## Victim popular with co-workers

The pointlessness of the devastating death of Michael Bebeau Thursday was underscored by the fact that he was such a good friend and loyal employee.

Michael Bebeau, 28 of Livonia, had his life cut short when he was stabbed to death by a shoplifter at the Northville Township Meijer store Thursday night. He was universally well-liked according to his employer.

"I think the (funeral) service will attest to that by the turnout, you'll see," said Store Director Steve Misiak. "He'd been with us for three years, and I've been here for a year, so I've known him that long."

According to Brian Breslin, vice president for public and consumer affairs at the Meijer headquarters in Grand Rapids, Bebeau had been employed as an undercover detective with the company since Oct. 20, 1989.

According to Misiak, Bebeau had apprehended shoplifters in similar situations many times.

"He was a good associate," said Misiak. "He was very well trained."

"This was something that you can't ever count on. Sad is the only way to describe it."

Bebeau was single and lived with his mother, Breslin said. Following the incident Meijer owner Frederic Meijer contacted Bebeau's mother to offer his condolences.

"Everyone at the store and at the headquarters extends to his mother

our sympathies, our thoughts and our prayers over what's happened," Breslin said.

Breslin said there had not been any funeral arrangements made by press time on Friday. Bebeau, who served four years in the U.S. Marine Corps, is survived by his mother, Kathleen Bebeau, a brother and a sister.

Misiak echoed Breslin's sentiments.

"We certainly offer the family our sincere condolences," he said. "He will be missed not only as an associate, but as a good friend to many people. I know that sounds like a cliché, but in this case it's true."

## Quick action caught suspect

Two suspects are in custody for the murder of a Meijer employee who was stabbed at the Eight Mile and Haggerty Road store around 11:30 p.m. Thursday night.

The victim, Michael Bebeau, 28, of 36070 Brookview in Livonia, was stabbed in the upper left chest after apprehending a man who attempted to steal items from the store's jewelry counter.

According to the Northville Township police report, Bebeau, a plainclothes loss prevention detective, saw the suspect taking merchandise on the store's video camera. Bebeau followed the man outside the double-door entrance near the customer service desk, where he apprehended the suspect.

The suspect, Rodney Christopher Humber, 16, of Detroit, complied with Bebeau's request to return to the store's office for questioning after some verbal resistance. On the way back inside, Humber, escorted by Bebeau and another store detective, exchanged words with a second male who was apparently returning merchandise at the customer service desk.

Shortly after that exchange, the suspect turned without warning and

stabbed Bebeau with a steak knife. He then fled the scene to the parking lot.

Township police responded to the 11:25 p.m. call within two minutes and quickly located the suspect.

"The citizens did a real good job by pointing the guy out," said Capt. Phillip Presnell of the township's detective bureau. "We had a lot of eyewitnesses, and they pointed him out and our guys arrested him."

Police caught the suspect in the store parking lot and arrested him without incident. He was found with approximately \$500 in merchandise from the store. The second man with whom the suspect conversed at the service desk was also taken into custody. Police said they believe he acted with Humber, and he is being held pending review by the Wayne County Prosecutor.

Bebeau was rushed to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia and arrived at the

## Meijer takes steps to reduce trauma

Witnessing a shocking violent crime — like the murder of Meijer employee Mike Bebeau last Thursday — can have a devastating effect on family, friends, eyewitnesses and co-workers.

To alleviate some of the pain and confusion, corporate officials from Meijer have contracted with psychologist Ron Jones to help people who knew Bebeau or who witnessed the incident work through their feelings and come to grips with what happened that night.

Jones was recommended to Meijer by the Northville Township Police department.

Bebeau, 28, was killed in the line of duty after he apprehended a shoplifter inside the store. The plainclothes store detective was stabbed with a steak knife by his assailant. The murder took place inside the store, near the customer service counter, police said.

Several of Bebeau's fellow store detectives witnessed his murder that night along with others in the store. Jones, a critical incident psychologist, was called to the store Friday morning.

"He's there to counsel Meijer

associates that have a concern, are upset or have a need to talk to someone about Mike Bebeau's death," said Brian Breslin, a spokesperson from Meijer headquarters. "He's already spoken with loss prevention people in the store that were involved in the incident and he will be talking with other associates."

Store officials from the chain's headquarters in Grand Rapids confirmed that the psychologist was at the Northville Meijer store on Friday talking with co-workers, friends, and staff.

Breslin said Jones' name was referred to the store by the Northville Township Police Department.

"His name was provided to us by Northville police as someone they have used in the past," Breslin said.

Jones, who was still counseling Meijer employees at press time Friday, could not be reached for comment.

The idea behind crisis intervention came from police, fire and ambulance services, according to clinical social worker William Lee. "They discovered that in very major trauma situations, if the trauma wasn't dealt with (employees) did experience severe stress."

## City orders developer to repair road

The city administration is taking a hard line over the condition of roads at St. Lawrence Estates.

City Manager Gary Word has ordered The Selective Group, developers of St. Lawrence Estates, to comply with the city-approved site plan for St. Lawrence's roads despite a study that found the existing roads superior to what was required.

The order follows eight months of complaints by St. Lawrence homeowners of deficiencies in their condominium complex's roads, street lights and sidewalks. They complained that the roads already had begun to deteriorate, that the street lights were not

installed to site plan specifications, and that the sidewalks never were installed.

Those complaints led to an April 10 show-cause hearing at which Selective attorney Dean Gould defended his company against the homeowners' charges, and insisted that the roads were as durable or more durable than what was specified in the site plan.

On April 24, Selective was issued administrative orders requiring the company to show that the roads, street lights and sidewalks were not deficient or correct the deficiencies. The company and homeowner's association reportedly are near an agreement on the sidewalks, in which Selective will pay the associa-

tion what it would cost the company to install them. The money is to be used for other capital improvements in the complex.

Selective has been granted a two-week extension on the sidewalk order, to Sept. 4, and also has agreed to repair the street light deficiencies.

In the meantime, structural tests performed by Soil and Materials Engineers (SME) of Plymouth, and overseen by NTH Consultants of Farmington Hills, showed that the St. Lawrence roads are actually stronger than what was required by the city. SME also serves as a consultant to the homeowner's association.

"In general, the overall structural adequacy of the existing pavement is considered to be superior to that ob-

tained from the originally specified pavement section," according to the June 29 NTH report.

The report also found that roads could not have been built to original site plan specifications without first stabilizing the road bed, as was done by the paving contractor, Nagle Paving of Farmington Hills.

"It supports our statement that we did it the right way based on the conditions at the site," said Selective President Michael Horowitz. "If we had done it the way it was approved, then both us and the city would have been guilty of doing it the wrong way."

The NTH report did recommend repairing roads on the west side of

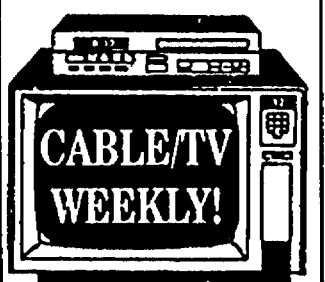

# State considers reform in wake of dirty election

Even the author of a proposed campaign reform law admits Michigan politics is likely to remain mud-plattered in the wake of Aug. 4 primaries.

State Sen. Phil Arthurhult, R-Whitehall, seeks a new law that would bring criminal charges against candidates and campaign committees that knowingly issue false print or broadcast ads.

But Arthurhult admits controversial ads that recently appeared locally would probably pass muster even if the law had been in effect. Take Congressional challenger

David Honigman's television ad alleging fellow challenger Alice Gilbert, a former judge, left a courtroom full of people waiting while she attended an opening day baseball game at Tiger Stadium.

"At first blush, I don't think she could bring charges," Arthurhult said. "Were there people in the court that day? Were court cases scheduled and then dismissed? All that would come into play."

Then there was the bare-knuckles battle for Wayne County sheriff. Radio spots for challenger Kevin Kelley used a squeaky-voiced impersonator

to ridicule incumbent Robert Ficano, who countered with ads of his own in which a UAW official charged Kelley with making "David Duke-like" statements.

"Ficano might be uncomfortable, but there's probably nothing he could do," Arthurhult said. "As for the David Duke allegations, it's not like saying his opponent himself had been a member of the Ku Klux Klan."

What, then is the point of the proposed reform?

"There's actually two points," Arthurhult said. First, campaign chairpersons and

treasurers would have to sign affidavits stating the print or broadcast ads they were presenting were true to the best of their knowledge.

"It's almost impossible to bring action against a campaign committee," Arthurhult said. "This at least puts a name to the claims."

Second, cash payment for campaign advertising would be banned. Arthurhult said he believed this would make all ads traceable to their authors.

Infractions would be considered misdemeanors.

"It is a fine line, but this at least would penalize those who step over it," Arthurhult said.

It's one thing to identify mudslingers, another to bring them to court.

A third provision, requiring a 24-hour "cooling off period" before an ad was printed or broadcast, has already been deleted.

"We found that would be illegal under Federal Communications Commission law," said Arthurhult, who also acknowledged the provision drew howls of protest from First Amendment defenders as unlawful

prior restraint.

