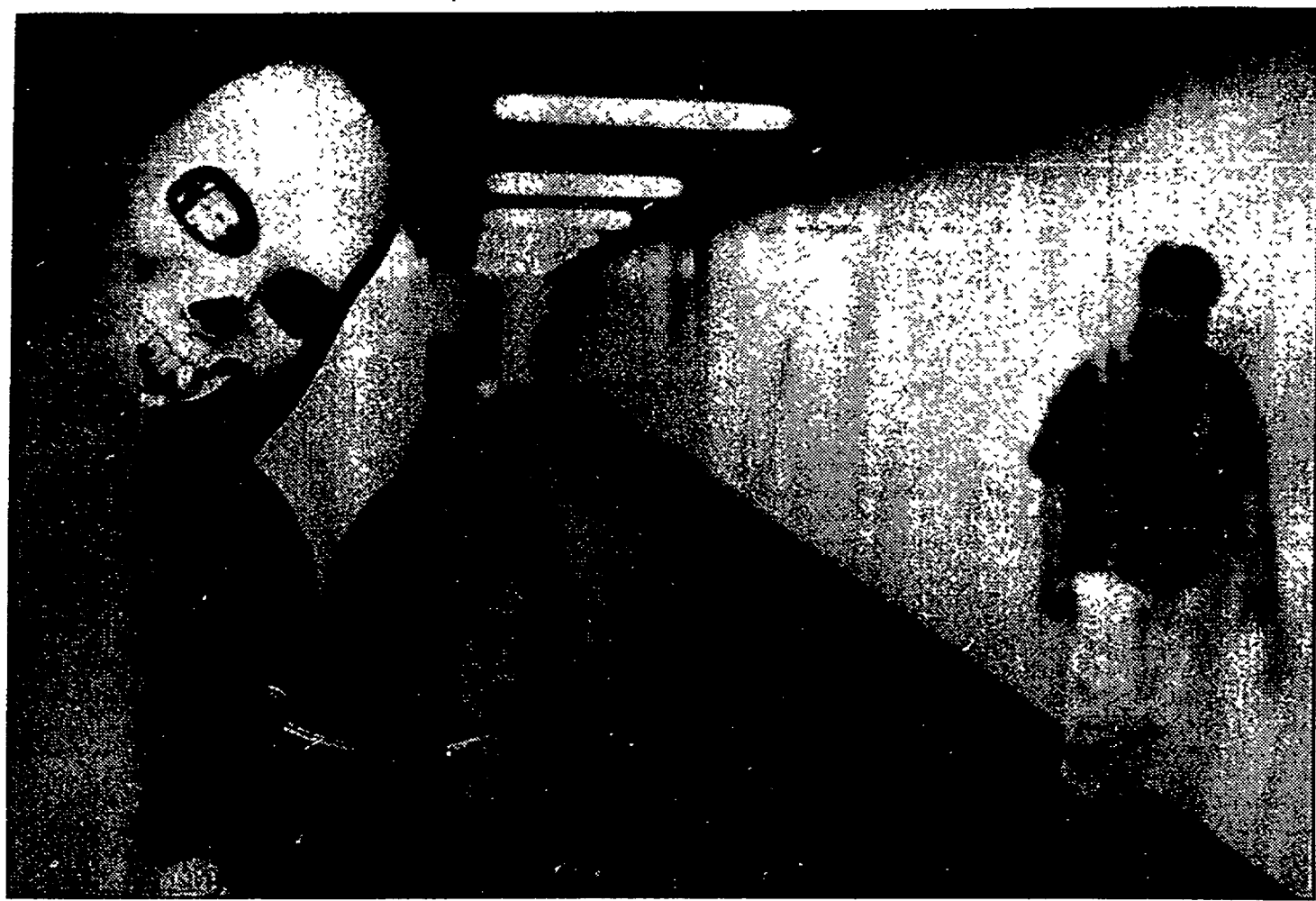

Schools note Month of Young Child

Walk into the Early Childhood Center this month and you'll see a flood of purple ribbons. Children are wearing them to honor the Month of the Young Child.

For years the State of Michigan has designated April as the Month of the Young Child. The designation is intended to recognize the needs of young children and to celebrate their accomplishments.

Northville's Early Childhood Center, at 501 W. Main, is no exception. In addition to a host of month-long activities celebrating young children, the center, now in its seventh year, brought its act to school board members last Monday.

In anticipation of the presentation, the school board lent its support to the center's program by adopting a resolution to locally recognize April as the Month of the Young Child.

Students at the Early Childhood Center—under the direction of program administrator and early childhood specialist Mary Kay Gallagher—gave board members an hour-long presentation to showcase some of their highlights and activities at the center.

As part of their presentation, students sported their favorite swim

suits, play wear, and party outfits in their own spring fashion show.

A slide show spotlighted activities such as the center's partnership with the local senior center.

For Gallagher, the presentation was one technique for bringing young children to the forefront of board members' minds, to draw attention to their needs, and to recognize their accomplishments.

Purple ribbons are illustrations of the support and commitment administrators have made to young children.

"We are wearing them so people are more aware that these children are important people to us," said Gallagher. "Children are our greatest resource, and we have a bunch of neat people working hard to meet the needs of the young child."

In an effort to meet their needs, program administrators are doing some creative things both inside and outside the classroom.

Inside, kids are enthusiastic about learning to read, understanding the weather and habits of animals, and about life. Through cooperative programs, students have been able to take what they've learned inside the classroom out into the community to share with others, Gallagher said.

Students in a partnership program with the Senior Center can use

skills taught in the classroom to bring a smile to their senior friends' faces, and artwork to the halls of the senior center.

"The partnership with the Senior Center has had real positive outcomes for both children and the seniors," said Nancy Shuerman, chairperson of the partnership program. "We've become friends through cooperative learning."

For Karl Peters, director of the senior center, the program's benefits have been as equally positive.

"It was really nice being with the kids," he said. "The seniors really enjoyed being a part of the program. It's the first time I've ever seen the bridge players stop playing cards and not complain."

As part of the partnership program, students have paraded through the center, made cookies and decorations for impromptu and holiday get-togethers, and sung songs, all in return for a reciprocal visit from Santa and Mrs. Claus at Christmas.

"The most inspiring part was when the citizens joined in on the songs," Shuerman said. "Some of them knew all the actions to go with the songs. The children were very excited and thrilled to be there with the seniors."

Seniors were excited too. In response to the program, the seniors have started a \$250 scholarship

program.

"They just wanted to give something back to the community," Peters said.

The seniors' responsiveness to the center mirrors the demand for the center's services. Since its inception seven years ago, the program has experienced tremendous growth in enrollment, content and curriculum, Gallagher said. Gallagher, who has been in charge since the center opened, said she's heard great things from parents and teachers involved in the center.

For parent Chris Kosal, a member of the parent advisory committee, what's being taught at the center mirrors what national experts are recommending.

"I consider our staff an expert staff," Kosal told board members, "because they are already doing what goes on at national workshops."

For board member Carol Rahimi, who used to work with Gallagher at the center, that news was no surprise.

"It says great things to you that you still have the same staff you did from the start," Rahimi said. "It says there is something exciting happening over there."

Obstacles delay start of recycling

Northville city's fledgling curbside recycling program has cut its landfill-bound solid waste flow by about 20 percent since the plan was implemented earlier this year.

Northville Township, on the other hand, adopted a recycling strategy months earlier than its city counterpart, but still has no active curbside recycling plan in place.

A township curbside program likely will not start until late this year, officials say, and by the end of this

month, the township will have paid over \$25,000 more than it anticipated — at a continuing \$3,600 monthly clip — to its solid-waste hauler to compensate for higher-than-expected trash volumes.

The township also remains saddled with an estimated \$18,000 annual expense for its Sheldon Road recycling center, a site officials hope to phase out after a curbside program takes root.

Officials hasten to point out that township residents stand to receive

Charity will race into town

The Wish-A-Mile 300 is wheeling its way to Northville.

