Voters get new school millage plan

A split millage proposal asking voters next month to approve a renewal of the current levy, and an additional 1.4 mills, is the latest offer from Northville school officials.

Nearly 80 people jammed the board meeting room Monday night to hear the revised millage proposal and see what programs and staff positions would be cut from the district's current \$23-million budget as a result of the defeated 25.41-mill request in April.

Prefacing the unveiling of the revised proposal, Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said seven of the 11 central office administrators agreed to take a salary freeze this year to help get the district over its financial hump.

In other cost-cutting measures, the district's teacher's union has also agreed to reconsider its salary sche-

dule for the upcoming year.

But despite those concessions the voters' ax swung hard and cut deep. Two million dollars worth of teaching and staff positions, educational programs and supplies, and sports and busing programs will be chopped off should only the renewal pass.

"It won't be business as usual," Rezmierski said. "When we open again in the fall our school system will not be anything like the school system we have this year."

The proposal reflects what officials said they heard from voters in recent surveys.

This ballot proposal — which splits the renewal of the current 22.63-mill levy from a separate request for an additional 1.4-mill increase — mimics what voters said they wanted to see on the June 8 ballot, Rezmierski said.

But despite the potential



15 file for fall race

Off to the races.

At least 15 residents will jockey for seven elected positions in the most hotly contested Northville Township board race in recent memory.

Five township board incumbents will run again. All will face tough challenges in coming months.

Incumbent trustees Donald Williams and Thomas Handyside did not file nominating petitions by the 4 p.m. May 12 deadline. Their departure ensures a change in the makeup of the township board, unless either decides to run on an independent ticket.

Supervisor Betty Lennox will face planning commissioner and Zoning Board of Appeals Chairperson Karen Baja for the top slot in the township.

The winner of their Aug. 4 Republican primary run-off could face independent challenger William Brown in the Nov. 3 general election. Brown, who has pulled petitions, has until July 16 to file for office.

Clerk Tom Coel and Treasurer Jack Hosmer also must defeat opponents. Cook is challenged by Sue Hillebrand and Hosmer will run against Rick Engelland in the Republican primary.

Engelland notched a higher vote tally than Hosmer in a special 1990 election for treasurer, but both were edged by Lennox, who later was appointed as former Supervisor Georgina Goss' replacement.

Four trustee openings attracted considerable attention. Incumbents Richard Allen and James Nowka will duel Mark Abbo, Gini Britton, Rebecca Connell, Russ Fogg, Barbara O'Brien, James Petrie, and Angela Thomson.

All are Republicans, with the exception of Petrie, who filed as a Democrat. Petrie is all but assured of a spot on the November ballot, and will be joined by the top four vote-getters in the Republican primary.

The four candidates with the highest vote totals will earn trustee positions.

Constables James Schrot and Edward Mroz again will run for two constable posts.

Candidates have until 4 p.m. May 15 to weigh any second thoughts. Otherwise, they are on the respective ballots.

Fifteen candidates seeking board seats represents the high water mark for some veteran township officials.

"It's the most I've known in all the years I've been here, and that's 14 years," said Deputy Clerk Eunice Switzler.

An attempt to attract federal dollars to the WTUA sewer project has cost taxpayers in Northville, Plymouth, and Canton townships more than \$600,000 since 1989.

The cost of lobbying Congress for a \$20-million grant is a fact of big time political life in some eyes, a waste of time and money to others.

Western Townships Utilities Authority officials say they believe in Cassidy & Associates, a Washington D.C.-based lobbying firm hired in late 1988 to help secure up to \$20 million in federal aid for the \$100-million project.

Some members of Congress do not share that sentiment.

WTUA has not received a penny of federal money, after 39 payments of a monthly \$20,000 retainer paid Cassidy & Associates. But WTUA officials remain hopeful that the lobbying firm's efforts will pay off.

Tom Yack, Canton Township supervisor and WTUA chairperson, on Tuesday said a decision is near on whether the grant request will be written into a U.S. House of Representatives public works appropriations bill.

Yack said the bill will be introduced



"I have no reason to believe it won't," he said.

An aide to U.S. Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor, on Tuesday was not so sure.

"The short answer is, we don't know," said David Geiss, an administrative assistant to Ford. "The long answer is, they have to go through the authorization process (and) have not gone through on this program."

Asked if the prognosis was good for a \$20-million grant, Geiss said: "Not as we're talking here today."

Geiss said Ford, who will run in the newly created 13th congressional district — which includes the WTUA communities — was surprised when Cassidy & Associates approached him in 1988.

City seeks opinions on parking plan

The Northville Community Chamber of Commerce, in cooperation with the city's Downtown Development Authority, will meet with downtown employers and employees May 19 and 26 to hear their thoughts on a proposed parking plan.

Under the plan, designated employee parking lots would be set aside in less prime parking areas, to make prime spaces available for shoppers and other downtown business customers.

The plan is the result of discussions at several DDA meetings, and surveys by the chamber's Business Development and Retention Committee that labeled parking as a chief concern of merchants and shoppers alike.

City officials had planned to tear down the existing Cady Street parking deck and replace it with a much larger three-floor version. But fiscal constraints have put that proposal on hold.

The employee parking plan represents an effort by the city to better regulate existing parking until the new deck is built. The key to the program, DDA and BDRC members said, is active participation and enforcement of the plan by all affected employers, employees, property owners and office tenants.

The southwest corner of the MAGS parking lot, the west side and north edge of the public lot north of MAGS, and a portion of the public lot along East Dunlap east of Edwards Caterer would be set aside as employee lots under the current version of the plan. But those boundaries may change due

to feedback at the upcoming meetings.

One group of businesses along the south side of Main Street have already banded together to free up prime spaces in the Cady Street deck.

The 6 p.m. meetings are scheduled for May 19 at Edward's Caterers, 116 E. Dunlap, and May 26 at Genitti's Hole-in-the-Wall Restaurant, 108 E. Main. Those with businesses north of Main Street should attend the May 19 meeting, and those south should attend the May 26 meeting. Anyone not able to attend their designated meeting is welcome at the other session.

The DDA also considered — and agreed to delay — implementing a restricted morning parking policy. That policy would have prohibited cars from parking in certain prime areas while businesses open in the morning.

Mustang of the Week

The entire Northville High School **SCIENCE OLYMPIAD** team has been awarded "Mustang of the Week" honors in recognition of their performance and proficiency in the science areas.

Beginning in late December, the team worked after school and on weekends to prepare for the regional competition which took place March 21. Competing against 22 other high schools from Wayne, Washtenaw, and Monroe counties, Northville placed fifth and is the first alternate to attend state competition. Many Northville participants brought home first- and second-place medals in several of 23 individual science events.

Northville High School teacher Sandra Vala coached the team, and stated, "The members of this team have worked very hard this winter and had a superb performance in the regional competition Saturday. As coach of the team, it is exciting for me to see such talent, dedication, hard work and effort."

Events of the competition covered a wide range of topics in earth science, environmental science, biology, chemistry, and physics. It included written exams, hands-on laboratories, and tests of student-built mechanical devices, such as bridges, musical instruments, and timepieces.

Said Vala, "Students have spent many of their hours polishing their knowledge of science specialties, and they truly end up as experts in these areas."

Supreme Court upholds rape case

The Michigan Supreme Court, on a 4-3 vote, has upheld the criminal sexual conduct conviction of Bobby S. Conn of Northville.

The case stirred great legal controversy because the Oakland County prosecutor used "hearsay" testimony — a 7-year-old girl's remarks to osteopath Samuel Scheinfeld.

"We were extremely pleased" that the high court reversed a Court of Appeals decision overturning Conn's conviction, Assistant Oakland County Prosecutor Robert C. Williams said. "We thought he got a fair trial and he was exactly where he belonged" — in prison.

Justice Dorothy Comstock Riley's opinion held that the girl's identification of Conn fell under the medical exception to the rule against hearsay (second-hand) testimony.

"The doctor testified that he inquired into the identity of the assailant as an aid for his diagnosis and treatment," Riley wrote. "He inquired into the identity of the assailant so he could scan for sexually transmitted diseases."

"Furthermore, since the doctor learned that the assailant was a member of the victim's household, he in fact began her future treatment by alerting

the authorities.

"The mother (who lived in Conn's apartment when the crime occurred in 1984) was incapable of protecting her daughter from the assaults of the defendant."

A jury convicted Conn after Oakland Circuit Judge Norman Lippitt admitted the evidence. Conn won a reversal before the Court of Appeals. But Oakland County Prosecutor Richard Thompson carried the case to the highest state court and won reinstatement of the conviction.

Signing Riley's 30-page opinion were Justices Patricia Boyle, Robert Griffin and Conrad Mallett Jr.

Signing Justice James Brickley's 33-page dissent were Chief Justice Michael Cavanagh and Justice Charles Levin.

Brickley said the girl gave three different answers to the doctor about who had intercourse with her.

"The fact that this 7-year-old was so susceptible to pressures from her closest authority figure is evidence, in my opinion, that any hearsay statements from that declarant are of questionable reliability or trustworthiness," Brickley said.

The mother took the girl to see Scheinfeld — who practices in Northville — on Feb. 16, 1984, after the girl complained of pelvic pain. The mother said the girl had injured herself.

The girl first said she fell upon her bicycle; then, at her mother's prompting, indicated a male babysitter had been "messing" with her; and finally said Conn, to whom she referred as "dad," had abused her sexually.

The doctor informed child protective services. "The victim was removed from her home and allowed to physically heal. She began psychological therapy and was at the time of the trial receiving therapy," Riley said.

The Supreme Court found the girl's statements trustworthy, and the statements were "reasonably necessary to diagnosis and treatment."

Conn is serving a sentence of 25 to 80 years in prison, Williams said. He was never granted bond, and remained in prison even after the Court of Appeals reversed his conviction, pending the outcome of the appeal to the Supreme Court.

Conn's case was one of three the Supreme Court consolidated into a single opinion.

Three strive to unseat Bullard

Two Republicans and one Democrat are vying to unseat incumbent state Rep. Willis Bullard (R-Highland) in the November election.

Republicans James Ash of Wixom and John Riley of Milford, and Democrat Robert Harvey of Wixom were listed as Bullard's opponents on the May 12 filing deadline date.

The newly formed 38th District includes the Northville community north of Baseline Road. Bullard has served in the current 60th House District, which includes much of the same area, since 1983. Due to the redistricting, though, he plans to move from his home in Highland Township to Milford so that he can run for a seat in the new 38th District.

Bullard said Wednesday that he looks forward to the challenge from Ash and Riley in the primaries and plans on an aggressive campaign.

"Since I've been elected, I've never had any primary opposition and this year I have two," he said.

Bullard said he believes that a high number of candidates running

for political positions is a trend this year.

"This is a year with a lot of dissatisfaction with government, at the national as well as the state level. I think that brings out a lot of people who wouldn't otherwise run for office."

Issues he expects to tackle during the campaign include jobs and economic development and property taxes.

"Jobs and economic development are always an issue, especially when (economic) times are not that good," he said. "Property taxes will probably be a larger issue in the fall, but I'm sure that will come up in the primary campaign."



Four make run for new 20th District House seat

The battle for the 20th District State House seat gained two more contestants before the Tuesday deadline for petitions.

Robert Bernard of Citizens for a Better Northville threw his hat into the ring Friday and Livonia resident Ronald Ambrose filed his petition Tuesday afternoon, just beating the 4 p.m. deadline.

Bernard and Ambrose joined current 36th District Rep. Georgina Goss, R-Northville, and Plymouth City Commissioner Jerry Vorva in the race for the seat representing Northville.

All four candidates are running as Republicans. No Democrats filed, which means the Aug. 4 primary election will effectively elect the winner, barring a successful independent candidate or write-in campaign.

Bernard said he decided to seek the seat to preserve a conservative voice in the Legislature.

"I think Georgina's lacking credibility now with this whole sewer project," he said, referring to the Western Townships Utilities Authority. Describing Vorva as a liberal Democrat running on the Republican ticket, Bernard said, "I'd hate to see him get in because of Georgina's weakness and lose a Republican seat."

Bernard is building his conservative campaign platform on several planks.

"For one thing, I'd like to clear up the whole WTUA thing," he said. "I

dependence on lobbyists and political action committees, he favors limits.

Having held no elective office in the past, Bernard expects his campaign to be a grass roots effort by necessity. "I don't expect to see any major contributors," he said. "I'm a true outsider."

Incumbent Goss is the insider in this race. She held the inside track during her first run for the House last year, winning Gerald Law's 36th District seat in an August special election after Law resigned to become Plymouth Township's supervisor. The move was one of several triggered when Wayne County Commissioner Susan Heintz resigned to take a post in Gov. John Engler's administration. Heintz backed Plymouth Township Supervisor Maurice Breen to fill her commissioner's post, and Law left the Legislature to take Breen's place.

With the support of Heintz, Law, Breen and others, Goss won a narrow victory over Vorva and Deborah Whyman in an Aug. 6 Republican primary. She faced no Democratic challengers.

Goss, who served on the WTUA board during her stint as a Northville Township supervisor, downplayed the effect of recent revelations regarding no-bid hiring, bond obligations and other issues related to the \$100-million sewer project.

"The WTUA project has been very visible; however, it was a good project when it started and is still a good project," she said. "I believe that al-

though there is controversy regarding some of the consultants, they have all done an excellent job and have not overcharged the project."

