

County land project on indefinite hold

The Huntington Falls project is dead in the water. Since developer Robert DeMattia couldn't raise the \$31.75 million necessary to go ahead with his proposed \$2-billion development on abandoned Wayne County property, he has essentially given up hope of pulling the

project together in the foreseeable future.

"It's a tremendous project," a disappointed DeMattia said Friday. "I hope it goes sometime."

A county official last week was quoted as saying the 933-acre site faces going back on the market, with DeMattia forfeiting a \$300,000 deposit on the land. County officials could not be reached Friday for further information, and DeMattia said he did not know when or if the

county planned to seek new bids.

Township Supervisor Betty Lennox said Friday that the apparent finality of the money problems at the site was news to her.

"The last I heard the county was thinking of doing the infrastructure themselves, but I haven't heard anything since," she said. "The county has not kept us up to date on that project. Twice they had promised to send me

press releases on the project, but I heard nothing. I think they think they own the property and they just don't have to answer to anyone."

Lennox was dismayed to hear the news because she said the township was eager to have the site developed into a project like the one DeMattia had proposed, but

Holloway files suit against the township

No surprise here: Holloway Sand & Gravel Co. and Northville Township are headed back to court.

Holloway filed a civil complaint against the Charter Township of Northville and Michael Kruszewski, the township's chief building official, on May 21.

Holloway filed the complaint in Wayne County Circuit Court, stemming from the township's denial of two Holloway plans to develop a 177-acre parcel at the southwest corner of Ridge and Six Mile roads.

The township must file its response by June 17, according to court documents.

The township board and planning commission earlier this year rejected Holloway's requests to develop a sand and gravel mining operation and an asphalt plant at the site.

Local officials cited potential problems such as long-range site development, reduction of property values for nearby lots, disruption of water tables, and noise and dust issues as reasons for denial. Additionally, the township determined that Holloway did not provide sufficient information to rule on other issues.

The year-long Holloway/township review process attracted considerable attention from area residents, the vast majority of whom applauded the township's stance.

Township Supervisor Betty Lennox would not discuss the township's possible rebuttal to Holloway's complaint, but said resident input was a key to the township's decisions.

"We've listened to what the residents have said out there," Lennox said. "They're No. 1 on our agenda."

Holloway believed the township should have listened to other sources. Among the company's 107 gen-

eral allegations, Holloway cited the area's need for raw and processed sand and gravel materials.

The company also said the Ridge and Six Mile property is properly zoned for such uses, and dismissed township charges that the proposed development would negatively impact the township.

Holloway's complaint supports its earlier contention that the plans should have been approved with conditions.

"The reasons given for denial of the permit, even if true, were not justification for denying the special use permit, but are either conditions to attach to such a permit or circumstances which can be monitored by Northville and if any threat to the public welfare is observed, appropriate action can be taken to suspend its mining operation," the complaint stated.

Also at issue is an asphalt plant ordinance approved by the planning commission in December and later adopted by the township board. The ordinance sets specific standards for asphalt plants, and the township hoped to use the law as a cornerstone in asphalt plant reviews.

But Holloway filed a complaint in circuit court before the planning commission was able to draft its ordinance. Since that time, Holloway officials repeatedly stated that their asphalt plant should be judged on standards in place in April 1991, when the company first tendered its application.

Holloway engineer Kristine Andonian summed up Holloway's thoughts toward the ordinance at an April 30 board session.

"Holloway disagrees with the procedure the township has outlined," Andonian said. "We don't believe the (ordinance) applies to us."

Colleagues honor Freydl

For Mary Freydl, being among the 25 finalists in the state competition for Teacher of the Year was secondary in comparison to winning the same distinction from her colleagues in the district.

"It's always nice to be recognized by your colleagues, but the most meaningful for me was being recognized by my colleagues here in the district," Freydl said. "That's the level where it means the most. Those are the teachers I work with and the students that I served. That's the most meaningful for me."

Freydl, an English teacher at Cooke Middle School, was recognized for her teaching efforts at a state awards banquet in Lansing on May 8.

Prior to being selected as one of the state finalists she made the cut

from nominees at Cooke and Meads Mill. Then she fared well against stiff competition from elementary and high school nominees to bring home the district title.

Cooke Principal Jeff Radwanski said Freydl, who's been a teacher at Cooke since it reopened two years ago, is a "professional's professional."

"She's a fantastic instructor," he said. "She's extremely competent and works with her students before and after school and during her lunch hour."

Freydl, who teaches English, has been with the district in various positions since 1973. Prior to coming to Northville she taught English at the University of Michigan and at Howell High School.

"She emphasizes complete thoroughness in assignments with students," Radwanski said. "She stresses

the importance of proper spelling and grammar in finished documents and really stretches them to do things they don't think they can."

Freydl was last year's district representative for the WDIV-Newsweek Teacher of the Year award. Since she only made it as a runner-up, Radwanski said he thought it was fitting to nominate her this year for the state competition. A portion of his reasoning for nominating her stems from the success she's had with publishing students' works and the performance of the middle school's forensics team.

"In the two years she's been at Cooke, she's been responsible for six published writers' awards, and as the forensics team coach, that team has done extremely well this year under her direction," he said.

Police seek answer

A report of a possible kidnapping — but no reports of a missing child — has Northville Township Police looking for some answers.

A witness described what appeared to be the abduction of a child from the area of Swan Harbour Apartments last Wednesday night, but township police have not heard of any missing children since then. Capt. Philip Presnell said Friday. Police ask that anyone with any knowledge of the incident contact them immediately, so the case may be either pursued or closed.

A witness saw a white male, probably in his 20s, apparently force a young boy through the sliding side door of a van on Swan Lake Drive at about 10:05 p.m. Wednesday. A second adult was driving the van backwards at the time. Once the boy was inside, the van quickly backed up to the clubhouse, Presnell said. The witness estimated the child's age at about 10, but also said it could possibly have been a girl, Presnell said.

The witness noticed a bike and a white tennis shoe with blue highlights left behind. The witness immediately called police, but by the time police arrived just four minutes later, the shoe and bike were gone.

But was it a kidnapping, or simply rushed parents trying to get an un-

Hospital workers protest staffing

A dozen mental health workers picketed Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital Thursday, protesting what they call a lack of commitment to long-term patients by the hospital and state Department of Mental Health.

"Most of the (hospital's) programs, we feel, are geared to the acutely mentally ill," said resident care aide David White. "But what we have, after the closing of Ypsilanti (Regional Psychiatric Hospital), is a core of 450 chronically mentally ill patients."

"They have not made a commitment to the chronically mentally ill."

The current rush toward deinstitutionalization of patients and their

transfer to community-based programs, White added, ignores the realities of life for the chronically mentally ill.

"A lot of our patients haven't been in the community for 10-15 years," he said.

White, president of American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees Local 960, said Northville's direct care staff of resident aides has been decimated over the past decade by hiring freezes and the hospital's failure to replace retiring workers.

"We have not had any new (resident care aide) hires since 1981, and we just lost 75 people to retirement," he said. "They're not replacing any of

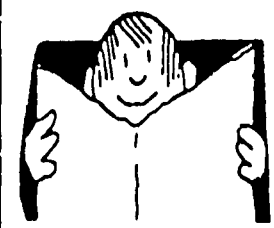





Rezoning cases move ahead

The city's planning commission is sticking to its guns, or at least to one of them.

The commission voted May 19, after a lengthy debate, to pursue one of two controversial rezoning proposals. The decision comes despite a May 5 workshop at which a resident announced her opposition to the rezoning.

The proposals are among several the commission made following protest by Randolph Street residents against developer Sheldon Gordon's plans for an apartment building behind their properties. The protests helped derail Gordon's own rezoning request and forced him to pursue a smaller development.

The planning commission, heeding resident cries to limit residential development, suggested rezoning parcels on Randolph, Rayson and Cady from R-3, or multiple-family, to R-1B, or single-family residential, to bring them more in line with the city's Master Plan. Commissioners also proposed rezoning properties along the west side of Wing between Main and Dunlap, which are now zoned as

Greater Commercial District, to a residential zoning.

Randolph and Rayson residents whose areas are now zoned R-3 said May 5 that they feared a move to R-1B would make several current duplexes non-conforming. While the existing duplexes would be allowed to remain, if destroyed they could not be replaced without a variance from the city's Board of Zoning Appeals. New duplexes could not be built without a variance.

The residents agreed to an R-2 designation, which would not affect the duplexes but would prevent development of an apartment building.

Wing Street residents announced their opposition to any rezoning.

The single Cady Street property that was tabbed for rezoning, owned by Mrs. George Post, is the only one zoned R-3 on Cady Street. Post angrily opposed any rezoning at the May 5 workshop.

"What in the world would you want to change my zoning for?" she asked. "We fought in order to get R-3." Post said an acquaintance on the planning commission pushed the rezoning through the commission years ago.

Post noted that her property is across the street from public facilities including the Board of Education building, which makes it unlike typical single-family residences.

"It is R-3 now and we have good reasons for wanting it left that way," she said, including the property's potential resale value.

"No way are we going to consider changing it," she said.

After reviewing the residents' comments, Planning Consultant Don Wortman recommended rezoning the Randolph and Rayson properties to R-2, and leaving the other land alone.

"In situations like this, I'm hesitant to do a rezoning when the property owners object," Wortman said May 19.

"We don't have any guts, huh?" asked Commissioner Steve Ball.

Ball sought to pursue both the Cady and Wing rezonings, protesting the commission's talk about the "evils of spot zoning," but its refusal to take a stand against it.

