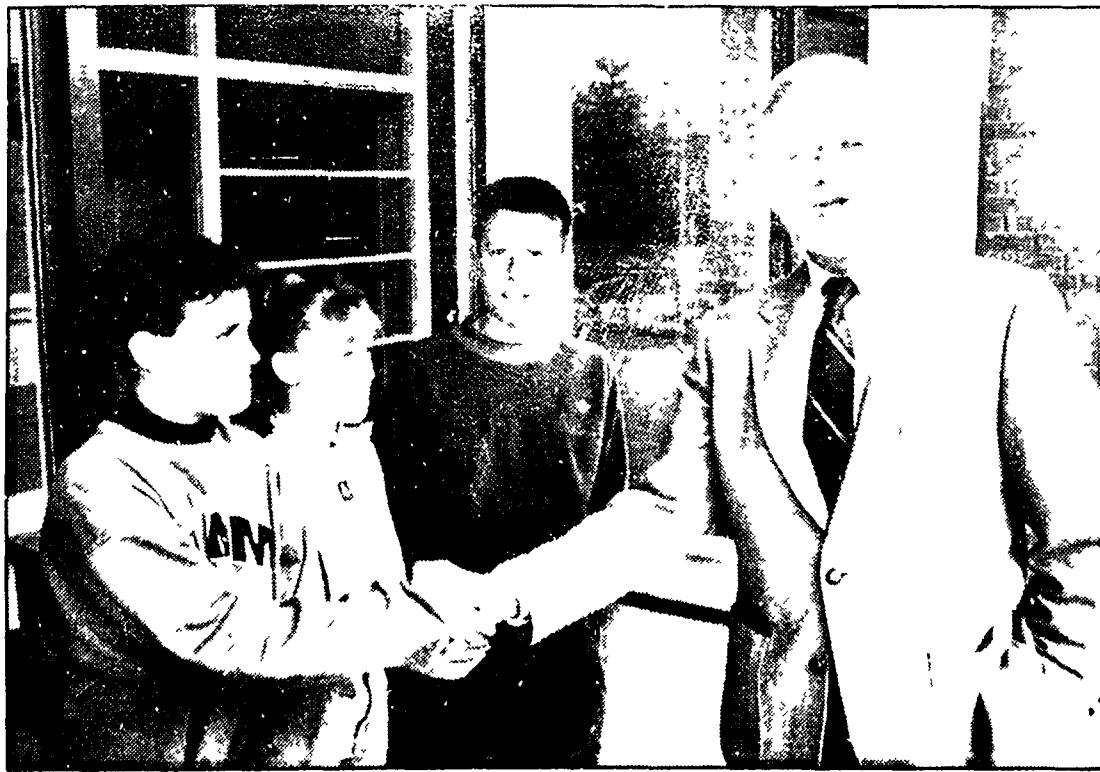
With the deadline nearing, Jacobi feels eager to start a new chapter and live out his days in blissful retirement with his wife in Traverse City.

Dust issue clouds air in township

Make no mistake, airborne dust from gravel roads is the hot topic in Northville Township these days.

Residents are as stirred up as the dust that clouds much of the township's 13 miles of gravel roads. They want relief from what they consider a health and safety issue and are looking to township hall for answers.

Township officials say they are willing to help, but haven't wavered from their decision not to spend township money on dust control measures.

Emotions boiled over Wednesday and Thursday nights as residents and officials sparred over the township's duties and obligations to

taxpayers.

Harsh words eventually ebbed, though, and some residents and officials agreed to further talks and push Wayne County for remedies.

Residents want the township to continue twice-yearly spray treatments of calcium chloride on gravel roads. The township maintains that the treatments are too costly, and axed the program from its 1992 budget, saving up to \$27,000.

Township officials put together an eight-option proposal that offers residents the chance to pay for dust control through special assessment districts. None of the options in the township's plan include spending township dollars on a solution.

Budget forecast shows concerns

Northville Township, meet your financial future.

Then prepare for some tough decisions.

The township board is scheduled to meet Thursday evening to review a document which forecasts the township budget for a five-year period.

The budget forecast combines the township police, fire, and general fund budgets and projects those costs in relation to local tax base, cost-of-living, and employee salary increases, said Treasurer Jack Hosmer, who developed the document with Deputy Treasurer Bill Butter-

field and Finance Director Dwayne Harrigan.

Hosmer said the budget forecast is a tool based on a "whole bunch of assumptions" but carries a definite middle-of-the-road flavor.

Budget forecasters took a close look at projected residential growth, Hosmer said. Discussions with Michael Kruszewski, the township's chief building official, indicated that the township can expect to add about 150 homes per year — with an average \$192,000 price tag — to the tax rolls over the next five years.

While adding to the community's state equalized valuation, the antici-

Ambler to fill out Williams' tenure

The township board on Thursday tabbed a longtime Northville resident as replacement for departed Trustee Donald Williams.

Richard Ambler, who once served a term on the city council and a partial term on the school board, will sit on the township board until November, when Williams' stay in office was scheduled to end.

Williams, a trustee since 1984, recently resigned. Ambler's appointment rounds out the board at seven members.

Township officials decided not to hold interviews for the position. Supervisor Betty Lennox said Ambler was asked to join the board because he has a history of community involvement.

Ambler, contacted Friday, was unaware he had been appointed to the board, but said he was anxious to get to work.

"This is definitely a surprise, and I wasn't campaigning for it," he said.

"I've always enjoyed any kind of community service and I'm looking forward to this."

Ambler, who is retired but runs a consulting business here, served on the city council from 1960-64. He later filled an unexpired term on the school board and negotiated a police contract for the township.

Community recreation and library programs interest Ambler, and he noted a couple of front-burner topics that will soon need his attention.

"From what I understand, the budget is a serious consideration," he said. "And of course this dust problem (on gravel roads) is something I'd like to look at."

State law requires the township to either appoint a new board member within 45 days of a position vacancy or lose that right. Lennox said Ambler can serve the next few months on the board without worrying about running for office.

The board could have appointed one of the seven candidates seeking election as a trustee, but did not want to show favoritism, Lennox said.

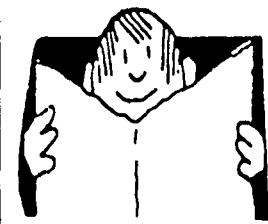

Dust issue clouds the air in township

Maxwell resident Patricia Wong on Thursday asked the township board to pay for 1992 spray treatments while residents and officials hammer out an agreement.

"We feel we've been given an unfair ultimatum," Wong said. "[Choose a township option] or choke on dust. It's more than discomfort; it's a health issue," she added.

Township Supervisor Betty Lennox responded to Wong's plea for relief, saying, "We can certainly take that under advisement. We certainly understand your plight."

Township officials would like to redirect residents' anger to Wayne

County. The township feels the county is unwilling or unable to return tax monies for secondary road upkeep.

The board suggested residents and the township schedule a meeting with key Wayne County officials, including County Commissioner Maurice Breen.

"Now's a good time to talk to the county commissioner," said Trustee Richard Allen. "Guess who's running for election."

Much of the residents' anger has been directed at Township Manager Richard Henningsen, who has spoken out against using township funds for road treatments. Henningsen has coordinated the township's

special assessment district proposals and met the wrath of a resident who said Henningsen had not surveyed or talked with residents on his street.

Henningsen defended himself Thursday, and by meeting's end had asked the board for support or direction.

Township officials and residents may be on the road to a meeting with Wayne County, but the outcome of the dust problems remains a mystery.

"I think this is a real political issue," said Trustee James Nowka. "I don't know how you deal with these things."

Meads students help animal group

Middle school students at Meads Mill dug deep into their pockets last week to come up with \$177.89 for the Michigan Humane Society.

Andrea Moretti, an eighth-grade student who coordinated the collection drive, said it heightened an awareness among her peers about animal abuse and neglect.

"A lot of people felt really bad," Moretti said. "They didn't think people would do that to animals."

Publicity for the drive started Monday, June 1 before the actual collection canisters appeared in classrooms and around the school. Assistant Principal Susan Meyer said she was trying to use

subliminal advertising prior to the drive so kids would have a chance to think about why they were donating.

"We wanted to make them think about it first," Meyer said. "We were making kids conscious about the problem."

In an effort to avoid knee-jerk donations, students were asked to donate in the morning, before the school's lunch hour. Meyer said by soliciting donations before lunch, students were forced to think about their decisions to donate first rather than just dumping spare change from lunch bills in collection canisters.

As a preface to their request for money, student council members posted 1,395 pictures of malnourished dogs and abused cats around the school. Reaction from the students to the pictures

was shock, disgust and sadness, the student and the principal said.

"Kids were shocked at the facts and the pictures," Meyer said. "It was a learning process."

Student council, which organized the drive, also passed on to students interesting facts and statistics about the severity and frequency of animal abuse and neglect. In addition, Andrea said posters detailed the work the Michigan Humane Society does to preserve the rights of animals.

Andrea, who has a pet dog at home, said the pictures turned her stomach.

"They were very hard to look at," she said. "They just love people so much that they just don't deserve that kind of treatment."

A check in the full amount was mailed to the Humane Society last week.

