State OKs return of some track tax

Finally, the governor and state Legislature have taken action that will improve rather than hurt the city's bottom line.

The House Tuesday passed an \$800-million executive order from Gov. John Engler that will, in part, return between \$400,000 and \$450,000 in racetrack tax revenue to the City of Northville. The Senate had already agreed to the order, which is designed to balance the state's budget.

House members had objected to earlier versions of the order before agreeing to a compromise last Tuesday. The executive order's position on racetrack revenue

represents a compromise between legislators representing racetrack cities and the governor, who had sought to withhold all the funds this year.

"It includes half of whatever they (racetrack cities) were expecting to get," said Engler spokesperson John Truscott Thursday. "It hasn't made it back to the governor's desk yet. . . . It will be signed as soon as we get it."

Truscott said the cities will receive their shares before the state's fiscal year ends Oct. 1, but he was unsure how the payments would be made.

"I'm not sure what the payment schedule would be or if they would get it all at once or in several payments," he said. "The cities can count it in their books. They know it's coming; it's just a matter of cutting the checks." City Manager Gary Word was unclear on the

funds would be used for, if and when the state sends them. That decision would be left up to the city council, he said.

The order returns half the \$3.5 million in withheld revenues to cities that house the tracks, and directs the other half into the state's general fund. Such a move would mean the return of between \$400,000 and \$450,000 in withheld revenue to Northville this year.

The city is slated to receive up to \$900,000 annually under the State Racing Statute of 1980. City officials had figured on receiving \$735,000 during the 1991/1992 budget year, but the governor's refusal to return any of the funds helped produce Northville's current \$1-million deficit and prompt a string of layoffs and cutbacks in the police, DPW, clerical and administrative departments.

The funds are a percentage of the more than \$20 million collected from racetracks annually by the state.

The returned revenue is designed to help defray the cost of providing police and other services to the track, and has long been a target of legislative cuts. Though the money was never totally withheld before, cities have often received less than they were slated to receive under the law.

Six racetrack cities including Northville banded together in March to research the possibility of suing the state for the funds. The city earmarked between \$1,000 and \$2,000 toward that effort.

The funds have been frozen since last year when Attorney General Frank Kelley ruled that they would not lapse into the state's general fund if withheld by the state.

Three forfeit township seats

A facelift was guaranteed the township board earlier this week, after trustees Donald Williams and Thomas Handyside decided not to seek reelection.

But instead of a little lift and tuck, the board now appears set for major reconstructive surgery.

Incumbent Treasurer Jack Hosmer on Friday renounced his candidacy for the position to which he was

appointed last fall.

Hosmer informed township officials of his decision the day after the board approved reductions in salaries and benefits for part-time township elected officials.

Hosmer's salary was set to be lowered from \$9,000 to \$5,500 under the new township guidelines. But it was not the pay cut that prompted Hosmer's move, he said Friday.

"I knew the outcome even before

Board slashes fringe benefits

Perks are out, ethics are in at Northville Township Hall.

The township board last week agreed to scrap its benefits packages for part-time elected officials, and also slashed salaries for the clerk and treasurer positions.

The move came one week after the board voted to delay a decision on an ad-hoc committee's five-part recommendation on salaries and benefits provided to township politicians.

With election season looming, however, and four incumbents facing what likely will be tough campaigns, the board decided to bite the bullet, approving the bulk of the perks committee's proposals.

The board on Thursday also got its first glimpse of a retooled ethics policy. Board members are set to review the new policy in depth at next month's regular meeting.

Keys to new township compensation policy, which takes root in 1993, include:

- The township no longer will provide pensions and other benefits including health and dental care for politicians. Currently, the township supervisor, clerk, and treasurer are eligible to receive a pension benefit equaling 14 percent of their annual salary. Other benefits available to politicians included health and dental care, perks no other part-time township employees are afforded.

- Salaries for the clerk and treasurer were scaled back considerably. Clerk Tom Cook now is paid \$15,000, while Cook or his successor will earn \$7,500 beginning in 1993.

Treasurer Jack Hosmer (ains

\$9,000 in 1992, while the next township treasurer is slated to earn \$5,500.

- The board rejected the salaries and benefits committee's recommendation that the supervisor be paid 40-50 percent of the current township manager's wage. Supervisor Betty Lennox will continue to earn \$25,000 instead of \$17-\$21,000 as had been proposed.

- The board also quashed a plan to hike trustees' salaries to talked-about figures ranging from \$1,200 to \$2,500. Trustees will continue to receive \$900 a year.

The board voted on each portion of the committee's recommendation. All votes were unanimous, with the exception of the proposed hike for the trustees.

Trustees Richard Allen, James Nowka, and Thomas Handyside voted to hold the line at \$900 for trustees, while Lennox and Hosmer voted against the plan.

Hosmer, who on Friday renounced his candidacy for treasurer, said he "had no problem doing away" with benefits for his position.

"I was surprised when I found there were benefits," he said.

The decision to keep the supervisor's salary at \$25,000 was largely based on the board's feeling that the position is time-consuming.

"It does demand a tremendous amount of time," Handyside said.

"It's not a cameo position," Nowka added. "I would be just as happy if the board let the salary stay at \$25,000 per year."

Cook and Trustee Donald Williams did not attend Thursday's board meeting.

CBN conflicts with district's policy

Language in the school board's policy on conflict of interest has a local citizens group and district officials at odds again.

Phil Phillips, spokesperson for Citizens for a Better Northville and a potential write-in candidate for the school board election, last Monday charged that two of the seven board members violate the board's conflict of interest policy by having spouses who teach in the district and hold power to vote on their contracts.

At the last board meeting, CBN accused Joseph Dunkerley and Donald Klokenga of violating the two-year old policy which in one paragraph prohibits board members from having "pecuniary interests, direct or indirect, in any contract to which the school district is a party." The next paragraph says that any board member who has a financial interest must disclose it at once and abstain from voting on the contract or purchase

The board's policy was revised in April following the recommendation of the district's attorney, Thomas Schwarze of Keller, Toma, Schwarze, DuBay & Katz in Detroit. Schwarze could not be reached for comment or interpretation of the policy on Friday.

Phillips said CBN's purpose in bringing the issue to the forefront was to clarify the board's policy.

"I made the point that these guys are in violation, but I'm not trying to beat anybody up over it," Phillips said.

"Our purpose was not to embarrass anybody or make it look like we were. We just wanted to know if it was a violation of the policy," Phillips said. "It's not a personal issue; it's a policy issue. But you can't tell me that Klokenga doesn't benefit from the \$40,000 - \$50,000 his wife makes."

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said Friday the conflict in the policy stems from the interpretation of the policy's language.

Rezmierski said the use of the word contract in the first paragraph of section 1 b of the policy — which prohibits any financial interest by board members — refers to purchasing and building contracts and not to personnel and staffing contracts. The reference to contracts in the second paragraph — where text requires board members to abstain from voting when faced with contracts that pose a conflict of interest — refers to personnel contracts.

Using that interpretation, Rezmierski said, neither Dunkerley nor Klokenga violates the policy. In addition, since the policy was enacted after each board member was already sitting on the board, the point that they violate it is a moot point, he said.

"Jay (Dunkerley) was on the board before his wife, Shirley, was hired," Rezmierski said. "The policy was written after both were elected to the board."

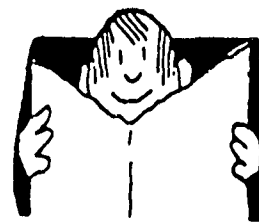

going to the meeting," Hosmer said. "The process last night, I had a little problem with it."

"I found that it lacked methodology, objectivity, and was pretty much an opinion of [individuals]."

Hosmer said he supported the position of Sue Hillebrand, a candidate for township clerk. During the final public comments portion of Thursday's meeting, Hillebrand questioned the legitimacy of the hand-picked review committee, saying the group was incorrectly formed, met in violation of the state's Open Meetings Act, and did not receive all relevant information from township officials.

Hillebrand immediately was assailed by trustees Richard Allen and Thomas Handyside, who accused her of "Monday morning quarterbacking" and speaking out for political purposes.

Hosmer said a lack of thoroughness in the salaries and benefits review process helped convince him to restructure his priorities.

"I did a lot of soul-searching," he said of his decision not to run.

Handyside, who was appointed trustee in 1987 and won election in 1988, said his decision not to run again was prompted by a number of issues.

