



Plant sale in wings?

A citizens' committee assembled to review potential reuses for the Ford Plant property has its work cut out for it.

City Manager Gary Word told committee members July 8 that the Ford Motor Company is seriously considering an offer from a private developer who has demanded a decision within weeks.

The committee was assembled from city and township residents and officials, following a suggestion at a June 29 town meeting on the fate of the vacant Ford Plant (see related story).

Word's disclosure follows increased interest by private developers in the 13.7-acre Ford Plant property. Since Ford dropped its asking price from \$2.5 million to \$1.75 million in March, the automotive company has reportedly received more than 100 inquiries about the plant, five to six of which are considered serious.

The latest offer is considered the

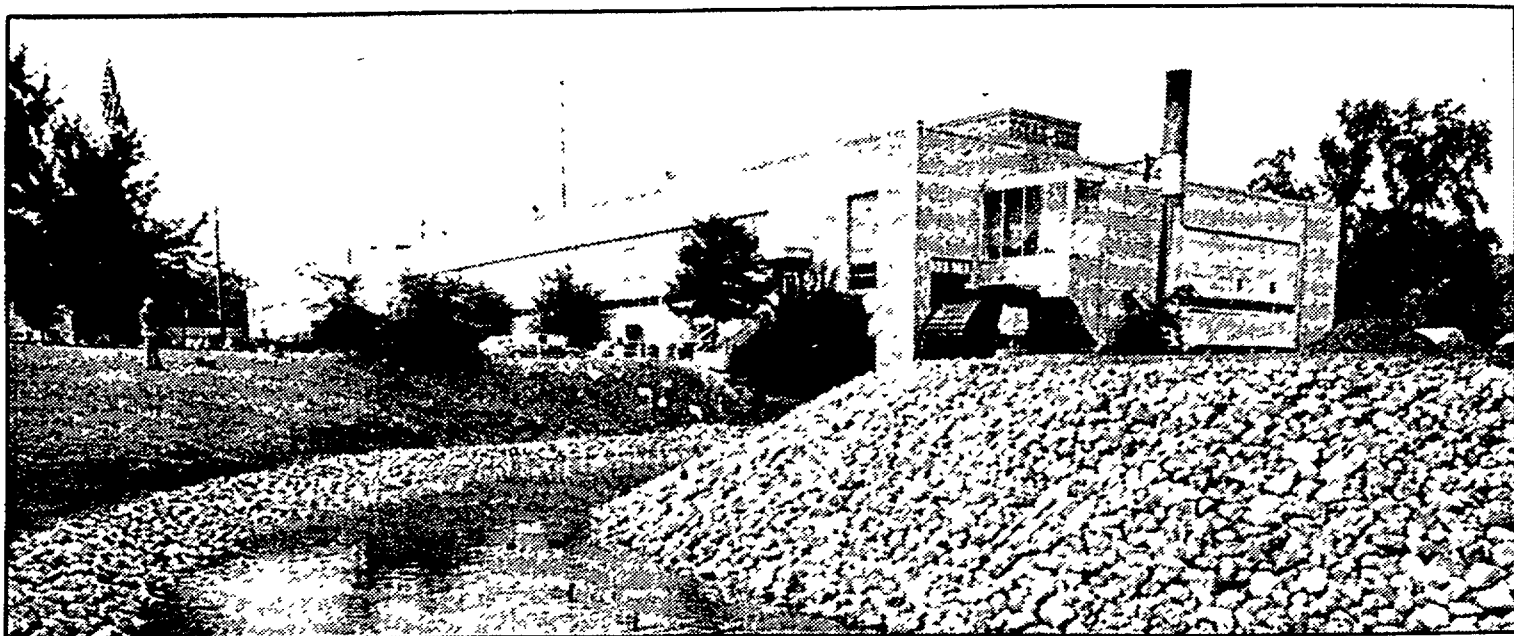
most serious, and the most pressing, of all. While he would not reveal the exact deadline or the developer's name, Word said the developer has requested a response from Ford within the next several weeks. Ford officials are requesting an extension allowing six to eight weeks to decide, he said.

Word said the developer's offer may not differ greatly from the community's own plans for the parcel.

"Ford has been advised by this party that the proposed uses are not inconsistent with the uses identified by the Quinn Evans study in 1989, or for that matter, the uses identified during the meeting of June 29," he said. The Quinn Evans study found the plant suitable for reuse as a library and either a small retail mall or school services center.

Another developer is considering building "public, non-retail" space at the site, Word said, though the developer has not decided whether to make an offer.

Ford officials could not be reached for comment.

Study group digs in to consider future

With less than two weeks to work, and a developer breathing down their necks, a local citizens committee is considering how best to reuse the vacant Ford Valve Plant property.

Most committee members agreed that Ford Field west of Griswold

should be retained for recreational uses, but their opinions differ over how to reuse the plant itself and how involved the city should get in that reuse.

The committee's views reflect those of residents at a crowded June 29 town meeting, in which some pushed the city to purchase the plant outright and use it for a library while

others argued that a private redevelopment would be better for the city's tax base.

The committee is composed of local architect Greg Presley, attorney Michele Kelly, City Planning Commissioner Dave Totten, Recreation Commissioner Ken Romine, resident Steve Focht, and Township Manager Richard Henningsen. The members

were appointed by City Manager Gary Word, who will sit on the committee as well.

The committee convened for the first time last Wednesday, July 8. "Since time is of the essence, we need to move quickly," said Presley, who was appointed chairperson.

Pair face off for seat

Novi resident Michael Meyer faces Birmingham accountant Walter O. Briggs IV in an Aug. 4 primary for the Democratic nomination to run for U.S. Congress in the 11th District. The district includes the Northville community north of Baseline Road.

The winner of the Democratic primary will face off against one of three Republicans on Nov. 3. Republicans running for the seat are state Sen. David Honigman, former Circuit Court Judge Alice Gilbert and Republican Party activist Joseph Knollenberg.

Meyer will be drastically outspent in the primary. He is working with a \$4,000 budget while Briggs expects to spend around \$500,000 throughout the campaign.

This is not Briggs' first run for Congress. He ran unsuccessfully against incumbent William Broomfield in 1990. Broomfield plans to retire at the end of this year. Meyer has never run for office out-

side of Novi before. The educator and musician has been on the Novi School Board for nine years. Meyer, the father of one, said he is running to provide a real choice for voters.

Briggs, who has two children, is descended from the family who built Tiger (Briggs) Stadium.

The newly-formed 11th District covers about 580,000 residents and about 400,000 voters include those in Novi, Highland, Walled Lake, Milford, Wixom, Commerce, White Lake, Orchard Lake, West Bloomfield, Keego Harbor, Sylvan Lake, Bloomfield, Bloomfield Hills, Birmingham, Lyon Township, South Lyon, Farmington Hills, Farmington, Franklin, Beverly Hills, Bingham Farms, La-therup Village, Southfield, Livonia and part of Redford.

Reports suggesting boiling of water were just all wet

Detroit news reports warning Northville residents to boil their water were all washed up, according to local public works departments.

Though Detroit workers did perform repairs on a Joy Road water main valve late Thursday night, Northville never lost pressure as a result, so there was no increased danger of contamination in the lines.

City DPW spokesperson Becky Dozier said Supervisor Ted Mapes monitored the city's water pressure throughout the night and found no cause for alarm.

"Mr. Mapes sat up all night with his gauge and there was no pressure reduction," she said.

Nevertheless, the DPW was flooded with calls from concerned homeowners wondering what to do, as a result of Detroit television broadcasts Friday morning.

"I was watching Channel 7 and Erik Smith mentioned that Northville

and Novi might experience a slight drop in water pressure. Then I turned on Channel 4 and they said six communities were involved and Kathy Adams was telling everybody to boil their water," Dozier said.

"It's amazing how things can get blown out of proportion."

Northville Township's water department received a similar surge in phone calls, said spokesperson Moira Sullivan.

"I've been thinking of calling Channel 4 and telling them to double-check with the City of Detroit before they run something like that," she said.

It's a loss of water pressure rather than simply water main repairs that can result in contamination, Sullivan explained.

"If they lose water completely, then you can get some sedimentation and discoloration when the pressure comes back up," she said. "That's when we recommend that residents boil their water."

Township ends gravel road treatment

The next time the dust flies, township residents are on their own.

The township board last Thursday unanimously agreed to scrap township-paid treatments of calcium chloride for the area's 22 secondary gravel roads.

Residents must pay for future treatments of the dust-inhibiting spray through special assessment districts.

The board's decision capped a month of on-again, off-again support for the hundreds of residents who live on the township's gravel roads. At its regular June meeting, the board rejected residents' pleas for dust relief, saying the estimated \$12,000 per treatment was not in the 1992 budget.

Less than a week later, the board agreed to pay for one calcium chloride application. The lone scheduled spray was completed earlier this month.

The move to cut the township's ties to dust control was sparked by interim Trustee Richard Ambler, who recently was tabbed to replace former Trustee Donald Williams.

Ambler said the township should not have to pay for calcium chloride, a benefit that serves a minority of township residents. He cited the township's current budget crunch as reason enough to end a spraying program the township picked up in the early 1980s.

"Budget cuts must be made (to continue spraying)," Ambler said. "I can't see cutting any services so I can have my township road paid for."

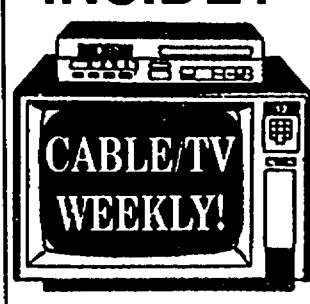

NEW LAW AFFECTS REFRIGERATOR DISPOSAL: Northville residents should be aware that effective July 1, 1992, it is unlawful to dispose of any appliances that contain refrigerants. Refrigerators and air conditioners are included in this prohibition and can no longer be accepted for trash disposal unless the refrigerant is removed by a certified technician and the appliance is labeled to indicate that the removal has been performed.

Effective July 1, Painter & Ruthenburg, the community solid waste hauler, will only pick up and dispose of appliances that have had the refrigerants removed and are so labeled.

Birmingham accountant Walter O. Briggs IV faces one opponent in the Democratic primary for a seat representing the 11th District in the U.S. Congress. Briggs, 35, is married with two children. He has lived in Oakland County for all of his life.

His campaign is focusing on personal contact, including mailings and door-to-door meetings with voters. He got into the race to stop "career politicians" from controlling the election. He is working with a half-million dollar budget.