Wortman cautioned that the commission could be setting itself up for a court fight, particularly with the Wing Street properties.

"We heard the property owners themselves say they bought the property for commercial use," he said. "If you're going to go from GCD to residential, you'd better have darn good reasons. . . You'd better be prepared for a bit of a battle."

Commissioner David Totton agreed to push for the Cady Street rezoning, "because it sticks out like a sore thumb."

He was less sure about rezoning Wing Street.

"I think we have less of a case for the GCD because it's right across from a parking lot and just down from downtown," he said.

Ball moved to pursue rezoning Post's Cady Street property and the motion passed by a 5-3 vote. A motion to pursue the rezoning of GCD lots on Wing failed by the same margin.

The commission scheduled a public hearing June 16 to hear comments on the proposed rezoning of Randolph and Rayson properties from R-3 to R-2.

A July 21 public hearing was scheduled to hear comments on the proposed rezoning of the Cady Street property.

Probe says WTUA broke no laws

A state review found no evidence that the Western Township Utilities Authority broke state law, said the legislator who sought the study.

But state Rep. Jim Kosteva, D-Canton, said he plans to introduce legislation to tighten standards for business practices of agencies like WTUA, which has been accused of cronyism.

The review by the state treasury department's municipal finance division "found no violation of existing state laws," said Kosteva, who will provide more details in coming weeks.

Kosteva said he sees the need for legislation to ensure that "WTUA and other quasi-governmental agencies across Michigan" operate in a more fair and open manner.

"WTUA has been irresponsible when it comes to

the letting of professional service contracts," he said.

Ties have been found between the WTUA's original board members and the law firm, public relations firm and engineering company that were hired to do work for the agency.

WTUA was formed in 1986, and is overseeing the \$90-million project of building a sewer system from Canton, Plymouth and Northville townships to an Ypsilanti treatment plant.

Canton Supervisor Tom Yack, chairman of the three-member WTUA board, said some changes have already been made. Proposals have been taken from newspapers to print WTUA's legal notices and from law firms interested in providing legal service. Another proposal, to expand WTUA's

board beyond the three current members, was rejected.

"In the first part of July, we should be considering the proposals from law firms," Yack said.

Yack said the engineering contract will not be considered because the firm designed the system and making a change would be counterproductive.

Yack and outgoing Plymouth Township Supervisor Gerald Law also supported the work of WTUA Executive Director Deloris Newell. Newell formerly worked on the campaigns of Maurice Breen, Gerald Law, and former WTUA board members and Northville Township supervisors Georgina Goss and Susan Heintz.

Fire Safety

When you dial 911, the system goes into action

What happens when I call?

The unthinkable is happening. You notice a strange odor, and just at that moment the smoke detector starts to sound. You turn to look and to your horror see smoke starting to pour out of your family room.

You rush to investigate, and find the family room sofa ablaze. Thick, dark smoke is starting to fill the room. You yell for your family to get out, and grab the home fire extinguisher from the kitchen in an effort to fight the fire. The heat is too intense, however, and you have to retreat.

Fortunately, everyone gets out safely and meets in the neighbor's driveway as planned. You knock on the neighbor's door and yell for them to call the fire department. Your house is on fire.

A nightmare for certain. But one that happens. What happens when your neighbor makes that call?

The neighbor called 911, and immediately reached the police/fire dispatcher. Because our community is a part of an "enhanced" 911 system, a screen on the dispatch console displayed the address and telephone number of where the call originated. "There's a fire in my neighbors' house!" says the caller. He confirms that everyone is out of the house, and gives the address. The dispatcher says that help is on the way.

This is a very busy time for the dispatcher. She first

reaches for a button on the console, sending an electronic tone over the Fire Department radio frequency. The tone activates pagers carried by all of the Department's fire fighters. The dispatcher then keys up the microphone and announces the call: "Base 17 to all monitors, respond on a structure fire..." With the fire department notified, the dispatcher changes radio frequencies and contacts the police officers on the road: "Station 4 to all units, we have a structure fire..."

Now things really start to happen. Living in a town where, fortunately, fires are not an everyday occurrence, all of the firefighters are "on call." There is nobody at the fire station most of the time. That changes quickly when the pagers go off, however, as the firefighters respond from their homes, businesses or other activities to the

station. Once there, they grab their turnout coats, bunker pants, helmets and other equipment, and the trucks are on the way.

Meanwhile, the police officers who were already on the road to get to the scene. They verify that everyone is, in fact, safely out of the house. If the fire were small enough, they would try to help contain it with fire extinguishers from their cars. If the fire has spread, or hazards exist nearby, this information is radioed back to the dispatcher, who alerts the responding Fire Department personnel.

In an average time of about four minutes the fire trucks arrive at the scene. The fire fighters quickly size up the situation and plan their attack. The battle is joined.

our workers on the wards. We're doubling up, tripling up... A lot of things just don't get done."

Poor staffing on the ward tempts workers to take shortcuts and overlook safety precautions, White said. In an era of AIDS and other diseases, he said, the results of those shortcuts could be fatal.

"I've had staff come down with tuberculosis," White noted. "When you're working short, you tend to get

careless because you're constantly racing against the clock."

White attributed the understaffing and overwork in part to decisions made by Gov. John Engler's appointee to head the Department of Mental Health.

"The mental health director, James Haveman, will just not commit the resources that we need to be competitive, to do a good job," he said.

Hospital Director Dr. Walter

Brown said the furor represents a shift to licensed caregivers more than a shortage of workers.

"It doesn't mean that no direct care staff has been hired," Brown said. "On the direct care side, we have increased the total number of registered nurses and licensed professional nurses... What we're trying to do is meet the professional levels of other facilities."

"The LPNs can provide a different standard of care."

But Brown admitted that the

patient-to-staff ratio has risen slightly in recent months.

"There is a slight gap between the numbers we've lost (to retirement) recently and the numbers we've moved into the system, but we're working on that every day."

Brown said Northville absorbed about 95 of Ypsilanti's patients, and more than 30 staff members, when that facility closed last April.

Northville currently houses 661 patients.

feared it would be a long time coming.

"I think anybody who bids on that land will face the same thing DeMattia did unless they have a big cash reserve or resource behind them," she said. "We want a quality development there, one like DeMattia had planned."

In October 1990 DeMattia and Wayne County officials signed an agreement for the developer, a Northville Township resident, to buy the property between Five Mile and Six Mile roads. At the time of the agreement he paid the county \$300,000 toward the sale of the property to build his proposed community of luxury homes, offices, a research center and a golf course.

The balance of the due bill for the property was to be

paid by the summer of 1991, but DeMattia has been unable to come through with the rest of the money. Under the terms of the original agreement the Plymouth-based developer will forfeit the \$300,000 the company paid to the county as a down payment.

The property was the former home of the Michigan State Training School for mentally impaired children,

which closed in 1974. Since then, the site has remained abandoned and largely unmaintained by the county. It has been a target for vandals and a site of regular calls for Northville Township police and fire departments.

Most recently, members of the Northville Historical Society have taken up the site's cause as a target for preserving the valuable architecture still remaining.

march to the beat of more drums than in recent years.

Six bands have already signed up to perform in the parade including the Fifth Michigan Regiment Band, a Civil War band with authentic Civil War-era uniforms and instruments.

McDonald is also trying to assemble new segments for this year's parade, including a pet parade.

"We even invited President Bush and Dan Quayle," McDonald said. "We thought, well, it doesn't hurt to try."

Fundraising for the annual event is on schedule, McDonald said, noting that many businesses are choosing to "sponsor" the parade with a

\$100 donation. The parade committee is also holding a \$1 raffle with prizes from Northville and Novi businesses.

"We have about a third of what we need to pull off the parade," she said. "The rest of it will be covered, we hope, by the raffle."

Three residents won the Fourth of July theme contest, one for suggesting an "old-fashioned" parade and two others for suggesting that it commemorate the 500th anniversary of Columbus' discovery of the New World.

Both suggestions should be considered by parade entrants when designing their floats.

"We're going to have a float showing Christopher Columbus discovering America, only to find a Kiwanis

booth there selling peanuts," McDonald said.

The "old-fashioned" theme will continue at Mill Race Historical Village the afternoon after the parade, when the Historical Society hosts its annual Independence Day celebration.

There will be no fireworks at this year's Fourth of July, due to the city's financial condition and liability concerns following previous events.

cooperative child to go somewhere?

Police checked with local schools and neighbors — everywhere they could think of — but found no reports of a missing child.

"We don't know if this is a parent or someone with some sort of parental authority," Presnell said. "We just can't figure out if there is any absolute validity to this."

Township police ask that anyone with relevant information call them at 349-9400. That might be another witness, or even the adults involved.

If indeed nothing improper took place in the incident, "We'd just like to know that," Presnell said. In the meantime, police classify the situation as a possible abduction.

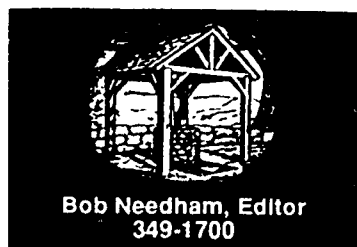

Our Opinion

Proposed cable law raises a good point

The first fruits of a local alliance with a New York law firm specializing in cable TV deserve, at the very least, a closer look.

The firm, Municon, recently presented the City of Northville with a proposed new ordinance to regulate cable television. The city hired Municon to assist in the review of its cable television service. Cable franchise agreements are under review in both the city and township, both of which are nearing the end of their 15-year term.