"The leading problem is time commitment," he said. "I am extremely busy, not only with my job, but with

Northville Youth Assistance . . . It's very time-consuming."

Handyside has been forced to step to the sidelines on several recent votes because of the job he recently accepted with Browning-Ferris Industries, which operates the landfill in neighboring Salem Township.

He said the position did not create a problem, though BFI currently is involved in several projects in the township.

"I don't think there is a conflict; I'm convinced there is no conflict," he said.

Handyside did contemplate a run at the supervisor's position, but again pointed to time constraints as a problem. As far as his post as the chairperson of the township Water &

Sewer Commission, Handyside said a decision also looms there.

"I may or may not drop off that," he said. "Maybe it's time for the composition of that group to change, too."

Williams initially was elected trustee in 1984, and again in 1988. He has moved from the community and was unavailable for comment Friday.

The deletions mean that almost 50 percent of the board will change, heading into the August primary and November general election. Hosmer's departure virtually assures fellow Republican Rick Engelland — the only declared candidate — of the treasurer's job. The trustee openings will be filled by four of nine candidates, including two incumbents.

In reviewing the policy, Rezmierski said the conflict comes in to play in interpreting the text. While he said that both Klokkenka and Dunkerley have always abstained from voting on teachers' contracts and anything that has to do with teachers' issues, he can see where there's room for a technical violation.

"Certainly the criticism is there on the surface. I see your point and technically it could be a violation, but you have to look at the issue and what

how they voted," he said. "He (Klokkenka) and Dunkerley have always abstained from anything that even comes near those contracts. They've always done the right thing. By abstaining they aren't gaining."

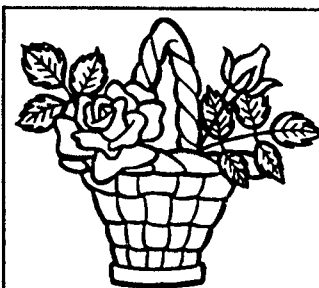
Neither Klokkenka nor Dunkerley could be reached for comment Friday. While the issue affects both board members, for Klokkenka — who is running for re-election in June — the concern is more immediate.

Rezmierski said the district has had no discussions on the matter since it came up last week, but

did say he and school officials would be looking into it.

When Rezmierski was asked if the issue would have any bearing on Klokkenka seeking re-election, knowing it might be construed as a "technical violation" of the policy, Rezmierski said he didn't know whether Klokkenka would withdraw from the election or if the district might ask him to.

"That I don't know; I don't think he is not intending to run," Rezmierski said.

CBN's voice eyes seats

The field of candidates for the Northville school board election could grow should Phil Phillips of Citizens for a Better Northville make the decision today to be a write-in candidate in the June 8 election.

Phillips, spokesperson for the citizens group, said Friday he's about 75 percent sure he would announce his candidacy today.

"It's a consideration," Phillips said. "And it's fairly serious."

A car sales analyst for Ford Motor Company, Phillips has been a Northville resident for 16 years. He has two children currently in the district.

Phillips said Friday he's stewing over his decision because he has concerns about running for one of the two seats up for election in June. He didn't want to disclose those concerns Friday, but said if he decided to run he'd say more then.

"I'm 75 percent sure, but I have my concerns. I have my perceptions of the board... and I'm not sure I want to get in the middle of all that."

The terms of Carol Rahimi and Donald Klokkenge expire this June. Both are seeking re-election. Therapist Pat Custer and Rosevelt High School teacher Glenn Meisel both filed petitions by the deadline in April. Phillips, if he runs, would face those opponents for one of the two, four-year seats.

At last Monday's board meeting, Phillips on behalf of the CBN addressed board members with concerns the group had about existing board policies and millage related issues. Specifically, he asked for more complete information about dollars and cents and for clarification of a recent revised board policy that addresses conflict of interest.

CBN is also expected today to release a statement — similar to the one it released after the first millage proposal was announced — opposing the proposed 1.4-mill increase, Phillips said.

"We need to work out a few more details, but our statement is not really dramatically different from the one before," he said.

She was born July 3, 1904 in Custer to the late George and Alta Mestor Mallison. Her husband, Roy, preceded her in death in 1966.

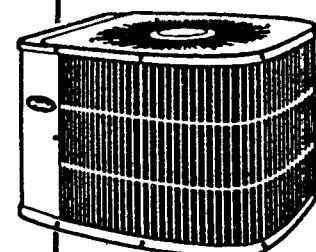

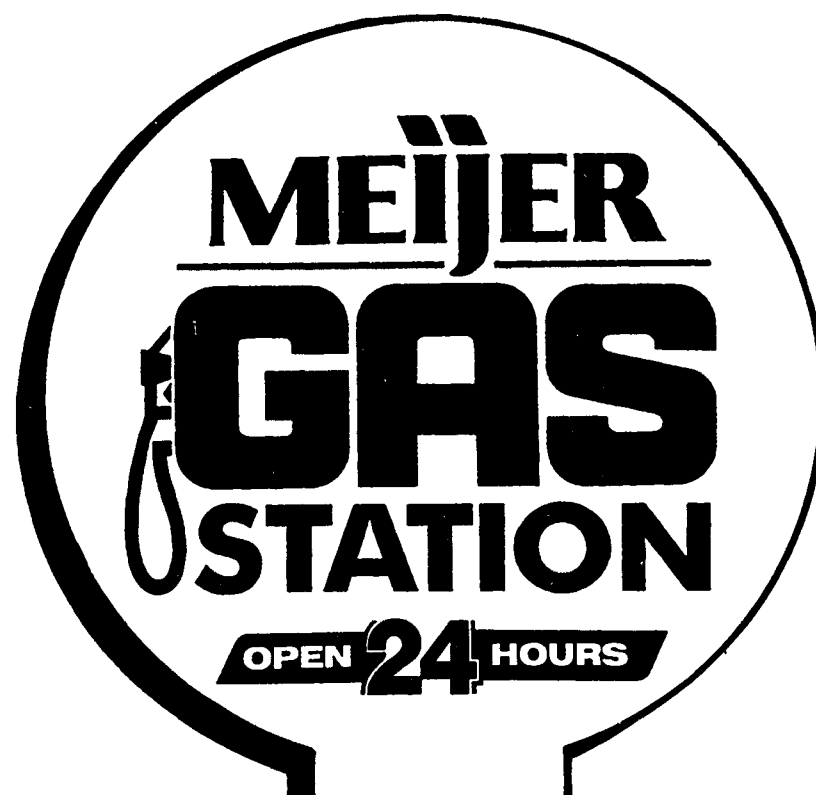

Police chase collides with car thief in Livonia

Bank employee pleads guilty to embezzlement

United States Attorney Stephen J. Markman announced that a resident of Northville pleaded guilty in federal court May 5 to a charge of embezzling bank funds for personal use.

Anna R. Gorry, 44, of Northville entered the plea before U.S. District Judge Bernard A. Friedman.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Stephen J. Murphy III, who prosecuted the case, said in a press release: "The information presented to the court at the time of the plea showed that during the period May 1, 1990 through Oct. 2, 1990, Mrs. Gorry misappropriated, for her own personal use, \$37,892.52 of the funds of Manufacturers National Bank of Detroit, of which she was an employee at the

time."

Murphy said she worked at the branch at Haggerty and Eight Mile. Bank officials declined to comment.

Murphy added, "Sentencing of Mrs. Gorry was scheduled by Judge Friedman for July 21, 1992. Mrs. Gorry faces a maximum penalty of up to 30 years in prison, or a

\$1 million fine, or both. The sentence will be imposed under the United States Sentence Guidelines according to the nature of the offense."

The case was investigated by the United States Federal Bureau of Investigation. Murphy said Gorry remains free on \$5,000 personal bond pending sentencing.

District ax may fall on sports, staff

Schools officials are dotting their Is and crossing their Ts before printing any new millage campaign literature for the second millage election June 8.

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said Thursday school officials hope to have an official hit list of expected staff and program cuts ready for publication later this week, after the district's Strategic Planning Committee meets Wednesday night.

"We are making sure that our information and their (strategic planning committee) information are dead accurate in dollars and cents before anything goes out to the voters," he said.

Committee members will finalize a list of budget cuts this week and expect to get the results of their deliberations out on the street as soon as possible.

A tentative worksheet released by officials last Monday lists nearly \$2.2 million worth of cuts from the original budget. If voters approve a 22.63-mill renewal but not a 1.4-mill tax increase, the plan targets nine to 11 existing teachers for layoffs and eliminates five new teachers previously budgeted to meet projected increases in student enrollment.

