## School daze caused by traffic jams

Pure chaos. Northville school officials had no other words to describe what was going on in most, if not all, of the district's parking lots on Tuesday, the first day of classes.

David Bolitho, assistant superintendent for administrative services, agreed. Traffic was heavy at most of the buildings, he heard from the hand-held radio he used to keep him notified of the situation at the other schools.

"There are traffic jams at every school," he said Tuesday morning while monitoring traffic and buses at Amerman Elementary. "We've had very high traffic flow at all the buildings."

Now, whether the rain or the district's new 1.5-mile magnet bus plan was to blame for the dangerously high traffic volumes remains to be

seen, Bolitho said.

He hoped some of the traffic was due to the rain and to the first day of school, a day when more parents would traditionally drive their students to school rather than see them off by bus.

"There were a lot of moms and dads at each one of the schools, so it's really hard to judge the traffic flow," he said.

Nonetheless, higher traffic volumes did complicate things at most of the schools and posed some serious safety concerns. In addition to the sheer number of automobiles in the lots of the schools, drivers were moving every which way and adding to the congestion. Parking lots were packed with cars, minivans, buses, parents and students until the first bell rang marking the start of the new year.

The exception, Bolitho said, was at

## Familiar face eyes contract

WTUA officials are looking for a contractor to operate and maintain the sewer authority's wastewater and treatment facilities, and one familiar face seems tailor-made for the job.

An offshoot company of Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May, the lead engineer in the \$100-million Western Townships Utilities Authority sewer project, is considering a bid on a contract which could tie it to the project for years to come.

And based on WTUA's bid specification documents, the firm is eagerly encouraged to apply, come the Sept. 18 deadline.

According to an advertisement in a trade publication, WTUA is seeking proposals for "the operation and maintenance of a new wastewater transportation system including collection and pumping facilities."

Ayres, Lewis this year established a company to handle similar tasks, and has some interest in tendering a bid, said Abe Munfakh, president of Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May Operations Services Inc.

"We've not made a decision yet," Munfakh said. "We've asked for a copy of specifications. I can't tell you yes or no at this point."

Ayres, Lewis has earned the lion's



share of WTUA's \$10-million engineering tab after it was awarded that contract on a no bid basis in 1987. WTUA implemented a bid procedure after intense public scrutiny of the project, but Munfakh's firm may have written-in advantages over other possible bidders.

WTUA's request for proposal (RFP) seeks a firm to operate and maintain its middle and lower Rouge equalization basin and pump station facilities, the wastewater collection system throughout the three WTUA townships, and other everyday sewer maintenance chores.

Those bidding on the proposed three- to five-year operation maintenance contract must deal with WTUA's evaluation criteria, which places high emphasis on related project experience, familiarity with WTUA member communities and local standards, and understanding the project.

Less critical, according to the evaluation list, is company background, staffing, management summary, and proposed fee.

Munfakh said his firm's five-year relationship with the project does not give it an unfair advantage. He said other potential bidders can gather information through WTUA and the Department of Natural Resources.

And Munfakh said ALNM-OSI was "not established for this project at

## Sieggreen wins national honor

A colleague told Dwight Sieggreen that if he won the national presidential award for science excellence, he'd be notified by telegram.

So Tuesday, when the sixth grade science teacher got home from school and found a letter from the White House in his mailbox, he was disappointed because he thought he'd lost.

But instead and to his surprise he opened up the letter and found out he actually won the Presidential Award for Excellence in Science and Mathematics Teaching. He was speechless.

"I'm still kind of in a daze," he said Wednesday. "I really haven't come to grips with it yet. I'm walking on air."

Sieggreen was one of three finalists in the state competition. Only one of the three from Michigan would claim the big prize — an all-expense-paid, week-long trip to Washington, D.C., and a \$7,500 grant. It was Sieggreen.

"It was exciting, but I didn't think that I'd get it. Matter of fact, I had a dream that I didn't.

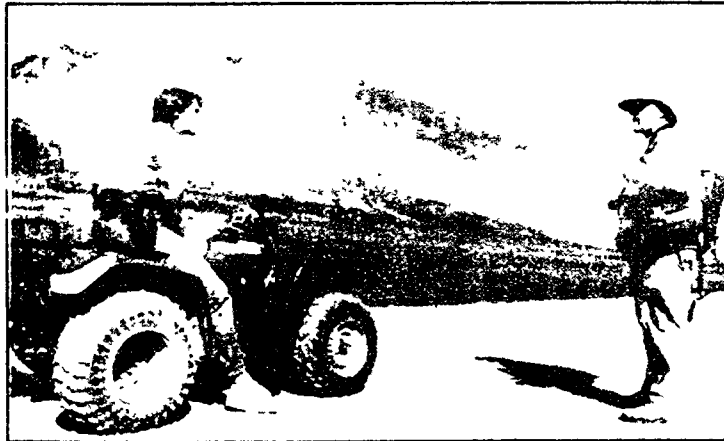

"But it's very exciting. I'm still having a hard time believing it happened here."

Sieggreen was nominated for the prestigious award by Meads Mills

seventh-grade science teacher Norm Hannewald. In appreciation for the nomination and for all the projects the two teachers have collaborated on for the district, Sieggreen intends

to have Hannewald accompany him to the awards reception in D.C. the week of March 9.

During that week, both teachers will spend time attending receptions in the award winners' honor, visit with the other 49 delegates from across the country, and meet with key people in science and mathematics. They will also attend receptions at the Rose Garden, the National Academy of Sciences, the Carnegie Institute, and the U.S. Department of State.

"There are two differences between this award and the state award. For this one there is the \$7,500 grant and the chance to go to Washington to meet people who think like you do," he said.

A humble Sieggreen said Wednesday he believes the selection committee chose him for his accomplishments inside and outside of the classroom.

"It (the award) really recognizes teachers for two things," he said. "One, for what goes on in the classroom, and secondly, for what you have done for the profession."

## Restaurant back on front burner

Something's cooking at the old Northville Charley's site, but for now, restaurateur Chuck Muer is only willing to whet your appetite.

Muer on Tuesday said a deal could be finalized by Oct. 1 that would place the eatery back on Northville Township's menu of restaurants.

It won't be in Muer's name, though. He apparently is set to close a deal with a long-time associ-

ate, Chuck Rachwitz, dubbed Chef Rocky.

"I wouldn't have anything final until the first of October, and nothing is all done until the ink is dry," Muer said. "But we're friends and business partners. It shouldn't be a problem."

Problems have been the main course at Northville Charley's since the restaurant closed in January 1991. Located across from the state hospital at 41122 Seven Mile, Northville Charley's slipped into the Chapter 11 vat in November of 1991, and never could pull itself from the soup.

Muer later re-purchased the business — he'd previously sold it to Farmington Hills-based Charley's Restaurants — and tinkered with the idea of re-opening the once-popular seafood spot.

But Rachwitz, a corporate executive chef for eight years, entered the picture as a potential buyer. Rachwitz was unavailable for comment Tuesday.

Muer wanted to keep the lid on details Tuesday. He did say the sale "is not a done deal, but there's not anything in the way to prevent it."

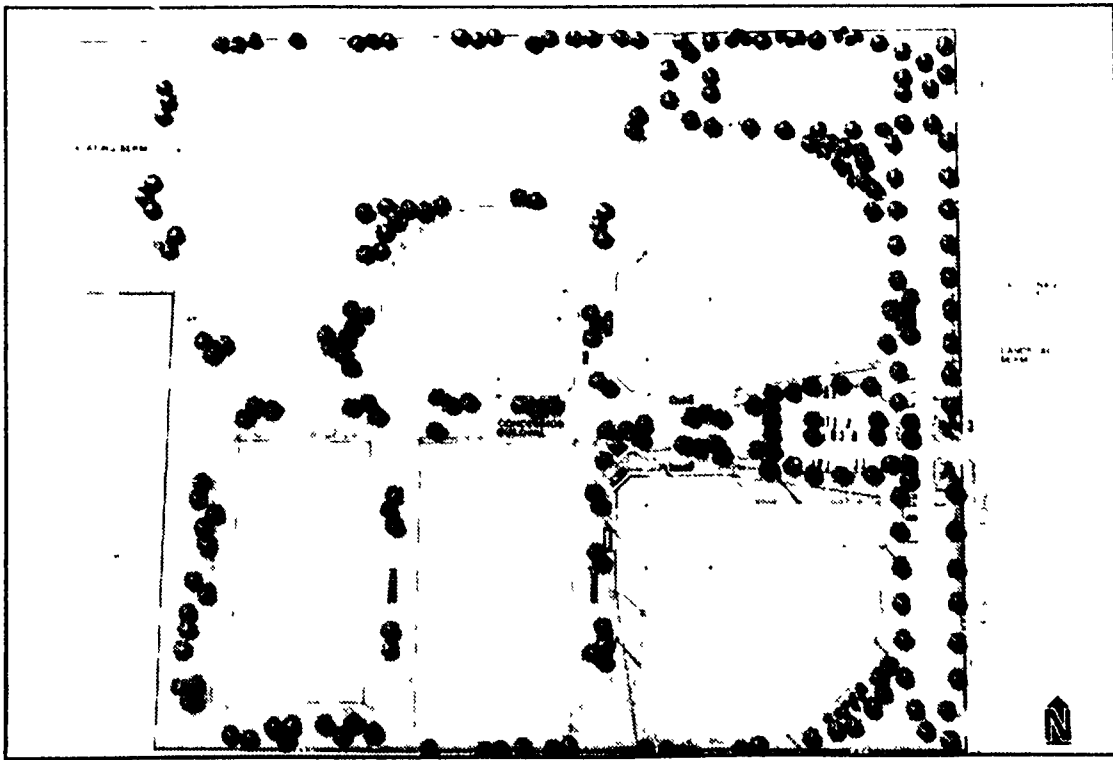
## Park bids opened

DeAngelis Landscaping tendered a \$196,440 bid to grade and seed the community's sloping, weed-choked park site between Five and Six Mile roads.

The company's bids for other portions of the multi-tiered recreation proposal also came in on the low end of the scale. A basic package including grading and seeding, develop-

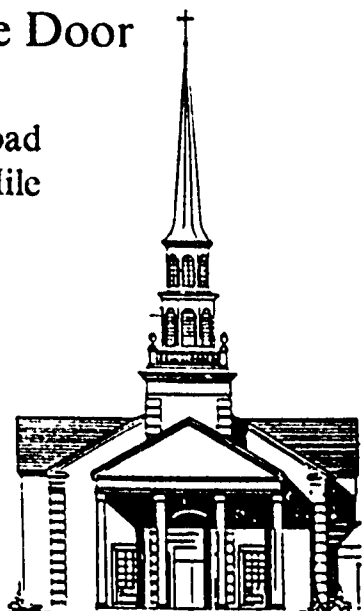

# City businesses move over, out

Rising rents are forcing one downtown store to move one door to the south, and another to move out of town altogether.

While the owners of Judy's Curtain & Decorating Shoppe at 107 N. Center St. plan to move their shop into the current home of Fox Portrait Studio at 105 N. Center St., Fox will relocate Oct. 5 to a new facility in Plymouth, at 9425 Haggerty Road.

David Case, president of the Detroit-based studio chain, said Fox was forced out after more than 15 years at its current location when the owners of Judy's Curtain Shoppe decided to move from their leased space at 107 N. Center into Fox's current location. The driving force behind the two moves was rent, Case said.

Norm Gullian and Tom Bradley, whose wives run Judy's Curtain Shoppe, own the adjoining building at 105 N. Center. They have leased the space for Judy's Curtain Shoppe from building owner Betty Northrop for the past 10 years.

Northrop could not be reached for comment. "Our landlord wants to move his business from

the store next door into the building he owns," Case said from his Detroit office. "They're being pushed out of their building because their rent is being doubled or something."

"If the owners were going to keep the rent the same, I probably would have stayed. The bottom line is we had to move next door and pay a lot more rent," he said.

Case said the move south should prove profitable for Fox in the long run.

"I can get a lot more moving out; much more exposure, much more parking, and my store doesn't get closed down four times a year for events," he said.

"Exorbitant rents . . . don't make it conducive to doing business in town," Case added. "Northville is just as cute as hell, but we don't make a lot of money there. . . It's just not worth it anymore."

Next door at Judy's Curtain Shoppe, co-manager Judy Bradley confirmed that rising rents played a role in the decision to move the store. "That kind of was the clincher," she said.

"We had to go someplace," she added. "We hated to lose Fox. They were wonderful tenants . . . They were nice people to deal with."

Another factor behind their decision to move was Ronnie Cambra's relocation of her Kitchen Witch store, Bradley said. Kitchen Witch had been located in the lower level at 107 N. Center, before moving to 118 E. Main where Cambra now shares retail space with Christmas & A Whole Lot More.

"We had planned on staying, but for us to stay and not have Ronnie, it just wasn't the same," Bradley said.

Bradley, one of the two Judys behind the curtains at 107 N. Center, said she and Judy Gullian will begin readying the shop's new home as soon as Fox Portrait Studio moves out.

"By the end of October we'll be in there," she said.

Because the new location will be slightly smaller than their present facility, Bradley said, the new store will no longer carry paints. But other than that, business will continue as usual and items including wallpapers and curtains will still be available.

# Teen nabbed on drunken driving, fleeing raps

City police arrested a 16-year-old Northville boy for driving under the influence and fleeing and eluding a police officer before dawn Sept. 6, following a high-speed chase through Northville and Novi.

The chase ended just before 4 a.m. when the boy, driving a friend's vehicle without permission, drove into a Novi police car on Ten Mile Road near Novi High School.

A Northville City police officer had begun following the boy at Main and Rogers when he sped north from the intersection, the car's tires squealing. The suspect ignored stop signs, passed another car illegally and reached estimated speeds of 90 mph during the ensuing chase along Rogers, Potomac, Lexington, Eight Mile, Taft, Nine Mile and residential areas off Nine Mile. He then sped north on Novi Road to Ten Mile, where he drove through a red signal and eventually hit the Novi patrol car.

The pursuing Northville officer helped arrest the youth, and noticed an odor of liquor on his breath and slurred speech. He was charged with operating under the influence of liquor, fleeing and eluding, and not wearing a seatbelt.

The youth told police he fled because he feared getting a ticket for drinking and driving. "I had a fast car so I decided to lose the police," he reportedly said. He admitted drinking five beers in two hours.

The youth was released to his father's custody, and the matter was turned over to juvenile court.

# Inter-city flooding dispute drags endlessly on

A Novi homeowner is weighing her legal options in the wake of her latest defeat at Northville City Hall.

Laura Lorenzo, who has accused the city of approving undersized culverts in Singh Development's Pheasant Hills subdivision, blames the culverts for increased flooding on her property to the north.

In July, the city Board of Zoning Appeals denied Lorenzo's request to overturn city approval of the Pheasant Hills culverts.

On Aug. 31, the Northville City Council voted unanimously to deny her request for a rehearing before the

BZA, despite her claims that the BZA's first decision was based on incorrect information from the city attorney's office.

"I'm very disappointed in the City Council's decision, but it doesn't sur-

prise me," Lorenzo said Tuesday. "This has been their attitude all along."

Lorenzo added that she is considering several responses to the latest rejection in her long-running battle

with the city.

"I'm off in a couple of different directions," she said. "I am going to be consulting an attorney for what the next step should be."

Lorenzo said she will also seek assistance from the state Attorney Grievance Commission, to review what she called "possible misconduct" by city attorney Richard Connors. Lorenzo charges that Connors presented the BZA with an inaccurate summary of engineering reviews performed on the Pheasant Hills waterway, and that the BZA relied on that information.

"I feel at the very least he should have acknowledged and rectified the incorrect information he gave to the

Zoning Board of Appeals," Lorenzo said. "Since the ZBA relied on that information so heavily and relied on the attorney's opinions, it's my opinion that the attorney should have admitted the mistake."

Lorenzo is also preparing a formal complaint to the Board of Professional Engineers regarding McNeely & Lincoln, the city's engineering firm. She has charged McNeely & Lincoln with poor documentation of its decisions, and failure to obtain needed variances from the city's BZA and a letter of map revision from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) prior to installing restrictive culverts under McDonald and Col-dspring drives.

She has also complained that city officials are ignoring opinions from FEMA and Department of Natural Resources officials. The opinions state that a city ordinance requiring altered waterways to maintain the ability to carry a base flood should apply to the Mill Pond culvert.

City officials argue that the ordinance does not apply.

"It seems to me that the City of Northville is relying solely on their engineer for its opinions. Now we have two agencies that are responsible for administering this program that disagree," Lorenzo said. "There's a question of the level of competence, for at least floodplain reviews, for the engineering firm."

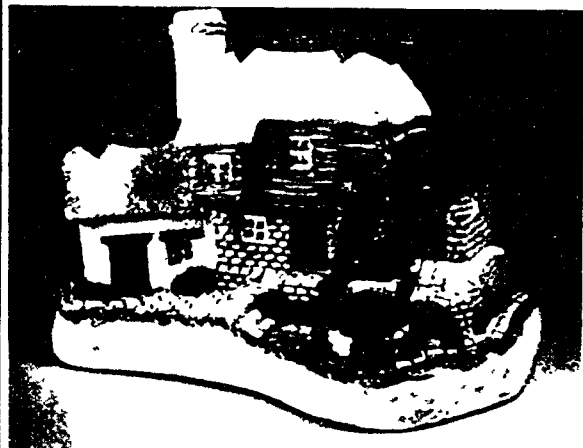

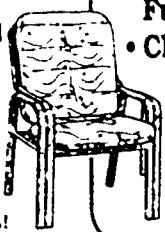

The moving company's coordinated with everybody under creation. I guess they're out there now starting to get it moving into place along Novi Road," Garfield said.

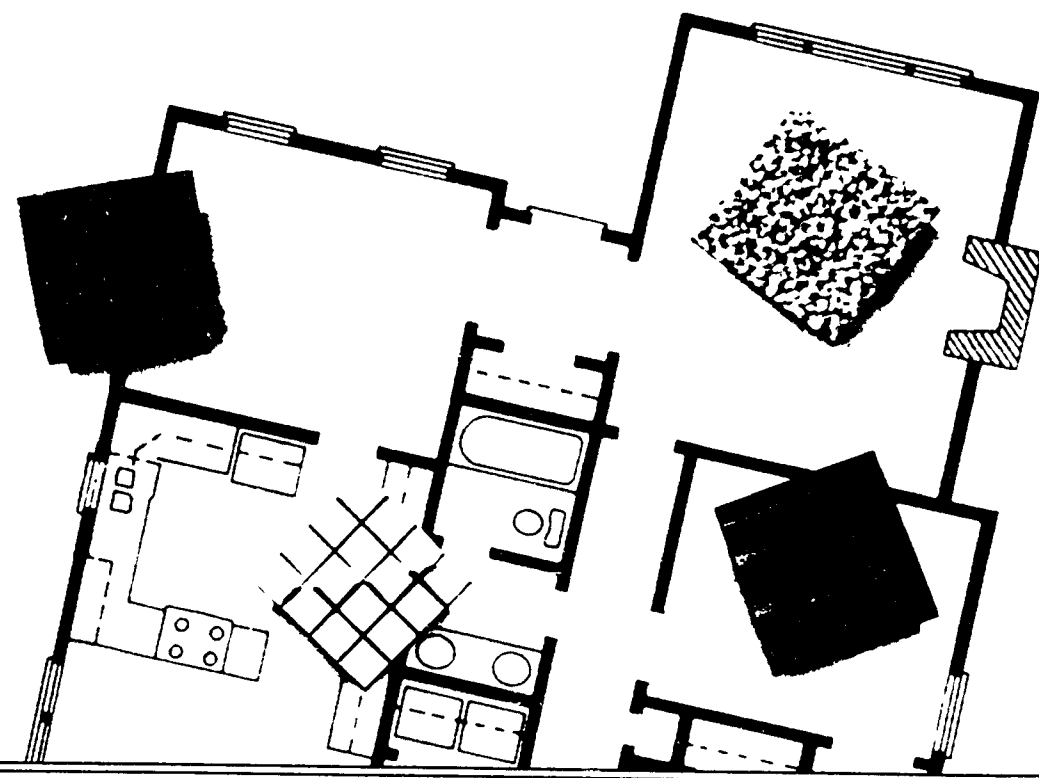
Traffic may be stalled slightly as the 1830s-era building begins its travel in state, with utility company employees on hand to lift up the overhead wires.

# Council delays rezoning decision after drawing fire

The Northville City Council heard withering criticism from a Cady Street homeowner and her sons Monday, and postponed a decision on whether to rezone her residential property to single-family residential.

The postponement came after nearly an hour of protests against the rezoning from Mrs. George Kohs and her sons, Curt and George Jr., and support for the rezoning from many of the Kohs' neighbors. The neighbors also presented the council with a petition signed by 40 people favoring the change.

The Kohs property at 473 W. Cady St., which is surrounded by R-1B zoning, is now zoned R-3 multi-family

residential. The city Planning Commission recommended July 1 that the property be rezoned to R-1B, which would only allow single-family residential redevelopment. The existing designation, they said, bordered on spot zoning.

But the Kohs family argued that their property has been R-3 for 18 years and should remain so, because it borders on a cemetery and sits across the street from school facilities.

"The only thing the city has done to protect my parents' investment is to allow the R-3 zoning," said George Jr. The Planning Commission came under heavy fire from the Kohs family for its decision.

"We were stunned as a family by the incompetence displayed by the commission . . . and furthermore the lies

and deception displayed by their planning consultant at that time," George Jr. told the council.

Though he gave no examples of lies or deception, Kohs cited several examples of what he believed were incompetence. He noted that the commission did not know the property's acreage or the number of units that could be built on it, and was unaware of seven duplexes in the surrounding R-1B area.

"My parents didn't initiate the deterioration of that neighborhood by allowing multiple-family dwellings, R-2 dwellings," he said.

Whether or not the Kohs family had contributed to the decline, neighbors said they did not want to see the neighborhood go downhill any further. And they argued that allowing the R-3 zoning to remain, with the possibility of a 32-unit apartment building on the 2.12-acre site,

would be a detriment.