The federal budget is \$350 billion in the red. What would be the first cut you would make to help alleviate that deficit?

The first thing I would do is to sit down and stop playing partisan politics with the budget. We spend a lot of time arguing back and forth as Democrats and Republicans. There are some problems in both parties in terms of budget overspending. There also are some solutions.

What I would do first is focus on defense and recognize our military priorities and the nature of our military has changed. We can significantly reduce the defense budget, which is the largest item, by cutting weapons and by restructuring the military.

We have a lot of competing redundancies. We have airplanes in both the Navy, the Air Force and the Marines. We can combine those so they can work more efficiently together.

We also have a significant amount of waste in the military budget. When you have a 14-page specification to buy a fruit cake, it adds significantly to cost. While they appear to be small items, when you total them up the kind of waste we're talking about in

the military amounts to somewhere around \$16 billion.

Would you support those kinds of cuts in the military budget?

Yes, I would. And what I would do further on the budget, I would support measures that cut the deficit and the budget in general by 5 percent a year by improving management. We look at our overall budget, we can cut it by \$60 to \$80 billion a year just by improving management of the budget. . . Instead we want to use this budget deficit as rhetoric. . .

Would you support cuts in entitlement programs like veterans benefits and medicare?

I would look at the entitlement programs. In fact, if you look at Medicare, which is one of the largest, what we have to address is the rising cost of health care. We have to do that through universal insurance. Medicare ends up being billed for all those uninsured. I would address that part of the deficit through universal health insurance.

Wouldn't that cost the government even more?

No, it wouldn't. In fact, it would save us money if you look at universal health insurance and with it cost containment programs. Right now the uninsured go to an emergency room for care because they can't get an appointment. Those costs are passed on to us. One of the cost containment programs being a more standardized mechanism of billing insurance firms to cut out waste. . .

To balance the budget would you support Bill Clinton's tax increase plan for those who earn over \$200,000 a year?

The problem here is we all feel overtaxed. Every one of us looks at the government and says, "These people have been wasting our money for years." Politicians can't seem to get their act together.

What we need to do, first and foremost, is get our act together, get the government cleaned up, resolve the problems of waste and restore the trust people have that their politicians are going to spend their money wisely. When that is done, then and only then, can we come back to the people.

Do you think a trade treaty with Mexico would help or hurt U.S. industry, particularly the auto industry?

We've already seen jobs in America go over to Mexico. I'm concerned about the free trade agreement with Mexico because I think we are using it again politically.

The problem I have is we are going to send jobs to a country that has extremely low wages. It has no environmental standards as we've seen with the catastrophe that occurred in the last month down in Mexico. (A gas line exploded in Mexico City.)

As a result, manufacturers are going to take advantage of the work-

force and abuse the environment there, which affects us here. And do it at a lower cost, so we're going to have a competitive problem. Until those problems are addressed, we can hold Mexico or any other trading partner to the environmental and wage standards that we enjoy in the United States.

I believe in free and fair trade. Not just giving jobs away.

What can the federal government do to improve education in the U.S.?

The thing we could do first is stop using it as political rhetoric. What we're doing is enunciating very good goals, very laudable goals but failing to come through with the actions necessary to make it work. Career politicians seem to be comfortable saying something, but not acting on it. We've got to do things at all levels.

We've got to fully fund Head Start.

We've got to recognize that education starts at a very early age and make it accessible to all children. I would expand the charge of Head Start to say go back to when the mother is pregnant. . . and start the education process then. We know that babies who are born healthy have a much better chance than those who are malnourished.

How would you make higher education available to the middle class?

That's the key. If you look at it, the very poor and the very rich can attend college. We need to adjust the levels that are used to qualify people for loans so all middle-income people can go to school. And we need to raise the levels that are used for Pell grants. . .

You keep mentioning career politicians. Do you support term limitations?

Meyer mounts nomination challenge

Novi School Board member Michael Meyer hopes to take a big political jump to the U.S. Congress. Meyer is running in the Aug. 4 Democratic primary race for the 11th District.

If he wins, Meyer will face one of three Republicans vying for their party's nomination. Meyer has served on the school board for nine years. He works as a director of religious education at Our Lady of Good Counsel in Plymouth, as a bereavement counselor for O'Brien Chapel-Sullivan Funeral Home in Novi, as a community college professor and as a professional musician.

Meyer's campaign is evident by the green and white signs popping up in the 11th District and in position papers published in local newspapers. He has an informational booth at the upcoming Novi '50s Festival and is running his campaign with a \$4,000 budget.

Meyer said he is not seeking any endorsements except that of the voters.

Do you support term limitations?

Yes, I do. And yet I don't know if that needs to be done through an amendment to the constitution as it was done with the president. I do think, though, that the original intent was that there would be a regular rotation of the representation.

Obviously, the senators had six years, the president four and the house two for apparently a very good reason.

I'm not blind to the fact that tonight (July 2) I begin my 10th year on the Novi school board. I'm not blind to the fact that maybe after nine years, I bring a little wisdom to that board that perhaps a newcomer may not have.

Nonetheless, I think at a certain point it will be prudent for me to step off the school board and let someone else come in.

In Congress, you can build up

power with time?

Yes, I understand that, but sometimes I think that power can be misused. To answer your question even further, if I were to win a seat to the U.S. Congress, it would be my intent — if the people wanted — after two years to run again and perhaps one other time.

After six years I think it would be time for me to look to some other area of government and/or a life occupation to get my message out and do what I do — mainly teach.

The federal budget is \$350 billion in the red. Do you think the budget deficit is a major problem, and how would you hope to alleviate that problem?

It is a major concern and major challenge facing our government. Secondly, I think there are a variety of ways it can be addressed.

I just recently received from Congress — the Democratic caucus mailed me this brochure titled "The Challenge of Sound Management." It's got 28 recommendations for balancing the budget. The ones I highlighted in my article for the HomeTown newspapers (in an advertisement published July 9) are particularly fourth-quarter spending.

The idea that people in government — and of course it happens in many other places — is if we don't spend it they won't give it to us. There is all kinds of major spending that

goes on in the fourth quarter. . . That fourth-quarter spending is one that particularly caught my eye.

I truly believe that so much of the money that we allot for foreign policy that's not being used, ought to be returned. I think a redirecting or perhaps better a balance of how much we give to foreign countries such as the former Soviet Union, such as the Philippines.

What about nationalized health care? Is that something you support?

Yes, I do. But not the Canadian plan (fully state-funded benefits). I support it with the play-or-pay plan that's in the House and Senate right now. What that means is your employer would provide health care for you. If not he would pay into the federal government to somehow cover that national insurance — play or pay.

Arkansas governor and Democratic presidential nominee Bill Clinton supports a tax hike for the rich, which he considers to be people who earn over \$200,000 a year. Is that something you would support?

I don't, and I'll tell you why. I think that people should be taxed in a fair way. I think to just simply focus in on a particular group is improper. I think we should look at how we tax people, and if they are not paying

Resident foils robbery attempt at neighbor's

A First street resident foiled an apparent attempted robbery at his neighbor's house July 9, according to city police reports.

The resident told police he heard a car door slam just before 1 a.m. that morning, looked out his window, and someone sitting inside his neighbor's pickup truck going through its contents. He walked outside and yelled at the man, who fled.

The pickup truck owner investigated and told police that all three of his unlocked vehicles appeared to have been searched, though nothing appeared to have been taken.

The suspect was described as a 5-foot 7-inch tall white male weighing about 145 pounds, wearing dark shorts, a white short-sleeved polo shirt and possibly a white baseball cap. He was last seen running west on West Cady Street.

SUSPICIOUS PERSON: Two 12-year-old girls told city police that a suspicious person followed them into downtown Northville.

The girls were riding their bicycles into town from Highland Lakes at 1 p.m. July 7 when they saw a man drive by them, heading west on Doherty near Gerald. Shortly thereafter,

the man drove by them again in the opposite direction. The man passed them a third time, heading north on South Main Street just north of Doherty. He rolled down his window and mumbled something unintelligible at the two, who fled.

The suspect was described as a partly bald man in his 50s, with short grey hair and glasses. He was driving a black or navy blue car, possibly a two-door, with tinted windows.

STEREOS STOLEN FROM CARS: City police are investigating the recent theft of two car stereos. A \$400 Blaupunkt AM/FM cassette player was reported stolen sometime between June 30-July 7 from a car parked at a North Center Street home. 'Haz mat' situations require special training

The call had been for an explosion inside a factory, but as the first trucks pulled up to the scene it was clear there was no fire. The lieutenant was counting his blessings when he noticed several people lying on the ground just outside the large rear door of the main factory building, and a light vapor cloud drifting through the door toward the nearby residential neighborhood.

A man who identified himself as the plant manager staggered up and advised the lieutenant that a pressurized chemical storage tank had "blown" and was leaking.

As the chief arrived the lieutenant had determined the identity of the substance from plant personnel, and had consulted the hazardous materials guide carried on the engine. The information was relayed to the chief, who immediately ordered the withdrawal of all fire department personnel to a perimeter 300 feet upwind of the factory.

With the assistance of the police, portions of the downtown residential neighborhood were ordered evacuated, while other residents were warned to remain in their homes with the doors and windows shut. The chief then called dispatch and requested activation of the Western Wayne County Hazardous Incident Response Team.

The use and storage of hazardous chemicals in our communities is a fact of modern life. On occasion, emergency situations involving such substances will occur, and our fire departments have taken on the responsibility of managing these incidents. Training in the recognition and early management of "haz-mat" incidents is now a standard part of every firefighter's training. Bringing the incident to a safe conclusion, however, requires highly specialized training and equipment beyond the means of most communities. For this reason, regional haz-mat response teams have been formed in order to share the cost and responsibility of handling the haz-mat incident.

The chief's request for the haz-mat team was relayed to the county, which activated pagers carried by two members of each fire department in Western Wayne County. Information on the nature of the incident, wind conditions and the location of the staging area was also conveyed. As team members responded, a special trailer containing the team's equipment left Metro Airport and headed for the scene.

While the local fire department worked to cordon off the area and assist with the evacuation, a call to CHEMTREC, an emergency information clearinghouse, provided additional information regarding the substance. Based on the conditions, it was determined that firefighters in regular "turnout" gear with self-contained breathing apparatuses could effect a safe rescue of the persons lying on the ground outside the rear door to the factory. These patients were removed to ambulances specially set up to handle "contaminated" patients, and

the hospital was notified of the condition of the patients and the substance to which they had been exposed.

