

Schools explore fee system for use of buildings

Northville school officials hope to trim their operational expenses by imposing a fee on clubs and groups that use district facilities for after-hours activities.

Under a proposed facilities-use rate schedule, clubs and community groups will be subject to a fee for using rooms and facilities in each and every one of the school district's buildings.

"We are looking at all the outside groups who use our facilities and trying to consolidate so the activities can center in the buildings that are the most cost-effective to run," said Superintendent Leonard Reznierski.

According to the proposed plan — slated to go before the School Board for consideration Monday, Sept. 14 — each of the three designated facility user groups will be

charged fees for using school buildings after 6 p.m., on weekends and on holidays.

Usage fees will vary based on the room requested and the amount of energy consumed. The costs of maintenance and custodial services will also be factored into the individual user fee and will vary per request.

School Board President Carol Rahimi said while the fees are not yet cast in stone, suggested hourly fees for Amerman's gymnasium are estimated at about \$7 (without maintenance and custodial expenses) and about \$4.50 for that school's media center.

For school-affiliated groups — like Scouts, Mother's Club, PTAs, senior citizens, youth services — and traditional school programs — like athletics and band events — there will be no charge for using any room in any building during regular school hours and before 6 p.m. However should those groups choose to meet after 6 p.m.,

they too will be subject to an hourly user fee.

"Affiliated groups like the PTAs, Scouts, boosters and the senior citizens can use the buildings free of charge," Rahimi said, "if they use them when we have them available. Like the elementaries: They are in full swing until 6 p.m. After that the utilities are turned down, and at that point there's a fee."

"We are just trying to be more cost-effective," she said. "Rather than have all the buildings open and the lights ablaze for a group of 10 people, we'll try this."

Non-affiliated groups — like private groups and church organizations that are not tied to the schools — will pay an hourly user fee regardless of time and location, explained Rahimi and Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services David Bolitho.

Bolitho explained it this way: Non-affiliated groups can rent a room during regular custodial shift that would

cost about \$11.35 an hour for heat, ventilation and lights. Add in 50 cents for maintenance, and custodial services at \$7 an hour, and it amounts to about \$18.85. That figure, he said, will change depending on what room is requested, the amount of energy consumed, and the hours it takes to prepare the room for the activity and/or clean up after it.

Fees are averaged and based on past utility use, maintenance and custodial services needed to keep facilities up and running during the group's activities. They vary from room to room and building to building, officials said. Rates will be based on the costs to operate and clean the particular room or facility requested.

"These costs are in line and, pretty frankly, dirt cheap for what you are getting from the building," Reznierski said.

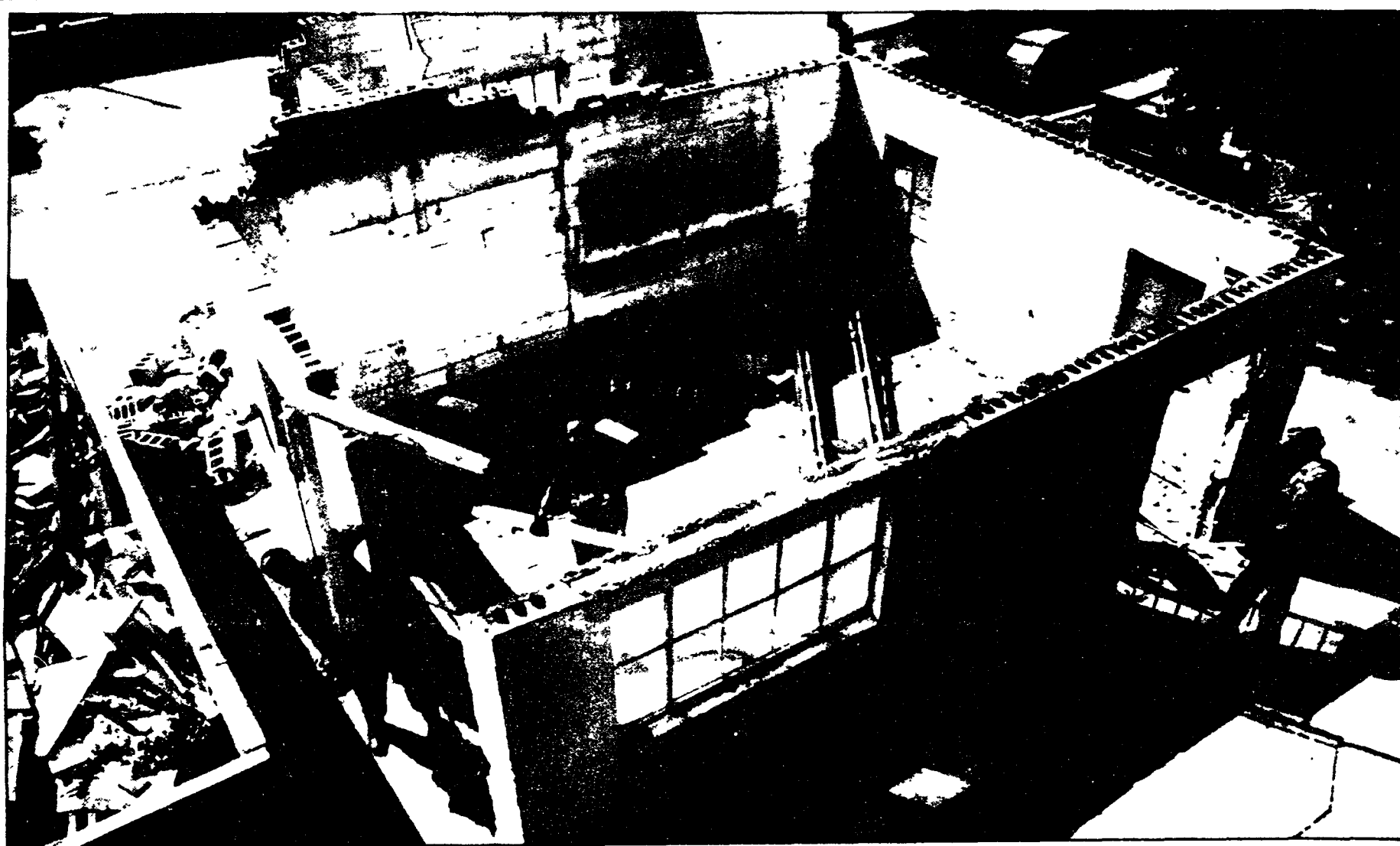

Group eyes planner choices

Northville Township is hunting for a new planning consultant, and could snare its quarry by the end of the month.

Three firms are in the running for the township planning consultant job, including one company with recent ties to the township.

A Planning Commission subcommittee will interview Wade Trim Associates, Beckett & Raeder, and McKenna Associates on Sept. 22. The subcommittee is expected to pass on a recommendation to the full Planning Commission and then to the Township Board for its October session, said Carol Maise, township planning and zoning administrator.

The new planner could be on board by October's Planning Commission meeting.

Apparently out of the running is Grand Rapids-based WBDC Group, which gained the township's planning contract in early 1991. Maise said WBDC has suffered from the loss of several of its planners, including Brad Strader, who handled Northville's planning chores.

The firm's planners now operate out of Grand Rapids, which poses logistical problems, Maise said.

Strader, well-respected by the township Planning Commission, hired on with McKenna Associates a few months ago. Maise would not say if Strader's presence guarantees McKenna the contract.

