City sells one of three lots on Cady

The City of Northville took one more step out of the real estate business last week, with its sale of a Cady Street property.

The undeveloped lot at 315 E. Cady St., one of three contiguous city-owned lots east of Church Street, was sold for \$65,000 to Charles Parrott.

Parrott owns Tri-County Title Agency at the corner of Cady and Griswold, next to the city lot. He plans to expand the building and market part of it as professional office space. The purchase gives him the land needed for the expansion.

The city's Downtown Development Authority and Planning Commission both recommended

that the lot be sold to Parrott, after informal reviews of his development plans.

The city council agreed to seek bids on the lot in January following a request from Parrott to purchase it outright. He had made a similar request three years ago, but was turned down.

Parrott's was the only bid received by the April 15 deadline.

The council agreed to sell the 91-by-98-foot lot below its appraised value of \$84,000, following Word's advice.

"We are in relatively poor economic times, particularly in terms of property sales, which may explain the fact that we did not receive a bid as high as we might have hoped," Word said.

Still, Word argued, "We simply need the money

... Reluctantly but firmly, I would recommend that we accept the offer of \$65,000, or if rejected, that we offer all three lots for sale."

Word noted that the city had received inquiries during the bidding as to whether the city would consider selling the three lots together.

The council decided to take the offer and run, though, voting unanimously to award the bid to Parrott.

Council Member Jerry Mittman also noted that the sale price is more than originally estimated. "This isn't a fire sale; we're getting more than we had originally hoped," he said.

The city's deficit reduction plan is based in part on \$40,000 in revenue from the sale of city property.

Board delays decision on pay, benefits

Three township elected officials with the most to lose last week delayed a committee's recommendation to slash politicians' salaries and benefits.

Supervisor Betty Lennox, Clerk Tom Cook, and Treasurer Jack Hosmer on Thursday headed up a 3-2 majority opinion that effectively tabled the study, which was conducted by three township residents.

Officially, the board agreed to "receive the input and take it under advisement," based on Hosmer's motion. More study was necessary before the board could adopt such changes, the majority voters agreed.

Board members Donald Williams and Richard Allen dissented, and trustees James Nowka and Thomas Handyside were absent.

Committee members had recommended large salary cuts for the township supervisor, clerk, and treasurer, and asked the board to drop

pension, health care, and other benefits for those positions.

Allen said the board should stick to its initial plan, which was to set a policy before the May 12 filing deadline for township elected offices.

"We owe it to the people running for office to make a decision this evening," Allen said. "We should either accept or reject it."

Wage cuts for the treasurer, clerk, and supervisor were among the key recommendations offered by the study group. Committee members Larry Wood, Tom Killeen, and Laurie Marrs suggested dropping the clerk's salary from \$15,000 to \$5,200; the treasurer's salary from \$9,000 to \$5,200; and the supervisor's salary from \$25,000 to 40-50 percent of the township's manager's pay (to about \$17,000-\$19,000).

The committee, formed in March, also recommended the township drop its health, pension and dental benefits for elected officials. The

Officials hear reasons for vote

Now knowing why voters rejected the district's last millage proposal, school officials are expected tonight to write a second proposal for the June 8 election — a proposal they hope voters will pass.

Voters who called in to sound off to board members and district officials Thursday night said a lack of information and rolling the renewal and 2.78-mill increase into a single issue

were two of the main reasons they voted down the recent millage proposal.

"They (the voters) really wanted to see it as a split vote with the renewal and increase split," said Board Member Carol Rahimi, who answered about 10 calls from voters with varying responses. "They are just saying no new taxes."

The results of the phone survey, coupled with more than 240 written

Director discusses project, background

Before the Western Townships Utilities Authority came calling, Deloris Newell's government resume included a two-year stint on the Westland City Council and four years as a county commission aide.

She had no background in sewer projects, much less a \$100-million sewer project. Nor does Newell possess a college degree.

But Newell does have friends in high places, and today the Westland resident serves as WTUA executive director, a \$35,000 annual position that was not publicly advertised prior to Newell's hiring last year.

Newell has worked on the political campaigns of no less than five top-ranking WTUA officials, including two officials who hired her.

WTUA-related officials' state and Wayne County campaign finance records are dotted with Newell's name. She has worked on the campaigns of



former WTUA Chairperson Maurice Breen (Plymouth Township supervisor and county commissioner), current WTUA Treasurer Gerald Law (Plymouth Township supervisor and former state representative), former WTUA Treasurer and Chairperson Georgina Goss (Northville Township and state representative), former WTUA founding member Susan Heintz (Northville Township supervisor and county commissioner) and

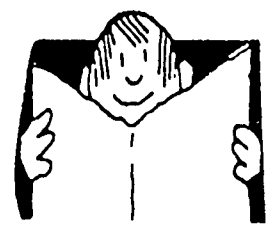

supervisor, clerk, and treasurer are the lone part-time township employees to receive those benefits.

Committee members did recommend that the township boost payments to trustees from \$900 annually to \$1,500, with additional payments for extra meetings and other board or commission activities.

The study was based on the committee's research of comparable Wayne County townships and with salary and benefits information provided by the township.

Board members agreed to further the study to determine which areas

should be cut, and which areas propped. Hosmer supported higher pay for the trustee positions, and Lennox clearly was surprised by the depth of the proposed cuts.

"I think they were a little severe," she said Friday. "I think the clerk's cuts, considering what the position's paid, I think the cut was 72 percent."

Wood, who served as committee chairperson, said compensation for part-time elected officials should be based on the amount of time required to perform those tasks, as well the number of available township support staff.

"I just received (the study), but the committee probably had an excellent recommendation," said Sue Hillebrand, a candidate for Cook's clerk post. "I had no problems with the recommendations."

A handful of residents who are seeking township offices attended the meeting. They praised the committee's findings.

"I thought they did an excellent job," said trustee candidate Barbara O'Brien. "It occurred to me, that instead of just sending this all off to limbo, (the board should) vote on it section by section."

Q. Can I pass a vehicle on the right shoulder?
A. You can only pass a vehicle on the right where there is a lane
available specifically for that purpose. Section 257.637 subsection 2 of
the Motor Vehicle Code states you may not leave the main travel
portion of the roadway to pass. Any time you travel on the shoulder,
even if it is paved, you are in violation. The white lines pointed on the
right edge of the pavement delineate the main travel portion of the
roadway, and if you cross that white line to make a pass on the right,
you are in violation.

City considers new cable TV rules

A proposed cable television ordinance got a good reception Monday at the city council.

The 62-page model ordinance, drafted by the New York firm Municon, regulates everything from a cable company's franchise fees and alternative user charges to its consumer protection measures.

Municon was retained by the city and several other communities served by the Canton-based Omnicom of Michigan earlier this year, as the communities entered a window of opportunity to renegotiate their contracts.

The ordinance would be separate from the city's actual franchise

agreement with a specific cable firm, which is a switch from the current setup. Northville's current 15-year franchise agreement with Omnicom, which expires in December 1994, acts as the city's cable ordinance as well.

"It is common that along with a new franchise agreement, a separate ordinance be passed as well," said City Manager Gary Word.

A separate ordinance gives the city more control over its cable company than a franchise agreement alone. Word explained. "An ordinance can be modified during the terms of the franchise agreement (but) if everything's in the franchise agreement, it's pretty difficult to change it during the terms of the agreement," he said.

The ordinance also could provide

the city increased control over other broadcasting media in the city's future, said Mayor Chris Johnson. "It would regulate cable TV, but it also may be useful to regulate potential new technologies as well," he said.

Word, who said the ordinance was being introduced now in order to protect the city's rights in the future, noted that recently introduced federal legislation may supercede local regulations but that communities with ordinances in place or under review would be grandfathered.

"I think it's important that the ordinance be introduced and the process started," he said.

The model ordinance will be reviewed by the city attorney and made available to Omnicom for its com-

ments. The cable company is expected to send the city some feedback on the proposal.