Omnicom of Michigan, the local cable franchise holder, was already prepared with reams of objections to the proposal, since Municon earlier presented the same ordinance plan to Canton Township, another Municon client and Omnicom franchiser. Of course those objections deserve a long and thorough airing, which they'll get during the public hearing process to change any ordinance.

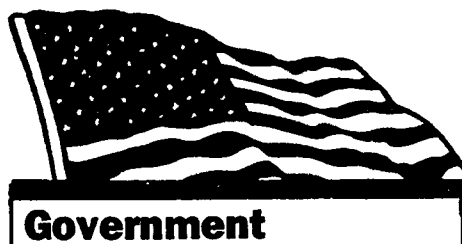
On the surface, however, we think Municon has at least one good idea, a proposal to split the franchise agreement from the cable regulation ordinance.

Currently, the city operates with a single document which serves as both the 15-year contract with Omnicom and as the set of local regulations for cable service. This means the regulations are locked in for the same period of time as the franchise.

Splitting the two into a separate contract and a regulatory ordinance looks like a mighty good idea to us. It would allow the city to change cable regulations at any time during the life of the franchise contract. That makes a lot of sense; if a need for change becomes apparent five years from now, why should the city have to wait another 10 years before taking action?

Make no mistake; the split wouldn't let the city to pull the rug out from under its cable company with outrageous, unexpected changes. Any mid-contract alterations to the regulations would still have to go through the standard procedure for any ordinance change, including public hearings.

The splitting of the franchise agreement and regulatory ordinance is the biggest item in Municon's proposal, but not the only one. Other suggestions are requirements for universal service and a



higher "franchise fee" paid to municipalities.

We're not as excited about these ideas. They have their merits, but both would probably result in higher rates for most subscribers. And we agree with Omnicom that the whole concept of a franchise fee, as currently constructed, feels uncomfortably like a hidden tax; it's worth discussing further.

Omnicom's attorneys strongly object to all these suggestions. Their language consists of phrases like "impairment of Omnicom's rights under the existing franchise ordinance" and "obligations on cable providers to which Omnicom is not subject under the existing contractual franchise ordinance." In other words, the new proposal would be tighter than the current setup.

Well — gee. We suppose that's true. But is it necessarily bad? The city and township pass cable regulations to look out for the subscribers, not for a given cable company. Of course fairness to the cable company must be considered, but that goes without saying.

The Omnicom attorneys even go so far as to claim that "impairing" the rights Omnicom enjoys under the current ordinance would violate both the state and federal constitutions. Well, we're no lawyers, and maybe that's why we can't quite make this leap of logic. It seems to us that once Omnicom's contract is up, it doesn't have any rights beyond those of any other company. Isn't that why contracts like this have sunset dates, so that changes can be made? It's entirely possible, although not very likely, that after the contract ends Omnicom won't even continue to be the local cable company.

For a start, then, the contract with Municon seems to be paying off. Some good ideas now sit on the table, and we look forward to the debate which will hash them out. Although Omnicom might not like the end result, cable subscribers ought to.

As I recall it, the general tenor of the complaints Jean had to field were that Northville students were indeed truly superior and that it bordered on heresy for anyone to suggest otherwise.

The reaction to my column was nowhere near as harsh as the response Jean received, but it was there nonetheless.

I received one call from Jill Streitt, the mother of one of the Novi valedictorians and the wife of a Novi school board member. She's also one of my more favorite people — a smart, articulate lady with strong views on education which she espouses intelligently.

Among other things, Jill suggested that I meet with Novi's 4-pointers so I could see for myself what a fine group of intelligent young men and women they truly are.

The meeting took place last Wednesday morning, and I thought it went fairly well. I didn't convince them to see things my way; nor did they win me over to their point of view. I did get to see what a fine group of intelligent young men and women they truly are — but that wasn't much of a revelation; I never doubted it in the first place.

But back to the fear and trepidation problem. What I'm afraid of is that I will be booed unmercifully when I walk up onto the stage Wednesday night to present the All-Academic team certificates at Northville's senior honors convocation.

Novi News Managing Editor Mike Malott presented the certificates at Novi's honors convocation last week, so I checked with him to see how it went.

"No problems at all," he reported. "I even got a huge round of applause when I presented the certificates."

"You did?" I asked, cheered by the possibility that I might at least be spared an outpouring of hostility at the Northville convocation. "You mean they weren't mad about it? You mean they might actually have forgotten by now? Let bygones be bygones? That kind of thing?"

"Actually," said Malott thoughtfully. "I think it was because I mentioned that Phil Jerome — not even in his wildest dreams — ever had to worry about getting a 4-point-oh."

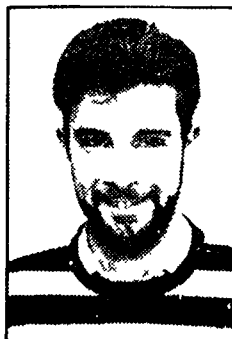

Lessons learned in Northville

CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE 94-03-92

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE ZONING ORDINANCE BY AMENDING THE TEXT THEREOF

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE ORDAINS

PART I. The Charter Township of Northville Zoning Ordinance No. 94 as amended is hereby further amended by amending Article II Section 2.2 DEFINITIONS, ARTICLE XVIII GENERAL PROVISIONS, SECTION 18.11 ACCESSORY BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES AND USES, SECTION 18.12 OFF-STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS, SECTION 18.27 WASTE RECEPTACLES, SECTION 18.23 FENCES, SECTION 18.33 NON-COMMERCIAL RADIO AND TELEVISION RECEPTION ANTENNAS, ARTICLE XXIV GENERAL EXCEPTIONS, SECTION 19.7 PORCHES.

PART II. Conflicting Provisions Repealed

Any Ordinance or part of Ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed save that in all other respects Ordinance No. 94, as amended, is hereby ratified and reaffirmed.

PART III. Effective Date

The provisions of this ordinance shall be in full force and effective immediately upon publication.

PART IV. Adoption

This ordinance may be adopted by the Township Board of the Charter Township of Northville, pursuant to authority of Act No. 184, Public Acts of 1943, as amended at their next regular/special meeting.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE ORDAINS

Section 1 Amendment to Section 2.2 DEFINITIONS

1. ACCESSORY BUILDING OR STRUCTURE: a detached building or structure on the same lot with, and of a nature customarily incidental and subordinate to a principal structure. Accessory buildings and structures include any structure constructed, erected or placed materials or combination of materials with a fixed location on or above the ground, or attached to something having such location, including, but not limited to, accessory buildings, signs, bridges, entry elements, billboards, radio or television or cellular phone antennas, construction trailers, decks, gazebos, swimming pools, parking areas, tennis courts, sheds, and storage bins. Where an accessory structure is attached to a principal building, such accessory building shall be deemed a part of the principal building. Approved regulatory signs, sidewalks, pedestrian paths, necessary public utilities, driveways, frontage roads and landscaping shall not be considered a structure. Light posts and wells shall be excluded as accessory structures from residential districts.

1a. ACCESSORY USE: a use which is clearly incidental to, customarily found in connection with and located on the same zoning lot, unless otherwise specified, as the principal use to which it is related. The term "accessory" when used in this Zoning Ordinance, shall have the same meaning as accessory use.

An accessory use includes, but is not limited to, the following:
a. Storage in a barn, shed, tool room, woodworking shop, stable, garage or similar accessory building or other structure reasonably and necessarily related to the use and enjoyment of the residence, farm, or raising of livestock.

b. Decks, whether attached or detached from a principal structure, porches, gazebos and playground equipment.

c. Residential accommodations within a permitted principal building for household employees, migrant workers, hired hands, horse trainers or caretakers.

d. Swimming pools, changing rooms, tennis courts or similar recreational facilities for the use by occupants of a residence or their guests.

e. A newsstand primarily for the convenience of the occupants of a building or business and which is located within five (5) feet of such building and has no exterior signs or displays.

f. Storage of merchandise normally carried in stock in connection with a business or industrial use and storage of goods used in or produced by commercial or industrial uses, unless such storage is excluded in the applicable district regulations.

g. Accessory off-street parking spaces, open or enclosed, subject to the accessory off-street parking regulations for the district in which the zoning lot is located.

h. Accessory off-street loading, subject to the off-street loading regulations for the district in which the zoning lot is located.

i. Signs, subject to the standards contained in this Ordinance.

j. Fences when constructed and located in accordance with the requirements of this Ordinance.

k. Home occupations in accordance with the standards in Section 4.2, 11. Home Occupations.

l. Uses customarily and clearly incidental to a main use such as, but not limited to, offices of a manufacturing or warehousing use contained in the same principal structure. Where two (2) or more activities take place within a principal building, the accessory use shall generally be the use occupying the least square footage or generating the least amount of traffic or other external impacts. Interpretation of accessory v. principal use shall be made by the Zoning Board of Appeals.

76. PRINCIPAL USE: The primary or predominant use to which the premises are devoted and the primary reason the premises exist. No lot may contain more than one principal building, structure or use, excepting groups of multiple-family dwellings, farm worker housing, retail business buildings or other groups of buildings the Planning and Zoning Administrator deems to be a principal use collectively.

SECTION 2 Amendment to Section 18.11 ACCESSORY BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES AND USES (see also figure 18.11)

1 Accessory buildings, structures and uses shall be subject to the following regulations except as otherwise permitted in this Ordinance.

a. Relation to Principal Building. Accessory buildings, structures and uses are permitted only in connection with, incidental to, and on the same lot with, a permitted principal building, structure or use. No accessory building, structure or use shall be occupied or utilized unless the principal structure is occupied or utilized.

b. Permit Required. All accessory buildings or structures shall require a building permit.

c. Restrictions in Front Yard and Side Yard. Accessory buildings shall not be erected in any front yard or required side yard, with the following exceptions:
(1) An accessory building or structure may be erected in the non-required front yard on a lot at least two (2) acres in size provided the front yard setback of the accessory building is at least equal to the front yard setback of any residential dwellings on adjacent properties, including those directly across the street.

