

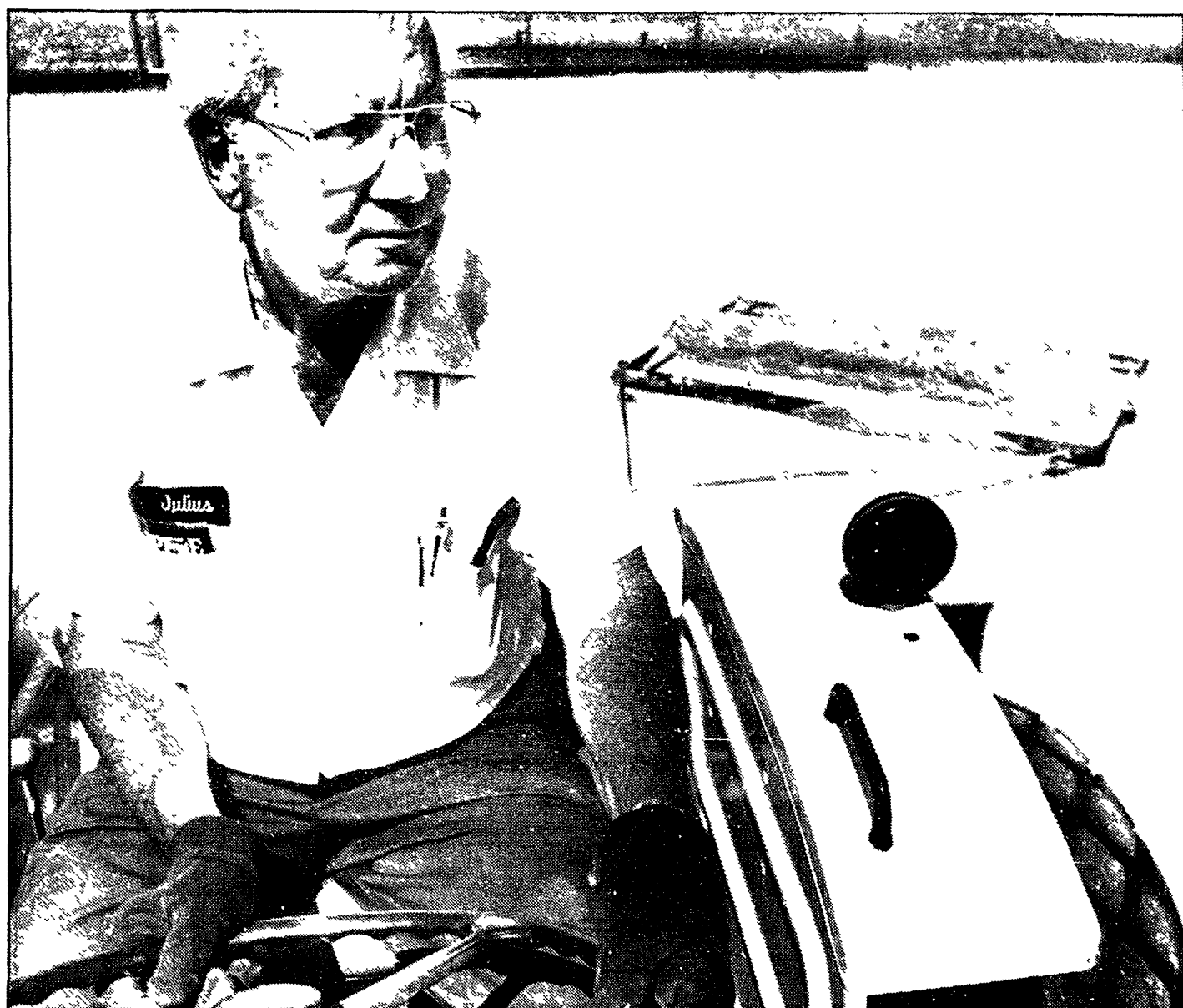

Expert volunteer helps parks

Julius Saner is the picture of contentment this warm, sunny morning at Fish Hatchery Park.

Wheeling his tractor in ever-tightening circles, Saner pulls a drag across a baseball diamond infield, smoothing away the stones that could force a bad-hop single or a bloody nose.

Soon the job is complete, and Saner will move off to some other task, hoping to keep pace with the tall grass, creeping weeds, rough fields, and other daily chores that confront Northville's Parks and Recreation Department.

After 28 years with the city's Department of Public Works, and a five-year stint as recreation's maintenance supervisor, Saner should be comfortably settled into retirement. Instead, he's out early at Fish Hatchery, or Ford Field, or Hines Park—wherever he's needed—logging 40

hours a week as an ace maintenance man.

A typical day for Saner might include sharpening mower blades, restoring equipment, training the department's four part-time maintenance workers to line baseball and soccer fields, and cutting grass and brush.

And all this is gratis, free of charge. He's the ultimate volunteer, said Traci Gottschalk, parks and recreation director.

"He's a wonder man. He really cares about us," Gottschalk said.

While Gottschalk gushes, Saner is modest about his role in the local recreation scene.

"I'm happy to do it," he said. "I really enjoy it or I wouldn't be out here."

City and recreation budget cuts helped play a role in Saner's decision to volunteer. Financial troubles have affected many city departments, and earlier this year recreation officials were forced to lay off a maintenance worker.

"Because of the cutbacks, I couldn't justify

coming in and taking any money at all," he said.

Saner left the recreation department in 1991, but said he's happy to be back in a volunteer role. He praised Gottschalk and Assistant Director John Powe for their desire to upgrade recreation facilities and programs.

"This is altogether a different operation," he said. "I've seen the recreation department turn around 100 percent."

Saner originally was scheduled to work from mid-March to mid-April, readying fields for the new season. But there always seems to be another job, another project that only Saner can shepherd. Gottschalk has seen to that.

"He's the only one who knows how to do all this," she said.

Saner doesn't protest too loudly, if at all. He'll stay out on the tractor a while longer.

"Every morning throughout the summer, if possible, I'll be around to help out," he said. "But if my wife reads this she'll kill me."

Obscenity charges tossed out

Taboo is not forbidden in Northville Township.

A 35th District Court judge last week dismissed obscenity charges against the owners of Northville Video, 43197 Seven Mile, the target of a February police raid.

Judge James Garber, calling Michigan's obscenity statute "fatally flawed," ruled in favor of defendants Carl Wilson and Laura Wilson, the owners of Northville Video.

Garber said the ruling conflicted with his personal beliefs, but backed other court decisions which found that materials containing or describing sexual conduct are not necessarily obscene.

"... Even though I might personally have preferred to see the prosecution of this case proceed to trial, I am reluctantly constrained to hold in favor of the defendants," Garber wrote in his opinion.

The Wilsons faced obscenity charges stemming from a Feb. 11 township police raid on Northville Video. Police acted on a search warrant issued by the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office and confiscated the jackets from four alleged obscene videos, as well as boxes of alleged obscene glossy materials and a computer and computer files.

Carl Wilson and Laura Wilson were unavailable for comment Friday. Their attorney, Carl Rubin, said the Wilsons were happy with the decision.

"They're pleased that the judge did the right thing and followed the law," Rubin said. "I've had this case so many times, and the courts have agreed with me."

"I'd have been very surprised if (Garber) did otherwise," Rubin said.

Raymond Walsh, assistant county prosecutor, was unavailable Friday to comment on a possible appeal.

Rubin said he anticipates an appeal.

"I know this will not end it," he said. "I expect an appeal."

Township police Capt. Philip Pressnell, who headed up the video store investigation and raid, was unaware of the decision until Friday afternoon.

"Justice has been served, and we'll abide by the court's decision," he said.

Police originally acted on a complaint from Michael Quinkert, a Detroit man and president of the Michigan Coalition on Pornography.

In his complaint to police, Quinkert alleged that Northville Video stocked films that violated Michigan's obscenity statute. The alleged obscene titles included *Taboo*, *Taboo IV*, *Anal Angels*, and *Anal Alley*.

Clerk leaves city amid uncertainty

Departing City Clerk Cathy (Konrad) Watkins began Friday to clean 20 years of memories out of her desk.

"Nothing like waiting until the last minute, is there?" she said.

After 20 years of service to the city, and seven years as city clerk, Watkins has an office full of history to pack up. And the office may remain empty for a while after she leaves.

Because if Watkins has waited until the last minute to plan for her departure, so has the city.

As of noon Friday, her last official day as Northville's clerk, the city had barely begun seeking Watkins' replacement.

On Friday afternoon, Executive Secretary Beverly Dennis was sworn in as acting city clerk, a designation needed to authorize her to sign legal documents.

Also Friday afternoon, City Manager Gary Word began affixing addresses to envelopes, preparing to mail notices advertising the clerk's position to the 500 Michigan clerks on a

Voters today decide tax rate and board slots

Northville School District voters will find four ballot questions awaiting them at the polls today.

