's better than nothing."

For Lenore Monticello, declaring her stance for or against the millage proposal would have been premature.

"I think I need to look at it real close," the mother of two boys said. "I really didn't know there was an election coming up, so I'm really still out on it."

Since her sons, Andrew 4, and Jeffrey 1, are not yet enrolled in the school system, Monticello admits she hasn't followed school finance all that closely. But she added that since

Andrew will be enrolled in Amerman Elementary next fall, school funding is more of a priority.

"I think if the school really needs the money, I would support it, but I really haven't taken a close look at it," she said.

Pat Rossing, an employee at Genetti's Hole-in-the-Wall, said the issue hit her home when both of her kids at the high school came home and said because of the financial situation, field trips had been cut.

"The kids came home and said we just can't take any more field trips," she said.

Cutbacks in school field trips isn't reason enough for her to justify a yes or no vote for the 12 percent increase, Rossing said.

"They obviously feel they need the money, but I really don't know what the cuts are for. I really haven't decided one way or the other."

For Hugh Jordan the tax increase would show up on his rent bill rather than a property tax bill. Jordan, who rents an apartment in downtown, said even though he isn't a homeowner he would still be adversely impacted by a tax hike.

"My landlord would raise my rent if his taxes went up," the former police officer said. "It's expensive. It's getting to the point where it's getting too expensive to live in town."

Jordan, like many others surveyed, said the cost of living in Northville is shooting upward. An anticipated increase in the city tax rate, coupled with the proposed 2.78-mill school increase, has some residents, like Jordan, worried about the cost of living in Northville. If the number of "for sale" signs around the city and township is any indication of the creeping costs, then Jordan said he will be forced to look for a cheaper place to live.

"I don't want to move, but it's really getting expensive. Have you seen how many houses are for sale around here? For people who are on a fixed income, you more or less have to trade this off for a place you can afford."

# Restaurant owner foils armed robbery attempt

The owner of a local restaurant foiled an armed robbery attempt early last Thursday by screaming for help and running away from his assailant.

Township police said a lone gunman stepped from a dumpster outside the rear of Cindy's Coney Island, 43261 Seven Mile, in the Highland Lakes Shopping Plaza and confronted the 59-year-old store owner.

But before the robber could demand cash, the restaurant owner began to yell for police and dashed away. The suspect then reportedly shouted, "I'll shoot you; don't scream."

The owner did not stop and both men eventually fled in opposite directions, police said.

Police said the suspect is described as a white male in his 20s, approximately 6', who reportedly wore a light blue or white waist-length jacket. The suspect carried a handgun during the 5:20 a.m. robbery attempt, police

said.

The owner ran into Seven Mile and attempted to flag down motorists, without success, police said. He finally ran to the Mobil Gas Station at the Seven Mile and Northville Road intersection to call police.

Police said the suspect ran south of the restaurant into a wooded area after the confrontation with the owner. Police searched the area and could not locate the suspect, but did discover evidence of his flight.

A tracking dog from the Van Buren Township Police

Department reportedly followed a fresh trail to Innisbrook Apartments, and then lost the scent, police said. Innisbrook Apartments is located east of the restaurant on Seven Mile.

Police do not believe the robbery attempt is related to Wednesday's rape incident at nearby Swan Harbor Apartments.

Police are asking anyone with information on the attempted armed robbery to contact the township police department at 349-9400.

suspects, Presnell said.

During her statement to police, the victim painted a portrait of a violent, hour-long assault during the early morning hours last Wednesday, Presnell said.

The suspect reportedly duct-taped the victim's apartment door peephole, as well as the peephole of an apartment across the hall from the victim's, police said. He then may have used a pass key to open the main door lock, and some type of wire cutting tool to slice a door chain on the victim's apartment.

The attacker then reportedly entered the sleeping woman's bedroom and jumped on her waterbed. The woman reportedly told police she was awakened by wave motion on the

waterbed. She screamed, she told police, and the man struggled with her, attempting to cover her mouth.

He eventually bound the victim with duct tape and repeatedly raped her, forcing her to perform oral sex as well, Presnell said. At one point, the woman's young child responded to her mother's struggles and entered the rape scene.

The suspect "told her to order the kid back in her room or he'd kill them both," Presnell said. The man then continued to assault the woman, and reportedly rubbed a long-bladed knife along her body during the rape.

Finally, the man walked to one of the apartment's two bathrooms and turned on a shower. The woman said she then heard water running in a second bathroom and the attacker gathered sheets and blankets from the bed and threw them in the

bath tub.

Police said the man then returned to the bedroom, grabbed the woman, and dragged her into the bathroom, where he threw her too into the bathtub.

The woman finally freed herself from the duct tape constraints and called police, Presnell said.