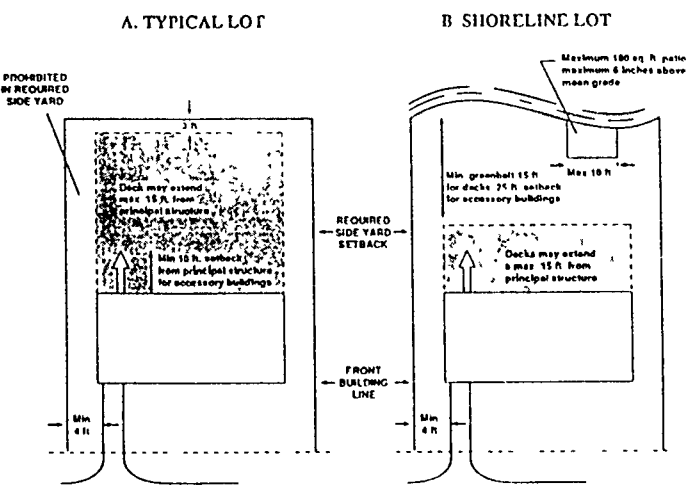
(2) Attached residential dwelling units, detached parking garages or carports may be exempted from this requirement provided the Planning Commission approves elevation drawings and materials. In reviewing such structures, the Planning Commission shall consider the impact of headlights and views from nearby public streets and adjacent properties.

d. Required Setbacks When Attached to Principal Buildings: Where the accessory building, structure or use is structurally attached to a principal building, structure or use, it shall be subject to all the regulations applicable to principal buildings, structures and uses, except where noted otherwise herein.

e. Required Setbacks when Detached from Principal Building: Detached accessory buildings shall be at least ten (10) feet from any principal building or any public street right-of-way line, at least three (3) feet from any rear lot line, and at least twenty-five (25) feet from the shoreline of any lake, pond, flowing watercourse or wetland regulated by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources or U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, except a boathouse, deck or patio may be constructed along the shoreline.

f. Restriction from Right-of-way: In no instance shall an accessory use, building or structure be located within a public right-of-way or easement, or private access easement.

g. Maximum Size. The cumulative square footage of detached accessory buildings or structures shall comply with the following:
(1) On lots up to two (2) acres in size the cumulative square footage shall not exceed one-half (1/2) the occupable square footage of the main building, which shall be defined as all living areas excluding a basement or garages.

(2) On lots over two (2) acres in size, the cumulative square footage of accessory building(s) shall not exceed two (2) times the occupable square footage of the principal building. The Zoning Board of Appeals may modify the maximum size standard for accessory buildings related to farming or raising of livestock in consideration of the size of the property, conformance with other standards and the character of adjacent uses.

h. Maximum Coverage. The combined square footage of all accessory buildings, structures and uses, excluding swimming pools, may occupy a maximum of twenty-five percent (25%) of a required rear yard and a maximum of twenty percent (20%) of any total rear yard.

i. Maximum Number. No more than three (3) detached accessory buildings shall be permitted on any lot less than two (2) acres in area in any zoning district. For lots two (2) acres and over in size, the number of buildings shall be determined by the maximum size and maximum lot coverage.

j. Maximum Height. The maximum building height of any detached accessory building shall be fourteen (14) feet, measured from the average height between the eaves and the ridge (see Section 2.2 DEFINITIONS, 13 for calculation of building height and Section 19.3 HEIGHT LIMIT).

k. Drainage: The placement and design of any accessory building or structure shall not have a significant negative impact on stormwater runoff. The Building Department may require grading plans to ensure compliance with this provision.

l. Parking. Required parking for an accessory use or structure shall be consistent with the requirements of Section 18.12 OFF-STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS computed for each accessory building, structure or use.

m. Restriction on Use. The parking, storage or remodeling of mobile homes, semi-trailers or similar items as accessory buildings is prohibited in all zoning districts, except the Zoning Board of Appeals may permit temporary construction trailers as provided in this Ordinance.

n. Restrictions on Occupancy. Accessory buildings shall not be occupied for dwelling purposes, as accommodations for household employees or caretakers, nor used for any business profession, trade or occupation.

2 Decks and Patios:

Attached or unattached uncovered decks, terraces, patios, cement slabs and porches without a roof or other form of solid enclosure, shall meet the following standards:

a. Maximum height of five (5) feet measured at the average finished grade, excluding an open railing a maximum thirty-six (36) inches high. The area between the ground and floor elevation of such decks shall remain open except for structural supporting posts.

b. Decks shall extend no further than fifteen (15) feet from the rear building line.

c. For shoreline lots, a minimum fifteen (15) foot wide greenbelt shall be provided between the deck and the nearest edge of the shoreline, except a maximum five (5) foot wide connecting walkway may be allowed in the greenbelt. A separate patio may be permitted along the shoreline with a maximum size of one hundred eighty (180) square feet, a maximum length measured along the shoreline of ten (10) feet and a maximum height of six (6) inches above the mean grade.

d. Decks shall not extend into the required side yard.

e. Decks may include a roofed gazebo a maximum size of one hundred fifty (150) square feet provided the gazebo is unenclosed year round except by wood, screens or wooden railings to a maximum height of thirty-six (36) inches above the gazebo floor.

3. Privacy Walls and Screens.

a. Privacy walls and screens shall not extend into the required side yard.

b. Privacy walls and screens shall not extend beyond the front building line.

c. Privacy walls and screens shall not extend more than fifteen (15) feet beyond the rear building line.

d. Privacy walls and screens shall have a maximum height of four (4) feet.

e. Privacy walls and screens shall consist of open material, such as lattice, and shall not be solid.

4. Fences:

a. Exceptions: Lots in any residential zoning district having an area in excess of two (2) acres and at least two hundred (200) feet of frontage along a public street are not subject to any of the limitations of Section 18.11, 4 Fences.

b. In One-Family Residential Districts, fences are permitted within a rear or side yard and may be located along a property line, subject to the following:

(1) Such fence shall not exceed four (4) feet in height.

(2) Fences shall meet the location standards of Section 18.21 CORNER CLEARANCE to provide adequate sight distance.

(3) Such fence shall not be located in a front yard.

c. In One-Family Residential Districts on lots of one-half (1/2) acre or more in area, decorative fences, as defined in Section 2.2 DEFINITIONS, 40, shall be permitted within a front yard or within a side or rear yard abutting a street or vehicular easement, subject to the following conditions:

(1) Such fence shall not exceed three (3) feet in height.

(2) The fence structure shall meet the location standards of Section 18.21 CORNER CLEARANCE.

(3) Within any single plane, decorative fences shall not obstruct vision, as viewed from perpendicular to the plane of the fence, to an extent greater than sixty percent (60%), evenly distributed over the total area of the fence.

d. In One-Family Residential Districts on lots of less than one-half (1/2) acre in area, decorative fences, as defined in Section 2.2 DEFINITIONS, 40, shall be permitted subject to the conditions of paragraph c. above and subject further to the following:

(1) Sections of such fence shall not exceed twenty (20) feet in length.

(2) Sections of such fence shall not be closer to each other than ten (10) feet.

(3) The total length of all such sections of decorative fences shall not exceed one hundred (100) feet combined.

e. Fences which enclose public or institutional parks, playgrounds, or public landscaped areas, situated within an area developed with recorded lots shall not exceed eight (8) feet in height, measured from the surface of the ground and shall not obstruct vision to an extent greater than twenty-five (25) percent of their total area.

f. All fences in any zoning district shall comply with the requirements of the Building Code as it applies to fence installation and materials.

g. No Fence shall contain barbed wire, electric current or charges of electricity except that barbed wire may be permitted in 1-1 Industrial Districts and for enclosing public utility facilities which require such fencing for the safety of the public. If used, barbed wire shall be no closer than six (6) feet to the ground.

5 Swimming Pools and Hot Tubs.

a. Requirement for Fence: Every person owning land on which there is located a swimming pool, spa, hot tub, or similar device (below ground or above ground) which contains twenty-four (24) inches or more of water in depth at any point, shall erect and maintain thereon a surrounding fence or enclosure sufficient to make such device inaccessible to small children. The fence or enclosure shall be approved by the Chief Building Official. Such fence or enclosure, including gates, shall not be less than four (4) feet or greater than (6) feet above grade, and shall meet the current building standards of Northville Township if applicable under Section 18.11, 4 Fences. All gates shall be self-latching with latches placed no less than four (4) feet above grade or otherwise made inaccessible from the outside to small children.

b. Hot Tub Design. Hot tubs may include solid enclosure around the base of the hot tub, but such enclosure may not extend above the top of the hot tub unless otherwise provided by Section 18.11 ACCESSORY STRUCTURES. Any permanent hot tub not enclosed by a fence shall include a locking lid.

c. Relationship of Height to Setback. Swimming pools, spas, hot tubs, similar facilities and surrounding decks, walks or similar accessions shall be setback from adjacent lot lines according to the following:

(1) at least six (6) feet from any lot line where elevation measured from the grade at any point adjacent to such facility is two (2) feet or less.