From its outset, American politics has been a rough-and-tumble affair.

Court rulings have steadfastly kept it that way, giving public officials less protection under libel laws than that afforded private citizens.

Lately, however, many citizens have begun questioning negative ads — calling them a turnoff.

The defeat of Honigman and Gilbert at the hands of Joseph Knollenberg was attributed, in part, to voter dissatisfaction with the others' name-calling ads.

## Suspect bound over for break-in

A suspect in an Aug. 4 burglary was bound over to Wayne County Circuit Court after a preliminary examination at 35th District Court.

Frank David Keipp, 29, of Farmington Hills, was arraigned Aug. 7 in front of 35th District Judge James Garber on a charge of breaking and entering an occupied dwelling with intent to steal, and a not-guilty plea was entered on his behalf. He returned to court Aug. 14 for the preliminary exam and was then transferred back to Wayne County Jail where he has been held in lieu of a

\$25,000 bond.

His next appearance will be Aug. 28 at the Frank Murphy Hall of Justice in Detroit.

Keipp is charged with breaking into a Grace Street home. The homeowner told city police that he returned home just after midnight that day and heard noises upstairs. He said he grabbed a shotgun, called 911 and saw Keipp at the top of a stairway leading to the bedrooms, holding a cased gun and box of ammunition in his arms.

The man said he ordered Keipp to stop but the suspect kept walking toward him, apologizing and admit-

ting that he had been caught. At the foot of the stairs, Keipp reportedly threw the gun and ammo at the man's feet and darted out the door.

The man followed and fired a warning shot into the air as police arrived, but the suspect kept running south on Grace Street.

The man knew Keipp as an employee of a roofing firm that worked on his home about a month before the burglary.

City police tracked Keipp to his sister's house through the roofing company. Keipp turned himself in to police Aug. 6 to answer questions, and was arrested and held until his arraignment the next morning.

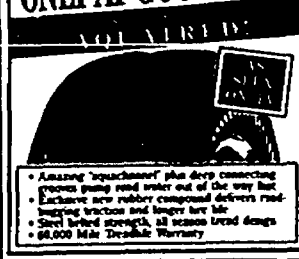

The move is due to reduced use of the center since the city initiated curbside collection of recycling materials, and is intended to reduce the need for overtime by DPW workers. Since curbside recycling started in February, average use of the center has dropped to 35 cars on Wednesdays and 55 cars on Saturdays.

The center is available to City of Northville residents only, and identification is checked at the gate.

The center accepts clear, green and brown glass, plastic types 1 and 2, tin cans, household and car batteries, paint, used motor oil and antifreeze, compost material, scrap metal, and newspapers. Liquids should be in sealed, clearly labeled containers. Newspapers should be stacked in brown paper bags or tied into bundles. Telephone books, magazines and road maps are not accepted.

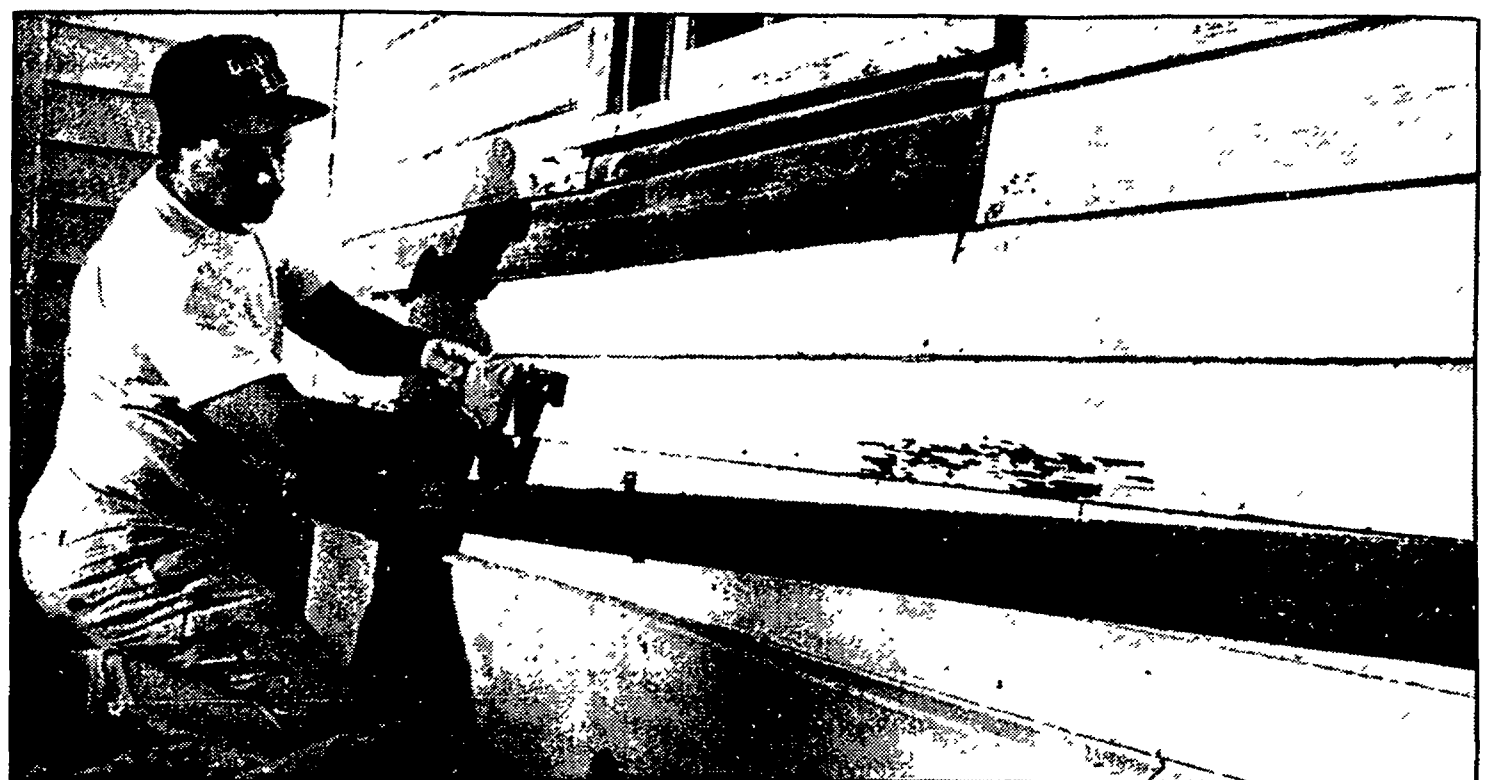

# City wants Selective roads to comply

the complex including St. Lawrence Boulevard and Covington Court that had only received one layer of asphalt, before adding the second layer. A section of Covington Court that had received both layers was recommended for another 1-inch layer.

Horowitz said those repairs will be made.

Whether or not the roads are better than what was specified, Word

said, they do not match the city's specifications and Selective did not seek a variance from the site plan. "In terms of what they have done, our position is they must meet site plan specifications," he said.

Word said Selective still can apply for a site plan variance for roads not yet completed at St. Lawrence, but that the completed roads must be reconstructed to meet the plan.

"The administrative hearing was called by us, and we dealt with the de-

veloper," Word said. "We're holding them accountable."

If Selective fails to comply with the administrative order, the city will issue a stop work order halting all construction at St. Lawrence, he said.

Horowitz said he was "disappointed" with Word's Aug. 12 letter ordering Selective to abide by the site plan. "I don't think it responded to the facts or improved the situation,"

he said.

"I think what the city's letter is saying is that they don't want to resolve this; they either want it to be resolved between us and the homeowners or in court... Having said all that, I'm hopeful that we can solve this with the homeowners' association."

"It would be pretty silly for us to pull out the road and put in what they're telling us to, because it would be worse than what's there now."

# County charter promises hot contest

One of Wayne County's hottest fall elections might not involve candidates or taxes but a series of highly technical ballot proposals amending the county charter.

Wayne County Commissioners placed the proposed charter amendments proposals on the fall ballot Thursday, saying they would make county government more efficient by clarifying the roles of the commission, county executive and other county officials.

Commissioners approved the proposal on a series of unanimous voice votes though several commissioners, including Kevin Kelley, D-Redford and Maurice Breen, R-Plymouth Township were absent from the session.

"This should take care of at least three-quarters of the headlines we've been making lately," said Commissioner Bryan Amann, D-Wayne.

But county Executive Edward McNamara is readying his veto pen and promises a "major campaign" against the proposals in the fall should his veto be overridden.

"This is a series of proposals designed to weaken the county executive's office," deputy executive Michael Duggan said. "It would take the county back to the days when the county commission ran everything and we're sure the people don't want

that."

The proposals include:

- Amending the charter to "expressly use the separation of powers concept to determine the relationship between the executive, judicial and legislative branches of county government."

- Providing the auditor general with "the express power to conduct financial and operations compliance audits of all county agencies" as well as providing misdemeanor penalties for those who refuse "reasonable inquiries made by the auditor general."
- Requiring county commission approval of compensation rates and benefits for non-union executive's employees.
- Requiring the executive's office to file an office reorganization plan within 180 days after the start of the executive's new term.