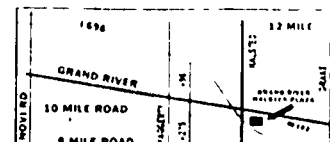

Woman reports threat by her husband in city

A 28-year-old Randolph Street resident reportedly threatened his wife June 9 with a knife.

The incident grew out of an argument that evening over the man's work schedule. The wife told city police. She said the two began yelling at each other, she slapped his arm, and he grabbed a large fillet knife and pointed it at her stomach, brushing her shirt and saying, "How would you like it if I filleted you like a fish."

When she tried to phone police, she said, he grabbed the receiver and yanked the cord out.

The woman left and when she returned a short while later, he was gone. She called police, who found the man jogging and questioned him. He admitted threatening his wife with a knife but denied putting the point of the blade against her shirt. He agreed to leave the house for a day, and she decided not to seek felonious assault charges against him.

DRIVER LEAVES WITHOUT PAYING FOR GAS: A 22-year-old Lathrup Village man was questioned

by city police about his alleged theft of \$10 worth of gas at noon June 10 from Clark Oil, 510 S. Main St.

The man and a friend had reportedly pulled away from the pump without paying, and without removing the gas pump nozzle from the car. The nozzle's splash guard and spring were damaged in the incident.

An attendant managed to get the car's license plate number. When city police contacted the man, he admitted driving off with the nozzle still in the car but denied pumping any gas. He agreed to pay restitution.

MAN ARRESTED FOR TRESPASSING: City police arrested a 27-year-old Northville man on an outstanding warrant for unlawful entry and trespassing June 10. The man was arrested at the corner of Main and Center by a city police officer who knew of the warrant. He was wanted for allegedly entering a building on Church Street Feb. 16 without the owner's permission.

After the arrest, police found the man was wanted in Livonia as well,

for driving on a suspended license and with expired license plates. He was released after posting a \$500 personal bond.

BICYCLIST HITS CAR: An 18-year-old Northville man bicycling north on South Main Street June 12 ran into a car. The man was reportedly watching eastbound traffic as he crossed Seven Mile Road at 4:40 p.m. and ran into the side of a westbound car. He was visibly injured in the mishap, and taken to St. Mary Hospital by Community Emergency Medical Service.

He was cited for operating a vehicle at an unsafe speed.

FENDER BENDER: A 17-year-old Pinckney male was cited for disobeying a flashing red signal after driving into another car at Eight Mile and Center June 6.

Why do fire fighters have to chop holes in roofs?

Why do they chop holes in the roofs?

The Chief pulls up on the scene behind the first engine. As he gets out of his car the first arriving fire fighters are pulling hose lines and hooking up to the hydrant, so the Chief walks around the house to size up the fire. He notices the heaviest smoke is pushing out from under the eaves and around the window frames of the single story family room which juts out from the side of the house. He correctly surmises that this is the location of the fire, which is fortunate since it reduces the chance that the fire will work its way up to the second floor of the main house. The plan of attack will be simple: Make entry through the front of the house, cut the fire off at the family room and contain it there until extinguished.

The Chief reaches the front of the house as the first

team is masking up and preparing to make entry. He tells them what he has seen, and gives them their instructions. As the fire fighters crawl through the front door, the Chief returns to the family room to direct the ventilation effort.

At any fire inside a confined space, such as your house, the smoke, toxic gasses and heat that are produced by this fire rapidly build up inside and become trapped. In addition to presenting a hazard to anyone inside the structure, these "products of combustion" reduce visibility for fire fighters trying to reach the fire or anyone still trapped inside. As the smoke and heat inside spread, damage from the smoke and heat alone can cause damage to areas never touched by the fire itself.

An important part of fighting any fire is ventilation, the process of releasing the smoke, heat and gasses from the structure. Properly done, ventilation speeds the fire attack or search process and helps to limit damage to the structure.

Ventilation can be accomplished several ways. Because smoke, heat and fire travel up, "vertical" ventilation can be useful when the fire is burning near the top of a structure. This involves cutting holes in the roof with an ax or a power saw, then punching through the ceiling below. If done in the area directly above the fire, vertical ventilation allows the heat and smoke to rise up through the hole and out of the structure.

Ventilation can also be accomplished "horizontally," through windows or other openings in the sides of a structure, and may be assisted with mechanical devices such as fans or blowers which increase air flow.

By its nature, ventilation usually causes some damage to the structure. The key is to find the right balance between damage caused by ventilation, and decreasing damage caused by the fire.

With a team already inside the house and advancing toward the fire, the Chief decides on horizontal ventilation and directs a fire fighter to take out two windows at

the far end of the family room. The fire fighter takes a pike pole, lowers his protective eye shield and, standing to one side, breaks the glass with a six foot, metal-tipped pole. Thick smoke immediately begins pouring from each window, just as the fire fighters inside have worked their way to the family room.

As the smoke rushes out of the room and visibility inside improves, the fire fighters spot the flames in the area where the sofa used to be and open up with a hose. As the fire is extinguished, a positive pressure ventilation fan is set up in the front doorway, and the onrush of air helps to quickly clear the house of smoke and heat. The windows would have to be replaced, the Chief told the homeowner, but the ventilation had worked, allowing the fire to be put out quickly, and saving substantial heat, smoke and water damage. Replacing the windows would be cheap.

Budget forecast shows possible worries ahead

pated growth level may not keep the township from experiencing severe financial troubles, Hosmer said.

"Some decisions need to be made very quickly," he said. "The township's heading for some red ink, and pretty good size unless some action's taken."

"We have to bite the bullet, but we can't keep stripping and stripping services," he added.

Hosmer said the township must seek new revenues to keep afloat. That task can be managed without hiking the millage rate, a touchy subject at any time, and especially in an election year.

"The board has to step up to the new revenues that are available," Hosmer said. "There are some but-

tons officials can push."

One of those buttons is a one-percent administrative fee on tax bills, he said. The township long used such a fee but scrapped it a few years ago. A move to reinstitute the fee collapsed last year during the budget adoption process.

The township may qualify for a mid-decade census, which could provide increased state aid, and another revenue-producer could come from a tool commonly used by public school districts.

The township should use the Truth-in-Taxation process to head off the rate of inflation, which actually strips the township of its millage rate, Hosmer said.

The board review of the budget forecast is set for 8 p.m. June 18 at township hall.

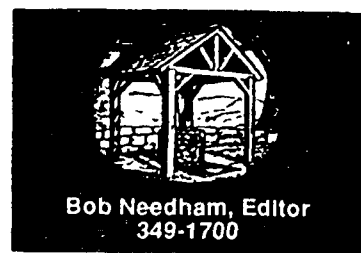

With election over, let's start a new era

Now that the second straight contentious Northville School District election is safely behind us, we'd like to reflect a little on the past couple of months. A lot of people won't like this, and a lot of people won't agree. But we think it needs to be said.

This became something of an ugly period in the history of this community. The people who opposed a school millage increase and those who supported one made up two clear-cut "sides," creating a division — short-lived though it may be — the likes of which we haven't really seen lately.

We think a simple explanation goes a long way toward understanding this situation: Neither side has an ounce of trust in the people on the other side.

Many people, in particular those affiliated with Citizens for a Better Northville, believe everyone in the district administration is out to do nothing but pull the wool over the public's eyes, calculating ways to hide massive salary increases for themselves and duping many parents about the truth. School officials and some members of Citizens for Quality Education think the anti-millage forces set out to purposely deceive the community for their own selfish gain. To certain people on each side, a mention of the other side brings only scornful sneers.

Some people on both ends have, at times, been more than a little ridiculous. And more than a little wrong.

As one (if not the only) entity which maintained regular contact with both millage camps, we feel justified in saying this: You're both off base.

School folks: CBN members are not insane. They are not out to destroy the community; they live here too, remember? They bring up issues some of you would rather not discuss. Raising a stink over salaries and raises, for example, does not make them bad people. You think they're wrong — okay, that's your right. But it's absolutely legitimate to raise the issues, especially in these times. They've made mistakes — you bet. We all have, right?

CBN members and sympathizers: The school establishment is not evil. Their interests do extend beyond — far beyond — their own self-interest, to the students and parents they are hired to serve. They've screwed up too, and have been slow to understand some pretty simple facts of life. But by and large, they try to do the best job they can.

There's been some discussion of the role the *Record* played in this whole situation; several people on both sides were convinced we were secretly in cahoots with the other. Fiddlesicks.

No, we're not perfect — far from it —

but we do our best. And yes, we served as a channel for much of the name-calling and negativity. But our job is to reflect what's happening in the community, ugly though it may be. We're not here to ignore things; we're here to give issues as full an airing as possible, and we hope that through that process the will of the majority develops and ultimately prevails. We think we've done that; if you disagree, so be it. But be aware that we've got no hidden agenda, other than the simple goal of helping to make and keep Northville as good as it can be.

Where do the last couple of months leave the community? On the whole, pretty much the same place we were before. The schools come September will be very different places, but this will still be Northville.

A lot of bad feelings remain, though, and the trick now is to work through them and try to guard against a division like this cropping up again. That's going to require some work.

We need to improve communication among the various facets of the community. People need to talk to each other more often, and to make a greater effort to understand the other person's point of view.

This cuts both ways, but it would be particularly helpful if Citizens for a Better Northville would direct some of their energies into established channels. Offer input, volunteer, get involved in the issues; be proactive rather than reactive. If you don't like the composition or the operation of the Strategic Planning Committee, for example, don't just take pot shots from afar; get involved in it.