Fairbrook resident Jim Petres agreed that the duplexes were bad for the neighborhood, "but to compound the problem, to add more duplexes or a potential apartment complex . . . it's going to have an adverse impact on the economic value for the rest of us."

More than a dozen Northville residents spoke in favor of the Planning Commission's stance.

Ultimately, at Council Member Paul Folino's suggestion, the council agreed to continue their review of the rezoning at their regular Sept. 21 meeting. Folino said he wanted more information on the potential change in the Kohs property value if its zoning was changed, and wondered why the commission had dropped another rezoning proposal along Wing Street.

# Honigman mulls future after primary defeat

It was a beautiful, clear, sunny day the Thursday after the Aug. 4 primary election.

But not to Dave Honigman. Honigman, recuperating at his West Bloomfield home two days after the election, looked like he felt — spent. He recently left on vacation.

Dressed in a Yale sweatshirt, Country Day sweatpants and baseball cap, with his eyes still at half mast from lack of sleep, Honigman admitted he didn't quite know what had hit him.

The election as Republican candidate from the newly drawn 11th Congressional District, by most accounts, had been his to win. He had

held public office for eight years and he had unlimited money to spend on a campaign.

He conceded defeat to conservative, pro-life Joe Knollenberg when TV news was saying a mere 4 percent of the votes were in. "When I barely won Walled Lake, I knew," he said.

Honigman attributed about half of Knollenberg's victory to the pro-life vote. "You see their candidates (winning) all over Oakland County. I admire Right to Life."

About 35 percent was a result of what he terms "attack ads." And the rest, he said, was due to Bill Broomfield's endorsement.

"It shows the non-importance of newspaper endorsements. We got 14

of 15," Honigman said.

"I can't honestly think what we would have done differently. We did everything more than everybody. We knocked on 40,000 doors. We had the largest number of volunteers. It's difficult."

"It would have been a lot easier for me one on one."

But, Honigman said, once Knollenberg declared, he knew it would be a three-person race. He knew the pro-choice Republicans would run a candidate.

"My abortion position being in the middle was very inexpedient and being subjected to half a million dollars of attack ads. It was hard to withstand. It hurt her, too."

He was referring, of course, to Alice Gilbert, who resigned from the Circuit Court to become the pro-choice candidate. Gilbert says her so-called "attack ads" pertained to the issues.

Sitting on his patio overlooking his forested backyard, Honigman was eventually joined by his wife, Joann, and campaign manager Tim Pope of Novi. Pope looked even worse than Honigman. Joann had evidently recovered faster.

"Someone said today, it just became a natural disaster or an act of God," said Pope, who ran past successful campaigns for both Honigman and state Sen. Michael Bouchard.

"You hope you can run a candidate who has positions on one extreme or another. David said he wouldn't change his positions no matter what." He told us: "You've got to feel proud of yourself even if you lose."

But Honigman admits that his middling position "finally caught up with me."

The big question: Does this mean he will limit his political horizons to the Michigan Senate, or leave politics in two years at the end of his elected term?

Honigman first said he doesn't know.

"It is an ordeal campaigning — emotionally draining. You've got to ask yourself how many times can you

do this — put your family and friends through it." And, in apparent reference to people in his campaign running out of control, he said: "Sometimes it's hard to hold them back."

"I feel terrible for all the people who worked their hearts out."

But he mentioned that to make him feel better, some of his staff reminded him that Abraham Lincoln also lost elections.

"I love public office. Still, campaigning and being in office are two different things."

Asked again whether he will stay in politics, he said: "I think so, but we'll have to think about it."

"Of course you will," Joann said. "Life goes on."

# Gilbert examines what went wrong with election

Alice Gilbert is weighing her options.

The former judge who left the bench after 31 years to run for the Republican nomination from the 11th U.S. Congressional District said: "I'm going to take my time and examine my options."

In a telephone interview from her West Bloomfield home, she said she's not tired, despite the hectic campaign.

Gilbert, who finished third behind

the winner, Joe Knollenberg, but not too far behind state Sen. Dave Honigman, said she didn't expect to take a vacation.

"I'm not saying I'd do anything different," Gilbert said, in examining the campaign she ran.

She said she was "crippled" by not having access to primary voter lists, which she said were not available to her. And, as a latecomer in the campaign, she said it would have been too difficult to have hand copied the lists from all 75 communities.

"I had run other campaigns. I left the bench taking for granted those lists would be available to me." Both Knollenberg and Honigman had access to those lists, she said.

Gilbert, as did Honigman, attributed defeat primarily to the pro-life vote. But, unlike him, she's very worried about what that projects both for women candidates in November and for choice.

She also said: "I don't think the newspaper endorsement means anything."

She criticized the papers for highlighting what they termed "mudslinging" and for not giving the candidates' in-depth positions on issues other than abortion.

Gilbert also was critical of outgoing U.S. Rep. William Broomfield, who handpicked and endorsed Knollenberg as his successor. "If he were a true Republican, he would have withheld his endorsement."

She noted that Oakland County executive candidate L. Brooks Patterson originally came out for Honig-

man, but when others declared he withdrew to let them run on their own.

Gilbert said she was happy about

the "broad base of support" she drew from communities where she was not as well known. "I'm flattered I got such overwhelming support."





# Abortion stance a plus, Democrat Briggs says

Abortion isn't the only position decision for campaign workers siding with Republican Joe Knollenberg or Democrat Walter Briggs IV.

However, Briggs claimed last week the Republican Party's strict stance opposing abortion is benefitting his campaign for the 11th U.S. House district.

Briggs, of Birmingham, said more people have volunteered to help his campaign since the Republican Party renewed its anti-abortion position at last week's national convention in Houston.

"A large number of my new volunteers are upset about the platform's total outlawing of abortion and the criminalization of women who choose to make their own decision," Briggs said in a press release.

The Republican platform calls for a constitutional ban on abortions, even in cases of rape and incest.

Briggs is facing Knollenberg of Bloomfield Township in

the Nov. 3 election for the new 11th District, which includes the Oakland County portion of Northville. Knollenberg beat out former Oakland Circuit Court Judge Alice Gilbert and state Sen. David Honigman in the Aug. 4 GOP primary.

Knollenberg is anti-abortion, but stressed that abortion was only one issue in the race. In fact, some of his supporters are pro-choice.

The Briggs campaign staff said it could not estimate how many volunteers it had, but figured the number is in the hundreds. One is Aggie Monfette.

"I'm more or less independent," she said. Monfette said the abortion issue was a critical factor in her decision to become a Briggs volunteer.

"They've gone overboard," she said of the Republicans. She said she also was concerned with other issues, such

as the environment and health care.

"I'm not a one-issue person," she said.

Monfette volunteered for Briggs when he ran against Broomfield in 1990.

Kenneth Davidson is a new volunteer.

"I think this is a person who looks at problems and looks at ways to solve them rather than just take a moral position," Davidson said.

Republicans, Davidson said, "come out on both sides of the street. They say one thing in one place and another thing in another place."

While the Republican platform took an anti-abortion stand, in an interview President George Bush said he would oppose abortion if his daughter wanted one, while supporting whatever choice she made.

In the Knollenberg camp, campaign manager Carol

Morlan said the campaign has an abundance of volunteers, nearly 1,000, and the abortion issue is one of many factors that helped Knollenberg win the primary.

"It's not like it's anything new," Morlan said about the issue.

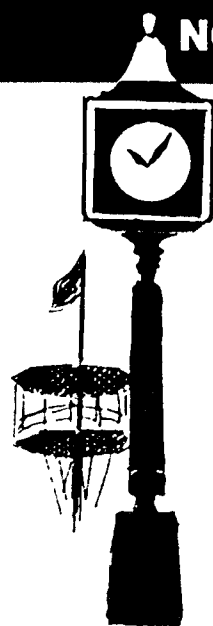
"I support the pro-life platform," said volunteer Sean Zayas. "But I think it needs to be a bit more flexible." Zayas said the Knollenberg machine has a wide range of volunteers, including pro-choice supporters.

"Joe is pro-life, but he has people on both sides because there are other issues," Zayas said.

"I'm pro-choice," said volunteer Maggie Basile. "But one issue doesn't decide an election. I agree with Joe. That's why I'm here."

She said Knollenberg's stand on the economy and other issues outweighed her pro-choice preference.

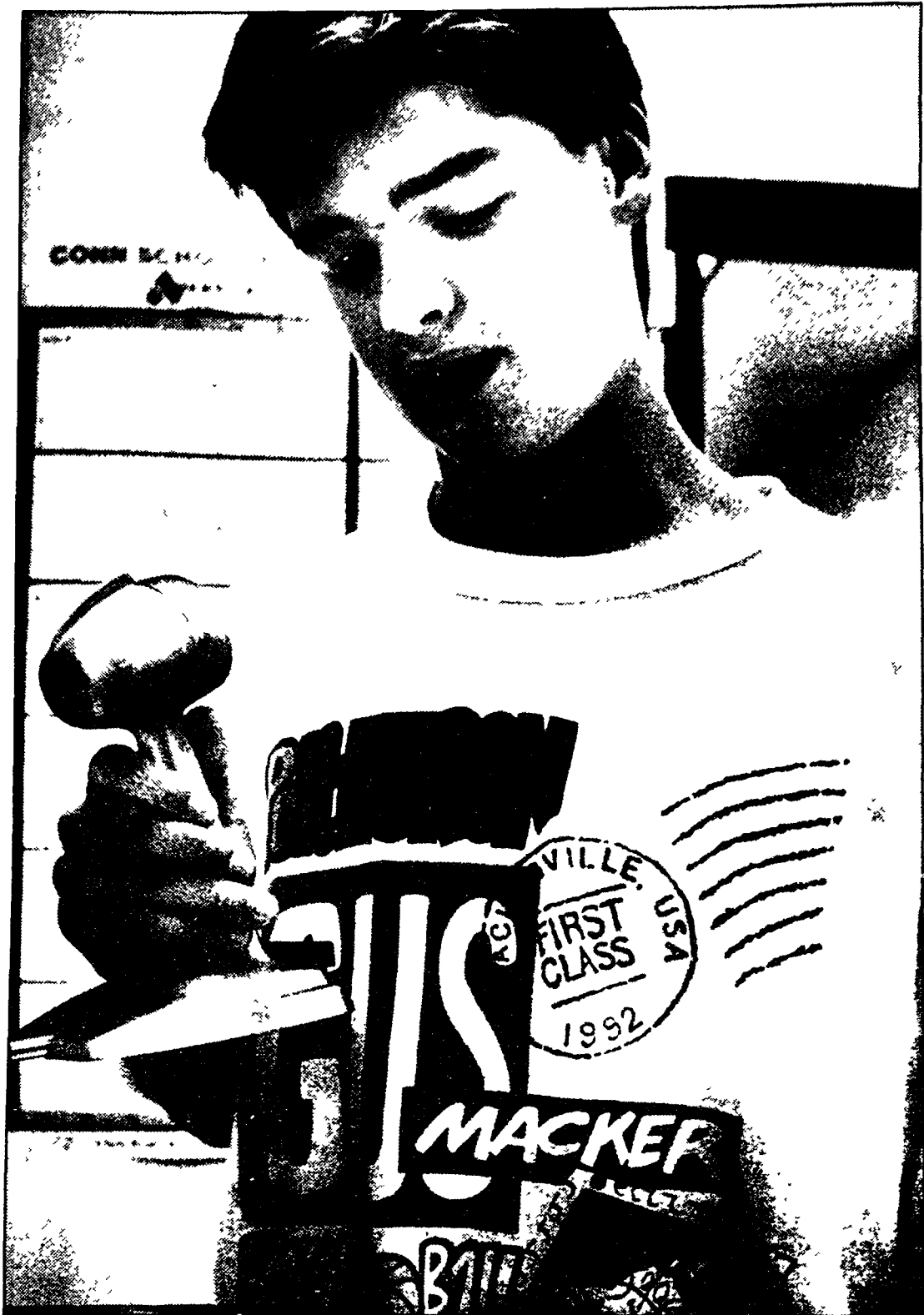

# Tears, cheers mark Amerman school kick-off

At Amerman Elementary on Tuesday morning, it was confusing.

It was raining. There were crowds of children lined up outside the building waiting to enter their classrooms for the first day of school. More were approaching the school from the north and south sides, all shielded under brightly colored plastic umbrellas.

Some wore bright, cheery smiles. Others had fear in their eyes as they dragged themselves into the school yard. Together they watched all the commotion.

There were cars and minivans pulling in and out of the school's driveway, each dropping off more and more students. Parents waved and yelled to old friends. Drivers beeped to and at their fellow drivers. The brakes on the school buses squealed as buses pulled in and out of the

driveway.

In front of the school, motorists slid into vacant spaces, dropped off their passengers and then sped away.

There were lights and camera flashes and muffled voices everywhere. There was laughter and tears. It was like a dream interrupted only by the shouts of parents and children when they saw a familiar face.

It was truly chaotic.

But amidst all the commotion, parents and children celebrated. They celebrated the first day of school. It was a rite of passage, a sign of growing up. Parents were proud. They sent their children off with hugs and well wishes and promises that it would all be okay.

They took snapshots. A man in a tailored suit jumped in front of his children and videotaped them as they walked up the steps to the school. Another sat consoling his daughter and comforting her first day jitters.

Amerman Principal Steve Anderson, tucked beneath a

maize and blue umbrella, greeted parents and students at the curb on Center Street. He shook hands with parents and welcomed their children. The first day of the new year was also his first day on the job.

Anderson remained calm in spite of all the hectic noise around him. He expected it.

"It's common to see parents taking pictures on the first day, especially at the elementaries," he said.

Anderson chuckled as he looked around at all the parents and all the cars going every which way.

"It's the first day. You expect more traffic and more parents here."

But more parents meant more traffic, which just meant more congestion.

For Janice Fretters, driving her 5-year-old to Amerman was no reason to celebrate.

"It was horrible," she said. "I parked two blocks away and then had to walk him two blocks into school."

Fretters, who is a working mother, said she had to

rearrange her work schedule to accommodate driving her son to school. Now she will go into work an hour later so she can drive the boy to school every morning.

"I am not asking a 5-year-old child to walk down a major road without sidewalks and then up a blind hill to get to school. I just don't think that it's safe. . . He can't read. How in the world did they expect him to walk that far to school?"

Fretters, who lives off of Nine Mile Road in Novi, said she hadn't seen one crossing guard posted at any of the intersections on her drive to Amerman.

"There are no crossing guards or any police protection in the subdivisions by Galway or on Center Street and Nine Mile," she argued.

Fretters said she was also concerned about speed limits on Nine Mile Road.

"Officially it's 35 miles an hour there, but I sat there one day and watched them go as fast as 45-65 miles an hour. I just don't think it's safe."

the high school, where things seemed to quiet down earlier than anticipated.

"The high school cleared at 7:25 a.m. Now classes start at 7:30 a.m., but the traffic flow entering and exiting up the hill seemed to have slowed down."

Boltho said radio reports from the three other administrators at district buildings indicated there are some glitches in the new bus system.

Early projections indicate there might be a need for an additional bus run for Meads Mill students to bus the number of students in that area crowding bus stops Tuesday, Boltho said. And signs directing drivers at all the buildings will have to be posted to ensure traffic flows in a safe and orderly manner.

Traffic flow around all the build-

ings is heavy. But we need to make sure that everything is going one way."

Boltho said the district has ordered new traffic signs and one-way arrows to help control the flow of traffic. But they have not yet come in. In the interim, Boltho said the administration will post signs guiding traffic through the bottleneck areas that become easily congested.

At Moraine and Winchester elementaries, building administrators sent parents a letter telling them where and how to park at their schools to try and alleviate some of the traffic congestion.

The idea, Boltho said, is to get traffic flowing in an orderly, one-way manner so there are less chances for accidents and injuries and less delays for parents.

He and the administration will be

on site all this week monitoring the bus routes and the schools to see where changes will have to be made. Once the district administration gets

an actual picture of how many children will be riding buses and how many others will be dropped off, they can make adjustments to their plan.







Fall is one of the best times to visit Mill Race Village. Several weeks remain to tour the interiors of the eight buildings. Docents are still needed to volunteer each Sunday afternoon during open hours from 2 to 5 p.m. There is no admission charge, although donations are always accepted. Join us Sunday afternoon.

The village will be open Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 19 and 20, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. as part of the community's Victorian Festival. Sunday activities include an old fashioned picnic on the green (bring all of your own supplies as nothing will be provided), a hat judging contest, the Great Duck Race, and a quilt show by Hands All Around Quilt Shop. The quilt show will also be open on Sunday. There will be an admission charge to enter the quilt show, which will be held in the New School Church.

Tivoli Fair returns Friday, Sept. 25 and Saturday, Sept. 26 at Northville Downs. The juried arts and crafts show is one of the top shows in this region. Profits from the fair are used to maintain and restore the buildings at Mill Race Village. Tivoli is the primary fund raising source of the Northville Historical Society. Almost one-half of our operating revenue results from this show. Be sure to come out Friday from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. or Sunday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tivoli is a great place to begin or to complete your holiday shopping.

The 1877 History of Oakland County reveals some early history about the Oakland County portion of our community. Just as Northville is Town One South Range Eight East, Novi is Town One North Range Eight East. The T.I.N.R.8.E. designation goes to the land founded by Baseline (Wayne County) on the south, Farmington Township on the east, and Lyon Township on the west.

The first recognized "white" settlers in Novi Township were Erasmus Ingersol, his wife and nine children. Other early settlers of that community in the vicinity of Northville were Pitts Taft, Joseph Eddy, John Gould, William Yerkes, and Thomas Pinkerton. One of the most complete records of these early settlers is a retelling of the arrival of the Yerkes group which can be found in *The First 100 Years* by Jack Hoffman as well as in *The History of Oakland County, Michigan* and in *The Michigan Pioneer Series*.

All the books mentioned above and many others are now included in the collection of the Northville Historical Society Archives. The Archives is now open by appointment. Call 349-9005 for additional information.

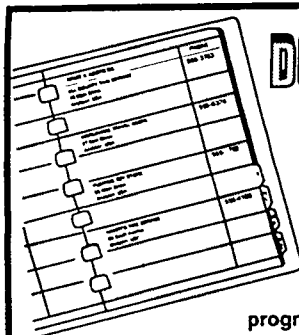

all." He said the company has bid on 15 similar proposals throughout the state, gaining contracts on three projects and remains in the running for three more.

Munfakh, a Plymouth Township trustee who loses his township board seat in November, is aware of the potential for conflict-of-interest ques-

tions. He said he has stepped away from ALNM-OSI's investigation of the WTUA proposal.

"I'm not involved in it at all," he said. "I specifically, purposely stayed out of it."

ALNM-OSI will decide within a week if it will bid on the contract, Munfakh said.

Meanwhile, WTUA officials on Tuesday were not discussing the op-

eration and maintenance project. WTUA Chairperson Thomas Yack and Executive Director Deloris Newell were unavailable for comment.

WTUA administrative assistant Anita Crone was not talking, either. "I can't answer any questions; I'm not authorized," she said.

If WTUA follows its operations and

maintenance bid schedule, a contract will be awarded Oct. 15. That would mark the second major hiring by the WTUA board — two members of which are lame-duck township supervisors due to yield office in November.

WTUA last week hired a new law firm to replace the controversial Sills, Hemming, Law, Essad, Polaczky & Gillary.

ment of baseball and soccer fields, parking, and other improvements totaled \$314,647, said Traci Gottschalk, Northville Parks and Recreation director.

But bids are one thing. Financing such a project is another.

Recreation, township, and city officials met this week and last to ponder park funding methods. The recre-

ation department has but \$109,000 in a park development fund, and was rebuffed in an effort to secure a \$220,000 loan from the township's water and sewer restricted account.

Recreation officials then asked the board to consider an unsecured commercial loan that would lift the much-delayed park development from the drawing board and onto the table.

The board agreed to study the issue, but several questions remain, including doubts about communication between city officials and a lame-duck township board, and the board's ability or desire to move on such a loan.

The questions cast an ominous shadow over Tuesday's bid opening. The DeAngelis figures came in lower than Gottschalk suspected, but they

could be moot, since the bid expires at the end of 90 days unless both the developer and recreation department agree to extend the bid.

For now, Gottschalk intends to send the results of the bid opening to Snell Environmental, the department's park consultant.

"I want Snell to pick through it, evaluate it, and come up with a recommendation of what's in our best interests," she said.

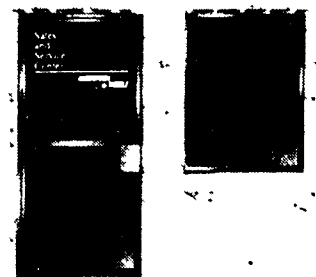

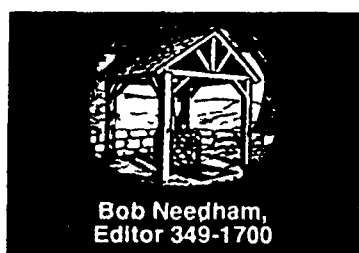

### Sharing services must stay on front burner

With existing shared-services programs between the township and city struggling through endless financial troubles, it might seem odd to push for more. That's just what we're going to keep doing, however, because it might well be best for all concerned in the long run.

The long-discussed but little-acted-upon idea of joining city and township police/fire dispatching received a tiny breath of new life last week. The City Council took up its annual review of goals and objectives, and there it was, smack on last year's list for "high priority": consolidation of dispatching with Northville Township.

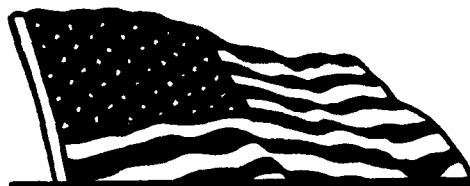
This past year has not seen any tangible movement toward that goal on the part of officials in either the city or the township. There are plenty of reasons for that, if you want to look for them; still, it does seem that something should have happened in the last 12 months.

