## City hires part-time assessor

The city council may not know it yet, but Northville has a new hired hand.

Gail Zbranchik, an assessor who has worked in West Bloomfield and Livonia, was hired by the city on a one-year, \$18,720 contract. She began working for the city Tuesday.

City Manager Gary Word said the contract will be on tonight's (May 4) council agenda. "The hire was a week premature, but the city manager has that option, as I understand it," he said.

Zbranchik, a Level II assessor qualified to perform residential inspections, is performing field inspections of Wayne County homes under the direction of Chief Financial Of-

ficer Mark Christiansen. She is working a maximum of 24 hours per week.

Zbranchik's assignment is to correct "gross errors" in the past assessing of Wayne County residences, Christiansen said. He noted that the last full residential inspection was made in 1981.

Christiansen, who recommended Zbranchik for the position, said he first met her "through the assessing

circles." The city did not advertise for the contract, and did not seek bids.

City ordinances require the manager in most cases to "receive sealed bids for purchases or contracts in excess of \$1,000 and present them to the council for approval, and advise the council on the advantages or disadvantages of contract and bid proposals."

But exemptions are allowed for

"contracting for professional services."

According to Word, the city administration reviewed several options before settling on Zbranchik.

"We did look at at least two people, and considered going to an assessing firm," he said. "But Mark feels strongly, and I concur, that the two

## Creek gains 4,500 trout

Don't get out the rods, reels and flies just yet, but Northville took a big step last week toward housing a genuine trout stream.

The Johnson Drain, which snakes through much of the community, last Wednesday received 4,500 fingerling brown trout in five separate plants. Conducted by the Western Wayne County Conservation Association and the state Department of Natural Resources, the fish plantings realized a dream of association member Bob Laich.

"I thought (the plants) went fantastic. Everybody seemed to be so enthused about this happening," he said. "I heaved a deep sigh of relief when I saw the truck come in the driveway . . . I just thought, 'Wow. It's finally here.'"

While it's still not exactly the Big Two-Hearted River, the Johnson Drain fish plants demonstrate a dramatic improvement in water quality in the creek. It only recently became clean enough to possibly support trout, largely due to rescue efforts by members of the conservation association.

As part of the preparation work for the trout plants, the DNR found Johnson Drain already serves as a home to the red-sided dace, a small fish on the federal endangered species list.

The group's work is far from

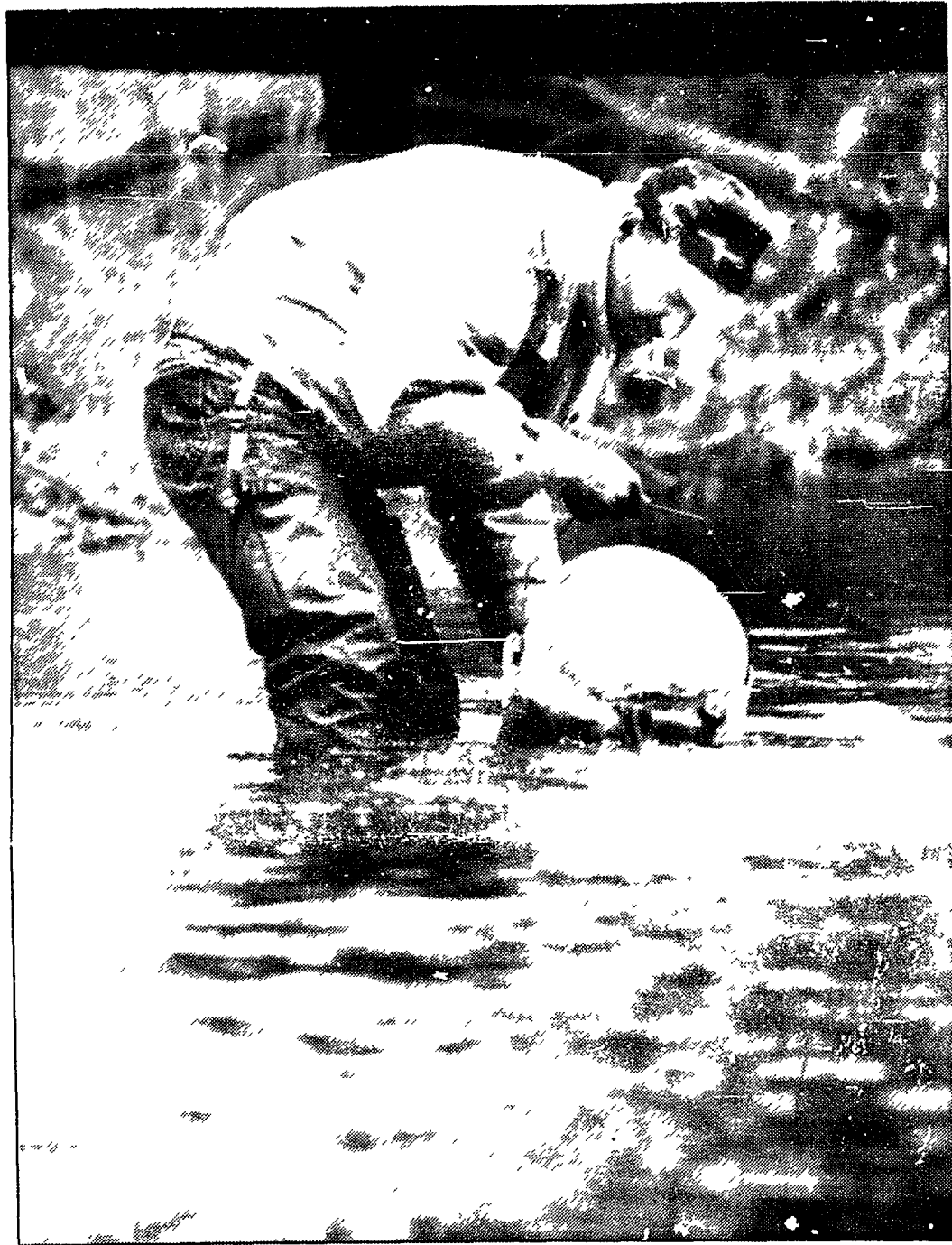

## Board rejects Holloway plan for mine, plant

The township board sided with its planning commission last Thursday and voted to reject Holloway Sand & Gravel Co.'s proposed 177-acre development.

Holloway cannot develop a sand and gravel mining operation or an asphalt plant on property the company owns at the southwest corner of Ridge and Six Mile roads, based on the board's approval of planning commission findings.

The last say may come from a circuit court judge, but local officials agreed that Holloway's plans were not in the township's best interests.

Holloway engineer Richard Zanotti said he was not surprised by the board's ruling. He said the company would discuss its options in coming days, and confirmed that litigation with the township is a possibility.

"That's one of the options, but I can't say it's the only option," Zanotti said.

Forty residents who squeezed into the township hall meeting room applauded the verdict. Many of those residents live within a mile of Holloway's proposed development.

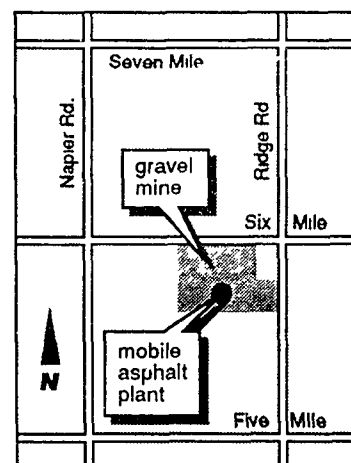
Most, like Blue Heron Pointe resident Bill Wood, thought a gravel mining operation and asphalt plant were out of character for the area.

"I moved over here not to live in an area that's heavy industrial," Wood said. "I'm very much against the gravel pit."

Others, like Ridge Ct. resident Eugene Reynders, worried about the proposed development's potential impact on the environment.

"This is the start of the Johnson Drain," Reynders said. "I think they're going to screw it up for the fish

they're putting in there" (referring to the recent stocking of brown trout fingerlings in the Johnson Drain; see related story).

The board's charge was to review and judge the planning commission's March findings that Holloway's gravel mining operation did not conform to township ordinance standards in four categories.

Deemed non-conforming were the issues of water quality, noise, future on-site land development, and property values.

Holloway disputed those claims at both the planning commission and township board levels, but failed to gain any support from township officials.

## Council finishes budget review

The city council wrapped up its review of the city's budget for fiscal year 1992/1993 Thursday night, but not without one council member rapping the results.

Council Member Jerry Mittman announced he is still opposed to the budget's proposed 4.2-mill increase for city operating expenses, and is still pushing the administration for more budget cuts and a smaller millage increase than approved in the 2½-year deficit reduction plan designed to erase a \$1-million shortfall.