District officials are seeking passage of a millage renewal request and a 1.4-mill increase in two separate questions. In addition, voters will elect two people to fill open seats on the Board of Education. A third ballot issue will ask the electorate to cast its vote in support of or against implementing a state-mandated, district-wide "Schools of Choice" plan.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday.

In two separate requests school officials are asking voters to renew the current operating tax rate of 22.63 mills and to approve a 1.4-mill property tax increase. One mill is \$1 of tax per \$1000 of assessed property tax.

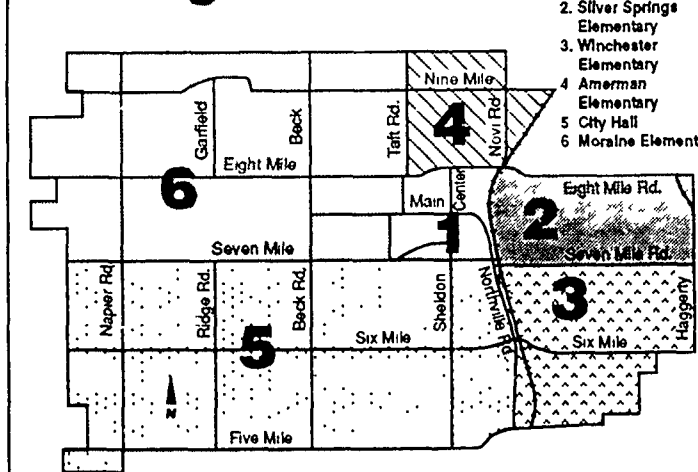
School officials have drafted a list of staff positions and programs—eliminating \$2,650,330 from the proposed 1992-93 budget if voters only authorize a renewal of the current levy.

Included on that list are 13.5 existing teachers and four to five new

teachers to handle growth in the district. One transportation supervisor, 12 bus drivers, and 9-12 maintenance people will also be axed. The athletic director and sports programs districtwide would be eliminated, with the exception of varsity sports at the high school. Three buses will not be replaced, nor will the district see any new hardware or software next year. The Student Assistance Program at the high school, the Business Education Partnership program, and the first-grade Graduated Start program are also on the block if only the renewal passes.

School officials say the proposed 1.4-mill increase would generate \$1,082,000 in tax revenues and would buy back a portion of the potential cuts. The increase would restore the existing 9-10 teaching positions and pay for hiring four to five new ones. The athletic director and the sports programs would be back in full swing. The transportation supervisor would be back on the payroll, along with a few of his drivers, and the district would replace three school buses for \$35,000. The student substance abuse program and partnership program would also be

back in place.

The current tax proposals represent the entire locally levied school property tax bill, although the school district also receives a 7.23 mill allocation from Wayne County.

Also in today's vote, two of the seven board members' seats are up for re-election for four-year terms. Hoping to retain their seats for second terms on the board are incumbents Carol Rahimi and Donald Klokenga. Seeking to oust them are newcomers Patricia Cluster and Glen Meisel. Phil Phillips, spokesperson for Citizens for a Better Northville, also announced late in May that he is offering himself as a write-in candidate for one of the open board seats.

Finally, a state mandated program for Schools of Choice will also be before voters. The program, if adopted, would require the Northville School District to pay transportation costs for students whose parents opt to send them to a school inside the district other than the one nearest to their home.

The Northville district has had an "open enrollment" policy on the books since 1979, allowing attendance at any school in the district—providing the student's parents arrange transportation.

A yes vote will be a vote for the district to provide transportation. A no vote will be a vote for keeping the current setup.

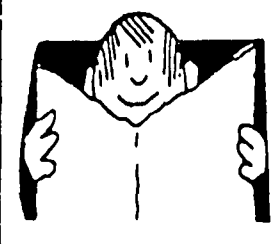

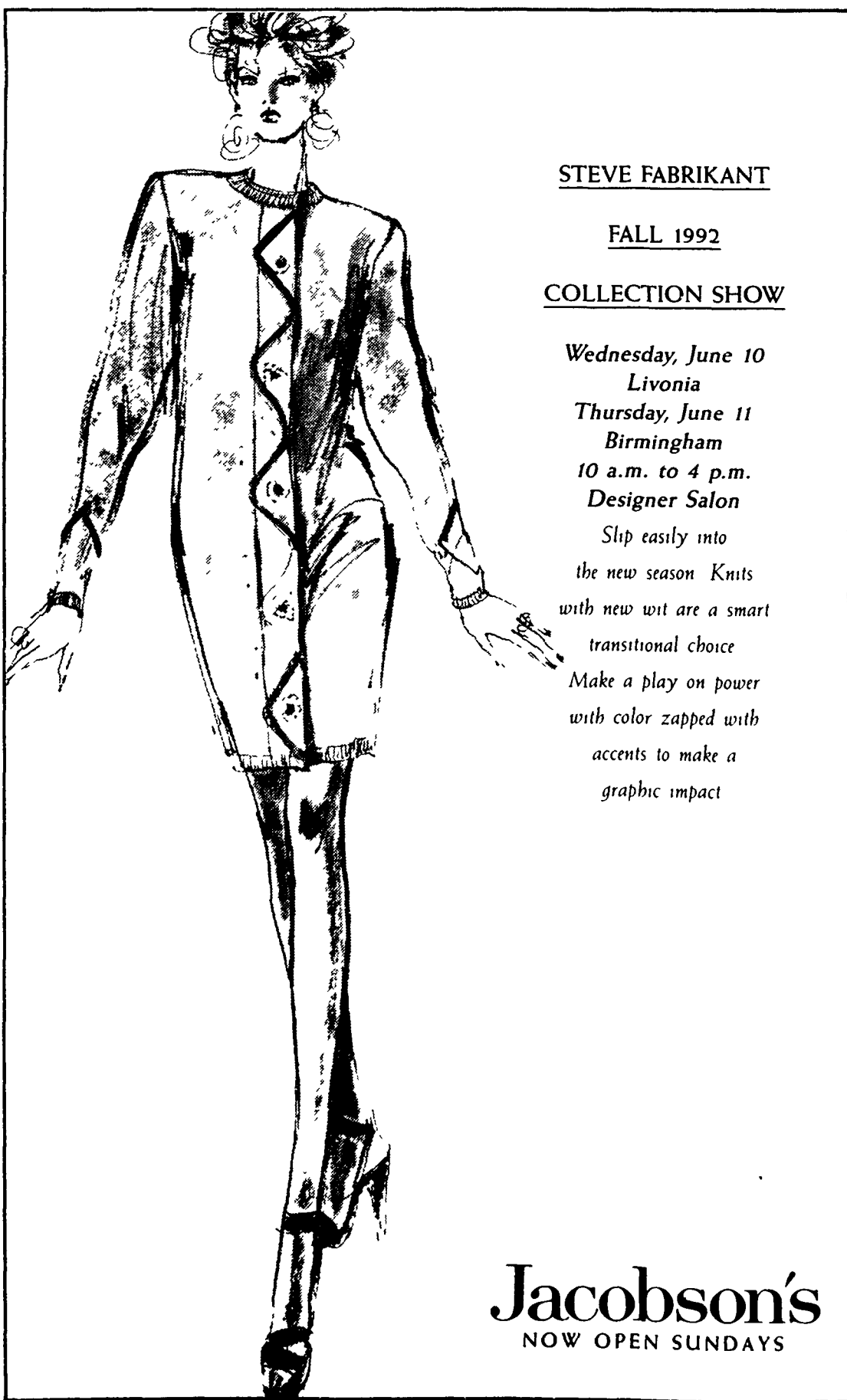

The session will be held at 8 p.m. Monday, June 29 at Northville City Hall.