With the background of inaction, and with the knowledge that the preliminary township budget includes a request for a new, township-only dispatch radio, the council wondered if police consolidation might be a dead issue.

The council members ended up leaving the idea as a high-priority goal, however. And that's cause for hope.

The reasoning was that since the entire Township Board will leave office in November, the city should at least discuss the consolidation issue with the new group of officials. That's true, and we hope that this time around, both bodies do indeed make a real priority out of exploring this avenue.

There's some question about the actual dollar value of potentially combined dispatching, as well as further wedding

of police and fire services. Lots of other bumps will appear in the road, too, since any savings will depend on eliminating duplication — and in some cases that would mean people's jobs.

We can't at this point predict the relative value of combining some of these services. The important thing now is to explore the issue, because something must be done to ease the tight governmental finances in this community.

That fact really needs to sink in to a degree which it so far has not. As we've seen, everybody talks about sharing services more but nobody does much about it. Yes, there was a half-hearted look toward the south, to see if the Plymouth communities might combine in a four-way setup. But the Plymouths are mired in bureaucracies of their own.

No one, apparently, has taken any steps toward looking north — to Novi, which has an established system for contracting with other communities for dispatch — or east, to Livonia. Those are just a couple of ideas which could get this issue off dead center.

Things are poised now for some valuable discussion. The City Council has continued to at least call this issue a priority; the township will soon get a new board full of people who have expressed similar feelings. All sits ready. Now someone just has to do something.

### A quiz on the true happenings



The squeaky wheel gets the grease — and the news coverage. So let's see how much we really know about what has happened to Michigan's economy and state spending over the last decade.

1. True or false: Two-thirds of Michigan's population increase during the 1980s went to prison.
2. State spending on prisons grew nearly 300 percent in the last nine years. Would you be right or wrong in concluding prisons are the biggest part of the state budget?

3. True or false: We'd be better off if the state spent as much on public health programs as it does locking up people in prisons.

4. Let's see if you can rank these categories in Michigan's \$20 billion spending plan: Health programs; Higher education; K-12 school aid; Social services.

5. Gov. John Engler generated a lot of controversy for eliminating most of the General Assistance welfare program and cutting aid to the arts, and we've heard schools moan about the "Robin Hood" state aid bill. But let's see if you can rank the departments that took the biggest percentage cuts from fiscal 1991 to '92 in the general fund: Agriculture; Commerce; Education; Labor; Management and Budget.

6. Looking at the period 1981-91, would you say the following statement is true, false or blatantly false: "The best

cure for welfare dependency is a job."

The answers are gleaned from "1991-92 Fiscal Digest," prepared by the staff of the Senate Fiscal Agency:

1. True. Michigan's population rose a trivial 33,000 to 9.3 million. The number in Department of Corrections facilities rose more than 22,000 to top 37,000. Thus, two-thirds of our population increase went to prison.

2. Wrong. Although spending on prisons grew 292 percent from \$231 million to \$905 million, prisons rank only as Michigan's fifth highest priority.

3. False. Of last year's general fund budget, 13.8 percent went to health programs, 11.5 percent to corrections.

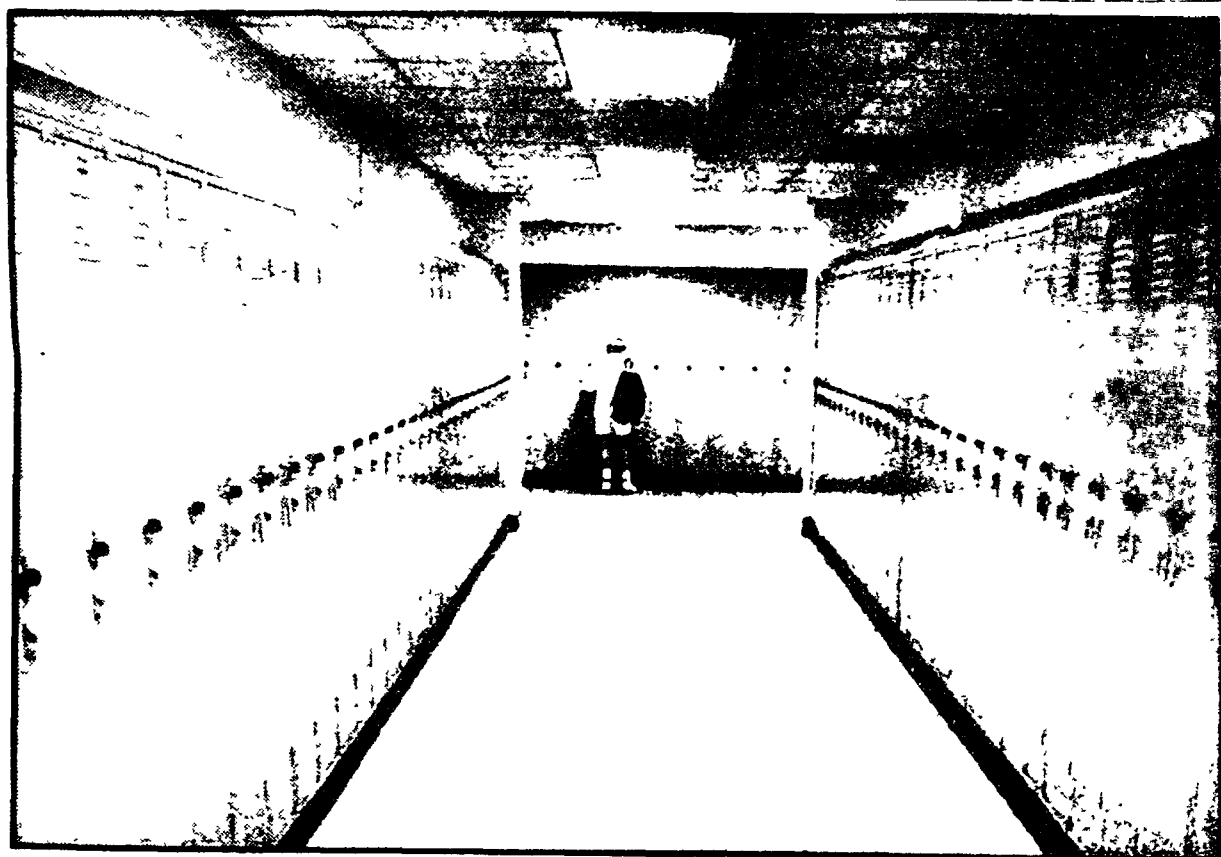
4. Social services, nearly 30 percent; K-12 school aid, 14 percent; health, 8.8 percent; and higher education, 6.5 percent.

5. Percentagewise, the biggest losers were Commerce, 42.4; Labor, 30.8; Management and Budget, 30.4; Education (the state staff, not school aid) 18.6; and Agriculture, 16.4. In short, the Lansing bureaucracy was cut to preserve public services.

6. Blatantly false. From 1981-91, total employment in Michigan rose 687,000 to nearly 3.9 million, but the AFDC welfare caseload rose from 191,000 to 205,000 — welfare cases went up even as employment rose. The welfare caseload has a life of its own regardless of what's going on in the general economy.

### Significant power at work



Anybody who didn't catch Tim Richard's piece on "Watch for upheaval in 1994" in last week's paper missed a significant and original work of political analysis.

Richard, who writes on the local implications of state and regional news, covered last month's state Republican convention in Grand Rapids. There he picked up word that the same fundamentalist wing of the Michigan GOP that gave Gov. John Engler such fits at the con-

vention is thinking of pushing for a state constitutional convention when the issue comes on the ballot in 1994.

What would they like to do?

According to Richard, they are backing something called "full choice," i.e. a state voucher that parents could take to any school — public, private, proprietary or parochial. "They praised McGuffey's Readers, Latin and parochial schools. Away from the microphones, I heard mutterings about creationism," he said.

Richard concluded that, "They are on a holy crusade to take back our culture."

This is pretty strong stuff.

But don't underestimate the moral fervor or political power that's coming together here.

My Republican friends confirm Richard's guess that the hard right, including Michigan Right to Life, had something like 45 percent of the delegates at the GOP convention. This is the same group that nearly put the party into the Pat Robertson camp in 1986-88 and which put together the grass-roots organization that nominated half the Republican candidates for the U.S. Congress in last month's primaries.

It's the Michigan version of the same people who took over the platform committee and rammed the most conservative

manifesto in modern times through the Republican national convention in Houston.

What's really going on here?

As I read this group, they really do believe that important elements of today's world are fundamentally odious to enduring American cultural values.

The moral breakdown of American has encouraged homosexuality, provoked AIDS, tolerated abortion and destroyed the traditional family. The public schools have failed to educate, displaced religious and ethical standards, indoctrinated children with left-leaning ideas and enforced a coercive liberal intellectual orthodoxy. The media are run by cultural elitists who propagate the same orthodoxy.

The political system does nothing but pander to special interest groups and must be cleansed by people of strong convictions and true values.

Upon reflection, I am persuaded that the same dynamics that created the Islamic fundamentalist movement now shaking the Arab world are driving the hard Republican right.

Both groups reject the consequences of modernization as blasphemous traditional values. Both look with anger and sadness at the deterioration of old-fashioned virtue and social institutions such as the family. Both feel that the intellectual advances of the 20th century, far from bringing clarity and hope, have led to confusion, error and lockstep orthodoxy enforced by the repressive apparatus of the government.

It's a view of the world that says the results of the passage of modern history are not "progress" but, in fact, regression. Many may disagree with this interpretation, but it's hard to argue with the emotional power that it expresses.

# Talks may help avoid tragedy

To Northville Meijer Associates, regarding Aug. 22 letter to the Editor:

The salutation of your letter does not indicate to whom it was addressed, but a copy was received at this office Sept. 2, 1992. I would like to respond to the opinions expressed in the letter and suggest that we plan a meeting in the very near future to discuss Meijer personal safety issues, which were so tragically brought to the public's attention because of the homicide of Michael Bebeau.

First, most of us are aware that quotes in newspaper articles do not necessarily reflect the total content of an interview. The Northville Township Police Department had a personal sense of outrage over the loss of a fine young man like Michael Bebeau, who, having just completed a bachelor's degree in criminal justice and with plans to attend the police academy, would one day have been one of our fellow police officers.

Second, I visited the funeral home to personally offer my condolences to the family of Michael Bebeau. Additionally, Capt. Phil Pressnell worked directly with the family, the VFW, and the Marine Corps to make special arrangements for the funeral services.

Third, immediately after the homicide on Meijer premises, the NTPD suggested to Meijer management that a psychologist specializing in crisis intervention be made available to Meijer associates to help them deal with the tragedy. Meijer accepted our specific recommendation and retained Dr. Ron Jones, consultant to the NTPD.

Fourth, I agree that NTPD personnel and Meijer personnel have worked cooperatively, and with mutual respect, to reduce theft of Meijer inventory. That collaborative effort, however, was confined within the parameters of Meijer management directives and the limits of the NTPD staffing resources. But problems at Meijer go beyond Meijer loss prevention, as frequently reported in the local news-

paper. There has been an inordinate amount of criminal activity on Meijer premises in comparison to any other establishment in Northville Township. Meijer customers have been the victims of car theft, purse snatchings (which can easily escalate into violent crimes if the victim resists), and abduction.

The NTPD is concerned about the safety of Meijer patrons and associates, and we suggest that you request that your management set up a meeting with our department as soon as possible to explore ways to diminish threats to personal safety while on Meijer premises.

These are a few of the reasons why our growing community requires an aggressive motor carrier unit.

Why should we listen to the local trucking industry which loudly complains, since they are the ones

violating the laws and disregarding public safety? Instead, taxpayers subsidizing costly road repairs, chemical dump sites renovation, and motorist highway safety should be the main consideration of the Township Board and politicians. Shame on township policy makers if they allow the interests of a few local businesses to dictate our law enforcement policies. Let's not be held hostage by local trucking businesses who intimidate our police officers with death threats, cash bribes, and garbage collection contract cancellations. If Midwest Sanitation or BFI pressures the township officials to authorize an "overweight truck" safety variance before it can fulfill its contract obligation of trash collection, then we need another company. If its fleet of trucks are not properly equipped to meet state and local weight or safety standards, then I don't want them traveling through our subdivisions.

Let's support our police department and Chief Snider's efforts to add a motor carrier vehicle to the fleet.

An article in the Free Press, written by Walter Williams, a professor, says that Iowa spends \$4,400 each year per student while Washington, D.C. spends \$7,550. Guess which one has the highest SAT scores? Iowa, and spending more money isn't the answer.

One of my clients has children in high school. Years ago we were told that in order to have better schools, we had to pay more and get some new teachers. His children have the same teachers that he had. He said we are paying more for the same old teachers and now they have tenure.

I can't remember if I learned that two plus two equals four in the second or third grade, but I would ask our school board to sit down and figure out what 6 to 7 percent raise equals each year and see how soon we'll be paying \$100,000 per year. It won't be too many years and no one will be able to afford living in Northville.

**Blood Pressure Basics**

You hear a lot about high blood pressure as you grow older. But what is it and why is it dangerous?

**Blood Pressure Explained**

Quite simply, blood pressure is the force exerted against the walls of the arteries by your blood as it travels throughout your body. If your blood vessels and arteries are wide, blood travels easily and the pressure is lower; the opposite happens if the vessels and arteries are narrow.

In the course of everyday living, there are normal ups and downs in your blood pressure. But when your blood pressure stays up, it's known as hypertension or high blood pressure. Continual high blood pressure can injure the arterial walls, causing very serious problems.


**What the Numbers Mean**

When blood pressure is measured, the two numbers are recorded as "165 over 95", for example. The first number, the systole, refers to the contraction of the heart when it forces blood out of the heart's chambers. The second number, the diastole, refers to the dilation of the heart following each contraction, or systole. The systole measures pressure when the heart's working, the diastole when it's resting. When the diastole is high and stays high, meaning the heart does not rest as it should, steps should be taken to change the situation.


What can you do about high blood pressure?

You might want to lose unnecessary weight, watch your salt intake and exercise sensibly. Of course, regular check-ups with your physician are always a good idea.

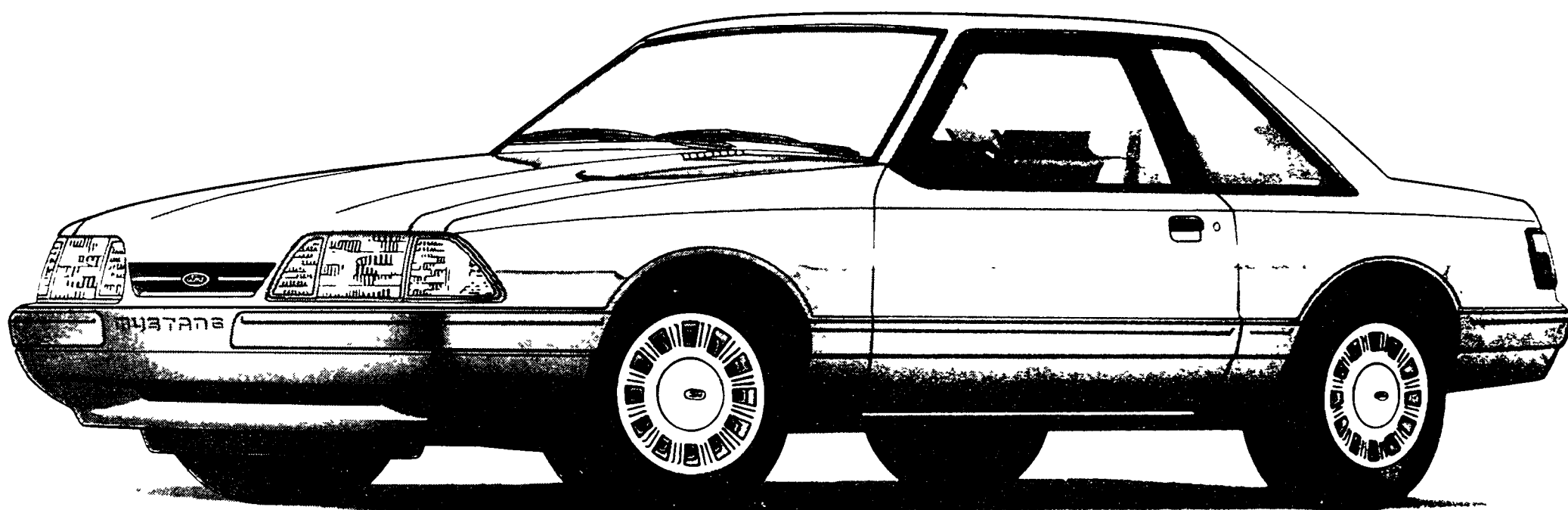

Nursing home helpers give and get satisfaction

It's all the little things that volunteers do that really matter at Star Manor.

It's their kind gestures, thoughtful actions, and short visits.

It's the smiles they bring to the faces of the residents they touch.

Each week and in some small way Northville business people Sue Poster, Betty Burch, Kathleen Switalski and Chris Surbrook donate their time and energies to help brighten a resident's day.

Each volunteer in his or her own way and for his or her own reason does something different with the residents each month.

It can be as simple as spending an hour a week just having lunch with them, reading to them, or just talking with them. Or it can be an involved arts and crafts project that diverts the residents' attention and gives them something different to do that day. Either way, it's a new face and it gives the residents something to look forward to.

And it makes Audrey Brandsen's job just that much easier.

Brandsen, who is the activities director at Star Manor, said she appreciates what the volunteers do to help.

"They all come with everything," Brandsen said. "Each brings everything they need with them."

It's a win-win situation all around.

The residents are happy and look forward to the volunteers' visits, and the volunteers themselves leave feeling pretty good about what they do, Brandsen said.

Sue Poster of Crawford's Bakery Connection comes to the Manor every other Tuesday and decorates fresh cookies, cupcakes, Crawford's own Dirt Cups, and mini chocolate eclairs with the residents.

"It's fun," Poster said.

Poster, who used to be a nurses'

aide at the home 18 years ago, said she got involved with the program because she saw a need for it, and because it gives her a chance to give something back to the community.

"Back then I realized there was nothing for them to do," she said. "They look forward to meals and I just felt there was a need for something like this ... It's like giving something back."

Poster said she got involved with the program at Brandsen's request. Since then, her visits have become highlights for residents with a sweet tooth.

"Once we made Dirt Cups. They just loved the gummy worms that go into them," she said. "They love sweets."

Betty Burch knows her sweets. That's why she's always welcomed at the Manor. As the owner of Grandma Betty's, Burch knows all too well about the residents' sweet tooth and hunger for junk food because she feeds into it.

Burch, who's been coming to the home once a week since October, is the host of the "lunch bunch." The lunch bunch is a group of residents that meets to discuss current events over lunch.

"We do everything," Burch said.

"We talk about dinosaurs and everything. This is a very curious bunch of ladies and they want to keep up-to-date."

So over anything from hot dogs and french fries to watermelon to Chinese food, the lunch bunch talks politics, Greek mythology, bugs, and even forensic medicine.

For the most part, Burch brings the residents whatever they want to eat. On any given day, lunch bunchers can munch on anything from pizza to fast food to Chinese food — all compliments of Burch.

"They don't always get McDonald's

hamburgers and hot dogs. But that's how it all started. They wanted McDonald's, so I got that. Then they wanted pizza, and I got that."

"They love fruit and french fries. But I've been trying to introduce them to new foods. I can bring two or three things; whatever they want, I'll bring."

Aside from the menu, Burch said, the lunch bunch ladies enjoy the discussions and the debates that accompany their lunches.

"One luncheon a week is really all they can absorb," she said.

A recent lunch bunch served up some pretty heated discussion on politics. Burch said her intent in discussing politics was to keep residents abreast of the political arena and informed about the upcoming presidential election.

"After all, they have to vote, so they need to know what's going on," she said.

Chris Surbrook of Northville's Happy Home House Care spends his time at the Manor reading books and magazines to the residents.

"I've been reading to about six to eight other seniors there since about January," Surbrook said. "It's community service; I do it for the heck of it."

Surbrook is also active with Civic Concern and the Northville Early Birds Kiwanis Club.

"I just try helping out whenever I can. The seniors weren't getting much attention, so I called Audrey to see what I could do to help."

That's why Kathleen Switalski got involved, too. For months Switalski, an employee at Genlitt's, has been teaching arts and crafts to the residents. Once a week she visits and does hands-on crafts with the residents at the home.

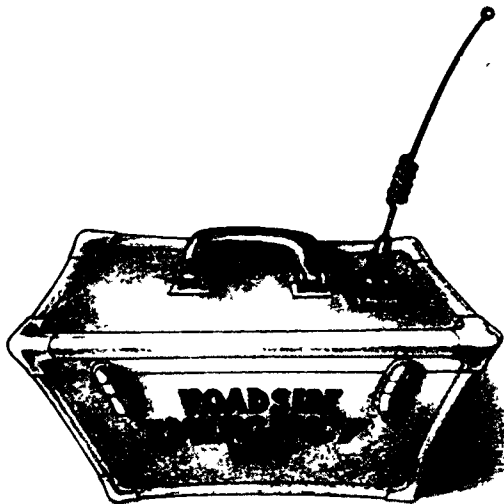

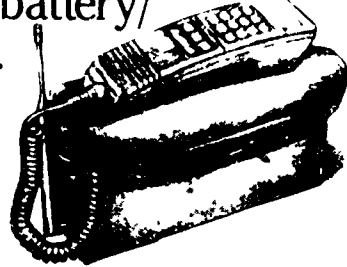

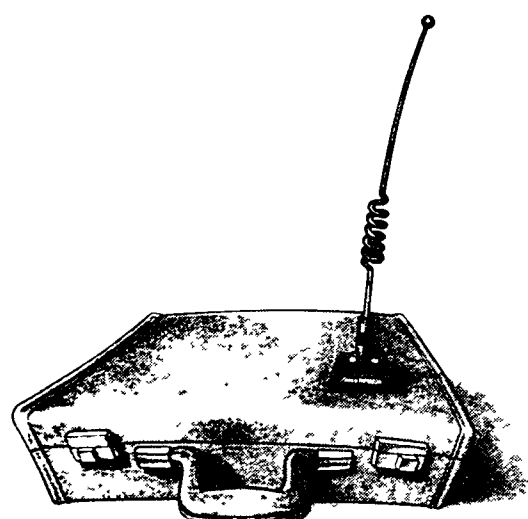

"She's got a few good tales in her. They're humorous. Heck, she's 97; she's got some mileage to her."