Northville and Plymouth townships, and WTUA, are now seeking bids for new consultants in response to ties uncovered between the various consulting firms serving WTUA and the townships.

Goss, calling from the floor of the state house, labeled school finances and property taxes among her major concerns.

"I'm very interested in working toward school finance reform, and most especially with out-of-formula districts . . . They've been hurt very badly by some of the actions taken up here."

Goss also wants to remain in office to oversee the progress of bills she introduced, including ones to regulate the state's oil-drilling industry and mandate that a certain percentage of the state's vehicle fleet use alternative fuels.

She acknowledged the current anti-incumbency fervor among the electorate. "I think that everybody in the state Legislature must understand that it can no longer be business as usual," she said. "There have to be major changes around here."

But she predicted the sentiment would have little effect on her own reelection, due to her short eight-month stint in the Legislature so far.

The outspoken Vorva, a Realtor and former Plymouth police officer, panned Goss' first term as a legislator. "In one year, all she's done is sit

and hide behind the thick walls of the Capitol and duck newspapers' questions," he said.

Vorva wants to foster "accountability" in state government, and said the game of musical chairs that gave Goss her current seat shows a lack of accountability.

"I never really stopped being a candidate against that particular group," Vorva said. "When I saw what they were doing last year, trading their jobs . . . keeping all the power to themselves, becoming somewhat of an oligarchy, it rubbed me the wrong way. It was obvious what they were doing, protecting contracts and protecting the money flow."

"That's not in the best interests of the public. That's the way it used to be in the City of Plymouth, and quite frankly, I put a stop to it."

Efficiency is another of Vorva's concerns.

"I have not seen one governmental unit that was not fat," he said. "They can all be trimmed to run efficiently, to save the taxpayers all kinds of money."

Vorva wants to assure "good honest business procedures" at the state level, including tighter accounting and competitive bidding procedures.

He also promised to take a 5-percent pay cut himself "immediately upon taking office," and to push for term limitations.

He would set a three-term limit for representatives, "because after four terms they get a retirement from the state . . . They're after that bennie. Well, I don't want that bennie. All

want is good responsible government."

If he had his way, Vorva would abolish the state's bicameral Legislature altogether. "You can do away with the Senate and save millions of dollars," he said. "Nebraska is the only state in the union that has a unicameral legislature, and it works fine."

The Plymouth commissioner pictures himself as a threat to entrenched politicians in general.

"It's my obligation to challenge their authority, but they don't see it that way."



Ambrose, a recent graduate of Michigan State University and Wayne State Law School, cited his education and experience on several political campaigns as qualifying factors.

"I think I have the ability to make a more efficient government," he said. "Some of the bills that are proposed are unconstitutional to start with, and the legislators are wasting taxpayers' money by proposing them."

Ambrose said he plans to take his message to the streets. "I don't expect to spend more than \$1,000 for my campaign; it's going to be a grass roots, low budget campaign," he said. "I'll be going door to door, talking to people . . . I'm almost considering myself the Jerry Brown of the 20th District Republican Party."


The new 20th District seat will cover the City of Northville south of Baseline Road, Northville Township, Plymouth city and township, and part of Livonia.





Women's rights activists rally local prison officials

About 40 activists Sunday staged a rally across the street from the Scott Regional Correctional Facility in Northville Township to protest allegations of sexual harassment and abuse and unequal opportunities of female inmates.

But a prison spokesperson said the allegations have no validity at Scott.

The purpose of the two-hour Mother's Day rally, one of its organizers said, was to show support for the women in the prison and for their estranged children and to call attention to the mistreatment of incarcerated females.

Susan Fair, the executive director of Freedom Link, a non-profit group in Ann Arbor that works to correct problems within the state's criminal

justice system, said the rally sought to remind people of the injustices female prisoners encounter on the inside.

"We try to get people to pay more attention to the bad medical care, sexual harassment and abuse these women have to take from male guards in the prisons," she said.

Since males guards took posts in the three Michigan women's correctional facilities in 1985, complaints of sexual harassment and sexual abuse have surfaced, including rape and the fondling of women inmates during routine pat-down searches.

Fair said she's had at least four inmates from the Scott facility allege similar complaints against male guards stationed inside the multi-level prison at Five Mile and Beck roads.

But Scott's media liaison, Lance Schuhmacher, disputes that.

"We have had no complaints of any kind of abuse sexual or not," Schuhmacher said.

Activists like Fair contend correctional facilities around the state — including Scott prison — allow male guards to "pat-down" female inmates. In addition, Fair said it is written in the Scott prison policy that male guards are required to monitor female inmates while they shower and are "engaged in intimate personal hygiene."

Schuhmacher said that the complaints from the activists who staged the rally were unfounded.

"To my knowledge we haven't had any of those kinds of complaints here. If there are it's complaints of harassment from females where officers are just enforcing the rules of the prison," he said. "But it's been nothing of a sexual nature or anything to do with shaking downs or pat-searches."



Health officials warn of Rouge

Spring is a good time for parents to remember about health hazards from exposure to the Rouge River. Cynthia Taug, Wayne County Health Officer, reminds parents and others that water quality of the river is severely degraded.

"While initial efforts by Wayne County and others are beginning to reduce overall pollution," she said, "the health department's stream

sampling shows very high bacterial counts." Virtually all samples collected at different locations violate state standards for bacterial quality.

Parents should keep younger children from any contact with the rivers. As in prior years, teenagers and adults who volunteer to help remove debris from these rivers will be given special precautions to help reduce risk of waterborne disease.



Six vie to fill 10th District seat on county commission

Five Republicans will square off in the Aug. 4 primary race for the one two-year seat representing the 10th district on the Wayne County Commission.

The winner of the primary will then vie against the race's sole Democrat, Michael Cottery of Plymouth, in the general election in November.

In the field of Republicans, incumbent Maurice Breen, of Plymouth Township, will try to retain the commission seat he was elected to fill in midterm one year ago. Breen, former Plymouth Township supervisor, was elected to fill the vacancy left by former commissioner Susan Heintz of Northville Township, who forfeited her seat to manage Gov. John Engler's southeastern Michigan office in Detroit.

According to Maria Sieminski from the Wayne County elections office, four other Republicans seeking to unseat Breen and challenge Cottery

in the fall filed petitions under the deadline on May 12.

Of the four newcomers running, two are Plymouth residents; the other two live in Livonia.

Patrick Downes, an area sales representative for Pitney Bowes in Southfield; and Clayton Stacey, both of Plymouth, will join Livonia residents Thaddeus McCotter, an attorney in private practice and Schoolcraft College trustee, and Lawrence Schweiger on the Republican ticket in August.

The crowded field contrasts with last year's election, in which Breen faced no opposition from Republicans or Democrats.

In press statements dated prior to Tuesday's filing deadline, McCotter and Downes stressed their individual motivations for seeking the seat.

"I run as a matter of principle," McCotter said. "Whether as a volunteer in the community or the Republican Party, my cardinal concern has always been the promotion of honest, open government."

McCotter has said in the past since the Western Townships Utilities Authority issue surface that he intends to make that issue central to his campaign.

Downes is also running on a platform that stresses government accountability and responsibility.

"Given the economic reality of the county there will undoubtedly be some difficult decisions to be made," he wrote in a press release dated April 18.

Democrat William Brinker will challenge Oakland County Commissioner Kay Schmid, R-Novi, in her first re-election bid.


Both filed Tuesday in the newly formed 17th District. Neither will face primary opponents.



Crowd seeks House

The Republican camp is going to be a busy place in the newly created 13th U.S. Congressional district.

By Tuesday's 4 p.m. filing deadline, six GOP candidates had signed on to face Democratic U.S. Rep. William Ford and third-party candidate Paul Jensen of Ann Arbor.

Among the last to file was state Sen. R. Robert Geake of Northville. Geake has served area residents in the State Capitol since 1977 and is assistant majority floor leader in the Senate. He is vice chairperson of the Senate Appropriations Committee, and also sits on the Labor Committee and the Family Law, Criminal Law and Corrections Committee.

Also a newcomer to the race for Washington was University of Michigan professor Raymond Tanter. A former official in the Reagan administration, Tanter is well-known in the Detroit area for his frequent appearances on local television news broadcasts.

Two relative unknowns were also late filers on Tuesday. Herbert Scott of Canton and William H. Steele, a Plymouth businessman, both filed petitions to seek the GOP nomination

for the U.S. House seat.

The remaining Republican candidates are familiar opponents for Ford, a 28-year veteran in Washington.

Glen Kassel of Westland was the last Republican to announce he will seek his party's nomination in the new district. He has owned and operated the Sims Agency, a real estate and insurance firm in Wayne, for 25 years, but Kassel is no stranger to the political arena.

Twice—in 1986 and 1988—Kassel ran unsuccessfully for the old 15th Congressional District against Ford. Kassel earned the Republican nomination in 1986.

Another veteran campaigner declared his quest for the Republican nomination in Northville last Saturday. Burl Adkins, a Downriver businessman, chose Northville city hall to kick off another run at the U.S. House. He received the Republican nomination for the 15th District in 1988 and 1990, losing to Ford on both occasions.

In 1986 Adkins challenged for the Democratic nomination and was defeated by Ford.

Redistricting initially placed Adkins outside the district. But the Southgate resident has said he is

currently seeking to buy a home in the Plymouth-Canton-Northville area.

When district lines were redrawn for the 1992 elections Ford, a Taylor native, was also left without a district. He elected to make his home within the new 13th district and seek his 13th term.

One candidate has stepped forth outside traditional party lines. He is

Paul Jensen, an Ann Arbor native and a political activist who has made unsuccessful runs for mayor of that city, as well as a bid to unseat retiring U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth. Jensen is running on the Tisch Citizens Party ticket.

Primaries for the four Republican candidates will be held Aug. 8 in preparation for the Nov. 3 general election.

Five vie for seat

The race to replace retiring U.S. Rep. William Broomfield got a little more crowded by Tuesday's deadline for candidate filings.

One more Republican, Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Alice Gilbert, joined the primary battle against State Sen. David Honigman and former county party chair Joseph Knollenberg.

Two Democrats also filed: past Broomfield opponent Walter O. Briggs IV and Michael Meyer, a Novi School Board member.

The candidates will face off in the party primaries Aug. 4. They are running to fill the newly formed 11th District seat, which includes the Northville community north of Baseline Road.

The new 11th district is strongly Republican, Broomfield said. It includes much of the same territory as his old 18th District.

Meyer said he has no delusions about the contest. "It's almost against all odds," he said. "I wouldn't do this if I didn't think I could win."

Briggs was unavailable for comment. Gilbert resigned her judicial position Tuesday so she could run for the Congressional position.



"People have lost faith in their lawmakers. As a judge, I have spent my career listening to all sides of an issue and then rendering an honest, objective opinion," Gilbert said in a press release.

Honigman declared his candidacy at a May 5 rally in Novi where he asked supporters to donate 92 cents in change to his campaign. His campaign's theme has been to call for "change" in 1992.

Knollenberg worked as Broomfield's campaign manager until the congressman dropped out of the race. His campaign will make use of volunteers and be a grass-roots effort, Knollenberg said.

"I've been an activist but always content to run my business and raise my family," he said.

\$1,082,000 the 1.4-mill increase would raise if passed, the district is still seeing large cuts across the board. At best, if the renewal and increase both pass in June the district will still feel a \$1,163,000 shortfall from its first request.

Should just the renewal pass, officials have identified a tentative list of cuts. Earmarked on that list are nine to 11 existing teachers plus the five new teaching positions planned to compensate for projected increases in student enrollment. One central office supervisor and the athletic director position would also be let go. Educational support services positions (assistants in the science, technology and gifted resource center and 10 teachers' aides), and in-district secretarial services are also on the chopping block.

In addition, all sports at the middle

school, freshman and junior varsity levels would be axed. Only Northville High School varsity programs would be funded.

The Partnerships in Education program, the Student Assistance Program at the high school, and the First Grade Graduated Start topped off the district's program hit list.

Busing, computer and technology, and maintenance and custodial services will all be reduced for a sweeping \$768,000 cut.

While a renewal of the current levy would bring in \$22,501,000, it still amounts to a \$2-million cut in the initial budget for next year.

Should voters pass the 1.4-mill increase, that added \$1,082,000 would be used to buy back all laid off teachers, the athletic director, athletic programs in the middle and high schools, and restore the Partnerships in Education and Student Assistance programs.



CBN raps board

Members of Citizens for a Better Northville had very little to say Monday night about the school district's second millage proposal, but took pot shots at school board members criticizing them for their first one.

The citizens group, which opposed the first millage proposal, asked the board to lift the "veil of secrecy" and be more forthright with the voters, to review current board policies addressing conflicts of interest and code of ethics, and to write a letter to its staff asking them to keep their comments about the millage issue outside the classroom.

CBN spokesperson Phil Phillips said his group opposed the way information about the millage issue was disseminated to voters in the April 28 election.

"We don't want to see only a portion of the voters get the information. We want all of us to get the information," he said.

Board President Jean Hansen agreed some of the CBN's concerns were valid, but Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said some of the board's actions relative to teacher contracts were protected under the state's open meetings law.

Phillips' second request is what caught board members Donald Klokenga and Joseph Dunkerley off guard and put them and their board colleagues on the defensive.

Phillips said CBN wants to see to it

that board members with spouses who are teachers in the district abstain from voting on issues tied to teacher contracts and salary matters, and accused Klokenga and Dunkerley of violating that principle. "It's true confession time," Klokenga responded. "Shirley, would you stand up," he said, calling for his wife, a teacher at Meads Mill, in the audience.