A central office supervisor and the athletic director would also be let go. All sports at the middle school, freshman and junior varsity levels would be axed too. Only Northville High School varsity programs would be funded.

In addition, the Student Assistance Program and the Business/Education Partnership program would be eliminated from the district's budget.

Failure of the last month's millage proposal, lawmaker's actions in state school aid, and the uncertainty of the

millage vote next month are all catalysts for a loss of more than \$1 million, even if voters approve the 1.4-mill increase.

"Anyway we look at it we are taking a substantial loss," Rezmierski said. "It's shaking out to be about \$1 million to \$1.5 million loss."

Defeat of the district's first proposal, dwindling state aid and crippling state tax recapture actions, coupled with news that August state aid payments to the district would be deferred until June of 1993, finds school officials anxiously awaiting the outcome of the June 8 election.

The June ballot splits the renewal of the current levy from a separate request for a 1.4-mill increase.

Passage of both the 22.63-mill renewal and the 1.4-mill increase still leaves the district in dire straits with upward of a \$1 million loss in staff and programs, Rezmierski said.

While the seven district "cabinet"

officers have offered to take pay freezes for the next year, the verdict is still out on whether the district's teachers' union will agree to return to the negotiating table and reconsider salary rates for the 1992-93 school year.

Rezmierski said he sent the teachers' union a letter requesting to reopen negotiations on the current contract which is on its last year of a three-year term.

"We asked them to reconsider the contract under the horrendous situation we find ourselves in," he said. "But we haven't heard anything so far."

Ray Balutowicz, president of the Northville Education Association and a teacher at Cooke Middle School, could not be reached for comment Friday.

Rezmierski said he hopes to hear some word next week from the union which Northville shares with Livonia and Clarenceville schools.

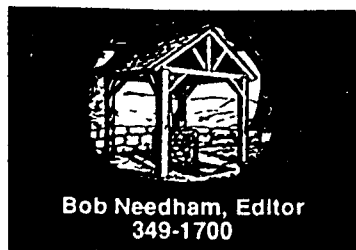

City budget about as lean as can be hoped

Budget deliberations of local government are rarely easy, but the City of Northville's this year have been particularly grim. Under the circumstances, the budget in its current form is about as good as it's going to get.

And make no mistake: That's not very good. The budget includes a nasty 3.61-mill hike in the city tax rate, and a city which helped to smother a proposed 2.48-mill increase in school taxes probably won't take kindly to this jump. The only mitigating factor is this year's freeze in property assessments, but that doesn't even soften the blow; it just means the blow doesn't get any extra force.

Of course, a couple of key differences distinguish the city's tax situation from the school district's. For one, it's somewhat easier to get a handle on the reasons behind the city budget situation. It's oversimplified, but still essentially true, to say that the city is in very dire financial straits because of one main reason: the elimination of state-returned parimutuel racing tax money.

The fact that the shortfall has hit so hard can be traced to the city administration's long dependence on racetrack revenue, which has been a frequent target of state legislators, and little real effort by the city to wean itself off that dependence. Ironically, one of the first tasks Manager Gary Word set for himself was to build a general fund balance, an idea that was derailed when the state withheld all the city's racetrack revenue this year.

The other big difference is that only five people get to vote on the city tax increase. The city is still operating under a multi-year millage levy, and is far enough under its Headlee Amendment limits that a simple vote of the city council is all it takes to accomplish the tax hike.

That's not to say voters don't get a voice. They do, and it comes tonight. The city council is holding a public hearing on the budget at 8 p.m. tonight at city hall, 215 W. Main. If you've got feelings on the city budget, this is the time to make them known.

From our perspective, the budget appears reasonable. With the enormous looming budget deficit in the city, a significant tax increase is the only way to avoid massive upheaval in the way the city works.

Lots of deep cuts have already been made, including staff layoffs and reductions in funding through all city departments. Frankly, some more cuts could be made, but the only reasonable ones which remain would be minor. For example, the beautification contribution — for flowers around downtown, and such — was cut in half, from this year's \$20,000 to \$10,000. Conceivably, that could be eliminated altogether. The earth wouldn't stop turning. Residents wouldn't be any less safe in their homes. But a certain quality of life has always been expected in the Northville community, and things like the appearance of downtown make up a significant part of that quality. And any further cuts in areas like these would provide limited relief to the city budget as a whole.

Other minor cuts have more merit. The city manager's direct phone line, which he himself offered to remove, could certainly go. But again, nickel-and-dime items like this are not going to make any noticeable difference in the size of the tax increase.

The only thing which would do that would be even deeper cuts in city operations — namely, laying off more staff people. The temptation to seek such cuts may exist, in the face of such a large millage hike, but we believe more major cuts would be a serious mistake.

Council Member Jerry Mittman continues to argue that the city officials have not worked hard enough to trim the budget. After cuts like the city has experienced — with overwork and rock-bottom morale the ruling atmosphere at city hall — that's a tough argument to support. Mittman plays a valuable role as the tax conscience of the city council, but enough is enough. We just don't see room for any more major cutbacks.

Whether you think that room exists or not, public input tonight will be vital. We think the budget is in basically the best shape it can be, under these lousy circumstances. Some minor tinkering may be appropriate.

But we're afraid the city has no other real option but to swallow a large tax increase for the time being, and meanwhile hope that the most recent positive news on the racetrack money actually results in a big check coming to Northville. That's not a wonderful position to be in, but we just don't see much choice.

A busy summer ahead

Wow. Last week's filing deadline for township, state and national public offices brought out a bumper crop of candidates. That's good news for the public and democracy.

Fifteen people filed for office in Northville Township. An eyebrow-raising six candidates surfaced for Northville's representation on the Wayne County Commission. A jaw-dropping eight hardy souls decided they want a shot at making that big trip to Washington as the U.S. representative from the Ann Arbor/Northville area. And significant chal-

lenges exist in the races for state House, U.S. rep. from Oakland County, and Oakland County Commission.

Lots of reasons exist for all this political activity; we can all figure them out. The results are the important thing, and the results ought to be good. This many candidates should result in serious, thoughtful discourse on true issues; in challenging questions with, we hope, revealing answers.

We look forward to the developing campaign. At least at this early stage, this is the way it's supposed to work.

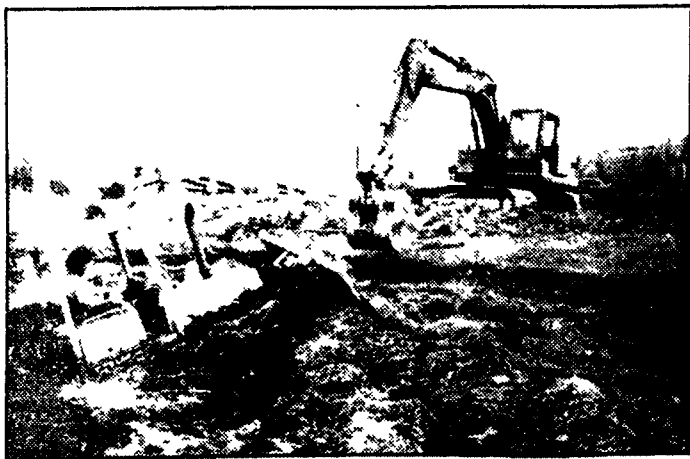

Lexington Pond gets a cleanup

Work crews began dredging years' worth of muck out of Lexington Pond Tuesday, in response to a 1988 complaint from the Lexington Condominium Homeowners Association.

Using a drag line, crane operators are pulling buckets full of mud out of the pond. Bulldozers have cleared a site to the side of the pond to temporarily store the dredged material until it is dry enough to haul away, a process which could take two months.

Engineer Maureen Turner said Friday that the workmen should be off the site within days. "They've got the pond partially dredged but the material's sliding back in and it's going to take a long time for it to dry out," she said.

Turner's firm, city engineers NeNeely & Lincoln Associates, is overseeing the project for the city.

Workers got off to a slow start Tuesday when a bulldozer, and its operator, sank deep into the mud. An attempt to pull the bulldozer out with the crane failed when the drag line broke, but it was later towed

out by another bulldozer.

"They didn't know what kind of material they were working with," said Turner. "They found out the hard way."

Lexington Condominiums residents first asked the city to clean the pond in 1988. They charged then that the pond had filled with sediment from Singh Development's construction of Pheasant Hills to the west.