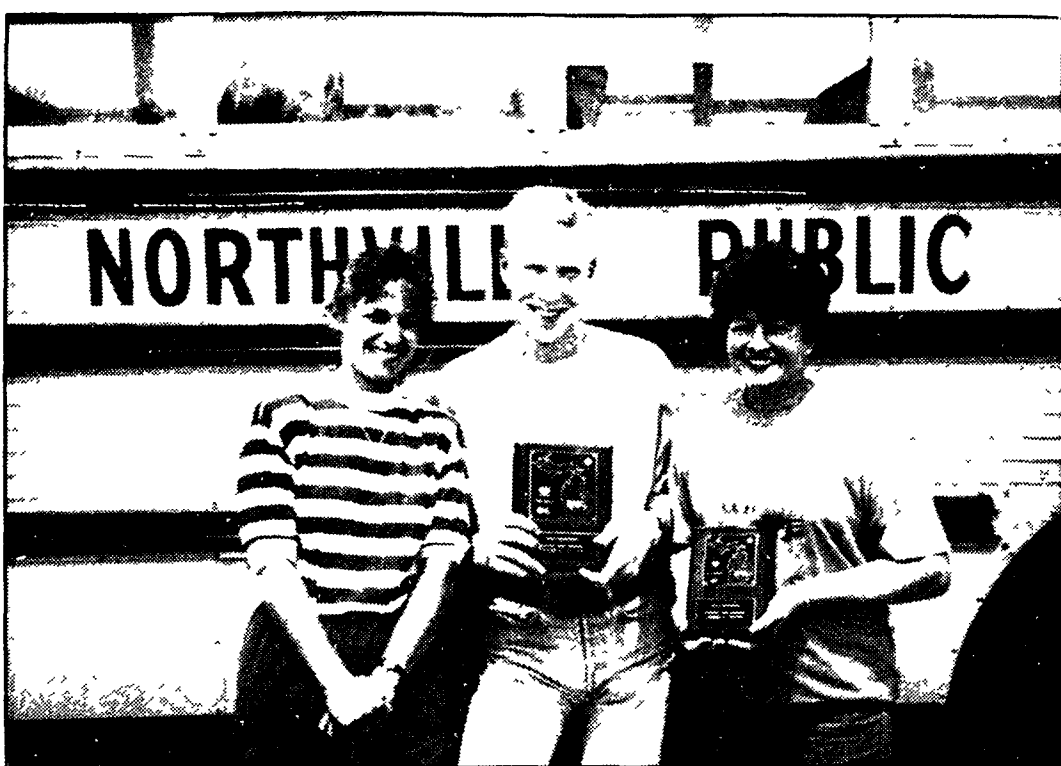
All interested residents are invited to attend.

That's the message Civic Concern would like to send to the donors who are so generous to the Northville-based relief agency during the holidays.

"I'd like to just gently remind the folks, who are always so good to us at Christmas, that we are still here," said food coordinator Angle Hansen.

"Our people are still in need."

One of the agency's more pressing needs is for non-food items, Hansen said.

"There's always the need for food, but we are always short because our funds don't permit us to buy items like paper products, tissue or toothpaste," Hansen said. "Instead of a big can of green beans or baked beans, if they could watch for a sale on toilet paper, that would really help."

Hansen pointed out that those in need often have trouble obtaining

items like soap, laundry soap and cleaning products.

"Those people who have food

stamps cannot buy these with food stamps," she said. "They must rely on their cash or something else."

Fire Safety

Attacking the fire is difficult

The first fire engine pulls up to the scene as smoke pours from around the family room windows. The engineer quickly switches the motor's power to the pumps, and opens a valve allowing the engine's 750-gallon on-board water tank to feed the pumps while he hooks up to a nearby hydrant with five-inch diameter hose. Meanwhile, other fire fighters are pulling smaller, inch-and-a-half hoses off the engine and tightening the straps on their air tanks and face masks. When all is ready, they slowly open the door to the house and drop to their hands and knees, disappearing into the smoke.

Although a number of advances have been made in the science of fire fighting over the last 100 years, one thing has not changed: Most fires are still put out with water. Fires involving some materials—such as flammable liquids, flammable metals and electrical equipment—call for specialized extinguishing agents, but the job of most fire fighters is still to "put the wet stuff on the red stuff."

In order to continue burning a fire needs fuel, oxygen and heat. Water puts out fire by removing heat. It is cheap and readily available in most locations, ensuring that it will continue to be the method of choice for extinguishing fires in ordinary materials.

Most fire engines carry a supply of water with them, generally between 500 and 1,000 gallons. This provides the fire fighters with more than enough water to put out small fires without looking for a hydrant, or allows them to get started on the fire while the engine is hooked up to a hydrant or other water supply source.

In areas where there are no fire hydrants, firefighters must rely on special tankers to bring in supplies of water or carry special hoses allowing them to "draft" from lakes or pools.

The most effective way to extinguish fires is from the inside out. By getting close to the fire, the fire fighters are able to put the water directly on the base of the fire and minimize the amount of water needed to do the job. Fighting the fire from the inside also allows them to push it out of the building, rather than back into areas not yet involved. Sometimes the fire has advanced too far, and must be fought "defensively." Given a choice, however, fire fighters will choose an aggressive interior fire attack.

Once inside the house the fire fighters feel their way along a wall, searching for the source of the fire. The thick, dark smoke makes it impossible to see, and they could not breathe were it not for the air tanks and masks. Turning a corner, the lead fire fighter notices an orange glow in the distance. Crawling closer to the glow, the fire fighter opens the nozzle and directs a high pressure stream of water at the base of the fire. The fire immediately darkens down, as waves of hot steam wash back over the crouching fire fighters. They continue to work the hose around the room, and as the steam and smoke begin to vent through the broken family room windows, visibility begins to improve. In a few short minutes they will know the worst is over. The fire has been "knocked down" and is now under control. The long process of overhaul, making sure the fire has not found its way into hidden areas where it can continue to burn, must now begin.

A mix of old and new faces will sit in Michigan's 72-seat delegation at the Republican National Convention Aug. 27 in Houston, and Northville's Susan Heintz will be part of it.

Gov. John Engler has attended before, but this time he will head a delegation 100 percent for President George Bush.

Heintz thought of going for fun. "Bobheintz has a frequent flyer ticket, and I was thinking of going and enjoying myself," she said before the GOP state convention. But when the at-large delegation list came out the next day, she was there as a delegate. (She refers to husband Bob as if his two names were one.)

Now Engler's Detroit office chief, Heintz was Northville Township clerk when she was elected a district alternate in 1984. In Dallas, she got her picture in *USA Today* while wearing a Detroit Ti-

gers cap and reading the party platform. Friends accused her of being the only person to read the platform.

Heintz's alternate will be a new face in Michigan politics: Michelle Engler, wife of the governor.

All three candidates for national committeewoman — winner Betsy DeVos of Ada, the outgoing Ronna Romney of Bloomfield Hills and challenger Andrea Fischer of Birmingham — were placed on the at-large delegate slate.

Delegates from the 13th Congressional District, which includes most of the Northville area, were apportioned geographically: attorney Sean Cox of Livonia from the old Wayne 2nd, Lewis Beaver of Westland from the old 15th District, and David Fantera of Ypsilanti, from the Washtenaw County portion.

"I enjoy politics and enjoy being part of the process," said Cox, who has "no political aspirations" of his own. This year he's chairing Thaddeus McCotter's bid for Wayne County commissioner.

Clerk leaves city post amid uncertainty

municipal mailing list obtained by the city. Word attributed the delay in mailing the notices to the time needed to obtain the mailing list and compose the flier.

Advertisements will begin running in local newspapers this week, he said.

The job search has been stymied in part by the lead time needed to place ads in specific municipal publications. Word said: "We're trying to target our ads to where they'll do the most good."

Word added that the city has already seen some interest in the clerk's position.

"We haven't advertised yet or posted (public notice that the position is open), but I've had a couple of unsolicited applications," he said. One application came from within city hall, he said.

The manager said he saw no reason to rush to fill Watkins' shoes.

"This is an important department head position and I'm going to fill it very carefully," he said. "I'm willing to sacrifice time to get the right person."

The postal notice says that the position "affords a challenging opportunity for a professional clerk."

The position's listed responsibilities include "election management, risk management, general records management, licensing, ordinance and charter maintenance, voter registration, Clerk to City Council and other related duties."

The city is seeking someone with "a combination of education and experience equivalent to post secondary training in business, public administration or related fields." Candidates with five years of experience and certification and municipal clerks are preferred.

Starting salary is offered in the

\$32,000-\$38,000 range, depending on qualifications and experience.

Applications are due by June 29.

In the meantime, the city administration has begun divvying up the tasks that usually fell to the clerk. Duties like record-keeping of parking tickets have been doled out to the police department, while the front office will take on new responsibilities including the handling of absentee ballots.

Watkins may return to city hall on a part-time basis, but that, too, is up in the air. "I offered to do some work part-time, but they have not asked me to come back for a specific job or a specific day," she said.

Watkins said she may return to help oversee the city's upcoming elections in August and November, "either as an advisory person or just getting the process started."

But, she insisted, "I'm not willing

Four years ago Cox was legal counsel to the Jack Kemp presidential campaign. He was in the middle of a legal battle by the Kemp-Robertson faction to change the rules so that officeholders couldn't be state convention delegates. The Bush people won the political battle, but Cox's side won the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals battle — two years after the convention.

to do the work without any help."

Watkins decided to leave Northville in part because of a recent reorganization at city hall that left her without a deputy clerk, and with a slew of new responsibilities. The entire clerk's department, like others at city hall, faced layoffs and cutbacks in response to the city's \$1 million deficit.

The clerk had a more personal reason for leaving as well, having married Marshall's clerk/treasurer Richard Watkins earlier this year. The Watkinses plan to make their home in Marshall.