"I've heard that Omnicom does object to certain portions of the ordinance," Word said, but he did not know Omnicom's objections.

Council Member Paul Folino suggested that Omnicom should be given the chance to respond to the ordinance before the city's attorney, but the suggestion was shot down by Johnson.

"I would think we would want independent legal opinion before one based on Omnicom's views," he said.

The council agreed to hold a public hearing on the proposal June 15, after receiving comment from the attorney and Omnicom.

Goss and Vorva alone in race for House

Civic-minded residents may be lining up to wade into local politics, but far fewer are interested in taking the plunge into state government.

As of Friday, only current 36th District Rep. Georgina Goss (R-Northville) and Plymouth City Commissioner Jerry Vorva had filed for the new

20th District seat, which will cover Northville Township, the City of Northville south of Baseline Road, Plymouth city and township, and part of Livonia.

The 36th District, which is being lost due to redistricting, covers Northville, Plymouth city and township, and about half of Canton.

Both Goss and Vorva filed as Republicans.

The deadline for filing is tomorrow (May 12) at 4 p.m. Petitions must be filed at the City-County Building, Room 207, in Detroit.

Republicans need at least 139 valid signatures to qualify for a space on the ballot, while Democrats need at least 145. Or you can buy your way onto the ballot with a \$100 filing fee.

School officials hear reasons behind millage vote

responses, should now serve as the foundation for the district's second millage proposal, which goes before the school board for approval tonight. The board meets at 7:30 p.m. at Old Village School, 405 W. Main.

The majority of the 145 voters who called in to the two-hour telephone session said they wanted to see a split request, with a smaller increase, if any at all. Most believed the tax request was voted down because it was not a split issue and because the increase was too high and not well documented.

Board members fielded calls from supporters and non-supporters who speculated on why the 25.41-mill request was defeated by more than a 3-1 margin on April 28. While on the line they also sought callers' opinions

on how to restructure the millage proposal for the June 8 ballot.

In general callers were just venting their frustrations, said Board Member Joseph Dunkerley, but in actuality had very little concrete input to offer about the second proposal.

Seeing a split vote with some kind of choice for a one-year period were top-ranking responses for the June 8 ballot. Showing evidence that the district was cutting back and detailing exactly what would be cut were also popular voter requests.

Top-heavy administrative costs and employee raises also put board members on the defensive, trying to squelch contested information that surfaced in a Detroit News article and in Citizens for a Better Northville anti-millage fliers.

District administrators and per-

sonnel were also on hand to answer the overflow of calls holding on lines for the six board members. Board Member Glenna Davis had a prior commitment.

"We were hearing a lot of misconceptions and a lot about misinformation about the facts and figures," said Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski.

Board members and district officials said while the majority of callers opposed any millage increase, each said they had a wide range of reactions. Some voters, a large percentage of the callers, said they would support just the 22.63-mill renewal on June 8, while others said they'd consider supporting the renewal and a smaller increase, if it were justified and the figures were completely disclosed.

"Just about everybody said they would support a renewal, but anything more would have to be explained in detail," said Board Member Donald Klokenga.

Although many of the voters were opposed to the tax hike and spoke their minds candidly, they were appreciative that board members took the time to hear them out.

"One was just glad I didn't try to lecture him or interrupt him. He just wanted me to listen to him," said Dunkerley.

That echoes what Rezmierski heard in some of the 30 calls he and school board President Jean Hansen answered.

"I just want to thank you for the opportunity," he was told by numerous callers.

Authority director discusses project, her background

former WTUA secretary and current legal counsel Robert Law (state representative).

Breen, Goss and Canton Township Supervisor Thomas Yack comprised the WTUA board which hired Newell as executive director.

But friendships and political ties are not the reason Newell is with WTUA, she said recently.

"No, I don't think so, and I certainly would hope not, because I think I've worked more than hard in my life to train myself," Newell said. "Do I think that? No, I don't."

Breen, chair of the WTUA board which promoted Newell, could not be reached Friday for comment.

WTUA hired Newell in 1990. She had spent the previous four years as Heintz's county administrative assistant, and was brought in to WTUA to serve under former executive director Ann Bollin.

When Bollin left last fall, Newell was bumped from administrative assistant to executive director as WTUA ignored a job posting procedure it has followed with other positions.

"What happened was (Bollin) had very severe health problems and just resigned," Newell said. "Here we were, with no full-time people and trying to get everything in place, so they appointed me as the acting director for three months. It's not an easy project to run . . ."

"So it wasn't a political thing, at least I tell you what I believe," she said. "I tell you what I believe."

Former Record reporter Anita Crone succeeded Newell as WTUA administrative assistant. Crone worked as a volunteer on Goss' 1991 state House campaign.

Newell said she was not well-versed in sewer projects before her hire.

"Oh, good lord, no," she said. "I was hired to do the day-to-day things in the office, as an administrative assistant."

Newell said she has "learned a lot since I've become director."

She received high marks from WTUA commissioner and Northville Township Supervisor Betty Lennox.

"I think she's doing an excellent job," Lennox said Friday. "She does all the work the board asks her to do and does it in depth and detail."

Lennox said she did not know Newell had worked on the campaigns of the five WTUA officials. She also said she did not know Newell had been hired without a job posting.

One of the things Newell has learned is that WTUA has attracted a great deal of media scrutiny. She said WTUA has attempted to wade through a swamp of Freedom of Information Act requests since the first of the year.

She said some media reports on the project are "untrue" and chafed at a suggestion that reports were in the public interest.

"Hitler said 'for the good of the people' too," she said. "Look at history . . . as we looked at history we found out he was not for the good of the people."

"I'm saying to you that one person's interpretation for the good of the people may not be another person's interpretation," she said.

Newell's name appears on an invoice submitted in 1990 to Northville Township by Communications Management Corporation, a public relations firm with distinct ties to WTUA and its three member townships. Newell denied working for the firm, which was owned by the law firm Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczky, legal representative for WTUA and for Northville, Plymouth, and Canton townships.

"I swear to you, I was never an em-

ployee of Communication Management," Newell said. "Whether my name got bounced off a computer somewhere, I don't know, but I was never an employee."

"Now, I know all those people," she added. "Don't take this as I don't know them. I do know all those people. (But) I was never employed by any of those companies."


Newell said the WTUA project is moving along, and currently is under budget. As director, Newell said she has helped streamline the operation and the authority now is seeking bids for professional services, an approach it did not take when the project was born.

WTUA is also undergoing an operations review by the auditing firm Plante & Moran to provide further information on the status of the project.

Despite months of controversy and charges of cronyism and nepotism, Newell said the project is in fine shape and has not lost the public good will.

"The only questions I'm getting asked are from reporters," she said. "We've had a total of, since December, a total of 10 calls (from residents)."

"Do you want to believe perception, or do you want to believe what you read?" she said.

The 1992 levy for the Street Reconstruction Program, which involves a bond issue approved by the voters in 1986, and a second bond issue approved by the voters in 1990, is proposed to be 3.33 mills, compared to 3.63 mills in 1991, a decrease of 8.3%.

The 1992 levy for the Randolph Drain Project is proposed to be 0.54 mill, compared to 0.48 mill levied in 1991, an increase of 12.5%.

The total City millage for both operating and debt is proposed to be 17.55 mills in 1992, compared to 13.94 mills levied in 1991, an increase of 3.61 mills or 25.9% more than the total levied in 1991.

ANTICIPATED EQUALIZATION FACTORS: The 1992 equalization factors for both Wayne and Oakland County are expected to be 1.00 for all classes of property.

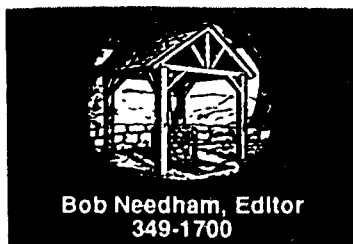

Assessing contract shows poor priorities

Another misstep in operations at Northville City Hall raises new concerns about sensitivity to the staff in these difficult budgetary times, and also demonstrates a flaw in standard procedures.