When the haz-mat team arrived at the scene, the team's commander consulted with the chief. A decision was made to attempt entry to see if the leak could be plugged. Working together with the local Fire Department, assignments were made and two haz-mat team members wearing special protective suits entered the plant. The leak, caused by a broken valve, was successfully plugged, and as the member of the entry team went to the decontamination area the vapor cloud began to dissipate. Within hours, conditions had stabilized and the residents of the neighborhood allowed to return to their homes. A potentially life-threatening incident had been handled successfully.

Local man faces trial for CSC

A Northville resident facing charges of criminal sexual conduct goes to court tomorrow, July 14.

Robert Allen Chace Jr., 22, a former South Lyon resident now living in Northville, is going to trial in Oakland County Circuit Court on two counts of second-degree criminal sexual conduct.

The non-jury trial will be heard before Circuit Judge Richard D. Kuhn.

Chace was arrested by the Oakland County Sheriff's Department March 18 on charges that he molested a minor February 16.

In April, the sheriff's department denied a Freedom of Information Act request by the South Lyon Herald seeking a copy of the March 18 police

report on the alleged incident.

The incident involved a 9-year-old girl who was visiting Chace's cousin's house on Valentine's Day weekend. The girl testified at an April 6 preliminary examination in 52nd District Court that Chace lay down on the mattress she was on and touched her that night, and made her touch his penis.

"He took my hand and touched his private with my hand," she said. "He touched my private . . . my boob," she added, referring to her breast.

Chace stood mute at an April 20 circuit court appearance, and a not guilty charge was entered on his behalf.

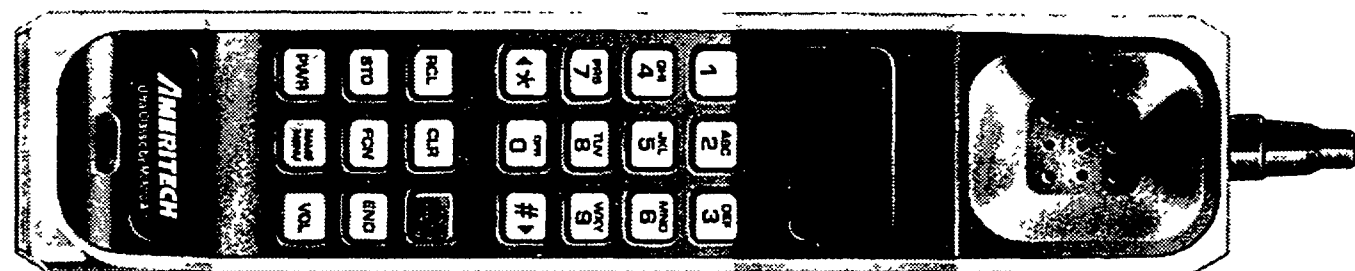

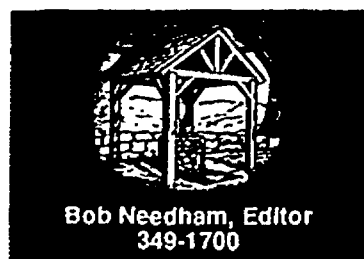

Vorva earns a shot at term in state House

A year ago around this time, the question was almost the same. Which of three newcomers — Georgina Goss, Jerry Vorva, or Deborah Whyman — would make the best state representative?

At the time, we thought the answer was Goss. But it's been an eventful year, in which a lot of things came to light concerning her tenure as Northville Township supervisor. Much of what we learned, we have taken strong exception to on this page. We continue to stand by those opinions.

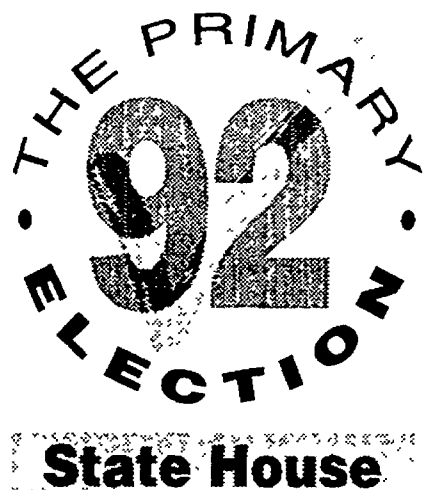
Goss' tenure thus far in Lansing is almost not a factor. She has introduced a handful of bills, all of which are reasonable but not momentous. None have made much progress, but it would be unrealistic to expect any different of a first-year legislator from the minority party.

With her local tenure thus providing the best basis for considering the race, it should come as no surprise that this year we change positions. We do not believe Goss operates in a manner which area residents want or deserve to represent them in the state House. In the Republican primary next month — which decides the seat, with no Democrat running — we think a change is needed.

Who, then, provides the best alternative? In our opinion, **JERRY VORVA** is the clear choice.

Of the three challengers to Goss this year, Vorva is the only one to hold elective office. That's not a prerequisite by any means, but his experience on the Plymouth City Commission should prove valuable in learning the Lansing ropes. Additionally, he can rightly point with pride to significant accomplishments made during his official role in Plymouth.

On the down side, we still tend to



think Vorva has a somewhat unrealistic view of what he will be able to accomplish at the state level. And he could certainly tone down his rhetoric somewhat to allow more breathing room for his root ideas and opinions — which are well-thought-out and capable of standing on their own.

Of the other challengers, Robert Bernard presents a unique alternative for voters looking for a particularly conservative voice, or a pro-life one (the other three candidates all offer varying degrees of pro-choice philosophy). Ronald Ambrose, whose only goal is politics (which makes us a little nervous), is personable and ready to represent the will of the district, but does not strike us as a leader.

Vorva displays more energy and more ideas than the other candidates. If voters are looking to get things accomplished and change the way Lansing operates, we think he's the best person to do it.

The question this year is similar to what it was a year ago. But we think the answer has changed.

How do we get state to leave schools alone?

How do we convince these folks up in Lansing to leave our school district alone? The state Legislature recently passed its so-called "school aid" bill — perhaps it should be renamed the "school affliction" bill — and again this year it dealt major damage to the Northville School District.

The exact financial impact of the latest bill is difficult to calculate, because so many different factors come into play. All that's clear is that "recapturing" of state school payments, a cut off of payments for social security of teachers, and other Lansing gimmicks will again leave Northville holding the bag.

Why would they do that? There apparently are a good many lawmakers in Lansing who are convinced Northville, and many communities like it, are "rich" or at least "wealthy." And they've concluded that there must be "equity in education." No longer should there be vast discrepancies in the amount of money spent on education between richer and poorer school districts. The solution, they apparently believe, is to take from the rich and give to the poor — thus the bill has been dubbed the "Robin Hood

scheme. It's the idea that led to tax-base sharing last year and more school aid cuts this year.

We might not mind if we could see a positive impact from all this. But we don't. The amount trimmed from our budget, once divided up among all the other school districts across the state, seems to make little difference to their fiscal situations.

Nor do we see the state sacrificing. The percentage of the state's budget spend on education continues to decline, just as it has done for the last two decades. Before we should be asked — forced — to give up so much, the state government should be restoring at least some of the huge sums it has cut from education funding over the last 20 years ... at least some.

So either the state legislators have concluded Northville, and communities like it, have somehow become responsible for fixing the school financing crisis statewide, or they've given up on the idea of fix school financing and decided the only way to get "equity in education" is to destroy the top school districts.

Because of the hangups with the city planning process, our location in the Novi Expo Center wasn't a sure thing until only recently. Initially we'll have 24,000 square feet at the Expo Center's west end, but there'll

be expansion to follow.

Watch this space for more developments on the Hall of Fame.

On that same note, some congratulations are due to Blair Bowman and company at the Expo Center. The facility has ironed out deals to host two big shows previously anchored at Cobo Hall in Detroit, those being the boat show and the camper/RV show.

Those two have to be among the top five annual shows of their kind hosted by Cobo. To steal them away to Novi is quite a coup.

If you've never been inside the Expo Center, it's difficult to imagine the sheer expanse of space inside. There's enough ceiling clearance throughout to drive a semi truck. The main hall takes several minutes just to walk from one end of it to the other. Imagine the Pontiac Silverdome with a 16-foot ceiling.

The only drawbacks the Expo Center has now are parking and temperature control. The parking situation will change as the center proves its worth. But the climate situation could be, to use a summery kind of word, sticky. There are heaters, but no air conditioning.

Jerry LeBlanc had a creative solution that was so screwy, it just might work.

He suggested building an ice hockey rink in the middle of the place. The heat exchangers needed to refrigerate the rink could heat the rest of the building in winter. In the summer time, you could send the cold air throughout the facility.

The kicker is that all year round, you collect \$100 an hour or so from any group that wants to rent ice time, so customers pay your heating and air conditioning bill.

"It's thermodynamics," Jerry said. "It'll work."

As an individual who ran against the longest serving Republican (retiring Rep. William Broomfield), I ought to be the biggest advocate for term limitations. I don't support term limitations.

It doesn't address the problem. It's good rhetoric, but it doesn't address the problem — the cost of a campaign. My budget for a campaign being a half-million dollars. That's outrageous. There are other candidates in this campaign who have personal wealth and plan on spending millions

of dollars running this race. In the last campaign I spent something less than \$100,000 and barely made a dent in the electorate. To make a dent and have a chance you've got to get your message.

What do you consider to be the major achievement of your life?

I look at the major achievement of my life as something that hasn't yet occurred. That is the raising of my children. I look forward to the day when I can say I am really pleased and proud of my kids.

Right now, I have spent a tremendous amount of time helping WDET, a public radio station, and was recently honored by being elected the chairman of the community advisory board. It was something I didn't ask for. I believe in the station and the need for that kind of communication.

their fair share then we should adjust to that way.

Would you support cuts in entitlements like those for Medicaid, social security, women and children, and veterans benefits to help balance the budget?

I wouldn't cut any of those.

What about the defense budget?

Yes, I would cut that within reason. The cold war is over. There should be something of a peace dividend. We've not seen it. Of course the Persian Gulf war was a very interesting thing. It would be very interesting to find out exactly why that war took place, only in light of the fact that it didn't seem to accomplish

what it set out to do.

Besides defense, is there any other area of the budget where you would support cuts?