After recounting their brief history, Klokenga defended himself against the CBN's claims. "I have always abstained from votes that had to do with teachers' contracts and I intentionally don't serve on the personnel committee for that reason," Dunkerley concurred.

In response to Phillips' allegations, Rezmierski quickly came to the board members' defense.

"It is documented in the official minutes of our meetings that those board members have removed themselves from voting on issues that would be considered a conflict of interest," he said.

Third, Phillips said he and other CBN members have received phone calls from parents complaining that a lot of teachers and administrators are talking about the proposed cuts in the classroom and that talk is upsetting to some students.

"We are asking for a letter to the staff telling them to not talk about the issue inside the classroom so the students don't have to hear it," Phillips said.

Board members agreed to comply with that request.

Bills would let cities promote more commerce

Cities would get new powers to promote retail commerce and high-tech industry under two bills before the state Senate.

The retail bill was pushed by Sen. Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham, and the high-tech bill by Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills.

"I have the same concerns in my district," said Sen. Fred Dillingham, R-Fowlerville, whose Corporations and Economic Development Committee reported out the bills last week.

Bouchard's SB 582 was the more controversial. It more tightly defines the rules under which cities may use special assessments in areas defined as "principal shopping districts" to promote them.

The sticking point: the cap on the largest assessment, set in the bill at \$20,000 for one store.

The Michigan Merchants Council, prodded by Jacobson's department stores, sought a \$5,000 limit and refused Bouchard's offer to compromise at \$12,500.

"We're back to a special interest bill. Our group views it as Birmingham retailers who couldn't bring it together in one focused front," said Chrs Hindsstratter of the Merchants Council.

But Peter Kuhnmuensch of the Michigan Retailers Association liked it. "It's not limited to promotions. It can affect economic development activities."

"It's vital to economic development. It's not limited to one city," said Bouchard, adding that northern Michigan towns like Petoskey are supporting it as well as small cities in the metropolitan area like Royal Oak and Plymouth.

Bouchard's bill amends a 1963 act allowing special assessments for malls, pedestrian walkways and other physical improvements. Besides the \$20,000 cap on a single assessment, changes include:

- At least 10 retailers must be affected.
- They could do market research, cooperative advertising, public relations and promotions such as fashion events.

Mall owners can organize such projects, Bouchard said, but older downtowns lack such mechanism.

Clarifying amendments limited the assessment to the businesses, not property owners, and to the retail portions of buildings with upstairs apartments.

The \$20,000 cap cost Bouchard one committee vote.

"It makes me, as a senator from Detroit, feel good to help those poor folks in Birmingham and the suburbs," said Sen. Michael O'Brien, D-Detroit.

But he voted no after the cap was raised to \$20,000. "I thought you wanted to help us," said Dillingham. "I changed my mind," said O'Brien, and the bill came out on a 3-1 vote.

Faxon's SB 677 extended for five years the time that high-technology firms — such as research, engineering and product development — can qualify for tax increment financing.

"We endorse the bill, and the Michigan Development and Financial Association endorses it," said Don Gross, Southfield's director of community development.

High tech was "sunsetting" from the TIFA (Tax Increment Financing Act) last Dec. 31. If Faxon's bill becomes law, the new sunset date will be the end of 1996.

With TIFAs, a city may "capture" an increase in property taxes in a defined district for city improvements within that district.

Northville High School senior, said Monday.

Not the most profound thing you'd expect to hear from one of the school's valedictorians, a national merit finalist, and one of two of *The Northville Record* 1992 All-Area Academic Team members.

But for Ord, being laid-back has just always been his approach to things.

"It's always worked for me," he said. "I never really know what I'll be doing or how I'll get it done; it just all happens."

It's kind of like his theory on entering the University of Michigan next fall.

"I'm going to U-M to pursue what I'm going to pursue," he said Monday.

But in a college acceptance essay he wrote earlier, he put it this way: "I am adamant on attending the University of Michigan and I plan to accept their invitation into the Honors Program. Literature, Science, and the Arts is my current academic arena, and my career goal is to balance the scales of mental and mater-

ial success."

Even though graduation's right around the corner this high school senior, who has carried a 4.0 grade point average, is undecided on his career plans, but for him that's okay too.

"It's hard to find a balance between what you like and what you want to do," he said. "I have some general ideas; I might go into medicine or computer science or be a writer. Everything is covered there, the arts and sciences, and everything in between."

"Maybe I'll just be a career college student," he said, chuckling.

Anyway you look at it, Ord's done something right—sometime—to get him where he's at today. With \$2,750 in scholarship money in his pocket he's already started packing for Ann Arbor.

For Jolie Graf, our second esteemed 1992 All-Area Academic Team member, the last day of high school is the first day of a well-plotted college career.

After graduation, Graf will pack her bags in the fall to take up residence at Wellesley College in

Massachusetts.

Even though Graf and Ord share honors on the valedictorian list, the National Honor Society roster, and on the list of students named as National Merit Finalists, the similarities stop there.

As a freshman next fall, she'll begin working toward a double major in biochemistry and English at Wellesley. After completing her undergraduate work, Graf hopes to earn a doctorate in genetics and eventually a juris doctorate to become a lawyer.

"I wanted to go away to school and didn't want to stay inside the state," Graf said. "Wellesley offered me the best opportunity."

Every since she can remember, science has been a preferred subject. But lawyers make more money than scientists, so Graf decided she wants the best of both worlds.

"I've always liked genetics a lot," she said. "One of my favorite things is science, but I can make more as a lawyer."

Since transferring to Northville High school as a sophomore from Wisconsin, Graf has been busy the last two years.

In addition to maintaining a grade point average of 4.0, Graf is a member of the school's SADD (Students Against Drunk Driving) chapter, its National Honor Society, and is active on the yearbook staff.

Her hunger for science is fed through participation on the school's Quiz Bowl and Science Olympiad teams.

Both students said their academic success is truly the work of their own hands, but it has been guided and encouraged by their parents.

"My parents didn't push me at all but they watched from a far," Ord said. "They were a big influence in my choosing U-M. They kind of steered me to it with subliminal messages, like leaving U-M napkins on the counter or banners on my door. I guess they figure if I'm going soul-searching I might as well do it closer to home."

Graf agreed.

"I definitely did it on my own," she said. "My parents were a big influence because they are letting me go to Wellesley and it's costing them more than they can afford. But they are letting me go there," she said.

Do the right thing on township benefits

The township board has already made one mistake by not acting on compensation for elected officials before Tuesday's deadline to file for the ballot. When the board takes up the issue again tonight, it ought to move ahead and adopt the recommendations of the committee it appointed.

The issue of compensation — including salary, benefits, and other perks — to elected township officials arose several months ago. The township board — the seven people directly affected by the issue — appointed a three-member panel from its Northville 2000 group to research compensation questions and return with a recommendation.

The plan was to decide on any changes — yea or nay — before May 12, which was the deadline to file petitions of candidacy for all township offices. Made sense; that way, anyone considering a run for office would know the compensation of that office before deciding to file.

The township board met in a special session last week primarily to consider the committee's recommendations before May 12. But with two board members absent — including Trustee James Nowka, who has publicly supported doing away with perks — the three votes of Supervisor Betty Lennox, Clerk Thomas Cook and Treasurer Jack Hosmer were enough to delay action on the proposals. Trustees Richard Allen and Don Williams dissented, pushing for the vote last week.


As it happens, the committee recommendations included significant cuts for the offices of supervisor, clerk, and treasurer.

Delaying action past the filing deadline was a disturbing move, but little more. The real concern is what the board will do with the committee recommendations. It's simple: They should approve them.

The committee was faced with a tough task, but did a thorough job researching compensation systems in other townships before arriving at a fair set of recommendations. Taken as a whole, the proposals address several problems with the current system, the kind of thing which led to this becoming an issue in the first place.

Northville Township's use of a full-time manager plus a relatively strong supervisor position makes it unique among area townships. The committee recommended a cut in compensation for the supervisor, and that's probably appropriate; with a full-time manager supposedly leading the township administration, a supervisor making upwards of \$25,000 a year and thousands more in benefits seems like duplication.

The clerk and treasurer positions likewise came under the committee's knife,

and again that's probably appropriate. When the deputy clerk and an elections clerk do most of the actual work concerned with a clerk post, a clerk's salary which rivals some full-time jobs definitely needs some downward adjustment.

The gap between the treasurer's salary and the rest of the board is also currently too wide, and the committee addressed that problem both by reducing the treasurer salary and raising the trustees'. This approach is logical; when the trustees serve as representatives on other boards and commissions, the time spent doing business — and the authority held — is probably not far different between the two jobs.

The recommendations, as far as they go, seem both reasoned and reasonable. The board members who voted for the delay last week had no good reason to do so, and such failure hints of self-interest, or self-preservation. Simply put, they've got no good reason not to approve the proposal.

It's distasteful enough to watch public officials delay salary cuts for the positions they now hold, and hope to continue holding for another four years. It would be much worse, however, to turn those cuts down. It should be self-evident that public officials in charge of their own salaries means raised eyebrows and public disgruntlement from the start (remember Congress?), and that's the reason to set up a compensation committee in the first place.

Of course the township board can't simply rubber-stamp a recommendation which comes before it, but this situation is far different from a Planning Commission rezoning case, say, or from a Water and Sewer Commission stance on a special assessment district.

It's different because the township board itself is the subject of the recommendation. That means in a case like this, more than any other, the board would need an awfully good reason to go against what its committee proposes. The board hasn't got such a reason here, and it ought to get on with things and approve the plan sitting before it.

Hide 'n' sneak not the answer



Liberals of the 1960s and '70s had the same answer for every problem, real or imagined: Throw money at it.

Since the mid-'80s, the new answer has been hide 'n' sneak: Hide the public records, close the public meetings.

Sen. William Van Regenmorter, a Republican from Ottawa County, learned the hard way that eventually the public wises up.

Van Regenmorter chairs the Senate Judiciary Committee, and last week he scheduled a hearing on his SB 908 — blandly labeled "general amendments to the Crime Victim's Rights Act."

Some amendments! Currently victims of serious crimes may ask to have their names withheld from the police records. Van Regenmorter would reverse centuries of law and custom, mandating that nearly all IDs be automatically closed, letting police work in secret.

He led with his jugular by scheduling the hearing just as a federal jury nailed Detroit's ex-police chief William Hart for embezzling \$1 million from secret drug funds.

For years Detroit officials strove to hide those records from the public. To their shame, Detroit police picked up two *Detroit News* reporters trying to track down the wrongdoing. To police, the bad guys were the expositors, not the thieves.

Well, Van Regenmorter's bill ran into a storm of protest. "Grossly unconstitutional," said attorneys for the *Free Press* and Michigan Press Association.

A national press group noted that Oakland, Calif., police

had been caught sloughing off rape complaints from the social underclass, suggesting the true reason cops want to shut the records.

Van Regenmorter canceled the hearing.

There's a familiar pattern in Michigan.

● The Potato Commission, appointed by the governor, is an official body which can assess and fine growers. Last month the Senate voted to exempt assessments and fines from the Freedom of Information Act.

● The Senate passed a bill to "reform" medical professionals' discipline. Two key "reforms" would shut down records under the Freedom of Information Act and procedures under the Open Meetings Act.

● The Legislature last year updated the 87-year-old Telecommunications Act by yanking many of Ma Bell's filings from the Freedom of Information Act.

● In 1990 then-Sen. Doug Cruce, R-Troy, sponsored Oakland Prosecutor Richard Thompson's crime fighting bills. Their notion of fighting crime was to exempt prosecutors' appeal briefs from FOIA, not just to prisoners but to everyone.

● State Rep. Burton Leland, D-Detroit, won House approval in 1991 of a bill to shut down certain motor vehicle records from FOIA. *The Detroit News* found Leland didn't really live in his district but in a Lansing suburb. Guess what tool was partly responsible for tracking down Leland.

That's only at the state level. Suburban police departments are notorious in covering up their inability to solve crime by denying information requests with a sneer and a "Sue us."

L.A. could look here for help



For those old enough to remember the Detroit riot of 1967, seeing the violence in Los Angeles on TV was like a recurring nightmare.

I remember it vividly. Some of these newspapers were printed in the old Polish Daily News plant on Canfield Street. I took a crew of volunteers downtown to put out the papers while the riot raged. The sight of corner stores blazing and armed National Guardsmen patrolling the streets is forever burned in my memory.

What Los Angeles burned into many minds was that a lot of the burned and looted shops were owned by Koreans. Like Detroit 25 years earlier, many black store owners displayed "Black Owned" signs to avoid destruction.

This raises a tough question: How come blacks are less successful in starting their own businesses than Koreans, Chaldeans or Vietnamese, immigrants who arrived penniless and voiceless in America but who now dominate commerce in many inner cities?

If the answer is that blacks are just unwilling to work hard enough to start and build a little business, then the only appropriate public policy response is to continue dependence on welfare and hope for the best.

But I don't believe either answer is true. And neither does Larry Doss, a tough-minded Coopers & Lybrand partner who happens to be black and who ran the successful Inner City Business Improvement Forum (ICBIF) in Detroit in the '60s and '70s.

Doss points to two business problems affecting blacks more than recent immigrants:

● Capital. Most black families have not accumulated

enough wealth for business capital. Venture capital isn't easy to come by. That's true for many immigrants, too.