(2) at least ten (10) feet from any lot line and fifteen (15) feet from any public street right-of-way line where the elevation is greater than two (2) feet above grade at any point.

d. Restriction in Front Yard. Swimming pools, spas, hot tubs and similar devices shall not be located in any front yard.

6 Non-Commercial Radio and Television Reception Antenna (Satellite Dish/Tower)

Non-commercial radio and television reception antennas shall be permitted in any district subject to the following conditions:

a. Roof-mounted Antennas Including Satellite Dishes

(1) All roof-mounted antennas, including those which do not extend above the height limit, shall be subject to the screening requirements of Section 19.9 HEIGHT EXCEPTION, ROOF TOP EQUIPMENT, provided, however, any antenna whose total dimensions are ten (10) square feet or less need not be screened. Roof-mounted antennas shall be of color tones similar to the color of the screening structure.

(2) All antennas shall be mounted to the chimney or mounted on the rear roof of the building.

b. Ground-mounted Antennas Including Satellite Dishes

(1) The maximum height permitted for any antenna shall be fourteen (14) feet.

(2) The antenna shall be located only in the rear yard and shall not be closer to any side lot line than the required side yard setback of the district.

(3) Antennas within one hundred (100) feet of a residential property line or public street shall be screened by a wall, fence, berm, evergreen plantings or combination of these elements. Required screening shall not interfere with reception. If the antenna is a mesh type, screening need not exceed six (6) feet in height.

(4) The color of all antennas shall be of tones similar to the surroundings. Ground-mounted antennas shall not be white unless it is of a mesh type or unless the background consists primarily of a white building. Bright or pastel colors shall not be used in any instance.

(5) In the event that a usable signal cannot be obtained by locating the antenna in the rear yard, the antenna may be located in the side yard of the property subject to the submission of a written affidavit and approval of the Zoning Board of Appeals. The placing of an antenna in a side yard shall remain subject to all other conditions set forth in this Section.

c. General Provisions

(1) Construction and installation of all non-commercial radio and television reception antennas shall conform to the Township Building and Electrical Codes.

(2) All non-commercial television and radio reception antennas shall meet manufacturers' specifications, be of corrosion-resistant material and be erected in a secure, wind-resistant manner.

(3) The diameter of a satellite dish shall not exceed twelve (12) feet.

(4) No advertising or identification display shall be placed on any portion of an antenna or tower, including a satellite dish antenna.

7 Waste Receptacles

Space for a waste receptacle shall be provided on each zoning lot in a non-residential district regardless of whether or not use of an outside waste receptacle is intended. Waste receptacles may also be permitted as accessory to any use except one-family residences (excluding condominium projects). Waste receptacles shall be permitted subject to the following conditions:

a. Waste receptacles shall be located in a rear yard or interior side yard unless otherwise provided in this Ordinance.

b. Waste receptacles must be clearly accessible to servicing vehicles.

c. Space for a waste receptacle shall be paved with a minimum dimension of nine (9) feet wide and six (6) feet deep.

d. The base for a waste receptacle shall be constructed of six (6) inches of reinforced concrete pavement. The base shall extend six (6) feet beyond the front edge of the dumpster pad or gate, to support the front axle load of a refuse vehicle.

e. Waste receptacles shall be screened on three (3) sides, with a gate on the fourth side if visible to a residential unit. The enclosure shall provide a three (3) foot clear area between the waste receptacle and any screen wall. A change to a larger or taller waste receptacle may require modifications to the screening to retain compliance with those standards.

f. Such screening shall be constructed of an earth mound, brick or decorative concrete material with a minimum height of six (6) feet or one (1) foot above the height of the enclosed waste receptacle, whichever is greater. Wood may be approved for waste receptacle enclosures in residential districts, provided that the lumber is of timber size as described in the Western Wood Products Association (WWPA) Rules as five (5) inches or larger with a thickness that is not more than two (2) inches greater than its width, suitable for outdoor use, and treated to prevent decay, or consists of Cedar, No. 2 Cedar rough sawn seasoned, Redwood, No. 2 Common Finish (SAS), Douglas Fir-Larch or Southern Pine. All lumber materials must be approved by the Township Building Department.

Each week 20 members of the First United Methodist Church of Northville commute to Dixon Elementary School in Detroit.

As volunteers in the Adopt-A-School program, these people aren't returning to school to further themselves but rather to take students at the K-7 school under their wings and turn them on to education.

The church members serve as mentors in a partnership program at Dixon Elementary. The school's principal, Robert Kolnowski, said he's seen the fruits of the volunteers' labor as students make great strides.

The Adopt-A-School program combines the efforts of Northville's First United with the Second Grace Methodist Church in Detroit, which last night hosted a banquet to honor the accomplishments of the 200-plus kids involved in the mentoring program.

"Our staff is seeing a change in the students' attitudes; their attendance has improved and their grades are up," Kolnowski said. "Children get support and get motivated to go on."

Kolnowski spoke of the success of the mentoring program initiated by the two Methodist churches back in 1990. The partnership program, which is sponsored by the Detroit District of Methodist Churches, is dedicated to helping the school's kids succeed, church organizers said.

Under the partnership agreement, volunteers from both churches donate their time before, during and after school hours to assist kids with their homework or play games with them. Volunteers come to the school at 19500 Tireman in Detroit on a weekly basis to give kids the extra attention.

"The objectives of the mentoring program, which provides tutoring and role-modeling to each of these students, is to give them extra attention beyond what the school and family already provides," said James Bosscher, a coordinator of the program for First United Methodist.

Kolnowski agreed. "They help them with their homework, play basketball and other games with them," Kolnowski said. "They also read to them and teach them about public speaking."

What makes this partnership program unique is that it pairs a suburban church with an inner-city one to provide mentors and role models.

"This program — although already a limited success — it won't be a success unless we are a model for other churches to follow," Bosscher said. "We want to see it grow and patterned after what we've done in the tri-county area."

About 40 volunteers from both churches visit students at the school weekly. That figure is evenly split between the two churches, Bosscher said. The number of mentors from the Northville church has grown by seven since the program's inception in 1990, he said. But the volunteers who travel to the site aren't the only ones who have con-

tributed to the success of this on-going project. "Participation has grown since the first year, when we had about 13 people," Bosscher said. "In addition to those individuals who go down there, we have more who participate in special events like career day and clean-up day."

The program, which starts with students at the third-grade level, pairs volunteers with students up through the seventh grade. Volunteers who have been part of the program since it started said they have seen their student counterparts progress since the mentoring program took root.

Bosscher has mentored two fifth-graders who have both been held back a few grades. He said he's seen a marked increase in the boys' attitude and academic performance.

"Their commitment has increased and both are going to be advanced this year," he said.

While Bosscher couldn't attribute the boys' success solely to his mentoring, he did say the program rekindled an interest and changed their attitudes.

"The key is to get an attitude change so they care," Bosscher said.

Bosscher said the objectives of the program are twofold.

"They need to be committed to going to school and doing their homework. That's the academic part of the program. The role-modeling is like a big brother thing. We want to be there for them if they want someone to talk to or to be on their side. For someone to be a champion for them."

g. Waste receptacles shall have an enclosing lid or cover.

h. Waste receptacles and their screening enclosures shall be located as far as practical but not less than twenty (20) feet from a residential property line or district.

i. The location of waste receptacles shall be indicated on the site plan and the location and screening shall be approved by the Planning Commission. Detailed drawings or a note shall be provided on the site plan indicating specific requirements are met.

8. Porches

An open, unenclosed and uncovered porch or paved terrace may project into a front or rear yard for a distance not exceeding six (6) feet, but this shall not be interpreted to include or permit fixed canopies.

9. Central Air Conditioning Units, Heat Pumps, Swimming Pool Heaters or Any Other Noise Producing Mechanical System

A central air conditioning unit, heat pump, swimming pool heater or any other noise-producing mechanical system which is typically located on the exterior of a residential unit, may be located as follows:

a. Within a rear yard provided that such system is not located closer to a side lot line than the distance required by the side yard setback.

b. Within a side yard which is in excess of the required side yard setback.

c. Within a side yard setback provided that such system does not extend into the setback by more than three (3) feet and if the abutting parcel is:

(1) A street.

(2) Occupied by a house that has no doors or windows on the side of the house facing the side yard.

(3) Occupied by an existing house located so that the distance between the abutting house is equal to the sum of the required minimum abutting side yards plus three (3) feet.

(4) Occupied by a use other than one-family residential.

d. Where a front yard setback is required in the side yard of a corner lot, such system shall not be located within such required setback.

e. If such system is not located in a rear yard or if it is located in a rear yard of a corner lot and is visible from the street, it shall be screened with landscape material with the starting size not less than the height of the system.

SECTION 3. Amendment to Section 18.12 OFF-STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS

2. Residential off-street parking spaces shall consist of a parking strip, parking bay, driveway, garage, carport or combination thereof and shall be located on the premises they are intended to serve and subject to the provisions of Section 18.11 ACCESSORY BUILDINGS. Driveways to a residential structure in any district shall be setback at least four (4) feet from the property line (refer to Figure 18.11 in Section 18.11 ACCESSORY BUILDINGS).

Don't be a flake when it comes to picking cereal

A stroll down the supermarket breakfast cereal aisle can be a challenge to the most informed shopper. Health pledges, great taste, cereal fun, toys and promises of athletic prowess stated on the boxes add to the confusion of seeking a nutritious breakfast for children and adults.

Cereal provides several nutritional benefits. It is a good source of carbohydrates, which gives us energy (calories) to start the day. Getting energy from a carbohydrate source low in fat, such as cereal, is one way to lower fat in the diet. If you're concerned about blood cholesterol levels, focus on the fat in the milk. For anyone over the age of 2, use skim or 1 percent milk rather than whole milk. When a cereal is fortified, that provides an excellent source of iron, and many women frequently have diets low in iron.