I think the way (the budget) would be cut is that fourth-quarter spending. I think it's going to take at least three years to get back on track. I think we have a situation where we have an enormous amount of unnecessary spending, other people use the term "waste in government." Pliers that are \$400 that you can get at the local ACO for \$2.50. That stuff is totally uncalled-for. Those are extreme cases. Every department should be looked at, not just the military. And when I say cut the military, I mean within reason.

Do you think a trade treaty with Mexico will help or hurt the U.S. economy, particularly the automotive industry?

There are two parts to this question. One is jobs, the other is the poverty.

With regards to jobs, I think a trade treaty ought to be looked at very carefully and very cautiously. I think it should not be at the expense of American autoworkers' jobs this side of the border.

On the other hand, I think anything we can do in a collaborative effort to help Mexico rise from the devastating lifestyle it has since the earthquake of several years ago is important to us. They are our neighbors to the south.

What would you consider to be the major achievement in your life?

Kennedy said that to live one's life to the full is the goal, to use your talents and your abilities to their best. That's my major achievement. Even in this race I've had several people who have said I've not done it the right way. I was supposed to become mayor of the city first — then state representative and state senator.

But I read my Constitution. It says right here in Article Two — it's just beautiful — "House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen every second year by the people of the several states and the electors in these states shall have the qualifications and no person shall be a representative who shall not have attained to the age of 25 years and seven years a citizen of the United States and who shall not, when elected, be an inhabitant of that state in which he shall be chosen."

My greatest achievement is I continue to be a free spirit at age 46 rather than being locked into what people tell me was supposed to happen when I was 22. That I was supposed to put all my ideals over here and just get down to the business of 30 years and out. Then retire and play golf somewhere in Florida or Arizona until someday God calls me home.

Word presented the committee with his own 11-point list of public policy criteria, drawn up before the June 29 town meeting.

Under Word's criteria, the city should retain control of Ford Field for recreation, but not acquire the plant itself "unless through referendum."

"We're really no business moving forward on acquisition unless we're willing to sacrifice on some other areas, and I'm not sure we as a community are willing to do that," Word said.

Other criteria include encouraging reuse of at least part of the plant for a library or community center, including the township in the plant's reuse, retaining the building's historic character, maintaining public access to the waterway, and avoiding adverse impact on neighboring commercial and residential areas.

When Word asked whether Northville Township would consider a joint reuse of part of the plant, Henningsen's response was, "I think we're in the same financial stress you find yourself in."

For the most part committee members agreed that Ford Field should be kept, and possibly expanded, for recreation use. Presley presented a sketch of the Ford property west of Griswold showing the addition of a regulation-size soccer field east of the present one, overlapping the current parking lot. The sketch still allowed for a narrow lot along Griswold that could accommodate 50-60 cars.

While Romine was pleased with the possibility of more soccer fields, Word liked the possibility of maintaining parking for private and public use.

Member David Totten was fearful that the city was not pursuing one proposed reuse with enough vigor. "There are two public uses that I would like to see served. One is recreation, which is being served. Two is a library, which is being blindsided right out of the conversation," he said.

"I am not the optimist you guys are," he said, worrying that a private developer is not likely to consider the community's needs in reusing the plant.

Presley disagreed, saying, "If we can keep our doors in the door, one possibility is that we could become party to the agreement."

"If we are going to do that," Totten said, "we have to be in early talking to Ford . . . so that we have some impact on the deal that is cooked up before it's hardened."

Totten also objected to the Northville Community Chamber of Commerce's contention that reuse of the plant should provide as much tax base as possible for the city. He argued that such a short-range goal could conflict with the community's long-range needs.

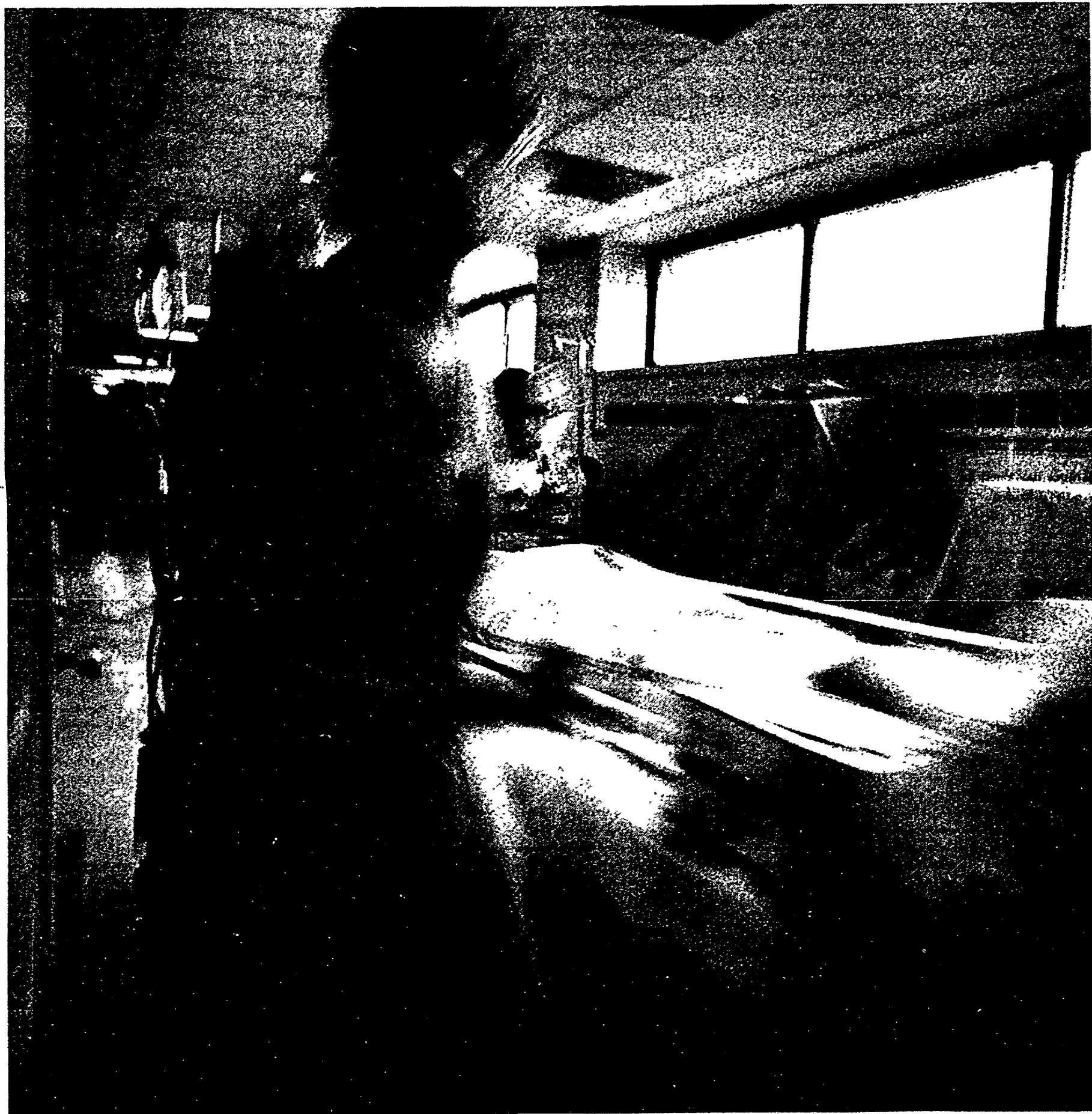
While Totten pushed for public reuse of at least part of the plant, Henningsen mentioned that the changing political climate may be less receptive to that. Ever-rising tax rates have forced residents to reconsider adding public uses and services, he said, and argue for a more balanced tax base instead of lower residential property taxes.

Ferrari wines thrive on blend of growing sites

Don Carano is a Reno, Nev., attorney and owner of the Eldorado Hotel and Casino. In 1981, he and his wife, Rhonda, founded Ferrari-Carano Vineyards and Winery in Sonoma County's Dry Creek Valley.

Their stylistic goal is creation of multi-dimensional, complex wines through blending individually fermented lots grown in a variety of climates and soils.

Fruits for the Ferrari-Carano wines originate from four different viticultural areas within Sonoma County: Dry Creek Valley, Alexander Valley, Knights Valley and Carneros. The 500 acres of winery-owned vineyards are tended by Barney Fernandez, one of the best vineyard managers in California, who has been instrumental in the acquisition and development of new vineyard sites.

The Ferrari-Carano vineyards are spread over a 50-mile radius which encompasses both hill-sides and valley floor locations. "Mountain soil is less hospitable, stressing the vines and producing smaller crops," Fernandez said. "When blended with the softer fruit from the valley floor, the result is a more complex wine style."

The first Ferrari-Carano releases were white wines, chardonnay and fume blanc, with impressive fruit balanced by the indelible imprint of barrel fermentation. The Caranos are now escalating their efforts to develop their red wine program. The core of this effort is to give their winemaker George Bursick all the tools he needs to produce richly concentrated, Bordeaux-style red wines.

The vineyards are planted to cabernet sauvignon, merlot, cabernet franc, malbec and petite verdot, the five red varietals used in Bordeaux. Bursick has overseen the design and construction of a state-of-the-art winery but is a firm believer that technology should not be over-used.

"The best wines are grown in the vineyard and the winemaker must be a good caretaker," he said.

Grapes, harvested for the red wine program are fermented and aged in separate lots to retain the special taste identities of their unique origins. Each is treated as an individual, capable of making a special contribution when the blend is assembled. The varied supply of fruit provides Bursick the palette of flavors and aromas he needs to achieve the multi-dimensional wine that has become the Ferrari-Carano signature.

The most recent addition to the red wine program is an 8,400-square-foot, Bordeaux-style, underground, temperature and humidity controlled, barrel aging cellar holding 1,500 60-gallon capacity French oak barrels. When a first-time visitor sees the cellar, with its vaulted ceiling and wine-stained French cooperage, it brings back the sight of the barrel chain at Chateau Mouton-Rothschild.

The cellar is situated next to the future site of "Villa Fiore" — a 14,500-square-foot Italianate villa designed to become the new Ferrari-Carano public tasting room and visitor's center. This spectacular property is fast becoming Sonoma County's destination winery for the aficionado touring California's wine country.

The wines of Ferrari-Carano available locally include a melony 1991 Fume Blanc (\$11), a flavorful 1990 Chardonnay (\$20), a rich, oaky 1989 Reserve Chardonnay (\$32), an intense 1989 Merlot (\$17) and a generous and supple 1988 Cabernet Sauvignon (\$15).