It would also help a lot if the school establishment would truly listen when people start to criticize it. Obviously, expressions of discontent and anger can sometimes represent the feelings of major segments of the community — of the majority.

Disagreements can be extremely positive, constructive situations if they are examined in open debate, always respecting the other person's point of view and avoiding a confrontational approach. That's what this society's all about, and we think it's that attitude which will result in a truly better Northville.

We here at the paper have tried for some time to cope with these incompatible boundaries — with little success, I might add. If we run Novi stories in *The Northville Record* to meet the needs of No-villers, we get crucified by Northville residents who want only Northville news in their *Record*.

Conversely, if we leave Novi stuff out of the Northville paper, we inevitably hear from the No-ville folk, peeved over having to buy two papers to keep up.

After much thought, a plan is now in the works that should satisfy all parties, wherever they may live.

But in the meantime, if you see my credibility wandering around, please whistle it home . . . if only I could tell you where to send it.

Sexism rears its ugly head



Right now I'm thinking about sexism.

Maybe it's because I just finished re-reading the column Susie Hollyer wrote earlier this year about Gloria Steinem's visit to Novi. Or maybe it's because it's my strong suspicion that we were subconsciously guilty of it in our photographic coverage of various high school graduations in our papers last week.

What happened is that we were all in the Comp Shop last Wednesday, making last-minute changes to pages before sending them off to the plant to be pressed.

And several of our papers had two-page spreads filled with pictures of graduation ceremonies. It was while I was checking out the graduation pictures in *The South Lyon Herald* that I noticed it.

"Hey, Dawn," I yelled across the room to Herald Editor Dawn Needham. "Did South Lyon have any male graduates? Or were all the graduates pretty girls?"

"I've already noticed that," she snarled, "and I intend to deal with it."

Understand that Dawn is our only female editor at the present time. But she more than holds her own and, in fact, is extremely adept at squelching even remotely sexist comments which creep into the conversation.

At any rate, a quick scan of the pages of graduation pictures in our other papers seemed to confirm the trend Dawn and I had observed in *The Herald* — far more pictures of female graduates than male graduates.

I may be a little quick in jumping to the conclusion that we were guilty of sexism. On the one hand, all of our photogra-

phers are relatively young males. But, on the other hand, the guilty party, if there is one, may be the person who selected which pictures to use.

And it's at least possible that the preponderance of pictures of pretty female graduates may have been totally coincidental.

Whatever, the charge of sexism was leveled against me once by an anonymous young male caller back in the days when I was talking pictures of the band for *The Record*.

I denied the charge vehemently. I told him that I was always quite conscious of getting pictures of males as well as females when on assignment.

"What I usually look for is someone who has an interesting face or is wearing a funny cap," I told him.

"Well, how come you always seem to end up taking pictures of . . . (and then he mentioned the name of one particular female student)?"

The young man had me. Had me cold. He was right — whenever I took band pictures I invariably managed to take a picture of the girl whose name he had mentioned.

Rather than deny it, I confessed. "Guilty as charged," I stammered. "My only defense is that she has got to be one of the prettiest girls I've ever seen in my life."

I suspected my anonymous caller would seve upon my admission as an opportunity to berate me further. But his response caught me by surprise.

Instead of blasting me, he agreed with me. "She really is beautiful," he said. "Did you know she only lives two blocks from me?"

Is there a moral to all this? It may be that sexism is pretty deeply ingrained in our society, and even people who strive to do the right thing often fall short.

At any rate, I think it's safe to say that you'll see some more male graduates in our pictures when commencement exercises roll around next year.

pleased I could accept the award on behalf of all the people who also deserved it."

Renee Boving of the American Association of University Women who nominated Ward for the school's award said she did so, so Ward could serve as a role-model for the women in the class of 1992 and those to follow. Since many of today's female youth are steering away from careers in technical fields that rely on math and sciences, Ward stands as an exception and a testament to the stereotype.

"She's a woman and a scientist," Boving said. Boving, who met Ward through the Detroit Chapter of the Association of Women in Science and through Northville-Novis chapter of the American Association of University Women, said she nominated her because she knew she'd be a positive role model for students.

Since graduating from high school Ward has earned her bachelor's and master's degrees from Wayne State University. She's done research in the biochemistry of mental disease and has published, lectured and participated in numerous science career days in the Detroit Public Schools

system, Eastern Michigan University and Michigan State University.

Ward said she accepted the honor and only wished her father was still alive to see it. Her father John F. Lewis settled the family on a small farm in Salem. A staunch believer in education, Lewis pushed Ward to succeed. He died in 1986 at the age of 96, shortly after tutoring a friend of Ward's through her GED.

"For Gramps this would have been a magnificent thing," she said. "His life was devoted to education, to me and my son. He was fantastic."

A Northville resident will be among those going to New York City in July for the Democratic National Convention.

Party leaders recently completed the Michigan slate of 159 delegates to the national convention, which starts July 13 in New York City.

Arkansas Gov. Bill Clinton (C in tables below) won 73 delegates, based on his 50-percent showing in the March 17 primary; former California Gov. Jerry Brown (B) has 38 for his 26-percent showing; former Sen. Paul Tsongas (T) of Massachusetts has 20 because of his 16 percent tally; and the remaining 38 are unpledged. Sens. Tom Harkin of Iowa and Bob Kerrey of Nebraska and maverick Lyndon LaRouche were on the ballot but didn't qualify for delegates.

Democrats allocated their delegates among the current 18 congressional districts, not on the new 16 which take effect this election. Their selection procedure was largely in place prior to the April 15 federal

court redrawing of Michigan's congressional map.

Sharon Bodansky of Northville will attend the convention as an at-large delegate pledged to Brown. Here are area delegates and the candidates to whom they are pledged:

2ND DISTRICT (including Northville south of Baseline Road): Paul Miller (B) of Dexter, Dana Barton (B) of Ann Arbor, Ann Graham (C) of Jackson, Jon Grossman (C) of Ann Arbor and Pandaora Katsikas (T) of Ann Arbor.

18TH DISTRICT (including Northville north of Baseline Road): Bob Lent (B) of Shelby Township, Mickey Meltzer (C) of Birmingham, Gail Nolin (C) of Sylvan Lake, Don Tucker (T) of Birmingham, and Bertha Bowerman (T) of Birmingham.

Unpledged Party leader delegates include state chair Gary Corbin of Lansing, U.S. Sens. Donald Riegle and Carl Levin, and all incumbent Democratic U.S. representatives including William Ford of Ypsilanti.

Ex-Gov. James Blanchard, now a Beverly Hills resident, is an at-large delegate pledged to Clinton and chairing the Clinton caucus.

Milt Jacobi closes out his long career in Northville

Jacobi has been an educator in Northville for a bit more than a quarter of a century. The last seven of those years he's spent as the big chief at Amerman. Prior to that he was instrumental in opening the doors of Winchester and Moraine elementaries. Before coming to Northville, Jacobi was a teacher and an administrator for nearly 10 years in neighboring districts.

Among his treasured personal belongings he's accumulated over the years is a mental scrapbook preserving some of his biggest accomplishments, toughest defeats, and most cherished memories of a life-long commitment to education.

Highlighting that list of personal triumphs were a principal's post overseeing 1,100 students, opening three new schools, and implementing a host of new, innovative education programs.

"There have been a lot of highlights," he said. "But being a principal of a school with 1,100 students was a big highlight, but it was very demanding."

Implementing a year-round curriculum and a non-graded lesson plan that allowed students to progress at their own pace are career highlights that came to Jacobi's mind.

But all in all his biggest accomplishments were seeing children and teachers he's worked with over the years blossom, grow, and learn.

"I'll miss the kids the most for sure, but at the adult level, I'll miss not being able to help parents and teachers," he said. "I've done a lot of nurturing of both parents, teachers, and students."

Moraine Elementary Principal Mary Najarian is one of those teachers Jacobi took under his wing and kindled a fire inside.



While Jacobi has seen Northville go through some changes, the reverse also holds true.



"As a beginning teacher," Najarian said, "he always kept you organized and aware of what's coming up. He always gave concrete examples that showed you what he meant and how it worked."

"As a rookie teacher he got you prepared," Najarian said, looking back to when she was his assistant principal at Winchester.

"He always made you plan for the what-if. The behind-the-scenes things that made you think of the what-ifs. The safety kind of things."

The interaction with teachers and students is central to Najarian's most vivid memories of working with Jacobi.

"He always made special events fun for kids," she recalled. "If it was going to inspire kids and make them want to do something, he put his all into it."

He's a planner and he's efficient, always one step ahead of the game, she said. Being mentored by Jacobi's soothing administrative style, Najarian said, has better prepared her

for her job as principal. Remaining calm in the face of adversity so as not to alarm those around you was a distinct instinct for Jacobi.

"When a parent had a complaint, he always told me to stay calm and don't get hyped," she said.

A blackout at Winchester Elementary years ago was a perfect example of the calming effect Jacobi instilled in people on the job.

When the power went out because of severe weather, all the staff, students and administrators were instructed to stay inside the gym. Little by little, panic set in as all the kids grew restless and scared inside the darkened gymnasium. Najarian said she too quivered a bit at what might happen. But without delay Jacobi went to the back of the gym, pushed open the door, and allowed the sunlight to seep in and pacify the crowd.