Police are awaiting results from the Michigan State Police Crime Lab, but feel they have some solid evidence. Presnell indicated that police "have located fingerprints at the scene," although the suspect apparently did wipe down his fingerprints on the front door when he left the apartment.

A nationwide alert has been issued for the suspect, police said.

Police are asking anyone with information in this crime to call the police department at 349-9400.

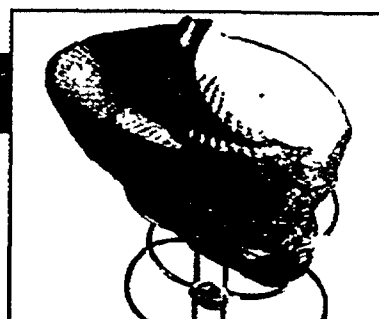

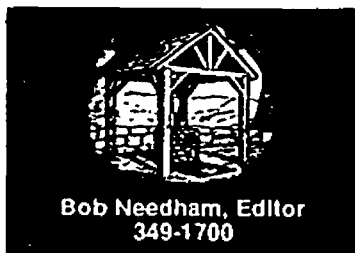

### Some DDA expansion may be worthwhile

Northville's Downtown Development Authority is seeking to extend its control over the city's commercial future.

While the idea does have some merit, the actual proposal may go too far.

The DDA has proposed extending its boundaries to include the former Northville Ford Plant, Northville Downs and Northville Driving Club property south of Cady Street, and the semicircle of land east of Griswold Street between South Main and the commercial land just north of Beal.

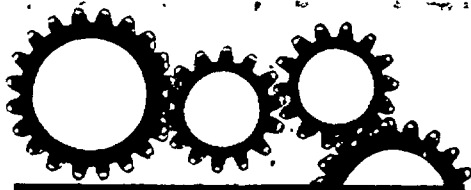
Including the Ford Plant within an expanded DDA district, it is argued by the DDA and city council alike, would place an additional level of city control over redevelopment of that site. That argument makes sense.

And inclusion of the proposed Cady Street parking deck also makes sense, as does inclusion of the relocated Cady Street that would curve around the deck.

But the DDA proposal also shows the district expanding to include what little industrial development that Northville has in its downtown, namely businesses like Foundry Flak.

DDA Member Mike Allen asked a very basic question about the proposal that may otherwise have been missed: What does inclusion in a DDA district, and possible streetscape improvements like brick walks and lampposts, do to benefit a business like Foundry Flak? It's a good question, and one that had other DDA members stumped.

And members of the planning commission, when asked to comment on the proposed expansion, warned that it may be premature. We hope the DDA heeds

the warning.

The planners were concerned that a more detailed plan had not been developed for the expansion area. They argued forcefully that the DDA should define in greater detail what it wants from an expanded district, and how the expansion would impact surrounding areas.

Several also disputed assertions made in planning consultant Don Wortman's short study of the proposal. They questioned Wortman's assertion that the expansion "will not impact upon established residential areas" and "is consistent (with) the recently adopted Master Plan."

One item not in dispute is that an expansion could raise additional funds for public improvements like streetscape renovations and parking improvements.

But those funds would be shaved off the top of the city's already-squeezed tax base, and the impact such tax capturing would have on the rest of the city's budget and Northville Public Schools must be assessed.

Like the DDA's previous consideration of a 2-mill levy on the businesses within its district, this proposal, and its impact, deserves much more scrutiny before it comes to pass.

## Racism doesn't explain it all



Things were going marvelously in the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments' attack on "urban sprawl" when somebody blundered.

SEMCOG's steering committee came up with the notion that race is "the dominant social factor" influencing urban sprawl — the paving over of green fields in excess of the region's population growth.

The idea was expressed as an insulting accusation. Politicos in Oakland, western Wayne, Macomb and Livingston counties saw red. And now an otherwise excellent program is in grave danger.

The attack on sprawl — called Regional Development Initiative in SEMCOG bureaucratese — was prompted by the two-million-square-foot Auburn Mills Megamall project northeast of Pontiac.

In 1989 the council in a little city that most people didn't know existed approved a project that would soak up enormous amounts of road money, screw up wetlands, generate traffic across neighboring towns and endanger the health of existing shopping areas.

Everyone seemed to memorize the numbers trotted out by the SEMCOG staff: Uncontrolled development in 20 years would eat up 40 percent more land for a 6 percent population growth.

Outlying communities attacked not only the racial remark but began revising the entire report. Many saw "loss of home rule" as the result of RDI.

Oakland County commissioners came up with their own report. Executive candidate L. Brooks Patterson saw a plot to

stifle northern Oakland's growth. Plymouth Township saw the whole RDI study as flawed. Novi and points west went on the attack. Northville Township's Richard Allen spoke out against the allegation of racism.

Some smelled radical socialism — although, in truth, any containment of sprawl is really conserving existing development and holding down taxes.