A Cherry Jubilee

Foreman's Orchards harvests cherries

When you think of Foreman's Orchards in Northville, you probably think of fall weekends, apple cider and doughnuts.

But did you know that the orchard, a Northville fixture since the 1930s, also takes part in the summer cherry harvest? Every year at this time some 20 to 30 tons of shiny, plump cherries in sweet and tart pie varieties, grown right on the property, are sold at the farm's store.

"We've had cherries for a number of years," said Ralph Foreman, the retiring owner of Foreman's Orchards. "We're the only orchard in this area that grows cherries, sweet or sour."

Harvesting of the farm's 20 acres of cherries began late last week, and doors opened on Saturday. A bountiful crop for 1992 will last about two and a half weeks. In addition to selling the fruit at the farm store on Seven Mile Road west of Beck, Foreman's cherries will be available at the Northville and Plymouth farmers' markets as well.

In addition to cherries, the farm will sell locally grown produce. As the seasons allow, Foreman's will offer sweet corn, tomatoes, green beans and green peppers, as well as the farm's own apples.

The Foreman family first farmed its 80-acre plot in 1905. In 1932 and 1933 it was planted into orchards and the farm market was opened. Over the years, apples, pears, cherries and peaches have been grown by three generations of the Foreman family. The cider press and doughnut making facility were added in 1972.

This year, things will be a bit different, however, as Ralph Foreman turns over operation of the farm to the Pereira family. Jack and Sandra Pereira, with their children Jude, Jessica, Justin and Jared, will box up all the bushels for sale.

Jude Pereira said the family intends to offer the same line of products that has always been available at Foreman's. Having just painted a fresh coat of sealer on the sales floor, Pereira points out counters and shelves where soon popcorn, preserves, honey and syrup will be sold. Seasonal produce will be the mainstay, right up through the Christmas Tree season next December.

"We'll have the market open now through the first of January," he said. "We may even have fall hayrides."

The Pereiras, a South Lyon farming family, are longtime friends of the Foremans, according to Ralph.

"The way we started out was his father grew a lot of pumpkins," said Foreman. "I sold a lot of his pumpkins at my place. He told me that if I wanted to retire, he'd go ahead and sell the pumpkins himself."

"So it will run under the same name. They want to carry on the good will and reputation of the family name."

The rustic environs of the market and cider mill are surrounded by dark-paneled walls. But there's an airiness about the place, owing to the wide expanses of floor space. Walking around the market, Foreman explains that the place is "bigger than it looks."

There's indoor seating for 30 people, a 40-by-60-foot room for sorting and processing of apples, and another 40-by-60 refrigerated room for cold storage.

"We have a storage capacity for 15,000 bushels of apples," said Foreman. "That's about three truckloads."

But the focus now is on the cherries, which Foreman says have been a favorite in the family down through the years.

"Here's a tip for you if you want a little change in your pie-making," he said. "Try mixing sweet and tart pie cherries together. My mother used to use about half of each, and it made a great pie."

Blend cherries for popular pies

CHERRY PIE

Pastry for a 2-crust 9-inch pie
1 cup sugar (or to taste)
2 to 3 tablespoons cornstarch
Pinch salt
Flavoring options (see variations)
5 cups pitted cherries
1 tablespoon butter or margarine
Egg glaze (optional: recipe follows)

Yields 8 servings.

Preheat oven to 425 F. Line 9-inch pie plate with dough.

Mix sugar, cornstarch and salt. Toss with cherries. Fill pie shell with fruit, dot with butter and top with an upper crust. Seal and flute edge. Cherry Pie often is given a lattice crust on top.

Paint the crust with Egg Glaze. Bake for 50 to 60 minutes, until fruit is bubbly and crust is brown. Serve warm or at room temperature. Cherry Pie may be accompanied by sweetened whipped cream or vanilla ice cream.

Variations: Any of these may be mixed into the cherries when being tossed with the sugar mixture: 3 or 4 drops of almond extract, a sprinkling of cinnamon or a sprinkling of ginger.

Cherry-Apple Pie: Replace up to half of the cherries with pared, cored and sliced Granny Smith or other cooking apples.

Cherry-Rhubarb Pie: Replace up to half of the cherries with trimmed, sliced

rhubarb; additional sugar will be required.

Egg Glaze: Beat 1 egg with 1 tablespoon water.

Here's an interesting pie, attributed to Zenda Cabral of Holladay, Utah. The dish is taken from "American Pie Celebration," a booklet published by Procter & Gamble Co.

The recipe calls for sour cherries, available frozen or fresh. You can substitute 5 cups of pitted fresh sweet cherries, cutting sugar to ½ cup. You need more volume of fresh cherries, because they will cook down more.

UTAH'S BEST CHERRY PIE

1 cup sugar
2½ tablespoons cornstarch
¼ teaspoon cinnamon
¼ teaspoon salt
½ cup peach nectar (available canned)
½ cup Chambord liqueur (optional: see note)
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
Pastry for a 2-crust 9-inch pie
3½ cups thawed frozen drypack pitted red tart cherries, well drained
Egg Glaze (see preceding recipe)

Yields 8 servings.

Combine sugar, corn-starch, cinnamon and salt in medium saucepan. Stir in nectar and liqueur. Cook and stir

over medium heat until thickened and clear. Add butter, stirring until melted. Cool.

Preheat oven to 425 F. Line 9-inch pie pan with pastry. Add cherries to nectar mixture. Pour into crust. Top with upper crust, which may be lattice-style, and bake about 40 minutes. Cool until slightly warm or room temperature.

Note: Chambord is a sweet, raspberry-flavored liqueur. You could substitute an equal amount of sieved raspberry jam. Or try cassis syrup or black currant jelly.

Fresh cherries make interesting salsa or chutney.

CHERRY SALSA

1 cup pitted cherries
2 tablespoons fresh chopped basil
1 tablespoon finely chopped green peppers
1 teaspoon lemon juice
¼ teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
¼ teaspoon grated lemon zest
Salt to taste
Red pepper sauce to taste

Yields about ¾ cup

In a food processor, or with a knife, chop cherries. Combine with remaining ingredients. Refrigerate at least 1 hour.

Chef Mary Brady

The real Diamond Jim made eating a hobby



I'm always asked if I'm related to "the" Diamond Jim Brady. My answer is always the same. "If I were, I'd be sitting on a beach in Hawaii. Or, better yet, on my 150-foot mega-yacht."

James Brady, my father-in-law, was the founder of Diamond Jim Brady's restaurant. It was his idea to associate the two, as Diamond Jim was somewhat of a legend in the '20s and '30s. Today, very few people could tell you who he was.

He earned his name as a result of the tremendous jewel collection that he acquired during his lifetime. It included a 33-carat scarf pin that cost him close to \$2 million. When questioned as to the authenticity of the diamond, he would carve the initials D.J.B. in the doubler's window, one way to assure that they'd never forget.

Diamond Jim's other claim to fame was the monstrous amounts of food that he consumed during a day. Astronomical portions. It is said that eating was the only thing to do for recreation during this time in history. It is often referred to as the era of the 15-course dinner.

Brady was an expert diner. Ironically he was born the son of a free-lunch-counter-and-saloon operator. His first job, that of hotel bellboy, he ate as much as he worked. His career was that of a salesman

of railroad equipment, a profession at which he excelled.

A napkin around his neck would start each meal. One on a knee would have been useless, as Jim's stomach started at his neck and swelled into gigantic proportions.

For breakfast, a full gallon of orange juice, hominy, eggs, cornbread, muffins, flapjacks, chops, fried potatoes and a beef-steak began his day. He did not drink any alcohol, but did ingest gallons of orange juice a day. It supposedly extended his life.

His midmorning snack was served at 11:30 and consisted of two or three dozen clams and oysters. An hour later was lunch: more oysters, clams, crabs, broiled lobsters, a joint of beef, salad and several types of pie. Then an afternoon snack, a heaping platter of seafood.

Now it was time for a nap, a rest to get

ready for dinner. Again oysters began the meal. Often three dozen Lynnhaven oysters each measuring six inches from tip to tip. The oysters were specially picked out by Maryland dealers who knew about the legendary eater.

Following would be six crabs, two portions of green turtle soup, a deluge of lobsters, six or seven of the monsters, two whole ducks, a steak, vegetables and platters of French pastry.

As a conclusion to the meal, Brady would order a two-pound box of candy. "They make the food set better," he declared. And of course a late night snack was always in order.

Over a 16-hour span, Jim consumed immense amounts of food. Once at a dinner party, the hostess asked him icily how he knew when his appetite was satiated. He answered, "Why ma'am, I'll tell you.

Whenever I sit down to a meal, I always make it a point to leave just four inches between my stomach and the edge of the table. And then when I can feel them rubbin' together pretty hard, I know I've had enough."

Most of his eating was done out. One restaurateur declared Brady "one of the best 25 customers we've ever had."

In the end, of course, the strain took its toll. At 56, it was discovered that his stomach was six times larger than a normal person's. When offered a new stomach, he considered it only for a moment. He would have to live with care and diet to get another 10 years out of his life.

He opted against it. At 61, five years later, he died in Atlantic City.

Muer restaurants release recipes

Chuck Muer is sharing some of the recipes that have made his restaurants successful in "The Simply Great Cookbook."

Simply put, the cookbook is great. Subtitled "Recipes and the Experience of Fine Dining from the Kitchens of Chuck Muer," (Momentum Books, Ltd., Ann Arbor) the book presents the culinary creations and wisdom of legendary Loretto (Chef Larry) Pagliara, his successor Chef "Rocky" Rachwitz of Livonia, and many others.

Rachwitz and pastry chef Carmen Vilcan tested many of the recipes at home.

"When we make soup at the restaurant, we use 20 gallons of chicken broth, 20 pounds of beans. You can't take a calculator and reduce the amount," said Rachwitz. "Restaurant pots and pans are different from the ones you use at home. We had to rebuild every recipe, and rework it using

the kinds of pots and pans you use at home."

This kind of attention to detail is what makes Muer's cookbook special. The chefs also provide lots of tips. For example, bacon is easier to slice if you freeze it first. Use a sharp knife and slice it while frozen. Here's another—Using arrowroot as a thickening agent insures a clear sauce and enhances the colors of vegetables and peppers.

Beginning cooks will appreciate the tips for cooking pasta, cleaning mussels, roasting red peppers, and opening clams. There are also a lot of definitions for things like key limes, zest, and roux.