Along with it will come 150 tired but triumphant cyclists, carrying the hopes of dozens of children who rely on the Make-A-Wish Foundation of Michigan to make their dreams come true.

The WAM 300 is a 300-mile, three-day bicycle tour geared to cyclists of all skill levels, and is one of the key fundraising events for the state's Make-A-Wish Foundation. Each cyclist is required to raise \$500 in donations to participate.

The annual bike tour snakes its way down the lower peninsula and, in this its fifth year, ends in Northville Sunday, Aug. 16.

Northville was chosen as the tour's destination for its ability to host a celebration, said Program Director

Sandi Janousek.

"We wanted some place that could hold that many people," she said. "We were looking for a party place to celebrate with us when we get in."

The trek starts Thursday, Aug. 13 with a bus ride from Northville to St. Ignace. After a warm-up ride around Mackinac Island, and a carbohydrate-loaded dinner, bikers will retire to rest up for the start of the tour.

Following a hearty breakfast Friday morning, the bikers will assemble at the foot of the Mackinac Bridge and pedal across the Straits of Mackinac into the lower peninsula. The route unfolds around Mullet Lake and Black Lake, and through the state forests of Mackinac and Au Sable to day's end at Roscommon.

"The first day is usually the longest," Janousek said, adding that

Planners settle on new PUD rules

It took several meetings, but the city's planning commission has finally hammered out the details of a proposed Planned Unit Development ordinance revision.

The revision would give developers the ability to shift the building density on their parcels.

In effect, a developer could build residential or other units closer together on one part of a parcel provided that the parcel's overall density remained the same.

The current ordinance was designed to encourage diverse types of residential housing and the preservation of a site's natural features and open spaces on large lots. The proposed revisions will allow Planned Unit Developments for other uses besides residential, and permit the developments on smaller parcels.

The proposal follows a recommen-

dation in March by Planning Consultant Don Wortman.

"Keep in mind that if someone wanted to put in a PUD at this time for a R1a or R1b (single-family development), they would need 80 acres. For R2, they would need 40 acres," Wortman told the commission March 3.

"I felt this was overly restrictive," Wortman noted then that some other communities offer a slightly higher density for Planned Unit Developments, saying, "It's a carrot-and-stick arrangement."

But he assured the commission that his proposed PUD revisions would not allow any greater density overall than the city's current zoning.

"The applicant is really not getting any break on density," he said. "The message that I heard in the Master Plan was that you didn't want to play with that."

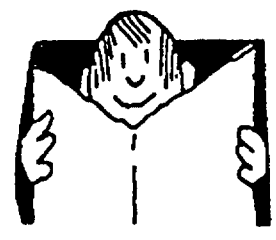

News Briefs

FOLLOW THE BOUNCING CHECKS: The official list of U.S. representatives who bounced checks at the infamous House bank included one of Northville's representatives as well as a potential future representative.

Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, made the list with a reported 17 bounced checks. Pursell has announced he will retire after this term because he was essentially redistricted away from most of his constituents under the new House boundaries.

Rep. William Broomfield, R-Lake Orion, did not make the list. But Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor—who has announced plans to run for the new district which will include some of Pursell's current turf—had six bounces, according to the list.

NEW SCHOOL GROUNDBREAKING: Northville school officials are hoping to get to the site of Thornton Creek Elementary school before construction crews break ground for the new school on Nine Mile Road.

A week from today, Monday, April 27, school, city, and township officials, will converge at the vacant site, on the northside of Nine Mile Road between Taft and Beck in Novi, at 6:30 p.m. and hold a groundbreaking ceremony for the school, which is expected to open in the fall of 1993.

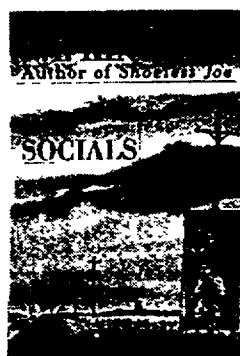

The Northville School District and City of Northville aren't the only taxing authorities getting their budget together for fiscal year 1992-93.

Wayne County officials are also compiling budget requests for the upcoming fiscal year.

As a result, budget requests for shares of county levies allocated to county school districts were due today to the county's tax allocation board.

Northville's budget request for its 8.90 mills of county-levied taxes for operating expenses was

approved by the school board last Monday.

Under the Public Act 62 of 1933, which legislates the county's 15-mill tax levy, the taxing board has the authority to allocate up to 8.90 mills to each district inside the county. The actual allocated millage rate is based on the taxable value of real and personal property in the district and it is apportioned by the county for school operating expenses. Since past allocation of those mills has been an automatic practice, this year should be no different, said district Business Manager John Street.

If all goes according to years past, the district should receive its entire allocated 7.23 mills,

which is its total 8.90 mills, less 1.67 mills from Headlee rollbacks.

As the budget request was submitted to the board for approval, board treasurer Robert McMahon suggested the district mail a copy of it to Northville's state representatives and state senators for review.

"I would like to see this be sent to our senators and state representatives so they can see what's going on here with state and local funding," he said. "Maybe then we can get answers to a number of questions."

Near miss for Northville

A tornado scooted along North Territorial Road Thursday afternoon, barely sparing Northville Township from damage while destroying several structures in Salem and Plymouth.

The tornado hit about 4 p.m., cutting a jagged path about two miles long. Plymouth Hills Mobile Home Park, off Ridge and North Territorial, suffered the most damage with at least three people reporting minor

injuries.

Eight trailers there were destroyed — including several which flipped over — and more than a dozen others suffered minor damage. The twister caused gas leaks in the mobile home park and made some areas near the trailers "hot" from electricity and forcing evacuations.

Parts of Salem saw barns wrecked and trees uprooted. The Northville Township Fire Department received a call to aid Plymouth Township, but reported no storm damage in Northville.

Plymouth Hills resident Bill Schultz recalled very hard rain just before the tornado hit. "It really did sound like a train," he said. "I saw my roof lift up... I could feel my house move."

Gail McPherson's husband, Bob, was hurt slightly with a cut on his arm. "We had no warning" of the tornado, she said.

Another witness, Cary Papas, remembered looking out his window and seeing all kinds of debris flying around. "Clouds were black and spinning," he said.

Take care during tornado season

Now that March has come in like a lion and gone out like a lamb, April may prove to be a more ferocious month.

Most tornadoes in Michigan touch down between April and July, which is why March 29-April 4 was declared Tornado Safety Week.

Nationwide, Michigan has the third-highest average number of tornado-related deaths per year, with

more than 227 people killed since 1950. The deaths were the result of the more than 522 tornadoes that hit the state in that period.

Most of those twisters struck southern lower Michigan.

Tornado Safety Week is an effort to educate residents to the dangers posed by the windstorms, and to the steps they can take to protect themselves.

A steady three-minute tone indicates that a tornado has been sighted in the area. Residents should take shelter in the basement or lowest level of a sturdy building immediately upon hearing the tone.

The Northville City Police Department, located in the lower level of Northville City Hall at 215 W. Main St., is handing out several pamphlets describing the steps that residents can take to protect themselves against severe weather.

Wait continues for township recycling

Just over a year ago, Northville Township officials announced they had reached agreement with Browning-Ferris Industries on a plan that effectively would swap some township sewer line capacity for perks including free township recycling for four years.

The agreement was heralded as a win-win situation, with the township receiving the free recycling and about \$260,000 cash for its general fund. BFI gained some highly valuable capacity in the township's portion of the Western Townships Utilities Authority sewer line.

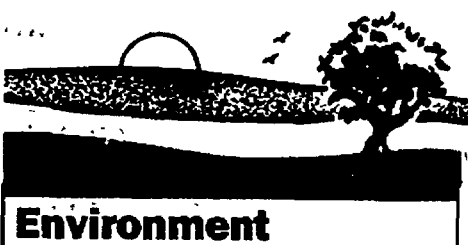
The importance of the announcement was magnified because the township was headed down the home stretch of a county-mandated solid-waste plan. Township officials had to put a program in place last year to abide by county standards, and momentarily, it looked as if the township might have been ahead of the game.