The work was delayed to allow the development in Pheasant Hills to near completion.

The work is being done by ABC Paving of Trenton, while Hurst Marine Contracting of Rockwood handles the actual dredging.

The project was bid out to ABC Paving in late 1991 for \$45,778. Under the contract, the pond will be cleaned out and a deteriorated dam replaced at its east end.

Singh agreed to ante up \$5,000 toward the cost, and the Lexington Condominium Homeowners Association agreed to pay \$3,000 to the dredging project. The rest is covered by Randolph Street Drain maintenance funds administered by the Inter-County Drainage Board.

'Regional government' concept arises again

No sooner had a citizens group announced it will raise issues of regional governance than two veteran planners warned them to be careful.

"If you say 'regional government,' it's dead," said Edward Hustoles, deputy director of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

"The Metropolitan Fund concluded that (in the late 1970s), and it destroyed the organization," said Hustoles, the SEMCOG staffer most closely associated with studies of urban sprawl. SEMCOG is a seven-county voluntary planning agency.

"I don't think we're anywhere near it (regional government)," added Charles Leman, president of Villcan Leman & Associates, which has done

land-use planning for some 300 local units of government.

Michigan's problem, said Leman, is that "we not only have city home rule; we have township home rule. In Indiana, they have city and county government. A township is only a way to measure land."

Both advised the newly incorporated Citizens Initiative for Southeast Michigan to look for limited projects — such as regional transit, trash collection or arts management — instead of a seven-county government.

Metropolitan Fund, to which Hustoles referred, was a business-sponsored think tank on regional issues. It espoused a seven-county government with a council of 18 elected from state Senate districts. So vehement was political reaction

that the group folded and reorganized as the Metropolitan Affairs Corp.

Hustoles and Leman were part of a panel Friday for a day-long meeting of the East Michigan Environmental Action Council in Troy.

Earlier in the day, Peggy Johnson, Rochester resident and executive director of the Clinton River Watershed Council, announced the formation of the Citizens Initiative.

Leader is Larry Deck, an Ann Arbor resident who is taking a year off from his job in computer software development. Deck is known to environmentalists as chair of Rails to Trails, a group which sought to convert abandoned railroad beds to public hiking, biking and horse trails in Oakland and Livingston counties.

The next Citizens Initiative meet-

ing will be May 28 at Schoolcraft College in Livonia.

"It's premature to conclude what form regional institutions ought to take. It's an open issue," said Deck after the EMEAC meeting.

Deck said the area group will be modeled after the Metropolitan Council in Minneapolis-St. Paul, Minn. "It will be a citizen-based process" rather than a politician-led process. The agenda: "in-depth study."

Other incorporators are: Alice Tomboulain, former state representative from the Rochester area and EMEAC leader, and Louie Lawton, West Bloomfield environmentalist.

Unlike the Metropolitan Fund effort, which studied political institutions, the Citizens Initiative is con-

centrating on environmental issues — subsidized suburban sprawl, urban decline, loss of farmland, overburdened roads.

So far the region has only two governmental agencies that could be called regional. One is the five-county Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority, a tax-supported agency which operates 13 metroparks. The other is SMART, the suburban bus agency that almost went bankrupt in March.

Talk of regionalism surfaced last year when the state slashed aid to the Detroit Institute of Arts and other cultural institutions. Detroit Mayor Coleman Young last month emphatically rejected talk of any governance change, asking only for more outside money.

School aid bill altered

In a quiet revolt, suburban state senators Wednesday upset Sen. Dan DeGrow's appellation, reducing the damage his school aid bill will do to out-of-formula districts like Northville.

"It was a major, major victory for the schools of Oakland County," said Rick Simonson, lobbyist for the intermediate school district.

"I prepared a large pink sign labeled 'job termination,' signifying pink slips," said Sen. Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham, spreading his arms about 5 feet apart. "But I didn't have to use it on the (Senate) floor. It's still in my office."

The revolt against DeGrow, R-Port Huron, chair of the Senate Appropriations subcommittee on school aid, occurred in the Republican caucus and behind the scenes.

Instead of taking away \$107 million in state aid for retirement and Social Security, DeGrow's bill takes back \$72 million, the same as last year. The amendment occurred during general orders when roll calls aren't recorded.

Out-of-formula districts are typically suburban areas with healthy business tax bases. They get no general state aid but draw "categorical" aid for retirement, special education and state-mandated programs.

Bouchard circulated memos to his 37 colleagues detailing their schools' loss of revenue if DeGrow's "equity correction" bill had passed. Under the original bill, the Northville School District would have lost \$1.7 million.

The amended version won 24-12 Senate approval.

Voting yes: Republicans Robert Geake of Northville and David Honigman of West Bloomfield, and Democrat Lana Pollack of Ann Arbor.

All the schools in DeGrow's Thumb area would have lost only a combined \$1.7 million.

In contrast, Honigman's schools would have lost \$23.7 million, Faxon's \$22.6 million, Pollack's \$10.8 million, and Geake's \$8.8 million.

"It had us between a rock and a hard spot," said Faxon, whose Senate district stretches from Birmingham to South Lyon with Novi and Walled Lake in between.

"I hesitatingly voted for it (the final bill) because it was substantially better than when it came from committee," Faxon said. "It still contains egregious errors. Nor have we removed the possibilities; they could reappear in the House."

Faxon, a member of the subcommittee which produced the bill, had consistently been on the short side of 2-1 votes.

It was the first major defeat for DeGrow and his allies, a bipartisan group from farm areas and older cities whose stated goal is to reduce the funding disparity of \$2,500 to \$8,000 between the poorest and richest districts.

The \$3.1-billion school aid bill goes to the House, where the DeGrow version has a champion in Rep. James O'Neill Jr., D-Saginaw, chair of the House school aid subcommittee. O'Neill, like DeGrow, wants to deduct as much categorical aid as possible from out-of-formula districts — mainly in Oakland, western Wayne and Macomb counties — to help poorer districts.

"Tax base sharing is still intact," said Bouchard, referring to the provision in the 1991 bill requiring out-of-formula schools to share half the growth in their business property taxes with the rest of the state.

"But I have an agreement we'll seek an expedited ruling from the Supreme Court on both tax base sharing and recapture," he said. Tax base sharing has been halted by circuit court order, though affected schools still must put the money in an escrow account.

In other amendments, the Senate stripped from the aid bill:

- \$13 million for "schools of choice" transportation, rejecting Gov. John Engler's recommendation. "Let the money go into the formula, and let the school districts decide how to spend it," said Faxon, voting no.
- \$6.3 million for a dozen districts to operate 200 class days a year instead of the required 180. "What's to say the 20 (added) days will yield results?" said Faxon.
- \$2 million for "charter schools," under which a school board would let groups of teachers set up specialized schools.

But the Senate retained \$2 million for training teachers in the Michigan Model for Comprehensive Health Education, an elementary school program that some critics, including some in Northville, call anti-religion and anti-family.

Senators also retained a section taking 1-180th of a district's school aid for every day lost to a strike. Democrats barely lost on two tie votes.

Give your pantry a good spring cleanup

Springtime is the perfect time to start anew, by disposing of unhealthy eating habits and reviving a nutritious regimen. The weather is improving so it's also a perfect time to start an exercise program to go along with this fresh start of healthy eating even with a harried schedule. The nutritional overhaul should start in the kitchen.

There should be plenty of rice and pasta, they are naturally low in fat and rich in complex carbohydrates that release plenty of energy. Whole wheat pasta and brown rice will also add fiber and new interesting flavors to hot or cold salads. Replace sugar-coated cereals with unsweetened ready to eat varieties. Read the label to make sure they contain at least two grams of fiber, eight grams or less sugar and less than two grams of fat per serving.

Check out those snack foods in your cupboard. Crackers made with lard, coconut, palm oils or shortenings have to go. In their place have high-fiber, low fat versions such as rice or barley cakes, melba toast, flat breads, matzo, rye crisps and whole grain wafers. Chips of all varieties are best avoided or eaten sparingly because of the fat, calories and sodium. Pretzels are low in fat but high in salt, so stock up on the unsalted brands. For the sweet tooth, buy cookies with less fat and sugar. Reach for graham crackers, animal crackers, gingersnaps and fig bars. Eat snack foods with discretion.