"I think the subcommittee's open-minded," she said. "Basically, we want to see what services they provide."

Staff versatility is a key. The township wants to know about each firm's landscape architects, traffic consultants, and other planning associates, Maise said.

Maise said the township sent out 19 request for proposals. Ten of the proposals were returned, and the three-member subcommittee whittled the list to three.

Members of the subcommittee are John Amos, Karen Baja, and Richard Allen.

WTUA board selects new attorney firm

Western Townships Utilities Authority officials hope a change of attorneys will put a new face on a project colored by months of controversy.

WTUA on Thursday named Foster, Swift, Collins & Smith, a firm with offices in Farmington Hills and Lansing, as its new legal representatives.

The new firm replaces Sills, Hemming, Law, Essad, Polaczky & Gillary as WTUA's legal advisers. Variations of Sills, Hemming worked with politicians from Northville, Plymouth and Canton townships since 1986 to

dream up and make the WTUA sewer line project a reality.

Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczky, the precursor to the outgoing firm, also serves as the legal consultant for the three townships. The firm earned millions from its work on the sewer project since 1986, including about \$900,000 on legal work for two sewer bond sales.

WTUA Chairperson Thomas Yack says a new law firm symbolizes a new start.

"They have no connections whatsoever to any of the communities that I could pick up on," he said. "They bring to the project enough relevant expertise. . . I think we can say Fos-

ter and Smith is a new face."

Yack said the firm has experience in similar projects in the Lansing area. He called the group "sort of a middle-sized firm" that would not lose WTUA in the shuffle but was large enough to specialize in a number of sewer-related issues.

Rates for associates and top-level staff range from \$80-\$165, Yack said. He also said he did not expect Foster, Swift to charge a retainer fee. In contrast to Law, Hemming, which charged WTUA retainer costs for legal, lobbying, and public relations.

Yack said WTUA has not set a specific deadline for the changeover in firms. The new group will work with

Sills, Hemming during a transition phase, he said.

Yack and two outgoing members of the three-person WTUA commission made the final decision after narrowing a seven-firm field to three. But Yack said the board — which includes lame-duck supervisors Betty Lennox of Northville and Gerald Law of Plymouth — welcomed its successors' input.

In fact, Foster and Smith finished second on Northville Township Supervisor-elect Karen Baja's list, and came highly recommended by Kathleen Keen-McCarthy, winner of the Plymouth Township Republican

primary, Yack said. Baja and McCarthy were not available for comment Friday.

The \$100-million sewer line is intended to lessen the three communities' dependence on Detroit's sewage system by establishing a network of lines to the Ypsilanti Communities Utilities Authority treatment plant.

But continuing revelations of behind-the-scenes ties fouled the project in some eyes. The law firm became a frequent target of criticism because it had never been required to submit bids for legal, lobbying, public relations, and other contracts it received.

Printer sets up local relief drive

On Friday afternoon Ron Bodnar was looking into the open tail end of two empty trucks. He was waiting and hoping people would come and fill the trucks with the donated items he asked for on behalf of the victims of Hurricane Andrew.

Bodnar, the owner of Copy-Boy Printers, 342 E. Main St., really hadn't anticipated launching the collection drive himself. He thought for sure somebody else in the community would do it, perhaps a church group or the like. But when he hadn't seen any signs or collection canisters posted around town, he knew he'd have to be the one to get the ball rolling.

So Thursday he printed some fliers and called a few friends to help him

pass them out. Together he and his tribe of about 25 volunteers went door-to-door to try and drum up some support for their cause.

"I was just interested in helping out," the printer said. "Like everybody else I just assumed I'd see a sign or a canister or a church group come forward, but I didn't, so I did it myself."

"As empty as those trucks look now, I really think we are going to collect a lot of stuff over the weekend. I'm hoping it will snowball," he said Friday.

Bodnar said there were really no personal motivations behind his wanting to help other than his genuine concern for the people victimized by the storm that leveled homes and businesses along the Florida coastline and throughout the south.

"I have family in Florida, but they were unaffected, and I like children. I

have children. I guess my main concern is for those children. I don't care if they are black, white or Hispanic. It happened. And I don't mind helping these people out."

By Friday afternoon, Bodnar had all his feelers out in the community. He and others had passed out more than 5,000 fliers announcing the drive. He had talked with many of the downtown merchants who lent their support by posting fliers, donating goods, or volunteering.

"We've had about 25 active volunteers between the ages of 7 and 60. We've had some really gung-ho kids. They don't understand it all, but they know there's a problem and they have a human need to help out."

Bodnar said he had help from McDonald Ford Ford, Brownie Girl Scout Troop No. 975, Civic Center, Northville city officials and staffers,

John Buckland and several others who helped behind the scenes.

"The hardest part was getting the trucks. You can't rent them any more for things like this because of a law passed in April. So it really helped out when Black's Hardware and Urban's Parfition donated the two trucks."

Time, Bodnar said, was his biggest barrier to having a successful collection drive. Pulled together at the last minute, he had committed to sending the community's donation along with the Salvation Army's shipment today (Monday). So he had virtually just the weekend to get the word out and fill both trucks.

"It's unfortunate we don't have a lot of time," he said. "We have to take our stuff to the Salvation Army on Monday at 8 a.m., so we'll be working

Schools consider charges for use of their buildings

Boltho said the fee schedule is one of many cost-cutting measures the district is taking to reduce its operational expenses and be more cost-effective.

Boltho said his rates were arrived at by reviewing monthly utility bills and averaging the cost of maintenance and custodial services for the time the building would be in use.

"We have not had adequate charges for people using the building. In the past it's come out of the general fund. . . This is what it costs us to run the buildings," said Boltho. "We are not gouging anybody."

Under his proposal, only schools that need to be kept up and running after traditional school hours will remain lighted and heated. All others will be shut down after 6 p.m. Groups wanting to meet after 6 p.m. will be encouraged to meet in the school that is the most cost effective or already operational, he said.

Rahimi said the plan could save the district between five and 10 percent of the total cost of running the buildings.

The members of the school board's facilities subcommittee met Thurs-

day night to review the new fee schedule after school officials had taken several calls from residents concerned about the issue.

While the fee system is a cost-cutting measure for the district, it's an added expense for some of the local clubs and groups that have historically used the schools free of charge. Prior to Thursday's meeting, both Girl and Boy Scouts were considered by the district as non-affiliated groups and therefore would have been subject to an hourly user fee.

In addition to several phone calls, a resident's comments made last Monday's School Board meeting prompted the administration to change its mind and move the Scouts into the affiliated group.

David Ryzyl, who's active with his family in local Boy Scout activities, asked board members last Monday to reconsider imposing the fee for the local groups of Scouts that rely on the schools for meetings and other activities.