"That's what I mean," she said. He's taught me to remain calm," she said. "He told me if you have to react, you do it in a way or in a place where nobody sees it."

Don't listen to critics who pan aluminum pots

Materials used for cookware play a very important role in success or failure of a product.

More than half of all cookware sold is made of aluminum. Researchers are still investigating any possible connection between aluminum and Alzheimer's disease. Nothing concrete has been discovered and until hard evidence is discovered, do not throw away your aluminum pots and pans. Researchers feel that since aluminum is ubiquitous, it would be difficult to stay away from it anyhow as it's in the air, water and soil and ultimately in plants and animals that we eat. Also, many over-the-counter drugs such as antacids and aspirin contain antacid aluminum.

Aluminum is a superior heat conductor; it heats evenly and quickly. All aluminum manufacturers suggest that storing highly acidic or salty foods such as tomato sauce, rhubarb or sauerkraut in their pots may cause more aluminum to enter the food. Of course, any undissolved salt or acid will cause "pitting" on the pot's surface.

Anodized aluminum has been treated to harden the metal, making it more scratch resistant. Food will barely stick on this hard smooth surface, making it easy to clean. This process makes these pots and pans good choices for cooking rhubarb and sauces with tomato, wine, or lemon juice as they do not leach into acidic foods. If necessary, scrub with coarse salt or mildly abrasive cleanser, rinse immediately. If darkened from oxidation, fill with water and vinegar or lemon juice and boil 15 minutes.

Nonstick coatings were around prior to anodized aluminum. The advantages of these are the quick, easy cleaning, and the ability to cook without additional fat. Disadvantages are that they may be scratched by sharp or rough edged kitchen utensils. Abrasive scouring pads or cleansers should not be used to clean them. It is safe to use scratched non-stick skillet.

Stainless still accounts for about 43 percent of cookware sold today because of its durability. The finish is attractive, it won't corrode or tarnish permanently. It's hard, tough and non-porous. Since stainless does not conduct heat evenly, most is made with copper or aluminum bottoms. It is not recommended to store acidic or salty foods in stainless steel for long periods, not for health reasons but undissolved salt will pit the steel surfaces. Wash in hot soapy water, and scrub with a nylon pad. Clean stubborn stains with a stainless steel cleanser.

Copper is an excellent conductor of heat and especially good for top-of-the-range cooking. Many cooks prefer copper cookware for delicate sauces and foods that must be cooked at controlled temperatures.

Cast iron is the all-time classic in cookware. You'll need to handle cast iron different than other cookware. To prevent rust damage, the inside of cast iron should be coated frequently with unsalted cooking oil. To season, rub inside of pan with vegetable oil, set over medium heat until oil begins to smoke (about 15 minutes). Cool completely and wipe off excess oil with paper towels. Try not to wash cast iron in strong detergents or scour. Wipe immediately after rinsing.

Choose cookware for your kitchen that fits your cooking/baking style and do not worry about pot and pan safety.

TURNING JAPANESE

Business lunch arrives in 'Little Tokyo'

If there's one Japanese import that doesn't give the domestic corporations fits, it's lunch.

Far from the burger and fries or soup and a salad that Americans lean toward, a Japanese lunch is built around rice or noodles. Quite often it includes sushi, the raw fish unique to the land of the rising sun.

While sushi might evoke a few squeamish reactions from we Westerners, its initiates swear by it. Slightly more attractive to the Western palate are the noodle dishes: udon, a thick round noodle, and ramen, the thin strands of egg dough now finding its way into the American mainstream as an instant microwaveable lunch.

In Japan's business community, lunch is an important part of the day. The Japanese tend to take shorter lunches than their American counterparts, though, and give a new meaning to the concept of fast food.

"They get a bowl of noodles and will slurp it down in 20 seconds, tops," says Steve Myers, a Novi businessman who spent 10 years working in Japan. "They inhale them and get back to work. The real trick is to do it so that when the end of the noodle goes in your mouth, it doesn't spray everyone around you."

Further, he says, it's become the norm in Japan to eat lunch in the office. Large corporations will have standing orders with local eateries, which deliver box lunches by moped to various offices.

If, as *Crain's Detroit Business* attests, Novi is becoming Little Tokyo, local luncheon lovers would be smart to latch onto the new concept. Indeed, restaurants in the Japanese tradition are already springing up in the area.

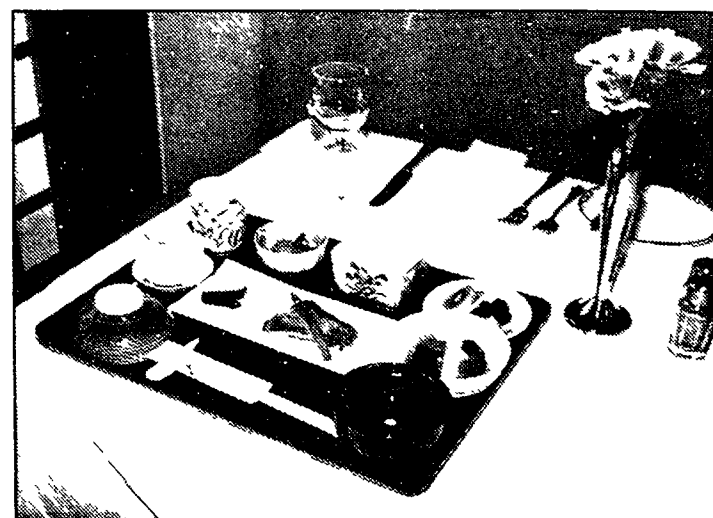
In Novi, both sushi and yakitori (grilled meats) are available at Teriyaki To Go on Novi Road, and the soon to-open Cherry Blossom in the West Oaks shopping plaza. Myers points out, however, that finding both yakitori and sushi under one roof is a rarity in Japan. There are sushi bars and yakitori stands where businesspeople will line up to fork over their yen, explains Cherry Blossom owner Shigeru Yamada.

"In Japan, if you wanted sushi, you would go to a sushi specialist so you can get more items," says Yamada, a Northville resident.

Yamada, former owner of Akasaka restaurant in Livonia, found great success offering both sushi and yakitori at his former location, and drew many customers from the Nissan Technical Center in Farmington Hills. Native Japanese transplanted to work here appreciate lunches that were as speedy as the ones in their native land.

"They can do a lot of relaxation during their hour break," he says. "And they can go out to the driving range in the summer."

Farm rearing keeps fresh salmon in the pink



The question has come up several times as to the origin of the salmon that we use in the restaurant.

I overheard a member of the wait staff answer "Norwegian" and cringed. There is very little salmon that comes from Norway any longer. The price has become prohibitive.

The evolution can be likened to imported cars. They cost a lot of money.

So, where does salmon come from? As I've mentioned in the past we buy most of our fish from Foley's in Boston. So, the other day I called Mike, our contact at Foley's and asked him, "Farm raised Atlantic salmon" was his answer.

This isn't just any salmon; Foley's has "gone to school" to locate the very highest quality, firmest textured, freshest salmon produced anywhere.

Four major factors differentiate one farm raised salmon from another: gene pools, farming practices, harvesting and slaughtering techniques and the packing and travel time of the finished product.

The fish begin their life in a hatchery in a pure fresh water lake. They are reared for about 16 months and then transferred to a

grow-out facility. This site is segregated in a body of water away from other salmon farms to prevent disease.

Norwegian personnel with extensive experience running farms in Norway manage the farm. The smolt spend the next 15 months growing to a size of 8 pounds. They are fed a combination wet and dry feed that utilizes herring for its omega-3 content. This feed yields an extraordinarily rich flavored salmon.

Two weeks prior to harvest the fish are taken off of feed. The "starving" process allows the fish to rid itself of all waste. The result is a firm flesh texture and enhanced shelf life.

When harvested, the fish are pulled from the water in small amounts. This as-

ures that the fish will be free of bruises and that the flesh will remain firm. The fish are stunned in a carbon dioxide holding tank which renders them dazed, but still alive.

The next phase is bleeding. After bleeding, they are floated in an iced seawater solution to maintain a low body temperature. Again this will preserve flesh quality and appearance.

The cold salmon are then transported to a state of the art processing facility where they are gutted, washed, chilled, weighed, inspected, graded and packed on an all stainless-steel processing line designed, guess where? Norway.

The ride to the Foley's plant is a mere six hours away. Minimal further processing is

done. All the salmon are individually inspected and packaged for shipment all over the United States.

Salmon is one of the best sellers on our menu. We have to be sure that the highest standards are adhered to. I can honestly say that the number of complaints are nil.

When I've had to fill in with salmon from other purveyors, it just isn't the same. My waitstaff now knows that we use farm raised Atlantic salmon, not Norwegian. I'm glad you asked.

Architecture builds food following

Architecture to a restaurant can be compared with spices to food. It definitely adds to the flavor, but exactly how much is open to individual interpretation.

"A restaurant is like a three-legged stool," said Tom Wilsam, owner of a Sizzler franchise that recently opened in Westland. "You have food, atmosphere and service. All three are equally important."

What role does architecture play in that triumvirate?

"It's difficult to say," said Gary Wright, design project manager for General Mills Restaurant Inc.