Northville city's adherence program appeared to lag in comparison. But a strange thing happened as 1991 began to slip away. Township officials talked of a September curbside recycling start-up date, but quickly changed the goal to November. A new preferred-status solid-waste hauler came on board, but November came and went and township paper, glass, plastics, etc., continued to clog rapidly filling, increasingly expensive landfill space.

The township's solid-waste hauler then came back to the township and told it to cough up more money for collection services, since the contract was based on a notion that a recycling plan would be implemented, with recyclable materials separated from the waste stream. The township then agreed to pay its hauler an additional \$3,600 monthly stipend — dating back to October 1991 — and was forced to maintain its costly Sheldon Road recycling area.

Meanwhile, the city went about its business and put a curbside collection program in place. Despite a few glitches, residents are now catching on to the idea of recycling, and city officials estimate that 20 percent of household refuse is now recycled — spared from burial in a landfill. The city eventually hopes up to 50 percent of its refuse will be diverted from landfills, which is, after all, the real reason for stepped-up emphasis on recycling programs.

But what about the township? Why is it lagging so far behind the city? And why don't township officials think a recycling

program will kick in until late fall?

Quite frankly, the agreement with BFI actually removed control of recycling from township hands. Township officials won't say they are being held hostage by BFI and the Ypsilanti Community Utilities Authority, but nothing can or will happen until those two entities ink a contract. No curbside pickups. No educational programs. No reduction in bills paid to the solid waste hauler. No scaled-back recycling center.

BFI won't even order recycling trucks to handle township curbside pickups. It will, however, continue to bill the township for collections it makes at township offices.

This isn't the most healthy position for a governmental unit, regardless of the potential future benefit. Officials of all involved parties feel the logjam is about to give, but best-case scenarios still place township curbside recycling start-up in the fall of 1992 — a year after the program was scheduled to begin.

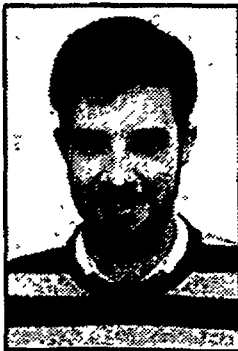
Interestingly enough — and despite delays suffered by the township — officials here sure jumped when BFI wanted action on a special assessment district it needed to tie into the WTUA line. The township seemingly stumbled all over itself requesting bids for the sewer line which would connect BFI to the western WTUA line, even going so far as to accept bids before finalizing the special assessment district terms.

BFI will pay the entire cost of that tie-in line, in case you imagined the township somehow got snookered into that expense.

Potentially, the BFI/Township/WTUA/YCUA deal will benefit Northville Township residents. It surely will help those other entities. Our concern is that the township gave away a significant measure of autonomy when it bought into the plan, and in return, the solid waste program it grasped has suffered. Only time will tell when actual recycling will begin, but that late most likely will be later than sooner.

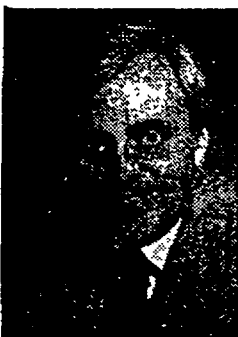

Obstacles delay township recycling plan start

four years worth of free recycling services from Browning-Ferris Industries, partial compensation for a township/BFI deal to open the Western Townships Utilities Authority sewer line to BFI wastewater.

But extended negotiations between BFI and the Ypsilanti Communities Utilities Authority, WTUA's treatment plant, have stalled township recycling plans. Township curbside recycling, initially slated to begin in November 1991, now likely will be

pushed back a full year from that date as a result.

Indications are that the BFI/YCUA stumbling block soon may be removed. Robert Line, BFI director of external affairs, on Friday said his firm is near agreement with YCUA. "I think we finally have ironed out all the issues that [delayed agreement]," Line said. Line said he was "cautiously optimistic" that BFI and YCUA had settled their differences.

Line and YCUA Director Bruce Jones declined to comment on sticking points that thus far have stalled

the township's recycling program.

Line did say BFI's Salem Township/Washienaw County site prompted logistics problems, since the other three WTUA communities are located in Wayne County.

"What delayed us longer than anything else was that BFI was out of the (WTUA) service area," Line said.

BFI is paying the full cost of a \$250,000 special assessment district tap-in line from WTUA's westernmost Northville Township site. The township board recently approved construction bids and the

special assessment district, contingent upon a signed contract between BFI and YCUA.

BFI currently trucks about 30,000 gallons of wastewater per day to YCUA. Under the pending agreement, BFI would be able to transport up to 100,000 gallons per day of wastewater to YCUA through the WTUA sewer, Line said.

But township recycling hinges on completion of the BFI/YCUA agreement.

BFI will not start township recycling collections until the agreement

with YCUA is finalized, said township Supervisor Betty Lennox. In addition, the solid waste plant will not order recycling trucks—a lengthy process—until agreement is reached, Lennox said.

The parent company wants an agreement in place before starting the recycling program," Lennox said. "We've hoped for a long time the (BFI/YCUA) contract would be signed... We project that recycling will start sometime in the fall."

The tentative deal between Northville Township and BFI includes provisions for free recycling for all town-

ship residents, including those living in condominiums and apartments. Township residents will place their recyclables in baskets at the curbside, according to recycling guidelines.

City residents use a blue bag system to separate recyclables from the solid waste stream. BFI's Line would not speculate on when the township could get its recycling program up and running. He said a 30- to 60-day educational program will be needed to inform residents on how best to recycle their household waste.

this year's first stretch measures 112 miles.

The second day's journey will take the cyclists through the heart of Michigan's Amish country to St. Charles, while the third ends at Northville.

Along the way, cyclists will be treated to frequent snacks of fruit, homemade cookies, and liquid refreshment like Gatorade. "We have a break about every 20 miles where you can stop and load up again... There's always food that you can stuff

in the back of your jersey for the next 20 miles," Janousek said.

Cyclists can also depend on several support vehicles that will follow the tour, including a repair truck to perform bicycle repairs along the way when a two-wheeler leaves its rider in the lurch.

"You're never left alone... We're always around," Janousek said.

Though the WAM 300 brochure lists the Northville Community Chamber of Commerce as the local coordinator, Northville's Rotary Club will be the actual coordinating body.

Laurie Marrs, the chamber's executive director and a Rotary Club member, explained that Make-A-Wish asked both Rotary and the chamber to consider sponsoring, but Rotary was asked first and accepted the challenge.

Marrs will chair the Rotary committee coordinating Northville's involvement.

And while the WAM 300 brochure speaks of "a celebration hosted by the Northville community," some details remain to be worked out on Northville's end of the route.

"We're thinking of ending it at either Maybury (State Park), Fish Hatchery Park or Mill Race Village," Marrs said. "We figure we have a ways to go on it."

The Lansing-based Make-A-Wish Foundation, founded in 1984, helps answer the wishes of Michigan children between 3 and 17 years old who suffer from life-threatening illnesses including cancer, leukemia and AIDS. It is one of 74 affiliates of the Make-A-Wish Foundation of America, founded in Phoenix in 1980.

Progress on adoption of the proposal stalled during a March 24 meeting due to a discussion over the revision's use of the word "unreasonable," but resumed after the word was deleted from several places.

The planners settled on a final draft version April 7, after arguing over how to ensure that a developer cannot create a PUD, build to the higher density on a portion of the parcel and then sell off the undeveloped

portion for redevelopment at a normal density.

The revisions stipulate that a PUD's open space would be dedicated as an easement, and recorded with the city as such.

The planners asked Wortman to insert language into the revision recording the easements as deed restrictions on the total property.

They agreed to a May 19 public hearing on the proposal.

The ordinance would then go to the city council for its review.