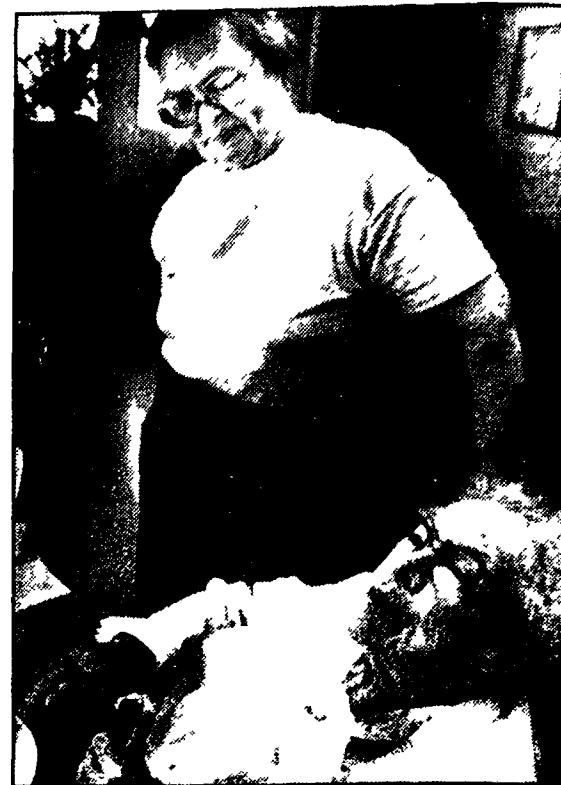
"It's a chance for her to relive her past."

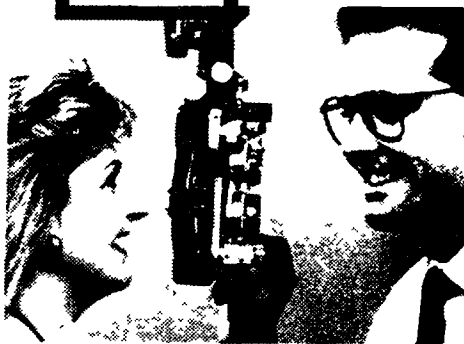

**Q: We love to visit lighthouses. Is there one in Delaware we should see?**

**A:** You won't want to miss the Fenwick Island Lighthouse, a historic 87-foot-tall structure whose beacon was first illuminated in 1859.

Fenwick Island, at the southeast corner of Delaware, was named after Thomas Fenwick, a wealthy Virginian who purchased the land in 1686.

Saltmaking, or extracting salt from the ocean, was big business there in the early 19th century; decades later Fenwick became a summer campground.

Today many visitors come to fish, sail and swim at the island's 208-acre state park.

For further information contact the Fenwick Island State Park at (302) 539-1055. Information is also available from your local travel agent.

**Q: We're off to Columbus, Ohio, with our children who are studying the U.S. presidents. Any ideas for us?**

**A:** Marion, Ohio, which is just north of Columbus, is proud to call Warren G. Harding, the 29th U.S. president, its most famous citizen.

Harding's home, now a museum, is at 380 Mt. Vernon Ave. The residence was built in the late 1800s during Hardings' courtship with Florence Mabel King; they were married there in 1891.

Harding ran much of his 1920 "front-porch campaign" from this house. Today's museum, at the back of the house, was once the campaign's press headquarters.

During September and October it is open Saturday from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday from 12 p.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is \$2.50 for adults and \$1 for children age 6-12. For further information call the museum at (614) 387-9630. Information is also available from your local travel agent.

**Q: What is the highest point in Texas? How can it be seen?**

**A:** The highest point is Guadalupe Peak, at 8,749 feet. The peak can be seen from the Guadalupe Mountains National Park, 16 miles north of Van Horn, southeast of El Paso via Texas Route 54.

The 76,293-acre park encompasses a scenic, rugged fossil-reef mountain complex. There are deep canyons, a tremendous earth fault, coniferous forests, desert lowlands, unusual flora and fauna and more than 80 miles of hiking trails.

Adventurers should check with a ranger before leaving the main road. They should dress appropriately for the terrain and watch for rattlesnakes, cliffs and thorny or sharp plants.

## Helsinki celebrates independence

### Finnish capital maintains unique Nordic-Baltic-European outlook

A good many visitors to Helsinki this August will arrive by boat, skimming into the deep South Harbor on one of the huge pleasure ships that cruise daily between Finland and Sweden, Germany, Poland and Estonia.

A few days—or even hours—later they will reboard and head for Russian waters. The traffic is about as heavy in the opposite direction.

Helsinki remains a little cousin to St. Petersburg in the minds—and travel patterns—of many foreigners.

Some won't even realize that Helsinki celebrates its 75th anniversary of independence in December; typically, the city has refrained from publicity that might be deemed immodest, provocative or over-commercial. But in the last century the Finnish capital has succeeded in honing a unique Nordic-Baltic-European identity in its physical look as well as its spirit.

Remnants of Swedish (1550-1809) and Russian (1809-1917) domination now share center stage with Finland's own styles. National Romanticism (a hybrid of Jugendstil focusing on local materials and myths) and the Functionalism made famous by Alvar Aalto.

At this time of the year facades of all kinds are neutralized by flower beds and terrace restaurants filled with ultraviolet-ray-loving Finns, whose immediate priority is to soak in every last bit of light before the darkening of autumn.

#### SIGHTSEEING

Finlandia Hall, built in 1971, is not just Helsinki's main concert site but the famous last work of Alvar Aalto, who designed everything from its facade to its furniture. Unfortunately, the white marble exterior has decayed drastically and must be changed.

Work will begin in January 1994, so these may be the last years to see it in its original state. Weekly guided tours in English: \$1.20 and \$2.40. To book, call 40 241.

Across the street stands a monument to the National Romantic style, the Finnish National Museum, 34 Mannerheimintie (40 501), built in 1906. Its architecture echoes various old Finnish churches and castles and the foyer is decorated with frescoes by the National Romantic artist Akseli Gallen-Kallela.

The unpretentious but pleasing permanent collection traces life in Finland from prehistoric times to the present. Open daily from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.; on Tuesday also 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. Admission: \$1.20 and \$2.40.

## Packing for Europe? Here's a new perspective

"Are all these bags yours?" asks the taxi driver, looking critically at the heap next to the curb.

"Yes," I say, trying not to sound apologetic. But as I climb into the back seat, clutching my carry-on, I wonder a little resentfully if he would ask Elizabeth Taylor the same question. I've read with self-justifying relief about how she travels.

James, my husband, pops into the back seat beside me.

"Got everything?" he asks cheerfully, knowing I will have compulsively counted: his duffel bag, my Pullman-on-wheels, the spare folding suitcase for souvenirs and purchases, the totebag of cooking supplies for our kitchen-equipped cottage, his carry-on, my carry-on, the portable computer and my shoulder-strap bottomless purse.

This is not how I used to travel. When I was much younger I studied helpful articles in newspapers and magazines with titles such as "An Insider's Travel Tips" or "A Celebrated Jet-Setter Tells How to Pack For Your Trip."

I absorbed the one unshakable rule: Virtue Lies in Traveling Light. My sophistication as well as personal morality, I learned, were sure to increase as the size and weight of my suitcase went down.

Although the matched set of Samsonite luggage I'd been given on graduation from high school was still good—in fact, its heavy plastic-molded cases were practically indestructible—it was definitely not what anyone would now call "Politically Correct."

So I began a long search for the Perfect Bag. It would be sturdy, infinitely expandable, affordable—and

Also nearby, the Tempelisaatio Church, 3 Lutherinkatu, was built directly into a rocky outcrop in 1969; its solar ceiling spreads from coiled copper into panes of glass that let in natural light.

In addition to Lutheran services the church holds fine chamber- and folk-music concerts. Hours for visiting change weekly, but it is usually open Monday to Friday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Call 494 698.

On nice days Helsinki's "tourist" islands are places to relax. Seurasaari, connected to the mainland by a wooden bridge 3 miles from the city center, has been turned into an open-air museum (484 712) strewn with old farmsteads and other buildings transplanted from different parts of Finland.

In September, partly open with no tours (but the guide booklets are very thorough), Mondays to Fridays 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.; Saturdays and Sundays 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission: \$1.20 and \$2.40; Wednesdays, free.

The purchase of a Helsinki Card can be a worthwhile investment since it grants free passage on all metropolitan transport and free or reduced entrance to many sites.

The card can be bought from the Helsinki City Tourist Office, 19 Pohjoisesplanadi (169 3757), and at some hotels and travel agencies. Cost: \$18.40 for one day, \$26 for two days, \$31 for three days; for children

aged 7 to 16, \$11 to \$16.

#### WHERE TO STAY

The Hotel Strand Inter-Continental, 4 John Stenbergin Ranta (39 351), is a world-class hotel with 200 rooms on the waterfront about five minutes from the downtown area. Request a room with a sea view. Doubles cost \$278 weekdays; \$139 weekends.

The venerable Hotel Seurahuone Sociis, 12 Kaivokatu (170 441), has 118 carefully appointed rooms, many of them quite large, right across from the beautiful Helsinki Railway Station. Downstairs is the city's most famous cafe, resplendent in high-ceilinged Jugendstil and open late into the night. Doubles cost \$222 weekdays; \$114 weekends.

Budget: Hotel Olympia, 2 Lantinen Brahenkatu (750 801), has 99 orderly rooms—many overlooking a tree-lined sports field—in a residential area about 15 minutes from downtown. Doubles cost \$95 all week.

The beds are a bit hard, but the Hotel Helka, 23 Pohjoisen Rautatiekatu (440 581), has 161 decent rooms in the city center and is part of the Best Western chain. Doubles in the old part cost \$93 weekdays or \$68 weekends; in the new part, \$149 weekdays or \$107 weekends.

The Theater Inn Omapohja, 3 Iitainen Teatterikuja (666 211), occu-

pies part of a turn-of-the-century building behind the National Theater. Its reception area is truly dramatic, but the 15 bedrooms are austere. Doubles with private shower and toilet cost \$78, doubles with toilet \$68, doubles without either \$61.

Full-service hotels in Helsinki generally have sauna available, but bathtubs and double beds are less certain.

#### WHERE TO EAT

Food, whether bought in restaurants or markets, is expensive in Finland. Liquor is also expensive, particularly because of high taxes.

Havis Amanda, 23 Unioninkatu (666 882), close by the South Harbor, is arguably Helsinki's best seafood restaurant—and fish in Finland can be very good indeed. There's always a set menu of roe appetizer, charcoal-grilled salmon with morels, and rhubarb soup with strawberry sorbet for \$52, or you can order a la carte. Dinner for two with wine: about \$150. Closed Saturday evening and Sunday.

Helsinki has no shortage of Russian restaurants, expensive considering the prices just across the border. Ravintola Galleria Hariton, 44 Kasarminkatu (622 1717), is the latest and most reasonable, and its "nouvelle Russian" cuisine makes it one of the best. Wild mushroom pelmeni (stuffed dumplings) cost \$8.30

and salmon "Moscow" style \$16. There is also reindeer Stroganoff for \$27. Dinner for two with wine: about \$75.

At the aromatic Kynsilaukka Garlic, 22 Fredrikinkatu (651 939), you can get a garlic-spiced martini for \$7. Specialties include a spicy bouillabaisse for \$24 or lamb in garlic for \$22. Dinner for two with wine: about \$80.

It isn't outstanding food or sharp service that makes Ravintola Elite, 22 Eteläinen Heipankatu (495 542), the favorite haunt of so many Finnish celebrities, so it must be its cool Functionalism atmosphere (it was opened in 1932) and leafy terrace. The cuisine is Finnish-French; basic dishes, such as the ample shrimp salad for \$13.40, are best. Lunch for two: about \$25. Dinner with wine: from \$55 and up.

Sam's Restaurant, 22 Annankatu (605 200), is a simple place, centrally located, and the food is cheap and good. Filling salmon soup, a Finnish classic, and shellfish casserole are each \$10, and filet steak with your choice of sauce and potatoes is \$16. Dinner for two with a carafe of wine: about \$45. Closed Sunday.

Priced between \$7.50 and \$14, Finnish pizzas are extremely thin, and each person normally orders his or her own. One cozy pizzeria is Mare Chiaro Secondo, 20 Hameentie (753 7003). Closed Saturday evening and on Sunday.

Alcoholic beverages of all kinds are horrendously expensive in Finland and even more so when bought in restaurants. A modest bottle of wine can easily cost more than a meal. Especially at lunch Finns frequently choose beer, and local brews are very good.

#### WHERE TO SHOP

Flea markets are the rage this summer. The oldest is the Hietalahti Flea Market, Monday to Saturday from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.; also, until Sept. 11, Monday to Friday from 3:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. Mostly used clothes, books and housewares, but sometimes you can find a gem such as a 1920s Kera bowl for \$20.

People in Helsinki still shop at green markets for fresh food and flowers, and the city has a number of fine square-and-hall combinations. Best known is the Kauppatori and its handsome Old Market Hall at the mouth of the South Harbor.

The market in the Hakaniemi district, however, is bigger, and its hall has good stalls upstairs for gifts. Markets are open Monday to Saturday from 6:30 a.m. to 2 p.m.; halls stay open until 5 p.m. For more information call the Helsinki Tourist Office (169 3757).

One noted travel columnist counseled recently, "If in doubt, don't pack it. Remember you can buy it there."

Ah, but has she tried finding a shop that sells Band-Aids—or shampoo, or eyeglass screws, or a computer disk—in a tiny French village on a Sunday afternoon? Or spending several long evenings in a remote Italian hilltop cottage with nothing to read?

My new golden rule of travel is: Don't Waste Time and Money Looking for It Abroad If You Can Possibly Take It With You.

## South Lyon devours Mustangs in grid opener

### Northville falls 34-6 at home

A big, dangerous cat is on the prowl and it left paw prints all over the place Friday night in Northville. Unfortunately, many of those prints were found in the Mustang end zone as South Lyon devoured its gridiron host 34-6. The Lions dominated Northville in the season opener as running back Billy Porter splashed his way to 241 yards and three touchdowns.

The visitors led 20-0 at halftime. Northville's only tally came on a short run by quarterback Danny Walsh late in the third quarter.

For Mustang coach Darrel Schumacher the game was, obviously, a disappointment. The longtime coach took much of the blame for the defeat, however.

"We just didn't execute well," Schumacher said. "We didn't do good at any phase of the game."

"I didn't have the kids mentally prepared to play. It was strictly my fault."

It was no secret South Lyon would run the ball.

Even though they knew what was coming, Schumacher said it was still difficult to stop. He gave credit to Lion quarterback Dan Eller.

"I thought he did a phenomenal job faking," Schumacher commented.

Eller's fake handoffs were so convincing that the Mustangs often went

after the wrong man. Schumacher said his squad did a poor job of tackling when they did find the ball carrier.

"We just didn't make the tackles,"

he said.

The Lions established the run immediately.

South Lyon took the opening kickoff and started on its own 35-yard

line. Fullback Ken Nelson rumbled 19 yards on the first play from the line of scrimmage. A few plays later Porter touched the ball for the first time and ran for 15 yards to the Northville 20-yard line.

The Mustang defense stiffened and forced a fourth-and-one situation. Porter got the call and scooted 11 yards up the middle for the touchdown at the 8:35 mark. A South Lyon extra point made it 7-0.

A 12-yard return by John Gatti put the Mustangs at their own 34 for their offensive series.

A holding call moved the ball back 10 yards and set up a first-and-20 situation for Northville. A pair of sacks and an incomplete pass forced the Mustangs to punt with nearly half of the first quarter gone.

South Lyon began its second possession on its own 42 after offensive holding and defensive offsides penalties were marked off.

An illegal procedure call on third down gave the Lions 22 yards to go for a first down. Porter went off tackle and shook off several Mustang defenders en route to a 50-yard run to the Northville 15.

South Lyon capped the scoring drive on a another third-and-long. Porter took an option pitch to the left side of the field and went in nearly untouched to make it 14-0.

The Lions got the ball right back as Northville fumbled the kickoff.

The first bright spot of the game came three plays later as junior defensive back Justin Cataldo intercepted an Eller pass to give the Mustangs the opening kickoff.

Northville started on its own 19. Facing a third-and-three, Walsh

completed his first pass at the start of the second quarter. He hit senior receiver Eric Shaw over the middle for a gain of seven yards.

Walsh continued his third-down success by nailing John Farrar for nine yards. On their own 45, the Mustangs continued the drive as junior Brian Jackson caught another Walsh pass for three yards.

The drive ended there, though. Walsh just missed Cataldo on third down, and the Mustangs were forced to punt.

The squads then traded possessions before halftime. South Lyon put the final points of the half up with less than a minute to go on a Nelson touchdown.

Northville appeared headed for its first score with just 31 seconds left. After starting on the Mustang 37, Walsh hit Cataldo and then Kevin Shaw to move to the Lions' 41. The senior QB then scrambled to the 34. Northville missed a 50-yard field goal attempt with seconds remaining.

The Mustangs did break the ice in the third.

With a few minutes remaining in the quarter, Northville took over on its own 46-yard line. Completions to Cataldo and Eric Shaw moved the Mustangs into position.

On a critical fourth-and-three, Walsh once again found Cataldo, this time for 16 yards to the 8-yard line. On the next play, Walsh took a keeper up the middle for Northville's first touchdown of 1992. A missed extra point made it 20-6.

Schumacher said he thought the tides were turning at that point.

"We played better defense in the

Northville will be in action tomorrow at home against Walled Lake Western. Game time is 5 p.m.

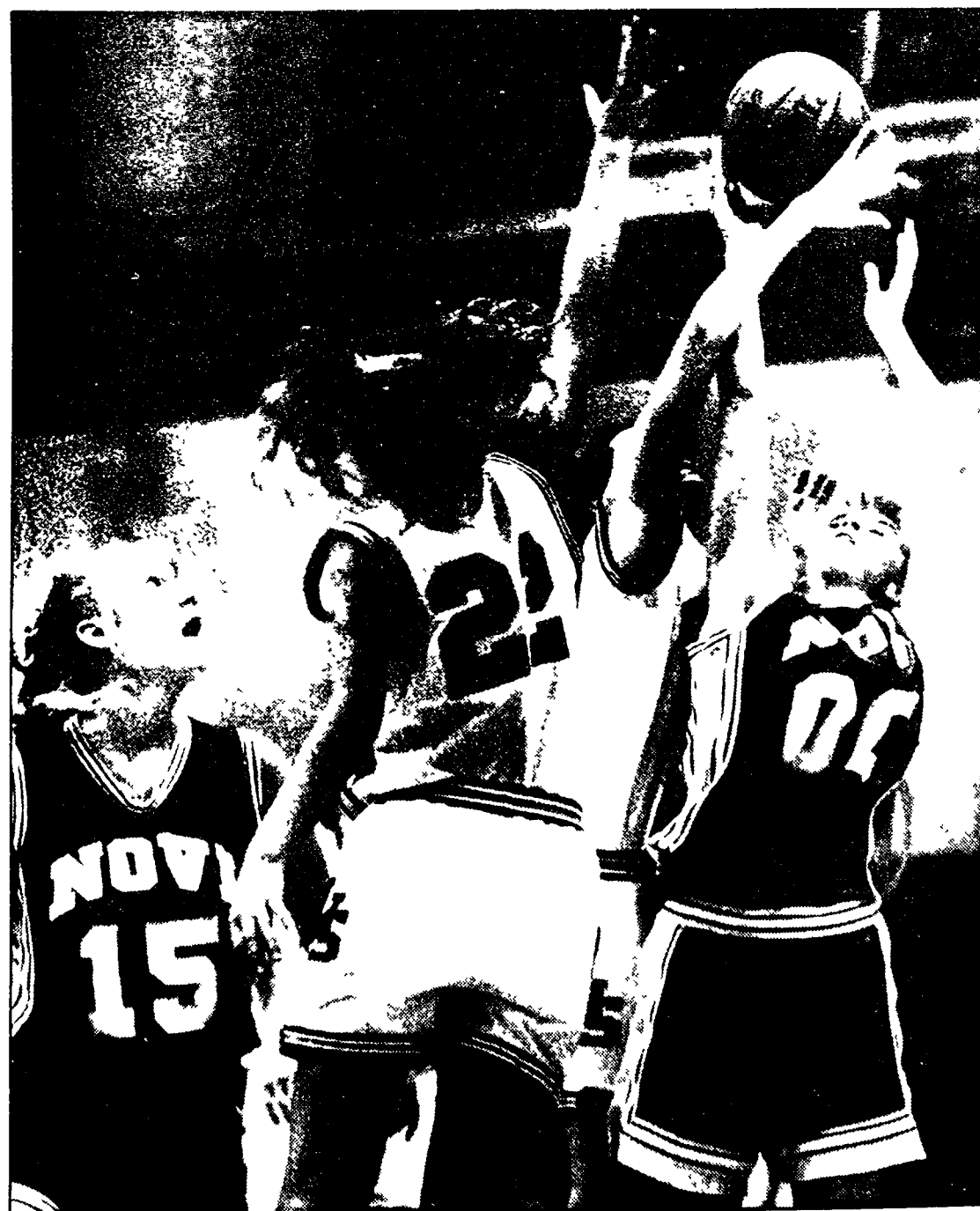

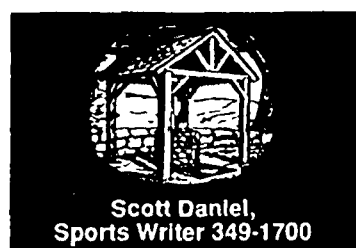

## Ballet offered through city

There are dozens of good reasons to invest in dance training for your child, according to Beth Dwalhy-Barr, Northville Parks and Recreation's dance instructor.