The 4.2-mill increase, which along with a string of layoffs is a cornerstone of the city's deficit reduction plan, is part of a proposed 3.61-mill overall hike for the city's operating millage. The total is lower because of a .3-mill reduction for street reconstruction bonds from last year, and the fact that South Main Street paving bonds were paid off last year with a .35-mill levy.

The total city millage of 17.55 is 25 percent more than last year's total 13.94-mill levy.

Mittman argued that the admini-

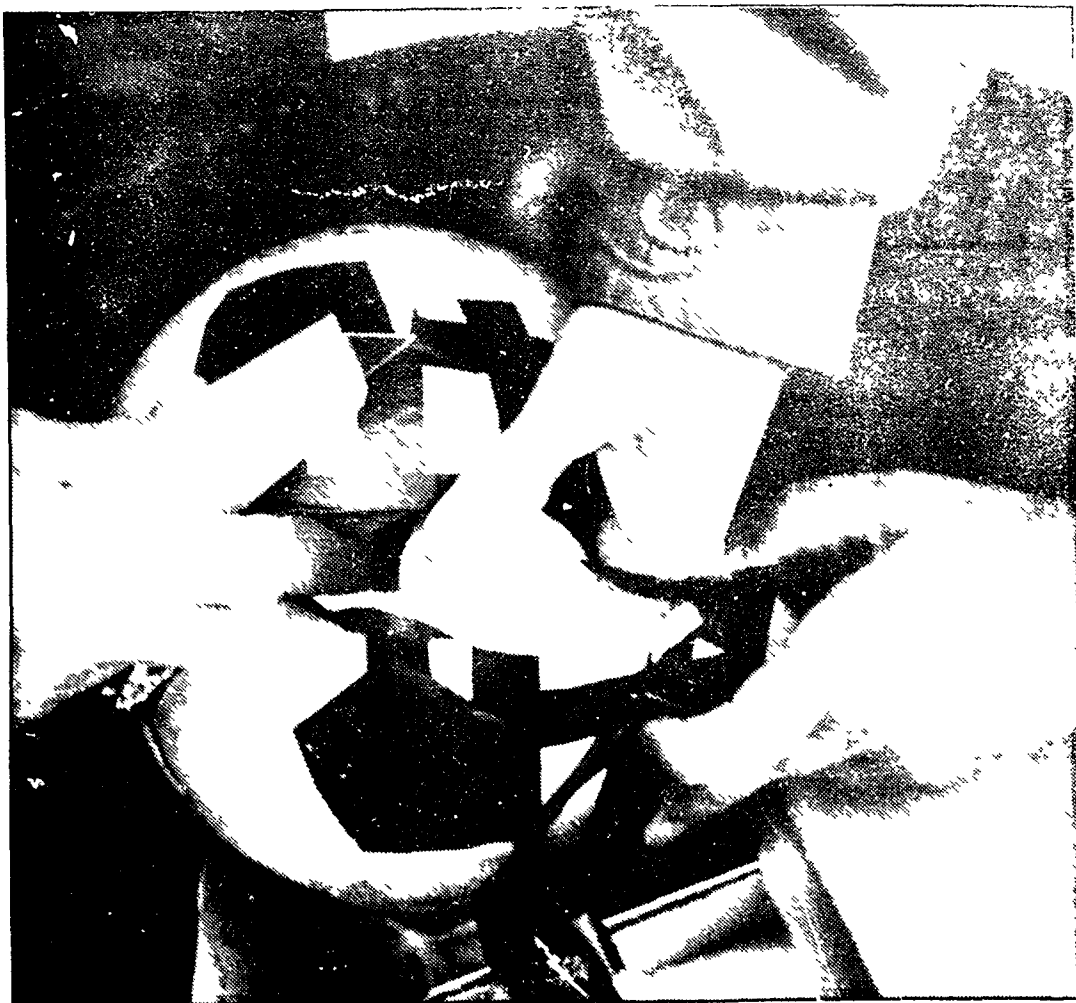

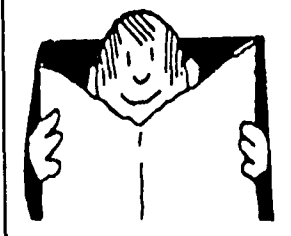

# Middle schools recognized

Northville's two middle schools will be among just four schools nationwide to participate in a national study on gifted education.

Meads Mill and Cooke middle schools were chosen as a single entry from a list of 20 exemplary middle schools to be studied by a committee of experts in the field of gifted education, said Gayle Fountain, the district's gifted-student facilitator.

On May 20 and 21 two of the committee members will make a visit to the district to talk with key people involved in the creation, implementation, and assessment of the middle school's program.

The object of the study committee is to document case studies of selected schools to see how gifted students are being accommodated within the framework of the middle school program. The study is being conducted under the auspices of the Gifted Education Policy Studies program (GEPSP). That program is a three-year federal grant program that is under the direction of James

Gallagher, a well-known name and author in gifted education circles who works at The Carolina Institute for Child and Family Policy.

Fountain said the Northville middle school program came highly recommended and was singled out from other district's middle school programs because it answered the committee's call for the ideal school.

Fountain said the committee was looking for exemplary schools which successfully met the affective needs of the gifted student, allowed gifted students to pace themselves, encouraged interdisciplinary learning and team teaching, and showed evidence of outcomes based education and critical thinking, all under the umbrella of the middle school.

"What was appealing to the committee was that our program was well-thought-out, well-researched, and catered to the individual needs of the gifted student without interrupting the mainstream classes," Fountain said.

Northville's middle schools are one of only a few middle schools who have successfully integrated

its gifted program, ALPS (Alternative Learning Programs for Students), into the middle schools. Recognition of the program comes on the heels of the ALPS program celebrating its own middle school milestone, Fountain said.

Today's sixth-graders are the ALPS program's pilot students from four years ago when the gifted education program made its debut at the elementary level, she said. Those ALPS students now in the sixth grade were once the test group that launched the program, that now has brought the district national recognition.

When ALPS kids are mainstreamed into regular middle school curriculum, teachers in the middle schools spend their in-service days learning to plan alternative activities and projects that complement the lesson plan but provide additional challenges for these high achievers.

"Our middle school teaching teams develop different plans, plans with options for these students," Fountain said. "We provide different kinds of activities because these kids still have to study, but the activities are more challenging and are tailored to meet those kids' needs."

## Apartment rape suspect arraigned on charges

A former Northville apartment complex maintenance worker was arraigned last week on multiple rape and breaking and entering charges.

Ronald Dale Johnson, 27, stood mute before 35th District Court Judge John MacDonald last Thursday and listened to charges that he violently bound and raped a 24-year-old woman in her Swan Harbour Apartments home early April 8.

MacDonald entered not-guilty pleas for Johnson on seven counts of criminal sexual conduct and one count of breaking and entering and ordered him held without bond in the Wayne County Jail.

A preliminary examination was scheduled for 9 a.m. May 8 at 35th district Court.

Johnson was in court a day after police shipped him to Northville Township from Leon County, Florida. Johnson had been held in Florida since April 11, when he was arrested outside a rest area for driving with a suspended license.

A computer check revealed that Johnson was wanted in Northville for the alleged rape. He reportedly had fled Michigan and traveled to Oklahoma and east again to Florida before his arrest.

Swan Harbour Apartments is located north of Seven Mile Road and east of Northville Road. Township police say Johnson used an apartment complex pass key to unlock the woman's apartment door and then used wire

cutters to snip a door chain before entering the apartment.

Once inside, the man reportedly bound the woman with duct tape and repeatedly sexually assaulted her. At one point, the woman's young child was awakened and entered her mother's room during the assault.

According to the woman's statement, Johnson told the woman to tell the child to leave the room or he would kill them both. The woman told police Johnson rubbed a long-bladed knife over her body during the assault.

Police later found a knife hidden in the toilet tank in the woman's bathroom.

Police said Johnson first threw the alleged victim's bedsheet into a bathtub filled with water. He later dragged the bound woman into the bathroom and threw

her in the bathtub with the sheets, police charge.

The woman, reportedly suffering cuts and abrasions from the alleged attack, eventually was able partially free herself and called police. She later told police that Johnson once had helped her move furniture in the apartment while he held the maintenance position.

Johnson reportedly slept at a nearby apartment for a short time following the alleged incident, and left town after realizing that police were searching for him, according to police reports.

Johnson reportedly lost his job at Swan Harbour Apartments in March, while serving a month-long stint in the Lenawee County Jail. Police said he was serving a sentence for failure to pay child support.