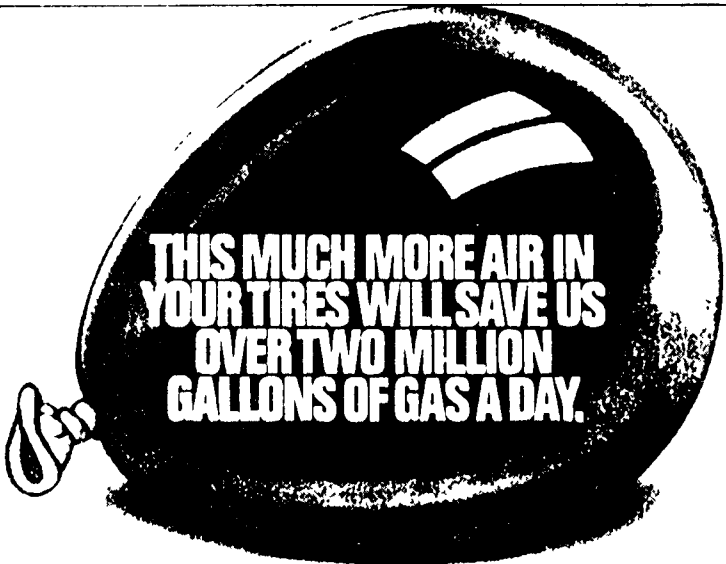
"I hope you take into consideration that we have a very small weekly budget," Ryzyl said. "I think it's a shame that you would charge Cub Scouts to use their own school."

"If your intent is to get people mad about not passing the millage — you are," he told board members.

Ryzyl, who attended Thursday night's committee meeting, was pleased to hear the scouts would not be subject to a fee provided they met before 6 p.m.

District officials said devising the fee schedule was a tedious job since operational expenses vary from room to room and building to building. Rahimi said Boltho has inventoried each room in each of the buildings so an itemized fee per room will be charged. Groups choosing to use the schools after 6 p.m. and on weekends and holidays will be asked to pay a premium to cover custodial charges of time and a half pay for janitorial services.

Boltho said the fees are based on actual bills and custodial and maintenance costs of the district. Hourly rates that will be charged to non-affiliated groups are not astronomical, he said, but they are in line with district bills. Boltho was quick to say that there were no inflated charges being passed on to non-affiliated groups in an attempt for those outside groups to carry the significantly higher number of affiliated groups that use the school facilities.

Fees don't deter fall athletes

The \$195 pay-to-participate fee hasn't dissuaded too many Northville High School athletes from playing fall sports this year.

Athletic Director Dennis Colligan said Friday 284 high school athletes made it to this year's eligibility sheets. That's three more than last year's fall final tally of 281.

"I had hoped that we'd have at least the same turnout as last year; I expected a little bit of a drop, but I think we will see that in the winter and spring sports," Colligan said.

Colligan said pay-to-play research shows that fall sports participation levels are usually at their normal ranges. Historically, other districts which have used a pay-to-play system have reported that participation tends to trickle off in winter and spring sports.

District officials had fretted that the pay-to-participate fees might discourage some athletes from playing sports this year. But last Tuesday's deadline for pay-to-participate fees for fall sports put them at ease.

Colligan was pleased to report that 242 of the athletes had paid their playing fee by the deadline last week. The other 42 athletes, Colligan said, he hoped had just forgotten to make the payment or forgotten to tell their parents about the due bill.

"I'm pleased that we've had that much coopera-

tion," Colligan said. "If you have worked with high-school-aged kids before, then you know that 86 percent is a good margin. I'm anticipating that 90 percent of the other 14 percent just forgot about the payment or lost the form."

In an effort to keep the payment aspect off the field, Colligan said he met the eight fall sports teams and the cheerleading squads at the onset of the season and handed out the payment forms. He informed athletes of the deadline for payment and let it go at that. He said he hasn't monitored it or

hounded athletes about it since then.

"We worked really hard to keep it (the monetary aspect of the program) away from the teams and the players. We wanted to let them play and practice and enjoy it," he said.

Colligan said the district had received six requests for financial assistance that had yet to be reviewed or paid out of the district's hardship fund, which is supported by donations from the community.

Last Monday, Superintendent Leonard Reznierski said he had sent letters out to all the civic groups and clubs asking them to donate money to help underwrite the costs of the pay-to-participate fees for hardship cases.

He also said a four-person committee, chaired by Robert Somson, executive director of the district's Special Education Department, has been convened to review hardship cases. Colligan; Laura Wiener, assistant principal at the high school; and middle school Assistant Principal Sue Meyer all join Somson on that committee.

A second seven-member committee has also been created to monitor the pay-to-participate program. High School Principal Thomas Johnson, district Business Manager John Street, Assistant Superintendent for administrative services David Bolitho, citizen at large Irene Flemming, and a representative from the Music Boosters and the Athletic Booster will also be designated to sit on the monitoring committee.

Shoe store opens

A new Northville retail store is really off and running.

Fire Safety

What's all the stuff that the firefighters wear?

Phil tagged along when his grandson's Cub Scout den paid a visit to the local fire department. He remembered these trips well. In his younger days Phil's own Scout troop had come. As time passed, Phil had come along with his children. Now, it was his grandson's turn.

In a lot of ways, Phil thought, things hadn't changed too much. The trucks, though larger and newer, were still there, covered with ladders, axes and compartment doors that opened to reveal even more equipment. Extra hose was still rolled along a rack against the wall, and in the background Phil still heard the persistent squawk of the radio.

In other ways, though, things were very different. The medical rescue truck and its sophisticated equipment was new. And as the firefighter leading the tour delivered his fire safety message to the group, it seemed to Phil that much of it was directed to the adults present. He did not remember any discussion about smoke detectors and the need for home exit plans when he last made this trip.

The biggest change that Phil noticed, however, was the

equipment worn by the firefighters. Thinking back to his childhood, Phil remembered the black rubber coats and the long, black rubber boots that pulled up to the hips. He also remembered the high-peaked leather helmets with elaborate decorative shields on the front. None of these things were there any more. In their place was an elaborate array of brightly colored clothing made of exotic materials.

Phil remarked that, with all of the equipment on, the firefighter looked like he was prepared to fight fires in outer space. The firefighter leading the tour laughed for a moment, then replied that Phil was not far from the truth. The inside of a building on fire, he explained, is an alien environment. Just as in space, temperatures very greatly from those we normally encounter. And just as in space, there is often no air to breathe. In order to put the fire out, or rescue people who are trapped, firefighters need equipment which allow them to work safely in this environment.

Phil learned that this special clothing is called "turn-out gear" by the firefighters, and that there have been a lot of changes in recent years. Nodding at Phil, the firefighter noted that a lot of the changes had, in fact, been the result of things learned in the space program.

Going through the equipment piece by piece, the firefighter pointed out that the long, black rubber coats, designed principally to keep fire fighters dry, had been replaced by coats that are made of three different layers of material. The outer layer is made of new, flame-resistant material. Beneath this is a vapor barrier, followed by a heat barrier. The outer shell is a brownish color, and covered with wide bands of orange and silver reflective material. This, the firefighter explained, makes it easier to see firefighters at night, or inside dark spaces.

The coat is also much shorter than the old coats, ending at the waist. This, it was explained, helps reduce weight and makes it easier for the firefighters to move their arms. In the place of the hip boots, there are now high-bibbed pants, made of the same material as the coat, with shorter, knee-length boots. In what Phil thought was an appropriate concession to tradition, these pants are held up by red suspenders.

The firefighter showed the group the hood firefighters put over their heads. Made of heat-resistant material such as Nomex, the hood protects the firefighter's face, ears and neck from burns. Even the helmets had changed. In place of the old, high peaked leather helmets firefighters now wear a more sleekly styled helmet made

of high-density, impact-resistant plastic materials. A shroud pulled down from inside the helmet provides extra protection for the firefighters' neck and ears. In place of the decorative shield, the front of the helmet now sports a plastic face shield. Thick, multi-layer leather gloves complete the basic equipment.