As to whether Watkins will return on a part-time basis, Word said, "I've asked her, and she's offered to help the city out . . . That may happen."

But Word was still uncertain whether Watkins' services will be needed. "I just think we need to organize that better, and if we need to, we'll make the request," he said.

Our Opinion

Library possibilities continue to develop

This district library business gets more interesting all the time.

The latest developments include the revelation that assorted library officials are kicking around the possibility of including Salem Township and the City of South Lyon in a Northville district library plan.

As you may recall, a district library differs somewhat from the current arrangement governing the Northville Public Library. As things now stand, the township and city each contribute money to the running of the library under a formula based partly on population. It's sort of a tricky business, particularly in today's fiscal climate, because both the township board and city council have to agree to a budget which first goes through an advisory commission. The commission includes members of both governments and others.

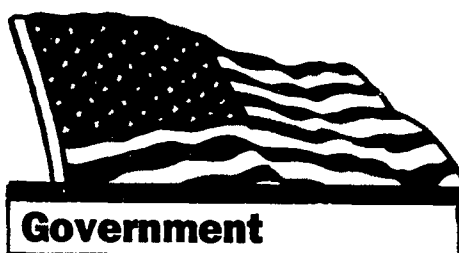
A district library would remove the responsibility for the library from the local governments. A separate government (a library board) would be set up and elected by the affected residents. That board could propose millage questions specifically to run the library, for no other purpose.

We've already been through the benefits of at least a thorough exploration of the whole district library concept. What's got us intrigued all over again is this possibility of thinking about a much larger district for the library to serve.

Salem and South Lyon have — for longer than Northville — been trying to get together a district library proposal of their own, and trying to entice Lyon and possibly Green Oak townships as well.

Naturally, the idea of a four-municipality library district, as outlined, carries with it both positives and negatives. But like the district library concept itself, the idea at the very least merits some thinking about.

Adding the two other communities would present a very different picture, and a very different proposal for voters to consider when the time comes. The larger population base for the larger district would be a definite advantage. The size of



a library needed to serve the four communities would probably not be all that much bigger than a library to fully serve Northville. Yet the added tax base would make that library much easier to fund. In other words, the larger district would simply be more cost-effective, and that's a very good thing.

Simple geography of the four-community plan might be a negative, though. A Northville Township/Northville City/Salem Township district would make a certain amount of sense, but adding South Lyon creates a pretty odd animal. South Lyon's borders wouldn't even touch the rest of the district, although that wouldn't be a problem if the people living there didn't think it was.

And their opinion on the matter would probably rest largely on exactly where the library was located. And that, naturally, would be the stickiest of questions. Locating a new Northville-only library will prove difficult enough; trying to find a site acceptable to four municipalities would probably present a headache too big to even think about at this point.

One other thought can't help creeping in with all this speculation. And that's that the old, rejected plan for a Haller library on Six Mile and Sheldon might look much more reasonable to Northville voters, at least, if the population it served were increased as much as this plan would.

Of course this is all very premature. Any district library proposal is still far off. These initial discussions, though, are proving to be fascinating, and we look forward to their continuation.

Do we need to emphasize the importance of this election?

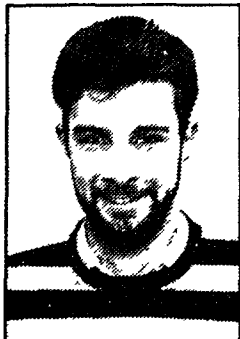

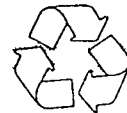

Mountain grown grapes add kick to Gauer wines

Special aromas and flavors of wine are reflections of the grape's natural environment. Exceptional varietal wines are produced when the elements of soil, climate and cultural skill are well married.

Soil type defines a wine's structure and has significant bearing on flavor components. Climate holds equal importance and site differentiation accounts in great measure toward a wine's complexity and long-term ageability.

Varietal intensity is the principal characteristic of mountain-grown fruit. As a direct result of more pronounced sun exposure, grape berries are smaller, more deeply colored and thicker skinned. This heightens and intensifies their flavor.

These elements are well-integrated in the mountain fruit of Gauer Estate Vineyard and are best illustrated in the winery's handsome chardonnays and cabernets.

Gauer Estate Vineyard pioneered mountain-side planting in the Alexander Valley. The various vineyard parcels are located in the Mayacamas Mountain Range of Sonoma County above the Alexander Valley at elevations from 400 to 2,400 feet. Compressed ash or volcanic tuffs, remnants from the fiery eruptions of Mount St. Helen can be found in some areas of the vineyard and contribute to the richness of the mountain earth.

Lack of water, however, can overstress grape vines. At Gauer, drip irrigation from spring-fed ponds is used to maintain the vines at levels just above stress, thus producing small berries with concentrated flavors.

Different mountain slopes create varying angles from which the sun can penetrate a vine. Gauer's terraced vineyard sites range from 15 to 22 percent with the choicest vineyards planted at a 30 percent slope. Here cabernet sauvignon, cabernet franc and merlot thrive on west and south-facing slopes while chardonnay, benefitting from cooler temperatures, is better suited to north-facing sites.

Mountain grape growing is an arduous, expensive, time-consuming task requiring extended patience. Many years pass between soil cultivation and the first harvestable crop. Today, Gauer Estate is reaping the rewards of patience in their richly styled wines. "We're attempting to bottle the essence of our exceptional vineyards," comments winemaker Kerry Damskey.

"I believe the marketplace has many good chardonnays. Therefore, we need to have something different. The lower vigor of Gauer's estate vineyards adds a dimension of strength to the wines. They are somewhat tight when young, but are more European in style than most California chardonnays. Essentially, they are more French because they tend to taste better with some bottle age. You won't find a tropical nature in the chardonnays from Gauer Estate."

UNCOMMONLY DELICIOUS

Best of chefs still turn to the common carrot

So here it is, the latest sensation among ingredients, the veggie that has food mavens clustering around exhibition kitchens in trendy restaurants and rummaging through the produce in upscale supermarkets.

It's the carrot.

Only kidding, of course. No vegetable has less chance of making it into the upper echelons of culinary fashion to join arugula and bell peppers in various improbable colors. And the reason isn't hard to figure out:

The carrot is "too common," said Hans Rockenwager, whose Los Angeles restaurant goes by his surname.

"It's not trendy in this trendiest of cities," said Chef John Sedlar of St. Estephe and of Bilkini about Los Angeles' regard of the carrot.

"It doesn't require finesse in cooking," said Robert Bell, chef of Chez Melage and Fino, Misto and the Depot. That's the downside of the carrot.

Yet every chef spoke up in its favor. It's inexpensive, it's nutritious, it's available all year round and, most important from a culinary perspective, it gets into more dishes than any other vegetable except for the onion, with which it is often partnered.

Chopped carrots and onions, often with the addition of celery, make up mirepoix, the sauteed mixture of aromatic vegetables that form the start of countless dishes in classic cuisine. Carrots with onions, and, often again, celery flavors soups and cooking liquids that in turn become sauces.

The carrot rates a nod over the onion in one respect: Alone among vegetables, it goes into a popular dessert, the omnipresent Carrot Cake.

Along with its other remarkable qualities, the carrot has a higher sugar content than any other vegetable but the beet. As a consequence, it makes an easy transition into sweet dishes. A traditional recipe, now largely forgotten, is Carrot Flan or Pie, a custard filled with sweetened puree, sometimes covered with thin slices of glazed carrot. This can be served as a side dish or, in more sugary versions, as dessert.

The carrot has been cast in supporting roles for so long that no one believes it has star potential. But it may have dramatic possibilities: carotene, the substance that gives the carrot its bright orange color, is getting a lot of attention from researchers and food faddists.

The theory is that antioxidant qualities of carotene are valuable in preventing a number of serious diseases. The contention is less than proven, but adding a few more carrots to the diet certainly can't hurt.

The carrot offers probably the most inexpensive ways of bringing color to the plate — another bonus of all that carotene. Overcooked and underseasoned, it often does little more than add a visual accent.

Properly made, though, the carrot becomes a sensation. With the following general procedure, you won't be able to make enough carrots to satisfy family and guests. That's a promise.

Glazed carrots: With a vegetable peeler, shave off the skin of as many carrots as you wish to cook. Be generous. Slice them into fairly thin rounds. Place in a large frying pan with enough water barely to cover them. Add salt to taste. Add two or three tablespoons of butter and about one tablespoon of sugar for a large pan.

Proportions don't matter greatly, but you don't want to make so much sugar as to make the dish cloying. Bring to a boil and cook over medium heat until the water evaporates and the carrots are tender. The sugar and the butter will form a caramel in the pan.

Continue to cook, tossing, until the carrots are lightly browned and well glazed. Add salt and white pepper to taste. Serve as a side-dish with practically anything.