Mackinac Center, the conservative Midland-based think tank, noted the RDI report ignored a major problem in Detroit — its enormous taxes.

Detroit soaks its people 90 mills of property taxes versus far less in the suburbs. Moreover, Detroit taxes income, utilities — anything that moves. People want to put their scarce mortgage dollars into housing, not taxes. One can hardly accuse the middle-class blacks leaving Detroit of racism.

Mackinac Center praises one element of the RDI: using scarce federal and state dollars to rehabilitate existing infrastructure instead of building new roads, water mains, sewers, sidewalks and public lighting. Suburbanites should heed that message.

Racism exists, though its extent can be exaggerated in a state which has a liberal constitution, a Civil Rights Commission, an open housing law, a fair employment law and vocal minority groups to seek their enforcement.

We need to conserve land and use our taxes wisely. But the SEMCOG steering committee's blunder has insulted so many potential supporters that one fears it may subvert the attack on a genuine enemy — urban sprawl.

## Firm named to design Beck park

Northville is two steps closer — nay, two giant leaps closer — to developing its Beck Road recreation property.

The 39-acre parcel on the west side of Beck between Five Mile and Six Mile has sat vacant for years, riddled by claims of mismanagement and recreation fund shortages. But a true park plan may finally be in sight.

Recreation commissioners last week recommended that the township board and city council accept a Lansing firm's \$10,944 bid to design the troubled park site. Last Thursday, the township board approved hiring Snell Environmental to develop design and construction documents for the Beck Road park.

The city council will mull the recommendation this evening (April 13).

Snell Environmental is expected to have its design and construction plans completed within 60 days. The recreation department will request construction bids at that time, said Traci Gottschalk, Northville Parks and Recreation director.

"They seem to think all their documents will be ready by mid-June,"

Gottschalk said. "They will be doing everything we requested . . . We're going to get exactly what we want."

Snell will follow an 18-point set of guidelines for the park, which will include designs for a two-phase development. Actual 1992 construction will be limited to phase one, which includes three soccer fields and two baseball fields, as well as a parking facility.

Parks and Recreation sent out 16 requests for proposals to area firms, and six answered, Gottschalk said. Bids ranged from Snell's \$10,944 offer to \$22,400. Snell's references from Muskegon, Pontiac and Greencastle, Ind. checked out, prompting the choice, she said.

Construction bids are expected to come in between \$150,000-200,000. Park development will be paid for through a user fee account, and the community may secure a loan to pay for any shortcoming.

The Beck Road park has been beset by problems for years. The most recent headache was the revelation that thousands of dollars in user fees had been misspent on faulty design plans.

But Gottschalk hopes the troubles are all in the past.

ship planning and zoning administrator.

"The planning commission did the real work; they spent almost a year reviewing this thing," Maise said. "The board is going to be reviewing the application and all the materials submitted."

"They'll use the finding of fact and go from there," she said.

Maise said the township probably will trot out a score of consultants from planning, engineering, noise and dust, assessing, and hydrogeological fields.

Comments and studies by those experts played a key role in the planning commission's decisions to recommend against Holloway.

But Holloway will be armed for bear, too, said company engineer and representative Richard Zanotti.

"It sounds like they're bringing their experts; I guess I'll bring mine," Zanotti said.

Holloway has been frustrated by the lengthy review and perceived de-

lays in the decision-making process, Zanotti said. He hopes the township will reach a decision — one way or another — April 30.

If the board backs the planning commission, both sides know their next meeting likely will be in circuit court.

"Hopefully, we won't have to do that (lawsuit), but I've invested a lot of money," Zanotti said. "I don't think the points they've brought up are points that should reject a sand and gravel plan."

"I think the points could be mitigated," he said.

Planning commissioners faced three options in their review of the Holloway proposals. They recommended denial on both issues, but could have approved or approved with conditions, the latter being Holloway's preference.

The commission opted for denial, citing issues such as potential reduction of property values, noise and dust problems, effect on area water tables, and future site development.

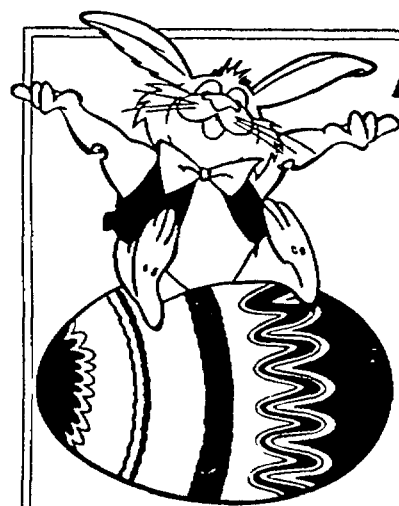

## Marianis take Banfi upscale with new line

The corporate profile of Banfi is straightforward. Banfi entered the winemaking field in 1978 after achieving its mark as an importer.