But many immigrant communities are very effective in financial networking, providing long-term and low-interest loans to their members. Think of Mike George and his enormous support to the Chaldean business community.

● Labor. Most immigrant businesses employ family members who work fantastic hours at very low pay to support a collective family enterprise. But among blacks, 66 percent are headed by single parents — up from 36 percent in 1970.

These factors suggest what can be — and has been — done in Michigan to help create a stable, thriving, urban middle class and prevent another explosion.

A minority business and industrial development company (BIDCO) was started last year and is lending to black entrepreneurs.

Banks in metro Detroit have put up \$600,000 to help inner city folks build businesses. Borrowers must train in New Detroit's small business development system.

For children, the Buddies in Business program at Greater Christ Baptist Church this summer will develop products, market them and learn the skills to make a business work.

Doss said the seeds planted two decades ago by ICBIF have grown. Today the Detroit area is "probably one of the top four cities in the country for black businesses — much better than Los Angeles."

Government programs have failed because they're blunt and imprecise, not targeted at the problems of real people.

People are realizing that resolving the problems of inner cities will come through thriving local businesses and a growing middle class.

Wayne County very reasonable

To the editor:
Your recent editorial entitled "Wayne County Makes Unreasonable Request" is both inaccurate and misleading.

The editorial states that the county's request for the city to participate in the cost for the resurfacing short sections of Seven Mile Road and Edward Hines Drive is a "dramatic policy shift." This is completely untrue.

It has been a long-standing policy for cities in Wayne County to share in the cost of improving County roads within their communities. This share has varied from 12 1/2 percent to 33 1/3 percent depending on whether or not the project qualifies for federal or state funding. The county share has ranged from 12 1/2 percent to 66 2/3 percent plus all engineering and administrative costs.

During the past five years, there have been 50 letters written to 18 different cities in Wayne County requesting participation in 40 county-initiated projects for which federal or state funds were not available. With the exception of Northville, every city has responded favorably to joining with the county in having certain sections of roadway within their city improved rather than just repaired.

It should be noted that the City of Northville has in the past participated in improvement projects on county roads within the city, the most recent of which was in 1985 when a two-lane pavement on Eight Mile Road between Center Street and Horton Street was widened to four lanes.

Your editorial further states that "the county's approach simply isn't fair since it has a responsibility to maintain county roads." You are correct in that the county does indeed have a responsibility to maintain county roads. The county has in the past and will in the future make every effort to meet this responsibility. However, this responsibility does not extend to assuming the full cost of road improvement projects. If such were the case, there would be insufficient funds left for the county to fulfill its mandated responsibility of providing a reasonable level of road maintenance. A distinction must be made between "road maintenance" and "road improvement." The proposed Seven Mile Road and Edward Hines Drive projects are considered as road improvements and as such are deserving of city participation.

So when you state that Wayne County makes an "unreasonable" request, I must ask, "Is it reasonable for the City of Northville to not share in the cost for improving (not maintaining) a county road within the city when virtually every other suburban city in Wayne County has been more than willing to participate in the cost of having one of its county-owned roads improved?" By obtaining city participation, the county is able to improve more miles of heavily traveled roads, thereby providing greater benefit to the traveling public and all the citizens of Wayne County.

Friends at Omnicom are at it again

To the editor:
Our friends at Omnicom are at it again. The latest ploy is billing us for a one month plus ten day period. Obviously, the charges for that period would be about a third more than prior billings, so when increases are passed on in the future, we'll rationalize "that these (new) charges are for more than a month."

And a new tactic in our most recent bill was a \$3.33 charge for an "additional outlet," which we didn't

add or have. For this Omnicom's explanation was that the charge was "always included in previous billings but now we (they) are itemizing the bills." However, our bill showed exact same charges as the prior month for basic, for premium channels (Cinemax, HBO) and cable guide PLUS the "additional outlet." So in effect our bill was increased by at least \$3.33, yet their reasoning said it wasn't. Getting explanations for billings is a real joke with Omnicom and just try to talk to General Manager Lisa Ballard (phone 459-7300).

Yes, it is time we banish Omnicom from Northville when their contract renewal comes up and bring in a cable company whose charges are lower, fairer and more in line with the competition in the area. And in so doing we'll almost certainly get better service, improved programming and more honest, less deceptive billings and policies.

Stage fright fizzles out in limelight

The Northville Players recently held their auditions for the melodrama, *Egad, The Woman in White!* Before I tell you about it, however, I must give you my own personal definition of the word "Audition": A voluntary exercise in terror, the likes of which will give you more shivering fits than a library full of combined books of Steven Spielberg and Edgar Allan Poe, and more horrifying nightmares than a graveyard at midnight on Halloween.

In the *Book of Lists*, by Amy and Irving Wallace and David Wallachinsky, what do you think is the number one fear of people? Fear of going to the dentist? Not even close. Fear of death and disease? Way down on the list at number six. No, my friends, the number one fear of most people is getting up and speaking before a group.

Now, as that astonishing revelation sinks in, it's important to point out that the only thing scarier than speaking your own words before a group is speaking someone else's.

How do you know what the author means in a play? What message is he/she trying to convey? What is your interpretation, not to mention motivation? The absolute worst is "reading cold"; when you are not familiar with the plot or characters. But the impossible is yet to come.

There are stage directions in the script! And, Oh, No! Gestures to be inserted with the dialogue.

As someone who admits to (like a former vice-president turned president) not being able to "chew gum and walk at the same time," how can I possibly be expected to stand before a roomful of strangers, a scattering of a few friends and acquaintances, speak someone else's prose, interpret dialogue, gesture and move around the stage all at the same time? (In other words, act!)

I never could do the old parlor trick of rubbing your head and patting your tummy at the same time. Coordination does not run in my family. It has something to do with genes. Indeed, as a product of a parochial elementary school sans physical education classes, fellow students at the public high school I attended, which shall remain nameless, drew lots to see who had the privilege of having me on their team. (Not in the words of Saturday Night Live's Wayne and Garth).

And so it was at the urging of my good friends and neighbors, Northville Players Kim and John Foster, and finally, by Jacquie Rundell, the president herself and producer of the play (the third "urging" the charm), I agreed to audition with many misgivings and much trepidation.

"C'mon," "It will be fun! There'll be lots of laughs and we'll have a great time," they said. And so I allowed myself to be convinced.

Now, walking barefoot on hot coals is "fun" (I did that once but will save

that story for another time); walking barefoot into a wrought iron table is "fun" (just call me Isadora Duncan); having teeth drilled without anesthetic is "fun"; but auditioning? Never.

But wait, I say. They're not looking for Sarah Bernhardt. This is not a Shakespearean classic. They are looking for actors and actresses who can "emote" (translated, "ham it up"). Eureka! I can definitely "fill that bill." Perfect. Case Closed.

Now preparations must begin in earnest. "Preparations," you say, "for an audition?" Ah, yes, my naive little friends, before I lie myself off to the audition and place my naked psyche on the block for all the world to see, I have a few little tricks of the trade to employ; some little games I have garnered from past experiences that have served me well. A battle plan, so to speak.

First, I remove my contact lenses and/or glasses. (We're talking major myopia here. I once wrote an essay entitled, "I can't find my glasses without my glasses," subtitled, "I have myopia; Does that make me a Dopa?" Okay, so that was in the 10th grade at the high school that shall remain nameless.)

The rationale here is that if I can't see the audience of my peers I won't be self-conscious, ergo, not nervous or apprehensive and am more likely to read without aplomb.

Then, I try to keep in mind that though many past performances of the Northville Players have been of a professional caliber, it is a fun-loving, very supportive group. They are not the enemy.

"How can you be shy?" they query. "You are an entertainer who does clowning and Mae West's 'Diamond Lil' for our Summerfest and Victorian Festival and many other characters."

"Ah," I say as I enlighten them, "but then I have costumes, makeup, and a character to hide behind. In the words of Miss Piggy, 'Moi is painfully shy.'"

Finally, I bring out the ultimate weapon in my arsenal: An amethyst. An amethyst? Yes, indeed. According to my erstwhile and sometimes psychic friend, Beverly, an amethyst will keep me calm and serene.

Well, if one is good, two are better, and three are best. I decide to pull out all the stops and wear the ring and the earrings and the pendant.

Wearing my lucky purple sweat-suit, I look like a giant plum from a "Fruit of the Loom" commercial.

I am ready to at last meet my public.

AS I ENTER the First United Methodist Church, where the auditions are being held, I whisper a silent prayer that I don't trip making an entrance. I have worked late tonight so that by the time I arrive they are well into the readings; I will not have the advantage of the descriptions of various characters preferred by the directors, nor will I be able to observe the other aspirants who have already

read their lines.

John Bullington, one of two co-directors, waves me to center stage and hands me a script. Before I can get my coat off and get my bearings, my worst fears are realized: I must read the script; cold.

I think it unusual that a Latin rhythm section is accompanying an audition for a melodrama until I realize that the castanets I am hearing are really my teeth chattering; the claves (those two little sticks they click together) are my knees knocking, and the bongos are palpitations. "Be still my beating heart!" I am beginning to feel a warm glow from the spotlight, but upon closer observation discover there is no spotlight: As the old adage goes, "Gentlemen perspire; Ladies glisten."

The first part I read for is Dora the maid; the person for whom the disparaging term "Dumb Dora" was invented; the insolent and inept maid. My friend Kim tries to convince me that there is great potential here. Sure. She probably has two lines, max, like "I'll get the door, Mum." Not a glamorous or sought-after role. I think, but agree to read for her just to break the ice. I figure I can handle two lines without a great deal of angst.

Getting into Dora's character is quite another thing, however. Her persona is elusive until I begin using an ersatz cockney accent. A specter from an old television show (now gone to T.V. neverland) has appeared: Mrs. Naugatuck from *Maude*. Or is it a demented Eliza Doolittle from *My Fair Lady*?

It works! I even get some laughs; most notably during the weeping scene. This is Dora's Big Moment; I can't let her down; she must have her place in the sun; her Andy Warhol's 15 minutes of fame, reduced here to about 30 fleeting seconds. Letting go of all constraints and restraints, any remaining inhibitions are flung to the winds with abandon as I flail about with great boo-hoos, convulsive sobs and a few snorts thrown in for good measure. I finally collapse in a heap on the floor. Then I hear it; the seducer of every actor and actress on the planet: applause! It is the most beguiling of mistresses, and a thrilling and potent addiction. This is beginning to be fun.

Next is the same scene with another group of auditioners. It is amazing to feel a totally different chemistry with them as the directors mix the actors, much as an artist would mix a palette of colours as they attempt to select and balance the cast. This time a Scottish burr emerges. Where did that come from? I don't do Scottish accents. (Another life, perhaps, a la Shirley MacLaine?) It goes well and I am eager to read for other parts.

It isn't long before I have the chance to read for the role I really covet: the Evil Countess Fusco, who runs the local asylum. She is so against type and my own true sweet nature that it would be a treat and challenge to be her, even if for a little



while. All hostilities and frustrations could be channeled and vented through this formidable battleax. What a cheap form of therapy.

I give this malevolent harridan my best Greta Garbo accent. A countless must be foreign and therefore have an accent, *n'est ce pas?*

Instead, I sound like a cross between Natasha from the Bullwinkle Show and Snow White's evil step-mother queen. What great fun it would be to play her.

Finally, I read for "Mrs. Catherick," a High Society type of the Old School who, before she became a socialite, was a Grande Artiste; well, an acrobatic dancer; er, actually a contortionist who once tied herself into a knot for three days until she "outdid herself." (Pah rum pum! Rim-shot!)

This is the one. Yes, I can emote and strut about and have a Grande Time with this Grande Dame.

Before I realize it, it is time to go; the auditions are over. I would have enjoyed reading for "Aunt Freder-

icka," the wheezing, sneezing, snorting, crotchety old miser (I do sneezes and snores well) but don't wish to appear greedy, and the hour is late: half past 9 (I am definitely getting into the mood of this whole thing).

Russ Dore, the other co-director, thanks everyone for coming and says he'll be in touch. (Shades of the old Show Business "Don't call us, we'll call you" farewell?) He then reads off several names, including mine, and asks them to stay for a few minutes. That must mean I got a role! That else could it mean? But which one? The excitement builds as he comes 'round, application in hand, to talk with me. He even inquires about my work and time schedules; there may be a conflict regarding rehearsals. And then the bomb drops; the melodrama will be done three times a day during the Victorian Festival in September. Alas, my heart is broken. Much as I would love to appear in *Egad, The Woman in White!* I simply cannot bear the idea of giving up my

Mae West's "Diamond Lil"/Lillian Russell character also performing during the Victorian Festival — at least, I hope I will be invited again this year.

Another time — another play, perhaps. Meanwhile, when asked which role I had been considered for, I was told: "All you read for, and then some."


Ultimately, does this bittersweet adventure leave me weeping into my Battenberg trimmed pillowcase? *Mais non, mon ami.* I feel as though I have had three invitations to a Grande Ball. And even though I cannot attend, it's lovely being asked.

Meanwhile, if someone should take another Show Business Axdom literally and "break a leg," I'll be waiting in the wings.

Boys choir to sing

The Choir of Men and Boys of Christ Church Grosse Pointe will sing in Northville this Sunday in the final concert of the 1991-92 series presented by First Presbyterian Church of Northville.