The firefighter next demonstrated the self-contained breathing apparatus, or SCBA for short. In order to make sure the firefighters can work and breathe in areas filled with heat and smoke, the firefighter explained, they wear a metal tank on their backs filled with compressed air. A two-stage regulator supplies air to a face mask. A special alarm device hung from straps made of flame-resistant material emits a piercing noise if the firefighter remains motionless for 20 seconds. A gauge allows the firefighter to monitor the air supply which, it was explained, would last for about 20 seconds.

When the tour was over, Phil thanked the firefighter for his presentation, and as he left the station Phil was already looking forward to the changes he expected to see when he came again, with his great-grandchildren.

Man faces possible charges for tall tale to police

A Southfield man who claimed he was the victim of an armed robbery outside the Northville Meijer store faces possible charges of filing a false police report.

Township police said the 19-year-old man was found on the ground in the 20401 Haggerty Meijer lot late Aug. 26. The man complained of inju-

ries to his head, leg, and left side, and told police that someone had struck him and stolen his father's 1988 Chrysler New Yorker.

According to the man's statement, he left work at Meijer at about 11:30 p.m. and drove eastbound on Eight Mile when he was struck from behind by an unknown vehicle.

The man told police he got out of the car to inspect damages when he was struck in the head by another

man. The suspect told police he was knocked unconscious, and that he found himself across the road from Meijer when he awoke.

But the man's story began to unravel at that point.

Police ran an inter-city broadcast of the missing vehicle, and the New Yorker turned up in Redford Township. Police there said the vehicle was found wrecked and abandoned near Schoolcraft and Beech Daly. Redford

Township police said they earlier had noticed the Southfield man and the New Yorker at a gas station near that intersection.

Police asked the Southfield man if he needed an accident report filed, but the man reportedly refused. The officer then drove to another accident, where a driver told police that a vehicle had spun out, lost control, and hit a wall. The first vehicle then left the scene, the man told police.

A gas station attendant described the Southfield man as being at the station earlier that evening. A Northville Township police officer also reported seeing the suspect in the lot at Meijer about 1 a.m. The man did not appear injured at that time, the officer said.

Police said a female companion of the Southfield man was questioned about the incident. She eventually admitted that the couple had left

work at Meijer and were involved in a car accident later in Redford Township.

Police then questioned the Southfield man at St. Mary Hospital. The man at first stuck to his armed robbery story, but later recanted, police said.

Police said the man could be charged with filing a false police report and leaving the scene of an accident.

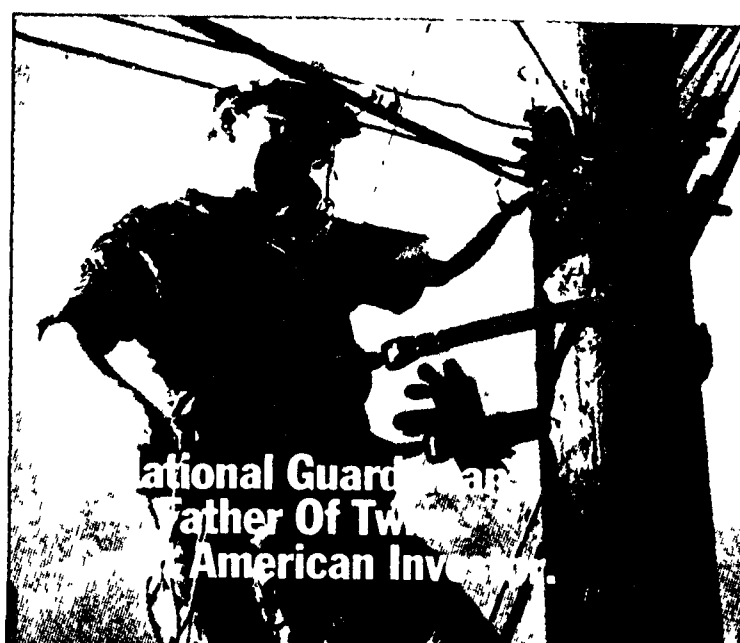

2000's report is positive, Home improvements at work

A good first step. There's more work to be done, but Northville 2000's preliminary report on the state of the township could help open the door to positive, much-needed change in local government.

When coupled with the primary election overhaul of the current Township Board, a changes-in-attitudes approach to a bevy of important issues seems in the offing.

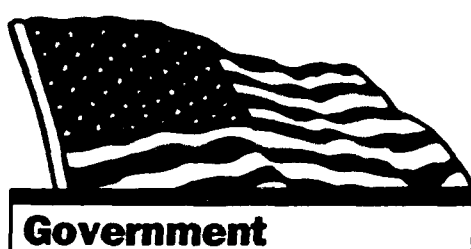
Northville 2000, formed about nine months ago to study the primary facets of township operations, delivered its baby a couple of weeks ago. Included were reviews of township finance, construction, public safety, recreation, and human services programs.

The overall report was tempered a bit more than we had anticipated — and more than some of Northville 2000's delegates had expected — but the overall theme was evident: Northville Township has long suffered from poor management and continually has reacted to issues rather than establish a proactive course of governing.

Reactive government results from poor leadership, governors who are unable or unwilling to envision future needs and communicate those ideas. That's clearly been the case in Northville Township.

The few instances of alleged visionary leadership here have been riddled with incompetence and scandal. Some board members ramble endlessly about how important the WTUA sewer project is, but they're unwilling to admit the obvious: that they slept while consultants — friends, political allies, relatives — freely gouged huge sums of money from the project without having to submit to bidding procedures.

And the lame ducks continually harp about the ill-fated Haller Library program. Reality check time, people: you bungled that project on several fronts,

and you seem to be the sole lamentors of the plan.

It's clear that the majority of Northville 2000 members are troubled by the township's business practices. Although some portions of its report stuck too closely to the dictum of various department heads and township officials, the bottom line is that the committee realizes change is necessary to revive a troubled community.

Perhaps the most insightful and meaningful recommendation brought forth by Northville 2000 concerns the public safety departments. While reporting that police and fire personnel seemingly are capable and professional, the document urged the notion of shared services programs with other communities.

This, folks, is the key to rejuvenating the community. Significant steps toward a Northville Community Police Department and Northville Community Fire Department most likely would free up significant sums of money to enhance those departments by directing funds to areas other than salaries and benefits.

There will be a lot of kicking and screaming before that happens, because territories have been staked out for years. But the community is paying an incredible portion of its tax bill for duplicated public safety services, including personnel and equipment.

Any real search for savings must start there, and Northville 2000 seems to be on the right track.

Continue the interest

The Northville City Council last week appointed Mark Cryderman to fill out the council term of G. Dewey Gardner, who recently moved to Brighton. A few things should be said about the shift.

First point: Gardner's service deserves note. His involvement in the city has been extensive and significant.

Gardner served many years on the City Council, including a stint as mayor pro tem. He left the council to wage an unsuccessful bid for mayor, but that didn't stop him from returning to the council — demonstrating an unusual level of commitment. Although his council service has been the most visible, Gardner has made significant contributions elsewhere, most notably on the Downtown Development Authority and city Beautification Commission.

He's not really going anywhere, of course; IV Seasons Flowers remains on Main Street, and we can expect continued involvement. Still, the end of a significant term on the council should not pass unnoticed.

Second point: The council selected a very capable replacement in Mark Cryderman. He has a demonstrated history of civic involvement and has served well on the city Planning Commission. We expect he'll prove to be a valuable council member, and congratulations

are in order on the appointment.