To recap, the city administration sought to hire an assessor on a one-year contract, subject to approval of the city council. Although this move was planned under the city's formal deficit reduction plan, it raised hackles around city hall.

The new assessor's job, after all, will essentially be to help Mark Christiansen do the job he was hired to do two years ago. Christiansen came in as assessor, but eventually became bogged down with other duties and now holds the joint titles of office manager and chief financial officer.

Council Member Paul Folino last week questioned the city's entire assessing program, pointing out that regardless of the reasons, Christiansen never accomplished the job he was hired to do — yet he remains with the city and another assessor has been brought on board.

Although the individual decisions which created the current situation may have made sense, the end result — especially as Folino put it — does seem odd. And it furthers the perception that the city's approach to its budget problems sometimes ignores the feelings of those at city hall.

After all, people with years of service have been laid off; one union had to offer up concessions to help protect positions. Jobs have been cut, some permanently. Yet somehow an assessing job has evolved into a position not unlike that of the canceled deputy city manager post, and a new assessing position gives a job to someone with no years of Northville service at all.

This isn't to criticize the individuals involved but to point out that the unfolding situation will worsen morale at city hall, which may already be at an all-time low. Faced with the city's financial crisis, some reorganization of jobs and responsibilities in the city made sense. The

reorganization should have been accomplished with more sensitivity, however, by trying to avoid the loss of valued employees while creating new posts.

On the matter of the new hiring itself, City Manager Gary Word brought the assessor on board under his reorganization of city hall, a response to the \$1-million deficit reduction plan. The hire, on Christiansen's recommendation, came about before the city council knew that it was happening.

Apparently, the city manager does indeed have the authority to enter a contract like this without bringing it to the council first, although council approval is ultimately required. In hindsight, it showed poor judgment for Word and Christiansen to move so quickly. It should be self-evident that the council would want to know about such a contract before the city agrees to it. (In this instance, the council ended up halving the term of the contract — from a year to six months, subject to further review at that time.)

More important, though, it never should have been a matter of judgment at all on the administration's part. That is, if the council wants and needs to know about these things ahead of time — and they do — then the manager shouldn't have this authority in the first place.

Clearly, a change is needed, whether it be to the city's operating procedures, ordinance books or the charter itself. Such contracts should certainly come before the council for final action before the person actually starts work.

A little on the high side?



The way I remember it, it used to be pretty tough to graduate from Northville High School with a perfect 4.0 grade point average (GPA). The same thing would probably have been true of Novi High School, except there was no Novi High School back in the days when I was a student.

Some Novi kids went to high school in Walled Lake and some went to Farmington, but most went to Northville. So, if it was hard for a Northville kid to earn a 4.0 it was just as hard for a Novi kid.

In fact, my distinct recollection was that it was almost impossible to graduate with a 4.0 GPA. That's not true anymore. At least six Northville and at least five Novi seniors will graduate with 4.0 GPAs this year.

The reason I know this is that I've been working on our second annual All-Area Academic Team which will be published this Thursday.

One of my jobs is to coordinate the All-Area team for Home-Town Newspapers' East Division high schools (Northville, Novi, South Lyon, Milford and Lakeland) and West Division high schools (Brighton, Howell, Hartland, Pinckney and Fowlerville).

Picking the All-Area teams is pretty easy. We ask each high school to nominate five seniors and report their GPAs and ACT scores. Equal weight is given to both the GPA and the ACT, and the 10 members of the team are determined by mathematical calculation.

At any rate, the responsibility for coordinating the All-Area teams for both the East and West papers has provided some

interesting insights.

For one thing, both Northville and Novi generally seem to feel that their respective districts are about the best around. But guess what? They're not the only ones. People in at least Brighton, Hartland and Pinckney feel exactly the same way about their districts.

The thing I found most interesting, however, was the preponderance of 4.0 GPAs among the Northville/Novi nominees. All 11 Northville/Novi nominees had 4.0s. By comparison, only two of the 15 nominees from the other three East Division (South Lyon, Milford and Lakeland) schools had 4.0 GPAs.

In other words, 13 of the 25 nominees from East Division schools had 4.0 GPAs. And 11 of them were from Northville and Novi.

The contrast is even greater when you look at the 25 nominees from the five West Division schools (Brighton, Howell, Hartland, Pinckney and Fowlerville). Of the 25 nominees from those schools, only one had a perfect 4.0 GPA. Lending credibility to the validity of that 4.0 was the fact that it was earned by a Brighton High School student (Ben Wirth) who had the highest ACT score (35) ever recorded in the two years we've been sponsoring All-Area Academic teams.

One of the nice things about these teams is that equal weight is given to the GPA and ACT. And, because most of the nominees have fairly high GPAs, the determining factor more often than not is the ACT. Using the ACT tends to balance out school districts which grade tougher than others.

Admittedly, none of this takes into account how hard a student has to work to earn a perfect GPA. There's no way to measure that.

But, if you think I'm suggesting that the Northville and Novi school districts tend to grade a bit on the high side, you're right.

The No. 2 drink in the world? It's in the bag

Tea is the world's second most popular drink, next to water. Consumers have a wide variety of tea products from which to choose: instant tea, iced tea mixes, specialty and flavored tea bags, loose tea, and the traditional tea bag. Herbal teas are not considered true teas, but instead are caffeine-free blends of one or more herbs with flavor and spices added.

The tea tree is actually an evergreen tree and a member of the Camellia family. For ease in plucking, the bushes are kept to heights of about three feet, but if a tea tree is left untouched, tea plants can grow up to 50 feet high and live for over 100 years. The oldest known tea tree in Southwest China is calculated to be 800 years old! Legend has it that tea was discovered in 2737 B.C. by a Chinese emperor when some tea leaves accidentally fell into boiling water. He then noticed that people who drank the tea brew enjoyed better health, and tea was born. From China it spread to Japan and other far Eastern lands.

The tea bag was an accidental find; tea was put in little silk bags as a cheaper method of distributing samples. To everyone's amazement, people started leaving the tea in the bag rather than removing it. When silk was too expensive to use companies switched to gauze, and now a high tensile strength filter paper is used for tea bags.

Asian teas are widely sold in America. Most supermarket tea is blended tea in a disposable bag; however, many markets do stock loose tea. Some of the most popular teas such as English breakfast, Irish breakfast and Earl Grey are blends of tea leaves from various sources. Individual teas are named for the place of origin: Darjeeling, Ceylon, Keemun etc. (Darjeeling is one of the choicest teas and comes from the foothills of the Himalayas.)

The name of a black tea sometimes reflects the size of the tea leaves. Souchong denotes large leaves, Pekoe is medium sized leaves and Orange Pekoe teas are made from the smallest leaves. Pekoe does not refer to the flavor of the tea, only the grade and size of a tea leaf.

Black tea is the type most familiar to Westerners. The tea leaves wither in the sun; then they are bruised to break the leaf cells and left in a warm place to ferment. During the fermentation process, the leaf color deepens and the flavor develops. They are then fired to stop fermentation and preserve them. Black teas have a rich reddish brown color and full aroma and flavor.

Green tea leaves are of course easy to identify. These leaves are steamed immediately after harvesting to prevent fermentation. The leaves are crushed, then fired and dried. Green teas have a pale color and less aroma and flavor than black tea. Oolong tea is somewhere between green and black tea in process and in color, flavor and body. They are fermented partially and then steamed to stop the fermentation. All teas should be stored in airtight containers in a cool dry place. If properly stored, they will be good up to a year without loss of flavor. Caffeine is also a natural part of a tea leaf. The way the tea is brewed will determine the amount of caffeine per cup. Herbal teas are caffeine-free.