"If you consider Walt Disney World and the different restaurant designs there, can you say whether architecture brought people in — the atmosphere created — or were they hungry, a captive audience and they had to eat?"

"You don't know if it's the food, atmosphere, service to people or location," Wright added. "I think it (architecture) plays a substantial part. For any nationwide restaurant, initial perception is recognition of the

building."

Architecture may not be important at the high-end of haute cuisine or the low-end, moms-and-pops where people go strictly for food, said Ron Rea, a designer and partner with Peterhansra in Birmingham.

But it does become a factor in the highly competitive middle ground.

"You're trying to give them a dollar value — good food, reasonably priced, in a good atmosphere," Rea said.

"Visuals of the exterior and interior will excite them. They will go in for the way it (building) looks. Then it's up to the operator to make sure they're served well, the food is good."

"I never tell my clients design will make their business. It will assist them have better business," Rea said.

General Mills owns and operates Olive Garden and Red Lobster restaurants. An Olive Garden recently opened in Novi. Another is under construction in Canton.

"Our buildings have a certain number of square feet, the number of

seats is constant and so is the kitchen," Wright said. "The exterior is customized according to the community you go in."

"We can take a base footprint and change the appearance of the footprint and the skin to make it look like many different types of buildings."

Clay tiles can give a Mediterranean appearance, vertical parapets and glazed tiles convey a more modern look and different kinds of bricks and awning treatments present other images, Wright said.

Many municipalities require certain kinds of appearances as far as brick work, roofing colors and lighting fixtures for conformity within a business district.

Structural changes will shift according to local building codes and unusual local conditions. Earthquakes are a concern in southern California. Snow piles up on roofs in the Midwest.

Wilsam's Sizzler has a high ceiling, pastel colors and extensive use of glass.

"Most restaurant buildings here,

in my opinion, are kind of dreary," he said. "They're made of of brick. They're dark. The big thing (about Sizzler) is an openness feeling. Glass in front is designed to make people feel good, just like background music."

"Philosophically, I think people eat out to have needs served. It's an escape. When I go out, I want to relax. It's just not to feed my stomach. I can go home and cook my favorite foods," he said.

Wilsam said he requested the company's newest prototype when selecting a design for his Westland restaurant.

"Architecture is an important function," Wright said. "It gives people the first impression they see and know of the restaurant. As they go through the door, different elements start to plug in. The interior. They start interacting with personnel, the hostess, waiters. The quality of food."

"You start with the building on an overall impression of restaurants. The first impression is the most lasting, or at least sets the tone."

Local chili cook earns trip to national final

Passing the Alka-Seltzer because Northville is boasting a new chili cookoff winner.

Jim Sgriccia competed last weekend in the Windsor Chili Cookoff in Canada, and took first place honors with his Day Later Chili. The event was the Ontario regional cookoff which qualifies the winner for a place in the World Chili Cookoff, in Scottsdale, Ariz. on Nov. 8.

"There were 32 cooks from six states plus Canada," said Sgriccia. "It was quite a variety."

And if you think that's a lot of competition, the field at the World Cookoff will be tougher than overcooked beef. The finale gathers 80 cooks representing all the regions sanctioned by the World Chili Society for three days, with the final cookoff on Sunday. The winner gets \$25,000.

Sgriccia is a veteran of chili cookoffs, having first competed in 1984. Since then, he's changed and improved his recipe a number of times, and has several trophies to show for it.

"Every now and then it happens," he said. "This is my third first-place finish, but it's my first major win."

Japanese business lunch is culinary adventure

According to Myers, it's considered bad form in Japan to consume alcohol with lunch.

"The Japanese tend to get very red-faced on just a little alcohol," he says. "That's usually reserved for get-togethers between colleagues and staff in the evening."

After work, says Yamada, the Japanese make up for lost time by carousing at the local karaoke bar, and entertain themselves with huge sing-alongs.

"At dinner time, the Japanese are big drinkers," says Yamada. "They spend a lot of time eating out. They'll have a dinner meeting, or a dinner chattering I should say, where they'll complain about work and work out complaints. Karaoke is the best way to get that out. They get to sing along and get loud."

Yamada's new venture at the Cherry Blossom will have both sushi and yakitori bars, as well as a karaoke bar. There will also be the classic tatami rooms, private screened dining rooms where diners sit on tatami mats on the floor (though the Cherry Blossom will have footwells under the table for Western legs).

Head chef Seiji Ueno has prepared a lengthy menu for the opening of the new restaurant. As in Japan, some vegetables and fish will be offered on a seasonal basis. He's hoping to attract adventuresome Western visitors willing to try food in the true Japanese style.

"It's now popular to try different food," he says. "If they're a beginner at sushi, we can assist them in what to eat. Many people are still hesitant to try, but once they try, they'll see the texture and the taste. It's an adventure of eating."

A lunchtime visit to Akasaka reveals a lengthy menu featuring sashimi (artistically sliced fish), tempura (deep fried vegetables or fish), gyoza (garlicky pan-fried pork dumplings), noodles, yakitori and 21 different kinds of sushi.

It should be made clear that sushi is never slimy or fishy smelling. Indeed no raw fish should ever be slimy or smelly, which would be an indication that it wasn't fresh. Indeed the sushi is crisp and somewhat dry, if very cold.

A thin, virgin white strip of squid atop cooked rice was tender, not chewy. It's flavor was that of a fine filet of sole. Sweet raw shrimp lived up to its name with a pleasant

sweet taste, and again that same crisp, fresh texture.

Sea urchin roe was hardly as exotic as it sounds. Made from the tenderest flesh of the spiny-shelled invertebrate, the roe had the color and texture of fresh-ground peanut butter, but tasted like the liqueur cointreau.

Knives and forks would be useless for eating the fragile sushi, though it comes in portions that seem too big for Westerners. Myers says it's perfectly appropriate to pick up the whole portion with chopsticks — perhaps seasoning it with a little soy sauce, wasabi (a ground horseradish mustard), or dried bonito — stuff the whole thing in your mouth, and start biting.

Noodle dishes at Akasaka come in huge bowls, and are reminiscent of Western soups and stews. Meat, however, appears only sparsely in Japanese food, due to its high cost.

Myers explains the differing use of meat in this fashion: in the West, a typical meal will feature meat as the main course, and starches and vegetables are viewed as side dishes; in Japan, rice is the main course, with the meat and the vegetables served in separate bowls as side dishes.

"And they eat pretty much the same things

at each meal," he says. "It's not breakfast, lunch and dinner as we think of it. It's just a stream of snacks all day long."

"The portions are different with each meal. Two strips of yakitori will be an appetizer. Two more will be a meal. Ten would be a feast."

Salaried professionals and middle managers eat differently than higher level Japanese managers, according to Myers.

"It's very hierarchical, and there's little mingling among the different levels," he says. "When I worked for Amway in Japan, it took a while for my staff to get comfortable with me coming to their place to eat."

High level managers, he says, will go to quiet, formal restaurants, and unlike their lower level counterparts, may discuss business over the meal.

The meal itself is a culmination of the Japanese respect for artistry in cooking. Myers says appearance and color are as important, if not moreso, than flavor. Locally, an example of a Japanese power-broker's lunch can be found at the Hotel Baronette.

The Baronette is, in fact, Japanese owned, and according to general manager Tadashi Nagao, about 30 percent of his guests come from there. To make them feel at home, he

presents a lavish lunch on authentic dishes, artfully prepared by chefs Simon Shinodada and Ken Yamasaki.

"This is the city boy's business lunch, not the countryside lunch," says Nagao. "There is at least one hot item, a teriyaki fish or beef, but rice is the biggest part. Sushi is always served with it. We use flounder or tuna, and it's always fresh."

The "salad" is more of a mixture of starches like potatoes, pumpkins and tofu as well as bamboo shoots and shitake mushrooms. On the side are "pickles," a Japanese staple of pickled vegetables.

"They're very salty," Nagao says. "But our steamed rice has zero salt content, so the salty flavor is absorbed by the rice."

Businessmen at all levels also enjoy visiting different ethnic restaurants for lunch, too.

"They can get any kind of foreign food from around the world," Yamada says. "Italian, Czech, Mexican, German, even the USSR, although that doesn't exist anymore."

It's fitting then that in the true Japanese spirit of adventure in dining, Westerners should experience lunch the Japanese way.

Keep your picnic safe from illness

A summertime picnic need not be ruined by a case of food poisoning if some common sense food tips are followed, according to Bill Schuette, Director of the Michigan Department of Agriculture (MDA).

He said storing foods properly is the key to avoiding a food-borne illness like salmonella. "Prevention is the watchword in food safety," said Schuette. "By following proper cold storage, sanitation and thorough cooking rules, you can keep food safe anytime you pack it to go."

PREPARING FOOD FOR THE PICNIC

Keep everything that touches food clean. Stop and wash your hands before preparing food. And wash utensils, bowls and countertops between work on each dish.

Use a fork — rather than your hands — to mix meat, macaroni, egg, tuna or green salads. Using your hands can be a problem because bacteria dig in around the fingernails and the creased skin of the hands.

If cooking food ahead of time, cook it thoroughly so bacteria doesn't grow.

Make sure all your ingredients are the freshest you can buy.

PACKING FOR THE PICNIC

Plastic foam coolers are ideal for picnics. For hot food, wrap the dish in several layers of newspaper before placing in a separate cooler. For cold dishes, place the cooler with ice or blue gel cold packs.