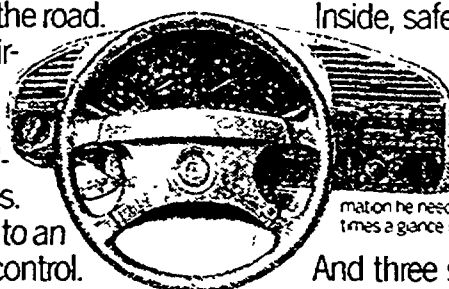

Milk products are turning up everywhere

"Drink your milk." We have heard that or maybe said that! Milk is important in a healthy diet because of the important nutrients it contains — calcium to name one.

A large share of the milk consumed in the United States is a beverage; however, milk is also an important ingredient for cooks. Due to its milkfat, milk adds moisture and richness to cakes, cookies and bread dough. It makes breads brown better, improves their keeping quality and gives a creamier softer crumb.

Milk is sometimes used as a soaking medium for fish or chicken livers. This soaking helps to get rid of strong flavors or provides the stick-em to coating for foods to be fried.

Milk plays a major role in making sauces, and is the primary liquid in most puddings and the base for ice cream and sherbets. Milk moistens breakfast cereal, sweetens coffee or tea and is the major part of other beverages like hot or cold cocoa, eggnog and milk shakes. Milk is also the starting point for yogurt and cheese.

Acidophilus milk is pasteurized skim or low-fat with a bacterial culture added. The milk is immediately packaged and cooled to prevent fermentation. When consumed the bacterial culture is activated at body temperature. Many people believe that these bacteria help maintain the balance of beneficial microorganisms in the intestinal tract.

Buttermilk is made by adding bacterial cultures to pasteurized milk (usually skim) to produce the acidity, body, flavor and aroma. Yellow flecks in some buttermilk are bits of real butter. Buttermilk is the base to many creamy dressings and gives flavor and tenderness to pancakes, biscuits, quick breads and cakes.

Evaporated milk is canned whole milk concentrate that has been heated to remove about 60 percent of the water. Evaporated milk can not contain less than 7.5 percent milkfat in this concentrate. One-half cup of evaporated can be substituted with equal amount of water to make one cup whole milk. Sweetened condensed milk is a canned milk concentrate containing not less than 8 percent milkfat, with 40 to 45 percent sugar added. It can not be substituted for evaporated milk.

Imagine a milk so stable that it needs no refrigeration. It's called U.H.T. (ultra high temperature) milk. This is a very popular milk in Europe and starting to account for a fraction of the milk sales here. U.H.T. milk production requires temperatures of 275 degrees — 300 degrees Fahrenheit. It is exposed to this high temperature for only a few seconds but long enough to destroy all bacteria. The milk is then placed in aseptic packaging and is safe to drink for about six months. The nutritional value is the same as pasteurized milk.

Whole milk has to contain at least 3.25 percent milkfat and 8.6 percent solids that are not fat. Lowfat milk has had sufficient milkfat removed to bring the fat level to between 0.5 and 2 percent. Many people assume that "2 percent" means that 2 percent of the milk's calories come from fat. An eight-ounce glass of 2 percent milk has about 130 calories and five grams of fat, and 45 of the calories are derived from fat — 35 percent of the total. Whole milk derives about 50 percent of its calories from fat. So 2 percent milk is better, but not much.

Skim milk, also called nonfat milk, has had sufficient milkfat removed to bring the total to less than 0.5 percent. Powdered milk or nonfat dry milk is skim milk with the water removed. It reconstitutes readily in warm water. Instant nonfat dry reconstitutes readily in cold

Southwest with style

Indian, Mexican foods spice up new class

It's boom time in the American Southwest.

This time, though, the hardest reservations to get aren't for Indians. They're for dinner.

Restaurants sprang up in the American Southwest proffering food based on the Spanish and Native American influences of their region. Visitors liked the idea and spurred a nationwide trend toward Southwestern cooking.

Master Chef Jeff Gabriel of Schoolcraft College is a devotee of the style, and will teach a class in Southwestern Cooking. The class will be given Thursday, April 30, at the Les Auteurs School of Cooking in Royal Oak.

"We do classes on many different topics, but the main thing is I teach by objective," said Gabriel. "I will write a Southwestern menu, and it will probably consist of a Southwestern marinated grilled steak with chili black beans, an herb-roasted cilantro potato, and also a soup with some kind of feathered game. I may also try chicken with a roasted pepper sauce."

Gabriel explained that whatever the topic, his classes generally require students to assist in preparing a soup, a fish course, an entree and sometimes a dessert. From this class, students should come away with an understanding of the flavors, ingredients and style popularized by restaurants of the Southwest.

"The influences come mainly from the West and California," said Gabriel. "There's a lot of grilling. They use a lot of western ingredients, such as different tomatoes and peppers. There are also different types of salsas, western more than Spanish or Mexican."

Native American influences are also evident, especially in the cooking methods. The grilling Chef Gabriel emphasizes isn't a far cry from the primitive style of the Indians of New Mexico and Arizona. They also make good use of what the land has to offer.

"They do a lot of things with cactus, and again peppers, all the varieties of peppers," Gabriel said. "Venison is very popular, and all kinds of game are very widely eaten."

Corn, black beans and Texas beans are readily available. Blue corn (which is actually more brown than blue) and blue cornmeal show up often in Southwestern dishes, Gabriel added, and hors d'oeuvres with blue corn tortillas are popular.

Flavoring in most Southwestern cooking is accomplished with cumin, chili powders and cilantro.

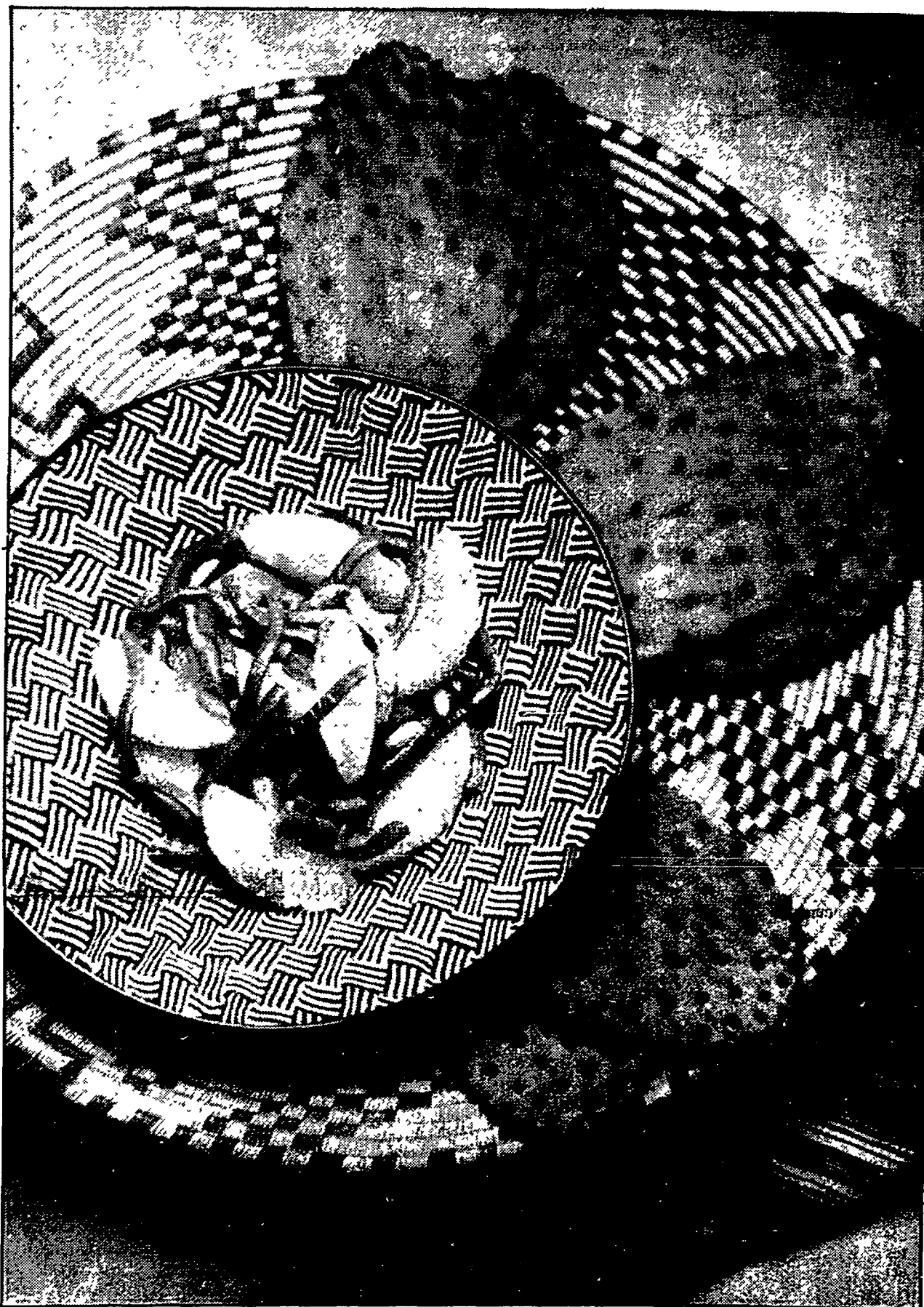
What many newcomers to Southwestern food don't realize is that there are variations by region, and even from pueblo to pueblo in parts of New Mexico.