A fifth proposal, expanding commission authority to subpoena records, documents and witnesses, was tabled for further study but may yet appear on the fall ballot.

It would take the votes of 10 of the 15 commissioners to override McNamara's veto.

All five proposals sprang from disputes between the commission and McNamara.

"We've had instances where the auditor general was stonewalled,"

said Kay Beard, D-Westland, who sponsored that proposal as well as the one that would give the commission final say over executive office pay rates.

"Really, that's the way it should have been except for a strange opinion from the county corporation counsel giving the power solely to the personnel department."

Commissioners said they never confirmed McNamara's recent hiring of former state representative Teola Hunter because of the executive's fai-

lure to file a reorganization plan. Hunter subsequently gained the Democratic nomination for county clerk.

Despite the political in-fighting, even some commissioners aren't sure how — or whether — the people will vote.

"It will be a long ballot," Amann said. "A lot of these items could be confusing if not explained to people."

It appears both sides will be doing some explaining before election day.

Police probe assault on MainCentre contractor

A man laying tile at the MainCentre building Aug. 18 told city police that another worker punched him in the face that morning.

A witness corroborated the man's story, but the suspect gave a different version. The alleged victim had not decided whether to file charges by press time.

Firefighters determine cause and origin of fire

It was a cold night, and as firefighters picked up hose and placed equipment back in service, portable electric lights set up inside the abandoned house illuminated the steam rising from the wet, blackened remains of what had been the living room. Electrical and gas service had been cut to the house two months ago, and no one was living there when the fire broke out in the early morning hours. It was, without question, a fire of "suspicious" origin.

Among a firefighter's many jobs is determining the "cause and origin" of a fire. In many cases the point where the fire started, the fire "origin," can be located with relative ease. Firefighters look for the area most heavily affected by the fire, the spot where the char is deepest or where furnishings are most damaged. Once this spot is located, they carefully remove debris from the area, look-

ing for clues as to the fire's cause. Because fire and smoke travel up from the point of origin, a "V" pattern of soot or char may be discovered on a wall, pointing to the place the fire was started. A "V" pattern moving up a wall from an electrical socket in an area of heavy fire damage, with the remains from an electrical wiring found nearby, would suggest the "origin" of the fire as well as its "cause."

Finding out what started a fire requires good detective work. In addition to examining the physical evidence, firefighters must interview occupants, neighbors or other witnesses for clues as to how or when the fire started, and what observations were made regarding the fire's development. Samples from the scene can be tested to determine whether flammable liquids played a role in starting the fire. By piecing together all of this information, a judgment can often be made regarding the most likely cause.

In our community most structure fires are started accidentally. Electrical wiring or appliances, discarded smoking materials, even lightning strikes are among the accidental causes of fires. A "suspicious" fire is one where

there is no readily explainable accidental cause, and reason to believe the fire may have been deliberately set. In such cases, firefighters work closely with the police department in investigation of the fire, in an effort to find and preserve the evidence necessary to prosecute those who were responsible.

According to National Fire Protection Association figures for the year 1990, 15.5 percent of all structure fires in this country were a result of arson. Those fires accounted for the loss of 715 lives and almost \$1.4 billion in property damage.

Several firefighters in our community have received advanced training in fire cause and origin investigation. In addition, our local fire departments can call upon the state police, Sheriff's Department and, in some cases, the Federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms for specialized assistance from arson investigators.

As the chief surveyed the scene his eyes were drawn to the spot in the center of the room. Damage was heavy there, and a set of springs was all that remained of a

stuffed chair. At the chief's direction, debris was carefully removed from the floor of the room, showing the deepest char to exist in the center of the room, beneath the spot the chair had once occupied. The floor was carefully rinsed with water from a hose, revealing a trail of char leading from the center of the room back to the kitchen and out the rear door of the abandoned house. The chief nodded as the pattern emerged, as it became clear what had happened. Someone had apparently doused the chair with an accelerant, such as gasoline, and then poured a trail out the rear door to serve as a "fuse." Samples of the wooden floor were taken for analysis by the State Police Crime Laboratory, and a gas can discovered in the bushes behind the house was taken to be checked for fingerprints. The "origin" and most likely "cause" of this fire had been determined, and the job of catching and prosecuting those responsible was about to begin.

use of deadly force was justified. The last criminal homicide in this area occurred in 1981.

Schoolcraft board to see some changes

Those with an interest in serving on the Schoolcraft board should probably keep their resumes handy.

There could be as many as two openings on the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees this fall, but board members won't be filling them until after the November elections.

Board chairperson Jeanne Stempfen of Northville and trustee Thaddeus McCotter were both winners in this month's primaries and have advanced to fall elections.

Stempfen, of Northville Township, is one of six candidates running in the non-partisan race for Wayne County Circuit Judge.

Livonia resident McCotter, a Republican, is taking on Democratic nominee Michael Caffery of Plymouth for the 10th District Wayne County Commission seat.

Both would have to resign their Schoolcraft seats if elected, but they'll stay on the board at least until then.

"I can make the meetings, it might be a little tight, but it should be no problem," Stempfen said.

McCotter, too, said he'll keep attending college meetings.

"I'm not presuming anything," he said. "That's the surest way to lose an election."

Of the two, McCotter faces the easiest race.

His commission district, including most of Livonia, Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Northville and Northville Township, is considered heavily Republican.

Stempfen faces a more competitive race for the county circuit court. She finished fourth in the primary, 2,700 votes behind third place finisher Robert L. Ziolkowski, a Detroit Recorder's Court Judge, and five ahead of the fifth-place finisher, attorney Joseph V. Brennan. Detroit Recorder's Judge Denise Page Hood, assistant Macomb County Prosecutor Diane Hathaway and attorney John W. Callahan are also on the ballot.

The three highest vote-getters will be elected to the bench.

New trustees are generally appointed after a series of public interviews with other trustees. Appointees would then seek election in June.

Regardless of the Stempfen's and McCotter's chances, officials aren't even considering replacements. Schoolcraft spokeswoman Sandra Florek said.

"We can't do anything until there's an opening," she said.

Lee, who serves as clinical coordinator of Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital's critical incident stress management team, goes to work whenever a patient or staff member suffers a death or severe injury. The team helps debrief other staff members, discussing the incident and warning staff to be aware of their reactions to the incident.

"They may replay it in their mind constantly. They may have nightmares. They may overeat, undereat... There's a lot of different possible reactions," Lee said.

Debriefing helps witnesses rationalize a traumatic event, Lee said. "It helps them normalize an abnormal

situation, put some handles and labels on it and support one another."

Witnesses are also cautioned to avoid caffeine, alcohol and sugar after an incident, Lee said, "because these are all things that stimulate the nervous system and the nervous system is already overstimulated."

"The first thing that people often do after a stressful event is to head for the bar or get a dessert, exactly what you don't want to do."

Lee commended Meijer for acting quickly to provide counseling to its employees after Thursday's incident.

"Hopefully (the employees will) get some help, because after an incident like that I know they'll need it."

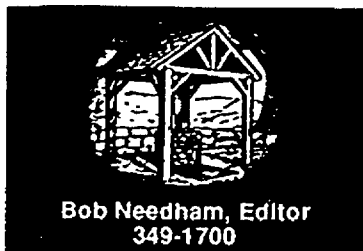

### Time for state to set costs in the FOI law

"Public" documents are supposed to be just that — public. That means that they are already yours. They belong to you. And since they belong to you, you ought to be able to go look at them, to read them over and to make copies of them at any time. That is supposed to be the basis of Michigan's Freedom of Information Act.

Well, think again. If you want to look at your public documents, you'd better be prepared to pay big bucks.

Under the state FOIA, local governments are allowed to charge for the costs of copying and mailing copies to those who request them. And they do charge. Do they ever charge.

The latest in a series of incidents came when Novi resident Laura Lorenzo requested documents, pertaining to the drainage problem she is having at her home, from the City of Northville. Lorenzo has been fighting with Northville for more than a year over a flooding problem she blames on the city-approved culverts constructed in Singh Development's Pheasant Hills subdivision.

What Lorenzo wanted from Northville was 48 pages of documents. What Northville wanted to charge her for those documents was \$103.37. She decided that was bit too much and so never paid the price and never got the documents.

The city claims the charge was based on costs that would have been passed on by the city's engineering firm, McNeely & Lincoln, which actually had to compile the stack of papers and run them off. The city also says the fee was based on 3 1/2 hours of retrieval time.

The city may be in violation of the FOI in several ways. For one, the cost of retrieval is supposed to be charged at the rate of the "hourly wage of the lowest paid, full-time, permanent clerical employee" within the department from which the records come. Calculating it out to an hourly rate, it would come to \$22.50 per hour, well over the city's highest paid clerk. Sure, the documents were pulled by a consultant, but the FOI does not address the question of what consultants can charge.

The FOI also says, "a fee shall not be charged for the cost of search . . . unless failure to charge a fee would result in unreasonably high costs to the public body because of the nature of the request . . . and the public body specifically identifies the nature of these unreasonably high costs. A public body shall establish and publish procedures and guidelines to implement this subsection."