Boys are auditioned as early as the third grade and are given concentrated training in voice for one year as "probationers" and then graduate as choristers. Their voice range is called treble. At the end of the probationary year, they are able to read music, and to participate in part and solo singing. The boys perfect the quality of the treble voice until voice change, when they graduate from the characteristic head tone to the chest voice of alto or bass.

The choir tours in Europe every fourth year. In 1993 the boys will be the resident choir at St. Paul's Cathedral, London, for a week in August and then will present concerts in Vienna. The European tours are largely supported by the Antique Show and Sale sponsored by Christ Church, Grosse Pointe at 61 Grosse Pointe Blvd. on May 29, 30 and 31.

Sunday's program will range from Herbert Howell's "Like as the Hart Desireth the Waterbrooks" and "The Nunc Dimittis" to selections from G.F. Handel's Messiah.

Charles Miller, assistant organist at Christ Church, will play the sanctuary Casavant Organ at First Presbyterian Church.

Q: Is it possible to go to the top of the Sears Tower in Chicago?

A: The Sears Tower is the tallest building in the world. The Sears Tower Skydeck was created especially for visitors to the building.

It's an observatory on the 100th floor, reached by high-speed elevator, 365 days a year. The hours are 9 a.m. to 11 p.m., April through September, and 10 a.m. through 10 p.m., October through March.

A tour of the Sears Tower includes exhibits about Chicago architecture and culture, an audiovisual show, a mapped guide to what can be seen from the Skydeck windows — and the ride to the Skydeck.

Japan's all abloom with Ohanami

Cherry blossoms and festivals mark arrival of spring in Tokyo

Tokyo is transformed by an explosion of nature's fireworks and a sweeping succession of time-honored festivals each spring.

Ohanami, or flower viewing, which began with cherry blossoms, continues in breathless bursts of dangling wisteria, voluptuous peonies, flamboyant azaleas and fragrant roses until 100 varieties of irises come into full bloom at the Meiji Shrine Garden in mid-June.

The winding lanes and bustling shopping streets of Shitamachi, Tokyo's most traditional district, come under the spotlight too, as neighborhood shrines and temples welcome spring with boisterous celebrations.

Dating back to the early Edo Period (1603-1867), one of the city's oldest and liveliest festivals will take place here in mid-May.

WHAT TO SEE


Tokyo's most venerable temple, the imposing Asakusa Kannon, located at 2-3-1 Asakusa, was in its heyday what the Pompidou Center in Paris is today: Street vendors, acrobats and raconteurs crowded in, turning the grounds into a non-stop carnival.

Though the main temple has been completely rebuilt, the spirited atmosphere remains intact. Cloistered in the back streets of Aoyama, the Nezu Institute of Art, located at 6-5-36 Minami Aoyama, houses a superb collection of more than 7,000 Asian art objects, including the famed Shinto paintings "Nachi Waterfall" and "Mandala With 81 Deities."

Outside, the museum's peaceful wooded grounds harbor seven tea houses, the interiors of which can be seen by applying at the office. Admission is about \$7; closed Monday. For more information call 3400-2536.

Hilton, Disney entering 'time share' market

While the recession lingers on like a bad cold, time-shares are enjoying a modest boom.

Sales are up, according to the American Resort Development Association (ARDA), a trade organization for the time-share industry.

As of April 1992, there were 1.415 million time-share owners in the United States, an 18.2 percent jump from 1990.

There is also excitement about two new players who have recently entered the market.

In February, Hilton Hotels Corp. formed a partnership to build and market time-shares with Grand Vacations Ltd., calling the new enterprise Hilton Grand Vacations.

But the start-up that prompted the most attention was made by The Walt Disney Co. In October 1991 they unveiled the Disney Vacation Club, a company to market Disney's first venture into time-sharing.

The magical name of Disney was like a wave of Tinkerbell's wand to the industry. It seemed to signify that at long last, time-shares had come of age.

For those in the time-share business, this was no small achievement.

"There was a public perception that time-shares meant lack of vacation flexibility," says W. Lynn Seldon Jr., publisher of time-share Travelog, a bimonthly newsletter for time-share owners.

"If you had a time-share at Hilton Head Island for the third week of August, people believed you were stuck forever with that week. That's just not true."

Then there was the problem of high-pressure sales techniques.

"You'd walk in and a salesman would explain that the unit was \$14,000 — but if you bought today

you could have it for \$11,000. If you waited till tomorrow, the price went back up," says Mark Pacala, general manager of Disney Vacation Club.

"So the only sales they made were there, right on the spot. And if you didn't buy you left feeling beat up."

Most industry watchers agree this has changed. Pacala notes that 70 percent of Disney's time-share purchases "are made by people after they get home. That's unprecedented in this business."

A time-share is essentially a pre-paid vacation. It's marketed as a period of vacation time, usually seven days, at a specific resort.

The price depends on the type and size of accommodation, its location and the season in which it is to be used. In time-share industry jargon, the colors red, white and blue are used to signify high, middle and low season, respectively.

A red week for a two-bedroom apartment at a top resort might cost \$12,000; a white week \$10,000 and a blue week \$8,000. The cost of an average time-share, according to ARDA, is \$9,000.

In traditional real-estate, clients buy the property; with time-shares, in effect, clients "own" the specific week in the specific property for the rest of their lives.

Owners can exchange their time-share week for a comparable week at another resort, using the services of brokers such as Resort Condominiums International Inc. (RCI), a company that manages time-share resort exchanges for a nominal fee.

For example, it allows the owner of a red week at Hilton Head Island in August to make an exchange for a red week in Vail, Colo., at Christmas.

The time-share industry began in Europe in 1968 when owners of apartments in the French Alps allowed people to buy vacations a week at a time. The idea was to get to a favo

rite ski resort for the same week, year after year.

"It was the oil crisis of the mid-'70s that awakened the industry in this country," says Brian Callaghan, who publishes "Endless Vacation," a travel magazine owned by RCI.

"You had all of these second homes built in the early '70s that were sitting unsold. Time-shares began to spring up about 1973."

There were eight time-share resorts in the United States at the end of 1973, according to the ARDA's research. Currently, there are 1,329.

If a time-share seems expensive, advocates urge consumers to consider the cost of a week's accommodation at their favorite resort and multiply it year after year.

"Time-shares appeal to families for several reasons," says Callaghan. "They're a tremendous hedge against inflation because they fix your vacation costs. After five to seven years, you've broken even."

Families who visit Disney World during the same week every year are attracted by Disney Vacation Club. The company has already completed 175 of its first 197 time share units in Orlando and 50 have been sold.

Buyers of Disney Vacation Club time-shares, which begin at \$12,190, are also buying points in a system that can be used for one long vacation, a series of short getaways or a vacation at a member resort.

Disney entered the time-share business after much watching and waiting, says Pacala.


"We're a growth oriented company and we thought the demographics were right. Let's face it, most people can't afford whole ownership or they don't want it."

"The days of the little vacation house by the sea or in the mountains are over. It's either too expensive or not available. We see the vacation club concept as the wave of the

future."



In the 200, Dogonski won in 23.7 while Hemp was right behind for second at 24.0.


The 1,600-meter relay team of Huzjak, Subotich, Miller and Lehr closed Northville's scoring on the day by winning in 3:34.60.

Department looks for a few good Friends

The Northville Parks and Recreation Department is looking for a little help from some friends. The formation of a new Friends of Northville Parks and Recreation organization is the concept of Parks and Recreation director Traci Gottschalk.


"Our department needs a stronger support base in the community and an outside tool for fund raising campaigns," Gottschalk said. "The Northville community also needs more awareness about the funding level of the Parks and Recreation Department, the services we provide and what facilities are needed in our community."

What Gottschalk is referring to is the reduction of city and township contributions to the Parks and Recreation Department. "The community as a whole doesn't realize that we lost one full-time maintenance employee to the recent budget cuts," she said. "Office hours and service like amusement park sales have been reduced or eliminated, but yet the number of participants in our programs has tripled in the past three years and is steadily increasing."

"We are trying to serve more residents with less resources," she said.

A Friends of Parks and Recreation organization, similar to the Friends of the Library, will target fund-raising projects, Gottschalk hopes. Outside funding for special projects will be important as there are several immediate needs that having no current funding source, like the Fish Hatchery Park tennis court repair.

Financial contributions are not the only resources the new Friends group will seek. Volunteers play an important role in the Parks and Recreation Department. Coaches, special event and project workers are examples of volunteers in the Parks and Recreation Department. The Friends group will be able to identify and organize projects for residents who wish to volunteer their time to the department. Projects might include park cleanup, setting up fitness trail or putting together a set of bleachers. An organization committee is being developed to adopt a constitution and bylaws for the Friends group. A

Childhood anger should be dealt with



Many of us in the student assistance arena have the opportunity to work with children in educational support groups. Many of these students came into the group angry at the world. They may come from a world of divorce, concern about a family

member's drug/alcohol use, difficult peer relations or school conflicts. Through our group activities and curriculum, we learn more about what causes the child's anger and help them to deal with it.

Some anger may be a defense to avoid painful feelings. It may be associated with feelings of failure, low self-esteem, feelings of isolation, or it may be anxiety about situations over which the child has no control.

Some children are afraid to show anger for fear that they will lose control. Others have not been allowed to show anger at home. These children suppress their anger and often suffer from depression.

The outwardly angry child is visible in class.

He or she fights with and bullies others, acts disrespectfully towards adults and shows little concern for others in general.

If anger is not talked about, the child will likely have problems through adolescence and may continue to be angry at society as an adult.

An angry child can set off anger in the adult. When dealing with an angry child, adults should teach and protect. It is important for adults to show the angry child acceptable ways of coping.

In *The Aggressive Child*, Redl and Wineman list the following suggestions which may help you deal with your angry child.

- Being proactive and rewarding good behavior will stave off possible anger. Example: "I know it was hard for you to wait your turn, but you should be proud of the way you did."
- Use closeness and touching to pre-empt an angry impulse. Move closer and hold the child if necessary to calm him or her.
- Show an interest in what the child is doing. A child who is about to use a toy or tool in a destructive way may be easily stopped by an adult who expresses interest in the child and what he or she is doing.
- Use humor. This allows the child to "save face." Remember that sarcasm and ridicule isn't the same as "saving face" humor.

● Explain why you think the child is angry. This helps the child get in touch with the cause of their own frustration. Example: "It makes you mad to have Jimmy play with your toy, but that's not a reason to grab it away."

● Remove the child from the scene. This will show the child that he or she cannot do what he or she is doing, but it doesn't embarrass or rob the child of dignity.

● Remember to keep your cool. Children DO emulate anger.

● Don't hesitate to say "No." Children want limits and boundaries.

● Tell the child that you accept his angry feelings but help him or her to use "I" messages, instead of fists, to express his/her feelings. Example: "When you take my toys without asking, I get mad and I would like you to ask for them."

When children feel valued and respected they will have a high regard for themselves. If we, as parents, model appropriate behavior, children will learn appropriate behavior. They will learn how to express all of their feelings in a way that is acceptable.

Auction a popular way to buy, sell property

The clap of an auctioneer's gavel May 21 may clinch the sale of more than \$300 million in commercial real estate and land.

The national auction, the largest ever of its kind, will include 86 properties in 20 states. It will be at the Fairmont Hotel in Dallas. Through a satellite communication process, other groups will participate "live" in San Francisco and New York City.

The value of all properties lined up for the auction exceeds \$300 million. Properties include commercial buildings, multifamily developments, land and recreational properties, according to Terry Strongin, vice president of RossDove Co., Inc., producer of the auction. His firm, one of the

nation's oldest auction companies, is now producing about 90 auctions per year, he said.


The auction is being presented by a partnership of Grubb & Ellis/Ross-Dove Co. Grubb & Ellis is a commercial real estate broker-age and management firm.

Increasingly, major properties are being auctioned rather than marketed in the traditional manner. Owners are noting that prices received for auctioned properties are not usually bottom-line prices, as they once were. The well-known "bidders' fever" enters the auction scene and prices tend to rise to a respectable level.

The most appealing aspect of selling real estate at auction is its speed. Instead of waiting months or years for an expensive property to sell, it can happen quickly—on

The Forrestall is rich with windows, space

The Forrestall is a large, informal family home. It is designed for construction on a view lot that slopes to the rear. All of the rooms along the back of the house are richly windowed for full appreciation of the vista, and the huge daylight basement has space for a family room, bathroom and three bedrooms.

This is a home to grow in. If finances are tight and/or three bedrooms are sufficient, the basement level could be left unfinished during the first phase. Then it could be developed later, as more living space as needed. If not needed for bedrooms and a family room, the basement could just as easily be redesigned for use as a studio, shop or office, or whatever.

The foyer opens opposite a living room that is virtually awash in natural light. The far wall is almost completely filled with windows, and the room is further brightened by four skylights. A half-wall, topped by columns, partially separates the living room from the foyer.

Family living will quite naturally

gravitate to the comfortable family room/kitchen. Long counters offer plenty of elbow room for group cooking projects, and the L-shape eating bar can easily accommodate numerous eaters.

Although the house has no formal dining room, the bay window is a natural place for an eating nook. Hanging plants will flourish there, as well. Other features include a fireplace, step-in pantry and built-in desk.

A half-bath at this end of the house is as convenient to the garage and the huge utility room as it is to the family room. The master suite and two bedrooms are located at the opposite end. Amenities in the master suite include a bay window sitting area, walk-in closet and double vanities. The two remaining bedrooms share a bathroom.