## Breen, McCotter face off for seat on Wayne County Commission

Incumbent Maurice Breen faces a challenge from Schoolcraft College Trustee Thaddeus McCotter for the Republican nomination for Northville's Wayne County Commission seat.

Breen formally announced his candidacy for the 10th District seat on Thursday. McCotter had earlier announced he expected to challenge Breen.

No Democrat has yet declared as a candidate for the seat, considered to represent a largely Republican area. The district includes Northville Township, the City of Northville south of Baseline Road, Plymouth city and township, and Livonia.

The deadline to file as a candidate is May 12.

Breen, an attorney, was appointed to the Wayne County Commission in August 1991, succeeding Susan Heintz of Northville Township who resigned to become regional director for Gov. John Engler. He is, as Heintz was, the only Republican on the 15-member commission.

"With my county experience, I believe I have generated the kind of ability and trust that voters want in this position," Breen said in a prepared statement. "I look forward to the next full term as commissioner."

Breen serves on the commission as a member of the committee on roads, airports, and public services, committee on audit, committee on economic development, and committee on public safety and judiciary.

When appointed to the commission, Breen had been Plymouth Township supervisor for 11 years, with a previous two-year term in 1970-72. He was also a Plymouth Township trustee from 1968-70 and from 1976-80.

Breen is chairperson emeritus of the Conference of Western Wayne, past chairperson of the Western Townships Utilities Authority, past president/treasurer of the Wayne County Association of Township Supervisors, former chair of the Plymouth Township Economic Development Corporation, and former member of the executive committee of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

Noting that the total county budget approximates \$1.5 billion, Breen said, "Wayne County government is big business; big enough to require an experienced, dedicated and capable decision-maker. I am glad to have extensive experience to apply while facing that challenge and responsibility."

Calling himself a reform candidate, Livonia resident McCotter — also an attorney — poses Breen's only challenge so far.

McCotter plans to use Breen's involvement with WTUA as a campaign issue, questioning the official's role in the network of political allies which created the sewer system to serve Northville, Plymouth and Canton townships.

"It's a question of public interest," said McCotter. "I'm not saying these people are criminals, but you do expect more from your public officials." McCotter also said he wouldn't seek contributions from political action committees.

McCotter has been a Schoolcraft trustee since 1989.

The University of Detroit Law School graduate is also chairperson of the Wayne 2nd District GOP organization, a grassroots fund-raising and campaign unit for Republican candidates in the Northville/Livonia/Plymouth area.

McCotter said he is leaving the GOP 2nd District post to run for the county commission.

McCotter, son of Livonia Clerk Joan McCotter, has also been involved in city politics.

Last year, he headed a charter amendment drive that altered the way city council vacancies are filled.

The controversial Western Townships Utility Authority sewer project is expected to play a major role in the Breen/McCotter race. Those facing charges of nepotism and political cronyism include Breen, whose brother worked on project land acquisition.

Similar charges were raised about current Plymouth Supervisor Gerald Law, whose brother's law firm performed project legal work. Law is a longtime ally who replaced Breen as supervisor.

Law denied allegations against all involved parties at a March press conference. Law also said the estimated \$2.7 billion sewer project, which ties into the Ypsilanti treatment plant, would save money for property owners in the three townships, compared with neighboring communities that tie into the Detroit plant. Potential savings are the focus of a separate, though related, controversy.

County commission districts await review by the Michigan Supreme Court, though little variation is expected from revised boundaries approved this month by a county apportionment panel. Districts were revised due to the 1990 census.

## Archdiocese still plans to sell seminary site

No matter how a court case is decided on the former St. John Seminary on Five Mile Road, the Archdiocese of Detroit plans to sell it.

"It's the intention of the Archdiocese to sell the property pending the resolution of the case," said church spokesperson Richard Laskos.

His comment followed U.S. District Judge Averil Cohn's action April 6, to continue a hearing on a dispute over the property.

Judge Cohn is expected to rule in the dispute as early as this month.

In October 1990, the Archdiocese terminated a \$5.5 million purchase agreement signed with Retirement and Health Services Corp. of Baltimore, Md., to convert the buildings into senior citizen housing.

The Baltimore firm sued the church, charging it broke the purchase agreement, while the Archdiocese maintains it can legally end the agreement.

Shortly after the agreement was terminated, church officials said a new buyer had been identified. But during the past year, church officials say they haven't identified a potential buyer.

There has been speculation that Livonia's Ward Presbyterian Church was interested, as church officials toured the seminary in 1991.

And because Detroit Tigers owner Tom Monaghan is a high-profile Catholic, there has been speculation he might seek to locate a new Tiger stadium on the property, near M-14 and I-275 and therefore accessible to metro Detroit motorists.

But former Plymouth Township Supervisor Maurice Breen and the township board passed a resolution proclaiming no Tiger Stadium would be built there, to end speculation. "It's not the type of facility we encourage in Plymouth Township," he said then.

Does Retirement and Health Services Corp. still plan a facility there if they win the case? "I certainly would like to take a look at it again," said John Erickson, president of the firm.

"I haven't talked to township officials for more than a year; I want to make sure where they would be on it," he said.

The 40-year-old seminary was closed in June 1988. The land is zoned residential, for one-acre or larger lots. Plymouth Township officials have said a buyer could seek another use for the property, as it's not likely to go to a house builder.

Plymouth Township officials last year assessed the site including buildings — 175 acres at Sheldon near Five Mile Road — at about \$3 million.

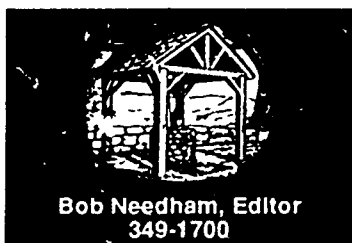

### Cutbacks should not curtail public access

With city residents facing higher taxes and fewer services, and city employees being laid off en masse, who should be worried about a few less pages of city council minutes?

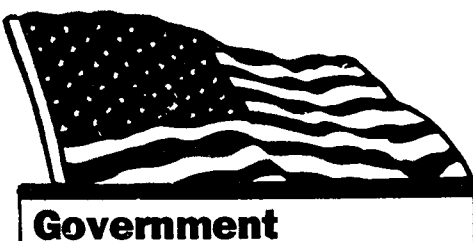
The public, that's who.

The most recent targets for trimming at city hall are the records kept of city council meetings. Staff members want to cut back the time and space devoted to compiling the documents, arguing that detailed minutes are an undue burden given their ever-increasing workloads, and that such detail is not required by law.

The theory makes sense from a fiscal standpoint, but it gives the jitters to anyone with a deep interest in the workings of local governments. Any reduction in the amount or quality of those available squeezes the amount of information to which the public can turn after the fact.

Say your local council member is growing increasingly out of touch with his or her constituents, or is losing grasp of the issues. Or what if said council member's opinions consistently come down in favor of a particular developer, who is later shown to be a prime contributor to that official's campaign chest?

Without either great notes or a detailed file of council minutes through which to track the member's actions, or both, such a situation could go forever



undiscovered.

We're not suggesting any such misapprehensions or malfeasance among the present crop of city officials.

But if evidence to that effect arises at some later date, about anyone, we'll want the most detailed records available to prove or disprove that possibility. If the city officials are aboveboard, we imagine they would want the same thing.

We urge the council and administration to reconsider their decision to cut back on the public record. If the staff cannot continue to devote as much time to the process, then at the very least the city should invest in some cassette tapes and a file cabinet to store audiotapes of back meetings for at least a year. Northville Township operates on that system, and it seems to work.

It's a small price to pay to keep the public informed.

### Awards recognize many contributions

Sometimes, good work gets recognized.

Sometimes, a person who makes a significant contribution to a community or a profession gets identified and honored so the general public may become more aware of the accomplishments. All too often that doesn't happen; recognition never comes. But sometimes, even when it's not sought out, the deserved recognition does arrive. Twice.

Frances Hopp, Northville's housing director since 1978, recently earned two awards for her pioneering work with senior citizens. The honors are well-deserved.

To the community at large, Hopp operates in a sort of anonymity. She probably has less visibility than most, or all, of the other department heads in the city and township.

That doesn't mean her work isn't important; it's vital. With the oversight Housing Commission, Hopp runs Allen Terrace, Northville's important senior housing project. That's only the start, however.