Creative cooks will enjoy the suggested variations for recipes—roasted walnuts can be used in place of toasted pine nuts, or use the raspberry-maple dressing as a marinade for seafood and poultry.

Backgrounds and anecdotes about the dishes and those who created them make the book a captivating "read," for those who prefer to leave the cooking to Muer and his chefs.

The book took its name from Muer's philosophy that everything about the meal—the food, its presentation, the atmosphere—must be "simply great," with as much accent on "simply" as on "great."

Cherries make more than just pies

This salsa goes well with chicken, pork or boiled fish. It is best served when recently made; the flavors dilute with storage.

CHERRY CHUTNEY

4 cups cherries, pitted
4 cups fresh peaches, peeled, pitted and sliced
2 1/2 cups brown sugar
2 cups cider vinegar
1 medium lemon, seeded and chopped
1/2 cup raisins
1/4 cup chopped onion
3 tablespoons fresh ginger, minced
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
1 clove garlic, minced
1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper

Yields 2 1/2 pints.

Combine all ingredients. Bring to a boil in large saucepan with heavy bottom. Simmer about 2 hours, until mixture thickens, stirring frequently. Ladle into hot canning jars to within 1/4 inch of tops. Seal according to jar maker's instructions. Place jars in rack in large pot of

boiling water with 2 inches above jar tops. Boil 15 minutes. Cool on racks. After 12 hours test for proper seal.

Alternatively, prepared chutney may be kept covered in the refrigerator for a week or two.

This chutney may be served with poultry or pork.

To preserve cherries for later in the year, you have these choices:

● Freezing: Wash cherries, drain well and place as they are in plastic bags; seal. At 0 F, they will keep up to a year. If you like, you can pit them in advance. To use, thaw only partly.

● Canning: Wash and stem cherries; pit, if you like. Prepare a sugar to 3 parts water until dissolved. Place cherries in canning jar and cover with syrup to within 1/4 inch of top. Seal according to jar maker's instructions. Place on rack in large pot of boiling water; cover jars to a depth of 2 inches. Process 20 minutes for pints, 30 minutes for quarts.

● Dehydrating: Regular and convection ovens that allow the proper temperature may be used instead of specially made dehydrators. However, you will need trays that permit air circulation. Wash and stem cherries. Pit and cut in half. Place skin side down on dryer trays. Dry at 135

degrees for 12 to 15 hours. When ready, the cherries will be leathery and sticky. Store in plastic bags in a cool, dry place.

Dried cherries may be used like raisins in many recipes, for example:

DRIED CHERRY MUFFINS

1 cup sifted all-purpose flour
1 cup whole-wheat flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup dried cherries
1/2 cup honey
1 egg
1 cup milk
1/2 cup oil

Yields 12 muffins

Preheat oven to 400 F. Grease muffin tin for 12 muffins. Mix together flours, baking powder and salt. Add dried cherries and toss until the cherries are well coated.

Separately, beat honey, egg, milk and oil until well blended. Pour into flour mixture and stir until just blended. Do not overmix. Divide batter among muffin tins. Bake 25 minutes.

CHERRIES JUBILEE

4 cups pitted fresh cherries
4 tablespoons sugar (or to taste)
2 tablespoons butter
2 to 3 tablespoons brandy
Vanilla ice cream

Yields 4 to 6 servings.

Combine cherries and sugar. Melt butter in large frying pan. When hot, add cherries and saute gently until fruit is glazed and syrup forms in pan. Add brandy, and standing well back, ignite alcohol fumes that arise from pan. Be careful when you do this so that you do not get burned.

Shake pan to encourage alcohol to burn. As flames begin to die back, spoon the fruit and its juices over scoops of ice cream.

Variations: You can use the same technique with cut up plums, peaches or apricots. Apple, pear and pineapple chunks also work well. The fruit may also be spooned over crepes.

Safety note: Do not use an excessive amount of alcohol or you may get too high a flame-up.

Break your cereal out of breakfast doldrums

When you pour your daily bowlful of corn-flakes or zap up a quick dish of oatmeal, you probably think you are preparing a fairly pedestrian repast. Actually, you are about to eat a food named after Ceres, goddess of grain.

Ancient Romans held a yearly festival — the Cerealia — to honor this divine Olympian and to seek her aid in gathering a bountiful harvest.

Today, the term "cereal" can refer to one of three things: the edible seeds of certain grasses, the grasses themselves, or, especially in this country, to the variety of processed breakfast products that come from them. These are the cereals you will find in artfully designed boxes lining the aisles of any grocery store. Most ready-to-eat breakfast cereals are made from wheat, corn, oats and rice.

The United States is one of the few countries where cold grain is eaten as the morning meal — although cereal is becoming more accepted elsewhere, even in faraway Japan, where a typical breakfast may consist of a bowl of noodles in broth served with fish and vegetables (I've tried it — and it's surprisingly delicious, even at 7 a.m.).

If you're always in a rush in the morning, or if you're on a diet, you may find breakfast the easiest meal of the day to skip. But don't do it. Some researchers have found that children who eat breakfast show significant improvement in academic functioning. It makes sense that adults should function

better on the job, too, after a nourishing morning meal.

A healthy breakfast (of between 300 and 400 calories) should supply about one-quarter of the day's nutrients. Avoid the traditional fried eggs and bacon because of the high fat content of these foods. Instead, choose foods high in carbohydrates (to get you going throughout the morning).

A good balanced breakfast might include a bowl of dry or cooked cereal with milk, an orange or banana, and a slice of toasted whole-grain bread with peanut butter for protein. (The Japanese breakfast would also be a good choice!)

Cereals, like oatmeal, that must be cooked are a good source of low-fat complex carbohydrates and they generally go through little processing, so you get the real thing.

Highly processed cereals (especially the ready-to-eat kind with the cute names designed for kids) generally have plenty of added sugar and may have added fat. Check the ingredients label on a box of cereal before you buy, if you want to avoid these added ingredients.

Don't store opened dry cereals more than three months on the kitchen shelf. Store whole-grain cereals and wheat germ in an air-tight container in the refrigerator where they will keep fresh up to six months after opening. Cooked cereal will keep, refrigerated, up to four days.

If the same old bowl of oatmeal every

morning is beginning to lose its appeal, try zapping a batch of Your Own Granola — you will get all the goodness of oats, but in a delightfully crunchy form.

Jack's Party Mix and Plantation Crunch Balls offer two options for transforming your basic breakfast cereal into tasty microwaved snacks to enjoy later in the day.

(Recipes in this column are tested in 625- to 700-watt microwave ovens.)

MICRO-TIP OF THE WEEK

"Instant" hot cereals (the kind that come in a packet and to which you add boiling water) are easy to prepare, but expensive. You'll find it's much cheaper to buy the same cereal in bulk and microwave. It's about as fast as "instant" too — a minute or two per serving.

YOUR OWN GRANOLA

2 ½ cups uncooked oatmeal
¼ cup coarsely chopped walnuts or pecans, or toasted slivered almonds
¼ cup wheat germ
1 teaspoon cinnamon
¼ cup honey
¼ cup melted butter or margarine
½ teaspoon vanilla extract
¼ cup raisins

Yields about 4 cups.
Preparation time: 10 to 15 minutes.
Cooking time: 7 to 9 minutes.

Oven setting: High (100 percent power).

Combine oatmeal, nuts, wheat germ and cinnamon in large microwave-safe mixing bowl; stir to mix well. Combine honey, butter and vanilla extract in 1-cup glass measure. Microwave about 1 minute, to melt. Stir and drizzle over oatmeal mixture, tossing to coat evenly.

Microwave 6 to 8 minutes, stirring every minute, just until light golden brown.

Fold in raisins and spread onto an ungreased cookie sheet to cool. Store in airtight container and refrigerate.

JACK'S PARTY MIX

4 cups small shredded wheat squares
2 cups small cheese crackers
2 cups thin pretzels
1 cup salted Spanish peanuts
½ cup butter or margarine
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon soy sauce
½ teaspoon each onion and garlic powder
¼ cup grated Parmesan cheese

Yields about 2 ½ quarts.
Preparation time: 10 to 15 minutes.

Cooking time: 6 to 9 minutes.
Oven setting: High (100 percent power); Medium-high (70 percent power).
In 3-quart microwave-safe bowl combine

wheat squares, crackers, pretzels and peanuts. Toss to mix and set aside.

Combine butter, Worcestershire sauce and soy sauce in 2-cup glass measure; microwave at high setting for 1 minute, or until melted. Add onion and garlic powder; stir to dissolve. Drizzle over mixture in bowl, tossing to coat evenly.

Microwave, uncovered, at medium-high setting 5 to 8 minutes, or until mixture begins to toast, tossing gently every 2 minutes. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese, toss, and serve warm or at room temperature. Store in air-tight container.

PLANTATION CRUNCH BALLS

1 pound chocolate almond bark
1 cup miniature marshmallows
3 cups crisp rice cereal
1 cup dry-roasted peanuts

Yields 4 to 6 dozen balls.
Preparation time: 15 minutes.
Cooking time: 3 to 4 minutes, stirring once, or until it can be stirred smooth. Stir in remaining ingredient. Shape into 1-inch balls and drop onto waxed paper. Refrigerate 1 to 2 hours until firm.

Getting hooked on grilled fish

Grilling fish is a lot easier than you think. The possibilities are endless. If you like steak, consider meaty fish like Alaskan halibut or salmon, shark, tuna or mahi-mahi. Scallops and shrimp can be paired with vegetables and fruit on a skewer.

"You can put Little Neck clams on the grill in the shell, when they open they're done, brush with some barbecue sauce," said Nick Tringali, who manages Jack's Seafood Market at 33224 W. Twelve Mile Road in Farmington Hills. "Oysters can be put on the grill too. Shuck them, leave half shell. When they start to bubble a little they're done."

A small whole fish like trout, salmon, striped bass or bluefish is also good grilled. Consider buying a fish grilling basket. They cost about \$13.95 for a small basket, \$20.95 for large. "It keeps the whole fish firm, and helps retain moisture," said Tringali.

"You've gotta have a clean grill, the grate and underneath," said Chef Chuck (Rocky) Rachwitz of Livonia, corporate executive chef for the C.A. Muer Corp. "Spray the grill with non-stick cooking spray."