A perfect cup of tea begins with fresh water. Fill the teapot with hot water and let stand while fresh cold water is brought to a full rolling boil. Empty the teapot, add the tea bags or leaves and pour in the boiling water. Immediately cover and brew from three to five minutes depending on how strong you like your tea. Remove the tea leaves or bags and serve. Your guests will have a wonderful cup of tea to go along with dainty tea sandwiches, cookies, cakes or hot buttered scones. Herbal teas are a nice change of pace for afternoon tea, pick a variety that will complement foods you are serving.

Here are some interesting ways to use tea either hot or cold. Soak dried fruit in brewed tea rather than water; it gives a delicate flavor. Blend some low-calorie lemon-flavored tea mix with plain yogurt to make it really zesty.

VARIATIONS ON A CLASSIC

Updating macaroni and cheese

Let's face it. Rigatoni with radicchio and linguine with lobster may be the rage among today's trattoria-crazed food mavens.

But it's plain old macaroni and cheese — crusty, bubbling and rich — that has been warming the bodies and souls of Americans for generations.

Macaroni and cheese will be the ultimate comfort food long after pasta primavera has gone the way of all flashes in the pan.

Nutritionally speaking, it's especially good for young people. Older folks probably shouldn't make it a staple, but it's still relatively healthy for them, too, according to Sylvia Tretman of the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service.

One cup of homemade macaroni and cheese has 430 calories. Though it contains 22.2 grams fat and 1,086 mg of sodium, it also adds 362 mg calcium, 1.8 mg of iron, 322 mg of phosphorus, .20 mg of thiamine, .40 mg of riboflavin and 1.8 mg of niacin. It also contains 860 IUs (international units) of vitamin A.

For a girl ages 11-14, a dish of macaroni and cheese would give her about a third of her recommended daily allowance of calcium, about 43 percent of her day's protein, and about 17 percent of her needed calories for the day.

"Macaroni and cheese is good for calcium and protein," said Tretman. "They don't have any RDAs that I'm aware of specifying fat. But as a home economist looking at it, it might be a little high in fat content. If you're eating it on a daily basis that might be a problem. But for a growing boy or girl I don't see it being a problem."

For an older person watching their sodium intake, the sodium content is a little high. But for nearly everyone else, careful selection of accompaniments could make macaroni and cheese an almost ideal meal, according to Tretman.

"Generally speaking, it's a nutritious food," she said. "You could team it up with a tossed salad or a green vegetable. Not a starchy vegetable like a potato or corn. Green beans or broccoli would do well to balance the heaviness. Add some fruit for dessert and according to basic diet needs, you've covered all the basic groups."

Best of all, there are ways to dress up the classic and make it an easy alternative to frozen and packaged products.

Jeffrey Baldwin of Walled Lake is corporate chef for Norman's Restaurants which operates the Salvatore Scallopini in Novi (along with Norm's Diner in Farmington Hills, Salvatore Scallopini in West Bloomfield and Southfield, Norm's Oyster Bar & Grill in Southfield, Norman's Eton Street Station in Birmingham and Nifty Norman's in Walled Lake).

He designs menus, decides what the restaurants will feature, trains staff, and looks after the day-to-day operations of Normans' restaurants.

In his junior year at Walled Lake Central High School, he enrolled in the culinary arts program at Southwest Oakland Vocational Education Center in Wixom. He later studied at the Culinary Institute of America in Hyde Park, N.Y. At the time, he was the youngest student ever to be accepted into the program.

As part of his training, he worked in a restaurant in Charlevoix, and later moved to Lake Tahoe. He opened two popular Detroit restaurants, Van Dyke Place in 1981, and The Whitney, in 1982.

Below, he shares with us a recipe that he calls "the macaroni and cheese of the '90s." His mostacioli with smoked turkey uses a pungent gorgonzola cheese to create a flavorful mouthful.

Brad Ogden also has some ideas about macaroni and cheese. Ogden is author of *Bradley Ogden's Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner* (Random House), one of this season's hottest cookbooks.

"I grew up on Kraft macaroni and cheese,"

he said. "And I guess my kids got an early taste of Kraft at their friends' houses, because when I made macaroni and cheese from scratch for them, and it turned out real good, they wouldn't touch it."

Ogden came up with three original recipes. All are quick and easy to make. They can be prepared ahead of time and baked just before serving, and they're ideal for large family parties, when both serving ease and budget are considerations.

All three recipes start with a simple white cream sauce made with milk or half-and-half. Different types of shredded cheese can be substituted for those Ogden suggests. Roasted chilies can be substituted for roasted tomatoes. Grilled ahi can fill in for sauteed salmon.

The salmon-flecked version is an upscale rendition of a decidedly low-key favorite.

"I got the idea from the old tuna casserole," Ogden said. "You remember, the one your mother used to make with canned tuna, noodles and peas."

Ogden gained renown by peddling pot roast and mashed potatoes during a decade when Italian, French and other Mediterranean cuisines were in vogue. He's still in love with simple, hearty American fare.

"Things like meat loaf, macaroni and cheese, pot roast and corned beef hash," he said. "Sure, we revise (the recipes) a little, make them a little lighter, but it's still the same familiar, wholesome, good-tasting food. I don't think it will ever lose its charm."

The Chicago competition is international and is a qualifying "meet" for Germany. Our team must do extraordinarily well. There can be no mistakes. If all goes as well as the practice, we

should do well.

Once again, over the last several days, I was reminded of how important teamwork is. Our team does not stop with the six members. There are apprentices, administrators, the community and peers in the culinary field.

They all devote time and resources because they believe in us. We can't let them down.

For me, the most significant team member is my assistant, Pat Wszolek. Pat worked for the Brady family at our restaurants on Seven Mile, in the Prudential Center and now in Novi. Her jobs have spanned from waitress to bartender and in recent years to the kitchen.

When I started competing five years ago, she expressed interest in helping. As an assistant, she spends nearly as many hours as I do, and knows everything about my display.

Pat could virtually do many of the components in her sleep. She probably dreams about it. I do, but usually it is more of a nightmare: not being ready on time, having a disaster occur right before we are ready to display.

Pat starts weeks ahead of time doing "dough" pieces. These are the little crackers and garnishes that are the finishing touches to many of the main courses. They are fragile and break easily. They'll have to make the drive to Chicago in one piece or

else . . . so packing correctly is critical.

Once there, Pat and I have lists of things that must be accomplished. One is for her and one for me. They are broken down by day. We don't go to bed until it is done. It we finish early we move onto the next day's list.

As you read this, we have put in days of work and the fun is just starting. We pack up tomorrow to leave by 7 a.m. for Chicago. By noon, we will be in the kitchen that we'll work out of for the next three days, and we'll work there until midnight.

The schedule doesn't get any easier as the week goes on. Pat takes care of me. She

preps all my vegetables, cleans my plates, stands by my side as I'm setting up. She is there for me. She notices the little things that I may miss and vice versa.

Each team member of our team has his or her assistant. None have been together as long as Pat and I. We have literally traveled the world together. We have had our ups and downs while doing shows. Our elation and crushed egos. We've been through it all.

Being an assistant, you don't get the glory. Her joy is in seeing me do well. She doesn't get to hang a medal on her wall, but she is so important in the procuring of it. Enough thanks cannot be conveyed.

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 cup margarine, divided

4 eggs, separated

1 cup evaporated skimmed milk
1 teaspoon grated lemon peel

In mixing bowl combine 1/4 cup flour and the salt; with pastry blender, or 2 knives used scissor-fashion, cut in 3 tablespoons margarine until mixture resembles coarse meal. Add yogurt and mix thoroughly; form dough into a ball, wrap in plastic wrap, and refrigerate for at least 1 hour.

Preheat oven to 400 F. Between 2 sheets of wax paper roll dough, forming a 10-inch circle about 1/4 inch thick. Fit dough into 9-inch pie plate; fold under any dough that extends and flute edges. Using a fork, prick bottom and sides of pie shell; bake until lightly browned, 10 to 12 minutes. Remove to wire rack; let cool.