But the third, and probably most important, point concerns the four applicants the council did not select.

In situations like this it's common to hear statements about how hard the choice was, how several people would do a good job in the open position. The prime motivation for such statements often appears to be sparing the feelings of the ones not chosen. At least in this case, though, the statements from the council members were absolutely true.

The applicant pool — Jim Cutler, Kevin Hartshorne, Chuck Keys, and Dave Totten, in addition to Cryderman — was of an unusually high quality. Each of the five has significant strengths which could be put to good use on the City Council.

The odd thing is that City Council elections historically suffer from a dearth of candidates. Of the five, Hartshorne is the only one who has run for election to the council in the past. We wholeheartedly agree that all four of the not-chosen candidates keep up their interest and, especially, strongly consider running for council in the election next year. When voters have a choice to make, more discussion takes place and better government is likely to result.

I knew it was 2½ -inches



My first mistake was not insisting we hire somebody to do it.

"They said it was really easy," she said. "They would be happy to send somebody out, but it was so easy that anybody could do it."

"I told them you're not exactly the most skilled guy in the world when it comes to putting up blinds, but they said it was really easy . . . they were sure just about anybody could handle it."

Right there — at that very point — is where I should have taken a stand about hiring somebody to install the fancy new blinds she had bought for the sliding glass door that leads from the master bedroom to the deck. But I didn't.

I allowed myself to be misled by her assertion that anybody could do it, and so we set out to install the blinds without professional assistance.

"The first thing we do is read the instructions; then we read them again to make sure we understood them the first time," I said.

So we both read the instructions and then we both read them again . . . just to make sure, reduce the possibility for error.

"What are you doing?" she asked. Not a question, more of an accusation that I was doing something wrong.

"I'm installing this bracket 2½ -inches higher than the length of the vertical slats," I said.

St. Julian Wine Company scored a double hit in the annual Michigan State Fair wine competition after its 1991 Vidal Blanc Ice Wine was named best of show white wine and its 1990 Chancellor was named best of show red wine. The white wine is a dessert wine, the red a table wine.

Local wine columnists Ray and Eleanor Heald were part of the panel of judges that sampled the 123 Michigan wines entered in the competition.

The daylong event was held at the Machus Red Fox restaurant in Birmingham. Ten Michigan wineries were represented.

Here are the 16 gold medal winners, not including the two wines judged gold medal winners, and best of show.

Breads are enjoying fresh popularity, and creative variations can be made at home.

Completely baked

Breads keep gaining popularity, with many varied possibilities

American consumers are eating more bread each year, and consumption is predicted to increase annually through 1996, according to the industry weekly, *Milling & Baking News*.

Two other interesting facts are emerging from the statistics, said Gordon L. Davidson, editor of the Kansas City, Missouri-based publication.

First, bread consumers are closing the gap between white bread and all the other breads (called variety breads). We still eat more white bread but an ever-increasing amount of other breads, too.

Second, per-capita consumption of frozen bakery foods dropped almost 5 percent last year, continuing a trend that began in 1982, according to Davidson.

The bottom line is we want our bakery products fresh. It seems, yet the idea of working with yeast scares many cooks so much that they never attempt to bake bread at home.

Yeast breads often are considered difficult because they have the reputation of being risky, and there's the extra work of kneading the dough.

Kneading should be done on a lightly floured surface, a board or countertop; add a little more flour if the dough remains sticky. Knead eight to 10 minutes until smooth and elastic. The dough should have tiny air bubbles under the surface.

Here are some bread-baking tips:

- Turn the dough onto the lightly floured surface. With lightly floured hands, shape the dough into a ball and fold it toward you.
- With the heels of your hands, using a rolling motion, push it away. Give the dough a quarter of a turn.
- Knead eight to 10 minutes; dough should no longer stick and will be ready for a second rising as recipe directs.
- Assemble all the needed ingredients and measure them accurately. Too little flour or too much liquid or yeast can greatly affect the quality of the bread.
- Be sure that the temperature of your oven is accurate. It sometimes happens that an oven will be 10 to 25 degrees off.
- Follow the recipe.

Baking experts say the main causes of home bread-baking failures are over-rising, under-kneading or jarring the risen bread.

The secret to working with yeast is in the proofing. Water should be 110 degrees Fahrenheit — warm to the touch but not hot. You should be able to run it over your wrist without the skin turning red.

The temperature of the water is going to be reduced if you put it in a cold measuring cup and bowl. Warm them up ahead of time with warm water.

When the temperature outside is cool, yeast breads can take quite a while to rise. During cool weather, an alternative is to turn the oven on warm, cover the bread loosely with plastic wrap and a clean dish towel and leave it to rise for 50 minutes. Remove the bread, preheat the oven to 350 F and bake the loaf.

Here are some recipes to get you started.

HONEY-WHEAT RAISIN BREAD

- 1 1/2 cups whole-wheat flour
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup uncooked, unprocessed oat bran
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup non-fat buttermilk
- 1/2 cup skim milk
- 1/2 cup honey
- 1 egg, beaten
- 3 tablespoons corn oil margarine, melted
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- 1/2 cup raisins

Yields 16 slices.

Combine flours, oat bran, baking powder, soda and salt in large bowl; make well in center of mixture. Combine buttermilk and next 4 ingredients, stirring until well-blended; add to dry ingredients, stirring just until moistened. Fold in walnuts and raisins.

Spoon batter into 8 1/2 x 4 1/2 x 3-inch loaf pan coated with

cooking spray. Bake at 375 F for 50 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool bread in pan 10 minutes. Remove from pan and cool completely on wire rack.

DILLY CASSEROLE BREAD

- 2 to 2 1/2 cups all-purpose or unbleached flour
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 to 3 teaspoons instant minced onion
- 2 teaspoons dill seed
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 package active dry yeast
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 tablespoon margarine or butter
- 1 (8-ounce) carton (1 cup) creamed cottage cheese
- 1 egg
- Margarine or butter, melted
- Coarse salt, if desired

Yields 18 slices.

Lightly spoon flour into measuring cup; level off. In large bowl, combine 1 cup flour, sugar, instant minced onion, dill seed, 1 teaspoon salt, baking soda and yeast; blend well. In small saucepan, heat water, 1 tablespoon margarine and cottage cheese until very warm (120 to 130 F). Add warm liquid and egg to flour mixture. Blend at low speed until moistened; beat 3 minutes at medium speed. By hand, stir in remaining 1 to 1 1/2 cups flour to form a stiff batter. Cover loosely with plastic wrap and cloth towel.

Let rise in warm place (80 to 85 F) until light and doubled in size, 45 to 60 minutes.

Generously grease 1 1/2 or 2-quart casserole. Stir down dough to remove all air bubbles. Turn into greased casserole. Cover; let rise in warm place until light and doubled in size, 30 to 45 minutes.

Heat oven to 350 F. Uncover dough. Bake 30 to 40 minutes or until deep golden brown and loaf sounds hollow when lightly tapped. Remove from casserole immediately; cool on wire rack. Brush warm loaf with melted margarine; sprinkle with coarse salt.

The following recipes are from 1991 *Best Recipes Yearbook*, published by Better Homes & Gardens.

WHOLE-WHEAT BRIOCHE

- 1 package active dry yeast
- 1 cup warm water (105 F to 115 F)
- 1/2 cup margarine or butter
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 3 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups whole-wheat flour
- 24 whole almonds
- 1 egg white
- 1 tablespoon water

Yields 30 rolls.