Peas and carrots: This is probably the most boring of vegetable side dishes, but it can be worth eating. Prepare the carrots as directed for glazed carrots.

I use small frozen peas in loose packages; place the peas, thawed, in a large frying pan about one layer deep. Add salt and pepper to taste. Toss over brisk heat until the liquid evaporates and the peas are heated through. Serve mixed with or along with the glazed carrots.

Carrot Vichy: This is an entry from the classic French kitchen. The carrots are cooked as in glazed carrots but, in principle, with highly alkaline mineral water from Vichy. (It was imported in the days before mineral water became fashionable, but I can't recall seeing it lately.)

Other cooks simulate the effect by adding a pinch of baking soda to the cooking water or even forgetting ab-

out it all together.

Another way to put carrots in the spotlight is with a puree, which provides an interesting taste and texture contrast to a vegetable garniture.

CARROT PUREE

4 large or 6 regular carrots
1/4 large sweet yellow onion, sliced thin
2 tablespoons butter
Grated zest of 1/4 orange
1 or 2 tablespoons orange juice
1/4 cup heavy cream
1 tablespoon brown sugar
Salt, white pepper to taste

With vegetable peeler, shave off skin of carrots. Slice carrots thinly. Place vegetables in saucepan with little water; cook slowly, covered, until very soft. Drain vegetables well. Place vegetables in food processor or blender. Add remaining ingredients and puree until smooth. Serve at once, or pack in a casserole and allow to cool. To reheat, bake at 325 F for about 20 minutes.

Variations: This recipe may be infinitely varied. Other possible flavorings include vanilla, nutmeg and herbs.

Puree may be spread into an 8-inch unbaked pie shell and baked for about 30 minutes at 350 F, until lightly browned.

Those willing to experiment could try a sweet version by omitting onion and adding two more medium carrots. Increase sugar to taste. Omit pepper and all but a pinch of salt. This too, may be baked in a pie shell. If you like, top may be covered with overlapping layers of thin slices of carrots, cooked according to directions for glazed carrots.

Yields six servings.

Two Los Angeles chefs — Patrick Healy of Champagne and Gerri Gilliland of Gilliland's and Lula's — spoke highly of pickled carrots. Healy served baby carrots, preserved in sweet vinegar, with pate instead of traditional cornichons (tiny gherkins). At Lula's guests immediately are served plates of carrots in the Mexican style with hot peppers.

MARINATED CARROTS

2 pounds of carrots
3/4 cup cider vinegar
1/4 cup oil
1/4 cup sugar
1/4 cup chopped onion
1 package of Italian seasoning
1/4 cup chopped parsley

Lately I've been reflecting on the changes my philosophies concerning the hospitality industry have gone through over the years.

My "professional" experience since college has been managing corporate Steak and Ales and the privately held Diamond Jim's in Southfield. It's a nice mix of training, the big versus the small. There are lots of differences.

I find it stifling to follow "rules" with no room for flexibility. A few years of Steak and Ale was ideal. What I learned was incredible.

There is no way I'd be able to do what I do "business-wise" without that background. My training was extremely thorough.

For the first six months I was assigned to every job function in the restaurant, from dish washing to cocktail waitressing. It was an eyeopener.

Then it was on to front-of-the-house management and learning the "numbers" game, otherwise known as "How much money can we make by doing so-and-so." Our living depended on percentages. If the figures weren't good neither were our pay-

checks. Money is a motivator to cut corners. Nothing drastic. The food was consistent.

Consistency was drilled into our brains. Be sure that the meal is the same each time. In fact, the edibles were so consistent that the only time the menu changed was for a price increase. No experimentation was allowed so that the public knew what was available every time. It works to this day.

Customer service was big. I probably learned more about the ins and outs of service at Steak and Ale than anywhere else I worked. They are perfectionists.

There is a true art to "working" a room. To watch and see everything. To anticipate a customer's needs.

And then I moved to Brady's. My husband Tom was opening Prudential and a mutual acquaintance suggested that he speak with me. The timing was exceptional. I was ready to move on, and excited at the challenge of opening a 225-seat restaurant.

The difference between working for an independent and working for a corporation was evident immediately. If a decision had to be made, my opinion counted. I actually had an input into the menu, uniforms, glassware, dishware and kitchen equipment. There is no dictator telling us what to do.

Freedom abounded. Work became much more fun. I especially appreciated

the difference in service philosophy. Customers became real people with first names and warm recollections of the Brady hospitality known on Seven Mile. Many have become dear friends.

My definition of service had changed. No longer was it limited to keeping plates cleared and water glasses filled. A true interest in the people and their lives became a daily practice. There is a big difference.

Webster's defines service as aid, assistance or help. I'd like to update it to read aid, assistance or help provided by someone that cares. It is the care that counts. Without it, life is a lot less interesting and fulfilling.

LIGHTEN UP FOR CALCIUM: Dairy products are still one of the best dietary sources of calcium. If you're concerned about the fat, lighten up advises Florine Mark president and CEO of The WW Group Inc.

"Osteoporosis currently afflicts one in four post-menopausal women in our country, and all American women have been advised to increase the amount of calcium in their diets," said Mark who offers this advice for keeping your diet low in fat.

Aim for two to three servings of dairy products a day. Instead of whole milk, choose skim; instead of whole milk cottage cheese and yogurt, choose the kind with one percent fat or nonfat. Instead of regular cream cheese, choose reduced-fat Neufchatel. Evaporated milk can be used instead of cream in soups and entrees. Low-fat cottage cheese can be whipped in a blender with a bit of skim milk and substituted for mayonnaise.

FROZEN COFFEE KEEPS BEST: Put your coffee in the freezer. Whole beans will keep for about two months in the freezer; ground coffee will remain fresh for two to three weeks in the refrigerator. Gloria Jean's Coffee Bean, the nation's largest gourmet coffee chain, recommends grinding beans just prior to brewing for 20 percent fresher flavor.

Gloria Jean recommends two level tablespoons of ground coffee per five ounces of fresh, cold water. Keep brewed coffee no longer than 30 minutes on the warming plate. As coffee continues to cook it takes on a bitter taste. Never re-heat or re-brew coffee.

REDUCE POTATO SPOTTING: Ever wonder why spotted, golden sweet potatoes develop black spots when they cook? According to Betty Crocker, the potatoes darken on cut surfaces due to enzymatic and chemical reactions between the potato and oxygen in the air. Sweet potatoes caramelize on the surface during the intense heat of baking, an effect that's increased by adding brown sugar. Baked sweet potatoes with dark brown spots are safe to eat. Some darkening will occur naturally, but you can minimize it by baking potatoes in a preheated oven and removing them as soon as they are tender.

BETTY CROCKER TIP OF THE WEEK: Toss fruit salad together just before serving to make the salad look fresh and beautiful. Prepare various kinds of melon and grapes the night before and store in airtight containers, separately. Slice berries and bananas just before mixing the salad.

Kabob has sweet, spicy taste

Summer signals grilling and most of us seem to have an inner sensor that directs us to the meat counter for that special cut to go on the grill.

The old myth that lamb is expensive and difficult to prepare has been overcome with the introduction of the new fresh American lamb cuts such as the center leg steaks, sirloin steaks, boneless shoulder or leg cuts for kabobs, small boneless roasts, and ground for burgers on the grill. Kabobs can be made from shoulder cuts and are as tender and mild as the more expensive loin or rib chops.

Lamb is naturally tender and grills to perfection.

Most lamb cuts give you less than 200 calories per 3 ounce cooked serving. This lean lamb kabob has only 214 calories and is well under the current recommendation for less than 30 percent of calories from fat. Loaded with iron, B-vitamins and minerals, lamb presents a solid nutrition story.

This "Apple-Icious Lamb Kabob" features a sweet and spicy barbecue sauce with an interesting secret ingredient found in everyone's kitchen. Applesauce adds texture and sweetness and for those fortunate enough to have their own apple tree in the back yard, fresh applesauce would be wonderful. We have marinated the lamb in an apple juice marinade which is as simple as mixing four ingredients in your bowl and allows the cook to grill in two hours or the next day.

Grilling instructions for lamb are easy and quick. Always use a moderate heat and watch the meat carefully to avoid overcooking. These kabobs take only about 10 to 12 minutes to reach a medium rare stage which leaves the meat still pink and juicy. If it rains on your summer picnic, turn

on the broiler and enjoy the kabobs from your oven.

Make that lamb barbecue special with some onions and new potatoes grilled along with the lamb. Add a summer fresh cabbage slaw and wrap a heavy textured bread in foil and heat over the coals. Season the bread with a garlic butter, and finish with lots of fresh sliced fruits and home baked cookies. (If you're in a hurry, remember that those fruits, vegetables, and salads are available at most super markets, cleaned and ready to serve and many in-store bakeries have yummy cookies to eliminate the heat of your kitchen oven.)