Freeze iced tea and lemonade in plastic containers and freeze small boxes of juice. They will thaw on your way to the picnic site and you won't

need ice. Keep in mind that before freezing liquid, make sure there's space to allow for expansion.

Try not to use the trunk of your car to store the food because it is the hottest place in the car.

PREPARING FOOD FOR THE PICNIC

Keep food in coolers until ready to serve. Whenever possible, keep the cooler and other foods inside or in the shade. The heat from the sun speeds up the growth of bacteria.

If using a public grill, make sure the fire is very hot to kill bacteria on the grill, or cover it with aluminum foil and make holes in the top of the foil to allow grease to drop through.

Cook meats, especially ground meats, thoroughly.

It's best not to set out most foods until you are ready to eat, but if you must, consider covering the food with a net tent made especially for this purpose. Flies are much more than pests. They can create serious problems because they are agents for 50 human diseases and often carry the eggs that cause pinworm, roundworm, whipworm, hookworm, and tapeworm. Nearly every part of a fly carries disease-producing organisms.

AFTER THE PICNIC

Food should sit out for no more than two hours. After that, the food should be packed away in a cooler and placed in a shady spot.

Used paper plates, napkins and cups should be placed in a garbage tin. They still have organisms on them and can attract flies and animals.

Any used dishes or plates should be stored separately from food, and should be washed in very hot, soapy water upon arrival home. Never wash in streams, rivers and lakes.

Upon arrival home, examine the leftover food immediately and if at a

safe temperature, place it in the refrigerator. Use it up within a day. If the food needs to be reheated or cooked, make sure you cook it thoroughly.

Pair apples, potatoes for special salad treat

1 teaspoon chopped fresh mint or 1/4 teaspoon dried mint leaves
1/4 teaspoon salt
lettuce leaves

In medium bowl combine apples, potatoes and peas. In small bowl combine yogurt, horseradish, mint and salt; mix well. Pour dressing over apple mixture; toss. Cover. Chill several hours. Serve on lettuce leaves. Yield: 4 servings.

GRANNY'S APPLE POTATO SALAD

1/2 cup margarine
1 cup plain yogurt
4 ounces blue cheese, crumbled
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon dill weed
1/2 teaspoon black pepper
2 Granny Smith apples, cored and diced
2 tablespoons lemon juice
6 cups cubed cooked potatoes
3 cups cooked ham, cut in narrow strips

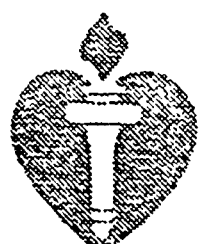
In large bowl mix mayonnaise, yogurt, blue cheese, salt, dill weed and pepper. Add apples, lemon juice, potatoes and ham. Chill before serving. Yield: 6 servings.

More heat than light from NBC's 'Home Fires'

Nuclear family under attack from within

Householder Teddy Kramer (Michael Brandon) spends most of one television half-hour preparing to kindle the "first fire of the season" in his living-room hearth. The meaning of this ritual is lost on his family, who inform him that it's still too warm for a fire. But he's a man with a mission, and besides, he's trying to avoid washing the dogs.

So far, "Home Fires," the first half-hour comedy from the creative team behind "St. Elsewhere," sounds like familiar domestic territory. For the most part, it is.

Appearing in viewers' homes beginning Wednesday, June 24, "Home Fires" trades heavily on the reputation for upscale quirkiness cultivated by its executive producers, Bruce Paltrow, Tom Fontana and John Tinker during their days at MTM, where Paltrow worked on "The White Shadow" and "Tattinger's" as well as "St. Elsewhere."

But what works in a professional setting is not always desirable at home. Perhaps that's why this family is in counseling, which is where we find them as each episode opens.

Therapist Frederick Marcus

(played by Norman Lloyd, an "Elsewhere" holdover), listens, sometimes visibly scandalized by the things he hears. Besides fire-builder Teddy, his patients include mother-figure Anne (Kate Burton) and their children: Libby (Nicole Eggert), a college freshman; and Jesse (Jarrad Paul), a hormonally active 14-year-old. Extended family and friends include Anne's mother, Nana (Alice Hirson), and Libby's boyfriend, Mike (Tyagi Schwartz). Most of the action takes place in the Kramer home, a museumlike structure distinguished by its interior glass walls (a visual comment on emotional stone-throwing, one presumes). A simply pastel drawing, which appears during the show's opening and at commercial time, is all we see of the building's facade.

Although "Home Fires" has been looking for a time slot since January and no fewer than three installments air during the first week, NBC has made no episodes available for advance viewing. Columbia Television, the show's production studio, was able to provide one half-hour preview tape, but even this is not a sufficient basis on which to form an opinion of the

series.

"Madonna and Child Reunion," the episode Columbia released, is scheduled to air Thursday, June 25. (The series' regular time slot is on Saturday; NBC terms the Wednesday and Thursday airings "previews.") The main plot concerns Jesse, who's trying to speak the language of love to his beautiful classmate Shauna, who's tutoring him in French. With bad advice and sometimes cruel prodding from Mom, Libby and Mike, and Dad off doing the Jack London thing, Jesse makes the wrong move with Shauna and faces the teen death sentence: social humiliation. This is pretty familiar ground, even if there are some bits of dialogue that must have burned the censors' ears. On the whole, Teddy and Jesse are more appealing than the womenfolk, who seem fretful and overwound.

Advance material describes "Home Fires" as a comedy about "a '90s family facing conflicts that arise in the absence of the traditional generation gap." In keeping with its sophisticated atmosphere, "Home Fires" has no laugh track, a device often used to give viewers a sense of a show's direction. In this case, the silence betrays the faint cry of a drama trapped in the creative attic.

Special probes racism in sports

Since 1946, when Jackie Robinson joined the Brooklyn Dodgers and became the first athlete to break the racial barrier in professional sports, athletics have been viewed as America's great integrator. That notion is challenged in *The Other Side of Victory: The Challenge of the Black Athlete*, a documentary currently airing in syndication.

Thirty-one years after Robinson's history-making achievement, Los Angeles Dodgers assistant general manager Al Campanis questioned on

national TV the ability of blacks to perform managerial jobs. Campanis was promptly fired, but his bigoted remarks caused many to consider the role discrimination continues to play in sports.

The Other Side of Victory goes beyond the mere identification of racism in sports and looks into such related issues as unethical recruiting and substance abuse. Close examination suggests an ongoing pattern of discrimination that exploits the black athlete and gives little in return. By contrast, the special profiles blacks who are breaking new ground in sports such as swimming and tennis.

ESPN's Robin Roberts and James Brown of CBS Sports, both black, are hosts of the two-hour special. They were highly recruited prep school all-Americans who have distinguished themselves in and out of the arena.

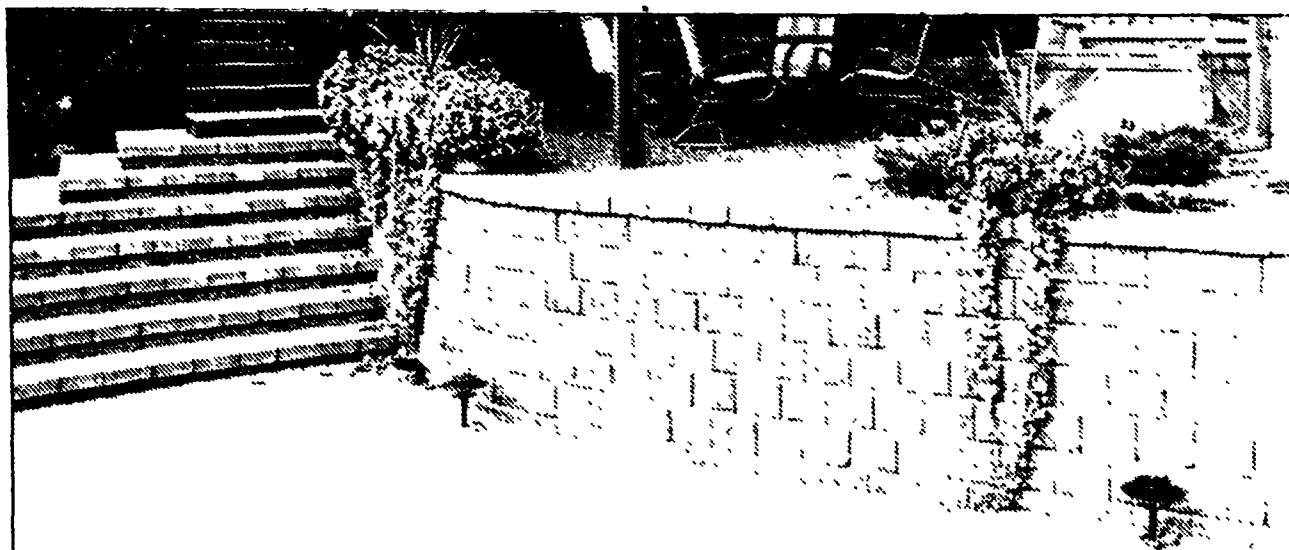

'When a Tree Falls' calls for ears to hear

For a child watching the world go by from a leafy backyard perch, picturing his strong, silent friend as a ream of paper is unimaginable. For others, it's business as usual.