In small mixing bowl, soften yeast in 1/4 cup of warm water. In large mixer bowl, beat margarine or butter, brown sugar and salt with electric mixer until fluffy. Add remaining warm water, 1 cup all-purpose flour and whole eggs. Beat well. Add softened yeast and beat well. Using a spoon, stir in remaining all-purpose flour and whole-wheat flour until dough is smooth.

Place in greased bowl. Cover; let rise in warm place until double (about 2 hours). Punch down. Cover with plastic wrap. Chill 2 to 24 hours.

Punch dough down. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface. Cut dough into 6 portions; cut each portion into 5 pieces. With floured hands, shape each piece into a ball. (You will have 30 balls of dough.)

Place rolls into greased muffin pans or individual brioche pans, using a sharp knife, cut a little slit in top of each roll. Place 1 almond sideways into each slit. Cover; let rise in warm place for 30 minutes.

In small mixing bowl combine egg white and the 1 tablespoon of water. Brush over tops of rolls and almonds.

Bake in 425 F oven for 12 to 15 minutes or until rolls sound hollow when tapped. Remove from pans. Cool on wire rack.

Note: For variety, omit almonds on top and instead sprinkle with poppy seed or caraway seed after brushing with egg white mixture.

DOUBLE-OAT BUBBLE BREAD

- 1 1/2 cups water
- 3/4 cup regular rolled oats
- 4 1/2 to 5 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 packages active dry yeast
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 cup margarine or butter
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups oat bran
- 1/2 cup molasses
- Rolls oats, poppy seeds or sesame seeds

Yields 2 loaves, 9 or 10 servings each.

In medium saucepan, bring water to boiling; add 3/4 cup rolled oats. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, about 8 minutes or until water is nearly absorbed by oats. Cover saucepan. Let stand for 10 minutes. Uncover and cool cooked oats to lukewarm.

In large mixer bowl, stir together 1 1/2 cups of flour and the yeast; set mixture aside.

In small saucepan, heat and stir milk, margarine or butter, sugar and salt just until warm (120 F to 130 F) and margarine or butter is almost melted. Add to flour mixture. Add eggs. Beat with electric mixer on low speed for 3 seconds, scraping sides of bowl constantly. Beat on high speed for 3 minutes. Using a spoon, stir in cooled oat mixture, oat bran and molasses. Stir in as much of remaining flour as you can.

Turn dough out onto lightly floured surface. Knead in enough of the remaining flour to make a moderately stiff dough that is smooth and elastic (6 to 8 minutes total). Shape into a ball. Place in lightly greased bowl; turn once. Cover; let rise in warm place until double (about 1 hour).

Punch dough down; turn out onto lightly floured surface. Divide dough in half. Cover and let rest 10 minutes. Divide each dough half into 9 portions for square or round loaves or 10 portions for rectangular loaves. Shape dough into balls. Place 9 or 10 balls in each of 2 greased 8x8x2-inch baking pans, 8x1 1/2-inch round baking pans, or 9x5x3-inch loaf pans. Cover; let rise until nearly double (30 to 40 minutes).

Brush top of risen dough with water; sprinkle with rolled oats, poppy seeds or sesame seeds. Bake in 375 F oven for 30 to 35 minutes or until bread sounds hollow when tapped, covering with foil the last 10 minutes to prevent over-browning, if necessary. Remove from pans and cool on wire rack.

Mini Double-Oat Loaves: To make 4 smaller loaves, prepare dough and let rise once as directed. Divide dough into 4 portions, making 10 balls from each portion. Arrange 10 balls in each of four 7 1/2 x 3 1/2 x 2-inch loaf pans. Let rise and bake as directed.

CHEDDAR CHEESE BOWS

Add directly to jars before filling them with tomatoes.

For pints use one tablespoon bottled lemon juice or one-quarter teaspoon citric acid.

In the Houlihan's Culinary Traditions Ltd. kitchen, Caroline watches her mom Elaine like an eagle. Elaine cooks like her Italian mother did, with her hands and eyes.

Not a problem if you're cooking for one, but a big one if you're cooking for the masses.

"We're standardizing all our recipes," said Elaine Houlihan of Bloomfield Hills who started Houlihan's Culinary Traditions Ltd. about 2½ years ago. Houlihan's, based in Auburn Hills, makes preserves, applesauce, pasta, tomato pasta sauces and olive oil pasta sauces. The Italian gourmet products are under the name Elena's.

When they were making a new line of Elena's olive oil pasta sauces with fresh herbs, Caroline stopped her mom to weigh ingredients, so if push came to shove, she could get the orders out on time.

The time came. Mom had to fly to New York unexpectedly when her mother became ill. Caroline and her siblings who help out at the family business, made the sauce and got the orders out.

This kind of attention to detail, quality, and caring make Michigan food products special. "Most of us are family owned businesses," said Elaine Houlihan. "We're giving the country the absolutely best quality. We don't know any different."

Businesses like theirs are growing and starting up everyday. Houlihan's employs 10 people. Caroline, a graduate of Michigan State University, is her mother's assistant and takes care of marketing. Her sister Jill, who earned a bachelor's degree in finance, and now attends Detroit College of Law, takes care of the books. Her brother John who will be attending Oakland University in the fall to study education, helps out in the summer.

Last year, Elaine Houlihan started the Michigan Specialty Food Manufacturer's Association to promote and help manufacturers of specialty foods in Michigan.

To be eligible for membership in the association, companies must be in business at least six months and

have six wholesale accounts. Membership is \$125 a year. For membership information, call Michele Marshall of Mucky Duck Mustard Company at (313)683-5750.

Many of the people who started these companies did so with encouragement from family and friends who raved about their products. Besides Houlihan's here are the other charter members.

Michaelene Hearn makes gourmet granola. She's contributing a portion of the profits from her Rain Forest Gatherings, a granola made with papaya, pineapple, mango, banana chips, cashews and Brazil nuts to the preservation of rain forests.

Celiose Varner (Celia's Sweets) began making pizzerelles (an Italian cookie) 10 years ago when her mother-in-law gave her a pizzelle maker. Now her daughter, son, and husband help her make 10,000 pizzelles a week.

Jack and Kristin Trabue of Word of Mouth Foods in Plymouth developed their business from their small butcher shop in Plymouth. They began to sell their pasta sauce in the

shop, and customers bought it, and told their friends to do the same. The company also makes barbecue sauce and seasonings.

Judy McKonnel of Wenchwork, Ltd. makes Jezebel Sauce, a sweet hot sauce, hot dill mustard, natural herbal vinegars, herbal blend and mulling spices.

First cousins Jacqui Ridley and Gail Jacob started making tea breads for Jackie's husband at Mark Ridley's Comedy Castle. Soon a wholesale business developed. In 1990, they bought a retail muffin shop and developed muffin chips, available in six flavors, and distributed across the United States.

Michele Marshall of the increasingly famous Mucky Duck Mustard Co. in Franklin uses a family recipe to make Mucky Duck Mustard. She recently published a cookbook with 170 recipes. With the exception of the first chapter of all chocolate desserts, each dish is made with Mucky Duck Mustard. The cookbook is available at Merchant of Vino in Birmingham and Troy.

eggs. Beat with electric mixer on low to medium speed for 30 seconds, scraping sides of bowl constantly. Beat on high speed for 3 minutes. Using a spoon, stir in as much remaining flour as you can.