Oh, one last point before we move on. In our firm opinion, any clerk who needs 3 1/2 hours to retrieve 48 pages of documents ought to be fired immediately for incompetence. Either that clerk can't find his or her way around a filing system to locate the documents or is misfiling them in the first place.

But this is only one example. Excessive fees for the copying of public documents seems to be running absolutely rampant in the local governments.

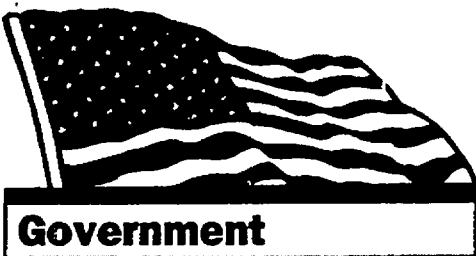
The *Northville Record's* sister newspaper, the *Novi News*, recently filed an FOI for a police report from a neighboring community, Livonia to be specific. The Livonia PD turned over the documents but charged this newspaper \$11.75. The total report was two pages long. That's right, two pages.

That works out to \$5.87 per page. By comparison, Lorenzo's \$2.15 per page FOI request was a bargain.

The list goes on. *The Record*, recently filed an FOI request with the Western Township Utilities Authority. We have a lot of complaints about the way WTUA responded to the request, but what we got was 136 pages of documents for \$202.38.

These documents came at the relatively cheap price of \$1.49 per page. WTUA claimed the cost was based on 18 hours of retrieval time and four hours of duplication time. Mind you, our receptionist copied off the same 136 pages, minus interruptions, in an hour and 15 minutes.

Keep going. Earlier this year, the *News* had a battle with the Novi Police Department over the availability of police incident reports and the cost of reports was only one small part of that. In fact, it was very small part of it. We don't ask for

copies of police reports except on the rarest of occasions, so the practice of charging for copies doesn't generally apply to us.

(One hint, dear reader. If ever you need to file an FOI request for documents from the government, don't ask for copies unless you absolutely need them. While the FOI allows them to charge you for copying, there is no provision in the law to allow them to charge you for viewing documents in their offices. And if you don't absolutely have to have copies, it's a heck of a lot cheaper to just read them there.)

But when the *News* learned the Novi PD was charging \$3 for the first page of an accident report and \$1 for every page thereafter, it complained. The Novi Police Chief argued at the time that his department's fees were not out of line compared to what is charged in other nearby departments. And you know what, he's right. According to a study the police department did back in the early '80s, the standard fee runs between \$1 and \$3 per page for a police report. That was a decade ago, and since then the fees in many departments have gone even higher, as evidenced by the rates charged by the Livonia PD.

Even so, the costs charged for copies at the police department are 10 to 30 times higher than what copies cost in other sections of the same government. You can still run off copies for 10 cents per page at the Northville Public Library.

Look at it from another perspective. We occasionally get complaints from our readers that we charge 50 cents for our Monday edition because it is so much smaller than the Thursday edition. But it would cost a lot more if you FOIed this information from the government. Figure we have 14 broadsheet pages, each with about as much space as four 8 1/2 by 11 sheets. That comes to 56 pages. Then we include a 40-page cable guide. If you FOIed a typical Monday edition from the government at the rates we've been discussing here, you'd pay between \$96 at the low end and \$563.52 at the high end for a single copy.

You couldn't afford a Thursday edition. Typically with 54 broadsheet pages, not counting supplements, one copy of the Thursday edition would cost between \$216 and \$1,267.92 based on the rates these governments have been charging.

Readers wince when they go to the newsstands these days and find novels costing \$5 or \$6, but if you tried to FOI one of the latter paperbacks from the government at these rates, it might cost you more than a good used car.

The average person might conclude these extraordinarily high prices on government documents are being set mainly to discourage people from asking for them. You might be willing to pay these rates once or twice, but they would tend to discourage future requests. Even if this isn't the motivation behind all these excessive charges, they surely do have that effect for most people of average means. Lorenzo, who had been anticipating a cost closer to \$33 than \$103, decided she could not afford the papers.

The most amazing thing yet may be that government officials can actually keep a straight face when they claim they are merely charging at cost.

It is time for the state Legislature to go back and amend the FOI to define what "reasonable copying costs" really are. The local governments sure don't seem to know what that means.

Keep in mind that members of the public have already paid once for the cost of the labor and materials to create, process and store these documents through their taxes. So we can't see any justification for anything more than about 10 cents per page for copying.

Local governments have already proven they cannot be trusted to set fair cost figures. The state Legislature now needs to step in and do it for them.

But more importantly, now that the Hall of Fame is ready to be built, other new doors will open. Specifically, the Hall will likely see an increase in donations of money, labor and material from major corporations.

"The catchphrase I keep hearing is 'Bricks and mortar,'" said Mark Bedsole, a director of the Hall of Fame who has been soliciting donations from some heavy hitters. "Companies say to me, come to us when you have bricks and mortar."

Ironically, it's going to take knocking out some bricks and mortar to get the work rolling. But within the next few weeks, the main entrance to the Hall, complete with a stunning glass enclosure for the city's own Novi Special, will begin construction.

The hammers won't bang the nails by themselves, however, and the drywall won't be hung on its own. SPARK is seeking to expand its base of volunteers. If you're a car nut (or even if you're not), and you have some time to spare in the evenings, why not give a call to 349-RACE, and help the Hall of Fame take shape.

## Woman do well in Wayne County judicial races

Female candidates did surprisingly well in this month's Wayne County judicial primaries, but is it a political breakthrough or another example of the glass ceiling?

Even the principals themselves don't agree.

On one hand, many female candidates said they sensed a changing, more receptive mood among voters.

"As I went out on the campaign trail I did hear from a lot of voters who told me they thought it was time to give women a chance," said circuit court candidate Jeanne Stempfen of Northville.

Stempfen, chair of the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees, placed fourth in the 12-person primary. The top six finishers now are vying for three seats on the circuit court bench. In addition to Stempfen the candidates are Records Court Judge Denise Page Hood, Records Court Judge Robert Ziolkowski and attorneys Diane M. Hathaway, Joseph Brennan and John W. Callahan.

Seven women were among the 10 candidates nominated in county races for the Michigan Court of Appeals, Wayne County Circuit Court and Wayne County Probate Court.

Still, even some winners said their success doesn't mean female candidates are successful at all levels — and may in some way be a symptom of the small number of women elected to state and national office.

PAC money, some said, rarely flows to females.

"I've seen reports from the U-M showing voters are more likely to vote for females for school board and judge, but both jobs are seen as less policy making and more healing, in a sense," Wayne County Circuit Judge Cynthia Stephens said. "My own earnest feeling is that the focus of power centers is not on the judiciary."

But Stephens, a Michigan Appeals Court candidate, said that could be an advantage.

"In judicial races, you have to be a self-starter, you have to meet with a lot of people and community groups," she said. "While community groups may not be as influential in state or national races they are very important in judicial and local races."

In perhaps the most-watched area race, former Oakland Circuit Judge Alice Gilbert finished a surprising third in the GOP 11th District Congressional primary.

But Wayne Circuit Judge Helene White said she didn't believe Gilbert lost votes because she was a woman.

"To me, it seemed voters were turned off by the negative campaigning between Alice Gilbert and Dave Honigman," White said.

Unlike some of her fellow nominees state Appeals Court candidate White said she believed further political breakthroughs for women are near.

"Women judges in Wayne County isn't a new thing anymore, but there are more women being elected to other offices," she said.

Others cautioned that female candidates' success in judicial races doesn't mean the legal profession is becoming more receptive to females.

"In our office we seem to see better female job applicants than males but a lot of big law firms don't hire that many females," said Nancy Diehl, head of the county prosecutor's office child abuse unit and a candidate for probate court.

"For women to make it in the field we really have to do well," said Diehl, who faces top vote-getter Cathie B. Maher of Canton Township in the fall race for Wayne County Probate Court.

Detroit Records Court Judge Denise Page Hood, a candidate for Wayne Circuit Court, may have put the issue in the best perspective.

"It's important that women are being elected judge," Hood said. "But the real test comes when we vote for a female county executive or governor."

## School takes steps to assure traffic safety

Northville School administrators have taken initial steps with city, township, and county officials to ensure the safety of students walking to school or to designated stops on the new bus routes next year.

District administrators have met with both city and township police departments and have been in contact with traffic officials at Wayne County to address safety concerns parents had about specific intersections near the district's school buildings.

Transportation officials James Hylman and Thomas Bailey met with city and township police chiefs on Wednesday to recommend additional crossing guards be employed to cover the major intersections near the district's school buildings.

City Police Chief Rod Cannon said school officials proposed hiring two additional crossing guards, one at Eight Mile and Taft Road and the other at Main Street and Doherty Drive.

Even though the additional guards weren't in this year's city police department's budget which has already been approved, Chief Cannon didn't foresee any problems given the circumstances. The city — like the township — has an agreement with the school to pay for one half of the cost of employing adult crossing guards.

"I don't see where we would have any problems," he said Friday. "...Everybody is having the same kind of money problems, but our children are our most precious resource."

Cannon said he and the township also consulted with Wayne County Traffic officials to get the county's recommendations on the heavily traveled, high-speed areas.