Founded in 1919, the company introduced the American palate to many of Italy's classic wines and what now may be called the phenomenon of Riunite Lambrusco, which in its mid-1980s stride turned over more than 13 million cases annually.

While Riunite was capturing the palates of many as a young, fresh, fruity pour, Banfi's owners, Americans John and Harry Mariani, were making a huge investment in Tuscany's Montalcino region. They had a dual purpose: to expand their wine line with Banfi-produced world-class Italian wine and to impact the movement to modernize the Italian wine industry.

Today, within the shadow of the medieval fortress town of Montalcino, the Mariani brothers are harvesting rewards from their 7,100-acre Tuscan estate. A broad spectrum of Banfi wines are produced in one of the most modern wineries in the world. It's not just high-tech, it's super technology from computerized crushers to the latest refrigeration units.

Crowning the estate is a restored medieval castle, now called Castello Banfi. Origins of the castle can be traced to the Longobards, a people of Viking descent who occupied the area in the 9th century.

Winemaking is in the able hands of Dr. Ezio Rivella, one of Europe's most respected winemakers. "The Marianis gave me only one job," contends Rivella. "Their stipulation was to produce the best wines in the world and prove that the Italians can match the finest the world can offer." Rivella does admit to an occasional sleepless night!

Banfi's Montalcino location puts it in the winemaking heart of Brunello di Montalcino, one of Italy's most prestigious red wines. Only 10 percent of the estate acreage is devoted to brunello. "There's no chance that we'll flood the market," Rivella maintains. "Knowing that this wine retails with a \$38 ticket, you can better understand this statement."

Banfi owns another winemaking estate in Italy's Piedmont. Wines produced there carry the Banfi Cellars label, while those produced in Montalcino are labeled Castello Banfi.

We recently tasted through the complete Banfi product line and found the following bottlings especially interesting. Like all things Italian, whether it's shoes, leather or wine, the price tag is steep, but the quality is impeccable.

1986 Banfi Brut (\$22.50) is produced by the classic Champagne method from 55 percent pinot noir, 40 percent chardonnay and 5 percent pinot blanc. The latter grape varietal adds grapey notes and seems to hold the other two varietals together while contributing a charming bouquet with roundness and richness. It's fruity, dry and elegant.

Introduced to the U.S. in late 1991, Principessa Gavi Vigna Regale (\$20) comes packaged in a very dark bottle to protect the deli-

# Wolverine Cuisine

Think of the world's great food meccas and you think of Paris, New

York ... and Michigan?

Why not, says Chef Mary Brady of Northville. Brady, a member of the Michigan Culinary team, will be presenting a class at the Les Auteurs School of Cooking this Thursday which focuses on the food of Michigan.

"There's a lot of food indigenous to Michigan," says Brady. "There's fish, wild game, fruits, wine. We're a huge producer of navy beans. Maybe the biggest producer in the country."

Brady explains that fish is her personal favorite of the Michigan specialties. With its 5,000 lakes and rivers — all freshwater — the state is home to many varieties of food fish.

There's bluegill, perch, bass and smelt, but the most prized is Michigan whitefish.

"Whitefish is the most magnificent," says Brady. "I'm not a big fan of whitefish really, but when you can get it fresh, it's very good."

Trout is a big favorite in Michigan, too, and it will be one of the highlights of Brady's class.

"Trout is ironically part of the salmon family," Brady says. "You can tell because it has that same pink flesh, and it's oily like salmon. We have brown, brook, rainbow and lake trout, with the lake trout being the most sought-after."

It is also apparently native to Michigan, as its presence here was recorded by French voyageurs as early as 1687.

The same cannot be said about salmon. Though the small, delicate coho and big, tasty chinook can be found in Michigan waters, they were introduced here, Brady says.

"This is something I didn't know before I started doing my research for this class," Brady says. "They were originally a saltwater fish, brought from the West Coast and stocked in Crystal Lake, but they couldn't live there."

Later, salmon stocking proved successful, but only through the introduction of another non-native species which now makes good eating in Michigan. Smelt were brought to the state to feed the salmon, and only then did the salmon survive.

"When I think of preparing some huge trout or salmon, it's exciting,"

Brady says. "But pollution is a worry. The mercury poisoning is what they're worried about. Mercury settles in the fat cells. But if you cut out all the belly fat carefully, you should technically be all right."

Back on land, Michigan earns its reputation as a food center because it is part of what geographers call the Eastern Heartland. The region includes Illinois, Indiana, Ohio and Pennsylvania, and they are recognized as agriculturally valuable states.

"We are the cherry capital of the world," says Brady. "There are more cherries produced here than anywhere in the world, and all within a few miles of Lake Michigan."