Dancers characteristically shun drug and alcohol use. Dancers are better readers. Dancers who begin serious training in childhood develop fewer cases of certain cancers as adults. They do develop fine posture, high self-esteem, self-discipline, and enlightenment through the arts. But most children, as well as adults, dance for the pure, unmatched joy of movement.

Dancers rarely abuse drugs or alcohol partly because they learn early that caring for their bodies is imperative to their training, Dwalhy-Barr said. And few dancers feel a need for artificially induced highs because, in dance workouts such as ballet, endorphins are released into the bloodstream which produce a natural elevation in mood as well as other healing properties. Some refer to the effect as euphoric.

Perhaps this is the reason that children who have been virtually dragged into ballet class seem elated at the conclusion of class.

Dwalhy-Barr said that a well-trained, experienced teacher will enrich the child by nurturing him or her with positive reinforcement and gentle guidance, engendering high self-esteem along with the ability to accept and integrate constructive criticism.

With regular serious training through puberty, fat levels are kept low at important developmental stages and this is why, doctors believe, dancers develop fewer cases of certain cancers (such as breast cancer) in adults who have trained in dance than in the general population.

Dancers are better readers because hand/eye coordination, essential to good reading skills, is enhanced with ballet lessons.

Such training can be dangerous if the child is enrolled too early, cautions Dwalhy-Barr.

"The bones and muscles are growing so very fast at early ages, that ballet training can change the direction of that growth.

"Ballet is definitely inappropriate until the child reaches the age of 6 to 8 years, depending upon the individual child."



### Ballet offers many benefits.

Early training with an experienced teacher is sometimes prescribed by orthopedic physicians when, for example, the child walks with turned-in feet and legs and needs to have the direction of that growth changed, more toward the turn-out taught in ballet.

Such corrections can be made in ballet or in creative movement classes which are most appropriate for children under the age of 6 or 7 years.

In creative movement children are given basic movement concepts and then encouraged to build upon those ideas with movement inventions of their own.

With the guidance and support of the teacher, the inventiveness of the creative movement student is encouraged and nurtured.

"Every child has innate creativity and joy of movement," says Dwalhy-Barr. "Children love to express them-

selves by using their bodies to the sound of music. And these classes help the child develop strength, flexibility, rhythm and coordination."

Dwalhy-Barr teaches several classes for Northville Community Recreation. They include creative movement for 4- to 6-year-olds, 4 p.m. Monday or Wednesday; and classical ballet, 4:45 p.m. Monday and Wednesday. For more information on these courses call the rec department at 349-0203.

## Treatment options open for breast cancer



Breast cancer has increased dramatically over the last 50 years and represents a major health problem. This year in the United States, 150,000 new cases of breast cancer and 49,000 deaths from breast cancer will occur. One in nine American women will have breast cancer at

some point in her life and 3.5 percent of American women will die from breast cancer. Breast cancer is the No. 1 cause of death for women ages 40-55.

Although several risk factors have been identified, both the exact cause of breast cancer and reasons for the increased cases are not known. Two-thirds of all breast cancers occur in women after menopause. If your sister or mother had breast cancer, you have two to three times the average risk, especially if your relative was under 40 when she had breast cancer.

Early onset of menstrual cycles (age 11 or 12)

and late menopause (after 55) increase your risk. So does having no pregnancies or late pregnancies (after 30). Some other possible factors include estrogen replacement after menopause, birth-control pills and a high-fat diet. The exact role of each of these is not clear.

A major effort is going toward the early diagnosis and treatment of breast cancer. Breast cancer screening has three components: self-breast exam, exam by health professionals and mammograms.

It is important for women to do monthly self-breast exams. Exams should be done during the same part of the menstrual cycle each month. Most breast lumps are discovered by the patient or her spouse.

Most breast cancers are a painless lump. Breast pain is nearly always not cancer. Any new, changing or enlarging lump should be evaluated. Any bloody discharge from the nipple should also be promptly evaluated. An annual breast exam by a physician or another health professional trained to do this, is also recommended.

A mammogram is basically a breast X-ray. Mammogram screening has been shown to save lives. Mammograms can discover small

breast cancers before they can be felt. Since mammograms are not 100 percent accurate, any suspicious lump on a normal mammogram still requires a surgical biopsy. The current recommendations for mammogram screenings in low-risk women are: a baseline at age 35-40; a mammogram every two years between ages 40-50; and every year after age 50. For high-risk women, for example, if a sister had breast cancer, yearly screening should begin sooner.

Several advances have been made in the treatment of breast cancer. Breast surgery can be less disfiguring, with a lumpectomy followed by local radiation. Lumpectomies are not used for advanced cancer.

In more advanced cancer, chemotherapy will be often given after surgery. The other major advance is the use of breast reconstructive surgery. If you have breast cancer, your physician can help you determine which treatment options are best for you.

### Creative development give cities a new look

New and creative redevelopment programs are emerging in the downtown areas of cities across the nation.

These developments include new condominiums for low-income families and luxury townhomes for more affluent couples or families. Most of the developments include specialty shops and other commercial units.

Larimar Square in Denver, for example, became a popular downtown section where residents and tourists shop at unique stores and shops and where yuppies live in classy townhomes. Before the area was redeveloped, it had become what appeared to be a hopeless skid row section of the city.

In Des Moines, Iowa, the old deteriorated part of the downtown area next to the county courthouse and railroad tracks has taken on new life. It has become a popular community entertainment and

activity center. New restaurants now operate in renovated buildings. And it's the site of frequent sidewalk community fairs.

An example of a progressive downtown area redevelopment plan now under construction can be seen in the city of Thousand Oaks, Calif., north of Los Angeles. A \$63.8 million Civic Arts Plaza redevelopment project being built on a 20-acre site.

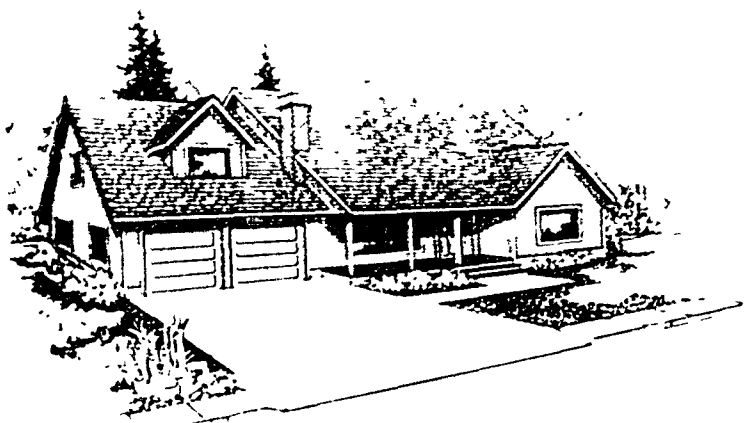
When completed, the project will offer something for everyone. A handsome 1,800-seat Civic Auditorium will bring music groups and other performances to the area.

### Great room an asset for the basic Crummett

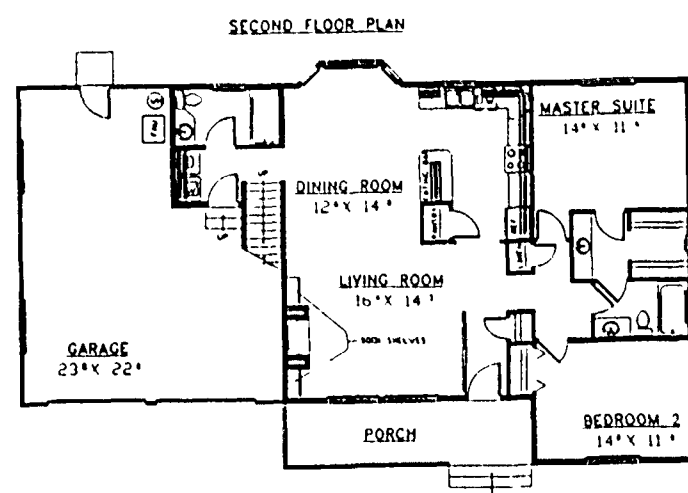
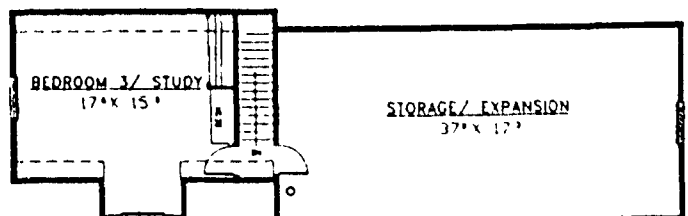
The living room is awash in natural light from two big windows, though the light's intensity is softened by a front porch overhang. Floor-to-ceiling bookshelves flank the fireplace.

HOMEOWNERS  
ASSOCIATION  
meeting tonight

Nowadays when you buy a home, more often than not, included in the purchase is membership in a neighborhood homeowner associations.

Most subdivisions in the area have homeowners' associations, which are perceived as meddlesome or useful depending on the resident's chosen lifestyle. The subdivision dweller with a liking for slash-and-burn-style lawn maintenance won't appreciate such a group nearly as much as the dweller's neighbors.

Homeowners' associations not only regulate (to some extent) and try to preserve the aesthetics of a neighborhood, but most have specific purposes like taking care of lakes or private roads. Many organizations make a point to keep tabs on local government, thus maintaining a collective eye on area development.

Memberships can be both voluntary and involuntary. According to Debi Amato, president of the Pleasant Valley Homeowners' Association in Brighton, membership in the group is mandated by the deed to the property. This way, secondary owners cannot exclude themselves from membership. In the Organization for Woodland Lake (OWL) in Brighton Township, President Effie Tompkins said membership is voluntary, but all residents in the group's area benefit from activities and services purchased with dues.

Most homeowners' associations collect dues, but the amount varies with size and activity. According to Genoa Township Board trustee Doug Brown, former president of the Tri-Lake Riparian Association and current member of the Civic Association for Crandall's Crooked Lake Heights Subdivision One and Two, his dues will probably increase now that the Livingston County Road Commission is ending a 4-1/2-year contract with the association to maintain the area's private roads.

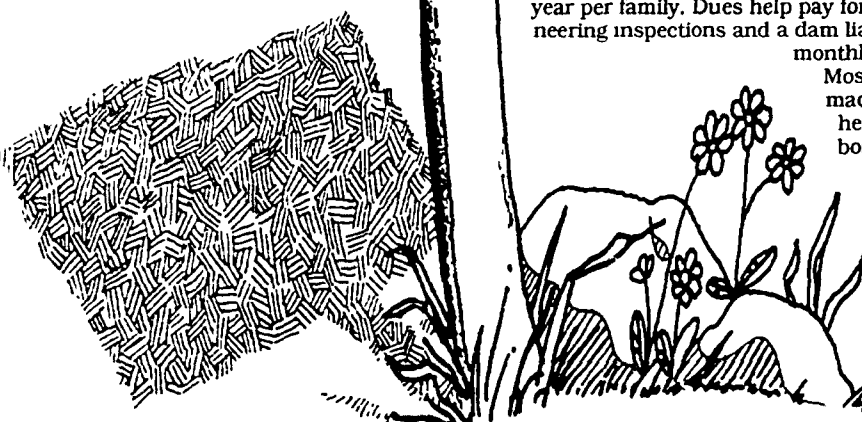
Currently, he pays about \$30 per year, because the bulk of the association's maintenance costs are added on the tax bill.

Tompkins said OWL members pay about \$150 per year per family. Dues help pay for lake clean-up, engineering inspections and a dam liability policy, plus a monthly resident newsletter.

Most associations are made up of the usual hierarchy of officers and board members. According to Tompkins, OWL consists of a 16-person board—one representative from each of the sites around the lake. The board elects the officers and

## Home-grown produce

### GARDENING

**Q. Proper storage of home-grown vegetables is most important, and I know there are certain general rules that should be followed if one wants to achieve success. What are they?**

A. With renewed interest in kitchen gardens, many gardeners have access to numerous vegetables and fruits for immediate use. Therefore, correct storage facilities are a must in connection with an abundant harvest.

A vegetable or fruit should be mature or nearly so at harvest, or it will not store well.

It should be free of all visible evidence of disease.

It should be free of severe insect damage.

It should be handled carefully so that it is not damaged by bruises or cuts. Damaged fruit or vegetables are more likely to suffer from mold or decay in storage than are carefully handled materials.

It should be harvested prior to any severe or killing frost because most fruits and vegetables do not store well if subjected to severe chilling, even if damage is not visible.

Generally speaking, it is not advisable to store vegetables and fruits together over long

periods of time. Many fruits, including pears and apples, give off a gas known as ethylene, and it will affect most other vegetables. On the other hand, pears and apples will absorb the flavors and odors of some vegetables.

Here is the average storage duration for commonly stored harvest:

- Tomatoes: one month.
- Celery, leeks: two and a half months.
- Beets, pears: three months.
- Apples, pumpkins, squash: four and a half months.
- Carrots, potatoes: six months.
- Onions: seven months.

**Q. What type of soil is best for peonies?**

A. Any rich, well-drained soil is satisfactory; in fact, they grow well in a wide range of soil types.

**Q. Will peonies flourish in a sandy soil?**

A. Sandy soil is perfectly suited to peony-growing if ample fertilizer is used to nourish it. Well-rotted manure or rich compost should be

# Buy fire-retardant shake shingles for your roof

**Q. The original cedar shake roof on a 25-year-old home we purchased two years ago has deteriorated beyond repair, according to several roofing firms who have inspected the property. I have to install a new roof and would like to renew the cedar shakes. But I am concerned about fire hazards and wonder if it wise to use wood as the roofing material.**

**The roofing firm has assured us that new cedar shingles are fire-retardant, but I am concerned on just how fire-retardant they are and how long the fire retardant chemicals used on the wood will last.**

**Architectural guidelines in our area limit the selection of materials we have**

**available, but there is a precast synthetic cedar-shake imitation. However, it is much more expensive than the wood product. Do you have any advice on this subject?**

A. Today's cedar shake and shingle roofing products are not the same products of the past. In recent years, the industry has developed fire-retardant cedar shakes and shingles.

This is accomplished by impregnating cedar materials with fire-retardant chemicals when the shakes and shingles are manufactured. These permanently fire-retardant cedar shakes and shingles are then subjected to stringent testing to ensure that they will meet all local and national fire codes.

The shakes and shingles that meet these standards are identified by the Certi-Guard label and are the only wood

materials permitted on new roofs in many fire-prone areas.

These cedar shingles are guaranteed fire-retardant for the life of the roof. The product undergoes a series of tests to meet Underwriters Laboratory safety standards for class C and class B fire ratings.

**Q. I would like to install new sheet vinyl in a recreation room that has a flooring of poured concrete. Is there any special preparation required for below-grade floors, or can I install the vinyl directly on the concrete surface?**

A. Vinyl can be used on below-grade surfaces. However, any floor cracks or uneven surfaces may show right through the new flooring unless you prepare the old surface

beforehand. This is true with new vinyl flooring or linoleum installation over old wood flooring as well as concrete.

One of the best techniques to assure a smooth, compatible surface is to use a mortar-based interior floor leveler to even out rough or cracked concrete or wood subfloors. A floor leveler is generally designed to adhere to concrete and wood and can also be used to patch cracks and fill low spots. A good floor leveler sets hard in 30 minutes and will not shrink or crack.

In preparation, all dirt, dust or loose materials from the old floor need to be removed. Wood subfloors should be securely fastened with nails or screws to reduce uneven surfaces as much as possible. Chalky concrete surfaces should be thoroughly cleaned, rinsed and dried.

A good floor leveler can be used on below-grade surfaces, with one caution. There should be no presence of moisture or continued dampness on the concrete

surface. Floor levelers are applied like premixed concrete. You only need to add water and stir and mix it to a creamy blend.

Most manufacturers recommend that you wet the concrete floor or wooden substrate before application to improve adhesion and retard suction. Then pour the mixed compound directly onto the uneven or cracked surface and spread with a steel trowel.

Allow 15 or 20 minutes for the mixture to set prior to finishing with the steel trowel. The finish can be sanded when it is thoroughly dry.

Floor levelers are also recommended for use when laying tough floors like tile, wood and carpet to offset the impact of long term wear on the subfloor.

rooms, conference rooms and a large multi-purpose room. It also will include the new government center facilities for Thousand Oaks, and a 388-seat Council Chamber/Forum Theater.

For a welcome change of pace, nature-loving visitors might stroll along paths in the 7-acre park included in the site plan, or peruse one of many art exhibits to be featured. The development is a giant leap into the future from the days when the site was known

as Goebel's Wild Animal Park. Many area families and tourists remember this as a place where the kids (and adults) enjoyed watching trained animals perform for them. The site, later known as Jungland, was purchased by an investor in 1969. He proposed a shopping center development on the site in the mid-1980s. But many community leaders felt the downtown area was strategically located for a key public complex and pushed for that type of usage. The land was

acquired by the city's Redevelopment Agency and the development process was under way.

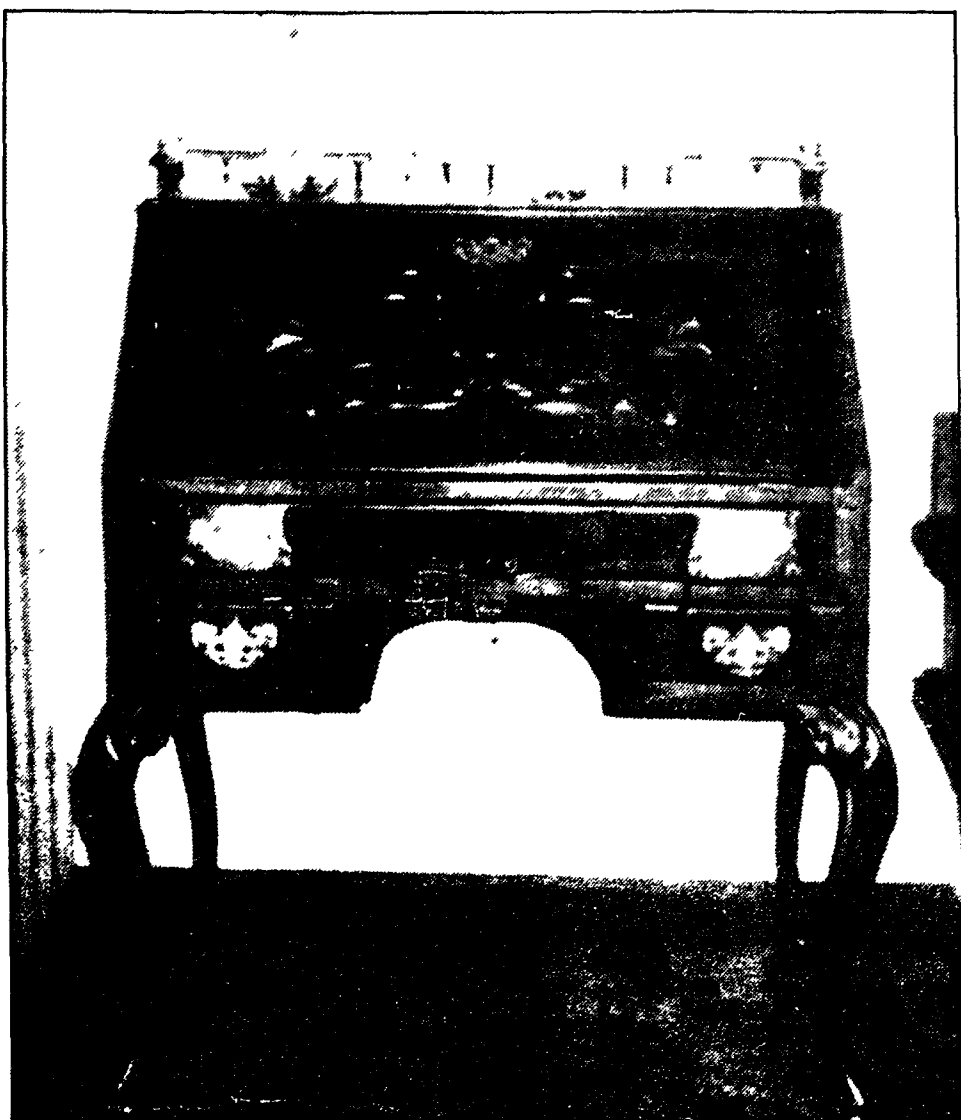

## Heirloom desk is a real value

**Q.** Enclosed is a picture of a desk that has been in my family for several generations. The brass hinge that supports the writing top is dated April 5, 1887. The carving on the front depicts the "North Wind." Could you tell me something of its value?

**A.** Your desk is Queen Anne style, maker and origin unknown. The date on the hinge is a hardware number. Your desk was made around 1900 and should sell for \$375 to \$400.

**Q.** I have started to collect ceramic plates trimmed in 22 karat to 24 karat gold, marked "Crest of Gold" Sabin. I also have a cup and saucer and an ashtray with the same marking.

**Can you give me the history, age and value of these products?**

**A.** These items were made by Sabin Industries Inc. in McKeesport, Pa. It is inexpensive china made in the mid-20th century and still being produced. Each piece would run in the \$10 to \$15 range.

**Q.** I would appreciate it if you could give me some information about a glass figurine of a rearing pony. It has a mark of an "H" in a diamond.

**I would like to know who made it, when, and its current value?**

**A.** This little figurine was made by A.H. Heisey and Co., in Newark, Ohio, during the early 20th century.

The company was founded in 1898, and in 1957 it was taken over by The Imperial Glass Co., Bellaire, Ohio. The



"H" mark was discontinued in 1968.

A dealer would price this at about \$165 to \$175.

**Q.** I have a three-piece toilet set consisting of a pitcher, bowl and soap dish. It is decorated with a floral design with gold trim. The mark I have enclosed is on the bottom of the three pieces.

**A.** Your toilet set was made around 1900 by Taylor, Smith & Taylor in East Liverpool, Ohio. It would probably sell for \$165 to \$185.

**Q.** I am curious about ironstone china. Could you give me some infor-

mation about it? I would also like you to explain just what ironstone china is.