Township Lt. Gary Batzloff said he contacted the school after hearing about the proposed busing cuts when the June 8 millage was defeated because he figured this would be an outcome of that election.

At Wednesday's meeting, Batzloff said school transportation officials recommended the township and the

schools jointly employ three additional crossing guards at the intersections of Six Mile and Bradner, Six Mile and Winchester, and Seven Mile and Silver Springs.

Under the proposal, crossing guards would be posted at all the intersections at peak crossing times 8:15-9:05 a.m., 11:45 a.m.-12:45 p.m., and 2:45-3:30 p.m., Batzloff said.

Those recommendations Batzloff are subject to the approval of the township board at its Aug. 31 meeting.

Last year, Batzloff said the township paid \$4,960 for its share of the two existing guards. To employ the additional three guards requested, the township would have to pay \$7,440 more this year. That is what the township board will be considering in the proposal next Monday, he said.

To compliment the crossing guards, Victoria Holland, assistant engineer of traffic operations in the Wayne County Road division, said after talking with both police chiefs she's recommended the county in-

stall pedestrian crossing signs and change the timing of the existing traffic lights in the area to give children more time to cross at the main intersections.

At some intersections, Holland said the county will be putting grounded yellow pentagon pedestrian crossing signs to warn motorists of an upcoming school crossing. Those will be installed at all the major intersections with the exception of Eight Mile and Taft which is already signed, she said. The county will wait to sign the Six Mile/Bradner intersection to see if the school includes it as a designated stop on its bus route, Holland said.

The yellow pedestrian crossing signs are placed in conjunction with school crossing signs to warn motorists in advance and at the site of the intersection and crossing.

The timing of the traffic lights at Seven Mile and Silver Springs and at Six Mile and Winchester will be changed to allow students more time to cross, Holland said. Traffic traveling east and west on Six and Seven Mile roads will be delayed longer to

provide students with adequate time to get across those streets.

As far as reducing the speed limits along Six and Seven Mile roads, Holland said there is little chance of that. Currently the posted speed limit on both mile roads is 45 miles per hour. Holland said state law prohibits the county from reducing those speeds if the school is not located on "main street proper." Since all of the district's school are on side streets, speed limits will remain as they are.

"There is nothing we can do about that," Holland said. "The problem is that the community has never had to face this issue before and without sidewalks the kids have no place to walk. They'll be walking on gravel and grassy shoulders."

In an effort to try and alleviate that problem, Holland has also included in her recommendation strong language to encourage school, city and township officials to install sidewalks.

"This is a community that has never had sidewalks before. If this no busing thing is going to be a permanent thing, I really recommend they put sidewalks in."

### Much maligned wineries show some verve

It's not status quo in Michigan's most progressive and innovative wineries. Even the national press recognizes this. Earlier this year, "The Wine Spectator," America's most widely-read wine periodical, mentioned St. Julian Wine Company as one of the best wineries outside California in an article discussing wine across America.

Singled out for special mention were St. Julian's 1990 Barrel-Fermented Chardonnay (\$14), 1989 Chambourcin (\$10.75) and Solera Cream Sherry (\$13.80). Barrel-fermented chardonnay is a new wine for St. Julian and the 1991 available now is in very limited supply.

Solera Cream Sherry from St. Julian was cited in *USA Today* as one of the best tastes of the region and one of the best wines made in the United States. Since its debut in 1975, this sherry has garnered 28 gold medals and brought a national reputation to the winery.

"I'm conservative," St. Julian's President David Braganini said. "When I was a little kid, I wasn't the first one to jump into the water. The American palate is geared to a more sophisticated style of chardonnay, and we can make that style from grapes grown in southwest Michigan in the Lake Michigan Shore appellation."

To meet the growing demand for Michigan chardonnay, St. Julian is planting additional acreage. Braganini also wants to plant merlot. "Cabernet sauvignon won't ripen in our climate," he maintains.

In our opinion, the best sparkling wine in the state is produced by Larry Mawby at L. Mawby Winery in Suttons Bay. The 1986 Bien de Village (\$30), a sparkling blend of 70 percent pinot noir and 30 percent pinot gris is a classically produced rendition with toasty and yeasty notes over cherry-like fruit. It's creamy and delicious with all the style and elegance of a rich French champagne.

A bargain at \$15 is Blanc de Blancs, the other bubbly from Mawby. Produced for 52 percent seveal, 37 percent vignoles and 11 percent chardonnay, it's lighter and crisper than the Bien de Village. In a blind tasting of world-class Blanc de Blancs, this wine would show at the top.

Mawby's innovations are showcased in his 1991 Pinot Gris (\$10.20) from 100 percent estate-grown grapes. Also 100 percent barrel fermented, this wine was aged on the lees for added complexity. It is in limited production and represents the very best in Michigan winemaking.

Besides being a delicious sipper, St. Julian Cream Sherry may be used in this recipe as a delicious appetizer created by Eva Braganini.

#### SOLERA CREAM MUSHROOMS

2 1/2 Tablespoons butter  
12 medium mushroom caps  
3 Tablespoons St. Julian Cream Sherry

1/4 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon freshly ground pepper  
3 Tablespoons heavy cream

In a medium skillet, warm butter over medium heat until sizzling. Add mushrooms and saute, turning once, until golden brown and tender, about six minutes. Add sherry, salt and pepper, stirring for one minute. Add the cream and cook, stirring until reduced to a thick sauce, about 1 1/2 minutes. Serve warm.

Rich and tender, these sauteed mushrooms are speedily prepared for four servings, but the recipe is easily doubled.

## The Sicilians are coming

### Southern Italy lends new style

For the better part of a decade, I've been predicting that Southern Italian food will take off as an American food trend. It hasn't happened yet, so I suppose the prediction remains good. The day of Southern Italian food will come, mark my words. Just wait and see. And wait. And wait.

The problem is, as restaurateur Celestino Drago noted recently, Southern Italian food — including the dishes of his native Sicily — are either too well-known here or scarcely known at all. Most of the Italian immigrants to this country who arrived 70 and more years ago came from the impoverished lands in Sicily and in the southern provinces of the peninsula. They were too poor to know much about the grander accomplishments of the cooking they left behind.

Instead, they took what they remembered and prepared it with the ingredients they found in their new homeland. Thus, they created what came to be Italian-American cooking, most typically red sauces made with more meat than they possibly could have afforded in the old country, served over bountiful portions of pasta. And none of that stuff about fresh fettuccine either — this pasta came out of a cardboard box.

The authentic dishes of the region, on the other hand, almost never made the passage to America, at least judging by restaurant menus.

Drago left Sicily as a teen-ager, but, as he remarked, his native land has remained in his heart. Encouraged by the response to a few Sicilian dishes on the menu of his Santa Monica, Calif., restaurant, he arranged for a visit of a cooking delegation from the ancient city of Messina, right across the straits from the toe of the Italian boot.

They represented the Sicilian branch of the Italian chefs' and restaurateurs association, and included Pippo Ruggeri, head of the Messina chefs' association; restaurateur Nino Libro; pastry maker Antonio Arena; and quite a few others. They arrived in town, made the obligatory pilgrimage to Disneyland and then cooked a meal at Drago before heading off to Las Vegas and San Francisco.

They also brought some food along with them. "Here, try this," said one of the Drago waiters, motioning me into the walk-in refrigerator off the kitchen.

There was a plate of Sicilian tangerines, fruit with an exceptionally perfumed flavor and a particularly juicy skin, full of the fragrant citrus oil. The fruit was for a special drink, invented for the occasion, Profumo di Sicilia.

As a matter of fact, I didn't particularly care for it, and, in any case, it requires a rose-flavored Italian liqueur called "Rosolio" that is practically unobtainable here. But for the record, it consists of equal parts of Rosolio, dry white vermouth and the bitter Campari liqueur, shaken with ice and poured into a glass with a twist of tangerine peel.

The food may or may not have been a revelation to the assorted restaurateurs, foodies and trend watchers who were invited to the dinner. I liked it a lot, but then I tend to prefer ethnic dishes of almost any kind to the chic plate-millinary of today's chefs. Anyway, my mother's family is Sicilian, so I'm entitled.

Perversely, the meal made me think that Sicilian food might not be all that well-suited to the contemporary restaurant fashion, which decrees a rigidly narrow range of dishes a la minute: grills and deglazing sauces, in contrast to the "made" dishes at this diner.