"The climate is what does it. In the spring, the cool air comes in off the lake, and prevents the trees from budding too early and dying from the frost. Other berries are grown throughout Michigan, too, but the number two fruit crop is apples. As a by-product of Michigan's apple crop, it naturally follows that our apple cider carries a great reputation."

The same region that produces those fine Michigan cherries — that is, the area around Traverse City — is also a prime candidate for grape vineyards for the same reasons. The climate and soil content produce wonderful wine grapes. Michigan is the number four wine-producing state in America, behind California, New York and Washington.

"I happen to think Michigan wines are great," Brady says, noting that Michigan wines have both their critics and their devotees.

More mushrooms are what Brady calls "the ultimate mushroom." They're in season right now, but don't go picking them without a guide who can separate them from the poisonous "false morels."

Many garden vegetables are farmed in Michigan, and the state is well known for corn, potatoes, squash and its relatives, beans, tomatoes and cucumbers. In season now, though, are the many varieties of asparagus.

"Asparagus is out right now, and it's wonderful," Brady says. "There's the teeny-tiny pencil grass, and the white asparagus is up now, too."



sausage and deer burgers, Brady says.

Waterfowl and land birds of all varieties can turn up in recipes, with the most prevalent being duck, pheasant, partridge, quail and grouse.

Rabbit is popular among Michigan's families of German heritage, but other small animals are hunted for food as well.

"Surprisingly, squirrel and opossum are eaten in many of the communities in the Upper Peninsula, where they depend on hunting to supplement their groceries," Brady says. "They make a Booyaw Staw, which probably came from the French word bouillon. It's made with meat from the kill, and onions and carrots, but past that there's no set formula. Everyone's is different."

Pencil grass may be unfamiliar to most people, but it comes with Chef Brady's highest recommendation.

"For a while, there, a lot of people were going to the baby vegetables — baby carrots and things like that," Brady says. "But the conjecture among chefs now is that they don't taste as good as the full size vegetables because they haven't had the chance to ripen and mature."

Asparagus is an exception to that rule, she says.

"When the asparagus is smaller, it's less fibrous and much sweeter," Brady says.

Wild game makes up another large segment of Michigan's culinary elements. For obvious reasons, venison is a big favorite, and in some northern communities it's a staple. It appears in pasties, sauerbraten,

## Meetings are for learning? She'll drink to that



It doesn't seem possible that Easter is around the corner. Wasn't last week Christmas? Didn't we just open?

We celebrated our six-month anniversary with a waitress meeting. This was the fourth.

These meetings are a mixture of education, instruction and feedback. Unfortunately the best time to hold our rendezvous are Sunday mornings. After a

grueling weekend, about the last thing any of us wants to do is go to work at 11 a.m. instead of 3 p.m.

But since our goal, as a team, is to provide the best possible service, we plunge in full force. Everything from nuts to bolts is touched upon. Particulars that are important to Tom or me are voiced, and vice versa. For instance, a never-ending scenario is "sidework."

Each wait "person" (I hate that word) is assigned a cleanup duty at the end of the shift. A headwaitress, or "babysitter," makes sure that it is done before they may leave. Good servers (I hate that word, too) consider their station a business for the time they are at work. Whether coming on

duty or leaving, it is their responsibility to check their tables to be sure all is ready. Are the tables, chairs and floors clean? Napkins and silver rolled? Desserts, condiments and soups filled? Butter cut? And on and on.

Many of the tasks are tedious and never noticed by anyone other than ourselves. Especially if the job is not done. For example, rolling silverware is A B O R I N G, M I N D - L E S S chore. But if we run out at any time during business hours, there is a scramble. The system breaks down. On weekends one person stands and rolls during peak hours.

A valid suggestion came up at the meeting: buy more silver and roll ahead of time.

So the next order that came in included mucho bucks in utensils. Problem solved. Life was a little bit easier for all.

The word "station" is somewhat ambiguous. Technically it consists of a number of tables that one is responsible for. My goal is to develop a crew that considers the restaurant as their station. We are on the way. I receive 99 percent positive comments versus the negative for my team. That's a fine compliment to all.

There is always fun built into these affairs. Recently we implemented an extensive beer menu, so a representative from our distributor explained the new additions. Beer is as complex as wine in many ways.

Speaking for myself, I never realized the extensive range of flavors. Being a wine drinker, I've always shunned beer, thinking that "Lite" was as good as it got. What a mistake.

Twenty samples were sipped. All had their own merits, which made for a nice treat. A tool was provided for us to impart our knowledge to our guests. We had fun comparing notes and will continue to do so for days to come.

Happy Easter to a wonderful staff. You are the greatest. And thanks to everyone that makes our jobs worthwhile.