"I like to incorporate the different regions," said Gabriel. "Most of all I like keeping it real simple. I like a Southwestern marinated grilled steak on top of a warm bean salad and a little bit of roasted pepper sauce. That's keeping it simple, but with unique presentation. It's not just separate meat, potato and vegetable. The spicy flavors are there along with the cool flavors."

The fact that the class is focusing on a trendy style should bring out some fun-loving would-be cooks, but that's usually the case anyway, said Gabriel.

"The classes are really good," he said. "They are a lot of fun. What I always hear is that people feel like they get a good value."

Students come from all backgrounds and culinary abilities. They include professionals, housewives, single people and just plain people who want to learn how to cook, according to Gabriel.

One class, like Southwestern Cuisine, costs \$25, but if you sign up for three classes, the total is \$65. They usually last for two to two and a half hours, and students go home with detailed recipes for the food they prepared.

"It's important that they be able to go home and duplicate it," Gabriel said. "I don't just do a demonstration, and I don't

make it so difficult that they can't do it at home. It's simplicity with elegance."

Students also get a complimentary glass of wine, which is matched to the food prepared. Wine choice is just one of the topics covered during the class. And of course students sample everything that is made.

"They almost walk out of there having

eaten a full meal," Gabriel said.

Recent classes have included a special roast rack of lamb in preparation for Easter, and a couples-only class called Romantic Cuisine, which Gabriel teaches along with wife Pam.

Bay scallops require same scrutiny as fish



Every day, I'm asked "What would you recommend we order from the special menu?" "Which fish is best?" "What doesn't taste fishy?"

If it tastes fishy, it isn't fresh. Consequently none of our fish tastes fishy. In general, we try very hard to order mild flavored species. We do not always have varieties that the layman is familiar with. Sometimes it takes a bit of coaxing to persuade you to taste wolfish (ocean catfish), rockfish (similar to grouper) or tautog, also known as blackfish.

Loup de mer, or ocean catfish, is sweet

and firm, with a snowwhite flesh. I prefer it to farm-raised catfish because of the texture. Is is also perhaps the ugliest creature in the sea, vicious looking with big, gooey teeth. But it makes such beautiful filets.

Six months ago, I couldn't sell a piece without guaranteeing its wonderful flavor. Now I can sell out an entire shipment in one evening. This is happening more and more with the unconventional fish. We have lists of people to call when their favorite comes in.

Of late, one of my favorites has been bay scallops. If they are available, we buy them. Their flesh is creamywhite and smells very similar to the ocean. If they are quickly seared and finished in the oven, an incomparable sweetness comes out — candy of the sea.

Bivalve mollusks, belonging to the same family as mussels and clams, scallops have two hinged shells, and feed on microscopic plants and animals which

they filter out of the nutrient-rich ocean waters.

They swim only when threatened by clapping their shells together to create a "jetting" effect. A single propulsion can carry a scallop up to 14 feet.

Sea scallops have a maximum lifespan of 16-17 years, and their shells can grow as large as 18 inches. They become marketable in approximately four years. In its early life, a scallop grows rapidly and its age can be determined by counting the lines on the outside of the shell.

The shell has historic and symbolic interest, having been used as symbols for the crusaders, incorporated in the coat of arms for Sir Winston Churchill, and as the logo for Shell Oil.

There are over 300 species of scallop with those from the Northwest Atlantic being the most prized (Guess where ours come from?). Fishing vessels towing large chain dredges across the ocean bottom

collect the shellfish. Once on board the boat, the scallops are dumped, shucked, washed and iced. Once in a while whole scallops are brought to market. I've used them one, and although beautiful, they're not practical or cost effective.

It is imperative that the fisherman use good judgement on bringing up the dredges before they are too full. If the scallops are not cleaned and iced in the least amount of time possible, they heat up, and when bagged begin to spoil from the inside out.

Many plants take part in a practice called "soaking," which masks off odors, adds weight and improves appearance. The soak solution has a tremendous water-binding capacity, so 100 pounds of scallops becomes 120 pounds of scallops in just two days. Salt is cheap, so there is a tremendous return on investment.

These "bargain" scallops show their true colors in your kitchen. The cell walls

break down when cooked, and the water is released. The trapped odors are liberated, and even if the scallop wasn't old when soaked, the process destroys the rich, sweet flavor.

Soaked scallops will be white in color, or have white fringes around the meat due to the bleaching effect. Generally they will have no odor or foul smell, and will be slimy to the touch. Unsoaked sea scallops have a sweet ocean smell with firm, moist meat. Their natural color varies from creamy white to tannish pink to orange.

I know I've said it a million times, but I'll do it again. Know whom you buy your fish from. Ask to smell and inspect it before purchase.

It is heavenly to open a tin of scallops from our purveyor in Boston. The ocean smells so real. It is as if you've just returned from a walk on the beach.

Sinful pleasures

Simple recipe has large following

It's ironic that the inscription on the bottom of Verna Wall's recipe card for Sinfully Delicious reads, "You'll think you've died and gone to heaven."

But, then again, one taste will tell you've probably done something that merits a little penance. Sinfully Delicious, a simple yet rich-tasting chocolate cake, is not just for chocoholics. It really is the everyman's cake.

It's flavorful enough to serve for company, but it's so simple (the ingredient list is just five items long) that it can be made at midweek and packed in kids' lunches.

"You can't really make a cake like that for just two people," she said, although we thought we could find a friend who wouldn't mind packing in half of one. "When I have my bridge club, or family over for dinner, I make it. The one I made the other day I distributed amongst the neighbors."

Wall also admits to a penchant for making desserts.

"I like all kinds of foods," she said. "But mainly I just do ordinary food. I'm not a gourmet cook. If I have to take anything anywhere, I always ask if I can bring dessert. I like fancy desserts."

Wall said she got the recipe from a friend just a little more than a month ago.

"It's new, and I think it's new to the area," she said. "No body I know has

heard of it. My friend came back from Minneapolis where her daughter-in-law had made it."

In an even stranger turn of events, Wall doesn't know what her own creation tastes like. She hadn't even made one before she decided to give up cake for Lent.

"I'm fasting on cakes," she said. "But everyone I've served it to has loved it."

So in her case, the cake truly does live up to its name of Sinfully Delicious.

SINFULLY DELICIOUS

1 German chocolate cake mix
1 large can condensed milk
1 jar of Mrs. Richardson's caramel sauce
12 ounce carton Cool Whip
3 small Heath bars, crushed
Bake cake according to directions, in a 9-by-13 pan. While cake is still warm, poke holes in the cake with a wooden spoon handle. Pour milk over evenly, then caramel sauce. Frost with Cool Whip and sprinkle with Heath bars.