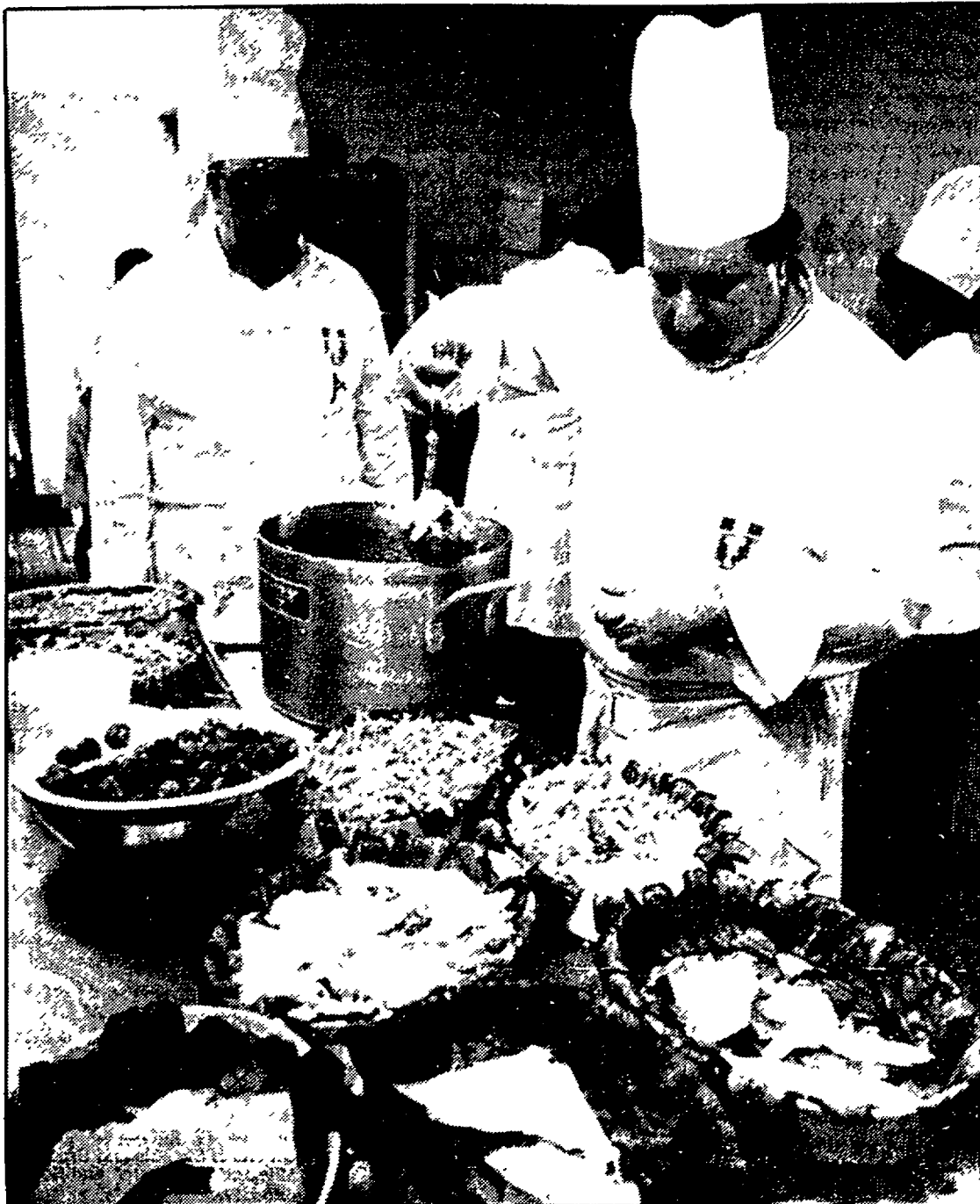
All dishes have to be made, of course, but some require more making than others, and that applies to the more baroque creations of the Sicilian chef.

We heard the usual talk about Sicilian food being essentially simple and dependent on the beautiful produce of the island. That's true only to a certain extent. *La cucina siciliana* also bears witness to centuries of Arab and Bourbon rule, the former is an often surprising combination of ingredients, the latter in a piling on of ingredients ormulu.

As things stand now, to try Sicilian dishes, you can hope that Drago carries out his announced intention of adding to his menu.

Or you can make them yourself, following these recipes adapted from those of Antonio Sparacino of Ristorante Antonio, who was a member of visiting *delagazione*.

We start out simply with a dish not included on the special menu: Maccu, a much-beloved soup, here given in the Messina style. Dried fava beans are carried at all Italian markets.

#### MACCU (FAVA BEAN SOUP)

1 pound dried fava beans  
1 small onion  
1 stalk celery  
1 or 2 tomatoes  
Salt  
1/4 pound pasta (see note)  
Best quality olive oil

Yields about 8 servings.

Pick over, rinse and drain beans. In large saucepan or soup kettle, cover with water to a depth of about 2 inches. Bring to a boil; simmer 3 minutes; cover and allow to stand, off heat, for 1 hour.

Add more water to cover beans by at least 1 inch. Bring to a boil. Peel and chop onion; chop celery; peel and chop tomatoes. Add to pot.

Simmer about 1 hour, or until beans are very tender, adding more water if necessary. When beans are nearly done, add salt to taste.

Note: You can use any kind of pasta. "Grandma would advise broken up spaghetti," says Sparacino's recipe. Cook pasta either in soup or separately.

Serve soup and pasta in bowls, garnished with olive oil to taste.

This is an example of the elaborate baked pasta dishes popular in southern Italy and Sicily. The version served at Drago contained small chicken meatballs as well as ham, cheese and hard-boiled eggs.

A good way of making a dish like this is to use a tomato sauce from another dish, such as the *Farsumagu*, made on an earlier day. The sauce will keep a few days in the fridge, or it can be frozen. Proportions for this dish don't matter much; the idea is to give the impression of a rich profusion.

#### PASTA 'NCACIATA (BAKED PASTA)

Chicken meatballs (recipe follows)  
4 large eggplants  
Salt  
Olive Oil  
1 large onion, chopped  
1/4 pound ground beef (or, preferably, chopped in food processor)  
10 or 12 large tomatoes, peeled, seeded and chopped  
Several sprigs of fresh basil or 2 large pinches dried  
Salt and pepper to taste  
1 tablespoon sugar  
1 pound penne or other tube shaped pasta  
About 1 cup boiled ham, chopped or sliced  
Several thin slices of provolone or Caciocavillo cheese  
3 or 4 hard-boiled eggs, sliced

Yields about 10 servings.

Make chicken meatballs according to following recipe. Set aside. Cut eggplant lengthwise into thin slices. Salt on both sides and set aside for about 20 minutes. Rinse slices, drain and pat dry.

Saute slices in large frying pan with as little olive oil as you can manage until tender. Eggplant soaks enormous quantities of oil. Set aside on paper towels to drain.

Make sauce by sauteing onion in olive oil until tender. Add beef and stir until beef is no longer pink. Turn up heat and rapidly boil away any moisture. Drain any excess fat. Add tomatoes, basil, salt, pepper and sugar. Simmer 20 to 30 minutes until sauce thickens.

Boil pasta in salted water until al dente. Drain. Mix with some of sauce until pasta is lightly coated but not awash in sauce.

### Change of seasons brings change of menu



As August draws to a close it is time to think about what to put on the fall menu.

This summer has been fairly disappointing, weather wise and food wise. The tomatoes never got really good. Most of the fruit is mediocre, not the best we've seen. And vegetables, other than corn, just fair. I'm told that the rain is to blame.

For whatever reason I'm just happy that

a new food season is upon us. While developing our original menu at Brady's I wrote lists and lists of foodstuffs I wanted to incorporate. And then, more lists of the dishes to put them into. The bottom line is the same a year later.

I like good, simple flavorful food. Traditional cooking methods that require very little handling of the raw product. The more an item is touched the greater the loss of quality.

Our forefathers did not spend hours rolling, stuffing, layering and wrapping. They used classical procedures that work. Stewing, braising, roasting, grilling. I agree that presentation is very important. But to me, the flavors must be there also. Granted, I am particular when I eat out.

Each of you should be too. The food that you are paying for should taste like something other than bland. Bland is not fun. Bland is flat and boring.

It amazes me that more cooks do not use seasoning ingredients. Fresh chopped herbs, vegetable and fruit purees, a bit of salt and pepper to bring out the natural essences present. We have become a nation afraid to use salt and our food is a good indication.

It is a known fact that salt is harmful only to those with associated medical problems. It is amazing what a few tiny grains can do. Initially salt was used as a preservative. That was before refrigerators. Then came the "processed" age. Salt, salt everywhere.

It is hard to find any manufactured food without too much salt. So, buy fresh and use judgement when adding your own.

Marinating meat, fish, poultry or vegetables is another way to add flavor. Generally speaking, the larger the item the longer it should be left in the marinade. Later use the marinade to baste.

Don't be afraid to experiment. There are very few rules when it comes to good flavor. Get loose, go wild! The sky is the limit.

So, I'll get back to our fall menu. The old favorites will stay. We can't take off our mainstays. But you will see some wonderful changes. I love slow cooking, lamb shanks, osso bucco, cassoulets, fricasees and stews. The long cooking time tender-

izes and melds all the flavorings. And possibly a simple but sumptuous pork loin. Or cioppino, the Italian shellfish stew. Maybe "bangers and mash", the English version of assorted sausages and mashed potatoes. The list goes on . . . I can't wait.

And, in closing, several notes not pertaining to food. My father called today to tell me how lamentable (kidding, of course) it was that I named the whole family except for he and my mother in last week's column. Well, Bud and Marj, the Smith reunion wouldn't have been possible without your years of devotion to us. We love you.

Also, happy anniversary to my fantastic husband, Tom. We are celebrating seven years of "married bliss" today. XXOO.