## Oatloaf has Southwest flair

One first prize winner in the second annual Quaker Oats "It's the Right Thing to Do" Recipe Contest gave a healthy new twist to an American classic — meatloaf.

Ellen Burr from Truro, Mass., was determined to make a meatloaf that even her husband would enjoy when she created Zesty Zuni Turkey Loaf. The Pueblo Indians were the inspiration for this good-for-you meatloaf. Burr starts with a mixture of ground turkey, pimiento sauce, corn and spicy seasonings, adding egg whites rather than whole eggs and oats instead of bread or cracker crumbs.

Whole grain oats stretch 1 1/2 pounds of lean ground turkey to serve eight while adding fiber and contributing to the loaf's moist and tender mixture.

A no-cook yogurt sauce flavored with chilies and cilantro replaces the butter and flour-based sauce in

Burr's original recipe while carrying out the Southwestern theme.

### ZESTY ZUNI TURKEY LOAF

**Loaf**  
1 cup Quaker oats (quick or old fashioned, uncooked)  
1 cup pimiento sauce or salsa  
2 egg whites, slightly beaten  
1 1/2 pounds ground turkey  
1 seven-ounce can whole kernel corn, drained (about 1 cup)  
1/2 teaspoon ground cumin  
1/2 teaspoon ground coriander  
1/2 teaspoon dried oregano leaves  
1/2 teaspoon ground sage  
1/2 teaspoon dried thyme leaves  
1/2 teaspoon celery salt (optional)  
2 tablespoons toasted sunflower seeds\* (optional)

**Sauce**  
1 8-ounce carton nonfat or low-fat plain  
1 4-ounce can chopped green chi-

lies, drained  
1/4 cup finely chopped cilantro  
1 teaspoon lime juice  
Heat oven to 350 degrees F. Spray 8x4-inch loaf pan with no stick cooking spray or grease lightly. For loaf, combine oats, pimiento sauce, egg whites, turkey, corn and spices; mix lightly. Press into prepared pan. Sprinkle with sunflower seeds, pressing lightly. Bake 1 hour or until cooked through. Let stand 5 minutes before slicing. For sauce, combine yogurt, green chilies, cilantro and lime juice; mix well. Serve with turkey loaf. 8 Servings.  
\* Or, substitute pepitas (shelled pumpkin seeds).

Rabbag of New York and bear the Triangle K symbol. They are available locally. If your wine shop does not currently carry Hagafen wines, they can be ordered by your wine merchant from the distributor Viviano Imports. Delivery can be made in a day or two.

cate nature of this white wine from damaging ultraviolet light. This Piedmont white is produced 100 percent from the cortese grape in the Regale vineyard within Banfi's Principessa estate. With a slight spritz to

heighten the lively fruit, the wine finishes crisp with a hint of oak.

The connoisseur wine, newly introduced by Castello Banfi, is the 1989 Collalito (\$33.75). The interest in wines produced from 100 percent syrah has heightened worldwide.

Banfi's is the first Italian syrah to enter the fray in the competitive U.S. market. If you're familiar with the red wines of the northern Rhone, made from 100 percent syrah, comparison with the intensely colored, deeply flavored, peppery, spicy Collalito is in order.

# Kirk Douglas stars as dyslexic grandfather

## "The Secret" sheds light on important problem

Be it exploitative, violent escapist fare or lurid sensationalism masquerading as news, there's no shortage of inconsequential, dubious programming on contemporary TV. From shirtless, tropics-based private eyes to alleged news programs that focus on murder-for-hire in the nation's high schools, cheap thrills appear to run rampant.

It is, therefore, all the more laudable when a series, special or telefilm not only aims to entertain its audience without aid of leggy blondes or ample gunfire, but address an important issue or cause as well. Such is the case with "The Secret," premiering Sunday, April 19, on CBS. Anchored by the full-bodied performance of Kirk Douglas (in a rare TV appearance), the movie sheds sympathetic light on the problem of dyslexia and the

ways in which misplaced pride and lack of communication can augment its sufferers' woes.

Douglas stars as Mike Dunmore, the affable co-owner of a general store in a sleepy Cape Cod community. Bruce Boxleitner plays Dunmore's son, Patrick, who felt his father was inattentive while he was growing up and now resents his dad's warm relationship with his grandson Danny (Jesse Tandler.) Laura Harrington is Meredith, Patrick's mild-mannered wife, who tries to orchestrate peaceful relations between her sullen, complicated husband and her father-in-law.

In his third-grade class, Danny is known as a talented artist, a good athlete and a likeable playmate. His low grades, however, are a source of concern to all but his dad, who dismisses such worries, saying, "he's a jock." When a teacher

suggests testing Danny for a learning disability, Patrick is outraged and overrules his wife.

Mike, on the other hand, seems sadly sympathetic to Danny's problems and comes up with \$1,200 to have Danny tested in Boston. When Patrick learns of the plan, he retrieves his son just moments before the test begins.