Condiments, oils and canned foods may need to be cleaned out, too. Use fresh or dried herbs and spices instead of high sodium flavor enhancers like soy or Worcestershire sauces and seasoned salts. For cooking use polyunsaturated oils, like safflower, sunflower or corn, or monounsaturated oils, olive and canola.

Many canned or dried soups and broths are high in sodium so replace with the sodium reduced or low sodium versions. If you do not think you like these lower sodium soups, add a few herbs and spices to make up for the less salt taste. Our modern grocery stores have fresh fruits and vegetables available year round so there is no real need for lots of canned of these. Buy the no salt versions of canned vegetables and the no sugar cans of fruits if you need to buy the canned varieties.

The freezer also needs to be checked for unhealthy food choices. Get rid of any breaded or fried frozen dinner and buy meals with less than 1,000 milligrams of sodium, 300 to 400 calories and about three grams fat per 100 calories. Premium ice creams need to be replaced with lower fat "lite" ice cream, and fat free frozen yogurts or frozen desserts made with fat substitutes. Good choices also include frozen fruit or juice bars with no added sugar, sorbets and fruit ices.

Overhauling the foods in the refrigerator will be a challenge. To keep calories, fat and cholesterol in check replace whole milk with either one percent or skim milk. Regular yogurt needs to be replaced with the low-fat or no fat containing less than 200 calories per serving. Since milk and yogurt are excellent sources of calcium and you need them in your healthy diet just make a couple changes.

Substitute low-fat cheeses, something with less than five grams of fat per ounce for the high fat varieties. Limit the regular packaged cold cuts and hot dogs which are both high in fat and sodium.

Margarines made with liquid unsaturated oils should replace regular butter and margarine. Liquid, soft and tub margarines are generally better choices. Read the labels. More healthy alternatives for high fat and high calorie salad dressings are the reduced calorie or low-fat dressings. A better idea is to stock the refrigerator full of fresh produce so there is little room for anything else.

REDUCING STRESS

Nary a day goes by when we are not confronted with stress on one level or another.

From the moment we are jangled awake by a ringing alarm to the moment our heads hit the pillow, many of us are caught in a downward spiral of stress.

Yet not all stress is bad. The butterflies we feel before that first kiss, landing a 20-pound trout or buying a first home are all stress-inducers. We may see these experiences as pleasant and positive, yet they may still be accompanied by sweaty palms, a flushed face and heart palpitations — the same reactions we have when faced with more unpleasant situations.

Unfortunately, there are sometimes seem to be more unpleasant stresses in daily life than positive ones — what with traffic jams, yelling kids and angry bosses. Frustrations can build to such a point that the body starts giving off warning signs to let you know that you aren't dealing with the stress effectively.

Physical warning signs include insomnia, shortness of breath, racing heartbeat, headaches, stiff muscles and frequent bouts of flu. Psychological troubles may include indecisiveness, forgetfulness, constant anxiety or anger, recurrent boredom and feeling of hopelessness. Such signs may well be Nature's way of telling you something's wrong.

TV commercials may tell you that caffeine makes you nervous. Some people think drinking a glass of milk be-

fore bed has a soothing effect and makes them sleep better. In fact, while caffeine is a stimulant, and certain elements in milk may have a mild sleep-inducing effect, experts say most correlation between food and stress is a case of mind-over-matter. Your overall diet (or perhaps a better term is "eating lifestyle") is what really makes the difference.

"A good balanced diet is important to keep you running well," says Sylvia Treitman, home economist at the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service. "It's not one particular food. It's getting a good balance that helps the most. I wouldn't say there's one food that has an effect."

Eating good balanced meals without loading up on one particular item "just tends to work," Treitman says. Overdoing it with excessive amounts of fat, processed sugar or alcohol are common pitfalls that can cause stress.

"Being good" can help your lifestyle," Treitman says with a laugh. "I know it doesn't sound like fun to most people. But when you overeat, you gain weight, and then you start to huff and puff. It all sort of works together."

Aside from eating a balanced diet, there are ways to reduce stress. Avoiding life's aggravations is impossible, but being aware of the situations that cause tension is the first step in learning how to better cope with them.

Relaxation techniques such as deep breathing and positive visualization are easy and effective ways to ward off stress, and you can practice these techniques whether alone or in public.

According to Treitman, visualization involving food may work for some people.

"All people have certain things that make them happy," she says. "There are childhood memories that make you feel good, like maybe mom's chicken soup."

The next time you find yourself mentally tackling one of life's problems, take a moment to give your mind a break and instead concentrate on visualizing something that you thoroughly enjoy. This momentary vacation from worry helps to break the stress cycle and lets you see things in a clearer perspective.

Good health is the key to happy living and is your best defense against negative stress. A regular exercise program coupled with a balanced diet and a positive outlook on life are definitely ingredients for success. It is also important to adjust your schedule to allow for fun time and quiet moments alone.

Your microwave oven can be an ally in your battle against stress because it lets you prepare meals in a fraction of the time a conventional oven would require. Also, with microwave cooking, there is usually less cleanup after the meal.

Freeze the extra in a one-quart plastic freezer container for a stressed-out day when you want a hearty and delicious meal without any hassle. To defrost, place the frozen soup in a microwave-safe casserole and microwave at Medium High (70 percent power) setting for 15 to 20 minutes. Let stand for 10 minutes, then continue to microwave on Medium High setting until heated through. Stir and let stand for five minutes before serving.

SOOTHING SPLIT PEA SOUP

8 cups hot water
1 pound (2½ cups) dried split green peas
1¼ to 2 cups diced ham, fully cooked
¼ cup chopped onion
½ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon paprika
¼ teaspoon pepper
¼ teaspoon dried crushed oregano
¼ teaspoon dried crushed basil
1 bay leaf
2 carrots, peeled and diced (about 1 cup)
1 potato, peeled and diced (about 1 ½ cups)

Yields 8 servings
Preparation time: 5 to 8 minutes.
Cooking time: 60 to 75 minutes.
Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power)

Combine hot water, peas, ham, onion and seasonings in 4-quart, microwave-safe casserole. Cover and microwave 40 to 50 minutes, or until peas are tender. Stir 3 times during cooking.

Add carrots and potato; microwave, uncovered, 20 to 30 minutes longer, or until peas and vegetables are tender, stirring three times during cooking. Remove bay leaf before serving. Serve hot.

NO-STRESS SCALLOPED POTATOES

4 medium potatoes, peeled and sliced thin
1 medium onion, sliced thin
¼ cup diced green pepper
1 (10 ¼ ounce) can condensed cream of mushroom soup
¼ cup milk
¼ teaspoon pepper
¼ cup fine, dry, seasoned bread crumbs
1 tablespoon butter or margarine, cut into pieces

Yields 6 servings
Preparation time: 5 to 10 minutes
Cooking time: 12 to 15 minutes
Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power)

Arrange potato and onion slices and diced green pepper in layers in buttered 4-quart microwave-safe casserole. In small mixing bowl stir together soup, milk and pepper; pour over all.

Sprinkle with bread crumbs and top with dabs of butter.

Microwave, covered, 12 to 15 minutes, turning casserole ¼ turn every four minutes. Let stand five minutes before serving.

CRUMB COATED PARMESAN CHICKEN BREASTS

¾ cup fine dry bread crumbs
¼ teaspoon garlic powder

¼ teaspoon onion powder
¼ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon ground pepper
1 tablespoon dried parsley flakes
4 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
1 large egg
2 teaspoons milk
1 teaspoon olive oil
4 skinless, boneless chicken breasts (about 2 pounds)

Yields 4 servings
Preparation time: 5 to 10 minutes (plus 5 minutes standing time)
Cooking time: 16 to 20 minutes
Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power); MEDIUM-HIGH (70 percent power).

Combine bread crumbs, seasonings and Parmesan cheese in plastic bag. Shake to blend. In small bowl, beat together egg, milk and oil. Dip chicken breasts in liquid mixture, then place immediately in bag with crumbs and spice. Shake to coat evenly.

There's no reason to desert dessert if you're trying to eat more healthfully. Smart substitutions and reasonable portions can keep calories and fat in check while satisfying the sweetest of sweet tooths.

A few basic guidelines will help you get started updating favorite dessert recipes. It's best to make just one substitution at a time. That way if the results aren't ideal, you'll know why.

Sugar. In most recipes, you can cut up to 25 percent of the sugar — ¼ cup in a recipe calling for 1 cup sugar — with no loss in quality. (Meringues are an exception.) Trim 200 calories with every quarter cup of sugar you omit. When making pies, cobblers, shortcakes and other fruit desserts, be sure to use the ripest fruit you can find — it will be the sweetest.