Turn dough out onto lightly floured surface. Knead in enough of remaining flour to make a moderately stiff dough that is smooth and elastic (6 to 8 minutes total). Shape into a ball. Place in lightly greased bowl; turn once to grease surface. Cover and let rest 10 minutes.

Turn dough out onto lightly floured surface. Divide dough into 4 portions. Roll each portion into 12-inch square. Cut each square into 12 12X1 inch strips.

On lightly greased or foil-lined baking sheets, shape each strip into a bow. Hold 1 end of each strip in each hand. Bring ends up and around so the center of strip forms 2 loops. Bring ends of strip together at center of loops, crisscrossing ends and leaving about 1½ inches of strip for bow's tails. Twist ends together once. Press dough together at center. Cover; let rise in warm place until nearly double (20 to 30 minutes).

Brush rolls with additional milk; sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Bake in 375 F oven 12 minutes or until golden. Cool on wire racks.

REUNION BREAD

2½ to 3 cups all-purpose flour
2 packages active dry yeast
1½ cups milk

½ cup sugar
½ cup margarine or butter
2 teaspoons salt
2 eggs
3 cups whole-wheat flour
½ cup chopped onion
1 tablespoon margarine or butter
½ cup pesto, purchased or homemade
2 tablespoons chopped walnuts
½ cup shredded Swiss cheese (2 ounces)
1 tablespoon Dijon-style mustard
1 whole almond
1 beaten egg white
Sesame seeds
Caraway seeds
Poppy seeds

Yields 1 large loaf (30 servings).

In large mixing bowl, mix 2 cups of all-purpose flour and the yeast.

In medium saucepan, heat and stir milk, sugar, the ½ cup margarine or butter, and salt until warm (120 F to 130 F), and margarine almost melts.

Add milk mixture and whole eggs to flour mixture. Beat with electric mixer on low speed for 30 seconds, scraping sides constantly. Beat on high speed 3 minutes. Using a spoon, stir in whole-wheat flour and as much remaining all-purpose flour as you can.

On lightly floured surface, knead in enough remaining all-purpose flour to make a moderately stiff dough that is smooth and elastic (6 to 8 minutes total).

Shape into a ball. Place in lightly greased bowl, turn once. Cover; let rise in warm place until double (1 to 1½ hours).

Punch dough down. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface. Cover and let rest 10 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a saucepan, cook the onion in 1 tablespoon margarine or butter until tender; set aside. Combine pesto and walnuts; set aside. Combine cheese and mustard; set aside.

On lightly floured surface, roll dough into a 16x12-inch rectangle. Cut into three 16x4-inch strips.

Spread onion mixture down center of one strip, leaving edges clear of filling. Spread pesto mixture down center of another strip. Spread cheese mixture down center of remaining strip. Place 1 almond in center of 1 strip.

Brush edges of strips with egg white. Fold each strip over, enclosing filling and forming a rope. Pinch edges to seal.

Shape 1 rope into a ring and place, seam side down, in center of lightly greased large baking sheet. Form remaining 2 ropes into rings so they intertwine with center ring, like the links of a chain, placing them seam sides down. Seal ends well. Cover and let rise in a warm place until almost double (45 to 60 minutes).

Brush dough rings with beaten egg white. Sprinkle 1 ring with sesame seeds, 1 with caraway seeds and 1 with poppy seeds.

Bake in a 375 F oven about 25 minutes, or until golden, covering with foil the last 10 minutes to prevent over-browning. Cool on wire rack.

Lily Tomlin's most unforgettable character

Comedian Lily Tomlin, whose comic impersonations have seeped into popular culture, spent her childhood soaking up the details of her neighbors' lives. Her favorite was Mrs. Rupert. For four years, Lily walked Mrs. Rupert's chihuahuas each evening and received 15 cents' payment in return.

"She was a small woman, very zaftig, and had long, black hair in a chignon.

"She taught me how to be a lady. I was, of course, standing aside all this time, loving this, because I had no intention of being a lady. She told me you only cross your legs at the ankle;

you never sit with your back against the chair; and you are able to retrieve anything you want (from your hand-bag) without looking.

"Every Saturday, I went shopping with Mrs. Rupert. I would have to wear a hat and gloves, and I had to have a little purse with little items in it. We'd walk about two blocks and take the Hamilton bus all the way down to Hudson's department store.

"If it was cold out, in the middle of the morning, before we ducked into a tea shop to have a little cocoa or something, we would go into a doorway and blow our noses. So we would be composed when we went inside a warm environment. And then we'd go inside and, sure enough, there'd be some poor soul reaching for the napkin container, you know, and Mrs. Rupert, she'd point that out to me." © TV Listing Inc.

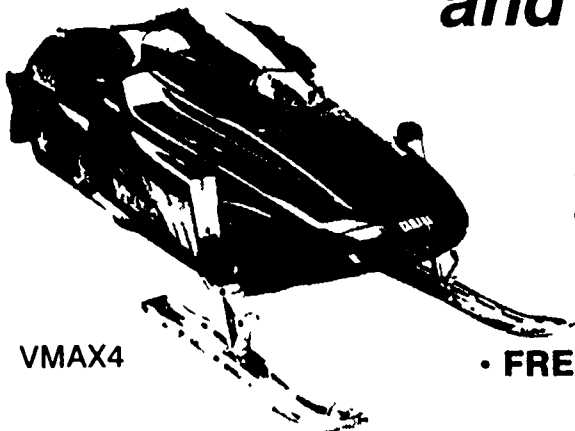

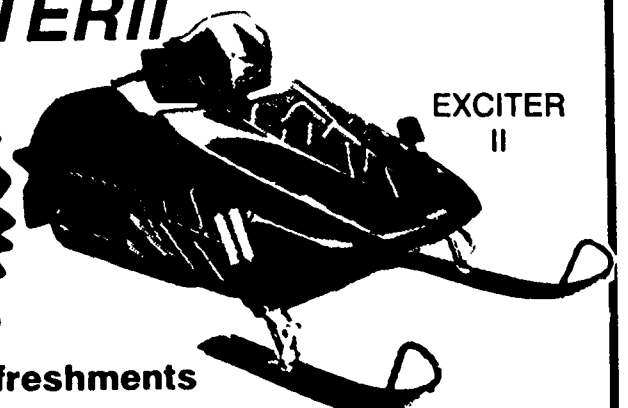

CBS expects viewers to love that 'Bob'

Producers say Newhart overdue for Emmy

Thirty years ago, Bob Newhart won two Grammy Awards for his hysterically funny phone-call routines, so it's fitting that his latest show — one is tempted to say his latest hit show — opens with Newhart on the phone, struggling with Call Waiting.

This is Newhart's fourth series. In 1961-62, he was host of a comedy-variety hour simply titled *The Bob Newhart Show*, which won an Emmy as best humor show just after it was canceled by NBC. In 1972, Newhart was back, in a situation comedy, also titled *The Bob Newhart Show*, on CBS. He played a Chicago psychologist with an odd collection of patients; Suzanne Pleshette played his schoolteacher wife, Emily. The show ran six seasons, and continues a favorite in reruns today, though it was consistently overpowered by *All in the Family*, *M*A*S*H* and *Mary Tyler Moore Show* at Emmy time.