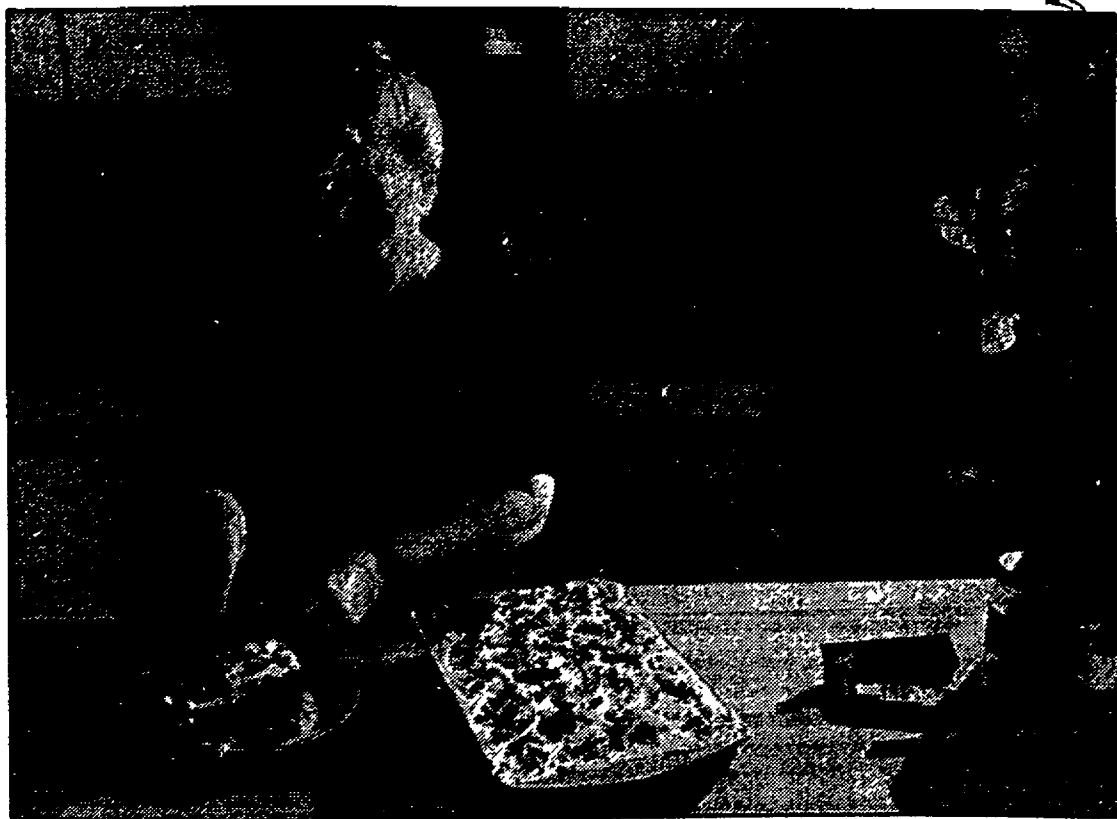

Recycling starts in the kitchen this Earth Day

April 22 is Earth Day, a celebration of the important aspects of environmental protection: preservation and conservation.

Amid reports of such global catastrophes as vanishing rain forests and holes in the ozone layer, we are becoming more aware of the need to protect our natural resources and wildlife.

Dolphin-safe tuna is available on grocers' shelves, and this is the tuna to buy — on Earth Day and every day.

To the benefit of ourselves and our planet, we have begun an environmental turnaround in recent years. We are becoming more aware of the repercussions of a disposable lifestyle, as throwaway containers choke landfills already brimming with trash. We are making progress, but much remains to be done. Bear in mind the following grim statistics:

Fact: The average American family produces 100 pounds of trash per week.

Fact: More than half of the cities in the United States will exhaust their current landfills by the year 1995.

What can you do, as a consumer, to protect and preserve our Mother Earth? Here are some ideas:

● Ask for biodegradable paper bags instead of plastic at the market — and reuse them. Better yet, buy reusable cloth or net bags to tote groceries home. Use plastic vegetable and fruit bags only when necessary. Buying a bunch of bananas? No need for a plastic bag!

● Make it a point to buy recycled paper products: toilet tissue, paper towels, napkins, etc. Limit your use of paper plates, cups, napkins. Instead, use china dishes and cloth napkins whenever you can.

● Don't patronize restaurants that package food in plastic foam containers. Tell restaurants you will come back when they switch to a more environmentally safe form of packaging.

TUNA-BROCCOLI BAKE

2 (10-ounce) packages frozen broccoli cuts
2 (7-ounce) cans dolphin-safe tuna, drained
1 (10-ounce) can cream of celery soup
½ cup milk
1 (4-ounce) can sliced mushrooms, drained
1 tablespoon lemon juice
2 teaspoons instant minced onion
¼ teaspoon dried dill
Dash cayenne pepper
Paprika
Yields six to eight servings
Preparation time: 5 minutes
Cooking time: 13½ to 16½ minutes.
Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power)
Place frozen broccoli in 2-quart microwave-safe baking dish; pour water over broccoli. Cover tightly with plastic wrap and microwave 9 to 11 minutes, or until broccoli is just tender. Stir to separate broc-

coli after 5 minutes; drain.

Crumble drained dolphin-safe tuna evenly over broccoli. Stir together soup, cheese, milk, mushrooms, lemon juice, onion, dill and cayenne pepper; pour evenly over tuna. Sprinkle with paprika and cover.

Microwave 4½ to 5½ minutes, or until heated through.

AU GRATIN TOMATO HALVES

4 large, ripe, fresh tomatoes
2 teaspoons crumbled dried sweet basil
1 teaspoon instant minced onion
1 teaspoon granulated sugar
¼ teaspoon salt
Dash of freshly ground pepper
4 tablespoons shredded sharp cheddar cheese
Yields eight servings
Preparation time: 5 minutes
Cooking time: 5 to 6 minutes

2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
4 ounces Provolone cheese, thinly sliced
1 tablespoon olive oil
¼ cup chopped pine nuts
1 clove minced garlic
1 cup fresh chopped spinach, well rinsed and drained
1 teaspoon crumbled dried leaf oregano.
Yields 4 servings
Preparation time: 5 to 10 minutes.
Cooking time: 9 to 14 minutes (plus 5 minutes standing time).
Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power).

Smooth mustard over each flattened chicken breast and cover with Provolone cheese. Set aside.

Mix olive oil, pine nuts and garlic in 1-quart microwave-safe baking dish; cover loosely with wax paper and microwave 2 minutes. Add spinach and oregano; cover tightly and microwave 1 to 2 minutes longer, or until spinach wilts.

Spoon spinach mixture in strips along 1 edge of chicken breasts and roll breasts up, with spinach mixture inside. Secure with wooden toothpick, if necessary.

Arrange rolls spoke-fashion on microwave-safe plate; cover loosely with wax paper and microwave 6 to 10 minutes, or until chicken is no longer pink, rearranging rolls halfway through cooking time. Let stand, covered, 5 minutes before serving.

Dual worlds collide for 'Miss Rose White'

Divided family clashes on reunion

Rose White arranged her life to fit the postwar American dream, complete with an advancing career at Macy's and the New York nightlife with the boy next door. But a family reunion shatters her illusions and returns her heritage. The Hallmark Hall of Fame presentation "Miss Rose White" airs Sunday, April 26, on NBC.

During the week, Rose (Kyra Sedgwick) climbs the Manhattan ladder alongside her Midwestern beau (D.B. Sweeney) and her fashionable friends. Every Friday night, however, Rose White reverts to Rayzel Weiss and goes to Brooklyn to share the Sabbath with her Polish/Jewish family. She has kept her dual worlds separate; her stern haberdasher father, Mordechai (Maximilian Schell), never visits her apartment and knows nothing of her Americanized identity. Rose enjoys practicing the Old World rituals with her loving aunt and uncle (Maureen Stapleton and Milton Selzer), but she is equally comfortable in her workaday ethnic denial.