Cholesterol. Eggs are one of the biggest contributors of cholesterol in desserts. Every yolk you eliminate saves 250 milligrams of cholesterol. Switch to egg whites (2 whites equal one whole egg), use a combination of whole eggs and egg whites, or try one of the egg substitutes. Using margarine instead of butter also will reduce cholesterol — but not calories.

Fat. Try cutting back on the amount of fat in baked products by one or two tablespoons. Substitute low-fat or nonfat dairy products for the whole milk varieties. Bake a one-crust pie or tart instead of a two-crust pie. Replace a loaf of and shortening crust with a crumb crust made with whole grain oats, flour and just enough melted margarine to hold the ingredients together. Skip the frosting and accompany slices of cake with a fruit puree, a scoop of frozen yogurt or a non-fat chocolate sauce made with cocoa. Fill and top fruit shortcakes with low-fat vanilla yogurt instead of whipped cream.

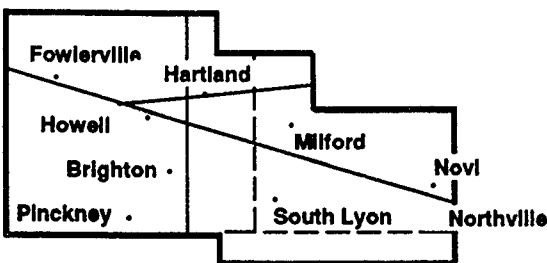
And the section on decorative pie edges shows how to spice up an ordinary pie recipe by making fancy fluted edges, leaf edges, ruffled or braided edges.

When vandals girdled a 300 year old Chinquapin Oak near their Marthasville, Missouri home, they wrapped the wound in sphagnum moss and tended the tree daily, despite blizzard conditions.

Stretch a budget Oriental style

If you want to get both body and checkbook off the road of excess and on the road to moderation, it's a good time to change the way you've been cooking.

Economy cooking used to be time-consuming because the mainstays — soups and stews — took a long time to cook. Today, convenience and health are just as important as the budget. Fortunately, a few shortcuts and ingredient substitutions can make these and other thrifty main dishes both nutritionally sound and weeknight quick.

Light yet satisfying Shanghai Meatball Soup, for example, is ready to eat in only 30 minutes. Convenient canned chicken broth and quick-cooking meatballs save time. Healthful additions to the soup include lots of low-calorie vegetables and ground turkey in place of the more traditional ground pork.

The meatballs owe their soft, moist texture to quick or old-fashioned oats. Whole-grain oats also add fiber and several important vitamins and minerals to ground meat and poultry. By broiling instead of frying the meatballs, you eliminate excess fat and the need for turning.

Like soup, meat loaf is another budget-wise main dish that's easy to modify to make it lower in fat, calories and sodium. Meat Loaf With Creole Vegetable Sauce takes advantage of the leaner ground beef that's readily available in the supermarket. And, healthful extenders — ¾ cup of wholegrain oats and 1 cup of lightly cooked vegetables — stretch a pound of beef to serve six hungry adults. To cut cooking time in nearly half, the meat mixture is shaped into a long, narrow loaf.

Here are other tips from the Quaker Kitchens that can help you eat healthfully, save money and get you out of the kitchen in a hurry:

- Buy seasonal produce; it's less expensive and at its peak of ripeness. Serve with the peel for extra fiber.
- Stretch more expensive ingredients like meat and poultry with vegetables and grains such as barley, oats and rice. For speed, opt for stir-fries and one-dish skillet meals. Use cooking spray and a nonstick skillet to cut fat and calories.
- Follow recommended guidelines for portion sizes. A 2- to 3-ounce cooked, trimmed serving of meat, for example, is plenty for one person.
- Make a shopping list, clip coupons (but only for items you need) and watch for unadvertised specials. Use unit pricing (the cost per ounce or cup) to compare brands and the cost per serving of foods that come in several size packages.
- Cook double batches of soups, stews and casseroles on the weekend and freeze in meal-size portions.
- Make your own fruit flavored yogurt by stirring cut up fruit into plain nonfat yogurt.
- Don't skip breakfast. Oatmeal is nutritious, inexpensive (just pennies a serving) and quick to fix in the microwave oven. Top with fruit and lowfat milk for a complete breakfast.

Spray rack of broiler pan with no-stick cooking spray or oil lightly. Combine first 7 ingredients and ¼ cup chicken broth; mix well. Shape into 1-inch meatballs; place on prepared rack. Broil 6 to 8 inches from heat 7 to 10 minutes or until cooked through. In 4-quart saucepan or Dutch oven, combine meatballs with water and remaining two cans broth; bring to a boil over high heat. Add pea pods and carrot strips; cook 1 to 2 minutes or until vegetables are crisp-tender. Turn off heat; add bean sprouts and green onion. Serve immediately. About six 1-cup servings.

1 6-oz. can no-salt-added tomato paste, divided
1 pound lean ground beef
¾ cup oats (quick or old-fashioned, uncooked)
2 egg whites
¼ teaspoon salt (optional)
1 16-oz. can stewed tomatoes
1 cup water
1 bay leaf

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Spray large skillet and rack of broiler pan with no-stick cooking spray or oil lightly. In skillet, cook first 6 ingredients over medium-high heat five minutes or until vegetables are tender, stirring frequently. Remove 1 cup of vegetables to large bowl. Add beef, oats, egg whites, salt and ½ can of tomato paste; mix well. Transfer to prepared rack; shape narrow 10 inch long loaf. Bake 30 to 35 minutes or until cooked through. Meanwhile, add stewed tomatoes, water, bay leaf and remaining tomato paste to vegetables in skillet. Bring to a boil; reduce heat. Simmer 18 to 20 minutes or until sauce is thickened, stirring occasionally and breaking up large pieces of tomato with spoon. Remove bay leaf; serve with meat loaf. Six servings.

VARIATION: For meatballs, shape into 1 inch meatballs. Bake on prepared rack 18 to 20 minutes or until cooked through. Cook sauce as directed above, increasing water to 1 ½ cups. Add meatballs to prepared sauce. Serve with rice, if desired.

Keep your food safe

"It must have been something you ate!" How often have you said this to explain diarrhea, cramps, fever, headache, vomiting and other unpleasant upsets?

The idea that the food on your table may make someone sick is very disturbing, especially if you're the one in charge of the food, food safety and protecting family and dinner guests from food poisoning. Inviting friends over for dinner and sending them home with food poisoning certainly will not endear you to them.

Food poisoning is the great master of disguise. You could be up half the night with an upset stomach, headache and nausea and think you have caught a "flu-bug" or virus that's going around. But that may not be the case at all. A lot of people who think they have the flu are really suffering a mild case of food poisoning.

Symptoms may occur as quickly as one half hour after eating contaminated food or they may not develop for several days or weeks. For most healthy people, food-borne illnesses are neither long lasting nor life threatening. The most vulnerable people are the very young, the very old, those that are already ill or those whose immune systems are not working.

Severe symptoms should be discussed with a physician. For a mild case, maintain constant liquid intake to replace fluids. There are many types of food poisoning, but these are

the three major culprits:

STAPH: (Staphylococcus aureus), usually transmitted by food handling. At warm temperatures (100 degrees F), certain bacteria multiply rapidly and produce a poison that makes people ill. Staph is not destroyed by ordinary cooking, so foods (especially starchy foods, cooked and cured meats, cheese and meat salads) must be handled carefully. Do not leave at room temperatures for more than two hours. Symptoms: nausea, vomiting, diarrhea — usually two-six hours after eating — lasting one-two days.

SALMONELLA: A bacteria that can cause more severe flu-like symptoms (diarrhea, vomiting, fever). Symptoms usually appear within 12-36 hours and may last as long as a week. Salmonella is most often found in raw or undercooked foods such as poultry, eggs, meat and unpasteurized milk. Thorough cooking is the best way to kill salmonella.

CLOSTRIDIUM PERFRINGENS: These grow where there is little or no air/oxygen. Symptoms: diarrhea and gas pains 8-24 hours after eating, usually lasting a day or less. It often strikes in foods served in large quantities and left out at room temperature (Cooked beef, turkey, gravy, dressing, stew and casseroles are usual carriers). Refrigeration keeps clostridium perfringens from growing. Large portions are best divided into several small dishes.