Long active in senior citizen concerns, Hopp was in on the ground floor of The Senior Alliance, this area's official organization for senior programs; and of the Northville Area Senior Citizens Advisory Council. She's been active in other orga-

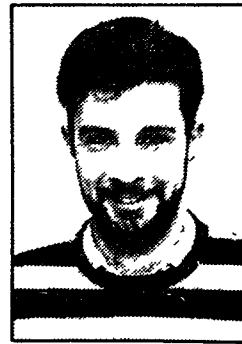
nizations, even serving as a delegate to the White House Conference on Aging in 1976. She served as housing director in Plymouth before coming to Northville, and in 1976 became the first certified housing manager in all of the United States.

That's not the full list of Hopp's accomplishments, but you get the idea. Her impressive record earned her a prestigious area Jefferson Award for community service earlier this year, and more recently she won the Edward H. McNamara Award from the Senior Alliance.

It's hard to imagine anyone more deserving of the honors. Congratulations and best wishes.

### Different sides of the coin



I was there the night Ronald Melnyk was killed.

Who is Ronald Melnyk, you ask? Well, word had it that if you lived in Novi and you liked cocaine, you were probably on a first-name basis with him. Melnyk was a mid-level coke dealer who lived in Westland but dealt in Novi.

He died just about a year ago in the parking lot of the Northville Township Meijer store, shot in his car by undercover narcotics officers as he tried to flee a dope sting.

When I went in the store to buy groceries everything was fine. When I came out, the north end of the parking lot was ablaze with flashing police lights. It was an eye-opener in more ways than one.

Melnik, police told us, had gotten spooked when officers on foot closed in on his vehicle. He fled, and in doing so, ran into two officers, causing minor injuries. For that he was killed.

And justly so, according to investigators.

After months of investigation, the Wayne County prosecutor's office told us that if an officer thinks you're trying to run him over with your car, he has the right to do anything up to and including killing you.

An outrage? To some folks maybe, and at first I thought it was. But for a police officer, who could be blown away by a guy he pulls over for speeding (as happened to a state trooper in Detroit last fall), the realities of the situation are seen through different eyes.

They are eyes that can be hardened to view every traffic stop, every call to a domestic quarrel, as potentially life-threatening. Can any one of us comprehend what it's like to live a life where it pays to shoot first and ask questions later, and the dividend is simply the right to live to a ripe old age?

So my view of the Rodney King court decision is somewhat jaundiced as well.

Again, the word "outrage" has appeared in newspaper headlines and statements from civic leaders. I agree with

them that something went terribly wrong when officers laid into King and struck him 50 or more times. And I also believe justice has not been served in this case, though there are still opportunities.

Were the officers guilty? Probably not of the crime with which they were charged. The assault charge required the prosecution to prove an intent to commit criminal wrongdoing, which it could not — at least not against an officer acting in the line of duty.

Laurence Powell, who delivered the majority of the beating seen in the now-famous video tape, was charged with unnecessary use of force, and the jury deadlocked, 8-4 for conviction. He may yet be retried, and he may yet be brought up on federal civil rights charges.

But in the eyes of the law, the eyes of the jury and most importantly the eyes of police officers, the behavior of the other officers may not have been all that outrageous.

Was King beaten without provocation? No, jurors who've spoken said evidence on the video tape (apart from the bite-size pieces we've been fed by the TV news) and in testimony showed that Rodney King acted in such a way that could have provoked the officers. As in the Melnyk case, officers are given great latitude when provoked.

Would they have kicked and beat King so mercilessly if he was a white guy?

Tough to say, but Ronald Melnyk was a white guy and the police killed him. No one blamed 'em either.

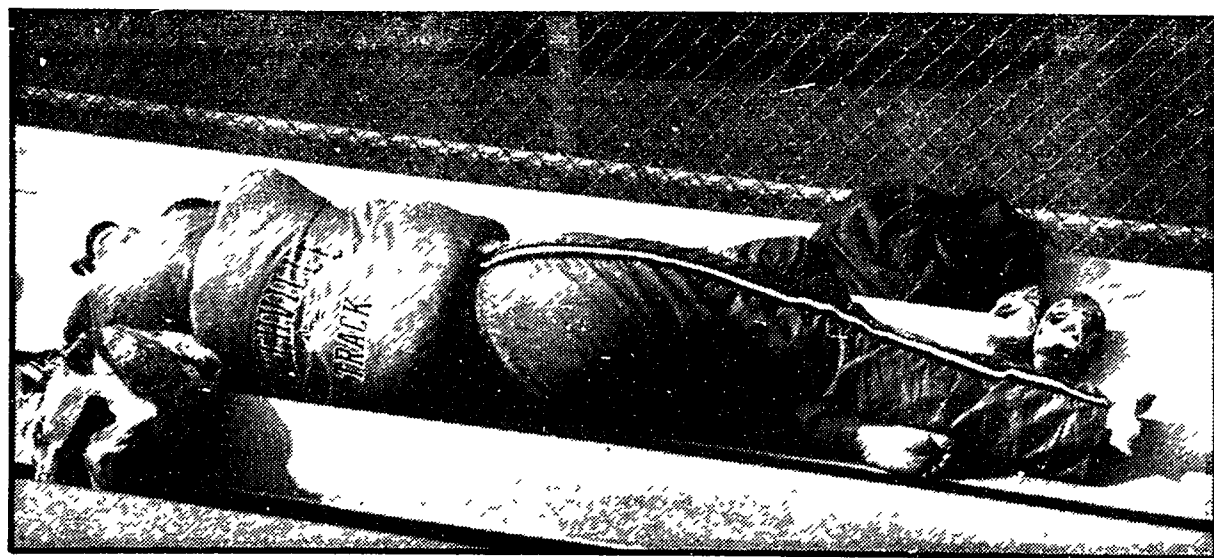
No, I would not want to be Rodney King, prostrate on the ground while four big guys with sticks beat me and kicked me.

No more than I'd like to be a police officer in South Central Los Angeles, where life is cheaper than a \$10 vial of crack — and every traffic stop or call to a domestic quarrel could be deadly.

It's a different culture, that of the L.A. police officer — and that of the ghetto motorist just trying to get through another day. It's as remote in lifestyle as it is in distance from our own safe, suburban haven.

But as Ronald Melnyk showed us, it's not so far away as we'd like.