APPLE-ICIOUS LAMB KABOBS

1 1/2 lbs. fresh American lamb, leg or shoulder, cut into 1 1/2 inch cubes
1 cup apple juice or apple cider
2 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
1/2 teaspoon lemon pepper
2 cloves garlic, sliced
1 large apple, cut in 12 wedges
Assorted vegetables: 1 large green or red pepper, 1 large onion, 1 small summer squash, cut in wedges

Mix apple juice, Worcestershire sauce, ginger, and garlic. Add lamb cubes and coat the cubes well. Place lamb cubes, apple juice, Worcestershire sauce, ginger and garlic in plastic bag or non-metal container in refrigerator for at least 2 hours and up to 24 hours.

Remove meat from marinade and thread on skewers, alternating meat, apples, and veget-

ables. (Serves 6).

Apple Barbecue Sauce

1/2 cup apple juice or apple cider
1/2 cup finely chopped onion
1 cup chili sauce
1/2 cup applesauce, unsweetened
2 tablespoons packed brown sugar
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon dry mustard
5 drops hot pepper sauce

In 1-quart saucepan combine apple juice and onion and simmer for 2 minutes. Stir in chili sauce, applesauce, brown sugar, Worcestershire sauce, dry mustard and hot pepper sauce. Simmer for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat.

To Grill: Use moderate heat. Grill lamb kabobs 4 inches from coals. Cook approximately 10-12 minutes for medium-rare. Turn occasionally and brush with barbecue sauce while grilling.

To Broil: Place lamb kabobs on broiler pan which has been lightly oiled or sprayed with non-stick coating. Broil lamb 4 inches from source of heat. Brush with barbecue sauce and turn kabobs occasionally while broiling. Continue to brush with barbecue sauce. Cook approximately 10-12 minutes for medium-rare.

Preparation time is 20 minutes and cooking time is 15 minutes. Kabobs: Calories: 241; Fat: 7.2g; Cholesterol: 76mg; Sodium: 407mg. Sauce: Calories: 47; Fat: .1g; Cholesterol: 0mg; Sodium: 320mg.

Carrots rise above common

Boil carrots in water to cover for about five minutes, until tender but still crisp. Drain and rinse thoroughly with cold water. Drain. Mix together with vinegar, oil, sugar, onion, dressing mix. Pour over carrots and toss. Cover and let marinate overnight in refrigerator. Sprinkle with parsley before serving.

One of the dishes that gave the carrot a bad name is the dreadful shredded salad, often made with raisins and even marshmallows. Here is quite a different idea adapted from "The Essential Root Vegetable Cookbook" by Sally and Martha Stone (Potter).

Yields six to eight servings.

MOROCCAN CARROT SALAD

1 pound carrots (about 5 or 6) peeled
1/4 cup oil
3 tablespoon lemon juice
1 tablespoon minced garlic
1/4 teaspoon ground cumin (or more, to taste)
1 tablespoon fresh mint leaves (or 1/2 teaspoon dried)
Salt and pepper, to taste
1/2 teaspoon red pepper
1 2-inch strip of orange zest, cut into finest possible shreds
Mint leaves for garnish

Using shredder attachment of a food processor, or by hand, cut carrots into shreds. Combine remaining ingredients, pour mixture over carrots. Chill salad. Serve garnished with a few mint leaves.

Yields four to six servings

Carrot cake has achieved immense popularity here in the last three decades or so, and recipes for it abound. For a change, here is a probable ancestor, still encountered in Vienna. In this recipe, too, you really don't taste carrots. They are there to contribute color and moisture.

KAROTTENTORTE

4 eggs, separated
3/4 cup sugar
1 1/2 cups ground walnuts or filberts
1 cup grated carrots (about 2 medium carrots)
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/4 cup twice-sifted cornstarch (sift, then measure)
Chocolate Frosting of your choice

Preheat oven to 300 degrees F. Heavily butter and lightly flour an 8-inch springform pan.

Beat egg yolks and half the sugar until very fluffy and pale. Beat in nuts, carrots and vanilla. Separately beat egg whites until soft peaks form. Gradually beat in remaining sugar until firm peaks form. Fold into batter, lightly but thoroughly. Fold into cornstarch, lightly but thoroughly.

Turn batter into prepared pan. Bake 1 1/2 hours or until cake tests done. Let rest in pan for 10 minutes. Then run a thin knife around edge and release rim. Turn cake onto rack. Let cake rest overnight before frosting.

Yields 1 8-inch cake.

Note: This type of flourless cake can be quite fragile. The cake may sink, leaving a raised rim, which is simply sliced off before frosting.

Schokolade-Karotten-Torte: Follow recipe for Karottentorte with the following changes: Use 5 eggs and 3/4 cups sugar. Before adding nuts and carrots to egg yolk mixture, beat in 4 ounces (4 squares) semisweet chocolate, melted and cooled. A mocha frosting would be a good choice with this cake.

Turkey isn't just for Thanksgiving

For the third year in a row now, the National Turkey Federation has declared June to be "National Turkey Lovers' Month."

Noting that turkey has always been popular at Thanksgiving and throughout the holiday season, the federation's "Turkey Month" celebration calls attention to the wide demand for a variety of turkey products all year round.

Why is turkey becoming so popular? Besides the great flavor, turkey is high in protein while low in saturated fat and calories.

Compare 3 ounces of cooked skinless turkey breast (119 calories and 1 gram of fat) to the same amount of broiled sirloin steak (24 calories and 6.4 grams of fat). The turkey has 55 milligrams of cholesterol, while the beef has 77.

Again, if you compare turkey pastrami to beef pastrami, the turkey-based version has less than half the calories and only about one-quarter the fat. If you're watching cholesterol and calories (and who isn't?) turkey is certainly the wiser choice.

Aside from turkey pastrami, there are a number of other turkey-based deli treats: sliced turkey breast (regular, smoked, barbecued), turkey bologna, turkey ham. All are ready to be made into tasty, low-fat sandwiches or to slice into casseroles, egg dishes — let your imagination go.

Versatile turkey breast can be the base for a variety of dishes: buy bone-in or boneless breast, turkey breast cutlets or tenderloins.

Cooked turkey, of course, may be substituted in recipes calling for cooked, cubed chicken. Cook turkey breast (see recipe below), then slice and serve with gravy, or dice and use as you would cooked chicken.

Allow about 1/4 pound boneless turkey meat per person. If using bone-in meat, allow about 3/4 pound per person.

Other parts — drumsticks, thighs, wings — are also sold separately and can be great on the summer barbecue. Ground turkey is widely available, as are turkey sausage and turkey franks. (Check the label on ground turkey to see if it contains the skin. If it does, fat content will be about the same as ground beef.)

The Turkey Federation stresses that turkey is especially well-suited to microwaving, remaining moist and retaining its natural flavor and nutrients. Reheated cooked turkey also retains its original moistness and flavor — tastes like it was just cooked fresh.

MICRO-TIP OF THE WEEK

To microwave turkey giblets, combine 3 cups of water, neck, heart and gizzard in a 2-quart microwave-safe casserole. Cover and microwave at medium (50 percent power) setting 35 minutes. Add liver, cover, and microwave 10 minutes longer. Let stand, covered, five minutes. Chop and use in gravy, stuffing, soup, etc.

MICROWAVE MONDAY TURKEY CUTLETS

1/2 cup maple syrup
1 tablespoon margarine
1 pound turkey cutlets or slices
2 slices (about 1/4-inch thick) turkey ham, cut in half
1 ounce Monterey Jack cheese, cut into 1/2 x 1/2-inch sticks.
1 teaspoon Creole seasoning
1/4 cup pecans, finely chopped
4 tablespoons sour cream or plain yogurt

Yields 4 servings.
Preparation time: 15 minutes.
Cooking time: 4 1/2 to 6 minutes (plus 2 minutes standing time).

Oven setting: High (100 percent power).
Combine maple syrup and margarine in 8-inch microwave-safe baking dish. Microwave about 30 seconds, or until margarine is melted; set aside. On each turkey cutlet place a ham slice. Arrange a cheese stick at one end of ham-topped cutlet. Roll cutlets up, jelly-roll style, to encase cheese.

Place rolls, seam-side down, in baking dish with syrup mixture. Sprinkle each roll lightly with 1/4 teaspoon Creole seasoning. Cover dish with waxed paper and microwave 1 1/2 to 2 minutes. Rotate dish 1/2 turn and baste rolls with sauce. Sprinkle pecans over top; recover. Microwave 2 1/2 to 3 1/2 minutes longer, or until turkey is cooked through.

Allow rolls to stand, covered, 2 minutes before serving. Top each roll with 1 tablespoon sour cream or yogurt.