HOMES GALORE

25 new homes show off area builders stuff

A little bit of everything under the housing sun will be on display later this month, as home builders from Livingston County and the surrounding area present the first-annual Cavalcade of Homes.

Set for May 23-31, the Cavalcade of Homes will feature 25 new homes in Livingston County and the immediate area. The event is sponsored by the Home Builders Association of Livingston County, co-sponsored by Standard Federal and Consumers Power.

Participating in the show are builders from Livingston County, as well as some from Novi, Plymouth and South Lyon. With the purchase of a \$5 ticket (available at any of the homes), people can visit all 25 homes at any time during the nine-day Cavalcade. Hours of the show are 3-8

p.m. weekdays, and noon to 8 p.m. on weekends and Memorial Day.

"We think it's going to be a great show," said home builder John Rudziensky of Paragon Development Inc., who is coordinating the event. "We figured there was a real need in the county to expose homebuyers to the builders, and especially to homes in their price range."

Rudziensky said the 1990 Homearama, held at the posh Pine Creek Ridge subdivision in Brighton, spurred interest in starting the Cavalcade of Homes. The idea, he said, was to feature homes which were a little more reasonably priced.

"Most of the homes in Homearama were out of the price range of the average buyer (those homes were in the \$600,000-\$900,000 range)," Rudziensky said. "We felt we should put together a show that spotlighted homes which were more in their price range."

The homes featured in the Cavalcade of

Homes range in price from about \$125,000 to \$389,000. Most are in the \$165,000 range, Rudziensky said.

"With low interest rates and this area growing so much, there's a lot of interest in Livingston County right now," Rudziensky said. "A lot of people might be looking to move out here, but they don't have a builder or they don't know any builders. This show will allow the builders to introduce themselves."

Rudziensky also said the Home Builders Association plans to make the Cavalcade of Homes an annual event.

The 25 homes which will be featured are spread around Livingston County, but most are in the southeastern portion of the county. Rudziensky said it should take about two days to see all 25 homes.

"To have this many builders in a single show is great," Rudziensky said. "We were

Compatible Bedmates

A little planning before the gardening season starts can yield delicious vegetables for the dinner table throughout the year while reducing the amount of labor required to till the soil.

Using the same garden patch for what's known as "successive plantings" (always has something growing), this is particularly appealing for the suburban and urban home garden, where land space often is at a premium.

It involves planning dates of harvest and planting another vegetable variety right after the first has completed its yield.

Scientists can't explain it, but experienced gardeners have found that certain planting combinations actually enhance growth and reduce insect problems, so keep these combinations in mind when ordering your seeds this month and next. Of course planting dates will vary according to your particular climate and zone that you live in.

Here are some "compatible bedmates."

- **Asparagus:** basil, parsley, tomatoes.
- **Beans:** marigold, celery, potatoes.

- **Beets:** carrots, onions, kohlrabi, cauliflower, kale, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, turnips, cabbage.
- **Carrots:** onions and parsley (which repel carrot fly), beets, peas, sage.

- **Corn:** beans, cucumbers, lettuce, soybeans (to repel chinch bugs), spinach, squash.
- **Cucumbers:** corn, radishes (to repel cucumber beetles).
- **Lettuce:** cabbage, onions, radishes.

- **Marigolds** (which cut nematode populations): anywhere.
- **Nasturtiums:** potatoes, squash.
- **Onions:** carrots, lettuce, radishes.

- **Peas:** beans, carrots, corn, potatoes, turnips.
- **Peppers:** carrots, eggplant, onions, tomatoes.
- **Potatoes:** corn, eggplant, peas.


- **Radishes:** carrots, lettuce, spinach.
- **Squash:** beans, corn, radishes.
- **Strawberries:** borage, lettuce, spinach.

- **Tomatoes:** marigolds, spinach, carrots, mint, lettuce, basil, nasturtiums.





In 1616, a special clay necessary for the production of porcelain was found in the Hizen Province of Japan. Previously, Japan had imported its porcelain from China and Korea.

Many small kilns were built in Hizen Province; they exported their porcelain through the nearby seaport of Imari. The European traders gave all the porcelain the name of Chinese Imari.

The colors used were blue and red or orange on a white background. It became so popular with the traders that it was copied in China and given the name of Chinese Imari.

Within 100 years, dozens of potters in England, Germany and France were imitating Imari and printing an imitation Oriental chop mark on the back.

The blue on the Japanese Imari was darker than the Chinese. Japan used an Indian red; the Chinese, a coral red. The Japanese glaze was grayish; the Chinese was greenish.

The early 17th- and 18th-century Imari is extremely rare and very expensive.

By the 19th century, the quality and beauty of Imari had deteriorated; the colors were gaudy, the designs elaborate and often lacking in taste. Well-executed 19th-century Imari is hard to find and very expensive when found.

A 20-inch 19th-century bowl decorated with lotus, dragons and waves sells for about \$400. A 24-inch charger of the same vintage with flowers and birds lists for \$650. A 15-inch vase decorated with courtesans, dragons and flowers sells for \$500.

An 11-inch square sake bottle from the mid-1800s decorated with birds and grapes lists for \$750. A 7-inch bowl made around 1900 with floral scrolls and lotus medallions lists for \$200.

auction day. Suddenly the owner is free of those burdensome interest payments and operational costs, and he has funds to invest in other projects.

Bidders are normally pre-qualified at major property auctions. In the case of the May 21 commercial property auction, bidders must not only qualify to buy property they bid on, they must put of a \$50,000 (cashier's check) deposit for each property.

Even the preliminary infor-

mation on the properties is purchased by bidders—\$50 for each information package. The entire process is very sophisticated, keyed to current market and financial factors.

Advance "auction information seminars" have been set up in each of the three cities where groups will be bidding, and property inspection dates have been set for individual offerings. Cooperating brokers, representing a buyer, may receive a 1 percent commission.

The number of real estate

auctions has increased greatly, particularly during the past two years. It's becoming an accepted and sometimes preferred marketing method of home builders, multifamily residential developers, owners of commercial real estate and mortgage lenders.

Crosby's current operation in New Hudson is in the "building process" as he notes with a smile. "This was a Coney Island when I bought it. My family, friends and employees, Dave Brown and Terry Milne, helped me repaint it and fix it up. It took a lot of coats of paint to change it over," he added.

"I really appreciate all the help I've gotten and I'm lucky to have Dave and Terry. Dave cooked at the Appleteaser in Milford and in Birmingham. Terry has 17 years experience with E.G. Nick's and West Bloomfield Charlie's."

Established in August 1991, the Copper Pot at first featured only breakfasts and lunches while the owner "played around" with ideas for the dinners he now serves. The addition of considerable kitchen equipment was necessary to offer his entrees and salads.

Employee drug use hurts everyone



In order to help identify a drug-impaired workplace, Marilyn Graham, administrator for the Starting Point Programs in Sacramento, Calif., developed a questionnaire for use by business owners and managers. To interpret the questionnaire, respondents are asked to look for

"yes" answers in clusters of two or three to create a pattern indicative of wasted employee time, abuse of privileges, etc.

- Has there been a recent increase in theft?
- Are there more strangers in and around your building?
- Do your employees visit their cars at odd times?
- Do employees go to the rest room or locker room often?
- Are certain employees frequently preoccup-

led or in a daze?

- Is there an increase in accidents with equipment?
- Are your workers' compensation claims rising steeply?
- Are certain employees always too casual about safety measures?
- Has your product-reject rate risen?
- Are you receiving more service complaints?
- Is afternoon work generally inferior to that done in the morning?
- Has there been a rise in absenteeism — especially on Mondays, Fridays and during the holidays?
- Are the same employees frequently tardy, absent, or forgetful?
- Are more grievances being filed?
- Is there more illness, especially colds and "flu"?
- Does one group of employees create most of the discipline problems?
- Are employees taking longer coffee breaks and/or lunches?

In their book, *Drugs and Alcohol in the Workplace*, Graham and her co-author Drusilla

Campbell state that employees who are chemically dependent show varying symptoms of abuse, depending on the drug(s) being used. For instance, cocaine users may often be the most highly-motivated, creative and energetic people on the payroll.

"Even after addiction, the impaired employee will still go through periods of outstanding work performance," says Campbell. "Alternating with these, however, will be radical mood swings that make him or her difficult to work with and impossible to correct or make suggestions to."

Most common among regular users is an "I couldn't care less" attitude accompanying delusions of grandeur ("At least I made it into work today... they'd be lost without me."). Physical symptoms include habitually licking the lips, jitters, loss of appetite and energy, continual sniffles, and unexplained heart palpitations.

800-Cocaine by Dr. Mark S. Gold is one book that is recommended to employers who suspect cocaine abuse among employee staff.

Want a hot number? Try a 401(k) plan

If you want to build a retirement fund and reduce your tax bill at the same time, look no further than your employer's 401(k) plan. But before you run to your company's personnel office and sign up, the Michigan Association of CPAs suggests you get all the facts.

One attractive aspect of 401(k)s is that the amount you choose to contribute is automatically deducted from your paycheck before your wages are taxed. As a result, you do not pay tax on that portion of your salary that you earmark for the 401(k). In 1991, the maximum contribution is \$8,475. The maximum contribution is adjusted for inflation yearly.

Another 401(k) benefit is that you don't have to pay any tax on your interest until you withdraw the funds. In most cases, you probably will begin drawing on the funds after you retire — when you are likely to be in a lower tax bracket.

Adding to the lure of the 401(k) plan is the fact that most employers will match all or part of your contribution, which significantly raises your rate of return. What's more, your contributions are 100 percent vested.

With most 401(k) plans, you have to manage your account yourself. You will be the one who decides what



with customers, especially his regulars who have their own coffee mugs as members of the Coffee Pot's "Breakfast Club." Omelets are high on the priority list.

Soup and sandwiches or hot plates are featured for the lunch crowd. Dinners range from the Friday night favorite of hand-dipped fish and chips at \$4.75 to barbecued ribs (five bones) with a quarter chicken, plus bread and a side of spaghetti at \$9.95. There's also an eight-bone barbecued rib dinner at \$8.95 or a full 13- to 14-bone slab of ribs a la carte at \$12.95. Of course, there are several selections of other meals in the in-between price range.

"We've been trying stir-fry cajun shrimp and lots of fresh fish as well as applejack chicken, which has a

honey-mustard sauce with apples and raisins," Crosby explained. "It is served flambéed with Jack Daniels. My favorite thing to cook is dinner and I like to saute."

Crosby said he likes to keep his prices reasonable, makes everything from "scratch" and uses only fresh vegetables.

Hours at the Copper Pot are 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. Mondays through Fridays; 6:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. Saturdays and 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. for breakfast on Sundays. The dining room, with its red and green booths and shelves displaying many copper articles, seats 50 without crowding.

"I started in the restaurant business when I was 13½ and I really enjoy it," Crosby said with his friendly grin. "People in this area are really nice and they seem to like all our food. This is a nice town to do business in."

401(k) plan is smart investment

proportion of your money is invested in what vehicles. Typically, at least three investment alternatives are offered — a stock mutual fund, shares in your company, or a guaranteed investment contract (GIC). A GIC is a fixed-income contract issued by an insurance company.

While 401(k) plans are designed specifically for building retirement savings, you can use the funds for certain hardships. To obtain a hardship withdrawal before you reach the qualified age, you have to prove that you need the money to pay for medical expenses, a down payment on a home (but not mortgage payments), tuition at a post-secondary school, or to avoid eviction or foreclosure on your home. You also have to prove

that you cannot obtain the funds from any other source, including selling assets or taking out a commercial loan.

If you do manage to extract your money from a 401(k) before age 59½, you will have to pay the income tax due. In most cases, you will also have to pay a 10-percent tax penalty. However, the penalty may be waived in the case of catastrophic illness. To make matters worse, hardship withdrawals come only from your own contributions, not from accrued earnings or employer-matching contributions.

A way around this problem does exist, however, if you find yourself really strapped for cash. Many companies allow their employees to borrow against their 401(k) at a rate slightly above or below the prime rate. Gener-

ally, the loan must be repaid within five years, unless it is used to purchase a primary home. But if you leave your job and have an outstanding loan, most employers will demand that you repay it in full. If your employer is forced to take funds from your account to satisfy the debt, the hardship withdrawal rules will still apply.

CPAs strongly advise employees to contribute the maximum to their 401(k) plans. But keep the early withdrawal penalties in mind, and don't commit more than you can realistically afford. Most plans allow you to change the amount of your contribution at certain intervals, so you won't be stuck contributing too much or too little if your financial situation changes.

Garden style, design and renovation

Would you like to transform your yard from yawn-inspiring to awe-inspiring?

The-easiest way is to hire a landscape contractor. He or she will map out suggested improvements, recommend the right plants for your climate and implement everything from automatic irrigation to erosion control.

If you'd rather tackle the job yourself, the staff at a nursery or garden center can offer advice; there also are newly published books that can help.

A clever one by Joel M. Lerner, "The Complete Home Landscape Designer" (St. Martin's Press), covers everything from how to locate utility lines to selecting statuary — plus pages of punch-out trees, shrubs, flowers and more to use in planning and improving your landscape.

Another guide, helpful for new as well as established yards, is "Landscape Design, Renovation and Maintenance," by Cass Turnbull (Betterway Publications).

In a chapter titled "What Makes a Yard Look Good or Bad," Turnbull offers the following advice: Just as with furniture and interior decorating, gardens have styles. Sometimes these can be blended, sometimes not.