Then Mordechai announces that Rose's long-lost sister Lusia (Amanda Plummer) has been rescued from a concentration camp and is coming to America, where she will live in Rose's apartment. Sketchy memories are triggered in Rose's mind of the separation from her now-deceased mother when she was 4 years old, and anxiety arises from the feeling that the Yiddish-speaking Lusia has no place in the world of career girl Rose White.

Lusia brings with her the answers to matters Rose had never questioned: Why did Mordechai leave his wife and Lusia behind when he and Rose immigrated to America, and more importantly,

what were their fates in Poland? The exposure of family secrets and shame that left heartbreaking chasms between father and daughters creates an intense drama that will leave no viewer unmoved.

Barbara Lebow's play "A Shayna Maidel" (A Pretty Maiden) was the source material for the teleplay, which was penned by Anna Sandor. According to executive producer Marian Rees, Sandor, whose mother narrowly escaped her Nazi captors while en route to a death camp, brought a "sense of integrity" to the project.

Rees chose Richmond, Va., for the settings of Manhattan, Brooklyn and Poland because of its varied ethnic base and its suitable architecture. (An old tobacco warehouse was used for an Ellis Island-type immigration center.) She gives credit to the detail-minded costumers and art department, and especially cites the artful composition of director Joseph Sargent, who worked wonders with the limitations of the locales. "We had a great opportunity to create not only the look but the authentic sense of people and place," Rees says.

Kyra Sedgwick ("Born on the Fourth of July," "Mr. and Mrs. Bridge") creates a believable Rose whose guarded assimilation into American society transforms into a fervent desire to reclaim her past. She learns forgiveness, acceptance and that her father was wrong when he claimed all he could give her was his name. Maximilian Schell ("The Man in the Glass Booth") constructs an intense man whose sealed years of unspoken grief and pain within a hard exterior. But Amanda Plummer, the acclaimed actress of stage ("Agnes of God"), screen ("The Fisher King") and television ("L.A. Law"), is most memorable as the catalyst Lusia whose abandonment and suffering have not stifled her compassion. For as Lusia tells her sister, despite the years and miles, "Love never dies."

Carlin back on HBO for live performance

Counterculture comedian George Carlin, who in the 1960s created stand-up characters such as the "Hippy-Dippy Weatherman," says his material is "absolutely not" relaxing into mainstream humor. "If anything has happened," he says, "the mainstream has come to me."

George Carlin Live at the Paramount, which will air live from the Madison Square Garden theater on Saturday, April 25, is Carlin's eighth HBO special since 1977. He reports that among the topics touched on will be "man's psychosexual need to prove his potency by fighting wars, and golf courses for the homeless, which is an attack on the upper class."

The former radio disc jockey began his stand-up career in 1960, developing his style in folk clubs and coffeehouses. The late '60s brought much exposure on TV and the first of many successful comedy albums. His ultimate goal of acting was best realized with his role in *Bill & Ted's Excellent Adventure* and its sequel, and then a fine turn in *Prince of Tides*.

Carlin derives his humor largely from the redundancies and oversimplifications of language. The social commentator strikes out against censorship and is amused by politics.

"I look on politics as a blood sport and high theater, and I enjoy it the same way I enjoy watching auto racing," Carlin says. "I'm in it for the accidents."

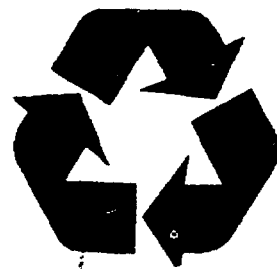

Networks' series ideas limp along same lines

Network programmers have always tried to keep up with the Joneses, and the prospects for next fall indicate nothing different. For example, NBC recently debuted *Mann & Machine*, a drama revolving around a female cyborg police officer. Now ABC has produced a fall pilot called *Running Delilah*, starring Kim Cattrall as a spy who is half-cyborg. Both stories focus on the characters' search for their human identity. Other programming trends are found in the following projects being developed by the networks.

Both NBC and ABC think a TV kids-show host would make a good subject for a sitcom, so you might see *Rise and Shine* on the peacock network and Griffin Dunne as *Graham* on ABC.

If you can't think of anything new, go to the past. ABC will produce a pilot for the drama *Charing Cross*, sort of a medieval *Bonanza* starring Ione Skye, while Fox goes for laughs in the Middle Ages with *Knight of the Realm*. CBS may try out two other centuries with the 1800's frontier drama *Medicine Woman*, starring Jane Seymour and Mel Harris, and Ryan O'Neal as an amusing Philadelphia innkeeper in the year 1775.

Next week, this column looks at more of the silly and serious pilots the networks hope will fly.

'Bedtime Stories' nothing to snooze at

Shelley Duvall, who's been producing original cable programming for the little person to these many years, is at it again. In a childlike voice that fluctuates between solemn whispers and squeaky exuberance, she introduces *Shelley Duvall's Bedtime Stories*, spotlighting two popular children's books per episode. The series premieres on Showtime Tuesday, April 19.

Duvall's previous success with *Faerie Tale Theatre* and *Tall Tales and Legends* paved the way for this series, which she also produces. But other than the brief observations she delivers from the midst of a pop-up book setting at the beginning and conclusion of the tales, Duvall's presence is secondary.

Primary consideration is wisely given to the delightful animation and narration, both of which brim with professionalism. From Jean Stapleton's New York dialect to Dudley Moore's unmistakably regal English, the voice-over cast Duvall assembles spins the animated tales as entertainingly as any of the actors picked to perform in her previous live-action series.

Duvall's stories are hand-picked from among the most cleverly written children's books available. At the end of the shows, she encourages kids to use their imaginations to draw pictures for stories of their own. In fact, the only thing this show may fail to do is put kids to sleep.