Using electric mixer, in large mixing bowl beat egg yolks with sugar until thick and lemon colored. Beat in lemon juice and remaining flour and margarine; gradually beat in milk and lemon peel.

In separate bowl beat whites until stiff; gently fold into yolk mixture. Pour filling into crust and bake at 350 F for 30 minutes (until a cake tester, inserted in center, comes out clean). Let cool on wire rack. Makes 8 servings.

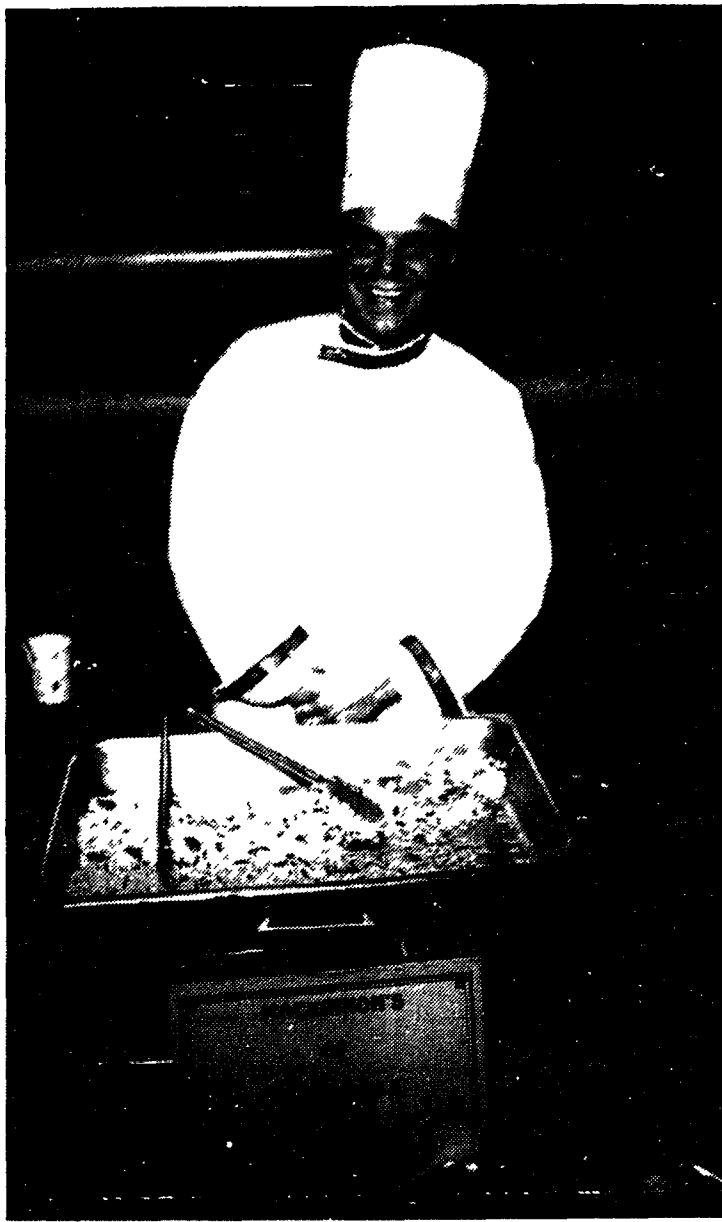

Macaroni and cheese captured in '90s style

2 tablespoons sun-dried tomatoes
2 tablespoons olive oil
2 tablespoons gorgonzola cheese
2 tablespoons Parmesan cheese
Freshly ground pepper to taste
¼ roasted pepper cut into ¼-inch strips
¼ cup small diced tomatoes
¼ cup chicken stock
2 tablespoons white wine

Heat oil in pan. Sauté garlic, add basil, turkey, pasta, white wine and chicken stock. Simmer until half the liquid is cooked out. Add Parmesan, season and toss with sun dried and diced tomatoes. Put on plate and sprinkle with gorgonzola and Parmesan cheese. Garnish with fresh basil sprig and garlic toast.

CREAM SAUCE
4 tablespoons unsalted butter
3 tablespoons flour
2 cups hot milk or half-and-half
2 small onions studded with 2 whole cloves each
1 pinch fresh grated nutmeg
Kosher (course) salt and fresh cracked black pepper

Place small, heavy-bottomed saucepan on top of double boiler

over medium heat. Add butter. When butter melts, stir in flour with wooden spoon. Cook for two or three minutes, until roux is smooth and foamy, but don't allow it to brown. Remove from heat, and whisk in hot milk or half-and-half.

Return saucepan to heat. Whisk until sauce is smooth and comes to a simmer. Lower heat, and simmer for three minutes, stirring frequently to avoid scorching.

Place pan over a pot of simmering water. Add onions. Cover and cook for 20 minutes, stirring occasionally. Season with nutmeg, salt and pepper. Strain and let cool.

Put sheet of buttered paper or plastic wrap on surface of sauce to prevent a skin from forming. The sauce may be refrigerated for a day or two. Yields 1½ cups.

PENNE WITH VERMONT WHITE CHEDDAR CHEESE
½ pound penne (or other tube noodles)
1½ cups cream sauce, with three or four drops Tabasco added
Kosher (course) salt
Freshly ground black pepper
Cayenne pepper, to taste

2 cups shredded Vermont white cheddar cheese
¾ cup homemade bread crumbs
2 tablespoons melted butter

Butter 9-inch round or square baking dish.
Cook noodles in salt, boiling water according to instructions on package. Drain noodles well and transfer to a large bowl.

Toss noodles with cream sauce (which need not be heated), salt and pepper to taste, a generous pinch of cayenne and both cheeses.
Mound mixture in baking dish. Toss bread crumbs with melted butter. (Fresh bread crumbs are available in many French bakeries.)

(If desired for some garlic flavor, butter may be melted with a clove or two of garlic, then allowed to sit for 15 minutes. Strain and discard garlic clove.)

Top casserole with bread crumbs, distributing evenly. Bake at 350 F for 20 minutes or until bubbling. Yields four servings.

SHELL PASTA WITH SALMON AND AGED JACK CHEESE
½ pound shell-shaped pasta

2 cups cream sauce
1½ cups shredded aged Jack cheese
¼ cup grated imported Parmesan cheese
Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste
Cayenne pepper
½ pound salmon fillets
2 tablespoons butter or olive oil
¼ cup homemade bread crumbs
3 tablespoons melted butter

Butter 9-inch round or square baking dish.
Cook noodles in salted, boiling water according to instructions on package. Drain noodles well and transfer to a large bowl.

Toss noodles with cream sauce (which need not be heated), both cheeses, salt and freshly ground pepper to taste, and a generous pinch of cayenne.

In small frying pan, sauté salmon fillets in two tablespoons of butter or olive oil until surface of salmon is crusty but inside remains moist. Break salmon into chunks and fold gently into noodle mixture.

Mound mixture into baking dish. Toss bread crumbs in 3 tablespoons melted butter. Spread crumbs evenly

over top of casserole.
Bake at 350 F for 20 minutes or until bubbling. Yields four servings.

FARFALLE WITH ROAST TOMATOES, SMOKED GOUDA CHEESE AND SAUSAGES

¾ pound farfalle (butterfly-shaped noodles)
1½ cups cream sauce
2 cups shredded smoked gouda
¾ cup grated imported Parmesan cheese
Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste
Cayenne pepper
4 plum tomatoes, roasted (recipe follows)
¼ pound to ½ pound maple link sausage or other small, mild pre-cooked sausage

Butter 9-inch round or square baking dish.
Cook noodles in salted, boiling water according to instructions on package. Drain noodles well, and transfer to large bowl.

Toss noodles with cream sauce (which need not be heated), both cheeses, salt and pepper to taste and generous pinch cayenne.