Romance is standard fare at 'Jack's Place'

Hal Linden stars in ABC comedy-drama

Love is silly. Shameless. Hopeless. For that matter, so is "Jack's Place," an unabashedly romantic comedy-drama debuting Tuesday, May 26, on ABC.

Hal Linden stars as Jack Evans, a piano-noodling Los Angeles restaurateur. Finola Hughes ("Cats," "Soapdish," "General Hospital") and John Dye ("Makin' the Grade," "Billionaire Boys Club," "Tour of Duty") co-star as Jack's cocktail waitress and bartender, respectively.

Chelsea (Hughes) is a whiz at baseball trivia, but romance generally leaves her stranded: She just can't read a man's signals after he's gotten to first base. Greg Toback (Dye) is a single father and something of a novice behind the bar. He likes Chelsea, and she pretends not to notice. They're both nice people. In fact, you won't meet anything but nice people on this show — except for a few ex-boyfriends who turned out to be cads.

Swirling around this core cast are the patrons and ancillary staff of Jack's Place, from the temperamental French chef who believes love and cooking don't mix to the long-lost daughter who comes looking for her father. Each hour-long show has three story lines, of which one is a boy-meets-girl romance. Guest stars will include

Linda Purl, Michele Greene, Robert Guillaume, Mickey Rooney and Trevor Eve, a British actor ("A Doll's House," "Parnell and the Englishwoman") who does an American dialect better than most and displays talent as a sketch artist as well.

"Jack's Place" isn't bad, but it would look better if one were tipsily infatuated with it, as executive producer Scott Brazil surely is. Brazil is a product of the esteemed MTM studios, where he worked on "The White Shadow" and won Emmys for "Hill Street Blues," but his last two drama series, "TV 101" for NBC and "WIOU" for CBS, flopped after they promised quirkiness yet proved merely derivative. It's a curse that's hard to shake. On paper, "Jack's Place" sounds charming — an affectionate anthology of romance in a neighborhood bistro run with a personal touch — but on screen it falls somewhat short.

Indeed, "Jack's Place" might look better if it looked worse. This upscale "bistro" has no red-checked tablecloths, no candles on the tables, no sawdust on the floor. Set and produced in a city where every good restaurant is distinctively decorated and trendiness is the only constant, Jack's Place has the visual appeal of a page from The Wall Street Journal. If there's to be any romance here, Jack's patrons will

have to bring it with them.

Ten years after ABC retired "Barney Miller," Linden is making his second attempt to return to series television. ("Blacke's Magic," with Harry Morgan, ran briefly in 1986 on NBC.) Handsome as ever in a Hart, Shaffner and Marx wardrobe, he looks far too debonair to be the Mr. Lonelyhearts of the prime-rib set. British-bred Hughes, a kind of soft-focus Joan Collins, needs to watch her diction: Her "last call" sounds like "law school" — hardly the invitation one wants to hear from a cocktail waitress.

Jack's Place joins the ABC schedule where "Civil Wars" failed, representing a programming about-face from a cynical, experimental divorce-court drama audiences rejected to a proven format swimming in a sentimental sauce. With its solid appeal to viewers over 40, "Jack's Place" may be helped in the ratings by rumors of a backstage romance between Hughes and Dye, but it will likely prove to be nothing more than a summer flirtation for the network.



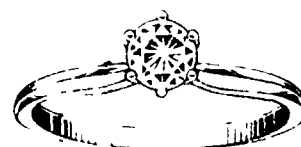

Toy with an attitude; TV diet plan

Gotta getta bar of soap? Disney and Hasbro have joined forces to market the talking "Gotta Love Me" Baby Sinclair doll, a cloth-and-plastic version of the youngest member of ABC's *Dinosaurs* family. But will doting *homo sapiens* moms and dads experience buyer's remorse when Baby's TV voice pipes up and teaches kids six choice phrases, including "Hello, fat boy" and "I'm gonna bite you now"?

Eat right, exercise and watch public TV. A psychologist at Memphis State University has determined that watching TV makes kids fat, because it induces deep relaxation, which lowers the metabolic rate. In a study of 32 girls, a single episode of *The Wonder Years* was found to lower the metabolic rate by 14 percent. LET'S TALK

Brando older, richer but still cares

Q: In 1972, Marlon Brando spurned his Academy Award (for *The Godfather*) in favor of having a young Indian maiden represent him in an effort to draw attention to the plight of the American Indian. Has he done anything to further his point of view? —Winifred Golden Neveu, Cheshire, Mass.

A: Since his refusal of the Oscar by proxy 20 years ago, Brando has continued to be sympathetic to causes relating to American Indians. It has been reported that Brando surreptitiously supported the American Indian Movement up until 1975. That year, when fugitive AIM leaders Leonard Peltier and Dennis Banks escaped a police roadblock, they left behind Brando's motor home, which, police reports say, contained weapons, dynamite and airplane tickets that were charged to Brando's credit card. Later in 1975, the actor's relationship with AIM soured during his attendance of a Menominee Indian standoff in Wisconsin. (Brando's prima-donna attitude got him booted from their camp.) At one time, Brando was developing a motion picture about the American Indians, but the project never got off the ground.

Recently, Brando, who plays the sadistic Spanish Inquisitor Torquemada in Ilya and Alexander Salkind's upcoming production of *Christopher Columbus: The Discovery*, announced that he would take steps to have his name removed from the film's credits because Columbus was not portrayed as a villain, which Brando says Ilya Salkind agreed to do.

"Christopher Columbus was directly responsible for the first wave of genocidal obliteration of the native peoples of North America," the actor says, responding to questions posed by *Daily Variety*.

Brando, who has not seen the film, made the statement after he was paid (and kept) an estimated \$5 million for about 10 days work.

Q: I would like to know where *Northern Exposure* is filmed. I have heard that part of it is filmed in Washington and part of it in Alaska. If so, where?

Has Janine Turner (who plays Maggie) appeared in any other TV series or

movies? —C.L. Leach, Eldon, Mo.

Nielsen families prefer hoops to homers

Baseball's all-American image has taken a beating this season as CBS' Major League telecasts have gone into a ratings slump. Meanwhile, they're doing high-fives at NBC, where ratings for the National Basketball Association playoffs have been impressive.

One charitable view is that baseball has been outdrawn by basketball because its season is just getting into full swing, while the NBA season is nearing its climax. Even so, ratings for CBS's coverage of the recent American Kennel Club championships were just slightly below those for a game between the world champion Minnesota Twins and the Oakland Athletics the same weekend.

At NBC, where sports announcer of the year Bob Costas is a slam-dunk favorite, the celebrating is accompanied by a big sigh of relief. With the last two NBA finals having ended in routes, there was concern that apathetic fans might tune out in anticipation of the Chicago Bulls repeating their walk through the playoffs. However, with teams like the Portland Trail Blazers, Boston Celtics and the rejuvenated New York Knicks in the equation, the ratings outlook for the finals has risen dramatically.

The NBA playoffs are part of NBC's countdown to the Summer Olympics in Barcelona, Spain, which also includes LPGA Golf, French Open tennis and the U.S. Olympic trials.

Country gentleman still picking

Ask people to name the world's most influential guitar players, and chances are Chet Atkins will make most lists. Although he is best known for his country music, Atkins also plays with pops orchestras and has collaborated with Paul McCartney, George Benson and Dire Straits' Mark Knopfler. Atkins will perform this Wednesday, May 20, for the *Country Music Hall of Fame* special on CBS.

Atkins' first instrument was a broken ukulele which, at age five, he restrung with wires pulled from a screen door. He went on to become one of the most demanded session men in Nashville. His credits for backup work include sessions with Hank Williams Sr., The Everly Brothers and Elvis Presley. But Atkins' relationship with the guitar is much more than that of a picker.

"Back in the '50s, Gretsch Guitars wanted me to play one of their guitars, but I didn't care for the ones they had for sale. So they finally said, 'Well, let's design a guitar that you want to play.' We did that. And it was very successful."

So successful that the Chet Atkins Country Gentleman became a favorite of musicians including George Harrison, and the early sound of the Beatles owes much to Atkins' design.

The 68-year-old 10-time Grammy winner has no plans to retire. "As long as I feel good and as long as I can hear some applause, he says, "I'll continue to do it."