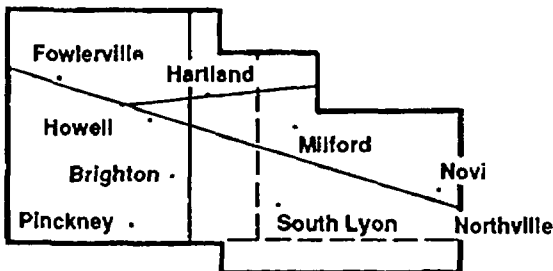

# Slouching toward wisdom: 'Middle Ages' finds mark

By Suzanne Gill

Producer Stan Rogow calls the 1990s "the '60s without drugs." Pointing to political changes at home and abroad and the expectation of more change to come, Rogow observes, "it's not unlike something that was happening in the late '60s, only now it's happening for a lot more people."

It was that idea and a conversation Rogow had with former NBC entertainment chief (now head of Paramount studios) Brandon Tartikoff that led him to develop *Middle Ages*, an ensemble drama debuting Monday, Aug. 31, on CBS. The series moves to a Thursday time slot on Sept. 3.

The producer of *Shannon's Deal*, *Playing for Time* and *The Clan on the Cave Bear*, Rogow, like Tartikoff, is a man in his 40s. When Tartikoff, who midwived hits from *Hill Street Blues* to *Fresh Prince*,

suggested a series about "guys our age," Rogow took umbrage.

"I said, 'I'm not interested in guys our age. Look at the way I dress, look at what I do for a living. It's not interesting to me.'"

In fact, *Middle Ages* includes people of all ages who are trying to keep their dreams from being buried in the debris of daily life. Peter Riegert (*Local hero*) and William Russ (*Wiseguy*) play lifelong buddies who've arrived at mid-life and are assessing their options.

Riegert, a family man and traveling electronics wholesaler, is suddenly haunted by his memories of a beautiful young woman who took drugs and jumped off a building 20 years earlier. Laughing, the vision tells him she can fly and so can he. But can he? While he is still wondering, the real woman (Ashley Crow) in his life reminds him that her exis-

tence, too, is something less than a fairy tale.

Russ is more impulsive, and, seeing the sexy 20-year-old lead singer he always wanted for his rock 'n' roll band, decides to quit his desk job, return to music and ask the young woman to marry him.

There's humor in *Middle Ages*, and hope; but only about as many car chases, shootouts, bikini-clad women and sunny days as there are in an ordinary life. Set in Chicago, the show captures both the energy and the dinginess of that great, sprawling city.

James Gammon co-stars as Riegert's single, 60-ish father-in-law, Dave, who is laid off by the same firm that employs Riegert. Dave survives a dark night of the soul to discover that he still has choices before him: He decides he'll drive a cab.

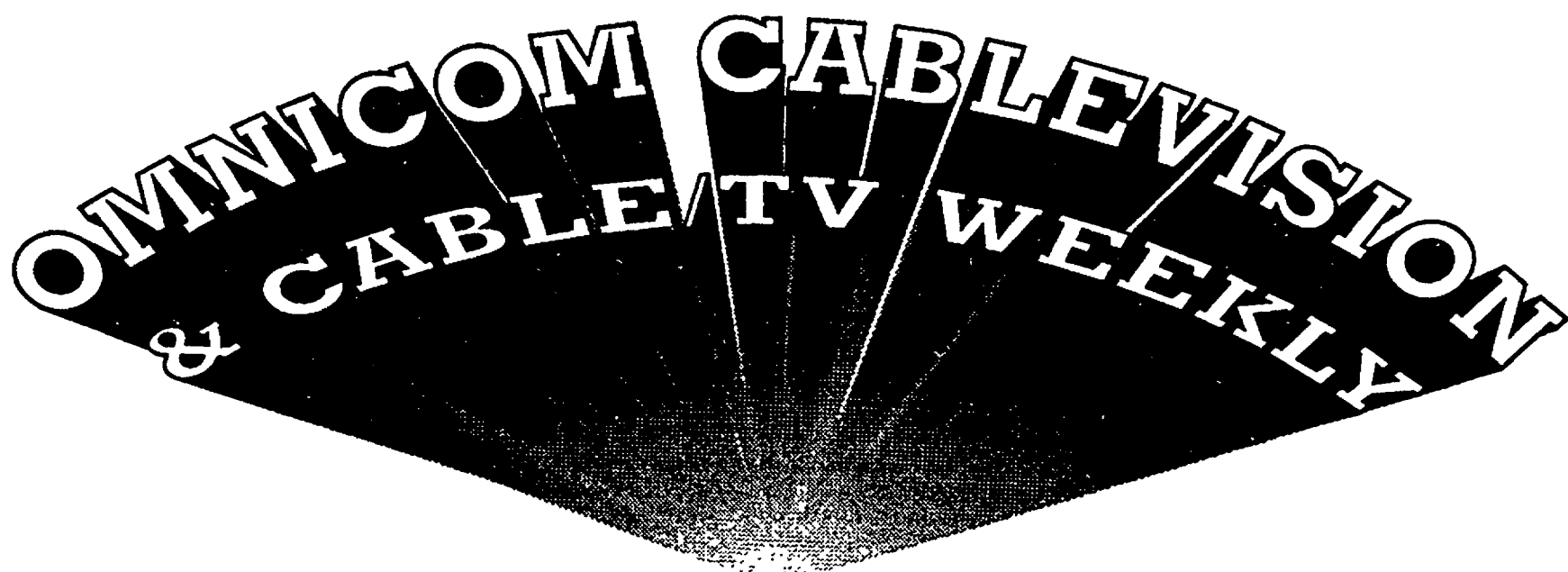

## Wartime art collecting; kids gone wrong

During World War II, the Third Reich's "care and safekeeping" policy was initiated to protect important works of art in Germany and the countries it invaded. The actual effect, however, was to license the pillaging of art treasures by Nazi collectors, particularly Hermann Goering. Debuting Friday, Aug. 28, on A&E's *Time Machine With Jack Perkins, Spoils of War* documents the cultural rape of Europe that resulted from officially sanctioned looting by both Nazis and Allies, following trails of stolen art that lead to Russia and the United States.

The escalating crisis of female juvenile delinquency is explored in the *Your Family Matters* special *Jennifer's in Jail*, airing Wednesday, Aug. 26, on Lifetime. Susan Dey is the host of this one-hour documentary that profiles the lives of several young offenders and examines how the justice system handles such cases.