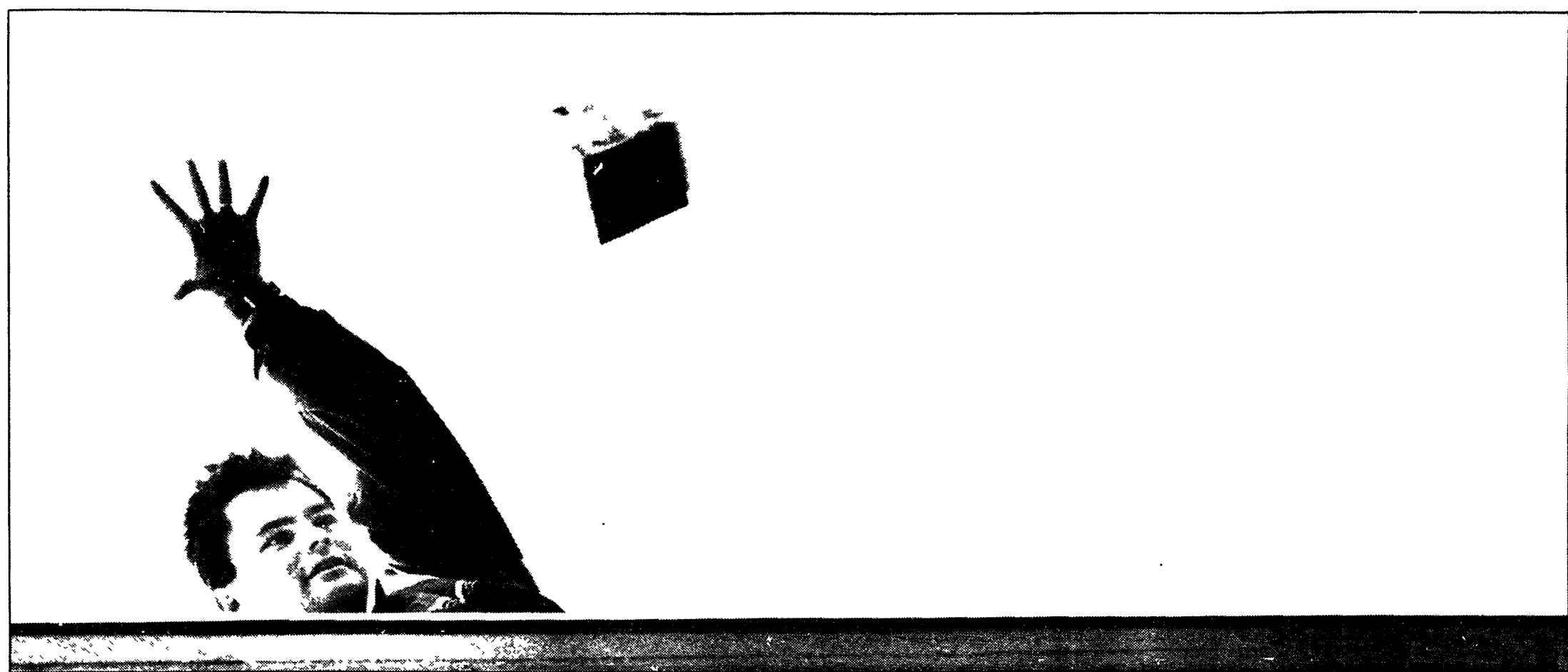

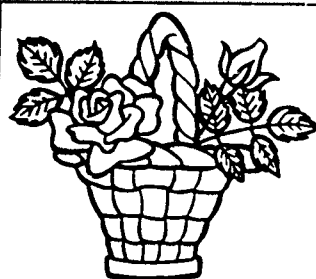

# Hiring for new position disturbs some city employees

Northville City's newest hire joins a shrinking contingent at city hall. That fact does not sit well with current city employees. Gail Zbranchuk, an assessor hired to inspect the city's residential properties, began work Tuesday under a one-year, \$18,720 contract. Her employment follows a string of layoffs, work reduc-

tions and deferred pay raises among full-time employees at city hall. Bill Edgar, representative of the Northville Police Officers Association, criticized the hiring and questioned why the assessing work could not be performed by existing city employees, particularly Chief Financial Officer Mark Christiansen. Christiansen was hired two years ago to reassess city properties but has since acted in several other roles. "The timing's poor, very poor," Edgar said. "It seems

strange to hire a full-time assessor and not have him do any assessing. . . If you have somebody on board that can do the job, why hire somebody else?" The hire also may signal a rocky start to the city's contract negotiations with the patrol officers' union, Edgar added. "We're willing to work with them," he said, "but it's awful hard to work with somebody when people on our team are traded away to make room for someone on another team."

Carol Butske, secretary/treasurer for the city's clerical union, echoed Edgar's concerns. "It certainly is not something we are happy about," she said. "We would prefer to have not seen that happen, but it's not something which we can control." The move is another blow to morale among existing city employees, she added. "I know there was a general undertone of disappointment" over the contract at city hall, she said. "From a morale standpoint, it isn't the best."

people who were most interested were local, qualified, and understood the nature of the types of properties in Northville." Christiansen himself was hired on a two-year contract in April 1990 to reassess the city's commercial prop-

erties and residences. That project lagged as the assessor temporarily filled a number of other roles, from interim city manager to coordinator of the city's new refuse/recycling program. "My goal is to make sure that the records are correct," Christiansen said of the new hire. "I've got a legal

obligation . . . the assessing requirement hasn't gone away." Christiansen was promoted in January to the newly-created positions of chief financial officer and office manager, as part of a staff reorganization that cost Deputy City Clerk Tonni Burns her position and saw Finance Director Beverly Walters de-

moted to the non-departmental post of chief accountant/system manager. The reorganization also included the loss of one and a half clerk's positions, but the clerical union agreed to a 10-percent reduction in work hours and resulting wages to save one full-time position.

The shakeup followed the announced layoffs of two full-time and four part-time police officers and a Department of Public Works employee, and the administration's decision not to hire a proposed deputy city manager. Contracting for assessing services was one item included in the reorganization plan, Word said. "It was implicit as part of that (plan) that assessing field work would be contracted out," he said. "It

was never, under the reorganization plan, understood that Mark would be doing that." The city contracted out for the position due to the lack of qualified people in-house, Word added. "I don't know of anybody on staff that's qualified to do it," he said. "If someone's got a Level II assessor running around, I'd like to know about it. So it's something we've got to go outside for."

done, Laich said. Members still plan considerable bank restoration and creation of better habitat areas in the stream itself. More basic cleanup is also needed, he added, but the trout addition is the best development in years. "I was just pleased with everything that came down," Laich said. He again praised the efforts of the DNR's Liz Hay, who worked hard to accomplish the plants. "We've got a start. To me, this is something (about which) both counties and the townships can be pleased." The trout are about a year and a half old, too small yet for catching. A survival rate of 10 percent will be considered good; 20 percent, excellent. Laich and the conservation association also plan to attack another front of creek protection: transferring the drain to a formal classification as a stream. As a drain, Wayne and Washtenaw counties hold jurisdiction over the creek. Its function, as far as the government is concerned, is to gather runoff rain water and carry it to the Middle Rouge River. As an official stream, the watercourse would come under the jurisdiction of the DNR. Any discharges into it, including storm runoff, would be much more closely regulated, Laich said. Such a change would require approval from Wayne County, Washtenaw County, and the state Department of Agriculture, he added. Ironically, the Johnson Drain suffered a raw sewage spill just five days before the fish plants.

"Thank God that was downstream from (the planting areas)," Laich said. "It should have been gone by the time we put the fish in." The spill took place in the Fish Hatchery Park area. The trout plants were near Fish Hatchery, at

Six Mile between Beck and Ridge roads, at Five Mile near the railroad tracks east of Napier, at Napier near North Territorial, and near Five Mile between Currie and Curtis roads. The Johnson Drain begins in

Salem Township west of Currie, angles southeast to Napier Road near North Territorial, then heads northeast through western Northville Township. It empties into the Middle Rouge River just south of Northville Downs.

Board members will staff seven phone lines at the school offices from 7-9 p.m. Thursday in an attempt to get residents to call in, ask questions and give the board some direction for the upcoming millage question. "We are hoping it will help us understand why the millage failed and help us to restructure the proposal for the June 8 ballot," said Dolly McMaster, assistant superintendent for instructional services. Board members said the phone survey is an ideal avenue for residents to call in, offer some suggestions, and be heard. "Our hope is that we can hear what the community is really saying and find out from them why it failed," said Board Member Carol Rahimi. "We need input now so we if we have to cut programs, we can find out what does the community think we should cut." The idea for the survey surfaced in a cabinet meeting of district officials Wednesday morning, the morning after the demise of the proposal, McMaster said. The district had sought a 2.78-mill increase on top of its current levy of 22.63 mills. The proposal failed Tuesday by more

than a 3-1 margin. "I think it's a good idea for the time frame we have to work with," said board Vice President Glenna Davis. "For the short time we have available, this allows us the maximum input from the most people." Davis said the board considered holding a public meeting to address the issue, but that proved not feasible with board members' conflicting schedules. Since the millage proposal failed, Davis said, she has heard people talk about all the misinformation that surrounded the millage campaign. "I was hearing a lot of people who had misinformation — even people who were in education. This way people can get the facts and their questions answered, and feel like they've been heard." Board members will be available from 7-9 p.m. at any of the following seven phone numbers: 344-8440; 344-8441; 344-8442; 344-8443; 344-8444; 344-8494; and 344-8451. If residents cannot call in Thursday, district officials urge voters to jot their comments down and drop them off at the administrative offices before 4 p.m. on May 7.

nistration should reopen contract negotiations with the city's clerical and Department of Public Works unions, to seek further wage concessions from them. The city is currently renegotiating its contract with the police unions, and the budget is based on no pay raise for police in the coming year. "Assume zero wage increases (for all employees), either through contract renegotiations or layoffs," Mittman said. "My feeling is we should reopen those contracts, and ask for a deferral (in pay raises). . . If we don't get a deferral, then we'll have to look at other cuts, and those may include personnel cuts." The city's unions had already agreed to defer contracted pay raises for six months in 1991/1992. Mittman also recommended taking an additional 5-10 percent off all discretionary non-labor items. He charged the administration with working out the details, repeating his oft-heard catch phrase, "We need to challenge ourselves" in slightly different form. "I'd like to challenge the admini-

stration to go through the budget one more time," Mittman said. "I still feel . . . that 4.2 mills is more than we should be going for." But some city officials said they have already been challenged enough. "I personally feel that we need a year with the layoffs that we have," Mayor Pro Tem Carolann Ayers said. "I don't think we can say that we've felt the full impact of the layoffs yet." Ayers also objected to basing a budget figure and millage on potential contract agreements. Chief Financial Officer Mark Christiansen, too, said that his staff has already been "challenged" by the cuts. He noted that city hall's layout was an inefficient one, and that in better economic times he would advocate a reorganizing the department locations and work spaces to foster greater efficiency. "Somehow we're going to have to muddle along in the inefficient manner that we are, and any further cuts would make it even more inefficient," he said. "Well, I guess I don't have a lot of pity, because that's the real world right now," Mittman said.

terminated that Holloway did not provide sufficient information to judge the merits of an asphalt plant targeted for the site. Holloway representatives agreed that the company did not provide information the township was seeking under its new asphalt plant ordinance. However, the firm said the township should have reviewed its asphalt

plant application when the plan was introduced in April 1991. "Holloway disagrees with the procedure the township has outlined," said Kristine Andonian, a Holloway engineer. "We don't believe the (new ordinance) applies to us." The township approved an asphalt plant ordinance at a hastily arranged meeting last December, days after Holloway filed a complaint in circuit court.