Chef Steve Wren of the Metropolitan Musicale in Farmington Hills recommends finishing most seafood with a squeeze of lemon or lime as it's coming off the grill. "Never salt the fish until just before it goes on the grill," said Wren. "Other seasonings are OK. Never put salt on the fish after it's been put on the grill and

turned. Salt won't penetrate the cooked side of a fish."

Here are some more tips from the National Fisheries Institute.

Always buy fish and seafood from a reputable source. Fish should have a firm, elastic texture and a bright, shiny color. On a whole fish, the head, tail and backbone should still be intact.

Take a smell. The aroma should be mild and fresh, somewhat like a sea breeze. If it smells "fishy," it's not as fresh as it should be. Check for tightly closed shells on clams, oysters and mussels.

Start the fire about 30 minutes before you want to start cooking. Spread charcoal evenly to equally distribute heat. Adjust the grill to four to six inches above the heat. When the fire is moderately hot, it's time to cook.

The general guide for cooking seafood steaks is 10 minutes per inch of thickness at 450 degrees. "Every grill is different," said Rachwitz. "When you push the flesh of the fish with a fork and it starts to flake it's done. It's better to under-cook, than over-cook." When the fish flakes easily, and the watery, translucent appearance becomes milky and opaque, it's done.

Scallops turn opaque throughout when done, shrimp turns bright pink and the center, when cut open, is milky white.

If you're cooking a whole fish with the tail on check for doneness at the

In salad or on the grill, seafood sizzles

CRAB SALAD NICOISE

1 pound green beans, cut into 2-inch lengths
4 medium boiling potatoes (about 1 ½ pounds)
½ cup olive oil
¼ cup white wine vinegar
1 tablespoon thinly sliced chives or green onion
¼ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon pepper
6 cups torn butter lettuce leaves (1 head)
½ - 1 pound crabmeat or shrimp meat or crab-flavored surimi seafood, or canned tuna or salmon
¼ cup small ripe black olives
1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved

Cook potatoes in boiling water 30 minutes or until tender; drain, cool 10 minutes. Cut potatoes into 1-inch chunks and place in a shallow dish. Cook beans in boiling water 10 minutes or until tender; drain and cool 10 minutes. Add to potatoes. Combine oil, vinegar, salt and pepper in small jar with tight fitting lid. Shake well and pour ½ over potatoes and beans. Refrigerate, covered, 2 hours or up to 24 hours, stirring occasionally.

To serve, arrange lettuce on 4 plates and spoon potato bean mixture on top. Divide crabmeat among the plates and garnish with olives and tomatoes. Drizzle remaining dressing on top. Yield 4 servings. Serve with crusty French bread.

KABOBS OF SALMON SPIRALS AND SHELLFISH

¾ pound salmon fillets, skinned

4 sprigs fresh dillweed
1 medium zucchini
1 medium-sized yellow bell pepper
½ pound sea scallops or medium shrimp
½ cup lime juice
1 tablespoon reduced-calorie margarine, melted
2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
1 teaspoon chopped fresh dillweed
cucumber dill sauce (recipe below)

Cut salmon into strips 5 inches x 1 ½ inches. Place a sprig of dillweed on each strip. Curl each salmon strip to form a spiral; secure with a toothpick and set aside.

Cut zucchini in half lengthwise, then cut diagonally into ½ inch pieces; set aside. Cut pepper into quarters; remove seeds and stem. Cut each piece in half. Thread one salmon spiral (remove toothpicks) with scallops and/or shrimp, zucchini and peppers alternating onto 4 skewers. Place skewers in a large, shallow dish.

Combine lime juice and the next 3 ingredients; mix well and pour over kabobs. Cover and refrigerate 30 minutes.

Remove kabobs from marinade; set aside. Coat a grill with vegetable cooking spray. Place kabobs on grill 4 inches to 5 inches from hot coals. Grill, brushing kabobs with marinade and turning once, just until scallops are milky and opaque and salmon begins to flake when tested with a fork, allowing 4 to 5 minutes on each side.

Before serving, remove from the freezer, break into large chunks and blend again until smooth. Freeze for 15 more minutes. Meanwhile, puree raspberries and 2 tablespoons sugar in a food processor or blender until smooth. Strain if desired. Spoon equal amounts of raspberry sauce onto eight serving plates; top with Espresso Freeze. Makes 8 servings.

In a medium saucepan stir together sugar and cornstarch. Stir in sliced plums and water. Bring to boiling, stirring occasionally; reduce heat. Cover and simmer for 6 to 8 minutes or until the sauce is of the desired consistency. Cool the sauce slightly. Serve warm over vanilla ice cream. Top with fresh plum wedges. (Or make parfaits by layering sauce and ice cream.) Makes 2 cups sauce, 6 to 8 servings.

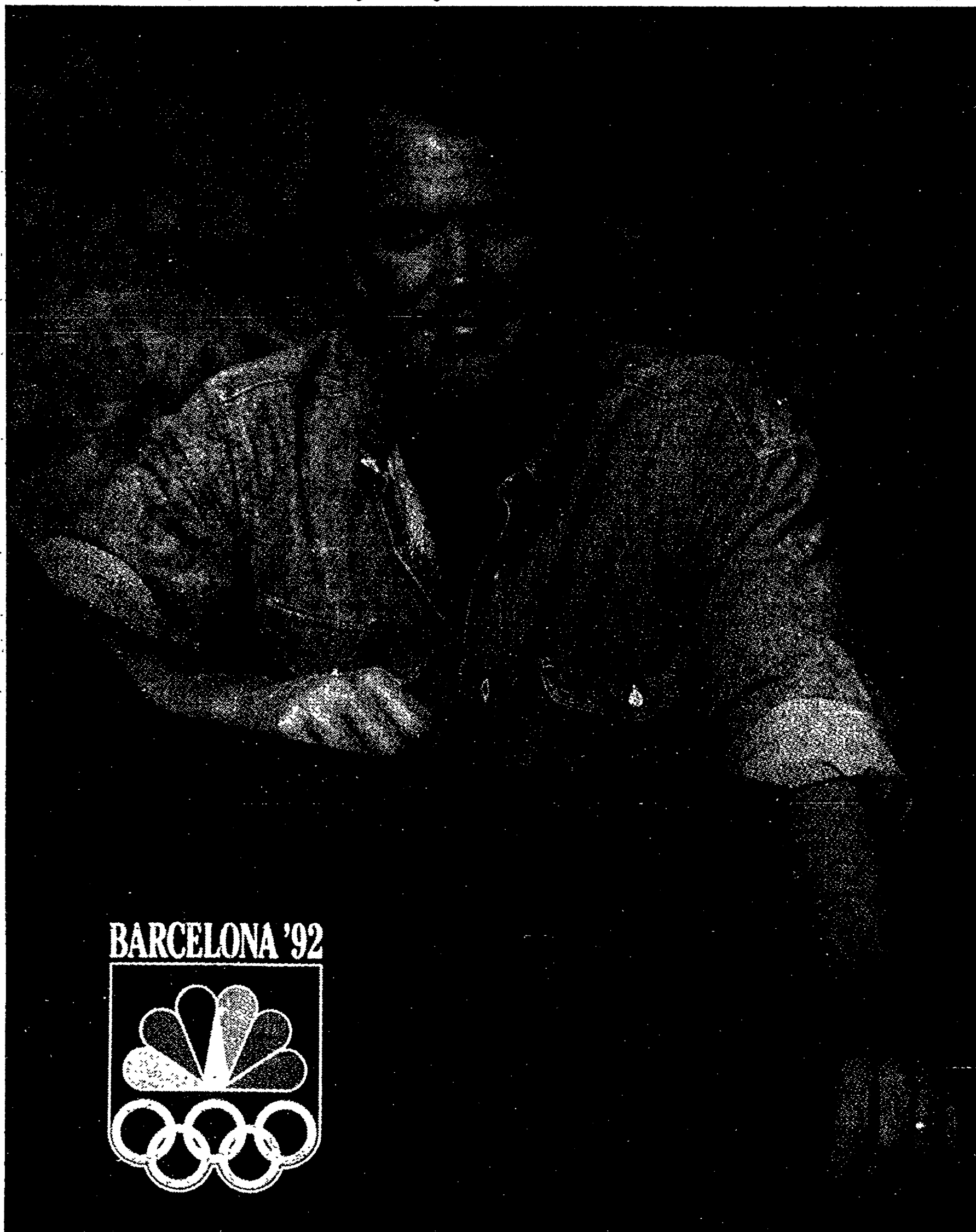

'Pinocchio' re-released, butchered on HBO

From the bait-and-switch school of programming comes a show designed to hoodwink subscription television's younger set. The bait is *Pinocchio*, the little Italian puppet boy, who returns to theaters this summer. But that's the Disney version.

The switch is another *Pinocchio*, a 52-episode animated series HBO has scheduled to air weekdays following *Babar* in the *HBO For Kids* morning block, beginning in July.

HBO's *Pinocchio* is the product of Japanese animator Tatsuo Yoshida, whose wildly uneven characters' only common trait is a penchant for ridiculing Pinocchio in howling fits of laughter.

The dialogue is erratic at best, and it's used for little else than explaining what the animation fails to show. "Cricket," who is apparently the cable version of Jiminy Cricket, is featured in an opening sequence, then reappears midway through the first episode to remind Pinocchio, "I am the ghost of the cricket who used to live with you!"

Without this dopey line, the viewer wouldn't have known that the insect had died.

HBO publicity promises a *Pinocchio* with "cherished" moral themes. But in the first two episodes he's beaten into submission by a drunken puppeteer, repeatedly mocked and largely responsible for the drowning death of a schoolmate.