When a Tree Falls, a special airing this month on many PBS stations, takes an honest, even-handed look at the issues surrounding timber harvesting. It's must viewing for families even remotely interested in preserving a legacy of forestlands for posterity.

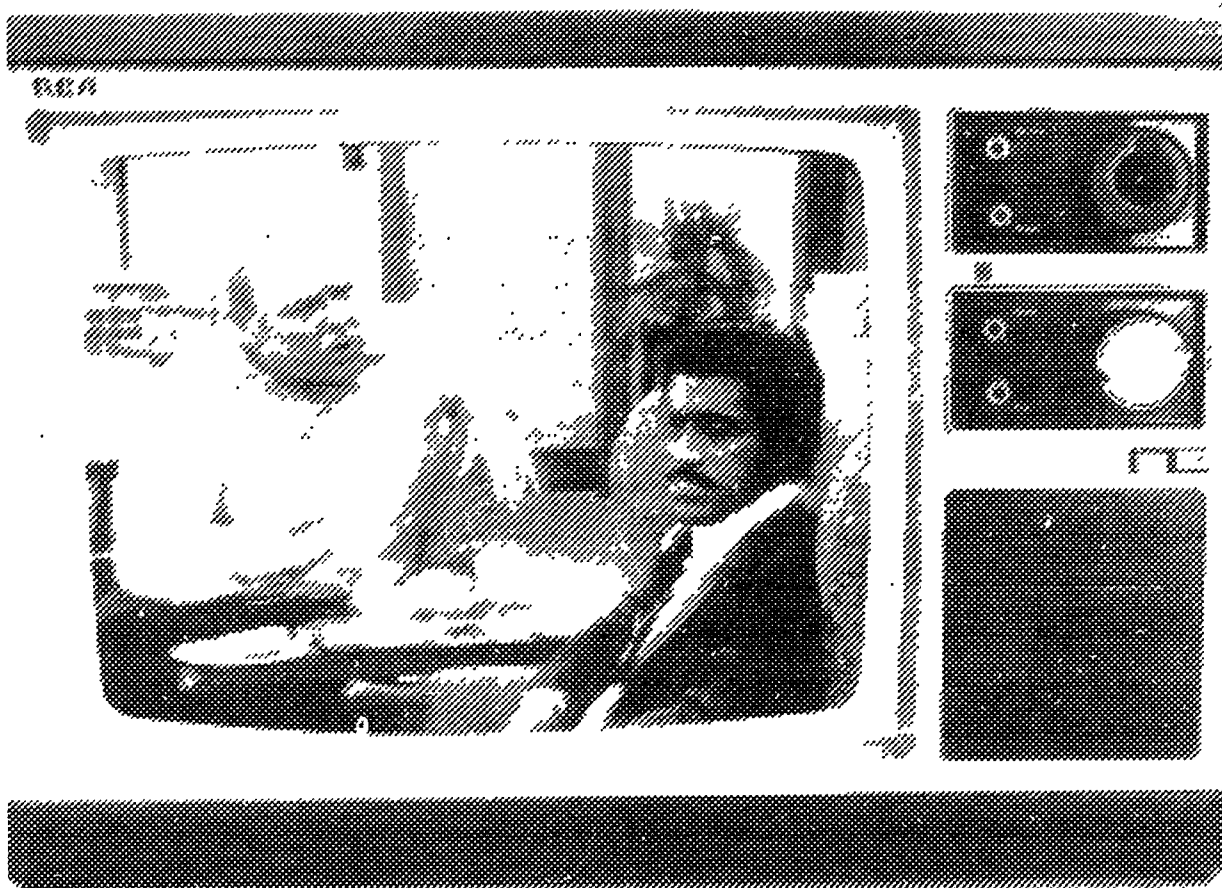
In the backwoods of coastal South Carolina, timber has historically lost in the race for progress. Pointing no fingers and assessing no blame, this program features instead the growing pockets of resistance — including a grade-school teacher supporting Project Learning Tree and the Wildlife Action group — whose messages are taking root. Trees are one of our few renewable resources, they stress, and we're selling out future generations by not putting back what we take.

When a Tree Falls delivers an effective, eloquent message in simple stories from ordinary people.

"We feel we are the experts in our own backyards," says one Wildlife Action volunteer.

When a Tree Falls offers a sharply focused view of a bigger issue in microcosm, begging in a small way for discerning ears to listen for every branch that falls.

Filmmaker blasts small screen's narrow view

'P.O.V.' launches season with 'Color Adjustment'

In most American homes, television is available around the clock on dozens of channels. It never stops — never even pauses — of its own accord. Hyperkinetic by nature, the medium is all but incapable of self-analysis.

Into the void steps PBS's summer documentary series *P.O.V.*, opening its fifth season with *Color Adjustment*, 80 minutes of exploratory sociology by filmmaker Marlon Riggs. Last season, Riggs' *Tongues Untied*, a film about the special torment of black men who are gay, touched a raw nerve; though it was praised by critics, many PBS stations refused to air it.

Color Adjustment, airing Monday, June 15, on most affiliates, is Riggs' view of television's portrayal of black Americans. Narrator Ruby Dee recalls the first roles for blacks on television: in *Amos 'n' Andy* and *Beulah*, a comedy starring Ethel Waters as a cheerful domestic. In 1956 Nat "King" Cole became the first black host of a variety program, sharing the stage with the

leading white performers. Sponsors forsook the show and it was cancelled after 15 months on the air.

In 1965, *I Spy* made Bill Cosby the first black to play a role that wasn't defined by his color. Three years later, Diahann Carroll played a professional woman in *Julia*.

Riggs both praises and damns these isolated examples. He points out how little such series had to do with reality in the streets and how carefully orchestrated they were: plucking these acceptable blacks from their unacceptable backgrounds and washing them of their racial identity. Riggs criticizes black sitcoms generally for failing to portray ghetto life as the degrading experience that it is.

On television, the seminal drama of black life was the 1977 miniseries *Roots*. Yet in Riggs' view, "prime time had selectively reformed American history, transforming a national disgrace into an epic triumph."

In on-screen graphics, Riggs repeatedly asks, "Is this a positive image?" But he fails to define his own term and so ultimately lets the medium escape with its message intact.