**A.** Charles James Mason developed ironstone in 1813. It was a chinaware that was heavier than porcelain, cheap and durable. The earthenware made earlier was thicker and discolored and checked with age.

For 40 years the Mason family held patents. Thereafter many other companies produced ironstone china—most of it inferior to Mason's.

**Q.** At an antique show recently I saw some novelty ceramics decorated with fat little elves with skinny legs and they had large round eyes. There were several of these shown by a dealer.

**Can you tell me anything about these?**

**A.** From the way you describe these, I think these items are decorated with pictures of "Brownies" designed by Palmer Cox, which were first drawn by the artist in 1883. These cartoon figures were used to decorate a variety of items. Here are some typical pieces:

- "Brownie" china cup and saucer, \$70 to \$75.
- "Brownie" Palmer Cox Whistle, \$150.
- "Brownie" auto race game, \$65.
- Cup (Brownies skating), \$75.

meets once a month. A general membership meeting is held once a year, as with most other associations.

Some groups are more loosely structured. Brown said that though his association is supposed to meet quarterly, it meets about twice a year, but he thinks this, too, will change when the county

contract expires.

One attribute almost all associations share is that they are incorporated with the State of Michigan. According to Amato, this makes the association a lawful entity with a "legal leg to stand on" if a resident violates the homeowners' policy. Incorporation lends legitimacy to a homeowner association.

In some cases, it also makes associations eligible for low interest-rate loans. Last year, the Pleasant Valley Association was able to pave two roads, partly with money borrowed at 4 percent interest, Amato said.

As a township trustee, Brown feels associations are helpful when lobbying for special projects or preventing development seen as detrimental to the area.

"Their concerns carry more weight," Brown said. "I have a keen interest in what they have to

say because they represent all of the people in the area."

Amato feels the same, though she is unsure if homeowners' associations make a dent on policy in the end.

"We can speak with one voice," she said. "They know that when they get a letter from the Pleasant Valley Homeowners' Association, I am not the only one involved; there are 60 families behind it."

Tompkins said OWL works very closely with Brighton Township to try to regulate activity on Woodland Lake and even

helped the township develop a wetlands ordinance. However, OWL was unable to stop a drain from being installed in the lake.

It is relatively easy to form an association. If there is interest in the community, it probably won't be too hard to get the required 50 percent of resident signatures. According to Brown, the next step is to petition the State of Michigan for incorporation. Retaining incorporation costs about \$10 per year.

**Q.** What's the best method of preparing soil for peonies?

**A.** For fall or spring planting, work fertilizer thoroughly into the soil before planting. This

way, no additional fertilizer will be needed the following spring. Keep newly planted plants well watered.

# Some smart ways to borrow money

Borrowing money can sometimes be too easy and cost you more over the life of a loan than you ever anticipated.

The Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants recommends that before you sign any loan agreements, you review all available sources for obtaining credit. Shopping around can make the difference in more than a few percentage points of interest.

## Your home as a resource

The smartest choice you can make is to borrow money from yourself. For example, if you are a homeowner, you can consider taking out a homeowner equity loan. In most cases, the bank will lend you as much as 80 percent of your home's appraised value, less your first mortgage. Home equity loans also offer you a valuable tax break: Regardless of your income, you can deduct the interest on home equity loans of up to \$100,000.

## Borrowing from your 401(k) plan

If you participate in a 401(k) plan or another company-sponsored savings and profit sharing plan, you may be able to borrow from it. Interest rates are usually lower than those associated with unsecured loans and, most importantly, you will be paying interest to your own account. However, there are federal limits on how much you may borrow and the length of time you have to repay the loan. What's more, if you leave your job while you have an outstanding loan from your 401(k) account, you usually have to repay it immediately. Otherwise it will be treated as a distribution and you will pay taxes on it, as well as an early distribution penalty.

## Another use for life insurance

Policyholders of whole life and certain other kinds of life insurance may borrow money against the cash surrender value of their policy. You are, in effect, borrowing against yourself, since the cash value is the amount that you could receive if you cashed in the policy. Even more importantly, depending on the age of the policy, interest rates can be less than half the rates charged by other sources. However, keep in mind that the interest you pay is no longer deductible.

## Using IRAs to make ends meet

If you need quick cash for a short period of time, you can consider tapping your Individual Retirement Account (IRA). Although you will face a stiff penalty if you permanently withdraw money from your IRA before age 59½, you can withdraw all or part of your IRA funds once a year without penalty, provided you make a rollover and replace the funds within 60 days. You pay no interest on the money you

have withdrawn from the account, but it will not be earning any money for you.

## What stocks can offer besides dividends

If you own stock and other securities, such as municipal bonds and Treasury notes, you can use these as collateral to borrow funds from your bank or brokerage house. This is typically called borrowing on margin. The type and value of the securities you use for collateral will determine the size of the margin loan you are eligible to receive. Interest rates for this type of loan are currently under 10 percent.

## Credit unions and other lenders

Don't overlook credit unions as sources for consumer loans. Various other lenders can offer you both secured loans — meaning that you are using a specific item as security or collateral for the loan — and unsecured loans. For example, automobile loans are considered secured loans and are offered by banks as well as car dealerships. Interest rates will vary among lenders.

Unsecured personal loans are typically offered by banks. With interest rates as high as 16 percent, these loans represent an expensive way to borrow funds. However, if you are paying hundreds of dollars in high interest on credit card balances, you may want to obtain a personal bank loan to consolidate your debt — but you'll still need the financial discipline to pay it off.

CPAs emphasize that you take a close look at your spending habits before obtaining a loan of any kind. Tightening your purse strings may help you keep your loan amount — and subsequent interest payments — to a minimum.

# The pros and cons of incorporation



Q: "My son operates a home-based business while working full-time elsewhere. What are some of the major advantages and disadvantages of forming his own corporation?"

A: Unlike proprietorships and partnerships, forming and maintaining a corporation is more complicated. This represents one of the biggest disadvantages of incorporation, mainly due to the additional registration and filing responsibilities.

According to Brenda Orlando, a Clarkston-based small business Certified Public Accountant, incorporating business owners must file Articles of Incorporation with the state's Corporation and Securities Bureau, establish the internal organizational structure of the business (adopt by-laws, appoint directors and officers, and issue shares or memberships), and submit to the Bureau additional documentation not required of proprietorships or partnerships on an annual basis (corporate tax return and annual report).

Also, corporations need to maintain corporate meeting minutes, which would be given to the IRS in case of an audit.

From a tax standpoint, the business-related deductions offered to corporations are basically the same when compared to other legal forms of business organization.

Last but not least, corporate business owners are recognized by the IRS as company "employees" and are subject to paying appropriate state and federal employment tax regardless of whether anyone else works for them.

The major advantage of forming a corporation

include that it is often easier to raise capital through banks and other lending institutions and to change ownership if and when necessary.

Elcy Maccani, Public Affairs spokesperson with the Detroit district office of the IRS, also adds that business owners are generally not held personally liable for debts incurred by the corporation. Maccani stresses, however, that there are definite exceptions to this rule.

Corporations and limited partnerships are further offered "better" protection of their business name as compared to the other legal forms of business and need only register once to obtain this protection on a state-wide basis.

Maccani suggests that small business owners thoroughly investigate all aspects of incorporation before making the decision to do so.

# Fall Fest has more punch in less time

The biggest change in this year's Plymouth Community Fall Festival is that it's been trimmed — from the traditional four days to three.

The festival takes place Friday through Sunday, Sept. 11-13, in downtown Plymouth and at Central Middle School.

"We see that as a positive move," said Marilyn Alimpich, president of the fall festival.

"The last couple of years we've been talking to the merchants, they thought closing the streets a day later would be helpful, and we wanted to be cooperative," Alimpich said.

Also, "Some of the organizations felt that dropping the Thursday schedule wouldn't cut into their profits," Alimpich said.

"I know we're planning to have more rides for the children this year — we're trying karaoke this year, and that will be a little different," Alimpich said.

Also, a jazz band has been scheduled to perform at the festival.

Gone this year is the dunk tank on Penniman run by the Plymouth-Canton Rockettes pom-pom squad.

"For one thing, the insurance rates were just astronomical for them," Alimpich said.

Still, there will be plenty of activities for kids, including New Morning School exhibits, face painting, rides and the Optimists Pet Show from 9 a.m. to noon on Saturday.

While the fall festival is traditionally the biggest event in a community where there are several big events, fest coordinator Joe Bida points to another standout feature of the fall festival.

"The money that's derived from the Plymouth Community Fall Festival is put back into the community," he said.

That's because a slew of civic groups have booths or run other activities at the festival to raise money — which is put back into activities they sponsor in the community year-round.

The festival was founded in 1956 by the Plymouth Rotary Club, to raise funds for play-

# Bloomfield Hills New Money,

Populated by enthusiastic entrepreneurs, this verdant haven is f

**B**LOOMFIELD HILLS, Mich. — Twenty-eight miles northwest of its old-moneyed compatriot Grosse Pointe, Bloomfield Hills — a lush tract of rolling terrain and palatial homes — is Southeastern Michigan's homage to new money well spent.

Flamboyant and fun, it's the kind of place where women worship at the altars of Chanel and Montana and where men, wondering whatever possessed them to buy foreign cars in the first place in the heart of American auto country, sheepishly drive their tags and engines from keep the

Vitality defines style in Bloomfield Hills, where Fourth of July block parties and neighborhood softball games are the rule, not the exception.

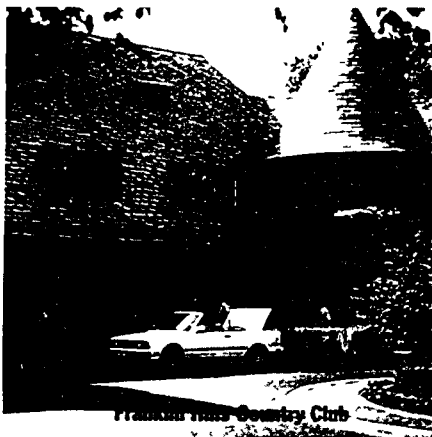
It's a younger, energetic group, says Sam Valenti 3rd, president of Masco Capital Corp., by way of explaining the difference between his adopted hometown and Grosse Pointe, the longstanding bastion of inherited WASP wealth on the other side of Detroit. "There are a lot of self-made people here and not a lot of pretensions. It's a whole new generation of people with the same Midwestern values and the same energy that built Detroit in the first place."

Valenti, a powerfully built man with bovine good looks, delighted in designing his own home, a gracious Georgian with imposing white columns. Valenti spent five and a half

building a model of the place before one timber was even erected. The process, he says, provided a refreshing break from his position at Masco, the parent of such manufacturing companies as Delta Faucet and Henredon Furniture Industries.

"Everything I do is intangible," he explains. "They're just numbers on a page. The home, on the other hand, was something he could wrap his hands around."

Like many homes in Bloomfield Hills, the Valenti residence gives traditional style a contemporary spin. The rooms are open and airy, from the red and blue family room with its sweeping view of the swimming pool to the floral living room with its French-doored balconies overlooking an expanse of emerald green lawn.

#### On the West Side

a label that applies to Bloomfield Hills and environs in relation to its East Side rival, Grosse Pointe — having a beautiful home not only serves as a status symbol but also is a draw for charity events. Katie Valenti, a bubbly brunette who has hosted at-home fund raisers for up to 250 people, admits with a smile: "It's an easy way to sell a party. People love going to other people's

homes.

In a community that puts a premium on family, the Valentis spend most of their free time with their children, Nicole, 15, and Sam, 11, 12, and head for their vacation homes in Harbor Springs, Mich., and Sanibel Island, Fla., whenever the opportunity presents itself. But Bloomfield Hills remains very much the family's center.

This community lives and breathes the values that the rest of the nation seems to be longing for right now, says Rick Inatome, chairman of Inacom Corp., a computer retailer, articulating what brought him and his family to Bloomfield Hills three years ago.

"We have wonderful family-oriented neigh-

bors. One year the entertainment for the annual summer block party was provided by a band made up of the neighborhood's high-level executives. Last summer, we got together with friends across the street, rented a 50-foot yacht and went barboating around the Caribbean with our four children and their two children."

Best of all, the affable Inatome says enthusiastically, "is the feeling of camaraderie. I'm at the head of a \$1 billion company. When I have a problem, I can walk down the street and talk to Joe Antonini, chairman and chief executive officer of Kmart Corp., a \$3.1 billion company."

Joyce Inatome paints a similar picture to that of her husband. "We all help each other and enjoy each other socially." During the height of the social season, friends and neighbors also support each other's pet causes. Joyce notes playfully, "It's, 'I'll go to yours if you'll come to mine.'"

While block parties continue to thrive (by most counts, you could attend two to four a month during the busy season), family events are on the rise. The first children's fund-raiser for the Hospice of Southeastern Michigan, co-chaired by Inatome and held at a nearby farm replete with petting zoo, hay and pony rides, karaoke, face painting and clowns, "is a prime example."

In addition to guaranteeing a rollicking good time for everyone, such events, says

Kathy Antonini, wife of Kmart's Joe Antonini, involve children in their community early on.

"The world really isn't Bloomfield Hills," says Antonini, who hosted a make-your-own-sandwich party for 15 children who colored the farm event's invitations. "On a small scale, you're teaching children to give their own time."

"We knew this was the area we wanted to be in," says Joyce Hurst, who, along with her husband, Robert Hurst, president of Michigan Bell Telephone Co., moved back to Bloomfield Hills four years ago after returning from Chicago.

Hurst, whose son and daughter are grown, loves the youthfulness, the diversity and the warm spontaneity of the West Side. During the

mily-oriented and fosters unpretentious, old-fashioned standards.

holidays, for example, she says, the neighborhood is full of progressive dinner parties, Christmas cocktails, hors d'oeuvres and Hanukkah celebrations.

While there is no dearth of good restaurants and country clubs in the area, inviting people into your home is decidedly the entertainment of choice. "We're definitely getting a lot of entertaining at home more," says a 37-year-old hostess, intimate sit-downs for 12. "I love to cook, and if my guests are people I feel comfortable inviting, I'm in the kitchen. While I cook, I'll prepare drinks. I'll not let them sit there."

As for the formality of such sources, Hurst says, "We're not so casual as it is in the city, but we don't have to have the sterling candelabra on the table when we dine. I guess it's safe to say we eat, we don't dine."

Other than dinners hosted by her two daughters, Katie, 17, and Michelle, 15, the parties she attends, even ones for eight, are not so formal. At one recent dinner, a couple was invited to the ceremony, but the guests were ushered into the kitchen to watch the chef prepare their supper.

You could get dressed up to go to these parties, Antonia notes. "You could get your hair and nails done, it's for sure. It's a family-oriented, relaxed, comfortable."

A woman who moved to Bloomfield Hills to escape life from New Jersey, says, "For two years, my husband and I have been in the city, and I'm not even going to the grocery store in the middle of the day," she explains. "It adds that the more formal attire does not mean it's a snobbish community. We have lived in a number of different places in the years we've been married, and I probably have felt the most at home here—the most welcome here."

The family is planting ever-deeper roots, building a traditional home that Kathy Antonia describes as having "a little French touch to it."

One of Bloomfield Hills' most respected

Some in the horsey set still ride at the Bloomfield Open Hunt Club, but many of the dedicated equestrians have bought farms up north in Metamora. As businesses pick up stakes and move from downtown Detroit into the suburbs, more West Siders are finding they can live full time on their farms and commute.

Ten-acre zoning minimums have kept developers from bulldozing farm land to make way for subdivisions, and most residents respect the longtime courtesy of allowing riders and cross-country skiers to traverse their property.

On her 25-acre Wonder Why Farm, Susie Stroth, an unaffected blonde, runs an interior-design business and trains her three horses.

"I have a three-year-old I just bought and am working on training, trying to get ready to show next year," says Stroth, an avid rider who takes to the saddle every day.

Stroth grew up in Bloomfield Hills, but now prefers the quiet, rural life of Metamora, where she cooks Thanksgiving dinner on her 19th-century wood-burning Canadian stove.

"You can be as friendly or as social as you want to be, but people don't drop in. They don't come by for coffee," Stroth says with a grateful sigh. "If you like animals, space and privacy, that's what this is all about."

The farther the business and population centers move from downtown, the less rele-

vant Detroit becomes in the minds of many.

A lot of suburbanites don't even go downtown, says one longtime West Side resident. "I have friends proud of the fact they haven't been downtown in three years."

West Siders also have little reason to drive to Grosse Pointe, since the East Side, with its slew of private clubs and private parks, has long been closed to outsiders. The enmity that used to separate East and West, however, has died down for the most part, and most charity-board rosters name residents of both sides. Still, certain resentments remain.

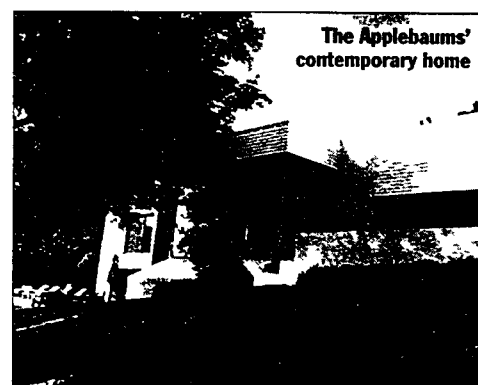
Katherine Duff Rines, who grew up in Grosse Pointe but now lives in Bloomfield Hills with her two young daughters and husband John, president of General Motors Acceptance Corp., is one human bridge between the locales. "When John and I entertain, people love it when we have guests from both sides of town," says Rines.