Holloway accused the township of foot dragging at that time, and the court eventually directed the township planning commission to decide the two issues at March meetings. Zanoliti said Holloway will decide soon on its next approach. "We need to make a decision very quickly," he said. "We have an asphalt plant (in Salem Township) that needs to come out at the end of the season."

"We have to know where it's going to go," he said. Only four of seven township board members attended the meeting. Supervisor Betty Lennox and trustees James Nowka, Donald Williams, and Richard Allen voted to accept the planning commission's recommendation. Clerk Tom Cook, Treasurer Jack Hosmer, and Trustee Thomas Handyside were absent.

## Batter up: How to make a good pancake

A pancake should be more than a sponge to soak up butter and syrup. A pancake should be tender, slightly moist and moderately dense. A bad pancake tastes like raw dough or cardboard and has a texture that's gummy, tough and chewy. Pancakes lend themselves to many occasions, as an hors d'oeuvre, for breakfast, lunch or dinner; or to glamorize leftovers. Pancakes are very versatile; you can stuff, roll or glaze them.

Making pancake batter yourself is just as easy as a mix; besides, homemade tastes better. If you are interested in lower fat, calories, cholesterol and sodium, make your own batter and leave out the egg yolk, salt, sugar and some of the fat. Use skim milk as the liquid. Buttermilk gives the pancake a little tang and makes them extra tender. Making these changes will make the batter a little thinner but then you will be, too.

No matter what name you use, blintzes, crepes, flapjacks, johnnycake, griddlecakes or batter cakes, they are all made with a thin mixture called a "pour batter." This means that the liquid and dry ingredients are about equal and they are just wet enough to be pourable.

Pour batters are usually classified as a quick bread because they do not use yeast as the leavening agent. The exception is the popular Russian blini which is a yeast-risen buckwheat pancake. These are usually made in a smaller size and are topped with sour cream and chutney, sour cream and herring, smoked trout or with butter and caviar.

There are three very important things to have to make the perfect pancake. First, the consistency of the batter is important. Dry ingredients such as flour, baking powder or soda, salt, sugar and other spices are blended together, mix the liquid ingredients together, and quickly add into the dry ingredients. Then just give it a few quick strokes to moisten the dry ingredients. A batter bowl which is a large liquid measuring cup is a very convenient way to make pancake batter, as it can be easily poured from this on the griddle.

Forget about the lumps; do not overbeat! For just a basic pancake recipe, for best results mix the dough and then let it rest, covered and refrigerated the night before. If the batter gets too thick, dilute with a little water; if too thin, add a little flour. For a very light and delicate finished product separate the eggs. Add the yolk with other liquids and beat the egg whites to fold into the batter as the last step.

The second important item to remember is the surface of the griddle or pan you're using. If you have a new griddle or pan it may need to be seasoned before using. If the pan you are using isn't reserved just for pancakes and it isn't seasoned, you'll have to add a little oil during preheating.

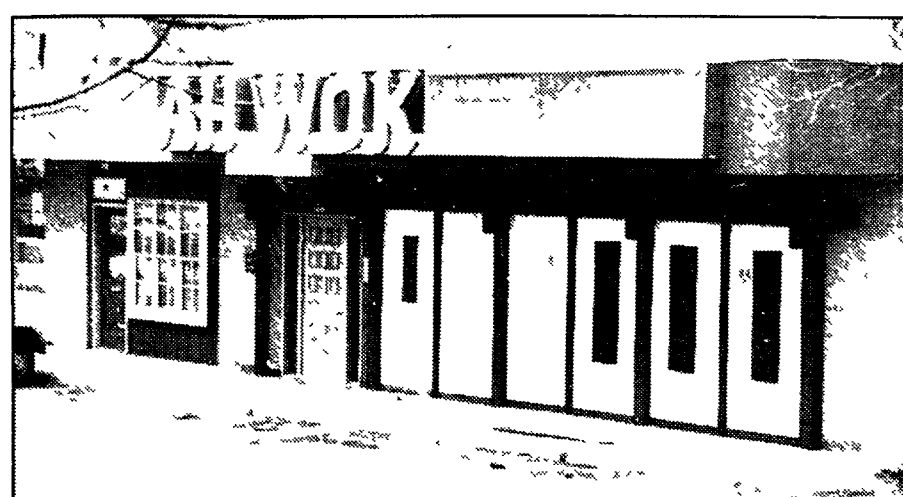
The third important point is the evenness of the heat. Always pre-heat the griddle. Test the griddle by dropping a few drops of cold water, the water should bounce and sputter. If the water sits there and boils the griddle is not hot enough. A pour batter will spread in a widening circle until set by heat. When the bubbles appear on the upper surface, the cake is ready to turn over. If it is bubbling only in one area of the pancake, the heat is not evenly distributed, check your heat source.

Pancakes are turned over once. Serve them at once, but if this is not possible put a towel on a cookie sheet and make sure the pancakes are separated. Place in a 200-degree oven until ready to serve. Don't stack them on top of each other without a cloth between or the steam

## LOCAL TREASURES

### AAA members cite area's four stars

Auburn Hills has the Palace, Birch Run has its outlet mall, and Northville and Novi have . . . food?

There are a number of small communities around the state of Michigan with well-known destinations, but until AAA's monthly magazine, Michigan Living, announced its second annual "Best of Michigan" awards, we never thought of food as the drawing card for our town.

Readers statewide responded to a December Michigan Living survey that included 30 categories, and the results were released just recently. Readers were asked to pick their favorite Michigan spots ranging from parks, outdoor music theaters, summer festivals and golf courses, to family attractions, restaurants, jazz clubs, wine cellars and lodging.

The top five vote-getters in each category were published.

Eating played a big role in the survey, with 16 categories devoted to food, chefs and restaurants.

While some cities with big reputations for eateries — Birmingham, Royal Oak, Detroit — were splashed throughout nearly every category, the Northville/Novi area scored mentions on four lists. That ranked our area on a par with hot spots like Ann Arbor and Traverse City.

Local eateries that earned spots in the hearts of Michigan Living readers were Guernsey Farms for ice cream, Ah-Wok for Chinese food, Key Largo for outdoor dining, and Too Chez as a top new restaurant.

It's also worth noting that Mr. B's, with a location in Novi, was honored in the "Non-chain burger" category — even though it is a small regional chain with several locations.

■ Key Largo: For "Al Fresco Fare" or outdoor dining, Key Largo in Walled Lake was the top vote-getter.

With an outdoor deck perched right on the waters of Walled Lake, Key Largo is the quintessential warm weather getaway where an afternoon or evening can substitute for a weekend up north. Whether they come for the restaurant or the bar, people come from all around to pack the place.

"Our bar's primary market is Bloomfield, West Bloomfield, Birmingham, Farmington, Novi and Southfield; those areas," said Bob Kazanowski, CEO of the company. "Key Largo is definitely a destination restaurant. You can see that at 5:30 in the summer when the deck is open."

Though Kazanowski formed a limited partnership to run the business, he and his partners aren't in it for the buck. Kazanowski worked with Chuck Muer of Muer Restaurants fame, and was an avid sailboat racer on the side. He and his partners, who were also boat racers, found a way to combine work and play.

"We're all America's Cup freaks," said Kazanowski. "With the setting, the water, the lake and the Caribbean-type motif, we put the whole thing together to end up doing something we really like. We figured if we like it, others will like it. It's definitely a labor of love."

■ Too Chez: A winner as one of the top new restaurants was Too Chez of Novi. In a uncanny coincidence, the editors of Michi-

gan Living gave the new restaurant category the tongue-in-cheek title "Nouvelle Cuisine." Though Toni Wisne's restaurant has been open less than two years, the catchline is an accurate description for Too Chez's menu.

Executive Chef Ed Janos uses his diversified training to create a menu that is as schizophrenic as the restaurant's decor. Janos prefers to call it eclectic.

"Too Chez is a good total package," said Janos. "Achille at the front door makes you feel good. If you come more than once, he knows your name. He takes good care of the regulars and makes them relaxed."