Roast tomatoes, using following recipe, and fold them gently into noodle mixture. Sauté sausages and add to mixture, cutting into smaller pieces if desired.

Mound noodle mixture in baking dish. Bake in 350 F oven for 20 minutes or until bubbling. Yields four servings.

ROASTED PLUM TOMATOES

4 plum tomatoes, quartered
3 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
3 bay leaves
8 sprigs parsley
2 sprigs fresh oregano
2 sprigs fresh basil
½ teaspoon kosher salt
½ teaspoon fresh cracked black pepper
¼ cup balsamic vinegar
¼ cup extra-virgin olive oil

Preheat oven to 500 F.
Place tomatoes in single layer in shallow baking dish. Sprinkle with garlic and herbs. Drizzle with salt and pepper and drizzle evenly with vinegar and olive oil.

Roast tomatoes for eight minutes until they are lightly caramelized but still keep their shape. Remove from oven and cool. Yields four servings.

in themselves. Pride in what they are and to have dignity. They can wake up in the morning and either go out and be mad at the

world or do something to make it good for them. These kids just don’t know better. And that’s no good because how are our

children going to have good lives if they don’t stay in school? There is a reason to stay. And I’m going to tell them.

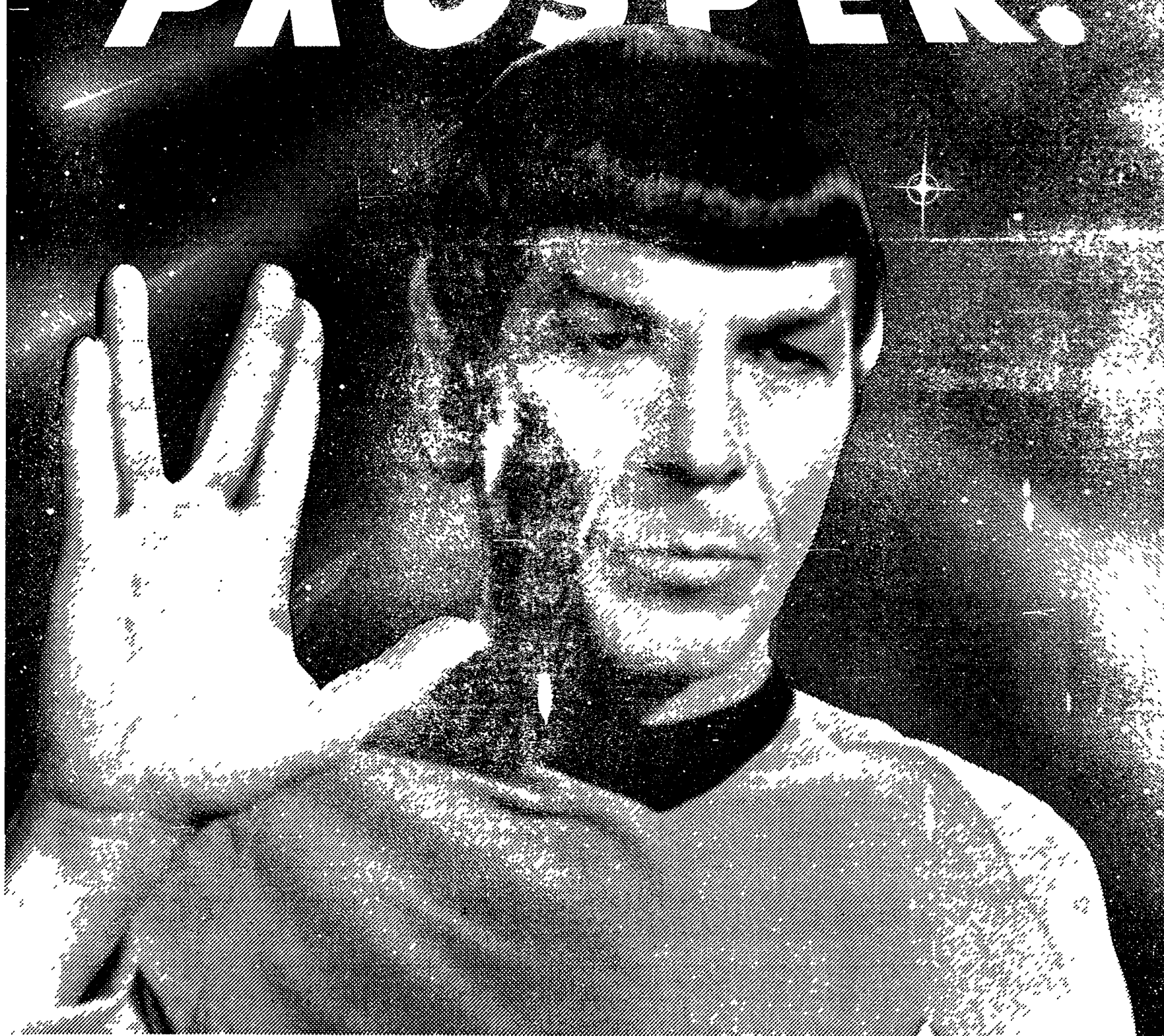

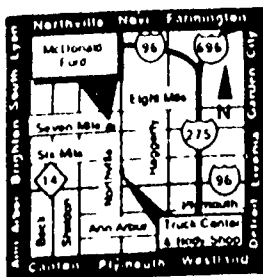

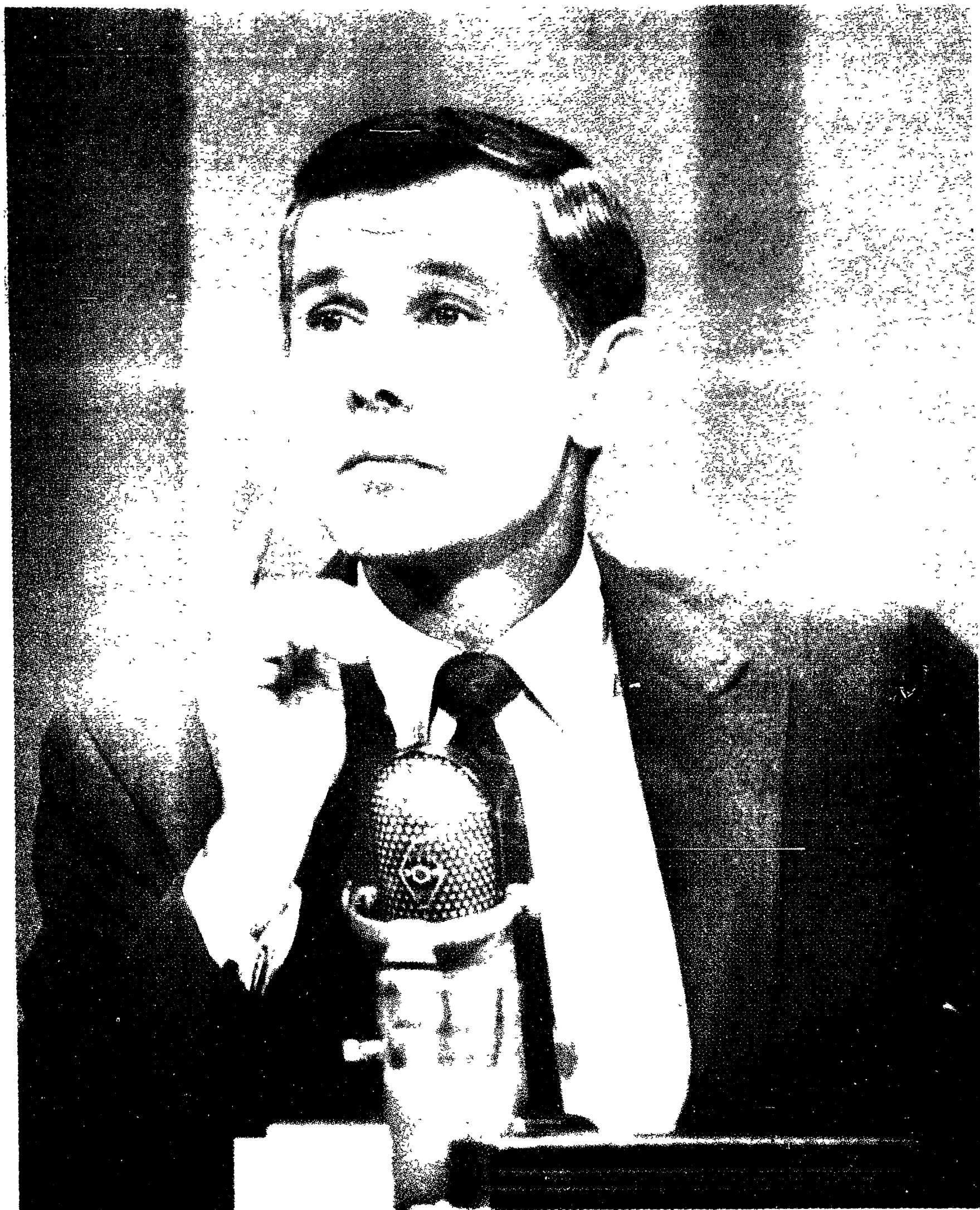

An era ends for NBC's 'Tonight Show'

Carson casts long shadow

It was inevitable and we knew it. Someday Johnny Carson, like Jack Parr, Steve Allen and others less memorable before him, would retire as host of "The Tonight Show." In May 1991, Carson caught the network by surprise when he announced that he considered this his final season. On Friday, May 22, he will sit behind the desk as host for the last time.

Carson's retirement isn't as serious an event as many he has helped us mark: the first moon landing, the painful late '60s, the fall of communism and seven-and-a-half presidential campaign seasons. It's a milestone nonetheless, and his three decades' tenure is an achievement not likely to be matched in television. The jester who first sat on the throne on Oct. 2, 1962 (he was introduced by Groucho Marx), can rightfully claim the crown.

For years, this retirement business seemed like a game. Each autumn, there has been an anniversary show: 23 years, 27 years; who could take it seriously? There were guest hosts, then permanent guest hosts, then ex-permanent guest hosts. Johnny was off on Mondays, he was off on Tuesdays, and about half the time he was off on vacation. Then there were his wives, who were known to divorce him. Surely he would have to keep working just to meet his alimony payments.