In 1982, a third show, *Newhart*, debuted on CBS. Now playing a Vermont innkeeper, Newhart surrounded himself with an able cast that just seemed to get funnier with each passing year. Yet once again Newhart's show was edged out in the Emmy competition for writing, acting and best comedy awards.

Bob, debuting Friday, Sept. 18, finds Newhart back in Chicago, this time as greeting-card artist Bob McKay, who gets a second chance at his life's dream: to bring his comic book hero, Mad Dog, a veterinarian with the superpowers of a canine (super sight, super hearing, etc.), to the world.

Despite his name, Mad Dog is too much of a Boy Scout for today's comic book consumer, at least according to mercurial "graphic novelist" Harlan Stone (John Cygan), who wants to turn the character into a bloodthirsty avenger whose first act is to destroy the old Mad Dog's trusty sidekick, Buddy.

The series' executive producers are Bill and Cheri Steinkellner and Phoebe Sutton, who've been a part of the *Cheers* production team for several seasons. And yes, they've won an Emmy for it.

"One of our goals," says Bill Steinkellner, "is to get Bob Newhart an Emmy for best actor because what he does he does so well you don't know he's doing it."

"It's like ballplayers who are so fluid, their swings are so good, you think, 'Aw, they're not even trying.'"

Part of the Steinkellner-Sutton strategy is to give Newhart some of the punch lines for a change.

"What I loved about the script that they wrote," Newhart observes,

"was that he had a chance to be petulant and angry and petty — and a lot of wonderful things which are fun to play."

In *The Bob Newhart Show*, the star recalls, Newhart was a foil for other actors' jokes. "No matter what Mr. Carlin said, I had to say, 'Right, Mr. Carlin.' I remember one episode, I said, 'How was your weekend, Mr. Carlin?' And he find, 'Fine, except that I was possessed by the Devil.'"

Other changes from previous Newhart series include fatherhood — but not the sort where precocious tykes say, "Oh Daddy's a fool, but we love him, and let's get him out of the fix he's gotten himself into," says Newhart. In *Bob*, Cynthia Stevenson plays McKay's grown daughter, while Carlene Watkins plays his supportive wife.

Additional cast members include Ruth Kobart as Bob's crusty former colleague who now works in an art department alongside men and women young enough to be her children. Andrew Bilgore plays the department's mild-mannered klutz (perhaps another Bob in the making?) and Timothy Fall as a spaced-out cartoonist who considers Bob one of his idols.

As for the show's premise, Newhart insists success is all in the execution. Bill Steinkellner agrees. "*The Jeffersons* did 250 episodes of a dry cleaner in his living room."

Looking at it that way, there's no reason why *Bob* shouldn't be a hit — and maybe even have a mild-mannered Emmy winner for a hero.

'Futures 2' applies math in right places

Too many students learn too late that life is sink-or-swim beyond the pep rallies and prom nights. And too few teachers are willing to take the extra effort to throw out a lifesaver.

Enter math guru Jaime Escalante, the real-life bastion of strength and wit portrayed by Edward James Olmos in 1987's *Stand and Deliver*. Escalante successfully challenged many of his East Los Angeles high-school students to master the Advanced Placement Calculus Test against incredible odds. His latest project, PBS' *Futures 2*, promises challenges anew for students interested in plotting their life course with math as a tool.

Futures 2, like many programs of its kind designed to be used in the classroom, serves mostly as a motivational tool — there's no lengthy division or intricate integers on camera. Instead, Escalante breezes through a basic concept or two in his noted irrepressible fashion, quickly turning over the remainder of each 15-minute segment to famous guests who demonstrate how math skills are used in their professions, be they astronauts (Guy Bluford) or anchormen (Ted Koppel).

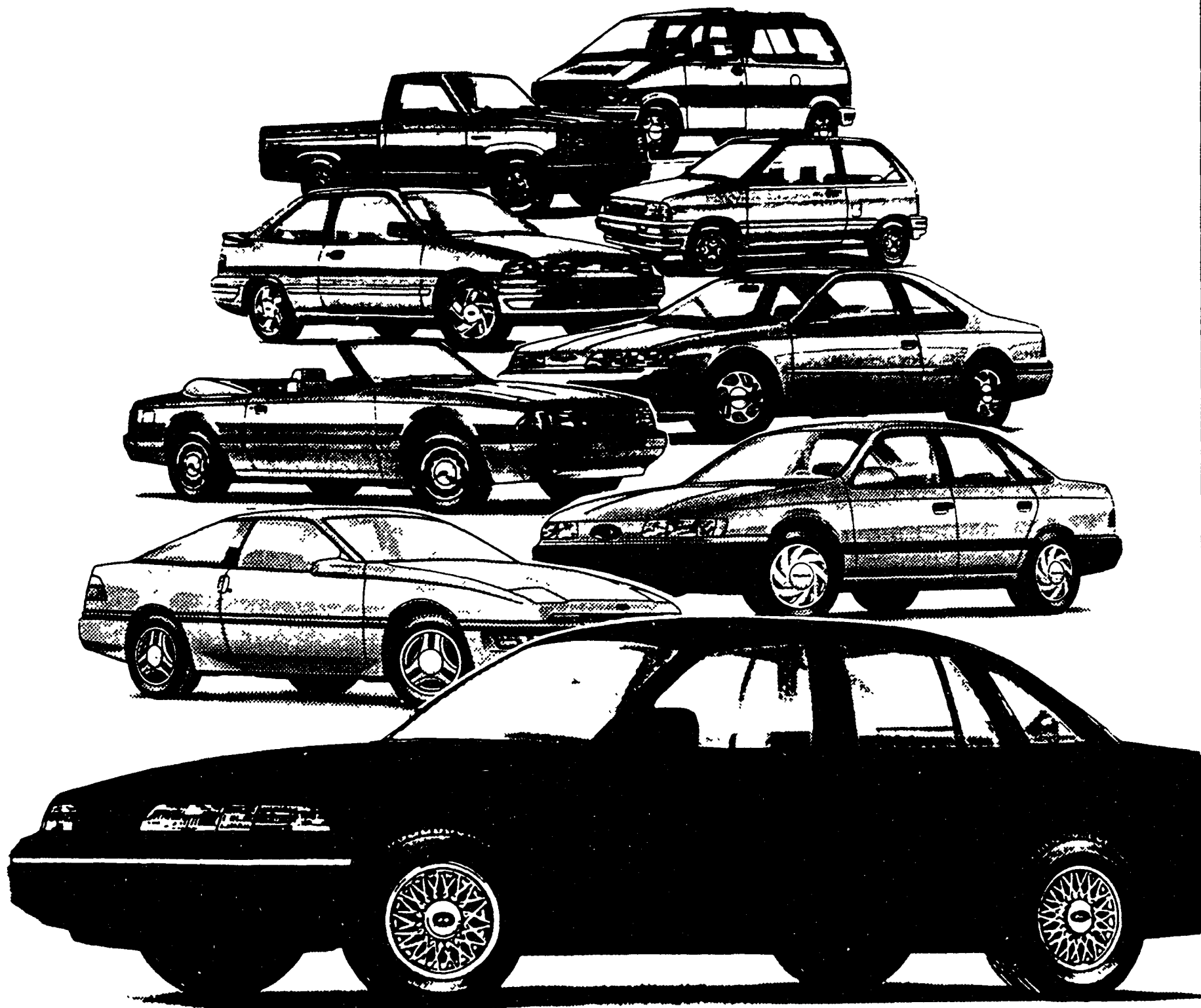