"The atmosphere is fun, you can be dressed up, you can be not dressed up, and you don't stand out because it's so vivid a decor you just fit in."

"The food is also good, and the service is good. Finally, I think people think it's a good value."

Too Chez doesn't have to be an expensive night out. You can a filling and satisfying meal of a pasta dish and salads for under \$8 per person. But if you want to shoot the works it is possible to drop a bundle too. There are oriental dishes, spicy Italian and Mexican dishes and good old family comfort food.

"We're not trying to be a pizza restaurant, or Italian or anything," said Janos. "Our objective is good food. I use my training as a chef to make sure the food good, and the preparation is correct. We pull off good things and execute them well."

"And I go to all ends to procure quality ingredients."

As the AAA survey illustrates, custom-

ers go to great lengths to visit Too Chez as well.

"We're aware of that," said Janos. "We get a lot of people from Ann Arbor and from the west. Our dinner crowd draws from all over the Detroit area. It's definitely not just a local crowd."

■ Guernsey Farms: A Northville institution, Guernsey Farms was honored for its ice cream.

Guernsey's has been a family operation in Northville since John McGuire purchased the former Red Rose Dairy at 125 N. Center St. in 1945. Today, he's still the boss, though son Marty now oversees day-to-day operations in the dairy.

With an eye for detail, the McGuire family has produced a rich and creamy line of ice creams at the modern dairy on Novi Road. The product has earned the dairy regional and even national recognition.

"Our emphasis is on quality," said Marty. "We try to make it the best, and we constantly taste test all our stuff. Even with the ice cream, the flavoring companies might change their flavors, so you have to see if it's good or if you want to change it. We look for quality. Price comes second."

In addition to the recognition prompted by Michigan Living readers, Guernsey's butter pecan was judged fifth-best in the country by People magazine in 1984, and Guernsey ice cream was named "Best in Detroit" by WJBK-TV Channel 2 last summer.

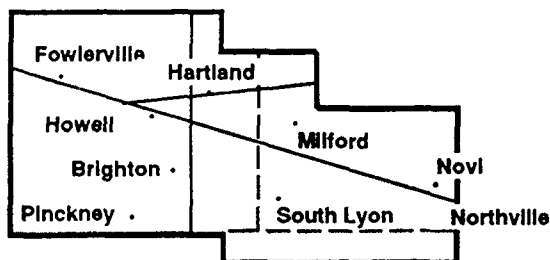
So it was with great satisfaction that the new Chef of the Year was Ray Hollingsworth. He deserves it. Congratulations.

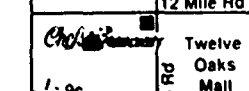

they produce will make them all flabby.

French pancakes or crepes are served as a snack, for lunch, a supper dish or a dessert depending on the flavoring. Mixtures for crepes include chopped tomatoes and onions, sausage and cheese, grated cheese and crumbled bacon, asparagus or thin sliced smoked ham or turkey, or spread with just plain jelly and butter. A crepe needs to be beaten until smooth, rest the batter for at least one hour, reblend batter and cook until set, turn over cook until done. Do not stack until completely cooled. After they are completely cooled, stack, wrap in foil refrigerator or freeze for later. Frozen crepes should be thawed in a cool oven.

Blintzes are a more lengthy process; however, they can be made a day ahead and when you're ready to serve, brown quickly and serve hot. They are also higher in calories since they are browned on one side, filled and fried again to brown the outside.

# ABC celebrates 40 years of "American Bandstand"

## Assembly of show becomes nostalgic journey for Dick Clark

"It's kind of like looking through a scrapbook," says Dick Clark, describing the two-hour "American Bandstand's 40th Anniversary Special," airing Wednesday, May 13, on ABC. Putting together a show such as this, Clark says, is "a mammoth undertaking" that requires "a small army" to accomplish. "The biggest challenge we have before us," the veteran broadcaster explains, "is this: We really do have only two hours."

Clark admits "it's impossible" to sum up 40 years of historic television in two hours of commercial air time. Instead, he reports they've tried to assemble a fast-paced collage of vintage clips, recent performances and personal reminiscences. Montage segments effectively deal with particular themes, like teen idols, stars who are now deceased and world events that helped shape the music of the last four decades. As a whole, the show is designed to place "Bandstand" in historical context. Besides, says Clark, "It's going to be terrific entertainment."

The "live" segments of the special were taped in the same ABC studio that "Bandstand" called home from 1964 on (where the network has installed a commemorative plaque, Clark notes proudly), and feature performances by Alabama, Boyz II Men, Neil Diamond and Gloria

Estefan & The Maimi Sound Machine. Don McLean will be on hand to mark the 20th anniversary of his chart-topping single "American Pie" and doo-wop masters Little Anthony and the Imperials will reunite for their first TV appearance in 24 years.

Stars like Paula Abdul, Natalie Cole, Pat Boone, Garth Brooks, John Mellencamp and Pauly Shore will offer their personal reflections on the significance of "Bandstand," while Clark himself chats with former audience regulars from as far back as the show's Philadelphia days. In the segment, scrapbook-style stills from vintage episodes will dissolve to reveal the same folks in 1992. Regarding his own changing appearance being so graphically depicted, Clark laughs and says, "The ravages of time will be seen."

The bulk of the show will consist of vintage performance clips and feature an astounding variety of stars, including Bryan Adams, George Harrison, David Bowie, Fats Domino, Michael Jackson, the Rolling Stones, The Temptations, The Who and Stevie Wonder. Deceased stars spotlighted include Jim Morrison (with The Doors), Buddy Holly, Bill Haley, Marvin Gaye and Roy Orbison.

Rock pioneer Bo Diddley will head the special's roof-rattling finale, leading an all-star romp through his "Hey, Bo Diddley."

Participants in the jam include Greg Allman, Stanley Clarke, Clarence Clemons, John Entwistle, Lita Ford, Johnny Rivers, Tom Scott and Max Weinberg.

"American Bandstand," TV's longest-running music/youth series, debuted in 1952 on Philadelphia's WFIL-TV. Clark took over as host in July, 1956, and the wildly popular local program made the historic leap to ABC and national exposure in August, 1957.

"Even though I told everyone at the network that we'd duplicate our success in Philadelphia," Clark recalls, "it was a little overwhelming. Within one month, it was the number one daytime show in America."

Clark believes the success of the show stemmed from its relationship with the audience, as well as just being in the right place at the right time. "When it started," Clark says, "it immediately became the national corner drugstore for a generation that had just found its own identity." Referring to Wednesday's special, Clark says, "Forty years of youth culture are reflected in this show."

And how does it all affect Clark himself, a consummate businessman and practically his own media conglomerate? "This touches me very deeply. I've spent all my adult life with this show," Clark reflects.

"It's been with me longer than anybody in my family. My parents are deceased. My oldest son is one year younger than I was when I started with it. It's just been with me for so long."

### ESPN has yachting's wind at its back

Last month when the Stars & Stripes defeated rival Kanza in a sudden-death sail-off, executives at ESPN must have breathed a collective sigh of relief.

A Kanza victory would have meant that both boats in the finals would have been owned by a single syndicate, turning what should be an exciting, drama-filled sea battle into an academic drill. The sports network could have found its ratings stalled like a sailboat on a windless day, but Stars & Stripes' victory ensured a ratings swell, with colorful veteran skipper Dennis Conner facing Bill Koch and the America3 Foundation for the right to meet the successful challenger yacht in the America's Cup finals.

Riding the wave of interest created by Conner's successful 1987 bid, ESPN made an unprecedented commitment to this year's coverage. Host Jim Kelley and crew Gary Jobson, Peter Isler and Sharlene Hawkes will call the best-of-seven America's Cup finals races, except for the first, which airs Saturday, May 9, on big-sister broadcaster ABC.

Fans can warm up for the finals on Friday, May 8, when A&E presents *America's Cup 1987: The Walter Cronkite Report*. The special gives neophyte fans an overview of the Cup's history, from its origins in 1851 through 1987, when Conner took back the trophy lost to the Australians in 1983.

### More reality shows, well, virtually

Shifting his focus to the small screen, Oscar-nabbing film director Oliver Stone will executive produce his first project for television, *Wild Palms*. The six-hour "event series," which will air next season on ABC, is based on a comic strip running in *Details* magazine. The strip's creator, Bruce Wagner, will write the series and co-executive produce it with Stone.

The plot centers on a television executive who's involved with the mind-bending technology known as "Virtual Reality," a computer-generated world free from the constraints of time and space.