DILLED TURKEY MEATBALLS

1 pound ground turkey
1 egg
1/4 cup finely chopped onion
1/2 cup fine dry bread crumbs
1 teaspoon dried dill weed

1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 (10 1/2-ounce) can cream of mushroom soup
1/2 cup milk

Yields 4 servings.
Preparation time: 10 to 15 minutes.
Cooking time: 9 to 15 minutes.
Oven setting: High (100 percent power).

In medium mixing bowl combine first 7 ingredients. Blend well with hands, then shape into 20 small meatballs. Arrange in 10-inch microwave-safe baking dish. Cover loosely with waxed paper and microwave 7 to 11 minutes, rearranging meatballs halfway through cooking time. Spoon off fat.

Combine cream of mushroom soup and milk. Pour evenly over meatballs; sprinkle lightly with more pepper and dried dill, if desired. Cover and microwave 2 to 4 minutes longer, to heat sauce. Serve immediately with fluffy rice.

BASIC MICROWAVED TURKEY BREAST

1 (2 1/2- to 4-pound) turkey breast, defrosted, if frozen
2 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted
Poultry seasoning, paprika and coarsely ground black pepper
Microwave-safe plastic cooking bag

Yields 6 to 8 servings.
Preparation time: 5 minutes.

Cooking time: 5 minutes, and 14 to 16 minutes per pound (plus 10 minutes standing time).

Oven setting: High (100 percent power); Medium (50 percent power).

Defrost turkey breast, if necessary, according to package instructions. Rinse and pat dry.

Brush melted butter or margarine over both sides of turkey breast, then sprinkle generously with poultry seasoning, paprika and pepper. Place in microwave-safe plastic cooking bag. Tie bag closed with a strip of plastic, leaving small opening to vent. Place in microwave-safe roasting rack, skin-side down.

Microwave 5 minutes at high setting. Reduce setting to medium and microwave 14 to 16 minutes per pound, draining off fat and turning breast over halfway through cooking time. (When done, microwave-safe thermometer probe should register 175 F.)

Let stand, covered, 10 minutes before serving.

Flavored vinegar spices up meals

Flavored vinegars are making a comeback. Why? Because they zip up salads, sauces, marinades, soups and stews and add pizzazz to your favorite dishes without adding fat.

Look for your favorite flavored vinegar in your supermarket, or be a money-wise gourmet and make your own. Package your homemade vinegar attractively and you've got a handy gift-giving idea.

Distilled, cider and wine vinegar are the three most common vinegars.

● Distilled or white vinegar is a colorless vinegar made from grains. The distilling process removes any flavor and leaves only an acidic taste.

● Cider vinegar, made from apples, is a golden-brown vinegar with a slightly fruity flavor.

● For wine vinegars, the color and flavor of the vinegar depend on the type of wine used. White wine produces a lighter-tasting vinegar than does red wine.

To make flavored vinegars, start with a base of cider, distilled or wine vinegar. Your choice of a base depends on how you plan to flavor your vinegar. Wine vinegars are a good match for herbs and spices. Cider vinegar can also complement spices. Fruits and edible flowers go well with distilled vinegar.

Flavored vinegars can be prepared in two ways: For the quickest method, heat the vinegar in a stainless steel or enamel pan until hot, but not boiling. (Do not use aluminum as it could react with the vinegar.) Pour the hot vinegar

over the herb, seed, fruit or spice and cover with cheesecloth. Let it stand in a warm, dark place for one to two weeks to mellow the flavor. Then filter the vinegar through several layers of cheesecloth and pour it into bottles.

For the second method, pour the vinegar directly over the flavoring ingredients and let the mixture stand for a month before filtering.

When sampling vinegar, trust your taste buds. If the flavor of the herb or fruit is too strong, add some plain vinegar. If the flavor is too weak, add more seasoning. Once you have tried a variety of vinegars, try combining flavors. Mix two or three ingredients, such as raspberry and mint, lemon and garlic, or peaches and cloves.

RASPBERRY WINE VINEGAR

2 cups fresh raspberries or two 10-ounce packages frozen raspberries, thawed and drained
4 cups cider vinegar
2 cups dry red wine

Rinse fresh raspberries with cold water and drain well. In a large bowl combine raspberries, cider vinegar and wine. Cover and let stand overnight. In a stainless steel or enamel saucepan, heat vinegar mixture to boiling; reduce heat. Boil, uncovered, for 3 minutes. Cool.

Strain mixture, discarding solids. Pour into bottles; cover tightly. Let vinegar age for 2 to 4 weeks before using. Store in a cool, dark place. Makes 6 cups.

Gauer wines benefit from mountain soil

Basic to the production of all Gauer chardonnays is a blend of four markedly different vineyard sites (ranging from 500 to 1,800 feet elevation) each contributing unique stylistic components. Three of the four vineyards are barrel fermented in 30 percent new French oak from the Vosges mountains. The wine remains on the lees

from seven to eight months to add creaminess and texture and alleviate any coarseness from the new oak. Malolactic fermentation levels are about 80 percent.

Gauer Estate cabernet sauvignon is a Bordeaux-style wine, a blend of cabernet, cabernet franc and merlot chosen from three different vineyard sites, one at an elevation of 2,400 feet.

There's a lot to learn from "Age-Old Friends"

**Cronyn, Gardenia soar in award-winning portrayals;
dialogue, not plot, is writer Larbey's chief skill**

Comedian Richard Pryor used to perform a routine about an old man in his neighborhood. The bit was hilarious, detailing the elderly gent's wandering mind and repetitious conversation, but it didn't stop there. The piece concluded with a warm remembrance of the old man's plain-spoken sagacity, a lifetime's worth of acquired wisdom. Pryor's colorful verbiage makes a direct quote impossible, but a flavorful paraphrase might read, "You don't get to be old by bein' stupid."

It's a thorny question to decide if the media is responsible for society's obsession with youth or vice versa, but the facts remain: Older people just do not appear very often in movies or television, except to be used as sources of humor or irritation. The sympathetic elderly character is rare, while the strong, independent older person with heart and mind intact is seen even less often.

This is why "Age-Old Friends," airing Friday on CBS, is so refreshing. With crisp performances from Hume Cronyn and Vincent Gardenia and stylish direction from Allan Kroeker, the film offers two seventysomething gentlemen who aren't crazy, aren't dying and aren't giving up.

The movie was originally made

for HBO and won wide acclaim in its 1989 debut. Cronyn was honored with an Emmy and an ACE award for his performance and Gardenia received the Emmy for Best Supporting Actor in a Movie or Miniseries. Bob Larbey fashioned the script from his play "A Month of Sundays."

Cronyn plays widower John Cooper, a man whose mercurial changes from acid-tongued curmudgeon to sweetly melancholy charmer are as sudden as summer lightning. Cooper can also turn into a glib roue in the presence of his pretty nurse Wilson, played by Michele Scarabelli. Though his mind is sharp as a tack, Cooper's physical condition is deteriorating and it infuriates him. Still, he cherishes his relative independence and has previously, we learn, turned down his daughter's requests to live with her.

Cooper's constant foil and friend (though relatively newfound; they hadn't known each other before coming to the home) is Michael Aylott, played by Vincent Gardenia. Aylott's physical health is sound, but his memory seems to be receding and the old man's game efforts to dismiss the problem dissolves into icy fear after he gets lost on the way to a nearby candy shop.

Infirmities aside, both men's spir-

its are strong and their friendship a sustaining presence. Whether playing chess, discussing least-liked residents (a priggish retired colonel tops the list) or remembering their departed wives, the affection between the two men is palpable. They also enjoy a drink every now and then.

"What would you say to a little nip?" Cooper asks coyly.

"Hello, little nip," comes Aylott's game reply.

Cronyn and Gardenia are equally terrific in their roles. Cronyn makes of a John Cooper a character of real strength, hampered but not defeated by his advanced years. Gardenia's character is more outwardly vulnerable, but his performance never surrenders Aylott's dignity.

Esther Rolle heads a strong supporting cast as Mrs. Baker, the irascible housekeeper who wearily agrees to sing for, and even dance with Cooper. Tandy Cronyn (his daughter in real life) plays Cronyn's only child, and her performance is fair and engaging.

Larbey's script is full of sharp dialogue that perfectly suits his actors' crisp portrayals. This is fortunate, since the actual events in the film are fairly easy to predict. Still, with fine acting and fast-paced direction, these "Age-Old Friends" have a lot to offer.