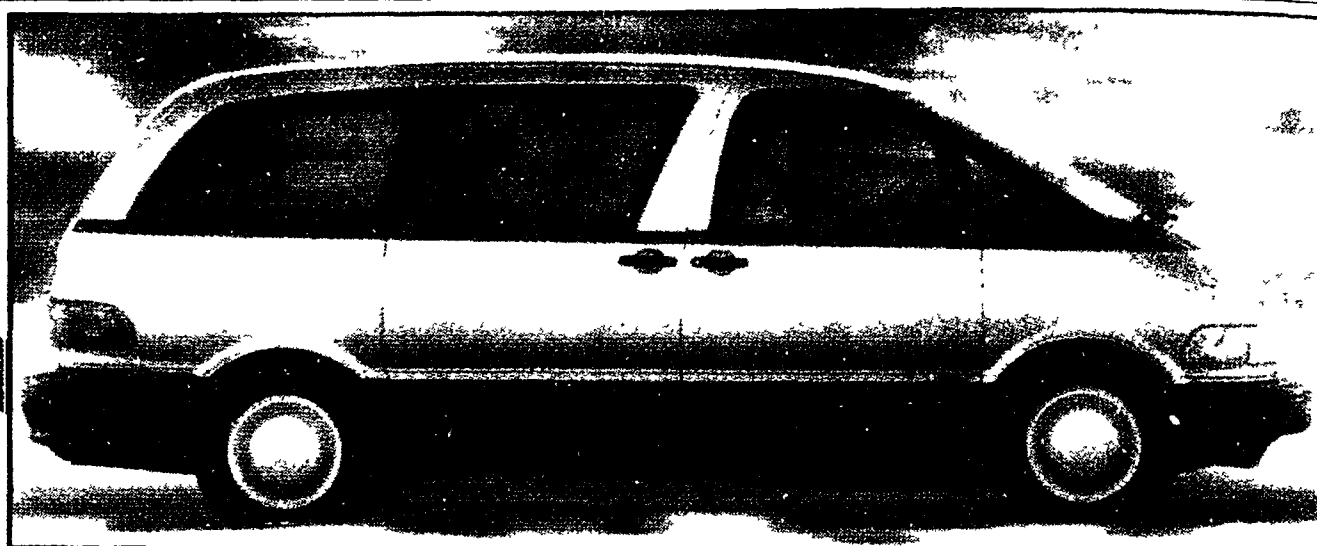

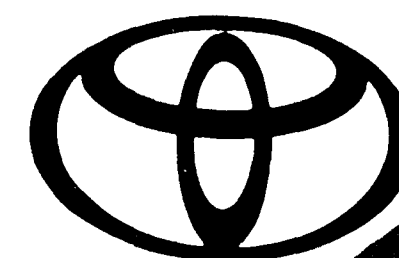

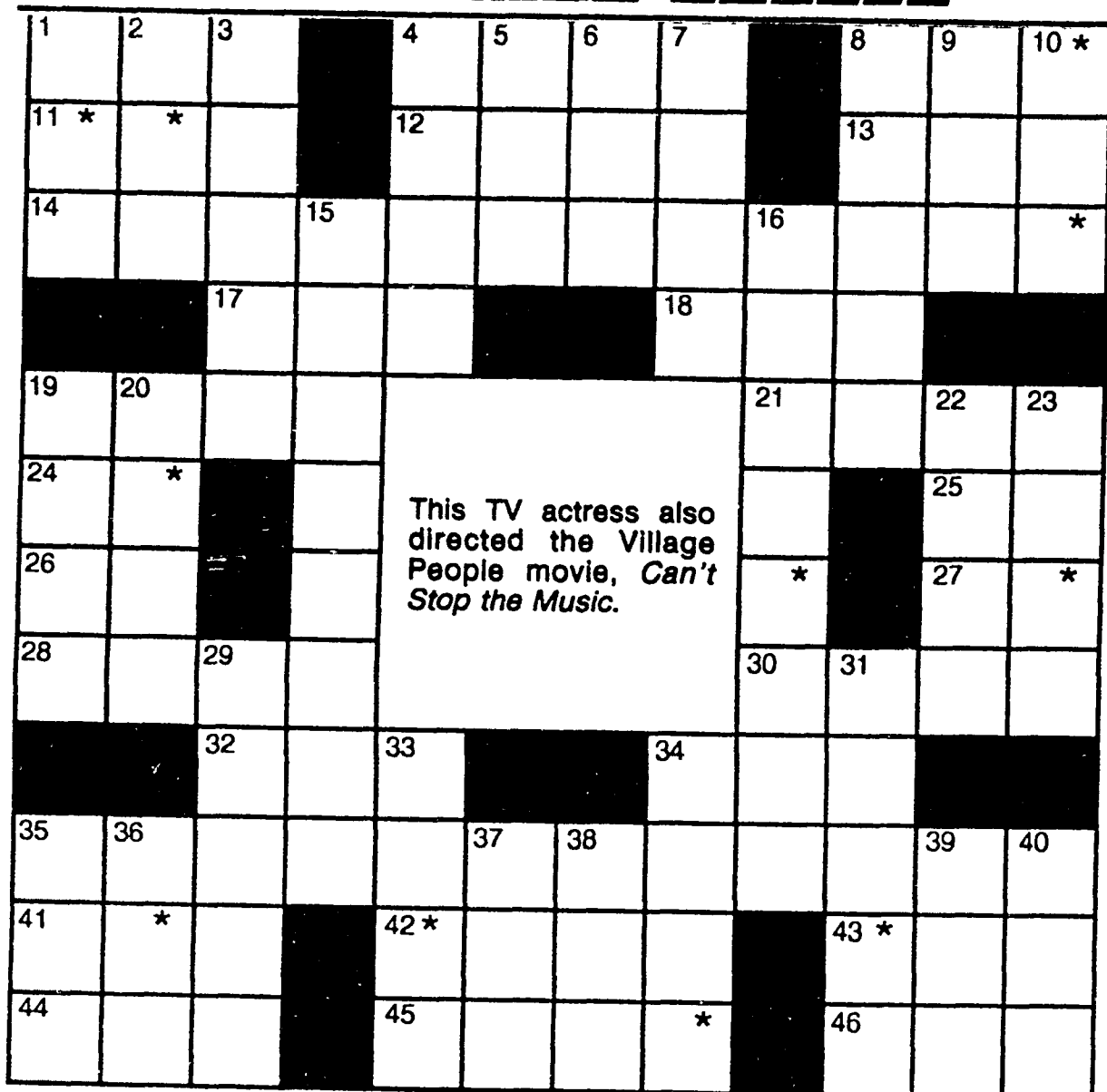

I feel certain David Canary will pick up the Outstanding Lead Actor award for his portrayal of Adam and Stuart Chandler on *AMC*, but I'd really like to see Peter Bergman (Jack, *The Young and the Restless*) win. He's one of those actors who gives his all to every performance.

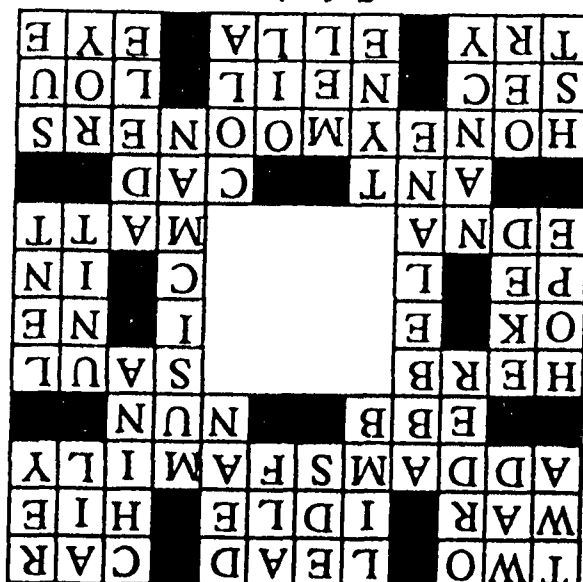

'Aloha' flashbacks: Elvis remembered

Marty Pasetta's career dates back to the early days of television and he credits his experience in live broadcasting with preparing him for the many big events and specials he's produced over the years. Pasetta helmed 17 Oscar telecasts, as well as several American Film Institute tributes, the People's Choice Awards and specials featuring George Burns, Carol Burnett and Alabama. He also was responsible for Elvis Presley's *Aloha from Hawaii* special in 1973, a landmark, live-by-satellite concert that reached an international audience.

Pasetta recalls approaching the Presley show with some trepidation, especially in his first meeting with the reclusive star.

"We met in Las Vegas," Pasetta says. "I went up to his hotel room and he had three bodyguards. When Elvis came in, they all sat down and took out their guns and laid them on the table." Shaken, Pasetta decided to go ahead with what he'd planned to say.

"I took a breath and said 'Elvis, I went to your show in Long Beach. You just stood there. You're fat, you're slow and you're boring.'"

Pasetta and Presley eyed each other silently. "Then he took off his glasses," Pasetta recalls, "leaned back in his chair and started laughing. Elvis said, 'Not many people are ever honest with me like that.' We became friends from that moment on."

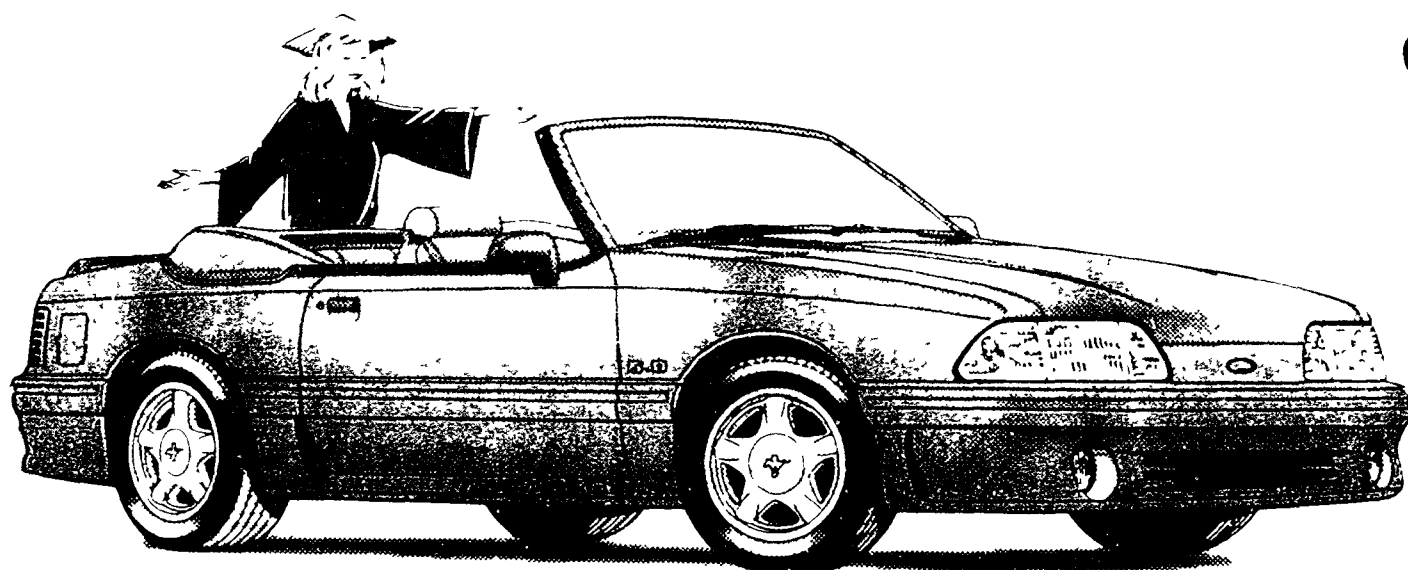

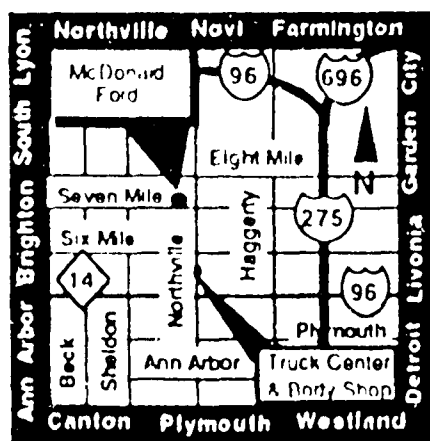