Want more science fiction? How about 24 hours a day? Recently, the USA Network announced that it has acquired the Sci-Fi Channel, a cable network offering programming solely of the science fiction, fantasy and horror genres. For its debut this fall, the channel will air the big-screen blockbuster *Star Wars*. Other programs already slated are the *Star Trek* film series, the popular British series *Dr. Who* and all 1,225 episodes of the gothic horror soap *Dark Shadows*.

In the future, the Sci-Fi Channel will become an arena for groundbreaking computer integration, interactive series and games such as Virtual Reality.

### Cybill Shepherd says a mouthful

Cybill Shepherd may not have had a series since *Moonlighting*, but she hasn't been idle; she's spent time developing her own productions. According to Shepherd, too many parts require the woman to be either "the victim or the monster."

On Monday, May 4, Shepherd stars in the telefilm *Stormy Weathers* on ABC. Her character is a Los Angeles-based private eye who holds a black belt in karate. (Shepherd, a yellow belt, does some of her own stunts.) This gumshoe lets her fingers do some walking as well, tracking down clues on a computer.

It's the kind of role she enjoys, not only for herself but for the example it sets. An ardent feminist and the mother of two daughters and a son, Shepherd is outspoken in her support of women's causes.

With 4-year-old Ariel bouncing on the bed ("Take your shoes off first"), Shepherd enthuses about the dual joys of working motherhood and deplores the state of child care in America. She warms to her subject, lapsing into a pep talk on how women need to "deprogram" themselves and shake off old stereotypes. She insists women can "have it all" and notes that she breastfed her twins while continuing to work. "I did it for 20 months, and if I can do it with two, you can do it with one!" she urges her imagined audience.

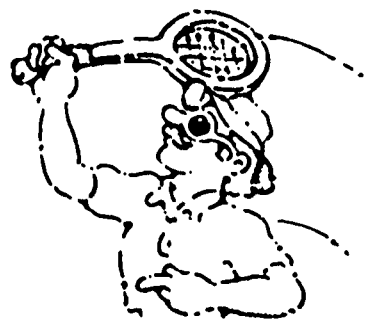

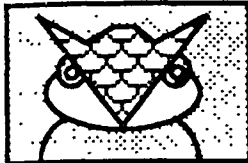

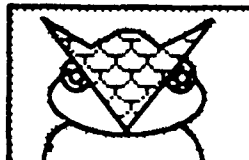

## 'Lawrence After Arabia' removes veil of mysticism

### Fiennes captures enigma of T.E. Lawrence

"The uncrowned king of Arabia," Lowell Thomas put it. The title is peculiarly fitting for T.E. Lawrence — Lawrence of Arabia — whose triumphs were never legitimized by power. Lawrence was first lionized by contemporary Thomas' film-and-lecture show, but PBS' *Great Performances* may have the last word with *A Dangerous Man: Lawrence After Arabia*, airing Wednesday, May 6, and starring Ralph Fiennes.

A middle-class Englishman of slight build, with sandy hair and piercing blue eyes, Lawrence was a gifted linguist and archeologist and a vaunting egoist. A perversely charismatic figure, he summons up — or sums up, rather — the image of German philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche's "superman": a transcendent hero who defies the accepted moral code in his "will to power."

Incapable of submitting himself to king and country, 30-year-old Lawrence, a British intelligence officer, became a hero by helping to lead a combined British and Arab force into Turkish-held Damascus in 1918. As a result of this unsanctioned campaign, Lawrence was, for a time at the conclusion of World War I, a world figure, straddling the gap between European culture and the mystical Arab world.

Fiennes' Lawrence is a colorful, mesmerizing serpent insinuating himself into the antichambers of power. He gives us Lawrence's willful, dramatic facade, a presence deliberately larger than life. (It is worth wondering

whether it is possible to play Lawrence without overacting.) Beneath the exterior was an illegitimate son, a terrified adolescent, a man whose wobbling moral gyroscope threatened to go skittering out of control.

Lawrence used clothes as costume, like a skin he could shed, appearing in

officer's uniform or the robes of a sheik as the occasion demanded — and sometimes in defiance of the occasion. Before our eyes, Fiennes peels off the layers. Soaking in a borrowed bath, Lawrence at last reveals his core. At the center is pure invention: a truly self-made man.

So what has Shane been doing on *Days* during all this time?

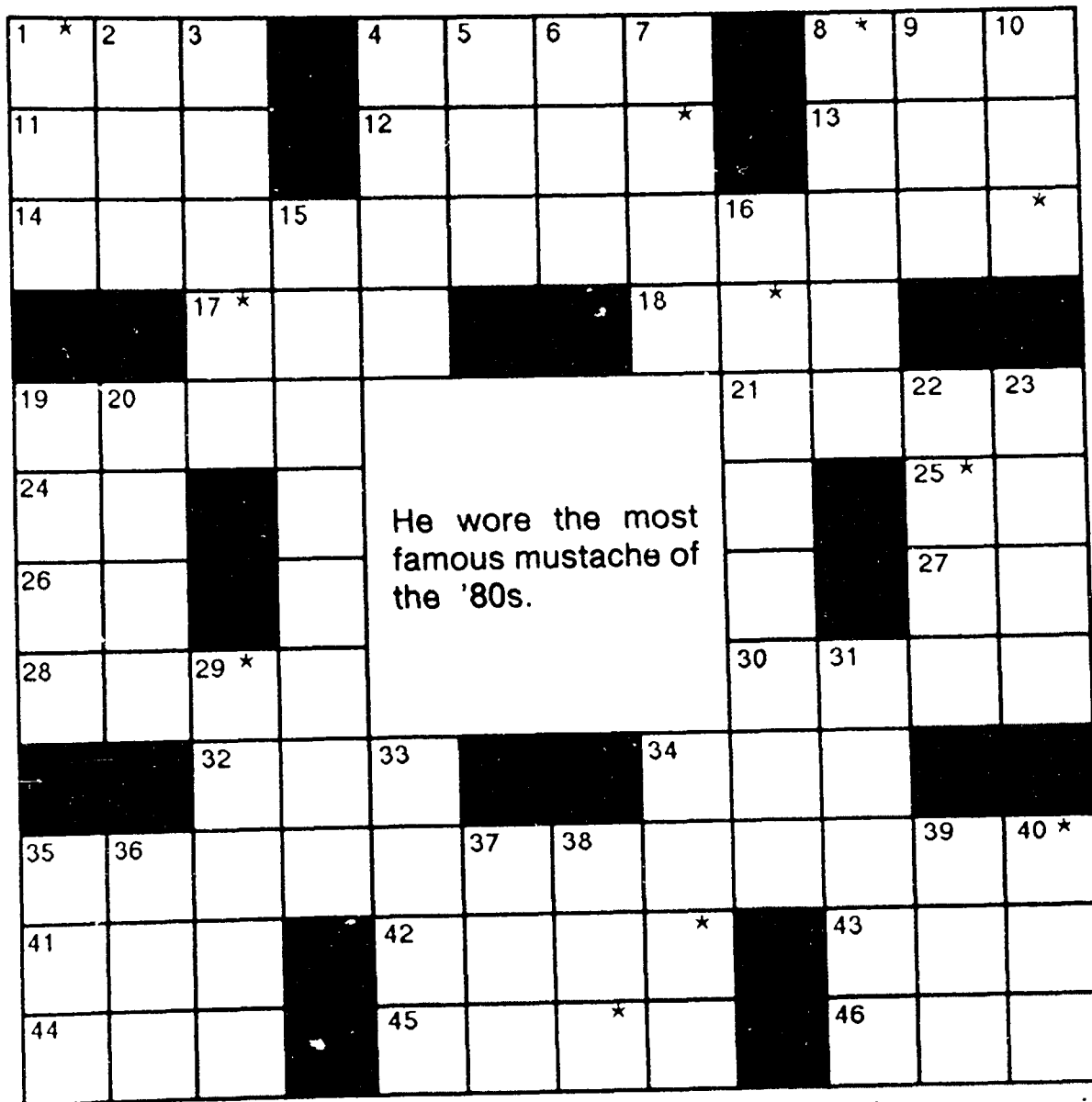
"The last thing I know, he was in his wheelchair banging his fist on a table saying, 'I will walk, dammit,' and then the next minute he is never heard from for four weeks," laughs Shaughnessy.

"I think they (the producers of *Days*) were a bit miffed when I went off to do the pilot, so it's like 'you sit and stew in your wheelchair and think about what you've done and when you are sorry you can come back,'" jokes the actor.

If, and that's a big "if" in the world of prime time, the pilot is picked up, we may be saying goodbye to Shane. But for now, Shaughnessy's happy with his daytime gig and plans to be around for a while.