The show business equivalent of panic set in shortly after the beginning of the new year. That's when the phone started ringing with requests from the famous and the wannabes to make a date to visit Johnny, whether for the first time or the last. Carson added four Tuesday appearances to his schedule, but seating on the Carson couch is limited; bookings were full more than a month ago.

It isn't just Johnny Carson who leaves "The Tonight Show" on Friday. Sidekick Ed McMahon, who has been laughing at Johnny's jokes since the beginning, and bandleader and sartorial scapegoat Doc Severinsen (along with the band) will disappear as well. Behind the scenes, a score of Carson staffers, who have produced the show for over a decade, also find themselves at a turning point.

Among them is co-producer Jim McCawley, who has booked comedians and others on the show for 15 years. For a comedian, a six-minute shot on "The Tonight Show" is both a rite of passage and a launching pad to fame. McCawley has arranged first "Tonight Show" bookings for Eddie Murphy,


Gallagher, Garry Shandling, Roseanne Bar, Sam Kinison, Paul Reiser and Keenen Ivory Wayans.

"The very first call I made was to David Letterman," McCawley remembers. Letterman, who had his pride even then, had already auditioned six times and wouldn't submit again. McCawley wisely said okay.

McCawley does much of his work away from the office. He is a regular at comedy clubs, where he offers pointers even when he isn't ready to extend the coveted booking. He's watched some comics work 10 years to get ready for late-night. Others have never worked out, and McCawley cites the comedy franchises of "certain cable channels" for spoiling many a young comedian for "Tonight."




Cherchez la femme. NBC's *Today Show* recently tied ABC's *Good Morning America* for the No. 1 position in ratings among early-morning network programs. A deal for a CBS miniseries had already been made, so executive producers David L. Wolper and Bernard Sofronski are carrying on with the project using a script adapted by David Stevens.

Queen (the working title) boasts a fine cast including Halle Berry in the title role, Ann-Margret, Martin Sheen, Tim Daly, Sada Thompson, Ossie Davis, and Danny Glover. Production has begun in South Carolina.

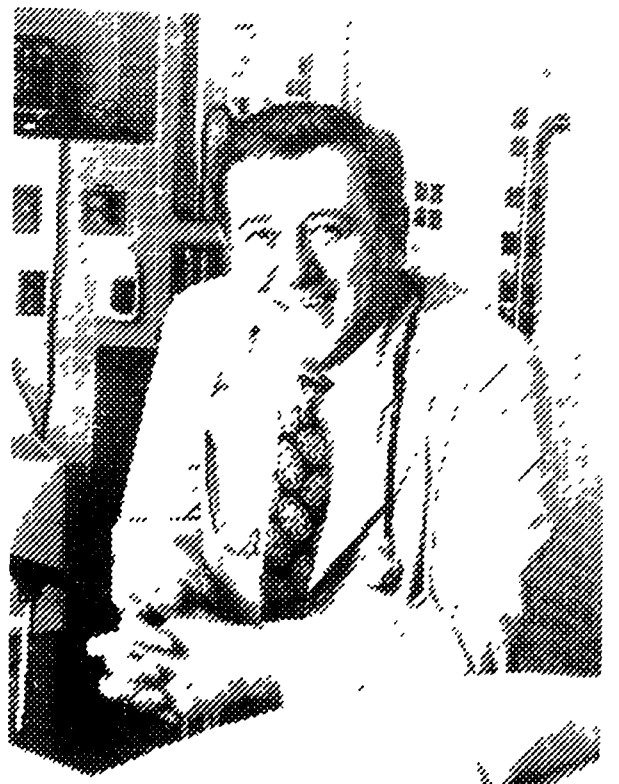

HBO scores three Sports Emmys

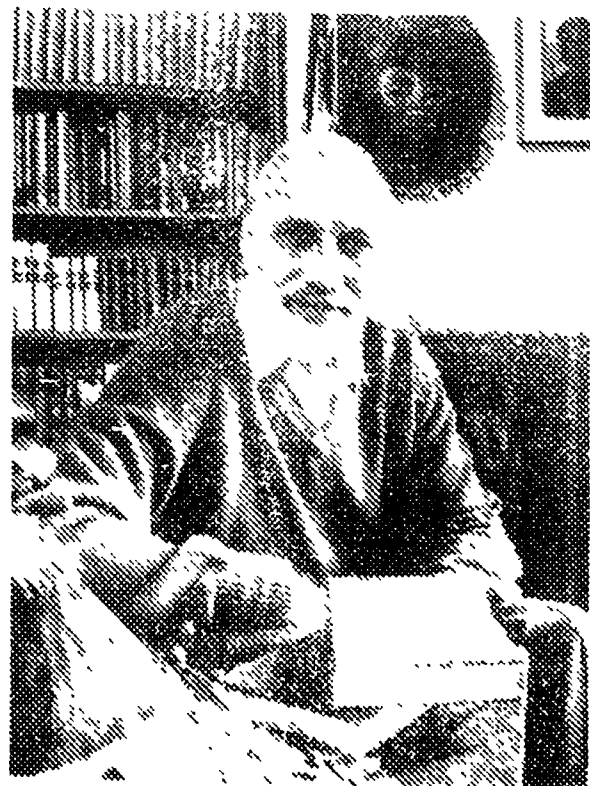

Home Box Office made a name in television sports by hyping big-money fights that often don't live up to their billing. But the premium cable channel took a serious step toward respectability at last month's Sports Emmy Awards in New York.