Advertisements have done a good job confusing the fiber issue in cold cereals. There are two types of fiber, soluble and insoluble. Oat bran is a source of soluble fiber. Wheat bran is a source of insoluble fiber. We need both soluble and insoluble fiber in our diets. Information is available about the insoluble fiber content of foods. Unfortunately, scientists have not developed tables that tell us the amount of soluble fiber in foods. However, we do know generally, oat bran, rice bran, dried beans and peas, and some fruits and vegetables are good sources of soluble fiber.

Many cereal companies would have us believe that their cereal products are the key to lowering cholesterol. Though there is truth to the claim that cereals may help lower cholesterol, the amount we would need to eat to achieve this is incredible. If oat bran were your only source of soluble fiber, you would have to have 100 grams of it each day to lower your cholesterol by 15 percent.

One serving of a popular cereal that advertises it contains oat bran has only 8 grams of oat bran per serving. This means you would have to eat about 15 cups of that cereal to get 100 grams of oat bran. If you are serious about lowering cholesterol, it would be better to add oat bran to various foods that you cook, besides a cooked cereal made from oats, rather than to rely on a cold cereal.

Insoluble fiber in whole grain cereals is important to help prevent constipation. Some nutrition scientists believe that insoluble fiber may have a role in helping to decrease risk of colon cancer. The National Research Council, the American Cancer Society and the National Institute for Cancer Research recommends that we obtain between 20 and 30 grams of fiber a day. Children's cold cereals are generally not a good source of fiber, despite what the box claims. Rather than rely on cold cereal for fiber, give them high fiber foods such as beans, fresh fruits and vegetables and whole grain breads throughout the day to ensure adequate fiber intake.

Another cereal-related issue is the amount of sugar that cold cereals contain. This may be especially important when children are eating several bowls of cereal each day. Try to choose a cereal that has no more than one to two teaspoons of sugar (4 to 8 grams sucrose indicated on the label per serving).

If your child likes to add sugar to cereal, then the lower the sugar in the cereal to begin with, the better. There is nothing wrong with a cereal containing some sugar, but whether and how much additional sugar you add is important.

To figure out the amount of sugar in the product, divide grams of sugar by four to determine the number of teaspoons per serving. For example, if one serving provides two grams that

Pairing the right wine with a fine meal can seem a daunting task, unless you know what to look for

WINE IS FINE And it's even better when you know how to pick a good one

You're having dinner at a nice restaurant and the task of selecting a wine has fallen to you.

You were doing fine up until this point, holding your own on world affairs, the election, hot literary properties, new diseases. But now, you are about to appear the fool, for, like many people who won't admit it, you know nothing about wine.

What to do? Until now, the cheap stuff with the colorful label from the grocery store has served you well. So long as the cork came out in one piece and the wine didn't smell like salad dressing, life was good. But the waiter is waiting. The decision is yours.

And exactly how do you decide if the offered bottle is a winner or Mountain Dew in drag?

Ask Ellie. Ellie Boudt manages The Merchant of Vino on Northwestern Highway in

Southfield. He has studied wine and its accompanying disciplines — geography, geology, farming, poetry, philosophy and history — for more than 12 of his 30 years. The last eight of those years have been spent at The Merchant.

"Wine is ultimately a farm product. The grape has a lot of water which comes from the ground," Boudt said. That's one of the main reasons the taste of wine varies from region to region.

Even if you know very little about wine, Boudt suggested several ways to, at the very least, make a very intelligent assumption about the wine before you.

Start with a glance at the label. "Any label is a reflection of the laws of that particular region. What is compulsory in one (region) perhaps is not in another," Boudt said.

The label will tell you the level of al-

cohol (which varies), the quantity the bottle holds (which may seem simple but it's important — we'll get to that momentarily), the name of the producer and the name of the area where the grape was grown. First rule: the more information on the label (and the more specific that information is), the greater the chances that you're looking at a good bottle of wine.

"The name of the area it comes from indicates the type of wine. It defines the fruit," Boudt said. "The producer defines the style. The vintage (again) defines the fruit." In an ideal world where all sugars are the same, a higher alcohol content means less sugar.

Boudt also said the higher the alcohol content, the higher the viscosity, which is the way the wine feels on the tongue and inside of the mouth.

parade? Or to a cemetery to pay homage to those that have served our country? Or even thought about what the day meant other than a day off?

I didn't. I was "working" the Team Taste Fest in the New Center area. Michigan had a booth, and Diamond Jim Brady's was part of it. This was one of our latest fund-raising events.

Remember, we had just finished a grueling two weeks of competing. We were all tired. No, exhausted. But we had to be there. It was mandatory. Each of us had the same thought on running through our minds, "This is crazy. Why am I doing this?"

The tent that housed us for four days was huge when empty, but as we moved in paper products and food, the space became limited. At any particular time, there were up to 50 people working. Many of the local culinary schools, Oakland Community College, Henry Ford in Dearborn and Breithaupt Vocational in Detroit sent student volunteers. Many of the teachers were on hand to help also.

In return for their work, these students received a Team Michigan T-shirt and their membership dues paid for the Michigan Chefs De Cuisine. They were fabu-

lous. Many of them stayed for the entire four days.

They gave up their vacation to help us raise money for the trip to Germany. They were a great group of people. Many were not "typical" students. They had raised their children and were now grandparents and in one case a great-grandparent. This was a second career for them. Jerrie, my "partner" for the duration was fantastic.

The item of food that I committed to was buffalo shrimp, tasty shrimp in a light and spicy tempura batter. We have done this in the restaurant on occasion with minimal effort. Being in a real kitchen and being under a tent are two different stories.

The first sign that I had made a mistake was upon arrival on the opening day, Friday. The fryer was not only ancient-looking, but didn't work. Starting time for serving was 11 a.m. We began cooking at 1 p.m.

Hordes of people kept coming up to the window asking for shrimp. We knew then it was going to be popular. Our answer was the same, "The fryer isn't working yet." They didn't care. Just bring on the shrimp. The nightmare had begun.

I went into this venture with mixed emotions. Once again I was being taken away from my restaurant, my livelihood. Luckily Jerrie watched the night shift for me, and I was able to be back in Novi by the time the evening action began.

On the other hand, I looked at it as an adventure. Something that I'd never done before. Well, by the end of the festival, I knew I never wanted to do it again. I'm not a carny person and don't have any desire to be.

My work is hard and requires many hours. Carnival people work twice what I do. They start early and end late. The stream of "customers" is constant with no reprieve.

And there is little pleasure other than collecting tickets. No interaction with a guest. No joviality, no fun. Just get the food out as fast as you can because there is always somebody else in line. Tempers run hot by the end of the day. People get tired of pumping out food.

It is a machinelike occupation; one that doesn't interest me in the least. I do admire those who have chosen this as a career. Madness.

By the end of Sunday, we were out of shrimp. Over 1,600 orders sold in three days. The last day and a half, we got it down to a science. Working out of two minimal fryers, we cranked out 400 pounds of shrimp. I was thrilled to have it over.

We cleaned up our area and prepared to close down the window. No such luck. Someone came up with Spanish rice. Why not hawk that? What the heck. "Spanish rice, Spanish rice. Only three tickets. Come and get your Spanish rice."

CHARCOAL GRILLING TIPS: Charcoal briquettes, a combination of coal, sawdust, woodchips and sand are relative newcomers on the grilling scene. They were invented after World War II by Henry Ford as a way to use scrap lumber from wooden auto bodies. While gas grills are gaining in popularity, some people, about 25 billion Americans a year, still prefer briquettes. Here are some tips.

Start the fire 20 to 30 minutes before placing your meat on the grill. Place the briquettes in a pyramid in the center of the grill. Ignite with charcoal lighter fluid or an electric starter and wait for the fire to die out and the coals to glow. About 30 minutes. The coals are ready for cooking when they're ash-covered and glowing. Place a generous amount of coals in the fire grate with 2 to 3 inches extending beyond where the meat cuts will be placed on the grill above.

Make your next wine a winner

Remember, however, the bottle isn't open. And you don't want it opened just yet.

Look at the wine — It should be clear. "If you're looking at a cloudy bottle, that's a problem," Boudt said.

While you're looking at the bottle, look at how high the level of wine is; check to see how far that level is from the bottom of the cork. Boudt said this distance, which should be minimal, is called the "fill."

"The fill should be as close to the cork as possible," Boudt said. The more air there is in the bottle, the more opportunity for oxidation of the wine. The oxidation process gives wine a vinegary taste; oxidation is the

only reason Boudt could think of to send back a bottle of wine.

That's why it's important to observe the quantity listing on the label, as mentioned above. If the bottle is said to contain 750 milliliters, yet the fill is bad, then that might mean the wine won't taste as good as it should.

There's one more thing to check, and one more thing to avoid, before opening the bottle. Boudt said you should gently run your thumb across the top of the cork.

"It shouldn't be pushed out or pushed in," Boudt said of the cork. You're looking for a level, firm closing. That means the cork's in good shape.

Avoid "getting hung up" on the vintage, or year the wine was bottled,

Boudt said. The year is more of a guide when you're considering keeping the bottle in a cellar or drinking it in the near future. It isn't a good enough reason by itself to send a bottle back, Boudt said.

Now let the waiter open the bottle. Touch the cork (Boudt said smelling a cork tells you nothing). If the cork is excessively dry, that could mean air is or has been leaking into the bottle, which accelerates oxidation. If the cork is excessively soft, that might indicate leakage from the bottle.