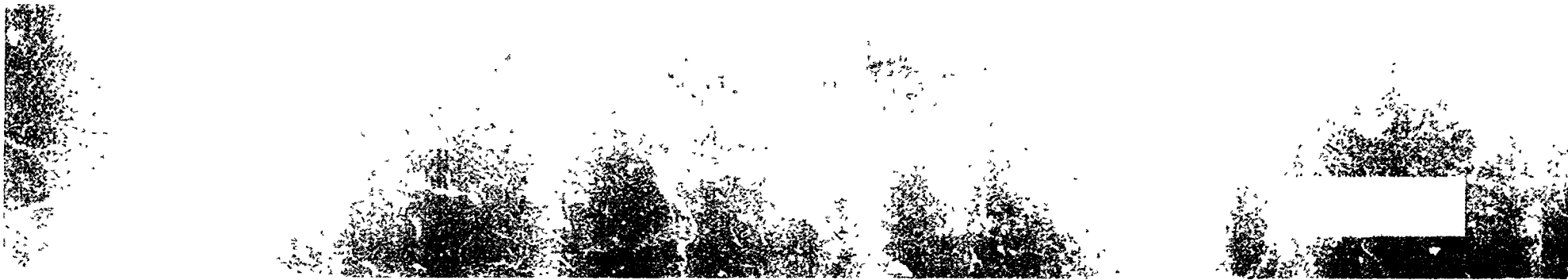

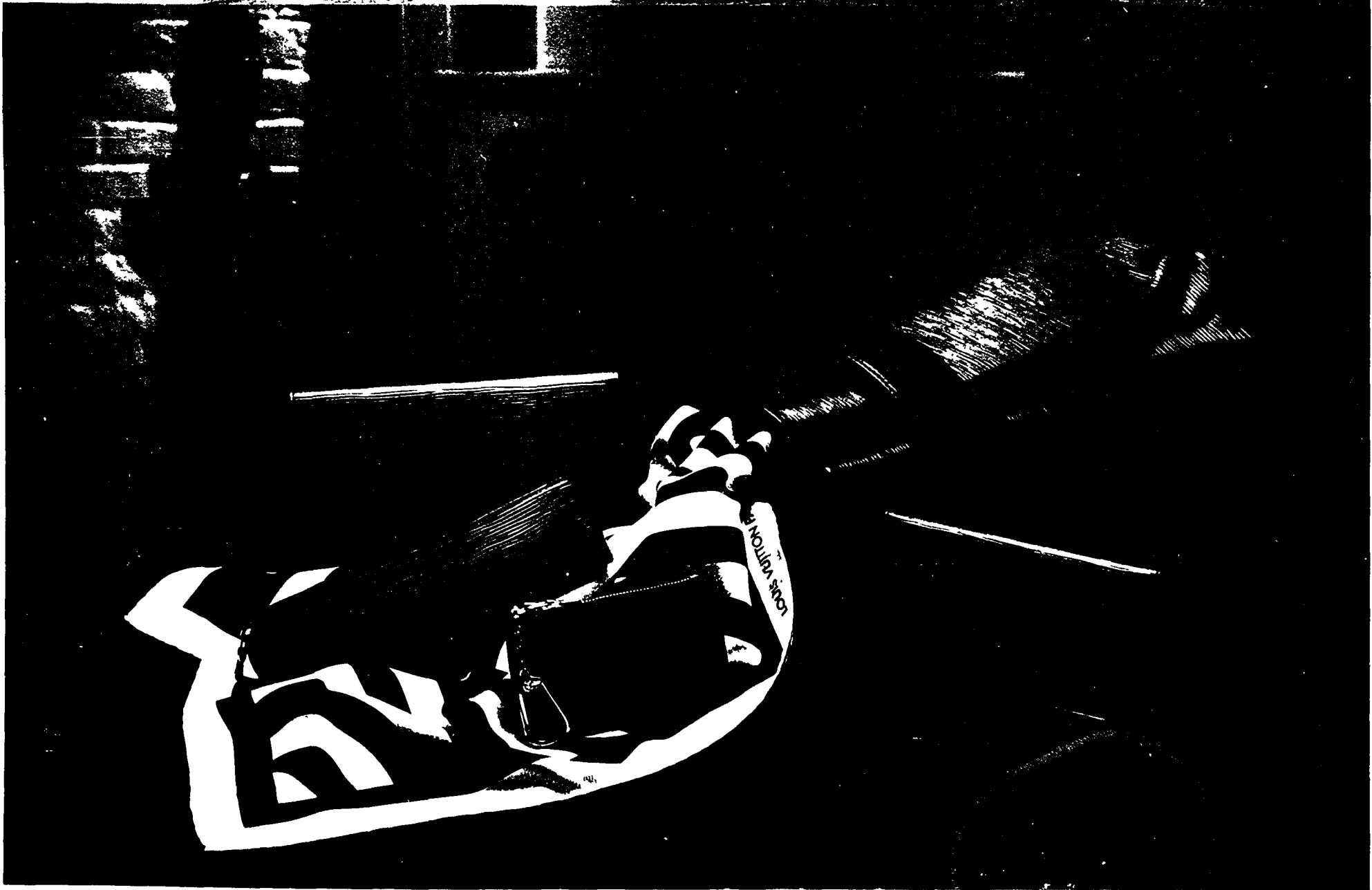

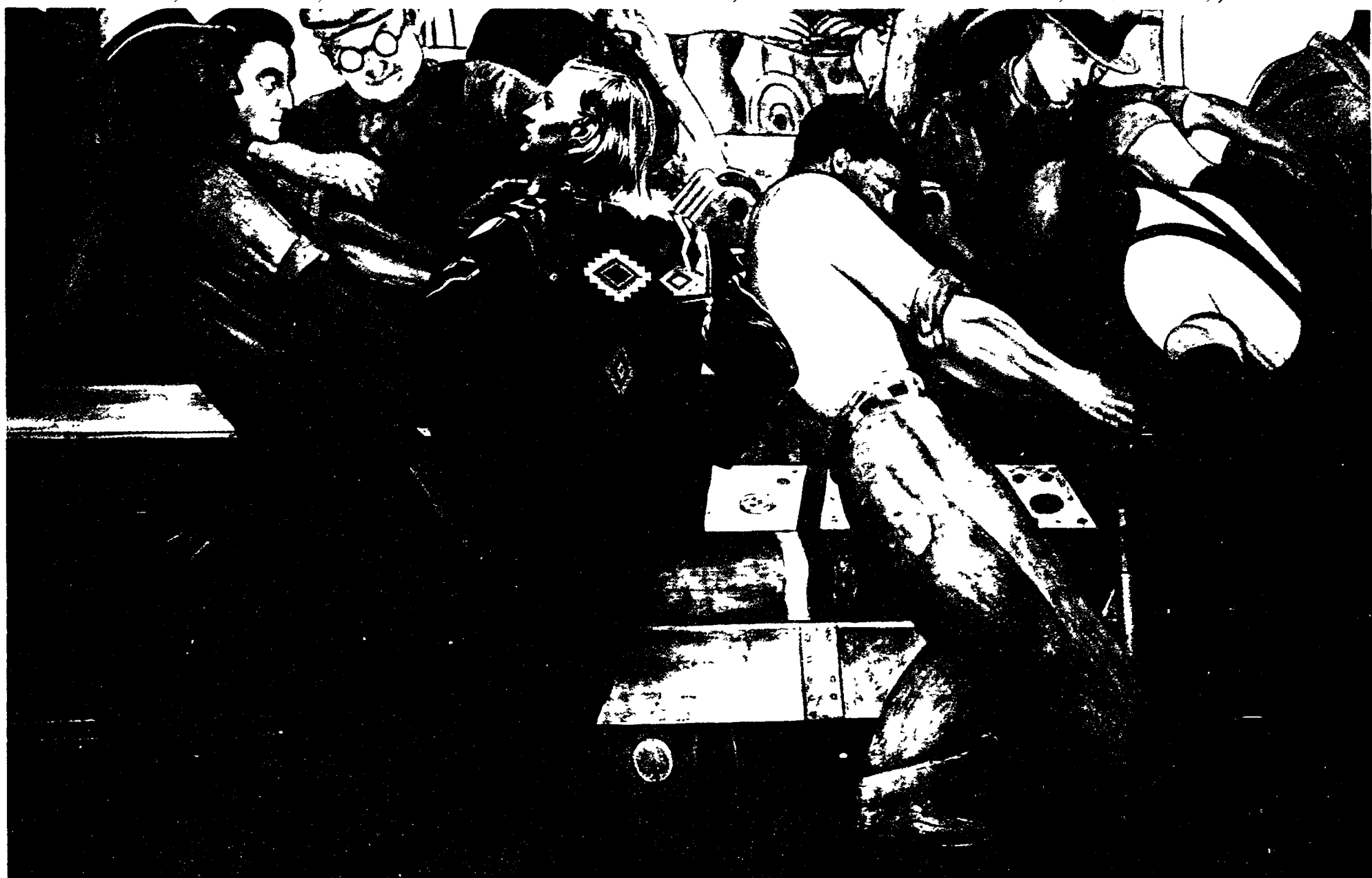

# Grosse Pointe Old Wealth, Vintage Values

Lake St. Clair is the equivalent of a town square, dictating the lifestyle of this community and giving it the feel of a resort in summertime.

**G**ROSSE POINTE, Mich. — Old money is the key in this understated community, where it's not uncommon to know four generations of a family.

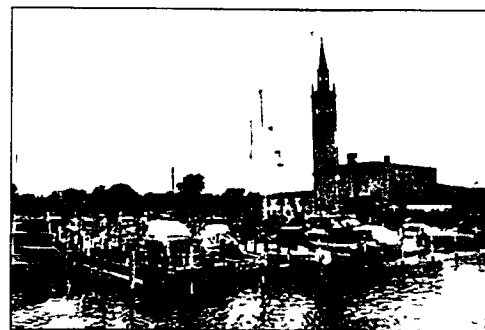
Although the point system that guaranteed a homogeneous population has been discarded, the WASP culture still dominates this conservative society.

We don't talk about money, says Stephanie Germack, a 25-year resident of Grosse Pointe. That's basic. It's considered poor taste.

Discussing money is one thing. Spending it is another. Grosse Pointers quietly apply their trust funds to vacation homes in Harbor Springs and Florida, ball gowns from Paris and yachts they sail from Lake St. Clair through the Great Lakes to the Atlantic.

A Grosse Pointer may balk at buying a \$50,000 car but not blink an eye at a million-dollar price tag on a 70-foot sailboat.

Drive along Lake Shore Drive and you'll see why. The easy blue of Lake St. Clair beck-

and appreciating home value.

The smaller the number, the better it is, explains Germack, a socialite active in the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and the Detroit Institute of Arts. I live six homes away from Lake Shore Drive on a small street.

A major exception to the preference for life-by-the-lake is Provencal Street, a private road that runs along the Country Club of Detroit's golf course. Guarded by a gatehouse, Provencal is home to many of Grosse Pointe's oldest families with stately homes beginning at \$1 million.

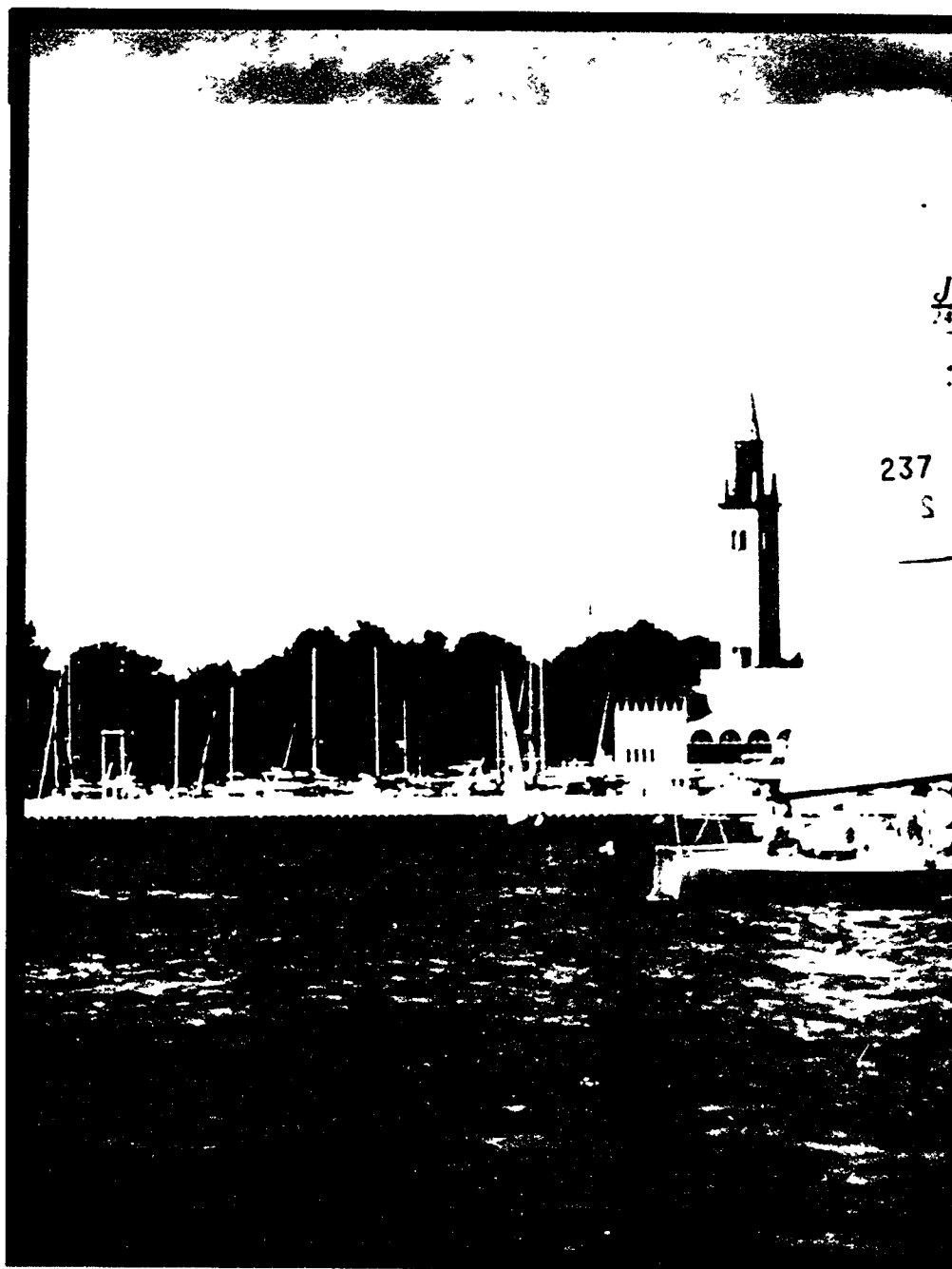
Returning to Grosse Pointe, as so many offspring do, a young couple might buy a starter home for \$150,000 and upgrade every five or 10 years, hoping a million-dollar home on Lake Shore Drive across the street from the water will become available, or the pinnacle, a sprawling, multi-million-dollar, 25,000-square-foot estate with the lake for a back yard.

Leonard and Sybil Jaques had been looking for a home on the water for almost a year when Twin Gates, their country French estate, went on the market in the early 1970s. If we couldn't be on the water, what was the point, says Sybil Jaques. Now prime property on the Shores' "sunrise strip" is even more rare.

Virgin property is nonexistent, so the ceaseless demand for housing has led developers to tear down many of the grand old estates, including that of Henry Ford, to make way for new homes. For home buyers who cannot seem to find the estate of their dreams, the trend is to buy a house on a good piece of property, tear it down, and build a new one in its stead, as did Cynthia and Edsel Ford.

In Grosse Pointe, we're pretty much on top of each other right now, Cynthia Ford says. Unfortunately, there's a lot of paring down of old estates, and subdivisions are going up.

An American car is parked in nearly every



driveaway in Grosse Pointe, although a Mercedes or BMW may lurk in the garage. In deference to the first family of Grosse Pointe, Fords are the dominant automobiles, with a Lincoln Continental the car of choice.

For years you would never see a foreign car here, recalls Tom Shoemith, who grew up in Grosse Pointe and is now owner of the Roosterfoot Catering Club. Even now, peo-



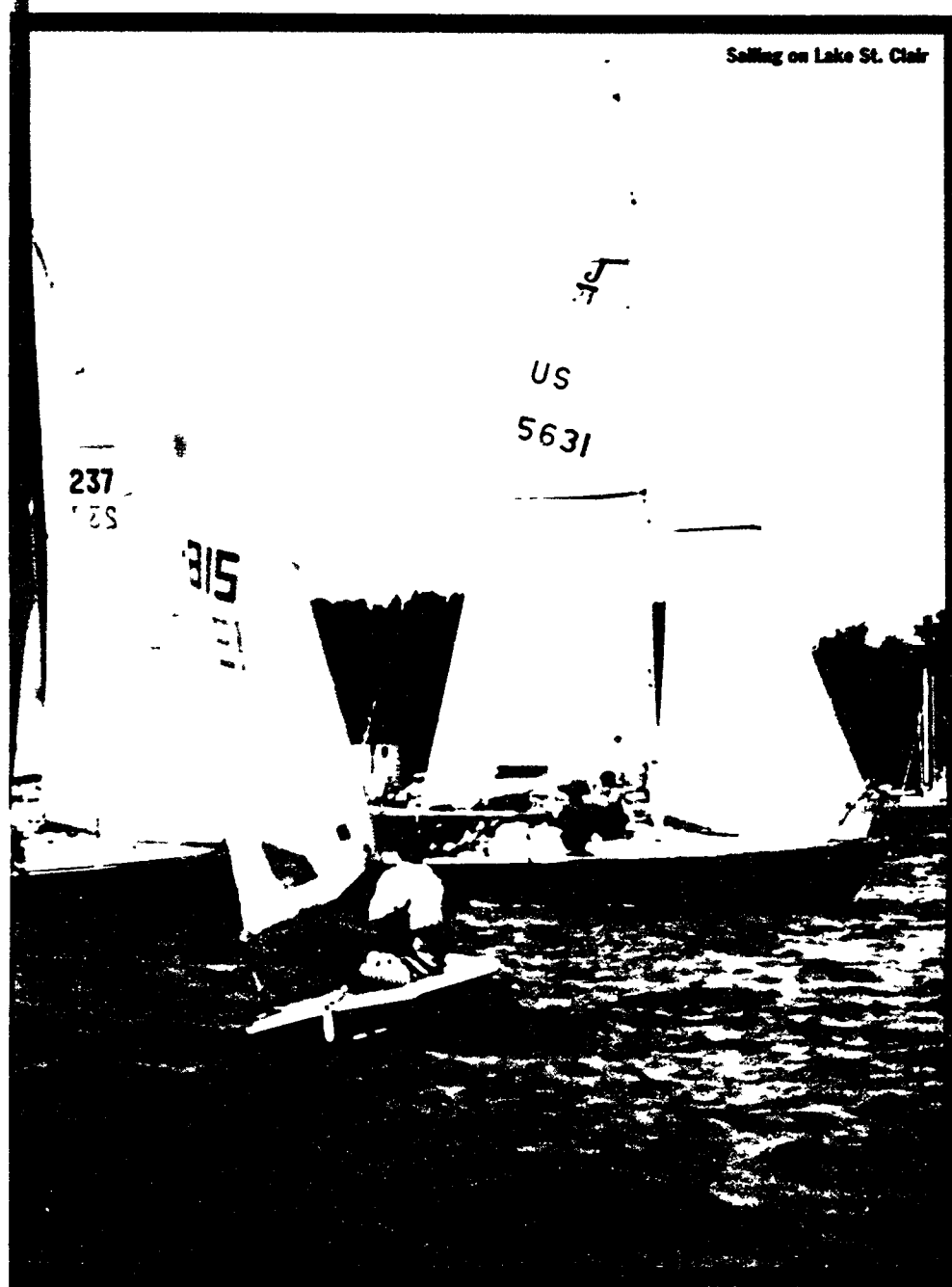

pressure can be intense when it comes to cars.

Debbie Mandt, whose husband, Philip, is an advertising executive, says she recently withheld her vote from a local political candidate because he drove a Toyota, pointing out,

Every job in Detroit is somehow connected to the auto industry, she says. (Still, Grosse Pointe can't be suffering too badly from the recession—it's putting a sprinkler system in the grassy medians of Lake Shore Drive.)

Foreign cars are not only considered unpatriotic but, in Grosse Pointe, are also deemed ostentatious. It's not unusual for a wealthy resident to drive a car for a decade—and then replace it with a used one. I always kiddingly said that Grosse Pointers bought a car every 10 years whether they needed one or

not, says a former car dealer here.

Women may buy only two or three Bill Bliss or Valentino evening dresses, and wear them over and over in a season and for years to come. They do not have this compulsion about not being seen in the same dress, says Germack.

The gowns, however, often originate in Paris or London, as it is crucial not to dress as someone's twin at the Grand Prix ball or the Detroit Institute of the Arts's Under the Stars gala, and the jewels are most decidedly genuine.

Germack says that while Grosse Pointe women may carry Nantucket handbags and wear their hair pulled back, never underestimate the way they dress up for evening. Even then, there is some restraint, Germack says, noting that when she visits her Boca Raton home, I wear much more glitz, sequined stuff or something off-beat. In Grosse Pointe I don't wear it as much.

Grosse Pointers are quite nonchalant about social events in general. A story of one Grosse Pointe matron illustrates the attitude. A scant 15 minutes before 400 people were scheduled to arrive at her home for a charity benefit, she

is filled with dozens of Oriental rugs, collected over the years. Extras are rolled up in the third-floor ballroom alongside their daughter Alisa's gymnastics equipment.

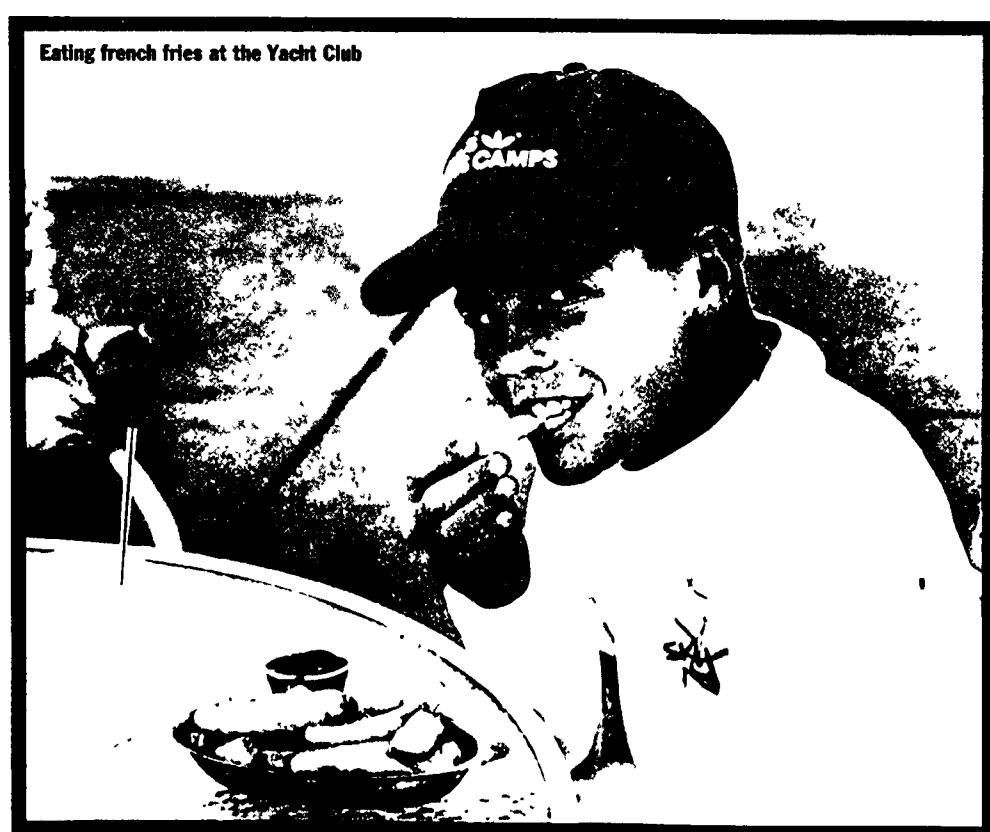

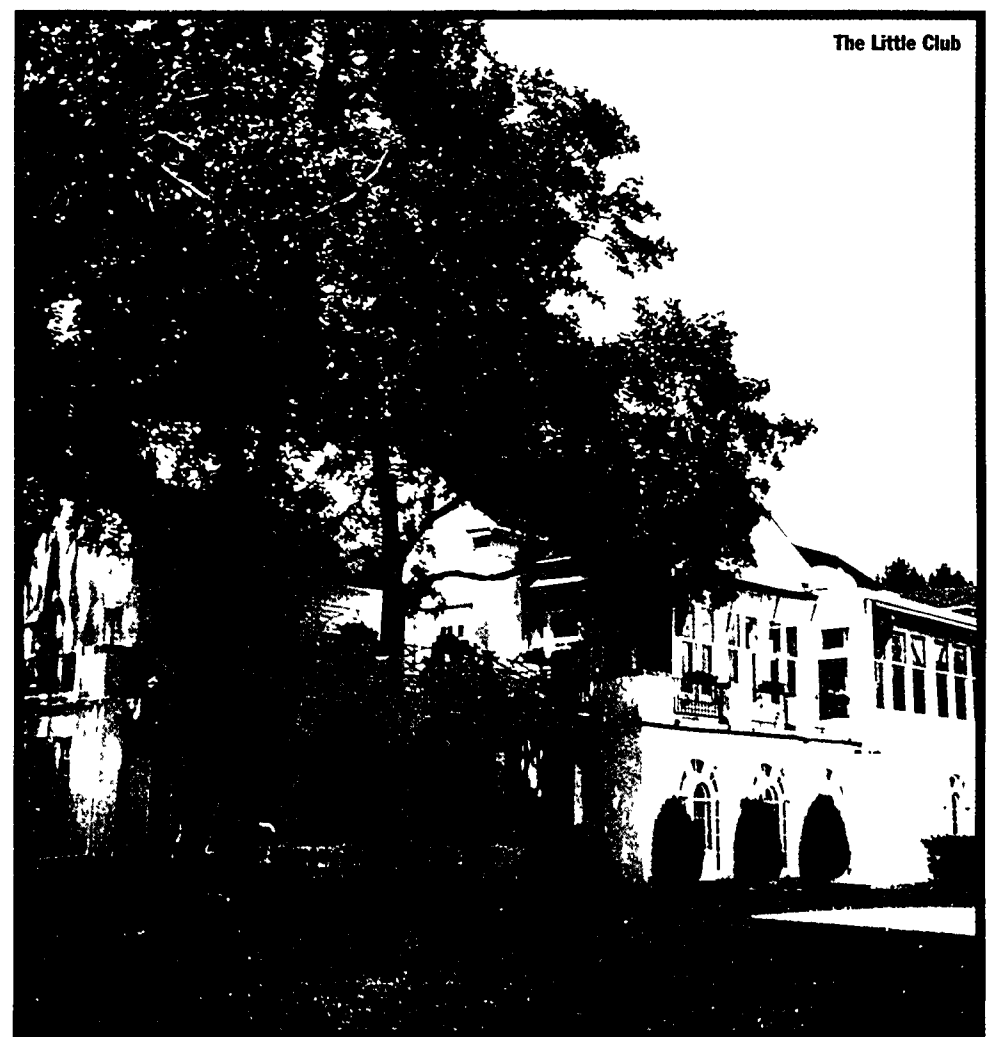

togethers—entertaining takes place at the clubs.