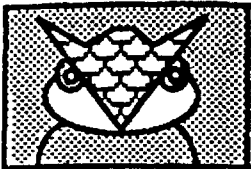

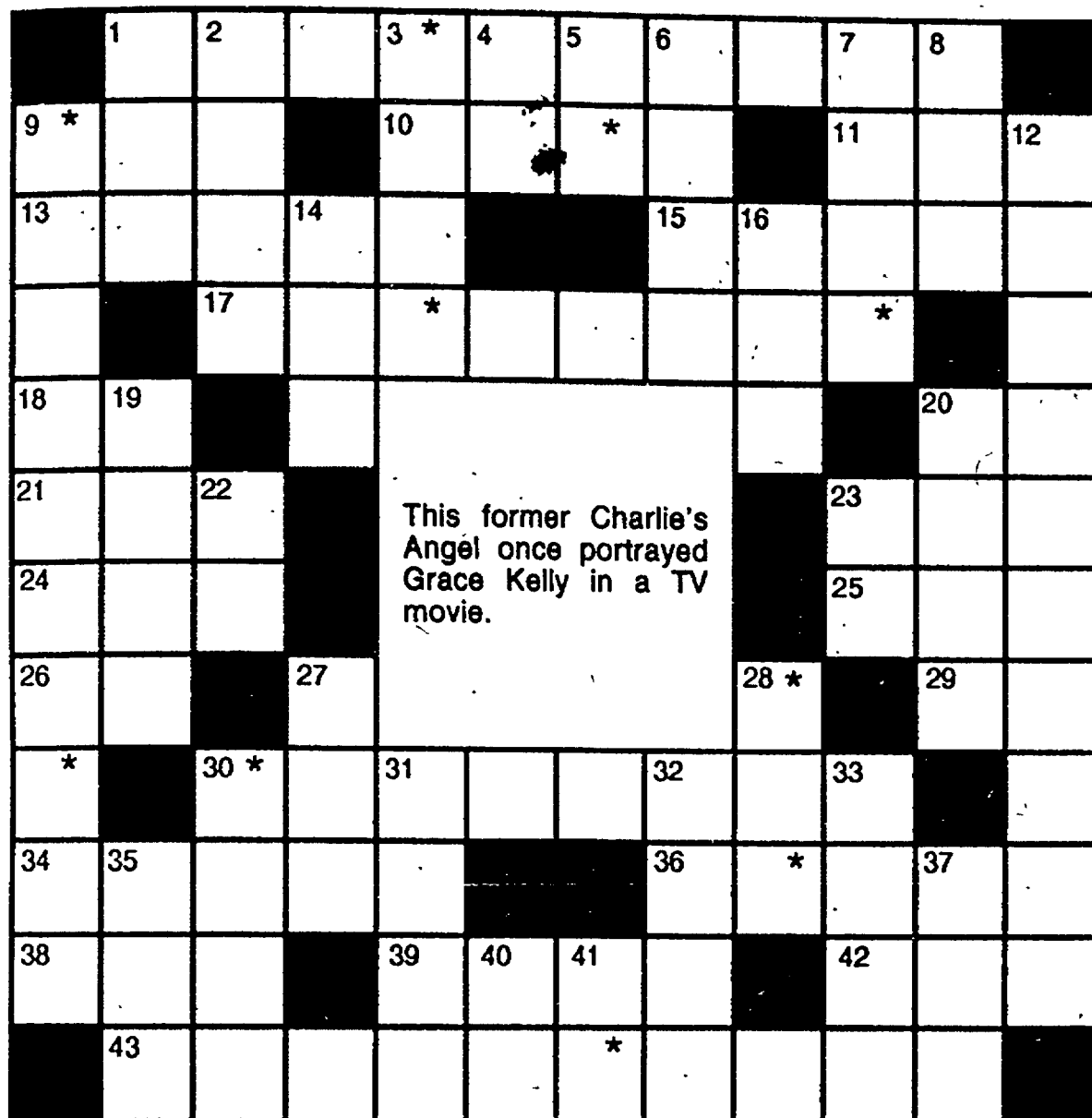

Future NBA stars play prep ball on CBS

Over the last decade Michael Jordan has become one of the most publicized athletes ever. So many people thrill to Jordan's NBA exploits and are eager to buy anything he eats, drinks or wears it's hard to imagine a time when practically nobody outside of Wilmington, N.C., had heard of him. That was before his first national exposure, in the McDonald's All-American high school basketball game.

Jordan is just one of many NBA stars to have played in the annual McDonald's classic since its inception in 1977. More than 97 percent have gone on to play major college ball, and 21 percent are playing in the NBA today. Selection committee chairman Morgan Wootten says those facts draw fans.

"From the fan's point of view, one of the biggest thrills they can imagine is being able to say that they saw a Magic Johnson or a Christian Laettner play high-school ball," says Wootten, who coaches DeMatha High School in Hyattsville, Md. "It gives them a chance to see some of the best players in the country compete in a game that raises money for worthy causes like Ronald McDonald House."

No one can say for sure that another Jordan will emerge from this year's game, which airs Saturday, April 25, on CBS' *Sports Sunday*. But with players like Jason Kidd, Rodrick Rhoades, Corliss Williamson and Othella Harrington on the rosters, it's possible.

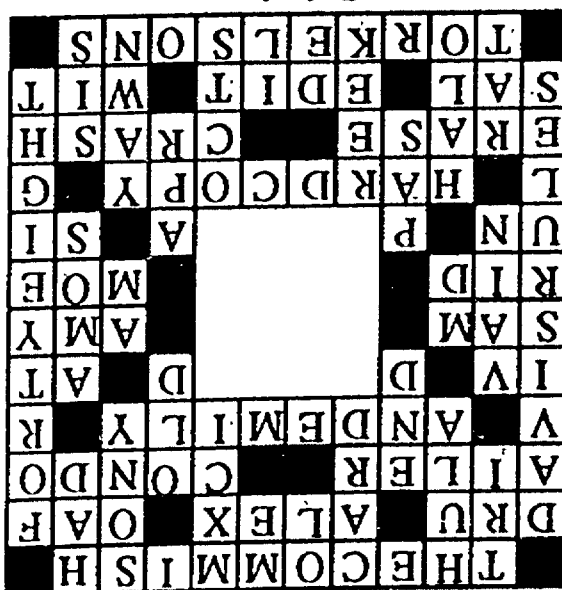

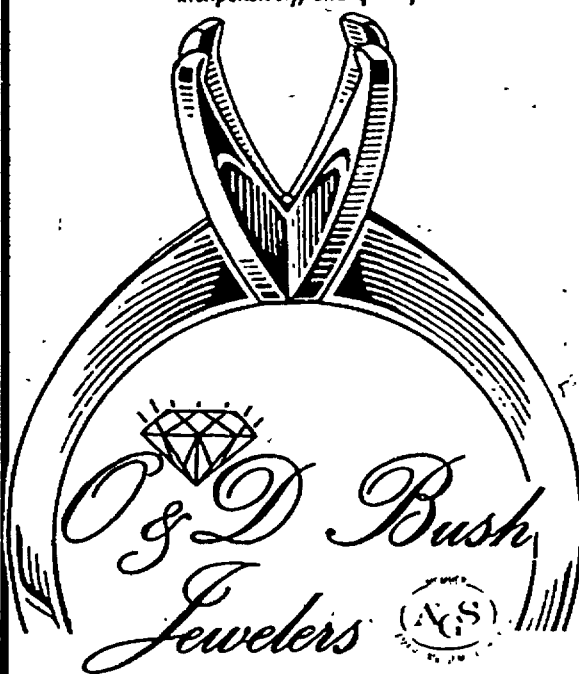

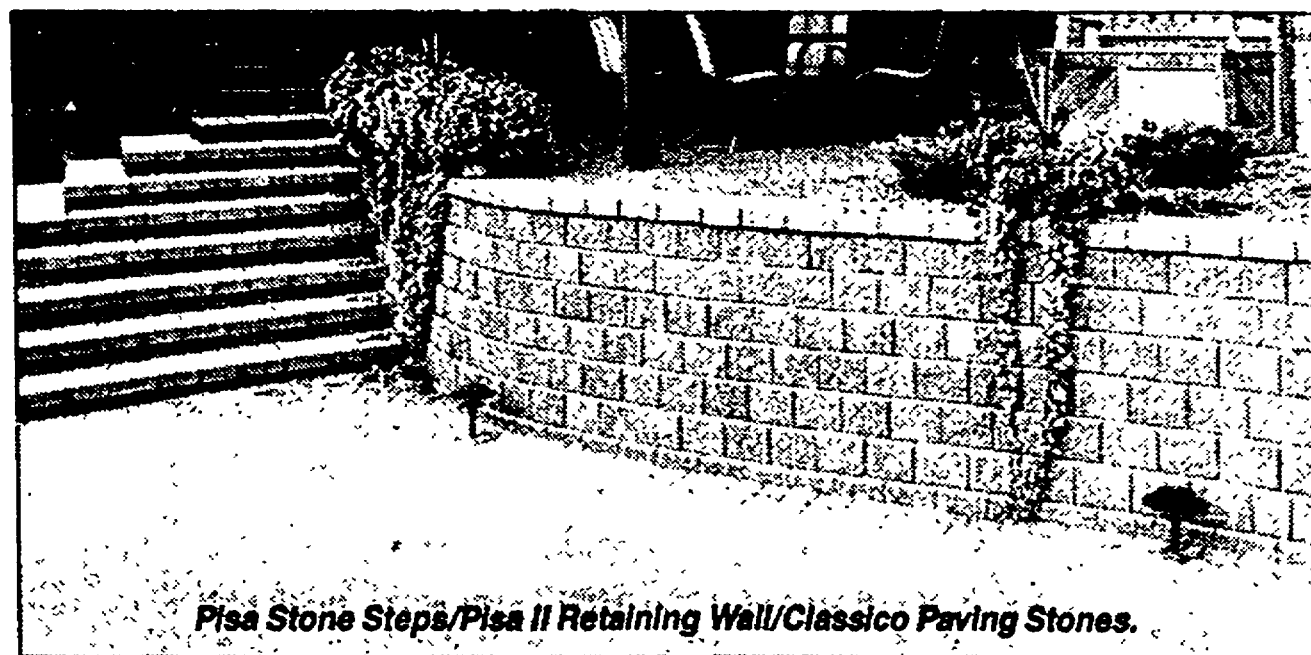