Typically, the waiter will pour a small amount of wine into your glass. Don't taste it — smell it (twice, as a matter of fact).

Slowly swirl the wine in the glass and take a sniff. This first pass will

smell more like the alcohol in the wine and certain other aromas, Boudt said. Now put it down for about 15 seconds, then pick it up and smell it again. That's what the wine really smells like.

By now you should have a very good idea of whether or not the wine will taste good. Keep one thing in mind — if you think it tastes bad, re-think your position. The wine, if it's passed the tests up to now, probably tastes exactly as it should, which simply might be different from what you expect.

If, on the other hand, it tastes like vinegar, conjure up your best Hollywood face, wave your hand to and fro and cast it aside like so much toxic waste. After all, you're an expert, now.

Al fresco fare is right for reunions

The temperature is rising and balmy breezes beckon you outdoors. Yield to temptation and take advantage of warm evenings and long, lazy afternoons to entertain al fresco.

The outdoors provide much of the fun, and guests will enjoy the lightest, simplest fare. You can invite a few friends over to enjoy the nice weather or plan a reunion, complete with a theme.

FAMILY REUNIONS

Warm-weather outdoor entertaining lends itself to family reunions. Or reunions of any ilk, from former co-workers to travel companions.

But reunions, which usually try to pull together a large group of people who live far away, take careful planning.

Start early. For large groups, planning six months to a year gives you plenty of time to contact those who have fallen out of touch.

Set a budget, based on food, activities, as well as planning costs.

Provide out-of-towners with a list of local hotels and motels.

Come up with a list of events for the reunion day or weekend. Activities can include attending a ball game, a mini tennis tournament, or backyard Olympics. Give everyone name tags, as well as a mailing list of all the attendees.

Give guests a keepsake, such as a T-shirt, mug or hat to remember the day.

Reunions also can have a theme. Western, tropical and safari themes lend themselves to comfortable warm-weather wear and interesting food. A mystery party can include both adults and children in the fun.

ICE CREAM SOCIALS

True ice cream lovers would say that ice cream is cause for a social occasion all by itself. So organize an old-fashioned ice cream social.

You can provide the basics, such as a tub of chocolate, vanilla and strawberry ice cream and all the toppings, and let your guests create their own sundaes. Suggest ice cream favorites from bygone years, such as a Black and White (chocolate syrup and vanilla ice cream) or a Strawberry Blonde (giner ale, seltzer and strawberry ice cream). Or have an ice cream social with a more exotic twist. Have the guests bring a pint of their favorite flavor to share or perhaps the newest flavor at a local ice cream vendor.

A more health-conscious alternative is to serve refreshing non-fat fruit sorbets or frozen yogurt with fresh fruit and crunchy granola toppings.

The ultimate ice cream social, however, is actually an ice-cream making party. If you don't already have an ice cream maker (and new models make it easier than ever to concoct your own little bit of heaven), invest in one. Then invite your pals over to invent new flavors using fruits in season.

PARTIES AND PICNICS

What is appropriate backyard fare? Keep it simple; keep it light, suggests Copley News Service home entertaining columnist Carol Cutler.

Meals should be planned around the entree, which can be fish, poultry, veal or lean, lean cuts of beef. Serve a cold soup, such as gazpacho or cream of watercress. And follow it up with a simple dessert, maybe a light fruit mousse, sorbet or fresh fruit.

Another easy entertaining option is a carryout party, which can be organized as a potluck. Have

one person bring appetizers from his favorite eatery; another can bring her favorite dessert.

Seasonal fruits and vegetables don't require lots of preparation. Fresh corn on the grill is a fresh treat in and of itself.

Or organize an old-fashioned cookout. You provide the grill, condiments and corn. Encourage guests to bring their favorite item to throw on the barbie. Your grill will boast an interesting array, from basic steak to shrimp kebabs.

Offer ideas for exotic fare, such as tandoori-style chicken, fish with garlic, peanut oil and shallots or beef marinated in coconut milk, ginger, rum and dried hot red peppers.

For picnicking at the beach or park, it is even more important to avoid anything complicated. Heaps of fresh fruit, raw vegetables, bread and cheese are simple and satisfying.

FOOD SAFETY

Whenever planning an outdoor feast, remember the basics of food safety.

Generally, the best environment for breeding bacteria is room temperature, so arrange for hot foods to stay hot and cold foods to stay cold. Perishable food shouldn't sit at room temperature for more than two hours.

Use ice-filled coolers, protected in the shade, to keep food and leftovers cold.

On the grill, make sure meats are thoroughly cooked. A meat thermometer is helpful for judging when large cuts are done.

Remember that protein-rich foods, such as homemade mayonnaise, poultry and meats are hospitable to bacteria, especially at room temperature.

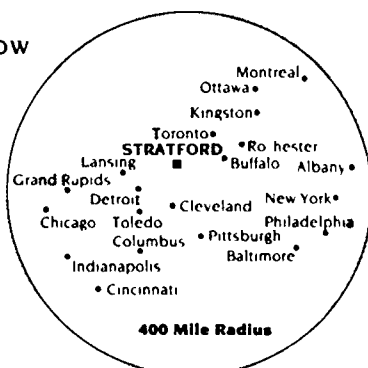

Have a cow over dairy delights

June is recognized as National Dairy Month to celebrate dairy products and the importance they play in our daily diet.

Milk and other dairy products supply protein as well as a variety of vitamins and minerals essential for good health.

Vitamin A, vitamin D, phosphorus, riboflavin and vitamin B-12 are among those necessary for healthy skin and hair.

The most commonly known benefit of milk and milk products is calcium — the mineral vital for strong teeth and bones.

While it's important to choose dairy products for the vitamins and minerals they provide, it's equally important to choose from the low-fat selections available in today's market.

Many delicious low-fat dairy products can be found in the dairy case for the health- and diet-conscious consumer.

Low-fat and skim milk, reduced-calorie margarine, low-fat and part-skim cheese, and the many low-fat frozen dairy desserts are all excellent choices.

Yogurt, which gained popularity as a "health food" in the '70s and '80s, has been perfected to taste wonderfully good as a snack or frozen treat. Frozen yogurt, which is low in calories and fat and high in calcium and protein, is one of my favorites.

Other low-fat dairy tips to try: Substitute 2 tablespoons plain yogurt for 2 tablespoons sour cream to top your baked potato.

Spread 1 ounce part-skim ricotta cheese on a bagel instead of 1 ounce cream cheese and cut the calories in half.

Spoon into chocolate frozen yogurt (105 calories and 2 grams fat per ½ cup) instead of high-fat premium chocolate ice cream (230 calories and 8 grams fat per ½ cup) for dessert. Go ahead and celebrate National Dairy Month by choosing low-fat dairy products. Healthy selections make all the difference in fat and calories.

BUTTERMILK-WALNUT SOUP

1½ cups low-fat buttermilk (1 percent milk fat)
1 ounce finely ground walnuts
¼ teaspoon minced scallion (green onion)
1 garlic clove, minced
½ packet (about ½ teaspoon) instant chicken broth and seasoning mix
¼ teaspoon salt
Dash white pepper
1½ teaspoons minced fresh dill

In blender combine all ingredients except dill and process until smooth; stir in dill. Cover and refrigerate until flavors blend, at least 1 hour. Makes 2 servings, about ¾ cup each.

Each serving provides: ¾ Milk, 1 Fat, 1 Protein, 20 Optional Calories.

BANANA-YOGURT ORLEANS

1 tablespoon whipped butter
1 teaspoon margarine
¼ cup freshly squeezed orange juice
1 tablespoon dark rum
2 teaspoons firmly packed light brown sugar
¼ teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 medium banana (about 6 ounces), peeled and diagonally sliced
1 cup plain low-fat yogurt
2 teaspoons grated orange zest

In 1-quart microwaveable shallow casserole combine butter and margarine and microwave on high (100 percent) for 30 seconds, until melted.

Stir in orange juice, rum, sugar and cinnamon and stir to dissolve sugar. Microwave on High for 2 minutes until mixture is reduced by ¼. Add banana and turn to coat; microwave on high for 30 seconds,

until banana is heated through (do not overcook).

In small mixing bowl combine yogurt and vanilla. Into each of 2 dessert dishes spoon half of the yogurt; top each portion with half of the banana mixture and 1 teaspoon orange zest. Makes 2 Servings.

The zest of the orange is the peel without any of the pith (white membrane). To remove zest from orange, use a zester or vegetable peeler; wrap orange in plastic wrap and refrigerate for use at another time.

2 teaspoons each reduced-calorie margarine (tub) and all-purpose flour
½ cup low-fat milk (1 percent milk-fat)
¾ ounce sharp reduced-fat Cheddar cheese, shredded
¼ cup thawed frozen chopped spinach

In 1-quart saucepan combine 1 ¼ cups water and scallion; cover and cook over high heat until mixture comes to a boil. Stir in rice. Reduce heat to low, recover and let simmer until rice is tender and liquid is absorbed, about 15 minutes.

Trusty crustaceans make tasty fare

If you're a lover of shellfish, you're sure to enjoy a mound of chilled shrimp or a platter of crimson crawfish. Learn the simple technique of separating these favorites from their shells, then savor them right on the spot.

Prized for their sweet meat, shrimp are the most popular shellfish and come in many varieties, forms and sizes.

Buying shrimp: Shrimp are available raw or cooked, fresh or frozen, shelled or in the shell. Raw shrimp in the shell are called green shrimp, although the shell may actually be shades of white, gray, brown, or pink. Peeled and deveined shrimp have had both the shells and sand veins removed.