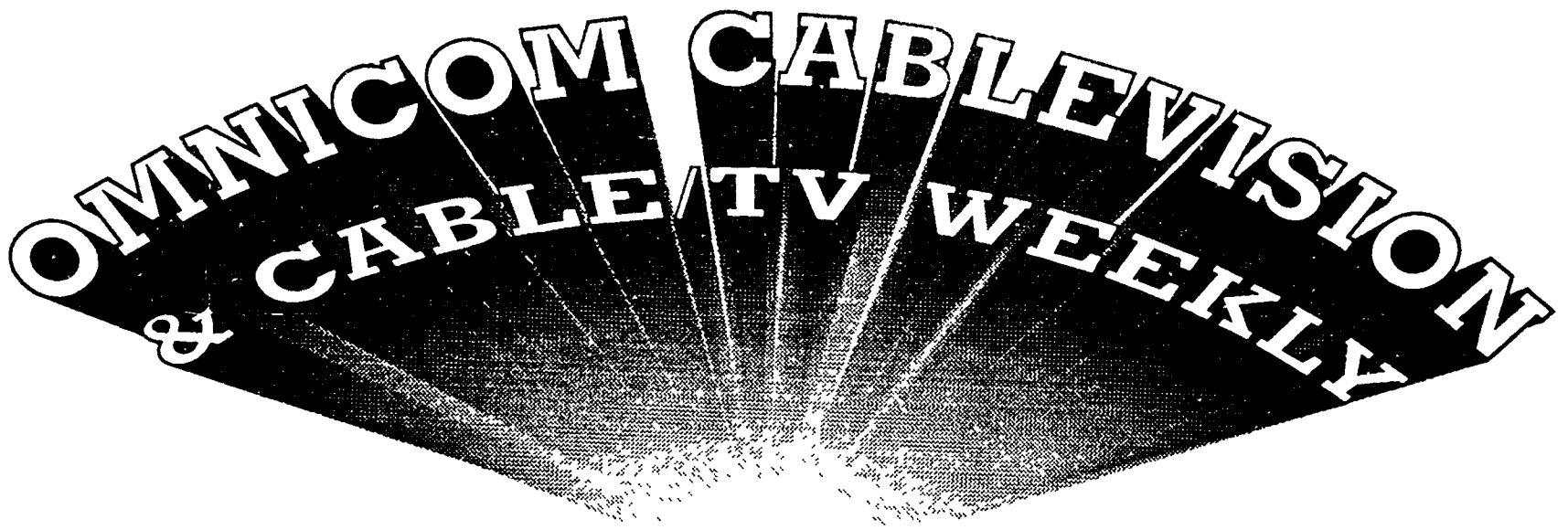

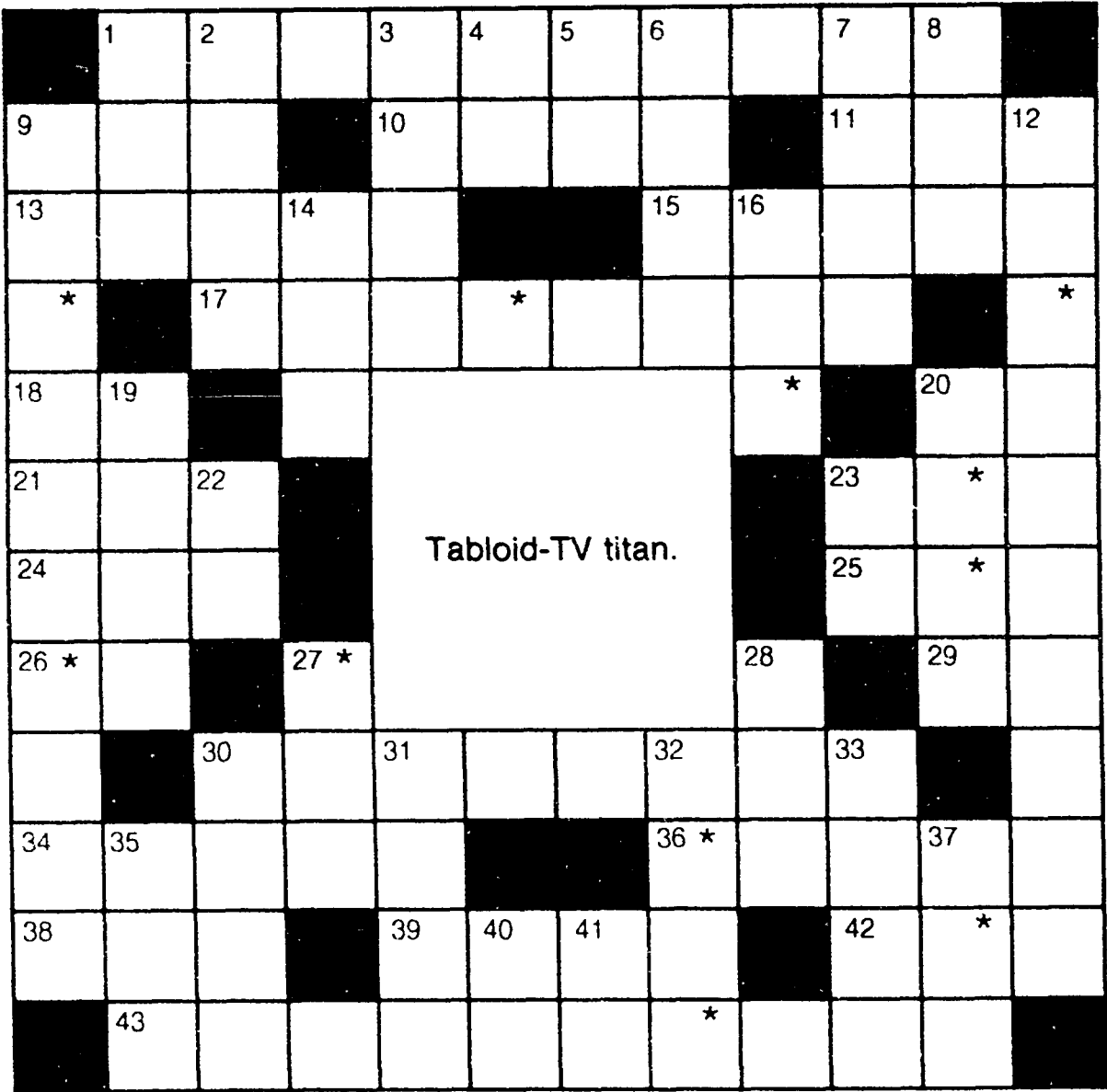

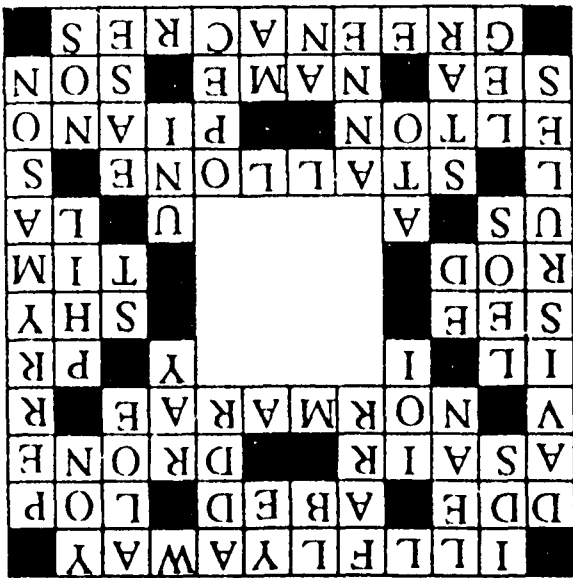

Alice Faye and Jack Haley were the stars, and Buddy Clark's voice was dubbed in for Jack Haley. I was involved with making the picture and can't find a tape, if there is one. —P.H. Chinery, Sun City, Ariz.

A: I'm sorry to say *Wake Up and Live* is not available on video at this time. I have checked upcoming TV schedules for a number of stations that air old musicals and noteworthy older productions, such as American Movie Classics (AMC) and TNT, but the movie was not scheduled anywhere. You might keep an eye on these stations, and perhaps you'll get lucky in the near future.

Q: I just saw *Straight Talk* and loved it! Dolly Parton was wonderful! What other movies has she starred in, and where can I write her? —S. Marie, Santa Barbara, Calif.

Shirley MacLaine, Olympia Dukakis and Sally Field. Parton also starred last year with Gary Busey and Willie Nelson in *Wild Texas Wind*, a telefilm about a singer (Parton) accused of murdering her abusive lover.

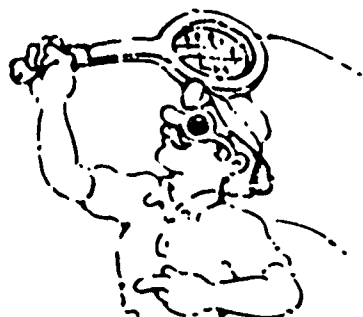

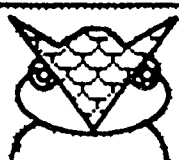

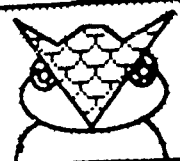