Common garden styles include formal English (clipped hedges, roses, knot gardens), English cottage (fruit trees and lots of perennials rambling around in great profusion), Japanese (highly trained and maintained pines and other trees with masses of low sheared shrubs, placed rocks, and sand seas), early American (forsythias, quince, peonies, bearded iris), Pacific Northwest (rocks look like mountain outcroppings, rhododendron, pines, heather, vine maples, Douglas firs), woodland (tall trees with understory plants and ground covers), prairie (grasses and sun-loving wildflowers).

Take time to look in books and visit gardens to see what style you identify with most closely. You may be torn among several, but eventually your own style will assert itself.

Generally, you want your more intensive formal-looking areas, like roses and annual flower beds, closer to the house; then you can let the garden become more natural as you move farther away.

Is your yard on a slope? Remember, gravity always wins. Invest the time and money to fix your steep grades now; plant your garden later. Consider terracing, or rock and wall reinforcements.

Ideally, your yard should include truck access, or at least wheelbarrow access, and

a hidden utility area. Also, be sure to plan your lawn so there is a minimum of objects to mow around.

You'll want shrubs and trees, plus grass, to soften the hard, angular lines of your house. Some people eliminate grass altogether and use a patio surrounded by beds.

A few very tall things are essential to put your house in scale, but you don't want so many that they block all the light. Put a big tree on the south or west side to protect from the blazing sun and to provide a habitat for songbirds and other wildlife.

Carve out your beds in gentle sweeps around the yard's outside perimeter; make them three times as big as you think you should. The amount of grass you need is really quite small — enough for six chairs and a picnic table.

Take measures to avoid a spotty, unplanned-looking yard. Plant in groups, never rows. Invariably, one of the plants in a row dies and is difficult to replace. Use groupings instead to give your yard a sense of being planned.

A sense of theme can be achieved by repeating a shrub or plant shape on different sides of an area, and by matching colors at bloom time.

An interesting yard has shows for every season. Spring bloomers include rhododendron, azalea, flowering ornamental dog-

wood, cherry, plum, crab apple — as well as deciduous flowering shrubs and flowering vines, such as clematis.

As spring turns to summer, you'll want some sweet-smellers to make lounging around outside appealing. There's usually a lull midsummer, so you may wish to add some annuals or perennials to keep things lively.

Choose some early fall bulbs and perennials to lead into the autumn show. Add some vines, trees and shrubs that turn colors or have interesting berries.

In deepest winter your yard's evergreen plants will keep the barren feeling away. Be sure to include plants with intriguing bark—such as London plane tree or red-twig dogwood.

Winter is when your hardscape shows up the most: the lines of your beds, the big rocks that you might put in for interest, and the shape, arrangement and texture of the stepping stones or paths.

People think flowers make a garden beautiful, but it's really contrast—in color (gray leaves next to purple leaves), form (round vs. columnar) and texture (soft or lacy next to spiky).

Good landscape design is a form of showmanship — and you are the one who sets the stage.

Agents, improving interiors, other tips

"It's not the best of times to sell a house," advises *Changing Times* magazine. "But believe it or not, it's not the worst, either."

After all, interest rates are low and buyers are eager.

The key is to compete effectively with the dozens of other houses for sale in your area.

Reducing your price is just one way; here are others guaranteed to give you an edge.

GET HELP

Yes, you can save the 6 percent commission and avoid dealing with a real estate agent if you go "fizbo" (FSBO, meaning "for sale by owner").

However, you'll still have to hire a lawyer to handle the paperwork; you'll need to be available whenever a buyer shows interest; and—perhaps most importantly—you'll miss having your home included in the Multiple Listing Service.

You're no doubt aware that the MLS is the bible of real estate agents, illustrating with captioned photographs every home for sale in a given area. But what you may not realize is that in many cities the MLS has become computerized.

A buyer provides detailed information on her ideal home (price range, location, square footage, number of bathrooms, whatever) and the system matches the data

with homes in the MLS. Wouldn't it be a shame not to include your house, with its Jacuzzi, office, three-car garage and dog run?

How do you find the right real estate agent? Cruise your neighborhood, looking for "Sold" signs displaying an agent's name and phone number; chances are he or she specializes in the area and has a good track record.

Also ask friends and business acquaintances for recommendations. Next, interview prospective candidates. Ask:

- What is your strategy for selling my house?
- Do you specialize in this area and use the MLS?
- Do you work full time, and how often will I hear from you?
- What is your annual sales volume?

A real estate agent also should provide you with a market analysis, showing prices of comparable homes in your area—as well as a list of professional and personal references.

Equally important. Be sure the agent you choose is one with whom you have excellent rapport.

Should you try to save money by negotiating a lower broker's commission? Or should you go for a quick sale and offer her a bonus as an incentive?

"Like everybody else, real estate agents have been hit by hard times," advises *Changing Times*. "So some companies will negotiate commission fees.

"But contrary to common sense, many agents are actually raising rates, arguing that homeowners need more help when buyers are scarce."

If you do offer an incentive or pay a larger-than-normal commission (more than 6 percent), expect top-notch sales expertise plus extra services, such as inspections, warranties and appraisals.

CURB TO CLOSET

You want your house to be so appealing that buyers slow down their cars, lean out the windows and sigh with admiration.

Here's advice from Jan Craig, president of ARIES (Assisting Realtors in Effective Sales), a Dallas company that specializes in making houses appeal to buyers; her comments are from *Texas Monthly* magazine:

"It's an industry axiom that a seller has to cut his asking price by at least \$3,000 for every \$1,000 in fix-ups that aren't done.

"You want a plain vanilla house. You want to undecorate it. It costs you to force someone else to buy your tastes. I use antique white—never white-white—on everything, replace old carpeting with off-white or beige, and put beige patterned no-wax vinyl on kitchen and bathroom floors.

"Every buyer wants to think he's getting more space than he's paying for. That's why you should thin out your clothes, hang the short things in front, and leave a few hangers empty. It makes the closet look bigger.

"Wash the windows. Clean windows are

the cheapest way to add luster to your house. People get depressed if a home is dark. A seller should open drapes and turn on every light in the house before a buyer comes through.

"Keep your yard neatly mowed and raked, and put some bright, pretty plants in pots by the front door and maybe plant some annuals. A house should look welcoming."

What should a seller expect to spend?


"Most of our houses run \$5,000 or a little more for painting, recarpeting and vinyl flooring," says Craig.

Why not let the buyer do the redecorating?

"Most buyers don't have the funds or the time. They're exhausted. They want to move in without a hassle."

Changing Times, however, suggests an alternative: Offer a decorating allowance—to be paid at settlement—covering agreed upon redecorating expenses. Another way to sweeten the pot: Consider a home warranty policy. This protects the buyer by paying for repairs and the cost of replacing heating and air conditioning systems and major appliances—less deductibles—for up to a year.

Skylights, sun rooms and gazebos

You needn't go outside to enjoy the sunshine.

Install skylights or add a sun room and you'll bask in bright, beautiful light inside your home.

And if you want to combine the best of indoors and out, you might enhance your yard with an outdoor room or gazebo.

SKYLIGHTS

The demand for skylights has more than doubled over the past five years—thanks to improvements in materials, design and construction.

New models are weatherproof and airtight; they block glare and handle condensation. Best of all, they open up views of the sky during the day and of the stars at night.

Skylight manufacturers report that many of their recent customers plan to put their homes on the market and are looking for an instant upgrade likely to please potential buyers.

Natural light from skylights also gives more interior design options. It can add drama to rooms, creating changing patterns of light and shadow; plants flourish as though in a greenhouse. And unlike windows, skylights don't take up wall space (a bonus for smaller homes).

If a room addition leaves interior rooms windowless and dark, skylights can help. In

any gloomy area, such as a hallway, stairwell, attic room, walk-in closet or entryway, they provide at least three times more light than equivalent-size windows.

Skylights also can reduce home energy costs. They eliminate the need for electric lighting during the day, and, as passive solar collectors, help heat the home during winter. Venting models can be opened to release warm air as needed during summer months.

It's possible to save money and install skylights yourself; some manufacturers provide step-by-step installation instructions.

Owners of clear skylights will most likely want to block light and heat during warmer months; options include manual, electric and remote-control blinds, shades and awnings—all designed to work at gravity-defying angles.

SUN ROOMS

No matter what they're called—sun rooms, greenhouses, solariums or conservatories—new styles no longer look like tacked-on afterthoughts.

Nor do they leak, overheat or fog with condensation.

According to Home Mechanics magazine, "Sun room manufacturers have solved these problems and are now offering trouble-free kits with new glazings, caulking, ventilation systems, structural condensation release systems and other innovations."

The numerous styles available range

from traditional Victorian conservatories—complete with ornate finials—to contemporary units with sweeps of curved and angled glass.

To expand your home's living space, install a sun room adjacent to a kitchen, living room, exercise room or bathroom. You might even add a bubbling spa plus humidity-loving potted plants.

Kits are available; many manufacturers also supply videotapes explaining sun room installation. (This is not a job for a do-it-yourselfer, however, unless you have a good understanding of glazing and home construction.)

For sun control, awnings and shades can be built into a sun room's framework. Special films also block the sun's ultraviolet rays and control heat gain; these often are sandwiched between air spaces inside the panels.

As for furnishings, "Bring the colors of your landscape indoors," advises Sunset magazine. For example, you might pick the hues of bougainvillea or roses for upholstery fabrics.

Also, manufacturers of outdoor furniture now offer attractive and sophisticated lines (made of wicker, rattan, wood, wrought iron and aluminum) that work well indoors as well as out.

GAZEBOS, OUTDOOR ROOMS

A patio, deck, atrium or Hawaiian-style lanai all have the potential to become "out-

door rooms," depending on furnishings and additions of amenities, such as a barbecue, spa or wet bar.

Free-standing glass-enclosed outdoor rooms are ideal retreats for gardeners; use a greenhouse to store gardening equipment and to house exotic blooms.

But perhaps the most airy, inviting and elegant of outdoor living areas is the gazebo.

Also known as tea houses, pergolas, arbors and summer houses, gazebos range from simple roofs supported by four pillars to elaborate structures with polished floors and stained-glass windows.

When selecting a gazebo for your yard, keep your home's architecture in mind; the two should complement each other. A frilly Victorian structure won't look right next to Spanish-style stucco.

You can have a gazebo custom-designed and constructed, but do-it-yourself kits, complete with parts, are available. Another option: Have a gazebo built from professionally drawn plans; one source is Better Homes and Gardens.

Make sure the site is level with proper drainage, and is sheltered from strong sunlight. Decide what you'll use the gazebo for, if you plan to entertain, it should be large enough to accommodate guests.

A small gazebo will do for a quiet summer retreat; it need be large enough only for yourself, a close friend, wicker chairs—and perhaps a table to hold two tall glasses of iced lemonade.

You don't need acres of land to plant vegetables in your backyard garden; salad greens can even be cultivated in a container.

Producing produce the natural way

One of the easiest and most fulfilling ways to help save the environment and adopt a healthier way of eating and living is to plant your own vegetable garden.

It takes time, but not as much as you'll spend eating delicious pesticide-free greens from your back yard or patio. You don't need acres on end to produce great produce, you can grow some vegetables in pots and other containers. And think of all the money you'll save when you grocery shop.

The first item of business is deciding what to plant. Be realistic. Plan to grow what your family wants to eat. That way you won't be working to harvest exotic vegetables that no one will touch.

CROP CONCEPTION

Once you know what you want to plant, you need to design a planting plan. You can't randomly toss out seed and bulbs and expect miracles. You need to know what time of year to plant certain veggies.

Most vegetable choices are the staples eaten regularly. Goodies such as lettuce, carrots, onions, potatoes, cucumbers, celery, broccoli and spinach are the best to begin your own vegetable patch.

What time of year you plant depends on where you live.

If you live in really cold climates and want to plant long-season vegetables like melons, start them indoors in the spring and protect them from early cool spells in the fall. If you live in a warm climate and are

planting cool-season crops like lettuce and spinach, start them in the winter.

Novices and experts alike stress following the seed package instructions for best results. Waiting for the harvest can take anywhere from 45 days for turnips to 120 days for sweet potatoes.

PATCH PLANNING

You've gone through all the garden magazines and seed catalogs and watched 100 episodes of "The Victory Garden." Now you're ready to hit the dirt digging.

But you need a plan. You need to know the location of your beds, what type of beds and how to prepare the soil.

The preferred garden site should have full sunlight throughout the day, shelter from winds and access to water. You can work on hills as long as you terrace. Also avoid low areas that won't drain well, overhead trees and nearby buildings.

After a site has been chosen, you need to begin digging beds. You can make your beds any size you want, depending on how much you plan to plant. The best shape for a bed is rectangular.

The best beds are raised beds; however, these take a little more work than flat beds. Working with raised beds allows you to further enrich the soil and makes it easier to work with poor soil. They also help keep little night critter such as opossums and skunks from digging up your work.

To prepare the raised bed, first mark off the area. Once this is done, you can begin preparing the soil. The recommended method of soil preparation is to double dig the bed.

To double dig, begin at one end and dig

along one edge of the bed at least one shovelful and toss dirt to the outside of bed. As you dig the next trench you fill the previous trench with that dirt. Once you have finished, you'll need to spread on some steer manure and possibly some peat moss. Then till it until the soil is light and mixed. To make the border use redwood or cedar. These hold up to weather the best.