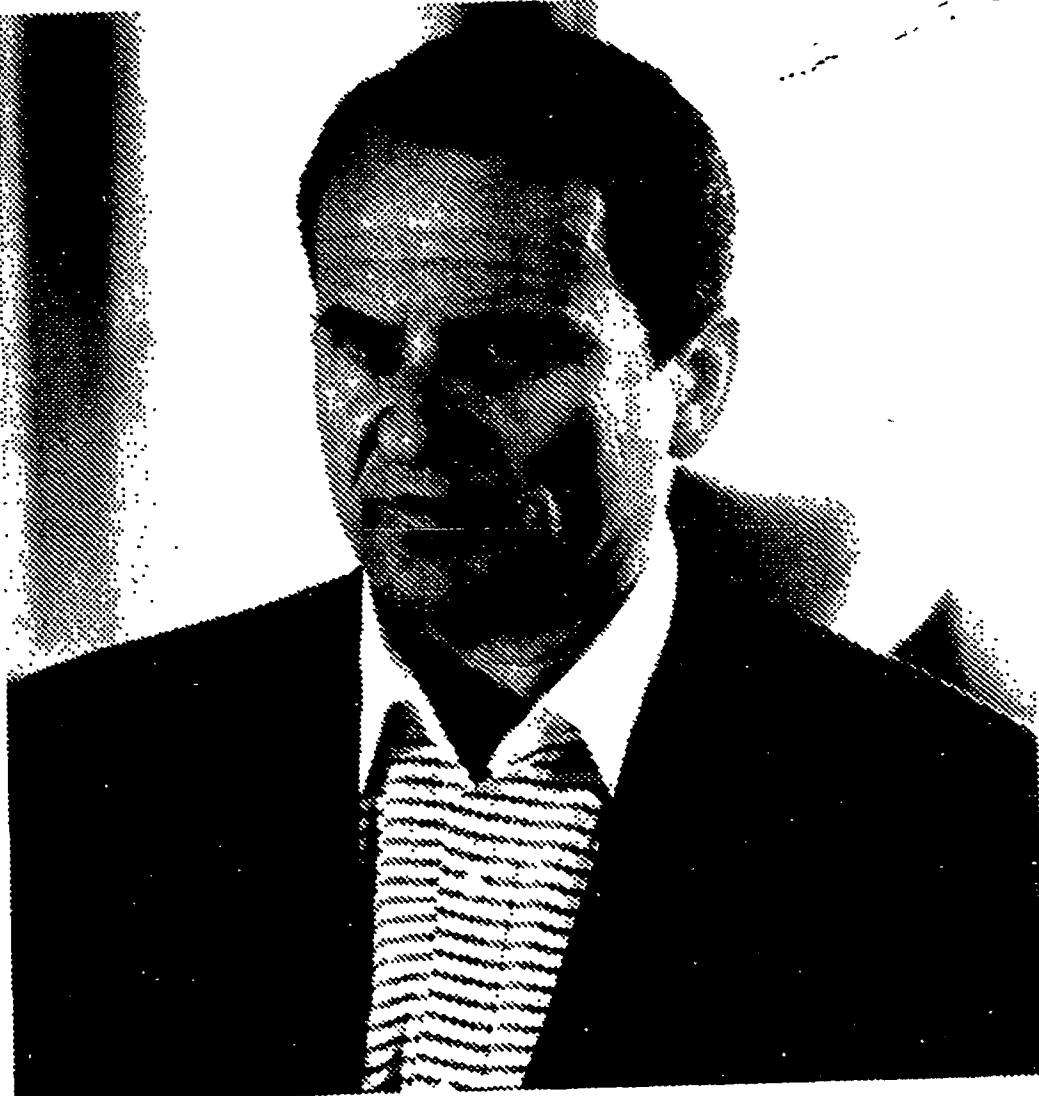

## ABC, ESPN cover Little League series

ESPN kicks off coverage of the 46th annual Little League World Series from Williamsport, Pa., on Thursday, Aug. 27, presenting both the foreign and U.S. championship games. On Saturday, Aug. 29, the respective winners meet on ABC's *Wide World of Sports* to determine this year's champion. ABC introduces the game with a half-hour pregame show for the first time in its 30 years covering the Series.

Julie Moran, an ABC announcer covering the final game with colleagues Jim Palmer and Brent Musburger, says the spirit of the competition is what makes the event special.

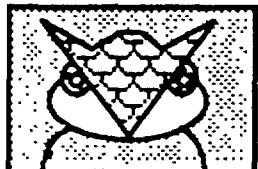

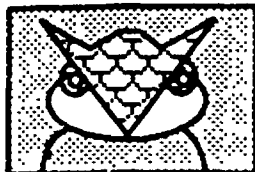

Unfortunately, the source of these misguided story lines is the producers and writers, and *Days*, along with several other daytime shows this year, has gone through a fair number of both.

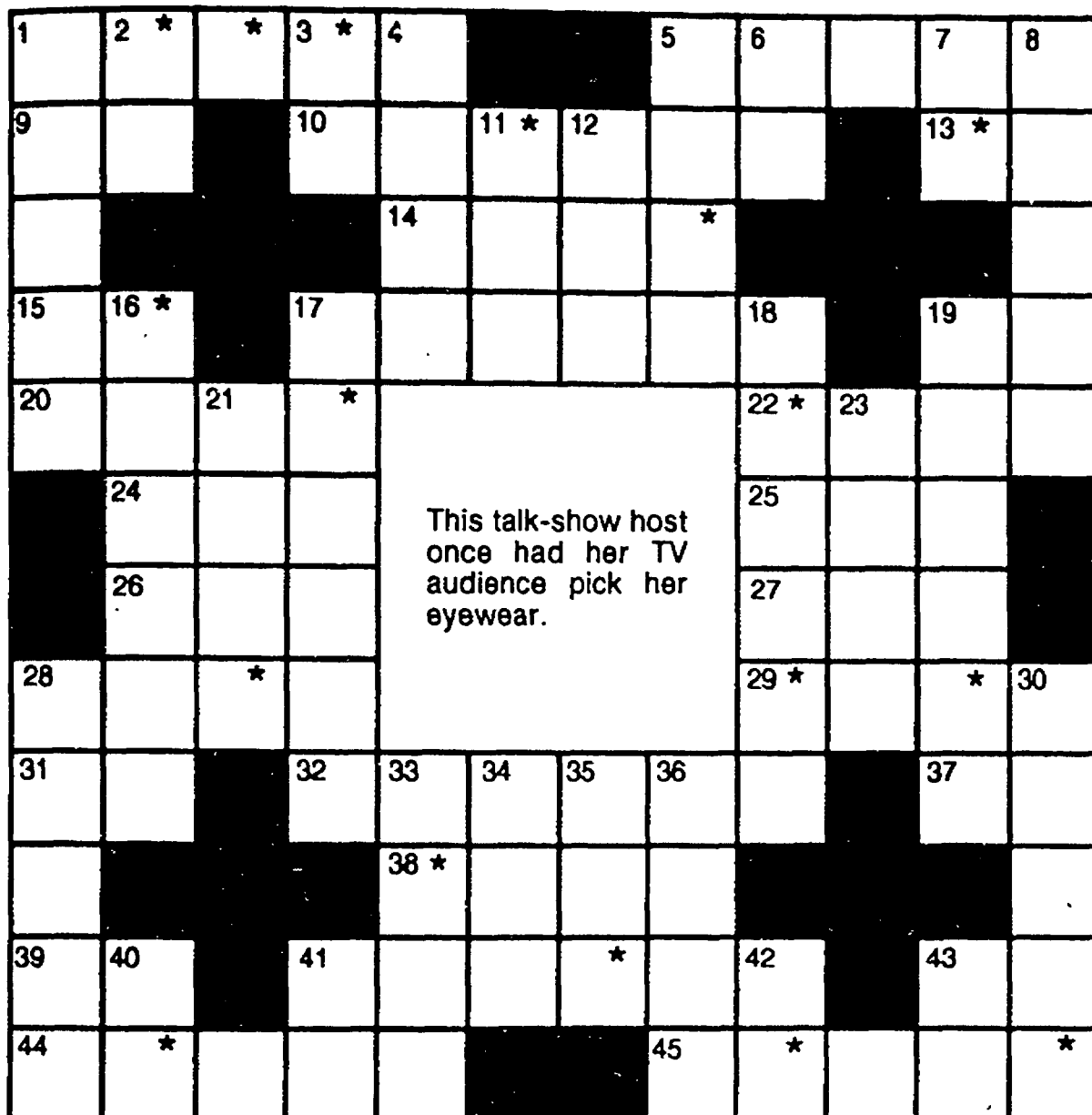

When *GH* brought Gloria Monty on board, she literally cleaned house, dumping characters that she had no interest in developing. Story lines were either wrapped so quickly no one knew what was happening or they simply disappeared. The fans didn't like what was happening, the ratings fell and Monty soon exited.

Enter Wendy Riche, *GH*'s new executive producer. While she is trying to make her mark on the show by bringing together Holly and Bill, she has handled things differently, paying attention to character history and development. Unlike Monty, Riche has brought back the fun and intrigue that have made *GH* so popular.

Executive Producer Ken Corday of *Days* is aware of the problems his show has suffered and has promised a return to the core of the show: the Hortons and the Bradys. I expect when Jennifer returns from maternity leave, the story line and characters of Jack and Jennifer will be much more mature.

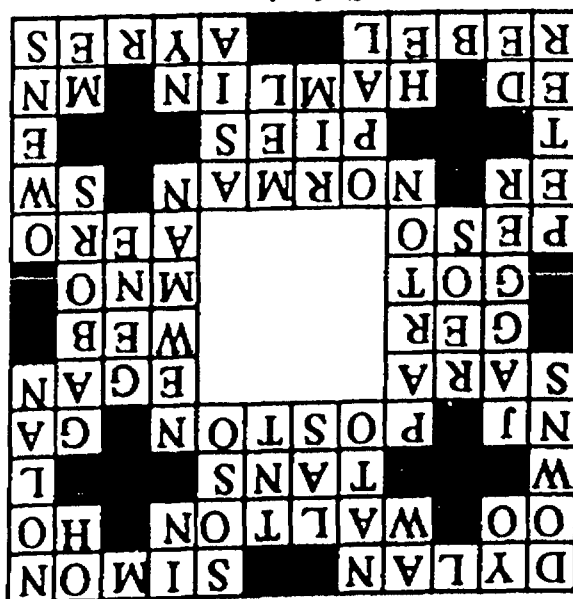

## 'Screenworks' makes impressive debut

Movies love dreamers. Perhaps because the industry was founded by men and women who staked their futures to a dicey enterprise, filmmakers seem drawn to stories of individuals who risk everything to realize the marvelous, magical (and, at times, maniacal) things they see in their heads.

Such a tale comes to the screen in *The Water Engine*, the debut presentation of TNT's *Screenworks* series. Produced in association with Steven Spielberg's Amblin Entertainment, *Screenworks* seeks to produce new material by America's leading playwrights. *The Water Engine* was scripted by Pulitzer Prize winner David Mamet.

William H. Macy stars as Charles Lang, a Chicago machinist who spends his evenings in a secret lab building his dream: an eight-horsepower engine that runs on water. When Charles tries to patent his amazing invention, his attorney (John Mahoney) enlists the involvement of wealthy businessman Lawrence Oberman, played by Joe Mantegna. Charles balks at the outright sale of his engine design and soon finds himself running from Oberman's thugs, ordered to nab the blueprints at any cost.

Macy carries the film with his intense portrayal of the naive inventor. Patti LuPone is sympathetic as Charles' blind sister Rita, and Mantegna is an icy menace as the powerful Oberman. Besides Mahoney, the fine supporting cast includes Treat Williams and Charles Durning.