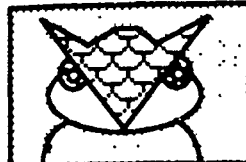

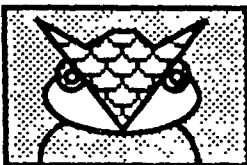

These public service announcements come in two types: Vignettes on topics such as "Self-Image" and "Excellence" provide counterweight to the evils of peer pressure, while "The Totally for Kids Detective Agency" helps put a lid on potentially dangerous situations kids may encounter.

The features pertaining to the awkward, maddening relationships kids develop among themselves offer refreshingly original perspectives. The once soothing notion that "They're not laughing at you, they're laughing with you," here becomes something more like "Let 'em laugh. What do they know?"

Meanwhile, John Walsh, the steely host of *America's Most Wanted*, lends stern authority to the "Totally for Kids Detective Agency," helping to mold model citizenry of a smaller stature. Young toughs considering changing their plans without phoning home or picking up a handgun are chastised in the same voice that strikes fear in the fleeing felons of prime time.

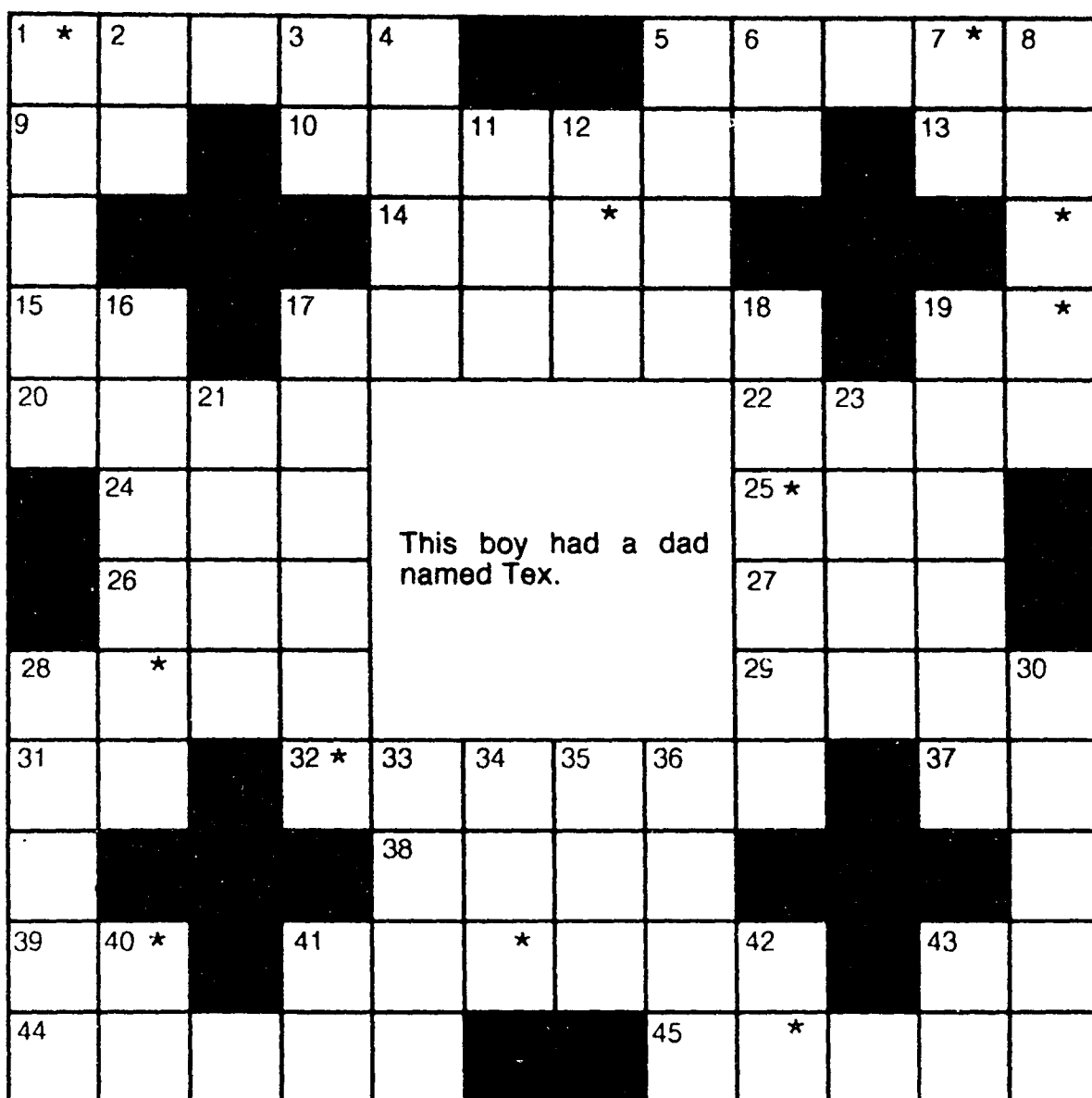

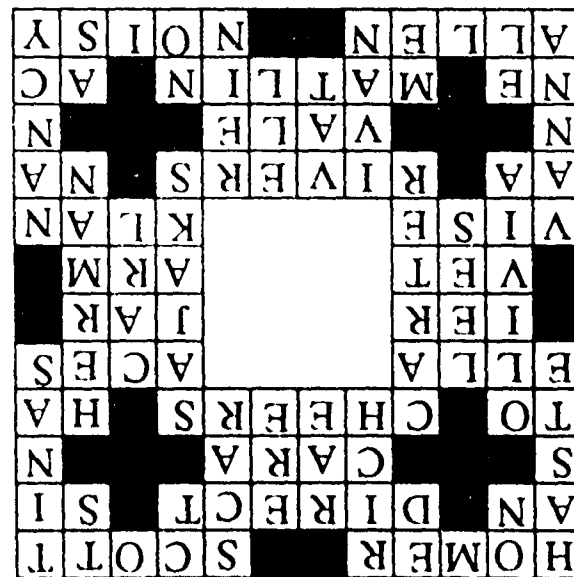

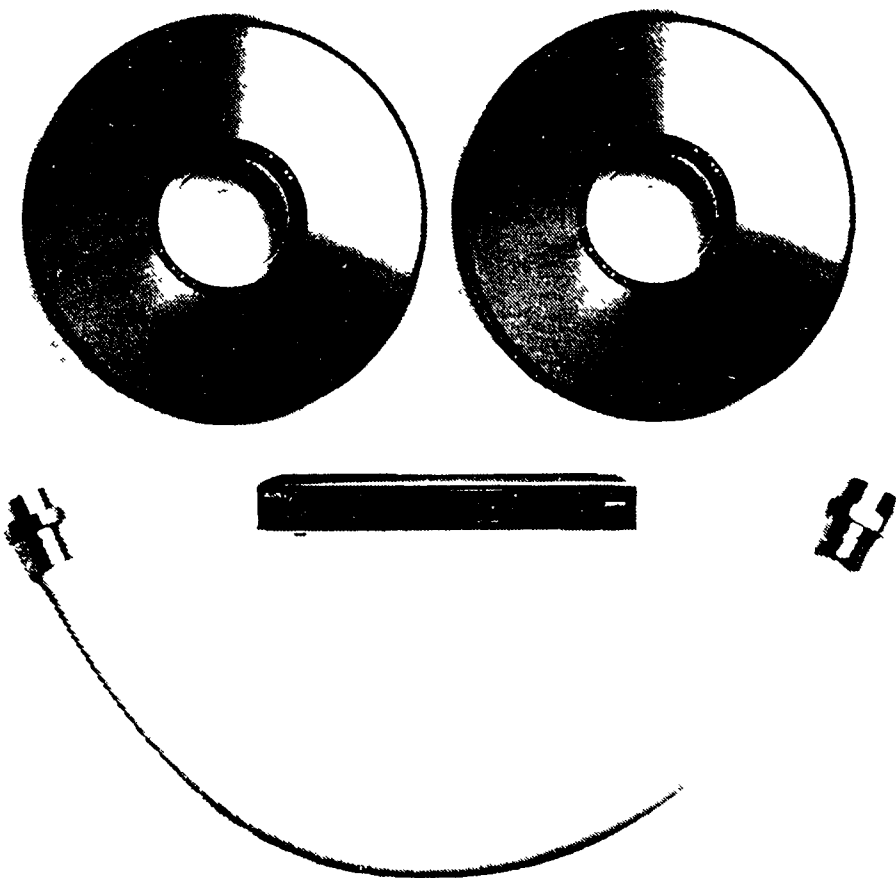