HBO's two-part special, *Play-By-Play: A History of Sports Television* garnered three awards at the April 20 ceremony, including the prestigious special award for Program Achievement. Producers Ross Greenburg, Rick Bernstein and Paulette Douglas, along with director Marc Payton, succeeded in making a program that is both informative and entertaining. A documentary on this subject was long overdue and should become required viewing in college media classes.

At press time, HBO had no immediate plans to rebroadcast the two-part program in its entirety, but part two is scheduled to encore on Monday, June 8.

This was no flash in the pan for the cable channel. HBO, despite airing far fewer hours of sports than the competition, had eight total nominations. Its five-Emmy total was just one less than front-runner CBS and equaled the number won by ABC, NBC and ESPN. The HBO sports special *When It Was a Game* received three nods and *Inside The NFL* garnered one. HBO was also nominated for its promotion of the Foreman vs. Ellis heavyweight bout.

Three countries unite for new look at 'Titanic'

Russian technology provides haunting images

The end of the Cold War inspired hope that former adversaries could cooperate in the exploration of outer space. While this has yet to happen, a successful joint venture of inner space exploration by American, Soviet and Canadian teams occurred last year. One result of their efforts, the hour-long CBS special *Titanic: Treasure of the Deep*, airs on Friday, May 15. Walter Cronkite serves as host for this thought-provoking journey to the most famous wreck in history.

Canada's Imax Corporation conceived the notion of an expedition to the site of the sunken luxury liner, 80 years after it came to rest on the ocean floor. Imax chartered the world's largest research vessel, Russia's *Akademik Keldysh*, and two advanced deep-diving submarines, also the results of Russian technology. With state-of-the-art, 1200-watt HMI lighting, the clearest images to date were obtained of the wreckage and the personal effects of its passengers, strewn about the silty bottom.

Expedition crewmembers included Dr. Anatoly Sagalevitch, who designed the *Keldysh* system; Emory Kristof, an on-board representative of the National Geographic Society; and Al Giddings, the producer/director for this CBS special. Giddings is widely regarded as the premier underwater director and cinematographer, and his extensive list of credits includes the films *The Abyss*, *The Deep*, *Never Say Never Again* and *For Your Eyes Only*. In addition to his vast experience under the sea, Giddings brought to the project his mastery of the use of Sony Betacam equipment.

"This Sony 3-chip camera is something of a phenomenon. When tweaked and readjusted to my particular film tastes," Giddings says, "it renders an image that I call my 'Kodachrome look.'"

And fantastic images they are, considering many involved 20-hour dives to a depth of 12,460 feet in the cold, dark and little explored waters of the North Atlantic.

"Those deep currents are not someth-

ing that we know a lot about," Giddings admits.

What is the *Treasure of the Deep* that the Titanic holds? Although an earlier expedition recovered hundreds of gold coins valued in the millions of dollars, Giddings finds a different sort of treasure in everyday items, like an immigrant's china cup that somehow managed to survive the force of its descent into a realm of extreme pressures. One school of thought, of which Jacques Cousteau is a proponent, demands that the Titanic site be treated as a graveyard wherein nothing may be disturbed. (Although this expedition used robotic arms to examine artifacts, no items were removed.) But, considering the effects of time, Giddings' opinion differs from that of Cousteau.

"Responsible recovery of some of the artifacts, if they were to be put on display for all to see, might be reasonable," Giddings believes. "The wreck itself is melting into the bottom — all that rusted business in great orange color is the oxides and the steel; there's a great orange path, almost like blood. (Robert) Ballard said when he first saw the Titanic, when they discovered it, that the ship looked like she was weeping. In a few hundred years there won't be anything left but a rust spot."

Merkerson loves acting, making a living

"As long as I'm working on something that will feed my soul — and my pocket — I'm fine," says S. Epatha Merkeron, who portrays no-nonsense police captain Margaret Claghorn on NBC's *Mann & Machine*. "When I came to New York, I just went from show to show ... you could do that then, because our government was funding our artists."

Confident of her abilities, Merkeron says she'd like to continue acting in film, television and on the stage. "As I get older, if I can have a good experience and get paid for it ... that's very cool!"

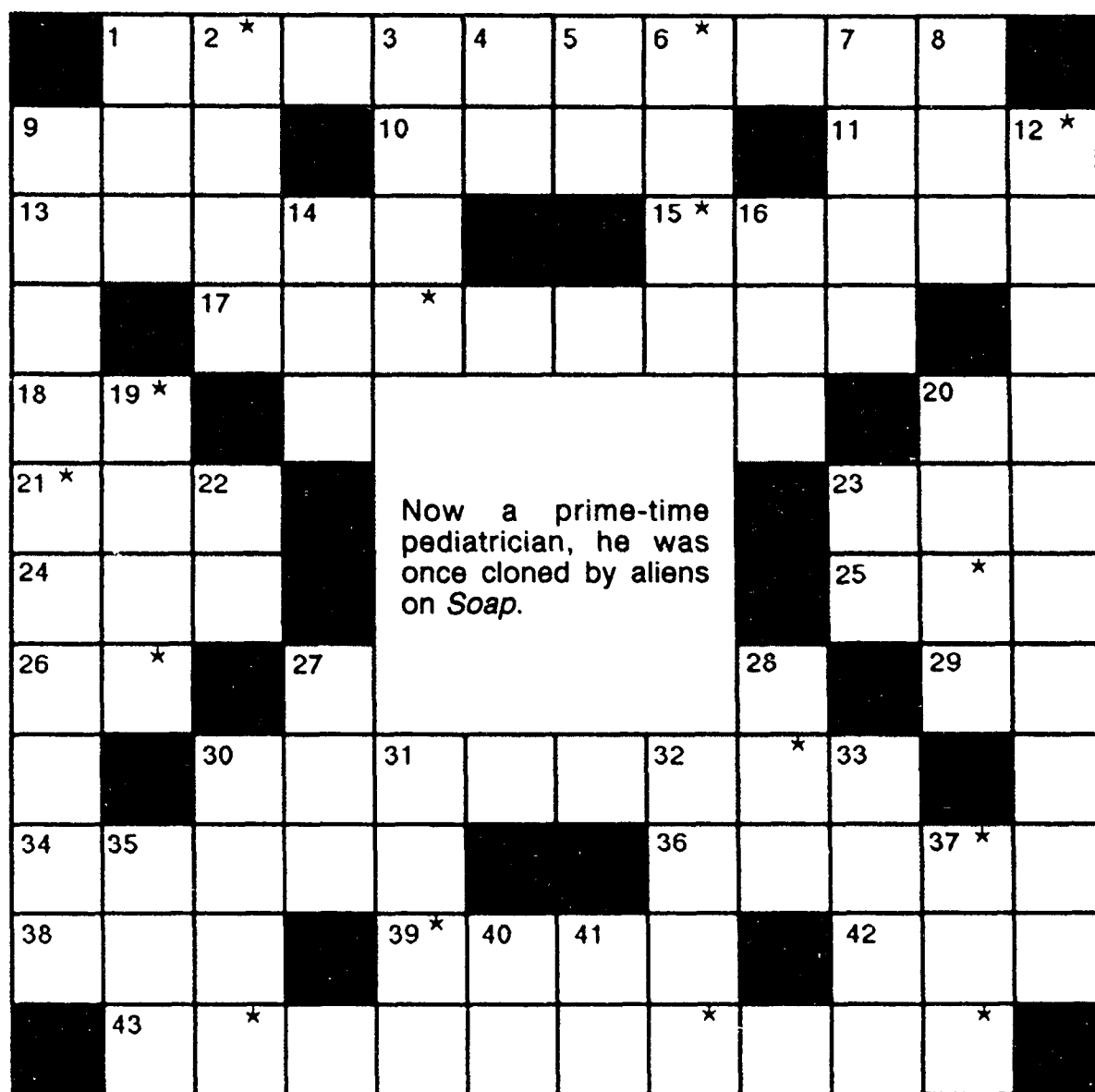