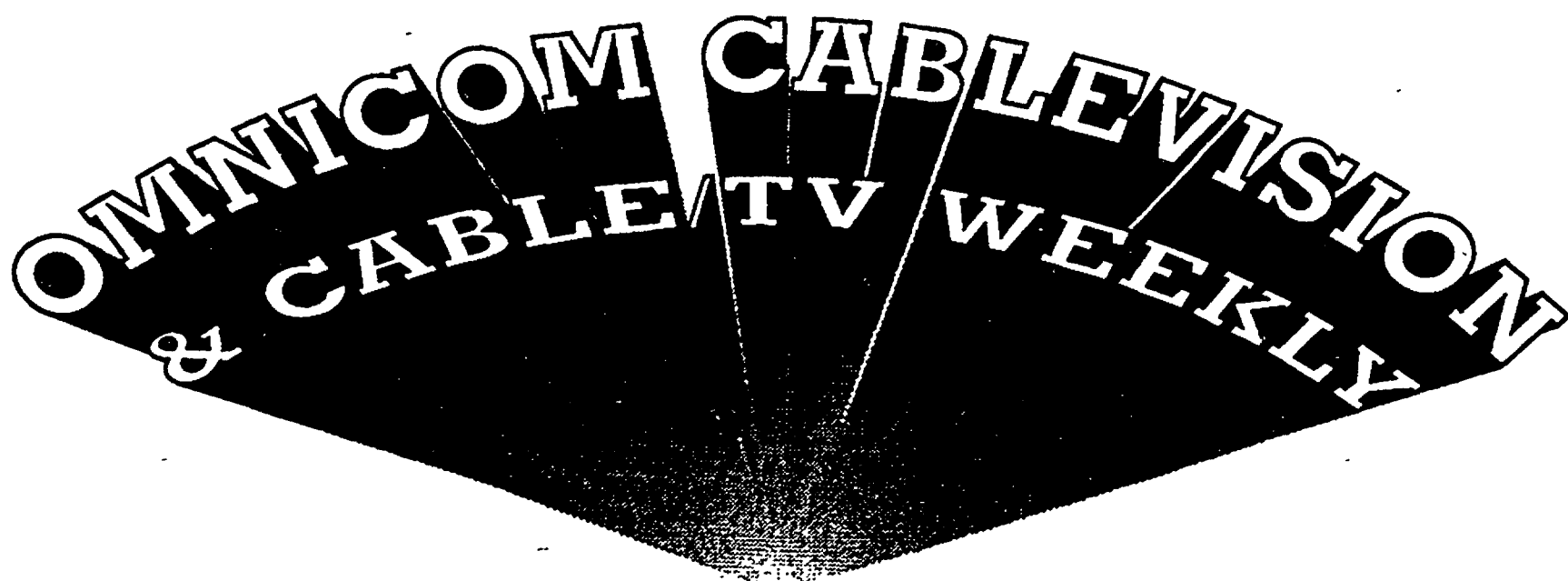

No time on his hands: John Tesh keeps busy

Music, 'E.T.,' the Olympics and... he's a newlywed

"In this world, a lot of people think that you can't do more than one thing," says John Tesh, in a rare moment of relative inactivity. "I do a lot of things 'kinda good,'" he laughs, "so I do 'em all."

A lot of folks would scoff at Tesh's low-key appraisal of his work. The producers of the syndicated "Entertainment Tonight," which Tesh co-anchors, would surely praise Tesh's charm and easy wit before the camera. Thousands of music lovers and sports fans gave their support by purchasing the composer's stirring soundtrack for TV coverage of the 1987 Tour de France bicycle race. NBC Sports has given Tesh a double vote of confidence by hiring him to provide on-air commentary for events like gymnastics, synchronized swimming and cycling in the network's coverage of the 1992 Olympics in Barcelona, Spain, as well as to compose several musical pieces to accompany footage of the Games. Since 1983, the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences has recognized Tesh with an armload of Emmy Awards.

Tesh regularly maintains a tight schedule, balancing the daily taping schedule of "E.T." with afternoons and evenings spent composing, recording or simply practicing the piano, a habit dating back to his

childhood in Garden City, N.Y.

"I don't get a lot of sleep, ordinarily," he admits, and says his schedule has only intensified with his dual Olympic duties. Still, Tesh meets his career's demands with equal parts eagerness and philosophy: "I like the chaos. I let my life go in the direction it wants to."

While attending North Carolina State University, Tesh had dual majors in music and communications ("My dad said to study something so I could make some money") and landed a job as a local news anchor before he graduated. Subsequent jobs took Tesh to Florida, Tennessee and New York, and an Associated Press award for investigative reporting seemed to confirm his career as a newsman. Then came the call from CBS Sports.

"I took what I felt was a big chance and it changed my life," Tesh says of his move into network sports. Besides increased exposure (and income), Tesh saw another opportunity. "I tried to use television to expose my music," he admits, and the gamble paid off, first in 1983, with his theme for the Pan American Games, and then with the Tour de France.

Following cutbacks at CBS, Tesh accepted an offer from "Entertainment Tonight" and was

readily accepted by co-workers and audiences alike. Simultaneously, his musical career was growing, with works like the theme for Fox's animated "Bobby's World," some film soundtracks and appearances with several symphony orchestras. On television, Tesh was rewarded with his own daytime interview show on NBC, "One on One."

The fall of 1991 brought a grand offer from NBC Sports to both cover and score the '92 Olympics. "I realize this could be a once-in-a-lifetime chance for me," Tesh says. Never claiming to be a sports expert, Tesh feels, "It's all about knowing how to do the homework. The athletes are the real stories."

Tesh also says that his twin Olympic responsibilities, reporting and composing, have a vital cross-pollinating effect. "Sports are very passionate. So is music. The translation is easy."

The music for the Olympics is collected on an album titled "The Games," available on Tesh's GTS label. The work contains nine tracks, including two arrangements of "Concetta," written for Tesh's wife, actress Connie Selleca, whom he wed last April. In December, Tesh is releasing an album of Christmas music, "Stuff you could decorate the tree to," he says. And after that?

"A little sleep, maybe."

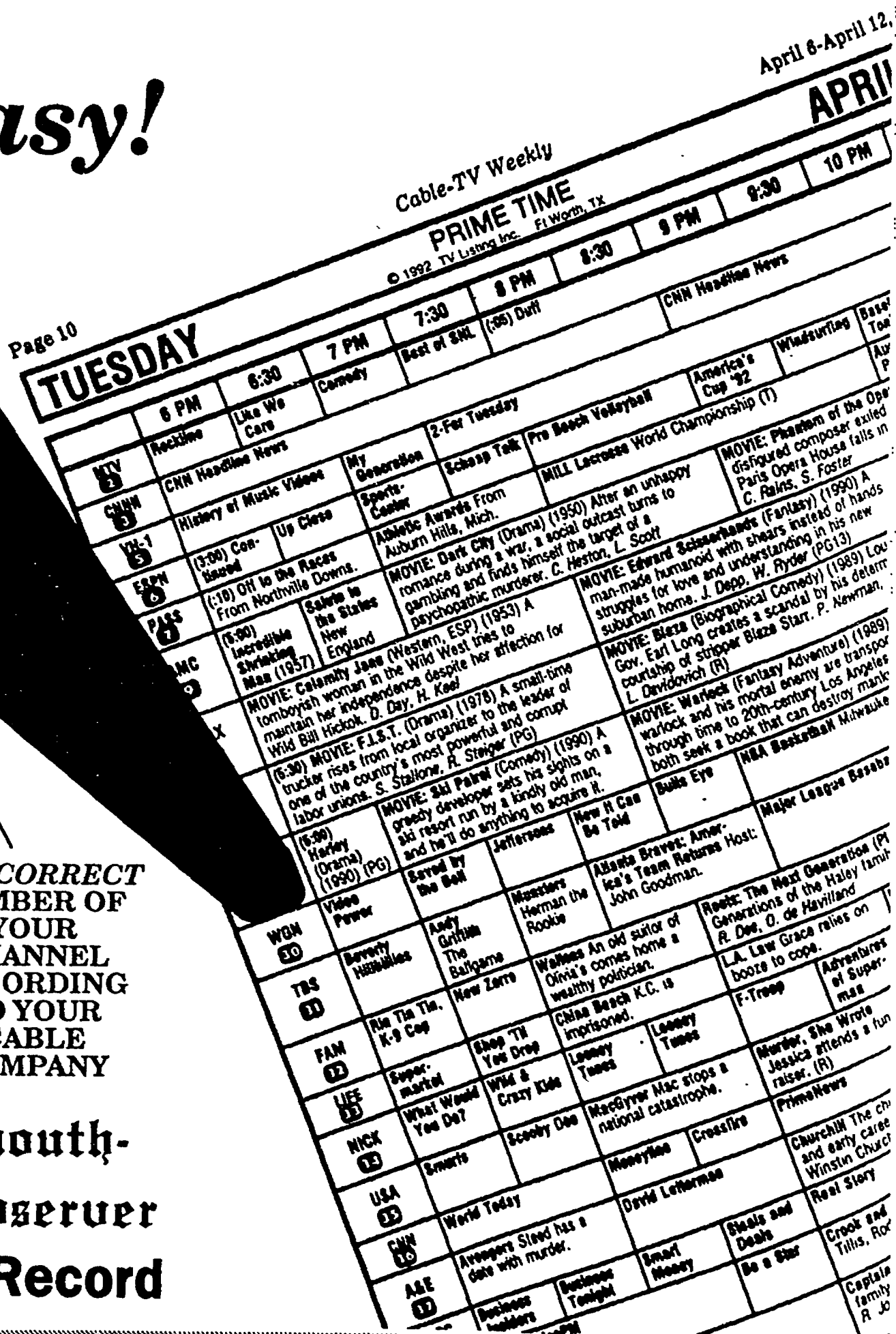

Comedy Challenge from 'Tonight'; 'Today' goes to Africa

Calling all comedians. NBC is ready to launch the *Tonight Show With Jay Leno Comedy Challenge*, a competition created exclusively for the network's 208 affiliates that is the first national TV promotion with no national sponsor. According to network executive Alan Cohen, "It's a great way to establish a mutually beneficial relationship with a local sponsor and create an added awareness for the station in its market."

Each affiliate will hold its own comedy contest and send a tape of the winning performance to *The Tonight Show* by the end of the year. The grand prize winner gets (what else?) a guest-shot on *The Tonight Show* and will join the ranks of such comedians as Jerry Seinfeld, Roseanne Arnold and Jay Leno himself who got their first big break on the late-night venue.

Casting its bread upon the waters, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting has announced its support of eight major productions in the general program and drama categories. The projects in development include *Reverse Angle*, a one-hour program on racial fear in America; *In the Mix*, a weekly news and information series for teens; and *Strike*, a series based on the 1988 strike of the *New York Daily News*.

Morning will begin in another time zone for watchers of NBC's *Today* in November. The morning news staple is set for six live broadcasts from Africa beginning Friday, Nov. 13. From three locations in Zimbabwe, *Today* will report on the people, politics and problems of the entire continent. To minimize some of the complex logistical difficulties, anchor Bryant Gumbel will go to Africa ahead of time (during *Today*'s pre-emption by the Olympics) with five crews to tape portions of the footage to be used in November.