When we entertain at home, it's cocktails and hors d'oeuvres, maybe a buffet dinner," Germack says. "It's not a sit-down dinner for 40 or 60 people."

The Grosse Pointe Club, which everyone calls the Little Club, is the most exclusive tucked away from street view in the Farms. Some residents who have lived in Grosse Pointe for years are still unaware the Little Club even exists.

Members claim the exclusivity wipes out any competition among themselves—the idea being if you've made it this far, you have nothing left to prove.

A struggle of sorts, though, has arisen between the Little Club's older members and the young marrieds. Thus far, they have avoided confrontation by claiming their own space. The older generation retreats to the

seclusion of the poolhouse roof, where children are banned while the younger set stays poolside.

The red-and-green receiving room in the cozy white clubhouse is popular for card games and backgammon, and the kitchen is known for its perch, fresh out of Lake St. Clair.

One member compares living at the Little Club to eating at home, where is the atmosphere of the larger Grosse Pointe Yacht Club is more akin to a busy restaurant.

In contrast to the discreetly situated Little Club, you can't miss the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club's landmark tower a few miles up the road in the Shores. Here members can pass through the lobby in shorts and bathing suit tops. "I would think the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club has more members in the 30 to 45 age group while the Little Club is probably more 50 plus," says Germack.

Germack and her husband, Frank II, a second-generation Grosse Pointer, keep their 38-foot power boat, Summer Break, at the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club.

All our informal entertaining is done on boats," Germack says. "We'll go out in the afternoon, come back, and while we probably won't eat in our bathing suits, we certainly would in slacks in the club. There are rooms in the club where men don't need ties."

The casual lifestyle of boating also appeals to the Jaqueses, who every evening in warm weather take their 60-foot cruiser from the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club and dine either aboard or at a waterside restaurant such as Simbad's in Detroit. For Cynthia and Eusebio Ford, who keep their power boat at the Little Club, boating means a night of perfect weather, a drink.

On boating is popular in the Shores. Sunday afternoon and taking the kids for a swim, he says, is not unusual. "I've seen Ford, East and everything this time of year," he says, smiling at the thought.

For the Grosse Pointers, sailing is a tradition. Ask a native boater, and it has been sailing, and it will be sailing.

Since it is three months out of the water, their parents kept the clubs' junior sailing teams that conducted a variety of national.

The clubs' offerings also rose through junior sailing after returning to Grosse Pointe after graduating from college, to crew their parents' or other club members' sail boats for the Port Huron, Mackinac and Chicago Mackinac races, and to hang out at the Bayview Yacht Club, just south of Grosse Pointe in Detroit.

The younger set favors Bayview because initiation costs \$6,000, compared to \$10,000 at the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club, and because they consider it a haven for serious boaters.

"We like to be referred to as sailors," says Kasey Clark, a tanned brunette in her early twenties who decided to return to Grosse Pointe after spending six months in Manhattan. Her parents belong to the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club, but she spends her free time at Bayview with her boyfriend, Matt Mallay, a junior member.

It's a sailing club, not a social club," Mallay says of Bayview. "There are no power boats, let's put it that way."

As a child, I would live on our boat for three months so I could just wake up and go swimming," Clark recalls.

Belonging to two clubs in Grosse Pointe is not uncommon, as golfers tend to join the Country Club of Detroit in the Farms or the Lochmoor Club in the Woods. In the winter, paddle tennis and bowling are popular club activities, and ice fishermen dot the lake.

The scarcity of restaurants and cultural activities and the proximity to Detroit lead Grosse Pointers to venture downtown more often than their counterparts on the West Side.

Cynthia Ford, who has lived in Grosse Pointe for about 12 years, says she and Edsel

enjoy going downtown to the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, the Detroit Institute of Arts and the Fox Theatre. "We have a little bit of everything, and it's all first class," Ford says, but she acknowledged that most Grosse Pointers' perception is that the city has grown more dangerous.

Rather than driving downtown, more and more Grosse Pointers head to the posh West Side suburbs such as Birmingham and Troy, known for their dining and shopping.

Sybil Jaques regularly drives west to lunch with friends and shop at the Tony Somerset Collection, which includes Saks Fifth Avenue, the new Sephora MACYS and Barneys New York stores. "We like to go to the other side of town because we can buy

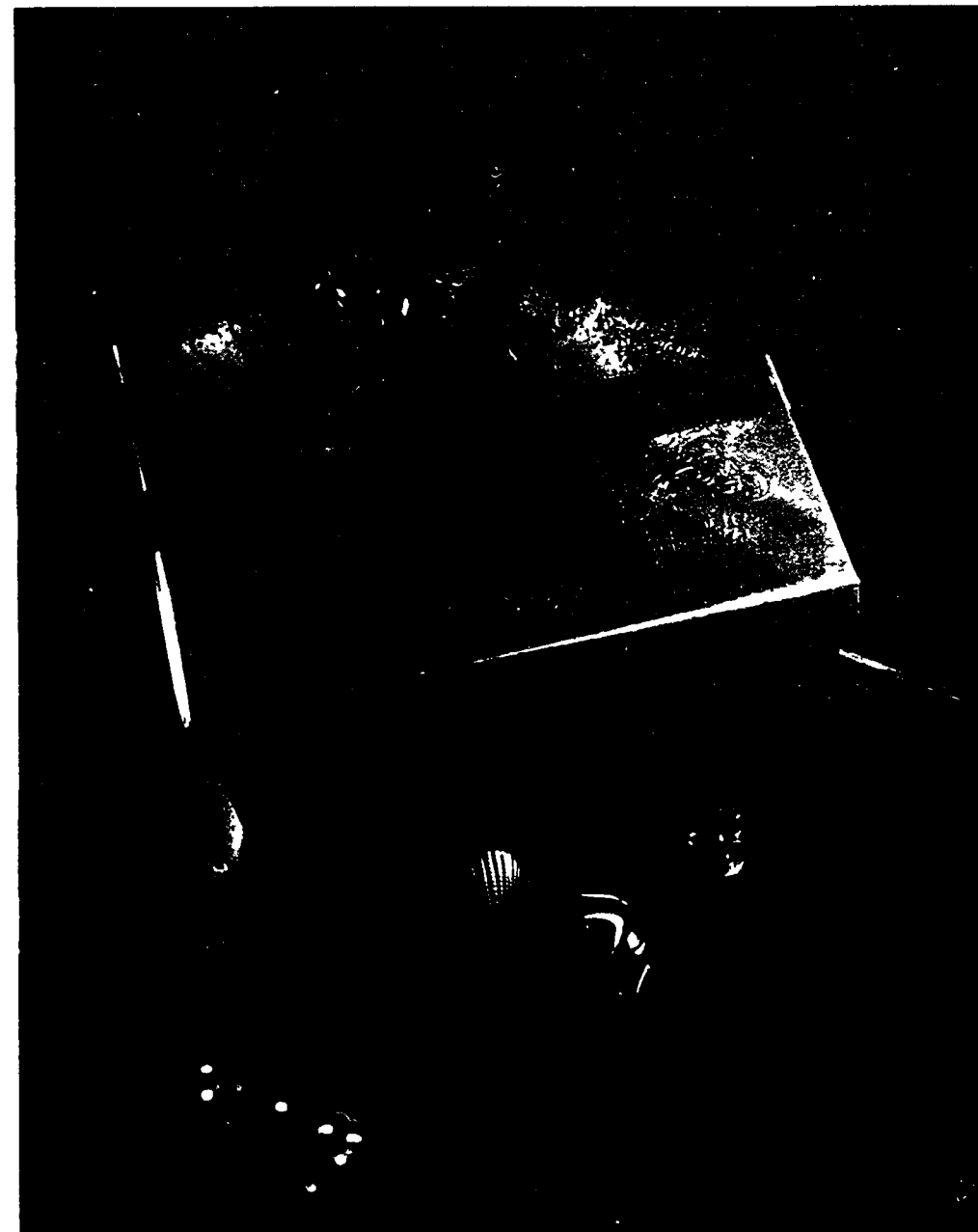

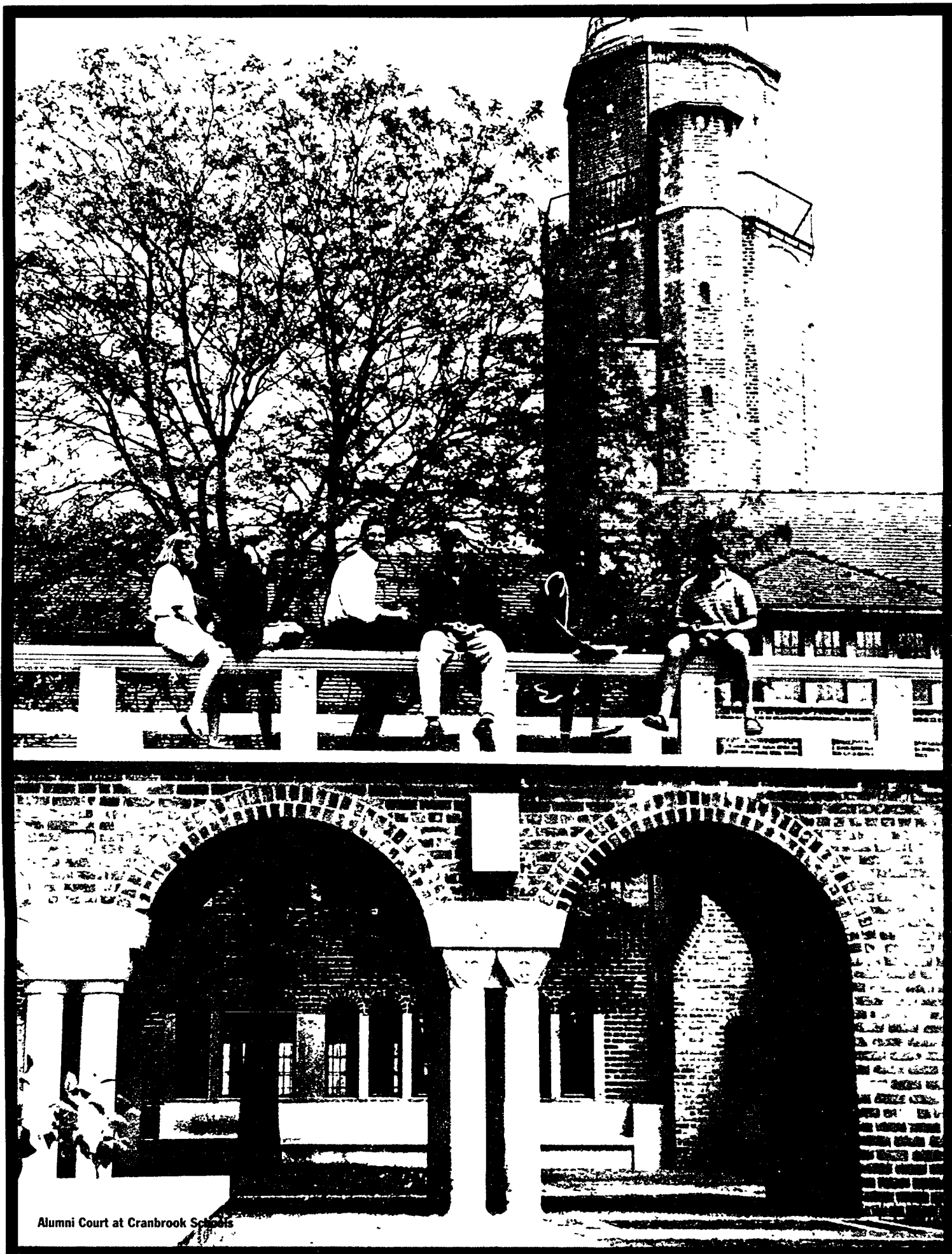

A look at five of them, each unique in it's approach and personality

**D**ETROIT — In the affluent suburbs of Detroit, status can come from your address, your country-club memberships and your children's schools.

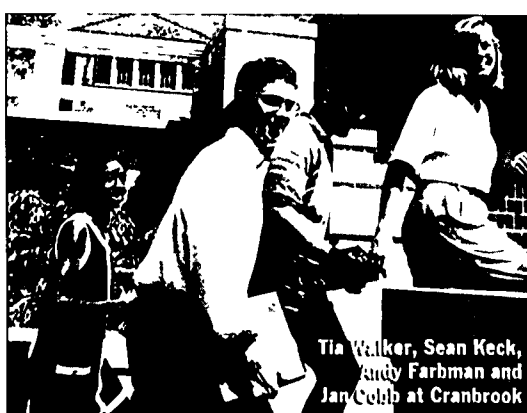
The school sticker in the back window of the Lincoln Continental can say plenty about the driver.

Cranbrook never loses its cache.

Roeper says you're an intellectual, a humanist.

Detroit Country Day puts you squarely in the establishment.

Grosse Pointe Academy says your children will receive a heavy dose of moral values, not to speak of the view of the lake at recess.

Finding the right school doesn't end there. Early in their high school careers, children begin hearing about colleges, and many find themselves visiting prospective campuses before they're 16.

Long held to be the premier school in Michigan, if not the Midwest, Cranbrook in Bloomfield Hills is ensconced on a campus so serenely beautiful, with its lakes and woods and Thiel Saamen architecture, that it is hard to imagine children wanting to go anywhere else. The curriculum emphasizes the humanities, and Cranbrook is known for

its dedication to the arts. Sam Valenti, a board member and father of a middle-school student, comments on the reservoir of talent in both students and instructors and describes the curriculum as well-rounded.

The lower and upper schools are coeducational, but Cranbrook separates boys and girls from sixth through eighth grade with the idea that children at that age learn and mature better when grouped with their own gender. More than 200 upper-school students, including a broad cross-section of international children, board at Cranbrook, and many faculty members live in homes on campus.

Sharing the campus, known as Cranbrook Educational Community, are Cranbrook Institute of Science and Cranbrook Academy of Art and Museum, a graduate school of art, design and architecture. Although the presence of such higher-education institutes could conceivably intimidate the four- to 18-

year-olds running around, students say the attitude is actually laid-back.

Tia Walker, who just graduated, said, "People aren't uptight. The teachers are relaxed and relax you, which makes it easier to learn."

Considered the liberal choice — or downright radical by some — Roeper City and Country School in Bloomfield Hills aims to develop individuality in its students. Indeed, one graduating senior showed up at commencement exercises last spring wearing a bridal gown and no shoes.

If there was a dress code, it wouldn't be Roeper," said Scott Burnstein, a 10th grader.

They want you to have your own mind. Dressing is a way of expressing yourself."

Founded by educators who escaped Nazi Germany, the school cultivates a healthy skepticism toward authority. Students call teachers by their first names and participate in decisions of the weightiest matters, even teacher hirings. In the high school, if I ever make a major decision without consulting the kids, I get killed," said Chuck Webster, Roeper's headmaster.

Innovative in academics, Roeper allows students the freedom to pursue their own interests while maintaining basic requirements. Admission standards are rigorous: as all 500 students, pre-school through grade 12, are expected to be gifted. When a class does not perform well on a test, the teacher questions how he taught the lesson, not how the students studied.

At the other extreme is Detroit Country Day School with a reputation as a highly struc-

tured, conservative school that produces achievement-oriented, preppy students.

From the unisex navy blazers and school ties to the powerhouse sports program, the atmosphere at Detroit Country Day in Birmingham is about as close to an Eastern prep school as Michigan gets. Detroit Country Day's biggest rival is Cranbrook, and students from the two don't usually mix.

Students at Detroit Country Day are serious about their studies, particularly math and science, and fiercely competitive in athletics. The school, in fact, requires seventh through 11th graders to join two sports teams.

Founded in 1914, but not fully coeducational until 1972, girls sometimes still feel they're not on an equal footing with their male contemporaries. Detroit Country Day has formed a gender committee to study ways of improving the relationships and attitudes.

On the east side of Detroit, Grosse Pointe Academy seems to instill the most devout loyalty in its alumni and parents. "I can't say enough wonderful things about it, and my children speak more highly of it than I do," said Michelle Taylor, whose three children attended the pre-school-through-eighth-grade school.

Located in a historic, hilltop building across the street from Lake St. Clair, the school was founded in 1885 as the Academy of the Sacred Heart. Although it became independent in 1969 and changed its name to the Grosse Pointe Academy, it maintains a

commitment to teaching moral values.

Parents praise the nurturing given their children by the faculty, noting that Sabine DuPont, the headmaster, shows genuine interest in each child, often helping the children out of the cars in the morning, teaching classes himself, and keeping students' projects and progress throughout the term.

The Academy's Annual Auction, now in its 26th year, has grown into the largest private school auction in the country, netting over \$500,000 last year. The May event is a highlight of the social season, pulling in patrons from the West Side, as well as from Grosse Pointe, to bid for such items as cars, safari trips on the Concord, and tickets to the Academy Awards.

The Academy of the Sacred Heart of Grosse Pointe is private, Catholic, and coeducational.

enjoys more than a century of history and extensive ties to Grosse Pointe's important old families.

Cynthia and Edsel Ford chose ULS for their sons, in part because of the Fords' long history at the school. University Liggett really puts strong academic standards at the top of the list," said Cynthia Ford, who has served on the ULS board for six years. "We have a sensational faculty. I've gotten to know a lot of them on a personal level as well as a professional one."

# Elegance on Wheels

A Detroit showcase for the best of the world's classic cars

**R**OCHESSTER, Mich. — The automobile, which is to Detroit what oil is to Texas and wine is to France, was on display in all its glory at the 14th Annual Concours d'Elegance at Meadow Brook Hall, one of the three most prestigious shows of its kind in the world.

Painted and polished and pampered to perfection, 240 classic cars, about one-third from the Detroit area, competed in the invitation-only show, a re-creation of the original Concours d'Elegance, popular in European resort towns in the Twenties and Thirties.

More than 14,000 car buffs turned out for the show set against the backdrop of the gentle green hills of Meadow Brook, the historic estate of Matilda Dodge Wilson, now part of Oakland University — the women wearing long flowing dresses, simple tank dresses or spanking white shorts, the men straw hats and navy blazers.

Judges critique the classic cars on the basis of beauty and elegance and award trophies in 14 classes, as well as such special categories as Most Elegant, People's Choice and the Governor's Trophy for best in show, which went to a 1939 Mercedes-Benz 770K Cabriolet.

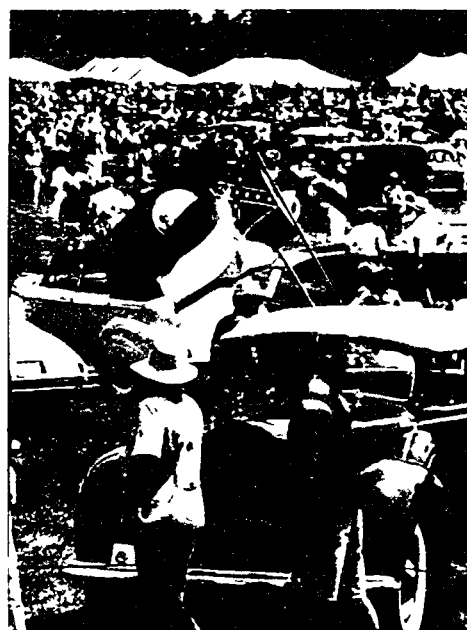
A couple of years ago, a totally unrestored car won best in show, said Edward Lucas, master of ceremonies at Meadow Brook. "It was a very rare car, a very desirable and valuable car, and it was in beautiful shape. We don't judge on restoration — we judge visual impact of the car, its elegance and its uniqueness. It's subjective."

Car collectors come from every walk of life and every region, said Richard Kughn, whose 1940 Packard Derham, a spiffy green convertible sedan, captured a blue ribbon.

In its attempt to re-create the original Concours faithfully, Meadow Brook revived the traditional fashion show that accompanied the parade of cars. Chauffeur-driven Ducesbergs and Rolls-Royces deposited models outfitted in fall fashions from the

Somerset Collection and Saks Fifth Avenue in front of the approving crowd, which had in eye for beautiful clothes as well as cars.

Kughn, a Detroit businessman whose holdings include Hôtel Trains and the Whitney restaurant, built his first car, a 1928 Model T, from junkyard scrap when he was a junior in high school.

Now he owns 252 classic cars. That's a lot of garage space, so he established Curial Museum in Detroit to house the collection. A lanky, distinguished-looking man, Kughn admitted that acquiring a collection of this size takes a few nickles.

Rather than keeping their cars locked away like stamp collections, some aficionados appreciate their automobiles as the machines they were built to be. Jim McDonald, a Bloomfield Hills collector with



a dozen classic American cars, drove his 1947 Cadillac convertible on a tour of New England.

"I got my first car 24 years ago," McDonald said wistfully. "It's a 1957 Thunderbird. Now it has 50,000 miles on it."

McDonald's 1940 Lincoln Continental, a first production model and one of his personal favorites, took home a blue ribbon from Meadow Brook.

You really eat, sleep and dream cars all the time," said McDonald, a former Ford dealer.