Usually you only will see shrimp tail sections in your market. Shrimp are sold by size or count per pound. The larger the shrimp, the more they cost. To calculate how much shrimp to buy, figure on three to four ounces of shelled shrimp per person. For some recipes, you can substitute canned shelled shrimp, which come in varying sizes. If you buy shrimp in shells, remember that 12 ounces of raw shrimp in the shell is equal to eight ounces of shelled raw shrimp, a four-and-one-half-ounce can of shrimp, or 1 cup of shelled cooked shrimp.

Storing fresh shrimp: Rinse the shrimp under cold running water, then drain. Cover and keep

them chilled in the refrigerator for up to two days.

Peeling shrimp: For fresh or cooked shrimp, loosen the shell by running your fingers along the underside from head to tail. Gently pull on the tail portion of the shell and remove it. To devein the shrimp, make a shallow slit along its back from head to tail, using a sharp knife. Remove the black sand vein that runs along the center of the back.

Cooking shrimp: In a three-quart saucepan bring four cups water and one teaspoon salt to boiling. Add one pound fresh or frozen shelled or unshelled shrimp. Return to boiling. Reduce heat and simmer, uncovered, for one to three minutes or until shrimp turn pink, stirring occasionally. Rinse under cold running water. Drain and chill. Serve with cocktail sauce or use in a recipe as cooked shrimp.

Crawfish are freshwater crustaceans that look like miniature lobsters. Also known as crayfish, crawdads, creekcrabs and yabbies, their meat is similar in texture but sweeter than that of shrimp.

Buying crawfish: Crawfish are sold live, cooked in the shell, or cooked and frozen in the shell. Frozen cooked tail meat is also available.

For each serving, allow about one pound of live crawfish. This yields about three to four ounces of cooked tail meat.

Storing crawfish: Cook live crawfish as soon as possible. To temporarily store them, rinse them under cold running water, then place them on top of wet newspapers in an insulated cooler that is half-filled with ice. Cook within one day.

Cooking crawfish: Rinse four pounds live crawfish under cold running water. In a 12- to 16-quart kettle combine eight quarts cold water and one-third cup salt; add crawfish. Soak for 15 minutes; rinse. Drain.

In the same kettle bring 8 quarts water and 2 teaspoons salt to boiling. Add crawfish. Return to boiling. Reduce heat and simmer, uncovered, about five minutes or until shells are a bright reddish orange. Drain. Serve hot with cocktail sauce or melted butter and lemon wedges.

Peeling crawfish: Pick up the crawfish and gently twist the tail away from the body. Unwrap the first two or three sections of the shell on the tail, then pinch the end of the tail while pulling out the meat. Remove the black sand vein, if desired.

If the claws are as big as your little finger, crack them. Another treasure awaits you in the body cavity — a bright yellow butter or fat. If you like, you can also suck the flavorful juices from the shell.

Marinade on meat gives grills gusto

Marinades will lend magic to your grilling. As flavor carriers, marinades enhance meats, especially fresh pork.

Marinades "marry" with meats before grilling, allowing the flavors to penetrate the food. Flavorful combinations of ingredients are called a marinade when added before cooking; a baste when added during cooking; and a sauce when added after cooking.

Marinades usually consist of three partners — acid, oil and flavor components. The acidic portion attempts to break down muscle fibers tenderizing the meat. They also carry their own potent flavors, like citrus juice.

Oil coats the surface of the meat, helping seal in natural juices to prevent the meat from

drying out during grilling. Flavor components can include a wide range of herbs and spices. Here are some marinades to try:

Lime-garlic: Combine ¼ cup chicken broth, 1 teaspoon shredded lime peel, ½ cup lime juice, 2 tablespoons oil, 1 tablespoon brown sugar, 2 cloves garlic, minced, and ¼ teaspoon red pepper.

Wine & Herbs: Combine ¼ cup olive oil, ¼ cup dry white wine, 1 tablespoon minced onion, ¼ teaspoon dried basil, crushed, ¼ teaspoon dried rosemary, crushed, and ¼ teaspoon pepper.

Mustard-bourbon: Combine ¼ cup Dijon-style mustard, ¼ cup bourbon, ¼ cup soy sauce, ¼ cup brown sugar, and 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce.

other sugars and fiber.

TNT's "Keep the Change"

offers warmth, wisdom

Buck Henry stands out in excellent cast

"I have a superstition about going home, of forcing the present to conform to the past," muses Joe Starling as he heads up the highway toward Montana. "It takes a species of temporary insanity to override that superstition," he adds, "and I am consumed with temporary insanity."

Starling is the protagonist of Thomas McGuane's acclaimed novel, "Keep the Change," the story of a man looking for where he belongs. Now, Turner Network Television brings the tale to the screen, airing first on Tuesday, June 9. Additional showings include June 10, 13, 14, 19 and 21.

Born to the sprawling Big Sky landscape of Montana, Joe couldn't find a place for himself in his father's dual worlds of banking and ranching; instead, he became a painter, trying to capture, and control, the daunting enormity of his surroundings. Early success takes Joe to Los Angeles, but his artistic fire soon fails and he winds up drawing illustrations for technical manuals. When Joe's mounting debts and dwindling self-esteem reach a perilous intersection, he is urged by his girlfriend Astrid to "do something. Even if it's the wrong thing." And so he does.

William Petersen ("Long Gone," "Young Guns II") plays Joe Starling,

and his edgy blend of dark dissatisfaction and boyish befuddlement suit the character well. Rachel Ticotin ("Total Recall", "One Good Cop") is Astrid, a woman of earthy allure and considerable wisdom. Oscar winner Jack Palance lends his fiery power to his portrayal of Overstreet, the rancher who covets the Starling ranch.

The film's large supporting cast is terrific. Actor/attorney Fred Dalton Thompson ("Cape Fear") stretches his talents admirably in the role of Otis Rosewell, a former hand of Overstreet's who agrees to assist Joe when he decides to try ranching one more time. Lolita Davidovich plays Ellen, Joe's first love and Overstreet's manipulative (and manipulated) daughter. "China Beach" veteran Jeff Kober delivers a deceptively simple performance as Billy, Overstreet's dim-witted son-in-law. ("He moves his lips when he's listening," Palance growls).

Actor/writer/director Buck Henry almost steals the show as Smitty, Joe's boozy, big-talking uncle. From his mishandling of the family finances to his looney scheme to import fresh seafood to Montana ("It's like a trail drive, only with crustaceans"), Smitty deserves nothing but wary disdain; instead, he is beloved, a dreamy little man who merits equally his family's affection and distrust.

"McGuane writes about people who are off the beat," Henry muses. "Like jazz—a little behind or in front of the beat—and it makes for a very human quality."

Director Andy Tennant carefully guides his actors' performances through John Miglils' fine, quirky script, and the result is an eloquent work that says as much in its silences as in dialogue. Much of the story is told in simply placing the action before the dwarfing Montana landscape where the picture was filmed, and Mark Irwin's photography lends a mythic quality to the mountain vistas. Returned to the timeless geography of his youth, Joe can evaluate his life's investments: the profits, the losses and the lesson learned.

Will 'Superman 5' fly? reader's query a real Lulu

Q: I heard that Alexander and Ilya Salkind are going to produce Superman V. What's the scoop? Could you give me an address to reach them? —S.H., Claremont, N.H.

A: The Salkinds are indeed beginning to talk up another chapter in the *Superman* saga, but the producers still appear hesitant to map out any firm details. However, they have revealed that the forthcoming picture will more or less "begin at the beginning," with little regard to plot lines of the past sequels, or the previous stars, for that matter. Christopher Reeve, whose career was built upon the *Superman* roles, won't necessarily return, according to the Salkinds, but his presence or lack thereof is still up in the air.

A: The character of Chris Peterson, the juvenile delinquent in a man's body, is played all too convincingly by Chris Elliott.

Elliott was working as an NBC guide in New York when he had the presence of mind to allow the then-insignificant David Letterman a tour (with his mother) for the children's admission price. After *Late Night* began to air, Letterman repaid his quirky friend by offering him cameo appearances in such roles as "The Guy Under the Seats," which opened the door for his current starring role on Fox.

currently available in video stores.

Q: What is the name of the actor who played Hogan on *Hogan's Heroes*? Did the police ever find out who killed him? —Eleanor Mills, Tigard, Ore.

A: Col. Robert Hogan was played by actor Bob Crane, who was brutally murdered on July 29, 1978.

Crane began his career as a musician, becoming a well-known radio personality in Los Angeles in the late '50s, which in turn led to a co-starring role on *The Donna Reed Show*. In 1965, he jumped at the chance to star as the off-beat POW leader in *Hogan's Heroes*, an extremely successful show that made him a bona fide celebrity.

While still a major star, he returned to the theater and toured the country. One night in a Scottsdale, Ariz., hotel, he was bludgeoned to death in his sleep. The authorities have developed a number of theories over the years, but a lack of evidence has prevented an indictment in what they are sure was the result of an intricate murder plot.

Q: Is Lulu Roman from *Hee Haw* the same person who starred in *Hazzard Corner* as Boss Hogg's wife? My sister says no, but I say yes. Who's right? —J. Eller, Hartsborne, Okla.

A: The full-figured Roman has appeared regularly on *Hee Haw* since 1969, with only a brief hiatus in the '70s to sort out a drug problem. Roman did not appear on *The Dukes of Hazzard* as Lulu Hogg. That honor belongs to actress Peggy Rea.