Meanwhile, Mike has agreed to run for the town council, urged by friends who believe he can be an effective mediator between land-hungry developers and the Cape's downtrodden fruit growers. Showered with praise, he decides winning and serving in such an office would help to fill the void left by the death of his wife.

At a candidates' debate, however, it becomes painfully clear that Mike has his own secret handicap. The proud, gregarious man now faces a decision that can affect his relationship with virtually everyone he knows, especially his cherished grandson.

Douglas is endearing and effective as Dunmore. In the early part of the movie, he substitutes his trademark intensity for a winning, appropriately grandfatherly quality. When, however, Dunmore's long-hidden handicap threatens to become public knowledge, Douglas vividly captures the old man's terror. Boxleitner is similarly on-target in the difficult role of Patrick, a man shackled by resentment and insecurity. Harrington gives Meredith an edgy anxiety and Brock Peters lends find support as Thurgood, Mike's longtime business partner. Tandler is likeable as Danny, if a little too cute.

Admirable in its structure and character development, Cynthia A. Cherbak's script suffers, at times, from case of corniness and a paucity of logic. Director Karen Arthur eases past most of these moments, however, and emerges with an enjoyable film that addresses its topic well. Additionally, Fred Karlin's music is nice and the scenery (the movie was filmed largely in Nova Scotia) is beautiful.

## 'Ask Mr. Wizard' for science in small doses

Realizing even a few seconds of unintriguing airplay may prompt youthful viewers to abandon ship, Fox Children's Network plugs the leaky areas between shows with more than commercials. Crammed between the ads and a range of public service announcements is *Ask Mr. Wizard*, a worthwhile 60 seconds of applied science. A public TV and Nickelodeon veteran, Mr. Wizard (Don Herbert) is heard but not seen in this series of quickie experiments covering topics from astronomy to zoology.

The tidbits of technology explained on *Ask Mr. Wizard* demonstrate the human ability to overcome obstacles through careful thought. Though some of the examples are indeed cutting edge, such as the computerized apple that measures when the most bruising occurs during shipping, the answers to other scientific puzzles are often surprisingly low-tech. (How are scientists able to monitor an individual ant working among thousands of others? Mr. Wizard claims that a simple dot attached to our industrious insect makes him stand out in a crowd.)

For children who can spend half a Saturday glued to the television while cartoon rodents perform slapstick, *Ask Mr. Wizard* will come and go painlessly enough. For those who dream of walking on Mars or finding a cure for cancer, 60 seconds of Mr. Wizard won't be nearly enough. © TV Listing Inc.

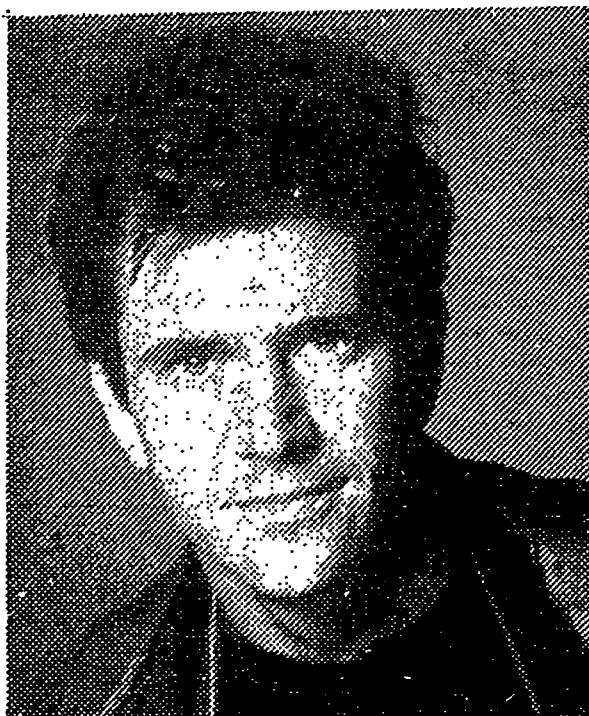

Not only does the actor have another film sequel for his signature role in *Lethal Weapon 3* coming out in May of this year, but the word is that Gibson may sign on as the new James Bond. 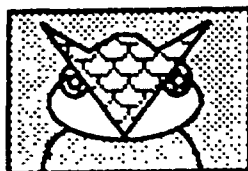

### Masters tourney an American crusade

Throughout its 55-year history, the Masters golf tournament has yielded some of the most dramatic moments in PGA history. However, few have equalled last year's improbable finish. Five American challengers fell to Augusta's treacherous back nine, while Ian Woosnam held on to make it four straight years that the traditional green winner's blazer was worn by a player from the United Kingdom.