Now you're ready to begin planting, watering and enjoying the growth of great produce you have done yourself.

HARVESTING HEAVEN

The day finally arrives when you get to pluck that onion out of the ground and prepare to enjoy its flavor. Just heading out with your basket and filling it up isn't all there is to harvesting your garden and preparing it for the next round.

You will want to rotate your crops after you harvest. Basically all you need to remember is not to plant the same vegetable in the same bed twice.

If you are unable to plan ahead, varying your planting schedule, you will more than likely end with three times more produce than you can use. The simplest method of preserving your harvest is to freeze your bounty.

Not everything can be frozen, but most crops can. Here are some tips as to how to freeze your fresh food:

- Prepare as for fresh cooking. Wash or scrub thoroughly. Peel and slice. Blanch vegetables and cool them quickly in ice water.

- Package promptly, expelling as much air as possible.

- Don't forget to label packages.

- Use freezer containers, freeze wrap or boil-in bags.

GOURMET GARDENING

If you enjoy such new trendy treats as the hybrid broccoflower or the exotic kohlrabi, you shouldn't have to wait until the waiter at Spago takes your order. You can grow it yourself.

Some of the more trendy veggies you can now grow on your own include:

- Peppers. With peppers in hot demand by cooks craving ways to spice up their special dishes, what better addition to your vegetable garden than some readily available cayenne, jalapeno, serrano or habanero peppers. The best source for seeds is from catalogs. Once you get the quality seeds, you'll be in spice heaven.


- Broccoflower. Here's a hybrid that is a cross between a cauliflower and broccoli. It looks like a head of cauliflower but is green and smells like broccoli when cooking. Developed in California, this taste treat should grow wherever you live.

- Asian vegetables. Staples such as bok choy, napa cabbage and all sorts of mushrooms such as dried ceps, enoki and honey mushrooms can be easily grown, provided you find a quality source.

- Garlic and shallots. Not considered as trendy as enoki, but way up the ladder in gourmet goodies, these two flavorful foods grow easily and add bold flavor to any meal. With all the emphasis on ethnic cooking, you'll need more garlic. Garlic can also be planted in flower beds and around other vegetables to keep certain insects away.

Patios, decks, spas and pools

The trend in home design is to treat outdoor space as an extension of the home's interior. French or sliding-glass doors leading to a deck or patio make a home seem larger and more luxurious; the sight and sound of flowing water add a sense of peace and serenity.

DECKS AND PATIOS

A contemporary, well-designed deck or patio will increase your home's value and create an attractive outdoor living area.

Popular amenities include redwood privacy screens, shade trellises, built-in benches and table planters, garden work centers and storage areas.

Your new deck or patio might be asymmetrical or curved, and could have separate areas for cooking, dining, entertaining or children's play. You might want to consider changes in level or steps and paths for graceful transitions between areas.

You needn't start with a flat back yard.

"Redwood decks are being cantilevered from second-story master bedroom suites, built out onto roofs or into side yards," says Pamela Allesbrook, representative for the California Redwood Association.

Decking and tile patterns can be applied in appealing diagonal, sunburst, herringbone and parquet patterns. Brick, tile and stone are being used as redwood deck design accents — mirroring the style, shape and materials of the main structure.

If you have a small yard, you might want to convert the entire area to a deck or patio. That way, no space is wasted, and you can include shrubs and blooms in decorative containers.

Plan on at least an 8-foot-by-8 foot eating area, plus room for a barbecue and a service bar, separate these areas with 3 to 4 feet of transition space.

POOLS AND SPAS

Swimming is one of the most popular forms of exercise, and pools are a great place to relax with family and friends.

"Industry advances also have made pool ownership more desirable in the last decade," says Elizabeth S. Nelson, representative for the National Spa and Pool Institute.

"Automatic cleaning systems and safety covers have made maintenance easier, and pools also can be built in a variety of shapes and sizes."

In the 1950s and 1960s, pools were rectangular or kidney-shaped. Today they're often long and narrow for swimming laps, elegant and geometric, indoor or cliff-hang-

ing, or natural-looking lagoons complete with waterfalls and rock formations.

Just about any design is possible; the owner of a bluegrass music store in Melbourne, Fla., built a pool in the exact shape of his 1950 gold-plated five-string banjo.

"Pools are not just a plaything for the rich," observes Nelson. "The average American can own one. In fact, an in-ground pool costs about the same as an average car—an above-ground pool is much, much less."

"Pools today typically are designed

smaller and shallower than their predecessors," says Bill Sadd, NSPI executive vice president. "And they're often accompanied by a spa."


Short on space? Consider a swim spa. It's an enlarged spa with special jets that create a strong current. You swim against the current — getting good exercise but not going anywhere.

If the words "hot tub" conjure images of wild parties, white wine and California beaches, you're behind the times. Today

most people buy a spa or hot tub primarily to relieve stress and tension.

Hot tubs are usually round and made of redwood; customized concrete spas can be any shape or size. Ideally, you would install a custom spa during a major home renovation or swimming pool installation.

The most widely purchased spas come in an extensive variety of shapes and colors; they're manufactured with the latest in plastics technology. Plumbing, heating and

filtering systems are built-in; maintenance is easy.

Your spa could be placed on a deck or patio, alongside a pool or within a romantic gazebo. Larger spas are best for big families if you entertain frequently or if people over 6 feet tall will be using it.

OUTDOOR FUN

Forget the hibachi. The trend is to install stone-and-tile barbecue centers in outdoor living areas.

These have ample counter space, built-in storage and refrigeration.

Some outdoor cooking enthusiasts even opt for Chinese smoker ovens (used to slow-cook meats) and outdoor baking ovens known as "Santa Fe fireplaces."

As for outdoor chairs and chaises, new styles are so substantial and comfortable they resemble indoor furnishings. Colors and patterns mirror those used in the house: dusty

rose, Wedgwood blue, vivid jewel tones, desert tans and forest green.

You'll also see patterns: jazzy contemporary prints, Southwest motifs, garden florals, jacquards, more.

Outdoor dining tables have become larger; some are able to accommodate up to a dozen people. Bar-height bistro tables also are popular and allow more informal dining.

Garden benches are inviting and romantic and create a sense of peace

and well-being. Styles from the Victorian area are being reproduced — one example is Brown Jordan's "Smithsonian Victorian Garden Collection."

Landscape and lawn decorations are reminiscent of a gentler era; gazebos, swings and arches have latticework that encourages climbing roses and vines; wrought-iron chairs and tables are indestructible but embellished with delicate patterns that resemble lace.

A gardener's guide to bountiful blooms

Every homeowner dreams of having a beautiful yard filled with vibrant, showy blooms.

According to landscape professionals, the trend is to plant flowers in long, curved beds.

"It's one of the best ways to create glorious rivers of color," says Terry Humfeld, executive director of the Professional Plant Growers Association.

But it's a mistake to mix too many hues. Instead, enhance the sophistication and eye appeal of your beds by selecting one or just a few flower colors for each.

Use hardy perennials as the backbone of your flower gardens, then fill in with easy-care annuals.

PICK A PALETTE

Color creates mood—so plant accordingly.

A quiet retreat with a hammock or bench will be enhanced with tranquil, cool colors: blue-violet, blue, blue-green, green and silver-green.

Cool-color perennials include bugloss, crocus, grape hyacinth, Jacob's ladder, Virginia bluebell, bellflower, lamb's ears and balloon flower; annuals include ageratum, alyssum, petunias, impatiens, salvia, forget-me-not, bells of Ireland and dusty miller.

Warm colors are energizing; plant them near children's play areas, swimming pools, outdoor spas, patios, decks and barbecue pits.

Sources of bright yellow, gold, orange, scarlet, hot pink or red include daffodils, iris, sundrops, black-eyed Susan, butterfly weed, coreopsis, day lily, tiger lily and chrysanthemum (perennials); marigolds, petunias, geraniums, calendula, amaranth, cosmos, gazanias, zinnia and verbena (annuals).

Dark-colored flowers will create an interesting focal point when planted toward the rear of your landscape—but if the background is shady or a canopy of dark foliage, choose light-colored flowers for contrast.

In beds and borders, dark colors recede and light colors pop out.

"You might wish to allocate two to three times the space for dark flowers, such as deep red geraniums, bronze-leaved pink begonias or red zinnias," suggests Humfeld, "and one-third of the space for light-colored flowers, such as pastel shades of petunias and impatiens, white alyssum, white salvia or dusty miller."

Set dark colors higher and light colors lower to achieve an attractive three-dimensional effect (this also works in cut flower arrangements). For example: Use rose-colored cleome, 36 to 42 inches tall, in the background; 18- to 24-inch blue salvia in the middle; 10-inch pink-blossomed begonias in the foreground.

Clever gardeners combine complimentary flower colors—those that are opposite

each other in the color wheel. (One reason barns are painted red is because the color makes a pleasing contrast to green meadows and plants.)

So alongside pure green foliage, plant pure red flowers such as amaranth, begonias, geraniums, impatiens, petunias, salvia, snapdragons or zinnias.

Next to shrubs with yellow-green leaves, place violet flowers: ageratum, campanula, lobelia, gomphrena, petunias, phlox, scabiosa or verbena.

Scarlet is striking alongside blue-green plants, such as blue spruce or some of the cedars. Look for scarlet varieties of poppies, celosia, cosmos, geraniums, marigolds, phlox, primrose, ranunculus and snapdragons.

KEEP PLANTS HAPPY

Your yard has a combination of factors that affect the hardiness of plants: temperature extremes, humidity, altitude, soil pH—to name just a few. How can you tell which annuals and perennials will thrive in your garden?

Become a "regular" at a nursery or garden center near your home. Before you buy

any plant, find out if it needs special treatment—from soil amendments to frost protection—and ask how well it is likely to do in the part of your garden you plan to put it (shade, full sun, slope, wind exposure).

Notice what plants seem to be doing well in your neighbor's yards, and ask them for advice (they'll be flattered). What do they feed their azaleas, for example, to get such gorgeous blooms? Or is the secret proper pruning? Better yet, join a local garden club.

Most perennials prefer a humus-rich, loamy soil that holds moisture yet doesn't get soggy. You can either amend your planting beds to accommodate finicky flowers or plant those that don't mind adverse conditions.

If you have light, sandy soil, plant butterfly flower, candytuft, Carolina lupine, coneflower, golden marguerite, hardy aster, pinks, hollyhock, lamb's ears, sage, sun-drops, torch lily or yarrow. For heavy, clay-like soils: bee balm, foxglove, goldenrod, aster, loosestrife, bugleweed, Greek valerian, sneezeweed or windflower.

Those that tolerate drought include basket-of-gold, butterfly

flower, candytuft, catmint, foxglove, hardy aster, hen-and-chickens, hollyhock, lamb's ears, lily-of-the-valley and yucca; those that can handle wet soils include astilbe, bee balm, forget-me-not, lobelia, loosestrife, rose mallow, Siberian iris and Virginia bluebells.

Day lilies may be the perfect perennial; they adapt to almost any soil, are equally happy in drought or damp and thrive even in partial sun. Plant them in groupings for best effect.

A good gardener continually anticipates the seasonal needs of plants; if your winters are mild, plant perennials in the fall to give them a chance to become well-established before the spring growth spurt.

Mulching protects from frost in the winter, reduces weed growth in the spring and holds moisture in the soil during the summer. After the blooming season, save seeds to plant the following year; use annuals that die in the fall to make compost for next spring's flower bed.



How to accessorize, maximize space

If your house or apartment is less than spacious, you can expand your living area with a little decorating hocus-pocus.

By employing optical illusions, making the best use of the space you have, and eliminating clutter, you can make your tiny nest seem bigger.

KEEP SMALL ROOMS SIMPLE

"One way to make a small room look bigger is to paint the walls neutral and choose neutral, overstuffed furniture," says Barbara Jacobs, ASID, an interior designer in Saratoga, Calif.

This decorating trick makes the space feel larger than it is because your eye travels easily around the room, moving from wall to sofa to picture.

"But if your glance is broken up with light-dark-light-dark color changes, the room shrinks," adds San Diego design expert Carol Brown, ASID.

Small rooms only seem tiny when they're cluttered and crowded. By keeping them simple and neat, you add apparent square footage to your living space.

Here are decorating tricks to make tiny rooms grow:

Choose one simple, light color and carry it through from one room to the next.

Keep the windows inconspicuous by using window treatments that blend into the walls, so they don't break up the room.

Upholster several pieces with the same fabric, if possible, rather than making the eye jump around from a tan corduroy couch to a plaid cotton chair to a white linen love seat.

Minimize clutter by choosing two or three large accessories (plants, flower vases, pictures, etc.), rather than lots of smaller ones.

Group several pieces of pottery or other accessories in one area, rather than scattering them throughout the room.

Choose "see-through" furniture — glass-topped tables and wall units with glass shelves and mirrored backs—that don't seem to take up any space.

Hang mirrors to help make walls disappear.

Don't make a small bedroom look even smaller by choosing a bed that's too large. You may have to start out with a double, rather than a queen-size, bed.

Upholster a piece of plywood with fabric and place it at the head of your bed if you don't have a headboard. It not only gives the room a finished look, but it also helps the eye travel horizontally, making the room seem wider.

Create the illusion of extra width by choosing low, wide bookcases and credenzas rather than tall, narrow pieces that break up the wall.



Turn an awkward corner into a cozy niche by using furniture that's scaled to the space.