Eagles flew with astounding regularity during the roller coaster final round. But both the brilliance and the bungling displayed on those decisive final holes were overshadowed by the wave of anti-European sentiment that swept the gallery at the supposedly-staid Augusta National Golf Club. Fans, frustrated with America's poor showing, vented their emotions on the man his countrymen call "Wee Woosie."

This year's Masters has become somewhat of an American crusade. Encouraged by a field that includes the red-hot Fred Couples and reigning PGA champion John Daly, the Americans are poised to retake Augusta and apply some salve to their wounded pride.

Airing Sunday, April 12, for the 37th consecutive year, CBS Sports will broadcast live the Masters final round, with Pat Summerall heading the team of commentators.

"I auditioned for the Oliver Stone movie (*JFK*), and I realized that I'd been in New York too long when I could do a Brooklyn accent better than my native Texan accent. It crushed me. I thought, 'Oh no, I've lost my roots.'"

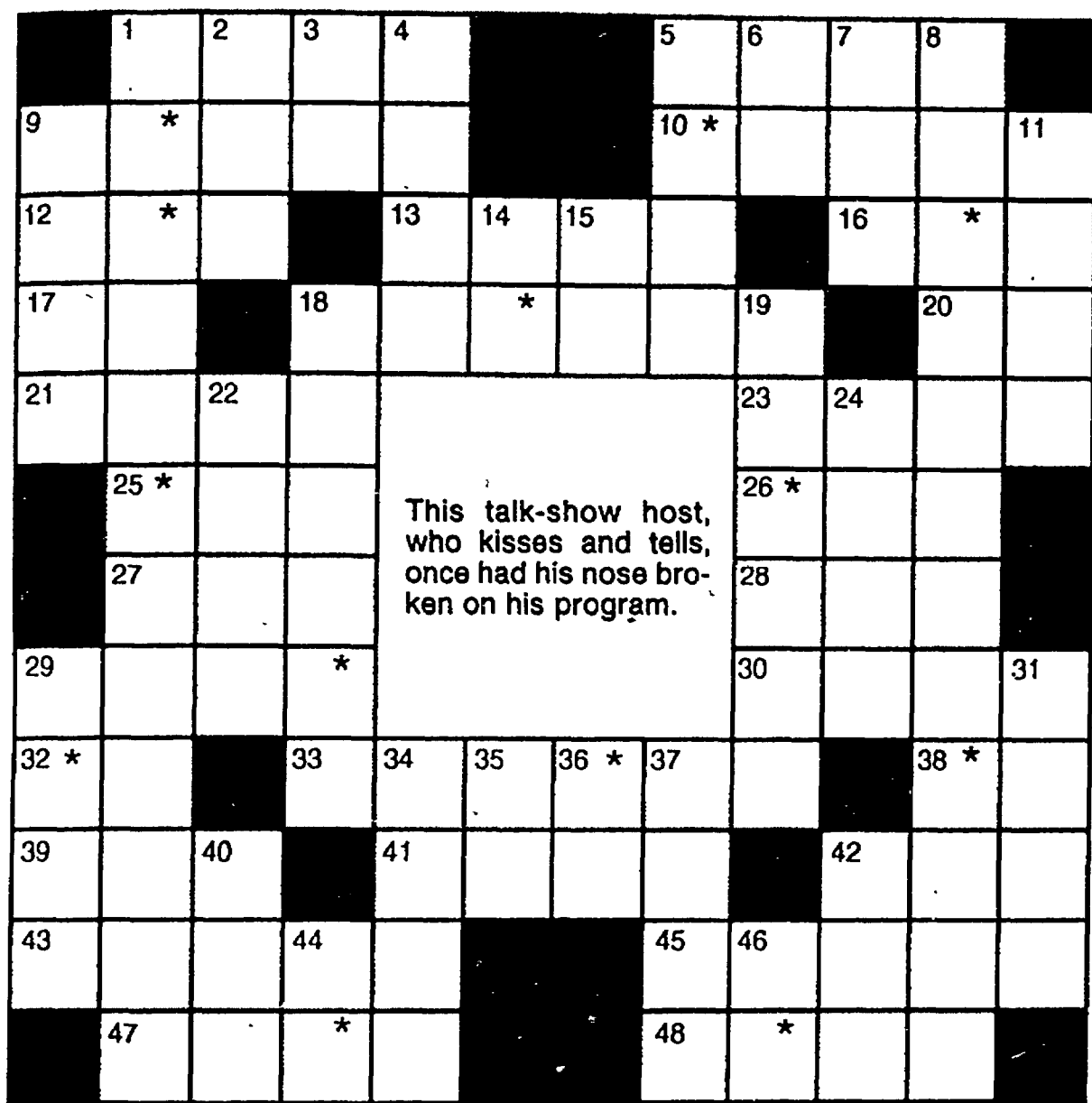
